FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 40th annual handbook which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

Attention is called to certain trends and developments that are apparent over the year. Special attention is directed to certain events that have special significance to member schools.

- 1. Membership in the Association has decreased to 320 high schools. This is a drop of 8 the past year and 30 during the past two years. The small high school slowly but surely fades from the picture as reorganization and annexation of school districts continue. The trend is also to close the campus or model high schools operated in conjunction with state colleges. In some instances the parochial high schools are curtailing their programs and are turning to the public school for certain high school courses or eliminating certain grades in the junior-senior high school.
- 2. The new schedule of membership dues became operative for the first time this year and the additional revenue from this source has made it possible to restore subsidies to such sports as tennis, golf, track, baseball and wrestling, which are not self-supporting. Under this system of subsidies every encouragement is given to member schools to participate and schools share in proportion to their excellence in a given sport field.
- 3. During the year certain amendments were added to the by-laws of the Association which will reduce the number of invitational basketball tourneys. Another rather controversial amendment was also passed that will reduce the number of weekday interscholastic basketball contests to three during the season. Such action is in harmony with the recommendations of the North Central Association of Secondary Schools. An examination of the regulations of other states indicates that several other states have adopted similar restrictions on mid-week interscholastic contests. While such restrictions may prove unpopular in certain areas, and may be branded as dictatorial, critics should recognize that there is a high probability that action would be taken by the state legislature if the Association failed to act. Bills to limit mid-week athletic contests have been introduced in the last two sessions of the legislature and the last time was withdrawn, with the understanding that the Association would correct the situation.
- 4. The interpretation of the sales tax law, as it applies to athletic and other events sponsored by schools or the Association (at which admission was charged), was the subject of many discussions and letters between the Association office and the Tax Commissioner's office.

A ruling was finally given that if the school boards had the final control of such receipts and disbursements (and the receipts were used for educational purposes) the sales tax would not have to be levied and collected.

5. The Accident Benefit Fund still continues to grow and both receipts and claim payments have broken all records. The incidence of injury again increased and the large deficit for the year has made it neces-

sary to again revise the rates upward. Increased hospital costs have also made it necessary and desirable that the benefit schedule be increased to bring about a more realistic benefit payment for hospitalization cases. Anyone interested in the operation of the Accident Benefit Fund is referred to the statistical information appearing in this handbook under the auditor's report.

- o. From a financial viewpoint, the past season has been the most successful in all the years that basketball tournaments have been sponsored by the Association, and net receipts have broken all records. The new two-class system appears to meet with general approval although minor organizational changes may have to be made before things runsmoothly.
- 7. Wrestling and track continues to grow, with baseball holding its own. This year two class A schools entered baseball competition for the first time. Six-man football is disappearing from the scene and is being replaced by the eight and nine-man game.
- 8. Increased participation is noted in music and speech activities. The cost of conducting these contests has also increased. Districts have found it necessary to levy special assessments on the schools, in addition to the fees set up by the Association. This practice has not met with the approval of many of the smaller schools. A revised fee schedule will become effective next year and should eliminate the need for the unpopular and cumbersome special assessments.
- 9. In general, this has been another successful Association year, saddened by the unexpected passing of Supt. Simle who had just been elected to the Board of Directors. Your Secretary was forced to spend several weeks in Rochester but this ordeal was tempered by the knowledge and confidence that the work would go on uninterrupted by an efficient and cooperative office staff under the direction of Assistant Secretary, F. U. Smith.

An assistant in the office has made it possible to contact and confer with schools in the field, and about 95% of the schools were visited at least once during the year. This personal visitation can become one of most valuable services to member schools, and do much to develop proper relations between the central office and the school personnel in the field.

As the books are closed for the year, we are mindful of the excellent cooperation and assistance given this office by the superintendents and coaches of the state. The Board of Directors and the office personnel together express our appreciation for your help in making 1963-64 another excellent year.

Father Becwar of St. Mary's School of Bismarck appeared before the Board, explaining their summer activity program. It was the consensus of opinion of the Board that there was nothing in violation of the rules of the Association in connection therewith.

Supt. August Spiss of Mandan also appeared before the Board, with the request that the Southwest Class A regional basketball tournament be located at Mandan, and that it be a two-day tourney ending with the semi-final round. Tooley moved that the tourney be moved to Mandan but that it be played to a conclusion. This motion lost for lack of a second. It was then moved by Whiting and seconded by Peterson that the matter be tabled. Motion carried.

The Board next proceeded to open bids for tournament basketballs. and it was found that the bid of the G. P. Sporting Goods Company of Bismarck, by Russ Anderson, Manager, was the lowest bid and it was duly moved and seconded that this bid of \$13.49 per ball, F.O.B. Bismarck, for the B1200 Wilson Jet basketball be accepted.

Some time was spent discussing T.V. and radio policies in connection with the state basketball tournaments. It was moved by Whiting and seconded by Simle that we continue the policies of the past year and that the chair appoint a T. V. Committee. Named to this committee were Cummings, Davy and Smith,

The Secretary next read a letter from Mr. Leonard Marti of the University of North Dakota, notifying the Board of an increase in charges to a \$150.00 for holding district track meets. After considerable discussion it was moved by Whiting and seconded by Maxwell that a \$75.00 fee be allowed for holding both A and B track meets and \$50,00 for just a B Meet. The secretary was instructed to so notify Mr. Marti and if this was not acceptable to him to try and locate these meets elsewhere.

Discussion followed on the proposed amendments to the by-laws which had been presented by the committee at the June meeting. It was moved by Davy that Section X of Article XIII (Rules of Eligibility) of our present by-laws should be left as presently written, but that Board interpretation should be that in order to be counted as one of the eighteen weeks comprising a semester classes must be held the major portion of that week. Seconded by Simle and carried.

It was duly moved and seconded that the following amendments to Section II of Article XII of the by-laws be presented to the general assembly at the annual meeting in October.

Article XII - Sport Seasons

Section II: Basketball

C. Total games played shall not exceed twenty season games or eighteen season games and one invitational tournament. Games played in the district, regional or state basketball tournaments sponsored by the Association shall not count in the maximum number of games permitted.

F. Not more than three regular season interscholastic basketball contests may be played by any team sponsored by the school on an evening followed by a school day. In case of postponement because of an "Act of God" the State Board may grant permission to re-schedule the contest.

G. All tournaments, other than holiday tournaments and Association-sponsored tournaments, are to be completed on a Saturday.

H. Re-number present (G) as (H).

It was moved by Whiting that the proposed amendments to Article VI be tabled and a committee be appointed to draw up a section to our constitution pertaining to junior high schools only. Seconded by Davy and carried. Named to this committee were Maxwell, (Chairman) Kolbo, Whiting and Smith.

Simle presented the question of junior high students participating in varsity interscholastic wrestling programs in schools organized on the 6-3-3-plan. It was moved by Tooley and seconded by Cummings that the question be referred to the junior high school committee for study. Carried.

The eligibility case of Preston Lester of Columbus was reviewed and it was the opinion of the Board that this boy would be ineligible for a period of eighteen weeks unless he were legally adopted by his uncle at Columbus.

A letter from KLPM radio station of Minot was read, requesting permission to make awards in the form of gift certificates from local merchants to outstanding athletes of the week during the coming football and basketball seasons. As this would be in violation of Section IV, Article VIII of our constitution, it was moved by Whiting and seconded by Simle that this request be denied. Carried.

Some time was spent in planning the program for the annual meeting in October and it was agreed that in lieu of a speaker for the first hour of the meeting a social hour with coffee be held, and a program patterned after the popular T. V. program "Meet the Press" entitled "Meet the Board" be arranged whereby members could raise questions of interest to various Board members. The secretary was appointed to prepare and arrange an agenda for the business meeting. It was the agreement of the Board to meet at the N. D. E. A. convention in Bismarck at 3:00 P. M. on Wednesday, October 16th.

The next order of business was to hear the report of the Officials Committee which had met on Friday evening to recommend a list of officials for the respective regional and state basketball and state wrestling tournaments in 1964. A committee consisting of Davy, Solberg and Tooley made the following recommendations for officials:

MINUTES OF

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Bismarck, North Dakota - October 16, 17, 1963

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Bismarck at the G. P. Hotel with all members present.

Each board member was presented with a packet containing the agenda for the meeting, a complete listing of all checks issued since the last meeting, a financial report of all business transacted from July 1 to October 15, 1963, and copies of the October Activities Bulletin.

James McCord from St. John's High School in Jamestown appeared before the Board to explain their high school set-up this year and plans for future years. At the present time they are operating grades 9, 11, and 12 and plan to eliminate grades 11 and 12 as well as grade 10 after the present classes graduate. After that time they will only be operating a junior high school consisting of grades 7, 8 and 9. This semester their freshmen take two academic courses at the Academy and two at Jamestown High School. Discussion followed as to the eligibility of these ninth grade students since they were not taking at least three subjects in any one high school. Mr. McCord reported that it would not be possible for these students to obtain three subjects in their school. It was moved by M. F. Peterson that if the 9th grade students who are maintaining dual membership in both schools would transfer one subject so that they would be carrying three subjects at Jamestown High School by Monday, October 21, 1963, such students are to be declared eligible at Jamestown High School at the beginning of the second semester providing they meet all other eligibility requirements. The motion was seconded by Don Whiting and carried.

Superintendent William Gussner of Jamestown and Principal Otto Bernhoft of Fargo, representing the Southeast Class A division, appeared before the Board expressing displeasure with the plan for the Regional A Tournaments as arranged by the Board. They were informed that due to the advanced stage of preparation and commitments which had already been made, it was too late to make any changes for this year, but if this plan still met with disfavor among the Class A schools at the close of the season, revisions would be considered by the Board for the 1964-65 season.

The Board spent some time reviewing the financial report, and upon motion, the report was accepted.

The next order of business was the selection of a delegate to represent the Association at the National Football Rules Meeting in New Orleans, January 7-9; 1964. It was moved by Don Whiting that whereas Sid Cichy of Shanley High School, who had been named as a delegate last year but was unable to attend, be again named this year. The motion was seconded by Don Kolbo and carried. George Rempfer of Oakes and Bob Lentz of Walhalla were nominated as alternates with George Rempfer being selected.

Wayne Sandstead, debate coach at Minot High School, was named to represent the Association at the N. U. E. A. Committee on Debate and Discussion in St. Louis, Missouri, December 27, 28, 1963. F. U. Smith, Assistant Secretary, was authorized to attend the annual meeting of executive secretaries at New Orleans, Louisiana, January 7-9, 1964.

Discussion followed relative to the program "Meet The Board" scheduled for the annual meeting of the Association.

The Board next took under consideration the letter sent to member schools from the State Tax Commissioner, Lloyd Omdahl, relative to the collection of sales tax. As Mr. Omdahl was scheduled to appear at the meeting of the school administrators on Friday, it was decided to take no action at this time relative to the quesion. The president and secretary were delegated to confer with the tax commissioner before the scheduled meeting on Friday.

Some time was spent reviewing the proposed amendments to Article XII, Section II, of the by-laws to be voted upon by the general assembly at the annual meeting, and the proper parliamentary procedure in case of acceptance or rejection of any of the various proposed amendments.

The Board then recessed until 10:00 A. M., Thursday, October 17th.

Thursday, October 17th, 10:00 A.M.

The first order of business on Thursday morning was the opening of bids for televising the 1964 state basketball tournaments. The only bid submitted was one from the North Dakota Broadcasting Company for \$2,500.00 for televising all games, or a minimum of four games of the State Class A Basketball Tournament at Grand Forks. It was moved by Joel Davy, seconded by T. E. Simle and carried that the bid be accepted. As no bids were received for televising the State Class B Tournament at Minot, it was moved by Don Whiting that the television committee be authorized to deal with television stations for the televising of this tournament, subject to the minimum price previously set by the Board of such televising. The motion was seconded by G. A. Tooley and carried.

Discussion followed on the eligibility of junior high school students participating in state track meets. It was decided to observe present practices in this pending a future report of the junior high committee who are working on a set of rules and regulations pertaining to junior high students in all sports.

The matter of adjudiciating of bands and choruses at district music contests was discussed at considerable length. The suggestion was made

that if several adjudicators were employed, the groups could be divided according to size and one adjudicator assigned to each division. This was left to the discretion of the executive secretary.

Balta High School, which has not fielded a basketball team for a number of years, has now decided to participate in interscholastic basketball and applied for assignment to District 13, Class B. It was moved by Nate Cummings that they be so assigned. The motion was seconded by Don Kolbo and carried.

Considerable time was spent in setting up the details felative to the Class A and Class B regional tournaments.

It was the opinion of the Board that should these charges be substantiated, the boy should be declared ineligible in all sports for the balance of the year.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Bismarck, North Dakota — January 26, 27, 1964

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Grand Pacific Hotel in Bismarck on January 26, 27, 1964, with all members present. Each member was presented with a packet containing the agenda, a copy of the minutes of the October meeting of the Board, a complete financial report of the year's business to January 24, 1964, and a list of checks drawn on the general fund since the last meeting. The Board spent some time examining the financial report and, upon motion, the report was duly accepted.

The canvassing committee, consisting of members Cummings, Kolbo and Tooley reported that they had canvassed the annual election results and found them to be as follows:

Joel Davy............185
Scattering votes14 Total votes cast.......207

Joel Davy and James Maxwell were declared elected to the Board for Class A schools effective July 1, 1964.

The next order of business was the appointment of a Class A representative on the Board of Directors to fill the vacancy caused by the death of T. E. Simle. August Spiss of Mandan was selected to fill this vacancy until the annual meeting of the Association, as provided for in the Bylaws of the Association.

Coaches Knoblich of LaMoure and Wash of Fort Yates appeared before the Board requesting that distance runners be permitted to enter in more of the distance events than was now permitted under our regulation. After considerable discussion, it was moved by Whiting that no change be made in present regulations. This motion died for want of a second. Kolbo then moved that our present rules be amended to permit a distance runner to enter two distance races plus a relay event. This motion was seconded by Davy and carried.

A committee representing the State A. A. U. Association met with the Board relative to the A. A. U. regional wrestling meet to be held in Jamestown the latter part of March, requesting a lifting of the Activities Association regulations which state that high school students participating in such a post-season event are ineligible for spring sports. It was the opinion of the Board that since this regulation is stated in Part B, Section III of Article XIII of the By-laws of the Association, the Board of Directors did not have the power to waive the rule and that any change in such regulation would require the passage of an amendment to the present By-laws according to the procedure outlined in the Constitution of the Association.

The TV committee reported that contracts had been awarded for televising the following 1964 basketball tournaments:

State Class A - Grand Forks - N. D. Broadcasting Co. for a fee of \$2500.00

NW Regional A - Minot

SW Regional A - Bismarck

- KXMC Television Station for a fee of 600.00

- KXMB Television Station for a fee of 600.00

As of this date no bids had been received for televising the State Class B tourney at Minot or the Class A regional tournaments at Grafton and Valley City.

The next order of business was the setting of the date for the first day of football practice in the fall, and the Board agreed that August 13th be set as such date.

Some time was spent by the Board in reviewing basketball tournament regulations. It was agreed that the regional Class A committees should have the power to determine the method of seeding teams in their respective regional tournaments.

A request was received from Jamestown High School, who had previously been assigned to the regional wrestling tournament at Bismarck, for transfer to the regional event at Fargo. Because of the large number of registrants at the Fargo meet, it was moved by M. F. Peterson that this request be denied, seconded by Whiting, and carried.

Discussion followed on a ruling which had been received from the State Tax Commissioner's office that sales tax would have to be collected on the sale of admission tickets to regional and state basketball tournaments. Chairman Solberg appointed Davy, Spiss, Abrahamson, and Smith as a committee to meet with Attorney Michaels of the Tax Commissioners office on Monday morning for reconsideration of this ruling. This committee subsequently reported that a revised ruling was received to the effect that no sales tax would have to be collected if the entire gross receipts were expended for educational purposes and an accounting system set-up in the Association office indicating that expenditures are made for such purposes.

The Board next reviewed the current status of the A. A. B. Fund. The chairman appointed members Maxwell and Cummings as a committee to meet with the executive officers of the Association to consider a revision of the current A. A. B. F. schedule for the next biennium.

The secretary reported that the district track meet which had been previously scheduled at Grand Forks had been rescheduled on the same dates at Mayville because of a conflict with the North Central Conference meet at the University on those dates.

A request was received from the North Central High School Hockey Association in the northeastern part of the state that the Activities Association sponsor a state hockey tournament commencing with the 1964-1965 season. It was moved by Davy and seconded by Kolbo that because of the small number of schools participating in hockey at the present time, the question of an Association sponsored state hockey tournament be deferred until such time when more schools add this sport to their inter-scholastic program. Motion carried.

A report from the referee on a Stanton-Dodge basketball game at Dodge was read by the Board, along with a protest submitted by the coach at Dodge. It was moved by Whiting and seconded by Davy that the Stanton protest along with accompanying deposit be returned to the school, as the protest was made by the coach rather than the administrator of the school. Motion carried. The secretary was instructed to contact the superintendents of the two schools and to investigate the facts relative to the charges made and to then take whatever steps were deemed necessary.

A newspaper story relative to a basketball game between St. Mary's of New England and Fort Yates was brought to the attention of the Board. It was agreed that should allegations made therein be found to be true after investigation by the secretary, disciplinary action would be in order.

It was pointed out that frequently commercial concerns or service organizations donate trophies for good sportsmanship, free-throw contests and the like. The Board agreed that the engraving of the name of the donor on the trophy, if a commercial concern, would be considered as advertising and in violation of Section IV, Article VIII, of the By-laws of the Association relative to awards.

The Board next considered a complaint relative to the dates selected for the 1963 Valley City State College Coaches Clinic. It was recommended that the secretary contact Athletic Director Bill Osmon of the college as to the possibility of holding future clinics on the same correspondence dates as in former years.

The Board agreed to meet at Minot on Friday, March 20th at 9:00 a.m. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Minot, North Dakota - March 20, 21, 1964

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at Minot, North Dakota on March 20, 21, 1964, with all members present except M. F. Peterson on March 20th and all members present on March 21st. Mimeographed copies of the minutes of the previous session had been previously mailed to the Board and these minutes were approved.

The Board next examined the financial report showing a list of all expenditures and income of the General Fund and Accident Benefit Fund up to March 18, 1964. This financial report was carefully examined and discussed and was accepted.

Discussion followed on the holding of Cheerleaders Clinics during the 1964-1965 school term. It was moved by Whiting and seconded by Kolbo that L. R. Herkimer be engaged to conduct such clinics during the month of October. Motion carried. Cummings moved that Dickinson, Minot, Devils Lake, and Valley City be sites for these clinics. Seconded by Davy and carried.

James Maxwell reported on a study made by the A. A. B. F. Committee, along with recommendations that the following changes be made in benefit payments:

- 1. Increase maximum allowance for hospital room charge from \$10.00 to \$13.00.
- 2. Increase maximum allowance for operating room from \$15.00 to \$25.00.
- 3. Increase maximum allowance for anesthesia from \$15.00 to \$25.00.
- Increase maximum allowance for drugs and dressings from \$10.00 to 15.00.
- 5. Increase maximum allowance for laboratory tests from \$5.00 to \$10.00.
- 6. Adopt the x-ray schedule used by the Workmen's Compensation Bureau, which would increase the allowance for most x-rays \$2.50 to \$5.00.
- 7. Use the new x-ray schedule also in out-patient hospital cases, instead of the present system of allowing itemized charge up to \$15.00 for an x-ray by the hospital. No other charge from present benefit schedule for out-patient service.
- 8. Increase allowance for office calls from \$3.00 to \$4.00 in items No. 71 and No. 72 of the benefit schedule.
- No change in the present fracture and dislocation benefit schedule, except to permit a 75% increase in allowance for requiring open reduction instead of the present 50%.
- 10. Since 87% of the schools are carrying the casualty plan at the present time, the separate casualty plan as such should be discontinued and instead be incorporated in the general plans, so that all schools would automatically have this protection.
- 11. Total fees collected should be raised to bring in an additional \$60,000.00 to cover the anticipated deficit this year, administrative costs, and proposed increased benefit payments.

Tooley moved the adoption of the report, seconded by Cummings and carried.

It was moved by Davy that the committee prepare a new premium rate schedule which would take care of present shortages in certain areas and the proposed increase in benefits to present at the June meeting. The motion was seconded by Whiting and carried.

The secretary next read the recommendations relative to the wrestling program as adopted by the wrestling coaches at their meeting in connection with the State Wrestling Meet in West Fargo on February 22nd. It was moved by Cummings and seconded by Tooley that the president of the Wrestling Coaches Association meet with the Board at the June meeting for the consideration of these recommendations. Motion carried.

Discussion followed relative to mileage payments for state wrestling, track, golf and tennis meets. It was moved by Davy and seconded by Spiss that the following schedule be adopted:

1 - 5 participants - 10c per one-way mile

6 - 10 participants - 20c per one-way mile

11 - 15 participants - 30c per one-way mile

Over 15 participants - 50c per one-way mile

Tooley moved an amendment to include baseball in the above schedule. Seconded by Kolbo and carried. The motion as amended was then voted upon and passed.

The secretary reported on the measures taken by the State Association along with the National Federation against the proposed telecasting of professional football games on Friday nights which resulted in the cancellation of such plans.

Discussion followed on the televising of the state basketball tournaments, with action deferred until the June meeting as to policies relative to the 1965 tournaments.

Davy reported on the committee hearing relative to Rugby's protest on the eligibilityy of a Stanley basketball player in the Northwest regional A tournament and the denial of the protest by the committee for lack of positive evidence. Cummings moved to uphold the action of the committee and that the matter be considered closed. Seconded by Spiss and carried.

A request was received from the Speech Committee for financial assistance in sending delegates to the Central States Speech Meeting in Chicago. It was moved by Davy and seconded by Tooley that the same allowance of \$100.00 as was allocated last year be allowed for such purpose this year. Motion carried.

The secretary informed the Board of the notification received from Larimore High School that they would be unable to host the sand greens golf tournament because of the condition of their course. It was moved by Maxwell and seconded by Whiting that this tournament be moved to Carrington, if possible to hold it there. Motion carried.

Discussion followed relative to football, basketball and wrestling clinics. It was moved by Tooley that these clinics be conducted again next year as in the past. Seconded by Kolbo and passed.

Maxwell moved that the calendar project be continued in 1964-1965. Seconded by Whiting and passed.

Chester Reitan of KXMC Television station of Minot appeared before the Board requesting permission to televise the final game of the Class 30

B tournament, since the game was completely 'sold out' for ticket admissions. Cummings moved that such permission be granted for a fee of \$250.00, seconded by Davy. Whiting moved to amend the motion to permit the televising of the 3rd place game for an additional \$125.00 if the station desired to carry this game also. Seconded by Spiss and carried. It was agreed that no announcement of such telecasting would be made before 3:00 p.m. on Saturday. The Board was subsequently informed by KXMC that they would televise both games on Saturday night for the fee of \$375.00.

Al Meyer, representing the Officials Association, appeared before the Board recommending a procedure for selection of officials for basketball tournaments, whereby each of the four Class A regions would submit a recommended list of ten officials in order of preference. Each class B district would select a man to meet in their respective regions and these regions in turn would also submit a list of ten recommended officials. These lists would then serve as a guide in the selection of officials for tournaments next year. It was moved by Kolbo and seconded by Davy to accept this recommendation. Motion carried.

It was agreed that a member of the Officials Association, plus a Class A coach and a Class B coach to be named by the Coaches Association, should meet with the officials committee of the N. D. H. S. A. A. Board in August for the selection of tournament officials. Named to this committee from the Board were Kolbo, Maxwell and Cummings.

Eugene Fitzgerald of the Fargo Forum appeared before the Board with the suggestion that the Class B regionals be held on different dates than the Class A State Tournament, so that newspapers and other news media might give better coverage to the Class B regionals. It was moved by Tooley, seconded by Cummings, and carried, that the chair appoint a committee to study tournament scheduling and that said committee should bring in recommendations on such at the June meeting. Appointed to this committee were Tooley, Chairman, Cummings and Spiss.

- Mr. Paul Rice of Enderlin, representing the Music Educators Association, appeared before the Board with the following recommendations for 1965 music contests:
- I. The vocal ensemble event under item 2 on page 7 of the music manual should be changed to: boys ensemble (5-9 members), girls ensemble (5 - 9 members), and mixed ensemble (5 - 9 members). The total choice of vocal ensemble events to be changed from 5 to 7.
- 2. In the event a school misses a festival because of some restricting condition, such as weather, the music director may approach the executive secretary of the N. D. H. S. A. A. and the matter should then be handled by the executive secretary.
- 3. Ratings as drawn in the Rules and Regulations book for music festivals should be used in all district and state music festivals. Ratings are to be posted by the festival manager at the festival site at the close of the judging.

Action on these recommendations was deferred until the June meeting when other recommendations might be forthcoming after the completion of this years festivals.

The secretary reported the difficulty being encountered in the scheduling of the district trackmeets on Saturday, May 16th, because of conflicts with the North Central College Conference and the N. D. I. A. C. track meets scheduled on the same day. The secretary was instructed to work this problem out the best way possible, substituting different dates if necessary.

James Maxwell, Chairman of the Committee on Junior High School By-laws and Regulations, gave a detailed report on the work of that committee. The secretary was instructed to mimeograph copies of the proposed by-laws to submit to the Board members prior to the June meeting.

Discussion followed relative to baseball in Class A schools. It was moved by Peterson and seconded by Davy that the state high school baseball tournament be open to both Class and Class B schools. Motion carried.

Delegates to the Summer Federation meeting at Jackson Hole, Wyoming, were next named and members Peterson, Kolbo, and Maxwell were authorized to attend this meeting with Maxwell and official voting delegate at the meeting. It was also agreed that the secretary and the assistant secretary should attend this meeting.

The Board next proceeded to organize itself for the 1964-1965 fiscal year. Willard Solberg and Joel Davy were re-elected as president and vice-president respectively,

After considerable discussion, Joel Davy moved that a school may elect to enter either the state grass greens tournament or the sand greens tournament but may not send teams to both golf tournaments. The motion was seconded by Whiting and carried,

The Board selected June 5th as the date of their next meeting, such meeting to begin at 9:00 a.m. The meeting will be held at the Association office in Valley City.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Valley City, North Dakota - June 4, 5, 1964

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association Office Building at 7:00 P. M. on June 4th with all members present except M. F. Peterson. Each member of the Board was furnished a complete financial report of the business to date, a complete financial report of the Accident Benefit Fund to date and a listing of checks issued on the General Fund since the last meeting.

Considerable time was spent reviewing the report of the general fund and the A. A. B. Fund. All items were found to be in order.

A report was submitted by the A. A. B. F. committee explaining the new premium rate schedule which had been drawn-up in order to offset the deficit in operations this past year and to provide for the increased benefit schedule adopted at the March meeting. Discussion followed relative to increased medical costs and the need for a more liberal benefit schedule if the Association is to continue to operate the A. A. B. F. plan. It was moved by Whiting and seconded by Maxwell that the schedule presented by the committee be adopted for the 1964-1966 biennium. Motion carried.

The Board next examined in detail the proposed by-laws relative to Junior High Schools which had been prepared by the Junior High Committee. It was moved by Maxwell that this report be adopted and the proposed by-laws be submitted to a vote of the membership at the Annual meeting in October. The motion was seconded by Davy and carried.

The Board next reviewed four controversial A. A. B. F. claims, one each from Alexander, Bowman, Minot and Zeeland. It was moved by Davy and seconded by Tooley that action on these be deferred until the next morning when all Board members would be present. Carried.

Consideration was next given to a follow-up protest by Rugby relative to the eligibility of a Stanley basketball player who participated in the Northwest Regional Class A basketball tournament at Minot. The Secretary reported on new developments in the case and the Assistant-Secretary reported on his investigation and visitation with the Stanley School authorities. It was then moved by Whiting that the action of the committee at Minot be sustained, that no further consideration be given to the protest, and that the check sent by Rugby relative thereto be returned. Seconded by Davy and carried.

The Board then recessed until 9:00 A.M. the next morning, resuming their meeting at that time with all members present.

The first order of business was the consideration of the A. A. B. F. claims on which action had been deferred the previous day. Following further discussion, it was moved by Maxwell and seconded by Whiting that none of these claims be allowed because of the nature of the ailment or the time element involved. Motion carried.

Tooley reported for the basketball tournament committee giving the results of surveys which were conducted of both the Class A and B schools, and presented the following recommendations in behalf of the committee:

- Class B Regional Tournaments should be held on Tuesday & Wednesday so as not to conflict with the State Class A Tournament.
- The game to determine 3rd & 4th place should be played in B Regionals.

- The plan for Class A Regional Tournaments should be basically the same as this past year, with said tournaments being played to conclusion.
- 4. Pairings for the Class A Regionals should be left in the hands of the regional committee - the 'bye' in the Southeast Region going to the first place team in the region as determined by the committee.
- Pairings in the State A Tournament should be on an alternating East-West basis for the next two year period, to be set-up by the Association office.

It was moved by Maxwell to adopt the above recommendations of the basketball tournament committee, seconded by Tooley and carried.

Radio and TV policies were left the same as last year.

Discussion then followed on expense allowances in effect for basket-ball tournaments. It was moved by Whiting and seconded by Cummings that the meal allowance for Class A and B Regional basketball tournaments be raised to \$20.00 per meal. Motion carried.

The Board next proceeded to set the dates and locations of tournament for the ensuing year and, after a general discussion, the following dates and sites were selected:

Discussion followed relative to problems in connection with the music program in the state. The Chair appointed Spiss, Kolbo and Cummings as a committee to study these problems and to prepare recommendations for presentation at the August meeting as to the financing of these festivals for the 1964-65 school year, and further revisions of the program for the 1965-66 school term.

The present mileage payment schedule for various state events was next reviewed by the Board. It was moved by Whiting that the mileage allowance for schools entering less than a full team at State Golf meets be set at 5c per one-way mile, seconded by Davy and carried. Davy moved that mileage payments be made to schools entering contestants in the State Cross-country run on the same schedule as allowed for track. Seconded by Tooley and carried.

The Secretary was instructed to notify managers to follow Association by-laws rules prohibiting any student from competition in an athletic tournament unless he was accompanied by a faculty representative.

Gerald Halmrast, president of the Wrestling Coaches Association, appeared before the Board recommending that wrestling clinics be held in all five regions. Cummings moved that Mr. Halmrast be sent to the National Rules meeting in Chicago and that he conduct a clinic in each of the wrestling regions this fall. Seconded by Tooley and carried. The Board also authorized Mr. Halmrast to survey wrestling coaches in the state relative to placing limitations on number of meets allowed per season, and other proposed regulations and to report result of same at the August meeting of the Board.

Representatives of the clergy of various denominations met with the Board relative to reserving time for state-wide church events on the

Activities calendar. It was agreed to set aside the week-end of the State N. D. E. A. meeting in the fall and the week-end following the State B basketball tournament in the spring for such purpose, and in those years in which Easter should fall at such time to use the week-end following Easter week. The spring dates for the next four years would be as follows:

March 25-27, 1965; March 24-26, 1966; March 30-April 1, 1967; March 28-30, 1968.

The Board agreed to raise the salary of Mrs. Vandestreek \$200.00 per year and Mrs. Richardson \$300.00 per year effective July 1, 1964.

F. U. Smith was named Associate Executive Secretary until July 1, 1965, and to assume the position as Executive Secretary at that time. The total combined salaries for the executive secretary and associate secretary were left at the same figure as the past year, with an amicable division to be arranged between the parties involved.

The Board re-examined their schedule of payment to members attending the National Federation meeting in the summer and the Secretary was instructed to issue checks on that basis to those Board members who were officially selected to attend the summer meeting.

There appeared to be no other new business and the Board selected August 7th at 10:00 A.M. as the date of the final summer meeting of the Board, with the Music Committee meeting at 2:30 P.M. on August 6th, and the Officials Committee meeting at 7:30 the same evening.

The meeting adjourned.

SPECIAL MEETING

NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION January 27, 1964

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held in the Bismarck Auditorium on January 27, 1964, for the purpose of considering the following amendment to the by-laws of the constitution, which had been presented for first reading in the December issue of the Activities Bulletin:

Article XII - Sports Seasons

Section II - Basketball

g. Not more than three regular season interscholastic basketball contests may be played by any team sponsored by the school on an evening followed by a school day. In case of postponement because of an 'Act of God' the State Board may grant permission to reschedule the contest.

The meeting was called by the secretary, as provided for by the constitution of the Association, upon receiving written requests for such meeting from more than fifty (50) member schools.

The chairman announced that because of the importance of the measure, a roll call vote would be taken on the proposed amendment. He then called upon the secretary for a second reading of the amendment.

Following this reading, the chair called on the secretary and vice-president Davy for comments, reviewing the history of attempts by the North Dakota Legislature to curtail mid-week activities of schools. Director Whiting reported on the action of the North Dakota School Officers, Association meeting in November in endorsing this proposed amendment.

Discussion followed pro and con. It was moved by Sausker of Lansford that the amendment be defeated. Killie of Fessenden offered a substitute motion that the amendment be passed, for purpose of clarification, in that 'aye' votes would then be in favor of the proposal. The chair ruled both motions out of order as the second reading of the amendment had been made and the method of voting had been previously announced.

Hagen of Dickinson rose to a point of information, asking whether the reconsideration of an amendment did not require a motion from the floor for adoption. The Chair ruled that this was not a case of reconsideration, but rather was a new introduction of an amendment which had been defeated previously at an earlier meeting.

It was moved by Slocum of Minot and seconded by Hegvik of Kill-deer that a five minute recess be called. Upon tabulation of votes, the motion was declared lost.

The question was then called for and the Chair proceeded with the vote by roll call of members. The final tabulation showed 127 votes in favor of the proposed amendment, 99 against, and 93 members absent and not voting. The amendment was declared carried.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
