

Constitution Of N. D. H. S. L.

ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as the NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE, hereinafter called the LEAGUE.

ARTICLE II — OBJECT

The object of the League shall be to promote, directly or indirectly, all desirable kinds of inter-high school contests, to hold them to the highest standards, and to make them serve the interests of the member schools.

SECTION I. Any accredited High School, Graded or Consolidated School, so classified by the State Department of Public Instruction may become a member of the League by acknowledging allegiance to it's authority and paying the annual dues. The membership year shall be from October First to September Thirtieth following.

SECTION II. The superintendent or his faculty appointee shall be the official representative of the school, hereinafter called the REPRESENTATIVE, such appointment, if any, being made in writing to the secretary.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

SECTION I. There shall be a Board of Control, hereinafter called The Board, consisting of five representatives chosen by the League at the annual fall meeting for terms of three years each new member to be seated July 1 following their election, each year, the Board shall choose from its own number a President, and a Vice-President. A Secretary-Treasurer shall also be selected by the Board of Control who will serve at the pleasure of the Board.

SECTION II. The president, vice-president, and secretary-treasurer shall each exercise all the functions assigned to him by work or implication of the Constitution, By-Laws and Regulations of the League, or the Rules of the Board.

SECTION III. The Board is the League's executive body, subject only to restraint of the Constitution, By-Laws, and Regulations of the League. The Board shall determine the time and place of its own meetings and shall fill vacancies in its own ranks, to serve until the next regular meeting of the League. Three members shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION IV. When the Board is dealing with affairs in which one of its members or his school is specifically involved, the remaining members shall select a proxy to sit in his place.

ARTICLE V - REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

SECTION I. The time and place of the regular meetings of the Representatives shall be those of the High School Conference and of the North Dakota Education Association, the hours and rooms being designated by the Board.

SECTION II. Special meetings may be called by the Board, and must be called by the Secretary upon the written request of twenty Representatives.

SECTION III. The Representative Assembly shall have elect-oral and legislative function only.

SECTION IV. Twenty Representatives shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE VI - FINANCE

SECTION I. The Board shall determine what expenditures are necessary.

SECTION II. Each member school shall pay to the Treasurer annual dues according to the following schedule: Class A, \$10.00; Class B, \$7.50; Class C, \$5.00; Class D, \$2.00. Class A shall include all schools that are members of the East-West Conference. Class B shall include fully or minor accredited high schools. Class C shall include graded or consolidated schools. Class D shall include schools not having interscholastic contests, but desiring athletic insurance benefits.

SECTION III. Special assessments may be levied by a twothirds vote of the Representative Assembly.

ARTICLE VII — AMENDMENTS

The By-Laws and Regulations of the League may be amended by a majority vote of those present, at any regular meeting, provided this vote is 25% of all Representatives, and provided notice of the proposed Constitution-amendment with its substance, has been served at a previous session or has been served by letter from the Secretary at the request of another Representative and provided that there shall be a lapse of one month between the time of presentment and final vote thereon.

BY-LAWS GOVERNING RELATIONS OF SCHOOLS

ARTICLE I - MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. Application for membership and acknowledging allegiance to the League must be made by the superintendent of the school on the League's prescribed card-file form.

SECTION II. A school may be suspended or expelled by the Board for violation of League rules; and once expelled, may be reinstated only by action of the Board.

SECTION III. No school shall be admitted to the League during a school year in which it has as a non-member been represented in any interscholastic competition by a student who would have been ineligible under the rules of the League.

ARTICLE II — RESPONSIBILITY

The school's responsibility to the League rests upon the superintendent. Consistent with this obligation, and except as otherwise specified, his powers and duties may be delegated for execution to one or more members of the teaching staff of his high school as follows:

- a. Representative, who may hold office in the League, or speak and vote in its assembly.
 - b. Business managers, coaches, directors, chaperones, etc.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

SECTION I. When authorized by the President, the Secretary may submit by mail questions for discussion, but not for vote.

SECTION II. The Secretary shall keep an accurate and systematized record of membership, officials of the League, and contestants.

SECTION III. The Secretary shall have general charge of the Board's correspondence, and shall distribute their forms, information and inquiries to members.

SECTION IV. The Treasurer shall receive all funds belonging to the League, which he shall invest or pay out for League bills as directed by the Board and formally approved by the President.

SECTION V. The Treasurer shall keep a systematic and detailed record of all receipts and disbursements, with vouchers for the latter, and shall make a complete financial statement to the League at the Conference session, at which time his accounts shall be audited by a committee of three appointed by the President.

SECTION VI. The Treasurer shall furnish a bond for two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00), to be approved by the Board and paid for from League funds.

ARTICLE IV - RULE VIOLATIONS

SECTION I. All questions in dispute shall be referred to the Board and their decision shall be final.

SECTION II. For any violation of League rules, an offending student may be barred from participating in contests which come under the League jurisdiction; and an offending school may be suspended or expelled.

SECTION III. Any school making a protest against another (which protest must be in writing), shall submit a full statement of facts to the Secretary, who shall submit a copy to the superintendent of the accused school. Such protest shall be accompanied by a deposit of two dollars (\$2.00), which shall later be returned if the protest is sustained by the Board.

SECTION IV. A school against which a protest or any charge has been made shall have the privilege of presenting its case to the Board.

ARTICLE V - CONTESTS

SECTION I. Neither contest rules nor eligibility rules may be waived by common consent, and they must be fully observed by League members even the competing with non-members.

SECTION II. Final agreements for contests between two League members shall be incorporated into contracts on forms provided by the League. These contracts shall be executed by the Representatives of the respective schools and exchanged prior to the contest, and shall not be cancelled or altered except by mutual consent of the schools concerned.

SECTION III. No member of the League shall schedule or engage in any contest with a non-member which is eligible for membership in the League, under penaltty of suspension for the remainder of the year; nor shall it enter into any contest with an out-of-state school which is not similarly qualified in respect to its own state.

SECTION IV. No member of the League shall engage in any contest with a school whose membership has been suspended, during the period of such suspension.

SECTION V. At least one week prior to any contest between League schools, they must exchange eligibility lists made on the League's forms, in which the superintendent and the principal of the high school certify to the present eligibility of each contestant named and pledge the use of only those who remain eligible at the time of contest.

SECTION VI. In any contest whatsoever, except those among students in the same school no ineligible student shall be used; nor shall such student appear on the field in uniform or otherwise participate as a member of the contesting organization or group. Non-

member using contestants or less than eligible standards may not secure membership within the same year.

SECTION VII. Contesting schools shall each have present an authorized faculty member who shall be responsible to his school for the conduct of his participants and students, thruout the contest and the visiting team's stay away from home.

SECTION VIII. Athletic coaches who are not regularly employed by the board of education are prohibited.

SECTION IX. Students shall not serve as business managers to arrange or handle contests between schools.

SECTION X. High standards of courtesy, fair-dealing and sportsmanship must feature all League contests. The Board may rate schools or students in these respects, recognizing high attainment and penalizing low.

SECTION XI. The League disapproves of expensive awards from school to students for accomplishment in contests.

SECTION XII. The school must keep adequate records of contests and contestants, and all reports required by the Board shall be promptly and accurately supplied.

ARTICLE VI — ELIGIBILITY OF CONTESTANTS

SECTION I. A student shall have been in attendance as many school days as he missed at the opening semester, should his enrollment not have been made the first day of the semester.

SECTION II. He shall not compete for more than four seasons in any one branch of inter-high school contests, provided that competition while in the eighth grade or below, shall not constitute one of the four seasons.

SECTION III. He shall not have participated in a similar contest during the same school year as a member of any other than a high school team.

SECTION IV. He shall not have been at any time a member of a team representing an institution of higher rank than a secondary school.

SECTION V. He shall be doing passing work in at least fifteen hours per week, the passing grade to be computed from the opening of the semester and relate to such subjects only as severally have a credit value of one-half unit per semester.

Note: This means three subjects, each of which is equal a half credit a semester, on the basis of 16 credits for graduation. We may not add physical training and orchestra fractional credits together, for example.

SECTION VI. He shall not be a graduate of a four year high school course, not a graduate of a senior high school offering three courses comprehending the tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades. Neither shall he compete after having earned credits sufficient to meet the graduating requirements in any course of study prescribed by the school he is to represent unless such credits have been secured in less than eight semesters of school attendance.

SECTION VII. He shall not be over 20 years of age.

SECTION VIII. After attending the first semester of the ninth grade he shall have credit on the school records in the unit-per-year or half-unit-per-semester subjects of at least three half units earned and recorded at the close of the last semester in which he was enrolled as a student, 30 days or more attendance or participation in interscholastic competition within any shorter period being sufficient to constitute enrollment in any semester.

SECTION IX. He shall always have contested under his own name.

SECTION X. He shall have been in attendance in the school he represents for one semester upon transferring from another school, unless his parents have become residents of the school district to which he is transferred or the school from which he is transferred does not offer work of the corresponding year in which he is ranked; and in the instance of a pupil transferred from a public high school to any other high school in the same city or vice versa he shall not be eligible to represent the new high school in the same school year.

SECTION XI. He shall not use tobacco nor intoxicating liquors during the school terms of two semesters.

NOTE: This has not been cancelled but it has been taken from its position between No. 10 and No. 12 in the list of eligibility rules, and placed along with three other rules in the new High School League Recommended Standards of Eligibility, the entire administration of which, including penalties is left complete within the hands of each local school administration.

The Standards are these:

(a) Every athlete shall be given a thorough physical examination before the opening of the athletic season.

- (b) Parental consent shall be secured before the participation of any athlete.
- (c) Proof in advance shall establish the birthdate of every 9th semester student before participation.
- (d) Every student participating in interscholastic contests shall abstain from the use of tobacco and alcoholic beverages.

SECTION XII. No student shall participate in any interscholastic contest after his eighth semester in high school unless he is under 18 years of age; nor after his seventh semester if his seventh and eighth are not consecutive.

SECTION XIII. High schools with an enrollment of seventy five or less may compete in Class C Tournaments or may elect to compete in Class B.

Minutes of the Annual High School League Meeting

Thursday, Oct. 24, 4 P. M., Fargo, N. D.

The North Dakota State High School League met in regular session at 4 p. m. with President M. B. Zimmerman, presiding.

The minutes of the previous two sessions together with the financial report of the year's business was distributed to the member schools that were present. Inasmuch as the completed detailed minutes were printed in the annual year book, it was moved and seconded that this abridged report be accepted and that the minutes and financial report of the secretary be accepted.

President Zimmerman then called upon the secretary for a further report on league business. The secretary then briefly outlined the increace in the Athletic Accident Benefit Fund-coverages. All forms of protection had increased from 10 to 50 percent. Attention was called to the increase in six-man football coverages from 600 boys for 1945-46 to 1,000 boys at the present time. The increased number of schools buying complete coverages for their boys was also noted.

The secretary also reported on the potential membership of classified schools in the state and called the attention of the members to the fact that nearly 60 percent of the league membership comes from schools with a high school enrollment of less than 75 pupils. It was recommended that possibly the league should develop activities that would better serve the smaller schools of the league.

Upon motion of Supt. A. C. Van Wyk and second by G. J. Gludt, it was moved that a committee be appointed to study the possibility of better serving the small school in the league.

Motion by Supt. L. T. Havig of Williston and seconded by Supt. M. J. Peterson of Cando, an amendment was offered which specifically mentioned that this committee should consist of five members, three of whom should come from schools with enrollments of less than 75 and two from schools with enrollment over 75. This amendment was duly carried and adopted after which the original motion was carried.

Subsequently President Zimmerman made the following appointments to the above committee.

Supt. T. S. Grimsrud, Lisbon, Chairman.

Supt. E. L. Conroy, Scranton.

Supt. Glen Iverson, Donnybrook.

Supt. Frank Gurley, Tower City.

Supt. E. S. Killie, Fessenden.

Supt. C. J. Gludt of Killdeer, moved that the league go on record recommending to the Board of Control that a full time secretary be appointed as soon as the board found this step expedient and desirable. This motion was seconded by A. R. Kempf of Beach. After a short discussion the question was called for and the motion prevailed.

Supt. Zimmerman called for the report of the nominating committee, consisting of Supt. W. R. Stewart of Stanley, Wm. Gussner of Jamestown, E. C. Blackorby of New Rockford. The committee, thru Mr. Stewart of Stanley offered the names of Supt. Johnson of Kenmare and Supt. Roberts of Hettinger. Mr. Stewart explained in his report that their nominations were made to obtain representation from all districts and with the understanding that Supt. Abrahamson of Belfield would continue as secretary-treasurer of the Board of Control.

Nominations were called for from the floor. Upon motion of Gludt and seconded by T. E. Tryhus of Michigan, the nominations were closed and the secretary instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Supt. E. C. Johnson of Kenmare and Supt. John Roberts of Hettinger. The motion was carried.

There being no further business, upon motion of Supt. Ward of Valley City and several seconds, the meeting was adjourned.

MINUTES OF H. S. L. MEETING

The meeting of the State High School League was held in Woodworth Auditorium at the University, Grand Forks, May 2, 1947. Twenty-two schools were present at this meeting and a quorum was declared present for business. President Zimmerman suggested that the minutes of the previous League meeting be omitted unless some school called for them. There was no call for the minutes and they were omitted.

Mr. Phil Cory of the Minot City Schools faculty was called upon to discuss the plan of reorganization of the state music and declamation contests as advanced by the NW. and SW sections of the NDEA.

N. D. HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE

After discussion and questions addressed to Mr. Cory and a talk by Mr. Page of the University explaining the efforts of the University in conducting these contests over a period of years it was moved by Principal King of Minot and seconded by Totdahl of Crosby that a special committee be appointed by the president to study the problem and report at the annual league meeting next fall with recommendations to the member schools. The motion was unanimously carried.

Principal Tighe of Fargo then introduced the following motion: The Board of Control poll itself on the question of locating the State Final Class A tournament alternate years in the east and west part of the state and report the results of this poll at the annual League meeting next fall. The motion was seconded by Hewitt of Grand Forks and carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Reitan of Larimore and seconded by Jordahl of Lidgerwood that the meeting be adjourned. Motion prevailed.

Minutes Of The Board Of Control

\boldsymbol{A}

Fargo, October 23-24-25, 1946

The Board of Control met at intervals during the NDEA convention at Fargo, whenever it was found possible to get together during a busy convention weekend. All members except F. H. Gilliland were present.

The following items of business were transacted:

1. A number of controversial claims against the Athletic Benefit Fund were discussed. Several cases from Casselton which were presented after the period for presentment had elapsed and were ordered paid after a satisfactory explanation had been made by Supt. R. S. Bishop for the tardiness of the claims.

The claim of the Leeds boy as presented by Supt. Arveson was also ordered paid after it developed that this lad had broken his nose in a regular scheduled practice and the extent of the injury was not discovered until the 60 days had elapsed.

2. Two eligibility cases were studied and board rulings made sustaining the previous ruling and interpretation made by the secretary to the interested school. David Pease moved with his parents from Jamestown to Fargo about six weeks before the end of the 1945 school term. Finding it impossible to obtain the subjects in Sacred Heart Academy he entered Fargo Central H. S. and completed the school year. This fall he registers at Sacred Heart Academy. The question was raised as to when he would become eligible to represent Sacred Heart in Athletics. While the Board of Control was sympathetic to the reasons for his transfer and agreed that the transfer was made for good reasons other than for athletics, the rule permits only two reasons for transfer, namely; "a change in residence of the parents making the transfer necessary and secondly when a school no longer offers work in the year in which the lad is registered." Neither one of the above reasons appeared to make it necessary to transfer from Central High to Sacred Heart. Hence the board agreed that he would have to attend Sacred Heart for one semester before becoming eligible.

A Minot lad moves with his parents from the central part of the city to the northwest part of the city where he is nearer to the college high school. For convenience he elects this fall to attend the college high school rather than the Central high school. The board interpreted this case also as one of transfer inasmuch as the family had merely changed residences within the geographical boundaries of the district. He was still a resident of the Minot school district and therefore entitled to all the privileges of his Central high school. To make special cases of residential changes within the boundaries of any district could cause an endless number of eligibility cases arising from similar cases within, not only Minot but other cities where college high schools, parochial schools, and the public high school exist within the confines of a district. Any such change or transfer must be considered as a transfer under the rule 10 and the boy involved must attend a semester before becoming eligible to represent his new school.

- 3. The petition of Crosby and Ambrose to be transferred from District 15 to District 16 was carefully reviewed by the board. It was the opinion of the board that this petition should not be granted at this time. It is quite possible that some redistricting will have to be done within the next year or two and it is doubtful whether a transfer at this time would be of any benefit to the two districts involved.
- 4. The applications of KLPM and WDAY for certain broadcast rights to the coming basketball tournaments were read and some time was spent with a committee from WDAY as to the possibility of broadcasting portions of the East Tournament at Fargo in March. Final action was deferred on these requests and the matter was tabled to be brought up for final action at the Valley City meeting of the Board at the coaches clinic during Thanksgiving Week.
- 5. Sometime was devoted to the question of trophies for the tournaments in basketball. Since the number of tournaments has been increased and the cost also increased it was agreed to make the following awards:

At each of the East tournaments and each of the West tournaments there shall be a first and a second place trophy—a total of eight trophies.

At the final State Class A and Final Class B tournaments, four trophies are to be awarded or a total of eight trophies (16 in all).

Gold basketballs to the first place final players and coach (22 balls).

Silver basketballs to the second place final players and coach (22 balls).

A suitable participation award for the third and fourth place teams of the state Class A tournament (22 awards).

A suitable participation award for the third, fourth, fifth, and sixth team players in the state final Class B tournament (44 awards).

It was agreed to purchase trophies for basketball and track at the Valley City meeting. Interested companies were informed as to our wants and the time of the buying. It was also agreed to buy the trophies in track at the same time. Track trophies will remain the same as last year and include trophies for the first four schools in the state meet (4 trophies).

Trophies to first and second place at the eight districts (16 trophies).

Participation awards for each of the 13 events at the state meet (4 places).

Two school relay trophies.

Golf and tennis awards for singles and doubles.

District awards, first, second, and third places for each of the 13 events.

No awards for golf and tennis at the district.

- 6. Pairing of teams for the Class B event at Minot were again discussed and it was agreed that team three of the West should play team two of the East and that team three of the East should meet team two of the West on Thursday night's play. Team one of each division to play the winner of said games 2 and 3 of the opposite division.
- 7. It was agreed that the state track meet be again held at Valley City, the exact date to be decided at the Valley City meeting.
- 8. It was agreed to again send seven men at board expense to Valley City clinic. They were in turn to return to their areas and conduct clinics on rules and coaching. The following men were selected and the secretary instructed to notify them of their appointment.

Harry Bridgeford of Fargo. Willard Solberg of Hettinger. Harry Weinbergen of Dickinson. Earl Hoffman of Grand Forks. Reuben Hammond of Minot.

9. It was agreed that we would try to obtain the following men to act as referees at one or more of the state sponsored basketball tournaments.

Norris Sando of Grafton. Earl Hoffman of Grand Forks. Reuben Hammond of Minot. Harry Bridgeford of Fargo. Bernard White of Grand Forks. Ervin Huss of Bismarck. Henry Rice of Fargo.

While it was agreed to leave the assignments for the respective tournaments open at this time the secretary was instructed to contact Bridgeford and Hoffman for the A tourney at Bismarck on March 6-7 and Hammond and Huss for the Fargo tournament on the same dates. The other assignments were to be made at the Valley City meeting.

- 10. The question of sending a representative to the National Federation meeting to be held at St. Petersburg, Florida, on Jan. 8 to 11, 1947, was discussed and because of the great distance and high cost it was decided to send no delegate this year.
- 11. Whereas E. C. Johnson was duly elected to the board of Control, Earl Abrahamson offered his resignation to the board in order that Mr. Johnson might be appointed at once and immediately function as a board member. This resignation was duly accepted and Mr. Johnson was appointed to fill the unexpired term and to take office at once rather than July first, 1947.
- 12. Upon motion Earl Abrahamson was named secretary-treasurer of the Board at an annual salary of \$1,500 per annum.
- 13. The use of a 16mm movie projector was discussed as a means of additional service to the league. While it was recognized that it would be rather difficult for a part time secretary to do much work in the field at the present time. It was agreed to purchase a reconditioned projector if one could be found at a reasonable price with a view of later buying a new one if conditions made its use desirable and expedient.
- 14. Some time was spent discussing the feasibility of increasing the AABF to include group coverage of all high school and even grade school pupils. Some attention was also given to the need for setting up a separate class of fees for gymnasium or tumbling classes inasmuch as this type of instruction carries a greater hazard than the usual physical education class. No action was taken and this item of business was left for a later meeting of the board.
- 15. There being no further urgent business the Board adjourned to meet at the Coaches Clinic at Valley City on Friday, November 29, 1946.

Minutes Of The Board Of Control B

VALLEY CITY, NOVEMBER 29, 30, 1946

The Board of Control of the High School League met at the Rudolph Hotel, Valley City, November 29th and 30th. Mr. VanWyk was absent.

The special Committee on "Small Schools" consisting of T. S. Grimsrud, Lisbon; E. S. Killie, Fesenden; E. L. Conroy, Scranton; Glen Iverson, Donnybrook; Frank Gurley, Tower City, met with the board to discuss plans for a "C" tournament.

Upon motion by Roberts and seconded by Gilliland the Board of Control voted to sponsor a "C" tournament in 1948. The Committee was instructed to proceed with plans and to bring in recommendations to the board.

Supt. M. S. Ward of Valley City was appointed manager of the State Track Meet to be held in Valley City on May 31, 1947.

Upon motion of Gilliland and seconded by Johnson the following stations were authorized to broadcast the tournaments:—

KDLR—Devils Lake Tournament
KOBC—Valley City————The Devils Lake Tournament
KLPM—Minot————The Dickinson Tournament
The Minot Finals Class B

KFYR—Bismarck_Bismarck West Tournament and Finals WDAY—Fargo_____Bismarck Finals and Fargo Tourney

It was also agreed that Grand Forks could cover the games in which Grand Forks played. It was also agreed that KLPM was authorized to feed games to other members of the Mutual hookup that are interested.

The locations of the rules clinics were discussed and while the opinion of the board was that local conditions might make it necessary to change locations, the following places were recommended for clinics:— Grand Forks, Devils Dake, Bottineau, Minot, Grenora, Williston, Dickinson, Bismarck, Bowman, Mott, LaMoure, and Fargo.

The possibility of purchasing copies of the Basketball film was: discussed but no action was taken at this time.

The eligibility of Leo Goetz of Minot Model High School was discussed at some length. Leo Goetz is a senior at Minot Model

High School entering this high school during summer school and remaining there at the opening of the regular fall term. The parents were residents of Anamoose. About a month after school opened the parents moved to Martin. Martin maintains a four year high school. No evidence was presented which would indicate that this lad attempted to enroll at either his home high school, Anamoose, or to his new home high school, Martin. It was the opinion of the board that Leo Goetz was a transfer student and as such must attend the Model High School in Minot, for a period of one semester before becoming eligible.

The eligibility case of Eugene Klaba of Sharon was also discussed and the lad declared ineligible for a period of one semester on the grounds that he was a transfer student.

Eugene Klaba, a former Fargo H. S. Student, whose parents now reside near Detroit Lakes, Minnesota registered at Sharon High School where he lives with grand parents. It was the board opinion that Eugene could have attended his home high school in Detroit Lakes or could have continued to attend Fargo but found it more convenient to attend Sharon. Hence he must be classed as a transfer pupil and be ineligible for the period of a semester.

All individual awards for the district track meets, 13 events, places the same as in 1946.

Officials for the state tournaments were selected as per the following list. It was agreed to set the fees at \$100 plus expenses at the qualifying tournaments and \$75.00 plus expenses at the state finals.

Minutes Of The Board Of Control

MINOT, MARCH 21, 22, 1947

The Board of Control of the North Dakota State High School League met on Friday and Saturday at 10 A. M. in the parlors of the Leland Parker Hotel with all members of the board present.

Communications were acknowledged as follows:

Bismarck Chamber of Commerce extending an invitation to hold the West Class A Divisional and the Finals Class A Basketball Tournaments in Bismarck, in 1948.

Fargo Chamber of Commerce extending an invitation to hold the East Class A and the Class A finals at Fargo, in 1948.

Minot Chamber of Commerce to hold the Final Class B Tournament in Minot, in 1948.

Devils Lake Chamber of Commerce to hold the East Class B Tournament in Devils Lake, in 1948.

Dickinson Chamber of Commerce to hold the West Class B Tournament there in 1948.

An agenda had been prepared by the secretary for the boards consideration at this meeting.

Following were the actions of the board on the agenda and other matters of importance.

- 1. Several pending Athletic Benefit Claims including those of Parshall, Linton, Carrington, were processed. In all instances these claims did not correspond with the regular conditions prescribed to be eligible for benefits. It was moved and seconded that inasmuch as these were irregular claims against the fund they should not be allowed. Motion carried.
- 2. The question of granting returning veterans preference as far as the rules were concerned for 1947-48 school term was discussed and it was the opinion of the board that there was no longer any reason to grant these special privileges. Upon motion it was agreed to reinstate all requirements for returning veterans who chose to return to high school and compete in interscholastic athletics.
- 3. The question of Personal Liability insurance for future tournaments was tabled until competent legal advice could be ob-

tained as to the liability of the league for accidents which may occur at a tournament sponsored by the league.

- 4. The question of additional penalties for Dunseith and Fairmount, who had played boys that were later declared ineligible by the board, was discussed and it was agreed that the cases should receive publicity in the News Letter and the penalty of forfeiture of all games in which these boys participated and their ineligibility for the balance of the basketball season should stand. It appeared to the board that there was no evidence of willful intent to violate the rules in either case.
- 5. Some time was spent in discussing HR1060 which would "exempt from admissions tax admissions to activities of elementary and secondary schools." The National Federation had previously urged state associations to support this legislation and many of them have done so. It was the opinion of the Board of Control that it was not consistent for us to seek federal school aid, reduction of personal income tax and at the same time ask for reduction of the federal tax on admissions for school affairs. The secretary, upon motion, was instructed to inform the Federation of State Athletic Associations that North Dakota was opposed to a reduction of this tax at this time and also send copies of this letter to the Congressmen from North Dakota. The motion prevailed.
- 6. Considerable time and thot was given to the recommendations made by the coaches at the East-West Conference meeting in Bismarck at the A tourney. All angles pro and con were considered and the welfare of the entire league membership was uppermost in the mind of the board.

It was agreed that the Javelin event in track be reinstated in 1948, as one of the thirteen events.

It was further agreed that the Pentathlon be discontinued as a track event counted toward total points in 1948.

It was further moved, seconded and carried, that no points be given for the relays this year inasmuch as relay trophies have been provided for these events.

It was further agreed that no appropriation would be made to reimburse state track participants for any part of their expenses this year.

The recommendation that each school be given seventeen passes to the state Class A was tabled.

The matter of distribution of the profits of the East A and West A Tournaments to the competing schools was tabled.

- 7. The Board of Control went on record as opposing High School Athletic contests played on a Sunday.
- 8. Jerry Moriarty of Sacred Heart Academy voluntarily reported that two of his high school boys who were ineligible had, without his knowledge, participated in a hockey game with Fargo High School. He further stated that he was willing to abide by the decisions of the board in this matter. The secretary was instructed to reprimand the school for its violation and otherwise administer the penalty meted out to schools under similar circumstances.
- 9. The secretary read a letter from Mr. T. R. Thordarson, Director of the Department of Correspondence Study at the A. C. Fargo, extending the facilities of the department for the storage and distribution of 16mm films appertaining to the various forms of athletics. The secretary was instructed to contact Mr. Thordarson and arrange with him for the purchase, storage and distribution of such films as would be of benefit to the league membership. Upon motion it was agreed that a new projector be purchased rather than the used machine authorized at the previous meeting of the board.
- 10. Upon motion it was agreed to purchase basketballs from the Northern School Supply Company of Fargo and the Colborn School Supply Company of Grand Forks under the same terms as this year and with the same distribution plan as was used this year.
- 11. The fees for the managers of the state sponsored tournaments conducted this year was set at a net of \$100.00.
- 12. The board then proceeded to set the dates and places of the various track meets sponsored by the Board of Control. The State track meets had previously been set for May 31st. Thru custom the district track meets come the week before the State meet. The following centers were selected and managers appointed:

- 13. Upon motion by Johnson and seconded by Gilliland it was agreed that next year's final state Class B tournament should consist of the first, second, third and consolation winner of the two state divisional tournaments.
- 14. The special committee on C tournament, consisting of T. S. Grimsrud, E. S. Killie, Frank Gurley, E. L. Conroy, Glen Iverson met with the board and reported their progress and the results of their

survey. It appeared that there would be a demand for such a tournament and the committee was instructed to proceed with definite plans of redistricting the present Class B schools and the creation of new Class C Districts.

- 15. Mr. Harry Welliver of the Minot State Teachers College Music Department met with the board to submit a plan whereby a new arrangement for the conduction of state and district music contests would be held under the general direction of the board of control. Since one of the main items of business at the High School Conference was to be the discussion of extra-cirricular affairs it was agreed that this matter be deferred until that time when the University would also have an opportunity of expressing their views on the matter. Certain difficulties in the realization of the plan submitted by Mr. Welliver were discussed. It was agreed to publish his proposed plan in the next News Letter in order that the members of the league could study it before the conference meeting.
- 16. Moved by Van Wyk and seconded by Gilliland that the East-West elimination State games be set for March 4, 5, 6, 1948, and that the state finals be set for March 12, 13, 1948. Motion carried.
- 17. Motion made by Johnson and seconded by Roberts that the state Class B finals be held on March 18, 19, 20, 1948. Motion carried.
- 18. Motion made by Johnson and seconded by Gilliland that the State Class B finals be held in Minot in 1948. Motion carried.
- 19. Motion by Roberts and seconded by Van Wyk that the Divisional Class B tournaments be held in Devils Lake and Dickinson as they were this year. Motion carried.
- 20. Motion by Gilliland and seconded by Roberts that the Divisional Class A tourneys be held in Fargo and Bismarck as they were this year. Motion carried.
- 21. Motion by Van Wyk and seconded by Roberts that the Class A Final Tourney be held in Bismarck. President asked the secretary to call the roll on this motion. Upon roll call Gilliland voted no, Van Wyk, yes; Johnson, yes; Roberts, yes; Zimmerman, no. The motion was declared carried by a 3-2 vote.
- 22. The secretary was authorized to attend the summer conference of state secretary in Oregon in July.
- 23. It was agreed to meet at the High School Conference in Grand Forks on April 30th, May 1, 2.
 - 24. Upon motion the meeting adjourned.

Minutes Of The Board Of Control D

GRAND FORKS, MAY 1, 2, 1947

The Board of Control of the High School League met in the parlors of the Ryan Hotel whenever it was possible to get together during the busy High School Conference and Building Clinic session. All board members were present.

A large number of matters pertaining to the League were discussed and while some items were deferred until a later meeting, the following resume gives the matters of business that were given final action.

- 1. The request of Coach Mack of Mandan to revive the International Track meet between athletes from Saskatechewan, Canada, and track athletes from North Dakota during the summer months was thoroughly discussed. Some considerable time was spent in discussing the National Federation action concerning post season and All-Star Contests and also the action of other states wherein they now refuse sanction of such contests. After due deliberation it was moved by Van Wyk and seconded by Roberts that in view of the present action of the National Federation that North Dakota could not approve or sanction such an All-Star appearance of Track athletes at an International Meet. The motion prevailed.
- 2. The purchase of the Payne Record book for distribution to member schools for the coming school year received attention from the board and it was decided to make no general distribution for next year but for the secretary to furnish the book where members requested it.
- 3. The question of League members relation with schools which are eligible for League membership but who refuse or neglect to join the League was discussed at some length and it was agreed that no member school of the League may have any relation whatsoever with a school which is eligible for membership but refuses to do so. It was understood that this motion referred particularly to the smaller consolidated school that neglects to join the high school League. Further that the motion referred to all activities sponsored by the League whether athletic or otherwise.
- 4. The secretary was instructed to invest \$10,000 of the League surplus in Government Bonds.
- 5. The question as to the amount of money to spend for building a 16mm film library was discussed and it was the opinion of

the board that from \$750 to \$1,000 should be allocated for this purpose. The secretary also reported on correspondence with Mr. Thordarson of the AC regarding the storage and distribution of films at the AC in Fargo and that all bookings and charges be made through this department.

- 6. The matter of providing trophies for certain conferences was discussed and it was agreed that this practice should be discontinued inasmuch as the promotion of such affairs were conference affairs and that certain conferences received this courtesy and attention from the Board while the same courtesies were not extended to others.
- 7. A number of schools participating in the state tournaments during the past year had filed letters with the secretary stating that the expense allowance authorized by the Board of Control was not sufficient to cover their necessary expenses at these tourneys. Upon motion by Roberts and seconded by Johnson it was agreed to allow each visiting team the sum of \$20 for each tournament and each home team the total sum of \$20.00 to take care of incidental expenses incurred at the state tournaments sponsored by the board.
- 8. A letter from Bernard Busse and Bernard White, who referred the Dickinson Class B tournament was presented by the secretary. This letter pointed out that these officials worked all consolation games at no extra pay while other tournaments added help was provided for consolation games. Upon motion by Johnson and seconded by Roberts it was agreed to pay them an additional \$20.00 for their services.
- 9. The board next proceeded to organize itself for the coming fiscal year. With Mr. Roberts presiding. Van Wyk moved the selection of Zimmerman for President of the Board of Control. Upon second by Johnson the motion was carried. It was then moved by Johnson and seconded by Van Wyk that Roberts be named Vicepresident. This motion prevailed. Upon motion by Van Wyk and seconded by Johnson, Abrahamson was named Secretary-Treasurer.
- 10. The application of Aberdeen High School for sanction of an invitational Basketball Tournament during the Christmas holidays where four North Dakota teams would be invited to participate was approved.
- 11. The Beach case concerning the question when the first semester should officially end for a boy whose eligibility ends with the first semester was reviewed. It was again the majority opinion of the board that eligibility for the first semester should terminate at 4 P. M. or whatever hour school officially closes.

- 12. Some time was spent discussing possible officials for the 1948 basketball tournaments. While it was impossible to definitely assign officials at this time it was agreed that the following men should be invited to officiate one or more tourneys during the coming year. Hammond and Busse were recommended for the state Class B finals at Minot. Hoffman and White of Grand Forks were elected but unassigned. Omach of Dilworth and McCain of Fargowere also elected but unassigned.
- 13. The Special class C committee met with the board of control and presented several possible plans for the "C" districts for the coming basketball season. After considerable discussion it was moved by Gilliland and seconded by Roberts that we adopt the eight district plan. Motion carried. In brief the following will describe the districts and list the schools which to date have indicated that they will play class C ball next year. It is quite possible that others will later join these schools. In most instances the districts cover entire counties but a few exceptions are noted.

District No. 1-

Covers Dickey, Sargent, Ransom, Richland, Barnes, Cass Counties. Schools listed at the present time are: Abercrombie, Christine, Cogswell, Guelph, Courtenay, Page, Tower City, Walcott.

District No. 2-

Griggs, Steel, Trail, Nelson, Grand Forks, Walsh, Pembina, Cavalier Counties. Schools: Caledonia, Aneta, Pekin, Thompson, Emerado, Forest River, Fordville, Gardar, Hamilton, Neche, Hannah. Hampden.

District No. 3-

Covers Bottineau, (Except Lansford School), Rolette, Towner, Ramsey, Benson, Pierce, McHenry, (Also Sheyenne school from Eddy Co.). Schools: St. John, Souris, Willow City, Granville, Karlshrue, Balta, Esmond, Minnewaukan, Fort Totten, Lawton, Starkweather, Sheyenne.

District No. 4-

Covers Sheridan, Wells, Eddy, Foster, Burleigh, Kidder, Stutsman, Emmons, Logan, LaMoure, McIntosh Counties. Schools Kief., Regan, Hurdsfield, Bowdon, Cathay, Goodrich, Pingree, Martin.

District No. 5-

Covers Slope, Hettinger, Grant, Bowman, Adams, Sioux, part of Morton County. Schools Marmarth, Rhame, Scranton, Reeder, Haynes, New Leipzig, Leith, Carson.

Listrict No. 6-

Covers Golden Valley, Billings, Stark, Dunn, Mercer, Oliver, part

of Morton counties. Schools Halliday, Taylor, Leifur, Golden Valley, Dodge, Golva.

District No. 7-

Covers Burke, Renville, Ward, McLean Counties. Towns Carplo, Des Lacs, Donnybrook, Powers Lake, Lignite, Portal. Northgate, Sherwood, Lansford, Glenburn, Tolley.

District No. 8-

Counties of Divide, Williams, McKenzie, Mountrall. Schools Ambrose, Wildrose, McGregor, Palermo, Arnegaard, Tioga, Wheelock.

- 14. It was agreed that Committees were to be set up to have charge of the different districts and that Mr. Iverson should be made chairman of the 7th District Committee and Mr. Gurley of the first district committee. The other members of the committees were to be recommended by the present committee.
- 15. It was moved by Gilliland and seconded by Johnson that December 15th be set as the deadline for C Schools to elect whether they wished to play C or Class B basketball.
- 16. It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Roberts that the revision of the present B set up be deferred until the July meeting of the board of control. Motion carried.
- 17. Mr. Gilliland invited the Board of Control to hold their summer meeting in Devils Lake. This invitation was accepted and it was agreed to hold this meeting the week following the fourth of July or as soon thereafter as possible.
- 18. It was also agreed that the C committee should be invited to meet with us at that time.
- 19. The question of baseball coverage in the AABF during the summer months was discussed and it was agreed that this coverage would be extended over the summer months on the condition that baseball was a summer school activity promoted and sponsored by the school and supervised by school personnel.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned with the understanding that all unfinished business be deferred until the summer meeting at Devils Lake.

We had a very nice day for the Meet, as you know, with only a slight wind for interference. Two records were broken. The track was in excellent shape. The Meet was run off on schedule and finished just a little ahead of time. I have heard of no dissatisfaction of any kind.

The commercial club took care of all the boys from a distance who needed rooms the night before. The Athletic Club furnished the luncheon for the coaches at noon. The Kiwanis Club furnished the banquet in the evening for all participants, officials, etc. At this time the medals and trophies were awarded. All the trophies were received at that time and most of the medals. The medals that were not awarded that evening because of the absence of the recipients have been forwarded them by mail.

All items of expense have been taken care of by our Board of Education with the single exception of the programs, 1,000 in number, the bill for which I believe the Times-Record has forwarded to you.

You will notice that the official record is a little different from the record as published in the press the following day. That is because the press scorer did not count the Pentathlon. Counting the pentathlon points made a little change in the final placement of teams. It brought Fargo up to fourth place ahead of Williston, and lifted Grand Forks to the sixth place. I believe next year you intend to omit the pentathlon and include the javelin.

In each case where there were ties, we flipped a coin or drew from a hat, and awarded the medals after that fashion. Conyne of Bismarck and Feininger of Dickinson tied in total number of points. Feininger won the toss. So all medals were distributed even in case of ties. It was a great pleasure to manage this Track Meet and we shall be glad to do so another year, if your Board so decides. If there is any other information you should like, which I may have omitted from this report, please so advise me.

Report of the Secretary-Treasurer of the North Dakota High School League

Your secretary-treasurer is pleased to render the following report on the League activities during the past year.

The League membership has remained at a rather stable figure of 270 schools despite the increase of membership dues. This is one more school than listed last year.

All fully accredited schools except Notre Dame Academy of Willow City were members of the League during 1946-47.

All minor accredited schools, except Christine, Courtenay, Fullerton, Kathryn, Kloten, Lawton, Mapleton, Palermo, Pekin, Surrey, Sutton, Thompson, White Earth, Wing, St. James of New Rockford, and St. Marys of Richardton were members of the League.

Twenty-seven consolidated and graded schools doing high school work joined the League. Some of these did not engage in any athletic program with other schools but joined to obtain insurance benefits and to receive the League publications.

With the advent of the 1947-48 school year it will be necessary for all accredited schools to become members of the League if they wish to participate in interscholastic relations with other member schools. It is suggested that member schools check carefully the list of member schools appearing in the directory section of this handbook before scheduling interschool contests for the coming year. All schools listed in this directory are members in good standing until September 30th, 1947. According to the League constitution memberships expire on September 30th and must be renewed before January first, and before December first to avoid a penalty.

The following summary will briefly describe the chief changes and accomplishments made by the League during the past year.

1. The Athletic Accident and Benefit Fund has been extended to include baseball as a special sport. This coverage ends with the closing of the school except in those cases where the school employs a coach or a recreational director and the summer athletic program is extended over the summer under the direction and supervision of the school. It is not the intention of the Board of Control that summer programs such as Junior Legion Baseball or other recreational programs sponsored by other than school organizations shall be covered by the AABF. AABF coverage now includes football,

6-man football, basketball, track, physical education, hockey, and baseball. The coverage also includes girls as well as boys in physical education classes and in basketball where basketball is played under approved girls rules. At the present time boys and girls in both senior and junior high school are covered. The Board of Control is at present considering further revisions of the fund and possibly will be able to offer additional features of the plan by the opening of the fall school term.

Interested schools are urged to carefully examine the various tables explaining the payments from the FUND during the past year. One table classifies the injuries according to the different sports and shows the injuries occuring in each sport. Another table indicates the payments made to the different schools. A third table summarizes all information concerning each claim. Our AABF has had a steady growth and membership in 1946-47 and is more than 150% greater than the previous year. Claims are correspondingly greater. Basketball and physical education still continue to pay their way. Football is a losing proposition. As a whole the income is still sufficient to break even. As in former years no administration charge has been made against the fund. A comparison of benefit schedules of private companies and protection charge made in the different sports should make it quite evident that no other state or company gives more for the small fee charged than is obtained under our league plan. No school or pupil can afford to take the chance of assuming the risk for the small fee of twentyfive cents for physical education, fifty cents for basketball or the dollar charged for football protection.

- 2. During the war years and the year immediately following certain concessions in eligibility rulse were made to returning exservice men who enrolled in high school to take up where they left off. In harmony with the action taken in many other states the Board of Control now feels that the war emergency is over and beginning with the 1947-48 school term, returning veterans must conform to all eligibility rules the same as any other regular high school student. Hence beginning with the fall term all eligibility rules of the League are in full effect and force.
- 3. In order to better serve the member schools, the Board of Control has authorized the purchase of up to \$1,000 of athletic films to be made available for member schools. The library will include such films as FOOTBALL BY THE CODE, the new Federation sponsored film produced in cooperation with the Wilson Sporting Goods Company and General Mills, and its companion film, BASKETBALL BY THE CODE. Three prints of these films will be available at a small rental fee from the Department of Correspondence Study at the AC in Fargo. It is also planned to purchase

copies of the Erpi Instructional films in the different forms of athletics and also a few copies of the Coronet Films. Complete announcements concerning the distribution of all League owned films will be made in the September News-Letter.

- 4. The Board of Control, thru a special committee, is developing plans for a "C" Tournament for all member schools with enrollment under 75. This plan will necessitate a redistricting of class B schools. It is planned to have the details arranged by next fall and in plenty of time to make the necessary announcements thru the League News-Letter. The present East-West division for Class A and Class B tournaments will be continued on a trial basis for another year or until such time as someone developes a better plan. No doubt many members feel that there is too much and too many tournaments on conflicting dates. Ours is a democratic organization and any League member who has a simplified plan may be assured that his suggestions are welcome.
- 5. In track certain changes have been authorized for the coming school year. The Javelin will be reinstated in the 1948 track meets as one of the thirteen events and the pentathlon will be eliminated in totaling points to determine the school winner. If the membership wish, no doubt the Board will agree to keep the pentathlon as an event for competition purposes.
- 6. An interest has developed in the revision of the present high school music contest so that more pupils and schools may participate without travelling too great distances for this competition. A special committee is working out detailed plans to submit to the League at the fall meeting. A careful reading of the Constitution of the League indicates that the original idea of the founders of the organization was to include all kinds of inter-school activities and not athletics alone. Too often the League is spoken of as a basketball or a football League. Most states have direct charge of all activities between schools and include music, declamation, debate, etc. Possibly the time is not far distant when North Dakota should exercise more jurisdiction in these activities.
- 7. Financially the League has had the best year in its history. The increased number of tournaments with capacity crowds, the increased income from dues have combined to raise receipts to an all time high. The audit report included with this yearbook gives a detailed report of finances and is presented for your approval. Receipts and expenditures have been classified in sufficient detail to give the observer a fair picture of the finances of the League. May your treasurer again repeat the observation made in previous year-books—while the finances of the League are in a healthy condition safely protected under bond and an appreciable surplus invested in

government bonds, it is not hoarding any unusual amount of money. The present srplus could be wiped out in a short time with a few lean years that are eventally sure to come to North Dakota. The expanding services of the League make it necessary to carry a substantial surplus. The time will come when the League must own its own office quarters, invest in office furniture and equipment, employ a full time secretary with ample clerical help. Our League is growing up and must no longer be considered a small business to be administered when other work is done and the spirit moves.

In planning for the bigger and better H. S. League to come, a few observations on the part of your secretary-treasurer may not be amiss. If the League is to be an up to date organization, a special committee on Constitution and By-Laws should be appointed to revise our present constitution and make such changes as will make it better fit the needs of modern times.

The eligibility rules should be carefully checked and new eligibility rules should be inserted governing such problems as post-season and all star contests, amateur standing of the high school athlete, acceptance of awards for athletic competition. Possibly some control should be exercised over schools which schedule twenty five or thirty basketball games in a season or play two or more football games within a week or play football without the proper protection. The National Federation has an agreement with organized baseball to prevent the signing of high school athletes before they have completed high school. Some of these matters should be incorporated into the by-laws rather than be controlled by Board action.

The attitude of the League toward girls athletics should also be clarified and in some instances erroneous impressions should be corrected. Our League or the National Federation is not opposed to girls athletics nor is there anything in our constitution that would prevent a member school from playing girls basketball. The League and also the National Federation do not approve of interscholastic basketball for girls for what they believe to be good and valid reasons. The League does endorse wholesome sports, under direction, for girls on an intramural basis. Many states organize a girls athletic association under the direction of the League and this might well be considered in this state with a view of so controlling and supervising this sport that all activities may be to the welfare of the participating girl.

Some attention might well be directed toward a more general control of all extra-curricular activities with a view of coordinating the different departments, and placing the proper emphasis on each activity.

Much has been accomplished in the League, but much more remains to be done. How many times we have heard of a system of rating officials, a summer coaching school for officials, an organization of registered and approved officials? Are there other sport activities that could and should be promoted on an interschool basis? These are questions the League must answer as time goes

It has been a pleasure to serve you again during the present year. Your criticisms and suggestions are welcome. Your cooperation is appreciated. At times the work is exceedingly heavy and your patience in those times is more than welcome. To better serve you and the other members of the League has been the first consideration of the Board and your secretary.
