


#### **FOREWORD**

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the Thirty-Sixth Annual Official Handbook of the Association. In it are presented the highlights of the year's activities and every attempt has been made to present pertinent historical and statistical information.

Any person interested in the program of the Association over the year should find the answers to his questions within the pages of this volume.

Attention is called to certain specific changes and achievements since the publication of the last Handbook.

- 1. During the past year the Association has operated with a board of nine directors with the addition of a member from the North Dakota School Officers Association and one from the State Department of public Instruction, each with full voting rights. This new organization plan has already presented the Association in a new light to the State School Officers and the State Department of Public Instruction and can only result in a better relation and a better understanding with these groups, with the ultimate result that the high school education of boys and girls in the state will be enriched and implemented.
- 2. The adoption of a new plan in classifying schools in which all schools over 299 are automatically placed in Class A and schools over 200 are given the opportunity of selecting this classification can only result in greater interest in the Class A program of the state. Twenty schools will compete in Class A during the next school year and others have indicated their interest to become Class A schools as soon as the rules will permit them to do so.
- 3. In basketball, the Association, in cooperation with the Dakota Broadcasting Company, has arranged to expand the television of tournaments and during the past year portions of the state Class A and B tournaments and the East and West A tournaments were telecast. While the immediate effect of television on gate receipts is a controversial matter, it must be admitted that thousands enjoy the tournaments who would not have the opportunity and from these thousands will develop new loyal fans who will swell the gate receipts in the future.

With the steady decline in the number of schools playing girls' basketball and the concentration of the schools continuing this support in three or four counties, it is no longer practical to sponsor a State Girls' Basketball Tournament and no plans have been made to hold such an event in 1961. Any such tournaments, if they are held, will be invitational in nature. No doubt interscholastic girls' basketball will still be played in some sections of the state.

Revenue from state basketball tournaments continues to decline, partly because of the greater cost of operation. Since much of the Association funds is derived from this source, some means must be adopted to supplement this income, or the Association program faces curtailment, to bring expenditures in balance with income. It would appear that financial problems are not confined to national, state, or local governmental units, but plague associations as well. It is recommended that schools study the auditor's report appearing in the Handbook for a true picture of the situation.

- 4. The Association wrestling program continues to grow and this year four regional tournaments were held to qualify entrants for the state meet. No doubt, wrestling will eventually become one of the major high school sports, as it is one in which the small lad has the same opportunity as the larger and heavier boy.
- 5. Track participation continues to grow, as does the quality of the competition. Records are tied or broken, some of which receive national recognition. One significant change in the program for the next year is the elimination of the javelin as a field event. Whether this action was wise or expedient may be debatable, but the action was taken after the schools were given an opportunity to express their preference.
- 6. In the field of music there is no drop in activity, but more students participate each year. Music has come to be just as much a part of the high school program as English, mathematics, or science. During the past year a new Class B-C district was opened at Jamestown with participation equal or greater than that in the average district.
- 7. The registration and training of officials continues to be one of the major projects of the Association and every attempt has been made to improve both the quality and the number of officials in all sports. All officials must attend at least one rules clinic and take the officiating test at least once each two year period if they wish to continue to officiate. Officiating continues to be one of the major problems to be faced by the school administrator and coach and can only be solved if each local school does its part in encouraging qualified sports fans to prepare themselves for the job of officiating. More and better officials are badly needed in all sections of the state.
- 8. The Accident Benefit Plan reached a new high in receipts and claims paid during the past year. What was once a sideline has become a major project for the Association. The payment of more than 5,500 claims during the year has cut deeply into the time of the office staff and may soon require additional office help.

The rate schedule has been revised upwards to bring receipts into balance with anticipated expenditures. Despite the increase in rates, the plan still continues to offer benefit payments at a cost well below those provided in other states by the state association or by commercial companies engaged in the school accident business.

The benefit payments for the coming biennium are much the same as those used the past two years, except that a maximum allowance of \$15.00 for outpatient hospital service has been added to the benefit schedule.

- 9. Special attention is called to the new 1960 Handbook of Interpretations. This publication contains the Constitution and By-laws of the Association with amendments up to July 1st and the interpretation of the rules and regulations of the Association. It has a plastic binding and opens flat to any page or section selected. This is a "must" publication for every school administrator, coach and director of any interschool activity and should be read and re-read as necessary.
- 10. The past year has been confusing in some respects. The new laws passed by the legislature and the interpretation placed on these laws and the length of the school term have interrupted the usual school routines. The difference in the opening date for schools during the past year has caused certain problems which in turn have affected the Association program.

The policy of scheduling games on Friday and Saturday nights or on evenings not followed by a school day appears to meet the approval of most school administrators. In most instances such policies should be encouraged and the Association has cooperated to implement them.

In general, this has been another successful eventful year in Association affairs and again your Board of Directors and this office is grateful for the assistance and the cooperation given by school personnel and private citizens in the administration of the Association program. From the nature of the program, voluntary help is always needed. For your help we are deeply grateful.

### NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Valley City, North Dakota - August 21, 1959

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City at 9:00 A. M., August 21, 1959, with all members present and also Superintendent E. C. Johnson of Kenmare who represented the special Class A-B Classification Committee.

The first order of business was a report by Mr. Johnson on the recommendations of this special committee for the classification of schools in Class A and Class B. Mr. Johnson reported that this committee was not in agreement and were submitting two plans for reorganizing Class A and that it was the recommendation of this committee that the Board of Directors prepare an amendment incorporating the essential features of one of the plans and submit it to the Association membership at their annual meeting in October. The two plans submitted were essentially as follows:

**Plan I:** All schools with an enrollment of 300 or more students shall be designated as Class A when the plan becomes effective. Thereafter, as soon as a school attains an average enrollment of 300 students over a two year period, such a school shall be declared an A school.

Schools between 200 and 300 students shall be given the option of remaining in Class B or may petition the Board of Directors to be designated a Class A school. Any such request must be for a minimum of three years.

Upon adoption of the plan, and in subsequent years, schools in the 200 to 300 range which did not originally elect to be placed in Class A may make an application to be placed in Class A, but such an application must be made two years in advance of its effective date and must be for a minimum of three years.

**Plan II:** Class A shall consist of the 32 largest schools of the state based on enrollment in grades 9-12 that elect to be designated Class A. The election to be designated Class A shall be for a three year period and once the quota of 32 schools is filled, no change shall be made for a period of three years.

At the end of a three year period, schools will again be given the opportunity to elect Class A designation. The 32 largest schools, based on enrollment at that time, that elect to be in Class A shall be designated Class A for another three year period

Under the above plan, all schools must indicate by a certain designated time if they wish to be Class A and the 32 largest schools indicating a preference for Class A will be selected.

After a general discussion of both plans, it was moved by Olson and seconded by Whiting that the essential features of Plan I be adopted and

submitted to the membership at their October meeting. The motion was duly carried. Chairman Havig appointed members Olson and Smith to draw up this amendment incorporating the general features outlined under Plan I.

The Board examined the annual audit made by the firm of Ludvigson Accounting Service of Valley City and it was duly moved and seconded and carried that this audit report be accepted. Each member was presented with a copy of this audit.

The Board also examined a financial report showing the receipts and the disbursements of the General Fund and the Accident Benefit Fund from July 1, 1959, to August 20, 1959.

The Board discussed the program to be provided at the annual Association meeting on October 22, 1959, and it was agreed that members Smith and Robinson would give short summaries of the annual Federation meeting and that member Barton Thompson would present the general topic "Controls On Interscholastic Activities By The Association."

The next order of business was the opening of basketball bids and it was duly moved by Hanson and seconded by Cameron that the bid of The Sioux Sporting Goods Company of Bismarck for the Rawlings RSS basketball be accepted at \$14.77 per ball F. O. B. Bismarck.

It was agreed to again carry Personal Liability and Property Damage Insurance and also to have the Hold-up Fidelity Bond protection available for all districts that wish to avail themselves of it. The secretary was instructed to negotiate with the Anchor Casualty Company of St. Paul, Minnesota, for this protection.

It was duly moved by Hanson and seconded by Olson that twelve players be permitted to dress for all Class B district, regional, and state basketball tournaments. This motion carried by majority vote.

Hanson, Thompson, and Robinson were appointed to the Accident Benefit Fund Committee to make any necessary recommendations for changes in the plan for 1960-61.

Secretary Abrahamson reported to the Board on the progress of the pending court case of Robert Smith versus the High School Activities Association.

The Board next directed their attention to the selection of officials for the respective regional and state basketball tournaments. It was agreed to employ two pairs of officials for each of the state boys' tournaments and the East and West Class A tournaments. The committee on officials consisting of Smith, Olson, and Robinson reported on their recommendations for officials for the respective tournaments and it was agreed to tender contracts to the following officials for the 1960 tournament series:

## NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Bismarck, North Dakota - October 21-22, 1959

The Board of Directors met at the Grand Pacific Hotel at Bismarck, North Dakota, on October 21, 1959, with all members present.

A request from the White Shield School to be assigned to Class B was read by the secretary and in accordance with past policies of the Board it was duly moved by Olson and seconded by Thompson that the request of White Shield be granted and that they be placed in Class B, District No. 12, in basketball. The motion was carried.

Bowdon High School, which now had an enrollment over 75 and had used up its year of grace, was assigned to Class B, District No. 8, by motion of Hanson and second by Robinson.

The secretary next reported that several Class C schools requested changes in districts and that they had obtained the release from one district and the acceptance into another. It was agreed to place Manvel and Dahlen in District No. 5, Class C, and Hampden in District No. 7, Class C.

The secretary reported that there were vacancies in the officiating assignments at the Class C regional at Dickinson. The board instructed him to fill these vacancies. It was also reported that there were two vacancies in the East Class A assignments. Superintendent Smith was instructed to contact the Class A coaches and advise the secretary of their wishes. Subsequently, John Smouse and Marco Gotta of Moorhead were secured to fill this vacancy.

The secretary reported that companies manufacturing basketballs were experiencing some difficulty in supplying the tan ball and would like to substitute the orange ball for the tournaments. It was the concensus of the board that the basketball rule book should be followed and that the tan ball be declared the official ball for all regional and state basketball tournaments in North Dakota in 1959-60.

The secretary reported that it would be difficult for Jamestown to act as host for the State Baseball Tournament next spring inasmuch as their school would vet be in session at the time of the tournament. He reported that New Rockford had been contacted and were willing to act as hosts for this State Baseball Tournament. It was agreed to transfer the site of the State Baseball Tournament from Jamestown to New Rockford.

OFFICIAL HANDBOOK

Upon motion of Peterson and second by Hanson, it was agreed to subsidize a wrestling clinic to a maximum of \$200.00 during the annual Valley City Clinic on November 27-28, 1959. The motion was carried.

It was agreed to send Coach Roy Reslock of Devils Lake to the National Football Rules meeting in Indianapolis, Indiana, on January 4-5, 1960. Clarence Laber of Watford City was named as an alternate in the event that Mr. Reslock could not attend.

Barton Thompson was named to represent the High School Activities Association at the NUEA Debate meeting in Washington, D. C., on December 28-29, 1959.

Superintendent Reitan of Cando met with the board and discussed the status of retarded pupils in special opportunity rooms. The board discussed this matter at length and it was duly moved by Olson and seconded by Thompson that the following policy be adopted by the Board of Directors on all pupils who are assigned to special opportunity rooms:

All pupils who are mentally handicapped and are members of an opportunity school and/or a class and/or a school for such pupils are not eligible to participate in interscholastic competition.

Superintendent Earl York, chairman of Class C, District No. 2, and Warren Pederson of Tower City met with the board concerning the procedure adopted by schools in District No. 2 in seeding B. B. teams for the district basketball tournaments. It appeared that the schools, by a majority vote, had prepared a "round robin" schedule so that all teams within the district would be required to play at least one game with every other school. Tower City objected to this procedure as unnecessary and undesirable. The matter was discussed at some length and the following resolution was adopted by the board:

It is the opinion of this Board of Directors that it is inadvisable and impractical to require all teams within a district to play all other teams unless it's mutually agreeable to all schools concerned and the board suggests and urges that District No. 2, Class C, and its committee seek some other means of seeding and pairing teams in their proposed district tournament. It is the feeling of this board that schools within the district should not have the authority to prepare a basketball schedule for other schools and in attempting to do so are invading the rights and prerogatives of the local school board.

Members Cameron and Robinson were asked to study the location of the teams indicating they are playing girls basketball and to suggest four girls districts from which would advance four teams to the girls final state tournament in 1960. This committee offered the following proposal. District 1: Ell Kay Larson, Munich, Temporary Chairman.

Should there be additional schools playing girls basketball not listed above, they should be assigned to their nearest district.

It was duly moved and seconded and carried that the above 'four district plan' be adopted.

Some time was spent in discussing the leadership the Association should take in the controlling of the number of basketball games and tournaments that are held on school days or on nights to be followed by a school day. It was the feeling of the board that some of the responsibility for permitting such contests should be given to the local school boards and further, that the local school boards would be in a position to assist in the control of such contests. The following resolution was adopted.

No invitational basketball tournament scheduled on schools nights preceding a school day shall be sanctioned unless the approval of the school board of each school accepting an invitation to appear in such a tournament is obtained by the tournament manager and filed with the application for sanction.

It was duly moved by Thompson and seconded by Olson that the above resolution be approved. The motion was carried.

Superintendent Thomas Crouse of the Mandan Training School and athletic director K. W. Triggs met with the board and indicated a desire to be admitted to membership in the Association and compete with the other high schools in the state in interschool affairs. This matter was discussed at some length and the various problems involved were explored. The board did not feel that they were ready to make a final decision on this matter and it was duly moved, seconded, and carried that this matter be tabled, pending an official application by the board of administration for membership and further study of the matter.

The question of accelerated students taking advanced work in institutions of higher rank than the secondary school was discussed and Chairman Havig appointed a committee consisting of Olson, Thompson, and Smith to frame an amendment to Article XIII, Section IV, which would make such an acceleration program possible without affecting a student's eligibility.

The board also discussed the question of pupils in the lower elementary grades competing on high school teams. It was the concensus of the board that our organization is a high school organization and that competition on high school teams should be limited to pupils in the junior and senior high schools. This matter was also referred to the "acceleration committee" with instructions to submit an amendment which would accomplish this purpose.

The board agreed to advertise for bids on televising regional and state basketball tournaments, such bids to be called by December 15, 1959. To avoid calling the entire board together, Hanson, Olson, and Cameron were authorized to meet after the bids were submitted and pass on these bids.

The board then adjourned until after the general Association meeting on Thursday.

#### City Auditorium - Thursday, 4:00 P. M.

The board reconvened and in accordance with instructions from the Assembly, voted to call a special meeting of the Association on Monday, February 1, to vote on Article II (Classification of Schools) of the By-laws, which was amended to read as follows:

#### ARTICLE II - Classification of Schools

Section 1: Class A Schools

- a. This group shall comprise all member high schools with an enrollment of 300 or over in grades 9-12 as of October 1, 1959, plus any school that elects to choose Class A as provided in paragraphs (b) and (c) herewith.
- b. Any member high school with an enrollment between 199 and 300 on October 1, 1959, may elect to join Class A for interscholastic competition by written notice to the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association before February 20, 1960.
- c. After the classes are established on February 20, 1960, a member school having an enrollment of more than 199 and less than 300 in grades 9-12 must give two years notice to the Board of Directors to change its classification. Such choice must be made not later than September 1st of any year and shall be effective with the opening of the fall school term two years later. Schools that elect to become an A school must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification. Provided further that when the high school enroll-

ment in grades 9-12 as of October 1, drops below 300, that school shall have one year of grace in which to choose its class of competition.

Should an A school drop below 200 in enrollment and continue below 200 for two consecutive years, this school must be reclassified as a B school. Should a school rise above 299 in enrollment and continue above 299 for two consecutive years, this school must be classified as an A school.

- b. Class B Schools:
  Change to Section II: Class B Schools. No other change.
- c. Class C Schools:

Change to Section III: Class C Schools. No other change,

The committee presented the following amendments and it was agreed that these amendments also be submitted to the membership on Monday, February 1, 1960:

#### ARTICLE V

Section II:

Add g. For participating directly or indirectly in the management, supervision, player selection, coaching, or promotion of bowl, all-star, or charity type out-of-season contests, or permitting any of its employees to participate in any way, directly or indirectly, when the players, during the current or previous school year were members of a high school team.

#### ARTICLE XIII:

Section II:

He shall not compete for more than four seasons in any one branch of interscholastic contests, provided that competition while in the seventh and/or eighth grade shall not constitute one of the four seasons.

#### Section IV:

He shall not have been enrolled in any institution of higher rank than a secondary school, except in the case of an accelerated student (enrolled in the 12th grade) doing work in an institution of higher rank. Such student shall continue to qualify for high school competition if taking three or more high school subjects in the high school in which he is enrolled and fulfilling all other eligibility requirements.

The next meeting of the board was scheduled for January 31, 1960, at 3:00 P. M. at the Grand Pacific Hotel in Bismarck.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

#### ANNUAL MEETING

## NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION Bismarck, North Dakota — October 22, 1959

The annual meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held on October 22, 1959, in the City Auditorium at Bismarck, North Dakota, with approximately 200 schools represented.

The meeting was called to order by President Havig at 2:00 P. M. and the following program was given: Reports on the National Federation meeting at Lookout Mountain, Tennessee, by Rex Robinson and F. U. Smith; "Association Controls" by Barton Thompson.

Following the program the meeting was recessed and reconvened for the business session.

It was moved by Burchill of Towner and seconded by Pennington of Rugby that the reading of the minutes of the last session be waived and the minutes approved as printed in the Official Handbook. The motion was carried.

Chairman Havig next called for the report of the nominating committee consisting of members Ziegenhagen of Enderlin, Simle of Bismarck, Rase of Dunn Center, and Zenner of Arthur. Chairman Ziegenhagen presented the following nominations:

Member at Large

M. C. Olson, Lisbon

Class C Representative

Rex Robinson, McGregor

Warren Pederson, Tower City

Nominations were called for from the floor. Since none were received, it was duly moved, seconded, and carried that the nominations be closed.

The next order of business was the consideration of the various amendments presented in the September News Bulletin. Attention was called to an error in listing the amendment to Article II, Classification of Schools, of the By-laws in which this amendment was placed under Constitutional amendments. To avoid any question on the legality of the presentment of this amendment, it was duly moved by Johnson of Kenmare and seconded by Thompson of Elgin that this amendment be amended under paragraph b, changing the time of notice to join Class A from February 1, to February 20, 1960, and further that this article be presented to the membership at a special meeting of the Association on February 1, 1960. Superintendent Van Der Hoeven of Lankin moved that the entire amendment be voted on by mail. This motion was seconded by Campbell of Haynes and on roll call there were 31 voting "yes" and 60 voting "no." The Chair declared the motion lost. The original amendment to the amendment was then voted upon together with the motion to present the amendment at the special meeting on February I, 1960. This motion carried.

The amendments to the By-laws were then taken one by one and were passed as follows:

#### Article IV - Rules Violations

Section V: Delete entire section.

It was moved by Thompson of Elgin and seconded by Bishop of Hazen that Article IV, Section V, be approved. The motion carried.

#### Article V - Penalties

Section I: a. If the superintendent or the principal is not responsible for the administration of the interscholastic activities of his school, or

It was moved by Bishop of Hazen and seconded by Rase of Dunn Center that Article V, Section I, paragraph (a) be adopted. The motion carried.

Section II: Add g. For permitting its facilities to be used during the current year or the following summer vacation period for bowl, all-star or charity type out-of-season contests or for participating, directly or indirectly, in the management, supervision, player selection, coaching, or promotion of such games, or permitting any of its employees to participate in any way, directly or indirectly, when the players, during the current or previous school year were members of a high school team.

After discussion, it was moved by Campbell of Haynes and seconded by Van Der Hoeven of Lankin that this amendment be referred back to the Board for further study to be presented at some subsequent meeting. This motion was carried. The above amendment was declared "lost."

#### Article X - Officials

Add Section IV: Officials registered with the North Dakota High School Activities Association shall not officiate at any bowl, all-star, or charity type out-of-season contest held during the school term or the summer vacation period involving persons who were members of a high school team the previous year. The penalty for such participation shall be suspension as a registered official of the North Dakota High School Activities Association.

It was moved by Day of Berthold and seconded by Bishop of Hazen that this amendment be approved. The motion carried.

#### Article XI - Phys. Exam., Parents Consent

Section I: No pupil shall be allowed to represent his school in high school athletics until there is on file with the superintendent or the principal a statement signed by a participating physician and his parents or legal guardian, certifying that he has passed an adequate physical examination since August 15th of the current school year; that in the opinion of the examining physician he is physically fit to participate in such activities; that he has the consent of his parents or legal guardian to participate.

A motion was made by Robinson of McGregor and seconded by Bachman of Adams that this amendment be granted approval. Motion carried.

#### Article XII - Sports Season

#### Section I: Football

b. Practice sessions shall start at least fourteen days prior to the first game and there shall be at least eight daily sessions.

A motion was made by Olson of Lisbon and seconded that this amendment be approved. The motion was carried.

Add g. No scrimmage with other school teams shall be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game of the season.

Superintendent Pederson of Tower City made a motion, seconded by Johnson of Kenmare, that this amendment be passed. The motion carried.

#### Section II: Basketball

c. Total games played shall not exceed eighteen season games. Tournament games in the Association sponsored play-off series, plus those in one other tournament, shall not count in the maximum number of games permitted.

A motion was made by Thompson of Elgin and seconded by Whitcomb of Portland that this amendment be accepted. The motion carried.

Add g. A basketball jamboree shall be counted as one game.

A motion was made by Glatt of Sutton and seconded that this amendment be approved. The motion carried.

#### Section III: Track

- a. The track season, other than Cross-Country, shall consist of a winter and spring period of not more than sixteen weeks.
- b. The track season, other than Cross-Country, shall end with the final State meet.

Motion was made and seconded by Bishop of Hazen and Olson of Lisbon respectively that paragraphs (a) and (b) of Section III be granted approval. Motion carried.

#### Section IV: Wrestling

- a. The full season shall be eighteen weeks in length.
- b. The wrestling season shall terminate with the last day of the State Wrestling Tournament.
- c. All other regulations shall be determined by the Board.
   A motion was made, seconded, and carried that this new section be adopted.

#### Section V: Other Sports

- a. The baseball season shall terminate on the last day of the State Baseball Tournament.
- In all other sports the length of season, number of games, and events entered by individual contestants shall be determined by the Board.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried that this amendment be approved.

#### Article XIII - Rules of Eligibility

Section III:

- a. He shall not have participated in a similar athletic contest during the same sports season as a member of any other than a high school team and the penalty for this violation shall be loss of eligibility from the date of infraction to the end of the season in that sport.
- b. A student who has participated in football, basketball, and wrestling may not participate in a non-school event in those sports after the official close of the school season in those sports, and any such participation will cause the loss of eligibility in all inter-school sports for the remainder of the school year.

It was moved by Branchaud of St. Thomas and seconded by Folkins of Goodrich that this amendment be approved. The motion carried. The Chair called for any other business and none being presented, it was moved by several that the meeting be adjourned.

## NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION Bismarck, North Dakota — February 1, 1960

This special meeting of the Association was called by the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association for the purpose of considering the adoption of several amendments to the Bylaws as submitted to the membership in the December Activities Bulletin.

President L. T. Havig presided and it was determined a quorum was present with between 125 and 150 schools represented.

Article II (Classification of Schools) was read by the secretary.

#### Article II - Classification of Schools

Section I: Class A Schools

a. This group shall comprise all member high schools with an enrollment of 300 or over in grades 9-12 as of October 1, 1959, plus

any school that elects to choose Class A as provided in paragraphs (b) and (c) herewith.

- b. Any member high school with an enrollment between 199 and 300 on October 1, 1959, may elect to join Class A for interscholastic competition by written notice to the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association before February 20, 1960.
- c. After the classes are established on February 20, 1960, a member school having an enrollment of more than 199 and less than 300 in grades 9-12 must give two years notice to the Board of Directors to change its classification. Such choice must be made not later than September 1st of any year and shall be effective with the opening of the fall school term two years later. Schools that elect to become an A school must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification. Provided further that when the high school enrollment in grades 9-12 as of October 1, drops below 300, that school shall have one year of grace in which to choose its class of competition. Should an A school drop below 200 in enrollment and continue below 200 for two consecutive years, this school must be reclassified as a B school. Should a school rise above 299 in enrollment and continue above 299 for two consecutive years, this school must be classified as an A school.

Section II: Class B Schools (No change)

Section III: Class C Schools (No change)

It was moved by Olson of Lisbon and seconded by Grant of Hillsboro that this amendment be adopted. After a brief discussion a vote was taken and the amendment was declared carried by a substantial majority.

Article V, Section II (g) was read.

#### ARTICLE V

Section II: Add g. For participating directly or indirectly in the management, supervision, player selection, coaching or promotion of bowl, all-star or charity type out-of-season contest, or permitting any of its employees to participate in any way, directly or indirectly, when the players, during the current or previous school year were members of a high school team.

On motion of Robinson of McGregor and second by Herbel of Bowbells this amendment was approved by voice vote.

Article XIII, Section II was read.

#### ARTICLE XIII

Section II: He shall not compete for more than four seasons in any one branch of interscholastic contests, provided that competition

while in the seventh, and/or eighth grade shall not constitute one of the four seasons.

On motion of Hanson of Harvey and second by Zenner of Arthur this amendment was approved as read.

Article XIII, Section IV was read.

#### ARTICLE XIII

Section IV: He shall not have been enrolled in any institution of higher rank than a secondary school, except in the case of accelerated student (enrolled in the 12th grade) doing work in an institution of higher rank. Such student shall continue to qualify for high school competition if taking three or more high school subjects in the high school in which he is enrolled and fulfilling all other eligibility requirements.

It was moved by Thompson of Elgin, seconded by Davy of Minot, that this amendment be approved.

Superintendent Bangs of Bottineau moved that the amendment be amended by striking out the works "enrolled in the 12th grade." This was second by McCrea of Valley City and carried.

The original amendment as amended was then voted on and carried.

It was duly moved by McCrea and seconded that this meeting be adjourned. The motion carried.

#### MINUTES OF

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

#### Bismarck, North Dakota - January 31 - February 1, 1960

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the G-P Hotel at Bismarck on January 31, 1960, with all members present except M. F. Peterson.

The Board first reviewed the financial report of the Association to January 15, 1960, as prepared by the secretary of the Association.

The results of the mail ballot was canvassed with the following results:

For member of the Board of Directors at large – M. C. Olson 235 votes

For member of the Board of Directors from

Class C Schools.

Warren Pederson 202 votes

Rex Robinson 213 votes

M. C. Olson, Warren Pederson, and Rex Robinson were declared duly elected to the Board of Directors with terms effective July 1, 1960. Since Don Cameron was no longer eligible to represent the Class C 28

schools on the Board of Directors, having become a superintendent of a Class B school, it was duly moved by Whiting and seconded by Smith that Warren Pederson be appointed to fill the unexpired term of Don Cameron, effective at once.

The following articles of the Constitution of the North Dakota High School Activities Association were amended to read as follows:

#### ARTICLE III (Members), Section II:

"Application for membership to the Association must be made by the superintendent or the principal of the school on the Association's prescribed form with the authorization of the Board of Education of the school district of the high school applying for membership. Membership once attained is continuous by the payment of the annual Association dues as prescribed in Article IV of the Constitution."

#### ARTICLE V (Officers and Duties), Section I:

"There shall be a Board of Directors, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of nine members, elected as hereinafter prescribed, for terms of three years except as hereinafter provided. Each new member shall be seated July first following his election and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms, except that he may be appointed or elected to fill a vacancy after one year's absence from office. Two members of the Board shall be chosen from Class A schools, two from Class B schools, two from Class C schools, and one member shall be elected from any member high school regardless of classification. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or a member of his duly constituted staff, designated by him, shall serve as an ex-officio member of said Board. One school board member, from a member high school shall be selected by the executive committee of the North Dakota School Officers Association and his term of office shall be the same as that of other elective Board members. Should this member cease to be a school board member from a member high school, the position shall be declared vacant and a successor selected by the Board of Directors of the School Officers Association to fill the unexpired term."

#### ARTICLE V, Section IV, (Powers and Duties of the Board):

(b) "It shall determine the time and place of its own meetings. Five members shall constitute a quorum."

#### ARTICLE IX, (Local Control), Section I:

"The superintendent or the principal shall be the official representative of the school, hereinafter called the Representative.

The Representative is responsible to the Association and his school in all matters pertaining to the interscholastic relations of his school. Interschool relations must be conducted by the duly appointed administrative officers of the school."

The Board declared all the above amendments carried and effective with the beginning of the next fiscal year on July 1, 1960.

Some time was spent in reviewing the amendments to be submitted at the special meeting on February 1. The Baord also discussed some of the necessary changes in the Special Handbook of Interpretations to be published and distributed for the next school year.

Barton Thompson gave a complete report of his attendance at the NUEA Meeting in Washington, D. C.

The secretary read two letters received from superintendents of Class C schools requesting that the number of players be permitted on the basketball squads at district, regional, and state tournaments to be increased to twelve. Inasmuch as all arrangements had been made for the tournaments in 1960, it was agreed that this request be tabled until next year.

Letters were also read by the secretary suggesting a later date for the State Track Meet. The Board was of the opinion that all arrangements had been made for the year and that it would be inadvisable to change the date and it was agreed that the State Track Meet be held on May 21, 1960, the day on which it is presently scheduled.

The Board next discussed the date of the opening of fall football practice and in view of the fact some of the schools will be starting in the latter part of August, it was duly moved by Robinson, seconded by Cameron, and carried that football practice for the 1960-61 season be authorized to begin on August 18, 1960.

The Board authorized the purchase of the new wrestling film entitled "Ready...Wrestle!", available through the Illinois Bell Telephone Company for a price of \$100.00.

The secretary reported that many schools had inquired about the possibility of obtaining personal liability and property damage insurance coverage on the invitational basketball tournaments which they promote. The Anchor Casualty Company has offered to furnish this protection for these tournaments at the same rate as is now provided under the general contract with the Anchor Casualty Company for district, regional, and state tournaments. It was moved by Olson and seconded by Hanson that arrangements be made to provide personal liability and property damage insurance to those invitational tournaments on which this coverage was requested. The motion was carried.

The question of cheerleaders clinics for the 1960-61 season was discussed at length by the Board and it was agreed to skip these clinics in 1960-61 with a possibility of reinstating them the next year.

The summer meeting of the Federation scheduled for July 2-6, 1960, at Glacier Park next received the attention of the Board and it was agreed to contribute \$100.00 toward the expenses of this summer meeting inasmuch as the meeting was to be held in the district of which North Dakota is a member. Members M. F. Peterson, Barton Thompson, and Warren Pederson were named to represent the Association at this national meeting.

The question of a meeting of the B committee chairmen was reviewed and it was the opinion of the Board that this meeting should be authorized on the condition that each district pay the expenses of their delegate to such a meeting. The Association would contribute the tickets to the State Basketball Tournament to those chairmen who would attend the meeting.

The recommendation of the North Dakota Officials Association that all officials be required to attend a clinic annually and take the official Federation test at least once in two years in order to remain qualified as an official was discussed by the Board. It was agreed that this was desirable procedure and the Board went on record endorsing this recommendation. It was further suggested that school administrators be advised to have their coaches attend the annual clinics.

The Board approved the TV contract for the telecast of the East and West Class A Tournaments, the State A and State B Tournaments. Mr. Reiten of KXMC-TV of Minot appeared before the Board with a request that he be permitted to telecast portions of the Class B Regional Tournament to be held at Minot. After discussing this matter at some length it was duly moved by Olson, seconded by Hanson, and carried that Reiten's request for reconsideration of bids on the Minot Regional Tournament be rejected.

Superintendent Leo B. Glatt of Sutton met wifh the Board to explain his reasons for withdrawing his team from the floor during the recent Sutton vs. Courtenay basketball contest. The secretary read to the Board a complete report of the incident from the officials concerned. The secretary was instructed to contact the officials at Courtenay and obtain any additional facts bearing on this case. It was the general opinion of the Board that if the facts were as presented by the officials that Superintendent Glatt should be reprimanded for his actions and warned that any repetition of this action could cause suspension from the Association. Subsequent to this meeting the secretary interviewed Superintendent Hardy of Courtenay, the time keeper and score keeper of the game, and also the coach at Courtenay and it appeared that the information as presented by the officials was corroborated and a letter of reprimand was sent to Superintendent Glatt.

The secretary also reported that in a recent Reeder vs. Gladstone basketball contest the regular officials failed to appear and the contest was

played without the use of registered officials. A request had been made by the Gladstone coach that this game be forfeited to Gladstone. It was the opinion of the Board that inasmuch as this contest had been played without the use of registered officials that the game should be ruled "No Contest" and neither school be permitted to count the results of this game as a win or a loss.

The secretary read a letter from Superintendent Urban of New Leipzig in which he petitioned to be assigned to the Bismarck track district. By motion of Hanson and second by Whiting this request was granted.

The Board discussed informally changes in the AABF benefit schedule and it was agreed to call a meeting of the AABF committee on Thursday, the 18th of February in Bismarck to further examine this schedule.

It was suggested that member Robinson give us a report on publicity of the Association at the next meeting of the Board which was set at Minot during the Class B Tournament, 12:00 noon on Friday, March 18, 1960.

Each Board member was given a description of the Northwestern Bell Telephone building in Valley City. No action was taken or suggested at this time on this matter.

It was reported that Arnegard High School had used some boys who were not eligible to represent the school in athletic contests during the first semester of this year. Inasmuch as no one seemed to have any definite information on this alleged violation, it was agreed that Havig should visit the Arnegard High School and obtain the facts on the situation and if the report was confirmed that ineligible players were used, that these boys be declared ineligible for the remainder of the school year and the Arnegard High School be given an opportunity to appear before the Board at their next meeting to defend their actions. Mr. Havig subsequently made the investigation and it was established that John Olson, Philip Olson, and Gary Stenseth were ineligible since they had failed to pass three subjects the preceding semester. Superintendent Olson was advised that these boys would be ineligible for the remainder of the year. There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

This special meeting of the Board was called to investigate the alleged violation of Article XII, Section II, of the by-laws of the Association of Belfield High School in permitting certain members of the high school basketball team to participate in an excessive number of contests during the season and also to participate in the District No. 15 Class B tournament at Dickinson.

President Havig opened the meeting with the statement that the first order of business would be to attempt to determine the true facts in the case.

Chairman Rasmussen of the District No. 15 Committee presented the Board with evidence that one Rudy Baranko, a member of the Belfield High School basketball team had participated in at least a minimum of twenty-two games during the season in addition to two holiday tournaments at Bowman and Beach, North Dakota. Mr. Rasmussen reported that there had been no attempt to discover whether additional members of the Belfield High School team had also participated in an excessive number of games. This report was signed by all members of the district committee and was presented after an investigation had been held by the district committee.

Coach Kroeger of Belfield admitted that Rudy Baranko of Belfield High School had participated in an excessive number of games.

It was determined that no one present questioned the statements presented by the district committee and it was agreed by the officials of Belfield High School that the allegations were true. Chairman Olyniuk of the Belfield Board of Education also agreed to the facts submitted, but pleaded for leniency on the part of the Board for the innocent members of the high school team.

It therefore appeared that the allegations were fact and the Board then proceeded to go into executive session to determine what the penalty should be for the violation. Past policies of the Board were reviewed, a careful examination was made of the District No. 15 Class B Tournament held at Dickinson and various possibilities of proper punishment were explored for a period of over two hours. The matter was discussed from all angles by the Board and also by the Board and the district committee. Finally Chairman Havig asked each Board member to cast a secret ballot on one of three possible penalties to be administered to Belfield High School. Upon counting the ballots from each of the five Board members present, it was discovered that there was a unanimous vote for the following plan of discipline to be administered to Belfield High School:

- (1) Belfield High School must forfeit all games in the recent Class B District No. 15 Basketball Tournament held at Dickinson in which one Rudy Baranko was permitted to participate, which in essence meant that the first place honors won by Belfield High School would be cancelled.
- (2) Watford City, who had won third place in the tournament, would be designated as a co-winner with Halliday in this tournament. Inasmuch as it was impossible to determine which team should be awarded first or second place, it was agreed to declare both teams co-winners of this tournament and the first and second position for regional play was to be determined by lot. (Upon the flip of a coin, Watford City was awarded the first team position and Halliday the second team position for regional play).
- (3) It was agreed further than the two schools should flip a coin to determine which one would receive the first place trophy and that the trophy should be re-engraved to designate Halliday and Watford City as co-winners of the district tournament. (The first place trophy was won by Watford City).

Following this decision the interested parties were called into the room and were advised of the results of this hearing.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 P. M.

### MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS Minot, North Dakota — March 18-19, 1960

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the conference room of the Elks Lodge in Minot on March 18, and 19, 1960, with all members of the Board present.

Each Board member was presented with a financial report of operations of the Association to March 15, 1960.

The first order of business was a report on the Belfield eligibility case which was given in detail by President L. T. Havig.

Archie Peterson, the Minot track coach, appeared before the Board with a request that the State Track Meet be postponed one week until

May 28, 1960. It was moved by Thompson and seconded by Olson that the State Track Meet be rescheduled for May 28, and that the district track meets be set for the weekend preceding the State Meet. The motion was carried.

Superintendent L. Olson of Arnegard and Marvin Olson, a member of the board of education from Arnegard, met with the Board in regard to the eligibility of certain players who had been declared ineligible to represent Arnegard High School The Board did not feel that any further penalty should be assessed against Arnegard High School for their violation of the eligibility rules, inasmuch as three boys had been declared ineligible for further participation during the entire school year.

Superintendent Grossman of Center voluntarily appeared before the Board to report that Center had inadvertently permitted one player to participate in the district tournament who had exceeded his allowable twenty games. It was moved by Whiting and seconded by Smith that the Board follow their usual policy by requiring Center to forfeit the games they won in the district tournament and also to forfeit the consolation trophy which they won at the district and this trophy should be sent to the state office of the Association. Motion was carried.

The Board discussed some means of bringing to the attention of schools the number of basketball games in which each boy participated up to the time of a given contest and it was suggested that the eligibility exchange sheets be revised to include a column in which the schools could list the number of games in which each boy had participated up to the time of a given contest. It was the consensus of the Board that such a procedure might help to avoid over-participation on the part of boys who are members of both the A and B squad.

Considerable time was spent in reviewing the proofs of the new Special Handbook of Interpretations which had been prepared by the secretary and corrections and changes were made as needed.

The Board next considered the recommendations of the AABF Committee and accepted the following recommendations:

- (1) That the present schedule of medical benefits is satisfactory.
- (2) That the present schedule of dental payments is satisfactory.
- (3) That payments should be made for repair of bridges and partials in cases of dental injury.
- (4) Out-patient hospital should be added to the schedule of benefits with a limitation of \$15.00 per accident.
- (5) That the secretary be instructed to revise rates as necessary to make the plan self-supporting.
- (6) The rate schedule should be simplified by placing all-day coverage and physical education together, inasmuch as nearly all schools now carry all-day coverage.

The Board next proceeded to reorganize itself for the 1960-61 year by re-electing L. T. Havig president and M. C. Olson vice-president.

The possible purchase of a building for the High School Activities Association was again discussed and it was agreed to refer the question of purchase and location to the annual meeting of the Association next fall.

The Chair appointed members F. U. Smith, M. C. Olson, and Warren Pederson to the Trophy Committee of the Board and it was agreed that this committee should meet on June 7, to select trophies for the entire Board's consideration and that the next regular meeting of the entire Board would be on the eighth of June.

It was also agreed to call in the managers of the A and B State Tournaments for a conference at this meeting to secure their recommendations for any necessary changes in the tournament organization plans.

The secretary next reported on the survey conducted among the high schools of the state relative to the retention of the javelin for the 1961 track season. It appeared there were 129 votes for the elimination of this event and 84 were against. Inasmuch as the majority was in favor of eliminating this event, it was duly moved and seconded that the event be dropped beginning with the 1961 track season.

The secretary was instructed to send a check in the amount of \$150.00 to the State Science Fair Committee.

It was the opinion of the Board that the calendar project should be continued for the next school year.

The secretary reported that the manager of the golf tournament had recommended that the state golf competition be reduced from 27 to 18 holes. It was duly moved and seconded and carried that this recommendation be adopted.

Letters were read from Carpio and Wildrose superintendents indicating their preference to become Class B schools beginning with the 1960-61 school year. Carpio was assigned to District No. 10 and Wildrose to District No. 11, Class B.

President Havig announced the appointment of a Class A Committee to recommend to the Board of Directors the preference of Class A schools for regional playoffs for the 1961 tournament series and suggested that this report be made available at the June meeting of the Board. The following were appointed: T. E. Simle of Bismarck, Chairman; James Maxwell of Grafton, J. I. Pennington of Rugby, and M. B. Zimmerman of Wahpeton.

Members B. M. Hanson, Barton Thompson, and Rex Robinson were appointed to a committee to poll schools in their respective classes for their recommendation on officials for the 1961 tournaments. It was also agreed that a member of the Board of Directors of the Officials Association should make recommendations as to the availability of qualified officials for the 1961 tournaments.

The Board adjourned to reconvene on Saturday morning at which time Reuben Hammond of Minot met with the Board as a representative

of the Officials Association Board. Mr. Hammond reported that it was the recommendation of the Officials Board that wrestling be added as one of the sports in which officials must register. The Board adopted this recommendation.

It was the opinion of the Board that registered officials should be required for all interscholastic games whether these games were with A or B squads.

Mr. Hammond presented the following suggested maximum schedule of fees for officials:

Upon motion by Thompson and second by Robinson, the above schedule was adopted.

Some time was spent in discussing the biased coverage of the sports announcer at KFYR and it was the consensus of the Board that the manager of KFYR should be contacted and advised of the Board's attitude toward this biased sports coverage.

Member Smith gave a report of the meetings of the East Class A schools in which a north and a south conference were formed.

There being no further business, this meeting adjourned with the next meeting scheduled on June 8, 1960.

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Valley City, North Dakota - June 8, 1960

The Board of Directors met in the City Hall at Valley City, North Dakota, at 9:00 A. M., Wednesday, June 8, with all members present.

The first order of business was the review of the Minot application for sanction of a basketball game at the University of Minnesota Field House on December 17, 1960, and a football game with Great Falls, Montana, in October. The Board had previously been canvassed on these applications and a notification had been received from the National Federation office refusing to sanction these games inasmuch as they involved a round trip exceeding 600 miles and were in conflict with Article II, Section II, of the National Federation By-laws. The review of this

application was for information purposes in order to apprise all members of the details of the application and the Federation action on this application.

The next order of business was to establish a policy on the definition of a 300 miles limitation. It was duly moved by Olson, seconded by Smith, and carried that the 300 miles distance shall be interpreted as the distance actually traveled to the site of the contest by any means of transportation used by the school concerned.

Superintendent Minard McCrea and Principal James Adair of the Valley City High School met with the Board relative to certain necessary improvements that should be made in the track facilities at Valley City if the State Meet were to be held there in subsequent years. President Havig appointed M. C. Olson and the Executive Secretary to a committee to confer with Mr. McCrea and obtain the cost of the projected improvements.

Superintendents T. E. Simle of Bismarck and Superintendent James Maxwell of Grafton, representing the Special Class A Basketball Committee met with the Board and offered the following recommendations for the Class A organization plan for 1961:

- 1. Round Robin:
  - A. All teams will play each other twice except Harvey and Bishop Ryan only once. This will make sixteen conference games which will allow two additional games against natural rivals and/or allow for commitments made over the years. In the event that two games are scheduled with Bishop Ryan and Harvey, each will count as a half game. Obviously, one scheduled game against them will count as a full game.
  - B. At the end of the season's play, if two teams tie for first place, a flip of a coin will determine first and second places for the two

teams seeded into the state tournament. If more than two teams tie. a drawing will be made to determine first and second place seeded teams into the state tournament.

- C. With two top teams seeded into the state tournament on season's record, the remaining eight will play a single elimination tournament. Four games will be played on Friday and two games will be played on Saturday night with the winners of the Saturday night games advancing to the state tournament.
- D. The two teams seeded to the state tournament will be designated as first and second from the West. A flip of a coin will determine positions three and four for the two winners on Saturday night.
- E. Pairings: Same as now in effect. (Note: The above is recommended for one year only for the purpose of giving all ten teams one year to adjust their schedules involving natural rivals and other committed games.)

1. Round Robin:

- A. All teams will play each other twice which will equal eight conference games.
- B. All teams shall play each other in a round robin schedule of eight games. Ties in the standings at the end of season's play will be broken by a flip of a coin if two teams are tied; and by a drawing if the tie involves three or more teams.
- C. In each section, teams four and five, on the basis of season's round robin play, would play off to determine the fourth entrant to the sectional tournament.
- D. There will be one playoff in each of the two sections to select two teams from each section to advance to the state tournament. The playoff in each section will be a one night event consisting of two games. On the basis of season's play, the pairings will be as follows:

Team 1 vs. Team 4 Team 2 vs. Team 3

The winner of each game will be the two teams to represent each section in the state tournament.

(Note) A suggestion has been made that a second night be used to play off for first and second places in both Northeast and Southeast sections. The committee has no objections.

The above recommendations were reviewed at some length by the Board and upon motion by Whiting and second by Thompson, it was agreed to adopt the above plan submitted by the Committee for Class A tournaments with the following modifications:

- 1. A formula system should be adopted and placed into effect whereby the rating of the teams from season's play should be determined.
- 2. All ten teams in the Western division should be fully eligible to attain one of the two seeded spots.
- 3. The lower eight teams in the Western division would then participate in a Western division tournament from which would be selected two teams from the semi-final round to bring the total representation from the West to four teams at the State Class A Tournament. The Western tournament would end with the semifinal round.
- 4. The plan in the East will be adopted as submitted with the exception that the two Eastern tournaments would be two-day affairs with a winner and second place determined in both the Northeast and the Southeast divisions with these two positions advancing to the final state tournament as representatives of the eastern division.
- 5. At the state final tournament the representative winners of the Northeast and Southeast divisions would be seeded in opposite brackets and likewise the runner-up positions would be seeded in opposite brackets.
- 6. The two seeded positions in the West, through season's play, would be seeded as teams one and two, based on season's records and the semi-final winners in the Western tournament would be seeded as third and fourth positions determined by lot, and the same seeding arrangement followed as in the East so that winners appear in opposite brackets.

A letter from Superintendent Barnhart of the Grand Forks High School concerning the charge for the use of the high school facilities for district music contests was read, as was a letter from Leonard Marti, Athletic Director of the University of North Dakota, concerning the charges to be made for the use of the Field House for basketball tournaments. These letters were discussed at some length and inasmuch as the districts now receive two-thirds of all fees collected for district music and speech events, it was the concensus of the Board that this was largely a district problem and should be resolved by the district committees themselves.

It was apparent that some attempt should be made to stabilize charges assessed for adjudicator's fees, manager's fees, and clerical help at the respective district centers. The Chair appointed members Pederson, Thompson, and Smith to make a study of these charges and report at the next meeting of the Board.

A delegation of ministers representing the Catholic Church, the Lutheran Churches, and the North Dakota Council of Churches met with the Board with a request that some dates be selected in the fall and spring at which time state-wide religious meetings could be scheduled. The opinion was expressed that by concentrating such meetings on a given weekend that many conflicts could be avoided and loss of school time reduced to a minimum. Some time was spent checking the calendar with this in mind and it was agreed to list the following dates on the calendar indicating that this weekend should be set aside for state-wide church events and that the scheduling of interscholastic activities should be reduced to a minimum on those particular dates. The following spring dates were suggested.

1961 - April 7 and 8 1963 - March 29 and 30 1962 - April 6 and 7 1964 - April 10 and 11

A letter from William Zacher, Athletic Director of Strasburg High School was read to the Board. It appears that a new parochial school is to be established at Strasburg which will use much of the same facilities that have been used in the past by the public school for a rental fee. The school district proposes to construct new classrooms. Thus, the children who have formerly attended the Strasburg Public High School with Sister Mary Richard Anthony as the administrator will be given the opportunity of either attending a parochial school or to continue on in the new public school. Mr. Zacher raises the question of eligibility of the pupils next fall in both the public and the parochial school. After discussing this matter, it was the Board's opinion that all the high school students who attend the Strasburg Public School last year shall be given the opportunity to select either the parochial or the public high school and be immediately eligible for participation in interscholastic activities. Any transfers from other schools who elect either the parochial or public high school shall be considered as transfer pupils and become eligible after attending eighteen weeks.

The Board also considered a possible transfer of pupils in the Buxton - Reynolds school district, but in the absence of any specific information on the proposal, it was deemed advisable to table this matter until additional information is received.

Member Robinson reported on the publicity pamphlet project and advised the Board that the approximate cost would be \$1,100.00 for a minimum of 25,000 copies. There was some question raised whether an outlay of this amount of money at this time would be justifiable and it was agreed to postpone any definite action on this project until the August meeting.

A letter from C. G. Brockmeier, district manager of the Northwestern Bell Telephone Company of Grand Forks, North Dakota, was read advising the Board that the Northwestern Bell Telephone building in Valley City would be subject to sale on bids sometime in the future and after their new building is built in Valley City. This probably would not be available until 1962. It was agreed to refer the matter of bidding on this building to the Annual Meeting in October for discussion.

The Secretary reported on several minor recommendations of the Music Committee for changes in the Rules and Regulations for Music and

Speech Contests and Festivals. Inasmuch as the changes were very minor, they were approved and the Secretary was authorized to incorporate these changes in the regulations.

The Secretary next reported on the recommendations of the Speech Committee. These changes were somewhat involved and suggested that competition be dropped at the state level for speech participants. It was the opinion of the Board that we were not ready to make these radical changes at this time, but that the speech work at the state level should be continued for Class B and C schools, but that the minor editorial changes in the music and speech regulations be approved. The Secretary was authorized to proceed with the publication of the Handbook.

The Board studied the financial reports compiled by the Secretary and attention was specifically called to the decreasing income from basket-ball tournaments and the possibility of increasing this income through the assessment of district basketball tournament receipts. The Chairman agreed to appoint a committee to make a study of this possibility and report at some future meeting of the Board.

The Chair called for a report of the Trophy Committee which had held several meetings on the afternoon and evening of the seventh and again at noon on June 8. It was duly moved, seconded, and carried that trophies be awarded as follows for the next three year period.

It was moved by Thompson, seconded by Whiting, and carried that one official should be sent to Chicago for each of the wrestling, football, and basketball clinics.

The Secretary was instructed to set up clinics in football, basketball, and wrestling after a conference with the clinic leaders.

The State Debate Contest was set for Bismarck on February 17, and 18, 1961, and an East and West Divisional Debate at Fargo and Minot respectively on February 4.

The State B-C Music and Speech contest was set at Jamestown College on May 5, 1961.

The Board suggested that a list of all officials who had failed to attend a basketball clinic should be sent to employing schools so that they would know which officials had attended clinics.

The Washnieski incident of last year was reviewed and discussed and Mr. Washnieski was asked to meet with the Board. A special session was held later at which Mr. Washnieski appeared and the Board reprimanded him for his actions in the incident and advised him that a repetition of this occurrence would make it necessary for him to be suspended from the organization.

It was agreed to recommend to the group that football officials be required to attend clinics as well as basketball officials. It was also agreed that it should become mandatory to take the test in both football and basketball at least once in a two year period.

The importance of developing wrestling clinics was discussed and it was agreed to recommend that wrestling be included as one of the sports in which registration would be required.

There being no further business this meeting adjourned until after the general meeting of the Association on Saturday.

Following the annual meeting of the Association the Board met to reorganize itself for the ensuing year. The following officers were selected: President - Al Meyer, Vice-President - Eddie Agre.

- (1) It was duly moved by Grande and seconded by Agre that the Officials Association adopt the policy of enforcing Rule 3, Section 4, in both first and second team games of basketball.
- (2) It was duly moved by Helm and seconded by Buehler and carried that a list be made of all basketball officials who had failed to attend a rules clinic and that this list be published and mailed to all employing schools.
- (3) The group endorsed the policy that tests be required of all officials in both football and basketball at least once in two years, effective with the 1960-61 season.
- (4) It was duly moved by Helm and seconded by McCord that attendance at football clinics be made mandatory for all officials beginning in 1960.
- (5) It was recommended that football clinics be held at least by the week prior to the opening of school
- (6) It was agreed that wrestling should be included in the sports in which officials shall be required to register.
- (7) It was noted that this year the terms of Eddie Agre from the southwest area and Sid Grande of the southeast area expire. The two groups were asked to caucus and submit nominations for these two vacancies on the Board of Directors. The name of Eddie Agre was submitted from the southwest section and Sid Grande from the southeast section. Nominations were called for from the floor and none were presented. It was duly moved and seconded that a unanimous ballot be cast for these two candidates and they be declared elected to their positions. The motion was carried and they were so declared elected.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.




