### **FOREWARD**

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 37th Annual Handbook of the Association which contains an historical and statistical account of the years operations. In order to better understand the operations of the Association, it is necessary to specifically mention certain items as they would otherwise be missed by most readers.

- 1. There has been a definite tendency for small high schools to reorganize with the larger town high schools and this has resulted in a decrease in the membership of the Association. It has also resulted in an increase in the number of "B" schools with a corresponding drop in Class "C" schools. The strictly rural district has practically disappeared in some counties and the territory served by larger reorganized districts operating a high school. It appears that these changes will eventually make it possible to divide the schools into two classes of "A" and "B".
- 2. The reactivation of the court action to compel the Association to make certain awards which are alleged to have been won at the 1957 State Golf Tournament and the Roosevelt High School eligibility case in our sister state of Minnesota has again furnished critics with material to criticize the Association for its regulations on post-season contests.

The Association again appeared before the Supreme Court of the state to request that they set aside a writ of prohibition granted by the District Court without a hearing. No decision on this request has yet been given by the court with the result that an incident in the spring of 1957 is still unresolved in the summer of 1961.

- 3. During the current year, the Board of Directors was obliged to adopt temporary measures to eliminate certain subsidies to schools for expenses to various state meets due to the decreasing revenues from basketball tournaments and the increased costs of operation. Increased tournament revenue and the 5% assessment on district basketball receipts indicate that the subsidies may be partly restored in the near future.
- 4. The phenomenal development of bowling over the state has raised certain problems relative to the status of this sport in our high schools. Some high schools provide for this sport in physical education classes while others have an official high school bowling team. Others do not sponsor the sport in any manner. The holding of high school bowling tournaments for high school teams, non-high school teams and semi-high school teams, complicates the problem and raises the question of responsibility for the rules and regulations under which such tournaments operate. A solution to the many problems presented in this rapidly growing sport must be found in the near future.
- 5. The closing of the small school, the heavy program imposed on a limited staff has reduced the number of schools playing girls' interscholastic basketball to a scattered few schools in three counties of the state and made the state girls' basketball tournament a mere local affair

with the result that no Association sponsored girls' state basketball tournament was held this year.

- 6. Upon advice from the schools participating in baseball, the State Baseball Tournament was changed from an eight team—three day tourney to a four team—one day tournament. From all indications this move has met with general approval of the participating schools.
- 7. A questionnaire on the proposal to submit a bid for the Northwest Bell Telephone Company building in Valley City for office quarters of the Association received an overwhelming four to one majority from the member schools and the Board of Directors authorized the submission of a bid on the property when the company is ready to receive such bids. It appears that this property may not be available until later this fall when all changes to the dial system will be completed.
- 8. The A. A. B. F. still continues to be a major activity of the Association and one that is taking an increasing share of the available time of the office staff. The number of pupils protected and the number of claims have far exceeded expectations and are the greatest in the history of the fund. Projected rate increases have not been adequate to meet the demands on the fund. The interested reader is referred to the statistical information and tables in the text of the handbook. If patrons of the fund continue to make increased demands on the fund there is no alternative than to raise rates to meet these demands or follow the precedent of many state associations in eliminating this important service.
- 9. Increased participation is noted in all activities. Music and speech activities continue to expand. In debate another classification will be added next year to provide competition for a "B" debate squad.

Increased participation in the newest sport of wrestling has made it necessary to add another regional center in that sport.

Both a sand greens and a grass greens tournament will be held next spring in golf.

10. In general, the Association has experienced another successful year and certainly much of the success must be attributed to the splendid assistance and cooperation received from the member schools and the hundreds of private citizens who have assisted in the administration of the varied association programs.

The Board of Directors and the office staff join to express our appreciation for the many kindnesses shown over the past year.

### BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Valley City, North Dakota - August 18, 1960

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City, North Dakota, on August 18, 1960, at 9:00 A. M. with all members present except M. F. Peterson.

The first order of business was a discussion of the publicity pamphlet which had been proposed by member Robinson. It was the opinion of the Board that final action on this matter should be deferred until the finances of the Association could be fully explored and additional quotations received from other printers.

Douglas Veitch of West Fargo, his mother, and Attorney Crothers appeared before the Board to discuss his eligibility status. In June the Board had considered his eligibility status and had ruled that he was ineligible at West Fargo for a period of eighteen weeks, inasmuch as he had transferred to West Fargo from Miles City, Montana. The secretary was instructed to contact Juvenile Commissioner Lieb of Fargo to uncover the true facts in the situation. It was the opinion of the Board that if he were assigned to attend school in Miles City through an actual court order that this order should be respected. The secretary was instructed to obtain all the facts and again poll the Board concerning his status.

The next order of business was a report of the Finance Committee consisting of F. U. Smith, Chairman, Barton Thompson, M. C. Olson, and L. T. Havig which had held a committee meeting on August 17. This committee reported that some adjustments must be made in both the income and expenditures of the Association to bring income and expenses into balance. The following recommendations were presented to the Board for their consideration:

- The committee suggest that there is a possibility of added income through an assessment of district tournament receipts.
- Possibility of making the AAB Fund self-supporting through charging of a sufficient additional dues to cover the administrative costs of the Fund.
- That charges made at the respective regional and state tournaments should be reviewed and possibly raised to secure additional revenue.
- 4. That admission should be charged at the State Track Meet.

To curtail expenses the committee offered the following suggestions:

1. The elimination of mileage to track, tennis, and golf participants at the state meets.

- That payments of team expenses in wrestling and baseball should be limited to that which could be paid out of the gate receipts.
- 3. Elimination of subsidies to the State Science Fair and the P. E. R. A.
- Reduce the number of Activity Bulletins published to four or five issues per year.
- To pay expenses for ten men instead of twelve at the Class A and B regionals and state basketball tournaments.
- 6. Eliminate the publication of the calendar or reduce the cost of the publication by a change of style of the calendar.

The Board carefully considered each of the committee's suggestions and after careful consideration adopted the following:

- 1. All sub-district and district basketball tournaments should be assessed 5% of the gross receipts and this amount contributed to the General Fund of the High School Activities Association.
- 2. That admissions of \$1.00 for adults and 50c for students should be charged at all state track meets.
- The following price schedule for all state and Class A, B, and C basketball tournaments was set as follows:

In order to reduce the amount of expenditure, the Board adopted the following policies:

- 1. Eliminate all team mileage to the state track, tennis, and golf tournaments and pay mileage to the state baseball and wrestling tournaments only insofar as receipts would permit.
- 2. Eliminate the \$150.00 subsidies to the State Science Fair and to the P. E. R. A.
- 3. Mileage at all regional and state basketball tournaments shall be allowed for ten players instead of the twelve formerly permitted in Class A and B tournaments.
- 4. The Board also considered reducing the number of Activities Bulletins, but was of the opinion that the Bulletin should be published monthly at least for the current year until our financial status has been more accurately determined.
- It was also agreed that the service of publishing the calendar should be continued as an important method of developing good public relations.
- 6. It was also agreed that the proposed charge of additional dues to schools carrying the AABF protection should be tabled until an appraisal could be made of the present proposed curtailments.

The next order of business was the determination of manager's fees for the East and West divisional tournaments. Upon motion of Whiting and second by Pederson, it was agreed that the manager's fees for each of the Class A East divisional tournaments should be \$50.00 and the one West Class A divisional tournament \$75.00 and that the fees for all state tournaments should remain the same as last year.

It was moved by Hanson and seconded by Olson, that inasmuch as the University—A. C. basketball series was scheduled at the University on March 3, and 4, 1961, that the Northeast Class A Basketball Tournament be rescheduled at the University on March 1, and 2, 1961. The motion carried.

The Board next discussed the present elimination plans for the two Eastern divisional tournaments and agreed to recommend to the East Class A schools that the team with the highest seasons record in each division be seeded directly into the State Class A Tournament and that the four lower teams in each division play off to select one representative from each division to enter the State Class A tournament. Further, that these tournaments pair team five against two and three against four for the first night's games with the winners playing off the second evening. No consolation games to be played. Such action was taken because of the difficulty of staging an elimination game between the close of the season on February 25, and the divisional tournament on March 1.

The next order of business was the opening of basketball bids and the contract for either the RSS or the RLO Rawlings ball at \$15.29 per ball F.O.B. Bismarck was awarded to the Sioux Sporting Goods Company

of Bismarck. The secretary was instructed to canvass a number of representative basketball coaches to determine their preference of balls.

The report of the special Officials Committee which had previously met was called for and the following officials were selected by the Board for the 1960-61 basketball tournament series:

It was agreed that officials should be paid on the same per game basis as the previous year, namely \$20.00 per game for all state and Class B regional basketball tournaments and \$15.00 for all Class C regional games.

It was also agreed that the managers of the respective state tournaments should be asked to meet with the Board at their Annual Meeting in October to discuss tournament plans.

The Board accepted the resignations of members Pederson and Hanson, inasmuch as they had changed classification of schools and were no longer eligible to serve on the Board as the official representatives of their former class of schools. On motion of Whiting, Warren Pederson was nominated to fill the Class B vacancy until the January meeting of the Board or until a successor had been duly selected as provided in the Constitution and By-laws of the Association. It was agreed to name Superintendent Kenneth Zenner of Arthur who was a former Class C representative on the Board of Directors to the Class C vacancy until the January meeting or a successor had been selected.

The Chair called for a report of the committee on district music and speech charges, but no report was available at this time and this committee consisting of members Smith, Thompson, and Pederson were requested to report at the next meeting of the Board in October.

The Board next proceeded to study the budget submitted by the secretary and agreed on the following budget:

The following program was agreed to for the Annual Meeting on Thursday, October 20, at Grand Forks:

A discussion of Association finances by President L. T. Havig.

A discussion of the Accident Benefit Fund by Secretary Abrahamson.

An address by National Federation Executive Secretary C. B. Fagan or his assistant, Mr. Arnold.

The application of Carrington to become a Class A school was read to the Board and accepted, effective with the beginning of the 1962-63 school term as provided in the Constitution and By-laws. The application of Oak Grove High School to become a Class A school was not considered a valid application since the enrollment at the present time is not 200 or more as required in the Constitution and By-laws. The secretary was instructed to notify Oak Grove that it would be necessary for them to file another application when their enrollment reached the point that entitled them to make such an application.

The Board agreed to meet at 3:00 P. M. on Wednesday, October 19, at Grand Forks.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:30 P. M.

### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING**

October 19-20, 1960 - Grand Forks, North Dakota

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Central High School at Grand Forks on Wednesday, October 19, 1960, at 3:00 P. M. Members M. F. Peterson and D. B. Whiting were absent. Members Pederson and Zenner had previously been appointed to fill certain vacancies on the Board until their successors could be determined and were present at this meeting.

The first order of business was to hear Superintendent Peter Simmet of Gilby who outlined to the Board the status of Gilby, Forest River, and Inkster high schools which had become a part of the Midway High School District. Mr. Simmet reported that the State Department had recognized these high schools as one unit and that at the present time work was progressing on a central building which would be available with the opening of the 1961-62 school term. He reported that their organization permitted an exchange of certain faculty members between the three high schools and that it was to their interests to be considered as one unified high school. After studying the Midway school district problem it was duly

moved by Thompson and seconded by Zenner that the three high schools be considered as one unit in the administration of their interscholastic activities and that these schools be permitted to field a unified basketball team to represent all three high schools and inasmuch as the enrollment was over 145 students that this school be considered a Class B school and assigned to District No. 5, Class B. The motion was carried.

Superintendent T. E. Simle, Principal C. S. Bjorlie, and Principal L. W. Hanson, state tourney managers of the various state basketball tournaments met with the Board to discuss tournament problems.

The application of St. Gertrude's High School of Raleigh to attain Class B status was reviewed and on motion of Pederson and second by Olson this request was denied for this year inasmuch as St. Gertrude's did not have an enrollment of 56 students in grades 9 - 12 which would qualify them for such an application under Article II, Section II of the bylaws of the Association.

The following applications for Class B status and assignments were made: Des Lacs—approved for Class B, assigned to District No. 11; Berthold—approved for Class B, assigned to District No. 11; Neche—approved for Class B, assigned to District No. 5.

The application of Lisbon High School for Class A status, which had been received by the secretary prior to September 1, was read to the Board and in harmony with the provisions in the constitution and by-laws, this application was accepted and approved effective with the opening of the 1962-63 school term.

Clarence Laber of Devils Lake, North Dakota, was appointed as the official North Dakota delegate to the National Alliance Football Rules Meeting to be held at Chicago on January 3, and 4, 1961. Coach Maynard Huisman of Mott was named as an alternate in the event that Mr. Laber could not attend.

Barton Thompson was appointed to attend the NUEA Meeting in St. Louis, Missouri, December 27 - 28, 1960, as the official representative from North Dakota.

An official application for membership in the North Dakota High School Activities Association from Marmot School District No. 5 of Morton County signed by H. Joos, president of the board of education, and Thomas Krause of the Mandan Training School was read to the Board. This application was considered at some length and it was the opinion of the Board that this application should not be accepted without further study and it was duly moved and seconded that the application be tabled. The motion was carried. The secretary was instructed to contact several other states and ascertain their policies relative to the admission of training schools for boys in their respective states.

The Board next considered the status of foreign exchange students who were sent to study in North Dakota schools by the American Field Service and similar sponsoring organizations. With an increasing number of students sent to America under the AFS program it was highly probable

that at least some of these superior students might wish to participate in the interscholastic program of the high schools and the question of their eligibility to represent their respective high schools had been raised in some quarters. After exploring this matter at some length it was the opinion of the Board that these students should be required to attend for a period of eighteen weeks before being eligible to represent their new high school and that all eligibility rules should apply to them in the same manner that it applied to the regular high school students in the school.

The Board next listened to the report of a committee on the adjudicator's fees recommended for district music and speech contests. It was the recommendation of this committee that \$40.00 per diem plus expenses should be an adequate compensation for adjudicating services at district contests and that these recommendations should be submitted to the respective music and speech districts.

The Board next compared prices for the proposed publicity pamphlet which had been tabled at the August meeting of the Board. New prices had been received and several new ideas submitted by the Brown Lithographing Company of Valley City and it was the opinion of the Board that a publicity pamphlet should be authorized and that a quantity of 25,000 should be prepared for distribution to the schools of the state. The maximum price quoted for this publication was \$434.30 for a two color printing job in the form of a three fold, eight page folder and the secretary and Mr. Robinson were instructed to proceed with such a publication.

The Board next considered a survey made of schools interested in baseball and on the basis of this survey reduced the State High School Baseball Tournament to a one day four team tourney. The secretary was instructed to notify the tournament manager and the schools of this change.

The secretary next read a letter from Tom Neuberger, cross-country coach at the A. C. in Fargo in which he offered to conduct a state cross-country meet on October 29, and asked for official recognition of this as a state cross-country meet. The Board voted to so recognize this meet and authorized the purchase of appropriate trophies and medals.

A letter from Leonard Marti, athletic director of the University of North Dakota, urging the Association to promote an official state hockey tournament was read to the Board. It was the opinion of the Board that the Association should not promote a state hockey tournament at this time, but that Mr. Marti could be authorized to proceed with an invitational hockey tournament, should he so desire and that such a function would be sanctioned by the Association.

. The present television policies in telecasting state and regional basket-ball tournaments were reviewed and it was agreed to again send out bids for the television of the 1961 tournament series, such bids to be closed on December 15, 1960. Members Olson and Zenner and the secretary were authorized as a committee to meet and award bids at 2:00 P. M. on December 17, 1960.

A letter from Mr. Moe of Bismarck representing the Commercial Travelers requesting permission to promote an East-West football game for charity was read to the Board. Plans had been made to have an official representative at this Board meeting, but such plans did not materialize. No action was taken on this proposal.

The application of Beulah High School to be transferred from the Bismarck to the Dickinson district in music and speech activities was read and this application granted.

The Board adjourned to meet following the general assembly meeting on Thursday.

The Board again assembled immediately following the general Association meeting with all members present except Peterson and Whiting.

In harmony with instructions of the general assembly, the Board agreed to reinstate the javelin as a field event in the 1961 track meets.

Superintendent Reitan of Cando presented an eligibility problem of a special student who was carrying three regular subjects in high school. Mr. Reitan reported that this lad was currently passing in shop, typing, and history, and inasmuch as these subjects have a credit value of ½ unit per semester and this is the first year this lad was enrolled in high school that this lad should be immediately eligible for high school competition provided the superintendent could verify him passing in the three high school subjects.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at approximately 5:00 P. M., Thursday, October 20, 1960.

The Board declared Joel A. Davy and F. U. Smith elected to the Board of Directors for a three year term effective July 1, 1961. Warren Pederson was declared elected to the Board of Directors for a three year term effective July 1, 1961. Ell Kay Larson was declared elected to the Board of Directors for the unexpired term of Warren Pederson. It was duly moved by Robinson and seconded by Smith that Ell Kay Larson be seated on the Board effective with the March meeting of the Board of Directors. The motion carried.

The complete financial report and a list of checks issued since the beginning of business on July 1, 1960, was presented to the Board and some time was spent reviewing the financial report.

Member Barton Thompson gave a complete report of his attendance at the N. U. E. A. meeting at St. Louis,

Superintendent J. E. Oien of Leonard met with the Board relative to the eligibility of James DeVries of Leonard. Early in January James DeVries came to live with his grandmother at Leonard, as the grandfather had recently passed away and left her alone. It was the full intent for this lad to continue to live with his grandmother until he completed his high school education at Leonard. The parents had plans of moving to the Leonard vicinity sometime in the future, as the farm in Minnesota on which they had been living had been sold and it would be necessary for them to change residence. Mr. Oien appeared to determine when this lad would become eligible to represent Leonard High School in interscholastic activities. The Board ruled that this lad would not be eligible to represent Leonard High School until his parents had actually moved to the Leonard vicinity or until he had attended Leonard High School for the time prescribed in the by-laws in tranferring schools.

Superintendent H. G. Sorenson and Coach Melvin Panjkovich of Wing appeared before the Board concerning the eligibility of one Robert Pearson. This lad, due to illness, was obliged to drop out of school during the second semester of the 1959-1960 school term and he remained out of school under doctor's orders until December of 1960, when he was again permitted to resume his school studies. Special arrangements had been made to permit this lad to complete his second semesters work of last year and at the opening of the second semester he had completed his credits and was enrolled in the regular courses of the Wing High School. It appeared further that the State Department of Public Instruction had

permitted the school to recognize the credits this lad had earned without completely fulfilling the attendance requirements. It was duly moved, seconded, and carried that the Pearson lad should be eligible to participate in interscholastic activities at the opening of the second semester if a doctor's statement was filed with the school and with the Association office confirming the fact that he was out of school under the care of a physician and provided that his work was of such a caliber that he continued to pass in a minimum of three subjects.

The Board next considered the case of Richard Harrington of Mayville High School. This lad enrolled at Phillips Exeter Academy in New Hampshire in the fall of 1960 and after attending there until the latter part of October, he withdrew from this school and re-enrolled at Mayville High School, his former school. It appears that this lad returned to Mayville because of illness in the family. A letter was read from Coach Dougherty of Mayville High School outlining the facts in the case and also a letter from the mother, Mrs. M. V. Harrington, asking for a reappraisal of this case. The Board discussed this case at length and agreed that according to our regulations this lad was a transfer student and would not regain his eligibility until the end of the second semester of the 1960-1961 school term.

Superintendent Neland Haavig of Walhalla appeared before the Board relative to the eligibility of Ronald and David Godfrey of Walhalla. These boys were former residents of Hannah and on August 5, 1960, their mother died very suddenly and on December 15, 1960, their father also passed away. Arrangements were made for these lads to be placed in the home of an older sister in Walhalla. The Board agreed that these lads should become immediately eligible at Walhalla if an affidavit is furnished this office showing that their residence is in the Walhalla school district and that the Walhalla school district also considers them as residents of the district.

Superintendent Tryhus of Buffalo appeared before the Board to discuss the eligibility of one Glen Lee of Alice, North Dakota. Glen Lee formerly lived at Alice and attended high school at Enderlin. On September 17, his mother passed away and a home was no longer maintained at Alice. The lad was taken into the home of a sister who resided at Buffalo, North Dakota. It was agreed by the Board that if papers could be secured from the Welfare Board indicating that his residence is with his sister at Buffalo that this lad should be declared eligible to represent Buffalo High School inasmuch as he had no other home to which to go,

The secretary reported an infraction of the eligibility rules by the school authorities of the St. Mary's High School at Devils Lake. Father Williams had reported to the Association office a few days previous that inadvertently they had played a lad during the entire first semester who had passed only two subjects the preceding semester. This was an oversight on the part of the new administration that had taken over at St. Mary's the past September. This infraction was voluntarily reported by the school authorities at St. Mary's and they had advised the executive secretary that they would abide by the decisions of the Board in this matter. The Board agreed that all games in which this ineligible lad par-

ticipated must be forfeited and that letters be directed to all schools which St. Mary's had played during the year forfeiting such contests and further, inasmuch as this ineligible player had already participated for one semester that he should be declared ineligible for the rest of the year. The secretary was instructed to advise St. Mary's of this penalty.

Superintendent James Broschat of Hamilton appeared before the Board and advised the Board that he was continuing as the coach of the Hamilton High School, but that he was being assisted by a party outside of the school who donated these services. Mr. Broschat advised the Board that at all times he was responsible for the team and accompanied them on all their out of town trips. It was the consensus of the Board that this arrangement satisfied our requirements relative to the employment of coaches.

The request of Souris to change music districts this year from Minot to Devils Lake was reported to the Board. This request was denied because Souris Is not a borderline school but is much closer to Minot than Devils Lake.

L. W. Hanson, manager of the State Class A Tournament, met with the Board to discuss certain details of the Class A Tournament. The Board discussed the procedure to follow in case of ties in either the Northeast or Southeast Class A districts and it was agreed that in the event no team wins a clear title to first place in these sections that the fourth and fifth teams should play off to determine the fourth place winner and all four teams then be required to play in a tournament to determine the two teams to represent each district. In such a tournament the two leading teams should be seeded in opposite brackets. Since the formula is used to determine positions in the Western Class A group there is little or no possibility of a tie for positions to occur and the Board agreed to abide by its former decision to seed the two top teams directly into the state tournament.

The Board examined the publicity pamphlet and discussed possible means of distribution of this publication. It was duly moved by Thompson and seconded by Pederson that a vote of thanks be extended to Rex Robinson in the preparation of the publicity pamphlet. The motion was carried.

The question of cheerleaders clinics for 1961-1962 was discussed and it was agreed that these clinics should be held again next fall.

The secretary briefed the Board on the present status of the court case of the Association versus Schafer.

The Board next discussed the possibility of submitting a bid on the Northwest Bell Telephone building in Valley City for office purposes and since the ballots indicated a majority of nearly four to one for submitting such a bid, the consensus of the Board was that a bid should be submitted. Members Smith and Olson were appointed to a special committee with the secretary to consult with either an architect or an experienced building contractor and to thus determine a fair and reasonable

value of the property and it was the understanding that this committee would advise the Board of their findings before any final bid is submitted on the property.

The secretary reported that some 33,000 cancelled checks representing Association business up to a year ago had been microfilmed through the cooperation of the American National Bank of Valley City. The question of keeping any of the old records was discussed by the Board and it was agreed that old claims and other papers which were more than six years old could be destroyed inasmuch as the statute of limitations would bar any action on transactions which took place prior to that time.

The matter of lifetime passes to the Board of Directors was discussed and the secretary was instructed to provide these passes to all Board members who had not received them.

It was agreed that tournament trophies should be presented by the following:

State Class A Tournament - F. U. Smith and L. T. Havig

State Class B Tournament - Warren Pederson and Barton Thompson

State Class C Tournament - M. F. Peterson

Class A Divisionals — Tournament Managers in the absence of any Board member.

It was agreed that the next meeting of the Board of Directors would be in Minot on Friday, March 17, at 9:00 A.M.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned.

### NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION Valley City, North Dakota MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Minot, North Dakota — March 17, 1961

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Minot at the Elks Club beginning at 9:00 A. M., March 17, 1961, with all members present except M. F. Peterson.

The minutes of the previous meeting had been mimeographed and presented to each Board member and their reading was waived.

The Board was also furnished with a complete financial report of the affairs of the Association up to date and some time was spent in reviewing this report of the General Fund and the Accident Benefit Fund. Attention was called to the large number of claims that had been presented against the Fund this year. It was moved by Thompson and

seconded by Pederson that this financial report be accepted as submitted. A running report of all checks issued between the last meeting and this one was also presented to the Board.

Sid Grande, representing the North Dakota Officials Association Board of Directors, met with the Board and volunteered their services to procure officials for the 1962 basketball tournaments.

The next order of business was a report of the Building Committee which had been previously appointed to appraise the Northwest Bell Telephone building in Valley City which was later to be vacated and sold. The committee reported that the building had been thoroughly inspected and they had received the recommendations of a building contractor as to its value. The committee further reported the progress that had been made toward the actual purchase of this building. It was duly moved by Thompson and seconded by Robinson that the Building Committee be authorized to submit a maximum bid of if necessary to procure this building for the Association. The motion was carried.

The secretary reported that the trophy awards made to the Herff Jones Company were never ordered or delivered due to the fact that James Richmire, their agent, had left the employ of the company and that at the last moment trophies for debate and wrestling had been ordered on an emergency basis from the Toring Company. The matter of future purchases of trophies awarded to the Herff Jones Company was referred to the Trophy Committee for a report at either the June or August meeting.

It was also noted that a number of the trophies furnished by the Balfour Company were delivered without the medallion attached and it was duly moved by Whiting, seconded by Olson, and carried that the agent Walter Sherman be billed one dollar per trophy for those orders on which the medallions were not attached.

Some time was spent discussing the possibility of a publicity pamphlet on the Accident Benefit Fund with no action taken at this time. The Chair, however, appointed Rex Robinson and Barton Thompson to work with the secretary to make a study of the practicability of such a pamphlet

Honorary passes were issued to each of the Board members who had not previously received one.

The next order of business was a discussion of a date when football practice should be authorized in the fall. It again appeared that some schools would be starting school the last week of August while some would begin on the Tuesday following Labor Day. It was voted to authorize the opening of football practice on Thursday, August 17, 1961.

The Board next considered the selection of delegates to attend the annual meeting of the National Federation to be held at French Lick, Indiana, July 2-6, 1961. The following delegates were selected: L. T. Havig, M. C. Olson, D. B. Whiting

The next order of business was the reorganization of the Board effective July 1. M. C. Olson was named president of the Board and F. U. Smith vice-president.

The Board discussed the calendar project and agreed that this project should be continued.

Cheerleaders clinic sites were set at Mandan, Minot, Devils Lake, and Valley City and it was agreed that a registration fee of one dollar should be charged for each cheerleader who attends the clinic.

President Havig reported that there would be a new classification of schools effective the next school year and that this new classification may require the rewording of a section of our constitution to conform with the State Department regulations. The following committee was appointed to confer with the State Department and to report to the Board any changes that would be necessary and desirable in our constitution and by-laws: D. B. Whiting, Warren Pederson.

The Board next heard applications from Class C schools to be advanced into Class B status and made assignments as follows:

Rhame – Application Approved – Assigned to District No. 16 Scranton – Application Approved – Assigned to District No. 16 Marion – Application Approved – Assigned to District No. 2 Goodrich – Application Approved – Assigned to District No. 9

It was also reported that Richardton would be establishing a new high school. No formal application had been presented however at this time. It was agreed that Richardton and the Abbey should both be assigned to District No. 15 if and when such an application is presented.

A letter was received from Superintendent Syverson of Hampden requesting a transfer from District No. 7 Class C to District No. 6 Class C. This request was granted and the secretary was instructed to inform Mr. Syverson of the Board's action.

The Board next discussed the method used in the selection of basket-ball and wrestling officials for regional and state tournaments and it was agreed that both basketball and wrestling officials should be selected by a committee representing each class of school and a representative from the Officials Association. The Chair appointed the following members to the Officials Committee:

M. C. Olson — Wrestling Warren Pederson — Class B Ell Kay Larson — Class C Joel A. Davy — Class A

It was agreed to operate football, basketball, and wrestling clinics in the same manner as was used during the past year.

The Board agreed to invite Joel Davy, the newly elected member to the Board, to be present at the June meeting of the Board, even though he does not officially take office until July 1.

The secretary read a letter from Superintendent Campbell of Haynes outlining a procedure for the selection of district basketball officials. No action was taken on this plan at this time.

The location of wrestling regions for the next season was discussed at some length and it was agreed that final action on this problem would be taken at a later meeting of the Board. The secretary was instructed to mimeograph the recommendations of the Wrestling Committee and submit their recommendations to the Board.

The question of dates and sites for the 1962 basketball tournaments was deferred until a later meeting.

The next order of business was a discussion of salaries to be paid employees of the Association and it was duly moved by Pederson, seconded by Thompson, and carried that the salary of Mrs. Vandestreek and Mrs. Lutz be raised \$200 per annum, effective July 1, 1961. The question of an adjustment in the salary of the executive secretary was discussed with no action taken and the matter was referred to a committee appointed by President Havig consisting of F. U. Smith, M. C. Olson, and D. B. Whiting, with instructions to report at the next meeting of the Board.

The secretary next read a request of the Valley City Athletic Club to stage a girls invitational golf tournament this spring. It was agreed that this golf tournament should be sanctioned.

Attention was called to the proposal of the Minot Junior Chamber of Commerce to present a most valuable player award at the conclusion of the Class B tournament in Minot. It was the opinion of the Board that this presentation would be contrary to the policies of the Board of Directors and that the secretary should instruct the tournament manager that the Board did not approve the selection of such a player and that this project should be abandoned as contrary to the best interests of the tourney participants. This was done and it was subsequently announced that the most valuable player award would not be given.

The Board agreed to meet in Valley City at 9:00 A.M., June 8 and 9, 1961. There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City on June 9, 1961, with all members present.

The first order of business was the examination of the financial reports of the Association to June 7, 1961. Each Board member had been given a complete financial report of the general business operations and the Accident Benefit Fund.

The Building Committee reported that there had been no further developments on the purchase of the Northwest Bell Telephone Company building in Valley City but that it does now appear that sealed bids will be called for sometime in the future. No action was taken on this report and it was agreed to leave the matter until the August meeting or if necessary to call a special meeting should bids be called for prior to the August meeting.

The Accrediting Committee reported that it had examined the Constitution and By-laws of the Association and also checked with the State Superintendent of Public Instruction relative to the new proposed classification of schools and recommended that Article III, Section I, of the Con stitution be amended to read as follows:

"Any high school, so classified by the State Department of Public Instruction, may become a member of the Association by agreeing to abide by the rules of the Association as set forth in its Constitution and By-laws, and by payment of the annual dues as hereinafter provided. The membership year shall be from September 1 to August 31 following."

It was duly moved by Whiting and seconded by Thompson that the report of this committee be accepted by the Board and that the amendment should be presented at the annual fall meeting of the Association. The motion was carried.

After examining the report of the Accident Benefit Fund operations for the current year it was duly moved by Robinson and seconded by Pederson that the rates for grade and rural protection be increased to fifty cents per student for the 1961-1962 school year. The motion was duly carried.

The question of mileage to teams participating in wrestling, track, and baseball was discussed by the Board and it was agreed that mileage allowance for each of these sports should be allowed if the individual sport program showed a profit.

The Board next considered the application of several Class C schools to be transferred into Class B and it was duly moved, seconded, and carried that-

Edinburg be accepted into Class B and assigned to either District 5 or 6 in accordance with their choice;

Wimbledon be placed in Class B and assigned to District 3;

South Heart be placed in Class B and assigned to District 15;

Montpelier be placed in Class B and assigned to District 2.

A letter was read to the Board from Principal C. S. Bjorlie of Minot Model High School requesting to be transferred from District 9 to District 10. Upon motion by Whiting and second by Robinson it was agreed to transfer Minot Model to District 10.

It was also agreed to transfer Assumption Abbey from District 16 to District 15 Class B.

The Board next considered the recommendations of the Music Advisory Committee and it was agreed to change the classification of instrumental ensembles as follows:

Entries in woodwind ensembles shall be limited to five, distributed as follows:

All Saxophone Ensemble - Limited to one entry

All Clarinet Ensemble

 Limited to one entry - Limited to one entry

All Flute Ensemble Mixed Ensemble

- Limited to two entries

Brass ensembles limited to five entries, distributed as follows:

All Cornet Ensemble

- Limited to one entry

All Trombone Ensemble - Limited to one entry

All French Horn Ensemble - Limited to one entry

Mixed Ensemble

- Limited to two entries

String ensembles will be limited to three entries.

Percussion ensembles shall be limited to three entries.

The Music Committee had also recommended that the State Class B-C Music and Speech Contest be held at Jamestown and this recommendation was accepted by the Board and the State Music and Speech Contest was scheduled at Jamestown for Friday, May 4, 1962.

The Board next reviewed the recommendations of the Speech Committee and agreed to accept their recommendation that a new speech classification entitled "Story Telling" be adopted for the 1961-1962 contest and festival.

It was agreed to add a new classification under debate for "B" squads, thus permitting entries of a regular team, a "B" team, and a novice team of beginning debaters.

It was also agreed to delete from the speech regulations the section which indicates that no ratings should be given in Class A speech festivals.

It was duly moved by Thompson and seconded by Peterson that the Association subsidize one-half of the expenses of a speech representative to a national or a regional speech meeting. The motion was carried.

The Trophy Committee next reported that the quality of the state basketball trophy was inferior and unacceptable and further that certain trophy awards made a year ago for state baseball, state and regional wrestling, golf, tennis, and debate were never filled. After general discussion the Board agreed to call for bids at 4:00 P. M. on August 17, for the following trophies for the years 1961-1962 and 1962-1963:

The salary of the executive secretary was discussed and it was agreed that there should be a \$700.00 increment added to the present salary.

The Board expressed its appreciation for the long and faithful service of President L. T. Havig who had been a member of the Board of Directors for the past seven years and whose term expires on July 1, 1961.

It was agreed that the Board should again meet at Valley City at 9:00 A.M. on August 18, 1961, and that the committee on trophies should meet at 4:00 P.M. on August 17, and the committee on officials at 7:30 P.M. on August 17.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
