The publication of the twenty sixth Annual League Handbook marks the end of one year of work with the H S League on a full time basis. Thirty four states have found it necessary to place the secretaryship on a full time basis and many of them have so expanded their programs that assistants have been added to the staffs.

To better familiarize the league members with the extensive program of the North Dakota State High School League, this foreward will attempt to list a few of the more important activities of the organization.

League membership for the current year numbered 356 schools. All fully accredited schools were members, all minor accredited schools except Mapleton joined the organization and most graded and consolidated schools also maintained membership in the League.

One of the monthly services of the league is the publication of the High School League News-Letter. This mimeographed publication, consisting of from six to twelve sheets of paper printed on both sides, is mailed to all high schools in the state, all county superintendents, the department of public instruction, secretaries of other states, to members of the North Dakota Officials Association and those private concerns as have indicated they are interested in receiving a copy. The publication of this letter involves the printing and mailing of 1,300 copies of the News-Letter each month. At times as many as twenty five reams of paper are used in the publication of one issue. The letter contains informational material of current interest on the league program and a sufficient number of copies is sent to each school to supply coaches, music and speech directors.

A definite program of the league is its educational program to prospective teachers in the fields of athletics, music and speech. Your secretary has had the privilege of meeting with the student classes in the state teachers colleges and other teacher training institutions. In addition to the visitations to the colleges as many feld visits to teachers in the high schools of the state have been made as time would permit. Your secretary has attended all meetings of the NDEA and the school administrators and as many local meetings of school superintendents and coaches as time would allow.

This office is the prime source of material for athletics, music and speech activities. More than five thousand rule books have been ordered from the National Federation, the parent organization of state athletic associations, and distributed to the schools in the state. This includes rule books, casebooks, players handbooks in the sports of basketball, football, baseball and track. Some four hundred music lists have been distributed to schools interested in the music contests. This office has also distributed debate material to those schools interested in that activity.

During the year, the flim library has been extended and now includes every film on rules that is produced by the National Federation in addition to excellent helps on coaching the different sports of basketball, football, baseball and track. This year films were taken of the 1950 state track meet and will be available to schools for a small rental charge. If this plan works out, this feature of the league program will be further extended in another year.

The High School League is also interested in improving officiating in the various sports. As a part of that program, there has been organized a North Dakota Officials Association and all officials of the state are asked to register with the league and participate in its training program. For the first year 205 officials registered, Qualified men were sent to the best coaching schools and returned to the state to conduct a series of football and basketball clinics paying special attention to the interpretation of the rules. During the past year eight such football clinics were conducted and eight basketball clinics were held at different points in the state. During the coming year this program will be further extended to include examinations for officials. The Board of Control has cooperated whole heartedly in this program and will require the use of registered officials in class A contests for the coming season.

The Athletic Benefit Fund is increasing in popularity and in service. During the past year more money was paid out than was received in fees. In addition all administrative costs were absorbed by the league. More than 1,030 claims were paid amounting to a total of over \$12,300 in benefits. A complete report of claims paid is found elsewhere in this handbook. The schedule of benefits has been revised for the 1950-51 season and it is hoped that the changes will make the fund even more attractive to schools in the state.

A new feature of the AABF is Plan A, known as the all day coverage plan. Under this plan a high school may protect its students against any injury listed in the schedule of benefits which occurs while on the school ground or in the school building, during the school day. A plan is also provided to extend the protection down thru the grades as is explained in the informational material describing the various plans.

In addition to the items already mentioned may be listed the various tournaments in basketball, the track meet operated under

two classes A and B, the golf tournament, the Tennis tournament and the new baseball tournament sponsored for the first time this current year. They are all an important part of any live school system and take considerable time and effort to operate.

This office realizes full well that all the program of the league could not operate except for the hearty cooperation of the hundreds of school superintendents, coaches, music and speech directors thruout the state of North Dakota. It is therefore with a feeling of gratitude and thanks that we review the work of the past school year. We, the board of control and this office are greatly appreciative of the splendid cooperation and help that has been contributed by the school men and women of North Dakota.

Your continued help and cooperation is earnestly solicited for the coming year in order that our splendid organization may realize to the greatest degree possible the aims and purposes for which it was founded some forty years ago.

Constitution of N.D.H.S.L.

ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as the NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE, hereinafter called the LEAGUE.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of the League shall be to promote, directly or indirectly, all desirable kinds of inter-high school contests, to hold them to the highest standards, and to make them serve the interests of the member schools.

ARTICLE III — MEMBERS

SECTION I. Any accredited High School, Graded or Consolidated School, so classified by the State Department of Public Instruction may become a member of the League by acknowledging allegiance to its authority and paying the annual dues. The membership year shall be from October First to September Thirtieth following.

SECTION II. The superintendent or his faculty appointee shall be the official representative of the school, hereinafter called the Representative, such appointment, if any, being made in writing to the secretary.

ARTICLE IV — OFFICERS

SECTION I. There shall be a Board of Control, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of seven members chosen at the annual fall meeting of League for terms of three years, each new member to be seated July first following his election. Two members shall be chosen from Class A schools, two from Class B schools, two from Class C schools, and one member shall be elected at large. Should any member change schools into a different class, his position shall immediately be declared vacant and a new member selected to fill the vacancy at the next meeting of the League. An executive secretary-treasurer shall be selected by the Board of Control to serve at the pleasure of the Board.

SECTION II. The president, vice-president, and secretary-treasurer shall each exercise all the functions assigned to him by work or implication of the Constitution, By-Laws and Regulations of the League, or the Rules of the Board.

SECTION III. The Board is the League's executive body, subject only to restraint of the Constitution, By-Laws, and Regulations

of the League. The Board shall determine the time and place of its own meetings and shall fill vacancies in its own ranks, to serve until the next regular meeting of the League. Three members shall constitute a quorum.

NOTE: The following proposed change of this section is to be voted upon at the October, 1950 meeting of the League.

THE BOARD IS THE LEAGUE'S EXECUTIVE BODY, SUBJECT ONLY TO THE RESTRAINT OF THE CONSTITUTION, BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS OF THE LEAGUE. THE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE THE TIME AND PLACE OF ITS MEETINGS AND SHALL FILL VACANCIES IN ITS OWN RANKS TO SERVE UNTIL THE NEXT REGULAR MEETING OF THE LEAGUE. FOUR MEMBERS SHALL CONSTITUTE A QUORUM.

SECTION IV. When the Board is dealing with affairs in which one of its members or his school is specifically involved, the remaining members shall select a proxy to sit in his place.

ARTICLE V — REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

SECTION I. The time and place of the regular meetings of representatives shall be those of the meeting of the school administrators of the state and of the North Dakota Education Association, the hours and rooms being designated by the Board of Control.

SECTION II. Special meetings may be called by the Board, and must be called by the Secretary upon the written request of twenty representatives.

SECTION III. The Representative Assembly shall have electoral and legislative function only.

SECTION IV. Twenty representatives shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE VI — FINANCE

SECTION I. The Board shall determine what expenditures are necessary.

SECTION II. Each member school shall pay to the Treasurer annual dues according to the following schedule: Class A, \$10.00: Class B, \$7.50; Class C, \$5.00; Class D, \$2.00. Class A shall include all schools that are members of the East-West Conference. Class B shall include fully or minor accredited high schools. Class C shall include graded or consolidated schools. Class D shall include schools not having interscholastic contest, but desiring athletic insurance benefits.

SECTION III. Special assessments may be levied by a twothirds vote of the Representative Assembly.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

The By-Laws and Regulations of the League may be amended by a majority vote of those present, at any regular meeting, provided this vote is 25% of all representatives, and provided notice of the proposed Constitution-amendment with its substance, has been served at a previous session or has been served by letter from the Secretary at the request of another representative and provided that there shall be a lapse of one month between the time of presentment and final vote thereon.

BY-LAWS GOVERNING RELATIONS OF SCHOOLS

ARTICLE I — MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. Application for membership and acknowledging allegiance to the League must be made by the superintendent of the school on the League's prescribed card-file form.

SECTION II. A school may be suspended or expelled by the Board for violation of League rules; and once expelled, may be reinstated only by action of the Board.

SECTION III. No school shall be admitted to the League during a school year in which it has as a non-member been represented in any interscholastic competition by a student who would have been ineligible under the rules of the League.

ARTICLE II - RESPONSIBILITY

The school's responsibility to the League rests upon the superintendent. Consistent with this obligation, and except as otherwise specified, his power and duties may be delegated for execution to one or more members of the teaching staff of his high school as follows:

- a. Representative, who may hold office in the League, or speak and vote in its assembly.
 - b. Business managers, coaches, directors, chaperons, etc.

ARTICLE III — OFFICERS

SECTION I. When authorized by the President, the Secretary may submit by mail questions for discussions, but not for vote.

SECTION II. The Secretary shall keep an accurate and systematized record of membership, officials of the League, and contestants.

SECTION III. The Secretary shall have general charge of the Board's correspondence, and shall distribute their forms, information and inquiries to members.

SECTION IV. The Treasurer shall receive all funds belonging to the League, which he shall invest or pay out for League bills as directed by the Board and formally approved by the President.

SECTION V. The Treasurer shall keep a systematic and detailed record of all receipts and disbursements, with vouchers for the latter, and shall make a complete financial statement to the League at the Conference session, at which time his accounts shall be audited by a committee of three appointed by the President.

SECTION VI. The Treasurer shall furnish a bond for two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00), to be approved by the Board and paid for from League funds.

ARTICLE IV — RULE VIOLATIONS

SECTION I. All questions in dispute shall be referred to the Board and their decision shall be final.

SECTION II. For any violation of League rules, an offending student may be barred from participating in contests which come under the League jurisdiction; and an offending school may be suspended or expelled.

SECTION III. Any school making a protest against another (which protest must be in writing), shall submit a full statement of facts to the Secretary, who shall submit a copy to the superintendent of the accused school. Such protest shall be accompanied by a deposit of two dollars (\$2.00), which shall later be returned if the protest is sustained by the Board.

SECTION IV. A school against which a protest or any charge has been made shall have the privilege of presenting its case to the Board.

ARTICLE V - CONTESTS

SECTION I. Neither contest rules nor eligibility rules may be waived by common consent, and they must be fully observed by League members even though competing with non-members.

SECTION II. Final agreeents for contests between two League members shall be incorporated into contracts on forms provided by the League. These contracts shall be exceuted by the representatives of the respective school and exchanged prior to the contest, and shall not be cancelled or altered except by mutual consent of the schools concerned.

SECTION III. No member of the League shall schedule or engage in any contest with a non-member which is eligible for membership in the League, under penalty of suspension for the remain-

der of the year; nor shall it enter into any contest with an out-ofstate school which is not similiarly qualified in respect to its own state.

SECTION IV. No member of the League shall engage in any contest with a school whose membership has been suspended, during the period of such suspension.

SECTION V. At least one week prior to any contest between League schools, they must exchange eligibility list made on the League's forms, in which the superintendent and the principal of the high school certify to the present eligibility of each contestant named and pledge the use of only those who remain eligible at the time of contest.

SECTION VI. In any contest whatsoever, except those among students in the same school no ineligible student shall be used; nor shall such student appear in the field in uniform or otherwise participate as a member of the contesting organization or group. Nonmember using contestants of less than eligible standards may not secure membership within the same year.

SECTION VII. Contesting schools shall each have present an authorized faculty member who shall be responsible to his school for the conduct of his participants and students, throughout the contest and the visiting team's stay away from home.

SECTION VIII. Athletic coaches who are not regularly employed by the board of education are prohibited.

SECTION IX. Students shall not serve as business managers to arrange or handle contests between schools.

SECTION X. High standards of courtesy, fair - dealing and sportsmanship must feature all League contests. The Board may rate schools or students in these respects, recognizing high attainment and penalizing low.

SECTION XI. The League disapproves of expensive awards from school to students for accomplishments in contests.

SECTION XII. The school must keep adequate records of contests and contestants, and all reports required by the Board shall be promptly and accurately supplied.

SECTION XIII. No athletic director, coach, principal, teacher or other official of a member school or any athletic official registered with the North Dakota State High School League shall assist, either directly or indirectly, with the coaching, management, direction, selection of players, promotion, or officiating of any all-star or similar contest in which one or more of the competing teams is emposed of high school players or players who during the previous

school year were members of a high school team, unless such contest is sanctioned by the Board of Control.

ARTICLE VII — ELIGIBILITY OF CONTESTANTS

SECTION 1. A student shall have been in attendance as many school days as he missed at the opening semester, should his enrollment not have been made the first day of the semester.

SECTION II. He shall not compete for more than four seasons in any one branch of inter-high school contests, provided that competition while in the eighth grade or below, shall not constitute one of the four seasons.

SECTION III. He shall not have participated in a similar contest during the same school year as a member of any other than a high school team.

SECTION IV. He shall not have been at any time a member of a team representing an institution of higher rank than a secondary

SECTION V. He shall be doing passing work in at least fifteen hours per week, the passing grade to be computed from the opening of the semester and relate to such subjects only as severally have a credit values of one-half unit per semester.

NOTE: This means three subjects, each of which is equal to half a credit a semester, on the basis of 16 credits for graduation. We may not add physical training and orchestra fractional credits together, for example.

SECTION VI. He shall not be a graduate of a four year high school course, not a graduate of a senior high school offering three courses comprehending the tenth, eleventh and twelfth grade. Neither shall he compete after having earned credits sufficient to meet the graduating requirements in any course of study prescribed by the school he is to represent unless such credits have been secured in less than eight semesters of school attendance.

SECTION VII. He shall not be over 20 years of age.

SECTION VIII. After attending the first semester of the ninth grade he shall have credit on the school records in the unit-per-year or half-unit-per-semester subjects of at least three half units earned and recorded at the close of the last semester in which he was enrolled as a student, 30 days or more attendance or participation in interscholastic competition within any shorter period being sufficient to constitute enrollment in any semester.

SECTION IX. He shall always have contested under his own name.

SECTION X. He shall have been in attendance in the school he represents for one semester upon transferring from another school, unless his parents have become residents of the school district to which he is transferred or the school from which he is transferred does not offer work of the corresponding year in which he is ranked; and in the instance of a pupil transferred from a public high school to any other high school in the same city or vice versa he shall not be eligible to represent the new high school in the same school year.

NOTE: The following proposed change of this section is to be voted upon at the October, 1950 meeting of the League. Amend by striking out that portion of this rule which is underlined.

HE SHALL HAVE BEEN IN ATTENDANCE IN THE SCHOOL HE REPRESENTS FOR ONE SEMESTER UPON TRANSFERRING FROM ANOTHER SCHOOL, UNLESS HIS PARENTS HAVE BECOME RESIDENTS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO WHICH HE IS TRANFERRED OR THE SCHOOL FROM WHICH HE IS TRANSFERRED DOES NOT OFFER WORK OF THE CORRESPONDING YEAR IN WHICH HE IS RANKED; AND IN THE INSTANCE OF A PUPIL TRANSFERRED FROM A PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL TO ANY OTHER HIGH SCHOOL IN THE SAME CITY OR VICE VERSA HE SHALL NOT BE ELLGIBLE TO REPRESENT THE NEW HIGH SCHOOL IN THE SAME SCHOOL YEAR.

SECTION XI. He shall not use tobacco nor intoxicating liquors during the school terms of two semesters.

NOTE: This has not been cancelled but it has been taken from its position between No. 10 and No. 12 in the list of elegibility rules, and placed along with three other rules in the new High School League Recommended Standards of Eligibility, the entire administration of which, including penalties is left complete within the hands of each local school administration.

The standards are these:

a. Every athlete shall be given a thorough physical examination before the opening of the athletic season.

b. Parental consent shall be secured before the participation of any athlete.

c. Proof in advance shall establish the birthdate of every 9th semester student before participation.

d. Every student participating in interscholastic contests shall abstain from the use of tobacco and alcoholic beverages.

SECTION XII. No student shall participate in any interscholastic contest after his eighth semester in high school unless he is under 18 years of age; nor after his seventh semester if his seventh and eighth are not consecutive.

SECTION XIII. High Schools with an enrollment of seventy-five or less may compete in Class C tournaments or may elect to compete in Class B.

NOTE: The following proposed change of this section is to be voted upon at the October, 1950 meeting of the League.

Rewrite Article VI Section XIII to read as follows:

SCHOOLS WITH A HIGH SCHOOL POPULATION OF 75 AND ABOVE SHALL COMPETE IN CLASS B TOUR-NAMENTS. SCHOOLS WITH A HIGH SCHOOL POPU-LATION OF 56 TO 74 INCLUSIVE MAY ELECT EITHER CLASS B OR CLASS C TOURNAMENT COMPETITION, THIS CHOICE TO BE MADE BY OCTOBER 1st OF THE CURRENT YEAR. SHOULD A SCHOOL IN THIS GROUP ELECT CLASS B, THIS CHOICE MUST BE FOR A THREE YEAR PERIOD. SCHOOLS WITH A HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT POPULATION OF FIFTY-FIVE OR LESS SHALL COMPETE IN CLASS C TOURNAMENTS PROVIDED FURTHER THAT, WHEN THE HIGH SCHOOL POPULATION RISES ABOVE SEVENTY-FIVE OR DROPS BELOW FIFTY-FIVE THAT SCHOOL SHALL HAVE ONE YEAR OF GRACE IN WHICH TO CHOOSE THEIR CLASS OF COMPETITION. THE SCHOOL DIREC-TORY PUBLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL BE USED AS THE BASIS OF

DETERMINING SCHOOL POPULATION.

Amendment to the amendment.

After the words—SHALL COMPETE IN CLASS C TOURNAMENTS—add the following.

HOWEVER, ANY SCHOOL WHICH HAS TRADITION-ALLY PLAYED IN CLASS B TOURNAMENTS MAY PE-TITION THE BOARD OF CONTROL FOR PERMISSION TO CONTINUE PLAYING CLASS B. UPON CONCUR-RENCE OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL SUCH SCHOOL MUST COMPETE IN CLASS B AND CAN CHANGE ITS CLASSIFICATION ONLY UPON TWO YEARS NOTICE TO THE BOARD OF CONTROL.

Minutes of the Board of Control

WAHPETON — JULY 28, 29, 30, 1949

The Board of Control of the State High School League met at Wahpeton July 28, 29, and 30 with all members present.

Upon motion by Van Wyk and seconded by Johnson, it was agreed to budget \$1200 for intra-state travel of the Secretary at seven cents per mile.

Moved by Johnson and seconded by Van Wyk that a budget of \$600.00 for attendance at National meetings be set up for the Secretary. Motion carried.

The Secretary was instructed to insure the office equipment for its face value.

Some time was spent discussing the location and time of football clinics to be conducted by Earl Hoffman and George Schaumberg. It was suggested that clinics be held as follows: By Schaumberg at Dickinson, Minot, Williston, and Bismarck, and by Hoffman at Devils Lake, Grand Forks, Fargo, and Jamestown. It was suggested that these clinics be held in early September as soon as the school term had started.

The Board was present at a demonstration of a mimeograph machine by the Globe Gazette Company and it was agreed to purchase a No. 450 Edison-Dick mimeograph for the League office.

A committee from Fargo consisting of Supt. Harold Kirk, Jack Einiger, Main Schafer, and Bill Hopp met with the Board of Control to invite the Board to place the State Class B tournament in Fargo for 1950. After discussing this problem pro and con for several hours, it was moved and seconded that the B tournament be held at Fargo, provided Fargo could assure the Board of Control that all games would be broadcast over the air and, secondly, that the floor at the Agricultural College be shortened to the standard length for high schools. The Secretary was instructed to meet with the interested parties at Fargo the following Monday and convey this message to them.

The location of the Class C Tournament was discussed at some length as was also the question of what should constitute Class C. A questionaire had formerly been sent to Class C schools to indicate their wishes on whether schools should be compelled to remain in their class. Since this questionaire was not conclusive nor did it show any decided preference one way or another, it was decided

to leave the question open for the League to discuss at their annual meeting in October.

It was agreed to hold the Class C State Tournament in Minot on March 16, 17, and 18, 1950.

The Secretary was instructed to see that the District Class B and C Basketball committees are completed.

The Secretary was instructed to call a meeting of the Class A Schools as soon as convenient after school opens to arrange for the music and speech set-up for the coming year. It was also suggested that a similar plan be followed for Class B and C in music and speech contests; such meetings to be held prior to the meeting of the League in October.

Elmer Johnson and A. C. Van Wyk were delegated to attend the winter meeting of the National Federation as official representatives of the Board of Control.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Minutes of the Board of Control

Minot — October 19-21, 1949

The Board of Control of the State High School League met several times during the N.D.E.A. convention at Minot. All members were present.

The amendments proposed to the Constitution and By-Laws of the High School League were discussed by the Board and it was decided to endorse them to the League membership at their annual meeting. The question of the membership at large position was considered and it was agreed that Mr. Gilliland whose term expires in 1951 would be the member at large. It was further understood that the election of the "C" representatives, should the amendment pass, would be for a one year term only. Thus the terms of the Board would be so staggered that two members would be elected for two times and three members for one time.

It was agreed to make the Grade Insurance Plan retroactive to the beginning of this school year. The question of grade insurance was further discussed and it was agreed to make the extended coverage effective through grades 1 to 8 inclusive. High School insurance would be limited to physical education and the particular sports the school should elect.

Supt. Iverson of Underwood presented an eligibility case for interpretation. Inasmuch as this was a transfer case it was ruled that the lad be ineligible for a semester. Fairmount also had a case on eligibility involving the transfer rule and it was ruled that this lad be ineligible for a semester.

The question of clinics in basketball was discussed at some length and it was the opinion of the Board that these clinics could become more valuable if some coaching angles were also worked into the clinics. Clinics were suggested at Dickinson, Mandan, Grand Forks, Devils Lake and Fargo.

The following men were named to conduct these clinics:

George McCain, Fargo, Official and Al Lanvick, Valley City,
Coach.

Earl Hoffman, Grand Forks, Official and Mel Johnson, Rugby, Coach.

Reuben Hammond, Minot, Official and Art Hovde, Minot Coach.

George Schaumber, Bismarck, Official and Lyle Hill, New Salem, Coach.

The above men were to be sent to Valley City at League expense to the Coaches School over the Thanksgiving recess and return to their communities and conduct the proposed clinics.

Some time was spent going over the referee assignments made in the July meeting and it was found that several men selected at that time could not accept dates because of conflicts.

Hammond, Busse, and V. Nelson of Hanks were assigned to the Dickinson Regional. Herb Parker was assigned to the Bismarck Class A finals. Harry Bridgeford was selected for the Bismarck Class A finals. It was understood that a certain amount of switching might still be necessary before the tournaments were played.

The Superintendents in the tourney centers were named the managers of the events with an Honorarium of \$100 net as a managers fee.

The time of games for the Fargo Tournament was set at 7:30 for the evening games and 2:00 P. M. for the afternoon games.

It was agreed that Van Wyk and Gilliland should be named a committee to set uniform prices for the different tournaments.

The question of radio broadcast was tabled until a later meeting.

Willard Solberg of Hettinger was named to represent North Dakota in the National Football Rules Committee meeting at Santa Monica, California in late December. Melly Johnson of Rugby was named as an alternate in case Mr. Solberg could not go.

It was agreed to follow the recommendations of the Officials Group relative to forming a State Officials Association and the Secretary was instructed to contact the group at the Valley City Coaching School and form committees to work out a constitution and by-laws for this group. It was understood that the League would not pay any expenses of delegates to this meeting.

The Secretary was instructed to write to St. James Academy and Sacred Heart Academy and inform them of the Boards attitude toward Sunday contests. The Board had previously gone on record as opposing Sunday contests for its members and notices to that effect had been printed in the annual handbook and also in the News Letter.

It was agreed to call the C committees in some time in January or February for the purpose of solving some of the C problems, particularly those of redistricting. The Board again reiterated its stand on no relations with non-members.

The question of boys playing on independent baseball teams while still a member of a high school team was discussed and upon motion of Johnson and seconded by Roberts it was agreed that the rule should be strictly enforced that a lad may not be a member of any other than a high school team in baseball, the same as now in football and basketball.

The Board met with the Music Committee chairmen at a luncheon meeting Friday. During the dinner hour several questions were discussed and recommendations were made as follows:

- 1. The list of events should be left as they are.
- 2. Contests should be carried on as they were last year on the state wide basis.
- 3. Motion made that piano solos be included this motion lost.
- 4. Motion made to hold the east state at Devils Lake This also lost.
- 5. Speech contests were to be left as they are unless speech group meeting that afternoon had other recommendations.

Following the meeting with the District Music Committees, the Secretary met with the Speech group of the N.D.E.A. to discuss the speech contests and festivals. The meeting was spent in discussing the relative merit of the formal declamations held for years past and the possibility of including some of the new events in the festivals. The speech group agreed to make certain recommendations as to changes in the speech set-up and deliver these recommendations to the Secretary prior to the Board of Control meeting in December.

The Secretary also met with the Executive Board of the Music Educators Association and the following recommendations were to be presented to the Board of Control of the High School League for their consideration.

- 1. The Music Educators would appoint an advisory committee of three representing class A, B, and C schools to advise with the Board of Control on music matters.
- 2. The Educators Conference enlists the cooperation of the High School League in avoiding the scheduling of athletic events during the two days of the annual N.D.E.A. meeting so that all North Dakota boys and girls may profit by the benefits of taking part in the all-state music activities.
- 3. We recommend that the date deadline for entries in the district and state festival-contests be rigidly adhered to.

Minutes of the Board of Control

Valley City - December 5, 6 1949

The Board of Control of the State High School League met at Valley City on Monday and Tuesday, December 5 and 6, 1949, with all members present. Supt. K. I. Zenner and Supt. Alf Flaten, new C members, were also present.

C. W. Baker of K L P M, Bill Weaver of W D A Y, and E. Fitzimmons of K F Y R met with the board relative to the term

of radio broadcast for the coming year. The matter was discussed at some length and finally Supt. Gilliland moved that all radio broadcasts be open to any and all stations for any part of or all of any tournaments without charge, subject to the interested radio station clearing time and local arrangements with the tournament managers of the respective state tournaments. This motion was seconded by Roberts and duly carried.

A number of eligibility cases were reviewed and acted upon by the Board as follows:

The Baker Case:

32

Baker is a small high school where only two years of high school work is offered in residence. Consequently several boys, who wished to remain at home, arranged to take two or more correspondence subjects through the Department of Supervised

Study at the A. C. Request had been made to rule these lads eligible for participation in interscholastic athletics.

The Board of Control has for years ruled that correspondence study could not be accepted under rule five but is acceptable under rule eight.

Rule five requires that a student must be currently passing in a minimum of fifteen hours per week. A correspondence student progresses at a rate and pace set largely by himself. He is under no obligations to perform a certain amount of work at a given time although it is recommended that he do so. He is not required to complete his work at the end of any given semester as is a student taking subjects in residence. In fact he may begin a course in September and finish it next July. The local teacher has no control over the correspondence student either in selecting the courses or in grading the papers. Normally the unit system is used in which a test is given at the completion of the unit. Completion of these units does not necessarily parallel the six weeks period or any other period of current standing. Hence it is the rule of the Board of Control that correspondence subjects may not be used under rule five and therefore the Baker High School students taking less than three subjects in residence may not be eligible for interscolastic athletics under the High School League rules.

The Cooperstown Case:

A lad whose parents originally lived at Northwood moved with his parents to Devils Lake where his father entered the trade of a carpenter. He worked for a construction concern and found it necessary to move frequently, sometimes once a month. In order to secure schooling for his son in a location where he could attend without moving around, the father arranged to leave the lad with an uncle at Cooperstown where he could remain and attend school without the frequent interruptions caused by frequent moving of the parents. The question raised - when will this lad be eligible to participate in interscholastic athletics?

The Board of Control agrees that the family did the best thing for the lad in making arrangements for the lad to attend school where he could continue his schooling without the interruptions caused by frequent moving of the family. However the League rule makes no provision for economic or social necessity. Two conditions and only two permit a lad to transfer schools and become immediately eligible for inter-scholastic competition. First, when the parents move the lad may move with them and become immediately eligible in his new location and secondly, when the school no longer offers the work in the year in which the lad is enrolled, he may seek a new high school and become immediately eligible.

Neche Case:

A lad, whose home conditions became unlivable due to personal habits of members of the home, came to Neche to live with a relative. His parents had been divorced several years ago but the lad had lived with the father. For the best interests of the lad, it was arranged that he should come to North Dakota and live with a relative. The question raised — when will this lad be eligible?

Here again the same reasoning may be applied as in the case above. Economic and social necessity made the move desirable and even necessary but the rule does not permit the lad to become eligible until the second semester.

Supt. Gilliland presented the case for Junior High Schools and asked the Board to make an interpretation.

When the rules were drawn up no Junior High Schools existed in the state. Now several of the larger cities have a definite organization consisting of grades 7-8-9. Some Junior High Schools carry as many as seven subjects, some of which are taken three or four times a week and thus have a credit value of less than one half unit. The Board agreed to permit Junior High Schools with this plan to add the basic subject hours together and declare a lad in the ninth grade eligible if he could show that he was passing in fifteen hours made up of more than three regular subjects. Thus a subject carried three times a week would be three hours, one carried four times a week would be four hours .To be eligible he must be passing in the fifteen hours. Physical education or music carried two hours a week are not to be counted in computing his total.

The question also arose as to those students who failed the ninth grade. Should this be counted as a semester in high school? The Board agreed that any student that carried two or more subjects in the ninth grade must be considered a ninth grader and a year of high school counted against him if he is repeating the ninth grade.

The allowance made New Salem at the regional and state tournament last year was reviewed by the Board of Control at the request of Supt. Hill of New Salem. The Board was of the opinion that they should have an additional allowance for the regional tournament inasmuch as they played the first game and hence it was necessary for them to come early and be ready for that game. The Secretary was directed to send New Salem a check for \$21.00 to compensate them for the additional expense. No change was made in the state tourney allowance as they were paid for the time they were present at the tournament.

One vacancy appeared in the officials list for the state final Class A tournament at Bismarck, F. W. Bierhaus of Moorhead was named for this position and the secretary instructed to contact him. This was done later and Mr. Bierhaus accepted the offer. The Board reviewed the allowance for teams at the regional and state tournaments and set the following schedule of payments to be used in figuring the team expenses at these tournaments:

Transportation is to be 50 cents per one way mile per tem or actual bus or railroad fare if they choose to travel in that manner.

Board and lodging shall be \$4.50 per day for a total of twelve men for the actual time necessary to be present at the tourney. In the event of a part day for meals the daily allowance shall be allocated on the basis of \$3.00 for meals and \$2.50 for rooms. A team shall be limited to ten men dressed for play. The other two men allowed may be for student manager or any other man the school wishes to take along.

The question of whether the Class B regionals should be eight or four team regionals was also discussed by the Board and it was agreed that the Board has intended that all Class B regionals for 1950 should be eight team affairs. This is evidenced by the selection of three officials for each regional and also by the fact that the Board had formerly agreed to send the teams from the different districts.

The Board spent some time discussing the proper amount to allow for expenses for officials at the state sponsored tournaments. The following schedule was agreed upon:

Mileage—7 cents per mile for one-nine cents when two officials together and 10 cents when three ride together or actual railroad or bus fare if they choose to use that method of travel.

Hotel-\$3.50 per day and meals \$4.00 per day.

It was moved by Gilliland and seconded by Van Wyk that we eliminate the selection of all tournament teams at the state sponsored tournaments and all participation awards be limited to the final state tournaments. The motion carried.

The Board also went on record with a recommendation that all coaches of league schools refuse to participate in the selection of any all state teams in either football or basketball.

Considerable time was spent in discussing what trophies to purchase for the tournaments. It was agreed that purchases would be made as follows:

First-second-third-fifth places are to be awarded trophies in the Class A Divisionals.

First-second-third and fourth places shall be awarded at the state finals in each of the Class A-B-C tournaments.

Participation awards are to be made to all teams in the state finals in each class. The first and second place teams shall be awarded gold and silver balls and the other six teams in each tourney shall be awarded regular participation awards.

Upon motion of Van Wyk and seconded by Johnson it was agreed to purchase certificates for all district and state winners if honor ratings in speech and music contests or festivals.

The State Track Meet was set at Valley City on May 27, 1950, with the district meets to be held the week previous.

The District Track Meets were set at the following sites — Dickinson, Bismarck, Minot, Williston, Devils Lake, Grand Forks, Fargo, and Jamestown. The Class qualifying meets were set at four of the above centers — Minot, Bismarck, Devils Lake, and Fargo. It was agreed that the four meets would be strictly Class B and C Meets and those designated as A centers would be meets held for the two classes run separately for each class. The district managers were designated as the superintendents in the centers except in Minot, Dickinson, and Jamestown where the college coaches would serve as managers.

First and second place winners at each meet would qualify for the state final meet at Valley City. Three entrants may be made for each event in the district meets, District awards shall be first, second, and third places. State awards shall be for first, second, third, and fourth places in the thirteen events. ayan mada a san madawa Milaya Marakin Jewister.

Trophies were ordered as follows:

First and second place school awards for the district winners. First, second, third, fourth place awards for the state meet. First place award for the two relays.

It was agreed to separate the golf and tennis tournament from the state track meet and hold it at a different time to be later sel-

Supts. Flaten and Zenner were appointed a committee of two ected. to submit an amendment to the League Constitution to stabilize the C Basketball and to submit this amendment in time to be printed in the January News-Letter for final action at the February meeting of the League. This was moved by Johnson and seconded by Roberts.

It was moved and seconded that we invite the Class B and C District Chairmen to their respective state tournaments for conference on their district problems.

Supts. Van Wyk and Gilliland offered the following schedule of prices to be charged at the state regional and final tournaments:

Supts. Zenner and Flaten were also instructed to work with the Secretary and submit possible C districts for 1951 at the winter meeting in February.

Upon motion of Gilliland and seconded by Roberts the Secretary was directed to notify schools of the League that a meeting of the League would be called at the winter meeting of the League of those schools that are interested in forming a Girls Athletic Association affiliated with the State High School League to supervise, promote and regulate girls athletics on a school and interschool basis.

Supt. Van Wyk offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. It was seconded by Roberts and carried.

Whereas, churches depend on the free time of children for the teaching of sectarian religion and will find their program seriously disrupted by Sunday interscholastic athletic contests, and,

Whereas, the Board of Control of the North Dakota High School League feels that the schools are under an obligation to cooperate with the churches and to reserve at least one day every week when the schools will not monopolize the children's time, and

Whereas, Sunday interscholastic athletic contests force some high school students to choose between loyalty to the teaching of their parents and church concerning the Sabbath Day and loyalty to their schools and their fellow students, and

Whereas, the Board of Control of the North Dakota High School League feels that it is poor educational policy to force such completely unnecessary conflicts of loyalty upon students by conducting interscholastic contests on the Sabbath Day.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Board of Control of the High School League of the State of North Dakota, that the members of the North Dakota High School League refrain from scheduling high school athletic contests on the Sabbath Day.

Golf awards for the state Golf Tourney were authorized as follows:

First, second, third place for doubles.

First, second, third place for singles.

Tennis awards were authorized on the same basis for singles and doubles.

The State Speech and Music Contests were set as follows:

West State Contest at Bismarck on Friday, May 12

East State Contest at Grand Forks on Friday, May 12

N. D. HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE

Upon motion of Johnson and seconded by Roberts the recommendations of the speech teachers made at the Minot NDEA meeting were adopted as follows:

- 1. Miss West is to appoint a committee to compile a list of recommended but "not required" plays.
 - 2. The same committee is to set a time limit on plays.
- 3. The former categories of humerous, serious, and poetry be dropped and that all of the Interpretative Reading should be one division to be known as Interpretative Reading of Literature.
- 4. Miss West is to appoint an Interpretation Committee to set a time limit on Interpretation selections, and to compile a list of suggested materials for Interpretation selections.
- 5. In the Interpretation division, the book of manuscript may be used, but the selection is prepared thoroughly in advance.
- 6. A maximum of 4 students from each school be sent to the festivals in the Interpretation division since the former four categories of Interpretation have been done away with. Literature may be any kind: humorous, serious, prose, poetry, etc.
 - 7. The oratory division should include only original oratory.
- 8. In the original oratory division, the oration would not have to be memorized.
- 9. A new division should be added in panel discussions. Mr. Abrahamson mentioned there is already an Extemporaneous Committee which decides Extemporaneous division topics, time limits, etc. This same committee should decide panel topics, time limits and number of contestants on each panel. At this point, it was informally suggested that last year there were too many topics; the number should be reduced to 12. Also informally suggested was that since 2 of the Committee members are superintendents, the 3rd should be a speech teacher for extemporaneous speaking and discussion (panel) groups.
- 10. It was moved and passed to wait until next year to discuss the inclusion of radio activities.
- Supt. M. B. Zimmerman was delegated to attend the National Meeting of Speech Teachers at Chicago on December 28-29-30 or select some one else to attend in his place.

The following were designated a committee to make final selection of trophies from the Balfour and Josten Companies—Supt. Alf Flaten, Supt. E. C. Johnson, Supt. M. B. Zimmerman. Trophies were

Minutes of the Board of Control

Bismarck — February 5, 6, 1950

The Board of Control of the North Dakota State High School League met at Bismarck at the Grand Pacific Hotel on February 5 and 6 with all members present.

Mr. Walter Sherman of the Balfour Company met with the Board and submitted designs for certificates to be awarded at the District and State Music and Speech Contests. The Secretary was instructed to work out the details with Mr. Sherman and have a sufficient number of certificates prepared to meet the needs for the contests. It was agreed to award a first and second place trophy to the schools winning first and second places in the East and West Debate Contests.

The Board reviewed the distribution of registration fees for the Class B and A Music and Speech Contests and made the following changes in the distribution of registration fees.

- 1. The fees received from the B and C contests in each district were to be distributed back to the district managers of each of the eight districts at the ratio of two-thirds to the districts and one-third to remain for financing the state final contests at Bismarck and Grand Forks.
- 2. Debate contests should be underwritten to the extent of \$75.00 for each of the two debate contests inasmuch as the fees from debate are not sufficient to cover the costs of operating the contests.
- 3. Fees from the Class A registrations from the various events should be sent to the managers of the different events on the basis of the amounts received for the different classes of competition. Thus fees received from vocal music registrations would go to the vocal contests. Fees received from instrumental registrations would go to the instrumental contests, etc.

The question of moving the Dickinson Regional Class B Tournament was discussed by the Board and it was agreed that the site should remain unchanged inasmuch as Dickinson assured the Board that they could accommodate all teams and any reasonable number of fans in the ten motels in the city.

The Board of Control also studied the survey on rule changes for the Class A Tournaments. Thirteen coaches had answered the questionaire sent out from the Secretary's office. Nine coaches were in favor of changing the rules in such a manner that two free throws would be awarded for each foul during the last three minutes of play and the ball would be played after the second attempt as it is in the other part of the game.

Four coaches were not in favor of making the change in rules for one reason or another. The Board was of the opinion that with this divided vote the rules should be left as they are at present for all tournament play.

Mr. F. H. Gilliland and the Secretary were authorized to revise the free schedule and the benefit payments of the Athletic Benefit Fund to increase the amount and the scope of the benefits for the coming year.

The locations of the golf and tennis tournaments were discussed at some length and upon motion by Van Wyk and seconded by Gilliland it was voted to hold the Golf Tournament at Valley City on Saturday, June 3. It was also agreed that this tourney would be open to as many eligible boys as wished to take part. Each school could send as many entries as they chose.

The Tennis Tournament was set for Wahpeton on Saturday, June 3. Each school may enter one team and two singles in this tourney. Appropriate awards were formerly selected for these events.

Draws were made for the four Class B Region to be announced as soon as district pairings have been made.

The Board of Control spent considerable time discussing possible ways and means of handling girls basketball. Various plans were considered and it was agreed that the best way would be to authorize girls basketball under league direction for Class C schools. It was agreed to appoint a committee to fully explore the problem and survey the wishes of the Class C schools as to type of tournaments to be held, to what level the tourneys should be carried, rules to be used and any other problems with definite recommendations in sufficient time to announce a definite program to go into effect for the next school term.

The Board of Control agreed to meet at the B and C tournaments with the representatives of the respective districts relative to their district problems.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Minutes of the Board of Control

Minot — March 17, 18, 19, 1950

The Board of Control assembled in Minot to meet with the representatives of the Class C schools. All eight districts were represented either by the district chairman or by some other committee man from the district.

The Committee met on Friday and Saturday and made the following recommendations:

- 1. For 1951 there should be 32 districts for basketball with and eight regional playoff with the winners of the eight regionals entering the state basketball tournament.
- 2 That the representatives attending this meeting preside at the fall meetings in which the district committes will be selected.
- 3. That the Board of Control take such action as it can to carry out the intent of the amendments presented at the last league meeting.
- 4. That the matter of limiting the number of games that may be played by member schools be tabled for one year.
- 5. That the uniformity of officials fees is desirable for all tournaments of equal grade.

42

- 6. That all member schools encourage their officials to be members of the North Dakota Officials Association.
- 7. That the present eligibility rules for contestants are satisfactory and no revision need be made at this time.
- 8. That all Class C tournament entry fees be uniform and be set at \$3.00.
- 9. That the deadline for class declaration be made uniform over the state and be set at November 1.
- 10. That December 1 be the date set for paying of the tourney entry fee. Any exception to this rule should be left up to the district committee.
- 11. That the Board of Control sponsor and promote the Class C regionals in the same manner as they now do Class B regionals.
- 12. That the district representatives endorse the amendments submitted to the league at the last meeting.
- 13. That more basketball clinics be held at more sites so that more territory can be covered and more uniformity result in the interpretation of the rules by the officials.
- 14. That the representatives of the various districts picked by the Board of Control to attend the Valley City Clinic be alternated among the various coaches and officials in the district.
- 15. That, once a workable district plan has been arrived at, a team wishing to play in a different district than that in which it is placed, must secure the consent of the Board of Control and the districts concerned. If a change in district is granted, the school must remain in that district unless changed by the Board of Control.

The above recommendations were approved upon motion of Funk of Willow City and seconded by Robinson of Tolley and presented to the Board of Control.

No further business was done by the Board of Control at the Minot meeting because of a lack of a voting quorum. The Board adjourned to meet at the Class B Tourney at Fargo the following week.

Minutes of the Board of Control Meeting

Fargo, March 23, 24, 25, 1950

The Board of Control met at the Powers Hotel in Fargo with all members except Gilliland and Roberts present.

Representatives of the eight Class B districts were present and met on both Friday and Saturday. The B representatives submitted the following recommendations to the Board of Control.

- 1. That the present Class B regions remain unchanged for the next year.
- 2. That the deadline for the individual school's declaration of class as well as petition for transfer from one district to another shall be November 1.
- 3. That the Board of Control recommend that the maximum number of games to be played by any school including tournaments between November 30 and the district tournament or first state elimination tournament shall be 18 games.
- 4. That the present four regional qualifications in Class B remain in effect another year.
- 5. That the Board of Control attempt to set up a uniform scale for the payment of tournament officials, either per game or per diem taking into consideration travel expense and also the length or duration, i. e. whether the tournament is two or three days in length, etc.
- 6. That the present officials clinics be continued, and that, if possible 16 area clinics, available to all officials representing all schools regardless of classification, be set up in the state with a view toward improving basketball officiating.

The recommendations of the committee were received and placed on file for future board action.

The Board discussed at some length the problem of C districts for 1950-51 and agreed to accept the general plan of 32 districts with a regional play-offs to qualify for the state Class C tourney of eight teams.

The Board also voted to accept the general plan of 16 districts for the girls basketball for Class C schools with eight regional playoffs to enter the state tourney.

Stan Kostka of the Johnson Sporting Goods Company of Fargo met with the Board relative to the purchase of balls for the 1951 tourney season. A letter was also read from George Mellem of Minot bidding for some of the ball business.

It was voted to defer the purchase of balls until the summer meeting of the Board. The Board studied the problem of basketball tournaments for the 1951 season and set the following dates for the tournaments.

March 1, 2, 3, 1951

The possibility of a summer state baseball tournament for high schools was discussed and the secretary instructed to survey the schools to find out the number that would be interested. Should there be sufficient interest this tourney would be held in early July or late June.

The Board agreed to waive the eligibility rule so that high school boys could participate on the Junior American Legion Team and also play on the high school team.

E. Abrahamson was elected secretary for the coming year at a 10% increase in salary.

The summer meeting of the Board was set at Valley City on June 8 and 9. There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Minutes of the Board of Control Meeting

Valley City, June 8, 9, 1950

The Board of Control of the High School League met in the office of the Secretary at Valley City, North Dakota, on June 8 and 9. 1950, with all members present.

It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Van Wyk that the rules be waived to permit the new C members full voting privileges at this meeting. The constitution provides for new members to be seated July 1 following their election. The motion was carried.

The Board proceeded to study the recommendations made by the executive committee of the North Dakota Officials Association. The following recommendations of this group were adopted to become effective for the coming year:

- 1. The Secretary was instructed to set up a series of sites for the officials examinations to be given on the designated dates by the National Federation in the sports and football and basketball. Form one of the national examination is to be sent out to the officials as they register to be used as a study guide for the mastery of the rules in the respective sports.
- 2. It was moved by Van Wyk and seconded by Johnson and carried that all officials used by Class A schools be registered officials for the sports of basketball and football. It was also agreed to recommend that Class B and C schools use registered officials whenever possible. Thus, the use of registered officials is mandatory for Class A schools and recommended for Class B and C schools.
- 3. Upon motion of Johnson and seconded by Flaton, it was agreed to pay expenses for a maximum of two meetings of the executive committee of the North Dakota Officials Association per year.
- 4. The Board of Control adopted the insignia recommended by the executive committee of the North Dakota Officials Association and the Secretary was instructed to order a sufficient number to supply all registered officials upon receipt of their membership dues.
- 5. The Board approved the recipocity agreement made between South Dakota and Minnesota whereby officials of these states would be authorized to work games in these states without joining the state association of the resective states and upon the payment of fifty cents reciprocity fee. Under this arrangement, residents of North Dakota would be fully authorized to work games in either Minnesota or South Dakota upon the payment of this reciprocity

fee. Officials from South Dakota and Minnesota would have the same privileges in North Dakota upon payment of a similar fee in their own state.

6. It was agreed to defer the rating of officials in North Dakota for the current year.

The Board spent some time discussing the new Class C set-up and adopted the plan of eight regional tournaments with the four district winners taking part in each region. The winner of each region would qualify for the state final tournament in basketball to be held at Minot on March 15, 16, 17, 1951.

Sites were set up as follows and the Secretary instructed to contact the towns and make arrangements for these regions.

- 1. Lisbon
- 2. Hillsboro or Mayville
- 3. Park River or Langdon
- 4. New Rockford or Devils Lake

It was moved by Flaten and seconded by Van Wyk that the girl's rules as recommended by the special girl's committee be adopted and the Secretary instructed to proceed with the printing of a girl's rule book. The motion was carried.

It was moved by Van Wyk and seconded by Zenner that the girls state tournament be held at Casselton on March 5, 6, 7, 1951.

The Secretary and manager of the girl's state tournament were authorized to obtain suitable officials for the state tournament.

The matter of basketball and football clinics throughout the state was the next item of business. It was agreed to select two men to attend the Grand Forks Coaching School August 14, 15, 16, 1951, and return to their respective areas and conduct rules clinics for the coaches and officials. The names of W. D. Allen of Minot and Earl Hoffman of Grand Forks were submitted to attend the coaching school at Grand Forks. The Secretary was instructed to select three officials to attend the Valley City Coaching School in late November. These three men would return to their areas and conduct basketball rules clinics.

It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Flaten that fall

football practice be authorized to open on Monday, August 21, 1950. The motion carried.

The matter of sanctioning the proposed Edison-Marshall-Bismarck-Minot basketball games during the Thanksgiving recess was discussed at some length and upon motion of Zenner and seconded by Roberts these contests were approved. The Secretary was instructed to apply to the National Federation for final sanction of these contests.

At the time the Board proceeded to organize itself for the coming 1950-51 year. Supt. M. B. Zimmerman was elected president and John Roberts was named vice-president.

Walter Sherman, representative of the Balfour Company, and R. O. Gregerson, representative of the Jostens Company, met jointly with the Board to submit a design or seal to be applied to all trophies and medals awarded by the League. It was decided to adopt the design submitted by the Balfour Company consisting of an outline of the state of North Dakota under a wreath within a circle. Under the terms of the offer made by both companies, the cost of this design would be absorbed by the companies concerned in consideration of a five year contract to purchase trophies from these two companies. The Secretary was instructed to enter into this five year contract with the Balfour and Josten Companies for the purchase of trophies and medals by the League.

Plans for the 1951 state and district track meets was the next item of business. The Board voted to retain the present Class A and B divisions with eight districts for the Class B schools. The number of qualifying meets for Class A schools was cut from four to two with Bismarck and Fargo selected as the sites for the Class A qualifying meets.

The State Track Meet was awarded to Valley City on May 26, 1951.

The plan of keeping the state golf and tennis meets separate and distinct from the state track meet was also discussed and it was agreed to hold the State Golf Meet at Valley City. The exact date of this event was not made at this time as the opinion was expressed that the meet should be held in August just prior to the opening of the fall football practice.

The State Tennis Tourney was placed at Wahpeton at a date to be determined later. It was agreed that a change in the rules should be made in this event so that the same boy could not enter in both the singles and doubles.

The time and location of the state music and speech contests were the next items of business. Upon motion Grand Forks and

Bismarck were named as sites for the state music and speech contests to be held May 11, 1951. It was agreed to use the same plan of awards—namely certificates for the district and state music and speech contests and a cup for the winner of the debate event. Duplicate certificates for solos were recommended so that the individual could have one certificate and one certificate be left in the school.

A delegation from Fargo met with the Board to extend an invitation for the Class A finals. This delegation indicated that they were not interested in sponsoring the Class B tournament. The Board of Control considered the invitations from the towns interested in tournaments and the available facilities for conducting tournaments. Upon motion by Van Wyk and seconded by Roberts, the East Class A tournament was awarded to Fargo and the West Class A to Bismarck. (Dates, March 1, 2, 3, 1951.)

Upon motion by Johnson and seconded by Van Wyk, the state Class A finals was awarded to Bismarck on March 8, 9, 10, 1951.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Johnson that the Class B State Tourney be held at Bismarck on March 15, 16, 17. The motion carried.

Upon motion by Flaten and seconded by Zenner, it was agreed to place the State Class C Tournament at Minot on March 15, 16, 17.

The Class B regional sites were selected at Dickinson, Minot, Devils Lake. Region 1 appeared to again have a conflict with the Valley City Winter Show. If that date could not be cleared, the Secretary was delegated to make other arrangements to hold the Class B Region 1 tourney at Fargo or some other suitable site.

Fees for the Class B regions were set at \$100 plus expenses.

The officials for the eight Class C regions were not selected at this time ut the Secretary was instructed to contact the local Officials Association for their recommendations for acceptable officials for these events. The eight Class C regions are four game night affairs and the fee for these contests was set at \$50.00 plus expenses.

The purchase of balls for the respective tournaments was discussed at some length and the Secretary was instructed to advertise for bids for the necessary balls. All bids were to specify the top grade molded ball as manufacutred by Goldsmith, Spaulding, Wilson, Reach, or Rawlings or the equivalent. Bids would be opened at the October meeting of the Board of Control.

The Athletic Benefit Fund was discussed at some length and the Board voted to extend the insurance to cover all school activities

for grades one to twelve inclusive. Supt. Gilliland and the Secretary were designated as a committee to revise the benefit schedule and the rate schedule for the various classes of coverages.

It was moved, seconded and duly carried that the deadline for declaration of Class B or C must be done by schools by November 1st.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Minutes of the Board of Control Meeting

Minot, October 20, 1949

The North Dakota State High School League held the annual fall meeting in the Junior High School Study Hall in Minot at 4:00 P. M. on Thursday, October 20, 1949. This was one of the largest meetings ever held by the League and the study hall was full. It is estimated 200 school men were present.

A short synopsis of the minutes of the 1948 meeting was passed out to schools and upon motion of Jordahl and seconded by several it was agreed that the reading of the minutes be waived.

Attention was also called to the fact that a complete financial report of the past years activities as audited and found correct were printed in the annual handbook. An oral report of the current financial status was given by the Secretary.

President Zimmerman took up the question of the several proposed amendments. The Amendment to Article III Section I was taken up and read by the Secretary.

AMEND ARTICLE I TO READ:

There shall be a Board of Control, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of seven members chosen at the annual fall meeting of League for terms of three years, each new member to be seated July first following his election. Two members shall be chosen from Class A schools, two from Class B schools, two from Class C schools, and one member shall be elected at large. Should any member change schools into a different class, his position shall immediately be declared vacant and a new member selected to fill the vacancy at the next meeting of the League. An executive Secretary-Treasurer shall be selected by the Board of Control to serve at the pleasure of the Board.

Supt. Gludt of Killdeer moved the adoption of the amendment. This was seconded by Supt. Olson of Lisbon. After a discussion the question was called for and the adoption of the amendment was duly passed.

ADD ARTICLE V SECTION I:

The time and place of the regular meetings of representatives shall be those of the meeting of the school administrators of the state and of the North Dakota Education Association, the hours and rooms being designated by the Board of Control.

Supt. Quam of Oakes moved the adoption of this amendment. This was seconded by Supt. Stewart of Stanley. After a discussion this amendment was also adopted.

ADD SECTION XIII TO ARTICLE V:

No athletic director, coach, principal, teacher or other official of a member school or any athletic official registered with the North Dakota State High School League shall assist, either directly or indirectly, with the coaching, management, direction, selection of players, promotion, or officiating of any all-star or similar contest in which one or more of the competing teams is composed of high school players or players who during the previous school year were members of a high school team, unless such contest is sanctioned by the Board of Control.

Supt. Reitan of Larimore moved the adoption of this amendment and it was seconded by Hagen of Dickinson. Again after a discussion the question was called for and the amendments adoption was carried.

ADD SECTION XIV TO ARTICLE V:

The football season shall be concluded on the last Friday of November and the basketball season shall be concluded at the end of the final tournament and no game may be scheduled to be played after the official close of the season.

Motion was made by Supt. Johnson of Rock Lake and seconded by Prin. Bjorlie of Minot Model, that the amendment be adopted. This amendment was discussed for some time and Supt. Havig of Williston moved that the amendment be tabled. This was seconded by Supt. Welsh of Lansford and passed and the amendment was declared tabled.

Supt. Zimmerman then called for new business and Supt. Zenner offered the following resolution which was seconded by Dooley of Reeder.

"Schools with a student population of 75 and above shall compete in Class B Tournaments. Schools with a student popu-

lation of 56 to 74 may elect either Class B or Class C Tournament competition, this choice to be made by October 1. Should schools in this group elect Class B, the choice must be for a three year period. Schools with a student population of 55 or less shall compete in Class C Tournaments. Provided further that when school population rises above 75 or drops below 55 that school shall have one year of grace to choose their class of competition."

Then followed a spirited discussion led by Supt. Welsh of Lansford. After a lengthy discussion entered into by several the question was called for and the vote was found to be 63 yes and 23 no. The resolution was declared carried.

n. b.

Subsequent to the League meeting a number of interested parties met with the Board of Control and protested the constitutionality of the proceedings. It was found that Section XIII added to Article VI two years ago permitted high schools with an enrollment of 75 or less to compete in either Class B or Class C Tournaments. The Board of Control agreed a technical error had been committed and any change affecting the present status of B and C Tournaments would have to be submitted through an amendment which requires a first reading thirty days before the second reading and vote thereon. The resolution was therefore declared null and void until such time as changed through constitutional amendment. It will be noted that under the resolution passed only a certain number of C schools would be given the right to elect either B or C tournaments while those under 55 in enrollment would be designated Class C with no choice.

Supt. R. S. Bishop of Hebron introduced the following resolution which would recommend to the Board of Control that an A and B Class Track Meet be set up with Class A schools being kept separate from Class B and C.

RECOMMENDATION TO THE BOARD OF CONTROL OF THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE

Whereas in the past the current system of holding the various Track Meets throughout the state to which all schools are admitted, regardless of size of enrollment, seems to favor the large schools and is therefore unsatisfactory to the smaller schools,

Be It Therefore Proposed that the Board of Control work out a plan for the separation of the Class A schools from smaller schools in the district and state meets. Such separation would not only greatly stimulate interest in track among the many small schools in the state but would bring about keener competition among the Class A schools.

Suggestions which may aid in developing a workable plan are as follows:

- 1. That district track meet sites remain as they are for all but Class A schools.
- 2. That for the Class A schools, the districts be combined to form either four or six new districts, located advantageously from a geographical standpoint.
- 3. That events at the state meet be run simultaneously in the afternoon, with separate fields for morning preliminaries, if necessary.
- 4. That qualifying meets, records, and requirements be left as they now are.
- 5. That in those district meets, sites where both Class A and other schools compete, separate events be run as in the state meet.
- 6. That for economy, a double set of less elaborate trophies and awards for winners of state meets be provided.
- 7. That no separation of Class B and C schools be attempted at this time to enable the program to become effective in the spring meets of 1950.

The amendment was seconded by several and discussed at some length. The question was called for and the motion was carried, 46 yes to 22 no.

There being no further business called for at the time, President Zimmerman called for the report of the nominating committee.

The nominating committee consisting of Supt. Falkenstein of Rolla, Supt. Havig of Williston, and Supt. Gurley of Tower City, submitted the names of Supt. John Roberts of Hettinger and Supt. E. C. Johnson of Kenmare to succeed themselves. Nominations were called for from the floor and none were submitted. A unanimous ballot was then cast for Johnson and Roberts for the three year term.

The chair again called on the nominating committee to recommend someone for the two new C positions created by the passing of the new amendment to the constitution. President Zimmerman explained to the group that Supt. Gilliland had volunteered to assume the position of member at large as provided in the new amendment and in order to equalize the number of openings each year that the

new C members would be elected for a one year term so that three new members could be named at next years election. The committee nominated Supt. Alf Flaten of Alexander and Supt. Kenneth Zenner of Ryder. Nominations were again called for from the floor and none were offered, and the report of the nominating committee was accepted and Zenner and Flaten declared elected for the one vear term.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned a few minutes before 6:00 P. M.

Minutes of the State High School League

Bismarck, February 7, 1950, At 3:00 P. M.

The meeting of the High School League was called to order by President Zimmerman in the Hearing Room of the State Capitol Building.

The reading of the fall meeting minutes was waived as all members had received a complete record of the proceedings of this meeting through the monthly News-Letters.

A count was made of the member schools present and this count indicated about 60 members present. Nearly two hundred had been present during previous sessions of the School Administrators but evening basketball games and weather reports had apparently caused many members to begin their trip home.

Several amendments were to have been presented at this meeting but according to the Constitution there was not a constitutional majority present to act on amendments. President Zimmerman announced the lack of this majority and this item of business was deferred until the next meeting of the League.

President Zimmerman explained in detail the proposal of the Board to promote and sponsor girls basketball for the Class C schools and to appoint an advisory committee of five to fully explore the problem and make definite recommendations as to the plan to be put into effect for the next school year.

Upon motion by Reitan and seconded by Jordahl the Board was authorized to proceed with this plan. After a general discussion the motion was carried.

President Zimmerman announced the following committee to serve in an advisory capacity to make this survey:

North Dakota Officials Association

The following constitution and by-laws were adopted at a meeting in Fargo during the Class B Tournament, March 18.

The following officers were elected: District 1, Larry Schneider, Fargo; District 2, Earl Hoffman, Grand Forks; District 3, R. Ferderer, Mandan; District 4, Reuben Hammond, Minot. The directors met and organized electing Earl Hoffman President and Reuben Hammond, Vice-President. Arrangements were made for the Board of Directors to meet at Valley City during the State Track Meet.

CONSTITUTION

Article I-Name

The name of this organization shall be the North Dakota Officials Association.

Article II-Objects

The object of this association shall be to further the best interests of athletics'

- By aiding the officials, coaches, and players in acquiring a thorough knowledge of the playing rules of the various sports.
- 2. By promoting uniformity in the mechanics of officiating.
- 3. By encouraging observance of the spirit and letter of playing rules and ethical codes on all occasions.
- 4. To obtain due recognition to the art of officiating by the public and school officials.
- 5. To secure recognition for the training and experience of the officials of the state.

Article III—Membership

Section I:

Any man of good character desiring to qualify as an official may present his application to the Secretary with the necessary fee and the recommendation of two or more men actively associated with athletics, one of which must be a member of this organization.

Section 2:

Any official failing to meet the requirements provided in the by-laws will cease to be a member.

Section 3:

The membership year shall be from August 1 to July 31.

Article IV-Management

Section I—Executive Committee:

- 1. The operation and management of the Association shall be vested in the Executive Committee which shall be composed of five men.
- 2. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for the execution of the mandates of the membership and for the general direction of the policies and activities of the Association and shall represent the organization in the activities undertaken in the cooperation with other athletic organizations.
- 3. In the event a member of the Board of Directors can not be present at any meeting of the Board, he is authorized to appoint a proxy from his district to serve in his place.

Section 2-Mode of Election:

1. The election of the Executive Committee shall be at the annual business meeting to be held at the State Class B Basketball Tournament.

- 2. The state shall be divided into four districts and one executive committee member shall be elected from each district and one at large.
- 3. Nominations for Executive Committee members shall be made by the districts and voted upon by the membership at large. The majority of the votes cast by those present shall prevail.
 - 4. Districts shall be determined by counties as follows:

District 1 — SE — Kidder, Stutsman, Foster, Griggs, Steele, Traill, Cass, Barnes, Richland, Ransom, Sargent, Dickey, La-Moure, Logan, McIntosh.

District 2 — NE — Grand Forks, Pembina, Walsh, Cavalier, Ramsey, Towner, Rolette, Pierce, Benson, Nelson, Eddy, Wells.

District 3 — SW — Emmons, Burleigh, Morton, Oliver, Mercer, McLean, Dunn, Billings, Golden Valley, Stark, Slope, Bowman, Hettinger, Adams, Grant, Sioux.

District 4 — NW — Divide, Burke, Williams, Renville, Mountrail, Ward, McHenry, Bottineau, McKenzie, Sheridan.

Section 3-Term:

1. The term of each member of the Executive Committee shall be for two years and they shall take office August 1 following their election. Districts one and three shall select their members in the odd years and districts two and four in the even years.

Section 4:

- 1. The Executive Committee shall immediately after election meet and select one of their number to serve as president and one to serve as vice-president.
- 2. In case of vacancy created by removal from the district, non-membership or resignation, the remaining members of the Executive Committee shall fill the unexpired term of such member by appointent.
- 3. Three members of the Executive Committee shall be considered a quorum and the majority vote of those present shall prevail.

Section 5:

1. The Secretary of the North Dakota State High School League shall serve as Secretary of the Association.

Article V—Amendments

Section 1:

Amendments to the constitution and by-laws of this organization as adopted may be made:

- 1. By a majority of those present at any regularly called meeting of the Association providing a quorum of one sixth of the membership is present and further provided that 24 hours must elapse between the first reading and the final vote for any amendment.
- 2. By a majority vote of those voting in the event of the mailing of the ballots to the members of the Association.

BY-LAWS

Article 1—Dues

The annual Dues to the Association shall be as follows:

\$2.00 for one sport

\$1.00 for each additional sport

The executive committee of the North Dakota Officials Association met at Valley City on June 3rd, 1950, with all members present.

Upon motion by Bridgeford and seconded by Schneider it was agreed that Earl Hoffman should submit a code of ethics for the association.

The Board studied samples of emblems used by the different state associations and agreed to recommend to the Board of Control the purchase of an emblem which would utilize the outline of the state of North Dakota.

It was agreed to recommend to the Board of Control that the Athletic Benefit Fund be extended to include registered officials.

The executive committee adopted the following uniform or dress for officiating:

Basketball:

A black and white striped shirt to be worn with dark colored trousers.

Football:

White knickers with black stockings. If cap is used it should be red or black.

The matter of examinations in football and basketball was discussed and it was agreed to recommend that the part one of the examinations be sent out with the supplies upon registration for study by the officials. It was the opinion of this committee that the matter of examinations should be optional at this time.

The executive committee agreed to recommend to the Board of Control that registered officials be required for Class A schools and recommended for Class B and C schools.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned to meet at the Valley City Coaching school in late November.

Boys Class C Basketball For 1950-51

The Class "C" boys basketball has been completely reorganized with 32 districts for the 1950-51 season.

In setting up the new districts, county lines have been ignored. Two considerations have guided the committee in determining the district boundaries. First, roads and natural playing areas have been considered in making district boundaries. Second, the potential number of teams within a given area has also been a factor.

Under the thirty-two district plan, a district tournament can be held close to the teams involved thus keeping travel and expenses to a minimum and enabling a larger number of fans to see the contests without too much travel.

The following items of information will enable schools to determine how to get into the tournaments.

- 1. Each district will hold a meeting after school opens and elect a committee of three to make all necessary plans for the district tournament.
- 2. The High School League Board of Control will appoint one man in each district to call a meeting for the purpose of electing the district committee.
- 3. Committee members should be elected for one year, two years, and three year terms, so that one new committee member will be elected each year. Under this arrangement an election will be held each year. It is possible to re-elect a committeeman for a second term if the district desires to do so.
- 4. Borderline schools may petition to be transferred from one district to an adjoining district where it can be shown that this transfer is to the interest of schools concerned. Any such petitions for transfer must be made by November first and once a transfer is granted, it is expected that a school will continue to remain in the new district.
- 5. Subject to any changes that the High School League may make at the annual meeting in October, any shifts from Class C to Class B or vice-versa, must be made by November first and once a shift is made, a school must remain in that class until permitted to change by authorization of the Board of Control.

- 6. Tournament entry fees are to be set uniformly at \$3.00 for all districts and are to be paid to the district committee. The fees so charged are to be considered as an evidence of intention to enter the district tournament. All such fees are to be used for district committee expense and their disposal is entirely in the hands of the district committees.
- 7. All tournament entry fees are due by January 15 and the acceptance of fees after this date is up to the discretion of the district committee.
- 8. Any profits accruing from district tournaments belong to the districts and the method of distribution shall be determined by the district committee. Any losses sustained shall be shared as determined by the district committee.
- 9. Winners of the district contests shall advance to one of the eight regional tournaments.

District 1-2-3-4 shall comprise Region I.

Districts 5-6-7-8 shall comprise Region II.

Districts 9-10-11-12 shall comprise Region III, etc.

- 10. Regional tournaments will consist of four teams and will be underwritten by the High School League and expenses guaranteed on a schedule set up by the Board of Control. Any profits from regional games belongs to the League and losses are absorbed by the League.
 - 11. Tentative regional centers are as follows:

Region I, Lisbon.

Region II, Hillsboro or Mayville.

Region III, Park River or Langdon.

Region IV, New Rockford or Devils Lake.

Region V, Steele.

Region VI, Kenmare or Bottineau.

Region VII, Williston or Stanley.

Region VIII, New Salem or Mott,

12. Winners of the eight regional games advance to the statefinals at Minot.

BASKETBALL DISTRICTS \bigcirc CLASS

Outline of Plans for Girls Class C Basketball for Year 1950-51

- 1. Entry into tournament competition is limited to schools with enrollment of 75 or less or Class C Schools.
- 2. The state is divided into 16 districts, each under the supervision of a district committee of three elected by the schools of the district.
- 3. The district committees shall be elected in staggered terms from one to three year terms so that one member is elected each year. It shall be the duty of the district committee to make all detailed arrangements for the district tournament, selection of sites, procurement of officials, distribution of profits subject to such general rules as are determined by the Board of Control.
- 4. The chairman of the two districts involved shall constitute the regional committee and make all arrangements for the regional playoff to enter the state tournament.
- 5. There will be 8 regions consisting of districts 1 and 2, districts 3 and 4, districts 5 and 6, etc.
- 6. The winner of each of the eight regions enters the state tournament.
- 7. All games will be played under modified boy's rules. Rule books are available for all interested schools.
- 8. Teams wishing to enter district tournaments will send a registration fee of \$3.00 to the district committee. Fees must be submitted by January 15. The district committee shall be authorized to accept or reject late entry fees.
- 9. Any petitions to be transferred from one district to another must be submitted to the Board of Control by November first to be considered.
