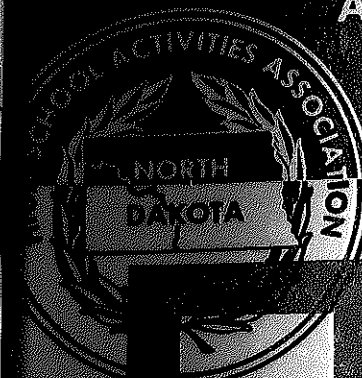

## FOREWORD

The Board of Control of the North Dakota High School Activities Association, (formerly the North Dakota High School League), is pleased to present the thirty-first annual **Official Handbook** which summarizes briefly the more important activities of the organization during the past year.

Every effort has been made to preserve a record of the important events that have transpired over the year, and at the same time to condense material wherever possible to prevent the handbook from becoming too long and cumbersome.

The following appear to be the more important accomplishments during the past year and the projected plans for the immediate year ahead:

1. A new Constitution and By-Laws have been adopted effective July 1, 1955. The new document has sought to retain the good features of the old one and add new sections which will better serve the schools of the state. A careful study of the constitutions of other states and several conferences between the Board of Control and the committee working on the project has produced a document which should meet the expanding needs of the Association.
2. The name of the Association has been changed from the North Dakota High School League to the North Dakota High School Activities Association. While it is still the same organization, the new name is more symbolic of the work and functions of the group.
3. A new **Special Handbook of Interpretations** is in the process of publication and will be available to all member schools at the opening of the 1955-56 school term. This volume explains in detail the interpretations that are placed on the Constitution and By-Laws of the organization and should be carefully studied by administrators and coaches in the high schools of the state.
4. During the past year a school calendar has been published and made available to schools, county superintendents, and other groups concerned with education in the state. This project appears to have met with general approval, and the projects will be continued next year. With the experience gained through last year's project, the new calendar should be even more valuable. Additional copies will be printed next year and made available for those who are interested.
5. Another worthy project in effect the past year has been the Personal Liability and Property Damage Insurance Policy covering all League sponsored activities. Under the terms of this policy, the Association is protected against damage suits for personal injury or property damage that may result from the operation of any Association activity in the fields of athletics, music and speech. During the past year one such claim has been paid and the Association released from any further liability in the case.
6. The Association can also boast another "first" in arranging to have the East Class A Basketball Tournament televised. This is the first time such an event has been brought into the homes of thousands of viewers in this area, and, judging from the comments, this action has met with the approval of the fans of the area. While the impact of this new venture is still undetermined from a financial view point, television is here to stay, and the experience of the past year should prove helpful in working out an answer to the problem in the future.
7. Another interesting development during the past year has been progress made with the State Science Fair. Our Association has made a financial contribution to this event for the past three years and has given it every encouragement possible. The Science Fair has come to be one of the important activities of high school students interested in the scientific field. All who have visited a district or a state science display enthusiastically endorse this as one of the fine activities for high school boys and girls.
8. Interest in the field of high school music continues to grow, and the participation during the past year has been the greatest in the history of the Association. The quality of music in the state has also kept pace with the increase in the number of entries at the various contests and festivals. Many small Class C Schools can now boast of bands and choruses superior to those found only in Class B and A Schools a decade ago. Rules and regulations for next year's contests and festivals have been carefully studied by special music committees, and revisions have been made to make further improvements for next year.  
In the field of speech the number of participants shows a decline. Too few properly trained speech teachers are available, and this activity has been delegated to the history teacher, the science teacher, or some other staff member with little training in the field and frequently less interest in the ultimate results. To help remedy the situation, the Association has planned a series of speech clinics for the fall of 1955 and has revised the classifications in which a student may participate. A new classification entitled "Discussion" has been added and special efforts will be made to encourage schools to enter this popular and important field. To assist schools in securing a greater participation in both music and speech, plans have been made to publish a special bulletin covering the rules and regulations in these activities and to have this brochure distributed when school opens in the fall.
9. The honors and recognitions accorded North Dakota on the national level during the past year is also achievement that should be mentioned. Board member L. T. Havig of Williston has been selected to the Executive Committee of the National Federation for a three year term. This is the first time in the history of the Federation that such an honor has been given to North Dakota. Past-President Gilliland was also cited at the last summer meeting of the Federation for meritorious service to the state Association and the National Federation. Your Secretary has also been recognized in Federation circles by being named Vice-President of the National Girls' Basketball Rule Committee and by appearing on several Federation programs.
10. This report would not be complete without recognizing the steady growth and expansion of the Accident Benefit Fund. During the past year protection has been given to more than 95,000 boys and girls in the state of which more than 17,000 have been children from rural schools operating under the County Unit Plan of protection in thirty-eight counties of the state. During the past year some 2,960 claims have been paid totalling more than \$51,500 in benefits. Evidence already indicates that at least five more counties will adopt the County Unit Plan of protection next year and that protection for high schools will be carried by nearly 100%

of the high schools of the state. This project still continues to be one of the finest services given by the Association to the school children of North Dakota.

11. The Association is still continuing its policy of subsidizing worthwhile activities of the schools of the state. The Accident Benefit Fund, State Science Fair, speech and debate activities, physical education, and the non-revenue sports of golf, tennis, and track all receive a substantial contribution from the funds of the Association in order that these activities may thrive and flourish.
12. Activities over the year have been conducted without unusual incident. Nature cooperated by giving us good weather for most of the basketball tournaments. However, the girls' regional and state tournaments were held during a period of blustery and cold weather, and the receipts from these events suffered accordingly. The State Track Meet also met with rainy weather which did spoil the anticipated performance of several excellent contestants. The State Baseball Tournament also ran into foul weather and had to be postponed and reorganized. Fortunately, the semi-finals and finals were run off under ideal weather conditions, and a superior brand of ball was demonstrated by the competing teams. Viewed as a whole, it has been another banner League year except for the minor inconveniences that were caused by the weather.

It is with a feeling of regret that we do record the passing of two individuals who had much to do with the success of the League program. Last fall, Mrs. Jane Dock, office assistant, died after a brief illness. This spring, C. J. Gludt, member of the Board of Control, passed away only a few days after attending a Board of Control meeting. The untimely death of both of these loyal servants of the League has left a gap hard to fill in Association circles, and their loss will be keenly felt by all members for a long period. Each has made a lasting contribution to our work and made ours a better organization because of their personal contact with the Association.

The Board of Control and this office again wish to acknowledge the assistance and cooperation given by the scores of men and women who have taken an interest in the affairs of the Association. They have contributed much and asked for little in return. Each of us wish to express our thanks for the help, the constructive criticism, and the general cooperation of all members in making this another good year.

This yearbook is dedicated to each of you for your unselfish and faithful service during the past year with a knowledge that the same cooperation will be forthcoming in the years to come.

## MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Valley City, North Dakota, August 27-28, 1954

The Board of Control of the High School League met in the League office in Valley City on August 27-28, 1954, with all members present. The minutes of the previous meeting in June were printed in the Annual Handbook distributed to all Board members and their reading was waived.

The first order of business was the opening of basketball bids for the 1954-1955 Basketball Tournaments. The low bid appeared to be from the Gun & Reel Sports Shop of Jamestown, North Dakota, and the contract for basketball for all district, regional and state tournaments was awarded to the Gun & Reel Sports Shop for the Wilson B 1000 Jet Basketball at \$14.59 per ball FOB Jamestown, less 2% if the invoice is paid within 30 days of delivery date.

It was moved by Killie and seconded by Slatta that the Secretary order one print of the new 16 mm Brittanica Film entitled "Fundamentals in Track & Field" demonstrated by Bob Mathias, from the Northern School Supply Co., and place it in the Film Library for distribution to interested schools. The motion carried.

The Board next carefully reviewed an eligibility problem raised by Supt. Stutlien of Ameniam.

A rural district close to Ameniam plans to close its rural schools and send the children by bus to the Ameniam schools. This district does not maintain a high school and in former years each family was obliged to make its own arrangement for high school instruction in some nearby high school. With the institution of bus service, these families would find it convenient to use the public conveyance service for both grade and high school pupils to the Ameniam school. Several high school pupils who had regularly attended high schools other than Ameniam would find it necessary to transfer schools should they avail themselves of the bus service. The question raised was on the eligibility of those students who transferred to Ameniam from other high schools because of the bus service.

It appears that the district involved was not becoming a part of the Ameniam School District through any redistricting process, but was merely using the bus system as a more practical means of serving the patrons of the district. No high school was provided in the district under either system.

While it is admitted that it may be more convenient for several families to utilize the bus service for both their grade and high school pupils, the transfer rule makes no provision for convenience or economy. The fact remains that this involves a change of high schools without a change in parental residence. The present rule 10 recognizes only two conditions under which a lad may transfer schools without loss of eligibility, namely,—when a family changes residence, a lad may move with his parents without loss of eligibility and if a school ceases to offer work in the year a student is registered, the student may seek a new high school without any loss of eligibility.

There are many instances of transfer for convenience; better selection of subjects, economic reasons, changes in family status, etc. However, the present rule makes no provision to recognize these reasons for transfer.

Since neither exception in rule 10 appears to be met in this case, it is the opinion of the Board of Control that transfers to Amenia High School caused by the institution of bus service in an adjoining district are eligible at Amenia High School only after one full semester of 18 weeks.

S. G. Cowles, Fargo, North Dakota, State Manager of the Anchor Casualty Company, met with the Board to outline the proposal of his company to provide Personal Liability and Property Damage Insurance to the High School League for all League sponsored events during the year. Mr. Cowles also outlined a proposal to provide Hold-up and Outside Messenger Protection for all tournaments on the district, regional and state level, and Fidelity Insurance for all tournament managers for the same tournaments. The Board requested Mr. Cowles to list in detail the exact coverages each type of insurance would provide and agreed to consider the question further at the October meeting of the Board of Control.

Supt. O. D. Herbel and K. Thue, Board of Education member from Wheelock, met with the Board of Control relative to the indefinite suspension of the Wheelock High School imposed at the June meeting of the Board of Control.

The entire case was reviewed by the Board, and the facts as stated in the June minutes of the Board of Control were confirmed by the Wheelock School authorities. Mr. Thue appealed to the Board to lift the suspension penalty, as it would ruin their small high school.

The Board of Control carefully reviewed the case and both parties concerned agreed to the following conditions.

1. The Wheelock School Board would make a public apology for their action, through a letter sent to the press. This letter must be approved by the Board of Control through the Executive Secretary before its release to the press.
2. A letter of apology must be sent to the basketball official concerned, under signature of the Board of Education.
3. A letter must be sent to M. W. Thatcher, Manager of the Grain Terminal Association, St. Paul, Minnesota, retracting all charges made in the former letter addressed to him.
4. Every attempt must be made to acquaint the Wheelock Community with details of the incident and the reasons for the Board of Control action through assembly programs in the high school and through the school paper.
5. Wheelock High School must cancel all basketball games it may have on its schedule for the 1954-1955, and cannot contract for any contests until such time as they are reinstated by the Board of Control.
6. The Superintendent of Schools and the Board of Education of the the Wheelock School District must file a letter with the Executive Secretary of the High School League in which they pledge their cooperation and agree to conform to the rules and regulations of the organization, both in law and in spirit, in all future relations of members of the High School League.

7. Concrete evidence must be presented to the Board of Control that the above mentioned conditions are met in full before the October meeting of the Board of Control. Upon the satisfaction of the above conditions, Wheelock High School will be eligible to apply for reinstatement in the League on a probationary basis for the period of one year.

New Rockford was named as the site of the Region IV Class C Boys' Basketball Tournament, and Dickinson was named as the site of the Region VIII Class C Boys' Tournament to be held on March 8-9, 1955.

The Board then checked the vacancies in the officiating assignments for the 1955 Basketball Tournaments, and made the following nominations:

It was moved by Killie and seconded by Havig that the Secretary be instructed to purchase a quantity of booklets entitled "Speech—Debate—Drama in Contests and Festivals" by William Howell of the University of Minnesota, to be made available to North Dakota High Schools interested in speech work at \$1.25 per copy. The motion carried.

The Board studied the recommendations made by the Music Advisory Committee and adopted the following classification of events to be used in all district music contests:

For all Instrumental and Solo events, Bands & Glee Clubs, the same classification as last year will be used.

#### Qualifications for the State

Entries must have a rating of Superior or better to qualify for the State Contest.

The Board of Control studied the recommendations made by the Special Track & Field Committee, and adopted the following:

1. No contestant in a District, Invitational or State Track Meet may enter more than four events including the relays and only one race of 440 yards or longer.
2. Relay races shall count toward team or school points on a 5, 3, 2, 1 basis for both Class A and Class B District and State Meets.
3. Only one 440 yard relay team and one 880 yard relay team from Class B-C schools qualify for the State Track Meet from each district. In Class A Divisional Track Meet, winners of 1, 2, 3, 4, places qualify for the State Track Meet.
4. In all other events, winners of first and second places at a District Meet for B-C schools qualify for the State Track Meet and winners of the first four places in Class A Divisional meets qualify for the State Track Meet.
5. A school may also qualify entrants for the State Track Meet by meeting certain minimum standards at an approved invitational meet which has a minimum of six schools competing with at least three entrants in the given event. In Class B District Meets, a school may also qualify entrants for the State Track Meet by meeting the minimum standards set up for the different events.
6. Each school shall be limited to three entrants in a given track or field event in District and State Meets.
7. It is recommended that preliminaries be run off in the 100-yard and 220-yard dashes and the high and low hurdles at the State Track Meet.
8. The following minimum standards shall be used for qualifying entrants at invitational meets:

9. The 24 inch take-off board for the Broad Jump is approved for all meets in North Dakota.

10. Tentative plans were made to hold a Track & Field Clinic in the spring. April 16th was suggested as a good date for this Clinic.

The Board of Control discussed the possibility of a printed League Bulletin instead of the mimeographed News-Letter. It was generally agreed that the printed bulletin would be more effective, although the cost comes considerably higher. It was suggested that the number of bulletins could be cut down to one each six weeks' period, and this would partly offset the increased cost. It was agreed to make a gradual change-over to the printed bulletin on a trial basis.

Supt. Havig reported that he contacted H. V. Porter, Executive Secretary of the National Federation, relative to an address at the winter meeting of the school administrators. The Board approved this move and the Secretary was instructed to contact Mr. Porter and arrange for his appearance at 3:00 pm, Monday, January 31, 1955.

Supt. Havig expressed his appreciation to the Board for their support in securing his election to the Executive Committee of the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations.

Some three hours were spent in checking and rechecking the proposed Constitution and By-Laws of the High School League before it is submitted to the schools at the fall League meeting.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned.

#### MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Fargo, North Dakota — October 20-21, 1954

The Board of Control of the North Dakota High School League met in the Powers Hotel at Fargo, North Dakota, on Wednesday and Thursday, October 20-21, 1954, with all members present.

A delegation from the State Teachers Colleges, the University, and the Agricultural College met with the Board to indicate their interest in obtaining AABF protection for their students under the North Dakota League sponsorship. The matter was discussed at some length both pro and con. The Board expressed considerable doubt that they could carry this protection for the colleges inasmuch as they were above the secondary level and their institutions were not supported through local taxation.

on the same basis as the high schools and elementary high schools in the state. In the event they were to be included, it would require an amendment to the present Constitution and By-Laws of the High School League.

After a long discussion it was moved by Gludt and seconded by Gussner that the question be tabled. The motion was carried.

Supt. George Brekke of Rutland appeared before the Board to suggest the addition of certain schools to District I, Class C. Mr. Brekke was informed of the procedure to be followed if schools wished to be changed from one district to another, which essentially is to secure a release from their present district and approval from the proposed district. Under these circumstances it is customary to grant the change, unless certain other complications develop.

The proposal of the Anchor Insurance and Casualty Company was again reviewed and it was the unanimous opinion of the Board of Control that the High School League should protect itself by proper insurance coverage of the activities of the League.

After discussion it was moved by Havig and seconded by Gludt that the High School League Board of Control enter into a contract with the Anchor Casualty Company to obtain Personal Liability and Property Damage Insurance on all League sponsored activities in the amount of a total coverage of \$500,000 Property Damage and \$100,000 on Personal Liability with a provision of \$10,000 Property Damage limits on any one accident, Fidelity Insurance Bond on all tournament managers, and \$1,000 inside robbery coverage and \$1,000 outside robbery coverage on each tournament. The Secretary was authorized to negotiate such a contract with the Anchor Casualty Company and bill the proportionate cost back to the respective districts at the rate of \$1.00 for each one hundred dollars of gross receipts at each tourney site. The coverage shall be for the period of one year. The motion was carried.

The question of the location of Dakota Lutheran High School was discussed and it was the opinion of the Board of Control that Dakota Lutheran should be assigned to District eight with the other two Class B Schools in Minot. Under the present division of schools in that district, Dakota Lutheran should be placed in the south half of the district. The Secretary was instructed to inform the district committee of the assignment.

The Board also reviewed the minutes of District 4, Class B and the action of the group in permitting divisional winners to elect the region which they wished to take part in at the regional level. It was the opinion of the Board that granting this choice was contrary to a standing rule the Board of Control had previously made wherein divisional winners were to be assigned to regions on the basis of their distance from the tourney site, namely, the teams closest to Minot should go to Minot and those closest to Devils Lake should go to Devils Lake. The Secretary was instructed to contact the district committee and inform them that regional representatives must be selected on the basis of distance from the tourney site.

The type and quality of medals to be awarded individual winners at the State Class B-C Music and Speech contests was reviewed and the Board agreed that a medal costing approximately a dollar to a dollar and a quarter would be desirable for this purpose.

Supt. Gilliland was delegated to obtain judges for the State Music and Speech contests to be held at Devils Lake in the spring.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

## MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Bismarck, North Dakota — January 29-31, 1955

The Board of Control of North Dakota High School League met at the Grand Pacific Hotel in Bismarck on Saturday, January 29th at 2:00 P.M. with all members of the Board present.

The first order of business was the Rhame-Reeder Hearing involving an altercation between Joel Schell of Reeder and Larry Getz of Rhame. Present at this hearing were Supt. Hammer and Coach Eslinger of Reeder, Supt. Richardson of Rhame, and the two lads concerned. The details of the incident were carefully reviewed and both sides appeared to be in agreement as to what took place. The lad also admitted striking the other lad. It was brought out at the hearing that the lad involved had been off the team since the event occurred on December 3rd.

It was the finding of the Board that:

1. There was some evidence of neglect on the part of Coach Eslinger in not properly controlling the members of his athletic team and it was the opinion of the Board that the incident might have been avoided if proper precautionary disciplinary action had been taken.
2. It was also the opinion of the Board that Supt. Richardson was somewhat hasty in seeking redress in the courts before first exhausting all means of redress furnished through the High School League rules and regulations.
3. The Reeder lad is to be reinstated on the team on a probationary basis on February 9th following the Rhame-Reeder game. It is the opinion of the Board that his absence from the team from December 3rd until January 29th was already quite a punishment to him and no good would result from extending his period of ineligibility any longer than February 9th.
4. The Schell lad is to reimburse the Getz lad for all medical and dental costs incurred as a result of the incident.
5. Both schools should hold assemblies and try to instill in their respective student bodies a sense of responsibility for creating the proper courteous relations between the schools concerned. The Board believes that the attitude of the student bodies of the two schools will soon be reflected in the attitude of the down town fans.
6. If relations are in any way strained between the two schools, it is suggested that out-of-town officials might help the situation.

It now appeared that case should be closed and considered an unfortunate incident which occurred in a moment of passion. Both boys were present at the hearing and bore no ill will toward each other. The

school authorities likewise appeared to bear no grudge. Possibly this unpleasant incident may be the means of developing better relations between the schools and towns concerned.

The Board next heard a report by member Arveson who had attended the National Speech Meeting in Chicago and participated in the selection of the national debate topic for 1955-56. Mr. Arveson gave an extended and complete report on this meeting and suggested the importance of discussion as a part of the speech work of the state. It was decided to appoint a committee to work with the Advisory Speech Committee toward the end that discussion might be furthered in the state. President Zenner appointed Board members Arveson, Gussner and Gludt to the Committee.

It was agreed that the calendar project should be continued for the coming school year as this project seems to have met with the approval of most if not all the schools of the state.

The next order of business was the review of the project of filming the State Tournaments. The matter was discussed for some time pro and con and it was finally agreed that this project be abandoned as too costly for the benefits that appear to come from it.

A request from several Class C schools in Region 4 for a change in tournament site from New Rockford to Carrington was reviewed by the Board. Carrington is host to the Girls' State Tourney and also a Girls' Regional Tourney. The Board felt that this fact plus the fact that all arrangements had been made for tournaments this year that the status quo should be maintained. The Board then adjourned to meet on Sunday morning.

The Board reconvened at 10:00 AM Sunday morning, January 30th. Jim Adelson of KXJB-TV met with the Board and outlined his proposition of televising the East Class A Tournament. The matter was thoroughly considered from all angles for a period of nearly two hours. It was finally agreed that the Board would grant permission to televise the East Class A Tournament on an experimental basis for this year on the following conditions:

1. KXJB-TV would pay the League a sum of five hundred dollars.
2. KXJB-TV would sponsor and promote the sale of a special television booster ticket good for one general admission to any session of the tournament at \$1.00 per ticket.
3. The sale of the booster tickets would be promoted twice daily over the sports period from February 7th through February 28th.
4. The proceeds from all tickets would belong to the High School League, and KXJB-TV would act as an agent of the Board of Control in promoting the sale of the special booster tickets.
5. To reimburse the TV station for postage and the time and effort in promoting these sales, the Board of Control will set aside all sales over and above \$1,500 less those redeemed at the door at \$1.00 each and agree to divide this excess on a fifty-fifty basis.

The Secretary reported on the progress of the insurance project offered to district tournaments for hold-up protection and fidelity bond for tourney managers.

Several controversial AABF claims were reviewed by the Board of Control and final disposition made of them.

Principal Sam Feld of Fort Totten met with the Board to appeal a former decision on the eligibility of one Don Hart of Fort Totten. To briefly review this case....The father of Don Hart had been employed off and on at the Garrison Dam Project at Riverdale. In early spring of 1954 he went to Riverdale in the hopes of permanent employment and set up a residence at Riverdale. In the fall of 1954 Don elected to remain at Fort Totten and attend school where he had attended the previous year. The latter part of October and after the football season, Don left Fort Totten and went to Riverdale to live with his father. He enrolled at Riverdale and attended classes for a week. Then finding that he would experience some difficulty in graduating and also finding that he was ineligible at Riverdale, he returned to Fort Totten and resumed his classes there. The Board had ruled at a previous occasion that he would be ineligible at Fort Totten as he was transferring schools without a change in parental residence. It was the opinion of the Board that he made a choice of schools when he registered in the fall at Fort Totten. He had the choice of remaining at Fort Totten and being eligible on the grounds that he was not transferring schools. He could also have gone to Riverdale at that time and been immediately eligible as his father had set up a residence at Riverdale. He made his choice to remain at Fort Totten and was eligible and played football. In transferring to Riverdale the latter part of October, he became a transfer student, and in returning to Fort Totten, he was again transferring schools inasmuch as he registered at Riverdale and attended there. It was the opinion of the Board that the original decision of ineligibility in this case should stand.

The Secretary next reported on the progress on the proposed Track Clinic scheduled at Jamestown on April 2nd, 1955. Track Coach Jim Kelly of the University of Minnesota had accepted the invitation to direct this Clinic.

The Board then adjourned to meet Mr. Porter, Executive Secretary of the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations, who arrived on the Northern Pacific Train from Chicago.

The matter of the next Board of Control meeting was discussed and it was agreed that a meeting at the State B Tournament in Minot would be the best time for all concerned. The Board then adjourned until the League meeting on Monday.

A short session was held immediately following the League meeting to consider the resignation of a coach at Hampden who resigned his position because of alleged interference of local fans in the administration of the athletic program of the school. Officials of the Ramsey County School Masters' Association appeared to report the incident. It was the opinion of the Board that additional facts should be secured and no action one way or another could be taken until more facts bearing on the case were presented.

The Board of Control was called into session on Tuesday morning, February 1st, to hear of certain problems of District No. 8 Class B. The question concerned the proper placing of Model High School in Minot in one of the divisions of the District. Supt. W. R. Stewart, Chairman of the

District, and Supt. Elmer Johnson of the committee appeared for the District. Opinion was expressed that a school within a given District should schedule a minimum number of games with schools in the District if they planned to participate in the tournament in the District. The Board felt that the proper placing of a school within a District is a local affair and should be handled by the schools of the District under the organization plan outlined by the Board of Control. Further, inasmuch as the District B chairmen would be meeting in Minot during the B Tournament, perhaps some attention could be given to the proper assignment of schools to the respective Districts and some solution be found for the problem in 1956.

There being no further business to come before the Board the meeting adjourned.

### MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

**Minot, North Dakota — March 18-19-1955**

The Board of Control of the North Dakota High School League met in Minot, North Dakota, on March 18-19, 1955, with all members present.

The Board met at 9 AM on Friday at the new municipal auditorium and were taken on an inspection trip through the building to survey the facilities that were available in the new building for the 1956 tournaments. Mayor Harrington issued a formal invitation for the Board to hold either the A or B finals in the building or any other tournaments they might see fit to bring to Minot. He assured the Board that these facilities would be available at no cost to the League. A lunch was served to the Board in the morning by the Minot delegation. President Zenner responded to the invitation of the Board and assured them that every consideration would be given the invitation. The Board of Control then adjourned to the Chamber of Commerce Offices and continued their meeting.

The location of the various tournaments occupied the Board's attention throughout much of Friday's session. The location of the various tournaments and the problems involved were thoroughly explored by the Board and final action deferred until Saturday after the B Committee Meeting. It was moved by Arveson, seconded by Gussner, and carried that Havig, Killie and Slatta be named a Special Officials' Committee to survey the District Committees in their respective classes of schools to obtain their recommendations as to acceptable officials for the 1956 tournament series. This Committee was instructed to present their recommendations at the August meeting of the Board of Control.

Upon motion of Havig and second by Arveson, Board members Killie, Gludt and Gussner were delegated to represent the Board of Control at the National Federation Meeting in York Harbor, Maine, next June.

The Board adjourned this meeting until 3 PM Saturday as several individual members wished to attend the Class B Committee meeting scheduled at 8 PM on Saturday morning. The Board again assembled at 3 PM Saturday at the MSTC gymnasium to complete the business at hand. Supt. Arveson reported the recommendations made at the Class B Committee meeting as follows:

1. It was proposed that some alternation plan should be worked out in Region IV, Class B between Bismarck and Dickinson so that the schools east of the river would not have to make the long trip to Dickinson each year.
2. It was proposed to renumber the present Class B Districts so that instead of having Sub-Districts there would be 16 Districts with a separate Committee in charge of each District. In Districts where Sub-District lines had not been drawn or were in controversy, it was recommended that a Committee of the Board, together with the chairmen of the Sub-Districts, would confer to draw up lines agreeable to the schools within a given District.
3. Some time was spent in discussing the problem of obtaining basketball scores for the newspapers and radio and TV stations in the state. No satisfactory solution to this problem appeared to be forthcoming.

Arveson, Killie and Gludt were appointed by President Zenner to serve on the B Committee and work out a plan of 16 Districts for Class B in cooperation with the District Committees of the present Districts.

Supt. Reich of Casselton appeared before the Board to extend an invitation on the part of the Casselton community to stage the Girl's State Tourney at Casselton. Mr. Reich reported that the Casselton Community Club would underwrite the tourney up to \$500. It was the opinion of the Board that any such offer should be in writing to be considered and that final action in the selection of a site for the Girl's Tourney be deferred until the August meeting of the Board.

The next item of business was the selection of sites and the determination of dates of the various Regional and State Tourneys. It was moved by Havig and seconded by Gussner that the Class A Basketball Tournaments be assigned as follows:

The date of the Girls' State Tourney was set for February 27-28-29th with the site to be determined at the August meeting of the Board of Control.

It was moved by Gludt, seconded by Killie, and carried that the starting dates of District Class B and C Tournaments and the Regional play-offs be at least seven days apart. Since the Regional Tournaments are set by the Board of Control, this implies that the District Committees must set the dates of the District events to conform to this requirement.

It was moved by Havig and seconded by Gludt that the following dates and sites be adopted for the balance of the 1956 tournaments:

The motion was carried.

The Board next proceeded to organize itself for the coming year beginning July 1st. William Gussner was nominated as President of the Board. It was moved by Havig, seconded by Arveson, and carried that the nominations be closed and an unanimous ballot be cast for William Gussner as President of the Board of Control. Gussner was declared elected President. E. S. Killie was nominated as Vice-President. Upon motion by Gussner and second by Havig nominations were closed and an unanimous ballot was cast for Killie as Vice-President. Killie was declared elected Vice-President.

The Board then selected August 25th and 26th as the date of their next meeting to be held at the League Office in Valley City. The Officials' Committee was instructed to meet on the 25th.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 5:15 PM.

### MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Jamestown, North Dakota — June 10, 1955

The Board of Control of the North Dakota High School League met at Jamestown at 3 P.M. on Friday, June 10th, with all six members present and Superintendent Zenner presiding.

The first item of business was the selection of dates and sites of several events scheduled for the 1955-56 school term. These events were determined at this time in order that they might be listed on the new school calendar to be distributed in August.

Upon motion of Havig and second by Killie, it was agreed to hold the second annual track clinic next spring at Jamestown on April 7, 1956. The Secretary was instructed to negotiate with the following men and arrange for one of them to conduct the clinic:

R. Walters, Track Coach, Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois  
Frank Potts, Colorado University, Boulder, Colorado; and Tom Botts  
University of Missouri Columbia, Missouri.

Upon motion of Arveson and second by Gussner, the State Class B-C Music and Speech Contest was set at Bismarck on May 4, 1956, with Superintendent T. E. Simle as manager of the event.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Music Committee and agreed to include a new classification for vocal ensemble groups of from five to nine contestants at both the district and state levels. Each school would be entitled to send one such group to the district contests in addition to the present girls' trio, boys' quartet, girls' quartet, and mixed quartet groups. This action was prompted in part by the requests made by music instructors to provide a classification for double trios, octettes and madrigal groups.

The next order of business was the selection of the site for the Girls' State Basketball Tournament. Invitations had been received from Carrington and Casselton. It was moved, seconded and carried that the 1956 Girls' State Basketball Tourney be held at Carrington with Superintendent Norman Hanson as the manager.

The recommendations of the Speech Committee were carefully reviewed and some time was spent on the problem of securing greater participation of the high schools in the state in speech activities. Superintendent Arveson gave a detailed report on the discussion activity as carried on in several other states. It was the opinion of the Board that a series of speech clinics over the state would be of material help in building interests in speech activities in general, and also in building interest in the field of discussion.

It was moved by Killie and seconded by Havig that we accept the recommendations of the Speech Committee and set up a series of six speech clinics over the state, and that we allow expenses as follows for these clinics:

Per diem expense of \$8.00 for board and room for each of the four conductors. Mileage for one car at seven cents per mile.

The tentative dates and locations of the clinics are as follows:

Valley City — Wednesday, November 2, 1955

Bismarck — Thursday, November 3, 1955

Dickinson — Friday, November 4, 1955

Williston — Saturday, November 5, 1955

Minot — Monday, November 7, 1955

Devils Lake — Thursday, November 8, 1955

Tentative conductors for the clinics are as follows:

Stage Craft — Dr. Fred Walsh, A. C., Fargo

Discussion — Superintendent R. G. Arveson, Leeds

Interpretation — Constance West, A. C., Fargo

Extempo Speech — (To be selected.)

It was the understanding that a new classification entitled **Discussion** be included in the speech events at the district and state level. It was also agreed that the time for such speech events as readings and oratory be cut from ten minutes to eight minutes, and that this time limit be enforced at both the district and state levels. All the above recommendations were voted upon by the Board and were carried.



The next order of business was the number of school calendars to order from **The Dalton Press**. Upon motion of Havig and second by Arveson, it was agreed to place an order for 1,500 copies of the calendar. It was suggested that **Class A** Schools should be entitled to four calendars, the average **Class B** School should be entitled to three calendars, and most **Class C** Schools might find use for two calendars. Schools wanting more copies could purchase them at cost from the League as long as the supply lasted.

A letter was read from Kvikstad of the Northern School Supply Company indicating their desire to present a trophy in memory of Charles Kimball and requesting approval of this venture and also suggestions as to the method of award. The Secretary was instructed to contact Mr. Kvikstad and report that such an award would be acceptable provided it carries no commercial advertising and some objective method could be worked out for its award. It was suggested that such an award could be possibly be given to the winning track school rather than be awarded to an individual.

Some time was spent in reviewing the proposed budget for clerical and office help. It was agreed to set up an allowance of \$4,800 for this purpose for the coming fiscal year.

Principal Gullikson of Jamestown, Manager of the State High School Baseball Tourney, met with the Board relative to possible ways of getting this tourney completed after rain had postponed the event for three days. It appeared that the coaches wanted the tourney completed and were willing to cooperate with any reasonable plan to bring it to a successful conclusion. The following plan was agreed to by the Board of Control, and Manager Gullikson was instructed to notify the teams of the Board's action:

1. The present eight teams would be paired on a geographical basis as follows:
 

Hope vs. Minto	Hettinger vs. Streeter
Casselton vs. Enderlin	Cando vs. Lansford
2. These games to be arranged by the schools concerned at a convenient place and dates prior to June 16th. The losers of these games would be eliminated from the tourney, and the winners would advance to the semi-finals round. Teams make their own arrangements for expenses or sharing of profits at this elimination series.
3. Tourney would be rescheduled for Jamestown on Thursday and Friday of June 16th and 17th with a new draw for positions as follows:
 

Winner of Casselton-Enderlin versus winner of Hope-Minto game.

Winner of Cando-Lansford versus winner of Hettinger-Streeter game.
4. Teams qualifying for the semi-finals will be allowed mileage at 20 cents per one way mile and will be fed breakfast and noon

lunch and allowed 75 cents for a supper meal for the time necessary for them to remain. Housing would again be furnished for teams finding it necessary to remain at Jamestown.

Some discussion was held concerning the present conflict between Junior American Legion Baseball and high school track activities. It was the opinion of the Board of Control that perhaps Legion Baseball could be started a week or two later and thus avoid some of the present conflict with high school track. The Secretary was instructed to contact the Junior Legion Baseball Committee to see if some plan could be worked out to remedy the situation.

A number of letters were read favoring the proposed **Class B** Basketball Districts for 1955-56 and others were also noted that expressed disapproval of the suggested changes. The Secretary was asked to contact the district chairman of those districts that were not satisfied with the new set up and request them to appear before the Board at the August meeting.

The Board next considered the appointment of a **Class B** man to the Board of Control to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Mr. Gludt. The names of many very excellent **Class B** men were considered. Upon motion of Havig and second by Killie, Superintendent K. L. Rue of Cavalier was named to fill the position until the next League election of a Board member.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

### MINUTES OF THE HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE MEETING

Fargo, North Dakota — October 21, 1954

The High School League Meeting was called to order by President Zenner at 2 PM with approximately 150 delegates present.

President Zenner announced that the minutes of the previous meeting were printed in the Annual Handbook and would be read by the Secretary if anyone so desired.

It was moved by Bachman of Cathay and seconded by Van Der Hoeven of Fillmore that the reading of the minutes be waived. The motion carried.

Old business was then called for and Superintendent E. S. Killie, the duly appointed official Representative of Fessenden High School, a member in good standing of the North Dakota High School League, read to the representatives of the members present at this meeting and moved the adoption of the following resolution amending the Constitution and By-Laws and changing the name of this association, which resolution is in words and figures as follows:

**RESOLUTION AMENDING CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE AND CHANGING THE NAME OF THE ASSOCIATION;**

**WHEREAS**, Article VII of the Constitution of the North Dakota High School League provides as follows:

## ARTICLE VII — AMENDMENTS

"The By-Laws and Regulations of the League may be amended by a majority vote of those present, at any regular meeting, provided this vote is 25% of all representatives, and provided notice of the proposed Constitution-amendment with its substance, has been served at a previous session or has been served by letter from the Secretary at the request of another representative and provided that there shall be a lapse of one month between the time of presentment and final vote thereon," and,

WHEREAS, There is a quorum of members present at this duly assembled regular meeting of the members of this Association, and the following and hereinafter stated amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association, together with notice that said proposed amendments would be presented to the next regular meeting, have all been duly served by letter from the Secretary of the Association to all member schools at the request of the special Constitution Committee appointed by President Gilliland at a Board of Control Meeting in October 1953, and authorized by High School League action on February 1, 1954, to be presented at this meeting of the High School League, and,

WHEREAS, Each member of the Association has received a full and complete copy of said proposed amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws together with notice of the fact that the question of adoption of said proposed amendments would be voted upon at this regular meeting and said notices have been given to and received by all members of this Association more than one month prior to this meeting, and,

WHEREAS, The present Constitution and By-Laws do not adequately cover the growing and expanding program of the Association, and the present name of the Association does not portray the purpose and field covered by the Association, and it would be to the best interest of the schools of North Dakota, their programs, all persons interested therein, and this Association to adopt the hereinafter set forth amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association, which in effect would be giving this Association a new Constitution and a new set of By-Laws adequately phrased and revised to enable the Association to meet present day trends and needs in the field of education.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, That Articles I to VII, both inclusive, of the Constitution of the North Dakota High School League and each and every part and section of each of said Articles, being all of the Articles of said Constitution, and each and every part, portion, and section thereof, and the whole of said Constitution be and the same is hereby amended and reenacted and adopted to read as follows, to-wit:

## PART II

**Constitution of the North Dakota High School****Activities Association****ARTICLE I—NAME**

This organization shall be known as the North Dakota High School Activities Association.

**ARTICLE II—PURPOSE**

The purpose of this Association is to contribute to the education of high school boys and girls of North Dakota by:

- a. Administering a program of interscholastic activities, clinics, contest and festivals among its member schools;
- b. Elevating the standards of good sportsmanship and encouraging growth in good citizenship, not only of high school students, but also of all others who come in contact with school activities;
- c. Protecting member schools, students, and personnel from exploitation by special interest groups;
- d. Encouraging pride in scholastic achievement as a fundamental basis for a well-balanced activities program;
- e. Supplementing the dramatic, literary, music and physical education programs of the schools and giving due emphasis to those tendencies which promise best to promote the mental and physical health and social well-being of all students.

**ARTICLE III—MEMBERS**

Section I: Any accredited high school, graded, consolidated or approved school, so classified by the State Department of Public Instruction may become a member of the Association by agreeing to abide by the rules of the Association as set forth in its Constitution and By-Laws, and by payment of the annual dues as hereinafter provided. The membership year shall be from September 1 to August 31 following.

Section II: Application for membership and acknowledgement of allegiance to the Association must be made by the superintendent or the principal of the school on the Association's prescribed form.

Section III: No school shall be admitted to the Association during a school year in which it has as a non-member been represented in any interscholastic competition by a student who would have been ineligible under the rules of the Association.

Section IV: Any school resigning its membership may not re-enter the Association during the period of the school year in which it resigns nor during the following year.

Section V: Any school may be suspended or expelled from membership by the Board of Directors for violation of rules; and once expelled or suspended, may be reinstated only by action of the Board.

Section VI: Schools, which do not participate in interscholastic activities but which desire to secure the benefits of the Association's A. A. B. Fund protection, may become eligible for such protection subject to the rules of the Association and payment of the dues thereof, but shall not be entitled to other privileges of membership.

Section VII: Any approved junior high school, housed and competing as a separate entity, may become a member of the Association by its principal completing the proper application forms as outlined in Section II above and by the payment of the annual dues.

Section VIII: Each member school shall have one vote in the Representative Assembly.

#### ARTICLE IV—DUES

Section I: Dues shall be based on the rate of seven cents per student enrolled in grades 9-12 for regular high schools or 7-9 for junior high schools, the enrollment being the official enrollment as of October 1 of the previous year. The amount of the dues shall not be less than eight dollars or more than fifty dollars annually. For schools or school districts not participating in interscholastic activities but desiring A. A. B. Fund protection, the annual dues shall be two dollars; for County-Units, the annual dues shall be ten dollars.

Section II: Special assessments may be levied by a two-thirds vote of the Representative Assembly.

Section III: Dues for the ensuing year are payable to the Executive Secretary-Treasurer on September first. All dues must be paid by November first and a penalty of one-half the amount of the original dues shall be added to the dues of each school which fails to pay by that date. Any school failing to remit its dues by December first is thereby automatically denied membership and may be reinstated only by Board action.

#### ARTICLE V—OFFICERS AND DUTIES

Section I: There shall be a Board of Directors, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of seven members, elected as hereinafter prescribed, for terms of three years. Each new member shall be seated July first following his election and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms, except that he may be appointed or elected to fill a vacancy after one year's absence from office. Two members of the Board shall be chosen from Class A Schools, two from Class B Schools, two from Class C Schools, and one member shall be elected at large.

Section II: Board members shall be nominated at the annual meeting of the Representatives of the Association, hereinafter called the Representative Assembly, and shall be elected by mail ballot,

such ballot to be prepared by the Secretary and mailed to member schools on or before January first following the nomination and shall be returned to the Secretary before January fifteenth, the ballot being valid if the envelope in which it is mailed is postmarked before midnight of January fourteenth.

Nominations for members from Class B Schools shall be made by a special nominating committee at the annual meeting in 1955, and for Class C Schools and member-at-large in 1956, and for Class A Schools in 1957, and thereafter in consecutive order as the terms of the various members expire. Nominations may also be made from the floor.

Should any member remove from the state or profession, change into a different class school, or cease to be an administrator, his position shall be declared vacant immediately and a new member appointed by the Board to fill the vacancy until the next annual meeting when the regular procedure of nomination and balloting shall be followed to fill vacancy for the remainder of the term of office.

Section III: The Board shall select from its membership a President and a Vice-President. Each shall exercise all the functions assigned to him by word or implication of the Constitution, By-Laws, and regulations of the Association or special rules of the Board. The President of the Board shall, in addition to his other duties, preside at all meetings of the Representative Assembly.

#### Section IV: POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD:

a. The Board of Directors shall constitute the executive and administrative body of the organization subject to the restraint of the Constitution, By-Laws and regulations of the Association.

b. It shall determine the time and place of its own meetings. Four members shall constitute a quorum.

c. It shall have general supervision over all interscholastic activities of the schools of the Association, and shall interpret the rules thereof.

d. It shall contract for the services of an executive Secretary-Treasurer who shall be paid a salary from the treasury of the Association. The qualifications, term of contract, and amount of salary to be paid the executive Secretary-Treasurer, hereinafter called the Secretary, shall be determined by the Board.

e. The Board shall have charge of the funds of the Association and shall determine what expenditures are necessary.

f. It shall decide all protests and shall fix the penalty for violation unless otherwise provided in the rules.

g. It shall have the power to make investigations relative to the violation of the rules of the Association.

h. It shall have the authority to appoint special committees to assist in the arrangement and supervision of various activities and contests.

i. It shall have the authority to approve or disapprove invitational meets, contests, or festivals in all types of interscholastic activities.

j. It shall provide suitable awards for the winners of contests conducted by the Association.

k. It shall have the authority to approve and register major officials in all inter-school contests.

l. It shall have the power to levy on the gross receipts of all tournaments conducted under Association auspices and to set entry fees for all activities.

m. It shall serve as a canvassing board for all elections.

n. In matters not herein determined, the Board shall have absolute authority until the next regular annual meeting of the Representative Assembly.

#### ARTICLE VI—EXECUTIVE SECRETARY-TREASURER

Section I: The Executive Secretary-Treasurer, hereinafter called the Secretary, is an officer of the Association and of the Board of Directors, and shall be appointed by said Board for a contract term of not to exceed three years.

Section II: The Secretary shall serve during the will and pleasure of the Board but shall not be removed during his term of office except for just and reasonable cause.

Section III: He shall receive for deposit and account for separately and separately all dues, fees and funds of the Association, expend them as directed by the Board and make a complete report of all receipts and expenditures to the Association at its annual meeting and such additional reports as he may deem necessary or may be required by the Board.

An audit of the financial records of the Association shall be made annually by a public accountant, and a report of such audit distributed to each member school of the Association.

Section IV: The Secretary shall be bonded in an amount fixed by the Board, the premium of such to be paid by the Association.

Section V: The Secretary shall be charged with the responsibility of maintaining an office and hiring assistants to conduct the Association's affairs, subject to the approval of the Board.

Section VI: The Secretary shall exercise the powers and prerogatives of an executive administrator of all Association policies, practices and projects, and shall direct and supervise all state-wide inter-school events as the Board may assign and direct.

#### ARTICLE VII—REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

Section I: The time and place of the regular meeting of the Representative Assembly shall be that of the North Dakota Education Association, the hour and place being designated by the Board.

Section II: Special meetings may be called by the Board and must be called by the Secretary upon written request of fifty representatives; notice of such special meeting must be mailed to all member schools at least fourteen days previous to the special meeting.

Section III: The Representative Assembly shall have legislative and nominating functions only.

Section IV: Fifty official representatives shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Each member school may be represented by only one representative and shall have only one vote.

#### ARTICLE VIII—DISTRICT COMMITTEES

Section I: The immediate management of all activities in the various districts and classes of schools of the state shall be placed in the hands of committees of three members who shall be chosen for a period of three years at the annual district meeting, one member of whom shall be elected each year. The representative of each member school shall be the superintendent or the principal. One of the members of the district committee shall be chosen chairman either by action of the district committee or by the representatives present.

Section II: In the event that the athletic district be of such size or contain so many schools as to be unwieldy for arranging contests or activities on the district level, it may, upon a majority vote of the representatives of the schools therein, sub-divide itself; and in such case each sub-division shall select its own committee to govern its own affairs.

Section III: Music and speech activities shall be governed by district committees of not more than three members of which at least one, but not more than two members, must be representative of each

of the classes of schools which participate in the activities of each such districts, except that when the district is comprised of one class only, three members shall be elected from the same class.

Section IV: The district chairman shall report or cause to be reported the names of the district committee members to the Secretary, who shall prepare and publish a list of all committee members and send same to all member schools.

Section V: The district committees shall meet at some suitable place on or before November fifteenth to consider the interscholastic affairs of its jurisdiction. To this meeting all superintendents, principals, coaches and/or music and speech directors shall be invited, and the committee shall conform to the directions of the member schools. At this meeting the basis for deciding district championships in athletics and/or participation in other interscholastic activities shall be determined.

#### Section VI: POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE DISTRICT COMMITTEE:

a. It shall have authority under the restraints of the Constitution and By-Laws and regulations of the Board over all matters concerning athletics and/or speech and music activities in the district.

b. The district committee shall report in full the proceedings of all meetings to all schools affected in the district and to the Secretary of the Association.

c. In such activities as are carried on to the state level, the district committee must conform in its planning with dates, fees, rules of eligibility and other regulations as set up on the next higher level or by the Board.

d. District athletic committees shall have authority to set aside annually from tournament receipts a sum to be determined by member schools which shall be held in the district to be used at the discretion of the district committee for legitimate expenditures of committee delegates or committee members in the conduct of district affairs.

#### ARTICLE IX—LOCAL CONTROL

Section I: The superintendent or the principal shall be the official Representative of the school, hereinafter called the Representative. He shall have the authority to appoint a faculty member to act as the official Representative, such appointment being indicated on the official delegate card issued annually to each school.

The Representative is responsible to the Association in all matters pertaining to the interscholastic relations of his school. He shall

not permit his Board of Education or other individuals or delegations to interfere in inter-school relations, but these must be conducted entirely by the duly appointed administrative officer of the school or the Representative.

Section II: The principal or superintendent of each member school shall read or cause to be read to the high school and/or junior high school pupils thereof on or before September fifteenth of each year the eligibility rules of the Association. These rules shall be posted in the high school assembly room or on the school bulletin board and copies given to local papers. Special district rules and/or special rules of the Board shall be read and posted as soon as possible after their receipt.

Section III: Member schools may join Conferences or may unite with other schools to form Conferences provided all such schools are members in good standing of the Association or of Associations or Leagues of other states or provinces, and provided, always, that the rules and regulations of such Conferences be in conformity with the rules of the Association and subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Board. A copy of the Constitution and By-Laws of each such Conference must be filed with the Secretary.

#### ARTICLE X—A. A. B. FUND PLAN

The Association authorizes the Board to establish, maintain and administer a mutual accident benefit plan for grade and high school students of member schools of the Association as well as graded and consolidated schools, rural schools, and others which are approved by the Board for participation in the plan, to fix the schedule of benefits and rates, and to make such revisions or alterations as the circumstance or the financial status of the A. A. B. Fund may demand.

#### ARTICLE XI—AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Constitution may be made by a majority vote of the member schools in a mail ballot, and amendments to the By-Laws and regulations of the Association may be made by a majority vote of those present at any regular or special meeting if fifty or more Representatives are in attendance, provided in both instances that notice of the proposed amendment with its substance has been served at a previous meeting or by letter from the Secretary at the request of a Representative, and provided further, that there shall have been a lapse of thirty days between the time of presentment and the final vote thereon.



## BY-LAWS

**ARTICLE I—CONDUCT OF MEETINGS, RULES OF ORDER**

Section I: Time and place of meetings: Meetings of the Representative Assembly shall be held in accordance with the provisions of Article VII, Sections I and II of the Constitution, and shall be at an hour and place as determined by the Board, and such time and place shall be specified in the notice of meeting sent to each member school at least two weeks prior to the date of meeting.

Section II: Call to order: At the stated hour of meeting the President shall take the chair, call the members to order, and on the appearance of a quorum, proceed to business.

Section III: Representatives: Only those who are official Representatives holding the signed delegate cards shall be seated and permitted to participate in the business of the Assembly, unless specifically empowered to do so by the President.

Section IV: Quorum: Fifty Representatives shall constitute a quorum.

Section V: Committees: All Committees, whether standing or special, shall be appointed by the President unless otherwise provided by the Representative Assembly.

A Nominating Committee, consisting of not less than three nor more than five members, shall be appointed by the President at least two weeks prior to the annual meeting of the Representative Assembly for the purpose of nominating members to fill vacancies on the Board of Directors as provided in Article V, Section II of the Constitution.

The Nominating Committee shall submit one nominee for each vacancy, but the Representatives shall have the power to make additional nominations from the floor.

Section VI: Adoption of Committee reports: Reports of committees shall be considered in their proper place in the order of business, and where reports are of such a nature that a vote is necessary for adoption, the President shall determine the manner of voting provided that no action may be taken on committee reports except in a regular or special meeting of the Representative Assembly, and provided further, that any member may call for a recorded vote by member schools if he is not satisfied with the method of voting selected by the President. If such member is sustained in his request by a majority of the members present, a recorded vote shall be taken.

Section VII: Motions: No motion shall be debated until the same shall have been seconded and put by the Chair; and if desired by any member, motions shall be reduced to writing, delivered to the President, and read before the same shall be debatable.

Section VIII: Debate: No member shall speak more than once on the same question without leave of the presiding officer, unless

he be the author of the matter pending, in which case he shall be permitted to speak in reply, and provided further, that no member shall speak more than a total of five minutes on any question.

Section IX: Robert's Rules of Order: Where not specifically provided for in the rules of order, all matters of parliamentary procedure shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

**ARTICLE II—CLASSIFICATION OF SCHOOLS**

There shall be three classes of schools for purpose of interscholastic competition:

a. Class A Schools: This group shall comprise the sixteen largest high schools in the state in point of enrollment in grades 9-12 as of October 1. This list of schools, as compiled in 1954 on the basis of the average enrollment for the previous four years, shall be revised as necessary every four years.

b. Class B Schools: This group shall consist of those schools whose enrollment in grades 9-12 as of October 1 as indicated in the annual report was 75 or above exclusive of the Class A Schools, provided, however, that schools with 9-12 grade enrollments of 56 to 74 may elect to compete in either Class B or C competition, such choice to be made by October 1 of the current year and to extend for a three year period. Provided further, that any school below Class A which has traditionally competed in Class B may petition the Board for permission to continue in this classification. Upon concurrence of the Board such school must compete in Class B and can change its classification only upon two years' notice to the Board. Provided further, that when the high school enrollment in grades 9-12 as of October 1 rises above 75 or drops below 56, that school shall have one year of grace in which to choose its class of competition.

c. Class C Schools: This classification shall consist of those schools which have a high school enrollment in grades 9-12 as of October 1 of 55 or less except as provided for in the above section.

**ARTICLE III—CONTESTS**

Section I: Final agreement for contests between two Association schools shall be incorporated into contracts on forms provided by the Association. These contracts shall be executed by mutual consent of the Representatives of the respective schools and exchanged prior to the contests, and shall not be cancelled or altered except by mutual consent of the schools involved.

Section II: No member of the Association shall schedule or engage in any contest with a non-member school which is eligible for membership in the Association under penalty of suspension for the remainder of the year; nor shall any member school enter into any

contest with an out-of-state school which is not similarly qualified in respect to its own state.

Section III: No member of the Association shall engage in any contest with a school whose membership has been suspended during the period of such suspension.

Section IV: At least one week prior to any contest between Association schools, the schools must exchange eligibility lists made on the Association's forms, on which the superintendent and/or the principal of the school shall certify to the present eligibility of each contestant listed and pledge the use of only those who remain eligible at the time of the contest.

Section V: In any contest whatsoever, except those among students in the same school, no ineligible student shall be used; nor shall such student appear on the field or floor in uniform or otherwise participate as a member of the contesting organization or group. Non-member schools using contestants of less than eligible status may not secure membership in the Association within the same year.

Section VI: Contesting schools shall each have present an authorized faculty representative who shall be responsible to his school for the conduct of its participants and students throughout the contest and the visiting team's stay away from home.

Section VII: Students shall not serve as business managers to arrange or handle contests between schools.

Section VIII: High standards of courtesy, fair-dealing and sportsmanship must feature all Association contests. The Board may regulate schools or students in these respects, recognizing high attainment and penalizing low.

Section IX: Each school shall keep adequate records of contests and contestants on the record books or blanks provided by the Association; all reports required by the Board shall be supplied promptly and accurately.

Section X: No interscholastic event shall be held on Sunday.

#### ARTICLE IV—RULE VIOLATIONS

Section I: Neither contest rules or eligibility rules may be waived by common consent, and they must be fully observed by Association members even though competing with non-members.

Section II: All questions in dispute shall be referred to the Board and its decision shall be final.

Section III: Any school entering a protest against another school shall submit in writing a full statement of facts and grounds for protest to the Secretary who shall submit a copy to the superintendent or principal of the accused school. Such protest shall be accompanied

by a deposit of ten dollars (\$10.00) which shall later be returned if the protest is sustained by the Board. The school against which a protest or any charge has been made shall have the privilege of presenting its case to the Board.

Section IV: For any violation of Association rules an offending student may be barred from participating in contests which come under Association jurisdiction; and an offending school may be suspended, expelled, or caused to forfeit games or championship rights.

Section V: In case of protests or charges against schools for violation of the rules, the Board may suspend for one year any school whose case is presented by legal counsel or delegations of any sort.

#### ARTICLE V—PENALTIES

Section I: Expulsion: A school may be expelled:

- a. If the superintendent or principal is not responsible for the control of the interscholastic activities of his school, or
- b. If it refuses to abide by the decisions of the Board.

Section II: Suspension: A school may be suspended:

- a. For playing an ineligible player,
- b. For failure to fulfill contracts,
- c. For playing a suspended school or an eligible non-member school,
- d. For willful violation of the Constitution, By-Laws, or regulations of the Association,

- e. For unduly influencing a student to attend school or by offering or giving any remuneration either directly or indirectly to influence him to attend or his family to reside in a given district in order to establish the student's eligibility on the team or activities of the school, or
- f. For failure to submit annual reports.

Section III: Forfeit of Games: A school may be required to forfeit games:

- a. For playing ineligible players, or
- b. For other violations of the Constitution, By-Laws or regulations of the Association.

Section IV: Forfeit of Championship Rights: A school may be required to forfeit championship rights:

- a. For playing ineligible players in any District, Regional, or State Tournament or play-off, or
- b. For any violation of the Constitution, By-Laws, or regulations of the Association.

#### ARTICLE VI—SANCTIONS

Section I: No member school shall be represented by any team group in an interscholastic event where more than two schools are

represented unless such event shall have received the sanction of the Board.

Section II: No interscholastic football game shall be played after the final State championship has been decided; no interscholastic basketball game or tournament shall be played after the final State high school championship game each year.

Section III: In case a contest consists of schools from more than one state, National Federation approval and Association clearance must be secured providing the distance is more than 600 miles round trip, or unless these contests are between near-by schools on interstate conferences or between schools which have regularly competed in such sports during past seasons.

#### ARTICLE VII—AMATEURISM

Section I: All contestants must be amateurs.

Section II: Professionalism is defined as accepting remuneration, directly or indirectly, for playing on athletic teams, or for managing, officiating, or playing under assumed names. Reasonable meals, lodging and transportation may be accepted if accepted in service and not in any other way.

Section III: A student shall be considered as violating his amateur standing if he participates in athletic activities, schools, try-outs, practices and games held or sponsored by professional athletic organizations, clubs, or their representatives during the season of a sport. This rule shall not apply to activities during the summer vacation.

NOTE: Any employee or school official of a member school who acts as an agent or encourages any negotiations between a student and representatives of Organized Baseball prior to the student's graduation is violating the agreement between the National Federation and Organized Baseball. Such action on the part of any employee or school official may cause his school to be suspended from the Association for a period of time to be determined by the Board. Any evidence that a representative of Organized Baseball is attempting to, or has signed a student prior to graduation, should be reported to the Secretary at once. This is a violation of the agreement between the National Federation and Organized Baseball, and penalty for such action is under the jurisdiction of Organized Baseball.

Section IV: No high school student shall be eligible to participate in any inter-school contest or activity under the rules of the Association if it shall be shown that he or any member of his family is receiving or has received any remuneration, either directly or indirectly, to influence him or his family to reside in a given school district

or to attend any given school in order to establish eligibility on the team or organizations of said school, and any school permitting such participation shall, upon satisfactory evidence, be suspended from membership in the Association for a term of not less than a year.

This rule shall not interfere with the right of high school pupils to work during vacation or during out-of-school hours in order to pay their way through school. It shall apply to the use of funds created by gift or by subscription with the intent of offering them or parts of them for the free use of the student or any member of his family as an inducement to secure their attendance at said school and to become eligible for participation in the activities thereof.

Section V: Reinstatement of amateur: A high school student who has violated his amateur standing according to the rules and By-Laws of the Association may apply for reinstatement as an amateur to the Board one calendar year after the date he was declared ineligible on account of the violation, provided he has been in school throughout the year.

Such application shall be in writing and shall be signed by the student and superintendent or principal, and shall certify that one calendar year has elapsed since the student was declared ineligible, and that the student has not violated amateur rules during that calendar year.

#### ARTICLE VIII—AWARDS

Section I: The giving and receiving of awards and medals shall: a) be kept within reasonable bounds, b) have symbolic value only, and c) be done by and with the consent and under the supervision of the superintendent and/or principal concerned.

NOTE: The giving and receiving of awards by and with the consent and under the supervision of the superintendent and/or principal concerned shall mean that the supervising official of each school shall have real control and supervision without pressure of any kind from outside persons or groups of persons.

Section II: Awards such as unattached letter, trophy, metal football, metal basketball, metal track shoe, or similar article symbolic value only may be given, provided that the cost of the award shall not exceed five dollars (\$5.00).

Section III: Conferences or schools conducting invitational tournaments and meets under Association rules may make awards to the winning schools or contestants, provided that the awards are within the bounds of the Sections I and II above.

Section IV: Suitable awards of symbolic value only may be given by such organizations as service clubs, patriotic organizations, civic groups, Dads' and Mothers' Clubs, and the sports department of a newspaper, radio, or television station. No awards shall be accepted which in any way advertises any firm or individual so far as commercial or business interests are concerned.

Section V: The Board shall have authority to designate, give and control medals and trophies to be awarded to schools or individuals on championship teams in any sport or activity, provided that these awards are kept within the bounds of Sections I and II.

Section VI: Awards, medals, recognitions, gifts, trips, and honors shall not be accepted by individuals or schools from colleges, universities and higher institutions of learning and their alumni. High school athletics or performers should be permitted to complete their high school careers without being molested by outside sources.

Section VII: Penalties for violations of the above rules may be suspension of the school and ineligibility of the individual who accepts the award.

#### ARTICLE IX—QUALIFICATIONS OF COACHES

Section I: Each coach shall be a certified teacher, and shall be employed as a teacher in the community in which he coaches.

Section II: A teacher in order to qualify for a coaching assignment shall be required to have been assigned to teaching, supervisory, or administrative duties other than his coaching duties for a period of time equivalent to at least half the regularly scheduled class time in the school where said teaching, supervisory, or administrative duties are to be performed. Study hall supervision shall be regarded as the equivalent of classroom teaching.

#### ARTICLE X—OFFICIALS

Section I: The major officials in all inter-school contests shall be on the registered list of officials of the Association.

Section II: Registered status shall be secured by making application to the Board through the Secretary, and approved officials shall be given approval cards signed by the Secretary.

Section III: Qualifications and standards for approval shall be set by the Board, and only such officials as are properly registered shall be eligible for approval.

#### ARTICLE XI—PHYSICAL EXAMINATION, PARENTS' CONSENT

Section I: No pupil shall be allowed to represent his school in school or grade athletics or other strenuous activities until there is on file with the superintendent or principal a statement signed by a practicing physician and his parents or legal guardian certifying that he has passed an adequate physical examination since August 20

of the current school year; that in the opinion of the examining physician he is physically fit to participate in such activities; and that he has the consent of his parents or legal guardian to participate.

#### ARTICLE XII—SPORTS SEASONS

##### Section I: Football:

a. The full season shall not exceed a period of 13 consecutive weeks.

b. Practice sessions shall start at least fourteen days prior to the first game.

c. There shall be no spring football practice and the date of the first fall practice shall be set by the Board.

d. No more than two games may be played in any seven day period.

e. No game shall be played after November 15.

f. No practice sessions shall be held except in the immediate environment of the city or the school district in which the school is located.

##### Section II: Basketball:

a. The full season shall not exceed a total of twenty consecutive weeks.

b. Two complete calendar weeks of practice, including a minimum of ten separate daily sessions, are required before the first game.

c. Total games played shall not exceed the number of weeks constituting the season. Tournament games shall not count in the maximum number permitted.

d. The season shall end on the last day of the last State Tournament. The last State Tournament shall end on the Saturday nearest to March 19.

e. An alumni game, if played, shall count as one of the games permitted.

##### Section III: Track:

a. The track season shall consist of a winter and spring period of not more than sixteen weeks.

b. The track season shall end with the final State meet.

##### Section IV: Other sports:

a. In all other sports the length of season, number of games, and events entered by individual contestants shall be determined by the Board.

#### ARTICLE XIII—RULES OF ELIGIBILITY

Section I: A student shall have been in attendance as many school days as he missed at the opening of the semester should his enrollment not have been made at the opening of the semester, provided, however, that he shall have made such enrollment and begun regular work prior to the thirty-first day of the semester.

Section II: He shall not compete for more than four seasons in any one branch of interscholastic contests; provided that competition while in the eighth grade or below shall not constitute one of four seasons.

Section III: He shall not have participated in a similar contest during the same school year as a member of any other than a high school team.

Section IV: He shall not have been enrolled in any institution of higher rank than a secondary school.

Section V: He shall be doing passing work in at least fifteen hours per week, the passing grade to be computed from the opening of the semester and to relate to such subjects only as severally and individually shall have a credit value of one-half unit per semester.

NOTE: This means three subjects, each of which is equal to a half-unit of credit a semester, on the basis of sixteen credits required for graduation. Fractional credits, such as  $\frac{1}{4}$  unit each in physical education and glee club, for example, may not be combined or added together to form the necessary credits required for eligibility. Pupils below the ninth grade must be passing in all subjects to be eligible.

Section VI: He shall not be a graduate of a four year high school course, nor a graduate of a senior high school offering three courses comprising the tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades. Neither shall he compete after having earned credits sufficient to meet the graduating requirements in any course of study prescribed by the school he is to represent unless such credits have been earned in less than eight semesters of school attendance.

Section VII: He shall not be eligible to compete in interscholastic activities on or after the day on which the twentieth anniversary of his birth occurs.

Section VIII: After attending the first semester of the ninth grade he shall have credit on the school records in the unit-per-year or half-unit-per-semester subjects of at least three half-units earned and recorded at the close of the last semester in which he was enrolled as a student, thirty days or more of attendance or participation in interscholastic competition within any shorter period being sufficient to constitute enrollment in any semester.

Section IX: He shall be an amateur and shall always have contested under his own name. (See Article VIII, By-Laws)

Section X: He shall have been in attendance in the school he represents for one complete semester of eighteen weeks upon transferring from another school if the transfer is made at the opening of

the first semester, and in attendance for one full year of two consecutive semesters if the transfer is made during the second semester, unless his parents have become residents of the district to which he is transferred or the school from which he is transferred does not offer work of the corresponding year in which he is ranked.

NOTE: Opening of the first semester means within the first thirty days of the semester. (See Section I) If the transfer is made prior to the thirty-first day of the first semester, he becomes eligible at the end of eighteen full weeks; if transfer is made during the first semester but after the thirtieth day of the semester, he becomes eligible at the end of the second semester. If transfer is made during the second semester, he becomes eligible to compete at the end of the first semester during the next school year.

Section XI: He shall not participate in any interscholastic contest after his eighth semester in high school unless he is under 18 years of age, nor after his seventh semester if his seventh and eighth are not consecutive.

#### STANDARDS:

HE SHALL NOT USE TOBACCO OR ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DURING THE SCHOOL TERM OF TWO SEMESTERS.



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the adoption of these Amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws and the change of name of this Association does not create a new organization and the adoption of said Amendments and said change of name shall not by any one be construed in any way to create a new organization or change the status of this Association, and for that reason there is no change in the status of this Association or in the terms of said officers and there is no change in ownership of property.

F. H. Gilliland, the duly appointed official representative of Devils Lake, a member in good standing of the North Dakota High School League, seconded the motion to adopt said resolution.

Joe Day Inkster questioned the secrecy of the ballot as provided in Section II, Article V of the Constitution, and moved that all ballots be provided with a special envelope marked "ballot" to be inserted inside another envelope and to be deposited in the ballot box after the outside envelope had been removed. The motion lost for the want of a second.

Van Der Hoeven of Fillmore moved the addition of the following sentence to Article IX, Section I of the By-Laws:

"This Section shall not apply to Class C Schools."

The Amendment was seconded by Laschkewitsch of Hannah. After a general discussion a vote was called for and the Amendment lost.

Superintendent Bangs of Bottineau then moved that Sections I and II of Article IX of the By-Laws be withdrawn and the provisions in Article V, Section VIII of the present By-Laws be substituted for this Section. This motion was seconded by Laschkewitsch. After a general discussion, the question was called for and on a show of hands it was defeated 70 to 34.

A general discussion was then engaged in concerning the definition of a coach. It was then moved by Gilliland and seconded by Day that the word "athletic" be added before the word "coach" wherever it appeared in Article IX of the By-Laws. This motion was also lost.

It was then moved by Pennington of Rugby and seconded by Barthel of Courtenay that the final action on the resolution to adopt the new Constitution and By-Laws be tabled until the February meeting of the League.

Some discussion then ensued over the length of time available for a League meeting during the NDEA. It was moved by Funk of Willow City that the League meeting be held on the morning of the second day of the convention. In the discussion it was brought out that there were numerous conflicts with other meetings. It was then moved by Havig that the League meeting be called for 2:00 PM on the second day of the NDEA Convention. Funk then withdrew his original motion in favor of the second motion and offered the second to Havig's motion. A vote was called for and the Havig motion prevailed.

It was then moved by Superintendent Mullan of Upham that the nominating committee be authorized to bring in one name for each vacancy on the Board. The motion was seconded by Robinson. The motion lost.

Other business was called for; none was offered and President Zenner called for the report of the Nominating Committee. Superintendent Roberts, Chairman, of Hettinger offered the following:

Wm. Gussner and Al Hagen for one position on the Board of Control. L. T. Havig and Paul Miller for one position on the Board of Control. L. Hanson and J. Pennington for the member-at-large.

R. G. Arveson of Leeds was nominated from the floor for the member-at-large. It was moved by Grant and seconded by Van Der Hoeven that nominations be closed. Motion was carried. Chairman Zenner appointed tellers to canvass the vote. Vote indicated the following results:

Gussner 58 votes versus Hagen 29 votes.

Havig 66 votes, versus Miller 18 votes.

Arveson 40 votes, versus Hanson, 29 votes, versus Pennington 18 votes.

Messrs. Gussner and Havig were declared elected for the three year term. Arveson of Leeds was declared elected for the short term as member-at-large. It was moved by Bachman and seconded by Mattson that the meeting be adjourned. Meeting adjourned 5:45 PM.

## MINUTES OF THE HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE MEETING

Bismarck, North Dakota -- January 31, 1955

The High School League met in Bismarck City Auditorium on Monday, January 31, 1955, with approximately 175 schools represented. The meeting was called to order at 3:15 PM by President K. L. Zenner.

President Zenner called upon Board member L. T. Havig, who is a member of the Executive Board of the National Federation, to introduce Executive Secretary H. V. Porter of Chicago, who had been invited to address the group on the topic "The Administration of the Athletic Program in the High Schools of the Nation." Mr. Porter responded with a splendid address in his usual competent manner.

Following the address President Zenner called the group to order to consider old and new business of the League.

It was suggested that the minutes of the previous session might be waived unless there were objections to this procedure inasmuch as they were printed in the November News-Letter and had been mailed to all schools. Upon motion of Roberts and second by several, it was agreed to waive the reading of the minutes.

The Executive Secretary was called upon to give a brief report of the finances of the League for the current year. Mimeographed copies of the report to date were furnished to all present and some time was spent in explaining the various items.

President Zenner then called for any old business to come before the group. Supt. Grant of Hillsboro called the attention to the group to the resolution concerning the adoption of the new Constitution which was presented at the fall meeting of the League and tabled until this meeting. Supt. Grant moved that the matter of adopting the new Constitution be now made the first matter of business and that such matter now be taken from the table for consideration. The motion was seconded by Roberts of Hettinger. President Zenner called for discussion on the question, and after a brief discussion, the question was called for and by unanimous vote it was agreed to take this motion from the table for consideration at this time.

Pending Amendments were then made the next item of business and the Secretary was called upon to read the Amendments that had been submitted in the January News-Letter for the second reading.

Article IX, Section I of the By-Laws as submitted read as follows: "EACH COACH SHALL BE A CERTIFIED TEACHER, AND SHALL BE EMPLOYED AS A TEACHER IN THE COMMUNITY IN WHICH HE COACHES."

The Amendment submitted in the January News-Letter would add the following sentence to the Section I above so it then would read as follows:

"EACH COACH SHALL BE A CERTIFIED TEACHER, AND SHALL BE EMPLOYED AS A TEACHER IN THE COMMUNITY IN WHICH HE COACHES. THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS IS EMPOWERED TO TEMPORARILY WAIVE THE CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENT UPON SATISFACTORY PROOF THAT A PROPERLY CERTIFIED COACH COULD NOT BE SECURED."

Supt. Bachman of Cathay moved the adoption of this Amendment to Article IX, Section I of the By-Laws of the Constitution. The motion was seconded by Grant of Hillsboro and after discussion the Amendment was carried by unanimous vote.

The Secretary then read the proposed addition to Section IV of the Constitution under powers and duties of the Board:

"IT SHALL HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO ACQUIRE BY PURCHASE, GIFT, DEVISE, OR OTHERWISE REAL ESTATE OR INTERESTS THEREIN FOR THE GENERAL USE AND PURPOSES OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION; TITLE TO ALL REAL ESTATE ACQUIRED BY THE SAID ASSOCIATION SHALL BE VESTED IN THE PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT, AND EXECUTIVE SECRETARY-TREASURER, AND THEIR SUCCESSORS IN OFFICE, AS TRUSTEES FOR THE ASSOCIATION. SAID TRUSTEES SHALL HOLD, OPERATE, LEASE, CONVEY, ENCUMBER AND CAREFULLY MANAGE ALL REAL ESTATE OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION AS THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL DIRECT FOR THE USE AND BENEFIT OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION."

Supt. Killie of Fessenden moved the adoption of this Amendment and this was duly seconded by Olson of Lisbon. After a discussion the question was called for and the Amendment was adopted by unanimous vote.

President Zenner then called for any other Amendment or changes to be offered to the proposed Constitution and By-Laws. None was submitted.

Supt. Gilliland of Devils Lake then moved the adoption of the Constitution and By-Laws as amended in accordance with the resolution submitted by Supt. E. S. Killie at the October, 1954, meeting of the League and laid on the table until this meeting. The motion was seconded by Roberts of Hettinger.

Upon calls for the question, President Zenner called for a vote on the question of adopting the Constitution and By-Laws of the North

Dakota High School Activities Association in accordance with the original resolution as submitted by Supt. Killie at the October meeting and the Amendments now approved. All members present voted "aye" with no dissenting votes.

President Zenner then declared the Constitution and By-Laws of the North Dakota High School Activities Association adopted by unanimous vote effective July 1, 1955.

New business was then called for and none was submitted.

It was then moved and seconded that this meeting be now adjourned. The motion was carried and the meeting adjourned at 5:00 P.M.

#### MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE NORTH DAKOTA OFFICIALS' ASSOCIATION MEETING MINOT, NORTH DAKOTA — MARCH 19, 1955

The Executive Committee of the North Dakota Officials' Association met at Minot, North Dakota, on Saturday at 11 AM with all members of the Committee present. President Meyer called for any old business. A general discussion followed on the question of rating officials. President Meyer reported on the Minnesota experience of rating officials and the tendency to rate officials when they were not too satisfactory and to give no response when their services were satisfactory. The question of the detailed work involved in such a program was also outlined. With 700 officials in the state working games for ten or more schools, a rating system could involve the processing of some 7,000 letters if all schools respond. A general feeling was expressed that the proposed surveys of schools for possible officials for the different tournaments would accom-

lish much that a rating system would do, without the detailed work required under a rating system. It was agreed to defer any request for a rating system at this time.

The advisability of changing the meeting date of the Officials' Group from the B Tourney to the Valley City Coaching Clinic at Thanksgiving was discussed, and it was agreed to bring this matter before the Officials' Group for action.

The qualification of officials for membership in local associations was also discussed. It appeared that there was no check with officials to determine if they were registered with the State Association. Membership in the North Dakota Officials' Association should be a pre-requisite to membership in any local. It was also suggested that officials should sign the score book and indicate their registration number following each contest.

Some time was also spent in discussing methods whereby the Board of Control of the High School League would have available the best men to work tournament games. Reuben Hammond was delegated to survey all local associations and other areas where local associations were not operating to obtain a good list of officials who were considered competent to work tournament games, and meet with the Board of Control to assist in the selection of officials at their August meeting.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Some time was spent discussing the merits of the Three Officials System in basketball. Mr. Busse explained in detail how the System operated through illustrated drawings and expressed the opinion that this System could be easily adopted by any three officials without previous experience in its use. It was moved by Agre and seconded by Hoidal that this group recommend to the Board of Control that the Three Officials System be given a trial at one or more League sponsored tournaments. The motion was carried.

A general discussion of the fees to be paid officials was held with no action taken.

There being no further business, the chair requested that the southeast and the southwest groups meet for the purpose of nominating their delegate to the Executive Board.

Following the caucus the group again met. Lewy Lee was nominated by the southeast group. It was duly moved, seconded and carried that nominations cease and that a unanimous ballot be cast for Lewy Lee as a member of the Board of Directors for a two year term. The southwest group then brought in the name of Eddie Agre as their nominee from that section. It was duly moved, seconded and carried that nominations cease and that a unanimous ballot be cast for Agre for membership to the Board of Directors for a two year term.

It was then moved and seconded that this meeting be adjourned. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 2:15 P.M.

Mr. Stevens, Chairman of the Nominating Committee consisting of Stevens, Gates and Simle, submitted the name of Supt. McCrea of Valley City for President to succeed Mr. Zimmerman. Moved by Leifur that the Nominating Committee report be accepted and the Secretary be instructed to cast a unanimous ballot. Seconded. Carried.

Moved by Hovde that the conference recommend to the Board of Control that the State Tournament be alternated East and West each year with the 1956 tournament to be held in the West. Seconded by Johnson.

On a roll call vote, the eastern division schools all voted "no". The western division schools all voted "yes". Dickinson was absent. The motion lost 8-7.

Moved by Carlson that the Secretary be instructed to send out four passes to each school. These passes to admit the school officials free to all Class "A" athletic events sponsored by a Conference School. Seconded. Carried. (It was pointed out in the discussion that the chief need for the tickets was for scouting purposes.) Secretary's note: These passes will be mailed in the fall.

Moved by Hovde that all schools send opponents information of their playing roster at least one week prior to a game with an opponent. Seconded. Carried.
