

Constitution Of N. D. H. L. S.

ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as the NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE, hereinafter called the LEAGUE.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of the League shall be to promote, directly or indirectly, all desirable kinds of inter-high school contests, to hold them to the highest standards, and to make them serve the interests of the member schools.

ARTICLE III — MEMBERS

SECTION 1. Any classified school in North Dakota, or any school of equivalent rank specifically admitted from year to year by the Board, may become a member of the League by acknowledging allegiance to its authority and paying the annual dues. The membership year shall be from October 1 to September 30 following

SECTION II. The superintendent or his faculty appointee shall be the official representative of the school, hereinafter called the REPRESENTATIVE, such appointment, if any, being made in writing to the secretary.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

SECTION I. There shall be a Board of Control, hereinafter called the BOARD, consisting of five representatives chosen by the League at the Annual Fall Meeting, for terms of three years, each, new members to be seated July 1 following their election. On or before July 1 of each year the Board shall chose from its own number a president, a vice-president, and a secretary—for the Board and for the League. ("Secretary" or "Treasurer" hereinafter means secretary-treasurer.)

NOTE: It is proposed to amend this section as follows:

"There shall be a Board of Control, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of five representatives chosen by the League at the annual fall meeting for terms of three years each new member to be seated July 1 following their election, each year, the Board shall choose from its own number a President, and a Vice-President. A Secretary-Treasurer shall also be selected by the Board of Control who will serve at the pleasure of the Board."

This amendment is to be voted upon at the annual meeting 1945.

SECTION II. The president, vice-president, and secretary-treasurer shall each exercise all the functions assigned to him by work or implication of the Constitution, By-Laws and Regulations of the League, or the Rules of the Board.

SECTION III. The Board is the League's executive body, subject only to restraint of the Constitution, By-Laws, and Regulations of the League. The Board shall determine the time and place of its own meetings and shall fill vacancies in its own ranks, to serve until the next regular meeting of the League. Three members shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION IV. When the Board is dealing with affairs in which one of its members or his school is specifically involved, the remaining members shall select a proxy to sit in his place.

ARTICLE V - REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

SECTION 1. The time and place of the regular meetings of the Representatives shall be those of the High School Conference and of the North Dakota Education Association, the hours and rooms being designated by the Board.

SECTION II. Special meetings may be called by the Board, and must be called by the Secretary upon the written request of twenty Representatives.

SECTION III. The Representative Assembly shall have electoral and legislative function only.

SECTION IV. Twenty Representatives shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE VI - FINANCE

SECTION 1. The Board shall determine what expenditures are necessary.

SECTION II. Each member shall pay to the treasurer annual dues according to the following schedule: *Class A, \$1.00; Class B, \$2.00; Class C, \$3.00.

*NOTE:

Class A shall include towns under 1,000 population.

Class B shall include towns from 1,000 to 2,000 population.

Class C shall include towns of 2,000 and over..

The population shall be based upon the latest federal or state census.

SECTION III. Special assessments may be levied by a twothirds vote of the Representative Assembly.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

The By-Laws and Regulations of the League may be ammended by a majority vote of those present, at any regular meeting, provided this vote is 25% of all Representatives, and provided notice of the proposed Constitution-amendment with its substance, has been served at a previous session or has been served by letter from the Secretary at the request of another Representative and provided that there shall be a lapse of one month between the time of presentment and final vote thereon.

BY-LAWS GOVERNING RELATIONS OF SCHOOLS ARTICLE I — MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. Application for membership and acknowledging allegiance to the League must be made by the superintendent of the school on the League's prescribed card-file form.

SECTION II. A school may be suspended or expelled by the Board for violation of League rules; and once expelled, may be reinstated only by action of the Board.

SECTION III. No school shall be admitted to the League during a school year in which it has as a non-member been represented in any interscholastic competition by a student who would have been ineligible under the rules of the League.

ARTICLE II - RESPONSIBILITY

The school's responsibility to the League rests upon the superintendent. Consistent with this obligation, and except as otherwise specified, his powers and duties may be delegated for execution to one or more members of the teaching staff of his high school as follows:

- a. Representative, who may hold office in the League, or speak and vote in its assembly.
 - b. Business managers, coaches, directors, chaperones, etc.

ARTICLE III — OFFICERS

SECTION I. When authorized by the President, the Secretary may submit by mail questions for discussion, but not for vote.

SECTION II. The secretary shall keep an accurate and systematized record of membership, officials of the League, and contestants.

SECTION III. The Secretary shall have general charge of the Board's correspondence, and shall distribute their forms, information and inquiries to members.

SECTION IV. The Treasurer shall receive all funds belonging to the League, which he shall invest or pay out for League bills as directed by the Board and formally approved by the President.

SECTION V. The Treasurer shall keep a systematic and detailed record of all receipts and disbursements, with vouchers for

the latter, and shall make a complete financial statement to the League at the Conference session, at which time his accounts shall be audited by a committee of three appointed by the President.

SECTION VI. The Treasurer shall furnish a bond for two thousands dollars (2,000.00), to be approved by the Board and paid for from League funds.

ARTICLE IV — RULE VIOLATIONS

SECTION I. All questions in dispute shall be referred to the Board and their decision shall be final.

SECTION II. For any violation of League rules, an offending student may be barred from participating in contests which come under the League jurisdiction; and an offending school may be suspended or expelled.

SECTION III. Any school making a protest against another (which protest must be in writing), shall submit a full statement of facts to the Secretary, who shall submit a copy to the superintendent of the accused school. Such protest shall be accompanied by a deposit of two dollars (\$2.00), which shall later be returned if the protest is sustained by the Board.

SECTION IV. A school against which a protest or any charge has been made shall have the privilege of presenting its case to the Board.

ARTICLE V - CONTESTS

SECTION I. Neither contest rules nor eligibility rules may be waived by common consent, and they must be fully observed by League members even the competing with non-members.

SECTION II. Final agreements for contests between two League members shall be incorporated into contracts on forms provided by the League. These contracts shall be executed by the Representatives of the respective schools and exchanged prior to the contest, and shall not be cancelled or altered ecept by mutual consent of the schools concerned.

SECTION III. No member of the League shall schedule or engage in any contest with a non-member which is eligible for membership in the League, under penalty of suspension for the remainder of the year; nor shall it enter into any contest with an out-of-state school which is not similarly qualified in respect to its own state.

SECTION IV. No member of the League shall engage in any contest with a school whose membership has been suspended, during the period of such suspension.

SECTION V. At least one week prior to any contest between League schools, they must exchange eligibility lists made on the League's forms, in which the superintendent and the principal of the high school certify to the present eligibility of each contestant named and pledge the use of only those who remain eligible at the time of contest.

SECTION VI. In any contest whatsoever, except those among students in the same school no eligible student shall be used; nor shall such student appear on the field in uniform or otherwise participate as a member of the contesting organization or group. Nonmember using contestants or less than eligible standards may not secure membership within the same year.

SECTION VII. Contesting schools shall each have present an authorized faculty member who shall be responsibile to his school for the conduct of his participants and students, thruout the contest and the visiting team's stay away from home.

SECTION VIII. Athletic coaches who are not regularly employed by the board of education are prohibited.

SECTION IX. Students shall not serve as business managers to arrange or handle contests between schools.

SECTION X. High standards of courtesy, fair-dealing and sportsmanship must feature all League contests. The Board may rate schools or students in these respects, recognizing high attainment and penalizing low.

SECTION XI. The League disapproves of expensive awards from school to students for accomplishment in contests.

SECTION XII. The school must keep adequate records of contests and contestants, and all reports required by the Board shall be promptly and accurately supplied.

ARTICLE VI — ELIBILITY OF CONTESTANTS

SECTION I. A student shall have been in attendance as many school days as he missed at the opening semester, should his enrollment not have been made the first day of the semester.

SECTION II. He shall not compete for more than four seasons in any one branch of inter-high school contests, provided that competition while in the eighth grade or below, shall not constitute one of the four seasons.

SECTION III. He shall not have participated in a similar contest during the same school year as a member of any other than a high school team.

SECTION IV. He shall not have been at any time a member of a team representing an institution of higher rank than a secondary school.

SECTION V. He shall be doing passing work in at least fifteen hours per week, the passing grade to be computed from the opening of the semester and relate to such subjects only as severally have a credit value of one-half unit per semester.

Note: This means three subjects, each of which is equal a half credit a semester, on the basis of 16 credits for graduation. We may not add physical training and orchestra fractional credits together, for example.

SECTION VI. He shall not be a graduate of a four year high school course, nor a graduate of a senior high school offering three courses comprehending the tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades. Neither shall he compete after having earned credits sufficient to meet the graduating requirements in any course of study prescribed by the school he is to represent unless such credits have been secured in less than eight semesters of school attendance.

SECTION VII. He shall not be over 20 years of age.

SECTION VIII. After attending the first semester of the ninth grade he shall have credit on the school records in the unit-per-year or half-unit-per-semester subjects of at least three half units earned and recorded at the close of the last semester in which he was enrolled as a student, 30 days or more attendance or participation in interscholastic competition within any shorter period being sufficient to constitute enrollment in any semester.

SECTION IX. He shall always have contested under his own name.

SECTION X. He shall have been in attendance in the school he represents for one semester upon transferring from another school unless his parents have become residents of the school district to which he is transferred or the school from which he is transferred does not offer work of the corresponding year in which he is ranked; and in the instance of a pupil transferred from a public high school to any other high school in the same city or vice versa he shall not be eligible to represent the new high school in the same school year.

SECTION XI. He shall not use tobacco nor intoxicating liquors during the school terms of two semesters.

NOTE: This has not been cancelled but it has been taken from its position between No. 10 and No. 12 in the list of eligibility rules, and placed along with three other rules in the new High School League Recommended Standards of Eligibility, the entire administration of which, including penalties is left completely within the hands of each local school administration.

The Standards are these:

- (a.) Every athlete shall be given a thorough physical examination before the opening of the athletic season.
- (b). Parental consent shall be secure before the participation of any athlete.
- (c). Proof in advance shall establish the birthdate of every 9th semester student before participation.
- (d). Every student participating in interscholastic contests shall abstain from the use of tobacco and alcoholic beverages.

SECTION XII. No student shall participate in any interscholastic contest after his eighth semester in high school unless he is under 18 years of age; nor after his seventh semester if his seventh and eighth are not consecutive.

Minutes of the Annual High School League Meeting

October 26, 1945

The annual meeting of the State High School League was held at 4 p. m. October 26, in the study hall, Central High School with Supt. M. B. Zimmerman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved and the C. P. A. audit of the books was read and accepted.

The resignation of Supt. L. A. White was read and accepted.

Mr. George Hanna read a splendid tribute to Mr. L. A. White, retiring secretary. Upon motion by Supt. Quam of Oakes and seconded by Estenson of Cooperstown the secretary was instructed to send a copy of the tribute to Mr. L. A. White in Minot.

Mr. Ensrud of Grafton opened the discussion on Spring football. Upon motion by Mr. Walters of Park River and seconded by Bohnhoff of Grand Forks spring football was authorized and made a matter left to the descretion of the individual school.

Motion made by Gludt of Killdeer and seconded by Carlson of Finley that a committee be appointed to meet with the consolidated League relative to the possibility of consolidating the two leagues. The chair appointed Mr. Gludt of Killdeer, Mr. Stevens of Lakota, Mr. Grimsrud of Lisbon.

Mr. Van Wyk presented the amendment for first reading of Section I of Article 4 of the constitution to read as follows:

"There shall be a Board of Control, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of five representatives chosen by the League at the annual fall meeting for terms of three years, each new member to be seated July 1st following their election. Each year the Board shall choose from its own number a President and Vice President. A Secretary-Treasurer shall also be selected by the Board of Control who will serve at the pleasure of the Board."

Upon motion the secretary was instructed to write to Supt. John J. Roberts who was ill at his home in Hettinger, offering the best wishes and speed on his way to recovery. The motion was seconded by Supt. G. Hanna of Valley City.

The nominating Committee consisting of Ensrud, Lazenby, and Grimsrud submitted the name of Supt. Gilliland of Devils Lake. Upon motion the report was adopted and Mr. Gilliland was declared duly elected.

H. A. McCleod of Mandan was nominated by the Board to represent the H. S. League at the Rules Conference in Chicago in January.

The Board agreed to meet at Bismarck on December 15th to complete plans for the tournaments and officially decide other pending unfinished business.

Mr. Gilliland was appointed to fill the unexpired term of L. A. White as a member of the Board, prior to his elected term which officially begins on July 1st.

The question of penalty for Fargo and Sacred Heart who had both played ineligible players was discussed and it was agreed that both Fargo and Sacred Heart should declare their games forfeit and each team be charged with a loss.

Motion by Van Wyk and seconded by J. Roberts that the request of Pollock, S. Dak., to invite Ashley, North Dakota to participate in an invitational basketball tournament be approved. Motion carried.

The request of Estherville, Iowa to invite North Dakota schools to an interstate track meet in the spring was refused on the grounds that the distance and travel necessary to attend this meet would be prohibitive and contrary to the policy adopted by the National Federation of State Athletic Associations.

The secretary was instructed to order Football Rules Books from the National Federation for the fall of 1945.

Upon motion by Van Wyk and seconded by Roberts it was decided to employ three referees at both the Class A and Class B basketball tournaments at a fee of \$60.00 and expenses.

Upon motion the following were invited to officiate the tournaments:

Class B Minot, March 22, 23, 24:

Upon motion Supt. A. C. Van Wyk, Bismarck, was named as manager of the Class A Tourney and Supt. Paul Miller, Minot, as Manager of the Class B Tourney.

Managers fees were set at \$100 net for the class A Tourney and \$75.00 net for the Class B Tourney after withholding tax is paid. It was also agreed that these fees should be made a part of the regular tourney expenses.

The board was of the opinion that prices of the tournaments should be increased sufficiently to take care of the increase in federal tax over last year.

The secretary was instructed to write Supt. Paul Miller relative to the possibility of increasing the seating capacity for the class B tournament.

Upon motion by F. H. Gilliland and seconded by A. C. Van Wyk, KLPM of Minot was authorized to broadcast the "B" Tournament and KFYR of Bismarck the "A" Tournament

Motion was made by J. Roberts and seconded by Van Wyk that the secretary make arrangements with the Dickinson Press to publish the annual year book. The motion prevailed.

Upon motion the State Track Meet for 1945 was awarded to Valley City on May 26th. G. W. Hanna was selected to manage the state meet.

The district track meets and managers were named to be the same as last year (1944).

The purchase of trophies for the basketball tournaments and state track meet was authorized to be made from the Balfour Company. Mr. Van Wyk was instructed to consult with Mr. Walter Sherman, Balfour representative and arrange for engraving.

The Josten Company was awarded the contract for the tie clasps to be awarded to the 10 all state basketball players at each state tournament and also for the ribbons to be awarded at the district track meets.

Mr. F. H. Gilliland was named on a committee to make suggestions for extending the services of the High School League.

It was the opinion of the board that the dues to the League should be materially increased to at least pay in part for the services rendered.

Bismarck, February 17, 1945

Present: Pres. M. B. Zimmermann, A. C. Van Wyk, E. A. Abrahamson. Also Supt. W. Neff of Mandan and Prin. Gruenfelder.

This meeting was called at the request of the Mandan High School authorities to consider an elegibility problem that could not be settled in a satisfactory manner by other means.

A Mandan lad, whose parents are residents of Mandan enrolled in Kemper Military Academy and wished to return to his home town of Mandan and enroll at the opening of the second semester. The question at point is— may he return to his home town and become immediately eligible for interscholastic competition.

The Board decided, as they had done previously by mail, that if he returned to Mandan he would be considered a transfer student and would be obliged to attend a semester before becoming eligible.

Since Rule 10 on transfer is one of the controversial rules and one on which more inquiries are raised than any other rule, the present interpretation of the Board of Control is given in some detail as a guide to schools that may have cases affected by this rule.

There have been two schools of that on this rule giving somewhat of a different interpretation during the past fifteen years.

In the period up to 1936 the philosophy of the Board was based upon the principle that a boy might always have the privilege of returning to his parental home and become immediately eligible to participate in interscholastic athletics provided that the parents had not changed their residence during the interim that the boy was away from home and in attendance at some other school. An important case supporting this view is found in the 1934 year book page 18. In this case an Oakes lad attended school in St. Paul Minnesota. He elected to return to Oakes to attend the public school. He was declared eligible to represent his home high school of Oakes at once on the grounds that his parents were and had been residents of Oakes and he had the privilege of always returning to his home at whatever time he chose and becoming immediately eligible.

Since 1936 there has grown up another philosophy of interpretation of this rule. It has been based upon the principle that every boy has a home school and that becomes "his" school until such time as he shall voluntarily elect some other school to be "his" school. If he voluntarily elects to go to another city and enroll in some school, public, or private, and in the interim his parents continue

to live in the same city, then should he return home, he has forfeited his right to call his home town school "his" school and must attend a semester before becoming eligible as must any other boy who has changed schools without this change being necessitated by a change in parental residence.

The 1938 Handbook of Interpretation interprets the Rule 10 with this principle in mind. Question 126-127-128 throw some light on this problem and appear to bear out this interpretation of Rule 10.

An important case in recent years supporting this second interpretation is the so called Casselton case of a few years ago. In this case a lad who had been in attendance at Sacred Heart Academy in Fargo, found it more convenient to come back to his home in Casselton and attend the public high school. It was decided at that time that this lad would be ineligible for a semester on the grounds that he had voluntarily selected some other school as "his" school and was changing schools without such change being necessitated by a corresponding change in parental residence.

A check with the National Federation indicates that other states also impose some penalty upon the lad who changes schools. The penalty varies from a period of thirty days to an entire year of ineligibility when a lad changes schools without a corresponding change in parental residence.

Class A Tournament, Bismarck-March 15, 16, 17, 1945

All members present:

It was agreed that the Board would again sponsor a coaches and superintendents luncheon. This was arranged and forty-two were present at this luncheon.

Manager Van Wyk offered a schedule to be followed by the three referees for the different games at the tournament. Upon motion this schedule was approved. Due to the increased costs of travel it was voted to increase the mileage allowance for teams at the two tourneys to 45 cents per mile instead of the 40 cents that had previously been allowed.

President Zimmerman presented a letter from J. H. Lunday, President Tournament Committee of the Fargo Junior Association of Commerce, extending an invitation to hold the 1946 Class A Tournament in the city of Fargo; also a letter from Fay Brown, President of the Bismarck Association of Commerce, extending a similar invitation in behalf of Bismarck. Glen Miner, representing the Devils Lake Chamber of Commerce, submitted an invitation on behalf of the city of Devils Lake for the Class B Tournament in 1946. No action was taken on any invitation at this time.

The East-West Conference held their annual meeting, the results of which appear elsewhere in this report.

The Coaches also held a meeting and made the following recommendations to the board:

- I. Board of Control should select officials for the State Tournaments before Oct. 1 of each year. These officials should be North Dakota men.
- II. To promote better officiating and more interest in officiating an effort should be made to have H. V. Porter hold two clinics in North Dakota. (One at Minot and one at Bismarck.)
- III. State Tournament officials should be sent to Porter's Clinic.
- IV. Additional local clinics should be conducted by these officials. At least one clinic in each of the four Class A Divisions of the state.
- V. Officials who attend these clinics should be registered and a combined list sent to League member schools with the recommendation that these men be hired for seasonal games and district tournaments.
- VI. Recommended fees for officials \$7.50 per game for each of two basketball officials, \$10.00 per game where one man works alone, \$7.50 per game for each of three football officials.

In cases where officials must travel 5c per mile should be allowed in addition to the standard fee.

It is believed that from such a start more officials may become interested and an effective organization may be made.

A wire was received from B. C. B. Tighe of Fargo officially protesting the use of any home town official in tournament games.

Letters were read from the members of the committee appointed last fall at the annual league meeting to consider the merger of the consolidated and High School Leagues. It was agreed to consider this further at the Minot meeting.

Meetings adjourned until the following week.

Minot Class B Tournament-March 22, 23, 24, 1945

All members present:

- 1. Motion made and seconded that balls for the 1946 tournaments be contracted for at once. Northern School Supply Co. to furnish balls for the Class A Tourney and Districts 1-10 inclusive and regions of these districts and the Colburn School Supply Co. be given contracts for the Class B Tourney and Districts 11 to 16 inclusive and regions of these districts. Motion carried.
- 2. Considerable time was spent in reviewing 12 or more Benefit claims that were in question and the secretary was given instructions as to their disposal.
- 3. Mr. Gilliland proposed the following changes in the AABF schedule of claims to go into effect for the 1945-46 school term. After several hours discussion, in which technical advice was secured on the proper medical terms, it was moved and seconded that the plan be adopted and that the secretary should have sufficient booklets outlining the plan, printed and distributed to the schools and the medical profession so that questions concerning coverage would be duly answered. Motion carried.
- (See report on AABF for complete revision Schedule of the Fund.)
- 4. A letter of protest was read from Supt. A. L. Hagen of Dickinson concerning the date of the State Track Meet. While the board was sympathetic with the problem presented by Mr. Hagen in driving to a Saturday Track Meet after Commencement Activities on Friday night, it was the opinion of the board that plans were so advanced that it would be inadvisable to change the date for this year. Hence the date for the State Track Meet remains on May 26th.
- 5. Mr. H. H. Kirk, Supt. of the Fargo Schools, and Mr. W. R. Braseth, Pres. of the Fargo Junior Chamber of Commerce, appeared before the Board and orally presented an invitation to hold the

Class A Tournament at Fargo. Mr. Kirk outlined the facilities that Fargo had to offer.

A letter from H. O. Walsted, President of the Minot Junior Association of Commerce, extending an invitation to hold the 1946 Class B Tourney was read.

Upon motion it was agreed upon that action on the location of the two tournaments be deferred until the meeting of the Board at the State Track Meet in Valley City.

- 6. Moved by Gilliland and seconded by Roberts that the secretary be instructed to take a poll of the Class A schools to obtain an expression of their preference to the location of the tournament for 1946 and secondly to find their opinion on the question of alternating the location of the tournaments between the two cities of Bismarck and Fargo. Motion prevailed.
- 7. Moved by Van Wyk and seconded by Gilliland that the 1946 tourney dates be set as follows:

Class A-March 7, 8, 9

Class B-March 14, 15, 16

Motion carried.

- 8. It was agreed that the purchase of trophies be deferred until a later date inasmuch as no company can offer anything acceptable at the present time.
- 9. Upon motion of Van Wyk and seconded by Roberts it was agreed that the secretary be instructed to convert the \$600 in Gold Bonds to the appreciation type of bond. It had previously been drawn to the board's attention that these bonds now were listed on the market several points above par and that they are callable in 1946 at par.
- 10. Moved by Gilliland and seconded by Roberts that the secretary be authorized an additional \$50.00 for office help for the current year. Motion carried.
- 11. Motion made by Gilliland and seconded by Van Wyk that we inform our committee on Consolidation that we will meet with them at the State Track Meet in Valley City on May 26th. The secretary is to inform the committee and also the consolidated Board of this action. Motion carried.
- 12. Moved by Gilliland and seconded by Van Wyk that the president appoint a committee of one to work out a plan on the registration of suitable and acceptable officials for 1946. Motion carried.

- 13. It was agreed upon motion that all former board members residing in the state be granted free passes at the tournament games. (Moved by Van Wyk and seconded by Roberts.)
- 14. Moved by Van Wyk and seconded by Gilliland that we adopt a record book to be offered to the schools at the opening of the 1945-46 school term. It was understood that Mr. Gilliland would continue on the problem and present a completed form at the next scheduled meeting. Motion carried.
- 15. Coach Jack West of the University of North Dakota met with the Board and spent considerable time in outlining a plan whereby schools could form a cooperative thus obtaining athletic equipment at reduced prices and also secure some of the surplus commodities that are being released by the army and navy. Mr. West also pointed out that surplus commodities available were of a great variety and included such school equipment as laboratory equipment, radio and sound equipment, lighting fixtures, etc., in addition to the usual athletic equipment.

After considerable discussion pro and con, Mr. Van Wyk offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS,

The shortage of athletic equipment in the schools has become so critical that many schools are unable to properly equip their athletic teams, and hence must greatly curtail their athletic program, and

WHEREAS,

We believe that athletics is an integral part of the educational system and essential to the well being of American youth, and

WHEREAS,

We believe that there is a quantity of usable school supplies and equipment that is being and will be released for school use by the army and navy, and

WHEREAS,

We believe that benefits of such a program should go directly to the schools and not to private corporations organized for profit at the expense of deserving schools.

BE IT RESOLVED.

That the Board of Control endorse the organization of a non-profit mutual aid corporation for the following purposes:

1. To provide an organization which all schools may join in order to combine their purchasing power thus enabling them

to purchase athletic supplies, recreational supplies at the lowest possible cost.

- 2. To provide experienced advice to the schools in the selection and care of equipment and athletic supplies both from the standpoint of economy and safety of the pupils using them.
- 3. To secure information as to the location, quality, kinds, and the prices of athletic supplies and equipment that are, or may become available to the schools under the recent Federal Surplus Act, and to negotiate for the purchase of desirable items for the schools.
- 4. To seek out private sources where necessary athletic supplies may be obtained so our schools can carry on their athletic and physical fitness programs for the ensuing year.
- 5. In the event that the outlook for supplies for next year is unfavorable that an appeal be made thru the proper government authorities to permit manufacturers to release a limited amount of essential supplies to enable schools to carry on their physical fitness program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED.

1. That any such non-profit organization should be operated strictly for the benefit of the school and that the officers and directors should consist of school men.

Upon second by Gilliland the resolution was voted upon and carried.

16. The usual school luncheon with coaches and superintendents was held with 41 being served.

There being no further business the board adjourned to meet at the State Track Meet at Valley City on May 26th.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL

The Board of Control met at the Rudolph Hotel in Valley City on Saturday, May 26, 1945, with all members present.

1. The Board met with the consolidated League Board and the special H. S. League Committee, consisting of Gludt of Killdeer, Stevens of Lakota, and Grimsrud of Lisbon, to work out possible plans for merging the two Leagues.

After considerable discussion it was agreed to have the special committee continue and make definite recommendations by August 15th. Any proposed plans for amending the League constitution could then be presented to the League for their approval at the annual League Meeting at the N. D. E. A. for final approval.

- 2. Upon motion by Roberts and seconded by Gilliland it was agreed to invest \$4,000.00 in Series F Government Bonds.
- 5. Considerable time was spent in hearing committees from Fargo and Bismarck relative to the location of the Class A Basketball Tournament and committees from Devils Lake and Minot relative to the Class B Tournament.

After considerable discussion of the merits of the different locations it was moved by Van Wyk and seconded by Roberts that the Class A Tournament be placed in Bismarck in 1946 on the condition that all expenses are guaranteed and all net receipts are turned over to the High School League. Upon roll call Van Wyk, Roberts, Gilliland and Abrahamson voted aye, Zimmerman not voting. The motion was declared carried.

Upon motion of Abrahamson and seconded by Roberts it was agreed that Minot be selected as the site for the Class B Tournament on the same conditions as Bismarck with the added understanding that the Hotels be made available for the participating teams. Upon roll call, Abrahamson, Roberts, and Zimmerman voted yes and Van Wyk and Gilliland voted no. There being a majority vote in favor of Minot the motion was declared carried and Minot selected as the site for the 1946 Class B Tournament.

- 4. The question of purchasing stock in the Cooperative Association sponsored by Coach West of Grand Forks was discussed and it was agreed that this matter be tabled until the annual league meeting at the N. D. E. A.
- 5. Upon motion of Gilliland and seconded by Roberts it was voted to sent two officials from the Northeast, two from the Northewest, two from the Southwest and one from the Southeast to the rules clinic at Valley City on Nov. 23, 24, 1945. It was agreed that these officials would attend these clinics at League expense and would return to their respective communities and conduct clinics for officials in their home.
- 6. The question of our officials association was discussed and it was agreed that this matter should be tabled until next fall when final plans for registration of officials would be presented.

- 7. Gilliland submitted the final draft for the Permanent Record Book of Athletic Events and the Board voted to offer this service to all member schools for the coming year at a charge of \$1.00 per Record Book.
- 8. Since the Dickinson Press could not print the annual year book it was decided to award the job to the Dakota State Journal at Minot, North Dakota.
- 9. Eligibility rules were reviewed and special attention was given to rule 10 on transfer. The recent Dickinson case was discussed and the opinion of the Board was unanimous in declaring the boy ineligible.

An 8th grade lad had been in attendance during the school year at the St. Patrick's Parochial school in Dickinson. About the first of May the boy transferred to the public grade school. The point in question was since the lad was an 8th grader and the rules do not specifically mention 8th grade transfers may not the lad become immediately eligible to represent the Dickinson High School in track events.

The decision was unanimous that an 8th grader comes under the same rules as any high school pupil and where rules do not specifically mention 8th graders any and all rules applicable to high school students who wish to participate in intraschool athletics must also apply to all grade participants.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE EAST-WEST CONFERENCE

March 15, 1945

- I. SUBSTANCE OF THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF THE CONFERENCE—
 - 1. The Constitution was amended to provide the following:
 - a. Each of the four Districts is to name one District Director.
 - b. One Director in each Division is to be designated Divisional Chairman.
 - c. The Executive Committee is to consist of the three Conference Officers and the two Divisional Chairmen.
 - 2. A motion was passed that President Hanna should rearrange the Constitution to include the above and other changes that have been made but not yet included in a revised edition of the Constitution.
 - By motion each Division was authorized to use its own method of selecting the four teams for the State Tournament competition.
- II. IN SESSIONS OF THE DISTRICT MEMBERSHIPS-
 - Coaches Ted Campagna and Ed Bohnhoff and Superintendents William Gussner and Paul Miller, were chosen as Directors of their respective Districts.

2. The Southwestern District decided that any 3 or 4 way tie should be decided by lot.

III. EASTERN DIVISION ITEMS OF BUSINESS-

- The Divisional Chairmanship is to automatically alternate between the Districts, by years, beginning with Ted Campagna for the year 1945-46.
- A minimum of three Divisional football games shall be required to qualify for Divisional ranking.
- 3. The present basketball set-up shall be continued. (COMP-PILER'S NOTE:—For pre-tournament play-offs the Division shall be a financial unit, all net profits or losses being equally shared by the eight teams, and the expense allowance of non-resident or traveling teams being computed at 40c a one-way mile and \$3.50 per man-day, for 10 players and coach.)

IV. WESTERN DIVISION DECISIONS-

- The Divisional Chairmanship shall alternate annually between the two district Directors, beginning with Arnold Strand of the SW District, for 1945-46.
- 2. Basketball teams shall be ranked for divisional play-offs, on a percentage basis as to seasonal play.
- 3. Ties are to be determined according to the wishes of the teams involved.
- 4. The number one team of each District shall play the number four team of the opposite District, and the number two team shall play the number three team of the opposite district.
- 5. Beginning as paired above, the double elimination tournament shall be used at the Bismarck and Minot play-offs.
- 6. A committee appointed to adjudicate the matter of expenses for the 1945 pre-tournament play-offs, agreed to allow 2 days' expenses, with 40c per team-mile for map mileage, the home teams to receive \$20 each.

North Dakota State High School Track and Field Meet

ANNUAL INTERSCHOLASTIC TRACK AND FIELD MEET

Under Auspices of the North Dakota High School League Hanna Field, Valley City, N. D., May 25 and 26, 1945

The meet began in Valley City with golf and tennis on May 25, and continued with the track and field events May 26. Fifty-two schools and 233 individuals were entered as compared with 37 schools and 192 students of one year ago. Free housing was supplied by the Civic and Commerce Association for students necessarily remaining over night, and the meet culminated in a banquet supplied by the Kiwanis club which was held at the dining hall in the City auditorium, at which the trophies were presented. The Board of Control were present and took charge of these presentations. This matter of bringing all these students and coaches together in one great dining hall added a great deal to the interest, fellowship and color of the occasion.

Tennis competitions were held on the public school courts, near the high school; golf contests were held on the Municipal links; and the pentathlon contests were all held at the college gymnasium except the 100 yard dash, which was held at the athletic field. These three events had a somewhat larger entry than those of a year ago, and it is the hope and expectation that these can be made to grow into major events.

The meet was won by Bismarck with 41½ points. Fargo was second with 22½ points; Jamestown was third with 19, and Minot was fourth with 15. The points of the entire meet were spread over 15 different schools. Lunn of Bismarck was high-point man, having won three firsts—the 100 yard dash, broad jump and the high jump. Solberg of Fargo won two firsts, having made a clean sweep of the hurdles. He tied the state high hurdle record at 15.6 seconds, and it is quite generally believed that if he had not knocked over one of the hurdles, throwing him off stride, he would have broken the record. Delger of Bismarck set a new pentathlon record of 4715 points. These are the only state records broken or tied this year.

However, all 1944 records were surpassed this year except that of the broad jump, the shot put, and the quarter-mile relay.

Report of the Secretary of the North Dakota High School League

The present secretary assumed his duties on November 1st, 1945 after Mr. L. A. White, who had held the office for many years, resigned.

Much of the work was new to the incoming secretary and my humble apologies are offered at this time for any omissions of duties or delay that may have been caused by inexperience in the work. Nevertheless it has been a pleasant undertaking and a great deal of satisfaction has been derived out of the association with school men in their league problems.

During the past year two hundred sixty-four schools have joined the league. A check with the 1944-45 school directory indicates that only two classified high schools failed to join the league. These schools are Buffalo and Minto. Twenty-three minor classified schools were not members. On the other hand nineteen consolidated schools joined the league. Many of the smaller schools found it impossible to engage in athletics during the past year and that no doubt explains why some schools failed to join the league.

Five hundred copies of this letter has been mailed each month to school superintendents, coaches, and other interested parties. While the letter does represent a lot of work there has been genuine satisfaction in the response from the recipients.

It is the opinion of the secretary that the Board of Control has made some real progress toward making the league a more effective institution.

The members attention is particularly directed toward the revision and expansion of the Athletic Accident Benefit Fund, a report of which appears elsewhere in the yearbook. All changes in schedule go into effect at the opening of the 1945-46 school term.

The league record system worked on so diligently by Mr. Gilliland of Devils Lake is also offered to the members with a suggestion that they avail themselves of the fine service this record system supplies.

The efforts toward the amalgamation of the Consolidated League with the State High School League, particularly so that the smaller schools may obtain the insurance benefits is also a step in the right direction.

The preparation of a directory of coaches and superintendents for 1944-45 and also the publication of the constitution made up to date is also submitted to the membership as accomplishment of the year.

The secretary wishes to express his appreciation to the members for their prompt way in answering his nuisance letters and also for their cooperation over the year.

Report of the Treasurer of the North Dakota High School League

The entire operations of the league are covered by two C. P. A. audits made by F. E. Luehe and published in this year book. Due to the change in treasurers it was necessary to make two audits this year. The audits are self-explanatory and the entire operations of the year may be found by combining the two audits.

A few comments are offered to explain certain matters and present the entire picture of the finances of the league.

In general the league finances are in good shape altho the league does not fall in the millionaire class as some members would have us believe. The net worth of about ten thousand dollars is not excessive for an institution as large as the high school league and every effort should be made to keep a substantial nest egg to care for emergencies that sooner or later always arise.

It should also be noted that the bulk of the income from the league comes from the basketball tournaments. Any year in which there is not a profit from the tourneys will mean that the surplus will have to be tapped for operating expenses.

All investments are in government bonds and must be considered gilt edge. League funds are safe guarded by a ten thousand dollar bond furnished by the treasurer.

In general 1944-45 has been a banner year as far as receipts are concerned as the two basketball tournaments turned in over five thousand dollars of net profit—the largest in the league's history.

Possibly a few words of comment should be made concerning expenditures in order to further clarify the auditors report.

Office expense includes a filing cabinet and some other miscellaneous office equipment that was purchased. Only \$86.00 is for labor.

Stationery and printing includes the publication of the news letter, all football, basketball and track rule books that are distributed to the member schools, year books, etc.

Expenses charged to the board of control include the secretary's salary, expense of coaches' luncheons at both tourneys, expenses of a representative to the football rules meeting at Chicago, expenses of the secretary to Chicago at a meeting of the National Federation, expenses of special committees appointed to work with the board on special matters, and the actual expenses of the board at board of control meetings.

Expense for communications may seem large. One eligibility case alone cost over thirty dollars in telephone calls. Hence it can be readily seen that long distance calls mount and become a considerable item of expense.

In closing, your treasurer wishes to make this remark that the books of the League are open for inspection by any member at any time and any question concerning the financial condition of the league will be cheerfully answered.

The Athletic Accident Benefit Fund

The Athletic Accident Benefit Fund has been completely revised by the Board of Control. The new plan becomes operative at the opening of the 1945-46 school term.

A glance at the plan will indicate that the payments for the respective injuries have been increased. New Coverages include concussion, fractured sternum, ruptured kidney, ruptured spleen, separation of tendon from bone, surgery of semi-lunar cartileges, and suture of lacerations. An allowance is also made for hospitalization under certain circumstances.

COVERAGE REGULATIONS

No accidents are covered by this plan unless they occur in games under the sponsorship of the school concerned, or in regular practices conducted by the school and under the supervision of a teacher or athletic coach employed by the school. Irregular practices conducted by the students themselves will not be considered as coming under this coverage, nor will any accidents that occur on the way to or from practice places, which have no bearing on the conditioning process or training of the individual.

No benefits will be paid under this plan for physical education accidents unless they occur during the regular physical education class period, or during special periods scheduled by the regular teacher in connection with the physical education program. Benefits will not be approved for physical education unless such pupils involved were directly under the personal supervision of the physical education teacher. Playground activities before or after school do not come under the provisions of the plan, nor do activities with playground apparatus unless it happens during a class period and as a part of that group activity in physical education.

Membership for a given individual begins only when his fee reaches the League Secretary, but in all instances it must be sent through the officials of his home school. All transactions concerning the A. A. B. F. must be between the school authorities and the Secretary of the League. Letters from individuals concerning the benefits will be immediately referred to the school concerned.

Schools are urged to have all students taking part in athletics or members of physical education classes to protect themselves in this system of benefits. Schools are urged to send in their premiums in groups rather than reporting a few at a time. Some schools make the plan compulsory for all students. It is a voluntary plan, however the cost of the protection is so low that the individual can not afford to pass the opportunity of having it.

No benefits will be paid by the Fund in cases where accidents occur when a school is carrying on relations with a school that is not a member of the North Dakota High School League, except as provided by the regulations of the organization, nor will any school be eligible to receive benefits for its students unless they are bona fide members of the League and in good standing.

It is understood by pupils, their parents or guardians, and member schools that participation in the benefit plan is not to be construed as an acknowledgment by the schools themselves of liability for injuries incurred. Likewise the North Dakota High School League nor the Benefit Fund which it administers, its officers or agents, do not assume or acknowledge liability for injuries incurred. The execution of forms required in connection with claims for scheduled benefits shall neither be an acknowledgement of any liability on the part of the Benefit Fund; nor a waiver of any of its rights, whether said forms are called for by a member or officer of this organization. Under no circumstances shall it be assumed that the benefits of this plan are paid as a legal responsibility.

It is to be assumed that all information contained in this bulletin is well known to Doctors, Hospitals, School Officers, Parents and Students registered with the Benefit Fund.

In all claims under the benefit plan the regulations of the Workmens Compensation Department of the State of North Dakota will apply regarding physicians who may qualify to act in the treatment of cases, and who may sign the reports relating thereto.

Junior or Senior High School Pupils in the seventh to twelfth grades inclusive are eligible for membership in the benefit plan. This includes all grades normally contained in any Junior High School or Senior High School organization. Schools having only the ninth to twelfth grades in the High school organization, and only extending their regular High School Physical Education program that far, should not extend this protection below the ninth grade, except for boys who are participating on the interscholastic teams. Do not extend this protection below your Junior and Senior High School organization for Physical Education purposes.

Physical examinations by Physicians are not required by the League for eligibility to participate in athletics, however it has been recommended by the league and it has been agreed to by all Class "A" schools that they require each candidate for an athletic team to have a physicians certificate permitting him to take part in athletic contests. All pupils should have a thorough physical examination each year. It is certainly not too much to demand that all boys taking part in athletics should have a Physicians' approval of their physical condition.

Most applications for benefits are well defined and the question of allowing the proper benefit can be readily decided by the Secretary of the League. In cases involving factors that make the determination of the benefit a controversial matter, the Secretary will delay payment until it has been approved by the Board of Control, either in meeting or by mail. The Board of Control is the final authority for the approval, adjusting or disallowing of claims. Any school may appeal decisions of the Secretary to the Board of Control for final action.

The North Dakota High School League's Athletic Accident Benefit Plan is not an insurance company. The benefit payments are not guaranteed. It is possible that the available money in the fund would have to be prorated to claimants of benefits. It is not the aim of the League to make money with the plan. It is necessary for the League to maintain a small reserve to take care of unpecedented demands on it. To date the fund has been able to maintain a sufficient reserve so that the benefits have been gradually increased with out the increasing of the cost to the individual.

(a) The time coverage is for the official season of the given sport. The coverage for physical education terminates with the closing of the school year. Football and basketball coverage will include officially conducted spring practices but shall end with the discontinuance of such practices. The time coverage for track shall include all official practices and meets after the close of the school year up to the return of the squad from the state track meet.

MEDICAL REGULATIONS

Benefits will not be allowed for the following injuries unless the injured individual refrains from athletic activity and games for a period of days as stated below. A statement to this effect must be a part of the application for benefit.

In all of the above cases the individuals benefits will be cancelled for the balance of the school year until a physicians certification of physical fitness is filed with the Secretary.

Under no conditions will a single injury qualify for benefit under more than one classification. In cases of multiple injury at one time, the maximum benefit allowance shall be the scheduled benefit for the most serious injury plus one-half of the other injury benefits.

Return to physical education classes will be permitted at any time a Physician's statement to that purpose is obtained either by the individual or the school, and filed with the Secretary.

In any case a radiograph may be requested on the part of the League Secretary, and in such cases an additional allowance will be made of \$3.00 if the claim is approved for payment.

Hospitalization benefits will not be paid for cases involving infections, unless in connection with the above injuries for which hospitalization is provided.

Hernia is not accepted under the schedule because in most cases it is deemed to be a progressive congenital weakness and not directly the result of any one accident.

DENTAL REGULATIONS

Dental radiographs may be demanded on any claims presented to the Secretary of the League, but an additional allowance of \$2.00 will be made in addition to the scheduled benefit.

The amount of the allowance approved by the Secretary or Board of the League will in no case be more than the amount of the itemized statement filed by the Dentist, which must accompany every request for benefit. No amounts will exceed the maximum payments listed in the benefits schedule.

Dental work must be entirely completed before the scheduled benefit is paid by the Secretary of the League. No dental benefits will be paid for teeth reported injured before restoration is made. In no case will the amount of the benefits exceed the actual cost of repair and restoration.

TRANSPORTATION BENEFITS

The provisions of the North Dakota High School League Benefit Plan shall extend to the transportation of athletic teams to and from games that are played out of the city. This applies only to squad members, when such members are being transported by the school as a group and under the supervision of the school. It does not apply to cases where such squad members are riding in transportation not provided by the school, or where such squad members leave the transportation provided for other transportation.

The benefits provided in the above schedules will be applied to transportation accidents with all the limitations as provided for, and for the same cost as provided in the schedule of that sport. The bootball protection payment includes transportation for the football squad only, likewise the same will be true for basketball and track or other activities as scheduled. There are no additional transportation benefits other than those listed herewith.
