FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the Thirty Fourth Annual Handbook. It is with a degree of pride and satisfaction that we note that our organization is celebrating the fiftieth anniversary of its birth and that the organization has been in continuous service for a half century administering to the needs of the schools of the state of North Dakota. From a humble beginning, at a time when a high school was a forward step in any community to a well developed organization touching the lives and welfare of all the boys and girls in North Dakota from the kindergarten thru the senior year in high school in rural, town and city schools is the story of fifty years of service of what was once known as the High School League and is now entitled to use the more dignified and more appropriate title of the High School Activities Association.

The field of operation is no longer confined to interscholastic athletics. The interschool sports are just one phase of a well developed program.

Music and speech activities receive their just share of attention. Safety and health of the student within the school system is urged and advocated thru annual physical examination of students in physical education and sports. School insurance is provided for all the children in the state. The program of registering and training officials in service reaches out into the communities beyond the schools. Public relations becomes an important project thru contact with teacher training institutions and the publication of monthly bulletins distributed widely over the state to all radio and television stations and the press in addition to nearly a thousand officials.

North Dakota has been a member of the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations since 1923 and has received many benefits from this affiliation. In turn North Dakota has been duly recognized by being represented on the National Executive Committee for the past three years.

This is a happy moment in the history of the NDHS Activities Association and all of us are proud to have had a small part in its steady development.

G. W. Hanna, the first president of the League extends his greetings on this fiftieth anniversary as does L. A. White who was secretary for a period of 20 years.

A greeting from each of them follows this article.

It is desirable to mention a few of the achievements of the past year and certain events which will have an important effect on the affairs of the association in the years to come.

First and foremost is the pending court case on the eligibility of certain students who allegedly violated certain eligibility rules and were declared ineligible by the Board of Directors. Following an adverse decision in the lower court, the matter was appealed to the Supreme Court of the State of North Dakota after specific authorization from the membership of the organization at the annual meeting and after the board had been given a vote of confidence and an overwhelming vote of approval in their interpretation of the rules of the association. The association can only wait and hope that the decision will be favorable.

Significant also was the passage of two amendments to the by-laws of the association, effective with the opening of the 1958-59 school term.

High School students must now enroll before the twenty third day of a semester in order to be able to represent the school in any interscholastic

contest during the semester. Participation in invitational basketball tournaments are now limited to two and one of these must be counted in the allowable 20 games permitted during the basketball season. The abuse of the tourney privilege has made such action necessary.

✶ The past year marks the first time that a state basketball tournament has been televised on a state wide basis. The wisdom of such action on the part of the board is controversial and only time will tell whether this is a move in the right direction. Whether the time is ripe for such a move may be questioned. However it must be recognized that television is here to stay and the competition that television offers must be met and solved as was radio a quarter of a century ago. There is no doubt but what television does much to develop new sports fans and any temporary loss to television will be more than regained as time moves on.

Significant is the addition of the sport of wrestling to the high school athletic program. For the first time, North Dakota will hold a state wrestling tournament in the winter of 1959. This sport has much to offer and will become one of the major sports in North Dakota.

Another step in the right direction is the cooperation with existing state agencies. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or his designated appointee has been named to the board of directors in an ex-officio capacity. Plans are underway to change the constitution so that a representative of the School Officers Association will also be represented on the association board of directors. This change should improve relations with all school agencies and should further establish the prestige of the High School Activities Association.

The Accident Benefit Plan continues to grow and a recent survey of school administrators and school boards seems to indicate that this service is indispensable and must be continued. During the year 115,000 pupils have been enrolled in the plans and benefit payments have been made to more than 4,000 claimants. A complete report will be found elsewhere in this publication.

Perhaps the most far reaching and dramatic event of the year was "Sputnik". Not only has this event challenged mans thinking and opened new horizons, but it has also brought about the greatest criticism of American Education. Magazines have been filled with articles by critics who would scrap our system of education for that found in Russia. Fortunately those responsible for our American system of Education will not be panicked and will tenaciously hold on to those principles that have been developed over the past two hundred years and are typically American.

The reappraisal of our educational system is not all bad and will accomplish many good results. If we can keep our heads and separate the wheat from the chaff, "Sputnik" can be a blessing rather than a curse.

We must not permit our schools to deteriorate to the point where music, speech and competitive athletics are relegated to the background. We must not try to make all children in the school to be molded into the same pattern. Our desire to elevate the standards of class room teaching must be accomplished without sacrificing those activities which have come to be an integral part of our American School system. Our system is not perfect but it has withstood the tests of criticism and time. We must find a means of meeting Russias challenge without discarding that which we have found to be good.

The board of directors of the association and this office are grateful for the cooperation we have received over the past year and earnestly solicit your continued cooperation in the coming year. We are thankful for the help given by individuals and groups and are always mindful that an enterprise of this magnitude can not be carried out without much

voluntary help. May our organization enjoy another half century of leadership in educational work in the state and continue to serve the thousands of boys and girls who are Americas hope for the future.

MESSAGE FROM THE FIRST PRESIDENT

Congratulations to the Association on having rounded out a half century of great usefulness.

At the opening of the century, the whole make-up of the American high school was in the formative stage. North Dakota high schools were just coming to life, and we who were on the scene were groping our way toward the light in every conceivable phase of the high school make-up. The curricular field was wholly undefined, the extra-curricular was undiscovered, and inter-school competition was unborn. North Dakota hadn't a single building for high school alone, a high school gymnasium, or an athletic field.

In 1903 we built that first high school and gymnasium, and organized our first athletic teams. My own basketball team was the first one I had ever seen. When a few other schools developed teams we began to have games with each other; but our lack of knowledge, lack of leadership and lack of equipment occasionally gave us problems, along with the pleasures and benefits of such competition.

Out of these experiences the North Dakota High School League was born, to stimulate interscholastic competition, to enable us to avoid the pitfalls of such competition and to guide us toward the attainment of all the higher values. The success has been magnificent.

In a narrow sense this League had for its purpose, the setting forth and enforcing certain rules pertaining to inter-school athletic events. And as such, it did indeed perform a significant function.

But the men in whose hands the destiny of the High School League rested, recognized even in the early days that the high school was becoming more and more "the people's college", for "all the children of all the people". And the League gradually became more than an organization to enforce negative rules; it became a definite factor in challenging the meaning of secondary education in many expanding directions.

And who can measure the tremendous impetus this State Organization has had not alone in the field of sportsmanlike athletics, but in the cultural fields of music, debate and drama.

These are tremendously challenging days in education, and particularly so in the field of secondary education. And there is reason to hope that the N.D.H.S.A.A. may more and more draw the best thinking of the educators of the State together in unity of planning, and with an ability to be openminded toward all worthy new changes, while standing firm for all that has been proven good.

The board next examined the Audit Report as submitted by the Ludvigson Accounting Service of Valley City and it was duly moved and seconded and carried that the report be accepted.

It was moved by Olson and seconded by Thompson and carried that the secretary be authorized to invest \$7,000.00 in a Certificate of Deposit at 3% interest with the First National Bank of Valley City and \$5,000.00 in a Certificate of Deposit at 3% with the American National Bank of Valley City.

The next order of business was the opening of bids for basketballs for the district, regional and state basketball tournaments. It was found that the bid of the Sioux Sporting Goods Company of Bismarck, for the RSS Rawlings Basketball at \$14.39 per ball F. O. B. Bismarck, was the low bid. It was duly moved by Killie and seconded by Thompson that the bid of the Sioux Sporting Goods Company be accepted. The motion was carried.

Attorneys Sproul of Valley City and Nerison of Jamestown met with the board to bring the board up to date on the recent court case and to advise them of any further action in the case. No signed order from the court had been received up to this time and hence no appeal could be made until official order was forthcoming on which to base an appeal. The consensus of the board was that an appeal probably should be made. The immediate need appeared to be to get publicity out to the member schools and the general public on the facts of the case. Some time was spent on a news release to be printed in the Activities Bulletin for September. The board agreed on the contents of this news release and the secretary was instructed to get this news release in the September Bulletin.

It was also agreed that when the official court order was received that the board would call a special meeting to decide on any further action in the case.

It was also agreed that the hour program allotted the Association during the N. D. E. A. be largely devoted to the review of the court case and a review of current eligibility rules. The following program was tentatively agreed upon:

Relation of the State Department to the High School Activities Association; M. F. Peterson, Superintendent of Public Instruction.

Development of Eligibility Rules: E. Abrahamson, Executive Secretary, High School Activities Association.

History of the present court action against the Association: E. S. Killie, Member of Board of Directors.

The possibility of a series of regional association meetings was discussed at length and it was agreed to call a series of four meetings this fall in connection with the Cheerleaders Clinics. The sites for these meetings would be Dickinson, Minot, Devils Lake and Valley City on the same days that the Cheerleaders Clinics would be held in the respective cities. The program at each regional meeting would be left flexible to cover the specific problems of interest to those attending. Eligibility problems, Rules Interpretations, the Association Program, School Insurance Program, were suggested as possible topics for the regional meetings.

The board next examined several Accident Benefit Claims and made final disposition of them as follows:

Colleen Shannon claim of Alexander High School was rejected as it was for an injury alleged to have occurred as a result of an injury in February of 1955. It was the opinion of the board that this claim should be outlawed because of the lapse of time since the original injury.

Richard Anderson of Park River Grade School claim was allowed for a flat allowance of \$250.00 for the loss of sight in one eye.

Duane Nordrum of Benson County Aggies should be allowed in accordance with allowance as per schedule of benefits for the regular plan and also an allowance as per schedule under the casualty plan. This case was subsequently paid for \$701.75 to close the case.

The board examined the contracts for the use of the Minot City Auditorium for the Regional and State Class B tournament scheduled in that city in March 1958 and ordered them approved.

It was agreed to renew the contract with the Anchor Casualty Company of St. Paul for Personal Liability and Property Damage Insurance on the association sponsored activities for the current fiscal year.

The board reviewed the eligibility of a Meier lad of Napoleon. This lad had moved with his mother to Fargo in the fall of 1956 where she established a home. The lad attended Shanley High School in 1956-57 and played on the Shanley High School teams. This spring the mother moved back to Napoleon and has lived there since. The boy planned to enter Napoleon High School this fall. It also appeared that the mother planned to return to Fargo for a period of about ten weeks later this fall to complete some courses at the A. C. However, she did not plan to resume housekeeping at Fargo but planned to room at one of the dormitories for this short period of time. It was the opinion of the board that Mrs. Meier had reestablished her home at Napoleon by moving back last June and that the lad should be immediately eligible at Napoleon since her home would still be at Napoleon when school opened this fall. Change of residence on the part of the parent in this case satisfies our transfer rule and is sufficient grounds for transferring schools without the usual penalty of loss of eligibility for eighteen weeks.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned with the understanding that a special meeting of the board would be called upon receipt of the official court order in the recent court case. This special meeting would be called for purpose of making a decision on the appeal.

**MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION
Minot, North Dakota - October 16, 1957**

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the offices of the Chamber of Commerce in Minot on Wednesday afternoon October 16th with all members of the board present.

The minutes of the August session of the board were approved on motion of Havig and second by Cameron.

Coach Art Hovde, of the Minot High School, met with the board to obtain approval of a series of basketball games to be played at Minot on December 27-28 with Bismarck, North Dakota, Rapid City, South Dakota and DeLaSalle High School of Minneapolis. It was explained that this was not to be a tournament but merely an arrangement wherein different high schools would be matched against one of the other schools without regard to the results of the first evening games. After discussing this at some length, the board agreed to sanction the games with the understanding that Minot would not request approval for some future series in Minneapolis in another year.

The board studied the financial report showing the receipts and disbursements from July 1 to October 14, 1957. It was moved by Killie and seconded by Thompson that current funds of the Accident Benefit Fund, not needed at the present time in the amount of \$40,000.00, be invested with the Fidelity Savings and Loan Association of Valley City for the final quarter of 1957. The motion prevailed.

The investment policy carried on by the secretary was outlined and discussed and it was moved by Havig and seconded by Robinson that the present investment policies be continued until again considered by the board. The motion was carried.

The board next considered possible representatives to attend the National Football Rules Committee meeting in Lexington, Kentucky, in early January, and the NDEA sessions on debate at Chicago in late December. It was agreed to name Coach Woody Wilson of the Bismarck High School to attend the National Football Rules Committee meeting. Board members Barton Thompson was designated to attend the NDEA meeting on debate in Chicago. Each delegate was to be instructed to file a report of the meeting upon his return from the meetings.

The next order of business was the reading of applications for approval of coaches that did not fully meet the association requirements for coaches. After considering the particular problems of the schools concerned, it was moved by Olson and seconded by Cameron that a temporary approval be given Hoople and Versippi Schools for coaches to be employed during the 1957-58 school term. The motion was carried.

District Class B assignments were made of the following schools whose enrollments had increased to the point where they were obliged to play in the Class B tournament organization:

Page High School was assigned to District 3, Class B.

Center High School was assigned to District 14, Class B.

Gackle High School was assigned to District 13, Class B.

The secretary then read a letter from Thomas Workman, of Lidgerwood, representing the Wild Rice Conference of High Schools, expressing confidence in the Board of Directors of the Association in their interpretations of the eligibility rules and giving the board their moral support in

the court case versus Shafer. This vote of confidence had been unanimously passed by the members of the conference. The letter was ordered placed on file.

The board policy on radio broadcasts of tournaments was reviewed and the problems of radio broadcasts was aired for more than an hour. The problems appeared to settle around the following points:

1. Filing an intent to broadcast and failure to show up.
2. Abuse of the courtesy pass provision.
3. Too many stations wishing to broadcast certain games or tournaments.

It was suggested that the radio stations had an organization called the North Dakota Radio Broadcasting Association and possibly some solution could be worked out by contacting them for their own suggestions. The secretary was instructed to make contact with the association and report back to the board with any suggestions they might offer to alleviate the problems.

The next item of business was possible ways of handling the telecasting of tournament games. It appeared that the North Dakota Broadcasting Company and also KNOX of Grand Forks were interested in live telecasts of games originating at the Grand Forks Class A tourney and possibly other tournaments. No solution to the telecast problem appeared to be at hand until additional information was received from the two concerns.

The secretary was instructed to contact both concerns and obtain their suggestions on the following possibilities and report back to the board:

1. The possibility of both stations telecasting over a state wide network.
2. The possibility of submitting bids for exclusive right to telecast the games.
3. The possibility of a joint telecast over both net-works using the same camera and equipment for all telecasts.

The board next directed its attention to possible requirements to be set up for officials contracted to work the various regional and state basketball tournaments. Some discussion was had on the conduct of officials during the tournament. While it was felt that possibly the North Dakota Officials Board of Directors should take the initiative in working out a Code of Ethics for Officials, a good start would be to obtain the Montana Code for examination and study.

The matter of trips to members of the winning tournament teams was discussed by the board. The present rules prohibit trips financed by colleges and universities but apparently do not prohibit such trips when promoted by local fans. No action was taken at this time, but the opinion was expressed that some attention should be directed to amending the by-laws to prohibit trips to tournament teams financed from any and all sources.

The secretary reported that there were two vacancies in the assignment of officials at the State Class C tournament at Jamestown and one vacancy in the Class C regional tourney at Lisbon. Appointments were made as follows:

State Class C, Jamestown: Joe Ford of Jamestown and Paul Vance of Hannaford.

Class C Regional, Lisbon: Gerald Zinck of Valley City.

The meeting adjourned to be called following the Annual Association meeting on Thursday.

The board reconvened following the adjournment of the annual meeting.

It was duly moved by Killie and seconded by Olson that in view of the overwhelming support given by the schools at the annual meeting, both in the interpreting of rules and regulations of the Association and the unanimous vote of confidence of the group in endorsing the stand the board had taken in the conduct of the Shafer case, that the attorneys be advised to appeal the case to the Supreme Court of the State of North Dakota, and to proceed with such details as are necessary to set the appeal in motion. The motion was carried unanimously.

The meeting was then adjourned.

NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION
Valley City, North Dakota - December 21, 1957**

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the association office at Valley City, North Dakota, to consider bids for the telecasting of 1958 State and Divisional Basketball Tournaments. All members except Rex Robinson were present.

Bids were submitted by the Meyer Broadcasting Company of Bismarck, North Dakota, for telecasting the West Class A Basketball Tournament at Bismarck, North Dakota, on March 6-7-8, 1958, over stations KFJR-TV, KMOT-TV, and KUMV-TV for a sum of \$350.00 on an exclusive basis.

Bid of KNOX-TV of Grand Forks, North Dakota for the right to telecast games at the State Class A Tournament at Grand Forks, North Dakota on March 13-14-15, 1958, over station KNOX-TV for the sum of \$100.00 per game with a minimum of five games to be telecast.

The bid of the North Dakota Broadcasting Company as follows:

1. Eastern Class A. This bid is for the exclusive rights for KXJB-TV Channel 4, Valley City, only - \$801.00 for all games, with the right of telecasting not more than four games, in which instance we bid a minimum of \$601.00.

2. Western Class A. This bid is in behalf of KBMB-TV Bismarck, KCJB-TV Minot, KDIX-TV Dickinson, for which we bid for all games \$1,051.00, with the option to carry no more than four games, but in which instance we bid a minimum of \$601.00.

3. State Class A. This bid is in behalf of station KXJB-TV Valley City, KBMB-TV Bismarck, KDIX-TV Dickinson, KCJB-TV Minot. Our bid for all games is \$1,401.00, with the option to carry no more than four games, but in which instance we bid a minimum of \$901.00.

4. State Class B. This bid is for stations KCJB-TV Minot, KBMB-TV Bismarck, KDIX-TV Dickinson, for which we bid \$1,051.00 for all games, with the option to carry no more than four games, but in which instance we bid a minimum of \$601.00.

The bids herein represent a minimum guarantee of \$2,704.00, regardless of the number of games telecast in all tournaments. With the options included to telecast all games of all tournaments, our bid would total \$4,304.00.

The bids offered herein are not offered as individual bids, but as a group bid for the exclusive rights to all tournaments or none.

Certified checks of \$500.00 accompanied the bids of the Meyer Broadcasting Company and the North Dakota Broadcasting Company.

After due consideration of all bids it was duly moved by Thompson and seconded by Killie that the bid of the North Dakota Broadcasting Company be accepted. The motion was carried and the secretary instructed to draw up contracts for the telecasts as outlined in the bid of the North Dakota Broadcasting Company.

Members Olson, Killie, Cameron together with President Gussner were named to the insurance committee of the board.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

**MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION
Bismarck, North Dakota - January 26, 1958**

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at Bismarck on January 26, 1958, with all members present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Canvassing Committee consisting of Killie, Cameron and Gussner reported the following results of the mail ballot for officers of the association.

For Member at large: M. C. Olson.....220 votes

For Class A representative:

L. T. Havig.....203 votes

F. U. Smith.....185 votes

For Class B representative:

Barton Thompson.....203 votes

For Class C representative:

Rex Robinson.....228 votes

The committee reported that there were several write-in votes giving votes to several different men but not enough to be significant. It was duly moved by Havig and seconded by Thompson that the report of the Canvassing Committee be accepted and members M. C. Olson, L. T. Havig, F. U. Smith, Barton Thompson and Rex Robinson be declared elected to the Board of Directors of the Association.

A committee from the State Association of Radio Broadcasters met with the board to review present policies relative to the broadcast of the various state and regional basketball tournaments. Radio policies had previously been discussed at the fall meeting of the Board of Directors and the committee from the Radio Broadcasters had also surveyed its members for suggestions to improve present rules and regulations relating to radio broadcasts. After a general discussion for more than an hour with suggestions from L. N. Hanson, Grand Forks, State Class A Manager, the following suggestions were agreed upon to be incorporated into the policies affecting radio broadcasts of tournament which are to be sent to all radio broadcasters.

In the event that more requests for permission to broadcast tourney games were received than building facilities or lines permitted then the

following order of preferences should be used to guide the tourney manager in granting requests to broadcast:

1. Preference should be given to stations located in the city where the tourney broadcast originates.
2. Preference should be given to those stations which indicate their intent to broadcast the entire tournament as against a station that intends to broadcast only a few games of the tournament.
3. Preference should be given to those stations which have a record of broadcasting tournaments in past years.
4. Preference should be given to those stations located in a city that have a home team playing in the tournament.

It was agreed that radio stations would file a preliminary letter of their intent to broadcast a part or all of a given tournament and that this letter should be followed by a definite commitment of the games to be broadcast at a given tournament on the Monday preceding the tournament on forms to be provided by the secretary of the association.

It was duly moved by Killie and seconded by Olson that the above procedure be followed beginning with the coming regional and state basketball tournaments. The motion was carried.

It was agreed to call a meeting on February 8th of the Track Committee to make any recommendations in the present minimum standards in use to qualify for the state track meet and also to review the present regulations which apply to district and state track meets.

It was also agreed to call a meeting of the Accident Benefit Committee of the board to meet in Valley City on March 1st to review benefit schedules and rates to become effective for the 1958-59 school year.

The work of both these committees would be reviewed at the next meeting of the board.

The secretary reported on the Mutual Aid Pact of the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations and the request of Secretary Porter that North Dakota provide a minimum of 100 briefs of the arguments in the case of Shafer vs the North Dakota High School Activities Association before the district and the state Supreme Court. The secretary also reported that the National Federation would assist the North Dakota Activities Association in the cost of appealing this case to the Supreme Court of the state. It was agreed on motion of Havig and seconded by Killie to provide the Federation with the desired copies of the briefs.

Barton Thompson reported orally on his assignment as delegate to the N. U. E. A. debate meeting in Chicago on December 28-29, 1957. A complete written copy of this report was provided for each board member.

The board next examined the schedule of basketball officials fees recommended by the North Dakota Officials Executive Board and adopted by the North Dakota Officials Association for season games. It was noted that the state of Montana had also adopted a recommended schedule of fees for games in the different classes of schools and that this adoption was made jointly by the Montana Activities Association and the Montana Officials Association.

It was duly moved by Robinson and seconded by Olson that the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association do adopt and accept the following recommended schedule of basketball officials fees for the state of North Dakota for seasons games:

Apprentice:

\$ 5.00 per game for Class C games plus \$2.50 for preliminary game.
\$ 7.50 per game for Class B games plus \$2.50 for preliminary game.
\$10.00 per game for Class A games plus \$5.00 for preliminary game.

Approved or Certified Officials:

\$ 7.50 per game for Class C games plus \$2.50 for preliminary game.
\$10.00 per game for Class B games plus \$2.50 for preliminary game.
\$12.50 per game for Class A games plus \$5.00 for preliminary game.

The motion was carried.

The following were appointed to present trophies at the 1958 basketball tournaments:

State Class A, Grand Forks.....Gussner and Havig
State Class B, Minot.....Olson and Thompson
State Class C, Jamestown.....Cameron and Robinson
State Girls', Valley City.....Robinson and Cameron

It was agreed that the next meeting of the Board of Directors would be at Minot, North Dakota, on Friday morning 9:30 A. M., March 21, 1958.

The secretary distributed a report showing the receipts and disbursements of the association during the current fiscal year up to January 23, 1958.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

Minot, North Dakota - March 21, 22, 1958

The board met in the offices of the Minot Chamber of Commerce with all members present except L. T. Havig. Mr. Havig was present for the meeting on Saturday morning.

The first order of business was a review of the recommendations of the Committee on the Accident Benefit Fund. The committee had recommended a revision of benefit payments to bring them more in harmony with those recommended by the medical profession and used by the Blue Shield in the State of North Dakota. Rates, or fees, were also to be revised to provide for a greater income to meet the increased demands on the fund. The committee also reported that they had been working with a committee from the dental profession to set up a dental schedule more in harmony with that suggested by that profession.

A survey of the schools indicating their attitude toward increased benefits and increased rates was also reviewed.

After considerable time had been spent on this problem it was duly moved by Killie and seconded by Olson that the board adopt a revised schedule of benefits and rates as recommended by the committee. The motion was carried.

The secretary read a letter from Mr. L. R. Herkimer, of Dallas, Texas, in which he reported that he was saving October 20, 21, 22, 23, 1958 for Cheerleaders Clinics in North Dakota. After discussing the problem, it was moved by Olson and seconded by Killie that four Cheerleaders Clinics be arranged in North Dakota next fall. The motion was carried. Suggested sites for these clinics were Williston, Bismarck, Devils Lake or Rugby, and Valley City.

The problem of grade basketball tournaments, in which non-members were participating, was discussed at length. It was agreed that non-eligible grade schools, who participate in grade tournaments with member schools, should be required to observe the same eligibility rules as our member schools, and that managers of tournaments, inviting grade schools who were not eligible for association membership, should place this requirement in the invitation to participate.

It was duly moved by Thompson and seconded by Robinson that the calendar project be continued in 1958-59 and that the secretary be authorized to proceed with the project.

The board then proceeded to organize itself for the coming year beginning July 1, 1958. E. S. Killie was named as president of the board and L. T. Havig was selected as vice-president, effective July 1.

It was moved by Robinson and seconded by Thompson that M. C. Olson and Don Cameron be named as delegates to the summer federation meeting in Santa Barbara, California, in June of 1958 and that Olson be the voting delegate and Cameron the alternate. The motion was carried.

The board then adjourned so that the Class B members of the board could meet with the committee on basketball which was meeting at the same time in another building.

The board resumed their meetings at 9:00 A. M., Saturday, with all members present.

The board reviewed the eligibility cases of Hamilton, Thompson, Reynolds, Erie and Lisbon and it was duly moved, seconded and carried that the board do approve the action of the secretary in disposing of these cases as reported in the monthly Bulletin.

It was agreed to continue the annual subsidy of \$150.00 to the State Science Fair and to the North Dakota Physical Education and Recreational Association and the secretary was instructed to issue a warrant to these organizations.

The board next considered the advisability of amending the constitution of the North Dakota High School Activities Association in such a manner that a school board member from a member school selected by the North Dakota School Officers be named to the board of directors of the association. It was moved by Thompson and seconded by Olson that member Killie and the secretary be named a committee of two to draw such an amendment and submit to the board at the next meeting.

The matter of football and basketball clinics for the 1958-59 school year was discussed and it was agreed to again sponsor a series of clinics. The secretary was instructed to draw plans and engage clinic leaders for these clinics. Bismarck, Minot, Williston, Dickinson, Jamestown and Grand Forks were suggested as sites for the football clinics. Williston, Dickinson, Bismarck, Minot, Valley City, Rugby, Grand Forks, Jamestown, and Langdon were suggested as possible sites for the basketball clinics.

It was moved, seconded and carried that proceeds from television be added to the gross receipts at the tournaments that were telecast and the distribution of such addition to the gate receipts be made in the same manner as other receipts.

Ed Odermann of Dickinson, representing the Amateur Baseball Congress, met with the board and displayed a baseball rule book in pictures and explained the different uses this publication could serve. It was moved by Killie and seconded by Olson that the secretary order 100 copies of

this publication and distribute one to each team that registered for the baseball program. The motion was carried.

The sport of wrestling was reviewed and member Havig gave a detailed report of the success of the invitational wrestling tournament that was sponsored by Williston High School in February. It was the consensus of the board that wrestling was a wholesome sport and had possibilities if properly encouraged. It was moved by Killie and seconded by Robinson that a State Wrestling Tournament be promoted and sponsored by the association in 1958-59 school year with Williston as a site, provided a minimum of 16 schools indicated an interest and a willingness to enter the event and that a committee consisting of Havig and Robinson be appointed to work out the details and report at the June meeting of the board. The motion was carried.

The members of the Board of Directors of the North Dakota Officials Association met with the board and suggested that the fees paid basketball officials at the state and regional tournaments be evaluated and increased. They also reported that they were adopting a code of ethics for their association. The matter of officials fees was subsequently considered by the board and the following schedule of fees was adopted for the 1959 basketball tournaments:

The fees for the State A, State B, State C, and the East and West Class A, and the four Class B Regionals, shall be set at \$20.00 per game plus expenses. The Class C Regional and the State Girls' Tournament shall be set at \$15.00 per game and expenses.

The board next considered the salary of the secretary and upon motion of Olson and second by Cameron, it was agreed to adjust the salary of the secretary to \$8,700 per annum beginning July 1, 1958.

It was moved by Thompson and seconded by Havig that Olson and Cameron be appointed a committee to study the possibility of a retirement fund for employees and report to the board after attending the National Federation meeting. The motion was carried.

It was agreed to hold the next meeting of the board on Thursday, June 5th, 9:00 A. M. at Valley City.

The board adjourned to meet at a luncheon meeting at noon on Saturday to hear the report of Norman Hanson of Carrington, Secretary of the Special Committee on Class B and A reorganization.

Mr. Hanson reported orally on the procedure of the committee and filed the following report of the findings of the committee:

Minot, N. Dak.
March 22, 1958

The committee from Class B schools met at Minot in the YMCA building at 9:30 A. M. for the purpose of considering various basketball plans. Present were: E. C. Johnson, Kenmare, chairman; N. H. Hanson, Carrington, secretary; O. Tufte, Mott, vice-chairman; R. Goheen, Ashley; J. T. Carlson, Lakota; L. Grant, Hillsboro; F. Marsden, Milnor; E. Loe, New Town; M. McCrea, Valley City, Class A; J. Maxwell, Grafton, Class A; A. Gullickson, Jamestown, Class A; T. Simle, Bismarck, Class A.

Reports were given by district representatives which varied from one plan to another.

Earl Abrahamson explained the present class setup.

It was explained by Class A representatives that no change was felt necessary in the basketball setup and a further clarification was made concerning the East-West conference system of voting on membership.

Mr. Tufte made these points:

1. That a general dissatisfaction exists.
2. That there is no statewide interest in the tourney except by the people directly concerned.
3. That regular season games between teams of various classes would result in financial loss.
4. That a chance at a state title should be provided.
5. That the East-West conference should not be disturbed.

A series of ten suggestions was drawn up as follows with the order in which they were eliminated by vote shown at the left:

- 4 1. Leave present system as is.
- 3 2. Tufte plan - 4 top A and 4 top B.
- 9 3. Present 16 A plus 4 largest B schools make up Class A.
- 8 4. Make Class A top 16 schools conforming to the constitution.
- 7 5. Double AA with top 8 teams in one class plus next 16 on basis of size.
- 2 6. Marsden plan - 32 largest schools by virtue of population put in Class A.
- 10 7. Put in Class A all schools which are larger than the smallest existing Class A which at the moment is 225.
- 1 8. Leave Class A as it is.
- 6 9. That all present Class B and Class A with the East-West conference to remain a separate entity within that structure and present class C be designated Class B.
- 5 10. Integrate 4 A sectional winners and runners-up and 4 regional B winners in one state tournament - thus eliminating the present A and B tourney.

The order of elimination showed that item 7 was last to be eliminated.

There was a motion by Lars Grant that we adopt No. 7 with the recommendation that it not be mandatory but make any school eligible to apply for membership in Class A if enrollment is between 225 and 300 with the Board of Control to approve or disapprove the entry. Second by Mr. Marsden.

There was an amendment by J. T. Carlson that any school over 300 be forced to enter Class A. E. Loe seconded. The vote on the amendment was 6 for and 4 against which negative note included 2 Class A participants. The vote on the motion was 5 yeas and 5 against with the negative note again including 2 Class A representatives. Since the vote was 5 to 3 by B schools the chairman declared the motion carried.

The secretary was ordered to report the results to the board of control and the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS **NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION** **Valley City, North Dakota - June 5, 1958**

The board of directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the office of the association on June 5th with all members present. The board reviewed the recommendations of the Music

Committee and agreed to adopt the following changes in the organization plan for the 1958-59 Music Festivals and Contests for Class B and C schools:

- a. Permit each school to enter three boys and three girls in vocal solos instead of two boys and girls as was in effect last year.
- b. Increase the size of instrumental ensembles three to 9 members instead of 3 to 6 members as was in effect last year.
- c. Adopt a rating system of I-II-III-IV without reference to Highly Superior, Superior, Excellent or Good.
- d. Raise the entry fees for all solos to seventy five cents from fifty cents and one act plays from \$2.50 to \$3.00.
- e. Adopt the new adjudicator sheet as worked out by the Music Educators group.

The board next reviewed the recommendations of the Speech Committee and agreed to the following changes:

- a. Adopt a rating system of I-II-III-IV as is used in music above.
- b. Raise the entry fee for readings from fifty cents to seventy five cents and one act plays from \$2.50 to \$3.00.
- c. Adopt the general topic of "Modern Teen Age Problems" for extempo speech.
- d. Drop Discussion as an association sponsored speech event for 1958-59 but permit any college or high school to conduct an invitational Discussion Festival if desired.

The possibility of another music and speech district at Ellendale was discussed and it now appears that Ellendale is interested in making that city a district center. It was duly moved by Olson and seconded by Thompson that this new center be authorized. The motion was carried.

It was moved by Havig and seconded by Thompson that the State Class B-C Music and Speech Contest be held at Minot STC on May 2, 1959. The motion was carried.

The dates for the Class A Music and Speech events were reviewed and accepted as drawn up by a committee of a year ago except that where an event was scheduled for a Thursday and Friday such events be changed to a Friday and Saturday.

It was also suggested that the West A Instrumental be held at Mandan if possible.

Supt. Barthel of Hoople met with the board to seek approval of Mr. Paul Fedge at athletic coach of the Hoople High School for the 1958-59 basketball season. It was agreed that, if the position could not otherwise be filled by August 15th that approval be made for this year only on the part time basis and upon the understanding that no similar request would be made a year hence.

Members Havig, Killie and Robinson were named to a committee of the board to make recommendations for officials for the different basketball tournaments at the August meeting of the board.

The matter of a track clinic for 1959 was discussed at some length and it was agreed to try two clinics, one at Minot and the other at Jamestown on April 3-4, 1959 to better cover the state. The secretary was instructed to secure a clinic leader to take both clinics.

The problem of late entrance at track meets and the mounting costs of track to the association was explored at some length and it was moved

by Thompson and seconded by Killie that an entry fee of fifty cents per man be charged each school participating in the district track meets and that this entry fee be paid prior to the district meet as a qualifying condition for entering the meet. The motion carried.

The financial report of the association general and AABF Fund were examined by the board and it was agreed to assess the AABF Fund five percent for administration and transfer this amount to the general fund of the association.

The question of paying Chiropractors for their services was explored by the board and it was agreed to make them eligible for payment for their services under the same restrictions that apply to medical services under the direction of a MD. No payment is to be made in either situation for physiotherapy or ultra-sonic treatments or x-ray therapy. Further the patient must decide whether he wished to be treated by a Chiropractor or a Medical Doctor and could not collect a benefit payment from both sources.

The board next proceeded to set up basketball tournament sites and dates. The following schedule of basketball tournaments was approved for 1959:

It was agreed to hold the next meeting of the board on August 22nd at 9:00 A. M. at Valley City with the officials committee meeting on the 21st to make their recommendations for officials for the different tournaments.

The members of the board expressed their appreciation of the services of President Gussner on the board of directors for the past six years and who now was retiring from active service on the board.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

ANNUAL MEETING

NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

McFarland Auditorium, S. T. C.

Minot, North Dakota - October 17, 1957

The annual meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held in McFarland Auditorium on Thursday afternoon, October 17, 1957. The non-business portion of the meeting was called to order at 2:00 P. M. and the following program was given:

Address on the Relation of the Association to the State Department of Public Instruction - Richard Klein, Director Secondary Education.
Talk on Survey of Eligibility Rules of Other States - Secretary Earl Abrahamson.

Factual Review of the court case - Shafer vs the Officers of the Association and the Superintendents of Fargo, Bismarck, and Jamestown - Superintendent E. S. Killie.

This was perhaps the largest group to attend an annual meeting and more than 225 schools were represented.

The business meeting of the association was called to order at 3:45 P. M. It was moved by Van Der Hoeven of Fillmore and seconded by Reitan of Cando that inasmuch as the minutes of the previous session were printed in the Annual Handbook, that their reading be waived, and that they be adopted as printed in the Annual Handbook. The motion prevailed.

The first order of business was the second reading of the amendments to the by-laws. Amendment of Article XIII, Section I, to read as follows:

A STUDENT SHALL HAVE BEEN IN ATTENDANCE AS MANY SCHOOL DAYS AS HE MISSED AT THE OPENING OF THE SEMESTER, SHOULD HIS ENROLLMENT NOT HAVE BEEN MADE AT THE OPENING OF THE SEMESTER, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT HE SHALL HAVE MADE SUCH ENROLLMENT AND BEGUN REGULAR CLASS WORK PRIOR TO THE TWENTY-THIRD DAY OF THE SEMESTER.

It was duly moved by L. Grant of Hillsboro and seconded by C. S. Bjorlie of Minot Model High School that this amendment be adopted. All

members voted yes and the chair ruled that this amendment was duly and carried by unanimous vote.

Article XII, Section 2, Paragraph C, to read as follows:

TOTAL GAMES PLAYED SHALL NOT EXCEED THE NUMBER OF WEEKS CONSTITUTING THE SEASON. TOURNAMENT GAMES IN THE ASSOCIATION SPONSORED PLAY-OFF SERIES, PLUS THOSE IN ONE OTHER TOURNAMENT, SHALL NOT COUNT IN THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF GAMES PERMITTED.

It was moved by Arneson of Edinburg and seconded by Bishop of Hazen that this amendment be adopted. The motion was carried unanimously and the amendment was declared passed.

Article XII, Section 2, add Paragraph F as follows:

NO TEAM OR INDIVIDUAL PLAYER SHALL BE PERMITTED TO PLAY IN MORE THAN TWO TOURNAMENTS PER SEASON IN ADDITION TO THOSE IN THE PLAY-OFF SERIES SPONSORED BY THE ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION.

It was moved by Bangs of Bottineau and seconded by Branchaud of St. John that this amendment be approved. The motion was carried unanimously and the amendment was declared adopted.

President Gussner announced that inasmuch as schedules had been largely made for the current basketball season, that all the above amendments would become effective on July 1st which is the beginning of the next fiscal year.

The Chair next called for the report of the nominating committee, consisting of Tate of Maddock, Neff of Mandan and Zenner of Arthur. The committee reported the following nominations:

For Class A members to the Board of Directors: L. T. Havig of Williston, F. U. Smith of Park River.

For Member-at-large to fill unexpired term of R. G. Arveson: M. C. Olson of Lisbon.

For Class B representative to the board for unexpired term of K. L. Rue: Barton Thompson of Elgin.

For Class C representative to the board for unexpired term of J. E. Slatta: Rex Robinson of Alamo.

The report of the nominating committee was accepted and placed on file. The Chair called for nominations from the floor for the Class A positions. None were offered and it was moved by Grant and seconded by Berger that nominations for Class A vacancies on the board be closed. The motion was carried.

Nominations were opened for the member-at-large position from the floor. None were offered. It was moved by Eberly and seconded by Roberts that nominations be closed for candidates for the position as representative-at-large. The motion was carried.

Nominations were called for the vacancy as Class B representative. None was offered. It was moved by Bishop and seconded by Rindt that nominations be closed for this position. The motion was carried.

Nominations were called for the position as Class C representative. None was offered and on motion of Bachman and second by Bye nominations were closed and the motion carried.

The Chair then reported that the usual procedure of election by mail ballot, as provided for in the constitution and by-laws, would be followed.

The Chair then called for any new business to come before this meeting.

It was moved by Blikre and seconded by DeForge that the Association go on record endorsing the Board in the recent court case and specifically authorize the Board to take any further action that the Board deems necessary. The Chair called for any discussion on the motion. Peckham moved that the motion be amended to read that the Board be authorized to expend such association funds as necessary to finance the appeal. There was an expression of several that the Board already had that authority and the amendment was withdrawn. After a call for further discussion, the question was called for and passed without a dissenting vote. The Chair declared the motion carried unanimously.

It was then moved by Rindt that the Association go on record indicating its approval of the interpretations of the rules and regulations as made by the Board of Directors. The motion was seconded by Totdahl. After a discussion the question was called for and the motion was carried unanimously. The Chair then declared the motion carried.

Tufte of Mott asked for the floor to present a new organization plan for a combined final tournament in basketball with both Class A and Class B. Mr. Tufte explained that it was not his intent to have the plan acted upon at this meeting but rather to present it for study with a view of adoption at some later time. The copy of the plan was accepted and placed on file. It was then moved by Marsden and seconded by Hanson that a committee of eight, two from each Class B region of the state, be appointed to meet with representatives of Class A to study the plan and make such recommendations as they see fit to the membership. The motion was carried.

No further business was offered and it was moved by several that this meeting be now adjourned. The meeting was adjourned at 4:45 P. M.

It was moved by Miller and seconded by Grande that the following schedule of basketball officiating fees be recommended to the Association and to the High School Activities Association for joint adoption, to become effective with the 1958-59 school season.

An apprentice official is defined as a registered official who has not attained a certified or approved rating.

An approved official is defined as an official who has had at least one years experience and has passed the test at least once in a two year period with a grade of 75% and who has worked a minimum of ten games.

A certified official is defined as an official who has had at least two years experience in officiating and has worked a minimum of twenty games and has passed the basketball test at least once in two years with a grade of 85%.

The motion was duly carried and it was agreed to submit the above schedule of fees to the association meeting on Saturday morning for approval and also request the High School Activities Association to adopt the schedule.

The secretary reported that the National Federation had provided a National Emblem for officials registered with the association and authorized each state to set up the requirements to be eligible to wear the emblem.

It was agreed that the emblem should be given to those officials who qualified as an approved or certified official in accordance with the above definition.

It was duly moved by Hammond and seconded by Agre that this board recommend to the High School Activities Association that the minimum fee for officiating all Class B regionals, Class A divisional tournaments and all state tournaments be set at \$100.00 and that the officials working the extra game be paid the regular per game price for the extra game in addition to this minimum. The motion was carried.

It was moved by Grande and seconded by Hammond that recommended mileage for traveling to and from tourney sites be set at eight cents per mile for the driver and two cents per mile for the official who may be riding with the driver. The motion was carried.

The board spent some time discussing a Code of Ethics for officials. The Montana Code was distributed to the group. It was the consensus that the association should have a code and it was agreed that the board would draft such a code to be adopted at the March meeting of the board.

After informally discussing matters of interest, the board adjourned to meet following the general meeting on Saturday and elect the officers for the coming year.

 9. To attend rules meetings, clinics, and take the rules tests as prescribed by the state association.
7. The Official Board meet with the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association on Saturday morning and discussed fees for officiating the various state tournaments and the clinics for the coming season.
