

FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 60th Annual Yearbook which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

- 1. 1983-84 marked our 76th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Our membership remained stable at 244 schools after many years of decline.
- 2. The "Nation at Risk" report brought a great deal of discussion concerning activities and their effect on scholastic achievement and loss of classroom time. The NDHSAA Board of Directors assumed the leadership by evaluating programs, then moving the State Baseball, Tennis and Golf Tournaments after Memorial Day. All Regional Track Meets have been moved to Saturday along with the first round of the Class B Boys' and Girls' Regional Basketball Tournaments. At the General Assembly meetings in October and again in January, the Board of Directors urged all local administrators to evaluate their programs in an effort to eliminate unnecessary loss of classroom time. Efforts will continue during 1984-85 to make additional changes.
- 3. The Cooperative Sponsorship Program continued to grow again this past year because of declining enrollments in some schools and the desire of students to be able to participate in activities not offered by their schools.
- 4. After two years of deficits, 1983-84 provided a profit. Ideal weather conditions during play-offs and tournaments plus many outstanding teams provided excellent gates. (A complete audit report can be found in the back of this publication.)
- 5. A new ABF claims system designed to eliminate bookkeeping and paper work for school administrators proved to be very successful. The ABF also operated in the black after two years of red ink. (A report is included in the auditor's report.)

A sincere thanks to all the administrators, coaches and activities directors for your fine support and cooperation in 1983-84. Our staff will continue to make every effort to provide your school the best possible service in 1984-85.

Board of Directors Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association Valley City, North Dakota — August 11, 1983

The Board of Directors of the NDHSAA met in the Association office building at 1:00 P.M. on August 11th with all members present except Ott.

President Olson welcomed new member Cal Sailer to the Board.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the investments and interest accounts of the NDHSAA for the past year with the Board.

The Board reviewed the annual audit of the Association for the 1982-83 fiscal year as prepared and presented by James Lochow, Certified Public Accountant of Valley City. Upon motion by McLeod and second by Moose the report was approved as presented.

The Finance Committee also recommended a committee be appointed to study the feasibility of purchasing a computer for the NDHSAA office. President Olson appointed Brintnell and Dehne to this committee.

Tjaden moved that the committee's recommendation be accepted, second by Huber and carried.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the 1982-83 fiscal year with the Board and proposed a 1983-84 budget of \$596,100.00. Kunkel moved to adopt the 1983-84 budget as proposed, second by McLeod and carried.

Tjaden reported on behalf of the T.V. Committee and made the following recommendations:

- Have Association lawyer evaluate present T.V. contract and Board review it at January meeting.
- 2. Following changes in T.V. Fees:

Girls' Regional Basketball - \$700.00 (3 games)

Boys' Regional Basketball - \$900.00 (3 games)

\$200 for each additional game in both girls' and boys' basketball.

Football - \$1,500 live; \$1,000 delayed

Brintnell moved that the above listed fees be minimum amounts that the Board would accept for these events. T.V. stations interested in these events must submit bids by September 18 for 1983-84 and August 1st in the future. Second by McLeod and carried.

Upon motion by Tjaden and second by Brintnell the report was approved as presented.

McLeod reported on behalf of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee and made the following recommendations:

- 1. Jackets are not symbolic and would not be allowed to be presented as awards even if under \$75.00.
- 2. That Part Two, Article XIII, Section XII of the Constitution and By-Laws be changed to read:

"The use or possession of tobacco, alcohol or any controlled substance as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extra-curricular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities for a minimum period of six consecutive school weeks for the first offense and a period of eighteen consecutive school weeks for any subsequent offense."

(And that the Board shall sponsor this change to the General Assembly).

Motion by McLeod to approve, second by Dehne and carried.

The Board heard a report from the Promotions Committee and they made the following recommendations:

- That all schools be surveyed relative to holding a Parade of Champions each year.
- 2. The NDHSAA Sportsmanship program still functions and is being expanded each year.
- Activities Week will be promoted again this year by the National Federation and NDHSAA.

McLeod moved for approval of this report, second by Huber and carried.

The Board considered non-certified coaching requests. The following applications for approval of non-certified head coaches were approved under the customary restrictions:

Tjaden moved for approval of these applications upon the NDHSAA office receiving the proper papers, second by Sailer and carried.

The Board heard the Attorney's opinion on the hardship rule as it applies to the nine semester rule.

The Board considered the eligibility case of Gerald Idland of Devils Lake that had been tabled from the June meeting. Motion by Moose to deny the request for eligibility under the hardship rule, second by McLeod and carried.

The Board considered the eligibility case of Steve Reinhart of Lakota that had been tabled from the June Meeting. Motion by Dehne to deny the request for eligibility under the hardship rule, second by Moose and carried.

McLeod reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Robert Ford to Sherwood under the hardship rule and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be approved. The motion was seconded by Kunkel and carried.

Brintnell reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Jeff Tidd to Cavalier under the hardship rule and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be approved. The motion was seconded by Sailer and passed.

A report by Ott on the investigation he conducted on the transfer of Shawn Burgad to Strasburg from Emmons Central was considered. Motion by McLeod to approve under the hardship rule, second by Huber and carried.

The Board reviewed car bids and after discussing sale of present cars, Huber moved to have Executive Secretary and Assistant re-check bids to be sure what they included and then purchase cars. Second by Moose and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board that all 1983-84 tournaments had been accepted except Region VIII Girls' Basketball and State Gymnastics but felt there would be no problem.

The Executive Secretary read a letter from Dean Lenaburg, the NDHSAA attorney, giving his opinion on what is possession. The Board determined that the word possession must stay in Part Two, Article XIII, Section XII of the Constitution. The Board also instructed the Executive Secretary to develop a pamphlet that would help interpret this rule.

The Board reconsidered the problem of the dates for Class B Boys' Regional Basketball Tournaments. The Board determined no tournaments would be held on Ash Wednesday unless a problem with scheduling in facility was unavoidable. Each region will determine whether to play Saturday, Monday and Tuesday or Monday, Tuesday and Thursday.

The Executive Secretary read a communique from Supt. Don Herbel of Hebron thanking the Board for approving the co-op agreement in football.

The Board heard a letter from Dickinson High School dealing with the eligibility of Bill McGill who attended school in Sweden the 1982-83 school year on a Cultural Exchange for no academic credits. Huber moved that Bill McGill be eligible in Dickinson for his senior year and that the 1982-83 year not count as semesters in attendance. Second by Sailer and carried.

Huber reported on the meeting of the Legislative Council Education Committee and informed the Board of the areas of concern of their Committee. The next meeting of this Committee will be October 3rd in Bismarck and Board Members were instructed to be prepared to discuss this meeting at the September Board Meeting.

The Board heard a request from the N.D. Jaycees asking for permission to have the finals of their Punt, Pass & Kick Contest at halftime of the Class B Championship Football Game. Moose moved to deny this request, second by Kunkel and passed.

N. DAK. HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

The Board discussed the problem of rule violations with summer programs and out-of-season activities. Motion by Tjaden to appoint Ad-Hoc Committee to study this problem. Second by Sailer and carried. President Olson named Tjaden, Kunkel and Brintnell to this committee.

Gary Pearson of Grafton appeared before the Board to discuss his plans for building a N.D. High School Activities Hall of Fame. After a question and answer period Mr. Pearson was informed that the NDHSAA would research this proposed project and place it on the September agenda for further discussion.

There being no further business, the Board Meeting adjourned.

The Assistant Executive Secretary reviewed with the Board an official's contract violation by Jon Plowman of Center. Motion by Huber to have Mr. Plowman appear before the Board at the October meeting. Second by McLeod and carried.

The Board discussed possible fund raising projects that the NDHSAA could get involved in for profit. This item will be placed on the agenda of the Class B District Chairmen's meeting for discussion.

The Board reviewed the application for cooperative sponsorship of activities for:

Hurdsfield to Bowdon for 7th & 8th grade Boys' Basketball McLeod moved for approval of this request, second by Dehne and carried.

Mr. Rinehart of Lakota appeared before the Board to appeal previous action declaring Stuart ineligible because of the eight semester rule. After a period of discussion McLeod moved to reafirm previous action because of the NDHSAA Constitution, second by Tjaden and carried.

The Board discussed the dates for the Class B State Track Meet and the concern of schools because it is on such an early date in May. The Board reviewed the various reports and upon a motion by Brintnell and second by Huber all reports were approved.

The Executive Secretary and the Assistant Executive Secretary reviewed the final report for all Girls' Basketball Tournaments and all Football play-off games with the Board.

Each member of the Board was furnished with a packet containing a complete financial report of the general fund and the ABF fund from July 1, 1983 to February 29, 1984. The Board reviewed the various reports and upon motion by Brintnell and second by Dehne all reports were approved.

The Executive Secretary reported that all members of the professional and secretarial staff had accepted contract offers for 1984-85 made by the Board.

Brintnell reported on behalf of the Trophy Committee and explained to the Board the procedure that would be followed in letting bids for trophies and how the selection process would work at the June meeting. The Board heard a communique from Oakes High School reporting themselves for violating the transfer rule. Huber moved that the school be sent a letter of reprimand for the rule violation but be complimented for turning themselves in. Second by Ott and carried.

Next a request from Mayville-Portland to allow their band to attend the Indianapolis 500 Parade was heard. Moose moved to approve the request, second by Kunkel and carried.

The Board reviewed the following applications submitted by schools for cooperative sponsorship of activities:

St. Thomas to Valley Hoople — 9-Man Football Sawyer to Velva — 11-Man Football Page to Clifford-Galesburg — Baseball

Kunkel moved for approval of these applications, second by McLeod and carried.

The Board heard a report on the National Federation "Hall of Fame" and approved the nominations of Sid Cichy and Roger Maris to the "Hall of Fame" from North Dakota.

The Board heard communiques from the Stanley King Family, Elmer Huber, L. E. Faris and Rev. Jack Richards.

The Board reviewed a letter from Roger Slotsve of Velva requesting an increase in payments for state wrestling tournaments. This letter was referred to the Finance Committee for further consideration.

The Board discussed the voting and alternate delegates to the National Federation summer meeting. Ott moved that the President and Vice President be appointed to these positions. Second by Dehne and carried.

The Board reviewed the results of the survey conducted by the Assistant Executive Secretary dealing with a proposed change in the format for nine-man football. After reviewing it, it was turned over to the Football Committee for further study and recommendations.

The Board reviewed a letter from Kirk Hansen of Ellendale asking the Board to consider having rooms available for teams who qualify for the State Class B Wrestling Tournament. The Assistant Executive Secretary was instructed to review this possibility with tournament manager Ron Luttschwager.

Huber moved that the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association recommend to all school districts that extracurricular activities be restricted to weekends and one school night and students not be dismissed from academic classes to participate in or attend extra-curricular activities. Second by Ott and was defeated by voice vote.

The Board considered the dates for Boys' Tennis for the fail of 1984 because of a conflict with teachers convention. Dehne moved that the date for regionals be September 28-29 and the State October 5-6. Second by Moose and carried.

The Board heard a letter from New Salem protesting the final results of the State Class B Wrestling Tournament. A scoring error was made in the final team standing but because it was detected after the 48 hour limit the Assistant Executive Secretary ruled that it was not a correctable error and the final results could not be changed.

Supt. Dale Hurt and Coach Dale Beckman of New Salem appeared before the Board to present their side of the appeal and Supt. Ron Broeker and Coach Frank Fish of Watford City appeared before the Board to do the same. After both sides had an opportunity to present their views to the Board they were excused and told the Board would inform them of their decision.

After a lengthy period of discussion Ott moved that New Salem and Watford City be declared co-runners-up with both schools receiving second place trophies, and that the record book show no score for either team and a footnote show that this decision was made by the NDHSAA Board of Directors because of a scoring error made in final tournament results. Second by Huber and was defeated by voice vote.

Next McLeod moved that the NDHSAA Board of Directors interpret Rule 6-6-3 of the National Federation's Wrestling Rule Book dealing with the 48 hour period for correctable errors does not include Sundays or legal holidays as defined by North Dakota Century Code. Second by Kunkel and was defeated.

Moose moved to approve the appeal submitted by New Salem and to correct the error made in the final team results of the tournament. Second by Brintnell. After a lengthy period of discussion Moose and Brintnell agreed to withdraw their motion from the floor.

Moose moved to recall McLeod's motion to the floor for further consideration. Second by Brintnell and carried.

Again after a discussion of McLeod's motion, Huber moved to table this until the Assistant Executive Secretary could get an interpretation from the National Federation dealing with what is included in the 48 hour period. Second by Dehne and carried.

The meeting recessed until 1:30 P.M. on March 16th at Bismarck.

Bismarck, North Dakota — March 16, 1984

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association reconvened at 1:30 P.M. on March 16th at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck with all members present except Olson.

The first item of business was to continue the appeal submitted by New Salem dealing with a scoring error in the 1984 State Class B Wrestling Tournament.

The Board first heard a report from the Assistant Executive Secretary who informed the Board that the National Federation interpreted 48 hours to be consecutive from the time the tournament ends and that Sundays would be included.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board that the NDHSAA lawyer informed him that by North Dakota law Sunday would not have to be included in the 48 hour time limit.

OFFICIAL YEARBOOK

The Board after hearing both opinions upon a motion by Moose and a second by Kunkel passed the McLeod motion that had been tabled.

McLeod then moved that the scoring error in the 1984 State Class B Wrestling Tournament be corrected and that New Salem High School be awarded second place and Watford City be awarded third place. Second by Moose and carried.

The Board heard a report by Tjaden on behalf of the T.V. Committee and made the following recommendations: That Boys' and Girls' State Basketball Tournaments be one bid and a separate bid for the State Hockey Tournament. Tjaden also reported on the concerns of the committee dealing with the bidding process and what items should be covered.

The Board also reviewed a report submitted by Harold Pedersen dealing with things he felt should be included in the T.V. bidding and contracts. Brintnell moved to accept the T.V. Committee report, second by Kunkel and carried.

The Board reviewed the final Wrestling financial report as presented by the Assistant Executive Secretary. The Executive Secretary presented preliminary financial reports for basketball and hockey. A final complete report will be available at the April meeting of the Board.

The Board reviewed recommendations of the Class B District Chairmen and their recommendations will be acted on at the April Meeting of the Board.

A group of representatives from WDAY-TV and the Meyer Broadcasting Co. appeared before the Board to encourage them to group bid for all activities and to review any other concerns the Board has with current television coverage.

Ron Hoff of White Shield High School appeared before the Board to ask questions dealing with a proposed All Indian Basketball Tournament. The Executive Secretary was instructed to inform Austin Gillette of Garrison the rules and regulations that would have to be followed in sponsoring such a fournament.

The Board reorganized for the 1984-85 year. An election was held and Jerry Tjaden was elected president for 1984-85 and Dwight Moose was elected vice president for the same year.

The Board discussed the legal responsibilities of transportation of students in co-op programs. Ott moved to rewrite the applications so schools are aware of the legal obligations dealing with transportation of students in co-ops and also to inform schools presently in co-ops of these legal obligations. Second by Moose and passed.

The Board reviewed the participation survey and upon a motion by Brintnell determined that cheerleading, pom-pons and drill teams should be included as a separate activity in the survey. Second by Ott and carried.

The Board heard a report on the Parade of Champions to be held on Saturday night at half-time of the championship game.

The Board heard a report on the incident that occurred in Region VII Boys' Basketball Tournament where an official was assaulted by a Beulah fan.

Kunkel moved to request the appropriate school officials to appear before the April Board meeting to review the incident. Second by McLeod and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board some concerns of schools dealing with practice times for regional basketball tournaments. The possibility of eliminating practices at regionals was discussed and the Board went on record as being against the elimination of practice at regional tournaments.

The Board reviewed the following applications submitted by schools for cooperative sponsorship of activities:

Wildrose to Alamo - Golf

Marmarth to Rhame - Jr. High Track

Brintnell moved for approval of these applications, second by Moose and carried.

The Board reviewed comments made by the Hope High School Coach after the championship game of Region II Basketball Tournament. The Board was informed that a letter of reprimand had been sent to the coach and school. Brintnell informed the Board he had talked to the coach and that the coach asked him to apologize to the Board on his behalf. The Board felt the incident had been handled properly and no further action was necessary.

The Executive Secretary reported on a gifted student at Mandan High School and questioned where he's eligible to compete. Ott moved that if the student has an IEP as a special ed student, he be eligible to compete at Jr. High level and if not one be written so he's eligible to compete as a Jr. High student. Second by Moose and carried.

There being no further business the Board Meeting adjourned.

The Board reconvened at 1:15 P.M. on March 17th at the Bismarck Elks to review the report of the T.V. Committee.

Tjaden reported on behalf of the T.V. Committee and recommended some changes in the general T.V. contract. Ott moved to approve the changes in the general T.V. contract as submitted, second by Dehne and carried.

Tjaden reported that the T.V. Committee was now recommending that one group bid be the only way bids would be accepted for NDHSAA activities: After discussion Moose moved to rescind motion that split T.V. bids into two groups, second by Ott and carried.

Moose then moved that recommendations of T.V. Committee be accepted and only a group bid for all activities be accepted by NDHSAA. Second by Ott and carried.

There being no further business the Board Meeting adjourned.

North Dakota High School Activities Association

Valley City, North Dakota — April 25 - 26, 1984

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City at 10:00 A.M. with all members present.

The financial reports of the General Fund from July 1, 1983 to April 13, 1984 was reviewed and approved. The Board also reviewed and approved all NDHSAA investments.

Rick Fitzner reported on the ABF fund from July 1, 1983 to April 13, 1984 and also reviewed the new pay back policy used by the ABF this year for the first time.

The Assistant Executive Secretary reviewed the minutes of the North Dakota Officials Association Board of Directors Meeting and the Annual Meeting of the NDOA with the Board. No Board action was necessary on any of the NDOA items. The Board also discussed the problem with Bench Decorum and encouraged school administrators to get involved in trying to improve the conduct of coaches.

The Board reviewed the final financial reports for the Boys' Basketball Tournaments.

The Board reviewed the items presented by the Class A Regional Chairmen. The Board will take final action on these recommendations in June.

The next order of business was the opening of T.V. bids for the next two years (1984-85, 1985-86). The Executive Secretary opened the sealed bids in the following order:

The KX Network (KXJB-TV Fargo, KXMB-TV Bismarck, KXMC-TV Minot, KXMD-TV Williston, KNDX-TV Dickinson) submitted the following bid for the 1984-85, 85-86 Boys' Class A & B Basketball Tournaments, Girls' Class A & B Basketball Tournaments and the State Hockey Tournament: \$160,000 for the two years.

Meyer Broadcasting Co. & WDAY Inc. submitted the following bid for 1984-85 and 1985-86 and covering the same tournaments: \$121,000 for the two years.

The bid specifications included the following stipulations:

- 1. Class A & B Boys' Basketball 8 games on statewide network.
- 2. Class A & B Girls' Basketball Championship game in each tournament plus one other game statewide network
- 3. Hockey a minimum of 4 games statewide network

After the above bids were read by the Executive Secretary each bidder was given a chance to speak on behalf of his bid. The T.V. Committee was then excused to review bids and be sure bidders had followed the requirements set forth in the bid sheet. The Committee reported that all bids were in the proper form and Tjaden moved that the KX Network bid of \$160,000 for 1984-85, 1985-86.school year be accepted. Second by Brintnell and carried.

The Board reviewed applications submitted by schools for cooperative

sponsorship of activities. The following cooperative sponsorship applications were reviewed:

Almont to New Salem — Football Neche to Pembina — Boys' & Girls' Basketball

Esmond to Maddock - Football

Crary to Devils Lake - Football Cottage to Bowman - Jr. High Sports

Chaffee to Maple Valley - Football

Tolley to Kenmare - Gymnastics & Wrestling

McLeod moved for approval of all these applications, second by Ott and carried.

A communique from Supt. Ron Broeker of Watford City was reviewed by the Board and no action was taken.

The Board received a communique from Pettibone High School that informed the NDHSAA that their school would not field a varsity team in Boys' or Girls' Basketball for the 1984-85 school year.

The Board heard a request from Deering High School to dissolve their cooperative agreement with Glenburn for Girls' Basketball. After a careful review by the Board, Moose moved to deny the request, second by Sailer and carried.

The starting time for evening games at Regional and State Basketball Tournaments was discussed. The Board expressed concern over teams getting home late from regional tournaments. The Board took no action and referred this item to the Athletic Review Committee for consideration.

Supt. Dale Gilje and Principal Greg Haugland of Beulah appeared before the Board to review the incident that occurred in the Region VII Boys' Basketball Tournament at Williston. Supt. Gilje spoke on behalf of Gary Murray and attempted to explain what happened at the Region VII Tournament. The Board expressed their concern over the incident. After excusing Mr. Gilje and Mr. Haugland the Board reviewed the incident and tried to determine what action to take. The Board then tabled this item until tomorrow.

Communique from the North Star Conference golf coaches requesting the Board to adopt three regions for Boys' golf was reviewed. This was referred to the Athletic Review Committee for consideration.

The Board discussed the problem with post season basketball tournaments. It was pointed out to the Board that there is a very rapid growth in these types of tournaments. This problem was referred to the Constitution and By-Law Committee for consideration of what action could be taken.

Next the Board heard a communique from the Park River Ministerial Association.

A group from the Grand Forks Public Schools appeared before the Board to request a cooperative program in Girls' Swimming between Grand Forks Red River and Grand Forks Central. After carefully reviewing the application Tjaden moved to approve the request for a cooperative program, second by Ott and the motion failed.

Kunkel reported on the hardship eligibility investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Brett Lies from Kansas City to New Rockford and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be approved, second by Ott and carried.

The Board discussed the possibility of developing a policy for handling the housing of wrestlers at the State Class B Wrestling Tournament in Jamestown. The Assistant Executive Secretary was instructed to meet with Ron Luttschwager, the Jamestown Athletic Director, and see if this could be worked out.

The Board also reviewed the pocket calendar put out by Northern School Supply. Motion by Ott to allow Northern School Supply to publish this again for 1984-85, second by Tjaden and carried.

A new policy for the sale of Class B Boys' Basketball Tournament Tickets was reviewed. Dehne moved for adoption of the following policy:

Orders for tickets from the general public for the State Class B Boys' Basketball Tournament will be accepted by the NDHSAA office if postmarked on or after January 15, 1985. Any requests that are spostmarked before January 15, 1985 will be returned. All envelopes bearing the January 15, 1985 postmark will be chosen in a common draw. All requests received after January 15, 1985 will be serviced in the order they are received.

Second by Brintnell and carried.

The Board reviewed the plans for the trophy bidding at the June Meeting.

The Board heard a letter from Barbara Fox asking the Board to reconsider prior action and present the 1942 State Class B Boys' Basketball Championship to Elbowoods. The Board took no action on the request.

The Board then recessed reconvening at 9:00 A.M. on April 26 with all members present.

The first item considered was the Beulah incident that was tabled at yesterday's meeting. The Board heard a draft of a letter of reprimand that could be sent to the Beulah Public Schools. McLeod moved that the letter be sent, second by Moose and carried.

The Board reviewed plans for the June Meeting and set the retirement banquet for the night of June 13th and the Annual Board Meeting for June 14 and 15. The Executive Secretary was instructed to work out the details and send to Board Members.

A newspaper article dealing with a Minot High School music trip to Colorado that was not authorized by the NDHSAA Board of Directors was presented. The Board instructed the staff to inform schools of rule that requires Board authorization for such trips and to change the NDHSAA Handbook to indicate this.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the Catastrophic Insurance Program with the Board and informed them that two plans would be available for next year. One plan would require all schools to join and would be handled by the NDHSAA office and the second would leave membership to local school boards and they would pay directly to the company. The Board decided to go with the second option and leave the option of membership to local schools.

Next the Board reviewed the transfer case of J. T. LeBeau of Ft. Yates. After a lengthy discussion Ott moved that when a student transfers from one school to another that is involved in co-op programs said student would be immediately eligible in that sport at the sponsoring school. Second by Moose and carried.

Bob Hetler appeared before the Board to express his concern over conflicts of schedules in the spring activities. Motion by Moose that schools be encouraged to give NDHSAA sponsored activities priority over sanctioned events in scheduling, second by Dehne and carried.

The Board next discussed the possible switch to the intermediate size ball for Girls' Basketball. The Assistant Executive Secretary informed the Board that this was discussed by the National Federation Basketball Rules Committee but no action was taken.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

Annual Meeting

North Dakota High School Activities Association October 20, 1983 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The annual meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck on October 20, 1983 at 3:00 P.M.

President Leon Olson called the meeting to order and declared a quorum of fifty members in attendance.

President Olson asked the Executive Secretary to give a report on activities and the Education B Committee of the Legislature.

The report of the nominating committee was presented by Supt. Frank Fischer of Jamestown submitting the following names for vacancies on the Board of Directors for three year terms:

> Class B N.W. Region - Terry McLeod, Glenburn Class B N.E. Region - Lowell Peterson, McVille Class A East Region - Dr. Mark Sanford, Grand Forks

Phil MacIver, Principal of Valley of Hoople-Crystal nominated Supt. Mel Olson of Cavalier for Class B Northeast Region; Supt. Keith Lutz of Elgin nominated Supt. Ray Frank of Killdeer for Class B Northwest Region.

Motion by Supt. Owen Wallace of Fessenden to accept the report of the nominating committee and that those individuals along with nominations from the floor be placed on the ballot, second by Supt. Oscar Peterson of Mott and carried.

Terry McLeod, on behalf of the Board of Directors, moved to amend Part Two, Article IX to read:

> Each coach or activity advisor shall be a person trained to be a certified teacher or shall possess a valid teaching certificate. Local School Boards are empowered to temporarily waive the certification requirements if a certifiable coach or advisor can not be secured.

Second by Supt. Robert Lentz of Valley City and passed by voice vote.

Terry McLeod, on behalf of the Board of Directors, moved to amend Part Two, Article XIII, Section XII to read:

> The use or possession of tobacco, alcohol or any controlled substance as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extra-curricular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities for a minimum period of six consecutive school weeks for the first offense and a period of eighteen consecutive school weeks for any subsequent offense.

Second by Athletic Director Terry Hjelmstad of Minot and passed by voice vote.

Supt. Ronald Broeker of Watford City moved to amend Part Two, Article XIII, Section VII to read:

> A student shall not be eligible to compete in interscholastic activities on or after the day on which the twentieth anniversary of his/her birth occurs; except that in case of a

handicapped child, the handicapped child will be allowed to compete until he/she has completed the twelfth grade provided that he/she is receiving at least one of the following services while in school: 1. special education 2. speech pathology and audiology or 3. physical or occupational therapy.

Second by Supt. Lowell Peterson of McVille and defeated by voice vote.

The Executive Secretary urged schools to become involved in the NDHSAA sportsmanship program, and to provide information to the NDHSAA office on grade point averages, dropout rates and school time lost by activities students. He also encouraged schools to return surveys on state track meet dates and the parade of champions.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The Board discussed the fees and mileage being charged to officiate. Houser moved to rescind the action of last year setting the fee for district tournaments at \$40.00 per game and to leave this to the individual districts. Seconded by Jacobson and carried.

The Board went on record for being in favor of continuing the 25¢ per mile figure for travel by officials.

The Board next discussed the method used in selecting officials for football play-offs. Houser moved to continue the same method, seconded by Matejcek and carried.

Jacobson informed the Board of a desire of Class A coaches to select officials for state and regional tournaments by pairs. The Board will study this recommendation.

The Board next discussed the new time out rule and what the NDOA would recommend. The secretary was instructed to place this item on the agenda for the March meeting.

The Board also discussed the bench decorum rule and went on record to work toward a more strict enforcement of the rule.

The Board next reviewed the 14 nominees for the "Hall of Fame" and checked to be sure all were eligible to be considered for membership. After

careful review, the Board selected six candidates for consideration. Jacobson moved that Jerome "Wheaties" Peterson of Minot, Joe Shoman of West Fargo, Jerry Balzer of Bismarck, and Ray Albrecht of Bismarck be placed in the NDOA "Hall of Fame". Seconded by Houser and carried. The Board determined that Peterson would be inducted at the 1984 State Class A Tournament, Balzer and Albrecht at the 1984 State Class B Tournament and Shoman at the 1984 EDC Regional Basketball Tournament.

The NDOA Board would like the NDHSAA Board to consider using a ${\sf TV}$ spot on officiating in one of the tournaments.

The Board set their next meeting for Saturday, March 17 at 9:30 A.M. at the Bismarck Civic Center and the Annual Meeting of the NDOA will be held at 10:30 A.M. on March 17, at the Bismarck Civic Center.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota Officials' Association Annual Meeting March 17, 1984 — Bismarck, North Dakota

Del Gab called the Annual Meeting of the NDOA to order with about 50 members present, at 10:30 A.M. on March 17th at the Bismarck Civic Center.

Bob King read the minutes of the previous Board meeting held in November at the Sheraton Riverside Inn in Minot and they were approved as read. King also reviewed the action of the Executive Board Meeting held earlier in the morning.

The membership was informed of the Board of Directors' action relative to joining the NFIOA. It was decided that NDOA members be encouraged to join the NFIOA but it would not be mandatory or handled through the NDHSAA office. Motion by Zuger to approve board action, second by Jessen and carried.

The secretary next reviewed the process now used to select tournament officials. The group discussed different ways to get coaches to send in ballots and the consensus of opinion was that officials encourage coaches to send in ballots.

Jessen moved to have Class B coaches vote for only four officials instead of eight as now is done. Second by Schneider and was defeated by voice vote.

Next Schneider moved that a weighted factor be used in the vote for Class B State tournament officials and still vote for eight. Second by Jessen and was defeated by voice vote.

The group next discussed the action of the NDOA Board of Directors requiring officials to sit out one year after working three consecutive state tournaments.

Del Gab of Dickinson was duly nominated and elected for a two year term to the Board of Directors from the Southwest Region. Doug Jacobson of Fargo was duly nominated and elected to a two year term on the Board of Directors from the Southeast Region and Larry Houser of Park River was duly nominated and elected to a two year term as the East Member-at-Large on the Board of Directors.

The group was informed of possible rule changes for 1984-85 and what recommendations the NDHSAA would make to the National Basketball Rules Committee.

By straw vote the officials in attendance at the Annual Meeting voted in favor of continuing the "Three Point Basket."

Following the meeting, the Board met and reorganized itself for the coming year. Del Gab and Doug Jacobson were named President and Vice-President respectively for the coming year.

The next Board of Directors Meeting will be held at 11:00 A.M. on November 10th at the Jamestown Civic Center.

The Assistant Executive Secretary reported on the 1983-84 T-Shirt experiment run by the Association. He gave a financial report of the past year and made a recommendation for 1984-85. Ott moved to approve, second by Kunkel and carried.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Class A Regional Chairmen and upon a motion by McLeod and second by Ott approved the following change:

 Tournament Basketball Player Roster: Only twelve players be allowed to dress for District, Regional and State Basketball Tournaments but schools can have a 15 player roster and select what 12 to dress each game.

All other items presented will be covered in later advisory committee reports.

The Board reviewed the recommendations from the Class B Chairmen and took action on the following items:

- 1. Terminating a game after half when a 40 point spread is reached in 9-man Football.
- NDHSAA adopt the intermediate size basketball for all girls competition in 1985-86.
- 3. Girls' Basketball players now be allowed up to 4 quarters of competition in an invitational tournament and one tournament of a lower level. Constitution and By-Laws Committee submit thange to allow same rule for boys' basketball.
 - Continue the 3 point basket experiment for all girls' and boys' basketball for the 1984-85 school year.

Motion by Dehne to approve these items, second by Sailer and carried.

The Board reviewed Basketball Advisory Committee recommendations and upon motion by McLeod and second by Tjaden the following items were adopted:

- 1. Drop the use of the new officials evaluation form.
- Change the game limitation from Junior High Girls' Basketball to 10 games.
- Start all Class A & B night games in regional basketball tournaments at 6:30.

The Golf Advisory Committee recommendations were reviewed and upon motion by Tjaden and second by Dehne the following items were approved:

- 1. Use "Summer Rules" for Girls' Golf.
- Approve three regional set-up for Class A Boys' Golf. NDHSAA office staff set up qualifying procedure.
- Ćlass B Sand Greens qualify low 5 teams or any teams that are 50 over par.
- Class B Boys' Grass Greens Tournament to two day 36-hole tournament.

The recommendations of the Gymnastics Advisory Committee were

reviewed and upon motion by Ott and second by Tjaden the following items were approved:

- Recommend staying with North Dakota modification that gymnasts be allowed to repeat Group I vaults without penalty.
- 2. After a one-year trial basis, eliminate finals at Regionals.
- No coach shall be responsible for the organization and running of the Regional and State Meets.
- 4. Teams that qualify for the State Meet will be allowed to enter the top 5 scorers from each event at the State Meet.
- Recommend eliminating the regulation on length of practice sessions.
- Standardize the size of the State trophies. All sports will receive the same size trophies for the same State team placement.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Hockey Advisory Committee and upon motion by Dehne and second by McLeod the following recommendations were approved:

- Eliminate the automatic checking of the curvature of the stick if a goal is scored in overtime.
- 2. Recommend to all schools that entertainment between periods be limited to a total of 8 minutes per night.
- Hold a coaches clinic in conjunction with a rules clinic at Grand Forks on the day of a Sioux hockey game and invite N.D.H.S.A.A. to take part.

The recommendations of the Tennis Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Dehne and second by Brintnell the following items were approved:

- 1. No participating coach shall be responsible for the management or running of a Regional or State Tennis Tournament.
- 2. Hold all team play on Friday and all individual play on Saturday.
- 3. On Friday and Saturday first round start at 8:00 A.M.
- Recommend first round on Friday and Saturday individual day played inside — after that consolation round go outside, weather permitting. Winners stay inside.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Track Advisory Committee and upon motion by Tjaden and second by Huber the following items were approved:

CLASS B

- Drop the 1600 Medley Relay and replace with the 800 Meter Relay.
- Use the Class A Regional order of events schedule for the Class B Regionals.
- 3. Regional coaches to verify times at Regional Meets.
- All events in Regional meets will be finals. (No prelims in any event).
- 5. State Meet program is prepared by listing the qualified athletes from the best times to poorest times and the athletes be marshalled at the line into heats as the athletes check in.

Team trophies be awarded to the top three places in Regional meets.

CLASS A & B

- Use the "five alive" in high jump and pole vault at Regional and State meets.
- 2. Revise the minimum standards as follows:

300 Meter Hurdles – 49.0 (B) Shot Put – 34' (B) 800 Meter Relay – 1:52.5 (B)



- Assign lanes in the 800 Meter Run, 1600 Meter Run and 3200 Meter Run by times in the following order 3, 4, 5, 2, 6, 1, 7, 8.
- 4. Starting height for Class B high jump in girls regions be 4'7".
- Emphasize that Regional Meet Managers can modify starting height in pole vault and high jump after looking over field.
- 6. Starting height in Class A pole vault at State be 11'6".
- In State Meet program list all qualifying times and distances for all contestants.
- 8. Use a tie-on type of pass for coaches at State Track Meets.
- 9. Develop policy manual for handling press at State Meet.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Volleyball Advisory Committee and upon motion by Dehne and second by Tjaden approved the following items:

 Regional format be as follows with first, second, third and fourth place teams advancing to state:



- 2. Regions having more than eight teams will have a play-off game on the Thursday before Regionals to determine who will be the top eight teams. Teams ranked eight and nine will play at the site of the higher ranked team's home site. This play-off match will be a 3/5 game match.
- 3. Season starting date will remain the same but the first allowable day of competition be moved from December 3rd to December 1st. Rationale: This gives volleyball one additional weekend by adding only one day to the regular competitive season. This also would give volleyball one weekend where there is no conflict with basketball.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Wrestling Advisory Committee and upon motion by Moose and second by Dehne approved the following items:

CLASS A

- 1. Weigh-in time for State Tournament be at 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 noon on Friday and 8:30 A.M. to 11:30 A.M. on Saturday.
- Recommend starting wrestling at 12:00 noon on Saturday at State Meet and start consolation finals at 5:30 P.M. and finals at 7:30 P.M.
- Recommend the same format for 1984 Regional and State Tournaments.

CLASS B

- Recommend if any region fails to fill both spots in State Tournament that third place winners from other regions be eligible and drawing held to fill vacancy.
- Recommend that NDHSAA office send copies of State Tournament pairings to regional managers in sealed envelope to be handed out to coaches at completion of Regional Tournament.

*CLASS A & CLASS B

- Recommend that 7th, 8th, and 9th graders be allowed to wrestle
 either junior high or senior high until the final day of weight
 certification. After this date if they wrestle up to B or varsity
 they can not go back to junior high competition.
- Recommend changing logo on State Tournament brackets to NDHSAA seal and not "Sports Goofy".
- Recommend that NDHSAA request permission from National Federation to experiment with the following three rule changes in wrestling:
 - A. Rule 6-3-1 . . . In dual meets, immediately before competition starts, the referee shall call the team captains to the center of the mat and decide by the toss of a coin which team has the choice of position at the start of the second period in each weight class. Team that has choice of position at start of second period must place their wrestler on the mat first. The winner of the toss may choose the odd or even numbered weight classes listed consecutively. This choice is not altered in case of fall, default, forfeit or disqualification.

- B. The penalty for stalling shall be a warning for the first infraction and followed by unlimited number of one point penalties and no disqualification.
- C. The wrestler who has choice at the start of second and third periods may choose to start on top, bottom, or in neutral position.
- Recommend weight certification period for 1984-85 season be December 13th through December 22nd.
- 5. Recommend consider adding workshops for wrestling officials, Recommendations of the Music Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Ott and second by Kunkel the following items were approved:
 - At State Festival, each judge has the option of awarding one "outstanding performance" award. (One award may be given per performance site)
 - 2. Request managers to monitor Honorable Mention award closely.
 - Managers must have meeting with judges on contest day prior to first performance.
 - 4. Change name of Class B "Districts" to "Regions".
 - 5. (Rule 7, Page 23) At Regional and State Contests, time slots shall be at six minute intervals for vocal solos and ensembles, seven minute intervals for instrumental solos and eight minute intervals for instrumental ensembles. (This will allow time for oral critiques and will make contest scheduling consistent statewide.)
 - (Rule G, Page 19) Raise number of percussion ensembles from three to five.
 - Each Region should appoint an Advisory Committee of three directors to assist manager and help keep consistency of scheduling, etc.
 - Add NDHSAA Board of Directors' resolution to rulebook pertaining to preference given to NDHSAA sponsored Regional/State contests over sanctioned events.
 - (New K, Page 20) combine Stage/Jazz Band Ensembles (not eligible for State Contest) and add "Ensembles may include improvisation."
 - (New L, Page 20) Swing Choirs to be called "Vocal Jazz/Swing Choirs" Choreography may be included. The group should be judged first on their musical performance.
 - (Rules 4, 5 & 6 on Page 22) "Bands, orchestras and choruses may
 use a maximum of two selections. Includes Categories J through
 R on Pages 20 & 21.
 - Extend thank you to the President of BJC for the fine job the administration and faculty does for the State Music Festival.



NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: The significant accounting policies followed are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

Fund Accounting
To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the user of resources available, the accounts of the association are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purposes. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group.

The assets, liabilities, and fund balances of the association are reported in self-balancing fund groups as follows:

Operating funds, which include unrestricted and restricted resources, represent the portion of expendable funds that is available for support of the operations of the association. The operating fund has been subdivided into the general fund and the accident benefit fund.

Plant funds represent resources restricted to plant acquisitions and other plant expenditures. $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right)$

Basis of Accounting All funds are accounted for using the accrual basis. Revenues are recognized when earned and expenditures are expensed in the period they are incurred.

Plant Assets and Depreciation
Uses of operating funds for plant acquisitions are accounted for as transfers to plant funds. Proceeds from the sale of plant assets are included in the operating fund balances. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is provided over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets on a straight-line basis.

- 2. INVESTMENTS: The association pools its funds and keeps them invested for maximum yield. On June 30, 1984, 11% of the investments were in a local bank, 64% in two local savings & loan associations and 25% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. This is in comparison to June 30, 1983, when 19% of the investments were in two local banks and 81% in two local savings and loan associations. Investments consist primarily of money market and time savings certificates which bear interest at rates from 9.45% to 12.1%. The average yield for the year ended June 30, 1984 was 10.7% compared to 10.16% for the prior year.
- 3. RESERVES AND UNDESIGNATED BALANCES: The board has designated or reserved portions of funds for contingencies and special purposes. The reserves are reviewed and updated, if necessary, on an annual basis by the board of directors. Unclaimed checks issued in excess of one year are restored to the bank accounts and carried as a liability for a period extending beyond the six year requirement of the statute of limitations.

Undesignated balances are intended to be maintained at only a nominal level.

4. RETIREMENT FLANS: The association has provided elective retirement plans for the administrative staff. These retirement plans provide for 64% of the salary to be contributed by employees which is matched by the association. The funds are in a trust with a local sawings & loan association.

After July 1, 1979, professional staff members (that are qualified teachers) have been included in the state teachers retirement plan. Contribution and matching requirements are also $6\frac{1}{2}$ % of salaries. Beginning July 1, 1983, the association agreed to fund the entire contribution of 13.5% for those covered under the teachers retirement plan.

The associations contribution totaled \$19,793.84 in 1984 and \$11,457.60 in 1983.
