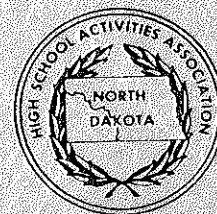

## FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 44th Annual Handbook which contains a historical and statistical account of the year's operations.

Attention is called to certain trends and developments that are apparent over the year, and special attention is made to several significant milestones in the history of the organization.

1. Two hundred ninety eight high schools were enrolled in the Association this past year, seven less than a year ago and a drop of 52 during the past five years. The small high school slowly but surely fades from the picture as reorganization and annexation of school districts continue. In addition, campus or model high schools have now all been discontinued and the number of parochial high schools is also declining.

2. On the other hand, the number of special members, elementary schools not connected with a high school but operating a junior high school interscholastic program, continues to increase with 53 such members this past year.

3. Two schools, Bowman and Red River of Grand Forks, joined the Class A ranks this past year, bringing the total number to 37. It is expected that this number will increase rather steadily during the next few years because of the consolidation of schools.

4. An amendment to the Constitution was passed by the membership, permitting the executive secretary of the School Boards Association to serve as that body's representative on the NDHSAA Board of Directors.

5. Amendments to the by-laws were also passed by the general assembly modifying the restrictions relative to early season football scrimmages with other schools, and clarifying the rule as to the required number of practices for individual students before being permitted to participate in football contests. Modifications were also made regarding track regulations for junior high school students.

6. From a financial standpoint, the past season has been the most successful in all the years that basketball tournaments have been sponsored by the Association, with gross receipts and net receipts breaking all previous records in spite of substantial increased expense allowances being allocated to participating teams.

7. Interscholastic athletic programs in spring sports for girls continue to grow. The number of districts for girls track was increased from four to eight this past year to handle the increased number of participants. More schools also fielded girls teams in tennis and golf than ever before. Competition in gymnastics will be added next year as a fall program for girls.

8. Increased participation is noted in music and speech activities, but the cost of conducting these contests has also increased. It is hoped that the present district fee schedule will continue to provide sufficient funds for the operation of the district contests so that special assessments of schools will not be necessary.

9. The ABF continues to grow in number of children covered and in number of claims paid. Premium rates (which normally were revised every two years) have remained the same the past four years. Increased costs have necessitated approximately a 10% increase in rates for the next biennium. A poll of member schools this past spring indicated a 5-to-1 majority in favor of the Association continuing this program rather than turning it over to commercial concerns.

10. Many additional schools have added Title I summer programs to their curriculum this past year and have enrolled students therein under the ABF program. If this trend continues, it is our hope that we can offer this program at a reduced rate another year.

11. Wrestling and track continue to grow, with baseball holding it's own. Member schools voted to run separate A and B divisions in wrestling during the 1968-69 school year.

12. Studies are being conducted relative to the advisability of adding boy's gymnastics, and swimming for both girls and boys, to the list of interscholastic sports activities sponsored by the Association.

Steps taken by the Board have increased the work and scope of the Association program the past few years and additional programs are scheduled for the near future. This will necessitate an increased staff to carry out the expanding programs effectively.

In general, this has been another eventful year in Association affairs and again your Board of Directors and this office are grateful for the assistance and cooperation given by school personnel and private citizens in the administration of the Association program. From the nature of the program, voluntary help is always needed and, for your help, we are deeply grateful.

**MINUTES****Board of Directors Meeting****North Dakota High School Activities Association****Valley City, North Dakota — August 17, 18, 1967**

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City, North Dakota, on August 17th and 18th, with all members present except Louis Johnston. Warner Quale, Executive Secretary of the North Dakota School Boards Association, represented Mr. Johnston at the meeting:

The reading of the minutes of the previous session was waived as each Board member had been presented with a copy of these minutes.

The first order of business was a presentation of the audit report for the 1966-1967 fiscal year by R. B. Ludvigson, Certified Public Accountant of Valley City. Upon motion by Cummings and second by Spiss, the audit was accepted as reported. Upon recommendation of the auditor, McCrea moved that the Association set up a reserve contingency fund of \$80,000 from the unappropriated surplus. Seconded by Kolbo and carried.

The Board next examined the complete financial report of the operation of the Association from July 1, 1967, to August 15, 1967. It was moved by Peterson and seconded by McCrea to approve the financial report. Motion carried.

Superintendents Keller of Litchville, Hanson of Casselton, and Oyos of Leonard of Region I met with the Board requesting a change in the site of the 1968 Region I basketball tournament from Wahpeton, as previously set by the Board in the June meeting, to Valley City. After considerable discussion it was moved by Larson and seconded by Spiss that this be done if such were acceptable with the Wahpeton Science School. The motion carried and the secretary was instructed to contact Mr. Ed Werre of Wahpeton relative to same.

Representatives from the Southeast Class A District met with the Board requesting that the Activities Association sponsor interscholastic gymnastics and swimming. After considerable discussion, it was moved by Spiss and seconded by Cummings that committees be appointed to formulate rules and regulations relative to these two sports. Motion carried.

The only bid for supplying basketballs for the 1967 district, regional and state basketball tournaments was submitted by Gerrell's of Devils Lake at \$15.90 per ball. F. O. B. Devils Lake for the Wilson Jet B1200 official basketball. It was moved by Spiss and seconded by McCrea that the bid be accepted. Motion carried.

The Board next reviewed the annuity agreement entered into between the Association and Richard Schindler and on motion by Spiss and second by Peterson the following resolution was adopted.

## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the law for insurance of Savings Associations accounts by the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation provides separate and distinct insurance coverage for the beneficiary of each Trust Estate up to Fifteen Thousand and No/100 (\$15,000.00) Dollars independent of any trust coverage for other Trust Estates or accounts belonging to such beneficiary;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That Four Thousand and No/100 (\$4,000.00) Dollars of the undersigned organization's funds, together with earnings thereon and additions thereto, be and are hereby conveyed to Francis U. Smith and James H. Maxwell, as Trustees, and their successors, in trust for Richard D. Schindler and his wife, as beneficiaries, in all accordance with the Trust Agreement dated this date and hereby approved and authorized and executed, acknowledged and delivered by this organization and said Trustees and said Richard D. Schindler individually, an original executed copy of which Trust Agreement is on file with this association and is hereby referred to and made a part of this Resolution as fully as though set forth herein. The conditions of this Trust are as set forth in said Agreement, and the Trustees and their successors are hereby authorized and directed to invest said funds hereby set aside and provided for in a separately numbered account in Fidelity Savings and Loan Association, a corporation, of Valley City, North Dakota, subject to all the conditions and terms set out in said Agreement;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the records of the undersigned association show the transfer authorized by this Resolution and that the terms and provisions of said Trust Agreement above referred to and made a part hereof be carried out without delay; and that this Trust shall be designated "Trust Agreement No. 3".

Following discussion relative to a vacation policy for the executive-secretary and assistant-secretary, it was moved by Larson that two weeks per year be allowed during their first 5 years of employment, three weeks for five to ten years of service, and four weeks after ten years service. Seconded by McCrea and carried. It was pointed out that attendance at annual National Federation meetings and normal time spent in going to and returning therefrom was not considered as vacation time.

The Board next considered improvements for the parking lot behind the Association office. It was moved by Spiss that this area be blacktopped when equipment for same is in the area subject to the decision of the president and secretary of the Association. Seconded by McCrea and carried.

Some time was spent reviewing details concerning the annual meeting to be held in October. August Spiss was selected to present the by-law changes recommended by the Board of Directors and Harry Salisbury to present the proposals recommended by the Southeast Class A Dakota Association. Don Kolbo was delegated to report on the Annual Federation meeting held in Honolulu. Upon motion by Peterson and seconded by McCrea, the sum of \$200.00 was allocated for the guest speaker, Mr. Fagan. The chairman appointed the following on the nominating committee: Superintendents Hilbert Hanson of Kindred, Chairman, John Hegvik of Killdeer, and Kenneth Helling of Edinburg, and instructed the executive secretary to notify them of such appointment.

Dick Schindler next presented the following recommendations as made by the Boy's Track Advisory Committee:

1. Minimum standards for qualification in certain events be revised as follows:
 

220 (on curve)	23.5 seconds
mile run	4 min., 42 seconds
high jump	5 feet 10 inches
pole vault	11 feet 9 inches
2. Contestants in the 220 yard dash be permitted to qualify for the state meet only if said race is run on a curve.
3. All district meets and state track meet to start high jump competition at 5 feet and pole vault at 10 feet.
4. Shots and discus to be weighed at district meets.
5. Individual qualifiers for state meet to furnish their own 1/8 inch running spikes for running on the synthetic track.
6. Qualifying times from district and invitational meets to be used to determine heats for all running events with preliminaries at state meet.
7. Drawing for lanes to be made in the half mile and mile runs.
8. Heats to be set up with the best qualifying times from district and invitational meets in the first heat, for the state mile relay events.
9. A one lap stagger to be used in the 440 yard run, 440 yard relay, and 880 yard relay, and mile relay.
10. A one curve stagger with the runner breaking after passing the flag at the end of the first curve to be used in the 880 yard run and mile run.
11. Admission prices at state track meet to be 50c for students and \$1.00 for adults for each session.
12. The State Track meet be run on a two day schedule as follows:

Class A pole vault (finals)

Class B high jump (finals)

Class A shot put (finals)

Class B discus (finals)

4:25 p. m. 100 yard dash (prelim)

5:50 p. m. 220 yard dash (prelim)

It was moved by Cummings and seconded by McCrea to approve the above recommendations. Motion carried.

The following recommendations of the Track Advisory Committee relative to junior high track regulations were next presented:

1. Each entrant be permitted to enter a maximum of three events with following modifications:
  - a. A student may be entered in three running events providing only one is of 220 yards and the other two are of lesser distance.
  - b. A 7th grader may enter only one running event if entered in the 440 yard run. Seventh graders may not run in the 880 yard race.
  - c. An 8th or 9th grader may only enter one running event if entered in the 880 yard run.



It was moved by McCrea to approve the junior high recommendations and to submit same as amendments to the by-laws to the general assembly at the fall meeting. Seconded by Larson and carried.

The following recommendations of the Girl's Track Advisory Committee were next presented:

1. Minimum standards for qualifications for state meet be revised as follows:  
100 yard dash — 12.5 seconds  
discus — 90 feet
2. That girls be permitted to qualify for state meet by meeting minimum standards at sanctioned invitational meets in which 6 or more schools compete, the same as boys.
3. That use of either the junior high size discus or girls discus be permitted since both are of same weight.
4. Substitutions be permitted on relay teams in case of injury or sickness.
5. All records to count at state meet regardless of wind velocity.
6. Appropriate clothing to be worn at track meets.

Upon motion by Peterson and second by McCrea the above recommendations were approved.

Discussion next followed relative to the large number of schools in each of the 4 girls track districts. It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Kolbo that the number of districts be increased from 4 to 8 and that the secretary assign schools to specific districts. Motion carried.

The Board next reviewed an ABF claim submitted for Thomas Dyer of Bismarck, who died as a result of being struck by a car while running on the highway in track practice. It was moved by Larson and seconded by McCrea that the claim be allowed. Motion carried.

A question as to length of the cross-country run at the state meet submitted by Jamestown High School was referred to the Board. It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Cummings that the distance be set at 1.8 miles as in previous years. Motion carried.

The Board next took under consideration the setting of sites for various events which had not been previously set or which had been rejected by previous assignees. Upon motion by Kolbo and second by McCrea the Northeast Class A and B track meet was set at Grand Forks for May 17th with Ken Rio as manager. McCrea moved that the Southeast Class A Basketball tournament be held at Moorhead State College, with Concordia as a second choice. Seconded by Kolbo and carried.

The next meeting of the Board was set for 1:00 p. m., October 25th at the Oak Manor Motel in Fargo.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

### Board of Directors Meeting

#### North Dakota High School Activities Association

Fargo, North Dakota — October 25, 26, 1967

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Fargo at the Oak Manor Motel on October 25th at 2:00 p. m. with all members present.

Each Board member was presented with a packet containing the agenda for the meeting and a financial report of all business transacted from July 1 to October 23rd.

Representatives from Blue Cross-Blue Shield appeared before the Board and outlined a proposal for the operation of an Accident Benefit Fund plan for schools by said company. After considerable discussion, it was moved by Peterson that a committee be appointed for further study of the plan and that said committee bring in a report at the January meeting of the Board. The motion was seconded by Cummings and carried. Appointed to the committee were Maxwell, Cummings and Smith.

Superintendent James Slocum and Principal Norman Howe of the Minot Public schools appeared before the Board, along with Wayne Sanstead and Sister Claudette as representatives of the North Dakota Speech Association, relative to the action taken by the Board in June placing speech groups under the same travel restrictions as music and athletics. After studying the problems involved with the placing of speech activities under such restriction, it was moved by Cummings that the previous action be rescinded, seconded by Kolbo and carried.

Duane Carlson of Minot presented a request for authorization for an allowance for help in the handling of the State Wrestling Tournament. It was moved by Broton and seconded by Cummings that \$100.00, including manager's fee, be allowed for such purpose. Motion carried. Mr. Carlson was also authorized to secure such secretarial help as was needed in connection with the State Class B Basketball Tournament.

Don Johnson, Athletic Director at Fargo South, met with the Board relative to operational procedure in connection with the Class A and B track meets to be held at Fargo next spring. Approval was given to a plan whereby the Fargo track coaches would do the preliminary work relative to setting up the events with Mr. Johnson serving as manager during the day of the meet. The executive secretary was instructed to

write to Mr. Egan explaining the reason for not having a participating coach as manager of the meet.

John Strohm of the Music Advisory Committee next presented a request for certain changes in the music regulations for the 1967-1968 school year and for the establishment of a state orchestra festival with soloists and ensembles receiving #1 ratings thereat qualifying for the State Music Contest at Jamestown. It was moved by McCrea and seconded by Peterson that in as much as the 1966-1967 handbook of music regulations had already been distributed to the schools that the proposed changes in regulations be adopted for the 1967-1968 school year. Motion carried. McCrea next moved that the request relative to orchestras be granted, seconded by Spiss and carried.

Lewis Johnston requested that the Board sponsor a constitutional amendment which would permit the executive director of the School Boards Association to serve as their representative on the N.D.H.S.A.A. Board of Directors. It was moved by Peterson and seconded by Spiss that such an amendment be drawn and presented to the General Assembly at the annual meeting on October 27th. Motion carried.

Del Easton, Principal of Williston High School, next appeared before the Board in behalf of the Williston Chamber of Commerce requesting that the Class B, Region 7, basketball tournament be held at Williston. Invitations from Williston and Garrison for this event were read by the executive secretary, who also reported that a poll of the districts involved showed two being in favor of Williston as the site and two in favor of Garrison. It was moved by Kolbo that the tournament be returned to Williston in 1968, seconded by Cummings, and carried.

A letter from the Secondary School Principals Association relative to membership on the N.D.H.S.A.A. Board of Directors was read by the executive secretary, along with his reply to same. It was the feeling of the Board that no further action was necessary.

The Board then recessed until 9:00 a. m., October 26th, at which time they reconvened with all members present except Peterson and Johnston.

The Board spent some time reviewing the financial report and upon motion the report was accepted.

Taken under consideration next was the use of an ineligible boy in the early part of the football season by Fairmount High School. The executive secretary was instructed to verify whether the school had forfeited the games in question as instructed. It was moved by Spiss that no further disciplinary action be taken considering the actions of the school upon discovering the violation and that the secretary notify all members of the Wild Rice Conference of action taken. Seconded by Larson and carried.

The secretary next reported that the mail poll of the Board relative to the eligibility status of John Huffman of Dickinson and Allen Blotski

of Selfridge resulted in a unanimous decision that each boy would be ineligible for a period of one semester.

Taken under consideration next were eligibility cases involving Dean Lundblad of Fargo North and Eugene Conklin of New Town. The Board ruled that if a court order were produced in evidence of the placement of Dean Lundblad with foster parents in Fargo that the boy would be ruled immediately eligible, otherwise he would be ineligible for a period of 18 weeks. Eugene Conklin of New Town was ruled ineligible for one semester.

The Board next reviewed the request of St. Alphonsus School of Langdon for permission to use a non-certified teacher as basketball coach during the current term, along with correspondence from the State Department of Public Instruction denying such approval, and a subsequent denial of approval by the executive secretary. It was moved by Larson that the secretary inform the St. Alphonsus School that the Board had reviewed the case, but that the requested approval could not be granted without the prior approval by the Department of Public Instruction. Seconded by McCrea and carried.

Considerable time was spent reviewing a proposed awards program being promoted by the Manly Shoe Corporation. It was the consensus of the Board that this program would be in violation of the N.D.H.S.A. Constitution and By-laws and the executive secretary was instructed to notify the company of same.

A proposed post-season national wrestling play-off being sponsored by the Pennsylvania Wrestling Coaches Association was next reviewed. As eliminations would be held after the close of the wrestling season, participation in same would be in violation of the North Dakota post-season rule. The secretary was instructed to so notify the National Federation.

A request from the Moose Jaw Kinsmen for a relaxing of the travel rule relative to participation by North Dakota schools in their Band Festival was read. It was moved by Spiss and seconded by Broton that no exception be made to the rule which limits participation to schools within 300 miles of Moose Jaw. Motion carried.

Ell Kay Larson reported that district 12 was the only district which would have less than 6 teams in district basketball tournament competition this year. Considering the fact that a state-wide Class B re-districting plan for 1968-69 is to be presented in January, it was moved by Cummings and seconded by Spiss that district alignments be left as is for this year. Motion carried.

A request by the manager of the Minot Civic Auditorium for a change in scheduled dates for the Northwest Class A and the Class B Regional VI Basketball Tournaments because of a Lumbermen's Convention having been scheduled in the auditorium on March 2-5 was read. In compliance with the request it moved by McCrea that the starting for

the Northwest Class A regional be advanced one day and the Class B regional VI tourney be moved back one day from the original scheduled dates. Motion carried.

The next order of business was the opening of bids for televising 1968 tournaments. The following bids were received (as a two year contract was let for the State Class A tournament a year ago, no call for bids was made for this tournament):

1. KXMC-TV of Minot for the State Class B tournament at Minot: \$200 for the championship game plus \$100 for every other game they elect to televise.
2. KXMC-TV of Minot for the Northwest Class A regional tournament: \$250 for the semi-final session plus \$100 a game for every other game they elect to televise.
3. WDAZ-TV of Devils Lake for the Northeast Class A regional tournament: \$100 for the entire tournament.

It was moved by Larson to reject all bids since they were considerably below those received in past years. Seconded by Broton and carried. Kolbo moved that TV rights be offered the bidding stations according to the following schedule:

1. State Class B: \$1200 for entire tournament or \$500 for any individual session.
2. Class A regionals: \$900 for entire tournament or any part thereof.

The motion was seconded by Larson and carried.

The Board spent some time reviewing details in connection with state-sponsored tournaments, particularly the changes made from a year ago. Due to the increase in purchase price, the sale price of tournament balls was set at \$15.00 each.

The secretary and assistant secretary next gave progress reports on the work of the committees which had been set up to develop rules and regulations relative to interscholastic gymnastics and swimming programs.

The Board next reviewed the problems encountered in securing a track for the Grand Forks Regional A and B track meets, including a report from Ken Rio as to the cost involved in securing the UND track. The secretary was instructed to contact Mr. Leonard Marti, UND Athletic Director, relative to same. The Board also instructed the office staff to assign schools to the meets at Grand Forks, Mayville, and Fargo since many were of equal distance from two sites.

Some time was spent reviewing the present ABF plan and the anticipated deficit in connection with this year's operation. It was felt that a survey should be made of member schools as to their wishes relative

to changes, but to postpone such survey until after the committee report in January.

Discussion followed relative to the issuing of yearly complimentary passes to college athletic directors for Association-sponsored tournaments. However, it was felt that this might result in requests from other groups for similar privileges and so the matter was tabled.

An invitation for participation by the NDHSAA in the M. F. Peterson Recognition dinner event scheduled for December 1st was read. It was moved by Larson and seconded by McCrea that the invitation be accepted and that a contribution of \$50 be made to the fund being raised.

A request that the Association office assume the responsibility of deciding whether the football play-off game between the WDA and SDA representative should be played or cancelled because of weather conditions was next presented. It was the opinion of the Board that since this was merely a play-off between conferences and was not a contest sponsored by the N.D.H.S.A.A., such decision should be left to the conferences involved.

A request by Beulah Gregoire of NDSU for publication of an article in the Activities Bulletin relative to rating of women officials was read. It was moved by Larson and seconded by Kolbo to grant this request. Motion carried.

Discussion followed relative to requests received for sanction approval for basketball games between several North Dakota and Minnesota high schools as preliminary games to University of Minnesota contests. Approval for same was given providing no loss of school time was involved if the round-trip travel distance exceeded 600 miles.

The executive secretary and assistant secretary were authorized to attend the winter meeting of executive secretaries and the football rules committee meeting at Las Vegas on January 4-6, 1968.

The next meeting of the Board was set for 10:00 a. m.; January 28th, at the G. P. Hotel in Bismarck.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

#### North Dakota High School Activities Association

##### Minutes of Annual Meeting

Fargo, North Dakota — October 27, 1967

The annual meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held in the Ben Franklin Gymnasium in Fargo on Oc-

tober 27, 1967, at 9:00 a. m. Don Kolbo, vice-president of the Association, presented a report on the National Federation meeting held in Honolulu last July. Following this presentation was an address by Clifford B. Fagan, Executive-secretary of the National Federation, on "What is it All About".

The group then recessed for a few minutes and re-assembled for the general business meeting at 10:30 a. m.

It was moved by Barthel of Chaffee and seconded by Bakke of Grand Forks that inasmuch as all members had copies of the minutes of the last meeting in the Annual Handbook, the reading of these minutes be waived. Motion passed.

August Spiss, chairman of the By-laws committee, next presented the following proposed amendment to the by-laws and moved its adoption:

#### Article XII — Sports Season

##### Section 1 — Football

- b. Practice sessions shall start at least 14 days prior to the first game and there shall be at least 8 daily sessions. Individual participation must have participated in at least 8 daily practice sessions before being permitted to participate in an interscholastic contest.

The motion was seconded by Panek of Grafton and carried.

Spiss next presented the following proposed amendments to the junior high by-laws and moved their adoption:

#### Article VI — Track Regulations

##### Section 3 — Limitation of Competition

- a. A boy may enter a maximum of 3 events as follows:
  1. Three field events
  2. Two field events and one running event of 440 yards or less including relays for 7th grade students; two field events and one running event of 880 yards or less including relays for 8th and 9th grade students.
  3. One field event and two running events of 220 yards or less including relays for 7th grade students; one field event and two running events of 440 yards or less including relays for 8th and 9th grade students.
  4. Three running events of 220 yards or less including relays.
- b. No individual participant in the 7th grade to run over 440 yards in any one event or over 880 yards if enrolled in the 8th or 9th grade.

##### Section 4 — Track events

- d. 440 yard run
- e. 880 yard run (8th and 9th graders only)

The motion was seconded by Holwell of Bottineau and carried.

The following proposed change in the Constitution, requested by the School Board's Association was next presented:

#### Article V — Officers and Duties

##### Section 1:

There shall be a Board of Directors, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of nine members, elected as hereinafter prescribed, for terms of three years except as hereinafter provided. Each new member shall be seated July 1st following his election and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms, except that he may be appointed or elected to fill a vacancy after one year's absence from office. Three members of the Board shall be chosen from Class A schools, three from Class B schools, and one member shall be elected from any member high school regardless of classification. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or a member of his duly constituted staff, designated by him, shall serve as an ex-Officio member of said Board. One school board member from a member high school, or the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association, shall be selected by the executive committee of the North Dakota School Boards Association and his term of office shall be the same as that of other elective Board members. Should this member cease to be a school board member from a member high school, or the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association, the position shall be declared vacant and a successor selected by the Board of Directors of the School Boards Association to fill the unexpired term.

It was moved by Spiss and seconded by Kolbo that the proposed amendment be adopted. No vote was taken at this time, since this was an amendment to the Constitution rather than the By-laws and requires a vote of the member schools by mail ballot. The secretary informed the group that this ballot would be mailed to all schools at the same time as the election ballots in December.

Don Bredell, representing the Southeast Dakota Association, next presented the following proposed amendment to Section 1, f and g, of Article XII of the By-laws and moved the adoption:

#### Article XII — Sports Seasons

##### Section 1 — Football

- f. No more than two scrimmages with other schools shall be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game of the season and these scrimmages may be held only after 14 practice sessions or 7 practice days. Scrimmages held after the permissible starting date shall be counted as contests.
- g. Practice sessions shall be held in the immediate environment of the city or school district in which the school is located. Special training camps are not permitted. The two allowable interschool



scrimmages shall be held within the environs of one of the participating schools or at some point between the two schools.

The motion was seconded by Bernhoff of Fargo. Slocum of Minot moved to table the motion, seconded by Hanson of Harvey. The motion to table carried. Mr. Slocum then suggested that the question be submitted to the member schools by mail ballot. After an explanation that amendments to by-laws have to be voted on at general meetings of the Assembly rather than by mail ballot, Slocum moved to rescind the action of tabling the original motion. Second by York of Mapleton and carried. The original motion was then voted upon and passed.

Don Bredell next presented the following amendment to Section II, H, Article XII, of the By-laws and moved its adoption:

Article XII — Sports Season

Section II — Basketball

h. A basketball jamboree and/or scrimmages in excess of 3 in number with other schools shall be counted as one game.

The motion was seconded by Buchholtz of Jamestown. After considerable discussion, the question was called for and declared lost by the chair.

The report of the nominating committee consisting of Superintendents Hilbert Hanson of Kindred, John Hegvik of Killdeer, and Kenneth Helling of Edinburg was presented by Chairman Hanson, submitting the following names for the vacancies on the Board of Directors.

Two Class B representatives for three year terms:

Ell Kay Larson and James Broton

Mr. Hanson moved the acceptance of the report. Nominations were then called from the floor. Rolland Larson nominated Casper Kourajian of Medina. It was then moved by Muckenhirn of Larimore and seconded by Sheppard of Northwood that nominations cease. Motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

#### North Dakota High School Activities Association

Bismarck, North Dakota — January 27, 28, 1968

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 9:00 p. m. at the Grand Pacific Hotel in Bismarck on January 27th with all members present. Each member was presented

with a packet containing the agenda, a complete financial report of the years business to January 24th and a list of checks drawn on the general fund since the last meeting. The Board spent some time examining the financial report, and upon motion, the report was duly accepted.

The executive secretary outlined a proposal received from Channel 8 in Devils Lake for television rights for the Northeast Class A region basketball tournament at Grand Forks, whereby the TV station would pay the Association 20% of the revenue received from sponsors in connection therewith. The station expected to sell advertising rights for approximately \$400.00 per game which would mean about \$80.00 per game for the Association. After some discussion, it was moved by Spiss and seconded by McCrea to rescind the action taken in October establishing minimum fees for regional tournaments and that the TV committee be authorized to negotiate with stations that might be interested in telecasting these tournaments. Motion carried.

The secretary next reported that arrangements had been made so that the Class B regional basketball tournament (Region VI) could be held on the dates originally scheduled.

The Board then recessed and reconvened at 9:00 a. m. on January 28th with all members present.

Mr. Kolbo presented a report of the Class B re-districting committees recommending that only minor re-adjustments be made in district alignments during the next year or two so as to keep a minimum of 6 teams in a district, rather than a major re-alignment at this time since it appeared that the number of districts might have to be reduced to 16 instead of 32 within a few years because of the expected number of school closings. The committee recommended the following transfer of schools for the 1968-69 season:

Verona from District 3 to District 4.  
 Adams from District 9 to District 11  
 Starkweather from District 13 to District 12  
 Balta from District 14 to District 13.

Upon motion by Kolbo and second by Cummings the above recommendations were adopted.

The canvassing committee consisting of members Cummings, McCrea, and Kolbo reported that they had canvassed the annual election results and found them to be as follows:

James Broton and Ell Kay Larson were declared as elected members of the Board effective July 1, 1968.

The assistant secretary next presented a report on the recommendations adopted by the North Dakota Officials Association. The chairman appointed a committee consisting of Cummings as chairman, Broton and Larson to study the report and instructed them to present recommendations relative thereto at the March meeting of the Board.

The secretary pointed out the difficulty of holding a meeting with the Board of Directors of the Officials Association at the time of the State Class B basketball tournament because of the Class B district chairmen meeting and the Board of Directors meeting both being scheduled at Minot this year. It was moved by McCrea that since only two such meetings of the Board of Directors of the Officials Association were held annually prior to last year, that only two meetings be held and be scheduled in June and November each year. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

The secretary reported that the poll of the Board showed unanimous agreement with the interpretation made by the office staff relative to the game restriction rule in case of dual participation on A and B hockey squads.

Some time was spent reviewing recommendations submitted by the advisory committee for an interscholastic swimming program for next year. The secretary was instructed to confer with the committee relative to certain points in question. As no report was submitted by the gymnastic committees, action on this was deferred to the March meeting.

A proposal submitted by the Stutsman County Schoolmasters Ass'n. was read which would amend Section II, h, of Article XII of the By-laws so as to read, "All tournaments, other than Association sponsored tournaments, must end on a night not followed by a school day." No action was taken as this would automatically come up for a vote of the assembly at the next annual meeting.

The secretary reported that some dissatisfaction exists relative to the combining of former music districts 8 and 9 into one district. It was moved by Spiss that the chairman of the district call a meeting of all schools in connection with the district festival next spring and that a vote be taken of these schools as to their wishes for another year, with the report of same to be submitted to the NDHSAA office. Seconded by Broton and carried.

A request from Medina for transfer from music district 5 to music district 7 was next presented. Upon motion by Broton and second by McCrea the request was approved.

Consideration was next given to a complaint by Supt. Robinson of McGregor relative to the All State Chorus and Band program sponsored by Minot State College. It was moved by McCrea that the NDHSAA and the NDASA work jointly on this requesting the college authorities to work directly with local school administrators and that Mr. Broton bring this to the attention of the NDASA Board of Directors at their meeting on January 28th. Seconded by Kolbo and carried.

A letter from a service group in Minot was read requesting permission to award a trophy to the most outstanding player in the State Class B tournament. Spiss moved that since this would be contrary to our policy of naming all-star and outstanding players that permission be denied. Seconded by McCrea and carried.

A letter from the American Amateur Baseball Congress relative to whether the awarding of an autographed black baseball bat to the players of the winning team in their program would be permissible under State Association rules was read. Larson moved that the group be informed that this would be contrary to our Awards rule, unless the bat was hollow or a miniature size, so that it did not possess utilitarian value. Seconded by McCrea and carried.

Discussion followed whether under the rules of the Association sanction approval was necessary for interscholastic events involving more than two schools in events not sponsored by the Association. It was the decision of the Board that according to the wording of the By-laws such sanction approval was necessary.

A request from Casselton for expansion of the accident benefit program to cover recreational programs on Saturday and Sunday afternoons was next considered. Upon motion by Larson and second by Broton, the request was disapproved.

The secretary reported that conflicts had developed in connection with some of the district track meets being held on a Saturday. Permission was granted to schedule these meets on Thursday if necessary.

Rod Romine of Station KXMC of Minot appeared before the Board presenting the following offer for telecasting rights to the State Class B basketball tournament: \$1200.00 for the entire tournament or \$700.00 for the Friday and Saturday evening sessions. He also presented a bid of \$300.00 for the final night of the Northwest Class A basketball tournament. The matter was referred to the TV committee who agreed to the terms offered.

It was suggested by the Secretary that the Board set the starting date for football practice and the first permissible game for several years in advance to facilitate scheduling by schools. After some discussion, it was moved by McCrea that the date for the first allowable game in 1968 be set for August 30 and that the date be set for the first Friday in September thereafter. Second by Larson and carried.

The Belcourt school administrators appeared before the Board relative to the eligibility status of Peter Davis who enrolled in their school at the start of the second semester and who had been ruled ineligible earlier by a mail poll of the Board. After considerable discussion the Board rescinded its previous action and declared the boy eligible by a 5 to 3 vote.

Mr. Laybourn and Mr. Stenslie next appeared before the Board relative to their proposal concerning their handling of the accident benefit program next year. After considerable discussion, it was moved by McCrea that the executive secretary set up four regional meetings explaining this proposal along with others received to the school administrators of the state. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

It was moved by McCrea that the chairman appoint a salary negotiating committee to study the salaries of the office personnel for the 1968-69 year. Seconded by Kolbo and carried.

A letter of resignation by Superintendent McCrea of Valley City from the Board as of February 1st, because of his discontinuance of

work in school administration as of that date was next read. Harry Salisbury, Principal of Valley City High School, was appointed to the position until the next regular election.

The executive secretary reported that the temporary court order placing Bruce Schwann of Velva in the custody of his mother in Velva was still in effect as the judge had not as yet issued a permanent order in this case, and so the boy would still be eligible at Velva.

An appeal from a decision by the secretary as to the eligibility status of Jim Vorachek of Lankin who had transferred to Edmore last fall and back to Lankin at the start of the second semester was next considered. It was moved by Peterson and seconded by Kolbo to uphold the decision of the secretary declaring the boy ineligible at Lankin the second semester. Motion carried.

The executive officers of the North Dakota Principals Association appeared before the Board recommending that the By-laws be amended so as to require that at least one member of the Board of Directors be a high school principal. Since the constitution already provides that members on the Board shall be superintendents or principals, it was the feeling of the Board that no specification should be made as to number from each group and the matter was tabled.

Representatives from the Southeast Class A division appeared expressing dissatisfaction with officials assigned for the Southeast Class A regional basketball tournament. As contracts had already been made with the officials and since the officials concerned had been recommended by representatives of this group, it was moved by McCrea to leave the officiating assignments as previously made. Seconded by Peterson and carried.

Mr. McElhiney, Principal of North High of Fargo, appeared before the Board requesting a modification of the rule prohibiting junior high school students who are housed in separate building and under a separate administration from participating on varsity teams, so as to allow these students to participate on varsity teams in those sports which are not conducted in the junior high school, such as swimming and gymnastics. It was moved by McCrea to modify the policy to allow such participation on the high school team in his attendance area. Seconded by Kolbo and carried.

The next meeting of the Board was set for 2:00 p. m., on Friday, March 15th, at Minot.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

## MINUTES

## Board of Directors Meeting

Valley City, February 9, 1968

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 1:00 p. m. in the Association office in Valley City on February 9th with all members present except Kolbo and Peterson.

The first order of business was a hearing into what had transpired at a basketball game between Page and Pillsbury at Page on February 3rd, because of a formal complaint which had been lodged against the Page school by the officials of the game. Present at the hearing were school officials from the two schools and the basketball officials. Each of the parties were allowed to present their views and report of the alleged incidents. Following the close of the testimony, the Board went into executive session reviewing the testimony presented and discussing whether the actions by the Page team, cheerleaders, and fans had placed the Page school in violation of Section VIII of Article III of the By-laws pertaining to unsportsmanlike conduct. The Chair called for a secret ballot on same and the results of the ballot showed by a unanimous vote that the school had violated this article. It was moved by Cummings to place the Page school on probation for the remainder of the 1967-68 school term and during the 1968-69 term, with the stipulation that any violation during the probationary period would make them liable for suspension. The motion was seconded by Quale and a secret ballot indicated that the motion passed by a unanimous vote. The executive secretary was instructed to so notify the Page school authorities, before any information relative to same was released to other sources.

As the hearing also brought out that the parties involved had not been following the procedure outlined relative to contracts between schools and officials, the assistant secretary was instructed to bring this to the attention of the parties involved, as well as to the North Dakota Officials Association Executive Board.

The secretary presented a request from Jack Brown, President of the N. D. Chapter of the AAA, that an exception be made relative to the post-season rule in wrestling to permit high school students to participate in Olympic try-outs. It was the consensus of opinion of the Board that since the rule relative to post-season wrestling was a By-law of the Constitution, that the Board had no authority to set it aside and would be forced to enforce the rule as written.

A request for permission for presentation of a cheerleaders trophy at the State Class B basketball tournament was presented. Permission was granted for same providing the trophy did not advertise any individual business or business organization.

Next under consideration was the question of cheerleader clinics in the fall of 1968. Larson moved that we continue the practice of hold-

ing such clinics every other year and since no clinics were held in 1967 that these be scheduled for the fall of 1968. Seconded by Broton and carried.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

## MINUTES

## Board of Directors Meeting

Holiday Spot, Minot, N. Dak. — March 15, 16, 1968

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at Minot, North Dakota, on March 15, 1968 at 1:00 p. m. with all members present. Mimeographed copies of the minutes of the January and February meetings, which had previously been mailed to the Board were approved.

The Board next examined the financial report showing a list of all expenditures and receipts of the General Fund and the Accident Benefit Fund up to March 13, 1968. The report was carefully examined and accepted.

Mr. Larson reported on the meeting of Class B district chairmen which had been held that morning, pointing out that some recommendations as to changes would require Board action and others action by the office staff. It was moved by Peterson and seconded by Quale to accept the report. Motion carried. Actions on recommendations were deferred to the June meeting.

The executive-secretary briefed the Board on the results of the survey recently conducted relative to the ABF plan, wherein member schools overwhelmingly preferred to continue under the present plan using the same benefit schedule. It was moved by Cummings that present premium fees be increased approximately 10% for the next biennium to cover anticipated increased claim costs, seconded by Kolbo and carried.

Mr. Carl Carlson of Minot next appeared before the Board relative to ABF coverage for airbase school children. Since these students are all covered under government insurance programs, he requested that the Minot schools be permitted to omit youngsters enrolled in the airbase school from the total enrollment in computing premiums for the next school year, and that these students not be covered under the ABF plan. It was moved by Kolbo and seconded by Spiss that this request be approved. Motion carried.



The Board spent some time discussing implications relative to the video-taping of basketball tournament games. Upon motion by Broton and second by Spiss, the matter was tabled until the June meeting.

Gary Leslie, chairman of the boy's gymnastic advisory committee, presented recommendations relative to an interscholastic program in this sport. Following considerable discussion, it was agreed that further study be given to same at the June meeting. It was moved by Spiss that ABF coverage for this sport be made available for 1968-1969, and that the office staff determine rates for same. Seconded by Salisbury and carried.

Consideration was next given to a request for the Northwest Class A region that they be permitted to qualify one entrant to the State Basketball tournament on the basis of season's record and that an 8 team regional tournament be held to select the second representative. It was moved by Larson that the policy adopted in 1963 by the Board stipulating that no team could be seeded directly into the state tournament be continued. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

The problem of excessive weight loss and crash dieting in connection with the wrestling program was reviewed. It was moved by Larson that effective with the 1968-69 season, doctors should indicate on the pre-season physical exam card the lowest weight class in which a boy would be permitted to compete during the season. Seconded by Spiss and carried.

The assistant-secretary next presented the recommendations submitted by the wrestling coaches association. It was moved by Peterson and seconded by Spiss that action on same be deferred until the June meeting. Motion carried.

The Board next took under consideration a request from the tournament manager that a definite policy relative to passes be established for the State Wrestling Tournament as is the case in basketball. It was moved by Broton that the following schedule be adopted for schools qualifying boys for the state tournament:

Administrators.....	2 passes per school
Coaches.....	2 passes
Student manager.....	1 pass
Each qualified wrestler.....	1 pass
Each Cheerleader in uniform.....	1 pass

Seconded by Salisbury and carried.

It was moved by Spiss and seconded by Quale that a three man wrestling advisory committee be appointed to serve in a similar capacity as the track advisory committee. Named to the committee were:

Gerald Halmrast, Bismarck, Chairman  
Al Larson, Carrington  
Roger Erickson, Edgeley

Discussion followed relative to eligibility status of boys who competed in the Olympic qualifying wrestling tournaments. Since these were post-season events, participation in same would cause loss of eligibility in spring sports according to the by-laws of the Association. Since this regulation was contained in the by-laws, it was the opinion of the Board that they had no power to waive such regulation and that an amendment to the by-laws passed by the membership would be necessary to change said rule.

N. W. Cummings, chairman of the committee appointed to study the recommendations presented by the Officials Association at the last meeting, moved the adoption of the following recommendations for the 1968-1969 season:

1. That the differential fee schedule for classes of officials be abolished, and that the maximum fee for Class A football, wrestling, hockey, and basketball games be \$17.50, and \$15.00 for Class B schools. Preliminary fees to remain the same as in 1967-1968.
2. That it be recommended that Class A schools use four officials for football contests and Class B school use three officials.
3. That a football workshop be held in conjunction with the Jamestown football rules clinic next fall, with the regular rules clinic to be followed with an outdoor session using football players to demonstrate aspects of certain rule interpretations.

Mr. Broton reported that the problem relative to all-state band and chorus festivals run by colleges had been referred to the Board of Directors of the North Dakota School Administrators Organization and that this group felt that this was a local problem to be handled by each individual school.

The Board next reviewed the report submitted by the swimming advisory committee. Action on same was deferred until the June meeting.

The executive-secretary reported that the results of the survey of Class A schools indicated that 4 schools were interested in participating in a baseball program this spring. It was moved by Salisbury to set up a Class A baseball tourney similar to the Class B tourney if all 4 schools wished to take part, or to allow said schools to set up their own tourney which would not be recognized as an official state tourney if they so desired. Seconded by Peterson and carried.

Requests from Upham and Lansford for transfer from assigned baseball districts were next presented. It was moved by Cummings and seconded by Salisbury that since such transfers would result in a deficiency in number of teams for the north half of district 6 that said requests be denied. Motion carried.

Because of the uncertainty of certain school closings, it was moved by Spiss that the rule adopted in the January meeting requiring a mini-

mum of 6 teams in each Class B basketball district be rescinded, seconded by Broton and carried. Larson moved that the petition presented by Adams requesting permission to remain in District 9 be granted. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

It was moved by Peterson that the secretary draw-up a proposed amendment to the by-laws giving the Board of Directors power to rule on certain hardship eligibility cases. Seconded by Larson and carried.

The Board next took under consideration three eligibility cases from Bismarck, Grand Forks, and St. Gertrudes of Raleigh. Upon motion by Salisbury and second by Broton, Steve Leoppke of Bismarck and Donald Peterson of Grand Forks were declared immediately eligible. Quale moved that Clarence Ternes of St. Gertrudes be ruled eligible for interscholastic competition during the 1968-69 school year. Seconded by Kolbo and carried.

Cummings moved that the calendar project be continued for another year, seconded by Spiss and carried.

Discussion followed relative to the annual meeting of the Association members next fall. It was moved by Cummings that said meeting be scheduled the afternoon of October 24th, seconded by Spiss and carried.

Delegates to the summer meeting of the National Federation were named as a committee to secure a speaker for the NDHSAA annual meeting. Named as delegates were: Nate Cummings, James Broton and Warner Quale with Nate Cummings being designated as the official voting delegate.

Harry Salisbury informed the Board that he would not be able to continue on the Board after July 1st as he had resigned as Principal of Valley City High School and accepted a position as Dean of Men at Valley City State College effective as of said date. Jerry Muckenhirn, Superintendent of the Larimore Public Schools, was appointed by the Board to succeed Mr. Salisbury.

The Board next proceeded to organize itself for the 1968-1969 fiscal year. James Maxwell and Don Kolbo were renamed as president and vice-president respectively.

It was moved by Larson that the salary for the executive-secretary be set at \$15,000.00 and the assistant to the secretary at \$12,000.00 for the 1968-1969 school year, and that the Association assume cost of premiums for Blue Cross-Blue Shield for both individuals. Seconded by Spiss and carried unanimously. Action on other office personnel was deferred until the June meeting.

June 13th and 14th were selected as dates for the June meeting of the Board with the meeting scheduled to begin at 1:00 p. m. on June 13. The meeting of the Officials Committee consisting of Cummings, Larson, and Salisbury, was scheduled for the evening of June 12th and the morning of the 13th.

The Board then recessed and reconvened at 9:00 a. m. on March 16th with all members present except Salisbury, Peterson, and Spiss.

Jack Brown, representing the North Dakota Officials Association, appeared before the Board requesting that bronzed picture plaques of members elected to the Officials Hall of Fame be displayed in an appropriate area of the Association office. It was moved by Cummings and seconded by Quale to approve the request. Motion carried.

Action on dates for state swimming and gymnastics meets and sites for all events was deferred until the June meeting.

Discussion followed relative to whether radio receipts should be included in the division profits in Class A basketball regions. It was moved by Larson and seconded by Broton to follow the practice used in past years. Motion carried.

The Board upheld a ruling previously made by the executive-secretary prohibiting entry at the district festival of a band composed of students from both the public school and a parochial school located in the same town.

A question submitted by the Grand Forks schools as to whether practice teachers could be used as head coaches in certain spring sports was next taken under consideration. Upon motion by Cummings and second by Larson such action was ruled as being in violation of the Association by-laws.

Discussion followed relative to ABF coverage for summer programs being sponsored by member schools. It was moved by Broton and seconded by Cummings that such coverage be continued again this summer for the same rate as in previous years.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

### MINUTES

#### Board of Directors Meeting

#### North Dakota High School Activities Association

Valley City — June 13, 14, 1968

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office building at 1:00 p. m. on June 13th with all members present. Each member of the Board was furnished with a complete financial report of the business to date, a financial report of the receipts and disbursements of the Accident Benefit Fund and General Fund to date, and an agenda for the meeting. Upon motion by Spiss and second by Cummings, the financial reports were accepted as submitted.

Leo Froehlich, of Jamestown College, presented a report on the 1968 State Music and Speech Festival and extended an invitation for the 1969 event.

The Board next reviewed the poll of Class B wrestling schools which showed 19 schools voting in favor of dividing wrestling into 2 classes and 10 in favor of retaining the present set-up. Salisbury moved

that 2 classes be established for the 1968-69 season, seconded by Spiss and carried.

The following recommendations submitted by the Wrestling Advisory Committee were next taken under consideration:

1. That the following weight classes as specified in the rule book be followed: 95, 103, 112, 120, 127, 133, 138, 145, 154, 165, 175, and unlimited. A boy must weigh a minimum of 175 lbs to wrestle in the heavyweight or unlimited class.
2. Continue to use riding time in North Dakota.
3. December 14th be designated as the weight certification date.
4. Recommended Minot as site for 1969 State Wrestling Tournament.
5. That wrestling regions be set for Class A schools following division lines for basketball and that 4 regions be established for Class B schools, if wrestling is divided into 2 classes, and that regional tournaments for both divisions be held on the same weekend, rotating the A and B events on Friday and Saturday each year.
6. In case the 2 divisions are established, the State Tournament for both divisions should be held at the same time and at the same site, beginning each day at 11:00 a. m. Managers to be instructed to make necessary adjustments in time schedule and number of mats to take care of 16 boys in each weight class.
7. Doctor's weight permit certifying card to be filed with the Association three weeks after the official start of the season. Late-comers to have form filed before their first match.

It was moved by Cummings to adopt the report as presented after amending same to provide that A and B regional events be held on the same Saturday each year. Seconded by Salisbury and carried.

The Board next took under consideration the following recommendations submitted by the Track Advisory Committee:

1. Minimum standards be revised as follows:
  - a. 180 yard low hurdle to 21.5 seconds with the requirement that this race be run on a curve.
  - b. 880 yard run to 2 min., 4 sec.
  - c. Mile run to 4 min., 40 sec.
2. Revise schedule of events in the 2 day State Meet so that Class A Javelin and Class B Long Jump begin at 11:00 a. m. of the second day and also schedule Mile Run on the first day following the 220 yard preliminaries with the Mile Run scheduled at 6:20 p. m., the 880 yard relay preliminaries at 6:40 p. m. and the Mile Relay finals at 7:00 p. m.
3. Allow qualifying by minimum standards at sanctioned indoor meets.

4. No qualifying meets be permitted after the date on which district meets are originally scheduled.
5. All district meets to be held on the date set by the Board unless weather does not permit.
6. Invitational meet managers must report all qualifiers to the Association office within 10 days of the meet or by the Saturday of district meets—whichever comes first—in order to qualify a boy for the State Meet.
7. Coaches of North Dakota schools are to be responsible for seeing that managers of out-of-state meets submit names of qualifiers.
8. State records to be kept for both Class A and Class B, as well as overall state records. Records to be brought up to date from Association Handbooks.
9. That the State Track meet be held at Valley City State College each year until equal facilities are available elsewhere.

It was moved by Spiss to adopt the report with the exception of item #9, seconded by Salisbury and carried.

Next taken under consideration were the following recommendations submitted by the Girls Track Advisory Committee:

1. Minimum standards to be revised as follows:
  - a. 75 yard dash — 9.4 seconds.
  - b. 100 yard dash — 12.2 seconds.
  - c. 220 yard dash — 28.5 seconds.
  - d. 880 yard relay — 2 minutes, 1 second.
2. National rules relative to wind velocity in connection with state records be followed at the State Meet.
3. Invitational meet managers must report all qualifiers to the Association office within 10 days of the meet or by the time of scheduled district meets—whichever comes earlier—in order for qualifiers to be entered in State Meet.
4. Four girls' track clinics to be held again next year.
5. Official watches to be used for Girl's State Meets.

It was moved by Peterson and seconded by Quale that the report be adopted. Motion carried.

Due to a closing of some schools and a change in sites for district meets, Class B track districts have become quite unbalanced. As a result, the Board instructed the executive officers to draw-up a realignment of Class B schools by districts.

The Board next considered the report of the Boys Gymnastic Advisory Committee. Because of the incompleteness of the report and the small number of schools engaged in the sport, it was moved by Salisbury to table consideration of the sponsoring of boys interscholastic gymnastics until there is more evidence of a demand for same. Seconded by Peterson and carried.

Quite some time was spent reviewing the report of the Girls' Gymnastic Advisory Committee. It was moved by Spiss that the report be approved and sponsorship of an interscholastic program in girls gymnastics be undertaken on a one year trial basis. Seconded by Peterson and carried.

The Board next reviewed the report of the Swimming Advisory Committee. Upon motion by Salisbury and second by Peterson, consideration of inauguration of an interscholastic program was tabled for one year.

A request by Class A coaches to permit individual basketball players 80 quarters of competition, with a maximum of 5 per night, instead of the present 20 game rule, was next presented. After some discussion, it was moved by Broton that an amendment to the by-laws embracing such change be put to a vote of the membership at the Annual Meeting in October. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

Mr. Jim Adelson of the North Dakota Broadcasting Company appeared before the Board with an offer relative to telecasting rights for the State Class A basketball tournament for a three year period. The fee for such rights was as follows:

\$4,000.00 for the 1969 tournament  
 \$4,500.00 for the 1970 tournament  
 \$5,350.00 for the 1971 tournament

The question was raised as to whether it would be possible to negotiate a three year contract covering the telecasting of both the State A and State B tournaments. Mr. Adelson stated that such might be possible and that he would investigate same. It was then moved by Spiss that the Executive Secretary and the Chairman of the Board be authorized to negotiate with Station KXJB-TV on a three year package agreement for both tournaments and to draw up a contract for same if they felt the financial terms were acceptable. Seconded by Cummings and carried.

The secretary reported on a complaint forwarded to the Association office by the State Director of Secondary Education relative to the number of invitational track meets being attended by some schools. Discussion followed as to whether limitations on number of meets per week or season in which a school might participate would be advisable or not. It was the consensus of opinion that this problem was probably due to the inclement weather this spring and upon motion by Larson and second by Broton the matter was tabled until such time as this became a continual problem.

The allowances being made district and state track meet managers for operation of meets was next discussed. It was pointed out that in many instances, the entire amount was spent in preparing the track and in the employment of personnel to run the meet, leaving nothing for managerial services. It was moved by Larson that the executive office

personnel study this problem and present a recommendation as to same at the August meeting.

The Board next reviewed recommendations of the Officials Association and the Officials Committee relative to tournament assignments for next year. Upon motion by Larson and second by Peterson, the following officials were to be tendered contracts for the 1969 basketball tournaments:

Discussion followed on the question of video-taping basketball tournament games. It was moved by Salisbury that the secretaries check at the National Federation meeting in July as to regulation by other states pertaining thereto, and report on same at the August meeting. Second by Spiss and carried.

It was moved by Cummings that an amendment to the by-laws changing the \$5.00 limitation on awards to \$10.00 be placed to a vote of the General Assembly in October. Seconded by Larson and carried.

In line with the recommendation received from the Cross-country coaches, Peterson moved that the date for the State Meet be changed to October 19th, and that the length of the run be increased to two miles. Seconded by Broton and carried.

The Board next studied recommendations submitted by the Speech Advisory Committee calling for the elimination of 'Story Telling' and the adding of 'Oral Book Review' and 'Broadcasting' as speech contest divisions. Upon motion by Peterson and second by Quale, the recommendations were adopted as submitted. Salisbury moved that trophies be awarded by the Association for the State Student Congress Meet as in other speech events. Seconded by Spiss and carried.

After considerable discussion, the Board voted to reject the recommendation of the Music Advisory Committee which would have eliminated the requirement that instrumental solos be memorized for district and state competition.

Mr. Kolbo reported that a formal poll had not been taken of the schools in Music District #8 as to their wishes concerning a division of the district, but that he would conduct same and submit the results thereof at the August meeting. Since this information was needed prior to the printing of the Music and Speech Handbook, Mr. Kolbo was instructed to conduct such poll as soon as possible and report the results to the Executive Secretary.

Mr. Kolbo next reported on his investigation of possible violations of eligibility rules by the Lignite school concerning participants in a track meet this spring. Allegedly a boy from the Columbus school partici-

pated as a member of the Lignite relay team, and the coach from the Lignite school had used a boy in the meet who had no physical exam card on file contrary to the order of the superintendent. Mr. Kolbo was instructed to continue the investigation further to ascertain all facts in connection with the case. It was moved by Salisbury that Coach Dean Hovey of Lignite be requested to appear before the Board at the August meeting. Seconded by Broton and carried.

The Board then recessed and reconvened at 9:00 a.m. the next morning with all members present.

A petition from the Steele High School requesting a re-assignment into another music district for 1968-69 because of scheduling problems was presented for consideration. It was the feeling of the Board that the problem was of a local district nature and so upon motion by Peterson and second by Cummings, the request was denied.

Discussion followed relative to the Cheerleaders Clinics next fall. Because of the increase in cost of staging such clinics, the individual registration fee was raised from \$1.00 to \$1.25.

Consideration was next given to track sites for 1969. It was moved by Cummings that the 1969 Boys State Meet be held in Valley City and that the office staff select sites for district meets endeavoring to obtain a better distribution than that of the past year. Seconded by Peterson and carried.

After reviewing all invitations that had been extended, the following sites were selected for NDHSAA events for the 1968-1969 school year:

Representatives from the Burroughs Company next demonstrated a sensomatic accounting system for the Association office. A communique from the tennis coaches concerning proposals for a change in scoring procedure, so as to designate a team championship was next presented. It was moved by Larson to adopt said proposal and to award a first place team trophy in both boys and girls tennis in 1969. Seconded by Broton and carried.



The Board also reviewed the present set-up relative to awards in golf. Upon motion by Kolbo and second by Salisbury, individual awards for members of the winning team were added to the list of awards for 1969.

Discussion followed on the remodeling of the Association office. Named to a building committee were Board members Maxwell and Larson, along with the Association secretaries. The committee was instructed to meet with local qualified builders prior to the next Board meeting and submit recommendations at that time.

Some time was spent reviewing details in connection with the annual Federation meeting in July. Cummings reported that because of unforeseen circumstances he would not be able to attend. Jerry Muckenhirn was selected in his place and James Broton was named as the official voting delegate.

The Board next considered quotations received for regular printing and off-set printing of the Activities Bulletin next year. It was moved by Kolbo and seconded by Broton that we continue the regular printed Bulletin. Motion carried.

The secretary reported that the Association records had been recently examined by a representative from the Internal Revenue Bureau and a written report received that everything had been found in good order. A recommendation to the effect that the by-laws should provide for the disposition of funds in case of dissolution of the Association was made by the examiner.

The minutes of the March 16 and June 13 meetings of the Officials Board of Directors were next reviewed. It was moved by Kolbo that state basketball tourney officials receive two reserved tickets for tournaments worked for their use when not working games. Seconded by Quale and carried.

Salisbury brought up the advisability of office personnel officiating high school football and wrestling matches, because of complications which might arise in case of protests. It was the opinion of the Board that because of the number of officials involved in a football contest that it would be OK for Mr. Schindler to continue officiating in this sport, but that he should discontinue the practice of officiating wrestling meets although contracts which he had already made should be fulfilled.

The Board voted a \$25.00 raise in salary per month to Mrs. Lucile Vandestreek, bookkeeper, and Mrs. Ethel Thvedt, secretary, effective July 1, 1968.

As there appeared to be no other business, the Board adjourned after selecting August 15th and 16th as the dates for their final summer meeting commencing at 1:00 p. m. on the 15th.

A crew of officials to be available to make the proper calls and interpretations. Mr. Brown suggested that all coaches be invited to attend the workshop.
