

FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 39th Annual Handbook of the Association which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

Attention is again called to certain trends and developments that are apparent over the year. Special attention is also called to certain events that have special significance to the member schools.

- 1. Membership in the Association has dropped from 350 to 328 high schools. The trend toward closing the small high school continues and with the new classification of schools into an A and B groups this trend may tend to increase.
- 2. As a result of the change in classification of schools, it was necessary to amend the constitution to provide for a Board of Directors from the two classes of schools. Effective this year, three representatives from each class of schools and one member-at-large in addition to the school board representative and the member from the State Department of Public Instruction comprise the Board.
- 3. Certainly one of the high lights of the year was the occupancy of the new office home and the purchase of necessary equipment to take care of office needs. As time goes on the wisdom of obtaining a new office home will become more apparent. The greater output of work in a favorable and comfortable environment has already gone a long way to justify the investment. Operational costs have been less than the most conservative estimates.
- 4. The new schedule of membership fees adopted by the schools effective with the 1963-1964 fiscal year will provide ample funds for operational expenses and will enable the Association to restore some of the subsidies to teams participating in the various sports at the state level.
- 5. Another milestone was the selection of a much needed assistant executive secretary to assist in performing the ever-increasing and expanding work of the Association. This position was long overdue and could not be postponed any longer.
- 6. During the past year the state legislature was in session and as usual legislation was proposed which vitally concerned the Association. Senate bill No. 145 proposed to eliminate all athletic contests held on week nights followed by a school day on which classes were held and provided for a fine for the violation of the provisions of the bill. The Association opposed this measure mainly on the grounds that we have an organization that can properly control such matters if such controls are necessary and desirable and further the administration of school athletic contests is not a fit subject for rigid and inflexible laws that can not take into account local and emergency situations. The bill eventually was defeated and the Association will take such action as necessary to discourage week night athletic contests.

Senate bill No. 310 was practically the same bill as was introduced four years ago and proposed that each individual school board would make, interpret, and enforce its eligibility rules. Obviously such legislation would create a chaotic condition and would make an organization

such as ours powerless and ineffective in adopting and enforcing a code of uniform eligibility rules. The terms of the bill was so impractical and malicious that it was killed in the committee after a hearing at which the Association and other interested groups voiced their disapproval.

- 7. The Accident Benefit Fund still suprisingly continues to break all records in number of children covered, number and amount of claims paid and in fees received. The interested reader is referred to the statistical information appearing in this handbook under the auditors report where comparisons may be made with former years reports.
- 8. Particularly gratifying this year, are the reports of the various state basketball tournament. Ideal weather and road conditions, new teams appearing in the tournaments made this years financial reports one of the best in a decade.

Wrestling and track continue to grow. Only baseball and 6-man football show a drop in participation. A loss in baseball participation account for the growth in track. The loss in 6-man football participation has been followed by an increase in 8 and 9-man football.

9. The rating system of officials by schools and the rating of schools by officials was instituted during the year and time will tell whether these confidential ratings will result in better officiating and better sportsmanship and playing conditions on the part of schools. One thing is certain and that is that the sumarization of hundreds of rating scales is a time consuming operation and unless officials and schools make use of the results of the ratings, then the added work does not justify the program.

In general this has been another successful year with more than usual progress. Again we are mindful of the valued help and assistance given by many school people and others interested in the Association program.

The Board of Directors and the office personnel express our appreciation for the whole-hearted cooperation of each of you in making this another banner year.

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The Board next examined samples of floor tile submitted by the Valley City Paint and Glass Company and selected pattern MC38 asphalt tile to be placed on the floor of the office building recently purchased, at the bid price of \$266.75. Members of the Board had previously examined the building and it was agreed that it was necessary to install the tile floor due to the number of holes left after removing the telephone equipment from the building.

It was duly moved and seconded that the recommendations of this Committee be accepted and the above list of officials be tendered contracts for the 1962-63 basketball tournaments.

The Board spent some time discussing the need for additional finances and considered various means of raising additional revenue for the Association. It was moved by Davy and seconded by Tooley that a committee be appointed by the president to submit an amendment to revise the dues and report at the next meeting of the Board. This motion was carried and the Chair appointed Whiting, Tooley and Davy to this committee.

The Board also spent time in discussing the allowance that should be made to Board members attending national meetings. Larson, Tooley and Davy were appointed to this committee and were instructed to submit a report at the next meeting of the Board in October.

The Board next proceeded to open bids for tournament basketballs, and it was found that the bid of the GP Sporting Goods Company of Bismarck, by Russ Anderson, Manager, was the lowest bid and it was duly moved and seconded that this bid of \$13.69 per ball, F. O. B. Bismarck, for the B1200 Jet basketball be accepted. The Board also discussed the number of balls that could be ordered at this contract price for each tournament and was of the opinion that two balls per tournament should be maximum permitted for any one tournament committee.

The Board next opened bids for televising the 1962-63 tournament series and found there was only one bid submitted by the North Dakota Broadcasting Company. This bid was for \$4,620,00 for all games or no less than four games of the State Class A Basketball Tournament at Grand Forks and the State Class B Basketball Tournament at Minot. The second bid from the same company was in the amount of \$1,030.00 for the Western Class A Basketball Tournament at Mandan on March 1st and 2nd. It was agreed to accept this bid for the exclusive telecast rights to these tournaments. The Dakota Broadcasting Company also submitted a bid of \$60.00 per game for the Southeast and Northeast Divisional Class A Tournaments; however, the Board was of the opinion that this was not sufficient to justify the acceptance of such an offer and the Board set a minimum figure of \$300.00 for each of these tournaments for one or all games of the tournament series.

The Board next authorized a contract for PL and PD insurance to the Security Insurance Company of Valley City for the 1962-63 school year.

A letter from Leonard Marti, Director of Athletics at the University of North Dakota, was read. This letter informed the Board that there would be an advance in the charges made for the rental of the Field House for tournaments, and also that they would have to charge a minimum of \$75.00 for operating a district track meet in the spring.

The Secretary then reported the final settlement of the various court actions instituted by Mr. Schafer of Bismarck, and the Board was advised that the books on these cases were closed and all attorney fees had been

Some time was spent in planning the program for the Annual Meeting in October and it was agreed that in lieu of a speaker for the first hour of the meeting that the meeting be one of a panel discussion, in which various topics of interest to the members would be discussed. A committee of Smith, Olson and Abrahamson was appointed to prepare the program and arrange an agenda for the meeting. It was the agreement of the Board to meet at the N. D. E. A. Convention in Fargo at 3:00 P. M. on Wednesday, October 17th. It was also the consensus of the Board that the March meeting should be alternated between the A and B tournaments and that the March Meeting this year be set during the State A Tournament at Grand Forks. This motion was carried.

Some time was spent on the present policy of the Board in refusing to sanction tournaments or games with out-of-state teams which involved travel over 600 miles. It was the majority of opinion of the Board that the distance traveled should not be a determining factor but rather that the question of loss of school time should be a more important factor than distance. It was agreed that the following policy would be adopted and the Secretary was authorized to sanction games and tournaments if they could meet this new condition. Contests or tournaments would be sanctioned in a bordering state over 300 miles distance, provided there is no loss of school time in either playing or traveling to or from this tournament, and further provided that each school would be limited to one trip of 300 miles or more in a given sport per season. It was also the opinion of the Board that it was proper for preliminary games involving high schools from North Dakota to be played at Universities or Colleges prior to the main game and that the Secretary be authorized to sanction such contests as requested by our member schools.

The Board was informed that final papers for the transfer of the office building of the Northwest Bell Telephone Company to the North Dakota High School Activities Association would be consummated on Wednesday morning, August 22nd, at 10:30 A.M. and that the office quarters of the Association would be moved on Thursday, August 23rd.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

October 17, 18, 1962 - Fargo, North Dakota

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Fargo at the Gardner Hotel, with all members present.

Each Board Member was presented with a packet containing the agenda for the meeting, a complete listing of all checks issued since the last meeting, a financial report of business transacted from July 1 to Cotober 15, 1962, and copies of the September and October Activities Bulletin.

The Secretary reported on correspondence he had with the Wonderly Company of Minneapolis, Minnesota, regarding a plaque to be installed on the front of the office building, incorporating the Association insignia. Different designs were studied and prices compared. It was decided to Different designs were studied and prices compared. It was decided to purchase a 17" diameter circular plaque of the Association seal for the purchase a 17" diameter circular plaque of the Association seal for the quoted price of \$174.00 delivered to Valley City. Some time was spent discussing additional equipment needed at the present time. The board authorized the purchase of a combination electric plate, refrigerator and sink.

An application from Makoti High School to be placed in Class B was read and, upon motion of Whiting and second by Tooley, Makoti was placed in District No. 11, Class B.

The special committee of the Board, consisting of Davy, Larson and Tooley, made the following recommendations for expense allowance of Board members attending out-of-state meetings and conventions for the Association:

- For all trips of more than 1,000 miles, each delegate shall be allowed round trip, first class air fare plus necessary hotel expenses and \$10.00 per day expense money for one day going and returning from the meeting site. An additional allowance of 8½c per mile shall be allowed from home to the air terminal and return for those who must travel to the air terminal.
- 2. For all travel less than 1,000 miles, mileage will be paid at 7c per mile plus one day's allowance of \$10.00 each way.
- 3. Room and \$10.00 per diem shall be paid each delegate at the convention or meeting site.

Upon motion of Davy and second by Tooley, the above expense schedule was adopted.

The Committee on annual dues next reported. Two schedules of dues were submitted. The first would have set dues on the following schedule:

\$ 50.00

The second proposal was 20c per pupil for all pupils in grades 7-12 with minimum dues of \$25.00 and maximum dues of \$350.00 for all member schools engaging in an interscholastic program of music, speech or athletics, and \$10.00 from schools or county units that wished to carry the Accident Benefit protection program only. After considerable discussion, it was moved by M. F. Peterson and seconded by Tooley that the second proposal be accepted and the committee be instructed to draw an amendment to Article IV, Section I, of the Constitution, incorporating this proposal and present to the membership at the annual meeting tomorrow for first reading. The motion was carried.

Sid Cichy of Shanley High School was selected as a delegate to represent the Association at the National Football Rules Meeting in Chicago, January 8-10, 1963. Kenneth Becker of Underwood was named as an alternate in case Mr. Cichy could not attend.

Earl Abrahamson was named to represent the Association at the N. U. E. A. Committee on Debate and Discussion in Cleveland, Ohio, December 27, 28, 1962. Marvin Skaar, Coach at Grand Forks High School, was authorized to represent the N. D. H. S. A. A. at the Secondary School Athletic Administrative meeting in Washington, D. C., December 3-5, 1962, and a maximum allowance of \$100.00 was made for this purpose inasmuch as Grand Forks High School and the State Coaches Association were also assuming a part of the expenses to this meeting.

The Secretary next called the Boards attention to the regulations of the American Junior Bowling Congress for high school students who bowl on adult teams where money prizes are awarded. No changes were made in the current policies of the Board relative to bowling.

The Board next considered the charges made against Superintendent Barton Thompson by Lee Grant, an official from Mott, North Dakota. The allegations were that as a result of activities on the part of Mr. Thompson, he had lost several season games and tournaments. Mr. Thompson apbeared at his own request and refuted the charges. He admitted that, because of certain circumstances, he had asked schools in his area not to use Mr. Grant in contests in which his team was involved; however, at no time had he tried to influence schools in contests in which his team would **not** be involved. It was the opinion of the Board that Article III. Section I, of the By-Laws of the Association provides for written contracts for contests and one of the provisions in these contracts is that officials must be mutually agreed upon. Any school has the right to approve or disapprove officials in all contests in which they are involved. It was the opinion of the Board that Elgin High School, through its superintendent and school board, was fully within their rights in passing judgment on officials to be employed in contests in which they are involved.

Some time was spent discussing the relative number of schools in Districts 13 and 14, Class C, and what procedure should be followed in selecting teams for the regional tournament, and it was decided to make no change until District 13 was contacted. Subsequently it was found that there were still four teams in District 13 and there would be no need for any adjustment.

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A possible request for permission of the Devils Lake High School hockey team to play a contest with an Illinois team was reviewed. It was the consensus of the Board that travel in excess of 300 miles distance should be limited to border states and those trips that could be made without loss of school time.

The matter of an assistant secretary was discussed at length and it was moved by Whiting that final selection of an assistant should be made at the March meeting of the Board, and the assistant should be tendered a salary of \$10,000.00 a year, July 1, 1963 to July 1, 1964, and that the salary of the executive secretary from July 1, 1964 to July 1, 1966, be set at \$11,000.00 per year. The motion was seconded and carried.

Kenneth Triggs of the Mandan Training School appeared before the Board to request membership in the Association for the Industrial School. After a general discussion it was again decided to table the request.

R. B. Ludvigson, C. P. A., met with the Board to discuss the annual audit and make certain recommendations to the Board. He discussed the possibility of the use of electronic data machines to perform much of the actuarial work of the accident benefit fund and the need of an assistant secretary to provide a continuity of program over the next years.

The secretary reported to the Board on the mail vote of the eligibility cases of Carson and St. Mary's of Devils Lake. In both instances the lads were ineligible on majority vote of the Board.

Principal L. W. Hanson of Grand Forks met with the Board and reported the loss of two horns that had been taken from two Fargo High School boys at the State A Tournament last spring by the tournament police because of interference with the officials signals during the game. Following the game, the horns were returned to Fargo lads but not to the proper parties and attempts have been made to collect payment for the horns. No official action of the Board was taken but it was suggested to Mr. Hanson that he refer all correspondence to the Association office.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Bismarck — January 27-28, 1963

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Grand Pacific Hotel in Bismarck on January 27-28, 1963, with all members present. Each member was presented with a packet containing the agenda for the meeting, a copy of the minutes of the October Meeting of the Board, a complete financial report of the year's business to January 25, 1963, and a list of all checks drawn on the General Fund since the last meeting. The Board spent some time examining the financial report and, upon motion, the report was duly accepted.

The next order of business was the report of the Canvassing Committee, consisting of Rex Robinson, Joel Davy, G. A. Tooley and M. C. Olson. Article IV, Section I, of the Constitution which reads as follows:

"Article IV - Dues

Section I: Dues shall be based on the rate of 20 cents per student enrolled in grades 7-12, the enrollment being the official enrollment as of October 1st the previous year. The amount of the dues shall not be less than \$25.00 or more than \$350.00 annually. For schools or school districts not participating in interscholastic activities but desiring Athletic Accident Benefit Fund protection the annual dues shall be \$10.00; for county units the annual dues shall be \$10.00" Received 170 "yes" votes and 90 "no" votes.

Article V, which reads as follows:

"Article V - Officers and Duties - Section 1:

There shall be a Board of Directors, hereinafter called the Board. consisting of nine members, elected as hereinafter prescribed, for terms of three years except as hereinafter provided. Each new member shall be seated July 1st following his election and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms, except that he may be appointed or elected to fill a vacancy after one year's absence from office. Three members of the Board shall be chosen from Class A schools, three from Class B schools and one member shall be elected from any member high school regardless of classification. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or a member of his duly constituted staff, designated by him, shall serve as an ex-Officio member of said Board. One school board member from a member high school shall be selected by the executive committee of the North Dakota School Boards Association and his term of office shall be the same as that of other elective Board members. Should this member cease to be a school board member from a member high school, the position shall be declared vacant and a successor selected by the Board of Directors of the School Boards Association to fill the unexpired term.

Section II: Board members shall be nominated at the annual meeting of the Representatives of the Association, hereinafter called the Representative Assembly, and shall be elected by mail ballot, such ballot to be prepared by the Secretary and mailed to member schools on or before January 1st following the nomination and shall be returned to the Secretary before January 15th, the ballot being valid if the envelope in which it is mailed is postmarked before midnight of January 14th.

Nomination for the member-at-large, one member from Class B schools and one from Class A schools shall be made by a special nominating committee at the annual meeting in 1962, two members from Class A schools in 1963 and two members from Class B schools in 1964, and thereafter in consecutive order as the terms of the various members expire. Nominations may be also be made from the floor.

Should any member remove from the state or profession, change into. a different class school, or cease to be an administrator, his position shall be declared vacant immediately and a new member appointed by the Board to fill the vacancy until the next annual meeting when the regular procedure of nomination and balloting shall be followed to fill vacancy for the remainder of the term of office.

Section III: No change."

Received 236 "yes" votes and 21 "no" votes. The amendments were declared carried.

The vote for three directors were as follows:

T. E. Simle, Don Kolbo and Nate Cummings were declared elected to take office July 1, 1963.

The Board next examined in detail a claim from Amenia High School against the Accident Benefit Fund for an injury to Russell Heil which occurred about a year ago and which the Secretary had rejected on the grounds that the claim was outlawed because of the lapse of time. A request had been made by the Amenia School Board that this claim be reviewed by the Board. It was the opinion of the Board that the claim had been properly disposed of and, upon motion by Tooley and second by Davy, it was agreed that the secretary's action in rejecting this claim was correct and proper.

The Secretary read a request on the part of Crosby High School that their band from Crosby-Noonan be permitted to enter the district contest as a unit inasmuch as this was now one school district and further that the band would be playing only for a rating and would not compete in any state contest. It was duly moved by Davy and seconded by Whiting that this request be granted and that the Crosby-Noonan band be permitted to participate at the district contest as a single unit. The motion carried.

The Secretary then read a request from KDIX-TV station at Dickinson that they would like to telecast a portion of the State Wrestling Tournament which was to be held in Dickinson on February 21st and 22nd. This matter was referred to the Television Committee for disposition and subsequently this Committee met and agreed that a token charge of \$50.00 should be asked for the privilege of telecasting this tournament.

An application for membership in the Association by Annunciation Priory High School of Bismarck was read and it was duly moved, seconded and carried that they should be admitted to membership upon payment of the regular annual dues.

The Board next received the application of Fargo High School for the right to schedule a football game with Sioux City, lowe in Fergo in 1963 and in Sioux City, Iowa in 1964. The Board discussed this at some length and agreed that if Fargo could play at Sioux City without the loss of any school time that this application for sancion should be approved.

A letter was also read from Mr. Rafferty, Coach for the School for the Deaf at Devils Lake, requesting permission to attend a Midwest Deaf Relays at Omaha, Nebraska on April 27, 1963. It was the opinion of the Board that this was a special case inasmuch as it was a track meet only for Deaf Schools in the several states and it was voted that approval should be granted to Devils Lake School for the Deaf to attend this track meet.

A letter was read from Coach Knoblich of LaMoure, requesting that distance runners should be permitted to enter in more of the distance events than was now permitted under our regulations. It was noted that the regulations that are used in the State of North Dakota conform to the recommendations made in the Track Rules Book. It was therefore duly moved by Tooley and seconded by Davy that the present rule as it applies to distance runs be retained. The motion carried.

The Secretary reported that a private retarded children's school in Valley City was interested in applying for Accident Benefit Protection for the children in attendance there. It was the opinion of the Board that it may not be wise to assume this additional risk with retarded children in a private school and it was duly moved and seconded to table this application for further investigation.

The Board next reviewed the 1963 tourney regulations (as had been prepared by the Secretary for region and state tournaments) and they made one change in the meal allowance at Class C Regional Tournaments and the Northeast Class A Tournament. The meal allowance in the Northeastern Class A Regionals and the Class C Regions was raised to \$15.00 per day. All other tournament regulations were accepted as printed.

The Board was also asked to clarify the status of Fargo in the Southeast Division of Class A and it was agreed that all games played with Fargo do not count for or against the school's standing and that Fargo should be assigned to the sixth spot in the Divisional Tournament.

The Reclassification Committee submitted their report for a fourregion Class A setup and a thirty-two district setup for Class B effective with the opening of the 1963-64 school year. Several letters had been received by this Committee, asking for transfers from one district to another, and several superintendents and coaches appeared before the Board to make requests for changes in the district. The Board very carefully studied an amended plan submitted by the Reclassification Committee from the original draft and the following plan was recommended by the Committee:

It was duly moved and seconded that final action on the Class B and Class A organization plan be deferred until the March Meeting of the Board as this would give other schools an opportunity to indicate if they were dissatisfied with the assignments that had been made.

The Board spent some time reviewing SB No. 145 which had been introduced into the Senate, and which in effect would have eliminated all week-day athletic contests for all schools in the State of North Dakota. It was the opinion of the Board that this was undesirable legislation and It was the opinion of the Board that this was undesirable legislation and that every effort should be directed to have this bill killed. It was decided to enlist the support of the School Administrators, and Members Whiting, Olson and Abrahamson were instructed to draw up a proper Whiting, Olson and Abrahamson were instructed to draw up a proper resolution urging the defeat of this bill and to have it presented at the School Administrators. This was done and subsequently carried unanimously by the School Administrators at their business meeting.

Certain recommendations of the Officials Association relative to registration fees and fees for clinics were read by the Secretary but in view of the pressing business at this meeting it was decided that this matter should be deferred also until the March Meeting of the Board.

The next order of business was the opening of applications for the position of Assistant Executive Secretary. It was noted that there were fourteen applications for the position. Applications were considered at some length and finally, through a process of elimination, three candidates were further considered. These candidates were board members Tooley and Smith, and Supt. Burchill. At this time the Board adjourned to meet again on Monday for further consideration of these applications. Another straw vote was taken and it appeared that there was general agreement on the candidates. It further developed that M. F. Peterson would be absent from the state for several months and, under the circumstances, it appeared that the Board would be in a position to make this selection of the candidate at this time. It was therefore moved, seconded and carried that a former motion to wait until the March Meeting for the final selection be rescinded and final selection should be made at this time. Members Tooley and Smith were excused from all of these discussions and finally it was agreed to select Mr. F. U. Smith of Park River as Assistant Executive Secretary at a salary of \$10,000.00 per annum effective July 1, 1963. The final rollcall vote was unanimous for Mr. Smith. It was also agreed that no release of this information should be given to the public until Mr. Smith had had the opportunity to meet with his own School Board and obtain his release, and that no announcement would be made of the filling of the position until such release was authorized by Mr. Smith through the Secretary's office.

The Board decided to meet at Grand Forks on Friday, March 8th, at 9:00 A. M. There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Class A will have 4 regional tournaments and 1 eight-team state tournament.

The Board next appointed a temporary chairman of each of the four regions to organize a region for all activities on a regional basis, such organization to be called by April 15th and reports of such meetings to be available to the Board at their June meeting. The following temporary chairmen were appointed.

Northwest Region, Principal Joel Davy of Minot; Southwest Region, Supt. A. L. Hagen of Dickinson; Southeast Region, Supt. Minard McCrea of Valley City; and the Northeast Region, Supt. Vernon Eberly of Larimore.

The Board next proceeded to set up certain general regulations as a guide to the various regions in submitting plans for their regional activities. These general regulations are as follows.

Basketball:

- (a) Sites, dates, managers and officials shall be determined by the Board of Directors.
- (b) It was recommended that all basketball tournaments be played through to a conclusion.
- (c) Each region is entitled to send two teams from each region to the State Tournament.
- (d) The financial arrangements shall remain as at present, with a 50-50 split of profits over and above expenses between the competing schools and the Activities Association.
 - (e) No team shall be seeded directly into the State Tournament.
- (f) All district plans for Regional Tournaments shall be submitted to the Board for final approval at the June Meeting. It was the opinion of the Board that there should be a degree of uniformity in the type of tournaments held in the respective districts.

Track:

It was the recommendation of the Board that track be organized on the four-regional basis, with each region being permitted to select two places in each event for qualification at the State Track Meet.

Music and Speech:

It was the recommendation of the Board that Music and Speech also be handled on a regional basis, the details of the music and speech being submitted by the Music Educators Group at a subsequent meeting of the Board.

The Board next studied an organization plan submitted for Class B and heard request for change of districts on the part of several schools. It was agreed that Rogers North Central should be transferred from District No. 7 to District No. 17 as per their request. The request of Max, Garrison and Riverdale to be transferred from District No. 26 to District No. 27 was also approved. The Secretary was instructed to name an Organizing Chairman for each district, whose duty it would be to call a meeting of all the schools in the district and select a permanent District Committee on a staggered basis. The Board next adopted the following organization plan for regional and state tournaments for Class B:

(There shall be eight regions comprised of the four district winners within the region. These regional tournaments would be played on Thursday and Friday nights, with the losers eliminated and the winner of each region qualifying for the state final eight-team tournament. The following dates were set for tournaments in 1964. Class B districts to be over not later than March 7th. Class B Regionals to be played on March 12 and 13 and the State B Tournament to be staged on March 19, 20, 21. In Class A the regional A's are to be played on March 5, 6 and 7, and the State A on March 12, 13, 14.)

No changes were offered in the present track setup for B schools, nor was any change suggested for music as far as Class B schools are concerned. A request by Jamestown High School to attend the Class A Speech Festival at Carrington rather than at Minot this year was studied and granted.

The question of girls basketball was discussed at some length and it appeared that only Barnes County was still continuing to hold girls basketball tournaments. It was duly moved, seconded and carried that the Association would not approve or sanction girls basketball tournaments effective with the 1963-64 school year.

The Board next discussed methods of obtaining satisfactory basket-ball officials for the 1964 tournaments and it was the opinion of the Board that the present committee system appeared to work as well as any other system yet devised and members Davy, Solberg and Tooley were appointed to an Officials Committee to survey schools in the respective classes for their wishes as far as officials are concerned. This committee was to report at the August meeting of the Board where officials would be selected for the 1964 tournaments.

Some time was spent in discussing changes in our by-laws to comply with the rquest of the legislature in curtailing games and fournaments held on school nights. The Board appointed Don Whiting, M. F. Peterson and T. E. Simle on a committee to make a study of by-laws and recommend changes in those by-laws which would accomplish this end.

The Board next heard a recommendation of the officials relative to fees to be paid to the leaders of the various basketball, football and wrestling clinics. It was agreed that the fees should be raised from \$10.00 per clinic to \$15.00 per clinic.

The next order of business was the setting of the date for the first football practice in the fall, and the Board agreed that August 15th would be the opening date for football practice.

Delegates to the Summer Federation Meeting at Lake Placid were next named and members Robinson, Solberg and Olson were authorized to attend this meeting, with Solberg the official voting delegate at the meeting. It was also agreed that the Secretary and Ass't. Secretary should also attend this meeting.

The following were so designated to present trophies at the various basketball tournaments: Members Olson and Smith for the Class A Tournament at Grand Forks; members Tooley and Davy for the B Tournament at Minot, and Members Larson and Abrahamson for the C Tournament at Jamestown.

The Board was advised that the trophy contracts expire this year and the following committee was selected to screen trophies at the June meeting of the Board: Robinson, Larson and Olson were designated on this committee to meet at 9:00 A.M. on June 10th and with companies who display trophies and submit their recommendations to the entire Board.

The Board next selected June 10th as the date of their next meeting, such meeting to begin at 1:00 P. M., with the Trophy Committee meeting at 9:00 A. M. The Board requested that rooms be reserved at the Flickertail Inn and that inasmuch as four members of the Board were retiring that this should be a special occasion where wives of the Board should be invited to attend.

The Board next proceeded to organize itself for the 1963-64 fiscal year. Willard Solberg was elected President, Joel Davy, Vice President, effective July 1, 1963.

Member F. U. Smith submitted his resignation effective at the end of this Board Session inasmuch as he had accepted the position of Assistant Executive Secretary of the Association. The Board accepted this resignation and James Maxwell of Grafton was selected to fill this vacancy until the annual meeting of the Association, as provided for in the by-laws of the Association.

The Board adjourned to reconvene again on Saturday morning at 9:30 A. M.

The first item of business on Saturday morning was a discussion of the conduct of the cheerleaders at the different games during the tournaments. It was the feeling of the Board that at least some of the cheerleaders present were violating good sportsmanship and proper courtesy for the opposing teams. It was the opinion of the Board that perhaps some standards of cheerleading could be submitted and the matter was to be placed on the agenda for the fall meeting of the Board.

The Board next convened with the Committee of Music Educators, consisting of Doran Christensen of Dickinson and Paul Rice of Enderlin representing the Music Educators of the state. Mr. Christensen submitted the following suggested outline for Class A and Class B competition in the field of music and recommended the adoption of these regulations effective with the next school year.

N. D. HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

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1. Events Classification:

1. Vocal Solo: Each school is limited to 12 entries, not more than two of which may enter in each of the following voice classifications:

Girl's Solo (High Voice) Boy's Solo (High Voice) Girl's Solo (Low Voice) Boy's Solo (Low Voice) Girl's Solo (Medium Voice) Boy's Solo (Medium Voice)

2. Vocal Groups: Each school is limited to five (5) entries in any of the following classifications. No ensemble shall have more than 9 members.

Boy's Quartet Girl's Trio Mixed Quartet Girl's Quartet Vocal Ensemble

3. Instrumental Solos: Each school is limited on the basis of the size of the band as follows: Bands of up to 45 members may enter a maximum of 15 solos; bands of from 45 to 60 members may enter a maximum of 18 solos; and bands of 65 members and

over may enter a maximum of 23 solos. No school may enter more than two solos in any of the following classifications.

Tuba Alto Saxophone Piccolo Marimba Tenor Saxophone Flute Violin Baritone Saxophone Oboe Viola Bass Saxophone English Horn Cello French Horn Bassoon String Bass Cornet Eb Clarinet Tympani Baritone Horn Bb Clarinet Baton Twirling Trombone Bass Clarinet Snare Drum Alto Clarinet Contra-Bass Clarinet (No provision made for piano solo or duet)

4. Woodwind Ensemble: Each school shall be limited to a total of five (5) ensembles in this category. Selection of ensembles is left to the discretion of the individual schools. Ensembles shall number from 3-12 performers.

All Flute Ensembles All Saxophone Ensembles Mixed Ensembles All Clarinet Ensembles

5. Brass Ensembles: Each school shall be limited to a total of five (5) ensembles in this category. Selection of ensembles is left to the discretion of the individual schools. Ensembles shall number from 3-12 performers.

All French Horn Ensembles All Cornet Ensembles Mixed Ensembles All Trombone Ensembles

- 6. Percussion Ensembles: Each school shall be limited to three (3) entries. Each group shall number from 2-12 performers.
- 7. String Ensemble: 3-12 players. Each school shall be limited to three (3) entries.

II. Districting:

1. Class B:

We recommend that the Class B Festivals (solos, ensembles, and large groups) be handled on the same basis as the Class B and C Festivals have been handled prior to September 1963.

2. Class A:

We recommend that Class A Festivals be handled on a regional basis as outlined by the N. D. H. S. A. A. effective September, 1963. Therein, each region would have two festivals, one for instrumental solos, ensembles and large groups and one for vocal solos, ensembles, and large groups. We recommend that these festivals be held on two different Fridays.

We would like to request two of the Fridays that are open between the basketball and track season if possible. There are usually three weeks open during this interim, one of which is usually Easter weekend.

The choosing of festival sites would be handled by the N.D. H. S. A. A. or by the consent of the schools and parties involved.

Final action on these recommendations was deferred until the June meeting and after the respective A Regions had held their meetings and studied their local problems. It was the opinion of the Board that this would still give sufficient time for regulations to be printed in the Music and Speech Handbook, and would also provide ample time for each school to make plans for music and speech in 1963-64. Mr. Christensen also made a special request to the Board that his music group be permitted to participate in the B and C contests in Dickinson on March 26th in order to qualify his students for the State Music Festival in Jamestown. It was explained that icy roads prevented their attendance at Minot and that they were obliged to turn back after driving part of the way to Minot. Mr. Christensen advised the Board that he had contacted the music people in most of the B and C schools in the Dickinson area and no opposition was found to exist against this proposal. The Board authorized participation in the B and C contests and it was also the opinion of the Board that Mr. Christensen and others in charge of this group should be commended for using good judgment in turning back on icy roads and not risking the lives and safety of the youngsters under their charge. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING** Valley City - June 10-11, 1963

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association Office Building at 1:30 P. M. on June 10th, with all members present. Each member of the Board was furnished with a complete financial report of the business to date, a complete financial report of the receipts and disbursements of the Accident Benefit Fund to date, a complete listing of checks issued on the General Fund since the last meeting, and an agenda for the meeting.

The Board carefully examined both the report of the Accident Benefit Fund and the general operations of the Association and a complete listing of checks issued since the previous meeting. All items were found to be in order.

The next order of business was a report of the Trophy Committee (consisting of Robinson, Larson and Olson) who had examined trophies from the Josten Company, Ayllard Trophy Company, Balfour Company and the Main Line Trophy Company. Considerable time was spent in examining trophies suggested by the Committee and, after a careful examination, the trophies were selected as follows:

BALFOUR COMPANY:

Series 1427-A: Price range \$30.25, \$23.00, \$20.00, \$18.50 for state basketball.

Series T-682: Price range \$25.00, \$21.30, \$19.30, \$18.90. (Prices reduced \$1.00 to \$2.00 for cutting down size of backboard more like shape of North Dakota) for regional basketball.

Individual wrestling awards for state wrestling (sets of four, each weight class) \$46.80.

Series 1303: District basketball trophy. Price range \$21.95, \$17.95, \$14.95, \$13.50. Gold and silver basketballs for individual awards to first and second state basketball teams. Tie-tac participation awards for six teams state basketball, \$1.35 in Nordic bronze.

AYLLARD TROPHY COMPANY:

Series D-100: State Track and Wrestling: Series CD2-6 State Golf, tennis and cross country: No. 324-C State Debate.

Series 418G: Trophies for district track and wrestling.

District track and wrestling ribbons.

State Speech and Music individual ribbons.

Individual ribbons for cross country.

MAIN LINE TROPHY COMPANY:

Individual awards for state track, golf, tennis, debate - \$1.75, \$1.65 and \$1.55.

The next item of business was a clarification of the Junior High School rule as explained in Question No. 14 in the Special Handbook of Interpretations. The Board carefully reviewed this interpretation and again agreed that this was the intent of the Board and that this interpretation should stand for the immediate future.

The Board next called on Chairman D. B. Whiting of the Committee on Weekday Contests for a preliminary report of his committee (Consisting of members Whiting, Peterson and Simle) and it was the recommendation of this Committee that amendments to the by-laws of the Association be considered as follows:

"Article XIII - Rules of Eligibility

Section X: (Add) The first semester shall end at 4:00 P. M. on the Friday within the eighteenth week of school.

Article XII - Sports Seasons

f. (In the second line after season) one of which must be played during Christmas vacation.

Article III - Contests

Section XI: Not more than three regular season contests may be played on an evening followed by a school day. In case of a postponement because of an "Act of God" the State Board may grant permission to reschedule the contest.

Section XII: All Tournaments, other than Christmas vacation tournaments, must be completed on a Saturday except Class B Regionals.

Article VI - Sanctions

Section IV: All grade school interscholastic tournaments must receive the sanction of the State Board. No grade school team shall take part in more than two tournaments in one season, one of which must be during Christmas vacation. No non-member grade school shall participate in a sanctioned tournament.

"B" team, freshmen, sophomore, junior high school or other school interscholastic tournaments must receive the sanction of the State Board. No school shall participate in more than one such tournament.

Committee Recommendations:

We recommend that a wrestling committee, composed of three State Board members and a wrestling coach, study the wrestling scheduling, including number of matches and time of matches, and report at the June 1964 State Board meeting.

We recommend that a music committee, composed of three State Board members and a music man, study the music festival situation and report at the June 1964 State Board meeting.

The above mentioned committees shall be selected by the State Board,

We recommend that local school boards and school administrators should get their own house in order before the State Legislature puts on "CONTROLS."

The various amendments were discussed pro and con and it was the consensus of the Board that the Committee should be continued and that each Board Member should study the proposals as made by this Committee and that final action on these or other amendments could be taken at the August meeting of the Board.

The Board next discussed at length the proposal for an administrative charge for processing accident benefit claims. It appeared, however, that this year there would be a slight balance left over after paying all claims which would somewhat cover the cost of administration of the Accident Benefit Fund. It was the opinion of the Board that inasmuch as dues had been raised effective with the next school year that no further administrative charge would be made for processing accident benefit claims at this time; however, if future experience reveals that the receipts are not adequate to pay the administrative expense of claims then this matter would again be brought to the attention of the Board.

The Board next discussed the type of tournaments to be held for the four Class A Regions and it was agreed that these tournaments should be played through to determine a champion and that all games would be played evenings only. No consolation rounds would be played. Likewise Class B Regional games should be played evenings only, with no consolation games played.

The Board next proceeded to set the dates and locations of tournaments for the ensuing year and, after a general discussion, the following sites and dates were selected:

1964 CLASS A REGIONS: March 4, 5, 6, 7: Southeast, Valley City; Northeast, Grafton; Northwest, Minot; Southwest, Bismarck.

STATE CLASS A BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT: Grand Forks, March 12, 13, 14.

1964 CLASS B REGIONS: March 12, 13.

Region I, Wahpeton; Region II, Mayville; Region III, Grafton; Region IV, Devils Lake; Region V, Jamestown; Region VI, Minot; Region VIII, Dickinson.

STATE CLASS B BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT: Minot, March 19, 20, 21.

WRESTLING REGIONS: February 14, 15.

Region I, Shanley of Fargo; Region II, Bismarck; Region III, Dickinson; Region IV, Minot; Region V, Grand Forks.

STATE WRESTLING TOURNAMENT: West Fargo, February 21, 22.

GOLF: State Grass Greens: Valley City, June 1. State Sand Greens: Larimore, June 1.

TENNIS: State Tennis Tournament, Jamestown, June 2nd.

BASEBALL: State Tournament, New Rockford, June 3rd.

TRACK: Class B-C Districts: Fargo, Grand Forks, Devils Lake, Minot, Jamestown, Bismarck and Dickinson.

Class A Districts: Fargo, Grand Forks, Minot and Bismarck.

STATE TRACK MEET: Valley City, May 23rd.

CROSS COUNTRY RUN: Jamestown, October 26th.

STATE DEBATE: Bismarck, February 21st and 22nd.

STATE MUSIC AND SPEECH: Jamestown, May 8th.

Mr. Paul Rice of the Enderlin High School Faculty, and a member of the State Music Committee, met with the Board and again reported the recommendations of his committee for the operation of Music Festivals for the 1963-64 school year. These recommendations had been previously presented at the March meeting of the Board and will be found in their entirety in the minutes of the March meeting of the Board. Although the Board had a few misgivings as to the practicability of all the features suggested, it was agreed to accept these recommendations for next year on a trial basis.

Some discussion was held on the possible need for additional districts in certain areas where the contests had become too large. The Secretary reported on a meeting with the Speech Committee and their plan is essentially the same as used last year except that entrants to the State Contest would not be limited to one individual in each event but rather to all contestants who attained a No. 1 rating.

The Secretary was instructed to set up football, basketball and wrestling clinics on the same basis as were used in the past year. Sid Grande, Herb Parker and Al Meyer were again selected to conduct the football and basketball clinics. Mr. Halmrast of the Bismarck High School Faculty was selected to conduct a series of wrestling clinics on dates to be arranged.

The Board reviewed television and radio policies used for the past two years and could not see any improvements that could be made at this time. The Secretary was instructed to follow the same policy in regard to television and radio broadcast of state tournaments as was used in the past year.

The Board examined the premises and agreed that certain painting should be done in the storage room and the ceiling of the main office, and the Secretary was instructed to have this work arranged for and also to purchase such other articles of office equipment as would be needed.

The Board was apprised of the action of District No. 23 in intervening in the dismissal of the Superintendent at Westhope, and it was the opinion of the Board that neither District No. 23 nor this organization had any jurisdiction in action of this kind and that it was strictly a local affair between the administration and the school board of the Westhope School District.

The Board also reviewed several controversial accident benefit claims and was advised of their present status. No action was deemed necessary.

Supt. Minard McCrea met with the Board and explained some of the problems that the Valley City School District had in maintaining the track in a condition that would be acceptable for the State Track Meet. Mr. McCrea suggested that a committee be appointed from the Board to meet with him at a later date to see what might be worked out in this regard.

Mr. Ken Rio was appointed to the State Track Committee to replace Mr. Peterson of Oak Grove who had left the state for a position with the Mankato State Teachers College.

The Board agreed to raise the salaries of the office help \$25.00 per month beginning July 1st. The Board also agreed to raise the salary of the Executive Secretary by \$500.00 effective July 1st.

The Board re-examined their schedule of payment to members attending the National Federation Meeting in the summer and the Secretary was instructed to issue checks on that basis to those Board members who were officially selected to attend the summer meeting.

There appeared to be no other new business and the Board selected August 17th at 8:30 A. M. as the date of the final summer meeting of the Board. The meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION Fargo — October 18, 1962

The annual meeting of the North Dakota High school Activities Association was held in the Agassiz school auditorium in Fargo on October 18, 1962. This was one of the best attended meetings in the past years, with 150 schools represented and another 100 spectators present.

The meeting was called to order by president Olson at 2:00 P.M. and the following program was given:

Report of Annual Federation Meeting, Saskatoon Final report on Court Case	Eil Kay Larson F. U. Smith
Need for Association publicity	D. B. Whiting
Report on Accident Benefit Fund	E. Abrahamson

The business session was called to order at 3:00 P.M. by President M. C. Olson.

It was moved by Burchill of Beulah and seconded by Cummings of Oakes that inasmuch as all members had copies of the minutes of the last meeting in the annual handbook that the reading of these minutes be waived. The motion carried.

President Olson then requested the secretary to read the proposed amendment to Article II of the By-Laws. This was done and Principal Joel Davy moved the adoption of the amendment. The motion was seconded by Hanson. A general discussion was held. Supt. Arneson of Edinburg offered an amendment to the amendment that would change the first sentence in Section I (a) from "a male enrollment of 200 or more in grades 9-12" to "an enrollment of 125 or more pupils in an all male school in grades 9-12" and a corresponding change in Section I (c) in the last paragraph from "and/or the male enrollment in grades 9-12 drops below 200" to "and/or the enrollment in all male school in grades 9-12 drops below 125." After further discussion the question was called for and the chair called for a standing vote on the amendment to the prefered amendment. Joel Davy and Don Whiting acted as tellers and the vote was 113 "yes" and 2 "no." The chair declared the amendment to the amendment carried and the amendment now reads as follows:

ARTICLE II - Classification of Schools - Section I, Class A schools:

- A. "This group shall consist of all member high schools with a total enrollment of 250 or over, and/or an enrollment of 125 or more pupils in an all male school in grades 9-12, inclusive as of October 1, 1962, plus any member high school that elects to choose Class A as provided in paragraph (b), (c) and (d) herewith.
- B. Any high school with a total enrollment between 199 and 250 in grades 9-12; inclusive on October 1, 1962, may elect to join Class A for interscholastic competition by written notice to the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association before January 1, 1963.
- C. After the classes are established on January 1, 1963, a member school having a total enrollment of more than 199 and less than 250 in grades 9-12, inclusive, must give two years notice to the Board of Directors to change its classification. Such choice must be made not later than September 1st of any year and shall become effective with the opening of the fall term two years later. Schools that elect to become Class A schools must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification. Provided further, when the total high school enrollment in grades 9-12 drops below 250, and/or the enrollment in an ali male school in grades 9-12 drops below 125, that school shall have one year of grace in which to choose its class of competition.

Should an A school drop below 200 in enrollment in grades 9-12 and continue below 200 for two consecutive years, this school must be reclassified as a "B" school. Should a school rise above 249 in enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, and continue above that figure for two consecutive years, this school must be classified as an "A" school.

D. Should a new high school be established in an existing district or area, whose enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, exceeds 249, the two-year waiting period stated in paragraph (c) above shall be waived and the school shall be immediately classified as an "A" school.

Section II: Class B schools.

All member high schools, other than those designated Class A, shall be classified as Class "B" schools.

Section III:

Class A and Class B schools shall compete in separate classes to determine state basketball championships. The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is authorized to combine classes in other athletic or non-athletic contests and festivals if it appears expedient and desirable."

Discussion was then continued on the amendment as amended for at least thirty minutes. Fiinally the question was called for on the original motion to adopt. A rising vote was taken and the result showed 11.7 "yes" and 27 "no" and the amendment was declared carried.

The chair then called for the reading of the amendment to Article XII, Section II, of the By-Laws. Both amendments had been presented

for first reading in the September Activities Bulletin. This amendment read as follows:

ARTICLE XII - SPORTS SEASONS

Section II: Basketball.

- a. No change.
- b. No change.
- c. Total games played shall not exceed twenty season games or eighteen season games and one invitational tournament. Should a school elect to participate in two invitational tournaments, then the games in one of these tournaments plus those in regular seasons play shall not exceed twenty games. Games played in the district, regional or state basketball tournaments sponsored by the Association shall not count in the maximum number of games permitted.
 - d. No change.
 - e. No change.
- f. No team or individual player shall be permitted to play in more than two tournaments per season, one of which shall not exceed a fourteam tournament, in addition to those in the play-off series sponsored by the Association.

Supt. Thompson of Elgin moved the adoption of this amendment. The motion was seconded by Robinson of McGregor. A general discussion followed and the question was called for. A standing vote was taken and the count showed 128 "yes" and 3 "no." The amendment was declared carried. Concern was expressed over when this amendment would become effective. In accordance with usual practice, amendments become effective the following July. A discussion followed and a motion was made to make the amendment effective in September 1963. This motion was later withdrawn and Supt. Olson moved that the amendment become effective this basketball season. This was seconded by Johnson and carried, with no dissenting votes.

The chair then called for the reading of a Constitutional amendment to Article V, Sections I and II of the Constitution which was read as follows:

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS AND DUTIES:

Section I:

There shall be a Board of Directors, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of nine members, elected as hereinafter prescribed, for terms of three years except as hereinafter provided. Each new member shall be seated July 1st following his election and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms, except that he may be appointed or elected to fill a vacancy after one year's absence from office. Three members of the Board shall be chosen from Class A schools, three from Class B schools, and one member shall be elected from any member high school regardless of classification. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or a member of his duly constituted staff, designated by him, shall serve as an ex-officio member of said Board. One school board member from a member high school shall be selected by the

executive committee of the North Dakota School Boards Association and his term of office shall be the same as that of other elective Board members. Should this member cease to be a school board member from a member high school, the position shall be declared vacant and a successor selected by the Board of Directors of the School Boards Association to fill the unexpired term.

Section II:

Board members shall be nominated at the annual meeting of the Representatives of the Association, hereinafter called the Representative Assembly, and shall be elected by mail ballot, such ballot to be prepared by the Secretary and mailed to member schools on or before January first following the nomination and shall be returned to the Secretary before January fifteenth, the ballot being valid if the envelope in which it is mailed is postmarked before midnight of January fourteenth.

Nomination for the member at large, one member from Class B schools and one from Class A schools, shall be made by a special nominating committee at the annual meeting in 1962, two members from Class A schools in 1963 and two members from Class B schools in 1964, and thereafter in consecutive order as the terms of the various members expire. Nominations may also be made from the floor.

Should any member remove from the state or profession, change into a different class school, or cease to be administrator, his position shall be declared vacant immediately and a new member appointed by the Board to fill the vacancy until the next annual meeting when the regular procedure of nomination and balloting shall be followed to fill vacancy for the remainder of the term of office."

SECTION III: No change.

The chair informed the membership that according to the provision of the Constitution, this would be presented for a mail vote.

The report of the Nominating Committee, consisting of Superintendents Havig, York and Rindt, offered the following slates of candidates:

Mr. Havig moved the acceptance of this report. It was seconded and accepted. The chair explained in detail that the passage of the amendment eliminating Class C made it necessary to offer a slate of officers to conform with the constitutional amendment just read. A few questions on procedure were raised but it was generally agreed that this was the only sensible course to follow. Nominations were called for from the floor and the following names were submitted:

 Don Whiting was granted the floor and offered the following constitutional amendment on behalf of the Board of Directors of the Association.

ARTICLE IV - DUES

SECTION I-DUES SHALL BE BASED ON THE RATE OF TWENTY CENTS PER STUDENT ENROLLED IN GRADES 7-12, THE ENROLLMENT BEING THE OFFICIAL ENROLLMENT AS OF OCTOBER 1 OF THE PREVIOUS YEAR. THE AMOUNT OF THE DUES SHALL NOT BE LESS THAN \$25.00 OR MORE THAN \$350.00 ANNUALLY. FOR SCHOOLS OR SCHOOL DISTRICTS NOT PARTICIPATING IN INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES BUT DESIRING ATHLETIC ACCIDENT BENEFIT FUND PROTECTION, THE ANNUAL DUES SHALL BE \$10.00. FOR COUNTY UNITS THE ANNUAL DUES SHALL BE \$10.00

Several spoke for the need for additional funds. The chair informed the membership that the two constitutional amendments would be on the ballot with the nominees for the position on the Board of Directors, to be returned by January 15, 1963.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

The motion carried.

The Northeast and the Northwest groups caucused to nominate a representative to the Board as the term of their representatives expired. NORTH DAKOTA OFFICIALS ASSOCIATION

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota Officials Association met at the North Dakota High School Activities Association office in Valley City with all members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The rating forms for officials and for schools were examined by the Board and it was agreed that the results of these ratings should be kept confidential and notices of the average ratings and suggestions for improvements should only be sent to the parties rated.

Fees for registration were discussed and it was agreed to recommend that the registration fee for one sport be increased from \$3.00 to \$4.00 and that the fee for additional sports be left at \$2.00 for the second sport and \$1.00 for any additional sports. It was the consensus of the Board that this additional fee would compensate for the additional work of compiling the rating scale.

It was also recommended that deadlines be set up for registering without penalty and that a penalty of \$1.00 be charged for late registrations. The suggested deadlines were August 1st for football and October 1st for basketball, wrestling and baseball.

It was agreed to submit the above recommendations to the annual meeting of officials on Saturday.

It was also agreed to recommend to the N. D. H. S. A. A. that the fees for conducting clinics be raised from the present schedule of \$10.00 per clinic.
