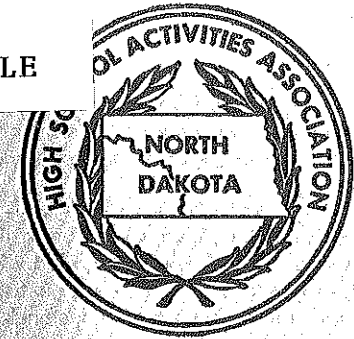

FORWARD

The thirty-fifth annual handbook of the North Dakota high School Activities Association is hereby presented to members and others interested in the program of the Association.

In the following pages will be found a brief summary of the activities of the Association during the past year. Figures and facts do not always tell the whole story and while the casual reader may obtain much information of a factual and statistical nature, yet this yearbook may not show many important milestones of growth unless specific mention is made of significant events not usually recorded in a volume of this nature.

Perhaps one of the important events of the year was the Supreme Court decision dismissing the court action started in the spring of 1957 on the grounds that the question was moot and in the words of the Court, "Judicial power vested in the courts of North Dakota extends only to the determination of actual controversies, properly before the court, and does not authorize the court to give advisory opinions on moot questions or abstract principles."

Thus ended a historical case in the experience of the Association with neither party receiving the answers to the issues raised. Ordinarily, a Supreme Court decision ends the controversy and the case is closed. Not so, however, in this case. The Association has again become the target of further litigation and this time a suit is instituted to compel the issuance of awards allegedly won at the State Golf Tourney by a participant who had been declared ineligible at a duly called hearing before the board of directors of the Association and who was permitted to participate out of respect to a temporary court order served on the Association.

The Association has no choice again other than to surrender principles or defend itself in court in the hopes that right will finally prevail.

No doubt this litigation will again be carried to the Supreme Court of the state and the outcome may not be known for months and even years.

This has been a legislative year and during the past sessions two bills were introduced in the House which were of special importance to the Association.

House Bill No. 709, which would have prohibited all inter-school basketball games on nights followed by a school day, was introduced by Representative Link and finally withdrawn in favor of a joint resolution of the legislature suggesting that schools examine their schedules and avoid mid-week athletic contests.

While it must be admitted that some schools have over-emphasized basketball, we believe that schools of the state have the good sense and the necessary organization to make and enforce such controls as may be

necessary to properly regulate interschool sports, and further that the regulation of school sports, is not a proper subject for legislation until such time as other means fail.

House Bill No. 861, promoted and sponsored by the same party who involved the Association in litigation, and which was designed to strip the Association of all controls in interscholastic activities, received a thumping defeat in the Senate Education Committee and was decisively defeated in the Senate and the clincher motion applied. School administrators, school board members, P. T. A.'s, and other related school groups united as they never had before and rallied to the support of the Association in defeating the bill which would have set interschool relations back fifty years.

A notable achievement in Association history was the adoption of an amendment to the by-laws of the Association which will add a school board member to the Association board of directors from the North Dakota School Officers Association beginning July 1, 1959. This forward move in a part of a national movement on the part of state associations and should do much to develop good healthy relations between school boards and school administrators.

The Association program maintained a healthy steady growth throughout the year.

The new promotion, "wrestling", attracted 183 participants from eighteen high schools.

Schools participating in baseball showed a 20% increase. Track interest also increased by a similar percentage.

Participation in the State Golf Tournament was the largest in the history of the event.

Music and speech participation was the greatest since the Association took over this phase of the program a decade ago.

The school Accident Benefit program still remains one of the important services of the Association. During the past year, 117,300 pupils were enrolled in one or more plans and 4,800 claims were paid, totaling more than \$85,000.00. Demands against the Fund increase each year and the increasing costs of medical and hospital services bear out the experience of other funds or commercial insurance companies and point to higher fees for protection to keep the Fund solvent.

Your board of directors has exercised every effort to safe-guard Association funds and has followed the auditor's recommendation in earmarking surplus funds for specific purposes.

The Association is continuing its program of subsidizing track, baseball, golf, tennis, and other activities and is approaching a period where income and expenditures are in balance.

The board of directors and this office are grateful for the very excellent cooperation we have enjoyed over the past year and especially for the united support given the organization during this legislative year. No better tribute can be paid to your officers or your organization than the loyal support given when the chips are down.

We also wish to express our appreciation and gratitude to the many citizens who have generously given of their time and efforts to carry out the extensive Association program. Your help and assistance is deeply appreciated.

MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS **NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION**

Valley City, North Dakota - August 22, 1958

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the office of the High School Activities Association at 10:00 A. M., August 22, 1958, with all members present.

The special officials committee of the Board consisting of members Havig, Killie, Robinson, and Eddie Agre representing the North Dakota Officials Association, had met the day previous to prepare a recommended list of suitable officials for the 1959 regional and state basketball tournaments.

The first order of business was to review the report of the officials committee and upon motion by Thompson and second by Cameron, the attached list of officials was selected for the 1959 tourney series. The secretary was authorized to fill any vacancies that might occur in the assignments.

Mr. Arnold Sandness, auditor, met with the Board and reviewed the annual audit and made the following recommendations to the Board:

1. A set amount to be determined by the Board should be set up as a reserve for the Accident Benefit Fund.
2. A definite amount of the reserve funds of the Association should be earmarked for specific purposes.

Mr. Sandness also explained the procedure in making the annual audit.

It was duly moved by Olson and seconded by Havig that the audit report be accepted. The motion was carried.

Chairman Killie then appointed members Olson, Cameron, and Smith to a special committee to review the recommendations made by the auditor and report at a subsequent meeting of the Board.

The Board next examined the budget that had been prepared by the secretary, and upon motion by Havig, seconded by Robinson, the following budget was adopted for the 1958-1959 fiscal year:

The board next discussed possible eligibility problems resulting from reorganization and annexation of territory to high school districts. Several possible situations were discussed.

Two or more high school districts may have formed a new high school district and for the present decide to operate the existing high schools in the district. May students within the newly formed district transfer from one high school to another operated by the district without the usual penalty for transfer?

In the opinion of the Board, where a newly organized district continues to operate several high schools, the children attending these schools must continue in the same school to avoid the application of the transfer penalty unless the school board sets up attendance units and restricts the enrollment in one or more of the schools. Should the district board close a high school within the district, then the children in the closed school may transfer to another high school without penalty.

If the newly organized district takes in territory from a rural district which formerly had no high school, high school pupils from this area may select any high school in the new district or may continue to attend a high school outside of the district area if they attended this school last year, unless the school board sets up attendance areas and specifically assigns such children to a certain school.

The Board next examined the eligibility problem submitted by Superintendent E. S. Killie concerning Hubert Lowery of Fessenden. By motion by Thompson and second by Olson it is agreed that Hubert Lowery should be eligible at once to represent Fessenden High School on the grounds that his transfer was authorized by the Juvenile Commissioner.

The Board next examined the bids for basketballs and the bid of the Gun and Reel Shop of Jamestown for the B-1000 Jet Grip Tite Wilson basketball at \$14.14 FOB Jamestown, being the lowest bid, was accepted.

The Board next examined contracts for the use of the Minot City Auditorium for the state B and regional basketball tournaments, and upon motion of Thompson and second by Cameron, the contracts were approved.

The Board next discussed the program of the Association during the NDEA meeting at Fargo, and it was agreed to try to obtain either Mr. Fagan of the National Federation or Mr. H. R. Peterson of the Minnesota High School League to address the membership on Thursday afternoon, October 16, and the secretary was instructed to make the necessary arrangements. It was also suggested that a brief summary of the National Federation meeting at Santa Barbara be given by member Olson at this meeting.

It was moved by Thompson and seconded by Robinson and carried that the Board again carry PL and PD insurance with the Anchor Casualty Company of St. Paul, Minnesota.

The Board next discussed the wrestling regulations and adopted the attached list of regulations for wrestling. The state committee consisting of Harold Pedersen of Williston, Robert Dire of Valley City, and R. P. Erhardt of New England was named by the Board.

The Board next gave some attention to present policies on radio and television of the state's sponsored basketball tournaments and the chair appointed Havig, Thompson, and Robinson to a committee to study our present policies on radio and television and report to the Board.

The recommendation of the special B committee of last spring relative to class A and class B schools was reviewed by the Board and on motion by Olson and second by Havig, it was agreed that these recommendations be tabled at the present time.

The proposed addition of a school board member to the Board of Directors was again discussed by the Board and it was agreed to defer action on this amendment until a conference can be held with the State School Officers Association.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

WRESTLING**Rules and Regulations****1. Rules**

The rules which shall govern wrestling competition are those of the N. C. A. A. as applied to high schools.

2. Length of Season

The wrestling season shall be 18 weeks in length. It shall terminate the week of the state tournament. The state wrestling tournament will be held at Williston, February 27, 28, 1959.

3. Weight Classes - 95, 103, 112, 120, 127, 133, 138, 145, 154, 165, 175, heavyweight.

Beginning January 1, and continuing until February 1, two additional pounds will be allowed in each weight class. Beginning February 1, and continuing for the remainder of the season, one additional pound shall be allowed in each weight class.

A contestant may compete in one weight classification only. If he fails to make the weight classification entered, he may wrestle in a higher classification.

Each school may have one man in each classification.

After February 1, a boy must wrestle consistently in the same weight division and should participate in the state tournament in this same division.

The weighing in and length of matches shall be governed by the wrestling rules of the N. C. A. A. as applied to high schools.

4. Uniforms

The uniform shall consist of full-length tights, with outside close-fitting short trunks; there must be no buckles on the shorts. Gym shoes are required.

5. Tournament Brackets

In setting up state tournament brackets, those who receive byes shall be selected on the basis of the season's records. Selection shall be by the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association. Pairings for the tournament shall be made by this committee.

6. State Wrestling Committee

A state wrestling committee shall be selected by the Board of Directors. This committee shall make recommendations to the Board pertaining to the operation of the wrestling program in the state. This committee shall have only such final authority as is expressly delegated by the Board.

For 1958-1959 the state committee is as follows:

R. P. Erhardt - New England
Robert Dire - Valley City

7. Awards for State Tournament**(a) Team awards:**

First and second place trophies. In the case of a tie an extra trophy should be provided.

(b) Individual awards:

Medals for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place winners should be given in each weight division.

Weight divisions are: 95 lb., 103 lb., 112 lb., 120 lb., 127 lb., 133 lb., 138 lb., 145 lb., 154 lb., 165 lb., 175 lb., and heavyweight.

8. Registration

Blanks will be provided interested schools and schools should submit the registration forms to the Association office in Valley City not later than February 10th. A registration fee of 50c per entrant must accompany the registration forms.

9. Allowance

Each school will be allowed mileage checks for entrants to the state wrestling tournament based on the following schedule:

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Gardner Hotel - Fargo, North Dakota

October 15 - 16, 1958

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Gardner Hotel at 2:00 P. M., October 15, 1958, with all members of the Board present except M. F. Peterson.

The minutes of the August meeting of the Board of Directors were approved. Each member had previously been presented with a copy of these minutes and their reading was waived.

A complete financial report of the general fund and the AABF fund covering the period from July 1 to October 14, 1958, was presented to the Board and examined by them.

The petition presented by Wolford High School to become a Class B school was read to the Board and it was duly moved by Thompson and seconded by Smith that Wolford be assigned to District No. 7, Class B. The motion carried.

Superintendent W. O. Rorvig of Berthold appeared before the Board and requested that District 24 C be combined with District 26 C, inasmuch as there were only five remaining teams in District 24 C and also four in District 26 C. Mr. Rorvig reported that contact had been made with the committee from District 26 C and that they approved this combination. It was duly moved by Smith and seconded by Cameron that District 24 C be combined with District 26 C and that the first and second place teams in this combined district be selected to represent the districts in the regional play-offs. The designation of teams to participate in the respective regions shall be based on the aggregate mileage of the respective teams from the regional sites and teams shall be assigned to the region based on this aggregate mileage.

R. B. Ludvigson appeared before the Board and presented a prospectus for financing certain improvements in the property of the Valley City Town and Country Club and suggested that possibly the Board of Directors would consider investing some of their surplus funds in this enterprise. The Board took the matter under advisement, but voted to defer final action until the next meeting of the Board.

Attorney John Hjellum appeared before the Board to briefly review the court case and to suggest a method of procedure in the event the Association should again be faced with a writ of prohibition on some possible eligibility problem.

The different phases of the case were discussed at some length by the Board and it was agreed that any and all awards made by the lads in question should be withheld, inasmuch as these lads were ineligible by Board action. The attorneys' fees for the appeal to the Supreme Court in the amount of \$1,332.16 were ordered paid upon motion by Thompson and second by Robinson.

It was the opinion of the Board that the constitution and by-laws should be critically examined and reviewed with a view of uncovering any conflicts or unclear parts of the constitution and by-laws and the chair appointed members Havig, Thompson, and Robinson to a committee to examine the said constitution and by-laws and report to the Board at some convenient future time with any recommendations they might have for changes.

The question of numbering of basketball jerseys as outlined in the 1958-1959 basketball rule book was discussed and it was the opinion of the Board that there are still many North Dakota schools who have usable uniforms without the proper numbering. To cause such a school to purchase new uniforms seemed impractical at this time. It was therefore agreed that the numbering rule on basketball jerseys shall not become effective in North Dakota until the opening of the 1959-1960 basketball season.

The Board examined the personal liability and property damage insurance policy offered by the Anchor Casualty Company. It was moved by Havig and seconded by Olson that this policy be accepted by the Board for the 1958-1959 school year.

It was moved by Havig and seconded by Thompson that the chairmen of the Class B basketball committee be authorized to meet at Minot during the State Class B tournament and that such a meeting be financed out of the proceeds of the district basketball tournaments. The High School Activities Association would furnish tickets to the state basketball tournament to the members attending. Superintendent Glenn Iverson was designated to be chairman of the group and to properly notify the district committees and also arrange an agenda for such a meeting. The motion was duly carried.

A request on the part of District No. 3, Class B, to dress twelve players for their district tournaments was discussed and it was the opinion of the Board of Directors that no change should be made in the present number of ten players to dress at district, regional, and state Class B tournaments.

The Board spent considerable time discussing the status of basketball jamborees. It was the understanding of the Board that a jamboree provided for from four to eight teams to meet in one evening and each team to play a maximum of one quarter of basketball during the evening. Such a jamboree does not appear to qualify under the definition of a tournament. It does, however, constitute a portion of a basketball game. Since participation for any length of time in a basketball contest constitutes a game as far as the individual player is concerned, it was agreed by the Board that a basketball jamboree should be considered as a game and any school that participates in a jamboree shall be charged with one game of participation toward their allowable twenty season games. The secretary was instructed that if sanction was requested for jamborees that the schools be informed that such jamboree, if approved, must be listed as a game.

H. K. Ulland of Lisbon was designated to represent North Dakota at the National Alliance Football Committee meeting to be held at New Orleans on January 5, 6, 7, 1959. In the event that he could not attend, Roy Reslock of Devils Lake was named as an alternate.

Member Barton Thompson was designated to attend the NUEA meeting in debate to be held at Chicago on December 29, 30, 1958.

Member Olson reported for the committee previously appointed to act on the recommendations made by the accountants Ludvigson and Sandness to the Board at the August meeting. Mr. Olson suggested that a reserve of 25% of the yearly payments made by the AABF fund based on the \$10,000.00 interval figure should be set aside as a reserve fund in the AABF fund, inasmuch as the claim payments made by the fund in 1957-1958 were some \$67,000.00. Then a reserve fund of \$60,000.00 times 25%, or \$15,000.00, should be transferred from the general fund and placed in a reserve fund in the AABF. Further, when the payments reach \$70,000.00 this reserve fund shall be increased by another \$2,500.00 and a similar increase made in future years for each \$10,000.00 in benefit payments made out of the AABF fund. Such funds shall be maintained at the 25% of the claims paid annually and the interest on such funds shall be returned to the general fund or kept in the reserve at the option of the Board. If the balance in the AABF reserve fund exceeds the 25% figure, then this fund shall be reviewed by the Board and lowered proportionately. Upon motion by Smith, second by Thompson, that the above policy be adopted and placed into effect immediately. Motion carried.

Mr. Olson reported that his committee on retirement and pensions had nothing definite to report at this time and it was moved and seconded that this committee be continued and requested a report at the January meeting of the Board.

The Board next received a report from the committee on radio and TV policies. This committee had carefully examined the past policies of the Board relative to radio broadcasts and it was agreed that the same policies relative to radio broadcasts be used as were in effect last year. It was also agreed that the same policies relative to television be in effect as last year with the understanding that if television is permitted that the fees obtained from this source shall be added to the gate receipts. It was agreed that in the event TV stations wish to televise portions of the 1959 basketball tournaments that the Board would meet on December 20 to consider such bids for televising the tournaments.

The wrestling committee was not present and hence no report was available from them at this time.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

SPECIAL MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

November 7, 1958 - Bismarck, North Dakota

Present: E. S. Killie, L. T. Havig, Barton Thompson, Rex Robinson, E. Abrahamson, Superintendent John Campbell and Ernest Ross, President of School Board of Haynes.

This meeting was called for the express purpose of hearing certain alleged violations of Article XII, Section 2, of the by-laws on the part of Haynes High School and the superintendent, John Campbell.

It had been alleged that Superintendent John Campbell had conducted official basketball practice sessions prior to the official opening of the basketball season on November 3rd.

The hearing continued for approximately two hours and the following appeared to be the facts:

1. No special practice sessions had been called for basketball, but basketball fundamentals and drills appeared to be the program for all physical education classes.
2. The drills and games used in physical education classes were of the nature that coaches would use in early season basketball practice.
3. Mr. Campbell declared that the drills and games used in his physical education classes were such as to be basic for baseball, track, football, or any sport.
4. A ditto-graphed letter inviting patrons of the school district to attend a basketball affair at the Haynes gymnasium on October 31st in which portions of a game would be played between the high school team and an alumni group and a "B" squad against another team was presented as evidence.

Mr. Campbell contended that this was merely a ruse to build interest and it was not his intent to play any games or portion of games. He further reported that he had cancelled this proposed event when he learned that such an event might be construed as a violation of the rules of the Association.

Mr. Ross, board president, reported that he was not aware of any violation of the Association rules and confirmed statements made by Mr. Campbell.

Subsequent to the meeting, Secretary Abrahamson contacted neighboring schools. Nearly all schools reported that they had heard rumors that basketball practice had been held at Haynes as soon as football was dropped after the first weeks of school. No school appeared to be in a position to confirm the allegation by actual proof.

It was the opinion of the members present at the hearing that the drills and games carried on at the Haynes High School were typical early season practice drills commonly used by coaches of basketball in early season practice. However, no evidence was produced that these drills

were given at any other time than during regular physical education periods and during recess periods. Nor were the drills limited to any special group of boys.

It is the further opinion of the Board that the proposed basketball night on October 31st in which portions of games were planned would constitute a violation of Article XII, Section 2, of the by-laws and the fact that this function was cancelled should not absolve Mr. Campbell from the technical violation of the provision of this article and section.

It is the finding of this hearing that Haynes High School, through its superintendent, should be warned of this technical violation and advised that Haynes High School be placed on probation for the current school year and advised that membership for 1959-1960 shall be contingent upon full compliance of all rules of the Association.

Further, that the practice of using physical education periods for fundamental basketball drills as was used this year prior to the opening of the 1959-1960 basketball season shall be considered prima-facie evidence of a violation of Article XV, Section 2, of the by-laws of the Association and constitute cause for suspension from the Association.

A copy of this warning shall be mailed to both Superintendent Campbell and Board President Ernest Ross.

SPECIAL MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Valley City, North Dakota - December 20, 1958

The meeting was called to order by President Killie with all members present except M. F. Peterson.

The first order of business was the opening of bids for televising the 1959 basketball tournaments. The only bid presented was that of the North Dakota Broadcasting Company who presented the following bid:

Gentlemen:

Enclosed find check in the amount of \$500.00, which is in accordance with the requirements for bid for exclusive rights to televise the games of certain tournaments.

1. Western Class A

We are unable to bid for this tournament because it is not technically possible for us to cover this tournament.

2. Eastern Class A

This bid is for KXJB-TV, Valley City, only. We offer \$751.00 for five games only - two Friday games, Saturday afternoon consolation, and two Saturday evening games.

3. State Class A

This bid is in behalf of KXJB-TV, Valley City, KBMB-TV, Bismarck, KDIX-TV, Dickinson, and KXMC-TV, Minot. We offer \$1,616.00

for eight games and if we choose to cover any additional games we will pay pro-rata or \$202.00 per game.

4. State Class B

This bid is in behalf of stations KXMC-TV, Minot, KBMB-TV, Bismarck, and KDIX-TV, Dickinson. We offer \$660.00 minimum for four games, with option to carry additional games at \$100.00 per game.

The bids offered represent a minimum guarantee of \$3,027.00 for certain games in three tournaments with options to cover additional games for specific additional fees. I sincerely regret we will be unable to bid on the Western Class A. We do not have the necessary micro-wave facilities to pick up a telecast from Williston.

It was duly moved by Havig, seconded by Thompson, that the bid of the North Dakota Broadcasting Company be accepted. The motion was carried.

Guy Flickinger, a student at Colgate High School, appeared before the Board to inquire about his eligibility status at Colgate. It appeared that the Flickinger lad attended school last fall at Colgate and participated on the Colgate High School basketball team, then dropped out of school in mid-winter without attaining his credits for the first semester.

Under rule No. 8 which requires that a lad must have passed three subjects his preceding semester it appeared that the lad would be ineligible to represent Colgate High School during the 1958-1959 basketball season and could only regain his eligibility by attending school this second semester and earning a minimum of three half units during the semester. There appeared to be some question as to the exact dates of his attendance and the secretary was instructed to contact Superintendent Ristuben of Colgate to obtain the necessary data. In the absence of any new facts the Board was of the opinion that this lad would be ineligible for participation during the current school year.

The Board next reviewed the status of girls basketball in the state and it was evident that the number of schools playing girls basketball had greatly decreased with only eighty schools participating. All the schools in District No. 6 had eliminated the sport and there was no team to represent this district in the state tournament. Consideration was given to dividing some of the existing districts, but it appeared to be too late to make any changes in the district set-up and the best solution of the problem appeared to be to operate the state tournament by a bye and the bye drawn in the same manner as any other team for parings in the state tournament. An examination of a map showing the location of the teams that were participating showed a concentration in the Valley City area. The secretary was instructed to contact Superintendent F. H. Gilliland of Devils Lake and if it was agreeable with Devils Lake, then an effort

should be made to change the site of the girls' state tournament from Devils Lake to Valley City.

The committee on retirement consisting of members Olson, Cameron, and Smith reported on their progress and they were instructed to continue and to present some definite proposals at the February meeting of the Board of Directors in Bismarck.

The report of the committee on the all-star game at Jamestown reported on their meeting with representative of the Jamestown Quarterback Club and advised the Board that they had recommended that the Quarterback Club reconsider their stand and that this game not be held.

It was subsequently reported in the Sunday papers that the Quarterback Club had abandoned plans for an all-star football contest in the summer of 1959.

Mr. Smith of Park River reported that the Eastern Class A schools had met at Grand Forks to consider reorganization of their conference and also the possibility of adding additional schools to Class A. Mr. Smith reported that there would be a meeting at Jamestown, Monday, December 22, of the entire conference to further consider the matter.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned and the next meeting of the Board was scheduled to be held at Bismarck, February 1, 1959, in the G. P. Hotel.

MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Bismarck, North Dakota - February 1-2, 1959

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Grand Pacific Hotel in Bismarck with all members present except Superintendent M. F. Peterson.

The first order of business was to canvass the results of the mail election and it was found that member Thompson received 195 votes and B. M. Hanson of Harvey 194 votes with a few scattered votes. The Board declared Thompson and Hanson elected to the Board of Directors for three year terms effective July 1, 1959.

The secretary read a letter from H. R. Herkimer, cheerleader clinic director, in which he advised the Board that he would be available for clinics in North Dakota next fall. After discussing the matter thoroughly, the Board voted to hold four cheerleaders clinics in the state in the fall of 1959 on October 26, 27, 28, and 29. The sites selected were Dickinson, Minot, Devils Lake, and Valley City.

The secretary read a communication from Stewart McPherson of Winnipeg in which he requested the use of the fan-shaped backboards

in storage at the University for a basketball contest which they had scheduled in Winnipeg during the month of February. It appeared that these boards had been rented to this corporation on two previous occasions and plans were so advanced that they would be greatly inconvenienced if the boards were not available for them this year. It was agreed to rent them the boards for a fee of \$25.00 with the understanding that they be returned to the University in the same condition they were received.

The next item of business was the discussion of a proposed amendment to the constitution of the High School Activities Association which would increase the size of the Board of Directors from seven to nine members by including a school board member from a member high school appointed by the executive committee of the North Dakota School Officers Association. It was duly moved and seconded that the Board of Control would present the following amendment in the March Bulletin and arrange for a mail vote on this amendment sometime prior to the close of the 1958-1959 school term so that if carried, this amendment could become effective on July 1. The following amendment was to be submitted to the schools for their approval:

AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE V (OFFICERS AND DUTIES)

The amendment to Article V of the Constitution of the North Dakota High School Activities Association to read as follows:

Section I: There shall be a Board of Directors, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of nine members, elected as hereinafter prescribed, for terms of three years. Each new member shall be seated July first following his election and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms, except that he may be appointed or elected to fill a vacancy after one year's absence from office. Two members of the Board shall be chosen from Class A Schools, two from Class B Schools, two from Class C Schools, and one member shall be elected from any member high school regardless of classification. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or a member of his duly constituted staff, designated by him, shall serve as an ex-officio member of said board. One school board member, from a member high school shall be selected by the executive committee of the North Dakota School Officers Association and his term of office shall be the same as that of other elective board members. Should this member cease to be a school board member from a member high school, the position shall be declared vacant and a successor selected to fill the unexpired term.

Section II: Board members, except the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the representative from the School Officers Association, shall be nominated at the annual meeting of the Representatives of the Association, hereinafter called the Representative Assembly, and shall be elected by mail ballot, such ballot to be prepared by the Secretary and mailed to member schools on or before January first following the nomination and shall be returned to the Secretary before January fifteenth, the ballot being valid if the envelope in which it is mailed is post-marked before midnight of January fourteenth.

Nominations for members from Class B Schools shall be made by a special nominating committee at the annual meeting in 1955, and for Class C Schools and member-at-large in 1956, and for Class A Schools in 1957, and thereafter in consecutive order as the terms of the various members expire. Nominations may also be made from the floor.

Should any member remove from the state or profession, change into a different class school, or cease to be an administrator, his position shall be declared vacant immediately and a new member appointed by the Board to fill the vacancy until the next annual meeting when the regular procedure of nomination and balloting shall be followed to fill vacancy for the remainder of the term of office.

Section III: The Board shall select from its membership a President and a Vice-President. Each shall exercise all the functions assigned to him by word or implication of the Constitution, By-Laws, and regulations of the Association or special rules of the Board. The President of the Board shall, in addition to his other duties, preside at all meetings of the Representative Assembly.

Member Thompson passed out a mimeographed report of the meeting of the N. U. E. A. debate group at Chicago.

The secretary read a letter from Father Mundt of the Sacred Heart School in Glen Ullin, applying for membership in the High School Activities Association. Upon motion of Olson and second by Thompson, it was agreed to accept the membership of the Sacred Heart School of Glen Ullin, provided a payment of \$8.00 for the annual dues plus the 50% penalty was made for the year. The motion was carried.

House bill No. 709 presented by Representative Link was discussed at some length and it was the opinion of the Board of Directors that this legislation was unnecessary, undesirable, and discriminatory, and hence should not be supported. The secretary was instructed to ascertain the time of the hearing on this and to report to the education committee that the High School Activities Association did not consider such legislation wise or timely.

Members Havig and Smith were designated to present the trophies at the State Class A Tournament; members Olson and Thompson at the State Class B Tournament; and member Cameron at the girls' tournament. Since the members of the Board would be in session during the Class B Tournament at Minot, it was suggested that former member Gussner be authorized to present the trophies at the State Class C Tournament.

Superintendent Leonard Moore of Glen Ullin, Superintendent Keith Thunum of Carson, and Coach R. Thorfinnson of Carson appeared before the Board to present information relative to an incident which occurred at the Carson-Glen Ullin basketball game held at Glen Ullin. Both parties outlined what transpired at this game and after a lengthy discussion they were dismissed and the Board considered the incident. It was suggested the secretary write a letter to the officials at Carson and Glen Ullin High School reprimanding them for their actions and urging that every effort be made to restore friendly relations between the two communities. It

was evident from the hearing that both parties were somewhat to blame for the difficulties.

Member Olson reported for the pension committee and moved that the final figures be obtained from interested banks or savings and loan associations and other investment companies and that a final plan be submitted for adoption at the March meeting. This motion was seconded by member Thompson and carried.

The inequities that exist in the Class C organization were discussed and it was agreed to appoint a committee to revise district lines in Class C. The following committee was appointed: Rex Robinson-chairman, Don Cameron, R. W. Juhala, Douglas Oglesby, and Bruce Anderson. It was suggested that this committee be advised of their appointment and be put to work immediately for preliminary surveys and later meet Thursday, March 19, at Minot for final work on redistricting.

Member Thompson reported the following recommendations for District No. 14, Class B, concerning track: (1) it was suggested that the 440 yard relay be replaced by a mile relay, (2) the track regulations should be so changed that a lad could run in only one race of 880 yards or greater, rather than the present restriction of 440 yards or over. These recommendations were to be referred to the track committee consisting of member Killie, Ernie Gates, and Charles Peterson. It was suggested that this committee meet in February to make any recommendations and changes necessary in track regulations.

Superintendent Havig of the constitutional revision committee passed out proposed changes in the constitution and by-laws. It was agreed that each member would take these proposals home and evaluate them and that the matter of amendments be deferred until a later meeting.

The results of a questionnaire on continuing the state tournament in girls' basketball was submitted to the Board. No action was taken on this question at this time.

The Board agreed to meet at Minot on Friday, March 20, at 10:00 A. M. to consider any business before the Association.

There being no further business, this meeting adjourned.

MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Minot, North Dakota - March 20, 21, 1959

The board of directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at Minot in the offices of the Chamber of Commerce with all members present. Deputy Superintendent A. R. Nestoss represented the State Department of Public Instruction at this meeting.

The secretary presented a complete financial report of the activities of the Association and the Accident Benefit Fund from July 1, 1958, to March 16, 1959. This report was reviewed by the entire board.

The secretary also reported that the proposed amendment to the constitution which would add a school board member to the board of directors of the Association had been printed in the March High School Activities Bulletin in conformity with instructions given by the board at their meeting held in Bismarck February 1, and 2, 1959. Ballots were in the process of being printed and would be distributed to member schools sometime during the month of April after the constitutional thirty day period had expired.

The first order of business was the reorganization of the board, effective July 1, 1959. Member L. T. Havig was named president and M. C. Olson was named vice-president; each to assume his respective duties on July 1, 1959.

The board discussed the selection of delegates to attend the National Federation meeting at Lookout Mountain, Tennessee, June 29 - July 2, 1959. It was moved by Havig and seconded by Olson that Rex Robinson and F. U. Smith be named as delegates to this meeting and that Rex Robinson be named the official voting delegate. The motion was carried. The board also discussed the advisability of M. F. Peterson, Superintendent of Public Instruction, also attending one of the early meetings of the Federation and they voted to invite Mr. Peterson to attend the meeting at Lookout Mountain if it were possible for him to do so.

The board next discussed the value of the calendar project to schools in the state and agreed that it was a worthwhile venture and that this project should be continued for the 1959-1960 school year.

Upon motion by Olson and second by Havig, it was agreed to subsidize the State Science Fair in the amount of \$150.00 and the secretary was instructed to issue a check to the State Science Fair in the amount of \$150.00.

The pension committee consisting of members Olson, Smith, and Cameron reported on tentative plans for an annuity for the executive secretary. After due consideration, it was moved by Havig and seconded by Thompson that the board accept the recommendations of the pension committee which are essentially as follows:

- (a) The Activities Association would deposit \$8,000.00 in a trust fund with the Fidelity Savings and Loan Association in Valley City, such amount to draw interest at the regular rate of interest paid by this institution.
- (b) The executive secretary, Earl Abrahamson, would pay the Association an assessment of \$300.00 per annum beginning on the second day of January, 1960, and continue thereafter on each successive second day of January until he reaches the age of 65. This contribution shall be added to the advance deposit

made by the Association and shall draw interest in the same manner as the deposit of the Association.

- (c) The executive secretary shall receive an annuity of \$75.00 per month beginning on the second day of January, 1964, and shall continue to receive this amount monthly until the entire principal plus accumulated interest has been exhausted.
- (d) In the event of death of the executive secretary, the secretary's widow shall receive the payments from the fund in the exact amount that had been received by the executive secretary.
- (e) In the event of death of both the executive secretary and his wife before the entire principal and interest has been exhausted, the balance of the principal and interest shall revert to the Activities Association.
- (f) In the event of death of both the executive secretary and his wife prior to the age of 65, any money plus interest advanced by the executive secretary into the fund shall be paid to his or her heirs. The balance in the fund shall revert to the Activities Association.
- (g) In the event of total disability of the executive secretary prior to the age of 65, payments shall be made upon proof of this disability as long as he lives, or until the money in the fund has been exhausted.
- (h) In the event of death of the executive secretary prior to the age of 65, then payments shall be made to his widow until her death or the money in the fund has been exhausted.

The committee shall secure the services of attorney, L. T. Sproul, of Valley City to draw an agreement embodying the above conditions and upon the execution of this agreement, copies shall be placed on file in the Activities Association office, in the office of the Fidelity Savings and Loan Association, and a copy shall be placed on file with the president of the Association. It was further stipulated that the operation of this agreement shall become effective not later than May 1, 1959.

The Class C committee consisting of Rex Robinson and Don Cameron of the board; Bruce Anderson of Crary, Douglas Oglesby of Hurdsfield, and Walter Hoff of Gladstone met with the board and submitted a recommended classification for the class C schools of the state of North Dakota to become effective with the opening of the 1959-1960 school year. The board carefully examined this plan and after considerable discussion, it was moved by Robinson and seconded by Cameron that the proposed plan be adopted and that the secretary send notice of the new plan to all the class C schools in the state. The motion was carried. The following is the outline of class C districts adopted by the board:

The board adjourned at 10:00 A. M. so that the class B members would be free to attend a class B committeemen meeting at 10:00 A. M. Subsequent to the recess, the board convened at 9:00 A. M. on Saturday morning, March 21, 1959.

The B members of the board reported then on the recommendations of the class B committee members were essentially as follows: (1) the committee recommends that class B schools be permitted to carry twelve men to all districts, regional, and state tournaments instead of ten. (2) the committee recommends that the board of directors consider a plan wherein all schools with an enrollment greater than 180 be placed in

class A and then eliminations for the state tournament be conducted at eight regional centers. The board considered the recommendations of the committee and it was moved by Havig and seconded by Thompson that we defer any action of reclassification of schools until the June meeting. The motion carried.

Al Meyer, president of the North Dakota Officials Association, met with the board and offered the services of the Officials Association in the selection of officials for the 1960 basketball tournaments. Mr. Meyer also reported that the board of directors of the Officials Association recommended the officials for class A games be paid a fee of \$15.00. The board of the Activities Association agreed to take these matters under consideration and assured Mr. Meyer that they would be very happy to have a representative of the Officials Association assist them in selecting officials for the 1960 tournaments. President Killie then appointed the following committee to represent the board in selecting officials for the 1960 tournaments: F. U. Smith for class A, M. C. Olson for class B, and Rex Robinson for class C. It was suggested that these members immediately survey the schools in their respective classes and obtain their suggestions for officials for the 1960 tournaments and that this committee be prepared to report at the August meeting of the board.

The board also agreed to send our clinic leaders to the Central States officials meeting usually held at Chicago for pre-season training of the officials.

Superintendent Havig reported that there was an apparent tie for second place in the state wrestling tournament and that if a further check indicated this tie to be correct, then a second trophy would be needed to present to the second place winners. Mr. Havig agreed to recheck the figures and advise the secretary if such a trophy should be ordered.

The board next considered the secretary's contract and President Killie reported that the board had held a meeting and had voted to renew the secretary's contract for a period of three years with a salary for the first year to be set at \$9,000.00. Payment for subsequent services would be a subject to review annually and subject to adjustment for cost of living increases. It was also agreed that mileage should be paid at the rate of 8½c per mile for all mileage by the secretary or by board members while on Association business.

The board then again considered the recommendations of the class B committee that a committee of A and B schools be selected to meet with the board at their June meeting and make any changes in the organization of class A and B. It was agreed that the following would represent the class B schools at such a meeting: John Roberts of Hettinger, Elmer Johnson of Kenmare, and L. J. Grant of Hillsboro. The appointment of an A committee was left pending until the East-West Conference meeting at Jamestown scheduled on April 11, 1959.

It was suggested that Bernum Hanson, board member elect, should be invited to attend the June meeting of the board.

It was agreed that Sharon Eide receive \$200.00 per month at the beginning of the second year of her contract.

The board agreed to meet on June 11, 12, and 13, 1959, beginning at 9:30 A. M. at Valley City, North Dakota.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Valley City, North Dakota - June 11, 12, 13, 1959

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City with all members present except Supt. M. F. Peterson and Supt. Don Cameron. B. M. Hanson, newly elected board member, was also present on invitation of the board.

The board canvassed the mail ballots of the amendment to Article V of the Association which was closed on May 15, 1959. It was determined that the vote was 243 'yes' and 13 'no'. The amendment was declared carried and effective July 1, 1959. Under the provisions of the amendment, a representative school board member from a member high school would be selected by the Executive committee of the North Dakota School Officers Association to serve on the Board of Directors of the High School Activities Association. Announcement was made that the school officers executive board had selected Donald B. Whiting of Max to assume this position effective July 1, 1959.

An informational brochure from Edward J. Hickox, Executive Secretary of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame was studied by the board. No action was taken at this time on any contribution to this project.

Each board member was furnished with a complete financial report of the years' activities in both the general and A. A. B. fund and these reports were carefully reviewed by the board.

The following budget for the fiscal year July 1, 1959 through June 30, 1960, was adopted on motion of Havig and second by Robinson.

The board carefully reviewed the eligibility of two Versippi High School lads, James Krauter and Arnold Betlaf, and also read the correspondence relating to these cases. Both boys failed part of their 8th grade in May of 1955 and in the fall of 1955 were permitted to carry three high school subjects along with their make-up work. Their 8th grade exams were successfully completed in December of 1955 and they were granted their 8th grade diplomas. Both boys participated in basketball the second semester of 1955-1956. In May of that year they failed their high school exams and remained ineligible the first semester of 1956-57 but participated during the second semester. The boys participated in 1957-1958 and in 1958-1959. It would thus appear that these lads have participated in the sport of interschool basketball for four seasons in high school and, hence, under Article XIII, Section 2, these lads have no further eligibility left in high school. These lads must be considered as freshman in 1955-1956 since they carried three high school subjects along with their 8th grade make-up work. Further, the school district collected high school tuition for them that year from December 3rd, the date of the completion of their 8th grade work. It was the consensus of the board that James Krauter and Arnold Betlaf are no longer eligible to participate in high school interscholastic basketball.

The board next reviewed an alleged infraction which occurred at Hebron High School. Several local high school boys attended a postponed invitational track meet at Dickinson after being advised by the school authorities at Hebron that they could not participate in this meet. Being certified for the original track meet, they were permitted to participate at Dickinson as the Dickinson track manager was not aware of any disciplinary action of these boys. A letter was read from Supt. Haring of Hebron in which he reported that proper disciplinary action had been taken against these lads. It was the opinion of the board that the matter had been adequately dealt with by the local school authorities and that a matter of this nature was one for the local school and not the Association. Matters of this kind could be discouraged if local manager would check to see that participants in any meet were accompanied by a faculty representative as is required under Article III, Section 6, of the by-laws of the Association.

Supt. Wm. Urban and Coach Leonard Barking of New Leipzig appeared before the board to explain the reasons for their participation at the Bismarck District Track meet after being advised that they should

participate in the Dickinson Track Meet. The evidence seemed to indicate that the coach ignored instructions of his superintendent and also those of the Executive Secretary in attending the Bismarck District Track Meet. The Secretary was instructed to write a letter to Supt. Wm. Urban and the Board of Education of the New Leipzig school district censuring Coach Barking for his arbitrary action and suggesting that the administration of the school should be the responsibility of the superintendent.

Attorney Sproul of Valley City appeared before the board and outlined the developments in the pending law-suit to force the Association to deliver the award to one Robert Smith. It was the recommendation of Attorney Sproul that the recent action of Judge Thom, in refusing to vacate his judgment in the original court case, should be appealed to the Supreme Court and a favorable action on this appeal would be an important factor in the pending case. Upon motion of Robinson and second by Olson, it was agreed to authorize the attorneys to proceed with the appeal.

The board reviewed the annuity agreement entered into between the Association and Earl Abrahamson and on motion of Olson and second by Smith, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the law for insurance of Savings Association accounts by the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation provides separate and distinct insurance coverage for the beneficiary of each Trust Estate up to Ten Thousand and no/100 (\$10,000.00) Dollars independent of any coverage for other Trust Estates or accounts belonging to such beneficiary,

THEREFORE, Be it resolved that Eight Thousand and no/100 (\$8,000.-00) Dollars of the undersigned organization's funds, together with earnings thereon and additions thereto, be and are hereby conveyed to Earl Abrahamson and E. S. Killie, as Trustees, and their successors, in trust for Earl Abrahamson, his wife and this organization, as beneficiaries, all in accordance with the Trust Agreement entered into between the undersigned organization and said Trustees and Earl Abrahamson individually, an executed copy of which Trust Agreement is on file with this Association and is hereby referred to and made a part of this Resolution as fully as though set forth herein. The conditions of this Trust are as set forth in said Agreement, and the Trustees are hereby authorized and directed to invest said funds in a separately numbered account in Fidelity Savings and Loan Association, a corporation, of Valley City, North Dakota, subject to all the conditions and terms set out in said agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the records of the undersigned shall show the transfer made herein; that the terms and provisions of the Trust agreement above be carried out without delay; and that this Trust shall be designated "Trust Agreement No. 9438."

A letter from Milton Raymer, Executive Secretary of the American Bowling Congress, requesting information of the Association eligibility rules applicable to interscholastic bowling, was read and the following

policy was adopted for all sports which the Association does not officially promote, recognize or specifically provide for in its by-laws:

If a member school has an organized team in any recognized sport and engages in contests with other schools in that sport, then our regular eligibility rules applicable to football, basketball, wrestling, track, golf, tennis and baseball shall apply to the member schools and the participants in the given sport.

However, if a given school has no organized interscholastic team in a given sport, other than football, basketball, wrestling, track, golf, tennis and baseball, then the students of that school are free to participate in the particular sport on an individual basis and the regular high school eligibility rules shall not apply to those individuals in that particular sport.

The board next considered the opening date for fall football practice and inasmuch as many schools are opening school on August 31st, it was moved by Havig and seconded by Olson that the date of opening football practice be set for August 20, 1959. On roll call four voted 'yes' and Smith voted 'no'. The motion carried by majority vote.

Rev. John Holton of Mandan, representing the Youth Department of the North Dakota Council of Churches, met with the board to request that the Association cooperate in setting aside certain week-ends on which state-wide church youth events could be scheduled without conflict from association or school events. It was explained that the Association had no authority to control the local school program and any agreement or understanding entered into between the two groups would have to be a recommendation to the local school administration. The best date appeared to be between the football and basketball season. The Association Board agreed to list the days of November 13, 14, 15, on the school calendar as a period in which to concentrate state-wide church conventions. A subsequent check of the school calendar indicated that this date had been selected for the State Meeting of Student Councils in 1959 and in a telephone conversation with Rev. Holton, it was agreed to recommend November 19, 20, 21, for 1959 and a week earlier in 1960.

The board next reviewed the recommendations of the track committee consisting of Ernie Gates of Jamestown, Charles Peterson of Oak Grove, Fargo, and E. S. Killie of Fessenden. The committee recommended the following revised minimum standards to be used at track meets to qualify for entrance to the state meet:

It was moved by Havig and seconded by Robinson that the above minimum standards be adopted effective for the 1960 state track meet. The committee recommended that the javelin be discontinued as a track event. However, it was the opinion of the board that this event should be retained until the schools could be polled to determine their wishes in this matter. It was moved by Thompson and seconded by Olson that the javelin be retained as a track event in 1960 and that a poll be conducted to obtain the preference of schools on this event for the 1961 track season. The motion carried. It was moved by Smith and seconded by Thompson that the minimum number of schools in a qualifying meet be raised from six to eight as recommended by the committee. The motion carried. The board also considered the possibility of running the state track meet as an afternoon and evening affair but after considering all factors were of the opinion that it would be better to hold in during the daytime.

It was moved by Robinson, seconded by Olson and carried that an entry fee of fifty cents be charged to all entries in the district track meets, state golf and state tennis meets.

The board next considered the track coaching school usually held in early April and after checking attendance at this school by track coaches, it was agreed to discontinue this clinic for 1960.

The board considered the possibility of adding cross-country as an association sponsored event. However, the number of schools showing an interest in this sport did not appear to justify this action. It was agreed to sanction an Invitational Cross-Country Meet at Valley City under the direction of W. Osmon, Athletic Director S. T. C., Valley City, if he desired to promote such a meet.

The board next reviewed the recommendations of the speech committee and agreed on the following changes in speech regulations:

1. A small trophy is to be provided for the winners of the West and East Debates in addition to the trophies provided at the debate finals.
2. A pin or other suitable award will be provided for the high point debator in the novice class in addition to the one award in the regular debate.
3. No visual aids shall be permitted to be used by participants in debate.
4. The debate topic used in the debate series will be the same topic as is used at the Tri-State Debate Contest held at Concordia College at Moorhead in early December.
5. Class A speech winners in the East-West speech festivals are eligible to enter the State Class B-C speech finals if they attain the highest honor rating given at these festivals.

6. Class A speech participants are eligible to receive certificates for honor ratings in speech.
7. Eligibility rules for speech participation are to be included in the Music and Speech booklet.
8. The list of one-act plays will be revised to include new materials.

The following changes were authorized in the music regulations:

1. Fees for Class A schools should be raised to make these events self-supporting.
2. Bass drum solo shall be added to instrumental solo events.
3. The number of entries in instrumental ensembles shall be increased from two to three in each event.
4. Add a recommendation that the festival manager encourages each adjudicator to adhere to a high standard of musical achievements in making his ratings and criticisms.
5. The eligibility rules for music shall be made a part of the Music and Speech booklet.

The committee on the Constitution and By-laws made their report and the board agreed to offer the following amendments to be submitted to members of the Association in the September Bulletin for action at the annual meeting.

CONSTITUTION

Article III - Members

Section II: Application for membership to the Association must be made by the superintendent or the principal of the school on the Association's prescribed form with the authorization of the Board of Education of the school district of the high school applying for membership. Membership once attained is continuous by the payment of the annual association dues as prescribed in Article IV of the Constitution.

Article V - Officers and Duties

Section I: There shall be a Board of Directors, hereinafter called the Board consisting of nine members, elected as hereinafter prescribed, for terms of three years except as hereinafter provided. Each new member shall be seated July first following his election and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms, except that he may be appointed or elected to fill a vacancy after one year's absence from office. Two members of the Board shall be chosen from Class A schools, two from Class B schools, two from Class C schools, and one member shall be elected from any member high school regardless of classification. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or a member of his duly constituted staff, designated by him, shall serve as an ex-officio member of said board. One school board member, from a member high school shall be selected by the executive committee of the North Dakota School Officers Association and his term of office shall be the same as that of other elective board members.

Should this member cease to be a school board member from a member high school, the position shall be declared vacant and a successor selected by the Board of Directors of the School Officers Association to fill the unexpired term.

Section IV: Powers and Duties of the Board

- b. It shall determine the time and place of its own meetings. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Article IX - Local Control

Section I: The superintendent or the principal shall be the official representative of the school, hereinafter called the Representative.

The Representative is responsible to the Association and his school in all matters pertaining to the interscholastic relations of his school. Inter-school relations must be conducted by the duly appointed administrative officers of the school.

BY-LAWS

Article IV - Rules Violations

Section V: Delete entire section

Article V - Penalties

Section I: a. If the superintendent or the principal is not responsible for the administration of the interscholastic activities of his school, or

Section II:

Add G: For permitting its facilities to be used during the current year or the following summer vacation period for bowl, all-star or charity type out-of-season contests or for participating, directly or indirectly, in the management, supervision, player selection, coaching or promotion of such games, or permitting any of its employers to participate in any way, directly or indirectly, when the players, during the current or previous school year were members of a high school team.

Article X - Officials

Add Section IV: Officials registered with the North Dakota High School Activities Association shall not officiate at any bowl, all-star or charity type out-of-season contest held during the school term or the summer vacation period involving persons who were members of a high school team the previous year. The penalty for such participation shall be suspension as a registered official of the North Dakota High School Activities Association.

Article XI - Physical Examination, Parents' Consent

Section I: No pupil shall be allowed to represent his school in high school athletics until there is on file with the superintendent or the principal a statement signed by a practicing physician and his parents or legal guardian certifying that he has passed an adequate physical examination since August 15th of the current school year; that in the opinion of the examining physician he is physically fit to participate

in such activities; and that he has the consent of his parents or legal guardian to participate.

Article XII - Sports Season

Section I: Football

- b. Practice sessions shall start at least fourteen days prior to the first game and there shall be at least eight daily sessions.
- Add g. No scrimmage with other school teams shall be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game of the season.

Section II: Basketball

- c. Total games played shall not exceed eighteen season games. Tournament games in the Association sponsored play-off series, plus those in one other tournament, shall not count in the maximum number of games permitted.

Add g. A basketball jamboree shall be counted as one game.

Section III: Track

- a. The track season, other than Cross-Country, shall consist of a winter and spring period of not more than sixteen weeks.
- b. The track season, other than Cross-Country, shall end with the final State meet.

Add Section IV: Wrestling

- a. The full season shall be eighteen weeks in length.
- b. The wrestling season shall terminate with the last day of the State Wrestling tournament.
- c. All other regulations shall be determined by the Board.

Section V: Other Sports

- a. The baseball season shall terminate on the last date of the State Baseball tournament.
- b. In all other sports the length of season, number of games, and events entered by individual contestants shall be determined by the Board.

Article XIII - Rules of Eligibility

Section III:

- a. He shall not have participated in a similar athletic contests during the same sports season as a member of any other than a high school team and the penalty for this violation shall be loss of eligibility from the date of infraction to the end of the season in that sport.
- b. A student who has participated in football, basketball, and/or wrestling may not participate in a non-school event in those sports after the official close of the school season in those sports, and any such participation will cause the loss of eligibility in all interschool sports for the remainder of the school year.

The board agreed to open a new district center for Class B-C Music and Speech at Jamestown College, Jamestown, North Dakota.

The question of football and basketball clinics was discussed and it was agreed to set up a series of football and basketball clinics on approximately the same dates and at the same sites as last year. The secretary was instructed to contact the clinic leaders and make the necessary arrangements.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

NORTH DAKOTA OFFICIALS ASSOCIATION

Valley City, North Dakota - November 28, 1958

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota Officials Association met at Valley City, North Dakota, at 3:30 P. M., November 28, with all members present.

The minutes of the November, 1957, and March, 1958 sessions were read and approved.

The Board considered the fee schedule for seasons basketball games and suggested that this fee schedule be publicized in the Activities Bulletin and made available to all schools and officials.

The fee to be charged for the East-West Football Championship game shall be recommended at \$25.00 plus expenses for each official.

The Board of Directors discussed present policies for hiring of officials for the regional and state basketball tournaments and agreed to endorse present policies of (1) one tournament only for each employed official, and (2) limiting of tournament officials to officials who are residents of North Dakota.

The importance of clinics in developing qualified officials was discussed at some length and it was agreed to recommend to the High School Activities Board of Directors that beginning with the 1959-1960 season, officials who fail to attend at least one rules clinic should be dropped from the eligible list of officials.

It was also recommended that representatives from officials associations in neighboring states be contacted to learn their organization procedure.

It was also recommended that one or more clinic leaders be sent to any National Rules Clinics for first hand information on rules interpretations.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

The board discussed the matter of fees for officiating basketball and football games and it was the consensus of opinion that \$12.50 for class A games was not adequate. It was agreed to recommend to the board of directors of the Association that the fee for class A games be raised to \$15.00.

The matter of selecting officials for the various regional and state basketball tournaments was also discussed at length by the board and it was voted to again endorse the principle that each of the officials should be limited to one state sponsored tournament, except in an emergency. The board also expressed their willingness to assist the board of directors of the High School Activities Association in selecting officials for the various tournaments and it was agreed that Reuben Hammond of Minot would so represent the Association at their meeting in which the officials were to be selected.

Some time was spent in discussing the relation of local official associations and the employing schools. The Association was duly concerned about reports that certain charges had been leveled against recognized officials associations by irresponsible coaches and the board also expressed concern over the withdrawal of teams from the playing court before the games were completed. The group indicated the willingness to volunteer their services to the High School Activities Association board to eliminate any of the alleged charges or misunderstandings. It was the definite feeling of the board of directors that the criticism of the work of officials and local associations by other officials was contrary to the ethics of the officiating profession.

President Al Meyer was directed to represent the Officials Association board of directors on Saturday morning at a meeting of the board of directors of the Activities Association.

There being no further business, this meeting adjourned.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE NORTH DAKOTA OFFICIALS ASSOCIATION**Valley City, North Dakota - November 29, 1958, 10:30 A. M.**

The annual meeting of the North Dakota Officials Association was held in the city auditorium at Valley City, North Dakota, at 10:30 A. M., Saturday, November 29, with 21 officials present.

The meeting was called to order by President Al Meyer and the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

It was duly moved by Ottinger and seconded by Brown that a fee of \$25.00 plus expenses be the recommended for each official in the East-West Conference Football Game. The motion was carried.

It was moved by Ottinger and seconded by Helm that the Association go on record endorsing the principle of (1) North Dakota officials shall be obtained for North Dakota state and regional tournaments and (2) only one regional or state basketball tournament shall be assigned any one official. The motion was carried.

It was agreed to recommend that beginning with the 1959-1960 season all officials must attend at least one clinic in the sports in which registered and failure to do so shall cause the official to lose his status as an official.

It was moved by Brown, seconded by Helm, and carried that basketball clinic leaders be sent to the Central States Basketball Rules Clinic at Chicago in October as a preparation for the state basketball rules clinics.

The next order of business was the filling of vacancies on the Board of Directors. The North-East section and the North-West section caucused.

Following a short recess the North-East group nominated Lorne Miller and Otto Helm. Nominations were called for from the floor and Harvey Hanson was nominated. No further nominations were submitted. Ballots were prepared and the tabulation showed Harvey Hanson had the largest number of votes. Harvey Hanson was declared elected a director from the North-East section.
