

### FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 41st Annual Handbook which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

Attention is again called to certain trends and developments over the year, and special mention is made of several significant milestones in the history of the organization.

- 1) The trend toward reorganization and annexation of school districts continues and seven small schools were closed during the year. Membership in the Association during the past year was 313. Two high schools will be added to the list of Class A schools during the coming fiscal year, namely, North High School of Fargo and Fort Yates Community High School.
- 2) The policy of reimbursing schools for a portion of their state tourney expense in those state events that are not self-supporting was reinstated during the year and has been of material help to schools in financing their athletic program.
- 3) The amendment restricting midweek athletic contests apparently did not meet the needs of the small schools and the Association liberalized these restrictions by raising the permissible midweek basketball contests from 3 to 5.

An attempt to adopt special rules for junior high school competition was referred to a special committee for further study. The small school appears rejuctant to accept the curtailment of the junior high athletic program recommended by several national organizations which have carefully studied the program for several years.

4) The general acceptance of the new class A and Class B basket-ball organization plan by both schools and the general public is reflected in the added tourney receipts which have reached a new high for the year.

The policy of telecasting state basketball tournaments is building a new interest in the sport and developing new fans.

- 5) Interest in other sports continues to grow, with more schools participating in the sports of wrestling, cross-country, track, golf and tennis.
- 6) The interest in athletics for girls has developed during the year on a national scale and the increased interest in physical fitness will ultimately result in the development of an/interscholastic program for girls in various sports. Your Board of Directors has already passed resolutions and made other preparations to supervise such a program when conditions make such a program desirable.
- 7) A significant step in the development of the association program was the employment of an assistant to the executive secretary. It is anticipated that the program of training and registration of officials, and the

uniform interpretation of playing rules will be greatly enhanced by concentrating this in the hands of one man in the office. It is also planned to expand the rules interpretation meetings to include the sports of track and baseball. The production of a new 16mm film on track will fill a long-felt need in this field.

- 8) The revision of the district fee schedule in music and speech made it possible to eliminate special assessments at the district level and provided adequate funds to finance both the district and state contests. Separate contests will be set up in 1965-66 for Class A and B schools, and should be more acceptable to both classes of schools.
- 9) A series of four cheerleaders clinics was conducted in the fall of 1964 and more than 1200 cheerleaders attended these clinics.
- 10) A new rate schedule was adopted for AABF fees and it appears that the new rate is adequate to make the plan self-supporting.

It is interesting to note that the policy of pro-rating claims, when the claimant has other insurance, (which has been pioneered by the Association) is becoming standard procedure in the commercial accident and health insurance industry. The AABF continues to grow in the number of children covered and the number of claims paid. A complete audited report of the year's operation may be found elsewhere in this publication.

11) In general, this has been another eventful year for the North Dakota High School Activities Association. Steps taken by the Board will increase the work and scope of the Association program in the years to come and, with it, must eventually come an increased staff to carry out the expanding program.

As the books are closed for the year, we are mindful of the excellent cooperation and assistance given this office by the many school administrators, coaches and others who have given willingly of their time and talents in order that the Association program could be accomplished.

It is with a little pang of regret that your Executive Secretary turns the responsibilities over to his able Associate, F. U. Smith. With the realization that the inevitable must happen and the knowledge and confidence that the work is left in good hands, the transition becomes more palatable and, in some respects, takes on qualities that make retirement not only attractive but something to which to look forward.

In these final minutes of meditation comes a glow of satisfaction in the wonderful associations that have been formed over the years, and a deep appreciation of the opportunity of working together with a splendid group of people in the office and in the field. May the Association continue to thrive and grow. My parting wish is that the Association will give my successors the same loyal cooperation and support as has been accorded me over the years.

### MINUTES

# Board of Directors Meeting Valley City, North Dakota — August 7, 1964

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City, North Dakota, on August 7, 1964, with all members present.

A special music committee of the Board and an officials committee consisting of representatives of the N. D. H. S. A. A. Board of Directors and Coaches Association and Officials Association had met previously on August 6th.

The reading of the minutes of the previous session was waived as each Board member had been presented with a copy of these minutes.

Coach Vinger of Rugby appeared before the Board with a request that the action of the Board at the June meeting relative to their protest of the eligibility of a Stanley basketball player be reconsidered. After considerable discussion, it was moved by Davy that the executive secretary be directed to write to the superintendent of the Rugby schools stating that Rugby was not remiss in protesting the Stanley-Rugby game at Minot. Although it was unfortunate that the eligibility information was not made known earlier, supporting the regulations of our Association is the responsibility of all schools and school officials. However, the Board of the N. D. H. S. A. A. sees nothing to be gained by any further consideration of this matter and so the case should be considered closed. The motion was seconded by M. F. Peterson and carried.

The next order of business was the examination of the audit report as submitted by R. B. Ludvigson, certified public accountant of Valley City. Upon motion by Maxwell and second by Kolbo, it was agreed to accept this audit report.

G. A. Tooley moved that the Fidelity Savings and Loan Association be requested to pledge securities beyond the \$10,000.00 Federal Insurance for Association deposits exceeding such figure, or set up trust funds accounts in units not to exceed \$10,000.00 so that all deposits are protected under the F. D. I. C. The motion was seconded by Kolbo and passed.

The Board next examined the complete financial report of the operation of the Association from July 1, 1964, to August 5, 1964.

Discussion followed on the retirement trust fund which had been established a few years ago for the executive secretary. It was moved by Joel Davy that the president appoint a committee to investigate the setting up of a similar plan for the associate secretary, seconded by Tooley and passed. Named to this committee were board members Spiss, Whiting and Peterson.

The next order of business was the adoption of the 1964-1965 budget which is as follows:

The secretary read a letter received from Supt. Chas. Crank of Garrison requesting a discount of A. A. B. F. premiums because of temporary enrollment inflation due to missile base construction in the area. It was felt by the Board that this evened out over a two year period and upon motion by Cummings and second by Davy it was agreed that the regular fee schedule should be followed.

The Board next opened the bids on basketballs for the 1964-1965 district, regional and state tournaments and it was found that the bid of Geffell's of Devils Lake for \$12.93 per ball for the Wilson B1200 'Jet' Official Basketball was low. It was moved by Davy, seconded by Maxwell, and carried to accept this bid.

Some time was spent discussing T. V. policies in connection with state and regional basketball tournaments. It was moved by Davy and seconded by Peterson to continue the same policies as adopted a year ago. G. A. Tooley moved an amendment which was seconded by Spiss, setting minimum fees of \$400.00 and \$750.00 for televising Class B and Class A regional events respectively. The amendment and original motions were passed. The chair re-appointed Davy, Cummings and Smith to serve on the T. V. committee to carry out the policies outlined.

Discussion next followed on the program and agenda for the annual meeting of the Association in October. The associate secretary and James Maxwell reported on the banquet speech which was given by Dean John Marvel of the University of Wyoming at the annual meeting of the National Federation at Jackson Hole. It was moved by Whiting that an attempt be made to secure Mr. Marvel as the speaker for the Association meeting allowing a maximum fee of \$200.00 plus expenses, and to contact Mr. Iverson, Executive Secretary of the N. D. E. A. as to the possibility of using Mr. Marvel on other programs with both organizations thereby sharing expenses. Second by Tooley and passed. Other suggestions for speakers in case it proved impossible to secure Dean Marvel were Stan Musial and Joe Foss. The secretary reported that the main item on the agenda for the business meeting would be the voting on the proposed junior high school by-laws.

Don Kolbo reported for the music committee explaning the new fee schedule which had been established for contest eliminating the need for special assessments by the various districts. In order to alleviate conditions at the state festival, district managers are to instruct adjudicators to be less liberal in the awarding of number, one ratings. The Association office is to poll the schools during the current year relative to changes for the following year. The adoption of the report was moved by Tooley, seconded by Davy and carried.

A plan for limitations on wrestling meets as submitted by the Wrestling Coaches Association was read. Tooley, Davy and Solberg were named to a committee to work with Gerald Halmrast, president of the Wrestling Coaches Association in formulating definite policies. The executive secretary along with officials of the wrestling association were named as a committee to select officials for the state wrestling meet. It was moved by Whiting and seconded by Cummings that the wrestling awards be comparable to those in track. Motion carried.

The Board next listened to the recommendations of the Officials Committee, and upon motion by M. F. Peterson and second by Cummings the following officials were to be tendered contracts for the 1964-1965 tournament series:

### BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

### Grand Forks, North Dakota - October 14, 1964

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Grand Forks at the Star-Dust Manor with all members present except M. F. Peterson.

Each board member was presented with a packet containing the agenda for the meeting, a financial report of all business transacted from July 1 to October 13, 1964, and copies of the October Activities Bulletin.

The Board spent some time reviewing the financial report and, upon motion, the report was accepted.

Upon motion by Whiting and seconded by Cummings, the Board next approved the easement as drawn granting Montana Dakota Utilities permission to run an underground gas-line under the parking lot to the rear of the Association office building, leading to the Times Record building.

G. A. Tooley moved the adoption of the following resolutions relative to the deposit of funds of the Association. The motion was seconded by Kolbo and carried.

# RESOLUTIONS ON DEPOSIT OF FUNDS OF NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION and ACCIDENT BENEFIT FUND

Whereas funds deposited in commercial banks are protected up to a maximum of \$10,000.00 under the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and there are times when the amount on deposit in any one of the North Dakota High School Activities Association and the Accident Benefit accounts exceed \$10,000.00,

Therefore BE IT RESOLVED, that commercial banks serving as depositories for North Dakota High School Activities Association accounts be required to pledge assets in an amount equal to the maximum amount in any one account to cover deposits in excess of \$10,000.00,

And WHEREAS, savings and loan associations are not authorized by law to pledge such assets,

And WHEREAS, the law for insurance of savings associations accounts by the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation provides

separate and distinct insurance coverage for the beneficiary of each trust estate up to \$10,000.00 independent of any coverage for other trust estates or accounts belonging to such beneficiary,

Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED, that all deposits of the North Dakota High School Activities Association funds together with earnings thereon and additions thereto made with the Fidelity Savings and Loan Association of Valley City, be and are hereby conveyed to Earl Abrahamson, Executive Secretary, or F. U. Smith, Associate Executive Secretary, as trustees for this organization as beneficiary; That the conditions of this trust are:

- 1) The trustees are hereby authorized and directed to invest said funds in a separately numbered account in the Fidelity Savings and Loan Association, subject to all the terms and conditions set out therein;
- 2) The undersigned grantor reserves the right to revoke this trust in part or in full at any time, but no revocation shall be valid unless written notice is given by the grantor to said institution;
- 3) In event of death, resignation, removal, incompetence or other disqualification of said trustees, the officers of the grantor shall have the right to appoint a successor trustee and the President or Acting President of said grantor shall serve as trustee until such right is exercised;
- 4) Unless revoked, this trust shall continue until by operation of law or by act of the said grantor such funds shall accrue absolutely to said beneficiary but, in any event, this trust shall terminate in 21 years and any funds then in the account shall be payable to the beneficiary;
- 5) The said institution is hereby authorized to pay the same or to act in any respect affecting said account before or after the termination of this trust upon the signature of the trustee, and has no responsibility to follow the application of thefunds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That deposits made under the provisions of this trust agreement shall be made at the discretion of the trustees in amounts not to exceed \$9,500.00 in any one account and that additional trusts be set up in units of not to exceed \$9,500.00 as funds become available for deposit and such trust accounts shall be numbered as trust agreement No. 1, trust agreement No. 2, etc., and consecutively numbered thereafter as necessary.

Requests for A. A. B. F. coverage from private schools for mentally handicapped children and from private kindergartens were read. After considerable discussion, Davy moved that applications from schools for the mentally handicapped be accepted on a one year trial basis, but that the request for such coverage from private kindergartens be denied. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

A request submitted by Howard Freeburg, Principal of the West Fargo High school, that the Board reconsider its present ruling relative to the eligibility of the mentally handicapped in special education classes was read. It was moved by Cummings and seconded by Spiss that the present policy of declaring said students ineligible be continued. Carried.

Discussion followed relative to the transfer rule as it affects foreign exchange students attending high schools in N. D. under the auspices of the American Field Services. It was moved by Davy that such students be immediately eligible upon enrollment providing they meet all other eligibility rules of the Association. Seconded by Spiss and carried.

Delegations from Mandaree High School and St. Marys High School of New England appeared before the Board relative to the eligibility status of Alvin Hall after his transfer from Mandaree to St. Mary's and re-transfer after one days attendance at St. Mary's back to Mandaree. Written reports and oral presentations were submitted by delegates from both schools. After some discussion it was moved by Tooley that the boy be declared ineligible at Mandaree until after the expiration of 18 weeks from the date of his re-transfer to Mandaree. Seconded by Whiting and carried.

A petition from Hurdsfield for transfer from District 27 to District 18 was read. It was moved by Whiting and seconded by Davy that this petition be granted subject to the approval of both districts. Carried.

An application from Oak Grove High School of Fargo for transfer to Class A status was read. As the application was not submitted prior to September 1st, it was moved by Spiss that the rules be followed, which would make such transfer effective for the school term 1967-1968. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

The next order of business was the selection of a delegate to represent the Association at the National Football Rules meeting in Chicago, January 5-7, 1965. It was moved by Kolbo and seconded by Tooley that George Rempfer of Oakes be named as the official delegate and Floyd Boschee of Rugby be named as alternate. Motion carried.

Wayne Sanstead, debate coach at Minot High School, was named to represent the Association at the N. U. E. A. Committee on Debate and Discussion meeting in Chicago, December 29-31, 1964. Spiss moved that should Mr. Sanstead not be able to attend, the President be authorized to name an alternate. Seconded by Davy and carried.

Earl Abrahamson was authorized to attend the annual meeting of the executive secretaries at Chicago, January 5-7, 1965.

A request from the Times Record of Valley City for an easement on the Association parking lot for the unloading of freight was read. It was moved by Davy and seconded by Maxwell that the request be denied. Carried.

The next order of business was the opening of bids for televising 1965 basketball tournaments. The following bids were received:

- N. D. Broadcasting Co. for the State Class A tournament at Grand Forks - \$3,601.00 for one year or \$7,500.00 for a two year period.
- Meyer Broadcasting Co. for the State Class A, Grand Forks, \$3,025.00.

- N. D. Broadcasting Co. for the Southwest Class A Regional, Mandan, \$825.00.
- Station KXMC-TV of Minot for the Northwest Class A Regional at Minot, \$810.00.

Discussion followed relative to the alternate bid of \$7,500.00 by the N. D. Broadcasting Co. for a two year period for the State Class A event. It was felt that since bids were called for on a one year basis that only such bids be considered. It was then moved by Spiss that the bid of \$3,601.00 from the N. D. Broadcasting Co. for the 1965 State Class A tournament be accepted. Seconded by Kolbo and carried. Whiting moved that the bids of \$825.00 by the N. D. Broadcasting Co. for the Southwest Class A Regional and the bid of Station KXMC-TV of Minot in the amount of \$810.00 for the Northwest Class A Regional at Minot be accepted. Seconded by Davy and carried.

Davy moved that the Association re-advertise for bids for televising the State Class B Basketball tournament, the Northeast Class A Regional tournament and the Southeast Class A Regional tournament setting a closing date of January 15th for receiving such bids with notification to prospective bidders that no negotiation would be made after that date for television rights for all or any part of said tournaments. Seconded by Tooley and carried.

The secretary next reported on the progress made to date in the securing of officials for regional and state tournaments, and the difficulty encountered relative to the Class A Regional tournaments because of conflicts with Class B District events. Authorization was made for him to contact other officials than those originally selected for these events.

A protest from Goodrich relative to a football game between Goodrich and Drake was read. As this appeared to be an error on the part of the official, it was moved by Davy and seconded by Cummings that the matter be referred to the conference committee for settlement. Carried.

Some time was spent reviewing the program for the annual meeting and the proposed junior high by-laws to be voted upon by the general assembly.

A protest from Supt. Buchholz of Pingree relative to the present method of distribution of profits from Regional Class A and B tournaments was read, along with the secretary's reply to the same. The Board considered the secretary's reply as sufficient action.

The following report of the Trust Fund Committee relative to a retirement pension plan for the associate secretary was given by Chairman August Spiss.

### REPORT OF THE TRUST FUND COMMITTEE

August Spiss, Chairman; M. F. Peterson; D. B. Whiting.

The committee met in the office of M. F. Peterson on Friday, October 2, 1964. Some time was spent in the reading and discussion of the trust

agreement set up for the present executive secretary in April 1959. On the basis of this discussion the committee makes these recommendations:

- A trust fund is to be set up for the present associate secretary,
   V. Smith. The amount of the Trust is to be sufficient to provide for a monthly income of \$75.00 on the same basis as for the present secretary. Earl Abrahamson.
- 2) Payments are to be made until the fund has been exhausted, but not to exceed a period of fifteen years. Any balance left in the fund shall be subject to the same conditions as in Article 6 of the agreement on which this proposal is based.
- 3) The original amount of the trust fund and Frank Smith's quarterly payments shall be determined by an actuarial study. It is suggested that the secretary and the associate secretary initiate this study and present their findings to the Board at the January meeting. The committee suggests that the amount of the trust be of such an amount that a reasonable quarterly payment by Mr. Smith will insure the \$75.00 per month income.
- 4) The committee also suggests an alternate proposal. This would involve payments by the Association and the associate secretary to insure an annuity at retirement age.

It was moved by Spiss and seconded by Cummings that the secretaries have an actuarial study prepared to present at the January meeting. Motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

### BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

### Bismarck, North Dakota - January 31, February 2, 1965

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Grand Pacific Hotel in Bismarck on January 31 and February 2 with all members present except Solberg and Whiting on January 31, and M. F. Peterson and Whiting on February 2nd. Each member was presented with a packet containing the agenda, a copy of the minutes of the October meeting of the Board, a complete financial report of the years' business to January 27, 1965, and a list of checks drawn on the general fund since the last meeting. The Board spent some time examining the financial report and, upon motion, the report was duly accepted.

The canvassing committee, consisting of members Cummings, Kolbo and Davy, reported that they had canvassed the annual election results and found them to be as follows:

August Spiss, Willard Solberg and Ell Kay Larson were declared elected as members of the Board effective July 1, 1965.

Discussion followed relative to the Board ruling as to the eligibility of students enrolled in special education classes. This ruling was clarified by stipulating that those students who were certified as special education students by the Department of Public Instruction would be eligible for interscholastic competition if they received the same certification of eligibility as other students from the local school, including the requirement of passing grades in the work which had been laid out for them in at least three subjects.

Dick Karlgaard of Bismarck and Loren Faris of Mandan, representing the Coaches Association appeared before the Board relative to the possibility of the establishment of a state championship football game. The Coaches Association was instructed to survey the Class A schools to see how many would be interested in such a play-off and would be willing to participate in such an event, and to then draw up a plan for such a play-off to present to the Activities Board at their regular meeting in March. A request was also made by these men that the javelin throw be eliminated as a track and field event in 1966. The secretary informed the group that similar action had been taken by the Board a few years ago, but this event had been subsequently restored again by action of the Assembly. Consequently it was felt by the Board that any future change would have to be made by action of the Assembly.

Mr. Faris reported that he had received an invitation to attend the Secondary School Athletic Administration meeting in Washington in April and inquired as to whether the Association would underwrite a part of the expenses involved. Action was deferred until the March meeting.

Mr. Karlgaard reported that he had received a request from Mr. Dave Levine, sports director of KXMB-television station of Bismarck, for permission to video-tape the state wrestling meet for televising at a later time. It was moved by Tooley that permission be granted providing the telecasting be done after the tournament had been completed and that it be done as a public service with no advertising in connection therewith. The motion was seconded by Kolbo and passed.

The TV committee reported that no bids had been received following the second notice submitted to the various TV stations for telecasting the State Class B basketball tournament, the Eastern Class A regionals and the Class B regional tournaments. Discussion followed as to whether

any further negotiations should be considered at a later date. It was moved by Spiss that the committee be authorized to sell television rights for the State Class B tournament at a later date for the advertised price of \$1,750.00 or to sell rights to televise portions thereof providing the tournament is completely 'sold out' for ticket admissions, at the following rates: \$800.00 for the final night and \$500.00 for any one of the other sessions. The motion was seconded by Kolbo and passed.

School officials from Drayton appeared before the Board relative to the eligibility status of a student who had transferred to their school from Hallock, Minnesota last fall. It was moved by Tooley and seconded by Davy that the decision rendered by the executive-secretary be upheld. Motion carried.

The next order of business was the setting of the date for the first day of football practice next fall, and the Board agreed that August 12th be set as such date.

The secretary next presented various retirement plans for the associate-secretary that had been received from the New York Life Insurance Company and the Fidelity Savings and Loan Asociation of Valley City. The New York Life Insurance Company offered two plans, one of which would require an annual payment of \$1,462.88 for fourteen years which would be divided between the beneficiary and the Association and the other an annual payment of \$1,297.48 for fourteen years. Two plans were also submitted by the Fidelity Savings and Loan Association. Plan one would require a \$600.00 annual payment plus a disability insurance premium for fourteen years, which payments would be divided equally between the beneficiary and the Association. Plan two provided for an initial deposit of \$4,000.00 by the Association and \$300.00 annual payments thereafter by the beneficiary for a period of fourteen years. After some discussion it was moved by Spiss and seconded by M. F. Peterson to adopt Plan two as presented by the Fidelity Savings and Loan Association. Motion carried.

Some time was spent by the Board in reviewing basketball tournament regulations. Upon motion by Maxwell and second by Cummings the manager's fee for the State Class A and B tournaments was set at \$200.00. It was also agreed that protests as to eligibility of contestants would be considered by the Board before or after the completion of a tournament, but not while said tournament was in progress.

The following assignments were made for the presentation of trophies at the state and regional basketball tournaments:

The secretary reported that two schools would be added to the Class A ranks effective next fall, Fort Yates in the Southwest region and Fargo North in the Southeast.

The wrestling committee reported that they would be holding a meeting in connection with the State Wrestling meet and would be ready to report at the March meeting of the Board.

The Board next considered a questionnaire submitted by the National Federation relative to holding the annual summer meeting in Hawaii sometime within the next few years. It was moved by Spiss and seconded by Cummings that we go on record as being opposed to this idea. As the motion carried by only one vote, the secretary was instructed to notify the Federation that North Dakota voted 'no' on a divided ballot.

The next order of business was the consideration of a request that the Association sponsor hockey as an interscholastic sport. As only five high schools are currently participating in this sport, James Maxwell was delegated to conduct a survey to determine how many schools would be adding hockey as an interscholastic sport next year and to report same to the Board at the March meeting.

Discussion followed relative to the employment of an assistant executive-secretary as of July 1st. It was moved by Davy that notice be given that applications would be received for such position, stipulating qualifications requiring a first grade professional certificate and teaching experience including the coaching of athletics and other extra-curricular activities, and that such applications be submitted to the executive-secretary or associate-secretary by March 5th. The motion was seconded by Maxwell and passed.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

### NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

Special Meeting - February 1, 1965

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held in the Bismarck Auditorium on February 1, 1965, for the purpose of considering the adoption of a set of by-laws pertaining to seventh and eighth grade and/or junior high school students which had been presented for first reading by mail to the membership in Decem-

ber and for the consideration of amendments to Section II, g, of Article XII, which had been presented for first reading in the December issue of the Activities Bulletin.

The meeting was called to order by President Solberg who called on Vice-president Davy to conduct the meeting.

The first order of business was the consideration of the proposed junior high by-laws. It was moved by Leon Olson of Williston that the note under Section IV of Article III be amended to read as follows: 'If the senior high school is housed in a different building and operates as a distinct unit separate from the junior high school in the system, then the senior high school team shall be limited to bonafide students of the senior high school, and ninth grade pupils enrolled in one of the junior high schools of the city are not eligible for membership on the senior high school team." The motion was seconded by several and passed. It was then moved by Lawrence Hanson of Grand Forks and seconded by Hayden Williams of Minot that the printed proposed by-laws as amended be adopted. Following a lengthy discussion,, it was moved by John Weber of Oriska that the proposed by-laws be referred to a committee to be appointed by the Chair for further study. The motion was seconded by Virgii Ford of Antler and carried.

Jerome Tjaden of Gwinner arose to question the decision of the Chair that this motion and action was final. A vote of the Assembly sustained the Chairman in his decision.

The next order of business was the consideration of the amending of Section II' g' of Article XII of the by-laws as sponsored by Lowell Peterson of Fingal, Lyle Peterson of Nome, John Weber of Oriska, Clair Bergene of McHenry and Ray Starks of Glenfield to read as follows: 'Not more than five regular season interscholastic basketball contests may be played by any team sponsored by the school on an evening followed by a school day. In case of postponement because of an 'Act of God' the State Board may grant permission to reschedule the contest.' Dale Doty of Ryder moved the adoption of the amendment, seconded by Anton Engelhardt of New Salem. After considerable discussion, the question was called for and passed by a 77 to 58 vote.

The next order of business was the consideration of an amendment sponsored by Harland Larson of Crystal, Victor Ball of St. Thomas, Lowell Peterson of Fingal, Lyle Peterson of Nome, John Weber of Oriska, Clair Bergene of McHenry, Wesley Kessler of Mercer, Martin Aarthun of Washburn and A. K. Johnson of Turtle Lake which called for the deletion of Section II, g, of Article XII of the by-laws. Lowell Peterson of Fingal moved the adoption of this amendment, seconded by Lyle Peterson of Nome. Following a lengthy discussion, a roll call vote was called for, which resulted in 93 votes being cast for the amendment and 102 against. The motion was declared lost.

Several arose to discuss other matters other than those for which this meeting was called and were advised by the Chair that inasmuch as

this was a special meeting called for a specific purpose such discussions were out of order.

As the business for which the meeting had been called was completed, the meeting adjourned.

### BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

### Stardust Manor, Grand Forks - March 12, 13, 1965

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at Grand Forks, North Dakota, on March 12, 13, 1965, with all members present except M. F. Peterson. Mimeographed copies of the minutes of the previous session had been previously mailed to the Board and these minutes were approved.

The Board next examined the financial report showing a list of all expenditures and income of the General Fund and the Accident Benefit Fund up to March 9, 1965. This financial report was carefully examined, discussed and was accepted.

The Board reviewed applications received for the position as assistant-secretary. It was noted that there were 19 applications for the position. Applications were considered at some length and finally, through a process of elimination, three candidates were selected to appear for personal interviews at a Board meeting to be held in Minot on March 20th.

James Maxwell reported on a survey he had made relative to the number of schools who would be participating in hockey the coming year. It was moved by Cummings that a committee be appointed to draw up a proposed framework for a hockey program under the auspices of the Activities Association to be presented at the June meeting, seconded by Maxwell and carried. The Chair appointed Mr. Maxwell as Chairman of this committee and instructed him to select two other committee members from schools participating in the sport.

The secretary reported that permission had been granted to Station KXMB-TV of Bismarck to video-tape the State Wrestling Tournament for a fee of \$50.00.

The Board next reviewed the new 1965 baseball rule options which could be adopted by the state organization. It was moved by Whiting, and seconded by Kolbo not to adopt these options. Motion carried.

Mr. Davy reported that it would not be possible to secure the Country Club Golf course for the State Grass Greens Golf Tournament on the date originally scheduled. It was moved by Whiting and seconded by Cummings that the tournament be rescheduled for Tuesday, June 1st. Motion carried.

The Chair appointed Don Kolbo, Chairman, Joel Davy, Ell Kay Larson, Virgil Ford of Antler and Lyle Peterson of Nome as a committee to review the proposed junior high school by-laws with instructions to report at the August meeting of the Board with recommendations relative to same.

Chairman Solberg appointed board members Spiss, Cummings and Kolbo as members on the Officials Committee to serve with two representatives from the Coaches Ass'n. and one representative from the Officials Ass'n. The committee was instructed to present recommendations for officials for next year's basketball tournaments at the August meeting of the Board.

The secretary reported on a regional physical fitness meeting to be held at Colorado Springs on April 9th and 10th which was being sponsored by the President's Committee on Physical Fitness and that a representative from the Association office in each of the seven states in the region was invited to attend at government expense. He recommended that the Associate-secretary be authorized to attend the meeting. It was moved by Maxwell to adopt the recommendation and that Joel Davy be also sent as a delegate to the meeting at Association expense, seconded by Tooley and carried.

Delegates to the summer Federation meeting at Williamsburg, Virginia, were next named and members Peterson, Cummings, Whiting and Tooley were authorized to attend this meeting along with the secretary and associate secretary. Nate Cummings was designated as the official voting delegate.

The Board spent some time reviewing the report of radio station WDAY and the secretarys report pertaining to the denial of broadcasting rights to this station for the Southeast Class A Regional Basketball Tournament at Fargo and their unauthorized broadcast of part of same. It was moved by Whiting, seconded by Kolbo, and carried, that the actions of the executive-secretary be upheld. Kolbo moved that Station WDAY be advised of the Boards action, seconded by Davy and carried.

The Board next reviewed the eligibility status of John Zoretic, a student attending Beach High School. By unanimous agreement, the Board ruled that this student would not be eligible for interscholastic competition next year as this would be his ninth semester in school.

Discussion followed on the TV policies relative to the State Class B Basketball tournament which had been adopted at a previous meeting, wherein minimum telecasting prices had been set at \$1,750 for the entire tournament, and \$800 for the final session and \$500 for any other session in case of a self-out. It was moved by Kolbo to amend the regulations to permit the immediate selling of the final session for a fee of \$850, seconded by Tooley. Whiting moved to amend this figure to \$900, seconded by Davy. The amendment and the motion as so amended carried. Whiting then moved that no video-taping of state basketball tournaments be permitted. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

The secretary reported on the emphasis being given nationally to girls athletic activities and the possibilities of future development in North Dakota. After some discussion, it was moved by Kolbo that the Association should set up regulations for the management and control of girls interscholastic activities as the need arises. Seconded by Spiss and carried.

The Board decided to continue the policy of conducting cheerleaders Clinics on a two year basis rather than annually and since clinics were conducted last fall that none would be offered this coming year.

It was moved by Maxwell and seconded by Spiss that the calendar project be continued next year. Motion carried.

Discussion followed relative to prohibiting of noise-makers at basketball tournaments but no action was taken.

The Board next proceeded to organize itself for the 1965-1966 fiscal year. Joel Davy and James Maxwell were named as president and vice-president respectively.

The secretary next presented a survey of various state organizations, showing services performed, staff personnel, salaries, etc. Discussion followed relative to office organization for next year. It was decided to defer definite action until the meeting the following week in Minot on March 20th.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

### Minot, North Dakota - March 20, 1965

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at Minot, North Dakota, on March 20, 1965, with all members present except M. F. Peterson and D. B. Whiting. Mimeographed copies of the minutes of the Board meeting held in Grand Forks on March 12 and 13 were presented to the Board and approved as printed.

Loren Faris, President of the Coaches Association, reported their survey of Class A schools on the holding of a championship football play-off showed about 70% of the schools in the west in favor, but only three schools in the east indicated they would participate in such an event. Consequently they felt nothing could be done at the present time about establishing such an event. He also reported on an invitation received by him to attend a national meeting of the AAHPER in Washington, D. C., in April, and requested financial help from the Association to attend this meeting. It was moved by Davy that the Association provide a sum equivalent to round-trip air transportation tourist rate toward Mr. Faris' expenses in connection with same. The motion was seconded by Tooley and carried.

- G. A. Tooley reported that the wrestling committee had reviewed the recommendations made by the wrestling coaches and presented the following proposals to the Board relative to wrestling for the 1965-1966 school year:
  - Six regions to be established next year if all schools as listed by the wrestling coaches participate in this sport—if not, adjustments relative to number of regions to be made by the Association office.
  - 2. First and second place winners to advance from regional meets to state meet.
  - 3. Schools be allowed to participate in 15 meets during the season, including a maximum of 3 meets involving more than 2 teams, exclusive of Association sponsored meets.
  - 4. Practice sessions shall be held for a period of at least 3 weeks prior to the first scheduled meet.
  - 5. The rule requiring the use of full-length tights be waived for the 1965-1966 school term.

It was moved by Tooley, seconded by Davy, that the above proposals be adopted. Motion carried.

Rod Romine of TV Station KXMC of Minot appeared before the Board requesting permission to telecast the final game of the State B Basketball tournament as the tournament manager had reported a sell-out for the game. It was moved by Kolbo and seconded by Tooley that such rights be granted for a fee of \$375.00 with the stipulation that no announcement of such telecast be made prior to 3:00 p.m. Motion carried.

Sid Grande, President of the Officials Association, presented the recommendations adopted by their group in November to the Board. Action on these recommendations was deferred to the June meeting of the Board.

The Board next interviewed Sid Grande of Jamestown, Victor Burchill of Beulah and Bruce Anderson of Wyndmere who were candidates for the position of assistant to the executive secretary. Following the interviews it was moved by Maxwell and seconded by Cummings that the position be offered to Sid Grande at an anual salary of \$8,500.00, with arrangements as to a starting date as of July 1 or August 1 to be made by the executive secretary and Mr. Grande. Motion carried.

Discussion next followed relative to the employment of the retiring executive secretary on a part-time basis. It was moved by Davy and seconded by Spiss that such employment be authorized as needed at a rate of \$25.00 per day with an anual limit of \$2,500.00 for the 1965-1966 fiscal year for such services. Discussion followed. It was moved by Maxwell to amend this motion setting the annual limit at \$4,500.00, seconded by Kolbo. The amendment and motion as amended carried. It was moved by Spiss that such services be in the nature of

necessary help as needed in the office by the executive secretary. Seconded by Maxwell and carried.

Chairman Willard Solberg was authorized to attend the Physical Fitness meeting at Colorado Springs in case Joel Davy could not.

The next meeting of the Board was set for June 10 and 11 at the Association office in Valley City.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

### Valley City, North Dakota - June 10, 11, 1965

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office building at 3:30 p.m. on June 10th with all members present except M. F. Peterson. Each member of the Board was furnished a complete financial report of the business to date, a complete report of the accident Benefit Fund to date and a listing of checks issued on the General Fund since the last meeting. Considerable time was spent in reviewing the report of the General Fund and the AAB Fund. All items were found to be in order.

The Board next reviewed the annuity agreement entered into between the Association and F. U. Smith and on motion of Whiting and second by Cummings the following resolution was adopted.

WHEREAS, The law for insurance of Savings Association accounts by the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation provides separate and distinct insurance coverage for the beneficiary of each Trust Estate up to Ten Thousand and No/100 (\$10,000.00) Dollars independent of any trust coverage for other Trust Estates or accounts belonging to such beneficiary,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That Four Thousand and No/100 (\$4,000.00) Dollars of the undersigned organization's funds, together with earnings thereon and additions thereto, be and are hereby conveyed to Francis U. Smith and Joel A. Davy, as Trustees, and their successors, in trust for Francis U. Smith, his wife, and the heirs of the survivor of said Francis U. Smith and his wife, all as beneficiaries, all in accordance with the Trust Agreement dated this date and hereby approved and authorized and executed, acknowledged and delivered by this organization and said Trustees and said Francis U. Smith individually, an original executed copy of which Trust Agreement is on file with this association and is hereby referred to and made a part of this Resolution as fully as though set forth herein. The conditions of this Trust are as set forth in said Agreement, and the Trustees and their successors are hereby authorized and directed to invest said funds hereby set aside and

provided for in a separately numbered account in Fidelity Savings and Loan Association, a corporation, of Valley City, North Dakota, subject to all the conditions and terms set out in said Agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the records of the undersigned association show the transfer authorized by this Resolution and that the terms and provisions of said Trust Agreement above referred to and made a part hereof be carried out without delay; and that this Trust shall be designated Trust Agreement number 2.

It was moved by Whiting that the salary figure to be paid Sid Grande as assistant to the executive secretary be amended to \$9,000.00 per year. The motion was seconded by Davy and carried.

James Maxwell presented in behalf of the hockey committee a proposed set of regulations covering this sport as an Association sponored activity. Discussion followed relative to each of these proposals. It was moved by Davy and seconded by Cummings and carried that hockey be included as an Association sponsored sport. The Chair appointed Maxwell, Johnston and Larson along with school representatives from Grand Forks and Devils Lake as a committee to review the proposed regulations and instructed them to present recommendations thereto at the August meeting.

The Board next reviewed requests for re-opening A. A. B. F. claims for Brian Dwyer of North Central of Rogers for an injury suffered in the fall of 1962 and Jim Lynard of Bowman in the fall of 1963. It was moved by Cummings, seconded by Tooley and carried, that no further allowance be made on either because of the lapse of time since the date of injury.

Consideration was next given to a bill of \$20.00 submitted by Fargo High School for transportation of band instruments to and from the tournament site in connection with the Southeast Class A Regional basketball tournament held in the NDSU fieldhouse. It was moved by Davy that this bill not be allowed. The motion was seconded by Kolbo and carried.

The Board then recessed until 9:00 a.m. the next morning resuming their meeting at that time with all members present.

The secretary reported the results of a survey of the 32 Class B Basketball district chairmen relative to preference dates for regional Class B Basketball tournaments indicated that 16 of the 23 replies favored Tuesday and Wednesday, 5 Thursday and Friday and 2 Friday and Saturday. It was moved by Tooley that whereas the majority of the districts preferred the Tuesday and Wednesday dates as used this past year, that the same schedule be adopted for next year. The motion was seconded by Maxwell and carried.

The Board next proceeded to study proposals for dates and sites for the various activities for the ensuing year.

Superintendent McCrea of Valley City appeared before the Board extending an invitation for the return of the state track meet to Hanna

Field in 1966. Mr. Davy also presented an invitation on behalf of Minot State College and Mr. Smith reported that an invitation had also been extended by Valley City State College. Cummings moved that the 1966 meet be held at Hanna Field, seconded by M. F. Peterson. Whiting moved an amendment setting the 1966 state meet at Hanna Field and the 1967 meet at Minot State College, seconded by Davy. The amendment and motion as amended carried.

It was moved by Spiss and seconded by Davy that the State Class A Music Contest be separate and distinct from the State Class B Contest in 1966. Motion carried.

Discussion followed on fees allowed managers for Association sponsored basketball tournaments. It was moved by Davy that fees for Class A regional tournaments be increased to \$100.00 and Class B Regionals to \$50.00, seconded by Maxwell and carried.

Don Rollie of Valley City, representing the Wrestling Coaches Association, appeared before the Board requesting a change in the 1965-1966 regulations as to the number of permissible wrestling meets involving more than two teams. After some discussion it was moved by

Whiting to amend the regulation changing the number of such permissible meets to five. Seconded by Davy and carried.

Upon motion by Tooley and second by Kolbo the above schedule was adopted.

Discussion then followed relative to sports clinics for the coming year. It was moved by Kolbo that clinics in track and baseball be added to this program, seconded by Davy and carried.

A proposal that greater recognition be given former Board members by mounting pictures of these individuals in the Association office was next brought up for consideration and approved.

The secretary was instructed to inform the Main Line Trophy Company of the dissatisfaction with the quality of workmanship in the individual track, tennis and golf awards received from this firm.

Considerable time was spent in studying the present Class B music district set-up and a proposed new alignment by the creation of one new district to alleviate crowded conditions in some districts. Approval was given to this proposal.

The Chair appointed a TV committee consisting of Don Kolbo, Chairman, Davy, Spiss, and Smith to present recommendations as to policies for 1966 at the August meeting of the Board.

Suggestions for the program for the Annual fall meeting were next considered. The committee was authorized to spend up to \$250.00 for speakers for such program.

The secretary reported on the proposed amendment to be voted on at the annual meeting of the National Federation in June which would broaden the scope of this organization to include other activities in addition to athletics. N. W. Cummings, the official voting delegate, was authorized by the Board to vote in favor of such amendment.

Discussion followed on the growth of interscholastic girls' athletic programs over the nation and the prevailing policy in other states of adding such activities to Association programs. It was moved by Davy that the Association sponsor state tennis, golf and track meets for girls next spring. The motion was seconded by Maxwell and carried. The state girls' golf and tennis meets were then scheduled for May 21, 1966, at Mandan, and the girls' track meet at Minot on May 28, 1966. The same policy as to entry fees, mileage payments and awards are to be employed as in the boys' meets. Mr. Grande was instructed to prepare a proposed track program for presentation at the August meeting.

Some time was also spent in discussing gymnastics programs for boys and girls. A study is to be initiated by Mr. Grande as to the feasibility of adding such programs in 1966-1967.

The Board voted a \$25.00 raise in salary per month to Mrs. Ethel Thvedt and granted Mrs. Lucile Vandestreek a three weeks annual vacation period in lieu of an increase in salary. The Board also voted a \$500.00 increase in annual salary effective July 1 for F. U. Smith upon his assuming the position as executive secretary.

After reviewing the practices common in other states, the Board established the travel allowance for Association business at 9c per mile.

There appeared to be no other new business and the Board selected August 20th at 9:00 a.m. as the date of the final summer meeting of the Board, with committee meetings scheduled for the evening of August 19th.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

### Gentlemen:

We have examined the accompanying statements of your organization, an unincorporated association, as of June 30, 1965, resulting from cash transactions modified to include depreciation on fixed assets. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and other audit procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

Budget data has been included on a memorandum basis on Schedule B-1 to indicate substantial compliance with the authority for expenditures. Similar data on income has been included on Exhibit B to indicate that the original estimates were conservative. Temporary collections and expenditures for your members, also called "clearing transactions", amounting to \$15,996.12, have been eliminated from the statements as they offset each other in exact amount and have no effect on your budget.

A review of your property insurance protection indicates that you are adequately insured with \$25,000.00 carried on the building and \$3,500.00 carried on the contents, which meets the 90% co-insurance requirement.

During the course of the examination, we noted that adequate advance planning by management resulted in an orderly transfer of responsibility from the retiring Executive Secretary Earl Abrahamson, to his successor, F. U. Smith, on June 30, 1965.

In our opinion, Exhibit A and supporting schedules present fairly the assets, liabilities and equities by funds on a modified cash basis on June 30, 1965, and Exhibits B and C and supporting schedules present fairly the result of your operations on a modified cash basis for the year ended June 30, 1965, on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.
