Constitution of N. D. H. S. L.

ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as the NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE, hereinafter called the LEAGUE.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of the League shall be to promote, directly or indirectly, all desirable kinds of inter-high school contests, to hold them to the highest standards, and to make them serve the interests of the member schools.

SECTION I. Any accredited High School, Graded or Consolidated School, so classified by the State Department of Public Instruction may become a member of the League by acknowledging allegiance to it's authority and paying the annual dues. The membership year shall be from October First to September Thirtieth following.

SECTION II. The superintendent or his faculty appointee shall be the official representative of the school, hereinafter called the REPRESENTATIVE, such appointment, if any, being made in writing to the secretary.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

SECTION I. There shall be a Board of Control, hereinafter called The Board, consisting of five representatives chosen by the League at the annual fall meeting for terms of three years each new member to be seated July 1 following their election, each year, the Board shall choose from its own number a President, and a Vice-President. A Secretary-Treasurer shall also be selected by the Board of Control who will serve at the pleasure of the Board.

SECTION II. The president, vice-president, and secretary-treasurer shall each exercise all the functions assigned to him by work or implication of the Constitution, By-Laws and Regulations of the League, or the Rules of the Board.

SECTION III. The Board is the League's executive body, subject only to restraint of the Constitution, By-Laws, and Regulations of the League. The Board shall determine the time and place of is own meetings and shall fill vacancies in its own ranks, to serve until the next regular meeting of the League. Three members shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION IV. When the Board is dealing with affairs in which one of its members or his school is specifically involved, the remaining members shall select a proxy to sit in his place.

ARTICLE V — REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

SECTION 1. The time and place of the regular meetings of the Representatives shall be those of the High School Conference and of the North Dakota Education Association, the hours and rooms being designated by the Board.

SECTION II. Special meetings may be called by the Board, and must be called by the Secretary upon the written request of twenty Representatives.

SECTION III. The Representative Assembly shall have electoral and legislative function only.

SECTION IV. Twenty Representatives shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE VI - FINANCE

SECTION I. The Board shall determine what expenditures are necessary.

SECTION II. Each member school shall pay to the Treasurer annual dues according to the following schedule: Class A, \$10.00; Class B, \$7.50; Class C, \$5.00; Class D, \$2.00. Class A shall include all schools that are members of the East-West Conference. Class B shall include fully or minor accredited high schools. Class C shall include graded or consolidated schools. Class D shall include schools not having interscholastic contests, but desiring athletic insurance benefits.

SECTION III. Special assessments may be levied by a twothirds vote of the Representative Assembly.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

The By-Laws and Regulations of the League may be amended by a majority vote of those present, at any regular meeting, provided this vote is 25% of all Representatives, and provided notice of the proposed Constitution-amendment with its substance, has been served at a previous session or has been served by letter from the Secretary at the requet of another Representative and provided that there shall be a lapse of one month between the time of presentment and final vote thereon.

BY-LAWS GOVERNING RELATIONS OF SCHOOLS

ARTICLE I — MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. Application for membership and acknowledging allegiance to the League must be made by the superintendent of the school on the League's prescribed card-file form.

SECTION II. A school may be suspended or expelled by the Board for violation of League rules; and once expelled, may be reinstated only by action of the Board.

SECTION III. No school shall be admitted to the League during a school year in which it has as a non-member been represented in any interscholastic competition by a student who would have been ineligible under the rules of the League.

ARTICLE II — RESPONSIBILITY

The school's responsibility to the League rests upon the superintendent. Consistent with this obligation, and except as otherwise specified, his powers and duties may be delegated for execution to one or more members of the teaching staff of his high school as follows:

- a. Representative, who may hold office in the League, or speak and vote in its assembly.
 - b. Business managers, coaches, directors, chaperones, etc.

ARTICLE III — OFFICERS

SECTION I. When authorized by the President, the Secretary may submit by mail questions for discussion, but not for vote.

SECTION II. The Secretary shall keep an accurate and systematized record of membership, officials of the League, and contestants.

SECTION III. The Secretary shall have general charge of the Board's correspondence, and shall distribute their forms, information and inquiries to members.

SECTION IV. The Treasurer shall receive all funds belonging to the League, which he shall invest or pay out for League bills as directed by the Board and formally approved by the President.

SECTION V. The Treasurer shall keep a systematic and detailed record of all receipts and disbursements, with vouchers for the latter, and shall make a complete financial statement to the League at the Conference session, at which time his accounts shall be audited by a committee of three appointed by the President.

SECTION VI. The Treasurer shall furnish a bond for two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00), to be approved by the Board and paid for from League funds.

ARTICLE VI — RULE VIOLATIONS

SECTION I. All questions in dispute shall be referred to the Board and their decision shall be final.

SECTION II. For any violation of League rules, an offending student may be barred from participating in contests which come under the League jurisdiction; and an offending school may be suspended or expelled.

SECTION III. Any school making a protest against another (which protest must be in writing), shall submit a full statement of facts to the Secretary, who shall submit a copy to the superintendent of the accused school. Such protest shall be accompanied by a deposit of two dollars (\$2.00), which shall later be returned if the protest is sustained by the Board.

SECTION IV. A school against which a protest or any charge has been made shall have the privilege of presenting its case to the Board.

ARTICLE V — CONTESTS

SECTION I. Neither contest rules nor eligibility rules may be waived by common consent, and they must be fully observed by League members even the competing with non-members.

SECTION II. Final agreements for contests between two League members shall be incorporated into contracts on forms provided by the League. These contracts shall be executed by the Representatives of the respective schools and exchanged prior to the contest, and shall not be cancelled or altered except by mutual consent of the schools concerned.

SECTION III. No member of the League shall schedule or engage in any contest with a non-member which is eligible for membership in the League, under penalty of suspenusion for the remainder of the year; nor shall it enter into any contest with an out-of-state school which is not similarly qualified in respect to its own state.

SECTION IV. No member of the League shall engage in any contest with a school whose membership has been suspended, during the period of such suspension.

SECTION V. At least one week prior to any contest between League schools, they must exchange eligibility lists made on the League's forms, in which the superintendent and the principal of the high school certify to the present eligibility of each contestant named and pledge the use of only those who remain eligible at the time of contest.

SECTION VI. In any contest whatsoever, except those among students in the same school no ineligible student shall be used; nor shall such student appear in the field in uniform or otherwise participate as a member of the contesting organization or group. Nonmember using contestants of less than elegible standards may not secure membership within the same year.

SECTION VII. Contesting schools shall each have present an authorized faculty member who shall be responsible to his school for the conduct of his participants and students, thruout the contest and the visiting team's stay away from home.

SECTION VIII. Athletic coaches who are not regularly employed by the board of education are prohibited.

SECTION IX. Students shall not serve as business managers to arrange or handle contests between schools.

SECTION X. High standards of courtesy, fair-dealing and sportsmanship must feature all League contests. The Board may rate schools or students in these respects, recognizing high attainment and penalizing low.

SECTION XI. The League diapproves of expensive awards from school to students for accomplishment in contests.

SECTION XII. The school must keep adequate records of contests and contestants, and all reports required by the Board shall be promptly and accurately supplied.

ARTICLE VI — ELIGIBILITY OF CONTESTANTS

SECTION I. A student shall have been in attendance as many school days as he missed at the opening semester, should his enrollment not have been made the first day of the semester.

SECTION II. He shall not compete for more than four seasons in any one branch of inter-high school contests, provided that competition while in the eighth grade or below, shall not constitute one of the four seasons.

SECTION III. He shall not have participated in a similar contest during the same school year as a member of any other than a high school team.

SECTION IV. He shall not have been at any time a member of a team representing an institution of higher rank than a secondary school.

SECTION V. He shall be doing passing work in at least fifteen hours per week, the passing grade to be computed from the opening of the semester and relate to such subjects only as severally have a credit value of one-half unit per semester.

Note: This means three subjects, each of which is equal a half credit a semester, on the basis of 16 credits for graduation. We may not add physical training and orchestra fractional credits together, for example.

SECTION VI. He shall not be a graduate of a four year high school course, not a graduate of a senior high school offering three courses comprehending the tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades. Neither shall be compete after having earned credits sufficient to meet the graduating requirements in any course of study prescribed by the school he is to represent unless such credits have been secured in less than eight semesters of school attendance.

SECTION VII. He shall not be over 20 years of age.

SECTION VIII. After attending the first semester of the ninth grade he shall have credit on the school records in the unit-per-year or half-unit-per-semester subjects of at least three half units earned and recorded at the close of the last semester in which he was enrolled as a student, 30 days or more attendance or participation in interscholastic competition within any shorter period being sufficient to constitute enrollment in any semester.

SECTION IX. He shall always have contested under his own name.

SECTION X. He shall have been in attendance in the school he represents for one semester upon transfering from another school, unless his parents have become residents of the school district to which he is transferred or the school from which he is transferred does not offer work of the corresponding year in which he is ranked; and in the instance of a pupil transferred from a public high school to any other high school in the same city or vice versa he shall not be eligible to represent the new high school in the same school year.

SECTION XI. He shall not use tobacco nor intoxicating liquors during the school terms of two semesters.

NOTE: This has not been cancelled but it has been taken from its position between No. 10 and No. 12 in the list of eligiblity rules, and placed along with three other rules in the new High School League Recommended Standards of Eligibility, the entire administration of which, including penalties is left complete within the hands of each local school administration.

The Standards are these:

a. Every athlete shall be given a thorough physical examination before the opening of the athletic season.

- (b) Parental consent shall be secured before the participation of any athlete.
- (c) Proof in advance shall establish the birthdate of every 9th semester student before participation.
- (d) Every student participating in interscholastic contests shall abstain from the use of tobacco and alcoholic beverages.

SECTION XII. No student shall participate in any interscholastic contest after his eighth semester in high school unless he is under 18 years of age; nor after his seventh semester if his seventh and eighth are not consecutive.

SECTION XIII. High schools with an enrollment of seventy five or less may compete in Class C Tournaments or may elect to compete in Class B.

Minutes of the Annual High School League Meeting

BISMARCK, OCTOBER 23, 1947

The High School League met in regular session in the Junior-Senior Study hall, Bismarck High School, at 4 p. m. on Thursday, October 23, 1947.

A condensed summary of the regular minutes of the two previous meetings was passed around to the members. Upon motion by Wakefield of LaMoure and seconded by L. J. Totdahl of Crosby the minutes and financial report were approved.

President Zimmerman called upon Supt. Havig of Williston to report for the special music committee on their recommendations to the League relative to the reorganization of the music and speech contests held in the state. The proposal of the committee had previously been published in the October News-Letter.

The matter pro and con was discussed at some length by the membership. Mr. Page and Mr. Rowland of the University explained the position of the University in the matter and Mr. Cory of the Minot high school faculty and a member of the committee expressed the committees view on the reorganization.

A motion was made by _____ and seconded by Odenbach of Palermo that the question of whether the League wished to sponsor these activities should be voted on at this time. A vote

of yes to mean that the League should sponsor these contests and a vote of no that the contests would be left as they have been, under the direction of the University. An amendment to the original motion was made that such a vote would not preclude the use of the University facilities or the facilities of any other state institutions should the League desire to request their use for contest purposes. The amendment was declared carried by acclamation.

President Zimmerman then called for a vote upon the question as amended and the vote showed 50 voting yes and 23 voting no. The motion was declared carried.

The present committee was continued to make additional detailed plans for sponsoring contests in 1949. It was agreed that plans had already progressed to the point where 1948 contests would operate under the same plans as in former years.

Supt. Grimsrud of Lisbon reported for the Basketball committee and briefly outlined the new districting plans for Class B and Class C schools.

President Zimmerman briefly explained the attitude of the League toward the smaller Class C school.

A letter was read from Coach Al Larvick, Secretary of the Coaches Association, Valley City, urging the League to increase the membership of the Board of Control to eight members with the three additional members to be elected from coaches in Class C Class B, and Class A Schools—one from each class. After the reading of the letter, Mr. Larvick was extended the courtesy of the floor and presented the recommendations in the form of an amendment as follows:

Article III, Section I, shall be amended to read as follows: "There shall be a Board of Control, hereinafter called The Board, consisting of eight members chosen by the League at the Annual Fall Meeting for terms of three years. Five of these members shall be chosen at large and three members shall be coaches to be selected, one from Class A Coaches, one from Class B Coaches, one from Class C Coaches."

Upon motion by Wakefield and seconded by Olafson the proposed amendment was amended to increase the Board of Control to fourteen members by adding three music directors and three speech directors to the board in addition to the three coaches. The amendment carried.

Mikkelson of Fargo urged the League consider the addition of hockey as a major sport.

The nominating committee consisting of Walters of Park River, Jordahl of Lidgerwood, and Elstad of Mohall, reported with the name of F. H. Gilliland to succeed himself.

Upon motion by Havig and second by Reitan the nominations were closed and an unanimous ballot cast for Gilliland for the three year term.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

DEVILS LAKE, JULY 15, 16, 1947

The Board of Control of the North Dakota State High School League met in the offices of the city schools in Devils Lake, North Dakota on July 15th and 16th, 1947, with all Board members present.

The question of referees for the different state sponsored tournaments in 1948 was the first item of business and assignments were made as follows:

Reuben Hammond & Bernard Busse—Minot Class B Finals March 18, 19, 20,

George McCain & Bernard White—Dickinson Class B Tourney March 11, 12, 13.

Art Hovde & Norris Sande—Devils Lake Class B Tourney March 11, 12, 13.

Roy Domek & E. Anderson—Class A Finals, Bismarck March 12, 13.

Reuben Hammond & Bernard Busse-Fargo A Tourney March 4, 5, 6,

Clarence Omach & Earl Hoffman-Bismarck A Tourney March 4, 5, 6,

In the event any of the above officials could not accept their assignments the following men were named as alternates: L. G. Peterson of Sheyenne, Elmer Smedy of Oberon, George Schaumberg of Bismarck, Victor Anderson of Moorhead.

Fees for officiating the different state tournaments were set as follows:

For all eight team tournaments the sum of \$100 plus expenses, for the Bismarck finals which is a four team affair, the sum of \$75.00 plus expenses. The above fees were to be paid for officiating all games including the consolation rounds where they are played.

Some time was spent discussing improvements in the Athletic Benefit Fund. It was the opinion of the Board that a new schedule of rates could be worked out giving blanket coverage to the entire high school based on an enrollment basis. Such a plan would simplify the proceedure and would not require the individual names of the students to be covered. Mr. Gilliland was authorized to proceed with such a plan and secure pamphlets explaining the new plan to be distributed at the opening of the 1947-48 school term.

Mr. Zimmerman, President of the Board of Control, appointed the following special music committee to present plans for the reorganization of district and state music contests. This committee was authorized to meet at a convenient time prior to the annual League meeting to work out a plan for submission to the League at the annual meeting. It was agreed that such a committee should be reimbursed for any expense they would incur in making these plans.

The following committee was appointed:

L. T. Havig, Williston, Chairman; Phil Cory, Minot; C. Larson, Bismarck; Professor John Howard, Grand Forks; L. C. Sorlien, Fargo; Supt. Wm. Gussner, Jamestown.

Some time was spent discussing the new state social security plan and the secretary was instructed to contact the state office

and find out if League employees could be included in this plan.

The Board then proceeded to meet with the special basketball committee in regard to the reorganization of the Class B districts and the new C set-up for the coming year.

Upon motion by Van Wyk and second by Gilliland it was agreed to hold the Class C tournament on March 18, 19, 20, 1948. The location of this tournament was left open until invitations were made by interested towns. It was further agreed that the C districts should be held not later than March 13th and the method of selection of these teams should be left up to the individual district committees.

Victor Anderson of Moorhead, Minn., and George Schaumberger of Bismarck were designated as officials for the state Class C tournament on the same salary terms as the Class B and Class A officials.

Upon recommendation of the special committee the following

were named as chairman for the eight Class C districts and were authorized to call a meeting and elect the other members of the committee to have charge of their districts.

It was further agreed that enrollment on October first should determine whether a team was eligible for Class C tournament play. The Board had previously agreed that any school with enrollment less than 75 which should elect to play Class B basketball should indicate that intention before December fifteenth.

The Board next gave their attention to the reorganization of the Class B districts. After a careful study of several possible plans the Board voted to divide the state into eight districts. For 1947-48 the east and west divisional tournaments would be conducted as previously planned. Two teams would be selected from each district according to some plan agreed upon by the districts themselves. The teams so selected would take part in the east-west tournaments. From each of the east-west tournaments the first, second, third and consolation winner would advance to the finals to determine the Class B state winner.

Districts 8, 7, 6, South half of five, and the west half of one would compete at Dickinson.

Districts 2, 3, 4, North half of five, and east half of one compete at Devils Lake.

Upon motion of Johnson and second by Van Wyk it was agreed to make the following apopintment of chairmen for the respective districts. These chairmen were authorized to call a meeting of the schools within their district to select a permanent committee to control affairs within their district. Each district would have complete control of its method of selecting teams within the district.

The following men were appointed as temporary chairmen to call a meeting and select permanent committee men.

Minutes Of The Board Of Control B

BISMARCK, OCTOBER 2, 3, 4, 1947

The Board of Control of the High School League met at various times during the NDEA convention at Bismarck. Following are the items of business transacted at these meetings. Several questions of rules interpretations were discussed and policies formulated.

1. Wheelock raised the question of when could the first semester be officially ended. It was the opinion of the Board that the time of the ending of the first semester was an administrative problem of the local school. The important factor should be that the time was equally divided between the first and second semesters and that the semester should officially end at 4 p. m. the regular closing hour of school. If for good and valid reasons a school were held on legal holidays or on Saturdays or by legenthening the school day such a procedure would be the privilege of the administration. However, a semester must be half the school year of eighteen full weeks.

Park River Aggies presented the question of eligibility of town grade pupils enrolled in the public high school to the high school team of Park River Aggies. It was found that there was no high school in the town school and the only school in which grade pupils could participate was in the Aggie school. The former decision of declaring the grade boys eligible for the Aggie H. S. was affirmed.

- 2. The secretary reported that all officials for the state Basketball Tournaments had been secured but Mr. McCain had been obliged to resign. The board agreed to try to obtain the services of Leonard Egstrom of Grand Forks in place of McCain, resigned.
- 3. The question of purchase of basketballs was discussed and it was agreed that the ball contracts should be equally divided between Northern School Supply Company and Colborn School Supply Co. The secretary was instructed to make this division.

- 4. The problem of radio broadcasts was discussed at considerable length and Mr. Fitzimmons of KFYR was called into conference on the question. The board was of the opinion that the resolution passed in 1944 was somewhat outmoded and that new conditions of broadcast should be drawn up. Complete listeners coverage of the entire state appeared to be the main objective of the board. The possibility of protection of advertisers and the sale of broadcasting rights as a source of league income was also discussed. The secretary was instructed to contact all interested radio stations and secure their suggestions as to methods of controlling broadcasts. Final action on broadcasts was to be made at the next board meeting.
- 5. The Board agreed to purchase two additional films for the film library, "West Point Championship Football and Play Champion Basketball." These films were to be deposited with the film library at the AC in Fargo for distribution to member schools.
- 6. Contracts for the purchase of Trophies were authorized as follows:

Jostens Company, Owatonna—State Basketball finals, 3 classes, A, B, C, four places at \$89.50 per set. Eight District Track trophies—first and second place trophies \$148.80. 374 Participation Awards for Basketball at \$.75. 30 Bronze Belt Buckles at \$4.25. State Track Medals—13 sets of four \$66.30. State Golf and Tennis Awards—\$22.35.

- L. G. Balfour Company—District Class B and C trophies at \$48.75 per set. Each district to determine number wanted. State A and B Playoffs, first and second place at \$26.00 per set. State Track Trophies, four places, total \$112.75. Two relay trophies \$35.00. 33 Gold Basketballs at \$3.45. 33 Silver Basketballs at \$1.55. 104 sets of 13 for district track at \$2.85 (three places). District golf and tennis awards at \$2.15 per set. Engraving and transportation to be added to both contracts.
- 7. It was agreed that President Zimmerman was to contact the Junior Chamber of Commerce at Jamestown relative to sponsoring the Class C state tournament and report at the next board meeting.
- 8. The state track meet was set at Valley City on Saturday, May 29, 1948 with Supt. M. S. Ward as manager.
- 9. The District Track Meets were set in the same cities as last year with the same managers, except Herb Parker was named as the manager of the Minot District meet. The district meets were scheduled the week prior to the state meet.

10. Supt. E. C. Johnson was appointed as a committee of one to investigate the possibility of promoting a summer baseball tournament for Class B and C schools.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Minutes Of The Board Of Control

VALLEY CITY, NOVEMBER 28, 29, 1947

The Board of Control of the State High School League met in the Rudolph Hotel during the Coaches Clinic at Valley City on November 28, 29, 1947 with all board members present.

Several eligibility problems were discussed and decisions made relative to them.

1. The Nekoma Case.

A lad whose home is in a township adjoining Nekoma where there is no high school elected in 1946-7 to attend high school in Grafton. It was convenient for him to attend there because he had a sister living there at the time. During the past summer the sister and family moved to Park Rapids, Minnesota, and because of housing difficulties it was not convenient for him to continue to live with his sister. He therefore elected to come to Nekoma where he lived with a brother. The question involved was—when would he be eligible for athletic competition at Nekoma? The board ruled he would be eligible to represent the Nekoma high school after he had attended a semester at Nekoma. While the board recognized the desirability of the change in schools, rule ten does not permit immediate eligibility for the reason of convenience.

2. The St. Thomas Case.

A lad is an orphan. He has been living here and there with relatives for some time. A year ago he lived in California with a brother. This summer he went to Alaska with another brother. Recently he moved to St. Thomas and lived with another brother who was formerly appointed his legal guardian. When is he eligible?

The question again was one involving rule ten. The board felt it was an important question as to when the legal guardianship was made. If this condition was imposed by the court after he had lived in California or Alaska, it was agreed that he would have the right to move back to St. Thomas and live with the legal guardian. If the guardianship existed prior to his selecting either California or Alaska as his home, then he had voluntarily selected some other school and any subsequent change in schools would have to be considered as coming under the transfer rule. A further check with Supt. Bell indicated that the guardianship had existed for some time. Therefore it was agreed that he should remain ineligible to represent St. Thomas High School for a period of one full semester of eighteen weeks.

3. The Tolley Case.

This lad, whose home is in the Tolley School District where there is maintained a four year high school, enrolled at the St. Leo's School in Minot and attended classes a week and then transferred back to Tolley and enrolled in the Tolley High School. The question is—when is he eligible to represent Tolley High School in interscholastic athletics? The board ruled that he is a transfer student inasmuch as he had enrolled in St. Leo's and attended one or more classes. Hence he would have to attend a full semester of eighteen weeks before becoming eligible.

4. Bottineau Case.

This question was one of inquiry rather than a specific case. The question was what scholastic standards must a grade student maintain in order to be eligible for the team. This particular question had been answered in the 1938 handbook of interpretations. A grade boy must be passing in all his grade work and not in three fourths or three half units as is demanded of high school students.

5. Arnegard Case.

A lad, who was a former grade school student in Arnegard moved to Washington and attended Junior High school there. This summer he returned to Arnegard and is making his temporary home with an aunt pending the possible arrival of the mother who plans to return to Arnegard in the near future. The question when is he eligible to play on the school team in Arnegard? The board ruled that he would be eligible after he attended the Arnegard school for a period of a semester or until such time as the mother actually moves to Arnegard and makes her residence there. Intention to move at some future time is not sufficient grounds to satisfy rule ten as to residence of the parents.

6. The Rolla Case.

Parents of a lad live in a district adjoining the Rolla School district which maintains a high school. For the past two years the

lad has attended the Marty Indian School in South Dakota. This year the lad decides to stay home and attend the Rolla H. S.. The question is when is he eligible to represent Rolla H. S. in an athletic contest? The board ruled that he would have to attend the Rolla school a semester before being declared eligible unless the Marty School was closed or did no longer offer the work in which he was registered. From all appearances he was a transfer student and would have to conform to the semester rule imposed on transfer students.

7. The Gardar Case.

A student living half way between Mountain H. S. and Gardar H. S. finds it more convenient to come to Gardar to school because he could live with a sister in Gardar. Question - when is he eligible? Again as in the other cases this lad is transferring schools without a change in parental residence and therefore is ineligible for a period of one semester.

A letter from the Olympic Games Committee was read. This letter enlisted the support of the high school league in modifying rules to permit high school athletes to participate in Olympic games and secondly requested the use of the league in raising money for the games. It was the opinion of the board that no rule changes were necessary for our high school athletes to participate in these games. It was further the opinion of the board that our present part time secretary office would not easily lend itself to any campaign for funds.

The secretary was instructed to accept membership from any school which wished to pay the membership fees whether they maintained a high school or grade school only.

Supt. A. C. Van Wyk was appointed a committee of one to investigate the legal responsibility of the League for injuries resulting from state sponsored tournaments. It was the intention of the board to carry personal liability insurance if it developed that the league would be responsible for these injuries.

The general question of personal liability of the officers of a non-incorporated association was discussed at some length and Supt. Van Wyk was instructed to consult proper legal counsel relative to the advantages and disadvantages of incorporating.

The Board officially selected Coach Johnny Mach of Mandan to represent the H. S. League at the National Football Rules Committee Meeting in Biloxi, Miss., in January.

Mr. Gilliland and Mr. Van Wyk were selected by the Board to represent the Board of Control at the Federation meeting in Biloxi, Miss., in January.

Upon suggestion from Mr. Gilliland it was voted to appropriate the sum of \$50 for each newly organized Class C district to be used for organization purposes.

The question of pairing of teams for the two Class B tournaments were discussed and it was agreed to seed teams as follows for the Minot final tournament:—

Team one west meets team five east; team two east meets team three west; team one east meets team five west; team two west meets team three east.

For the divisional state Class B tournaments it was agreed that the draw should be so made that no two district teams could be placed in the same bracket.

Managers of the different state tournaments were appointed as follows:

A. C. Van Wyk__Bismarck Finals and Bismarck Divisional Tourney

H. H. Kirk_____Fargo Divisional Tournament

F. H. Gilliland_____Devils Lake Divisional Tournament

H. Wienbergen_____Dickinson Divisional Tournament

E. J. Cassell_____Class C Final Tournament

The date of the Class C State Tournament was set for Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, March 15, 16, 17, 1948. Jamestown was selected as the site for this tournament.

Team allowance for the different state tournaments was set at 45 cents for one way transportation or actual bus or railroad fare and a per diem allowance of \$4.50 per man for ten players and coach for board and room.

Managers of each tournament were to be allowed a net of \$100 as a managers fee, said fee to be taken from the tournament receipts as a preferred expense.

Mr. Ernie Gates, representative of the North Dakota Coaches association met with the board and presented the following resolution to the Board of Control.

Resolved that the North Dakota Coaches association request the Board of Control that a State Officials association be formed and that the said officials assn. be administered by the Board of Control through the office of the secretary of the said Board, and that this resolution contain the following recommendations:-

- 1. That the Board of Control sponsor clinics in both football and basketball at such time and place to be set by the Board of Control.
- 2. That attendance to these clinics be compulsory for membership in the officials association.
- 3. That at each clinic, prospective officials be required to pass the standard test of the National Federation of H. S. Athletic association.
- 4. That each official be required to pay fee, such fees to be used to help defray expenses of such a clinic.
- 5. That the secretary of the Board of Control send each member school a list of all bona-fide officials who have successfully attended these clinics.
- 6. That each member school return such a list to the secretary of the Board of Control at the close of the session and rate all officials used by that school as satisfactory or unsatisfactory, or any other rating system the Board might require
- 7. That as this organization grows other matters such as officiating fees, dress, badge, travel fees be added to make said officials association a strong and permanent organization.

The above resolution was accepted and placed on file with the Secretary of the Board of Control.

Supt. E. C. Johnson reported on the preliminary work he had made on the possibility of a summer baseball program for member schools. Mr. Johnson was instructed to continue his work and report at the March meeting of the Board of Control.

The salary of the secretary-treasurer was increased to \$2,000 per annum effective 1947-48 with a further stipulation that the allowance for clerk hire be increased to \$125 to \$135 per month for a nine month period.

Several representatives of the interested radio stations met with the Board and discussed the terms of broadcasts for the coming tournaments. It was agreed that the following conditions would govern broadcasts for 1948 tournaments.

1. Any radio station may broadcast tournament games without any charge on the part of the league. 2. Any radio station which wishes to broadcast games at a tourna-

ment must agree to carry all games and all parts of a game. Permission will not be granted to broadcast from the floor certain games and to leave out others. 3. Any station agreeing to broadcast all games may feed another station one or more games and such games may be rebroadcast without restrictions on the part of the Board. The Board reserves the right to approve sponsors of all radio broadcasts.

Minutes Of The Board Of Control D

MINOT, MARCH 18, 19, 20, 1948

The Board of Control of the State High School League met in Minot during the State Class B tournament on March 18, 19, 20, 1948 with all board members present at all sessions.

The Chairmen of all class B and C districts had previously been asked to meet with the Board to discuss various problems common to all districts. All class B districts were represented and all C districts except districts No. 2 and No. 4.

Both Friday and Saturday mornings were devoted to a general discussion with these committee chairmen. All discussions were informal and an attempt was made to obtain the reaction of the school administrations and coaches in the field.

The following items were definitely acted upon by the Board of Control.

- 1. Upon motion of Van Wyk and second by Roberts it was agreed to award the contract for balls to Colborn School Supply Co. and the Northern School Supply Co. on the same basis as the past year.
- 2. Upon recommendation of the district chairmen present it was agreed that a special committee should be appointed by the president of the board of control to make a special study of eligibility rules. It was further the consensus of this group that an amendment should be made to the present rule 10 of transfer of students from one high school to another which would require a full year or two semesters of attendance before becoming eligible to represent the new school and further that this amendment should be presented by news-letter so that it could be voted upon at the next League meeting.
- 3. Principal Bjorlie, Coach Lande of Minot Model, and Coach Melvin Johnson met with the board relative to the referees for

the final game on Saturday evening. Some concern was expressed over the fact that Mr. Busse was connected with the State Teachers college and Hammond was a graduate of the College High School. It was the opinion of the Board that both these officials were competent and impartial and had been selected from a large field of applicants long before it was known which team would be matched in the tournament and that they should referee this final contest as per agreement between the board and the officials.

4. The board proceeded to organize itself for the 1948-49 fiscal year. M. B. Zimmerman was again elected president of the board, John Roberts was named Vice-President and E. Abrahamson was selected as Secretary-Treasurer. The salary for the secretary has previously been set at the November meeting of the board.

The board received several telegrams from Northwood High School requesting that they be transferred from District No. 3 to District No. 2 inasmuch as their natural playing competition was with schools from District 2 and they were located on the division line between the two districts and the request was granted.

Supt. L. E. Havig of Williston met with the Board of Control relative to the proposed music reorganization for 1949 contests. Mr. Havig was authorized to proceed with the reorganization plan and submit a concrete plan at the next meeting of the Board of Control.

Supt. John Walters of Park River, as the official delegate of the East-West Conference, met with the Board of Control with a request that the schools in the East-West Conference be permitted to share in the profits of the West and West Divisional Tournaments and secondly that in the future allowance be made for fourteen men at the tournament instead of the present eleven.

After considerable discussion the Board voted to allow the participant of each of the state divisional tournaments ten percent of the net receipt to be divided equally between eight teams competing at the respective events. The Secretary was instructed to draw checks on the League funds and mail said checks to the schools competing in each tournament. It was further understood and agreed that the eastern teams share only in the eastern net receipts and the western teams only in the western tourney net receipts.

Chas Kimball of Fargo met with the Board to present a request from the different local state officials requesting the cooperation of the Board in formulating a state organization and also in selecting a qualified official to attend a rules clinic at Minneapolis next August. This delegate in turn would return home and conduct two rules clinics in football, one in the eastern part of the state and another somewhere in the western part of the state. It was

also requested that a similar plan be followed in basketball or the Board of Control try to arrange for a clinic somewhere in the state prior to the opening of the basketball season.

The Board agreed to send a delegate to the Minneapolis clinic at League expense and promote the clinics within the state as requested.

The President was authorized and instructed to make this appointment.

Representatives from Fargo and Bismarck met with the Board relative to the location of the 1948 tournaments. Invitations were also received from Minot for the 1948 state final Class B tournament, Dickinson and Devils Lake for the state divisional tournaments. After considerable discussion tournament states and cities were selected as follows:

It was agreed that the same plan of tournaments be used in 1949 as was done this year. This implies a four team final for Class A and eight team final for Class B.

Some time was spent discussing tournament prices. Van Wyk and Gilliland were appointed a committee of two to draw up a schedule of prices to be adopted by the Board for future state tournaments.

Supt. E. C. Johnson reported on his findings relative to summer baseball and since it appeared that a large number of the schools were interested in this sport it was agreed that the Board would approve and sanction summer baseball carried on during the summer on a conference basis. Any student who was eligible to participate in athletics during the second semester would be considered eligible to participate in a school summer baseball contest. This summer baseball would be considered to be a normal part of the second semester athletic program.

Discussion of the summer meeting of the Board brought out the suggestion that a meeting could possibly be held either at the state track meet or at the summer conference of national secretaries in Minnesota.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned. Earl Abrahamson, Secretary.

Minutes Of The Board Of Control E

VALLEY CITY, MAY 29, 1948

The Board of Control met in special session during the state track meet at Valley City on Saturday, May 29, 1948. Zimmerman, Van Wyk, and Gilliland present and Johnson and Roberts absent.

Several matters were discussed informally but action was deferred on all but the more important items due to the absence of several board members.

It was agreed to send Earl Hoffman to the Coaches school at Minneapolis, August 17th to 20th, with the understanding that he return to the state and conduct rules clinics on football for interested officials. It was suggested that these clinics be held at Minot, Bismarck, Devils Lake, Valley City, and Grand Forks. Mr. Hoffman was to be allowed the sum of \$10.00 per diem for his work and expenses to the school and to the clinics conducted.

It was voted to purchase the series of 12 10mm sound films produced by United World of 445 Park Avenue, New York. These films cover all track activities and have been highly recommended by several prominent coaches in the state. These films would be deposited with the Film Library of the Agricultural College in Fargo and be available to member schools on a small rental charge.

The Secretary was instructed to obtain a football trophy for Mandan. This trophy was for the 1942 football season.

Supt. L. T. Havig met with the Board relative to the music contests and considerable time was spent going over this report. Mr. Havig was instructed to continue his study and meet with the Board at a meeting to be arranged later in the summer.

Representatives of District one met with the Board to suggest that they consider the possibility of holding qualifying tournaments in Class B basketball instead of the two now held at present. Supt. Wakefield of Lamoure, Olson of Lisbon, Quam of Oakes and Ingvaldson of Ellendale comprised the committee. No action was taken on this request at this time.

It was agreed to hold a summer meeting during the latter part of July or the first part of August to clear up any pending business.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.





North Dakota East-West Conference Constitution

ARTICLE I-NAME

Section I—The name of this organization shall be the North Dakota East-West Conference.

ARTICLE II-PURPOSE

Section I-The purpose of this Conference is:

a. To stimulate competition thru publication of comparative rating in Conference games.

b. To provide Conference championships when practicable.

- c. To increase gate receipts and the interest of patrons.
- d. To provide more uniform schedules for all.
- e. To help ourselves by helping one another.

ARTICLE III-MEMBERSHIP

Section I—The members of this Conference shall consist of the following schools: 1. Wahpeton, 2. Fargo, 3. Sacred Heart Academy (Fargo), 4. Valley City, 5. Devils Lake, 6. Grand Forks, 7. Grafton, 8. Walsh County Agricultural School, 9. Jamestown, 10. Bismarck, 11. Mandan, 12. Dickinson, 13. Williston, 14. Minot, 15. St. Leo's (Minot), and 16. St. Mary's (Bismarck).

Section II—Upon meeting the requirements for Class "A" standing, other North Dakota high schools may make application for membership in the Conference and may be admitted by a three-fourths vote of the members.

Section III—The Superintendent or his official appointee shall be the official, or voting, representative of the school, hereafter called the Representative, such appointment, if any, being made in writing to the secretary.

ARTICLE IV—COMPETITIVE UNITS

Section I—For competitive purposes the state is to be divided into two basic groups, the Eastern Division and the Western Division. The Eastern Division is to be made up of (A) the Southeastern District, consisting of schools 1, 2, 3, and 4 (above), and of (B) the Northeastern District, consisting of schools 5, 6, 7, and 8; and the Western Division is to be made up of (C) the Southwestern District, consisting of schools 9, 10, 11, and 12, and of (D) the Northwestern District, consisting of schools 13, 14, 15, and 16.

ARTICLE V-OFFICERS

Section I—Officers of the Conference shall be a president, a vice president, and a secretary-treasurer, elected by the Conference Representatives, and there shall be an executive committee (hereinafter called the Committee) consisting of the foregoing officers and the two Divisional Chairmen. The various Districts shall select District Directors, one of whom, in each Division, shall serve as Divisional Chairman.

Section II—The president shall be chosen in 1946, the vice president in 1947, and the secretary-treasurer in 1948, each serving for a term of three years after election, or till a successor is elected. District Directors are chosen annually. For 1945-6 the Directors in the Southeastern and Southwestern Districts shall serve as Divisional Chairmen, followed the next year by those from the Northeastern and Northwestern Districts, and alternating automatically by years thereafter.

Section III—The duties of the president, vice-president, and secretary-treasurer, shall be those common to such officials. The duties of the Committee are the direction of the general affairs of the Conference in the intervals between the Annual or called meetings of the entire body, and shall include the hearing and deciding of all protests and disagreements, their decision to be final except for appeal to the Board of Control of the North Dakota High School League. Committee members shall not sit on problems involving their own schools, but shall be represented by a person appointed by the remaining members of the Committee. The duties of the District Directors are the direction of the affairs of their respective districts that are of local character, under the general direction of the Committee, and those of the Divisional Chairmen, apart from their function as committeemen, shall have application to divisional affairs as distinguished from district matters.

Section IV—Protests and disagreements calling for the action of the Committee should make specific request for the Committee's action, and supply all data to assist the Committee in a decision, and when presented by any one other than the superintendent should carry written authorization of the school head.

Section V—Three members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum, and two-thirds of the Representatives shall constitute a quorum in meetings of the Conference. However, to pass a measure it must be approved by a majority of the entire membership of the Conference or the Committee, as the case may be, this principle applying also to the election of officers.

ARTICLE VI-MEETINGS

Section I—The Annual Meeting of the Conference and the election of officers and District Directors shall take place at the time of the state Class A (or Conference) basketball tournament, officers, Directors and Chairmen to assume their duties at the close of the tournament. Special meetings may be called by the Committee, or by a majority of the Conference, the time and place being similarly determined.

ARTICLE VII-DUES

Section I—Each member shall pay a fee of three dollars (\$3.00) annually, on or before October 1, to provide for secretarial and other expenses.

ARTICLE VIII—FOOTBALL COMPETITION

Section I—The Conference championship shall be determined by a game between the top-ranking teams of the Eastern and Western Divisions, to be played not later than November 11 or the Friday or Saturday following. In the event of a tie in the Conference Championship game the teams shall be declared co-champions and duplicate trophies awarded to the two schools.

Section II—Divisional championships shall be determined on a percentage basis with tie football games counted as a half-win and a half-loss in divisional standings. Conference teams shall endeavor to complete their divisional schedule no later than the final week in October.

Section III—In Divisional or Conference play-offs, the time of the game (except as stipulated above), the selection of officials, and other incidentals should be mutually agreed upon if at all possible. When such agreement cannot be reached, the question shall be settled by the Committee, subject to appeal to the Board of Control of the High School League.

'Section IV—Except for unusual circumstances, such games shall be played in the town of one of the interested schools, championship games of the Conference alternating between the East and West Divisions by games rather than by years. Funds should be used to pay the necessary expenses of the visiting team and other costs of the game, any additional money in Divisional or Conference championship games going 60% to the winning school and 40% to the losing school.

ARTICLE IX-BASKETBALL COMPETITION

Section I—So long as the North Dakota High School League maintains a state tournament for a classification including members of this Conference exclusively, such tournament shall be con-

sidered the Conference Championship tournament. It is understood that all the duties and powers of conducting such tournament (including the disposition of any profits) is vested in the Board of Control of the League.

Section II—In case the High School League ceases to maintain a state tournament such as mentioned in the preceding paragraph, the Committee is hereby empowered to make the necessary arrangements for a tournament to decide the Conference Championship.

Section III—Each Division shall select two teams for the state tournament in accordance with its own method.

ARTICLE X-TRACK COMPETITION

Section I-District Meets:

a. Schools of any District or division may, at their option, conduct a District or Divisional track meet to determine championships, subject to the regulations of the High School League.

Section II-State Meet:

a. Since the present state track meet of the High School League affords ample opportunity for the determination of the relative abilities of the Conference track men, there shall be no Conference meet on a state wide basis.

ARTICLE XI-ULTIMATE AUTHORITY

Section I—Participants in all Conference activities shall conform strictly to the eligibility rules of the North Dakota High School League, and in all particulars this Conference shall conform to the League rules or directions.

ARTICLE XII-BY-LAWS, AMENDMENTS

Section 1—By-Laws may be added at any meeting of the Conference by a majority vote of all the Representatives of the Conference.

Section II—Amendments to the constitution may be made at any session by a vote of two-thirds of the Representatives of the Conference, provided notice has been served in writing to all Representatives at least 30 days in advance.
