Forward

The Board of Control of the North Dakota High School League is pleased to present the twenty-eighth Annual Handbook which briefly reviews the activities of the League during the past year.

With the continuous expansion of the League activities, it has been necessary to condense tournament reports as much as possible in order that the handbook will not become too large for practical purposes. Every effort has been made to preserve essential facts and to include all items which tend to give a brief but concise report of the year's activities.

The Constitution and by-laws of the League have again been purposely omitted from this handbook inasmuch as the special Handbook of Interpretations was widely distributed to schools last fall. A sufficient surplus is on hand to provide extra copies of the special handbook to schools that have mislaid or lost their copy.

This handbook will again present concrete evidence of the expanding influence and the ever increasing services provided to the member schools of the state.

Following are a few of the more significant achievements of the League during the past year.

The past basketball season has been one with more than the usual degree of success. The availability of the new University field house, the new gymnasium of the Minot State Teachers College, average weather conditions and the usual basketball interest by the fans in North Dakota, the elimination of the Federal admissions tax on high school athletic contests, all combined to make the past season one of the most successful in the history of the League. An estimated attendance of 21,500 is a reasonable figure for the Class A finals at Grand Forks. A total of at least 8,000 people witnessed the final games and all available seats were filled. Other tourney sites likewise reported record crowds and the splendid attendance is reflected in the increased receipts turned over to the League.

With additional receipts, the League is in a position to earmark funds for other activities which are worth while and have been limited somewhat due to the cost to the individual school. Because of the better year, the Board of Control embarked on a program of subsidizing other activities which ordinarily have no income. Entrants to the State Track meet, the State Golf meet, the State Tennis meet were all granted an allowance to assist in paying the expenses of transportation to and from the State tourney sites. Summer baseball also came in for

a share of this additional help by having the teams housed and fed at League expense and a generous allowance provided for transportation to and from the state tourney. As funds become available additional assistance may be granted by the Board of Control for legitimate school activities.

The League program of registering officials and providing means of improving the quality of officiating has also been greatly expanded during the year. Approximately 500 officials registered during the year. Nearly two hundred of them took the tests in basketball and attended one or more clinics. This evidence of interest in officiating can only result in a better quality of work and a better understanding of the game on the part of both officials and fans. Approximately 75 officials from Minnesota and South Dakota were granted reciprocity rights in North Dakota and an equal number of North Dakota officials were granted similar rights in these states.

A milestone of progress was passed when North Dakota joined with nine other states playing interscholastic girls basketball and formulated a new joint code for girls basketball which will be jointly used by all states now playing the sport on an interscholastic basis. The code, based on current boys rules, with such modifications as are needed to adopt the game to the needs of girls will be more than welcome to officials, players and fans of the game. It is anticipated that the interest in the girls game will be vastly increased with the adoption and use of this new code.

The League office is rapidly becoming the source of rule books, case books and other publications used in the administration of the major sports in the state. During the year approximately ten thousand copies of these publications have been distributed to schools, officials, coaches, and the fans within the state.

The Athletic Accident Benefit Fund, started by the League in 1936 is showing a healthy growth and what was originally a small fund to pay for accidents occurring in the major sports has now become an important necessity for all progressive schools within the state. Nearly eighty percent of the schools are members of the fund and the fund now embraces high schools and grade schools and an ever increasing number of one-room rural schools.

During the past year some sixty thousand youngsters have enrolled under the plan and 1625 claims have been paid which total approximately \$21,000.00. The plan has been revised for the coming school term with a generous increase in the benefit schedule and the added feature of additional allowances for injuries which require hospitalization. The administration and

operation of the AABF continues to be one of the finest services of the League offered to the school children of the state.

The interest in all League sports continues to increase. The largest crowd to witness a track meet in the state was on hand for the state track meet this past spring. The grandstand was overflowing and hundreds lined the fences. Golf and tennis interest runs high. Attendance at the state baseball tournament was at least three times the number that saw the first tourney in 1950.

This fine program of the North Dakota League is not an affair run by one man or by the Board of Control. Its activities reach into so many fields that this would be impossible. Numerous committees must be set up to advise and plan with the Board of Control. Outside groups, such as local Chambers of Commerce, civic clubs, athletic clubs, and fraternal orders and Commerce, civic clubs, athletic clubs, and fraternal orders are frequently called upon to assist in one manner or other in staging tournaments and meets of various kinds. Within the schools, interested superintendents, coaches and teachers comprise special committees with special assignments in particular fields. District committees must plan for district music and speech events or athletic contests. School men must act as local managers. The contribution comes from many people and without it, the League could not function. The Board of Control and this office is mindful of the splendid cooperation and the cheerful service that is offered by all these individuals and organizations. Our sincere thanks to each and everyone of you for your generous contribution of both time and energy to the end that the important work of the League can grow and flourish for the boys and girls of the state. Your efforts are deeply appreciated by this office and the Board of Control and it goes without saying that every boy and girl who has benefited by these efforts would also join with an enthusiastic vote of appreciation for the opportunities you have helped to create for them.

What To Do Each Month

AUGUST

Minutes of High School League Meeting

BISMARCK, NORTH DAKOTA, OCTOBER 19, 1952

The High School League met in the city auditorium at Bismarck, at 4:00 P. M. on Thursday, October 18, with one of the largest representations ever to attend a League meeting.

Mimeographed copies of the amendments to be voted upon at this meeting and a brief summary of the action of the last league meeting were distributed to the members.

Upon motion it was agreed to waive the reading of the minutes of the previous session as they were summarized in brief on the sheets distributed to each member and also written in detail and printed in the annual handbook.

The first order of business called for by President Zimmerman was the final reading and vote upon the amendments.

I. Rewrite ARTICLE IV, SECTION I of the High School League Constitution as follows:

THERE SHALL BE A BOARD OF CONTROL, HEREINAFTER CALLED THE BOARD, CONSISTING OF SEVEN MEMBERS CHOSEN AT THE ANNUAL FALL MEETING OF THE LEAGUE FOR A TERM OF THREE YEARS, EACH NEW MEMBER TO BE SEATED JULY FIRST FOLLOWING HIS ELECTION. ANY AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE OF A MEMBER SCHOOL MAY SERVE ON THE BOARD FOR TWO CONSECUTIVE TERMS BUT MAY NOT AGAIN BE RE-ELECTED TO THE BOARD UNTIL AFTER THE LAPSE OF ONE YEAR. TWO MEMBERS SHALL BE CHOSEN FROM CLASS A SCHOOLS, TWO FROM CLASS B SCHOOLS, TWO FROM CLASS C SCHOOLS, TWO FROM CLASS C SCHOOLS, AND ONE MEMBER SHALL BE ELECTED AT LARGE, SHOULD ANY MEMBER CHANGE SCHOOLS INTO A DIFFERENT CLASS, HIS POSITION SHALL IMMEDIATELY BE DECLARED VACANT AND A NEW MEMBER SELECTED TO FILL THE VACANCY AT THE NEXT MEETING OF THE LEAGUE. AN EXECUTIVE SECRETARY-TREASURER SHALL BE SELECTED BY THE BOARD OF CONTROL TO SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE BOARD.

It was moved by Arveson of Leeds and seconded by Sather of Towner that this amendment be adopted as read. Some discussion followed and the question was called for. The results showed a good majority for the amendment and the chair declared the amendment adopted.

2. The amendment which would add ARTICLE V, SECTION XVI to the By-LAWS of the Constitution was read for the final reading as follows:

NO MEMBER OF THE LEAGUE SHALL IN ANY SCHOOL YEAR SCHEDULE OR ENGAGE IN MORE THAN EIGHTEEN BASKETBALL GAMES AND ONE INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT OR TWO ADDITIONAL GAMES BETWEEN THANKSGIVING AND THE FIRST QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT UNDER PENALTY OF SUSPENSION FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE YEAR.

It was moved by Hanson of Grand Forks and seconded by Quam of Oakes that the amendment be adopted.

Several rose to discuss this amendment. Hill of New Salem moved that the amendment be changed to permit two additional games in lieu of the invitational tournament for schools that did not participate in an invitational tournament. This was seconded by Eslinger of Hazen and after a discussion was carried by voice vote.

Gludt of Killdeer moved that the sixteen game limitation proposed in the amendment be changed to eighteen games. The motion was seconded by Folkins of Leal. Upon vote it was found that the margin was close and the chair called for a standing vote. Several tellers were appointed and the final count showed 99 yes and 95 no. Hence the change was declared carried. Gilliland of Devils Lake moved that this amendment would become effective July 1, 1952. It was seconded by several and declared carried by voice vote.

The final question was then called for and the amendment as amended and which now read as follows was read for final vote:

NO MEMBER OF THE LEAGUE SHALL IN ANY SCHOOL YEAR SCHEDULE OR ENGAGE IN MORE THAN EIGHTEEN BASKETBALL GAMES AND ONE INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT OR TWO ADDITIONAL GAMES IN LIEU OF AN INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT BETWEEN THANKSGIVING AND THE FIRST QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT UNDER PENALTY OF SUSPENSION FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE YEAR.

Superintendent Barthel of Courtenay moved that a roll call vote be held on this amendment. This was seconded by Clyne of Palermo and declared lost.

Upon a standing vote there were 77 yes votes and 111 no votes and the amendment was declared lost.

3. Amend ARTICLE VI, SECTION X of the By-Laws as follows:

HE SHALL HAVE BEEN IN ATTENDANCE IN THE SCHOOL HE REPRESENTS FOR ONE FULL YEAR OR TWO CONSECUTIVE SEMESTERS UPON TRANSFERRING FROM ANOTHER SCHOOL, UNLESS HIS PARENTS HAVE BECOME RESIDENTS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO WHICH HE IS TRANSFERRED OR THE SCHOOL FROM WHICH HE IS TRANSFERRED DOES NOT OFFER WORK OF THE CORRESPONDING YEAR IN WHICH HE IS RANKED.

Was read for the final time.

After a short discussion from several members the question was called for and a standing vote was taken. The count showed 125 voted yes and only a few voted no. The chair declared the amendment adopted.

4. Add ARTICLE VI, SECTION XIV to the By-Laws of the HIGH School League Constitution was read as follows:

HE SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO REPRESENT A SCHOOL IN ANY INTERSCHOLASTIC CONTEST FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR, IF HE HAS TRANSFERRED TO THAT SCHOOL BECAUSE OF UNDUE INFLUENCE BY ANY ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER, COACH OR TEACHER OF THAT SCHOOL.

It was then discussed and it appeared to the group that the immediately preceding amendment made this one superfluous. It was moved by Rogers of Mohall and seconded by Barthel of Courtenay that this amendment be tabled. The motion carried by a large majority and the amendment was declared tabled.

5. Change ARTICLE VI, SECTION VII of the By-Laws of the League Constitution:

HE SHALL NOT BE OVER NINETEEN YEARS OF AGE.
Amendment to Amendment

HOWEVER, IF HIS NINETEENTH BIRTHDATE OCCURS BETWEEN SEPTEMBER FIRST AND NOVEMBER ELEVENTH HE MAY COMPLETE THE FOOTBALL SEASON, IF HIS NINETEENTH BIRTHDATE OCCURS BETWEEN DECEMBER FIRST AND APRIL FIRST, HE MAY COMPLETE THE BASKETBALL SEASON, AND IF HIS NINETEENTH BIRTHDATE OCCURS BETWEEN APRIL FIRST AND THE CLOSE OF THE TRACK AND BASEBALL SEASON HE MAY CONTINUE TO BE ELIGIBLE THRU THE TRACK AND BASEBALL SEASON.

Several opposed the amendment to the amendment and a vote was called for upon motion of Hornbacker of Page and seconded by Westley of Bowman. The amendment was declared lost by a large majority. Upon motion of Glidt of Killdeer and seconded by Totdahl of Beulah the original amendment was referred back to the Board of Control for further study and the chair declared the amendment tabled. The report of the special A Committee was then called for and is presented as follows:

***Report of Re-Classification Committee
to the State H. S. League Membership***

OCTOBER 18, 1951

The committee has reviewed the results of questionnaires, its members have met with representative groups of school men associated with basketball activities, and in other ways has attempted to explore and study possible alternate solutions proposed by the motion that lead to its creation. The following present in brief for your consideration some of the principal points and conclusions.

A. Points of agreement and general acceptance:

1. Every member of the League is entitled to the same rights and prerogatives accorded to any and all of its members, and all rules, regulations, or principles are to be applied without favor or discrimination. By the same token penalties for violations are to be applied in like manner.
2. Leave Class C organizational set-up as practiced in 1950-51. (Fully endorsed by overwhelming majority of Class C schools and also as incorporated in the League Constitution.)
3. Continue with the 16 school Class A division. (The 16 school Class A division has the general endorsement of all its members.)
4. The committee believes enrollments must form the basis for classification, and that the tradition or record of success in athletic completion, or the lack of it; is untenable as a basis for classification.
5. Whatever advantages or disadvantages that may develop to any school or a few schools covered by any one

proposition cannot be accepted for general application to the others of the group.

B. Propositions presented the committee for consideration or posed by the committee for analysis:

1. Leave the present classification of A, B, C, as it is.

ADVANTAGES

- a. Organizational set-up has been established for each class and appears to be functioning well.
- b. In general competition has been normal, keen and fairly well balanced.

DISADVANTAGES

- a. Since St. Leo's was placed in Class A they have been unable to participate in all Class A sports and other events.
- b. It ignores the increased enrollment at Rugby which is well above the 240 mark, which appears to have been generally accepted as a suitable demarcation line between A and B.
2. Place St. Leo's in B and move Rugby into A, and then every four years place the sixteen largest four-year high schools in the state, in terms of enrollment, in Class A and consider that the remaining schools are in Class B or C as the rules may provide.

ADVANTAGES

- a. It closely approximates past practice.
- b. Will not require reorganization.
- c. Provides an objective formula.
- d. Enrollment growths will result in few organizational changes.
- e. The sixteen school Class A provides a natural break in enrollment brackets.
- f. It recognizes enrollment as the basis for classification and yet retains a degree of stability.
- g. This appears to meet the anticipated impact of higher enrollments of high schools within a few years.

DISADVANTAGES

- a. It ignores the record of competition, good or poor, in certain schools in either class.
- b. Schools with borderline enrollments may be changed arbitrarily from A to B, or vice versa, every four years.
- c. It ignore the inadequacies of the plant and facilities that may prevail at Rugby to enter A competition at present.

3. Merge all A and B schools into one class.

ADVANTAGES

- a. Reduces the number of final state tournaments.
- b. Let the best school win regardless of size.

DISADVANTAGES

- a. It would make hopeless competition for many Class B schools.
- b. Many A schools would not want to schedule B schools in their area.
- c. Certain schools would tend to dominate competition in their areas of the state.
- d. It would be a return to the practice long since discarded as undesirable.
4. Retain Class A set-up as now operated by the East-West Conference, and during season's play continue with the B set-up, but for the tournament play require the sixteen largest B schools, or any other number that the B schools themselves might determine, to play a tournament of their own. State finalists could be drawn from the A play-offs and the B major tournaments.

ADVANTAGES

- a. Meets the wishes of those who want to eliminate top competition in Class B. (Season's play would be the same as previously.)
- b. It would broaden the base upon which the state championship would be determined.

DISADVANTAGES

- a. Creates another tournament of doubtful drawing power.
- b. Enrollments at present do not lend themselves to the creation of a B major class. The classification would be arbitrarily unfair.
- c. Many schools in this so-called B major group have little tradition for high successes in athletic competition.
5. Establish a D class consisting of all denominational schools in the state, and provide a final state tournament including four Class A (2 from each of the East-Play-offs), ;2 Class B, 1 Class C, and 1 Class D.

ADVANTAGES

- a. Makes possible the shifting of three Class B schools into A without disturbing the 16 school concept.
- b. Provides for an all-state tournament.

DISADVANTAGES

- a. It is discriminatory to certain league members by denying them the same rights as others.
- b. It is discriminatory on the basis of religion.
- c. It would be unfair to many of the smaller C schools because of their size and or geographical locations.
- d. It complicates the organizational set-up.
- e. It would prolong the basketball season later into the school year.
- f. The proposed state tournament would place an undue amount of importance and emphasis upon the championship play involved.
- g. It is undemocratic in that the plan discriminates on the basis of religion.
- h. It would ignore the wishes of the schools affected.
- 6. For a season's play retain the present A and B set-ups, but for tournament play create an A major class consisting of the eight largest schools and an A minor class consisting of the next sixteen largest schools. The winners of these two tournaments could go into an eight team final state tournament.

ADVANTAGES

- a. It broadens the base for establishing championship play.
- b. It eliminates the current top B competition for the remaining B schools.

DISADVANTAGES

- a. It would make present Class A set-up meaningless and doubtless would destroy it.
- b. The inclusion of many B schools in the A minor class would be wholly arbitrary and therefore unfair, because the enrollments do not lend themselves to classifying schools in this manner.

C. Recommendations.

1. On the basis of our study, revealing as it does, that every proposal or alternative appears to have serious disadvantages, the committee recommends that for the present we retain the present system of classes without change.
2. And that should there be any evidence to show that members of the League are violating regulations, codes of sportsmanship, or professional ethics, the Board of Control should appoint investigating committees to ascertain their validity and pertinence.

Some time was spent in explaining the possible solutions to the problem and all League members were furnished a mimeographed report of the committee findings.

It was moved by Van Wyk of Bismarck and seconded by Turner of Ashley that the League adopt the recommendations of the committee. Upon the call for the question a vote was taken and this motion prevailed without a dissenting vote. These recommendations in effect retained for the present the present classification of A schools. New Business was then called for by the chair and a delegation from the speech section appeared to request that a special committee be appointed to work with the Board of Control in the planning and execution of the speech contests and festivals in the state. It was moved by Leifur of Bismarck and seconded by several that such a committee be appointed by the Board of Control to act in the advisory capacity with the board of control. The motion was carried. Subsequently the Board of Control appointed the following committee.

Keith Stetzel of Riverdale, Mrs. Bonnie Wilson of Bismarck and Professor John Penn of the University of North Dakota.

No further new business appeared forthcoming and the chair called for the report of the nominating committee, consisting of Ensrud of Grafton, Bishop of Hebron, and Sausker of Lansford. The following members were submitted by the committee:

John Walters of Park River and
 William Gussner of Jamestown.

Nominations were called for from the floor by the chairman, but there were none. It was moved by Leifur of Bismarck and seconded by Jordahl of Lidgerwood that nominations be closed and an unanimous ballot be cast for Walters and Gussner. The motion prevailed and Gussner and Walters were declared unanimously elected for the regular three-year term to the Board of Control beginning the following July first.

A rising vote of thanks was given Van Wyk and Zimmerman for their service to the League as members of the Board of Control. Mr. Zimmerman expressed his appreciation for the splendid cooperation he had received from the League members during his tenure on the Board of Control and also expressed the appreciation of his colleague, Van Wyk.

It was then moved by Jordahl and seconded by Eslinger that this meeting be now adjourned. The motion carried and the meeting was declared adjourned at 5:25 P.M.

Minutes of the High School League Board of Control

BISMARCK, NORTH DAKOTA, OCTOBER 17-19, 1951

The Board of Control of the High School League met on Wednesday evening, Thursday and Friday mornings whenever it is possible to get the group together during the NDEA convention at Bismarck. All members were present.

Some time was spent on the matter of Class A classification in session with the special Class A committee.

Considerable time was spent discussing the various aspects of the proposed amendment to be voted upon at the last meeting.

Superintendent Thoreson of Oriska appeared before the Board of Control relative to the eligibility of Donald Baumgartner. Donald, who originally attended the Oriska High School, transferred to St. Catherines at Valley City at the opening of the fall term. After registering and attending classes for a period of one week he decided to return to Oriska, his former school. The problem raised by Mr. Thoreson was when would this lad be eligible for competition with Oriska. The Board of Control ruled that he must remain ineligible for a period of eighteen weeks from the time that he transferred back to Oriska. Upon registering at St. Catherines and attending classes he had become a student at St. Catherines and any subsequent change of schools must be followed by a full semester of ineligibility.

Superintendent Tonneson of Newburg presented an eligibility problem to the Board. A lad who formerly lived in a school district adjoining the Newburg school district attended the Maxbass High School. During the summer his district voted on reorganizing and became a part of the Newburg School District. This fall the lad registered at Newburg transferring from the former school at Maxbass. The question raised by Mr. Tonneson was when would this lad be eligible for athletic participation at Newburg. The Board ruled that inasmuch as that home district of the lads had now become a part of the Newburg School District that this lad should be permitted to transfer schools without any penalty and thus be immediately eligible for athletic participation.

Upon motion by Gilliland and seconded by Flaten it was agreed to lift the suspension penalty on Rutland, effective November first.

Some time was spent on discussing the AABF coverage plan for the rural schools in a county. Upon motion of Gilliland and seconded by Flaten it was agreed to extend this protection to all the rural schools within a given county under one membership fee plan provided the county superintendent wished to enroll the entire group under the plan.

It was moved by Gilliland and seconded by Van Wyk that the secretary be instructed to survey the available forms for physical examinations of high school athletes and set up a form to be sent to all member schools with a request that they use this form for physical examinations of all boys and girls taking part in athletics. Motion carried.

Upon motion by Roberts and seconded by Van Wyk, Jerry Moriarty of Beach was designated to represent North Dakota at the National Football rules convention meeting in Chicago in early January. Coach Duane Carlson of Minot was named an alternate if Mr. Moriarty could not attend.

Meeting adjourned to meet at 9:00 A. M. Friday.

It was moved by Flaten and seconded by Van Wyk that the girls state tournament be underwritten at the rate of \$3.00 per day plus room for the 12 players. Motion carried.

The Board then proceeded to fill vacancies which had developed in the officiating assignments at the state tournaments. Upon motion Cliff Nygard of Bismarck and William Higgins of Mandan were selected for the East A Tournament at Fargo on March 6-7-8. Ward Davenport of Fargo was selected to fill a vacancy at the Valley City Class B regional on March 13-14-15.

There being no further business the Board adjourned subject to call when sufficient business would justify such a meeting.

Minutes of the Board of Control of the North Dakota High School League at

GRAND FORKS, NORTH DAKOTA, MARCH 14-15, 1952

The Board of Control of the North Dakota High School League met in the offices of the Chamber of Commerce in the Ryan Hotel in Grand Forks on Friday and Saturday, March 14-15, 1952, with all members present except Elmer Johnson. Walters and Gussner were also present at this meeting. A complete financial report of the current year's activities was presented to the Board and some time was spent in studying the various League activities.

Walters, Gussner and Flaten were appointed to a special committee to review physical examination forms which had been collected from the different athletic associations and to select a form which nearest appeared to meet the needs of the North Dakota schools.

Mr. Gregorson of the Josten Company met with the Board to propose trophies which could be used for district and regional tournaments for 1953. Roberts, Zenners and Walters were appointed to a committee to make final selection of trophies for 1953.

Mr. Strand of the Strand Studios at Rugby presented his statuettes to the Board as a possible award for the individual players on tournament teams. A delegation from Casselton met with the Board of Control to extend an invitation of that city to hold the 1953 girls state basketball tournament at Casselton.

Some time was spent in discussing current girls basketball rules and the suggested changes that were offered by the coaches at the girls state basketball tournament. The matter of rules was referred to a special committee on girls basketball. Mr. Zenner and Flaten of the Board of Control and Mr. Bachman of the girls basketball committee were authorized to attend a meeting at St. Louis, Missouri, on April 19, where nine states were attempting to write a joint code for a standard girls basketball rule book for all nine states playing interscholastic girls basketball.

The matter of present inequities in the size and number of schools in the girls basketball districts were referred to the above committee for solution. The recommendation of the coaches for an earliest track date for the final state track meet was discussed at some length pro and con. It was agreed to leave the date as originally set for May 31, 1952.

Zenner Gussner and Walters were named to represent the Board of Control at the National Federation meeting to be held at Estes Park, Colorado, from June 29 to July 2, 1952.

Tourney dates for 1953 were discussed and it was agreed to move the state girls tourney up one week to the last week end

in February instead of the first week in March. The dates for the state boys tournaments in all classes were left on the corresponding week ends that they were held in 1952.

Some time was spent in discussing plans for the summer state baseball tournament. Mr. Gilliland offered the facilities in Devils Lake during the week of June 9-14. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Zenner that the invitation of Devils Lake be accepted and that the plan in operation last year be used in eliminating the teams in Class B and C schools down to a field of eight teams. The motion was carried.

The committee on trophies reported back to the Board and their recommendations on district trophies were adopted.

The committee on Physical Examination Forms reported back to the Board and the Secretary was instructed to have forms printed for distribution to the member schools.

The Board met for the final session consider recommendations of the East-West schools.

The recommendation that the relay at district and state meets should be counted in the total meet points was discussed and adopted. It was also agreed to accept recommendation that participants in the track meets shall be limited to three events and one relay. Since North Dakota has competition in two relays, that implies that the personnel of the two relay teams must be different contestants.

The matter of passes to the state final A tournament was discussed at some length and it appeared that it had been customary to issue two passes to the eight schools that were eliminated from the state final tournament. Since that had not been done this year the secretary was instructed to reimburse each class A non-competing team at the state final tournament the price of two reserved seat tickets.

The Board agreed to meet in Valley City during the state golf tournament for the next session of the Board of Control.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE

Minutes of the Board of Control Meeting

VALLEY CITY, NORTH DAKOTA, JUNE 4-5, 1952

The Board of Control of the North Dakota High School League met in the H. S. League office at Valley City on June 4-5, 1952, with all members present. The work of the "Nine States Girls Basketball Committee" meeting in St. Louis, Mo., in April, 1952, was reviewed by the Board of Control. The Secretary reported the results of a survey within the state on the adoption of the changes

in girls rules which indicated some ninety votes for and three votes against the adoption of the joint code. Upon motion by Van Wyk and seconded by Flaten it was agreed to adopt this code for the use of High Schools in North Dakota playing interscholastic girls basketball.

Some consideration was given to the need for revising the district lines in girls basketball. The opinion was that this matter should be tabled until next fall and information obtained as to the location and number of schools that would participate in interscholastic girls basketball.

The AABF committee of the Board of Control reported on the proposed change in the plan. The proposed changes were adopted by the board and the secretary was instructed to have new pamphlets and forms prepared for the coming school term.

Some time was also spent in discussing the feasibility of providing protection for the two Junior Colleges in the state, Bismarck and Devils Lake. Upon motion of Roberts and seconded by Van Wyk, the committee was instructed to draw up a plan to be placed on an experimental basis for 1952-53.

Upon motion of Van Wyk and seconded by Gilliland it was agreed to subsidize the State Track meet, the State Tennis meet, the State Golf meet by allowing schools financial assistance for transportation of their qualified entrants at the following schedules:

For 1 to 5 entrants, \$.10 per one way mileage.

For 6 to 11 entrants, \$.20 per one way mileage.

For 12 to 17 entrants, \$.30 per one way mileage.

Coach Al Larvick of Valley City appeared before the Board of Control on behalf of the N. D. H. P. E. R. Association with a request that some financial help be given toward their program of health education at the fall N. D. E. A. session. The Board felt that this activity fit in with the H. S. League program and agreed to allow a maximum of \$150.00 toward the furtherance of this program for the coming year. The old Board of Control then adjourned and the new Board proceeded to organize itself.

John Roberts was named President of the New Board of Control and E. C. Johnson was selected as Vice President.

The following budget was adopted for use of the secretary for the coming year:

For office secretary and bookkeeper	\$2,400.00
(\$1,000 to be charged to AABF Fund)	
For part time help as needed	600.00
For Secretary travel in and out of state	1,700.00
For Secretary salary	6,500.00

Some time was spent revising the dates of the 1953 basketball tournaments with a view of avoiding conflicts in tourney dates. It has finally agreed to leave the dates as originally selected at the Grand Forks Meeting and to explore further the possibility for future tourneys. The Board then adjourned to attend a luncheon of the Valley City Kiwanis Club promoted for entrants in the State Golf Tournament.

The Board reconvened following the luncheon and selected the following sites for the state tourney series:

February 26-27-28, 1952

State Girls Tourney at Casselton.

March 5-6-7, 1952

East Class A Divisional at Fargo.

West Class A Divisional at Bismarck.

March 10-11, 1952

Eight Class C - Regionals as Lisbon, Maryville, Park River, New Rockford, Jamestown, Minot, Williston and New Salem.

March 12-13-14, 1952

State Class A Finals at Grand Forks.

Class B - Regionals at Valley City, Devils Lake, Minot, Dickinson.

March 19-20-21, 1952

State Class B - Finals at Minot.

State Class C - Finals at Valley City.

It was moved by Gilliland and seconded by Gussner that the Board of Control adopt a policy of naming a city school head as the manager of a tournament or meet held in any given city. The motion was carried.

The recommendation of the East-West Conference for 12 men at the Class A Tournaments was adopted by the Board upon motion of Gussner and seconded by Walters. It was the understanding of the Board that there be no change in the number of players allowed for B and C Tournaments. Under the new regulation Class A schools would be allowed the usual allowance for 14 men and B and C schools for 12 men.

The Board adopted the following policy on passes to be issued to schools:

For the State A Finals: 18 passes to competing schools and two passes to non-competing "A" schools.

For the "A" Divisionals: 18 passes to the competing schools. For B-C State and Regional Tournaments 16 passes to competing teams only.

The secretary was instructed to draw up regulations for passes to be issued to the Press and Radio. A lengthy discussion followed on the use of fan-shaped backboards, and the rectangular boards in tourney play. It was the opinion of the Board of Control that, to support the National Federation of H. S. Athletic Associations and to work toward uniformity of playing conditions, the fan-shaped backboard should be adopted for all tournament play at state and regional tournaments. Charles Kimball of the Northern School Supply met with the board on this problem and agreed to obtain information on methods of conversion and costs for making these changes. The Board agreed to gather additional information and further consider this problem at a later meeting of the Board. The secretary was also directed to contact the various tourney sites and see what could be worked out with the schools involved.

It was agreed to advertise for bids on balls to be used in the 1953 tournaments, such bids to be opened at the August meeting of the board. It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Flaten that Consolation Trophies be provided for state and regional tournaments in Class B and C finals. It was moved by Flaten and seconded by Walters that the State Track meet be assigned to Valley City on the condition that some effort be made to improve the condition of the track. The motion prevailed.

The plan of eight district qualifying track meets for B-C schools and two for Class A schools is to be continued in 1953 with Bismarck and Fargo as the sites for the Class A schools.

Some time was spent on discussing the date for the state track meet and due consideration was given to the recommendations of the East-West Conference coaches in suggesting that the state track meet be held on May 23. It was the general feeling of the board that the track season in North Dakota is short and weather conditions make the early date inadvisable. It was agreed to set the date for the state track meet on Friday, May 29. (The Saturday date would fall on Memorial Day.)

Upon motion of Gilliland and seconded by Flaten it was agreed to adopt a policy of allowing each district track manager and the State manager a sum not to exceed \$25.00 to be used for such key officials as starters, judges, etc. The secretary was directed to contact the 1952 district track managers and, if any payments were made for this purpose, to reimburse them up to \$25.00.

It was agreed to send Supt. Minard McCrea and honorarium of \$50.00 for his service as manager of the State Track and Golf meet in 1952.

The Board reviewed the regulations for the district and state track meet and agreed on the following policies:

1. Entrants are limited to 3 track and field events plus one relay or,
2. Two track and field events plus 2 relays, thus, to run in both relays, a lad cannot enter in more than two other events.
3. Winners of 1 and 2 places at B-C district meets qualify for the state.
4. Winners of first four places at the A district qualify for the state.
5. Qualification may be made by meeting minimum standards at an approved Invitational meet.

The State B-C Baseball Tournament for 1953 was awarded to Devils Lake for the second week in June with the team allowance to remain the same as used in 1952.

The State Tennis Tourney was awarded to Jamestown provided their new courts are ready. The date was tentatively set for June 1.

The 1953 state Golf Tournament was set at Valley City for June 3. William Breding of the Minot Junior Chamber of Commerce appeared before the Board with a request that the Junior Chamber of Commerce Golf Committee might be permitted to use the scores made in the H. S. Golf meet as a list from which to select their representative to the National J. C. Golf Tournament. The Board could see no objection to this arrangement provided it was understood that the H. S. League was in no way a party to selecting the contestant to advance to the National Contest.

Chairman Roberts appointed Gussner, Zenner and Johnson to a committee to recommend officials for the various state and regional tournaments and to report at the August meeting of the Board.

It was moved by Flaten and seconded by Zenner that officials used by all classes of schools, A, B, or C, be registered officials.

Some time was spent in discussing the problem of improving officials in service through clinics. It was agreed that the secretary should contact several centers in the state with an objective of providing workshops where officials and coaches could get together and discuss their problems. These workshops in football would substitute for the clinics held during the past two or three years.

Music and Speech activities on the district and state level were discussed at some length. It was deemed advisable to defer action on this problem to a later meeting after further investigation could be made on the approach to this problem in other states.

It was agreed to hold the next Board of Control meeting in Valley City beginning Thursday evening, August 21, and continuing on Friday, August 22, for as long as necessary.

Meeting adjourned to Thursday, August 21, 1952.
