#### **FOREWORD**

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 38th Annual Handbook of the Association which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operations. In order to keep the book from becoming to large it has been necessary to condense material whenever possible and eliminate some material included in former issues of the handbook.

To secure a better understanding of the yearly operations, the reader's attention is directed to the following important items of information or trends that are apparent from the year's business.

- 1. The tendency to close the small high school is evidenced by the drop in membership to 350 high schools and the increasing number of "C" schools electing to seek Class "B" status. The increasing tempo of such applications and the closing of many small high schools has prompted an amendment to the By-Laws of the Association to reduce the number of classifications of schools to two classes.
- 2. Particularly gratifying to association members was the long-awaited decision of the Supreme Court in the eligibility case, pending since 1957, in which the Supreme Court ruled that the Lower Court had erred in accepting jurisdiction on a moot question and had again erred in refusing to vacate a judgment sought by the Association. Partly as a result of the Supreme Court decision, the mandamus action to compel the Association to deliver the awards to the involved parties has been dismissed through agreement by both parties to the suit. Thus the final chapter has been written on the litigation that has been pending since 1957 and has involved two appearances before both the district and supreme courts of the state and has cost the Association considerable in both time and money.
- 3. Another milestone in the year's program is the procurement of the former Northwestern Bell Telephone building as a home for the Association. All preliminaries incidental to the actual occupancy of the building have been accomplished and the actual moving is only days away.
- 4. An important step taken by the Board of Directors was the adoption of certain general qualifications for applicants for the position of Assistant Secretary and the announcement that such applications would be received up to January 15, 1963. The rapidly expanding work of the Association has made such a step necessary.
- 5. The Accident Benefit Plan continues to expand beyond expectations. The number of children covered and the number of claims paid have greatly increased. Incidence of injury has increased in both town and rural schools. Patrons continually demand greater services and seek medical attention for minor injuries. As a result of the growth in claims, new rates are established for the coming year. Based on past experience, greater increases will be necessary in the future. It is estimated that 40% of the time of the office staff is devoted to accident claims. The time is not far distant when added clerical help is needed or machine office practices are introduced to save valuable time.

- 6. Schools continue to expand their programs and some of the hysteria generated by "Sputnik" seems to have subsided. More and more schools are coming to realize that a well-organized school program must include athletics, music and speech activities as well as the basic class subjects.
- 7. While most association activities are carried on without too many complications, it should be noted that the unusual rainy season did complicate the administration of the spring athletic program of track and baseball. For the first time in the history of the Association it was necessary to cancel two district track meets because of wet grounds, and the state baseball tournament was finally completed after three postponements and the elimination of the third and fourth place playoffs. Truly this is unpredictable North Dakotal
- 8. In general, it has been another successful year and again this office and the Board of Directors are mindful of the help and assistance by hundreds of school personnel and many private citizens in administering the activity program without your help it could not be done.

We are all truly grateful and express our deepest appreciation to you, one and all, for your time and efforts in promoting an important phase in the development of the thousands of boys and girls in the high schools of the state. Perhaps your help and interest will contribute something tangible and permanent in preserving the American way of life in this confused world of conflicting ideologies.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City, North Dakota, on August 18, 1961, with all members present.

A special Officials Committee and Trophy Committee of the Board had met previously on August 17.

The reading of the minutes of the previous session was waived inasmuch as each Board member had been presented with a copy of these minutes and they were further recorded in the Annual Handbook of the Association.

The first order of business was the examination of the audit report as submitted by Arnold Sandness, public accountant, of Valley City. Upon motion it was agreed to accept this audit report.

The Board next examined the complete financial report of the operations of the Association from July 1, 1961, to August 17, 1961.

The next order of business was the adoption of the 1961-62 budget which is as follows:

The Board next listened to the report of the Trophy Committee. Upon motion by Whiting and second by Thompson it was agreed to honor the contract for the state basketball trophies with the Allyard Trophy Company and that a new series be selected for basketball. Mr. Toring agreed to submit a new design at the October meeting of the Board.

Inasmuch as the displaying companies did not have a suitable trophy to present for baseball and wrestling, it was agreed that the Trophy Committee should be continued and that the Josten's Company should be asked to present possible trophies at the October meeting of the Board. The Trophy Committee was instructed to make a selection of trophies and present at the next meeting of the Board.

The Board next listened to the recommendations of the Officials Committee and upon motion by Davy and second by M. F. Peterson the following officials were to be tendered contracts for the 1961-1962 tournament series:

It was the recommendation of the committee that the regional wrestling officials shall be left to the regional wrestling managers to be selected from qualified officials in the respective areas.

The Board next opened the bids on basketballs for the 1961-62 district, regional, and state tournaments and it was found that the bid of the Gun and Reel Sports Shop of Jamestown for \$13.99 per ball for the B-1200 "Jet" Wilson Official Basketball was low and it was duly moved, seconded, and carried that this bid be accepted.

The Board next examined the expense allowance for officials and it was agreed to leave this expense allowance the same as before.

Upon motion by Thompson and second by M. F. Peterson the Board approved the action of the Building Committee in submitting a bid of \$28,501.67 for the telephone building and greed that this bid should be official from the Board of Directors to the Bell Telephone Company.

Gordon Teigen, director of the Student Union at the North Dakota State University, and Mr. Bill Crook of Rugby, president of the North Dakota American Junior Bowling Congress appeared before the Board to discuss the status of high school bowling in the state. The Board had previously sanctioned a state high school bowling tournament at the State University. However, it was found that only a very small portion of the teams entered were school teams and further, that very few schools in North Dakota sponsored any bowling activity whatsoever. The difficulty of operating a high school tournament under these conditions was fully discussed and it was the opinion of the Board that the High School Activities Association should no longer sanction such a type of tournament but that it would be a better arrangement for the AJBC to conduct this tournament under their auspices. It was therefore moved, seconded, and carried that the Board of Directors of the NDHSAA should go on record giving approval and encouragement to the AJBC program and that the tournament held at the State University should no longer be entitled a "State High School Bowling Tournament", but that it should be an official American Junior Bowling Congress Tournament and further, that the AJBC would continue to enforce their eligibility rules which in essence were those of our state High School Activities Association and they further would require that any participant in the AJBC program must refrain from bowling in any adult league or tournament where cash money or merchandise prizes were given. It was further agreed that this arrangement should be continued at the option of either group and that each group should be advised of the success or failure of this plan. It was the opinion of the Board that such an arrangement should implement the bowling program in the state of North Dakota without creating the complications that an official high school tournament in which only a part of the participants were from high schools and the majority from teams that had no school connection.

The Board next discussed the 1961-62 basketball tournaments and the secretary was instructed to contact Principal Lawrence Hanson to see if he would again manage the tournaments in Grand Forks and if he wished to be relieved to negotiate with the University officials for the management of these tournaments.

The prices charged for the State B and C basketball season tickets was re-examined and it was agreed that the prices for these tickets should be lowered to a maximum of \$5.00 to \$6.00 for season reserved in order to provide an inducement for fans to purchase season tickets rather than single session reserved seats.

The program for the annual meeting of the Association was discussed and member Whiting was instructed to contact Bud Wilkinson, chairman of the President's Physical Fitness Program and invite him to officially appear before the members of the Association at the annual meeting. In the event that Mr. Wilkinson could not appear personally, he was to be requested to send someone from his committee.

Chairman Olson suggested that tournament sites and dates should be selected at least two years in advance and the Board instructed the chairman to select a committee to draw up such a schedule. The chairman subsequently submitted the following names as members of this committee:

F. U. Smith, (Chairman), Warren Pederson, Ell Kay Larson, Don Whiting.

The question of reorganizing our Class A and B setup received some discussion by the Board and it appears that with the rapid closing of the Class C Schools that the time is not far distant when the state may be divided into two classes. It was the opinion of the Board that this matter should be brought to the attention of the different schools and that a committee on reorganization should be appointed by the president to make preliminary investigation of this problem. The chairman subsequently appointed the following committee:

Rex Robinson (Chairman), Joel Davy, Barton Thompson.

Superintendent Olson presented the question of eligibility of one Gene Goshee of Lisbon whose father was in the armed services and whose mother now was living in Lisbon due to the illness of her father. The boy was making his home with his mother in Lisbon. It was the opinion of the Board that this lad be declared eligible at Lisbon.

It was agreed that the next meeting of the Board should be in Minot at 3:00 P.M. on Wednesday, October 18. Reservations for the Board were made at the Holiday Spot Motel in Minot.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

#### MINUTES OF

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Holiday Spot Motel, Minot, North Dakota - October 18, 1961

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Minot at the Holiday Spot Motel at 2:00 P.M. on October 18, 1961, with all members present.

A complete financial report of the activities of the Association since July 1, 1961, was carefully reviewed by the Board.

Upon motion of Whiting and second of Pederson, applications of several high schools for B status were approved and assignments to districts were made as follows:

Binford - to District 6, Class B Buffalo - to District 3, Class B Central Valley (Buxton) - to District 4, Class B Donnybrook - to District 10, Class B Minnewaukan - to District 8, Class B

The transfer of Osnabrock High School from District 6C to 5C was approved on motion of Larson and second of Whiting.

The eligibility problem of Barry House, a ward of the Dakota Boys Ranch who had been returned to his home at Minot and enrolled in Minot Model High School, was reviewed. It appeared that prior to his placement with the Boys Ranch that this lad had attended Minot Central High School. It was the opinion of the Board that in enrolling at Minot Model High School this lad was changing schools and therefore ineligible for a period of eighteen weeks.

The eligibility of Richard Kopp of Beulah was reviewed and the mail vote of the Board was canvassed. The mail vote indicated on a divided vote that this lad was ineligible for a period of eighteen weeks inasmuch as he had transferred schools from Golden Valley to Beulah and had left the paternal residence to be with his mother on his own volition.

The case of Seth Larson of Carson was reviewed and it was the opinion of the Board that this lad should be immediately eligible to represent Carson High School.

The purchase agreement for the Northwestern Bell Telephone building in Valley City was reviewed by the Board and on motion of Whiting and second of Davy the officers, consisting of the president, vice-president, and executive secretary were authorized to sign this purchase agreement on behalf of the High School Activities Association and submit a deposit of \$1,500.00 to be applied on the purchase price as provided in the agreement.

Mr. K. Triggs of the Mandan Training School appeared before the Board and again appealed for admission of Marmot High School to membership in the Association. The matter was discussed at some length and upon motion of Whiting and second of Thompson it was moved to again

table this application for further study. The Chair called the roll on this question and it was found that six voted for the motion and three were opposed and the motion was declared carried.

It was moved by Robinson and seconded by Thompson that Maynard Huisman of Mott be named as a delegate to the National Football Rules Meeting in St. Louis on January 5 and 6, 1962, and that Sid Cichy of Shanley High School be named an alternate in the event that Huisman could not attend. The motion was carried.

It was duly moved, seconded, and carried that Secretary Abrahamson attend that N. U. E. A. Debate Meeting in New York on December 27 and 28, 1961.

The secretary was instructed to contact the speech group and advise them that the Activities Association would pay one-half of the expenses of one of their group to attend either the N. U. E. A. meeting in New York or the Central States Speech Meeting. Subsequently, the new speech organization advised the Board that they would prefer to send a delegate to the Central States Speech Meeting.

The Board next discussed the desirability of an amendment to the By-laws which would limit long distance trips as an award for athletic mittee consisting of Joel Davy - Chairman, Don Whiting, and Rex Robinson achievement and it was duly moved, seconded, and carried that a combe appointed to study the problem and submit a possible amendment to accomplish this purpose.

The Board next discussed radio and television policies for the 1962 basketball tournament series and it was the opinion of the Board that there should be a change in policy in both these fields. It was duly moved, seconded, and carried that the following tentative schedule of rates be set up for radio stations wishing to broadcasts regional or state tournament games:

For small class two radio stations with limited power – a suggested charge is \$25,00 for a single session and \$50.00 for a final game for each station carrying the broadcast.

For class one or the larger powered stations — \$50.00 for a single session and \$100.00 for the final session for each station broadcasting games.

The following tentative schedule was set up as a minimum for stations wishing to telecast state basketball tournaments:

\$500.00 for any session (other than the final session) for each station carrying the telecast and \$1,000.00 for the final session for any station telecasting the game.

The above schedules are tentative and subject to review by the Board should additional information indicate that these charges are not equitable.

The Board next discussed the starting date for basketball and it was explained that this starting date was determined by counting back twenty weeks from the date of the final state basketball tournament as provided

in the By-laws. Certain schools had pointed out that this shortened the season for the Class A schools and requests had been made to move this starting date up earlier for certain classes of schools. Upon motion by Whiting and second by Davy it was agreed to continue the November 6, 1961, starting date for basketball.

An attempt was made to define what is meant by "basketball practice" and it was the consensus of the Board that any time a coach worked with a special group of prospective basketball players either in physical education or at other times that this should constitute basketball practice. The use of a basketball or basketball drills when given in a regular physical education class to all members of that class at anytime during a regular physical education period is not to be construed as basketball practice.

The matter of institutional membership in the Basketball Hall of Fame was considered by the Board and it was agreed to take an institutional membership in this organization, provided the payment for this membership could be made in installments of anual payments of \$100.00 until the full membership fee is paid.

The Board discussed the procedure to be followed in case of ties in the season records of Class A schools in the Northeast and Southeast divisions and it was agreed to recommend to the East A schools that they adopt the same formula which is successfully used by the Western Class A schools to determine standings and avoid ties.

It was agreed to hold the State Wrestling Tournament at Minot State Teachers College under the management of the college officials.

The Board discussed the procedure for the Annual Meeting to be held on Thursday and the business to be presented at this meeting and instructed the secretary to pay an honorarium of \$75.00 to Dr. Paul Misner who had been engaged to address this meeting.

Following the adjournment of this meeting the Trophy Committee reported that they had examined trophies displayed by the Josten's Company and that they had made a selection for the State Wrestling Tournament with the top trophy costing \$21.50, the second place trophy \$20.90 and that regional trophies had been selected with the top price of \$14.35 and second place trophy \$13.90. This same trophy is to be used for the State Baseball Tournament.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned.

#### MINUTES OF

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Grand Pacific Hotel, Bismarck, North Dakota - January 28, 29, 1962

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Grand Pacific Hotel in Bismarck at 3:00 P. M January 28th, with all members present.

The Canvassing Committee, consisting of members Olson, Robinson and Secretary Abrahamson, reported that they had canvassed the annual election results and found them to be as follows:

A total of 273 votes were cast. Votes for directors were as follows:

Willard Solberg and G. A. Tooley were declared elected to the Board for Class B schools effective July 1, 1962. The question of amending Article III, Section I of the Constitution of the North Dakota High School Activities Association received a total of 238 favorable votes to 13 no votes, and it was therefore declared carried to read as follows:

#### Article III - Members

Section I: Any high school, so classified by the State Department of Public Instruction may become a member of the Association by agreeing to abide by the rules of the Association as set forth in its Constitution and By-Laws, and by payment of the annual dues as hereinafter provided. The membership year shall be from September 1 to August 31 following.

The Board examined in detail the complete financial report of activities of the Association to January 25th and, on motion of Thompson and second by Pedersen, the financial report was declared accepted.

President Olson reminded the Board that it would be necessary to again revise the AABF fee schedule for the biennium and it was agreed that a Committee should be appointed to accomplish this action. The Chair appointed members Smith, Larson and Olson to this Committee to meet with the Secretary and make any necessary revisions in Benefit Schedule or fees charged for the protection.

Mr. Deck of Dickinson, representing the North Dakota Broadcasters Association, Mr. Roman of the Roman Advertising Agency of Fargo, and Mr. David Blackstead representing KXJB met with the Board relative to the possible telecast contract for the coming Tournament Series.

A letter from Mr. John Boler, President of the North Dakota Broadcasting Association, was read and it was noted that he proposed to offer \$4,000.00 for the broadcasting of both Class A and Class B state basketball tournaments. A general discussion was held on the terms submitted by Mr. Boler and it was the opinion of the Board that an offer of \$4,000.00 was not acceptable for telecasting the State Tournaments and, upon motion by Robinson and second by Thompson, it was agreed that a counter offer of \$5,000.00 for telecasting any or all games of both Class A and Class B state tournaments would be offered to the Dakota Broadcasting Company, with a further understanding that should the Minot station desire to substitute any games of the Class B Region at Minot that they could do so at \$100.00 per game. This motion was carried. Further

discussion was held with the Committee relative to the proposal of the Association for telecast fees, and it was agreed by the Board that the offer of \$5,000.00 would be held open until February 15th. if necessary and that the Dakota Broadcasting Company must notify the Association by that time of they wished to accept the counter offer.

The Board next reviewed the recommendation of the Radio and T. V. Committee for charges that had been agreed upon by the broadcasters for the radio broadcast of tournament games on Regional and State levels, and the Board agreed that they would accept the tentative agreement made by the Committee which, in essence, is as follows:

1. Each radio station wishing to broadcast any regional, divisional or state basketball tournament promoted and sponsored by the North Dakota High School Activities Association must agree to pay to the North Dakota High School Activities Association fifteen per cent (15%) of the net proceeds received from the sale of these rights to an acceptable sponsor.

The net proceeds shall be the gross receipts received from the sponsors, less the following costs computed at standard rates or at reasonable charges for the following:

- a. Line charges, including local installations and local line charges from the source of broadcast to the telephone company's long distance cable.
- b. Crew costs (travel, hotel, etc) in broadcasting the tournament, including the announcer, engineer, etc.
- c. The sales or agency commissions which the station may be obliged to pay the sponsor's agents:
- 2. Each station broadcasting guarantees to pay the Association a minimum of \$10.00 for each game broadcast at any state basketball tournament, and a minimum of \$7.50 per game for any regional or divisional tournament. This payment applies only in the event that the 15% of net proceeds does not reach the \$10.00 or \$7.50 figure per game. The above charges shall apply equally to stations originating a broadcast or to stations accepting a feed from another station.
- 3. Radio stations which broadcast one or more games shall file a report with the Secretary of the North Dakota High School Activities Association, listing each game broadcast or fed to another station, the gross receipts received from sponsors, and the net proceeds to the station after legitimate costs have been deducted.
- 4. Thirty days or less after the broadcast, the minimum game charge or the 15% of the net proceeds, whichever is the greater, shall be remitted to the Association office.

Supt. J. I. Pennington appeared before the Board and requested that the Board revise its regulations on the number of schools necessary in a Track Meet to qualify individuals by meeting minimum standards. The Board agreed to change the number from a minimum of eight schools to

six schools in order that certain conferences might qualify track entrants in that sized Meet.

The Special Classification Committee reported that they had discussed several plans for re-classification of schools in North Dakota and that the consensus of the Committee was that Class A schools should be enlarged to thirty-two and that all other schools should be placed in a "B" Division. The Committee had considered various other plans but this arrangement appeared to meet with the greatest satisfaction. The Committee was asked to continue and to draft amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws which would effect the opinions of the Committee, with an understanding that these proposed amendments should be prepared and submitted to the Board for further study at the March meeting of he Board.

The Board next discussed the desirability of bonding all office staff that handle funds of the Association, and it was agreed that a Position Bond in the amount of \$10,000.00 be procured which would cover all members of the office staff in Valley City. The motion was carried.

The Board next reviewed tournament regulations, and some discussion was had on the number of players permitted to dress at tournaments. It appeared to be the consensus of the Board that ten men was a sufficient number of carry, and the Board agreed to continue this regulation the same as last year.

The Board also agreed that the formula should be applied to break any ties in the Northeast and Southeast Class A group in the same manner as it is used with the western schools. Supt. Smith of Park River was appointed to apply the formula for the Northeast schools, and Supt. McCrea of Valley City was appointed to apply the same formula for the Southeast schools if necessary.

The Board next reviewed the eligibility infraction of the lad from Velva and the subsequent resignation of the coach who was responsible for this violation. In the opinion of the Board, the school Superintendent and School Board of Velva had done all that was possible to properly handle the situation. The Secretary was instructed to write a letter of commendation to Supt. Nelson and the Board of Education of the Velva schools, commending them in their handling of this unfortunate incident.

The Committee on Tournament Sites made a partial report for the sites of Regional and State Tournaments in 1963 and 1964 for the western schools. These sites were tentatively selected as follows:

Southwest Class B Region: 1963-64 Dickinson: Harry Wienbergen, Mgr. Northwest Class B Region: 1963-64 Minot: C. S. Bjorlie, Mgr. State Class B Tournament: 1963-64 Minot: C. S. Bjorlie, Mgr. Class A Western Playoffs: 1963 Minot: Carl Carlson, Mgr. Class A Western Playoffs: 1964 Bismarck: T. E. Simle, Mgr.

No report was given at this time for Eastern Tournaments. The Board agreed to accept this tentative arrangement subject to review at the March Meeting.

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The Secretary reported on the schools that had made a contribution of \$5.00 or more to the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame, and the Board instructed the Secretary to print the names of these schools in the regular monthly bulletin as an encouragement to other schools to make similar donations.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The Board agreed that telecasts of the Western A would be authorized by a payment of \$150.00 for telecasting the Tournament over three stations and if a fourth station were added there would be an additional \$50.00 per game. This action was necessitated by KFYR indicating an interest in the Western Class A Tournament telecast.

#### MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Minot - March 16, 17, 1962

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Elks Club in Minot at 9:00 A. M. on March 16, 1962, with all members present except M. F. Peterson of Bismarck. The first order of business was a review of the financial report of the Activities of the Association up to March 19. This report was found in order and, upon motion, was duly accepted.

The Board next considered applications for advancement into Class B and applications were accepted and assignments made as follows: Egeland High School elevated to Class B and assigned to District VII; Glenfield-Sutton assigned to District VI, Class B; North Sargent of Gwinner assigned to District I, Class B; Sheyenne assigned to District VIII, Class B; Souris assigned to District VII, Class B; Sykeston assigned to District VIII, Class B, and Talyor assigned to District XV, Class B.

The Board next considered the opening date of football practice next fall and, upon motion by Whiting and second by Pederson, it was agreed to set August 16 as the first date on which football practice could be held.

The Board next listened to a report of the AABF Committee. This Committee reported on a survey of the schools of the state and it appeared that there was a general satisfaction of the present benefit schedule and a feeling on the part of the schools that no increase should be made in this schedule. A study of claims paid indicated that receipts from

wrestling and football were inadequate to cover the claims paid. The Committee made the following recommendations: (1) that the Benefit Schedule should remain as it is at the present time and (2) that the rates in football and wrestling be adjusted upward as necessary to bring the fees received and claims paid in balance. It was moved by Thompson and second by Davy that the recommendations of this Committee be accepted and that the Secretary be instructed to re-adjust rates as necessary in football and wrestling to make the plan self-supporing.

N. D. HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

The Board next heard a report from the Committee on reclassification and read the two proposed amendments that they submitted for study. The question of classification received the attention of the Board for quite some time and the concensus of the Board was that an amendment should be drawn without reference to any particular number of schools, and that all schools with an enrollment of 250 or more should be designated as Class A schools and that schools with an enrollment of 200 to 250 should have the option of joining Class A should they so desire. The Committee was instructed to prepare an amendment to accomplish this purpose and present to the Board for final approval at the next meeting. Subsequently the Committee agreed to hold a meeting at Valley City on Saturday, April 7, to further study the proposed amendment. Supt. A. D. Hendrickson of Crosby met with the Board and reported the plans to have only two high schools in Divide County, namely Crosby and Noonan, and to permit pupils from the Noonan High School to take certain subjects at the Crosby High School to enrich their program. Mr. Hendrickson inquired as to the eligibility status of pupils that might be taking subjects in the two high schools.

A letter was also read from Supt. Langemo of Zap on a similar proposal involving Beulah, Golden Valley and Zap high schools. Reference was made to the present provisions in the by-laws wherein students must be passing in three subjects carried in residence in order to be eligible to represent the school in interscholastic activities, and the particular section in the by-laws involving transfer from one school to another. It was the opinion of the Board that students in these high schools could comply with present regulations of the Association provided they carried a minimum of three subjects in one school and were passing in these three subjects. Further, any lad who wished to transfer from one high school to another would be subjected to the same penalties as are now applied to other high schools, and should a youngster desire to transfer schools in order to take certain subjects, or for other reasons, he would be subject to the eighteen weeks penalty.

A Committee to survey the schools in the respective classes, with a view of selecting officials for the 1963 tournament season, was appointed by President Olson, Members of this Committee are F. U. Smith for Class A; Willard Solberg for Class B; and Rex Robinson for Class C. These Committee members were instructed to survey schools in the respective classes and secure their advice on the best officials for the tournaments.

The next order of business was the consideration of plans for next year. It was agreed that the calendar should be continued, as it provides a good service for the schools of the Association. It was also agreed that football, basketball and wrestling clinics should be carried on under the

same general plan as last year, and with the same clinic leaders. The question of cheerleaders clinics was discussed at some length and it was the opinion of the Board that there was a call for these clinics and, inasmuch as they are self-supporting, the Secretary was instructed to contact Mr. L. R. Herkimer of the National Cheerleaders Association to see if clinics could not be held again in North Dakota during the month of October. It was agreed to set up these clinics at Mandan, Minot, Devils Lake and Valley City.

OFFICIAL HANDBOOK

The Board next proceeded to organize itself for next year and M. C. Olson was re-named President; F. U. Smith, Vice President.

The following delegates were named to attend the summer National Federation Meeting July 1-4 at Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada: Ell Kay Larson, Willard Solberg and G. A. Tooley. President M. C. Olson was named as an alternate.

The Board adjourned at this time as it was now nearly 1:00 P. M. and agreed to meet on Saturday morning, March 17th.

The Board met at 11:00 A. M. on Saturday, March 17th, in the offices of the Minot High School, with all members present except M. F. Peterson and Donald B. Whiting. A delegation from the City of Glenburn asked to have an audience with the Board concerning the final play of the Glenburn game of the previous night. If appears that there was a question of whether the game was properly administered during the last few seconds of the game, and whether or not a basket made by the opposition should be counted. The Board heard this delegation at some length and then called their attention to the fact that one of the regulations is that no protest will be entertained at any tournament game and that all evidence pointed to the fact that the referees properly called the play in question and it was agreed by the Board that the results of the game should stand as it appeared in the score book when the game ended.

The Board then received a delegation of Class A coaches. The first matter presented by this delegation was the opening date for basketball practice. Under the present arrangement, the Class A schools have an abbreviated season inasmuch as the starting date has been determined as being twenty weeks prior to the final state tournament. The Board agreed to set the starting date for basketball in 1962 on October 29th. Coaches again requested that twelve men be permitted to dress inasmuch as they carry twelve men throughout the year. After a general discussion it was agreed that twelve men would be permitted in the 1963 tournament series but that no extra expense allowance would be made for these extra players. The Board next assigned Carrington to the Northeast Division, Class A, and Lisbon to the Southeast Division of Class A, effective with the 1962-63 season. Reuben Hammond of the North Dakota Officials Association met with the Board and expressed general satisfaction with the cooperation this group had received from the Board, and recommended that score keepers and desk officials be required to wear some identifying uniform as recommended in the rule books. Mr. Hammond pointed out that such garb was available at any sporting goods company and could be obtained at minimum cost. It was duly moved and seconded and carried that in all district, regional and state basketball tournaments that the score keeper must wear some identifying uniform. It was agreed that Mr. Hammond should meet with the Board at the August meeting to assist in the selection of officials for the 1963 tournament season.

The Board next considered the purchase of certain office equipment and authorized the Secretary to trade in the present Pitney-Bowes postage machine and obtain a new one under the special trade-in allowance of \$100.00 now offered by Pitney-Bowes for a limited length of time-the net cost of this new machine being \$477.75.

The Board next decided to consider the Secretary's salary for the next year and the Secretary was excused for a period of time and, upon motion and second, it was agreed to raise the Secretary's salary \$500.00 beginning July 1st.

The Board next considered the time for a meeting in June and it was agreed that the Board would go into session at 9:00 A.M. on Monday, June 11th, at Valley City, North Dakota.

There being no urther business the meeting adjourned.

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING**

#### MINUTES OF

Valley City, North Dakota - June 8th and 9th, 1962

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the City Hall at Valley City, North Dakota on Friday, June 8th, 1962, with all members present. The First order of business was a review of the Financial Report of the general business of the Association from July 1, 1961 to June 6, 1962.

The Board next reviewed the complete Financial Report of the Accident Benefit Fund for the same period of time. Both reports appeared to be in order and were accepted.

Applications were read from CLASS C Schools that wished to be elevated into Class B. The following schools were granted CLASS B status effective with the 1962-63 school year, and district assignments were as follows:

> Karlsruhe - District IX, Class B Lignite - District X, Class B

> Tappen - District XII, Class B

The Special Committee of the Board reported that they were prepared to offer certain amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Association, to be presented for a vote of the membership at the annual meeting in October of 1962. The following amendments were presented and the Secretary was instructed to give the required notice of such proposals to the membership in the September Bulletin of the Association.

## PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE V - Officers and Duties:

Section I: There shall be a Board of Directors, hereinafter call the Board, consisting of nine members, elected as hereinafter prescribed, for terms of three years except as hereinafter provided. Each new member shall be seated July 1st following his election and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms, except that he may be appointed or elected to fill a vacancy after one year's absence from office. Three members of the Board shall be chosen from Class A schools, three from Class B schools, and one member shall be elected from any member high school regardless of classification. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or a member of his duly constituted staff, designated by him, shall serve as an ex-officio member of said Board. One school board member from a member high school shall be selected by the executive committee of the North Dakota School Boards Association and his term of office shall be the same as that of other elective Board members. Should this member cease to be a school board member from a member high school, the position shall be declared vacant and a successor selected by the Board of Directors of the School Boards Association to fill the unexpired

**Section II:** Board members shall be nominated at the annual meeting of the Representatives of the Association, hereinafter call the Representative Assembly, and shall be elected by mail ballot, such ballot to be prepared by the Secretary and mailed to member schools on or before January first following the nomination and shall be returned to the Secretary before January fifteenth, the ballot being valid if the envelope in which it is mailed is postmarked before midnight of January fourteenth.

Nomination for the member at large, one member from Class B schools and one from Class A schools shall be made by a special nominating committee at the annual meeting in 1962, two members from Class A schools in 1963 and two members from Class B schools in 1964, and thereafter in consecutive order as the terms of the various members expire. Nominations may also be made from the floor.

Should any member remove from the state or profession, change into a different class school, or cease to be an administrator, his position shall be declared vacant immediately and a new member appointed by the Board to fill the vacancy until the next annual meeting when the regular procedure of nomination and balloting shall be followed to fill vacancy for the remainder of the term of office.

Section III: No change.

# PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE II - CLASSIFICATION OF SCHOOLS

Section I: Class A Schools:

- a. This group shall consist of all member high schools with a total enrollment of 250 or over, and/or a male enrollment of 200 or more in grades 9-12 inclusive as of October 1, 1962 plus any member high school that elects to choose Class A as provided in paragraph (b), (c) and (d) herewith.
- b. Any high school with a total enrollment between 199 and 250 in grades 9-12, inclusive, on October 1, 1962, may elect to join Class A for interscholastic competition by written notice to the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association before January 1, 1963.
- c. After the classes are established on January 1, 1963, a member school having a total enrollment of more than 199 and less than 250 in grades 9-12, inclusive, must give two years notice to the Board of Directors to change its classification. Such choice must be made not later than September 1st of any year and shall become effective with the opening of the fall term two years later. Schools that elect to become Class A schools must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification. Provided further, when the total school enrollment in grades 9-12 drops below 250, and/or the male enrollment in grades 9-12 drops below 200, that school shall have one year of grace in which to choose its class of competition.

Should an A school drop below 200 in enrollment in grades 9-12 and continue below 200 for two consecutive years, this school must be reclassified as a "B" school. Should a school rise above 249 in enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, and continue above that figure for two consecutive years, this school must be classified as an "A" school.

d. Should a new high school be established in an existing district or area, whose enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, exceeds 249, the two-year waiting period stated in paragraph (c) above shall be waived and the school shall be immediately classified as an "A" school.

#### Section II: Class B Schools:

All member high schools, other than those designated Class A, shall be classified as Class "B" high schools.

#### Section III:

Class A and Class B schools shall compete in separate classes to determine state basketball championships. The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is authorized to combine classes in other athletic or non-athletic contests and festivals if it appears expedient and desirable.

# PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE XII - Sports Seasons

#### Section II: Basketball:

- c. Total games played shall not exceed twenty season games or eighteen season games and one invitational tournament. Should a school elect to participate in two invitational tournaments, then the games in one of these tournaments plus those in regular seasons play shall not exceed twenty games. Games played in the district, regional or state basketball tournaments sponsored by the Association shall not count in the maximum number of games permitted.
  - d. No change.
  - e. No change.
- f. No team or individual player shall be permitted to play in more than two tournaments per season, one of which shall not exceed a fourteam tournament, in addition to those in the play-off series sponsored by the Association.

Attorney Greffenius, of the Law firm of Sproul, Fitzner and Greffenius, reviewed the progress on the pending mandamus action brought by Schafer against the Association. He reported the favorable action on the part of the Supreme Court in granting the appeal in the former lawsuit and indicated that there was high probability that the pending mandamus action would now be dismissed or completed within a short period of time.

The Secretary next informed the Board of the proposal to establish a home for "The Committee on Debate Materials" at the University of Oregon, and that this was a national project in which the various debate leagues throughout the nation were asked to raise approximately \$17,000.00 in order to get the home started, and further that after this home was started that it would be self-sustaining and supported by the University of Oregon. North Dakota has been assessed \$300.00 for the two-year period by the Committee on Debate Materials, and it was agreed that North Dakota would subscribe its pro-rata share of \$300.00 towards this worthy project.

The AABF Committee on rate schedules then reported and it was the opinion of this Committee that it would be necessary to raise the rates in wrestling and all-day coverage if the plan is to be self-supporting. The raising of these rates was reviewed and accepted by the Board of Directors, to become effective with the opening of the 1962-63 term.

The Board was escorted through the Northwestern Bell Telephone Company building which was in the process of purchase by the Association and would become available for office space within the next one to two months. Careful examination of the premises was made by the Board, and the Secretary was authorized to purchase a reasonable amount of shelving and cabinets to care for the needs of the Association. The

Secretary also reported that there was a need for air conditioning in the building and that bids had been received from the Valley Heating Appliance and the Frostad Plumbing Company of Valley City for the installation of a 4-Ton air conditioner. The Board examined these informal bids and it was noted that the bid of Frostad Plumbing and Heating Company was low at \$1,340.00. The Secretary was authorized to proceed with the installation of this air conditioning equipment.

Fr. LaMeres, Supt. of St. Mary's High School at New England appeared before the Board to explain the alleged recruiting of student's by St. Mary's Coach, Kettner, and some time was spent in listening to Fr. La-Meres' version of the incident. It appeared that such recruiting was done at the request of the parents of children in the Plentywood-Outlook area in Montana. It was agreed to table this action unil further information might be available and additional facts develop concerning the allegations.

The Board next discussed television and radio policies for 1963 and carefully reviewed experience in both radio and television for the 1962 tournament series. It was the consensus of the Board that the radio rate should remain the same as this past year, i, e. with a charge of \$10.00 per game for the State Final Tournaments, and \$7.50 per game for all regional and divisional tournaments. It was further noted that a few stations carried only the final game. It was the consensus of the Board that in the event a station wished to carry only the final game a charge of \$25.00 should be made for this privilege. Further, a charge of \$25.00 should be made for the final game unless the station carried the minimum of four games. The television policies were also reviewed and it was agreed that the State A and B Tournaments would be placed on a competitive bid basis, with the floor of \$4,500.00 as the minimum that the Board would accept for the telecast of the final State A and B Tournaments. It was agreed further that bids also be accepted for the West A on an exclusive basis, with a minimum price set at \$900.00. Such bids were to be called for at the August meeting of the Board. Some discussion was also had as to the possibility of a desire to broadcast other divisional or regional games, and it was agreed that the Television Committee of Olson, Smith and Abrahamson should be continued and be authorized to deal with these problems when they arose.

The Board next considered recommendations of the Speech Committee for Speech Festivals. These recommendations were carefully reviewed and accepted.

The Board next considered the recommendations of the Music Committee and they likewise were accepted.

Dates (as set up by the Secretary) for football, basketball, wrestling and cheerleaders clinics were reviewed and accepted and ordered placed on the school calendar.

The Board next proceeded to set up tournament dates for the various state and regional tournaments in the different sports, and agreed on the following dates and locations for tournaments.

It was agreed to permit five men to participate in the grass and sand greens golf tournaments from each school and that in determining positions the best scores of the four top participants should be counted.

The Board agreed to discontinue the Divisional Debate Contest, and the State Final Debate Contest was set on corresponding dates for this year. May 10th was selected as the time for the State Music and Speech Contest, in which all schools would be eligible to qualify contestants. This event was again set at Jamestown.

A letter was read from Sec. D. B. Allen of the School Boards Association, notifying the Board that Mr. Don Whiting was again appointed for a second term on the Board of Directors of the High School Activities Association.

The Board next had a discussion on the National Federation meeting scheduled at Saskatoon, Canada July 1 to 4. It was reported that Mr. Solberg was unable to attend and Joel Davy agreed to go in his place.

The purchase of an office building was again discussed by the Board and it was agreed that a complete payment should be made for the building out of the surplus funds of the Association as soon as the Telephone Company was prepared to sign the deed, turning the property over to the Association.

The Board also indicated its appreciation to the City of Valley City, and the Chamber of Commerce, for the use of the facilities (without charge) in the City Hall for the past twelve years. The Secretary was instructed to prepare a letter to the Chamber of Commerce and also the City of Valley City, thanking them for the courtesies during this period of time.

The President then called for a report on the Committee on Credentials for the qualifications of Secretary of the Association, and the Committee reported that it recommended the following minimum qualifications in order to be considered for the position of Secretary of the Association.

The Committee on Executive Secretary Candidacy Qualifications is keenly aware of the fact that final selection of a suitable candidate for this position must rest with the Board of Directors, and that they must be given considerable freedom in making a final choice. Therefore, the following qualifications are to serve as mere guide-lines in the selection of an Executive Secretary for the Association:

- 1. The candidate must be under the age of fifty (50) years.
- 2. The candidate must hold a Master's Degree.
- 3. The candidate must have had at least ten (10) years of educational experience in the State of North Dakota—five years of which must have been in the administrative field, or its equivalent, with the ten years of experience prior to application being in North Dakota schools.

#### MINUTES OF

#### ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING

#### Minot High School Auditorium - October 19, 1961

The regular annual meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held in the Minot High School Auditorium at 2:00 P. M. with president M. C. Olson presiding.

The first hour was devoted to general introductions and an appropriate address by Dr. Paul Misner, Superintendent of Schools at Glencoe, Illinois. Following this session a short recess was called and the annual business session was convened at 3:00 P. M.

The first order of business was the reading of the minutes of the previous session. It was duly moved by Superintendent Thompson of Elgin and seconded by Superintendent Robinson of McGregor that inasmuch as these minutes were printed in the 1961 Handbook and distributed to the membership that the reading of the minutes be waived. The motion was carried.

The Chair then called for the financial report and it was also moved by Superintendent Burchill of Towner and seconded by Principal Davy of Minot that inasmuch as this report was also printed in detail in the 1961 Handbook that the reading of this report be waived. The Chair called for any questions that might be raised on either the minutes or the financial report and none were forthcoming.

The next order of business was the reading of the amendment to Article III, Section I of the Constitution and it was read as follows:

"Any high school, so classified by the State Department of Public Instruction, may become a member of the Association by agreeing to abide by the rules of the Association as set forth in its Constitution and By-Laws, and by payment of the annual dues as hereinafter provided. The membership year shall be from September 1 to August 31 following."

This amendment was explained and the membership was informed that in accordance with the Constitution of the Association that the amendment would be presented on the regular mail ballot.

The next order of business was a report by the nominating committee consisting of superintendent Killie of Fessenden, L. T. Havig of Williston, and K. L. Zenner of Sheyenne. The committee reported the names of Warren Pederson of Maddock and Barton Thompson of Elgin to succeed themselves and moved the acceptance of this report. The motion was seconded and carried.

# NORTH DAKOTA OFFICIALS ASSOCIATION MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Minot - March 16, 1962

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota Officials Association met at the Elks Club in Minot on March 16th, 1962, with all members of the Board present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Mr. Hammond reported on the survey of football fees schedule for officials; this survey had been made in several states in this area and it appeared that the payment in North Dakota is relatively on par with those of other states, and that several states leave the matter entirely up to the local associations and the schools concerned to set a fair fee for officiating. Mr. Hammond and the Board reported excellent cooperation between the Board and the High School Activities Association and their organization, and expressed the opinion that much had been accomplished since the Association had been formed. Mr. Eddie Agre further explained the proposed rating schedule for officials to be sent to schools and also strongly urged that officials have an opportunity of rating schools on their sportsmanship and attitude throughout the year. A general discussion of the work involved in the project was held and it was the opinion of the Board that extra help should be employed to summarize these rating sheets, and that the fees received from officials registrations would be sufficient to justify this extra expense. The opinion of this Board was that these rating sheets should be sent out this spring at the conclusion of the basketball season. Mr. Hammond was appointed to meet with the Board on Saturday and suggest the adoption of some uniform for score keepers and other desk officials so that they could be readily recognized by the officials working on the floor. It was also agreed that Mr. Hammond would represent the Board at the August meeting of the High School Activities Association Board and assist them in the selection of officials for the 1963 tournament season, and he was instructed to survey the various local associations and secure the recommendations from them as to their top men in basketball officiating.

There being no other business, this meeting was adjourned.

# EXAMINATION REPORT NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

For the year ended June 30, 1962

July 18, 1962

Gentlemen:

We have examined the accounts and general records of your organization, an unincorporated association, for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1962. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and thus included the tests considered necessary in the circumstances.

In our opinion, the accompanying statement of financial position and related statements of income and analysis of capital and surplus, together with supporting schedules and footnotes, present fairly the financial position of the North Dakota High School Activities Association on June 30, 1962, and the result of its operations for the twelve months then ended — on a cash basis. This presentation conforms to generally accepted accounting principles as limited for the cash basis method of accounting. This report is not consistant with that of the preceding year and the changes and reasons for same are briefly described as follows:

- 1. It is evident that you operate in a manner which requires the separation of your accounts by funds. This is the generally accepted method of reporting for institutions and non-profit organizations. Exhibit A has been prepared accordingly and Exhibit D discloses the reclassification of "Net Worth" of the prior report into the capital and surplus classifications of the separate funds.
- 2. It is also evident that a comparison of actual receipts and expenditures should be made to the budget adopted each year. Schedules B-I and B-2 have been included.
- 3. As the cash basis method of accounting does not recognize receivable or payables, standard disclosure requirements call for surplus to be classified into reserves where board action has created a restriction on same and the unappropriated remainder to be footnoted for other material facts which will affect same. This has been done.

While it appears that you have overexpended your budget, it must be stressed that this is the result of the absence of "clearing accounts" which are used for items that pass through your accounts with no effect on your financial position. It is recognized by your auditors that if these items were set aside as "offsets" apart from the budgeted items, the picture would not be the same.

In addition to the regular examination, we made an informal survey of the entire system now in use for all records. We suggest an opportunity to discuss with the board certain conclusions reached from this survey.
