POREWORD.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 61st Annual Yearbook which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

- 1. 1984-85 marked the 77th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Our membership remained stable at 244 schools.
- 2. Efforts were continued to eliminate unnecessary loss of school time by moving events to evenings and Saturday when possible.
- 3. A dramatic change came about when the General Assembly passed an amendment in January that permitted girls to compete in collision and contact sports. This amendment opened the way for girls to take part in several sports previously closed to them.
- 4. The 1984-85 year provided a profit for the General Fund. Once again we were blessed with good weather during most playoffs and tournaments which is the key to financial success or failure for the Association. (A complete audit report can be found in the back of this publication.)
- 5. The new ABF claim system succeeded in eliminating bookkeeping and paper work for school administrators. However, several very large claims plus a dramatic increase in the number of policies with \$300 and \$500 deductible clauses led to a substantial loss for the year. (A report is included in the auditor's report.)
- 6. The Team Scholar Award was initiated in 1984-85 and proved to be very well received. The program will be continued on an annual basis.

Once again a sincere thanks to all the administrators, coaches and athletic directors for your support and cooperation in 1984-85. Your staff will continue to make every effort to provide your school the best possible service in 1985-86.

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors Meeting August 9, 1984 - Valley City, North Dakota

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office at 1:00 P.M. on August 9th with all members present except L. Olson and Sanford.

President Tjaden welcomed new members Don Strang, Mel Olson and Arlo Howe to the Board.

The Board reviewed the annual audit of the Association for the 1983-84 fiscal year as prepared and presented by James Lochow, Certified Public Accountant of Valley City. Upon motion by Ott and second by Sailer the report was approved as presented.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the investments and interest accounts of the NDHSAA for the past year with the Board.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the 1983-84 fiscal year with the Board and proposed a 1984-85 budget of \$626,900.00.

Huber reported for the Finance Committee and made the following recommendations:

- 1. To transfer \$40,000 from the General Fund to the Building Fund.
- To not change any team payments at this time but to study the structure for all payments for all activities and report back to the Board.

Ott moved to accept the Finance Committee's report and the 1984-85 budget as proposed by the Executive Secretary, second by Huber and carried.

Kunkel reported on behalf of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee and made the following recommendations:

 That Part II, Article XII, Section II of the Constitution be changed to read: Total games played by any boys' basketball

7

team shall not exceed eighteen season games or sixteen games and one invitational tournament. Any boy may not participate in more than ninety quarters of competition or eighty quarters plus four quarters in one invitational tournament and one tournament of a lower level nor more than five quarters in one evening. The Board to sponsor this change and to include the emergency clause.

- 2. That post season games and tournaments be placed on the agenda for the General Assembly Meeting so the problem can be discussed with the membership.
- Discussion was held on Ex-officio Board Members holding office on the Board of Directors of the NDHSAA. After reviewing the Constitution it was determined they were not restricted, so no change is necessary.

Kunkel moved to accept the report, second by Sailer and carried.

Kunkel reported for the Trophy Committee and informed the Board that some trophy companies were unhappy with procedure used in purchasing awards for the NDHSAA. The Executive Secretary was instructed to write to these companies and inform them of the procedure.

The Board was also informed that no ribbons had been purchased yet. Huber moved that ribbons for the next three years be purchased from Allard Trophy, second by Ott and carried.

Sailer reported on behalf of the Football Committee and made the following recommendations:

 That Part II, Article XII, Secion 1 letter F be changed to read: One scrimmage with other schools will be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game of the season. Scrimmages held after the date of the first authorized game shall be counted as a game.

Strang moved that the Board sponsor this amendment change, second by Sailer and carried.

If this change is passed by the General Assembly the Board will reduce the number of football games to eight and put the play-offs on three consecutive Saturdays.

Next a new eight region format for Class B 9-Man football was reviewed by the Board. Strang moved that this eight region plan be adopted for the 1985 season and details be set by the NDHSAA staff, second by Olson and carried.

The Board heard a report from the Promotions Committee and made the following recommendation:

 To sponsor a Scholar Team award for NDHSAA members schools. This certificate will be presented to a team that achieves a 3.2 GPA during the season of that activity. All criteria will be developed by the NDHSAA staff. Kunkel moved for adoption of this plan, second by Ott and carried.

The Board reviewed the following applications for cooperative sponsorship activities.

Ft. Ransom to Lisbon for all activities Karlsruhe to Velva - Football Anamoose to Balta - Cross Country Balta to Anamoose - Football Max to Garrison - Football Emmons Central to Strasburg - Football Sheyenne to New Rockford - Football Anamoose to Drake - Jr. High Football Richardton to Dickinson - Boys' Tennis

Kunkel moved for approval of these applications, second by Ott and carried.

Kunkel reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer Luke Deibert to New Rockford under the hardship rule and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be approved. The motion was seconded by Sailer and carried.

The Assistant Executive Secretary reported on the hardship eligibility investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Jason Isgrig from Fargo Oak Grove to Fargo Shanley. After reviewing the case Howe moved to deny the request for eligibility, second by Huber and carried.

The Board discussed Association cars. Kunkel moved to advertise for bids to sell the 1984 cars and to order two 1985 cars, second by Sailer and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board that all 1984-85 tournaments had been accepted except the Region VIII Girls' Tournament at Dickinson State. Sailer moved that the tournament be assigned to Dickinson High School, second by Howe and carried.

The Board reviewed the Chemical Awareness Seminar that will be held in Lincoln, Nebraska on September 18 & 19. After a period of discussion the Board took no action on becoming involved in this seminar.

The Board heard a communique from the National Federation asking for the NDHSAA to support the National High School Sports Hall of Fame. Kunkel moved to table this request, second by Sailer and carried.

The Board considered allowing national organizations to advertise in state tournament programs. This was referred to the Promotions Committee for consideration.

Huber and Ott reported on a meeting held with the Bismarck Chamber of Commerce and Dick Karlgaard concerning problems at tournaments held in Bismarck. The Executive Secretary was instruced to write to Mr. Karlgaard and elaborate these concerns.

There being no further business the Board Meeting adjourned.

Strang reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of David Mortenson from St. Paul to Minot under the hardship rule and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be approved. Second by L. Olson and carried.

Strang reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Jeff Coffin from Hazen to Mohall under the hardship rule and moved the request for immediate eligibility be approved. The motion was seconded by Ott and passed.

The Board heard a request from Park River to move from 11-man to 9-man football for the 1985 season. After reviewing the letter submitted by Park River in October of 1983 asking for the switch, Huber moved to approve the switch because Park River had served the one year waiting period required. Second by Sailer and passed.

Kunkel reported on agreement between North Star Conference and Four Winds High School to play challenge game in both girls and boys North Star Basketball Tournaments at Four Winds if needed. Sailer moved to approve this agreement second by M. Olson and carried.

The Board heard a request from Patty Bass asking to join NDHSAA Retirement Program. Huber moved to approve the request, second by L. Olson and passed.

The Board was asked to authorize Bob King to sign trust fund cards, C.D.'s and money markets for the NDHSAA. Out moved that Bob King be authorized to sign any and all official documents of the NDHSAA. Second by L. Olson and passed.

Bismarck, North Dakota - October 10, 1984

The Board of Directors of the North Dekota High School Activities Association met at 1:00 P.M. on October 10, 1984 at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck with all members present except Ott.

Supt. Nick Roster of Oakes appeared before the Board to request action to solve the problem with the declining number of Class B schools playing 11-man football. He was informed that this is a major concern of the Board and they will continue to work toward a solution.

Supt. Adam Boschee of Kindred appeared before the Board to request permission to play 9-man football in 1985 and set aside the one year waiting period before the change. This item was tabled until later in the meeting.

The Board heard from Supt. Larry Brandvold of Newburg asking to dissolve a co-op program in football with Westhope. The reason for the dissolving of the co-op is so Newburg can start their own varsity football program. Huber moved to approve the dissolving of the co-op contingent upon receiving letters from both school boards approving their move by November 1st, 1984. Second by Sailer and passed.

Don Strang reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee and moved for the approval of the following school assignments:

Football - Region 1 Basketball - District 15 Wrestling - Region 4 Track - Region 4 Music - Region 5

Shiloh Christian School of Mandan

Basketball - District 18

Second by Kunkel and carried.

Mel Olson reported on behalf of the T.V. Committee and asked the Board to consider the following:

- Request from Bismarck-Mandan Cable TV to tape and rebroadcast the 1984 Girls' State Swimming Meet with no fee charged and NDHSAA buy the necessary tapes. Motion by M. Olson to approve this request, second by Sanford and carried.
- Request from Midwest Information System to get a lower fee in broadcasting over their network of radio stations. Committee recommended no change in the fee schedule.

Supt. Jerry Christianson of Wilton appeared before the Board to ask if they would consider getting involved in State Science Fair competition. Mel Olson was instructed to talk it over with NDASA and Arlo Howe to do the same with NDSSPA and report back to the Board.

Sanford reported on behalf of the Promotions Committee and presented the following item for consideration:

N. DAK. HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

 Heard a request from Steve Mayeda asking if the NDHSAA was interested in getting involved with national advertising in tournament programs. The Board instructed the NDHSAA staff to find out more details from this company.

After reviewing all bids, Sailer moved to accept the Streifel bid of \$9,800.00 on the white car and the Stocking bid of \$10,211.00 on the blue car. Second by Strang and passed.

Huber reported to the Board on the lastest meeting of the Legislative Education B Committee. Huber was instructed to keep the Board informed of any further meetings.

The Board reviewed a hardship eligibility investigation, conducted by Richard Ott, on the transfer of Todd Rath from Minot to Tuttle. After a careful review of the case, Strang moved to grant immediate eligibility under the hardship rule, second by Howe and carried.

The Board heard a request from Bowdon to play their opening football game in 1985 on Thursday instead of Friday. The reason for this request is because of a religious rule that does not allow certain students to play on Friday. Howe moved to allow this change for 1985 only. Second by Sanford and carried.

L.E. Faris, Athletic Director of Mandan High School appeared before the Board to present Mandan's side of the disqualification of the school's boys' tennis team from the state tournament. After the Board heard from all people involved they determined the situation was handled properly and no further action was necessary.

The Board was informed that North Dakota will host the National Federation Region 5 Meeting in 1985. This will be placed on the agenda and discussed in detail at a later Board Meeting.

The Board approved the attendance of the following staff to National Federation $\mbox{Meetings:}$

National Debate in San Antonio - Hetler National Federation Council and Football Meeting in Savannah - Anderson and King

The agenda for the Annual Meeting to be held the next day was reviewed.

The Board reviewed a communique from Roger Stone of Dickinson representing the Class λ football coaches and expressing their concern of cutting the number of football games allowed.

The Board reviewed applications submitted by schools for cooperative sponsorship of activities. The following cooperative sponsorship applications were approved on a motion by M. Olson and second by L. Olson.

Scranton to Bowman - Gymnastics & Wrestling

The Board heard a request from the Girls' Golf Coaches requesting to move the 1985 state tournament from Grand Forks to Fargo. Sailer moved to approve this request. Second by Strang and passed.

The Board was informed of a possible consolidation of Golden Valley, Zap, and Dodge. This was just for the Board's information as no formal action has taken place.

The Board then recessed until after the General Assembly Meeting on Thursday.

The Board reconvened at 4:30 P.M. at the Kirkwood Motor Inn with all members present except Ott.

The Board considered the request from Kindred to change from 11 to 9-man football. Kunkel moved to approve the request. Second by Sailer and passed.

The Board discussed the change in football caused by the General Assembly passing the scrimmage amendment. The Board instructed the Asst. Executive Secretary to write up a proposal dealing with the number of games allowed and other details and send it out and then have a conference call Board Meeting to consider adoption.

There being no further business the Board Meeting adjourned.

MINUTES ANOTH Dakota High School Activities Association October 11, 1984 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Annual Meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held at the Kirkwood Motor Inn in Bismarck on October 11, 1984 at 3:00 P.M.

President Jerome Tjaden called the meeting to order and declared a quorum of fifty members in attendance.

Dave Schneider of Edmore moved to approve the minutes of previous meetings from October 1983 and January 1984 as published in the yearbook. Second by Cliff Moser of Larimore and passed.

The North Dakota High School Athletic Directors Association presented their Athletic Director of the Year awards.

The report of the nominating committee was presented by Supt. James Holwell of Bottineau submitting the following names for vacancies on the Board of Directors for three year terms:

Class A Central Region - Richard Kunkel, Devils Lake Class B NW Region - Don Strang, Des Lacs-Burlington

N.D. Principals Assoc. - Arlo Howe, Dickinson Class A West Region - Ed Mundy, Minot

Holwell moved for the acceptance of the submitted names, second by Gene Burns of Epping and carried. No nominations were made from the floor.

Dr. Dave Haney of Dickinson Trinity appeared before the assembly to see if there was interest in reclassifying schools for football. After a period of discussion Mr. Haney moved that the Board of Directors of the NDHSAA study

the concept of reclassifying the football program into an 11-man category with two divisions based upon equitable enrollment numbers and a 9-man category with one or more divisions based upon equitable enrollment numbers. The football classifications would not carry the title of "A" or "B" ranking. Those classifications ("A" and "B") would apply to all other categories of co-curricular activities. These other co-curricular activities would not be affected by the football reclassification.

Motion was second by Al Larson of Carrington and passed.

Total games played by any boys team shall not exceed eighteen season games or sixteen games and one invitational tournament. Any boy may not participate in more than ninety quarters of competiton or eighty quarters plus four quarters in an invitational tournament and one invitational tournament of a lower level, nor more than five quarters in any one evening.

Second by Robert Gibson of Edinburg and passed by voice vote. This change carried the emergency clause and will go into effect immediately.

Bob King on behalf of the Board of Directors presented a change in Part Two, Section I Football, Subsection f to read:

Second by Robert Gibson of Edinburg and passed by voice vote. This change carried the emergency clause and will go into effect immediately.

Bob King on behalf of the Board of Directors presented a change in Part Two, Section I Football, Subsection f to read:

One scrimmage shall be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game and after eight (8) daily practices. Scrimmages held after the date for the first authorized game shall be counted as a contest.

Motion by Don Strang of Des Lacs-Burlington to approve this proposed amendment change, second by Leon Olson of Williston and passed with 88 in favor and 61 opposed.

Supt. Marlin Haluska of Sykeston moved to amend Part Two, Article XIII, Section VII to read:

A student shall not be eligible to compete in interscholastic activities on or after the day on which the twentieth anniversary of his/her birth occurs; except in the case of a certified special education student who upon reaching ninth grade will be allowed to participate in interscholastic activities for a period of four years.

Second by Supt. Wilmar Urban of Goodrich and was defeated by voice vote.

Some individuals expressed their concern on the present football plan. However, no formal action was taken by the Board.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

- *4. One scrimmage shall be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game and after eight (8) daily practices. Scrimmages held after the date for the first authorized game shall be counted as a contest.
- A football team may play nine regular season games and with no scrimmage or eight regular season games and one scrimmage. Under no circumstances may a team play nine regular season games and have a scrimmage.
- 6. The date for the first allowable game is August 27.
- All Class "A" and "B" 11-man games must be completed no later than October 22nd.
- All Class "B" 9-man games must be completed no later than October 18th.
- *9. No more than two games may be played by any team in any 7 day period, nor more than eight quarters by any individual.
- *10. No game may be played after November 15th.
- *11. Individual participants must have participated in at least 8 daily practice sessions before being permitted to participate in an interschool contest.
- 12. All teams must submit schedule to NDHSAA office by May 1st.
- Regulations that are part of the Constitution and By-Laws of the NUHSAA, others would be Board regulations.

Second by Howe and passed.

There being no further business, President Tjaden adjourned the meeting.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 1:30 P.M. on November 16, 1984 at the Sheraton Riverside Inn in Minot with all members present.

Cary Brevik of Minot representing the N.D. School Study Council appeared before the Board and presented a request that would allow the study council to purchase and furnish basketballs for all Class A regional and state basketball tournaments. After a period of discussion Howe moved to approve the request for the 1985-86 school year, second by Kunkel and carried.

The Board reviewed applications submitted by schools for cooperative sponsorship of activities. The following applications were considered:

Cass Valley North to Dakota - Football Crary to Devils Lake - Girls' Basketball

Sanford moved for approval, second by Howe, carried.

The Board reviewed the financial report of the Association business transacted from July 1, 1984 to October 31, 1984. The Board also reviewed the ABF report covering the same period. Ott moved to accept the reports, second by M. Olson and carried.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Class B District Chairmen's Meeting, but no action was taken at this time.

Sailer reported on behalf of the Football Committee and informed the Board that the regulations for the new 1985 9-man play-off plan had been reviewed by the Committee. The advancement of teams will be determined in the following way:

Howe moved that the NDHSAA send a letter of reprimand to Coach Heide on the improper way the incident was handled and that the Executive Secretary express these concerns to Coach Heide. Second by L. Olson and carried.

Next the Board reviewed a reported problem by the announcer at the conclusion of the Class A Football Championship game on television. The Executive Secretary was instructed to contact the announcers and see if the comments reported were actually made.

The Board reviewed a request from Sykeston to switch from District 15 to District 17 for Girls' and Boys' Basketball. This was referred to Class B Re-districting Committee.

The first item considered by the Board was whether the Fargo Public schools should be sanctioned because possibly playing an ineligible player in hockey.

Motion by Howe that the NDHSAA not sanction Fargo South High School for playing Carrie Preusse in an interscholastic hockey game. Second by Ott and the roll call vote was: M. Olson - no; L. Olson - yes; Sailer, yes; Sanford - yes; Howe - yes; Huber - yes; Kunkel - yes; Strang - yes; Tjaden - yes; Ott - yes, motion caried.

The discussion indicated the following: The Board, as the body having the power and duty to interpret the rules, states that Section X expresses, a permission as to non-contact sports. It does not expressly address the question of contact sports (except insofar as the interpretations previously have noted that experience has shown that the best programs are those which provide for separate teams for each sex, and because of general average size and strength differences, it is not in the best interests of boys and girls to have only 1 team open to them in contact sports).

The Board now for the first time having the matter expressly brought before it, states that saying it is not thought physically in the best interests of boys and girls is not to say it cannot be done if the individuals and specific schools think otherwise in a specific situation and it is otherwise appropriate. "Overmatching" is not appropriate. This motion does not consider any matter other than the fact that there was a girl who played in a specific sport.

At the present time there is no express prohibition in the Association's rules and bylaws preventing Carrie Preusse playing on the only Fargo South hockey team, which is generally composed of boys, or expressly preventing her engaging in interscholastic contests for the school.

If there is to be a sanction, it should be only upon a specific, express prohibition adopted by the Representative Assembly of the Association. The matter of what express rule there should be will be placed on the agenda for the next Representative Assembly.

The next matter to come before the Board was the problem created by the fact that the Association was sued before the Association had been asked for any official interpretation and ruling. In short, the Association was sued before the plaintiff asked us for a ruling.

This matter was discussed and led to the following two motions:

Kumkel moved to not accept plaintiff's offer to settle out of court and pay part of their legal fees, second by L. Olson and carried.

Next Ott moved to offer the plaintiff to settle out of court if they pay \$1,000 of the NDMSAA legal fees, second by Kunkel and carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

The Board reviewed the Basketball Advisory Committee recommendations and upon motion by Howe and second by Ott the following items were adopted:

- Recommend sites of district, regional and state tournaments must have fan shaped backboards.
- Recommend that the visiting scorekeeper sit next to the home scorekeeper during all regular season games. This should be done to avoid mistakes.
- 3. Allow competing teams in that game to film at district, regional and state basketball tournaments.
- 4. Recommend starting night games in State Basketball Tournaments at 6:30 P.M.

The Golf Advisory Committee recommendations were reviewed and upon motion by M. Olson and second by Kunkel the following items were approved:

- 1. Class A Qualifications for the state be: Four teams from WDA; Four teams from EDC and two teams from North Star. Also teams who score 50 or less over course rating and individuals who score 9 or less over course rating. Regional sites must have course rating.
- 2. Class B Grass Greens Eliminate B Regions Two day State Tournament at two sites for all teams and alternate sites.
- Class B Sand Greens:
 - 1. Eliminate regionals as there were only nine full teams in the west and 8 in the east plus 1 partial team in the west and 2 partial teams in the east.
 - 2. Have the state on May 27 and 28 with the first day having an 18 hole qualifying round. Choose the medalists from this round. (Suggested 10 because of no regionals)
 - 3. The top eight teams (no tie-breaker so if teams tie for 8th, they qualify for second day of play) qualify for the championship round the second day. Choose top five teams by second day of play only

The recommendations of the Gymnastics Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Strang and second by Ott the following items were approved:

MINUTES Board of Directors Meeting Morth Dakota High School Activities Association Valley City, North Dakota - June 13, 14, 1985

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office at 9:30 A.M. on June 13, 1985 with all members present except Huber.

Each member of the Board was furnished with a packet containing a complete financial report of the General Fund from July 1, 1984 to May 31, 1985. After a review by the Board, Kunkel moved to accept the report, second by Sailer and carried.

The Assistant Executive Secretary presented the final report on the T-Shirt sales for 1984-85. Motion by Sailer to approve the report and continue the program for 1985-86. Second by Ott and carried.

Rick Fitzner presented the ABF report up to May 31, 1985 and presented a possible plan to take care of the deficit in the program. After a period of discussion Howe moved that a 30% increase be added to the premium for coverage in the athletic areas of the ABF plan and that any changes in charges for individual sports be made that Mr. Fitzner feels are appropriate. Second by Ott and passed. Next a motion by L. Olson asked that an indepth study of the total ABF program be done and the results of this study presented to the Board at a later meeting, second by Sanford and carried.

Strang reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee and reported the results of the survey conducted dealing with reclassification for basketball. The results of the survey were: 67 schools favored keeping it the way it is; 52 favored continuing two class system but redo districts; and 72 schools favored a three class system. Motion by Strang that the Board set up a committee with 2 representatives from Class A schools, 4 representatives from Class B schools and the Executive Secretary to study the situation and bring a recommendation back to the Board that can be presented at the NDHSAA Annual Meeting. Second by Sailer and carried.

Kunkel reported on behalf of the Trophy Committee and moved to adopt a new policy on trophies presented at NDHSAA sponsored events. This policy is that only trophies purchased by the NDHSAA will be presented and all presentations must be made by NDHSAA Board of Directors, Executive Staff or the Tournament Manager. Second by Howe and carried.

Kunkel reported on behalf of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee and moved that the Board sponsor a change in Article XII Section IE that would change the date of the last football game from no game played after November 15th to read that the final date for football will be the Saturday that is nearest to November 15th. Second by Sailer and carried.

1. The top 3 teams from regionals will qualify for state competition regardless of team score. Only the top 4 scorers from each regional event will be eligible for team competition at state.

TEAM QUALIFICATION

- (A) A team may qualify through the regionals for state by placing first, second, or third at the regional meet.
- (B) Those teams that qualify for state will be composed of only that team's top 4 gymnasts from each event whose score was used for team score.

INDIVIDUAL QUALIFICATION

Gymnasts may qualify for individual competition if they comply with one or more of the following:

- (A) The individual's score was used as one of the top four scores for her team's score.
- (B) The gymnast was one of the top 14 individuals in an event.
- (C) The gymnast was one of the top 12 individuals in allaround competition.

SUBSTITUTION

- 1. If an illness or injury causes a team that has qualified for state to compete without one of their 4 per event qualifiers, a team may substitute using their 5th scorer from regionals. A certification of illness or injury must be signed by a physician. This certification must be produced no later than the coaches' meeting prior to the start of the state meet.
- 2. (A) A spring floor will be recommended for hosting any Class A regular season meet.
 - (B) A spring floor will be recommended for hosting any Class ${\tt B}$ regular season meet.

AMARDS

Ribbons will be awarded to the following places:

Regionals: Individual Events - 6th through 14th All-Around - 6th through 12th

Individual Events - 7th through 14th State: All-Around - 7th through 14th

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Hockey Advisory Committee and upon motion by Ott and second by Kunkel the following recommendations were approved:

- 1. Assignment of officials be made on a day to day basis by Bruce Anderson of the NDHSAA and the Senior Hockey Official working the State Tournament.
- 2. Recommend that there be a uniform starting time for games.

Varsity - 7:30 P.M. Junior Varisty - 5:15 P.M.

- 3. Recommend again that entertainment between periods be limited to a total of 8 minutes per night.
- 4. Recommend that there be at least 15 minute warm-up time.

N. DAK. HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

(a) Suggest the clock be started when the first team takes the ice after the JV game ends.

The recommendations of the Tennis Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Kunkel and second by Howe the following items were approv-

- 1. The west region shall consist of all schools located west of Highway 30 and the east region shall consist of all schools east of Highway 30.
- 2. Schools are required to wear appropriate school identifying uniforms issued or authorized by the school.
- 3. A trophy shall be awarded to the 4th place team.
- 4. Accept the tournament handbook as prepared by the NDHSAA and the Tennis Advisory Committee.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Swimming Advisory Committee and upon motion by Sailer and second by Strang the following recommendations were approved:

- 1. After the first year of the two-year trial on seasons, the following two recommendations have been made:
 - (a) Move the girls' season back one week for the 1986-87 season, (August 25, 1986)
 - (b) Leave the boys' season as it is at the present time.
- 2. The qualifying times of all exhibition swimmers shall be used for qualifying for the state meet. Any participant in a meet who meets the standards will be placed on the qualifying sheet.

The recommendations of the Baseball Coaches were reviewed and upon motion by Strang and second by L. Olson the following item was approved:

1. Advisory Committee be set up for baseball.

Supt. Streifel of Carson appeared before the Board representing District 31 and asked the Board to consider rotating the Region 8 Boys' & Girls' Basketball Tournaments between Mandan and Dickinson.

Supt. Bubach of Maddock appeared before the Board representing District 13 and asked the Board to consider placing the Region IV Boys' Basketball Tournament in Devils Lake and the Girls' Region IV Tournament in Maddock.

A delegation from Grand Forks consisting of Joe Ford, Mike Grandall and Tom Tschider appeared before the Board asking the Board to consider Grand Forks as the site for a Combined Class A & B Track Meet in 1986.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Track Advisory Committee and upon motion by Sailer and second by Sanford the following items were approved:

N. DAK. HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

Class B

 Recommend the combining of Class A and Class B State Meet, to be held on the same corresponding date as the 1985 Class A State Track Meet. This combined meet shall be held at the same site.

Motion by M. Olson to combine 1986 State Class A & B Track Meets to be held on the same corresponding date as the 1985 State Class A Meet and the meet be held in Grand Forks. Second by Sanford and passed.

2. Revise the Class B minimum standards as follows:

CLASS B GIRLS

800 Meter Run - 2:29.0 400 Meter Relay - 53.0

CLASS B BOYS

300 Meter Hurdles - 42.0 Pole Vault - 11' 9"

 It will be mandatory that there will be 33" hurdles for junior high (7-8) boys at 110 Meters; 30" hurdles for junior high (7-8) girls at 100 Meters.

Class A

- Change the distance limitation for 8th graders to allow one race of 800 Meters or more plus two races of 400 Meters or less
- A slip of declaration will be used for all athletes entered in the 100, 200 and 400 Meter Dashes and the 100, 110 and 300 Meter Hurdle events. These slips must be turned in to the Clerk of Course no later than 5 minutes after the first call of that event.
- Coaches expressed a concern over the conduct of the media in dealing with athletes at the State Meets.
- Recommend continuing the use of the coach's pass but extend this to a pass for participants, the State Meet schedule to be included in the information on the pass.
- The cut-off date of April 18th established in the 1985 season be re-defined as the third Saturday in April.
- 6. Revise minimum standards as follows:

Class A Girls

100 Meter Dash - 12.8 High Jump - 5' 2" Discus - 112' 0"

Class A Boys

800 Meter Run - 2:01.0 3200 Meter Run - 10:00.0 300 Meter Hurdles - 41.7

Class A & B

 At the state meet, assign sections in the 800 Meter Run as follows:

> 12 competitors or less - one section 13 to 24 competitors - two sections over 24 competitors - three sections Divide sections equally

Cross Country

- Junior High starts practice when school starts and allow 7th & 8th graders to move up through the last Saturday in September without loss of eligibility.
- Rotate the schedule of starting times at the state cross country meet so the four divisions alternate running first, second etc.
- Recommend the site for the state cross country meet be selected two years in advance so the location of the state meet is known before scheduling for the next year's regular season competition.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Volleyball Advisory Committee and upon motion by Sanford and M. Olson the following recommendations were approved:

- Regular season game limitation is 6 times number of allowable matches plus number of tournaments allowed in connection with regular season match limitation.
- State Tournament The first round will be played on Friday and remainder to be played on Saturday with championship being 3 out of 5 game match.
- Mandatory rules workshops be held for officials.

Motion by Kunkel to:

 Add one tournament to allowable regular season schedule for 1985-86 season. Second by Ott and carried.

The Board recessed until $8:00\,\mathrm{A.M.}$ June 14, 1985 and reconvened at that time with all members present except Huber.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Wrestling Advisory Committee and upon motion by Ott and second by Howe approved the following items:

Class A & B

- Recommend that the weight certification period start with the date of the first allowable match and end on the same date as now used.
- 2. Recommend to continue using computers at the State Meet.
- Recommend that when a wrestler is injured and cannot compete in the State Meet the substitute be seeded last from that region and others affected by injury be moved up.

Class A

1. Recommend that a team be allowed to bring full team to State

Tournament and do away with regionals on a one year trial basis. Teams would be allowed one additional regular season tournament.

- Recommend seeding the top eight wrestlers in each weight class at the State Tournament.
 - A. A seeding committee made up to two representatives from the EDC and WDA and one representative from the North Star be selected by regions.
 - B. Committee will meet on the Sunday prior to the State Tournament in Valley City.
 - C. Seeding will be determined by the criteria found in the National Federation Rules Book.
 - D. If no agreement by Rule Book criteria then Committee will vote to determine seed.

Recommendations of the Music Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Ott and second by Sailer the following items were approved:

- 1. 1986 State Music Festival be at Jamestown College on May 2.
- Recommend contest go to Minot SC in 1987 and 1988.
- Recommend that NDHSAA do not sponsor piano contests as piano not part of school music programs.
- Recommend that each regional committee invite directors to an annual meeting to cover specific contest items and judge selection.
- Recommended Bob Hetler study the feasibility of possible music judge certification clinics for 1986-87 school year and beyond. First report to be ready by NDEA Convention time in October 1985.
- New Rule 3 on Page 22: A student can only perform one solo per category. Ex. - One can play only one trumpet solo and and sing only one vocal solo.
- Rule D, Page 18: Raise number of vocal ensembles from 15 to 20.
- Study possibility of breaking ensembles into 3 sections instead of two: 2-3, 4-6 and 7-12. Recommend change for 1986-87 school year.
- Recommend plaque for Outstanding Performer Award (Max. of 20 possible Gave 9 awards this year)
- Recommend Class B Outstanding Performers represent vocal and instrumental music in the "Parade of Champions".

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Speech Advisory Committee and upon motion by Howe and second by Kunkel the following items were approved:

Debate Rule Changes

1. (Rule IV, Page 63) Expand Lincoln-Douglas Debate to two divi-

sions: Varsity and Novice. A "novice" shall be defined as a student who has not debated in more than six rounds of L-D or policy debate during any previous season. No JV or Varsity policy debater will be allowed to switch to the "novice" division of L-D Debate.

- Raise registration fees: Varsity from \$10.00 to \$15.00, JV from \$5.00 to \$10.00, Novice from \$5.00 to \$15.00 (need 2 judges per team), Lincoln-Douglas from \$5.00 to \$10.00 and extra judges fee from \$40.00 to \$50.00.
- 3. Reword rule on Page 58 defining a novice debater to read: "...those that have had no more than six rounds of experience." and "Last year's L-D debaters who have participated in more than six rounds of L-D debate in 1984-85 shall have no novice status."
- 4. All finals shall be run at 1:00 P.M.
- Rule 3g, Page 60 add (The low score will be dropped except where needed to break ties).

Student Congress Rule Changes

- Rule 2 at bottom of Page 75: Add "When roll call is taken in each chamber, each participant must present a written resolution or he/she will not be seated until such a resolution is presented."
- Rule 3c, Page 70: "Each school may not enter a presiding officer candidate in more than three of the chambers."

Speech/Play Rule Changes

- State B Plays be run on Friday with two sections, top two plays from each section perform again in evening to choose top four places.

The contestant in this event should remember that the speech to entertain should make a point, be amusing to the audience and be the original work of the student."

North Dakota Officials' Association Board of Directors Meeting

November 17, 1984 - Minot, North Dakota

Del Gab called the regular meeting of the NDOA Board of Directors to order at the Minot Sheraton Riverside Inn with all members present.

The minutes of the last Board of Directors' meeting and the Annual Meeting were reviewed and approved as presented.

The first order of business was reviewing the candidates for the "Hall of Fame". After a careful review of all candidates, Jacobson moved that the following individuals be placed in the NDOA "Hall of Fame" and when they should be inducted:

Second by Risk and carried.

The Board reviewed a proposal submitted by Dennis Laumb of Valley City dealing with the selection process used in determining Class "B" regional basketball officials. After a period of discussion, Houser moved that no action be taken on this proposal, second by Matejcek and carried.

The first order of business was to discuss the fees paid to volley-ball officials. Lorraine Lutjens and Bonnie Almond of Bismarck met with the Board and made the following recommendations:

- \$15.00 for J.V. games when 2 out of 3 games are played \$22.50 for varsity match when 3 out of 5 games are played (This would be a maximum fee)
- Mandatory workshops be held for officials to stress consistency in officiating. (These would be all day on a Saturday)

The Board then discussed the possible joining of the NFIOA by the NDOA. \$50 per game A & B Regional Tournaments

\$60 per game A & B State Tournaments

'Discussion followed, Art Schilke moved to amend the original motion to include that all Class "B" fees would stay the same for regular season games, second by Ron Keller and the amendment to the original motion was passed. The group then passed the original motion as amended.

OFFICIAL YEARBOOK

The group next discussed the allowance given to officials working state basketball tournaments. Howard Theige moved that the NDHSAA pay the actual cost of hotel rooms for any three day state tournament, plus \$18.00 for meals and pay mileage to all officials working that tournament. Second by Bruce Jessen and carried.

Henry Milkey moved to do away with policy that restricts officials to three consecutive state tournaments. Second by Emil Zueger and the motion was defeated by a show of hands.

The group was next informed of possible rule changes for 1985-86 and what the results of the questionnaire were in North Dakota.

Darrell Matejcek of Lakota was duly nominated and elected for a two year term to the Board of Directors from the Northeast Region. Dwane Getzlaff of Bottineau was duly nominated and elected to a two year term on the Board of Directors from the Northwest Region and Jeff Risk of Minot was duly nominated and elected to a two year term as the West Member-at-Large on the Board of Directors.

Following the meeting, The Board reorganized itself for the coming year. Del Gab and Doug Jacobson were named President and Vice-President respectively for the coming year.

The next Board of Directors meeting will be held in Minot on November 16th at the Girls' State Class "B" Basketball Tournament.













NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: The eignificant accounting policies followed are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

Fund Accounting
To ensure observence of limitations and restrictions placed on the user of resources available, the accounts of the association are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposess into funds established according to their nature and purposes. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group.

The assets, liabilities, and fund balances of the association are reported in self-balancing fund groups as follows:

Operating funds, which include unrestricted and restricted resources, represent the portion of expendable funds that is available for support of the operations of the association. The operating fund has been subdivided into the general fund and the accident benefit fund.

Plant funds represent resources restricted to plant acquisitions and other plant expenditures.

Basis of Accounting All funds are accounted for using the accrual basis. Revenues are recognized when carned and expanditures are expansed in the pariod they are incurred.

Plant Assats and Depreciation Uses of operating funds for plant acquisitions are accounted for as transfers to plant funds. Proceeds from the sale of plant assets are included in the operating fund balances. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is provided over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets on a straight-line basis.

- 2. INVESTMENTS: The association pools its funds and keeps them invested for maximum yield. On June 39, 1985, .4% of the investments were in a local bank, 36% in two local savings & loan associations and 63.6% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. This is in comparison to June 30, 1984, when 11% of the investments were in a local bank and 64% in two local savings and loss associations and 25% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. Investments consist primarily of money market and time savings certificates which bear interest at rates from 7.65% to 12.1%. The avagas yield for the year ended June 30, 1985 was 11.42 compared to 10.7% for the prior year.
- 3. RESERVES AND UNDESTGRATED RALANCES: The board has designated or reserved portions of funds for contingencies and special purposes. The reserves are reviewed and updated, if necessary, on an annual basis by the board of directors. ifter July 1, 1979, professional staff members (that are qualified teachers) have been included in the state teachers retirement plan. Contribution and matching requirements are also 6k% of salaries. Beginning July 1, 1983, the association agreed to fund the entire contribution of 13.5% for those covered under the teachers retirement plan.

The associations contribution totaled \$21,402.60 in 1985 and \$19,793.84 in

The employee's contributions (currently 6.25% of selaries) and related earnings are fully vested at all times. Retiring or terminating employees are entitled to withdraw such funds in a lump sum distribution.

The association's matching contributions and related earnings are payable to the employee over ten years on retirement at or after age 65.

If termination occurs after the tenth year, an employee can elect to defer all distributions until reaching age 65 and then obtain benefits as a retiring employee. If an employee terminates employment before retirement, these funds become partially vested as follows:
