#### **FOREWORD**

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association are pleased to present an historical account of the achievements of the association for the 1956-57 school year in the thirty-third annual handbook of the association.

This report will present the main accomplishments in condensed form and should be valuable to the interested coach or school administrator. It also will serve to preserve the record of important achievements for the years to come.

The year has been characterized by a greater interest and cooperation of the member schools with a greater appreciation on the part of the members for the good work that the association does. On the other hand, the feeling of elation that always accompanies success, is suddenly shaken and shattered by a temporary court order prohibiting the Association from carrying out its normal functions and in fact challenging the very existence and being of the organization which has effectively and efficiently served the needs of the schools of the state for half a century.

In the field of basketball the association has experienced one of the best, if not the best year, in its history. Rare, indeed, do we see the time when a complete series of regional and state basketball tournaments can be played in the state without interference from blizzards or blocked roads in some sector of the state. This year was an exception and the entire series over the whole state was held under ideal weather and road conditions. Unusual crowds took advantage of conditions and the result was one of the best financial seasons on record. The only exception was the State Track Meet which had to be postponed until the following Monday due to a steady downpour of rain.

The new type of Basketball Clinics appeared to meet with general approval and plans are to continue the demonstration type of clinic during the coming year are being formulated.

An outstanding contribution to schools in the state was the Cheerleaders Clinic held at Valley City in late October. The response was beyond expectations and the demand for such a clinic for the coming year was so insistent that a series of four in different sections of the state has been arranged for the coming year. The services of L. R. Herkimer, Executive Secretary of the National Cheerleaders Association, who took personal charge of this clinic and will be on hand for all four in the fall of 1957, was largely responsible for the success of the clinic. The response of the students was terrific and all who participated or saw the clinic in action were unanimous in proclaiming Mr. Herkimer an artist and past-master in his control of the participating students. Much good can come out of such a venture in developing the proper attitudes of sportsmanship and good relations between competing schools and the fans who witness the different sport events promoted by schools.

Music and Speech competition continues to grow and thrive and new records were set in the number of schools participating as well as in the quality of the materials offered.

Schools continue to endorse and participate in the Personal Liability and Property Damage Insurance program sponsored by the association.

The wisdom of this program seems to bear results this year as two serious cases of injury were taken care of, one of which involved medical costs in excess of \$1000.00. This Program not only pays off from a financial viewpoint but also tends to build good public relations with the public in general and sports fans in particular.

The Accident Benefit Fund continues to grow and thrive beyond expectations. This year more than 111,000 pupils were covered under the fund. Nearly 3600 claims were paid. A complete report of the operation of the fund will be found in the body of this handbook. The new Casualty plan was accepted by half the schools in the first year of its operation. Several bad injuries were taken care of through liberal payments out of this fund.

The new policy of pro-rating claims when the claimant is covered with other insurance has met with general approval and the savings made under this arrangement has made it possible to liberalize payments in many cases where the present benefit schedule is inadequate. As time goes on further increases in the payment schedule will be made possible under this arrangement. Excellent cooperation has been received by commercial companies in clearing claims in which they have been involved. It would appear that the fund is showing some signs of stabilization and that rates can be set up for a longer period of time. Little growth may be anticipated in the number of pupils covered except the changes that will occur because of the growth of school population.

Another significant occurence during the year is the resignation of three members of the Board of Directors. Superintendent R. G. Arveson, of Leeds, has accepted a position in California as has Superintendent J. E. Slatta of Sheldon. Superintendent K. L. Rue of Cavalier, has joined the staff of Stout Institute in Wisconsin. All these men have been leaders in their fleld and their work on the board of directors of the Association has been invaluable. Mr. Zenner of Arthur, completes his two terms on the board of directors and is not immediately eligible to succeed himself on the board. Thus, four new members will assume their duties as members of the board of directors of the Association. Some of the best men in educational circles have been appointed to the board to serve until the association can make its selection of board members at the annual meeting in October. It is thus assumed that the program of the association will go on interrupted despite the loss of those who so ably carried on for the association.

Of particular significance to member schools of the association and friends of education in general is the ultimate outcome of the pending law suit challenging the right of the association to supervise and direct the interschool relations of the high schools of the state. Not only will the outcome of the suit determine the status of the association but probably more important is the right of the individual school administrator to handle the discipline of the school under his charge. Should the case be decided in favor of the relator, the association would be without authority to either make or enforce eligibility rules which school administrators have seen fit to adopt over the past fifty years. Likewise school administrators would be powerless to enforce discipline within a given school system and the remedy of suspension from activities could only be used when specifically authorized by a school board. A school would not be able to

keep a boy or girl out of competition for any other reason than gross insubordination, habitual misbehaviour, or gross indolence. Scholarship rules would go out the window, age rules could be ignored, attendence would become an idle gesture, enrollment would be made when convenient for the student, professionalism would be invited and fair play be made obsolete as a knights armor. Chaos would result and interscholastic competition would be set back a hundred years. The time for leadership in school administration is now. Tomorrow may be too late.

The Board of Directors of the Association and this office are grateful for the splendid cooperation we have enjoyed over the past year and are ever mindful that much of the success of the entire association program is due to the generous contribution made by member schools and friends of education. May we look forward together for a continuance of the fine relationships that have been developed over the years.

## NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING Valley City, North Dakota - August 22-23, 1956

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the City Hall at Valley City, North Dakota, on August 22, 1956, at 3:00 o'clock P. M. Members Havig and Zenner were absent. Coach Al Meyer of Mayville met with the Board representing the North Dakota Officials Association.

The first order of business was the opening of bids for tournament basketballs. The low bid appeared to be that of Sioux Sporting Goods Company of Bismarck with a bid of \$14.50 per ball FOB Bismarck for the Rawlings RLO Official Last-Bilt Ball. Upon motion of Killie and second by Rue, the bid of the Sioux Sporting Goods Company of Bismarck was accepted.

The Board next proceeded to make assignment of officials for the various basketball tournaments. Surveys had previously been made of the different schools to obtain their preferences as to officials and the results of these surveys were made available to the Board. It was agreed that a policy of limiting officials to one tournament should be adopted and that officials from the state would be selected for the tourneys. The entire afternoon was spent studying ratings and qualifications of available officials, and finally, the following list of officials was selected for the tournaments as follows:

It was moved by Killie and seconded by Arveson that President Gussner appoint a committee to study fees paid officials' and report to the Board at the next Board meeting. Any change in officials' fees for the coming tournaments would await the recommendations of this committee. President Gussner appointed the following members to this committee: J. E. Slatta, Chairman, with committee members R. G. Arveson and L. T. Havig.

The next order of business was the location of the building sites in which certain tournaments would be played and the appointment of the managers of the Minot tourneys. A letter from the manager of the Minot auditorium was read in which he requested that the West Class A, Regional B and the State B Tournaments all be held in the City Auditorium and no rental fee would be charged for any of these tourneys. The Board agreed to this offer of staging the tourneys in the City Auditorium with Principal Bjorlie as the manager of the State B and the Class B Regional Tourneys and Principal Joel Davy as manager of the West Class A Tournament. The Class C Regional Tourney was set at the S. T. C. gymnasium in Minot. It was also the opinion of the Board that the Class B Regional Tourney scheduled at Fargo could be staged in the Ben Franklin School gym with Bob Brown as manager. The East Class A Tourney would be held at the A. C. Field House with Bob Brown as manager.

Some time was spent discussing the Accident Benefit Program and the need for an established policy on rates to be charged to schools that wished to have a special short term coverage for certain summer classroom activities such as kindergarten during the summer vacation period, summer makeup classes, remedial reading classes, or other strictly school classroom activities held during periods when the regular school term is closed. It was agreed to provide such protection on the same terms as provided during the regular term at a charge of ten cents per pupil.

The annual audit report, which had been prepared by the Ludvigson Accounting Service of Valley City, was reviewed by the Board, and on motion by Arveson and second by Killie, the report was accepted and approved. The purchase of \$4,680 in government bonds through funds derived from the sale of \$4,500 in bonds that matured and \$150 in cash as reported in the audit report was approved.

Killie and Abrahamson were appointed to a committee to submit an amendment to Article XIII, Section I of the eligibility rules which, in effect, changes the latest date for enrollment from the thirtieth day of the semester to the twenty-second day of the semester. Such a change is needed to bring the Association regulations in harmony with those of the State Department which require an attendance of a minimum of 135 days in order to obtain credit in any academic subject. This committee was also instructed to frame an amendment to Article V, Section I of the Constitution which would name the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his appointee as a member of the Board of Directors of the High School Activities Association in an advisory capacity. The two fore mentioned amendments were to be submitted to the Association meeting in October.

It was also felt that Article V, Section I of the Constitution should be interpreted by the Board so no misunderstanding would exist as to the definition of the word **term** as used in this Section. This Section limits the term of a Board member to two consecutive terms and further provides that he shall take office on July first following his election. The Section

does not clearly indicate the status of a Board member who has filled a part of a term through appointment or through election for less than a three year period. It is the ruling of the Board that a term shall be a three year period and any Board member is eligible to serve on the Board for two full consecutive terms of three years. Appointment or election for a fraction of a term (any period less than three years) does not disqualify the incumbent from seeking two consecutive terms of three years each.

A letter from Superintendent Johnson of Kenmare was read to the Board. Mr. Johnson raised a question on the status of the tentative grade given to vocational agriculture students at the end of the school term and at the close of the regular classroom work, but prior to the completion of the home project normally required of vocational students. The Board ruled that this temporary grade should and could be accepted by the school as the basis on which to determine eligibility for the coming semester. If the lad had a grade of passing at the end of the school term, then his work in agriculture could be counted as one of the three subjects necessary to comply with the eligibility rules. On the other hand, if his temporary grade was recorded as a failure, then his project work completed during the summer or in the fall should not be used to bring his grade up to the passing mark, and this subject be counted as one of the three necessary credits completed in the previous semester. Work done during the summer vacation period through correspondence or special summer classes or any other makeup work has never been recognized to be used to satisfy the requirement imposed under eligibility rule eight. Likewise, a failing student in an agriculture class should not be permitted to use credit made in a home project over the summer months to bring his final grade to a passing status and have such credit dated back to the previous semester and the results used to satisfy rule eight.

The Board adjourned at 10:30 P. M. to meet at 9:00 A. M. on August 23.

The next order of business was a study of the present girl's basket-ball organization. Consideration had been given to this problem by the Class C members of the Board on previous occasions and a survey of the number of schools playing girls' basketball indicated that the number had been slowly decreasing each year. Hence, it no longer appeared practical to continue a sixteen district organization plan. A plan dividing the state into eight districts with the elimination of the eight regional contests and the district winner o advance directly to the state final tournament appeared to be the best solution of his problem. An eight district organization plan would probably necessitate sub-district tournaments, but such tournaments would be organized through the district organization.

It was agreed to divide the state into eight districts as follows:

- District 1: Forbes, Guelph, Havana, Rutland, Cogswell, Fullerton, Monango, Stirum, DeLamere, Verona, Berlin, Fort Ransom, Hastings, Litchville, Marion, Dickey, Nortonville, Svea, & Jud.
- District 2: Kathryn, Nome, Fingal, Chaffee, Horace, Mapleton, Wheatland, Oriska, Amenia, Ayr, Argusville, Gardner, Grandin, Arthur, & Erie.
- District 3: Galesburg, Colgate, Pillsbury, Luverne, Dazey, Sanborn, Rogers, Leal, Wimbledon, Kensal, Countenay, Woodworth, Cleveland & Noltimier.

- District 4: Kloten, Emerado, Gilby, Forest River, Bowesmont, Fairdale, Adams, Lankin, Niagara & Logan Center (Kempton).
- District 5: Crary, Devils Lake School for Deaf, Southan, Brocket, Lawton, Webster, Starkweather, Alsen, Munich, Clyde, Calvin, Sarles, Rock Lake, Perth, Warwick & Wales.
- District 6: Glenfield, McHenry, Grace City, Bordulac, Sykeston, Bowdon, Hurdsfield, Goodrich, Denhoff, Balfour & Bergen.
- District 7: Braddock, Tappen, Dawson, Driscoll, Pettibone, Robinson, Tuttle, Wing, Regan, Center, Almont, Solen, Selfridge & Leith.
- District 8: Arnegard, Epping, Ross, Palermo, Alamo, Surrey, Deering, Lansford, Newburg, Upham, Gardena, Barton & Berwick.

(Any teams omitted from the above list will be assigned to the district representing their geographic area.)

In order to facilitate organization of the new districts, the following temporary chairmen are appointed in each district and are to be vested with the authority to call the interested schools together for the purpose of organizing the district and electing a district committee to represent the district:

The problem of deficits at the Girls' State Tournament was discussed in detail and various suggestions for limiting this deficit were reviewed. Certain districts had previously indicated their approval of an assessment to be made against schools participating in the girls' program. It was the general opinion of the Board that with the new organization in girls' basketball and the change in tournament site, there was a possibility of this deficit being reduced. The Board voted to defer any assessment against schools playing girls' basketball until this tourney season is over.

The Board next reviewed the Class C organization plan. No general redistricting appeared to be needed at this time. However, certain adjustments appeared to be necessary in districts 11-12-13 and the Board assigned schools as follows in these districts:

- District 11 Hamilton, Gardar, Bathgate, Crystal, Bowesmont, Neche, Mountain & Edinburg.
- District 12-13 Osnabrock, Hannah, Wales, Alsen, Sarles, Calvin, Clyde, Munich, Rock Lake, Egeland, Wolford, Perth & Hansboro.

To Join District 9 - Fairdale & Adams.

Since district 12 and 13 would be a combined district and they have indicated they would like to play their tourney together and are in different regions, it was agreed that assignment of the two representatives to the regions should be made on the basis of nearness to the regional site. The representative closest to Carrington would attend the Carrington regional and the team closest to Park River would compete in the Park River regional. This assignment is to be made regardless of position attained in the district tournament.

It was the understanding of the Board that the Thursday afternoon session of the School Administrators during the N. D. E. A. would be turned over to the Association with the Association responsible for the program for the hour prior to the business session. It was tentatively agreed that the following program would be prepared:

The Secretary was instructed to contact Paul Dalager, Executive Secretary of the N. D. E. A., and report the program to him for publication.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

# NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING Grand Forks, North Dakota - October 17, 1956

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Ryan Hotel at Grand Forks, North Dakota, on Wednesday, October 17th, with all members present. Also present was K. L. Dooley representing the State Department of Public Instruction.

The first order of business was the requests of several schools, which could not obtain properly qualified coaches for the current year, for approval of their coaches. It was moved by Havig and seconded by Killie that coaches with less than the regular qualifications be approved as per request in the following schools of Fryburg, Oriska, Grand Prairie, Alsen and Balfour, with the understanding that this approval be limited to this year. The motion was carried.

Letters were read from several school superintendents reporting that their enrollments were up to the point where it would be necessary for them to be advanced to Class B and a request from two schools with enrollments over 55 to be advanced to Class B. After due consideration, the Board agreed that the following assignment of districts be made: Willow City, Notre Dame of Willow City and Rock Lake to be assigned to District No. 7, Class B; Powers Lake and Glenburn to be assigned to District No. 10, Class B; Max to be assigned to District No. 12, Class B; and Regent to be assigned to District No. 16, Class B.

A letter was also read from Superintendent Tollerud of Sawyer reporting that the enrollment of Sawyer was now 88. However, Sawyer

would prefer to use the year of grace and remain in Class C for the current year.

A letter was then read from Principal L. N. Hanson of Grand Forks reporting the inadvertant playing of an ineligible player on their B squad. Mr. Hanson reported the conditions under which this had occurred and also reported that he had written to the other school and forfeited the game and had also removed the lad's name from the eligibility list. It was the consensus of the Board that Mr. Hanson should be complimented for reporting the violation voluntarily and for taking steps to forfeit the game. No further action was deemed necessary by the Board.

Member Slatta reported for the Officials' Fees Committee. It appeared that our payment to officials in basketball games was on par with those of similar states and the recommendation of this Committee was that officials' fees for this year for regional and state basketball tourney games should remain at the same figure as last year. It was agreed by the Board that fees would remain the same and the Secretary was instructed to make out officials' contracts for regional and state tourney games at the same fees at last year. It was also agreed that officials who work games under contract with the Association must attend one of the Clinics promoted by the Association.

Some time was spent discussing a change in Article XIII, Section I, of the By-Laws. Mr. Dooley of the State Department of Public Instruction reported that the regulations of the State Department required a minimum of 68 days attendance in order to qualify for credit. He urged the change in our eligibility rules to require a similar attendance to bring the rules of the two groups into harmony.

It was agreed to submit the following amendment to Article XIII, Section I, of the By-Laws to read as follows:

"A student shall have been in attendance as many school days as he has missed at the opening of the semester should his enrollment not have been made at the opening of the semester provided, however, that he shall have made such enrollment and begun regular class work prior to the twenty-third day of the semester."

Some time was spent in discussing a proposal which would make a member of the staff of the Department of Public Instruction an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors in an advisory capacity. While this policy had been followed in practice, it was felt that it would meet with general approval of school men to have the matter recorded as a part of the Constitution the board agreed to submit the following amendment to the constitution under Article V, Section 1:

"The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or a member of his duly constituted staff designated by him, shall serve as an exofficio member of said Board in an advisory capacity to coordinate the activities of the Association with the regulations of the State Department."

The Board next selected a football coach to represent North Dakota on the National Federation Football Rules Committee. Coach Milo Lodoen of Bottineau was named to this position and W. Wilson of Bismarck was named as an alternate if Mr. Lodoen found it impossible to attend.

Superintendent R. G. Arveson was named to represent North Dakota at the National Association of Speech Teachers in Chicago in late December.

The contracts with the City of Minot and the High School Activities Association for the use of the City Auditorium for the State B and the West Class A Tournaments were examined by the Board and approved.

The present allowance to teams at the regional Class B and regional Class C tournaments was carefully reviewed and it was agreed that the per diem allowance for teams at the Class B regionals be increased from \$5.00 per diem to \$5.50. The Class C regional was changed to permit teams participating in these tourneys to be allowed one meal at \$12.00 even though they were within the 50 mile limit as previously provided.

The question of Personal Liability and Property Damage Insurance for Association sponsored activities was thoroughly explored and the Secretary was instructed to again contract with the Anchor Casualty Company for this protection.

The Board adjourned to meet following the general Association meeting on Thursday.

Following the general meeting, the Board again convened with all members present.

Superintendent Rue reported that he had contacted Superintendent Elznic relative to his problem in securing a properly qualified coach. It was impossible for Mr. Elznic to be present at the meeting and the Board considered the problem based on the information it had at hand. It was noted that Bowesmont had made a similar request for approval of an uncertified coach a year ago and despite warnings had not remedied their situation this year. After due consideration and discussion of the problem, it was agreed to approve conditionally the status of their coach. Bowesmont would be permitted to take part in regular season's games but would not be permitted to participate in district, regional or state basketball tournaments this year. Further, a regular member of the faculty would be required to be present at all games away from home. Further, Bowesmont was to be instructed that the Board would not approve an unqualified coach in 1957-58.

The Board next considered the possibility of holding Hockey Clinics over the state. This matter had been proposed by a group of interested hockey fans from Devils Lake. It was the opinion of the Board that the sport of hockey was largely a local matter at the present time with only a few schools playing the game. The consensus of the Board was that until such time as there was a greater demand for this sport on the part of the high schools of the state, they would not be justified in promoting Clinics of this nature.

The Board received a report from the Secretary on the present status of the A. A. B. Fund and a complete report on the receipts and disbursements up to October 15th.

The Board discussed the time of their next meeting, and it was agreed to meet at Bismarck during the School Administrator's Meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

### NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING

Bismarck, North Dakota - January 27, 1957

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Grand Pacific Hotel on Sunday, January 27, with all members present and also Richard Klein, Director of Secondary Education, representing the State Department of Public Instruction.

A special auditing Committee consisting of Board members Zenner, Killie, and Gussner met at 11 A. M. to canvass the results of the mail election which closed on January 15.

The Canvassing Committee found the following to be the results of the election:

The Canvassing Committee reported the results of the vote to the Board of Directors and the report was adopted and approved. Chairman Gussner declared R. J. Arveson of Leeds elected to the position of Directorat-Large for a term of three years, effective July 1, 1957. Don Cameron of Gardner and J. E. Slatta of Sheldon were declared elected to the position of Director from the Class C Schools for a term of three years, effective July 1, 1957.

The Amendment to Article V, Section 1 of the Constitution of the High School Activities Association which reads as follows:

"The Superintendent of Public Institution or a member of his duly constituted staff designated by him shall serve as an exofficio member of said Board in an advisory capacity to coordinate the activities of the Association with the regulations of the State Department of Public Instruction" was declared carried and effective at once.

Jim Adelson of KXJB-TV Valley City, North Dakota, appeared before the Board and outlined the proposals for telecasting the different Class A Basketball Tournaments. The various angles of the telecasts were discussed for an hour or more and the Board took the matter under advisement.

The Board agreed on the following fees for telecasting the 1957 tournaments:

\$750.00 for telecast rights over Valley City, Bismarck and Dickinson stations operated by the Dakota Broadcasting Company for the semi-finals on Friday night and the finals on Saturday night of the East Class A Tournament held at Fargo.

\$100.00 per game for the semi-finals of the West Class A Tournament held at Minot to be telecast only over the Minot TV Station operated by the Dakota Broadcasting Company, with further stipulation that the minimum contract price should be \$300.00.

\$300,00 per game for the semi-finals and finals of the State Class A Tournament held at Grand Forks over all stations in the state operated by the Dakota Broadcasting Company;

OFFICIAL HANDBOOK

\$150 per game for the semi-finals and finals of the State Class B Tournament held at Minot over the Minot Telecasting Station

\$250.00 for the finals of the State Class B at Minot if that is the only game to be telecast at that tournament.

The Secretary reported a request from Mr. J. Birkeland of Grafton in which he would select some cheerleader from a Class A School in North Dakota to accompany the Grafton Municipal Band to the Orange Bowl on January 1, 1958. It was the opinion of the Board that both the selection of such a person and the attendance of an official high school representative were contrary to the principles of the Activities Association and should be discouraged.

Upon motion of Killie and second by Zenner, it was agreed to purchase an anemometer for the State Track Meet inasmuch as a reliable instrument could be obtained for approximately \$100.00 plus express. The use of this instrument should solve the ever present question of whether records established in running events should be recognized when they are made under windy conditions.

Some time was spent in reviewing the number of invitational tournaments held in the state. It appeared to be the consensus that some of the schools were playing too many games and accepting too many invitations to tournaments. It was suggested that a possible amendment to the By-Laws be drawn which would charge all first team invitational tourneys in excess of one to the allowable 20 games now permitted over the season. Thus, if a school wanted to attend more than one county or invitational tourney, the games in the second tournament would be charged against the allowable twenty permitted over the season. Such an amendment was to be submitted at the next Board meeting for further discussion.

Member Killie reported that work was continuing on the Record Book and that it was his opinion that something concrete could be submitted in time for the June meeting of the Board.

It was agreed to make a registration charge of \$1.00 for all coaches who attend the State Track Clinic scheduled at Jamestown on April 6, 1957. This fee would be used to pay a portion of the fee of \$200.00 which was to be allowed Mr. Fischer, Clinic Leader from Indiana University.

The Board directed their attention to the best methods of enforcing the requirement that all first team football and basketball games must be officiated by registered officials. A survey made on the names of officials used in football games last fall indicated that many schools were not too careful about obtaining registered officials and that officials in some sections were very lax in registering. Various suggestions were offered to solve this problem and these suggestions were to be taken under advisement as possible means of solving the problem. Among solutions offered were the following:

1. Have coach of visiting team check the official's card and number.

- 2. Have a form prepared which officials would sign giving their number and name to the employing school before the fees were paid to the official for his services.
- 3. Check our present contract forms to see if revisions might not be made to remedy the situation.

Considerable time was spent in discussing the activities of other aroups which are now somewhat separate and distinct from the program of the Activities Association. Special attention was given to the State Science Fair, Student Council Activity, FFA Activities, FHA Activities and similar projects. No action was taken.

It appeared to be the opinion of the Board that there was no particular need to call meetings of the Class B or Class C District Committees

R. G. Arveson, State Delegate to the National Speech meeting in Chicago in December, gave a complete report of the activities of the debate and discussion groups at this conference. It was noted that Mr. Arveson had been named president of the interest group in debate at this meeting.

The following selection of members to present the trophies at the different state tournaments were made:

State Class C.....Zenner and Slatta State Class A.....Gussner and Havig State Girls'.....Zenner and Abrahamson

Some time was spent in reviewing insurance forms used by the Secretary in the payment of claims in excess of \$25.00 where the claimant has other insurance coverage.

A report of income and disbursements up to January 25 was also submitted by the Secretary and reviewed by the Board.

A report on information sent out to all tournament managers was also given to the Board members and special publicity material for tournament programs was reviewed.

The Board reviewed the alleged violation of St. James High School of Grand Forks in which St. James had played an interscholastic contest in football with a Minnesota parochial school on a Sunday. The violation had been admitted and acknowledged by the St. James High School authorities. The Secretary was instructed to write a letter of censure to St. James High School with a warning that further violations would only result in the application of more drastic penalties on the part of the Board.

It was agreed that the next meeting of the Board would be held at Minot on the Friday of the State Class B Tournament, and the Secretary was instructed to make room reservations for the Board.

There being no further business the board adjourned at 6:00 P. M. Earl Abrahamson, Executive Secretary

## MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING Minutes North Dakota - March 15-16, 1957

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Minot on March 15-16, 1957, with all members present. The minutes of the previous meeting of the Board were waived as all members had been mailed mimeographed copies.

The first item of business was the consideration of a policy relative to the attendance of Board members at the annual National Federation meeting and the proper allowance to be given to each delegate at this annual session. It was moved by Killie and seconded by Rue that the following policy be adopted relative to expenses at such meetings:

"Delegates who travel by air or by train shall be allowed actual plane fare or actual railroad fare computed at first class round trip rate plus \$16.00 per diem allowance for pullman and meals, tips, etc. Delegates who elect to travel by car shall be allowed the first class round trip railroad fare plus a per diem of \$16.00 for the time necessary to reach the destination by rail plus one extra days allowance. In all instances expenses at the convention site shall be computed at actual cost."

The motion was carried.

It was then moved by Havig and seconded by Killie that the Board adopt a policy of sending each Board member once during his three year term in office to the National Federation meeting. Under this arrangement there would be two delegates each year and three delegates once in a three year period. The motion was carried.

Members Gussner and Killie were named delegates to the Miami meeting with Mr. Gussner named the voting delegate and Mr. Killie the alternate. The Secretary reported that it would not be possible for him to attend the meeting of secretaries at the Miami meeting and suggested that Mr. Zenner be appointed in his place. It was agreed that Zenner be also named to attend the Miami Convention of the National Federation.

It was noted that the term of L. T. Havig on the National Federation Executive Board would expire at the next Federation meeting this summer and the Secretary was ordered to draw a resolution urging the election of Mr. Havig for a second term on the Federation Executive Board. Copies of this resolution were to be sent to the executive secretaries of all states in this district, namely Minnesota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Wyoming, and Montana. Mr. Havig is now serving as vice-president of the Executive Committee and there appears a good possibility that he may be named president of the Board if elected to his second term.

The Secretary next reported the importance of reorganizing the Board of Directors for the 1957-58 school year so that this information could be included in the calendar project. The Board was organized for 1957-58 as follows:

Wm. Gussner President
E. S. Killie Vice-President

The next order of business was the review of the Wayne Robillard claim from Langdon High School. The diagnosis of this injury was clearly stated as a case of exhaustion and the treatment prescribed by the doctor was rest in a local hospital. The Secretary had refused payment of the claim on the grounds that exhaustion could not be properly classified as an accident but rather was a health condition resulting from over-exertion. After discussing this claim for some time it was agreed that proper disposition had been made of the claim and payment should be refused on the grounds that this was not, strictly speaking, an accident.

Principal A. L. Hermunslie and Coach M. Strand of West Fargo appeared on behalf of their district committee and made the following recommendations for improving the track organization plan in the state:

- The present plan of awarding four places at the state track meet should be changed to five place with points awarded on a 5-4-3-2-1 basis instead of the present 5-3-2-1 basis
- Consideration should be given to holding the State Class A and Class B Track Meets at different sites to avoid crowding events.
- District lines should be clearly drawn so no school could change from one district to another to avoid competition.

It was moved by Havig and seconded by Arveson that the Chair appoint a committee to consider the above recommendations and any other related problems concerning track in North Dakota. The Chair subsequently appointed Board members Killie and Zenner and Coach Ernie Gates to this committee.

The matter of publishing a calendar for the coming school year was discussed. It was the unanimous opinion of the Board that this was a worthy project and should be continued.

The Secretary reported that Mr. L. R. Herkimer, Executive Secretary of the National Cheerleaders Association, had arranged to be in North Dakota in late October, 1957, and would conduct a series of four Cheerleaders Clinics. The Board agreed to set Cheerleaders Clinics at the following sites: Dickinson, Minot, Devils Lake, and Valley City. Clinic fees were to remain the same as last year. The Secretary was instructed to proceed with plans to set up these Clinics.

Mr. Stenerson, Auditorium Manager, met with the Board to extend an invitation to hold the West Class A and the State B Tournaments at Minot. Mr. Stenerson advised the Board that it would be necessary to make a charge of \$150 per day for the use of the City Auditorium for future tourneys held in that building. He also urged that the Board consider making an allowance for cleaning and maintaining the auditorium for both the State B and the West Class A Tourneys which were being held in Minot this year. The Minot Auditorium Manager had agreed to provide the use of the auditorium rent free for the current tourneys and a contract to that effect had been signed by both parties. Lyle Swigart, Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, also appeared before the Board to extend an invitation to the Board to hold the West Class A and the State B Tournaments in Minot in 1958. He assured the Board that there would be no charge for the use of the facilities.

The Board next proceeded to set the dates for the tournaments in 1958. Since the By-Laws of the Association provide that the final State

Tournament shall be completed on the Saturday closest to the 19th of March, it was agreed that the final Class B Tourney be held on March 20-21-22, 1958 and all other tournaments be held in the same order as this year ahead of the March 20-21-22 dates.

OFFICIAL HANDBOOK

It was agreed to hold the next meeting of the Board on June 5-6 at Valley City. The first session of the Board would be held Wednesday evening and continue on the 6th for as long as necessary.

It was agreed that the selection of trophies should be made at this meeting and that trophy salesmen be informed that a special committee from the Board would meet with them on Wednesday afternoon, June 5, to examine possible trophies to be recommended to the Board. Members Rue, Havig, and Slatta were named to be the special Trophy Committee.

The Secretary reported that Mrs. Lutz, office assistant, was now working only part time and was completing the requirements for a degree at Valley City State Teachers College. She had expressed an interest in full time work after completing her degree providing the salary offered was comparable to that she could earn in the teaching profession. The Secretary was instructed to negotiate with her for the full time work.

Attention was directed by member Arveson to the new 1958 basket-ball rules which required that basketball uniforms be numbered in a specific manner and that a penalty be applied to all schools that do not comply with this regulation. It was the opinion of the Board that no school should be penalized for wearing jerseys without the proper numerals, but when new jerseys are purchased, the recommended numbers should be obtained. The Secretary was instructed to give publicity to this stand on the part of the Board.

It was nearly 6:00 P. M. and the Board agreed to adjourn until 9:00 A. M. on Saturday morning. Just prior to adjournment, Mr. Swigart called and requested that the Board meet in the office of the City Auditorium Manager during the half of the first game.

The Board assembled in the office of the City Auditorium Manager and there were briefed by the Building Committee that it would be necessary to make a charge of \$150.00 per day for the use of the auditorium for future tournaments in addition to the concession rights. No action was taken by the Board at this time as this was an informational meeting.

9:00 A. M., Saturday morning.

The Board met at 9:00 A. M. in the Leland Parker Hotel parlors.

Mr. Swigart met with the Board and reported that arrangements had been made to provide the auditorium rent free and that any charges would be taken care of by the local radio stations. The Board indicated surprise at this arrangement and suggested that Mr. Swigart check the authenticity of this latest promise, and if so, that a written invitation be extended for the 1958 tournaments covering this latest offer. Mr. Swigart telephoned an hour later and reported that this alleged promise was an idle rumor and could not be confirmed. The Board then agreed that no action would be taken on the location of either the A or the B State Tournament until the matter of building rentals could be clarified.

The Secretary presented a survey of the first team, second team tournaments, and grade tournaments to which schools had accepted in-

vitations during the current basketball season. From the survey it was apparent that junior high and grade tournaments were also becoming a problem.

After discussing the matter for some time, the Chair appointed Board members Rue, Slatta, and Havig to a committee to frame an amendment to the By-Laws which would further limit invitational tournaments.

The problem of radio broadcast of tournaments was also discussed at length and it was apparent that something would have to be done to limit the number of stations broadcasting a given tournament. It was the opinion of the Board that this problem would be discussed at the annual Federation meeting. Delegates Gussner, Killie, and Zenner were named to a special Radio and TV Committee to report back with recommendations at the August meeting of the Board.

The members of the Board of Directors of the North Dakota Officials Association met with the Board and a general discussion was held over problems of mutual concern. Such matters as kinds of Football and Basketball Clinics, methods of selecting officials for the various tournaments, fees for officiating tournaments, and other related problems were talked over for more than an hour. It was agreed to use the same plan for Clinics in the fall of 1957, and the Secretary was instructed to set up organization plans and make arrangements for these Clinics. It was agreed to increase the number of Basketball Clinics so that the different sections of the state would be served. Basketball Clinics were authorized at Dickinson, Bismarck, Minot, and Grafton, in addition to the one to be held at the Valley City Coaching School.

A great deal of time was spent on evaluating the present Class B Regional Tourney plans. In order to obtain the best judgment of the Class B schools on the problem, the following optional plans were to be submitted to Class B schools for their choice as to the best system:

- Provide 16 districts, as at present, with winners of the district advancing to a four-team regional tourney played one night only to qualify two winners for the State Class B Tourney. No regional champion is determined.
- Provide sixtéen districts, as at present, with the winner and runners-up advancing to an eight-team regional tournament played two days only. Complete semi-final rounds only to determine qualifiers for the State Tournament. No regional champions declared.
- 3. Continue with the present set up.

The Secretary was instructed to prepare a questionnaire embodying the above alternate plans and submit to the Class B schools for their appraisal.

It was moved by Zenner and seconded by Slatta that the 1958 Class C Tournament be awarded to Jamestown on March 17-18-19, 1958. The motion was carried.

It was moved by Havig and seconded by Arveson that West Class A be held at Bismarck on March 6-7-8, 1958, and that the East class A tournament be held at Fargo on March 6-7-8-, 1958. The motion was carried. No

action was taken on the other tournaments and final action was deferred to a later date.

This appeared to complete the agenda and the Board adjourned at 5:00 P. M. after being in continuous session since 9:00 A: M.

## SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION Valley City, North Dakota - May 22, 1957

This meeting of the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was called at the special request of Principal Warren Evenson of the Fargo Central High School and Principal Con Leifur of the Bismarck High School for a review of the eligibility status of several high school athletes who had participated in a basketball tournament in mid-April at a DeMolay Conclave held in Bismarck. Present at this meeting were all members of the Board, (except J. E. Slatta of Sheldon), Principals Leifur and Evenson, and also Harold Schaefer of Bismarck.

The meeting opened with Chairman Gussner presiding. Mr. Gussner stated the purpose of the meeting and suggested that each of the principals be given an opportunity to state his case.

President Gussner then called on Mr. Leifur to present his case. Mr. Leifur called the attention of the Board to Article IV, Section III of the By-Laws of the Association which reads as follows:

"Any school entering a protest against another school shall submit in writing a full statement of facts and grounds for protest to the Secretary who shall submit a copy to the superintendent or principal of the accused school. Such protest shall be accompanied by a deposit of ten dollars (\$10.00) which shall later be returned if the protest is sustained by the Board. The school against which a protest or any charge has been made shall have the privilege of presenting its case to the Board."

Mr. Leifur was of the opinion that the proper procedure had not been followed in reporting the alleged violation. Further, Mr. Leifur based his contentions on the 1951 SPECIAL HANDBOOK OF INTERPRETATIONS and admitted that he was not aware that a new edition of the HANDBOOK had been printed in 1955 and that his students had been advised on the basis of the rules and regulations appearing in the 1951 edition of the HANDBOOK.

Mr. Leifur also quoted Article XIII, Section III of the By-Laws which is as follows:

"He shall not have participated in a similar contest during the same school year as a member of any other than a high school team."

It was his contention that golf and tennis and basketball are not similar sports and, hence, this rule should not apply in this case.

Mr. Evenson was then called upon and he presented a copy of the Condensed Eligibility Rules. His contention was that these condensed

rules contained nothing which would indicate that a lad could not participate in a post-season tournament or play on a non-school basketball team if he were not a member of a high school basketball team.

Mr. Evenson admitted having a copy of the 1955 HANDBOOK OF INTERPRETATIONS but contended that he was not to be expected to know all its contents.

Mr. Schaefer was extended the courtesy of the floor. His presentation was largely critical of the organization and he challenged the right of the Association to make any rules which would restrict the right of any student to participate in interschool activities of any nature. Mr. Schaefer condemned the following Sections appearing in the Constitution and By-Laws:

Article III, Section V of the Constitution: "Any school may be suspended or expelled from membership by the Board of Directors for violation of rules; and once expelled or suspended, may be reinstated only by action of the Board."

Article IX, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution: "The Representative is responsible to the Association in all matters pertaining to the interscholastic relations of his school. He shall not permit his Board of Education or other individuals or delegations to interfere in interschool relations, but these must be conducted entirely by the duly appointed administrative officer of the school or the Representative."

Article IV, Section II of the By-Laws: "All questions in dispute shall be referred to the Board and its decision shall be final."

Article IV, Section V of the By-Laws: "In case of protests or charges against schools for violation of the rules, the Board may suspend for one year any school whose case is presented by legal counsel or delegations of any sort."

Mr. Schaefer made a passionate plea that the Board reverse its stand on the eligibility of some eight or ten high school boys who had participated in the DeMolay Basketball Tournament after the close of the basketball season. He indicated that his interest in this case was solely due to the fact that he was instrumental in making arrangements for the Conclave and the tournament, and the boys themselves were innocent of any violation of the rules.

Some two hours were spent in obtaining facts on the nature of the tournament and the participation of the boys in the tournament. The Board then went into executive session as had been agreed at the opening of the hearing and discussed the matter further.

After a thorough discussion for another hour, the Board ruled as follows:

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Constitution and By-Laws of the North Dakota High School Activities Association adopted by the member schools unanimously in January of 1955 and which became effective July 1, 1955, it appears that under Section IV of Article V, Part C of the Constitution that this Board is acting within its authority to interpret the rules of the Association, and

WHEREAS, under Article IV, Section II of the By-Laws, that matters in dispute shall be referred to the Board and its decisions shall be final, and

WHEREAS, under Article IV, Section IV of the By-Laws, a student may be barred from participation in contests and a school may be suspended or expelled or caused to forfeit championship rights, and

WHEREAS, under Article V of the By-Laws, a series of penalties for different violations are listed, and

WHEREAS, Article VI, Section II of the By-Laws and an explanatory interpretation has been incorporated into the Section to clarify the meaning of this Section and provides as follows:

"No interscholastic football game shall be played after the final State Championship has been decided; no interscholastic basketball game or tournament shall be played after the final State High School Championship game each year." ("This section definitely places a final date after which no football or basketgames or tournament may be played. This section applies to all member schools and includes any and all games which involve pupils from grades 7 through 12. The rule applies whether the game or tournament is sponsored by a school or some other group.")

WHEREAS, Article XII dealing with the **Sports Seasons** under Section II clearly indicates that the basketbali season must be confined to a period of twenty weeks and must end with the completion of the final State Tournament and no games or tournaments may be scheduled for any pupil in grades 7-12 after that date, and

WHEREAS, it does appear that the tournament held in connection with the DeMolay Conclave meets the conditions for both a contest and a tournament as outlined under Question 34 of the 1955 HANDBOOK of INTERPRETATIONS, page 40:

- (a) There was previous arrangements for this tournament. The use of the gymnasium had been arranged for in advance. Schedule and time had been arranged also.
- (b) There had been previous advertising and announcement. In literature sent out to delegates to the Conclace, note was made that there would be a tournament. Members were asked to bring their suits. Arrangements had been made to play the group from one city against members from another city.
- (c) The games were conducted under game conditions. Scores were kept and rules were adhered to also. Time was kept under regulation basketball rules.
- (d) Spectators were present from the DeMolay group and possibly others interested in basketball.
- (e) The game was regularly officiated without interruption for coaching.
- (f) Regulation rules were used in the contest.
- (g) Sufficient players were used to form two or more teams.

- (h) An account of the tournament was written up in the daily papers.
- (i) Awards were made to the winning teams, and

WHEREAS, Question 39 on page 41 of the 1955 HANDBOOK OF INTERPREATIONS makes it clear that these lads have participated in a basketball tournament after the season is over and the penalty for such an infraction is clearly stated in the answer to this Question; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that:

- (a) the plea for eligibility for the lads who participated in the DeMolay Tournament be denied and that all lads who participated shall be declared ineligible for the spring sports of track, golf, and tennis on an interscholastic basis;
- (b) the principals of the Fargo and Bismarck High Schools have been lax in not familiarizing themselves with the contents of the 1955 HANDBOOK OF INTERPRETATIONS and in not informing their students of the rules and regulations and their interpretations, which have been common knowledge now to member schools for a period of two or more years;
- (c) the Board expresses its regret that the infraction of the rules and regulations may have been done innocently on the part of the lads concerned and
- (d) the effectiveness of the Association demands that rules and regulations must be enforced without fear or favor.

The above resolution was introduced by member Zenner and seconded by member Havig. Upon roll call Zenner voted yes, Havig yes, Killie yes, Rue yes, Arveson yes, Gussner yes, with Slatta absent and not voting.

Vice President Killie, who took the Chair prior to the introduction of the resolution, then declared the resolution unanimously carried. Representatives attending the meeting were informed that the prior decision of the Board to rule these lads ineligible was sustained and they were instructed to guide themselves accordingly and in accordance with these findings to declare these lads ineligible for further interscholastic activities for the balance of the school term.

In the event of a possible injunction brought against the Association as a result of this hearing, it was agreed to secure the services of L. T. Sproul of Valley City and another law firm to represent the Association. Several other firms were suggested but it was agreed to await developments. The Secretary was authorized to contact Mr. Sproul in the event an injunction was filed.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

## MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASS'N. Valley City, North Dakota - June 5-6, 1957

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Association met in the Association office at 7:30 P. M. with all members of the Board

present except J. E. Slatta and a representative from the State Department of Public Instruction.

The special Trophy Committee of the Board met in the afternoon and examined trophies and awards displayed by representatives of the Josten, Balfour, Herf-Jones, and Toring Companies. The committee selected several possible trophies from the different companies to be considered by the entire Board.

The first order of business was the selection of trophies. After a careful examination of the offerings of each company, and a comparison of prices, the Board agreed upon the following selections:

Josten Company: Trophies for Class A-B-C-Boys' state basketball.

Tournaments; Series J632 - J631 - J630 - J629 - Trophies for five places all Boys' Tourneys.

Series J630 - J629 - J617 - J616 - Trophies for five places Girls' State Tourney.

Trophies for all boys and girls basketball districts as ordered by district committees: Series JX77 - JX76 - JX75 - JX74,

Toring Company, Valley City:

Series C9 1-2-3-4-for the State Track Meet. Series C9 4-5 for the District Track Meets.

Herf-Jones Company:

Round Design Trophy for State Baseball for 1-2-3rd places. Same trophy for State Tennis and Golf. Trophy for singles and doubles for first place only.

Balfour Company:

Series 929 - 930 - 931 - 932 - 933 for five places. East and West Class A Basketball, and four, Class B Regions. First and Second Place Trophy for Class C Regions. Gold and Silver Basketballs for the first and second place team members and Coaches for all State Basketball Tourneys.

Participation Awards for team members and Coach of the other six teams at the State Basketball Tournaments.

Medals for 13 events in District and State Track Meets, five places.

Medals for 1st & 2nd places in State Tennis singles and doubles.

Medals for 1-2-3-4 places in State Golf singles and doubles.

Medals for first place relay team members, District and State.

Medal for high-point debater.

Trophy for first and second place debate team (State).

Medals for State Music and Speech individuals rating Highly Superior.

All participation medals shall be 7/8 inch.

First place State Track Awards shall be 1 ¼ inch in size.

All contracts for trophies are to be for a three year period and subject to a 3% discount from quoted prices in consideration for the three year agreement.

The Board examined the minutes of the special meeting of the Board on May 22nd and suggested several corrections and approved the minutes as corrected.

The next order of business was the examination of the financial report submitted by the Secretary. It was moved by Havig and seconded by Rue that inasmuch as the AABF Fund would have a small surplus this year in its operation, that the \$3000.00 loaned to this fund in 1954-55, be now returned to the general fund. The motion was carried.

The Secretary reported on the correspondence he had with the Assumption Abbey High School of Richardton relative to their proposal to offer a \$150.00 scholarship to eighth grade graduates who would enroll in the boarding school at Richardton. It was the opinion of the Board that such an offer was contrary to Article VII, Section 4 of the By-Laws of the High School Activities Association. The Secretary reported that as a result of the correspondence, the Abbey had withdrawn the scholarship offer and had, by letter, so advised all schools to whom this offer had been sent. Hence, it was the opinion of the Board that no further action was necessary in regard to this alleged violation of the By-Laws and the incident would be considered closed.

It was moved by Havig and seconded by Rue that the delegates to the National Federation meeting in Miami be instructed to support the proposed amendments to the National Federation Constitution and By-Laws dealing with eligibility of students who transfer from one state to another. The motion was carried.

The Board next spent some time reviewing Article V, Section 2 of the Constitution which deals with the filling of vacancies on the Board of Directors in the event of resignations, removal from the state or profession, change from one classification of school to another, or resignation from an administrative position in a school system.

From Section 2 of Article V, it is apparant that it is the duty of the Board to appoint a new member to serve until the next annual meeting, when the regular procedure for nominating and balloting shall be followed, to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term in office. Section 2 further provided that the election of Board Members shall be by mall ballot, which shall be returned to the Association office postmarked not later than January fifteenth following.

It was the opinion of the Board that appointees to fill vacancies would therefor serve until the board had an opportunity to meet and canvass the results of the election. This normally is done at a meeting of the Board of Directors during the School Administrators Conference held in late January or early February. As soon as the votes have been officially canvassed, those successful candidates for the unexpired terms would take office immediately. There is nothing in this interpretation which would in any way conflict with Section 1, of Article V of the Constitution which provided that members elected for full terms take office on July first follow-

ing their election. The above interpretation deals only with nominees to fill terms of those named thru appointment by the Board of Directors to fill unexpired terms.

The printing of 1000 copies of the "Handbook of Interpretation", with revisions to bring the Handbook up to date, was authorized by the Board.

The Committee appointed to make recommendations for amendments to the By-Laws which would further limit the number of basketball games, reported with the following amendments to Article XII, Section 2 of the By-Laws of the Association:

Amend Article XII, Section 2, by adding paragraph F as follows:
NO TEAM OR INDIVIDUAL PLAYER SHALL BE PEMITTED TO
PLAY IN MORE THAN TWO TOURNAMENTS PER SEASON
IN ADDITION TO THOSE IN THE PLAY-OFF SERIES SPONSORED BY THE ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION.

Amend Article XII, Section 2, Paragraph C, to read as follows:

TOTAL GAMES PLAYED SHALL NOT EXCEED THE NUMBER
OF WEEKS CONSTITUTING THE SEASON. TOURNAMENT
GAMES IN THE ASSOCIATION SPONSORED PLAY-OFF
SERIES, PLUS THOSE IN ONE OTHER TOURNAMENT, SHALL
NOT COUNT IN THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF GAMES
PERMITTED.

On page 32, under the explanation of Section 2, second paragraph, change to read as follows:

"THE TOTAL TIME DEVOTED TO BASKETBALL SHALL BE CONCENTRATED IN A PERIOD OF 20 WEEKS AND THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SEASON GAMES SHALL BE LIMITED TO 20 NOT COUNTING THE ASSOCIATION SPONSORED TOURNAMENT PLAY-OFF SERIES AND ONE OTHER TOURNAMENT".

It was moved by Rue and seconded by Arveson and carried that the above amendments to the By- Laws be submitted to the members of the Association in the September Activities Bulletin for first reading and for final adoption at the next annual meeting of the Association in October of 1957 as provided in Article XI of the Constitution of the Association.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Special Speech Committee and agreed to the following changes in the regulations for district and state speech contests in 1957-58:

- Change the time allotment for Class A speech from one hour to forty-five minutes for each school.
- In district and state contests, Class B-C Schools, change the number of entries to permit a maximum of four students from a given school to enter in Interpretative Readings (Prose or poetry), and a miximum of two entries in Extemporaneous Speech, and two entries in Original Oratory.
- Select the following topic for Extemporaneous Speech in 1957-58. The General Topic shall be "Problems Typical of North Dakota".

- No provision will be made in 1957-58 to conduct Speech Clinics.
- 5. A series of four Discussion Festivals will be provided and the topic will be that recommended by the NUEA.

The Board next reviewed the recommendations made by the Music Committee and agreed on the following changes:

- Add to Instrumental Solos the following: English Horn, Contra-Bass Clarinet, Tympani.
- 2. Change the limits of competition to permit students above the sixth grade to compete as soloist in Class B-C Schools.
- 3. The recommendation that piano be included as a solo event was carefully reviewed and the experience of districts that had provided this competition seemed to indicate that this was not desirable. Hence, it was again the opinion of the Board that piano should not be included as a solo event in either district or state competition.

The Secretary was instructed to proceed with the publication of the "Music and Speech Handbook", and to make such changes in the present publication to incorporate the above mentioned changes.

The next order of business was the selection of dates and sites of the different basketball tournaments sponsored by the Association for the 1957-58 school term. The following dates and sites were made.

The Board next spent some time in going over the pending case brought by Harold Schafer. Mr. Fitzner, of the firm of Sproul & Fitzner, met with the Board and reported on developments to date.

The Board approved the selection of the law firm of Hjellum, Weiss, Nerison and Ottmar, to assist Sproul & Fitzner, in the defense of the Association against the Act of Prohibition filed by Mr. Schafer against the Association.

OFFICIAL HANDBOOK

The Board next spent some time considering possible appointees in filling the pending vacancies of the Board of Directors by the resignation of members, Arveson, Rue, and Slatta, all whom are leaving the state this summer. It was finally agreed to recommend Mr. Barton Thompson of Elgin to fill the unexpired term of K. L. Rue as Class B representative on the Board. Superintendent M. C. Olson was selected to fill the position of Member at Large vacated by Superintendent R. G. Arveson. Rex Robinson was selected to fill the unexpired term of J. E. Slatta as Class C representative on the Board.

The Secretary was instructed to contact the appointees to ascertain if they would accept the appointments until the next election, as provided in the Constitution of the Association.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

## MINUTES OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION MEETING

Grand Forks, North Dakota - October 18, 1956

The annual meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities As sociation was held in the gymnasium of the North Valley Junior High School, Grand Forks, North Dakota, at 2:00 P. M., October 18th. Approximately 100 member schools were represented.

The first hour was devoted to an informational program as follows: Report on the National Federation Summer Meeting by Superintendent K. L. Rue; National Federation Policies by Superintendent L. T. Havig, Vice President of the National Federation Executive Board; Speech Plans for 1956-57 by Superintendent R. G. Arveson; and Some Association Problems by E. Abrahamson, Executive Secretary of the High School Activities Association. Following the program, the business session of the Association was held.

The minutes of the previous session were waived inasmuch as they were printed in the annual Handbook and had been distributed to all member schools.

Old business was called for by President Gussner. None appeared to be forthcoming.

New business was called for. At this time, the following amendments were read for the first reading:

Amendment to Article XIII, Section I of the By-Laws, submitted by the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association, to read as follows: "A student shall have been in attendance as many school days as he has missed at the opening of the semester should his enrollment not have been made at the opening of the semester provided, however, that he shall have made such enrollment and begun regular class work prior to the twenty-third day of the semester." The

change in the above amendment is that **twenty-third day** has been substituted for the **thirty-first day** as now provided in the By-Laws. It was explained that the reason for the submission of this change was to bring the regulations of the Association in harmony with those of the State Department of Public Instruction which requires a minimum of 68 days of attendance each semester if credit is to be granted in any school. Under the terms of the Constitution and By-Laws, this amendment will be voted upon at the next regular meeting of the Association.

The Board of Directors next submitted the following amendment to Article V, Section I of the Constitution to be added: "The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or a member of his duly constituted staff designated by him, shall serve as an ex-officio member of said Board in an advisory capacity to coordinate the activities of the Association with the regulations of the State Department." Inasmuch as the above amendment is a constitutional amendment, this amendment will be presented to the member schools by a mail ballot at the same time that the regular ballot for naming members to the Board of Directors is presented.

Other new business was called for but none was presented. Several rose to make inquiries concerning certain practices of the Association but no motions were offered.

President Gussner called for the report of the Nominating Committee and the Committee reported as follows: Incumbent Arveson was nominated for the Member-At-Large. Rex Robinson of Alamo and J. E. Slatta of Sheldon were suggested for the Class C vacancies on the Board. The Nominating Committee reported that member K. L. Zenner was not eligible for reelection, having served two full terms.

Nominations were called for from the floor by President Gussner. No other name was submitted for the position of Director-At-Large and it was duly moved by R. S. Bishop of Hebron and seconded by Elvin Thompson of Sheyenne that nominations be closed. The motion was carried.

Gordon Sad of Nome submitted the name of Don Cameron of Gardner for Director from the Class C Schools. It was moved by K. E. Bachman of Bordulac and seconded by L. J. Grant of Hillsboro that nominations be closed. The motion carried.

No other business was submitted and it was moved by Grant and seconded by several that the meeting be adjourned. The motion was carried and the meeting adjourned at 3:50 P. M.

The importance of signing the score book and listing the official's registration number was also discussed.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned until after the general session when a short session was called to organize the Board for the current year.

Following the general officials' meeting, the newly elected Board met to organize itself for the coming year. Al Meyer was renamed President of the Board and Eddie Agre was named Vice-President.

It was agreed to hold the next meeting at Minot on the Friday of the Class B Tournament at 10:00 A. M.
