

### FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 43rd Annual Handbook which contains a historical and statistical account of the year's operations.

Attention is called to certain trends and developments that are apparent over the year. Special attention is called to certain events that have special significance to member schools.

- 1. Membership in the Association has decreased to 305 schools—this is a drop of 4 this year and 45 during the past four years. The small high school slowly but surely fades from the picture as reorganization and annexation of school districts continue. Also, in some instances, the parochial high schools are curtailing their programs and are turning to the public school for certain high school courses or entirely ceasing operation.
- 2. A new set of by-laws pertaining to junior high and 7th and 8th grade interscholastic competition was put into operation this past year. As is usually true of all new programs, certain defects have become apparent which should be corrected this next year.
- 3. Interscholastic athletic programs in spring sports for girls continue to grow. Although such programs have been in effect for only two years, approximately one-half of the high schools in the state fielded girls track teams in spite of extremely adverse weather conditions this spring. Participation in girls tennis and golf showed only a slight increase and so unless a definite increase is noted within the next two years it might be questionable whether these programs should be continued.
- 4. Hockey was added to the list of sports sponsored by the Association after a one-year trial period a year ago. The state tournament was well supported by the fans, resulting in the sport being self-supporting in it's first year of operation.
- 5. An amendment to the by-laws was passed by the general assembly, raising the enrollment from 250 to 300 for compulsory Class A classification. No present schools in the 250-300 bracket elected to return to Class B classification, and no Class B schools falling in this bracket elected membership in Class A. Such schools rather elected to remain in the Class in which they had been previously enrolled.
- 6. Amendments were also passed, restricting scrimmages between schools in the sports of football and basketball, and changing the enrollment date for eligibility of students from the twenty-third day of the semester to the eleventh day, to bring such rule in conformity with regulations of the State Department of Public Instruction.
- 7. From a financial standpoint, the past season has been the most successful in all the years that basketball tournaments have been sponsored by the Association, with gross receipts and net receipts breaking all previous records.
- . 8. Wrestling and track continue to grow, with baseball holding it's own. A state Class A baseball tournament (approved by the Asso-

ciation) was held this year for the first time. If interest continues in this sport among Class A schools, the Association plans on sponsoring an official tournament for this group as is done for Class B schools.

- 9. Increased participation is also noted in music and speech activities. The cost of conducting these contests has also increased. It is hoped that the new district fee schedule has made it possible for districts to eliminate special assessments at the district level.
- 10. A series of four cheerleaders clinics was conducted in the fall of 1966 and approximately 1,300 cheerleaders attended these clinics.
- 11. The A. B. F. continues to grow in number of children covered and in the amount paid out for claims. For the first time in the history of the operation of the fund, the same rate schedule has been used over a three-year period, and will be used again in 1967-68. It is anticipated however that rates will have to be revised again for the 1968-69 school year. A complete audited report of the past year's operation will be found elsewhere in this publication.
- 12. In general, this has been another successful Association year but saddended by the unexpected passing of your past executive secretary, Earl Abrahamson, who, although retired, was working on a parttime basis in the Association office until shortly before his death.

Steps taken by the Board will increase the work and scope of the Association program in the years just ahead and, with it, must come an increased staff to carry out the expanding programs.

As the books are closed for the year, we are mindful of the excellent cooperation and assistance given this office by the many school administrators, coaches and others who have given willingly of their time and talents in order that the Association program could be accomplished. The Board of Directors and the office personnel together express their sincere appreciatio for your help in making 1966-67 another excellent year.

OFFICIAL HANDBOOK

Dick Schindler next presented the following recommendations as made by the Boy's Track Advisory Committee:

- 1. A numbering system should be used for contestants at the 1967 track meet, with each school being assigned a block of numbers corresponding to the number of qualified entrants they had in the Meet. Each contestant would then be assigned a number and this number would appear on the program after his name in each event in which he was entered. Numbers from each school's block are to be assigned to contestants in alphabetical order.
- 2. Minimum standards for qualification in certain events to be revised as follows: high jump 5' 9", pole vault 11' 3" and mile relay 3 min. 35 sec.
- Contestants at district track meets in both the Class A and B divisions be permitted to qualify for the state track meet by meeting minimum standards
- 4. Contestants be permitted to compete in three distance events as long as only one of these events is 880 yards or longer. Also, that contestants be allowed to compete in the 880 and mile if these are his only two distance events; in other words, a contestant could enter the mile relay, the 440 yard run, and either the 880 or mile run; however, he could **not** enter the mile relay or 440 if he is entered in both the 880 or mile.

- The triple jump and 2-mile run not be added to the list of approved events.
- That a new district track entry blank as presented be adopted by the Association.
- 7. Scoring at district meets be set up on the same basis as the state meet whereby 5 places are awarded points on a 6-4-3-2-1 basis, and that contestants be awarded medals for each of the 5 places.
- 8. That a notice be carried in the Activities Bulletin that track coaches wishing to make recommendations should direct same to the Advisory Committee.

It was moved by Spiss and seconded by McCrea that the above recommendations be adopted. Motion carried.

The Executive Secretary read a letter of resignation from the Board submitted by Willard Solberg who had left the state to accept other employment. Supt. James Broton of New England was appointed by the Board to fill the position until the next annual election.

The Board next opened bids for basketballs for the 1967 district, regional and state tournaments, and it was found that the bid of Gerrell's of Devils Lake for \$12.95 per ball F.O.B. Devils Lake for the Wilson Jet B1200 official basketball was low. It was moved by Peterson and seconded by Spiss to accept this bid. Motion carried.

Following a discussion relative to TV policies for the coming year, it was moved by Cummings that advertisements for bids for basketball tournaments this fall call for alternate bids on a two-year basis, in addition to the regular one-year schedule. The motion was seconded by Peterson and carried. Spiss moved that the secretary be authorized to grant a 2% discount if bills were paid within 10 days of the opening of the tournament. Seconded by Cummings and passed.

August Spiss next presented the recommendation of the By-Laws Committee relative to amending Section I of Article XIII so as to conform more closely with attendance regulations of the State Department of Public Instruction requiring 160 days of attendance as found on page 171 of the Administrators Handbook. In line with this requirement, the committee recommended that this section be amended to read as follows: "A student shall have been in attendance as many school days as he missed at the opening of the semester, should his enrollment not have been made at the opening of the semester, provided, however, that he shall have made such enrollment and begun regular classwork prior to the 11th day of the semester." It was moved by Spiss that this recommendation be adopted and that the amendment be submitted to a vote of the general assembly at the annual meeting in October. Seconded by Johnston and carried.

The Executive Secretary next reported on the possibility of duplication of trophies in regional and state wrestling tournaments, using the same type trophy. It was felt by the Board that this should be avoided and the Secretary was thereby instructed to negotiate with the Balfour Company relative to a substitute trophy for one of the meets. It was moved by Spiss and seconded by Mr. McCrea that the secretary obtain samples of individual awards for hockey and baseball for examination by the Board at the October meeting. Motion carried.

Mr. Larson next presented the report of the Basketball District Reassignment Committee, recommending the transfer of Balta from district #13 to district #16. Upon motion of McCrea and seconded by Cummings, the report was adopted.

Discussion followed relative to the dates set up for the girls district and state track meets. It was decided to leave the dates as set for the 1967 season but to try to schedule these one week later in 1968.

The Board then recessed until 9:00 A. M. on Friday, August 12th.

Cecil Risser, principal of Dickinson Central, appeared before the Board in regard to establishing a rotation plan for the Southwest Class A Regional Basketball Tournament and extended an invitation from Dickinson to host this tournament during the 1968-69 school year. It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Peterson that this matter be placed on the agenda for consideration at the March meeting, when sites are set for future events. Motion carried.

A letter from Dick Karlgaard, President of the North Dakota Coaches Association, was read relative to the results of a poll taken of Class A administrators in regard to a football championship playoff, and only 7 schools out of 19 respondents voted in favor of such a playoff (9 were opposed and 3 were neutral) and so consequently he felt that there would be little interest in organizing such a playoff. Because of this lack of interest, the Board voted to table the matter.

Discussion followed regarding the new junior high by-laws and some of the problems which might arise. It was recommended by the Board that a study be made of the junior high sports programs in the state to find out exactly how they were organized, administered and supported. It was brought out that in some cases outside groups were handling these programs. The executive secretary and his assistant were instructed to call on representative schools in various sections of the state to obtain more complete information on this.

The Board next listened to the recommendations of the Officials Committee, and upon motion by Spiss and seconded by Cummings the following officials were to be tendered contracts for the 1967 basket-ball tournament series:

Some time was spent reviewing the program for the annual meeting in October. The executive secretary reported that negotiations relative to securing Lefty Gomez of the Wilson Sporting Goods Company as guest speaker appeared to be progressing favorably. Proposed amendments to the by-laws which were to be brought up before the general assembly were also reviewed.

Chairman Maxwell appointed the following to serve on the Nominating Committee: Supt. Norman Hanson of Carrington, Chairman; Supt. Al Hendrickson of Rugby, and Supt. R. S. Bishop of Hazen, and instructed the executive secretary to notify them of such appointment.

A letter of resignation as state track manager for 1967 from Dr. Pennybaker of Minot State College (because of his leaving the state) was read. It was moved by Larson and seconded by Spiss that Archie Peterson of Minot be named manager. Motion carried.

The eligibility case of Tyrone Marino of Belcourt was reviewed and discussed. Larson moved that the boy be ruled eligible at Belcourt immediately upon the start of school this fall. The motion was seconded by Cummings and carried.

A telegram from Cliff Fagan, Executive Secretary of the National Federation, relative to the telecasting of pro football games on Friday nights was read and the Board endorsed the action of the executive secretary in calling the matter to the attention of the school administrators of the state and instructed him to send letters to our Congressmen relative to this problem.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourne...

### MINUTES

### **Board of Directors Meeting**

Fargo, North Dakota - October 19, 20, 1966

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Fargo at the Oak Manor Motel on October 19th at 2:00 p. m. with all members present.

Each Board member was presented with a packet containing the agenda for the meeting and a financial report of all business transacted from July 1 to October 15.

The Board spent some time reviewing the financial report and upon motion the report was accepted.

Supt. Gordon Ridl and a school board member from Gladstone appeared before the Board requesting approval to again use John Campbell, a senior at Dickinson State College, as basketball coach during the current season. After examination of the facts involved, and a suggestion from State Superintendent M. F. Peterson that Mr. Campbell make application for an emergency certificate, it was moved by Larson that the approval be granted. Seconded by Johnston and carried.

Arnold Bakke, Principal of Grand Forks Central High School, appeared before the Board outlining plans for the establishment of a second high school in Grand Forks next year. However, because of the uncertainty of the completion date of the building for the second high school, he requested a ruling as to whether the Grand Forks school system should be represented by one or two teams in various activities, if

the building is not completed for the opening of the next school term. It was the consensus of opinion of the Board that the answer to same would hinge on whether one or two separate high school administrative units were established and operating next fall, and instructed Mr. Bakke to notify the office of such prior to the opening of school.

Principal Otto Bernhoft and athletic coaches of Fargo High, and Supt. Hanson of Casselton next appeared before the Board relative to a violation of the football scrimmage rule. After hearing the testimony thereto, it was the opinion of the Board that the violation was one due to a misunderstanding of rules rather that a willful and deliberate act. It was moved by Cummings that no penalty be applied, but that the secretary should send a letter of warning to both schools relative to further violations. Seconded by Larson and carried.

The Board next reviewed the situation relative to transfer students from St. Benedicts High School of Strasburg and voted to uphold their previous action in declaring said students ineligible for a period of 18 weeks.

The Board considered a request for permission by a school to schedule a sixth mid-week game, as one of their Friday games had to be rescheduled because of the unavailability of the city auditorium. It was the feeling of the Board that this would not come under the "postponement because of an Act of God" clause in the rules and so upon motion by Johnston and seconded by Spiss the request was denied.

Considered next was the case of a high school boy whose parents moved from Harvey to Jamestown approximately two weeks prior to the close of the football season. It was the ruling of the Board that the boy could delay transferring to Jamestown until the end of the football season without any loss of eligibility at Harvey or Jamestown.

The Board also reviewed the case of a boy whose home was in Harvey, but who had attended the Cardinal Meunch Seminary in Fargo the past two years before transferring back to Harvey this fall. Upon motion by McCrea and seconded by Peterson, the Board upheld the secretary's ruling that this lad would be ineligible for a period of 18 weeks at Harvey.

Next under consideration was the eligibility status of James Rolland of Sykeston, who had come from California to live with his aunt and uncle after his mother had passed away this past summer. The father is in a rest home in California. It was moved by Johnston that upon receipt of satisfactory evidence that the boy had no longer had a parental home, he be declared eligible. The motion was seconded by McCrea and carried.

The secretary informed the Board of a ruling received by the Ayllard Trophy Co. from the State Sales Tax Division that sales tax should be charged the Association as well as various school conferences for trophies purchased. It was moved by Peterson and seconded by Spiss that an Attorney-Generals opinion be secured relative to same.

The next order of business was the opening of bids for televising 1967 basketball tournaments. The following bids were received:

- 1. N. 1 Broadcasting Co. for the State Class A Tournament at Grand Forks for a one year contract: \$2,750.00 for a minimum of 5 games (two Thursday night, two Friday night, and one Saturday night) plus \$420.00 a game for any other games carried. For a two year contract: same terms as above for 1967 tournament and \$2,900.00 for a minimum of 5 games plus \$430.00 a game for other games carried for 1968.
- 2. KXMC-TV of Minot for the State Class B Basketball Tournament at Minot: \$1,100.00 for the entire tournament or \$500.00 per session.
- 3. KXMC-TV of Minot for the Northwest Class A Basketball Tournament at Minot: \$855.00.
- 4. KXMB-TV of Bismarck for the Southwest Class A Basketball Tournament at Mandan: \$755.00.

It was moved by Johnston and seconded by Peterson that the 2 year bid of the North Dakota Broadcasting Company for the State Class A tournament, and the bids of KXMC-TV of Minot for the State Class B and the Northwest Class A tournaments be accepted, but that negotiations should be made with KXMB-TV of Bismarck for the Southwest Class A tournament for a figure equal to that of the Northwest Class A tournament. Motion carried.

Dick Karlgaard appeared before the Board on behalf of the High School Coaches Association requesting financial assistance in sending a delegate to the National meeting of the AAHPER in Washington, D. C., in April. It was moved by Cummings that the Association provide a sum equivalent to the round-trip air transportation tourist rate toward the expenses in connection with same. The motion was seconded by Spiss and carried.

The Board next took under consideration the following recommendations submitted by District #24:

- 1. Reactivate meeting of Class B district chairman at the time of State Class B basketball tournament, with expenses to be paid a sach district.
- 2. Discontinue 5% assessment of Class B district tournaments.
- 3. Districts to be given more say in arrangements for regional tournaments.
- 4. Prohibit use of artificial noisemakers at basketball tournament games.

The following actions were taken relative to the above recommendations.

- Executive-secretary instructed to poll Class B districts as to whether they were in favor of a state meeting of district chairmen.
- 2. Voted to continue 5% assessment of Class B district tournaments.
- Voted to continue present set-up relative to regional tournaments.
- Outlawed use of artificial noisemakers at basketball tournaments and instructed executive-secretary to notify tournament managers as to same.

Some time was spent reviewing the program for the annual meeting and the amendments to be voted upon by the General Assembly.

The executive-secretary was instructed to dissolve the Earl Abrahamson retirement trust fund and to place said money in a general trust fund at the Fidelity Savings and Loan Association in Valley City.

Delegates to the Summer Federation meeting at Honolulu next July were next named. Members Maxwell, Kolbo, Larson, and Spiss were authorized to attend this meeting along with the executive-secretary and assistant-secretary. Maxwell was designated as the official voting delegate at the meeting.

Discussion followed relative to extending ABF coverage to include intra-mural basketball for 5th and 6th grade students held after 4:30 p.m. on school days and on Saturdays. It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Kolbo to do so for the current school term with no additional premium assessment, and that should losses sustained as a result thereof warrant an increase in premium, that such coverage be offered on an optional basis in the 1967-68 school term with whatever additional premium increase was deemed necessary to cover same. Motion carried.

Kolbo reported that several schools in music districts 8 and 9 had requested that these two districts be combined as in previous years. It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Spiss that the executive-secretary poll all schools in these two districts as to their wishes. Motion carried.

The executive-secretary reported that notification had been received from Fargo that the Country Club would not be available for the State Grass Greens Golf Tournament on May 31st as scheduled, but that it would be available on June 1st. Upon motion by Cummings and seconded by Johnston, the date for this event was changed to June 1st.

Discussion followed relative to sentiment for an Earl Abrahamson memorial. Appointed as a committee to study the matter were members McCrea and Cummings.

Some time was spent reviewing developments on the status of congressional action relative to the television of professional football

games on Friday nights and contacts which had been made by the office to the North Dakota congressional representatives relative to same.

Wayne Sanstead, debate coach at Minot High School, and the executive-secretary were selected to represent the Association at the N. U. E. A. Committee on Debate and Discussion meeting in Chicago, December 29-31. Mr. Sanstead was named as the voting delegate and was asked to make a report of the meeting at the January meeting of the Board.

The executive-secretary and assistant-secretary were authorized to attend the winter meeting of executive secretaries and the football rules committee meeting in DesMoines, Iowa, on January 5-7, 1967.

The Board next examined samples submitted by trophy companies for individual awards for first and second place winners in the State Hockey and Baseball Tournaments. It was moved by Cummings that gold and silver tie-tacs with skate attached and gold and silver baseballs, as per samples submitted by Jostens be adopted. Seconded by McCrea and carried.

The secretary reported that Minot State College had turned down the assignment for hosting the Northwest Regional Wrestling tournament. It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Spiss that it be scheduled at Minot High School with Ryan High School as an alternate site. Motion carried. It was also reported that Fargo North High had turned down the Southeast Regional wrestling event and that negotiations were underway with West Fargo in connection therewith.

The next meeting of the Board was set for 1:00 p.m., January 29th, at the G. P. Hotel in Bismarck.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

# MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING MEETING Fargo, North Dakota — October 20, 1966

The annual meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held in the Agassiz Auditorium in Fargo on October 20, 1966, with a large delegation present for an address by Vernon "Lefty" Gomez, Wilson Sporting Goods representative and former pitcher for the New York Yankees, on the subject "The Lighter Side of Basebali".

Following this address the meeting recessed for a few minutes and reassembled for the general business meeting at 3:10 p. m.

It was moved by Burchill of Beulah and seconded by Bishop of Hazen that inasmuch as all members had copies of the minutes of the last meeting in the Annual Handbook, the reading of these minutes be waived. Motion passed.

M. F. Peterson next read a report prepared by Willard Solberg and added comments of his own relative to the National Federation meeting held at French Lick, Indiana, on June 26-29, 1966.

The report of the nominating committee consisting of Superintenddents Norman Hanson, R. S. Biship, and A. C. Hendrickson, was presented by Chairman Hanson, submitting the following names for the respective vacancies:

Two Class A representatives for three year terms: James Maxwell, Minard McCrea.

One Class B representative for a one year term: James Broton. Mr. Hanson moved the acceptance of the report. Nominations were then called from the floor. As no nominations were offered, it was moved by E. S. Killie and seconded by Marvin Barthel that nominations cease and that the report of the nominating committee be accepted. Motion carried.

August Spiss, Chairman of the By-laws committee, next presented the following proposed amendments to the by-laws and moved their adoption:

### Article II - Classification of Schools

Section I - Class A Schools

- a. This group shall consist of all member high schools with a total enrollment of 300 or over, and/or an enrollment of 150 or more pupils in an all male school in grades 9-12, inclusive as of October 1, 1966, plus any member high school that elects to choose Class A as provided in paragraph b, c, and d herewith.
- b. Any high school with a total enrollment between 199 and 299 in grades 9-12, inclusive on October 1, 1966, may elect to join Class A for interscholastic competition by written notice to the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association before January 1, 1967.
- c. After classes are established on January 1, 1967, a member school having a total enrollment of more than 199 and less than 300 in grades 9-12, inclusive, must give two years notice to the Board of Directors to change it's classification. Such choice must be made not later than September 1st of any year and shall become effective with the opening of the fall term two years later. Schools that elect to become Class A schools must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification. Provided further, when the total high school enrollment in

grades 9-12 drops below 300, and/or the enrollment in an all male school in grades 9-12 drops below 150, that school shall have one year of grace in which to choose its class of competition. Should an A school drop below 200 in enrollment in grades 9-12 and continue below 200 for two consecutive years, this school must be reclassified as a B school. Should a school rise above 299 in enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, and continue above that figure for two consecutive years, this school must be classified as an A school.

d. Should a new high school be established in an existing district or area, whose enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, exceeds 299, the two year waiting period stated in paragraph c above shall be waived and the school shall be immediately classified as an A school.

### Article XII - Sports Season

Section I - Football

g. No scrimmage with other school teams shall be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game of the season. Scrimmages held after the permissible starting date shall be counted as contests.

Section II - Basketball

h. A basketball jamboree and/or scrimmage with another school shall be counted as one game.

### Article XIII - Rules of Eligibility

Section I — A student shall have been in attendance as many school days as he missed at the opening of the semester, should his enrollment not have been made at the opening of the semester, providing however that he shall have made such enrollment and begun regular class work prior to the eleventh day of the semester.

Supt. Sunderland of Cavalier seconded the motion to adopt the amendments pertaining to Section I of Article II. Upon a standing vote, amendments were declared passed by a vote of 59 for and 39 against.

Supt. Rex Robinson seconded the motion to adopt the amendment pertaining to Section I of Article XII. The motion carried by a vote of 67 to 16.

Supt. Marvin Barthel of Chaffee seconded the motion to adopt the amendment pertaining to Section II of Article XII. The motion carried by a vote of 68 to 19.

Supt. LeRoy Mackove of Souris seconded the motion to adopt the amendment pertaining to Section I of Article XIII. The motion carried by a vote of 83 to 0.

Supt. Lloyd Rase of Center raised the question as to whether the annual meeting could be held at the time of the Administrators Conference in January instead of at the time of the NDEA Convention. The chair explained that the date for such meeting is outlined in the Constitution and gave reasons for the date as specified. Mr. Rase then requested that a straw vote of those present be taken to see whether the members would be in favor of a change. The results indicated that a large majority preferred to leave the date as is.

Supt. Bergeth of Lakota raised the question as to whether the Association office couldn't issue complimentary passes admitting school officials to all season games involving member schools. The chairman reported that the Board felt that the issuing of such passes was a prerogative of each individual school rather than the State Assn.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

# Board of Directors Meeting Bismarck, North Dakota — January 29, 1967

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 1:30 p.m. at the Grand Pacific Hotel in Bismarck on January 29th with all members present except President James Maxwell who was detained a couple of hours because of weather conditions in the Northeastern part of the state. Vice-president Kolbo presided until Mr. Maxwell arrived. Each member was presented with a packet containing the agenda, a complete financial report of the years business to January 25th, and a list of checks drawn on the general fund since the last meeting. The Board spent some time examining the financial report, and, upon motion, the report was duly accepted.

The canvassing committee consisting of members Kolbo, Cummings, and Spiss reported that they had canvassed the annual election results and found them to be as follows:

Minard McCrea, James Maxwell, and James Broton were declared as elected members of the Board effective July 1, 1967.

The executive secretary reported that a contract for televising the Southwest Class A Regional Basketball tournament had been negotiated with Station KXMB-TV of Bismarck, for \$855.00, the same amount for which the Northwest Class A Regional tournament had been awarded. It was moved by Cummings and seconded by McCrea to approve the above action. Motion carried.

Some time was spent by the Board reviewing basketball tournament regulations. The secretary reported that tournament managers had been informed of the Board's action banning all artificial noisemakers. Approval was given to a request of the Grand Forks Jaycees for a 10c increase in the sale price of program booklets at the State Class A Basketball tournament. The Board decided to continue the policy of alternation of pairings for the State Class A tournament adopted two years ago.

The executive secretary reported that the results of the poll taken of Class B basketball districts relative to the holding of a state-wide meeting of the district chairmen at the time of the State Class B tournament showed 20 districts in favor thereof, 4 opposed, 1 split vote, and 7 not voting. Since the majority of the districts were in favor of such meeting, the Board authorized the secretary to call this meeting for 11:00 a.m. on-Friday, March 17th, with individual districts assuming the expenses of sending their representative to said meeting. Ell Kay Larson of Munich was named as chairman for the meeting.

The secretary reported that Bowman had elected to be classified as an 'A' school for the 1967-68 school year and that the addition of this school would place 11 schools in the Southwest Class A Region using present boundary lines. The chairman instructed Mr. Spiss to bring this to the attention of the Southwest Class A schools, and to report on the feelings of this group thereto at the March meeting of the Board.

L. E. Faris of Mandan next appeared before the Board requesting that the pole vault event in the track program be sub-divided with one event for fiber-glass pole vaulters and one for those using the conventional type pole, with each school being permitted to enter in only one of the events of their own choosing. Upon motion by McCrea and second by Spiss this matter was referred to the track advisory committee with instructions to report recommendations thereto at the June meeting of the Board.

Mr. Schindler next presented the recommendation report of the North Dakota Officials Association. The chairman appointed a committee consisting of Cummings as chairman, Broton, and Larson, to study the report and instructed them to present recommendations thereto at the March meeting of the Board. The establishment of dead-line dates for registration of officials was discussed and upon motion by McCrea and second by Peterson, the following dates were set:

Football — August 15th; Basketball, Wrestling & Hockey — October 15th; Baseball — March 31st.

The assistant-secretary was instructed to notify college athletic directors of these deadline dates and to publicize same in the Activities Bulletin and newspapers of the state.

Mr. Schindler next reported on the following recommendations of the girls track advisory committee:

- I. Girls track rules clinics be conducted by members of the girls track committee at four different sites in the state. Said clinics to be held on the same date as the boys track clinic at that site, but starting an hour earlier to permit attendance at both clinics in case of duplication of coaches.
- 2. A supply of Track & Field Guide's published by the Division of Girls & Womens Sports be purchased by the Association for sale to member schools.
- 3. Require doctor's physical examinations for all girls before beginning track practice,

- 4. That schools pay district entry fees rather than requiring this of individual participants or coaches as some schools did this past year.
- 5. That district entry blanks have a column for listing the grade in which contestants are enrolled.
- 6. Uniforms for girls consist of gym suits or track suits with warm-up clothes if possible. Bathing suits, jeans, cut-offs, or leotards not to be used.
- 7. The order of events as followed in the State Girls Meet last year be adopted as the uniform order of events at invitational, district, and state meets this year.
- 8. That minimum standards at district meets for qualifying for state meet be as follows:

It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Cummings to accept the above recommendation. Passed

Discussion followed relative to membership on the girl's advisory track committee. It was the opinion of the Board that the members of this committee should be selected from the secondary schools of the state, the same as all other advisory committees. Miss Delores Paulson of Jamestown was named as chairman of the committee with two additional members to be selected by the Secretary.

A request from Walt Sherman for permission to run an article relative to the FCA program in the Activities Bulletin was read. Upon motion by Peterson and second by McCrea this was approved.

A request for sanction approval for a band festival at Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan was next considered. As this festival was to be held on school days, the request was denied, upon motion by Spiss and second by Peterson, because of distance and loss of school time involved, as well as cash prizes which were offered.

The secretary next reported the survey conducted of member schools in music districts 8 and 9 showed that 29 schools preferred two

districts as proposed, 19 preferred operating as one district, with 5 schools having failed to report. Because of previous commitments having been made relative to adjudicators, etc., it was decided to postpone the split into two districts until next year.

A request that the McHenry County Music Festival be considered as a qualifying contest for the State Festival was read. It was moved by Peterson, seconded by Johnston, to continue the present practice whereby only district contests are considered as qualifying contests. Motion carried.

Some time was spent reviewing details relative to the first Association sponsored hockey tournament. The fee for the tournament manager was set at \$100.00 and the secretary was authorized to negotiate TV and radio broadcast rights, if requests for same were received. A request submitted by four schools for the deletion of the North Dakota modification of Rule 12, Section 2, of the N. C. A. A. hockey rules was presented. Since this modification was originally put in at the request of the hockey schools, it was the consensus of opinion that the rule should not be changed in mid-season, and upon motion by Peterson and second by Spiss the request was denied. However, it was the feeling of the Board that, in general, local modification of the official rules of a sport was not a good policy, and that they would concur with the rescinding of the rule modification for the 1967-68 season, if such were the wishes of the schools involved.

Mr. Wayne Sanstead, Debate Coach at Minot Central High School, next presented a complete report of the N. U. E. A. meeting held in Chicago, December 29-31, 1966.

A letter received from the Attorney Generals office pertaining to the Association's liability under the sales tax law was next read.

N. W. Cummings reported that no definite action had been taken in regard to an Earl Abrahamson memorial but the committee would be ready to report on same at the next meeting of the Board in March.

Discussion followed on the advisability of purchasing a sign for the exterior of the Association office. The secretary was instructed to secure cost estimates to present at the March meeting.

It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Johnston that a North Dakota wall map be purchased for mounting in the Association office. Motion carried.

Discussion followed relative to whether a speaker from the N. E. A. should be secured for the Annual meeting next fall, or whether we should follow the pattern used the past two years. The secretary was instructed to confer with Mr. Iverson of the N. D. E. A. as to availability of suitable speakers through the N. E. A.

The Board next considered the starting date for football practice next fall. It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Broton that this

date be set for Monday, August 14th, with the stipulation that the first 3 days must be devoted to conditioning exercises with no pads or contact allowed, and if a team starts practice after August 14th, the first three days must be also be devoted to such conditioning exercises. Motion carried. The first date on which a game or scrimmage may be held with another school was set for August 31st.

A request for sanction approval for a girls basketball tournament involving 6 teams which would end on a Monday night was denied.

A request from Tappen for transfer from music District #5 to District #7 was read. Upon motion by Peterson and second by Spiss the request was granted.

Discussion followed relative to expense allowance of delegates to the annual summer meeting of the National Federation meeting in July. It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Peterson that the formula adopted in 1962 be continued. Motion carried.

The next meeting of the Board was set for 9:00 a.m., Friday, March 10th, at Grand Forks.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

### Board of Directors Meeting

### Star Dust Manor - Grand Forks, North Dakota - March 10, 1967

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Assciation met at Grand Forks, North Dakota, on March 10, 1967, with all members present except James Broton and Lewis Johnston. Mimeographed copies of the minutes of the January meeting, which had been previously mailed to the Board, were approved.

The Board next examined the financial report showing a list of all expenditures and receipts of the General Fund and the Accident Benefit Fund up to March 6, 1967. The financial report was carefully examined and accepted.

The executive secretary reported on problems encountered in connection with delivery of trophies and medals from suppliers.

The Earl Abrahamson Memorial Committee of Cummings and McCrea outlined their suggestions for a large colored photograph of Mr. Abrahamson to be mounted in the Association office. It was moved by Spiss that this idea be approved and that the committee be empowered to carry out the suggestion, seconded by Larson and carried.

The secretary reported that he had attended a meeting of the Southeast Class A administrators and had outlined the proposed East-West football play-off game to the group, and although this group neither accepted or rejected the proposal, it was their suggestion that all Class A schools be polled relative thereto. It was moved by McCrea that such a poll be conducted and that the results be studied by the Board at their next meeting. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

N. W. Cummings, Chairman of the committee appointed at the last meeting to study the recommendations presented by the Officials Association, moved the adoption of the following recommendations effective for the 1967-68 season:

- The fee for officiating regional and state basketball tournaments be raised to \$25.00 per game, and expense allowances for said officials be increased to \$12.50 per day.
- A one year trial plan be used whereby the regional representatives of the Officials Association would meet with the Officials Committee from the Board of Directors for the selection of Association-sponsored basketball tournament officials.
- Coaches should be urged to attend the rules clinics sponsored by the Association in their particular sport, and that the cooperation of administrators be sought in this regard.
- All years of registration be counted under the new rating system unless a lapse of more than three years is recorded.
- 5. Registration fee be increased from \$4.00 to \$5.00 for first sport.
- Representative-at-large on Board of Directors of Officials Association be rotated from east to west.

Some time was spent studying alternate designs submitted by the Cook Sign Co. for an outdoor sign for the Association Office building. It was moved by McCrea to accept Plan #1. Seconded by Kolbo and carried.

The assistant-secretary presented recommendations submitted by the wrestling coaches. The following recommendations were approved.

- That week-ends of regional and state wrestling tournaments be kept free of other Association activities as much as possible.
- 2. A committee of 5 to 7 men study the weight control problem in wrestling.
- Whether weigh-in time for dual meets should be at home or face-to-face to be decided by two coaches involved.
- 4. If a team wrestles on two consecutive days, a one pound weight allowance per man be given this man on the second day.
- Coaches be permitted to sit on chair near edge of mat in regional and state tournaments, at the option of the tournament manager.

The Board also agreed to study the recommendation that the state wrestling tourney be held in Minot next year, and to consider at the June meeting the recommendation that wrestlers in the state tournament be given participation medals.

Mr. Spiss reported that the Southwest Class A regional group had accepted Bowman into their division next year, and presented a plan for the Southwest regional basketball tournament. The plan, as outlined, provided for two sub-divisions in the region with each division playing a round-robin schedule during season play for seeding purposes. The two divisions would then be combined into one elimination tournament that would be held at two sites for two nights and then completed at one site the final two nights. It was moved by Peterson to approve the plan as outlined, seconded by McCrea and carried.

Some time was spent reviewing present Class B district alignments. Due to reorganization and annexation resulting in consolidation and closing of schools, districts this year varied in size from 6 to 11 schools. Next year some districts would be down to 5 members. The chairman appointed the 'B' members of the Board, with Don Kolko as chairman, to study the situation and to bring recommendations to the board meeting in June.

The secretary reported that Mr. Leonard Marti, Athletic Director at UND, had brought up the possibility of a conflict in dates between the State Class A tournament and a NCAA divisional play-off at the University Fieldhouse in 1968 and had questioned whether it would be possible to schedule the Class A tournament at a different time. Mr. Kolbo moved that the date for this event be left as scheduled. Seconded by Peterson and carried.

The Board also recommended that member schools avoid scheduling activities on the week-end of the State NDEA convention.

It was moved by Kolbo and seconded by Cummings that the calendar project be continued for the 1967-68 school year. Motion carried.

The Board next considered a request from the debate coaches that the fees for judges at the state debate meet be increased. The secretary was instructed to survey neighboring state associations as to practices in their states.

Some discussion followed relative to possible speakers for the next annual meeting. No definite action was taken.

Next under consideration was an appeal from the chairman of the Moose Jaw Band Festival of Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, relative to the Board's denial of sanction approval for this event, along with letters submitted by the Premier of Saskatchewan and the Governor of North Dakota. It was moved by Peterson and seconded by McCrea that the action previously taken be upheld. Motion carried.

After some discussion, the Board agreed that our rules would not prohibit a boy from competing in the Junior Olympic Wrestling program during the summer months.

The secretary reported that a few requests had been received to add gymnastics to the list of sports sponsored by the Association. Discussion followed but no definite action was taken.

As all details relative to the pension plan for the assistant-secretary had not been worked out by the Fidelity Savings & Loan Association, action was delayed relative to same until the June meeting. Copies of the plan were to be mailed to members of the Pension Committee as soon as completed.

A request from Tom Egan, Football coach at Fargo Central, that helmets be allowed during the three days of conditioning practice was next considered. The Board turned down this request, pointing out that these

three extra days were for conditioning purposes only and that the use of helmets would be encouraging the very thing they were trying to prevent, namely contact and running of plays.

The Board next proceeded to organize itself for the 1967-68 fiscal year. James Maxwell and Don Kolbo were renamed as president and vice-president respectively.

In line with discussion, it was moved by McCrea that:

- a) The salary of the executive-secretary be increased at the rate of \$1,000 per year until it reaches the median of the upper 16 Class A superintendent's salaries as listed by the Department of Public Instruction, or some preferable index ratio submitted by the pension committee:
- b) That the salary of the assistant-executive-secretary be raised at a rate necessary to bring the salary at 75% of the executivesecretary's salary.

Seconded by Kolbo and, upon roll call vote, all members voted in favor thereof. Action on other office personnel was deferred until the June meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

### Board of Directors Meeting Valley City — June 14, 15, 1967

Each member of the Board was furnished a complete financial report of the business to date, a financial report of the receipts and disbursements of the Accident Benefit Fund to date, a listing of checks issued on the General Fund since the last meeting and an agenda for the meeting.

Upon motion by McCrea and second by Peterson the budget item for Board of Director expense for 1966-1967 was increased by \$2,000 to take care of expenses in connection with the National Federation meeting.

Ell Kay Larson gave a report on items discussed and recommendations made by the Class B district chairman at the meeting in March. In line with the recommendations that expense allowances for participating teams at state and regional basketball tournaments be increased, it was moved by Spiss and seconded by Cummings and carried that meal

allowance for regional tournament games be increased to \$50.00 per game and that the per diem allowance for state tournament participants be revised as follows:

Home team allowance and number of days allowance to remain according to previous formula.

To partially offset this additional expense, it was moved by Peterson that the price of adult season tickets at the state tournaments be increased \$1.00 and single adult admission 25c per session. Seconded by Spiss and carried.

Considerable discussion followed relative to the 5% assessment on gross receipts of Class B district tournaments. It was moved by Broton and seconded by Kolbo to suspend such assessment on 1968 tournaments. Motion carried.

It was moved by Cummings that the number of passes at regional and state basketball tournaments be increased to 20 plus a maximum of 6 cheerleader passes for each participating school. Seconded by McCrea and carried.

McCrea moved that the meeting of Class B district chairman at the Class B state tourney be made an annual affair and that the tourney manager reserve seats in a block section for these men, with expense of tickets to be borne by each district. Seconded by Peterson and carried.

The Board next took under consideration the following recommendations submitted by the Southeast Class A region:

- The North Dakota High School Activities Association should extend its control and direction over high school swimming and gymnastics for both boys and girls.
- 2. The North Dakota State Class A track meet should be set for the first week in June.
- The North Dakota State Class A track meet should be returned to Valley City in 1968.

Spiss moved that the Southeast A regional group send a representative to the August meeting of the Board to present recommendations as to gymnastics and swimming programs and regulations. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

After considerable discussion on the question of a later date for the state track meet, it was moved by Peterson to leave the calendar of events as previously set for 1967-68, but to take this under consideration for the following year. Seconded by Spiss and carried. Action on the site for the 1968 boys track meet was deferred until later in the day when considerations of sites for all events was to be considered.

The Board next reviewed the recommendations of the Officials Association and the Officials committee, and upon motion by Spiss and second by Cummings, the following officials were to be tendered contracts for the 1968 basketball tournaments:

Approval was given to the suggestion by the Officials Association that six officials be employed to work state tournament games with one pair being assigned only the consolation games to gain experience in a state tournament.

Don Kolbo next presented the report of the redistricting committee recommending that Balta be re-assigned from District 16 to District 14, and that other transfers be made this fall in case any district should fall below 6 in number, and that a major revision plan be submitted in January to the Board for submission to the membership. It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Peterson to accept the report as given. Motion carried.

Considerable time was spent reviewing complaints received relative to the running of district track meets.

After some discussion, it was moved by Cummings that the preliminary events in the Boys' State Track Meet be run on Friday afternoon with the final events on Saturday. Seconded by McCrea and carried.

The Board next took under advisement recommendations submitted by the Speech Advisory Committee. Judging regulations in connection with the State Debate Tournament were modified to conform with National Forensic League standards. In line with such, provision was made for the employment of 5 professional judges plus 10 college, students for judging of the "A" debate division, and entry fees were increased to \$15.00 per team in this division. Entry fees for the "B" and "Novice" division were left as in previous years. Because of the additional expense involved, it was moved by Peterson and seconded by McCrea that the Association discontinue the practice of paying for a dinner meeting of debate coaches and judges at the state meet. Motion carried.

It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Peterson that the recommendation of the Speech Advisory Committee providing for only 2 entrants to be selected in each category in Class A regional speech contests and one in dramatics for entry in the State Class A Speech contest be accepted. Motion carried.

Discussion followed relative to sanctioning of out-of-state speech events. McCrea moved that the same policy be followed as in the case of athletics and music whereby sanction approval is denied providing the one-way travel distance exceeds 300 miles and loss of school time is involved. Seconded by Peterson and carried.

Next under consideration was a report concerning the all state band and chorus festival sponsored by Minot State College. No action was taken.

The Board then recessed and reconvened at 8:00 p. m. with all members present except Peterson and Johnston.

Representatives from Jamestown College appeared before the Board extending an invitation to host the 1968 State Music Festival and Mr. Carl Carlson also appeared in behalf of the Minot Public Schools extending an invitation for the 1968 State Wrestling tournament. The Board also reviewed several written invitations from various schools for different events. After reviewing all requests, the following sites were set for NDHSAA events for 1967-1968.

The Board next considered a protest submitted by Velva High School relative to the consolation game of the State Class B Baseball tournament. Following an investigation of the facts presented, it was moved by Larson that the protest be disallowed. Seconded by McCrea and carried. The secretary was instructed to set the starting time for first round games in the 1968 tournament so that all games could be 7 innings in length, and still complete the tournament at a reasonable hour.

Fees paid managers of various state spring activities were next reviewed. It was moved by Kolbo that managers of boy's golf, tennis and baseball tournament all be paid \$25.00 effective with the 1967 tournaments. Second by Cummings and carried.

Mr. Kolbo next reported that music districts 8 and 9 had experienced a change of heart and wished to remain as one district as previously organized. It was moved by Cummings to rescind the action previously taken dividing this area into two districts, leaving this area as one district. Seconded by Kolbo and carried.

The Board recessed at 10:00 p.m. until 9:00 a.m. the next morning with all members present except Peterson and Johnston.

The following action was taken in reference to recommendations submitted by the hockey coaches:

- Repealed the North Dakota modification allowing body checking only behind the Blue Line, so that the North Dakota rule would conform to the NCAA rules.
- If more than 8 schools participate in hockey next season, the NDHSAA office should work out a system of selecting 8 teams for state tournament play.

Next under consideration was a recommendation by wrestling coaches that all participants in the state tourney be awarded participation medals. It was moved by McCrea that participation medals be confined to those sports where only team trophies are awarded, ie, basket-

ball, baseball, and hockey, since individual winner awards are given in track, wrestling, debate, etc. Seconded by Spiss and carried.

Discussion followed relative to football regulations with the Board ruling that the rule requiring a stipulated number of football practices before game competition applied to individual students as well as to teams. Since this appeared to be somewhat controversial, the secretary was instructed to draw up an amendment to the by-laws specifically so stating for submission to the General Assembly. The Board also voted to uphold its previous regulation relative to not allowing the use of helmets during the 3 day conditioning period.

Mr. Harry Salisbury, Chairman of the Southeast Class A regional group, appeared before the Board with a recommendation that the following proposed admendments to the by-laws be submitted to the General Assembly in October.

To be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE XII - Section 1 - Football

g — No more than two scrimmages with other schools shall be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game of the season and these scrimmages may be held only after 14 practice sessions or 7 days. Scrimmages held after the permissible starting date shall be counted as a contest.

ARTICLE XII - Section I - Football:

f — All practice sessions, except the two allowable scrimmages, shall be held in the immediate environment of the city or the school district in which the school is located.

ARTICLE XII - Section II - Basketball:

h — A basketball jamboree and/or any scrimmages in excess of three in number with another school shall be counted as one game.

The Board next reviewed the results of the survey relative to a Class A football championship game. It was moved by Cummings that the NDHSAA table this question until an acceptable plan is devised by the Class A schools. Seconded by McCrea and carried.

Spiss reported on a pension plan for the assistant secretary as proposed by the pension committee and moved its' adoption, seconded by Larson and carried. The secretary was instructed to have such plan drawn up in legal terms similar to the plan in effect for the executive secretary for presentation at the August meeting.

McCrea reported that plans for the Earl Abrahamson memorial were complete and that orders had been placed for its' completion.

A request from District 23 for accident benefit coverage for 5th & 6th grade interscholastic basketball was next presented. The request

was turned down since the sponsorship of interscholastic competition by the NDHSAA is restricted to grades 7-12.

Three ABF claims were next presented to the Board for consideration. Payment of \$1,500 was approved for the claim for Gary Bakken of Hoople. Payment on the claim for Kip Flagstad of Minot Ryan was withheld pending further investigation, as was the claim for Nicolette Glock of Munich.

The secretary reported that some opposition existed as to the policy adopted a year ago whereby first and second place trophies were provided for district baseball tournament competition at district expense. It was agreed that hereafter each district should have the privilege of ordering trophies desired as is done in basketball.

Special assessment levies by the City of Valley City for free parking lots were next studied by the Board. Upon motion by Spiss and second by Cummings the chairman and secretary were authorized to sign papers authorizing such assessment.

Some time was spent reviewing different school summer programs desiring accident benefit coverage. It was the opinion of the Board that such coverage should be limited to all-day and physical education coverage and should not include interscholastic sports.

The Board voted a \$25.00 raise in salary per month to Mrs. Lucile Vandestreek, bookkeeper, and Mrs. Ethel Thvedt, secretary, effective July 1, 1967.

The Board next instructed the office staff to establish a policy as to the time for news releases to the press and other news media, so that the timing of such releases was of equal advantage to all as far as possible.

As there appeared to be no other new business, the Board selected August 17th at 1:00 p.m. and August 18th as the dates for their final summer meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

Agre made a motion that the Officials Association recommend that the area representatives be responsible for their areas and be a clearing house for names and recommendations from local associations and officials in their area, and that the area representatives meet with the Board of the NDHSAA when they meet to select tournament officials. Second by Brown and carried.

Jack Brown made a motion that the secretary look into the possibility of getting some insurance to cover officials who are registered in North Dakota. The secretary to make a report at the March meeting. Second by Iwen and carried.

Jack Brown made a motion that the secretary look into the possibility of redesigning the official's patch for next year so that the number of the official would be on the patch. The secretary to report back at the March meeting. Second by Iwen and carried.

Agre made a motion to raise the dues from \$4.00 to \$5.00 for the first sport and to leave the others as they are. Second by Brown and carried.

Motion by Iwen that regional and state basketball officials have on record at the NDHSAA office a current physical exam report. This exam report to be sent along with the contract when the tourney is accepted. Second by Brown and carried.

Motion by Jack Brown that officials who have worked 5 years or more would not take the test each year but rather take it every other year. Died for lack of a 2nd.

Recommendation by the Board that all head coaches in each sport be required to attend a rules interpretation for their sport each year.

### Annual Meeting

### November 19, 1966 - Valley City State College Fieldhouse

President Ed Agre called the meeting of the North Dakota Officials Association to order with 40 members present. Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Copies of the financial report were distributed to the members present.

President Ed Agre recommended to the group that they try to set up local officials associations wherever possible to make communications between officials a little easier. Agre also urged all officials to sign up next year before the August 1st deadline so that a large percentage of the officials would be found in the referee's directory. He felt that in order for the directory to serve a useful purpose we would have to get more officials signed up by the deadline date.

It was moved by Bruce Meland and seconded by Keith Keidel that the Officials Association go on record as favoring a playoff for Class A football. Carried.

Motion made by Jim McCord that in the event a game was cancelled or postponed and the officials were not notified, the home management be responsible for paying mileage to the officials if they made the trip to the site of the originally scheduled game. Seconded by Ray Albrecht and passed.

A motion was made by Orville Iwen to leave our rating system as it is for the next year and give it a chance to work as set up at present. Seconded by Maynard Huisman and carried.

Bill Frost made a motion that fees paid officials working the regional and state basketball tournaments be raised from \$20.00 to \$25.00 per game, seconded by Ray Albrecht and carried.

Ray Albrecht made a motion that the per-day expense allowance for officials working regional and state tournaments be raised from \$10.00 per day to \$12.50 per day. Seconded by Ronald Cameron and carried.

Motion by Jim McCord that track starters be paid regular officials wages and they be required to register as officials, take the test and attend a clinic. Second by James Molstad and carried.

Robert Thompson made a motion that the Officials Association go on record as favoring a recommendation that Class B schools use 3 football officials and Class A schools use 4 officials. Second by Burt Mitzel and carried.

Motion by Bruce Meland that the 4 area representatives of the Officials Association be responsible for their area and be a clearing house for names and recommendations from local associations and officials in

their area, these 4 representatives to meet with the Board of the NDHSAA at the time the tourney officials are selected. Second by Roger Gebhart and carried.

Motion by Jim McCord that the secretary check into the possibility of an insurance that would cover all registered officials during a ball game and in traveling to the site of a game. Second by Joe Ford and passed.

Motion by Willis Cochran to table a suggestion that officials having a regional or state tournament have a current physical exam report on file at the NDHSAA office, and that the secretary look into the possibility of a physical exam in relation to the insurance question to be studied. Second by James Molstad and carried.

Motion by Robert Thompson that all head coaches be required to attend a rules clinic for their sport each year. Seconded by Roger Gebhart, carried.

Motion by Jim McCord to change the method of gaining points to allow all years of registration to count for points unless there has been a lapse of more than 3 years between the last registration and the current one. Appeals could be made to the Board of Directors and adjustments would be made for those we now have. Seconded by Roger Gebhart and carried.

Motion by Joe Ford to have the secretary look into the possibility of redesigning the officials patch for next year so that the number of the official would be shown on the patch. Seconded by Del Boss and carried.

Motion made by Ray Albrecht to amend the By-laws to raise the fee for registration for one sport from \$4.00 to \$5.00 beginning next year. Second by Maynard Huisman and carried.

Motion made by Ronald Cameron to amend the Constitution so that the representative-at-large be rotated from the West to East each time elections are held. Second by Roger Gebhart and carried.

Ray Albrecht made a motion that the rating sheets for officials be sent to all colleges in North Dakota so that officials who work college games frequently also get a chance to be rated. Second by Lyle Hanson, carried.

Jim McCord made a motion that a system for rotating the basketball tournament officials be worked out by the Board of Directors. Second by Gordon Olson, carried.

Nominations were in order for a representative in the Northeast, Bill Gailloway was nominated to succeed himself. It was moved that a unanimous ballot be cast for Bill Galloway.

Nominations were in order for a representative in the Northwest. Herb Parker was nominated to succeed himself. It was moved that a unanimous ballot be cast for Herb Parker.

Nominations were in order for a representative-at-large. The following men were nominated: Joe Ford, James McCord, Orville Iwen, and Cliff Nygard. Following a show of hands for each candidate, Orville Iwen was elected to succeed himself.

Willis Cochran of Page thanked everyone in the Officials Association for all the things they had done for him. He was especially grateful for all the fine friendships he had found in officiating. Willis will retire from officiating at the end of this season.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

A discussion was held on taking out insurance to cover officials. Mr. Schindler presented a plan worked out by an insurance company that would provide coverage to the entire group of officials. It was decided to bring this up at the annual meeting next fall. The use of numbers on the officials patch was also discussed and it was decided to table this until the fall meeting.

Mr. Brown recommended that the Officials Association study the possibility of dividing the state into 9 regions and have a secretary in each region. Schools within each region would be able to have their officiating schedule filled in by the regional secretary. All officials would belong to a region and attend rules meeting, etc., at a central point. This motion was seconded by Parker and carried.

There being no further business, Mr. Agre adjourned the meeting.
