FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 57th Annual Yearbook which contains a historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

- 1. This has been a very successful year for the NDHSAA. Excellent weather the past fall and winter, plus outstanding teams combined to produce record attendance at many regional and state events.
- 2. The number of high schools again decreased from 254 to 247 and indications are for a further decrease in 1981-82.
 - 3. Carrington dropped back to Class B putting the Class A number at 25.
- 4. Ten sports for boys and seven for girls were sponsored by the Association again the past year. Girls' basketball, boys' basketball, hockey, wrestling, and football subsidized the other twelve. Track is the most highly subsidized activity.
- 5. The General Fund experienced a successful year. A complete audit report can be found in the back of this publication.
- 6. The A.B.F. claims paid and operating expense exceeded premiums collected but high interest rates on reserves left the fund in the black again.
- 7. Declining enrollments continued to show in participation figures. Student participation in athletics decreased by 1,222. Likewise music participation dropped by 791. Speech reversed the trend and increased by 129 students.
- 8. Steps taken by the Board of Directors and approved by the membership should provide an interesting and exciting year ahead. The most exciting will be the new cooperative sponsorship program. Girls' volleyball for the Class "A" schools will also provide additional opportunities for girls.
- 9. A change in the hardship rule submitted by the Board and accepted by the membership should clear the way for deserving students to take part in activities.

In my first year as your executive secretary, I deeply appreciate the wonderful cooperation and support I have received from the office staff, school administrators, athletic directors, coaches, officials, the press and others. I pledge to you that I will do my best to help keep the North Dakota High School Activities Association an organization that operates under sound business practices and provides the very best in activities for the young people of our state.

The Assistant Executive Secretary next reviewed the Southeast Regional Track protest that was tabled from the June meeting. The Board then heard from Dale Sumers, the meet manager and Coach Jansen of Valley City, and Coach Schmeichel of Jamestown. After hearing the testimony of the manager and coaches a lengthy discussion of the protest and alleged rule violation was held. Brintnell moved that Valley City and Jamestown be declared co-champions of the 1980 Southeast A Boys' Regional Track Meet. Second by Hoff and carried.

Bergene next reported on the business meeting of the National Federation held on July $5,\,1980.$

The Board next discussed the problem of the starting dates of fall sports conflicting with summer programs. Olson moved that Track and Field be considered a different sport than Cross Country and that the starting date of

Girls' Swimming be changed from August 14th to August 18th. Seconded by Dehne and carried.

The Board next adopted the following Hockey format for the 1980-81 season upon a motion by Silseth and second by Olson.

1. Teams could be separated.

- A. The top team in each division will be seeded directly into the state tournament.
- B. The division standings will be used in setting up the pairings for the play-off games and division standings will be determined using the following point system:
 - 4 points for a win if teams play each other only once.
 - 2 points for a win if the teams play each other twice.

In case of ties, 2 points to each team if it is a four point game.

1 point to each team if it is a two point game.

C. All teams in each division except the champion will play off for positions in the state tournament. The following cross-bracketing pairings will be used:

2 East vs 7 West	5 East vs 4 West
3 East vs 6 West	6 East vs 3 West
4 Fast vs 5 West	7 East vs 2 West

Winner of each play-off game will qualify for the state tournament.

Site of the play-off game will be the home ice of the team with the higher finish in the division.

Three play-off games will be held on the Friday prior to state tournament week and the other three games will be held on the Saturday prior to state tournament week. Games that will be held on each night will be determined by open draw.

Officials will be assigned by the NDHSAA.

- D. State Tournament pairings:
 - 1 East vs 4 West
 - 2 West vs 3 East
 - 2 East vs 3 West
 - 1 West vs 4 East

If a lower placing team wins in the play-off that team would take the place in the state tournament. Example: If 6 East defeats 3 West then 6 East would take the 3 West spot in the state.

The Board next discussed the Hockey Workshop and Clinic that were requested by the Hockey schools at a meeting held last spring in Jamestown.

The Hockey Coaches Advisory Committee with Nick Novak of Jamestown,

chairman, has finalized the plans for this workshop to be held in Jamestown on Saturday, October 18th starting at 10:00 A.M. Gordon Lee of Minneapolis and Serge Gambucci of Grand Forks will be in charge of conducting the workshop. Attendance at this clinic will be mandatory for all head coaches and officials. The Board also adopted a plan to include the hockey rules clinic in this workshop and the two regularly scheduled rules clinics be dropped. The Board also agreed to underwrite this workshop to a maximum of \$800.00. The Jamestown Hockey Boosters and the American Hockey Association of the U.S. will also help in underwriting the cost of the workshop. The Executive Secretary was instructed to contact all City Park Boards that sponsor hockey and invite their coaches and officials to attend. Upon motion by Dehne and second by Fischer the entire Hockey Workshop Plan was adopted and carried.

Sheryl Solberg next informed the Board of a plan submitted by the Jamestown Gymnastics Officials to hold a one day workshop and rules clinic in Gymnastics. This clinic would be mandatory for all head gymnastic coaches and judges to attend and would be held in Jamestown on Saturday, October 18th. The starting time and schedule will be sent out later. This one day session will replace regularly scheduled clinics and workshops. Motion by Silseth to implement this entire plan, second by Hoff and carried.

Gary Pearson of Grafton radio station KXPO next appeared before the Board to discuss reason why radio and TV are charged for covering Association events and newspapers are not. After a lengthy discussion the Board agreed that someone would attend the next meeting of State Broadcasters for further input.

The Board next reviewed the fees paid to managers of NDHSAA sponsored events. Upon motion by Brintnell and second by Hoff the following new schedule will be followed:

The Executive Secretary next read a letter to the Board from the Department of Education regarding Title IX. The Executive-Secretary was also instructed to send copies of the letters from the Department of Education to all member schools and this item be placed on the agenda of the annual meeting.

The Board recessed until 8:30 A.M. on August 6th.

The Board reconvened at 8:30 A.M. on August 6th with all members present.

The Executive Secretary reported on the acceptance and rejection by host cities of state events which had been assigned at the June meeting. As Fargo declined to host the East Regional Gymnastic Meet a new site will have to be located by the NDHSAA staff. Wahpeton also declined to host the Class B Region I Track Meet and a new site will have to be selected.

The Assistant Secretary next briefed the Board relative to acceptance received in connection with assignments of officials for the girls' and boys' regional and state basketball tournaments and regional and state wrestling tournaments.

The Executive Secretary next asked the Board what action he should take relative to Association cars. Motion by Olson to give the Executive Secretary the authority to purchase two 1981 cars and dispose of 1980 cars by putting them up for bids. Second by Snortland and passed.

Silseth next reported on the plans for the F. U. Smith Appreciation Luncheon to be held in Bismarck on October 23, outlining the following recommendations:

- A luncheon be held from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on October 23rd.
- Letters be sent to all schools, officials groups, and any others that might like to attend.
- 3. Invitations be sent to the family of Mr. Smith.
- 4. Program to be in the nature of a roast.
- Individuals to pay cost of the luncheon plus a slight fee to pay for a gift.

The Assistant Executive Secretary reported on the progress that has been made in the selection of a speaker for the annual meeting. He was instructed to attempt to get Marv Helling of Minnesota to speak at the meeting.

Motion by Olson to list Bruce Anderson as the new finance officer of the Association. Second by Snortland and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the following hardship eligibility requests:

- 2. Carrington Executive Secretary was instructed to obtain more information.
- Cardinal Muench Motion by Fischer to deny, second by Hoff, carried.

The Board next discussed the dates for the Class A Regional Boys' and Girls' Basketball Tournaments. Silseth moved that the EDC, WDA and North Star Girls' Regional Tournaments be held on November 3, 4, 6, 7, 8 at sites selected in June and that Boys' Tournaments be held on March 2, 3, 5, 6, 7 at sites selected in June, with the EDC and WDA using the Montana Plan, and the North Star using the plan submitted to the Association by the Conference. Second by Dehne and carried.

The Board next reviewed a Sportsmanship Program prepared by Bob Hetler and this project was assigned to the Program Committee for further study. The Board was also made aware of the National Federation's plans to have a National High School Activities Week from September 28 to October 4. The Board instructed the NDHSAA staff to make all member schools aware of this week and encourage them to take part.

There being no further business the Board meeting adjourned.

Board of Directors Meeting

North Dakota High School Activities Association

Bismarck, North Dakota — September 14-15, 1980

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 4:00 P.M. on September 14 at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck with all members present except Olson and Ott.

Silseth reported on the investigation conducted by Mr. Fischer and himself concerning the transfer of Sherry Cook to Carrington under the hardship rule and recommended that the request for immediate eligibility be denied. Silseth moved that the request for immediate eligibility be denied, seconded by Fischer and carried.

Dehne reported on the investigation conducted by Mr. Bergene and himself concerning the transfer of Steve Blotsky to Fargo Shanley under the hardship rule and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be approved. The motion was seconded by Bergene but failed on a 4-3 vote.

Strang reported on the investigation conducted by Olson and himself concerning the transfer of Angela Hysjulien to Columbus High School and moved that the girl be declared immediately eligible under the hardship transfer rule. Seconded by Snortland and passed.

Brintnell reported on the investigation conducted by Silseth and himself concerning the transfer of Scott Jerald to Devils Lake under the hardship rule and moved that the boy be denied immediate eligibility as not qualifying under said rule. Seconded by Silseth and carried.

The Board next heard from Doyle Radke of Minot, Rocky Stavn of Bismarck and Gelaine Orvik of Fargo representing the Class A Track Coaches and this group had the following recommendations for the Board to consider:

1) A 16 week track season by counting back from state track meet

Board Members

- 2) Three calendar weeks of practice before first meet
- All students in winter sports must practice one week before they can compete in meet

After a period of discussion the issue was tabled until the October meeting.

The following applications for approval of non-certified head coaches were approved under the customary restrictions upon motion by Fischer and second by Dehne:

Next reviewed was a report showing a decline of 551 students at the fall Cheerleaders Clinics from 1,611 in 1979 to 1,060 in 1980. The report also showed 148 schools attended in 1979 and only 124 attended in 1980. No decision was made by the Board on the status of future Cheerleader Clinics.

The Board next heard a report of the recently completed NDHSCA clinic held in Fargo. The deficit of \$1,638.18 was over the \$1,500.00 allotted by the Board. Silseth moved that \$1,500.00 be paid to the Coaches Association and the NDHSAA continue sponsorship and financial support to the same extent next year. Also the Assistant Executive Secretary was instructed to write a letter of commendation for the excellent clinic conducted by the NDHSCA. Seconded by Fischer and carried.

The Executive Secretary briefed the Board on the plans for the Hockey Workshop and Clinic that will be held in Jamestown on Saturday, October 18,

Next the Executive Secretary reported on problems with tournament sites. Dick Karlgaard informed the Board that Riverwood Golf Course would not be available for the Girls' State Golf on Saturday, October 4th but would be on Monday, October 6th. He informed the Board both Minot and Fargo could host the tournament on Saturday, October 4th. Silseth moved that because the tournament was in the east last year that Minot be the site of the 1980 tournament. Seconded by Snortland and carried.

The Executive Secretary next informed the Board of the problem with the 1981 Class B Region I Track Meet. He informed the Board West Fargo declined the request of the NDHSAA to run the meet but did make their facilities available if someone could be found to run the meet. After a period of discussion it was moved by Dehne to hold the meet at N.D. State School of Science, Wahpeton on Friday, May 15th with Ed Werre as Manager. Second by Strang and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the hail damage to the Association cars and that bids have been advertised for the sale of the two 1980 cars. He also reported that Geisler Implement was the low bidder for 1981 and two 1981 Pontiacs had been ordered.

The Board next reviewed the plans for Frank Smith's recognition luncheon and the time for this will be from 12:00 to 1:30 in the Far West Room of the Bismarck Holiday Inn.

Discussion followed on the agenda for the annual meeting in October. The following items were placed on the agenda:

1. Address by guest speaker, Mary Helling

- 2. Committee reports
- 3. Vote on proposed by-laws and amendments

The Board next was informed on the Association's status with Title IX and after a period of discussion it was moved by Snortland to re-submit the previous motion that Girls' Volleyball be a sponsored activity of the NDHSAA with the following provisions:

- 1) Sponsor sport starting 1981-82 school year
- 2) One class ending at district level
- 3) No financial aid provided by the NDHSAA

Second by Hoff and carried. The Board requested this motion be brought before the Annual Meeting for an opinion vote.

Fischer moved to accept recommendations, second by Hoff and passed.

The Executive Secretary briefed the Board relative to the present investment of funds and informed the Board he was making short term investments because it looks like interest rates could increase.

The Board was also informed that the 1981 Summer meeting will be in Dearborn, Michigan.

The Board then recessed, reconvening at 8:30 A.M. on September 15 with all members present except Olson.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the push by the National Federation to have state associations become involved in fund raising projects. No action was taken by the Board at this time relative to the NDHSAA becoming involved in this project.

The Board next examined the addition to the Association physical exam cards made by the Jamestown Public Schools. Silseth moved to include this on the regular NDHSAA physical exam cards, second by Dehne and carried.

The Board next discussed the policy of switching from 11 to 9 man football. Brintnell moved that schools wishing to switch must inform the NDHSAA office by December 1st to be eligible in a new class the following year. Seconded by Strang and carried.

Athletic Director L. E. Faris of Mandan appeared before the Board relative to problem of towns with Catholic Junior High and no Catholic High School. He felt students in Catholic Junior High should be eligible in public high school if they declare this is the school they will be attending. The Board tabled this item until the October meeting and instructed the Executive Secretary to research this problem and report back to the October meeting.

President Bergene appointed the following nominating committee:

Chairman Bob Sheppard - Northwood

Mary Leidal - West Fargo

Ron Broeker - Watford City

The Board next instructed the Executive Secretary to set up a meeting on October 24th between George Smith, Manager, Bismarck Civic Center; Dick Karlgaard, Tournament Manager; Board Members Dehne and Silseth and the Executive Secretary and Assistant Executive Secretary to discuss the 1981 Class A & B Boys' Basketbal! Tournaments.

Strang reported on behalf of the by-law committee and requested the Board to sponsor the following changes:

Article XIII, Section X b

A student who, because of unavoidable circumstances, such as broken home conditions, death of parents or guardians, abandonment or other exceptional or emergency reason, finds it necessary to change schools, may be declared eligible by the Board of Directors, provided the administration of each school involved files a statement with the NDHSAA that the change was necessary and there was no undue influence or recruitment. Rulings in such cases will be considered by the Board only when in regular session and after a complete investigation by the NDHSAA professional staff and/or the Board of Directors.

This by-law change would have the emergency clause thus if passed go into effect immediately.

An addition to Section XI to Article III of the By-Laws would read as follows:

Schools with 75 students or less in grades 9 through 12 may join together with another school to compete in football, wrestling, speech and music activities under the following conditions:

- 1. Schools may join a neighboring school with this program.
- 2. Cooperative sponsorship agreements must be for a minimum of three years.
- The governing boards of participating member schools must jointly make the application to the NDHSAA Board of Directors.
- 4. The request must include a resolution stating the purpose for sponsoring a joint team or activity.
- 5. Requests must be submitted to the NDHSAA Board of Directors by December 1st to be considered for the following year.
- 6. Decisions on all applications will be determined by the Board of Directors no later than February 1st.

Motion by Fischer to sponsor these two by-law changes and have them presented and voted on at Annual Meeting, second by Strang and carried.

The Board next discussed item No. 2 under pre-season, in-season and post season participation rules. Fischer moved to re-write this regulation and bring back to October meeting. Second by Silseth and carried.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned.

Board of Directors Meeting

North Dakota High School Activities Association

Bismarck, North Dakota — October 22, 23, 1980

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 1:00 P.M. on October 22, 1980 at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck with all members present except Snortland.

First reviewed by the Board was the financial report of all business transacted from July 1, 1980 to October 15, 1980. The Board also reviewed the ABF report covering the same period.

Chairman Bergene appointed Duane Silseth as chairman of the Class B district chairmen's meeting to be held in Minot during the Girls' State Class B Basketball Tournament.

The Board next heard letters from Adams of District 9 and Maple Valley of District 4 requesting permission to remain in their original districts. The request was referred to the re-districting committee for further study.

The following applications for approval of non-certified head coaches were approved under the customary restrictions upon motion by Silseth and second by Dehne:

Kevin Dissel — boys' basketball coach at Stanton.

Rodney Johnson — boys' basketball coach at Plaza

Bob McIlonie — boys' basketball coach at Pingree

Daune Larson — girls' gymnastics coach at Devils Lake

Jim Shaw — hockey coach at West Fargo

The Board next reviewed a letter from the Civil Liberties Union office in Denver informing the Association of a complaint filed for alleged violation of Title IX because of the lack of girls' sports programs offered during the winter months. After considerable discussion the letter was referred to the Title IX committee for further study.

The Executive-Secretary next presented a three year report of the Cheer-leader Clinics sponsored by the Association and a discussion followed. Fischer moved to continue the present policy for holding the clinics in August for one more year. Second by Brintnell and carried.

The Executive-Secretary gave a report on the all day Hockey Workshop held in Jamestown on October 18, 1980. Strang moved that the Hockey Workshop program be continued in 1981 with the exact format to be developed by the executive staff. Second by Dehne and carried.

The Board next heard a report of the meeting between the executive staff and Dan Hart, program director for KFME-TV concerning the possibility of TV coverage for activities not now covered. The Executive-Secretary reported that considerable progress was made at the meeting. The matter of fees was referred to the TV Committee.

A letter from the Council of Chief State School Officers was read to the Board expressing opposition to National High School Athletic Championships.

The Board next reviewed recommendations from the Track Advisory Committee that were presented at the September meeting. Silseth moved that the track season as presently set for this year remain in effect but to evaluate it at the end of the 1981 season to determine if changes should be made. Second by Hoff and carried.

The Board next approved the attendance of the following staff members at upcoming National Federation meetings:

National Athletic Directors Conference in Atlanta -

Hoff - Brintnell - Anderson

National Debate Meeting in San Antonio — Hetler

National Federation Mid-Winter Meeting, New Orleans --King - Anderson

Federation Section V Meeting, Sioux Falls — Anderson - Bergene

The Board next held a discussion concerning coordinating the state-wide church events and football and basketball games with the NDCSA and NDEA Conventions. Fischer moved that in cooperation with the N.D. Ministerial Association that the Board of Directors of the NDHSAA recommend that local schools not schedule activities during the dates set aside for statewide church events. Second by Silseth and carried.

Next reviewed were plans for the F. U. Smith luncheon to be held on October 23 and the annual meeting to be held the same day.

Next the Executive Secretary read a letter from Al Meyer thanking the Board for the lifetime pass. Also a letter from the Associated Press was read thanking the Executive staff for their cooperation in handling NDHSAA news releases.

A communique from Supt. Delmar Lewis of Langdon was read to the Board protesting the selection of Williston as the site for the 1981 State Class A Girls' Basketball Tournament.

The Board then recessed reconvening at 9:00 A.M. on October 23rd with all members present except Snortland and Ott.

The WDA principals appeared before the Board to appeal a Board decision to play the WDA Boys' and Girls' Basketball Tournament over a five day period instead of three days as requested by this group. Del Easton of Williston acted as spokesman and he pointed out to the Board that the principals wanted a three day tournament instead of a five day for the following reasons:

- 1. Too much travel
- 2. Inconvenience for fans
- 3. Excessive loss of school time

Discussion was held on the pros and cons of the three day tournament plan.

Strang moved to allow the WDA to play their Girls' and Boys' Basketball Tournaments over a three day period, contingent upon tournament managers approval of change. Second by Hoff. Hoff moved to amend the motion to allow three day plan for Boys' Tournament but to keep the Girls' at five days. Second by Strang — failed.

Hoff next moved to amend original motion to allow WDA to use three day plan for Girls' and Boys' Basketball Tournament for one year. Second by Olson and carried. The Board next voted on the original motion and passed it.

Supt. Larry Brandvold of Newburg appeared before the Board to ask for a clarification of the eligibility of Paul Johnson. After discussing the problem the Board informed Mr. Brandvold that only the Baptist school in Minnesota could change the grade a student was in during a particular school year.

The re-districting committee next requested that schools still be allowed to switch districts by following the same procedure as in the past. Maple Valley's request to stay in District 4 was approved. Adams' request was denied until both District 9 and 11 approved it.

The Board next opened bids for the sale of two 1980 Association owned vehicles. Bids received were as follows:

Tucker Wavra of Valley City - \$5,100.

Ed Reidman of Litchville - \$5,600.

Motion by Olson to reject bids and allow Executive Secretary and Assistant Executive Secretary to sell cars. Second by Dehne and carried.

The Assistant Executive Secretary next reported for the Football Committee and briefed the Board on the upcoming play-offs. The Board also was informed of the problem with the increasing number of Class B schools playing nine man football. All schools will be surveyed to help determine what changes should be made in the present set-up for Class B 9-man football.

The Board was next presented with a re-written regulation controlling pre-season and in-season participation by students. After reviewing the proposed change the Board instructed the Executive Staff to re-write the regulations using a positive statement.

The Executive Secretary next informed the Board of a problem with the 1981-82 Calendar as it applies to the dates for Girls' Basketball Tournaments.

Brintnell next reported on his meeting with the N.D. Broadcasters Association and he also informed the Board that this group wants to meet with the NDHSAA to discuss some problem areas. President Bergene instructed the TV Committee to set up a meeting with this group.

Dehne, the chairman of the Title IX and Volleyball Committee briefed the Board on the procedure that will be followed in presenting the volleyball issue to the membership.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Board of Directors Meeting
North Dakota High School Activities Association
Minot, North Dakota -- November 21, 1980

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 1:00 P.M. on November 21, 1980 at the Holiday Inn in Minot with all members present except Fischer.

The Board reviewed the financial reports of the General Fund and the ABF Fund from July 1 through November 7. Upon motion by Dehne and second by Silseth the reports were approved.

The Assistant Executive Secretary next presented a financial report of the football play-offs and the Executive Secretary presented a preliminary financial report on the girls' basketball tournaments.

The following requests for approval of non-certified head coaches were acted upon and approved upon motion by Dehne and second by Brintnell:

Bill Galloway, Jr. — boys' basketball at Pisek Ann Kempf — boys' swimming at Bismarck Century

Silseth next reported to the Board on the meeting held with the Bismarck Civic Center Board and reviewed the material presented to the NDHSAA at this meeting. The Executive-Secretary was instructed to send out a copy of this material to all Board members.

Next reviewed were the following recommendations of the Class B District Chairmen:

- Recommended the Board take no action on Girls' Volleyball at this time.
- Recommended that sites for state Class B Girls' and Boys' Basketball tournaments continue to be in Minot and Bismarck.
- Voted 21-8 to start Girls' Basketball practice on August 17th, 1981.
- Discussed the need for regulations concerning video taping regular season athletic contests.
- 5. Recommended increased security at State Class B Track Meet.
- Voted 25-7 to recommend increasing quarter limitations for participants in basketball from 72 to 80 for girls and from 80 to 90 for boys.
- 7. District 6 requested permission to play fall baseball.
- 8. Recommended that the Board continue to endorse the present length of time between girls' and boys' basketball.
- Recommended that registered officials be required for varsity and junior varsity games only.
- Recommended that NDHSAA office send out agendas for Class B Regional meetings.

Dehne moved that action on the Volleyball recommendation be delayed until after the meeting of the Class A regional chairmen's meeting. Seconded by

Olson and carried. The Volleyball Committee was instructed to draw up a model plan for volleyball competition.

The Executive-Secretary next informed the Board of legal action brought against the NDHSAA and the Carrington Public Schools by Jeff Stangeland of Carrington over injury he suffered at a play-off football game held in Carrington in 1977.

Supt. Clute of Adams appeared before the Board to request that Adams be allowed to remain in District 9 and not moved to District 11. Petitions were presented to the Board from the patrons of the Adams school. Motion by Brintnell to allow Adams to remain in District 9 and that Milton-Osnabrock be contacted and given choice of district they would like to be in for 1981-82 school year. Second by Olson and carried.

Supt. Haugse of Alamo appeared before the Board to discuss problem in District 27 of one school not playing all schools with their varsity team in boys' basketball. After a period of discussion the Executive-Secretary was instructed to contact District 29 and see if they would admit Watford City into their district. He was also instructed to contact the Supt. of Watford City and the Chairmen of District 27 and 29 and have them appear at the next Board meeting.

The Executive-Secretary next read a letter from the President of the Richland of Colfax School Board concerning problems that occurred at a play-off football game held in Esmond on October 28, 1980. The Executive-Secretary informed the Board that he had written to the Esmond School concerning the allegations and also answered the letter to the Richland School Board.

A letter from Kevin Keenaghan, Supt. of Berthold was read to the Board supporting the stand of scheduling no activities during the designated statewide church weekend in October.

The Executive-Secretary next read a letter from Del Easton of Williston thanking the Board for the consideration given the WDA in rescheduling the length of the basketball tournaments.

The Executive-Secretary next reported that both 1980 association cars had been sold.

Next the Board discussed a problem with the 1981-82 school calendar concerning the dates of the Girls' Class B State Basketball Tournament. Strang moved that schools be allowed to start Girls' Basketball practice on August 17th and the first allowable game be August 31st. Second by Hoff and carried.

Strang next reported on behalf of the By-Law Committee and presented the following re-writing of item No. 2 under Pre-season, In-season, and Post-season participation rules on page 43:

Students may compete only on a school team during the high school season of that sport; also students may compete as unattached individuals in non-school contests until the first day of classes in their school for the current school year. Violation of this regulation results in ineligibility in that sport for the remainder of the season. The only exception to the above rule is in the case of talented students involved in Olympic competition as explained under Section III of Article XIII of the by-laws.

Second by Brintnell and carried. Strang also asked the Board for some suggestions to help re-write the proposed combining programs by-law. After discussion the committee was instructed to re-write and have it ready so it could be published 30 days before the January meeting.

Executive-Secretary Anderson next reported on the investigation under the hardship rule of Barry Borgen of Verona and recommended that he be declared immediately eligible at Verona. Motion by Olson and second by Snortland he be immediately eligible and carried.

Dehne next asked the Board to reconsider the hardship eligibility case of Steve Blotsky of Fargo Shanley and because of the change in the by-law at the October meeting moved that the boy be declared eligible under the hardship rule. The motion was seconded by Olson and carried.

The Assistant Executive-Secretary next reported on his investigation under the hardship rule of Jim Miller of Trenton and recommended that he be declared immediately eligible under the hardship rule. Motion by Snortland to declare the boy immediately eligible under the hardship rule. Second by Olson and carried.

Silseth next reported on the investigation of the hardship eligibility case concerning Mike Lee of Hillsboro. Motion by Olson to approve request for eligibility if Hillsboro accepts him as a legal student. Second by Snortland and carried.

The Board next approved a lifetime pass to be awarded to Ed'Werre of Wahpeton Science. Motion was made by Hoff and second by Silseth and carried.

The Assistant Executive-Secretary next reported on behalf of the Football Committee and informed the Board of the problems in the area of Class B 11-man football. It was pointed out to the Board that a new plan was under consideration in this area and they hoped to implement it before next fall.

Silseth next moved that the number of basketballs purchased under the NDHSAA bid be doubled and also number sent to each tournament be doubled. Second by Strang and carried.

The Executive-Secretary next read a communique from the North Dakota Medical Association informing the NDHSAA that they had formed a Sports Medicine Committee to work with the association in setting up clinics for coaches and trainers. They also recommended a new physical exam form to be used by athletes. The Executive-Secretary was instructed to inform the N.D. Medical Association of the willingness of the NDHSAA to work with their Sports Medicine Committee.

The Board next reviewed the minutes of the North Dakota Officials Association and it was determined that no items needed action by the Board.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

The Board next reviewed the protest filed by Tioga as a result of the wrestling dual held with Parshall on January 8, 1981. The Assistant Executive-Secretary explained the situation to the Board and recommended that the protest be upheld for the following two reasons:

- If a coach wants a boy to be eligible to wrestle at both 185 and heavyweight he should request he be weighed in at both classes.
- The official had no right to set aside Rule 4-1 and extend the weigh-in period beyond the 30 minute period.

Therefore when Parshall did forfeit at the 185 class, they also had to forfeit at heavyweight because they did not have a wrestler weighed in who was eligible to wrestle as a heavyweight. So Tioga would receive a forfeit at heavyweight and win the dual match 35 to 29. The Board also reviewed the ruling from the National Federation.

GOLF - Sand - Boys' Class B

Silseth moved that the protest be upheld and Tioga be declared the winner of the dual. Second by Dehne and carried.

The Board next heard a letter from Sherwood High School requesting the Board to consider starting boys' basketball one week earlier because of conflict other date has with Thanksgiving. Strang moved that this request be tabled until the meeting when sports seasons are set. Second by Hoff and carried.

A letter from Maddock was next read to the Board. This letter from the schools in Region IV requested that regions be allowed to pay the expenses for bands to travel to regional tournaments. The Executive-Secretary was instructed to answer this letter and inform this region why this policy is not possible.

The Board next made the following assignments for trophy presentations for all events until the end of the school year:

Next discussed were the meetings to be held in March with the Class A regional chairmen and the Class B district chairmen. Hoff and Brintnell next presented a report on the Athletic Directors Conference held in Atlanta in December which they attended.

The Executive-Secretary and Assistant Executive-Secretary presented a report on the meeting of the National Federation Executive Council and Football Rules Committee held in New Orleans on January 6, 7, and 8, 1981.

Next the Executive-Secretary presented the latest correspondence that the Dept. of Public Instruction received from the Dept. of Education regarding Title IX. He also gave the Board a copy of the letter written by the Attorney General's office answering the Dept. of Education's letter. No action was taken but it will be pointed out to the district chairmen at their meetings in March.

A letter was read from Grand Forks asking the Board to consider moving Girls' Swimming to the winter season so both Boys' and Girls' Swimming would be the same sports season. The Board instructed the Executive-Secretary to survey the swimming schools to see what their feeling is relative to this proposal.

The Executive-Secretary questioned the Board on what policy should be for individuals that have received honorary life-time passes regarding state tournament tickets. He was instructed to use same policy that is used for former Board members.

The next problem discussed by the Board was the starting date for fall activities. It was pointed out to the Board that schools were starting the week of August 24 and starting on the 20th really did not give much time for conditioning especially in football. The Board next heard a report on the development of a Policy Handbook by former Executive-Secretary F. U. Smith. The Board will receive a preliminary draft of the Handbook to review as soon as it is available. Mr. Smith will be asked to meet with the Board on April 29th in Jamestown.

The Board reviewed a request from KFYR in Bismarck to allow McQuade Distributing and Re-cycling to sponsor advertisement during the state tournaments. The Board instructed the Executive-Secretary to go by the policy developed in determining what firms may advertise at state sponsored events.

The Board next met with Mr. Larson of Ray, chairman of District 27, and Mr. Sailer of South Heart, chairman of District 29, and Supt. Ron Broeker of Watford City. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss scheduling and seeding problems in District 27. After a lengthy period of discussion Hoff moved that this problem be placed in the hands of the district committee as outlined in the Constitution and By-Laws, Article VIII Sections I through VI. Second by Silseth and carried.

The Board recessed until after the conclusion of the General Assembly meeting on Monday, January 26, 1981.

After reconvening, the first order of business was inspection of the McGregor X10L basketball from Northern School Supply who submitted the lowest bid. Hoff moved to accept the Northern School Supply bid of \$24.95 per ball, second by Silseth and carried.

Next discussed was what steps the Board must now take with the passage of the Cooperative Sponsorship Amendment. Motion by Silseth to have the Executive-Secretary and his assistant develop the necessary material to implement this program. This material would be presented to Board members on Saturday, February 21st at 12:00 noon at a meeting at the Jamestown Civic Center.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

Board of Directors Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association Bismarck, North Dakota - March 13, 1981

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck at 1:30 P.M. on March 13, 1981 with all members present except Crawford.

Each member of the Board was furnished with a packet containing a complete financial report of the general fund and the ABF fund from July 1, 1980 to February 28, 1981. The Board reviewed the various reports and upon motion by Silseth and second by Brintnell all reports were approved.

The Executive-Secretary next reported that all members of the professional staff had accepted contract offers for 1981-82 made by the Board. The Executive-Secretary next recommended a 13% increase for the non-professional employees of the Association. Fischer moved to accept this recommendation, second by Silseth and passed.

Fischer next reviewed the recommendations made during the meeting with the Class A Regional Chairmen. The following recommendations were received.

North Star Region:

- 1. Recommended NDHSAA sanctioning of volleyball (5 yes 4 no)
- 2. Speech and Music be put in same districts as athletics
- 3. Recommended housing of all teams in same motel at State Class A Basketball Tournament

EDC Region:

1. Recommended NDHSAA sanctioning of volleyball

No regional meeting has been held but individual school recommendations were reviewed.

Motion by Dullum and second by Bader that Class A regional chairmen meeting be moved to April meeting of NDHSAA and carried.

Motion by Van Camp, second by Bader, that NDHSAA Board of Directors sanction girls' volleyball and carried.

Bader moved to recommend that tournament sites host all teams at one motel if possible. Second by Dullum and carried.

Motion by Bader that a vote be taken at each regional meeting this spring concerning these items:

- 1. All schools bring entire wrestling team to state wrestling tournament (eliminate regionals)
- 2. Establishing 16 week track season
- 3. Allowing 20 boys' basketball games per season

Second by Van Camp and carried.

Duane Silseth was named the voting delegate at the business meeting of the National Council in July upon motion by Hoff and second by Fischer.

The Board next proceeded to organize itself for the 1981-82 fiscal year naming Duane Silseth as President and Don Dehne as vice-president.

The Executive-Secretary next read a letter from a Grafton Hockey fan who expressed dissatisfaction with the awards ceremony at the State Hockey Tournament. No action was taken by the Board.

The Executive-Secretary next reported that the professional staff of the NDHSAA had approved the request of the N.D. Dairy Association to present a sportsmanship award at the 1981 State Class A and B Boys' Basketball Tournaments.

The Board next reviewed a letter from Supt. Kolbo of Mohall that requested 7th and 8th grade students be allowed to take part in solo competition at the State Music Contest. The Board took no action and turned the request over to the Music Advisory Committee.

The Executive-Secretary next reported on a communique from the North Dakota Medical Association that informed the Board that representatives from the N.D. Medical Association would meet with the Board to discuss some problem areas in sports medicine.

Mr. Peske and Dr. Miller appeared before the Board and a lengthy period of discussion was held concerning some problem areas in sports medicine.

Dr. Miller on behalf of the N.D. Medical Association made the following recommendations to the NDHSAA Board of Directors:

- 1. The Committee on Sports Medicine is willing to act as a liaison to the N.D. High School Activities Association in areas related to sports medicine:
- 2. The Committee is willing to help in the planning and organization of a medical education program for coaches and trainers in conjunction with an annual coaches clinic. The Committee felt that someone connected with an organized athletic team and in attendance at an event should be knowledgeable in first aid or
- 3. The Committee is willing to assist in setting up a central injury registry to which coaches, managers, trainers or team physicians could report injuries. The type and frequency of injuries would be reviewed, and steps recommended to prevent them;
- 4. The Committee recommends that:
 - A. One comprehensive physical examination and history be conducted prior to initial entry into organized competition in contact or endurance sports. The enclosed "Student Participation and Physical Exam Form" is recommended for use. This exam would be conducted one time only, ideally by a physician acquainted with the student; and
 - B. The health history should be updated yearly using the Annual Questionnaire (which is also enclosed). Any abnormalities on this should be noted by the school person who reviews the forms, and these athletes should be referred to the examining physician. The physician in conjunction with the parent(s) and athlete should then determine the appropriate course of action: and

5. The Committee reviewed the NDHSAA guidelines regarding duration of season and number of games per season, and concurred with their limitations as published.

The Board of Directors of the NDHSAA agreed to take all of these recommendations under advisement.

The Board next reviewed correspondence from N.D. Nurse Practitioners Association requesting permission to be allowed to give athletic physical examinations to high school athletes. After a period of discussion the Executive-Secretary was instructed to write a letter to this association stating what the constitution of the NDHSAA states relative to physical examinations.

The Board next heard a request from Alexander requesting that they be moved from Region 8 to Region 5 for boys' and girls' track for this year. Moved by Olson to grant Alexander's request to be in Region 5, second by Strang and carried.

The Executive-Secretary next informed the Board of the upcoming meeting at the National Federation office for association legal counsels on May 5, 1981. Motion by Olson to send Executive-Secretary and President of Board of Directors to meeting. Second by Silseth and carried.

The Board next heard a letter from a Dakota High School wrestling fan concerning the problems at the Region IV Wrestling Tournament held in Mayville. Because of the accusations against Carrington High School the Board instructed the Executive-Secretary to ask the Carrington High School administration and coach to attend the next meeting of the Board to go over the accusations that were presented in the letter.

The Assistant Executive-Secretary next reviewed the progress in securing a speaker for the annual meeting. Silseth moved that the Assistant Executive-Secretary be instructed to contact Ryne Duren as a speaker for the annual meeting. Second by Brintnell and carried.

The Board next heard a request from Pembina High School that asked for the NDHSAA to attempt to get a reciprocity agreement with the Minnesota High School League that would allow schools from each state to join together under the cooperative sponsorship program. Brintnell moved that the NDHSAA contact the Minnesota High School League and propose for a reciprocity agreement for cooperative sponsorship programs. Second by Hoff and carried.

The meeting recessed until 1:30 P.M. on March 20th at Bismarck.

Bismarck, North Dakota — March 20, 1981

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association reconvened at 1:00 P.M. on March 20th at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck with all members present except Ott.

The Executive-Secretary read a letter from George Smith, Manager of Bismarck Civic Center requesting Board to consider making all seats reserved for state tournaments. This request was discussed but considering problems we already have with ushers it was decided it would be impossible to administer. Motion by Silseth to keep reserved sections the same as in past, second by Fischer and carried.

The Board next heard a delegation from Fort Yates regarding the Fort Yates' protest contained in the Standing Rock Community High School letter of March 11, 1981. That protest was "to protest the playing of the championship ball game between Center High School and Bowman High School for the Region VIII Championship". In attendance representing Fort Yates was Gernell Claymore and Sherman Laubach of the Fort Yates school and attorney Russ Myhre of Bismarck representing the Fort Yates school. Also in attendance was attorney Leonard Bucklin of Bismarck representing the North Dakota High School Activities Association.

Mr. Laubach made a presentation on behalf of the Fort Yates school stating why they believed the protest should be upheld. They were informed of the National Federation rules relative to protests and the Assistant Executive Secretary pointed out the reasons why they did not have sufficient grounds for changing the contest. After a lengthy period of discussion, Mr. Myhre (attorney) was asked if they wanted any action taken other than to void the playing of the championship ball game between Center High School and Bowman High School for the Region VIII championship. Mr. Myhre stated the only action they were requesting in regard to the protest signed by Bill Reiter, Athletic Director of Fort Yates High School, was to void the Center-Bowman game.

Motion was made by Silseth to deny the protest and that the Bowman-Center game would stand as played. Second by Fischer and carried.

The Fort Yates' representatives also suggested some revision be made, in the future, to the basketball playing rules so that there is some way to change calls of officials when the following items are present:

- 1. Decisions affecting the final outcome of a tournament game
- 2. Discretionary decisions affecting play
- 3. Factual basis
- 4. Timely appeal

The Board discussed the factors involved in so overruling the decisions of sports' referees and took the suggestion under advisement.

The Board next considered information relative to an incident which occurred in the Class B Region IV Wrestling Tournament at Mayville. The Executive Secretary read a letter from Tim Kilgore (official at Region IV Tournament) and a letter from a Dakota High School wrestling fan relative to this incident.

Al Larson, Superintendent of Carrington Schools appeared before the Board to answer the allegation against the Carrington students, athletes and coaches. In a prepared statement Mr. Larson commented on the way his school had handled this situation. Fischer moved that this complaint against the Carrington school and officials be dropped and that the school be complimented in the way it was handled by Mr. Larson. Second by Silseth and carried.

Motion by Olson that the NDHSAA Board of Directors go on record as supporting tournament managers in action they take in keeping proper tournament discipline at all NDHSAA sponsored activities. Second by Dehne and carried.

The Executive Secretary next reviewed the application form for cosponsorship of programs. He also informed the Board that a number of application forms had been sent out to schools and that action on these requests for co-sponsorship will be at the April meeting.

Next the Board heard a request from Emmons Central for clarification of the eligibility rule that requires a student to be passing three subjects in the school they are enrolled in. The Board ruled this is part of the Constitution and could not be altered in any way.

Dehne next reported on behalf of the Volleyball Committee and informed the Board that Class A Regional Chairmen favored the addition of Volleyball for 1981-82 and that the Class B district chairmen were opposed to the addition of Volleyball. Motion by Dehne to add Girls' Volleyball as a NDHSAA sponsored activity for Class A schools for 1981-82 school year. Second by Olson and vote carried with Fischer abstaining. Dehne informed the Board he would have detailed proposal ready for April meeting.

Brintnell next reported for the Trophy Committee and instructed the Executive Secretary to advertise for bids for trophies for the next three years. The Trophy showing will be held on June 15th at Valley City High School at 10:00 A.M. The Trophy Committee will narrow down the number of awards to be considered and at 3:30 P.M. on the 15th the entire Board will meet and select the awards to be used for the next three years.

The Board next reviewed recommendations of the Class B District Chairmen.

- 1. Discussion was held on site of 1982 Boys' Class B Basketball Tournament and continued use of the rotation plan.
- Board requested the Executive Secretary to contact Minot and have them report on seating in new fieldhouse and motel situation before April meeting.
- 3. That the NDHSAA promote a sportsmanship program to be used by all member schools. The NDHSAA Board of Directors instructed the office staff to set up a committee composed of representatives from the NDOA, NDHSCA and the Association of School Administrators under direction of Bob Hetler of the NDHSAA staff. Schedule meeting of the Sportsmanship Committee for April meeting.
- Recommended that cheerleaders be included in banquets at state tournaments.
- Recommended that teams involved in state tournaments get 100 reserved season tickets.
- That the name of the NDSU Indoor Meet be clarified so people know it is not sponsored by the NDHSAA.

Harold Pedersen of Fargo appeared before the Board to report on what arrangements had been made for the 1982 State Class B Basketball Tournament.

He reported that a lot of preliminary planning had been done and that all the necessary rooms for teams had been reserved and the dates had been set aside at NDSU Fieldhouse.

The Executive Secretary was instructed to put an article in the Bulletin explaining why 1982 Class B Tournament was placed in Fargo and also the philosophy behind the rotation plan.

The Board next reviewed the preliminary financial report of all tournaments to date and the Executive Secretary informed the Board that a complete financial report would be available for the April meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported on the 1980-81 hockey season and reported to the Board that overall the season went very well and was much improved over last year.

The Board next heard a letter from Mr. Fox of New Town concerning the 1942 State Class B Tournament and asked that Elbowoods be declared champion because of ineligible player that was used by Lakota. Board was informed of the action of the 1943 NDHSAA Board and upheld the action declaring no champion in 1942.

The Executive Secretary was instructed to order trophies for the two regular season regional champions in hockey.

The Board then set their next meeting for April 29 & 30 in Jamestown with the meeting starting at 10:00 A.M. on April 29.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City at 10:00 A.M. on April 29, 1981 with all members present.

The financial reports of the General Fund and the ABF Fund from July 1, 1980 to April 22, 1981 were reviewed and approved. Also reviewed was a financial report of all Boys' Basketball Tournaments held to date with a comparison between last year's and this year's tournaments.

The following requests for approval of non-certified coaches were acted upon:

Mike Podalak of Oakes — Boys' Golf — Approved Keith Meyer of Hillsboro — Girls' Basketball — Tabled Kevin Pfeiffer of Michigan — Football — Tabled Shelly Skemp of Lansford — Girls' Track — Approved

Motion by Strang to approve Oakes and Lansford applications. Second by Olson and carried. Motion by Brintnell to postpone action on Hillsboro and Michigan until all efforts have been tried to fill with certified staff. Second by Silseth and carried.

Next the Executive-Secretary presented a letter from the N.D. Dairy Products stating they would like to continue awarding a Sportsmanship Trophy at the Boys' State Basketball Tournament. Motion by Silseth to allow for one more year if award is presented at both girls' and boys' basketball tournaments. Second by Dehne and carried.

The Executive-Secretary read a letter from the Department of Education in Denver closing Title IX complaint against the NDHSAA.

The Board next heard a report by Olson on behalf of the Sportsmanship Committee. Motion by Silseth to have a Good Sportsmanship program developed by the NDHSAA and ready to implement for 1981-82 school year. Second by Brintnell and carried.

The Board next heard a report by Dehne, a member of the Volleyball Committee. The following regulations were recommended to govern Girls' Volleyball for 1981-82:

- Season runs from November 30th to February 20th (12 week season.
- 10 daily practices required before the first game. Earliest date for game December 14th.
- Teams may play 12 regular season games plus one tournament or 10 regular season games plus 2 tournaments or 8 regular season games plus 3 tournaments.
- Individuals shall not compete in more than four games against one opponent school teams on any one calendar date except in tournament play.

- All play shall be governed by National Federation Volleyball Rules Book, unless specified by the NDHSAA.
- NDHSAA will sponsor an East and a West regional tournament on February 20, 1982.
- 7. Trophies will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 5th place teams.
- Deadline for schools to sign up to participate in Volleyball will be October meeting of the Board.

Motion by Dehne to accept recommendations of Volleyball Committee and to implement for 1981-82 season. Second by Fischer and carried.

The Assistant Executive-Secretary next presented a report from the Board of Directors of the North Dakota Officials Association. The NDOA requested the NDHSAA Board to increase the mileage allowance for officials to 25¢ a mile for the 1981-82 school year. Brintnell moved to approve the 25¢ a mile reimbursement for officials, second by Strang and carried.

The Board next reviewed the items presented by the Class A Regional Chairmen and tabled these items until the June meeting which is after all Advisory Committees have held meetings.

The Board next reviewed the items presented by the Class B District Chairmen, all items were tabled until June except the request to increase the number of adult reserve seats available to participating teams in state basketball tournaments to 100. Fischer moved to have the tournament manager reserve 100 adult reserved seats for each of the eight participating teams. Second by Strang and carried

The Executive-Secretary next read a letter from the Minot Tournament Committee reporting on the progress of seating in their new building and also the status of number of motel rooms available in Minot for 1983 tournament.

The Board next discussed the Basketball Tournament Rotation Plan, discussion centered around if plan should be modified or changed in any way.

Motion was made by Huber to study the present tournament rotation plan. Second by Brintnell. Silseth next moved to amend this motion to include: Sites as set by the rotation will remain as assigned for the 1981-82 school year. Second by Dehne. The Board first approved the amendment by voice vote and then approved the original motion.

Hoff next moved that the first item to be considered in this study would be amending the tournament rotation plan starting in 1982-83 school year to rotate Class A Boys' Basketball Tournament between Fargo and Minot and placing Class B Boys' Basketball Tournament in Bismarck. Second by Huber and motion failed by 6-3 vote.

The Executive-Secretary next read letters from Class B schools regarding the location of the Class B Boys' Basketball Tournament and the Board will take these letters under advisement.

The Executive-Secretary next reported to the Board the bids he has received for a Long Term Disability Insurance for NDHSAA employees. Huber moved that this item be tabled and the Executive-Secretary receive additional bids from other companies. Second by Fischer and carried.

The Board next heard a report from the ABF Committee presented by Rick Fitzner. He reported that the committee did look at the possible addition of catastrophic coverage to the present NDHSAA coverage but recommended at this time not to expand the present coverage. The committee next instructed Mr. Fitzner to further investigate the possibility of adopting the Wisconsin Plan on insurance payments.

F. U. Smith next appeared before the Board to review the NDHSAA Policy Handbook that he developed by researching past NDHSAA Board minutes. Olson moved to accept the policy handbook, second by Strang and carried.

The Board was next informed of Duane Silseth's resignation from the Board of Directors of the NDHSAA. Motion by Olson to commend Silseth for his endless work and many outstanding contributions to the NDHSAA and to wish he and his family well in the future. Second by Dehne and carried.

Motion by Silseth for Dehne to be President of Board of Directors for 1981-82 was seconded by Fischer and carried.

Motion by Hoff for Brintnell to serve as vice president of the Board for 1981-82 was seconded by Strang and carried.

The Board next considered a replacement to the Board for Silseth. The following were nominated:

The Executive-Secretary next presented to the Board a plan that would change the Constitution and By-Laws to a loose-leaf notebook that would not have to be re-printed each year. The Board postponed action on this matter.

The Assistant Executive-Secretary next asked for permission to activate a 9-man Football Committee to investigate possible changes in the 9-man Football play-off plan. Motion by Olson to activate committee and have meeting in May at NDHSAA office. Second by Dehne and carried.

The Board next considered a reciprocity agreement with Montana for officials. Olson moved to accept the agreement with Montana Association and it was seconded by Brintnell and carried.

The Board next heard a request from Bucky Anderson of Bismarck asking for permission to rent the wrestling scoreboards for a regional USWF tournament to be held in Bismarck. Hoff moved to allow the rental of the scoreboards and it was seconded by Olson and carried.

Annual Meeting

North Dakota High School Activities Association October 23, 1980 — Bismarck, North Dakota

The annual meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck on October 23, 1980 at 3:00 P.M.

President Bergene called the meeting to order and then introduced the guest speaker, Marv Helling, Associate Director of the Minnesota High School League, who addressed the group.

Following the address, Mr. Bergene requested the official delegates to find their respective reserved seats and then he declared a quorum of fifty members in attendance.

The Chairman then asked for any corrections in the minutes of the previous annual meeting and the special meeting in January as printed in the 1980 Official Yearbook. Paul Pearson of Alexander moved to approve as printed, second by Foster Hagar of Finley-Sharon and carried.

Brintnell next reported on behalf of the Trophy Committee and informed the membership of the increase in the number of participation awards for State Basketball Tournaments from 13 to 15 awards as recommended by the Basketball Advisory Committee.

The report of the Nominating Committee was presented by Supt. Robert Sheppard of Northwood submitting the following names for vacancies on the Board of Directors for three year terms:

Class B NE — Don Brintnell of Pembina Class B NW — Terry McLeod of Glenburn

Class A E - Don Dehne of Fargo North

Supt. Dale Hurt of New Salem nominated Supt. Ray Frank of Killdeer for the NW spot on the Board. Second by Paul Pearson of Alexander.

Motion by John Hvidsten of Leeds to accept report of nominating committee and that these individuals along with nomination from the floor be placed on ballot. Second by Allen Halley of Rock Lake and carried.

Don Dehne, chairman of the Title IX and Volleyball Committee, informed the membership of the current status of Title IX as it relates to the NDHSAA and its member schools. After a lengthy period of discussion on the pros and cons of adding volleyball as a sanctioned and sponsored activity of the NDHSAA an opinion vote was asked for by the committee chairman. The schools in attendance voted 93 - No (not to sponsor), 57 - Yes, and 97 either not voting or not in attendance.

The next order of business was the consideration of four amendments to the by-laws, notice of which had been served to the members in the September issue of the Activities Bulletin. Howard Grumbo of Lidgerwood representing District I proposed the following amendment to Article XII, Section II Part G of the by-laws:

Not more than nine regular interscholastic basketball contests may be played by any team sponsored by the school on an evening followed by a school day. In case of postponement because of an Act of God, the State Board may grant permission to reschedule the contest.

This amendment shall contain the emergency clause and become effective immediately upon passage. The motion was seconded by Foster Hagar of Finley-Sharon and by voice vote passed.

Morris Martin of Richardton proposed the following amendment to Article III, Section V of the Junior High and 7th and 8th Grade by-laws.

All students participating on a team registered in the junior high division must be enrolled in the same school and be under the supervision of the same administrative head, except that schools which have less than 50 students enrolled in grades 7 and 8 may combine with another school in their district, or their designated high school district.

This amendment shall contain the emergency clause and become effective immediately upon passage. The motion was seconded by Ken Lanier of North Sargent and was passed by a voice vote.

Don Strang, on behalf of the Board of Directors, proposed a revision of Section X b of Article XIII of the By-Laws to read:

A student who, because of unavoidable circumstances, such as broken home conditions, death of parents or guardians, abandonment or other exceptional or emergency reason, finds it necessary to change schools, may be declared eligible by the Board of Directors, provided the administration of each school involved files a statement with the NDHSAA that the change was necessary and there was no undue influence or recruitment. Rulings in such cases will be considered by the Board only when in regular session and after a complete investigation by the NDHSAA professional staff and/or the Board of Directors.

This amendment shall contain the emergency clause and become effective immediately upon passage. The motion was seconded by Walt Hoff of Belfield and was passed by a voice vote.

Strang next proposed an addition to Article III of the By-Laws. This addition would be Section XI under Article III and would read as follows:

Schools with 75 students or less in grades 9 through 12 may join together with another school to compete in football, wrestling, speech and music activities under the following conditions:

- 1. Schools may join a neighboring school with this program.
- Cooperative sponsorship agreements must be for a minimum of three years.
- The governing boards of participating member schools must jointly make the application to the NDHSAA Board of Directors.

- 4. The request must include a resolution stating the purpose for sponsoring a joint team or activity.
- Requests must be submitted to the NDHSAA Board of Directors by December 1st to be considered for the following year.
- 6. Decisions on all applications will be determined by the Board of Directors no later than February 1st.

Seconded by Silseth.

Roger Slotsve of Velva moved to amend this proposed change to read: Schools with grades 9-12 may join together with one or more schools in any competitive inter-school activity as long as the total combined student numbers do not exceed Class B classification limits and keep the conditions as originally listed.

Seconded by Ron Stammen of Divide County and this amendment to the amendment was defeated by a voice vote.

Next Jerry Muckenhirn of Enderlin moved to amend this proposed change to read:

Schools with grades 9-12 may join together with another school to compete in all activities and keep the conditions as originally listed.

Seconded by George Wieland of Buchanan and this amendment to the original amendment was defeated by a vote of 72 - No; 63 - Yes.

Next Muckenhirn moved that action on this proposed addition to the By-Laws be postponed until the January meeting and that it be reworded for clarity. Second by Elmer Schweitzer of Gackle and this motion to delay passed by a voice vote.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

A special meeting of the General Assembly of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck on January 26; 1981 at 3:15 P.M. for the purpose of consideration of amendments to the by-laws with 187 schools in attendance.

Richard Ott, on behalf of the canvassing committee, reported that a total of 223 votes had been cast in the annual election with the following results for representatives on the Board of Directors.

President Bergene reviewed the policy adopted by the NDHSAA Board of Directors dealing with the days reserved for state-wide church activities. He encouraged member schools to respect these days for church activities and try not to schedule school activities.

Don Strang, on behalf of the Board of Directors, proposed an addition to Article III of the By-Laws. This addition would be Section XI under Article III and would read as follows:

Cooperative sponsorship of any activity by two or more member schools will be considered under the following conditions:

- 1. Schools are to be located in the same geographical area.
- 2. School Enrollments:
 - A. All member schools of the NDHSAA will be eligible to participate in the cooperative sponsorship program.
 - B. When Class "B" schools are involved with the cooperative sponsorship of an activity and the combined enrollment of the schools involved exceeds 325 students in grades 9 through 12 these schools will compete as a Class "A" school in that activity.
- Cooperative sponsorship agreements will be enforced for a minimum of three years.
- 4. The school boards of the participating member schools must jointly make the application to the NDHSAA Board of Directors.
- A resolution from each school board stating the purpose for sponsoring a joint team or activity must be submitted to the NDHSAA office.
- 6. Requests must be submitted to the NDHSAA Board of Directors by December 1st to be considered for the following year.
- Decisions on all applications will be determined by the Board of Directors no later than February 1st.

NOTE: If this proposed amendment is passed the dates listed would not apply to applications made for the 1981-82 school year. The Board of Directors of the NDHSAA would have to set dates for implementing the amendment for next year only.

Second by Alfred Borah of Aneta.

Jerry Muckenhirn of Enderlin moved to eliminate number two under Part B of the proposed amendment. Second by Ron Stammen of Divide County and this motion was defeated by a voice vote.

Next a roll call vote was held on the original proposed addition and was passed by a vote of 134 yes and 53 no.

Herb Johnson of Bowman proposed the following amendment to Part II, Article XIII, Section XII and would read as follows:

Use or possession of tobacco, alcohol, other harmful substances, illegal use or possession of narcotics or habit forming drugs is prohibited. Any student who is a driver or passenger in a vehicle detained by a law enforcement officer on an open container violation shall be considered in violation of this eligibility rule if he or she is convicted of the open container charge. Any co-curricular participant who includes in any of these harmful practices will be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities from the date of infraction, for a period of two consecutive school weeks for the first infraction, four consecutive school weeks for the second infraction, eight consecutive school weeks for the third infraction, and sixteen consecutive school weeks for the fourth infraction.

Mr. Johnson moved for adoption of this proposed change but it was dropped when his motion did not receive a second.

Dick Karlgaard of Bismarck proposed the following amendments that would revise Section I Part F and Section 11h of Article XII and would read as follows:

Article XII Sports Seasons

Section I Football:

f. One scrimmage with another school shall be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game of the season provided no school travels more than 100 miles (200 miles round trip) to hold said scrimmage.

Section II Boys' Basketball

h. One scrimmage with another school shall be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game of the season provided no school travels more than 100 miles (200 miles round trip) to hold said scrimmage.

The motion was seconded by Ron Stammen of Divide County and was defeated by a voice vote.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The Board tabled the bids for regional and district individual medals and the state music medals until the August meeting.

Fischer next reported for the finance committee and made the following recommendations:

- 1. Increase Board and employees per diem payment to \$18.00 per day in state and \$25.00 per day out-of-state. Also to increase mileage payment to 25¢ per mile. Motion by Fischer to accept, second by Olson and carried.
- 2. Recommended that the executive-secretary study the possibility of increasing the mileage payment to schools from 75¢ to \$1.00 per one-way mile and also a 10% increase in reimbursements in other areas and report back to committee at August meeting.

- 3. Recommended that the Board approve a long term disability policy for the office staff from Western States Life Insurance Co., effective July 1st, 1981. Policy would include 90 day waiting period. To be eligible staff members must use their existing sick leave before drawing from the fund. A \$5,000.00 reserve fund would be established to provide payment to employees in an interim period between end of sick leave and beginning of the insurance coverage. Fischer moved to accept, second by Dehne and carried.
- 4. Fischer reported on a request from the staff to re-open salary negotiations. After discussion Brintnell moved to take it back to finance committee for further study. Second by Strang and carried.

The Board next heard a report from Dehne on behalf of the Volleyball Committee. The Board considered a request from Langdon to change the starting date for volleyball because of scheduling problems with Class B schools. Dehne moved that dates be left as established and Langdon re-schedule game after allowable date. Second by Tiaden and carried.

The Board next reviewed the recommendation of the Class A regional chairmen and the Class B district chairmen to be sure the Board had considered all the recommendations of both groups.

Next reviewed were the recommendations of the Wrestling Advisory Committee and upon motion by Fischer, second by Brintnell the following items were adopted:

- 1. In State Class B Tournament use crossbracketing in wrestle-
- 2. Allow substitution for wrestlers at the state tournament up until first day weigh-in.
- 3. Class B coaches recommend continuing eight Class B Regional Tournaments.
- 4. Add 70 pound weight class to Junior High weight classes, it would no longer be optional.

The Board next reviewed the recommendations of the Gymnastics Advisory Committee and upon motion by Dehne, second by Olson, the following items were adopted:

- 1. Use the top four scores toward team score instead of the three that are now used.
- 2. Class A, after a one year trial basis would like to drop compulsories.
- 3. Allow the gymnasts to use orchestrated music for Floor Exercise
- 4. Class B would like to drop compulsories on a one year trial basis.
- New Qualifying Scores

For 3 scores

Class A - 94 points (7.83 average)

Class B - 82 points (6.83 average)

55

For 4 scores

Class A - 120 points (7.5 average)

Class B - 105 points (6.56 average)

6. Propose to the NDHSAA that they revise their Substitution Rule as follows:

OFFICIAL YEARBOOK

If an illness or injury causes a team that has qualified for state by team score to compete at state with less than four scores per event, a substitution for that injured gymnast may be made using a competitor that is not already entered in that event. A certification of illness or injury must be signed by a physician. This certification must be produced no later than the coaches meeting the night before the state meet.

- 7. Individual trophies should be presented to top 6 places in state.
- 8. Combine Class A & B regional into a one day regional meet. (B first and A second). Continue a two day state meet.

Upon motion by Hoff and second by Tjaden the following recommendations of the Swimming Advisory Committee were approved:

- 1. Deadline for State Girls' Swimming registrations is November 1. These must be postmarked by the post office no later than (Sunday) November 1. No changes will be allowed after this date. Boys' deadline date will be (Sunday) February 7.
- 2. Recommend there be three sites for swimming and diving rules clinics. One will alternate between Grand Forks and Fargo, one will be held in Minot, and one will be held in Mandan. (One year trial).
- 3. The coaches of boys' and girls' swimming recommend that there is no altering of the seasons from what they are at the present in terms of switching the seasons, combining the seasons, or altering the length of the seasons.

Next reviewed were the recommendations of the Golf Advisory Committee with the following items approved upon motion by Brintnell and second by Huber:

- 1. Recommend that Board of Directors approve attendance at the U.N.D. and Minot golf clinics.
- 2. Continue to encourage girls playing golf at Class B Tournaments.
- 3. Class B Grass State Tournament 1 day 27 holes.
- 4. Class B Sand State Tournament 1 day 18 holes.
- 5. Increase individual awards at state meets to six.

Upon motion by Olson and second by Hoff the following recommendations of the Tennis Advisory Committee were adopted:

- 1. The twelve point tie-breaker will be used in place of the nine point system.
- 2. A coach, within the original seven or necessitated substitutions, may alter the team line-up from regional to state play. Line-up

sheets, provided by the tournament manager, must be presented to the court official by a set time prior to play.

- 3. Recommend the tournament sites be set in a city that could provide indoor facilities.
- 4. Indoor courts should be reserved at the state meet for the championship side of the tournament bracket if necessary because of inclement weather with the consolation bracket being played outdoors if at all possible to save on the time element.
- 5. Increase individual awards to six at state meet.

Next reviewed were the recommendations of the Hockey Advisory Committee and upon motion by Dehne, second by Brintnell the following items were approved:

- 1. Give out a sportsmanship award to the team showing the best sportsmanship. Spirit award, if suitable sponsor interested.
- 2. Introduce the whole team on the first day of tournament and also in the championship game.
- 3. Give out awards after the consolation and third place game.
- 4. 1981-82 N.D. State Tournament referees:

Next reviewed were the recommendations of the Track Advisory Committee and upon a motion by Hoff, second by Dehne, the following items were adopted:

- 1. Add the 3200 meter run for girls to replace the 2400 meter run. Minimum standard time for state qualification will be 12:00 (Class A) and 12:15 (Class B). (One section only at state and regional meet).
- 2. Add the 300 meter low hurdles for the girls to replace the 200 meter low hurdles. Minimum standard time for state qualification is 49.5 (Class A) and .51 (Class B).
- 3. Add the 3200 meter relay event to replace the 800 meter medley relay. Minimum standard time for state qualification is 10:10 (Class A) and 10:30 (Class B),
- 4. Revise minimum standards of the following:

Boys 400 meter dash - 52,2 (Class A only) Boys 800 meter run -2:01 (Class A only) Boys 1600 meter run -4:33 (Class A only) Boys high jump - 6'2"

400 meter relay - 46.1 (Class B only)

- Send a survey to all participating schools as to the feeling of combining the Class A and Class B schools into one state meet. Also survey the feeling of schools on Moorhead as the site of that combined meet.
- 6. In field events, advance eight finalists to be consistent with the running events.
- 7. In the state meet races of 200 meters or more, lanes will be allowed to move in if there are scratches and those moving in are not gaining an advantage over the faster runners in that particular heat. Example: If lane 3 and 5 scratch, runners in lane 4 closes in to lane 3 and the runner in lane 6 closes in to lane 4. There would be no switching, simply closing in.
- 8. Recommend the arc starting line be used with sections on the line marked off for assigned schools. Judges must be at every flag.
- 9. Revise state meet schedule as follows: (Tentative)

The Board then recessed until 8:00 A.M. — June 17, 1981 and reconvened at that time with all members present except Ott.

The Board next reviewed the recommendations of the Basketball Advisory Committee and upon a motion by Dehne, second by Brintnell, the following items were adopted:

- Discussed method used in assigning officials for regional and state tournament games and recommended splitting of pairs if necessary to avoid teams having the same officials for all tournament games. Tournament manager has the right to make these changes.
- Recommend allowing North Star Conference to hold play-off basketball game for girls' and boys' regional tournament on Saturday night rather than Monday night.
- 3. Increase quarter limitation in girls' and boys' basketball to equal five times the number of regular season games scheduled.

- 3. Revise adjudicator ballots.
- 4. Move State Contest to Bismarck Junior College.
- Recommend not having 7th and 8th graders as soloists, but if the NDHSAA Board feels the rules are not consistent with those in other activities, a change would be acceptable.
- 6. Study the possibility of having a conductor in ensembles of 6 to 12 beginning in 1982-83.
- 7. Study use of Texas Recommended Music Lists in 1982-83.
- Study possibility of Bismarck Chamber sponsoring a directors' luncheon at the State Contest.

The Board next reviewed the recommendations of the Speech Advisory Committee and upon motion by Dehne and second by Olson the following items were adopted: Recommend the following contest sites:

- Recommend discontinuing Class B Regional One-Act Play contests, but send the first place play from each district directly to the state contest.
- Recommend that the One-Act Play portion of the State Class A and B Speech Contests be on the day before the speech events, starting no earlier than 5:00 P.M.
- Recommend having Humorous Plays in 1981-82 as was previously planned.
- Study possibility of giving awards to all plays receiving at least two superior ratings beginning with the 1982-83 school year.
- Recommend that students may enter two speech events plus be a One-Act Play participant as long as they do not enter a speech event with a preparation period.
- Recommend that if possible, Class A regions and Class B districts have play competition on a separate day from the speech contest.
- 8. Recommend publishing in the Association <u>Bulletin</u> a list of judges submitted by speech districts or coaches to be used as a help for district and state managers.
- Recommend Advisory Committee members be tabulation staff at State Contests.
- 10. Recommend substitutions for State Contests may be made through the NDHSAA office up to the day before the contest as long as contestant received at least fourth place in the district/ regional contest.
- 11. Recommend Class B State date be on April 24 as originally planned and recommend Class A be moved to April 3 from April 17 to shorten the Class A season, beginning with 1982-83 school year.
- Recommend that Extemporaneous Interpretation may be either prose or poetry.
- 13. Recommend informative speech remain the same except that Class A schools may use visual aids.
- Recommend putting a sportsmanship statement in the Speech Handbook.
- 15. Recommend that the burden of proof be upon the coach concerning material fitting the criteria of prose, poetry, or drama (bring the source to contests) and that students have a statement

in their introduction that clarifies that their dramatic selection is an adaptation from a novel, etc.

- 16. Recommend that focal points may be used in Dramatic Duo. Change wording on page 15 and subsequent pages.
- 17. Recommend that rule 2 on page 7 be reworded as follows: "No student may enter twice in the same events. Example — a student may not be a part of two separate duos."
- 18. Recommend that no cutting from a play selected by a school for One-Act Play competition shall be used by that school in any speech event during any one particular school year.
- 19. Recommend that if there is a three-way tie for first, all three may be state qualifiers.
- 20. Recommend that rule 4-D on page 27 be changed from "in state competition" to "previous school year."
- Recommend that the debate rule on page 62 be worded, "Falsification of evidence, if deliberate, shall result in the automatic loss of that round."

The Board next heard from Supt. Dale Fuhrman of Milnor representing District No. 1 and 3 asking the Board to consider rotating Region I Boys' and Girls' Basketball tournaments between Wahpeton and Fargo.

Upon motion by Fischer and second by Olson, the following dates were set for the 1981-82 Board Meetings: August 5-6; Sept. 13-14; Oct. 21-22; Nov. 20; Jan. 23-24; March 12-13; March 19-20; April 28-29; and June 15-16.















SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Following is a summary of the significant accounting policies of the North Dakota High School Activities Association:

- Assets and fund balances, and revenues and expenses are recognized on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements.
- The association has adopted fund accounting principles. A fund is an independent accounting entity created to account for specific activities, budget objectives or to comply with certain limitations.
- Fixed assets are capitalized at cost in a separate fund group when payment is made. Straight-line depreciation is recorded annually over estimated useful lives of ten to twenty-eight years on the building and land improvements, eight to ten years on fixtures and equipment, four years on films and library materials, and, an annual write-down to estimated resale value on the autos.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

June 30, 1981

- INVESTMENTS: The association keeps its reserve funds invested for maximum yield and safety. On June 30, 1981, 56% of the investments were in two local savings & loan associations and the 44% balance in two local banks.
- 2. RESERVES AND UNAPPROPRIATED BALANCES: The board has appropriated or reserved portions of the General and the Accident Benefit Funds for encumbrances, contingencies and special purposes. Unclaimed checks issued in excess of one year are restored to the bank accounts and carried in a reserve for a period extending beyond the requirements of the statute of limitations. Unappropriated balances are intended to be maintained at only a nominal level.
- 3. RETIREMENT PLANS: The association has provided elective retirement plans for the administrative staff. These retirement plans provide for 64% of the salary to be contributed by employees which is matched by the association. The funds are in a trust with a local savings & loan association.

 After July 1, 1979, professional staff members (that are qualified teachers) have been included in the state teachers retirement plan.
- 4. INSURANCE COVERAGE: The association has provided for fire protection of \$196,000 on the building and \$78,400 on the contents. Various types of liability coverage are carried up to a \$500,000 maximum for certain defined risks. Auto collision, burglary, surety bonds and workmen's compensation insurance have been provided in desired amounts. In addition, a "special events/litigations" liability coverage is carried with a \$5,000,000 maximum.
