FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association hereby presents an historical account of the more important activities of the Association during the past year. Again this year, it has been necessary to condense certain material to prevent the book from becoming too voluminous. Every effort has been made to preserve all important items, and any interested reader will find that the ensuing pages contain quite a complete record of the major achievements of the Association during the past year.

The following represent the more important accomplishments:

- 1. The monthly mimeographed news letter was replaced by a printed monthly bulletin entitled, The North Dakota High School Activities Bulletin. The bulletin of from eight to twelve pages is issued each month during the school term and is mailed to 2,000 readers, including member schools, officials, county superintendents, colleges, and others interested in the high school program of the state. The printed bulletin has relieved the office of a vast amount of detailed work and has presented the reader with a more attractive publication in a form more acceptable to the busy reader. The new publication costs very little more than the former mimeographed letter when labor and mailing costs are considered.
- 2. Arrangements were made with the Post-Office Department to mail the bulletin under a Second Class Mailing Permit and a considerable saving in mailing cost has been effected.
- 3. In the field of speech, two advances were made. A series of six Speech Clinics were conducted throughout the state. This resulted in a greater interest in speech and a better quality of speech work. A new field of discussion was added to the speech classifications and the response by the schools was most encouraging with more than three hundred participants entering discussion activities during this first year. This project will be continued during the coming year.
- 4. In the field of music, there is evidence of a steady growth with more schools participating in a greater number of events. Not only is there greater participation, but the quality of the material presented has made greater advancement. Many of the smaller high schools of the state now have their instrumental and vocal groups and are playing selections used only in the larger schools a decade or so ago. North Dakota can be justly proud of the music accomplishments of its schools and can be assured that North Dakota school children rank favorably with those in other states in general music training. In Class A Schools, a section was organized for orchestra and string instruments. From all reports, the Orchestra Festival was a huge success and plans have been made to continue the project another year.
- Another innovation during the past year was a cooperative project between the School Administrators' section of the N. D. E. A. and the High School Activities Association in which one session

of the administrators' program was turned over to the Association and devoted to matters of mutual interest to the two organizations.

6. In reporting the accomplishments of the year, the amazing growth and general acceptance of the Accident Benefit Fund must not be overlooked. A history of that growth will be found summarized in this handbook. During the past year, more than 3,200 claims totaling \$54,253 have been paid to cushion the financial shock of school accidents during the past school year. All but six counties provided this protection for the rural children of the county and more than 98% of the high schools carry the protection. During the past year, 106,000 school children have been enrolled in the Fund.

In a recent address by Dr. Hamilton of the University of Wyoming Law School to delegates at the National Federation of State High School Athletic Association, tribute was paid to the progressive legislation in North Dakota in permitting school districts to purchase this protection out of the general school funds of a school district.

7. In general, the year has been successful in the field of athletics. Basketball continues to be the major sport for most schools and the interest continues to grow in that field. The highlight of the basketball tournament season was the winning of the Class B title by an all-Indian team from Fort Yates. Football continues to be a major sport in all high schools with an enrollment large enough to play the game. There appears to be

a trend to step up from the six-man game to eight-man football. In one conference, nine-man football has made its appearance. Interest in track is evident by the increased number of schools participating and the number of records that were broken at the State Track Meet.

Participation in baseball is increasing each year and the quality of performance shows steady progress.

The list of entrants to the State Golf Tournament was the largest recorded since the tourney was established.

8. Many worthwhile projects inaugurated in past years are continued. Some of the more important ones include the publication of a school calendar, the registration and training of officials in the major sports, the publication and distribution of Music and Speech Rules and Regulations for Contests and Festivals, the distribution of rule books and related publications, and the administration of the Accident and Benefit Plan for the schools of the state.

For the coming year, there will be additional improvements in present services, and several new projects will be placed in operation. The following appear to be the more important services which will be new for 1956-57:

- Plans are being formulated for a new type of Basketball Rules Clinics which will devote the entire day to the rules and provide demonstrations of the mechanics of officiating.
- 2. The importance of the cheerleader at athletic events is being recognized by all states and arrangements have been made to

conduct a Cheerleaders' Clinic during the month of October. This can be an important step in improving relationships between schools and in controlling crowds at athletic events.

- 3. To partly compensate schools for the ever increasing expense of taking teams to state tournaments, the Board has set up a new schedule of school allowances at State Basketball Tournaments which takes into consideration the distance from tournament site and the gross receipts of the respective tournaments.
- 4. The Class C program in basketball has been studied and district lines have been redrawn in some instances. In the girls' proprogram, the number of districts will be reduced to eight and regional tournaments eliminated.
- 5. Of particular interest to schools in the state is the addition of a Casualty or Catastrophy Insurance Plan to the present Accident Benefit Plans. North Dakota is pioneering in this field and, if this new plan works out, a real service will be performed for the schools of the state.
- Schools interested in baseball will be pleased to know that a new baseball film has been added to the Film Library and will be available to schools at the opening of the fall term.

The High School Activities Association is assuming an increasingly important role in the affairs of the high schools of the state. It is only through the combined efforts of the schools in a voluntary organization such as ours that the schools can properly supervise the athletic, music and speech activities of the schools and attain the objectives of our Association which are made by the school people themselves.

As the affairs of our Association become more extensive and more complex, it naturally follows that individuals and groups begin to raise questions concerning the authority and rights of such an organization. Hence, some state associations have found themselves involved in law suits which have questioned the rights of the association in one form or another. Others have found that well-meaning individuals under the guise of good school administration have unwittingly become a part of movements which ultimately could destroy the very organization they seek to improve. School men should zealously guard the organization that they themselves have created and operated for nearly a half-century. The High School Activities Association is "yours" and should be kept under the control and direction of school people. Beware of those who would relinquish this control and direction and place it in the hands of those whose tenure of office depends upon the fortune of political parties.

Your Board of Directors and this office is grateful for the help and cooperation of the host of individuals who make our extensive program possible. We thank you for your past help and solicit your cooperation in the years that are to come.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING Valley City, North Dakota - August 26, 1955

OFFICIAL HANDBOOK

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association Office at Valley City on August 26, 1955, with all members present. Member K. L. Rue of Cavalier, who had been appointed to fill the vacancy caused by the death C. J. Gludt, met the first time with the Board.

Some time was spent in reviewing the audit report as presented by the Ludvigson Accounting Service of Valley City, and after due examination, the report was accepted.

It was moved by Zenner and seconded by Killie that the transfer of the \$3,000.00 from the General Fund to the Accident Benefit Fund be approved. The motion carried.

It was moved by Killie and seconded by Arveson that the Secretary be authorized to make such transfers as necessary during the current year from the General Fund to take care of any deficits that may occur in the Accident Benefit Fund. The motion was carried.

Several controversial claims were reviewed by the Board, and the Secretary was instructed as to the proper disposal of these claims.

The music and speech organization for the year was reviewed by the Board, and it was moved by Havig and seconded by Slatta that a new district be organized to accommodate the schools in an area between Bismarck and Wahpeton. Ellendale or Jamestown were suggested as possible sites for this center. The Secretary was authorized to proceed with organization of this district.

Bids for basketballs for the various district and state tournaments were opened, and in was moved by Havig and seconded by Arveson that the low bid of Gerrells and Company of Devils Lake for \$14.25 per ball F. O. B. Devils Lake be accepted. The motion was carried.

It was moved by Havig and seconded by Rue that wrestling coverage be added to the Accident Benefit Fund and be made available to those schools that have an interschool wrestling program at a fee equal to that now charged for the sport of hockey. The motion was carried.

The Officials' Committee of the Board then reported their recommendations for officials for the regional and state basketball tournaments in 1956. It was moved by Zenner and seconded by Slatta that the recommendations of the Committee be accepted, and that the contracts be tendered the following officials. The Secretary was authorized to fill any vacancies. The motion was carried.

The Board spent considerable time in reviewing the proposed Class B Districts. Superintendent Hilde of Washburn, Superintendent Barton Thompson of Elgin, and Superintendent J. Carlson of Lakota appeared before the Board to express their views on the original plan. Superintendent Larson of Watford City expressed his views by telephone. Various letters were read from other interested superintendents. It was finally agreed to adopt the following plan of 16 districts for Class B competition upon motion of Killie and second by Rue, effective 1955-56:

Superintendent Havig reported that the next meeting of the National Federation would be held in this district of the Federation, and that it was customary for the states in the district to act as host to the convention. It was agreed to make a contribution of \$75.00 toward the expense of this meeting. The Secretary was instructed to contact Secretary Jacioletti of Wyoming and find out if any other contribution would be necessary.

The Board authorized an expenditure of 150.00 to secure a leader for the spring Track Clinic.

The fall meeting of the Association at the time of the NDEA Convention in Bismarck was discussed by the Board, and since the School Administration had given up their place on the program on Thursday afternoon, October 20th, it was agreed to utilize that time by explaining several different aspects of the Federation and Association work. The Secretary was instructed to contact Paul Dalager and arrange for the annual meeting of the Association at a time which, insofar as possible, would avoid conflicts with other interested groups.

The program of Personal Liability and Property Damage Insurance with the Anchor Casualty Company of St. Paul was reviewed by the Board. Upon motion of Rue and second by Zenner, it was agreed to carry this protection during the 1955-56 Association year.

Some time was also spent in discussing the Casualty Insurance Plan whereby the present Accident Benefit Fund could offer some degree of protection for the more serious accidents which exceeded the present approximate limit of \$250.00. It appears that each year there are a few serious accidents that cost far more than the present Benefit Plan Schedule can meet. The Secretary was instructed to secure information on the cost and availability of such coverage from other states and commercial companies.

President Gussner appointed Board members Zenner, Rue and Slatta to a special Insurance Committee to present plans for the revised Benefit Payment Schedule of fees and benefits for the year 1956-57.

Mayor Holt of Valley City appeared before the Board to submit an Annuity Plan of Insurance on the life of the Secretary. Copies of his proposal were given each member, and a copy placed on file with the Secretary. No action was taken.

President Gussner appointed members Killie, Havig and Gussner to work with the Secretary in the preparation of a record book for school activities.

Some time was spent in the discussion of the new Section in the Constitution and By-Laws which requires all interschool events involving more than two schools to be sanctioned. It was the opinion of the Board that a general policy should be adopted which would grant approval to:

- (a) Those contests which have been established over a period of years and
- (b) Contests which have their origin and control placed under a member school.

It was moved by Havig and seconded by Slatta that an increment of five hundred dollars be added to the present salary of the Secretary for the current year. The motion was unanimously carried.

Informal discussions were held with no formal action taken on such matters as the proposed printed monthly news **Bulletin**, Speech Clinics, and other matters.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING Bismarck, North Dakota - October 19, 1955

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Bismarck on Wednesday, October 19th, with all members present.

The first order of business was the applications of several Class C Schools to be advanced to Class B and their assignment to districts.

Superintendent Havig moved that the application of Upham to be advanced to Class B be granted, and that they be assigned to Class B, District No. 9. The motion was seconded by Killie and carried.

The application of Glenburn was considered, and upon motion of Zenner and second by Arveson, their application was accepted, and they were assigned to Class B, District No. 15.

The application of Alexander was considered next, and on motion by Rue and second by Killie, was accepted into Class B, District No. 15.

In all the above transfers, it was understood that each of the above schools must remain in Class B for a minimum of three years as required under the By-Laws of the Association.

The Board next considered the petition of the Stutsman County School-Masters' Association to revise their district lines so that the Class C Schools of the county would constitute a district. It would thus be possible for the county tourney to also serve as the qualifying tourney for regional play. It was moved by Zenner and seconded by Slatta that this application be granted and that Kensal and Courtenay be transferred from District No. 16, Class C, to District No. 19, Class C, and Gackle be transferred from District No. 19 to No. 18. The motion prevailed.

A request to enlarge District 1, Class C, was read. This request appeared to come from the Class C Schools in District No. 1 and also to have the approval of the Class C Schools in Dickey County who were members of District No. 4. It was moved by Arveson and seconded by Zenner that the schools of Dickey County be transferred to District No. 1, Class C, provided that this transfer was agreeable to the other schools in Class C, District No. 4. The motion carried.

Superintendent Killie reported that St. James High School of New Rockford had reached an enrollment of seventy-five last year and automatically would be a Class B School this year. Inasmuch as St. James was within the boundaries of District No. 8, Class B, they would automatically become a member of this district.

Some time was spent in discussing the present outlines of the Class C Districts in both boys' and girls' basketball. Attention was called to the many transfers to Class B in the boys' districts and the number of schools dropping girls' basketball. It was apparent that there was a need to revise district lines in both the boys' and girls' Class C Districts. It was moved by Havig and seconded by Arveson that Zenner and Slatta be named a committee of two to work with the Executive Secretary in working out new district lines for Class C Basketball Districts. The motion was carried.

It was also agreed that each Class C Region should send a representative to the State Tourney in both boys' and girls' basketball to study the proposed district division with this committee. The Secretary was instructed to inform each district of this fact and request that each region make its own selection of its representative.

The advisability of calling in the chairmen of the Class B Districts at the State B Tourney was discussed, and inasmuch as these committees had met last year and a new district organization had been made only this past summer, it was deemed unnecessary to hold such a meeting this year.

The Board proceeded to select an official delegate to attend the National Football Rules Committee meeting at Nashville, Tennessee, in early January. Since Harold Peterson had been named as an alternate to such a meeting last year, it was moved by Rue and seconded by Killie that Mr. Peterson be named the official delegate this year and that James

Eckel of Valley City be named the alternate to such a meeting. The motion carried.

The desirability of representation at the safety and equipment meeting to be held at Chicago on December 19th was also discussed at some length. It appeared that certain items of safety equipment on which Mr. Gares of Jamestown had been working were up for discussion at this meeting. In view of this fact and because of the importance of this phase of the football program, it was deemed advisable to send Mr. Gates to this meeting. Upon motion of Havig and second By Zenner, it was so ordered.

The Board then proceeded to spend some time on the proposed Speech Clinics and the discussion program for the coming year. Mr. Arveson outlined in some detail the plans that had been made for the Clinic program and the discussion program. Upon recommendation of Mr. Arveson, it was agreed to terminate the discussion program for the current school year with two Discussion Festivals—one at Minot and the other at Fargo. The dates of these Festivals were to be determined after consulting the Speech Departments of the two colleges who were to act as hosts.

Superintendent E. C. Johnson of Kenmare appeared before the Board to obtain information on a transfer student from his school to St. Agnes of Kenmare. It appeared that this lad had been a regular student at Kenmare High School for a period of years and this year transferred to St. Agnes High School of Kenmare. The guestion raised concerned his eligibility at St. Agnes at Kenmare should he return to the Kenmare High School. The rules on transfer appeared to be clear in this case. Since the lad transferred schools at the opening of the semester without a change in parental residence making this change necessary, he would become eligible at St. Agnes after he had attended eighteen full weeks of school. Should this lad transfer back to Kenmare, his eligibility would depend upon when that transfer was made back to Kenmare. If the transfer were made within the first thirty days of school, the lad would gain eligibility at Kenmare after eighteen weeks of attendance. If the transfer were made after the first thirty days of school, he would gain eligibility at the end of the current year. If the transfer were made at the opening of or during the second semester, he would gain eligibility at the end of the first semester of the succeeding school year.

A pending Accident Benefit claim of Robert Hunke of Taylor was reviewed by the Board. This claim has been held in abeyance by the Secretary inasmuch as it appeared that the claim did not qualify for a benefit payment. After a thorough examination of the facts of the case, it was moved by Killie and seconded by Arveson that, on the basis of present information on the case, the claim should be disallowed. The motion carried.

The next item of business was the amount of the salary of the office assistant, Mrs. Reita Lutz. Mrs. Lutz had now been employed for seven months at \$200.00 per calendar month. It was moved by Killie and seconded by Rue that the salary be made \$225.00 per calendar month effective November 1, 1955. The motion carried.

The Board adjourned to meet again following the annual meeting of the Association on Thursday.

On Thursday afternoon the Board again met to complete unfinished business.

The first item of business was a review of the alleged violations of Hannah High School as charged in an official protest signed by Superintendent Walter Babitzke of the Edmore High School. In essence, the charges were that the coach of Hannah High School had held organized basketball practice and had played basketball games before the season for that sport was authorized. Superintendent J. N. Laschkewitsch represented Hannah High School. The coach of Hannah, Mr. John Campbell, was not present.

The allegations were not denied by Mr. Laschkewitsch, and it appeared that there was some misunderstanding on the part of both Mr. Laschkewitsch and Mr. Campbell on the rules which prohibited organized basketball practice before the regular authorized season of twenty weeks.

From the evidence presented, appeared that there was no willful violation of the rules and regulations although there did appear a definite laxity on the part of the Hannah School Officials in not becoming familiar with the rules. It was agreed that the Hannah School Officials should be reprimanded for their alleged violation of the rules, that Hannah High School should be placed on probation for the balance of the 1955-56 school term, and that both the coach and superintendent should understand that there could be no further organized basketball practice or games until the season officially opened. The Secretary was instructed to write to Superintendent Laschkewitsch and report the decision of the Board on this matter.

A letter was read from Fr. Brandner of the South Heart High School informing the Board that it was not possible for them to obtain a properly certified coach for the 1955-56 school term and requesting that a coach without the necessary qualifications be authorized for the current year. A similar letter was received from Superintendent Elznic of Bowesmont. Inasmuch as this was the first year in which the Association required a certified coach, and it did appear rather difficult for certain schools to meet the new requirement, it was moved by Killie and seconded by Rue that these two schools be permitted to contract for a coach of less than the usual requirements with the understanding that such approval would be for the 1955-56 school term only. This motion was in accordance with the provisions of the By-Laws of the High School Activities Association wherein the Board of Directors is empowered to waive the certification requirement in situations where a properly qualified coach cannot be obtained. The motion was carried, and the Secretary instructed to inform the schools of the action of the Board,

A letter was read from St. Michael's High School requesting admission into the High School Activities Association. From the letter, it appeared that there was still some question as to whether the State Department of Public Instruction would approve the establishment of this high school. The Secretary was instructed to return the membership fee until such time as the St. Michael's School was granted permission to establish a high school by the State Department.

The Secretary was also instructed to contact St. James Academy of New Rockford and check on the qualifications of their coach. While there appeared to be no question on his certification requirements, there was definite question as to the time that was spent at the school in other teaching or supervisory duties.

Some time was spent in deciding when the next regular meeting of the Board could be held. It was agreed that the Board should meet during the School Administrator's meeting in Bismarck on January 29-31, 1956. The best possible time seemed to be Sunday afternoon, January 29th.

The next meeting date following this session was set at Grand Forks during the Class B State Basketball Tournament.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING Valley City, North Dakota - November 27, 1955

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota Hgh School Activities Association met in the Association Office at Valley City on November 27, 1955, with the following members present: William Gussner, E. S. Killie, R. G. Arveson, K. L. Rue, and K. L. Zenner. Members Slatta and Havig were absent.

A resolution which had been passed by the Representative Assembly of the North Dakota Educational Association at the annual meeting in Bismarck was presented to the Board. The resolution read as follows:

"Be it resolved that this body, (the N.D.E.A. Representative Assembly), go on record as being in favor of having all North Dakota high school football games played on or before Wednesday during the weeks of the district and state conventions. And, further, that the secretary of the Assembly be instructed to notify the North Dakota High School Activities Association of this resolution."

The resolution was accepted and placed on file. It was agreed to suggest to schools that their practice sessions and games during the week in which the N.D.E.A. Convention is held be set at such times so as not to interfere with the attendance at this Convention. It was the opinion of the Board that, in the absence of any specific rule prohibiting games during the week of the Convention, each school would have to make adjustments to keep this conflict to a minimum.

Some time was spent in considering matters pertaining to track, golf and tennis activities next spring. Inasmuch as the relays at the State Track Meet now count for points, it was agreed to award individual medals to first and second place relay teams in the 440 and 880 relay instead of the school trophy that had been purchased in past years. The individual participation award in golf and tennis is to be eliminated. One small trophy is to be purchased as a school award in golf and tennis for the school winning in the doubles, and one trophy for the winner of the singles event. The individual participants winning these events would be awarded the usual medal.

The matter of mileage to entrants in the track, golf and tennis events was reviewed by the Board, and it was agreed to limit mileage to those participants who are accompanied by a delegated adult representative. This action was prompted by the fact that there has been an increasing tendency for participants to come to these events without proper supervision.

Superintendent Arveson reported on the progress of the Speech Clinics held in early November and the proposed plans to hold Discussion Festivals at Minot on January 14th and Fargo on February 11th. It was agreed to charge each school a registration fee of fifty cents for each student taking part in the Speech Festivals with a maximum charge of \$10.00 for any school. Each school would be entitled to bring as many participants as it desired. The Secretary was instructed to prepare registration forms and send them to all schools prior to the Festivals.

The Board next explored the possibility of a State Hockey Tournament to be held some time in February. It was the opinion of the Board that preparations for such an event could not be made at this time, but further study should be made on the problem with the possibility that if conditions warranted it, a hockey tourney might be held in 1957.

The Board agreed to sanction an Invitational Hockey Tournament at Grand Forks should such a request be made by the local high school and provided that such a tourney would be operated under the management of the school authorities of Grand Forks High School or their appointees. However, such a tournament should not be represented as an official or nonofficial state tournament.

The Board then proceeded to review the interpretation of the twenty game rule. Questions had been raised from several quarters relative to the application of this rule to the individual players on a team. The main question appeared to concern the substitute on the A Squad who played a portion of a B game as a preliminary to the A game. It was agreed that the twenty game limit should apply to all teams representing the school whether this team was the first, second, or third team. It was also agreed that the rule should apply to the individual player on any school team. However, in cases where both the ${\bf A}$ and ${\bf B}$ teams played in double header contests, a player would be permitted to enter in four quarters of play in one session and not be charged with more than one game. Entry could be made in both the ${\bf A}$ or the ${\bf B}$ games in any combination of quarters provided the total quarters entered would not exceed four. Should a lad be entered in more than four quarters in any session, he would be charged with two games out of his allowable twenty for the season.

The Board also carefully reviewed the interpretation of Rule Three which prohibits a member of the school team from participating on any other than a school team during the school year. In the past, a violation of this rule caused loss of eligibility in the particular sport in which the violation occurred. Under the new interpretation, the penalty is more severe and causes loss of eligibility in all sports from the date of infraction throughout the school year.

A careful examination of this interpretation indicated that there would be considerable conflict with city recreation programs, Y.M.C.A.

programs, and other good recreation programs. It was agreed to modify the interpretation of the penalty for violation in the following manner:

Any lad who participated on any other than a school team would lose his eligibility in that sport for the balance of the school year. However, a violation in one sport would not make this lad ineligible in another sport provided that the violation occurred during the official season of the sport. On the other hand, if the violation occurred after the close of the official season of that sport, then the penalty would be loss of eligibility in all sports from the date of the infraction.

Thus, to be specific, playing on any team after the season officially closes at the final state tournament, which in 1956 is March 17th, would cause a lad to become ineligible in all sports carried on after that date, namely, track, golf, tennis, and baseball.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING Bismarck, North Dakota - January 29-30, 1956

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Grand Pacific Hotel at Bismarck on January 29-30. 1956, with all members present.

The minutes of the previous session of the Board were presented to each Board member and a running account of the receipts and disbursements was also given to each Board member. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

A delegation of Class C school principals met with the Board to ascertain the present status of girls' basketball in the state. From the turn of the conversation, it appeared that some of the principals questioned the motive of the current "Basketball Questionnaire" and were of the opinion that a move might be on foot to eliminate the tournament program for girls. These schools were given assurance that the questionnaire was for the purpose of ascertaining the current status of the girls' program, and secondly, to find some solution to the mounting deficit of tournaments at the regional and state level.

The general opinion appeared to be that the schools present would be willing to pay additional dues in order to continue the sport, and that these additional dues could be used to absorb some of the deficit at the state and regional level. The group was assured that no action would be taken at this time, and that representatives from each region would be called in during the State Girls' Tournament to revise district lines and advise with the committee on procedures for another year.

The next item of business was a review of the eligibility correspondence concerning two lads from Zap and the subsequent protest on behalf of the Mercer County School Masters' Association. Mr. Dooley of the State Department of Public Instruction was also present at this hearing and outlined the action of the State Department in ruling the case of the two lads as hardship cases and therefore entitled to credits earned in less than the usual time in attendance. From the evidence, it appeared that the protest was based on the erroneous interpretation that high school pupils are obliged to carry and be passing in four subjects in order to be eligible. From the evidence submitted, it appeared that the ruling made by the Secretary that the two Zap lads were eligible should be confirmed by the Board, and that the two lads be fully eligible to represent Zap High School in interscholastic contests.

A letter from Principal Lundt of Alkabo was read to the Board. It appeared that every attempt had been made to secure a properly certified coach and that the coach they were attempting to get had refused to accept his contract. It was duly moved, seconded and carried that we approve a coach for Alkabo of less than certified status for the balance of the school term.

The case of St. Michael's High School was also reviewed by the Board: The school had originally applied for Association membership early in October and was refused until such time that the State Department would authorize them to operate a one year high school. They had been informed that, upon presentation of evidence that they could operate a high school, their membership would be accepted into the Association. The problem of St. Michael's appeared to be the inability to secure a properly qualified coach this first year of operation, and secondly, that their uncertified coach be accepted for the current year and that the district committee should proceed with plans to admit them to competition in the district tournament.

Bill Weaver of WDAY-TV met with the Board to outline his proposals for telecasting tournaments this year. It appeared that WDAY-TV was not in a position to handle live telecasts at the present time and was interested only in delayed telecasts. Mr. Weaver offered to make a film for delayed broadcasts and then turn this film over to the Association for circulation out of the Film Library. For the privilege of showing the delayed films as a delayed broadcast, Mr. Weaver offered to edit and title the films so that they would be suitable for showing. Mr. Weaver indicated his interest in the State A and B Finals and possibly some games of the Eastern Class A Tournament. Upon motion of the Board, the delayed telecast of basketball tournament games was approved on the condition that the film would become the property of the Association and be released for school showings.

Jim Adelson of KXJB-TV met with the Board and indicated an interest in live telecasts of the Eastern and Western Class A and also the State A and B Tournaments. Some time was spent in discussing the desirability of live telecasts and possible terms for such service. After offers and counter offers, the following tentative offer was made by the Board to KXJB-TV:

- 1. The semi-finals and the finals of the Eastern Class A in Fargo may be telecast live for the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.00).
- 2. The semi-finals of the Western A in Bismarck may be telecast over KBMB-TV live for the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.00).
- 3. The final night of the Class A Tourney at Minot (third and fourth places and first and second places) may be telecast live over the Minot TV Station for the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). If

the same tourney games could also be carried over Bismarck and Valley City, an adjustment of the fee to eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) would be made.

4. The final night of the State B Tournament at Grand Forks could be telecast live over Valley City, Minot, and Bismarck for the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800.00).

Inasmuch as it was not possible at the time to know just what commitments could be made and what cancellations could be made over the network, the Secretary was instructed to negotiate with the Dakota Broadcasting Company for such adjustments as appeared to be necessary.

It was agreed that the fees from telecasting would be added to the gate receipts of each of the tournaments and distribution be made of this income on the same basis as other tournament receipts.

An invitation from the Fargo Park Board to hold the 1956 State Golf Tournament on the Fargo course was read to the Board. It was the opinion of the Board that the tourney should be left at Valley City for this year as all plans were in the process of being made and publicity had already been given to this event.

The Board next proceeded to canvass the results of the mail ballot for the position of two members to the Board of Directors from Class B Schools. It was determined that E. S. Killie had 205 votes and K. L. Rue had 199 votes with a sprinkling of single votes for several others. The vote clearly indicated the election of E. S. Killie and K. L. Rue to three-year terms to the Board of Directors beginning July 1, 1956, and the Board declared members Killie and Rue duly elected.

The question of the purchase of medals for the ten Science Fair winners was discussed at some length. It was agreed to continue the subsidy of \$150.00 toward the operation of the Science Fair program. However, inasmuch as the Association does not operate the Fair or make the rules for the operation of the State Science Fair, the group operating the Fair should purchase their own awards, and this Board of Directors would have no objection of a portion of the subsidy money to be diverted for that purpose.

The matter of passes for cheerleaders was the next item of business for the Board. It was agreed that a maximum of four passes should be provided for cheerleaders at those tournament sessions where their own high school was playing, and that the tournament managers should be instructed to provide a maximum of four passes for the use of cheerleaders.

Superintendent Arveson gave a detailed report of the N.U.E.A. meeting in Los Angeles, California, on December 28-30, 1955.

The next order of business was the selection of an Executive Secretary-Treasurer of the Association. Earl Abrahamson was named to that position for a three-year term beginning July 1, 1956, at an annual salary of \$8,000.00.

The Board agreed to meet at Minot during the State Class A Tournament for the purpose of setting dates and sites of the 1956-57 tournaments and any other business that might come up at that time.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING Minot, North Dakota - March 9-10, 1956

OFFICIAL HANDBOOK

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High, School Activities Association met at Minot at the Y. M. C. A. with all members of the Board present.

Considerable time was spent reviewing the new proposed rate schedule for the A.A.B.F. Plans effective on August 1, 1956, and also certain changes in wording throughout the pamphlet.

It was moved by Killie and seconded by Zenner that the schedule of fees for the Group Accident Benefit Plan known as the A.A.B.F. be altered for the next two years as follows:

1. The Grade Plan fees should be raised from 30 to 40 cents per pupil.

2. Other group plans B-C-D-E-F-G-H-I to be made to conform to the new schedule as proposed by the Secretary as the result of a study of the average benefit payments of the A.A.B.F. Fund during the past five years.

After a general discussion, the motion was carried.

It was also agreed that the following notations and changes should be incorporated in the pamphlet explaining the A.A.B.F. Plans:

- A. The sport of wrestling should be added to the sports covered.
- B. The rate for wrestling should be the same as that of hockey.
- C. Picnics and other social affairs and parties held after the regular school hours will not be covered.
- D. Transportation benefits should be limited to events sponsored by or sanctioned by the Activities Association.
- E. Payment for dental injuries shall be left as stated in the present Plan and claims for dental work of immature children shall be allowed to the extent of work that can be completed at the present time within the school year and not for work that must be done several years hence.
- F. Leave out any specific reference to chiropractic and osteopathic treatments.
- G. Indicate that coverage is for the regular school term only and schools wishing coverage during special sessions may write in for special rates.

It was moved by Killie and seconded by Slatta that the committee be authorized to proceed with plans to provide a Casualty Plan which would cover accidents in excess of \$250.00 either through an increased rate or through some underwriting plan with some insurance company. The motion was carried.

It was moved by Zenner and seconded by Arveson that the Association again publish a calendar and that the Secretary proceed to collect information for the various school activities to be listed on this calendar. The motion was carried.

It was moved by Killie and seconded by Arveson that \$800.00 be budgeted each year for the purpose of paying the expenses of delegates to the annual Federation meeting, and further, if the total amount was not used in any given year, the unused portion could be added to the \$800.00 for the succeeding year. The motion was carried.

It was then moved by Killie and seconded by Slatta that Board Member, K. L. Rue be named the official voting delegate to the summer meet at Jackson Hole, Wyoming, in the latter part of June. The motion was carried. If any other members wished to attend this meeting, they should inform the Secretary in the near future so accommodations could be procured.

The Secretary was instructed to survey the schools that participate in golf as to their preferences of grass or sand greens for the State Golf Tournaments. If a majority of the schools preferred grass greens, a transfer of the State Golf Tournament to Fargo in early June was authorized.

It was agreed to call in the Advisory Committee of the music and speech groups to study the rules and regulations for the contests and festivals in 1956-57.

Arveson outlined to the Board the proposals of the Alex Hamilton Bi-Centennial Scholarship Award and the conditions under which North Dakota could participate. It was the consensus of the Board that the Association should not take on this project and the matter should be referred to the University Speech Department or the speech group of the N.D.E.A. for their disposal.

It was agreed to purchase at least one copy of the briefs used in the Colorado case to have on hand for reference and to assist the Colorado Association in a small way in carrying their financial burden in taking their case to the Supreme Court.

The Board spent more than an hour considering possible tournament sites and dates for the 1957 tournaments. However, no action was taken at this time. Likewise, several other items on the agenda were deferred until a later meeting.

The Board remained in session all day Friday and adjourned at 5:30 P. M. to reconvene on Saturday after the East-West Conference meeting.

The Board met at noon in the LaPlaza Cafe on Saturday with a committee of three: Messrs. Olson, Hendrickson, Mach and Principal Warren Evenson to hear the recommendations made at the East-West Conference during their morning meeting. Coach John Mach made the following recommendations to the Board.

- 1. Expense allowance for tourneys should be increased to \$7.00 per diem and this allowance should be made for 17 people.
- 2. The East-West Conference will determine its own membership regardless of classifications of schools in the Association.
- 3. Ties in conference standing will be determined by lot by the tourney manager in basketball.
- 4. Ticket allowance should be increased more than two for nonparticipating schools in the State Tournament.
- 5. Some plan should be made whereby coaches and tournament officials meet in an early session to establish uniform officiating procedure.
- 6. The Board should act on these recommendations before the next conference meeting is held.

The luncheon meeting was furnished by the Activities Association. The Board continued in session following this luncheon meeting, and in the absence of L. T. Havig, agreed to meet on April 8-9, 1956, and consider the proposals made and other business that could not be completed at this session.

The meeting was adjourned.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING Valley City, North Dakota - April 8-9, 1956

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the office of the Association on April 8-9, 1956, with all members present.

The minutes of the previous session at Minot were read and approved as read.

The Secretary reported on the results of the survey questionnaire that was sent to all schools that participated in the State Golf Tournament during the past two years. The results of this survey showed that there were ten schools that preferred to hold the State Golf Tournament at a site where sand greens were used and that three schools voted for grass greens. In view of the preponderance of votes for the sand greens, it was agreed to leave the State Golf Tournament at a site where sand greens are available.

The Secretary next reported correspondence he had had with Superintendent Bishop of Hebron relative to providing minature brick paperweights to be distributed at the National Federation meeting during the summer. It appeared that the Hebron Brick Company was very happy to cooperate and would provide these minature brick paperweights without cost to the High School Activities Association. The Board instructed the Secretary to obtain 400 of these tokens to be given out at the National Federation meeting this summer.

A request from Superintendent Hill of Ellendale to use a student at the Ellendale Normal as a part-time assistant coach at Ellendale High School was read to the Board. It was the opinion of the Board that the matter of employing a part-time teacher or coach without the proper certificate should be taken up with the State Department of Public Instruction and also with the North-Central Association before any action of this group on the question. If the matter could be cleared with the State Department and also the North-Central Association, then it was the opinion of this Board that the use of a cadet teacher as an assistant coach at Ellendale should be approved.

The Board next reviewed an eligibility case of Devils Lake. It appeared that this lad had gone to Florida and attended school there during the 1955-56 school term and was returning to Devils Lake to resume his studies as a senior in the Devils Lake High School for 1956-57. The question concerned when this lad would become eligible to represent Devils Lake High School. It was the opinion of the Board that this lad was a transfer student and, as such, must attend a minimum of eighteen full weeks at Devils Lake High School before he regains his eligibility.

A letter from Rev. Edward J. Rutter of Wimbledon concerning the proposed church basketball tournaments was presented to the Board. It was the opinion of the Board that an organized church tournament held after March 17th was no different from a recreational tournament, a 4-H tournament, or any other that had been barred as a post-season tournament and that the rules of the Association could not be waived for such an event. The Secretary was instructed to inform Rev. Rutter that any lad who was interested in spring sports could not participate in such a basketball tournament without losing his eligibility for spring sports.

A general discussion was held concerning the award and participation rules and the Board endorsed the informative writeups appearing in the ACTIVITIES BULLETIN relative to these two rules. It was the opinion of the Board that the award rule should be strictly enforced for the year and should apply to all school activities.

It was duly moved by member Havig and seconded by Slatta that Grace City be censured and reprimanded for scheduling and holding a grade tournament after the official closing of the basketball season on March 17, and further, that they should be warned that there could be no reoccurrence of such a violation without a serious penalty being invoked against the school.

The Board then proceeded to review the optional baseball rules for 1956. Upon motion by Killie and second by Rue, the Board adopted the following regulations concerning the State Baseball Tournament at Jamestown this coming June:

"First, a faculty coach would be permitted in the coaches' box provided that he was in uniform.

Second, it was agreed to adopt the optional rule permitting re-entry into the game once as outlined in the Baseball Rule Book.

Third, the wearing of the head protector while at bat at the State Baseball Tournament is mandatory and must be worn by every batter at the tournament."

The Secretary then reported on the report of the National Basketball Rules Committee in that the wide lane would be adopted for the 1957-58 basketball season and could be made effective for the 1956-57 tournament season by action of conferences or the state associations. It was the opinion of the Board that schools should be surveyed and given an opportunity to indicate their preference as to whether the wide twelve foot lane should be adopted for the 1957 tournament series. The Secretary, upon motion by Zenner and second by Arveson, was thus instructed to survey the schools playing basketball in North Dakota and obtain their preferences and have an announcement made in the May ACTIVITIES BULLETIN.

The Secretary then reported on correspondence that he had with H. L. Herkimer of the National Cheerleaders Association in Texas and reported on the possibility of one or two Cheerleaders' Clinics being conducted in the state of North Dakota, following those that are to be held in Minnesota under the direction of Mr. Herkimer. It was duly moved by Arveson and seconded by Zenner that we correspond with Mr. Herkimer and try to arrange two Cheerleaders' Clinics for next fall at the possible

sites of Minot and Valley City and that a registration fee of 75c be charged for each registrant at these Clinics. The motion was carried.

Considerable time was spent in discussing the merits of the several Discussion Festivals that were held during the past year and it was agreed to continue the project for the fall of 1956 by setting up a series of four Discussion Festivals to be held at the following sites: Grand Forks, Jamestown, Dickinson, and Minot at or about the middle of November. Suggested dates were November 10th and/or November 17th,

The Secretary was instructed to contact John Penn of the University, Dr. Lorna Lengfeld at Dickinson State Teachers College and Edna Gilbert at Minot State Teachers College to arrange for these events. It was further agreed that the national topic of agriculture is to be used as the discussion topic.

Some time was spent in discussing the relative merit of state contests in music and speech and the possibility that schools may now feel that the events should be closed at the district level. It was moved by Havig and seconded by Arveson that the Secretary survey the schools who are participating in music and speech to obtain their attitudes towards the elimination of the state contest. The motion was carried.

It was moved by Rue and seconded by Zenner that in the event that the survey was not conclusive that the state contest should be eliminited. A tentative site of Grand Forks and a tentative date of May 3rd was set for the State Music and Speech Festival. This motion was carried.

Considerable time was spent in discussing the possible Football and Basketball Clinics for next fall and the recommendations of the Class A coaches and also the Officials Association concerning Basketball Clinics were read to the Board. The demand for six-man Football Rules Clinics was also brought up by several of the Board members. After a lengthy discussion, it was agreed to run two six-man Football Clinics, one at Mayville and one at Devils Lake, and eleven-man Football Clinics at Minot, Bismarck, Dickinson, Williston, Grafton, Mayville, and Devils Lake. Several men were suggested as leaders of these Clinics as follows: Hoidal Meyer and Wolf were suggested as possible for the six-man Clinic and in addition, Grande and Higgins were suggested for the eleven-man Clinics.

The Board agreed to adopt the suggested plan of Basketball Clinics and to hold three all-day Clinics over the state: one at Dickinson, one at Minot, and one at Valley City. Again, Busse, Meyer, Hanson, Grande and Miller were suggested as possible leaders of the Basketball Clinics and it was further suggested that the three coaches of the winning teams In Class A-B-C were to be called in to meet with the Clinic conductors and work out a schedule of events and a program for these clinics.

Member Havig asked for clarification of the eligibility of individual events under the classifications of woodwind and brass ensembles for the state contest. The Board agreed that one entry or the group of entries receiving the top rating under the woodwind classification would be eligible for the state contests. Likewise, the one or number of entries receiving the highest ratings under the brass ensemble group would be eligible for the state contest.

The next order of business was a discussion of the procedure for the selection of officials for the 1957 tournament series. Considerable attention was given to the recommendations of the various coaches and other groups who appeared to have an interest in the problem. It was finally agreed that a complete survey should be made of the different classes of schools and obtain the preferences of the respective coaches as to the officials to be used in the different tournaments. Having was appointed to contact the Class A coaches, Killie to contact the Class B coaches and Slatta to contact the Class C coaches to obtain their preferences. Upon completion of this survey and later in the summer, the Board would meet and make the selection of the officials for the respective tournaments as indicated by the coaches' preferences and also the recommendation of the Officials' Committee.

Considerable time was spent on the amount to be given to the teams for their expense allowances on such questions as the number of days for which expenses are to be allowed, the mileage rate and the sharing of profits in tournaments. The Board appointed a special committee of Superintendent Rue, Slatta and Gussner to explore fully the possibilities of a revision of allowance schedules and report to the Board at their next meeting.

The Board then discussed for considerable time the type of B regional tournaments that should be conducted in 1957, and it appeared that in certain sections of the state that a number of schools seemed to prefer a 4-team regional rather than the present 8-team regional. The Secretary was instructed to prepare a questionnaire and mail to all Class B schools in which B schools would be given an opportunity to cast a preference vote on whether the B regionals should be conducted on the same basis as they were in 1956, or whether the plan should be changed to set up 4-team regionals with the winners of the 16 Class B districts participating in these regions. Upon motion by Rue and second by Havig, the Secretary was authorized to make such a survey.

The Board then proceeded to set up dates for various activities for 1956-57 school term. It was moved and seconded that the State Tennis Tournament be played at Jamestown on Tuesday, May 28th, and the State Golf Tournament return to Valley City on Monday, May 27th, 1957. It was further agreed that the State High School Baseball Tournament should be held at Jamestown on June 5-6-7, 1957. Track was set at Valley City for May 25th, 1957. It was the consensus of the Board that these dates be entered on the school calendar for next year.

The Secretary was instructed to prepare a budget for 1957-58 so that the anticipated income and expenditures would be available for the Board's scrutiny.

The next order of business was the selection of dates and sites for the 1957 basketball tournament season. By unanimous agreement, the following dates and sites were selected:

The Board next examined the expense of the track, golf and tennis program of the Association. It appeared that some schools have ignored the rule which requires an authorized faculty member to accompany participants in these sports. The Secretary was instructed to pay no allowance to participants unless they were accompanied by an adult appointed by proper school authority. It was further agreed that the Accident Benefit Fund would not apply to participants who attended these functions unaccompanied.

The next item of business was the recommendations of the Special Speech Committee. Each of the recommendations were reviewed and considered:

- 1. The Speech Committee had recommended that some attention be given to the selection of a discussion topic different from the debate topic. The Board was of the opinion that the regular topic should be used for the coming year inasmuch as it dealt with the farm problem, which is timely for North Dakota and because the material for study is abundant on that topic.
- 2. The Board agreed to support a series of Speech Clinics during the week of October 29th to November 3rd provided the colleges would assume the responsibility of organizing such clinics and supply the talent. The Association would provide the publicity and make such contributions as necessary for postage and such minor expenses to properly advertize these clinics.
- 3. The Board considered the addition of one more discussion site at Lisbon but were of the opinion that Jamestown would be reasonably close to schools in the southeast part of North Dakota. It appeared questionable that Lisbon would be interested in assuming the responsibility of organizing a center.

The Board next reviewed the recommendations of the Music Committee and agreed upon the following:

- 1. Medium voice would be added to the Vocal Solo Classification as recommended by the Committee. However, each school would be limited to two boys and two girls in the three vocal solo events with only one entry in a given solo event.
- 2. It was agreed to eliminate the specific instrumentation listed under Woodwind and Brass Ensemble groups and permit each school to enter any combination of instruments up to a maximum of six instruments. Each school would be limited to two entrants from each group of Brass Ensembles and Woodwind Ensembles.
- 3. A study of the survey indicated a preference on the part of school administrators to eliminate the State Final Contests for Class B schools. However, it appeared that this opinion was not always shared by music teachers. It was therefore agreed that the State Final Contest be sponsored in 1957 and further attempts be made to ascertain the best judgment of schools before plans must be made for 1958. It was agreed to try to obtain out-of-state judges for the State Final Contests provided the expenses for such items be kept within the anticipated income available for the purpose. On the basis of past experience, that would permit an outlay of approximately \$800 for the State Final Contest in music and speech. Grand Forks was selected as the site for the State Final Class B-C Contest on May 3, 1957.

The Board next reconsidered the location of the East Class A Tournaments which had been awarded to Grand Forks. With the State A Finals scheduled at Grand Forks in 1957, it appeared unwise to also play the Eastern Divisional Tourney at the same site on successive weekends. Upon motion by Havig and second by Zenner, it was agreed to assign the East Class A Tourney to Fargo at the A. C.

The Tournament Allowance Committee then reported their recommendations of a schedule of allowances for the State Final Boys' Basketball Tournaments which took into consideration the distance of a team from the tourney site and the amount of gross income derived from the tournament. After considerable discussion, it was agreed to adopt the following schedule of team allowances at each of the three final boys' tournaments:

10-100 miles from tourney site - 3 days allowance to teams.

101-175 miles from tourney site - 3½ days allowance.

176 miles and over from tourney site - 4 days allowance.

Mileage shall be paid at the rate of 50c per one way mile. Home team shall receive the equivalent of 1 days team allowance.

Per diem allowance for other team for the number of days as determined by the distance from the tourney site based on the following schedule:

The Board adjourned at 11:30 P. M. to resume its session on Thursday morning at 9:00 A. M.

The Board reassembled at 9:00 A. M. in the high school building and spent thirty minutes with a representative of the Blue Cross and Blue Shield Insurance Company exploring the possibility of some plan wherein this company might assume the responsibility of protecting children in North Dakota schools. This was strictly an informational meeting and no action was taken.

Some time was spent in discussing the place of the Board at the East-West Conference meeting which was to be held at 10:00 A. M. The Secretary was ordered to submit the report of the Tournament Expense Committee which had been approved by the Board.

It was agreed to invite the delegates to the East-West meeting to the high school for a noon luncheon at Association expense.

The meeting adjourned subject to call by the President following the East-West meeting if necessary.

No formal meeting was held following the East-West meeting and the Board was adjourned until the latter part of August at a date to be determined later.

MINUTES OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION MEETING

Bismarck, North Dakota - October 20, 1955

The North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the auditorium of the new Oscar Will School in Bismarck at 4:00 P. M. on Thursday, October 20th, with one of the largest attendances in the past years. The meeting was held at the conclusion of a general program session.

The session was called to order by President Gussner. A brief synopsis of the minutes of the February session of the High School League and a summary of income and disbursements up to October 15th of the current year was distributed to all members present. Inasmuch as the

minutes of the past session and a complete financial report were printed in the annual HANDBOOK, it was moved by Superintendent Thompson of Elgin and seconded by Superintendent Pennington of Rugby that the reading of the minutes and the financial report be waived. The motion prevailed.

Old business was called for by the chair. There appeared to be none,

New business was called for by the chair. It was moved by Peckham of Streeter that superintendents and principals should be admitted to all school activities up to the regional level without charge. No second to this motion appeared to be forthcoming. Regardless, the matter was discussed pro and con, and an amendment to the motion was offered that the privilege of free admission should be extended to all teachers that carried a membership card in the N.D.E.A. A general discussion ensued over the amendment. Some questions were raised as to the legality of such a motion and other phases of the question discussed by several. It was moved by Larson of Watford City and seconded by McCrea of Valley City that the entire matter be tabled. Since this was a privilege motion, a vote was called for and the motion was carried. The matter was declared tabled.

Other new business was called for and there appeared to be none.

The report of the nominating committee was called for. Superintendent Hanson of Harvey reported for the committee and offered the names of E. S. Killie of Fessenden and K. L. Rue of Cavalier to succeed themselves on the Board of Directors. Hanson moved the acceptance of the committee report. This was seconded by several and carried upon voice vote. The Board further recommended that a minimum of \$100.00 be set for the State B and C Tournaments and that the two officials who work the extra game at the A Tourney be given a fee of \$115.00.


