- 1. 1985-86 marked the 78th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Our membership dipped to 241 high schools.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office building at 1:00 P.M. on August 8th with all members present.

President Kunkel welcomed new member Ed Mundy to the Board.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the investments and interest accounts of the NIHSAA for the past year with the Board.

The Board reviewed a final financial report for all activities sponsored by the NDHSAA.

The Board reviewed the annual audit of the Association for the 1984-85 fiscal year as prepared and presented by James Lochow, Certified Public Accountant of Valley City. Upon motion by Tjaden and second by Olson the report was approved as presented.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the 1984-85 fiscal year with the Board and proposed a 1985-86 budget of \$655,900.00. Sailer moved to adopt the 1985-86 budget as proposed, second by Howe and carried.

Tjaden reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee and informed the Board of the following items to be considered by the General Assembly at the October meeting:

- A proposal to the bylaws will be made by Watford City dealing with the eligibility of hearing impaired students.
- The Board will sponsor a change to the bylaws changing the date for the final football competition.

Kunkel reported on behalf of the Trophy Committee and recommended no changes in the policy adopted earlier dealing with what trophies may be presented and who may present them.

Olson reported for the T.V. Committee and recommended that radio stations be allowed to continue to do spot broadcasts from NDHSAA sponsored events at no cost.

Alve Jemtrud from the North Dakota Educator's Insurance Trust appeared before the Board to make a proposal for Medical coverage for the NDHSAA staff. This was referred to the Finance Committee for further consideration.

The Board reviewed the following applications for cooperative sponsorship of activities:

Minot Ryan to Minot High School (Grades 9-12) Boys' & Girls' Cross County, Girls' Golf

Forbes to Kulm - Football

Robinson to Steele - Football

Howe moved for approval of these applications, second by Tjaden and carried.

Ott reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Grant Wilz from Rismarck Century to Bismarck St. Mary's under the hardship rule and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be approved. The motion was seconded by Sailer and carried.

Strang reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of David Watterud from Wildrose to Powers Lake under the hardship rule and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be approved. The motin was seconded by Olson and carried.

The Board discussed Association cars. Sailer moved to advertise for bids to sell the 1985 cars and to order two 1986 cars, second by Ott and carried.

The Board heard a communique from Supt. Del Zimmerman of Wishek dealing with the Board's decision to combine the Class A & B Track Meets for 1986.

Next the Board reviewed the minutes of the first meeting of the Basketball Ad Hoc Committee and were informed this Committee would meet again on September 18, 1985 in Valley City.

The Board reviewed a complete summary of the cost of trophies for the 1984-85 year.

The Board was informed of the early starting date of the 1986 EDC Boys' Basketball Regional Tournament. After reviewing the dates it conflicted with, the Board took no action to change it.

The Board reviewed a letter from the Turtle Lake-Mercer School Board asking the NDHSAA to forbid any activities on the weekend reserved for statewide church events. The Executive Secretary was instructed to write to the school board explaining the NDHSAA position on this matter.

The Board heard a communique from Supt. William Julson of Mayville-Portland asking the Board to reconsider the new format passed for Class B Grass Greens Golf competition. After a period of discussion the Board decided to try the new format for one year and then re-evaluate.

Tjaden reported on the progress of the North Dakota Academic Competition Committee and the next meeting date. President Kunkel appointed Tajden to continue to represent the NDHSAA on this committee.

The Assistant Executive Secretary reported on the proposed all-star wrestling meet to be held in March after the completion of the high school season. The Board reviewed the ruling of the Assistant Executive Secretary and agreed his ruling was correct and this would be a violation of the NDHSAA Constitution and ByLaws.

The Board reviewed the site selection for the Region 6 Wrestling Tournament. Motion by Sailer to switch the 1986 Region 6 Wrestling Tournament from Velva to Beulah, second by Tjaden and carried.

The Board reviewed a communique from Mike Olson, Athletic Director at Dickinson State College expressing his concern over the loss of hosting the Region 8 Basketball Tournaments at Dickinson State.

There being no further business the Board Meeting adjourned.

North Dakota High School Activities Association Valley City, North Dakota - September 26, 1985

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 10:00 A.M. on Sepember 26th at the Association office in Valley City with all members present except Sanford.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the August 8th Board Meeting. Huber moved to approve the minutes as corrected, second by Tjaden and carried.

The Board reviewed the report of all business transacted from July 1, 1985 to September 13, 1985. The Board also reviewed the ABF report covering the same period. Upon a motion by Olson and second by Ott both reports were accepted.

The next order of business was the opening of bids for Boys' Class A Regional Basketall Tournaments and the Class A Football Championship. The following bids were received:

WDAY & Meyer Broadcasting Co. bid \$1,600 for State Class A Football game if covered statewide and \$800 if covered only in east or west. Motion by Sailer to reject this bid because it does not meet minimum set by Board, second by Howe and carried.

Meyer Broadcasting Co. bid \$10,003.00 for the 1986 WDA Boys' Regional Basketball Tournament. Motion by Mundy to accept this bid and contract be sent out, second by Strang and carried.

Sailer reported on behalf of the Football Committee and made the following recommendations:

Class B 9-Man Rootball: Continue to have eight regions and move Minnewaukan from Region 5 to Region 4 for 1986 séason and add Underwood, Turtle Lake-Mercer and Washburn to Region 5 and add Oakes to Region 1.

Class B 11-Man Football: Reduce the number of regions from five to four with the following assignments:

Region 1: Central Cass, Fargo Oak Grove, Hillsboro, Mayville-Portland, Carrington, Larimore, Langdon and Cavalier.

Region 2: Harvey, Velva, Garrison, Hazen, Beulah, Center and SRCHS (Fort Yates).

Region 3: New Town, Des Lacs-Burlington, Stanley, Tioga, Kenmare, Mohall, and Divide County.

Region 4: Watford City, Killdeer, Beach, Belfield, New England, St. Mary's, Bowman and Hettinger.

The Committee also recommended that a committee be set up to study the entire football format and develop changes they feel necessary. Sailer moved to approve the report, second by Olson and carried.

The Board discussed the work of the Basketball Ad-Hoc Committee and where the Association should go next. Motion by Olson to allow the Committee to continue and have them meet with the NDHSAA Board on October 16th in Bismarck.

Solberg reported on the investigation she conducted concerning the transfer of Terry Poitra from Rolla to Dunseith under the hardship rule and recommended the request be granted. Motion by Olson to approve request for immediate eligibility, second by Strang and carried.

The Board reviewed the following applications for cooperative sponsorship of activities:

Forbes to Kulm - Boys' Basketball St. James to New Rockford - Jr. High Cross Country Park River to Grafton - Boys' Cross Country Granville to Surrey - Boys' & Girls' Cross Country Hurdsfield to Bowdon - Jr. High Boys' Basketball Souris to Westhope - Boys' Basketball

Tjaden moved for approval, second by Mundy and carried.

The Board heard a communique from Strasburg reporting they had used an ineligible player in a Girls' Basketball game. Motion by Tjaden that the school forfeit the game that the ineligible girl played in and compliment the school for prompt action of turning themselves in, second by Sailer and carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from Williston dealing with a possible rule violation in football scrimmages. After revieweing the situation carefully the Board felt that working out against alumni is a violation; no matter how many are involved and Williston should be informed of this. The second problem dealt with scrimmaging with your "B" squad and the Executive Staff asked for a ruling on this. Tjaden moved to allow one scrimmage by any football team if they play eight games or less and meet all practice requirements, second by Howe and carried.

The Board reviewed the report on the 1985 Cheerleader Clinics and was informed of the dates for 1986. The Board reviewed bids from the National Cheerleaders Association and the World Cheerleader Council. Motion by Ott to accept the three year bid of World Cheerleader Council for:

1986 - \$1,100

1987 - \$1,200

1988 - \$1,300

The bid includes all expenses except in state travel which will be furnished by NDHSAA. Second by Sailer and carried.

The Board heard a request from Underwood to move from 11 to 9-man football for the 1986 season. Motion by Ott to approve, second by Mundy and carried.

Next the Board reviewed a resolution from the Western North Dakota District of the American Lutheran Church asking the NDHSAA to pass an amendment to prohibit schools from scheduling activities on the days reserved for statewide church activities. Tjaden moved to have the Executive Secretary send a letter informing them of policy. Second by Sailer and carried.

The Board reviewed a communique from the North Dakota Coaches Association thanking the NDMSAA for their financial assistance in sponsoring the Coaches Convention and asked for continued support.

The Board also reviewed a letter from Supt. Nick Roster of Oakes asking the Board to consider bidding basketballs for a longer period of time. This request was duly noted.

Chairman Kunkel appointed Mel Olson as chairman of the Class B District Chairmen's Meetings to be held during the Boys' & Girls' Basketball Tournaments.

The Board reviewed the agenda for the Annual Meeting to be held October 17, 1985 at 3:00 P.M. at the Bismarck Kirkwood Motor Inn.

North Dakota High School Activities Association Bismarck, North Dakota - October 16, 1985

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at $1:30~\rm p.m.$ on October 16, 1985 at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck with all members present.

Howe moved that the minutes of September 26, 1985 be corrected to read that Cavalier be complimented for turning themselves in and not reprimended for use of an ineligible player. Mundy moved to approve the minutes as corrected, second by Olson and carried.

Sailer reported on behalf of the Football Committee and informed the Board that the Committee felt the previous action assigning schools in Class B 11-man football should stand. He then informed the Board that Maddock-Esmond had requested to be moved from Region 5 to 4. Ott moved to table the Football report until Superintendents Slotsve and Nudell appear before the Board, second by Huber and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on New Town's use of an ineligible runner in the Bismarck Invitational Cross Country Meet. The Board agreed that the Executive Secretary's ruling the runner ineligible was correct. Motion by Howe that New Town forfeit position in the meet because of use of an ineligible player but the school be commended for the candid explanation in handling the case, second by Huber and carried.

Strang reported on the hardship eligibility investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Clinton and Dennis Wolf from Mandaree to New Town. After reviewing the case Howe moved to approve the request for immediate eligibility, upon the receipt of the proper communciations from Mandaree, second by Strang and a roll call vote was requested by the Chairman: Tajden - no; Sailer - no; Sanford - no: Howe - yes; Mundy - yes; Huber - no; Ott - yes; Strang - yes; Olson - no; and Kunkel - yes. The vote was 5-5 so the motion was defeated.

The Board opened the bids for the sale of 1985 Association owned cars:

Jack Brown, Jamestown - \$9,780.00 (Silver) Cliff Moser, Larimore - \$9,001.00 (either car)

After reviewing the bids, Strang moved to accept the Brown bid of 9,780 for the silver car and the Moser bid of 9,001 for the white car. Second by Sanford and carried.

The Board reviewed a request for Cooperative sponsorship of activities from Elgin and the Living Word Academy. Mundy moved the application be denied because Living Word Academy is not an approved school, second by Sailer and carried.

The Board reviewed a co-op request from Surrey to Minot Ryan for Gymnastics and Wrestling. Tjaden moved for approval upon the receipt of the proper papers, second by Strang and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported that Meyer Inc. of Bismarck has agreed to pay \$1,500 for TV rights to Class A State Championship Football games if carried in west only and pay \$1,600 if carried statewide. Contracts had been issued.

The Board heard a communique from Supt. Nick Roster of Oakes dealing with scheduling problems they were having in 9-man football. The Board took no action.

The agenda for the Annual Meeting to be held the next day was reviewed.

Howe reviewed with the Board a foreign exchange student who transferred

from Scranton to Dickinson High School because of problems in the small rural community. The Board recommended that Dickinson High School file a hardship eligibility request with the NDHSAA.

The Board held an audience with Supt. Roger Slotsve of Velva and he asked the Board to reconsider moving Velva from Region 4 to 3 in 11-man football and explained why he felt this was a logical request. Board took no action.

Supt. Larry Nudell of Harvey expressed his concern over the problem in Class B $\,$ 11-man football and expressed some ideas the Board might want to consider to solve the problem. Board took no action.

Supt. Stan Miller of Center expressed his concern over the problem in Class B 11-man football and he felt the Board should mandate a system for schools to follow.

The Board considered the report of the Football Committee that was tabled earlier in the meeting. Sailer moved to approve the report that would move Maddock from Region 5 to Region 4 in 9-man football. Second by Strang and carried.

The Board heard a report from the Basketball Ad-Hoc Committee. Supt. Morris Martin of Richardton reviewed the two meetings of the committee and the Three Class system that was currently being considered. A lengthy period of discussion followed allowing the Board and members of the committee to express their feelings on the issue.

Sanrord moved that the NTHSAA Board of Directors accept the report of the Basketball Ad-Hoc Committee and incorporate it into proper constitutional language and submit it to the membership by mail ballot prior to January 15, 1986. Second by Strang and carried.

The Board reviewed a request from Bismarck for a cooperative program in gymnastics between Bismarck High School and Century High School. After a period of discussion the request was tabled until the next meeting.

There being no further business the Board Meeting adjourned.

Annual Meeting

North Dakota High School Activities Association October 17, 1985 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Annual Meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held at the Kirkwood Motor Inn in Bismarck on October 17, 1985 at 3:00 P.M.

President Richard Kunkel called the meeting to order and declared a quorum of fifty members in attendance.

President Kunkel introduced the $\ensuremath{\text{Board}}$ of Directors and parliamentarian Howard Snortland.

Supt. David Schneider of Edmore moved to approve the minutes of the previous meetings from October 1984 and January 1985 as published in the yearbook. Second by Dale Sumers, Athletic Director from West Fargo and passed.

The North Dakota High School Athletic Directors Association presented their Athletic Director of the Year Awards.

The report of the Nominating Committee was presented by Supt. Herbert Johnson of Bowman submitting the following names for vacancies on the Board of Directors for three year terms:

Class B Southwest Region - Calvin Sailer, South Heart Class B Southeast Region - Jerome Tjaden, Central Cass

Dr. Johnson moved for the acceptance of the submitted names, second by Supt. Cliff Moser of Larimore.

President Kunkel called for nominations from the floor, none were made and Supt. Oscar Peterson of Mott moved that nominations cease, second by Donald Dehne, Principal of Pargo North and carried.

Donald Strang, Chairman of the Board of Directors Basketball Committee introduced the Basketball Study Committee consisting of Athletic Director Dick Karlgaard of Bismarck, Chairman; Athletic Director Ron Luttschwager, Jamestown; Supt. Morris Martin, Richardton; Supt. Dave Schneider, Edmore; Supt. Del Zimmerman, Wishek; and Supt. R. L. Buchholz, Anamoose. Supt. Strang then gave the report of the Study Committee and informed the membership that the report would be refined for constitutional language and sent to the schools for study as soon as possible and that a mail ballot will be sent out in January for final consideration.

Ronald Broeker of Watford City moved to amend Part Two, Article XIII, Section VII: to read, "A student shall not be eligible to compete in interscholastic activities on or after the day on which the twentieth anniversary of his/her birth occurs; except that in the case of a hearing impaired child who is mainstreamed under Public Law 94-142, the hearing impaired child will be allowed to compete until he/she has completed the twelfth grade providing he/she is receiving special services as determined by an IEP. If as a result of circumstances beyond his/her control a student who is hearing impaired cannot be eligible for four years because of the age rule, that rule may be waived by the Eligibility Committee where the overall objectives of the Association and its member schools will not be undermined." Second by Dr. Ed Mundy of Minot. Motion defeated by voice vote.

Supt. Dale Hurt of New Salem moved to have the NDHSAA staff research what other states are doing concerning handicapped students being eligible for activities beyond the age limitations and report to the General Assembly at the January meeting. Second by Supt. Herb Johnson of Bowman and carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

North Dakota High School Activities Association
Minot, North Dakota - November 15, 1985

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at $1:30\,$ P.M. on November 15, 1985 at the Sheraton Riverside Inn in Minot with all members present.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the October Meeting. Mundy moved to approve the minutes of the last meeting, second by Ott and carried.

A special meeting of the General Assembly of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck on January 27, 1986 at 4:00 P.M. for the purpose of considering amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws.

President Richard Kunkel called the meeting to order. A quorum was established.

Parliamentarians Howard Snortland and Dr. Al Andrews were introduced.

Elmer Huber, Chairman of the Canvassing Committee, reported on the annual election of representatives of the Board of Directors as follows:

Scattered - 3

Supt. Roger Slotsve of Velva, Chairman of the Football Study Committee, gave a report on the progress of that committee.

Executive Secretary Bruce Anderson gave the following report on the survey requested by the General Assembly in October:

Forty-seven of the fifty State Associations responded:

38 States use the 19th birthday as the limit for eligibility.

9 States use the 20th birthday as the limit for eligibility.

All 47 states that replied to the survey limit participation in activities to 8 semesters once a student reaches the 9th grade.

All 47 states use the I.E.P.'s for special education students to determine scholastic eligibility.

7 states have a hardship appeal for students that have reached the age limitation for eligibility.

Supt. Steve Brannan of Trinity High School presented the following amendment to Part Two, Article III, Section IX and moved for its adoption.

No interschoʻlastic event shall be held on Sunday or from 12:00 noon Thursday to 12:00 noon Saturday of the North Dakota Education Association Convention.

Second by Supt. Kenneth Lanier of North Sargent. A short disucssion followed. The amendment then passed by a hand vote of 117 yes and 85 no.

Supt. Leon Johnson of Sargent Central then called for a roll call vote on the amendment. The motion for a roll call failed.

Supt. Ron Broeker of Watford City presented and moved for adoption an amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section VII:

A student shall not be eligible to compete in interscholastic activities on or after the day on which the twentieth anniversary of his/her birth occurs. A student that has passed his/her twentieth anniversary shall have the right to appeal to the Board of

Directors for extended eligibility in interscholastic activities.

Second by Supt. Mark Sanford of Grand Forks. A voice vote indicated the amendment failed.

Supt. Jerry Christianson of Wilton presented and moved for adoption a substitute amendment to Part Two, Article II "The Classification of Schools" to read:

Section I: Class AA Schools

- a. This group shall consist of all member high schools with a total enrollment of 325 or over, and/or an enrollment of 160 or more pupils in an all male school in grades 9-12, inclusive as of October 1, 1974, plus any member high school that elects to choose Class AA as provided in paragraph (b), (c), and (d) herewith.
- b. Any high school with a total enrollment between 200 and 324 in grades 9-12, inclusive on October 1, 1974, may elect to join Class AA for interscholastic competition by written notice to the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association before January 1, 1975.
- c. After classes are established on January 1, 1975, a member school having a total enrollment of more than 199 and less than 325 in grades 9-12 inclusive, must give two years notice to the Board of Directors to change its classification. Such choice must be made not later than September 1st of any year and shall become effective with the opening of the fall term two years later. Schools that elect to become Class AA schools must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification. Provided further, when the total high school enrollment in grades 9~12 drops below 325, and/or the enrollment in an all male school in grades 9-12 drops below 160, that school shall have one year of grace in which to choose its class of competition. Should an AA school drop below in enrollment in grades 9-12 and continue below 200 for two consecutive years, this school must be reclassified as an A school. Should a school rise above 324 in enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, and continue above that figure for two consecutive years, this school must be classified as an AA school.
- d. Should a new high school be established in an existing district or area, whose enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, exceeds 324, the two year waiting period stated in paragraph (c) above shall be waived and the school shall be immediately classified as an AA school.

Section II: Class A Schools

This group shall consist of the 96 largest member high schools, exclusive of Class AA, as determined by the Board of Directors of the N.D.H.S.A.A.

Section III: Class B Schools

- a. All member high schools other than those designated Class AA or A shall be classified as Class B.
- b. Any Class B school may initially elect to join Class A for interscholastic competition by written notice to the Board of Directors of the N.D.H.S.A.A. no later than September 1, 1986. Schools that elect to become Class A must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification.
- c. After September 1, 1986, any Class B school may elect to join Class A for interscholastic competition by written notice to the Board of Directors of the N.D.H.S.A.A. before September 1st of any year. The classification would become effective with the opening fall term two years later. Schools that elect to become Class A schools must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification.

Section IV: The N.D.H.S.A.A. Board of Directors will redesignate classifications every two years starting with the 1989-90 school year.

Section V: Class AA, A & B schools shall compete in separate classes to determine state basketball championships. The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is authorized to combine classes in other athletic or non-athletic contests and festivals.

Second by Supt. Dean Koppelman of Linton.

Supt. Wesley Kessler of Washburn then moved to postpone action on the amendments to Part Two, Article II until it could be determined whether or not the membership desires a three class basketball system.

Supt. Norman Batterberry of Max seconded the motion. A lengthy discussion followed. The vote indicated the motion to postpone failed.

The vote on the substitute amendment then failed.

Supt. Morris Martin of Richardton on behalf of the Basketball Study Com-

mittee then presented and moved for adoption an amendment to Part Two.

Article II "The Classification of Schools" to read:

Section I: Class AA Schools

This group shall consist of the 16 largest member high schools as of October 1, 1986.

Section II: Class A Schools

This group shall consist of 32 member high schools as determined by the Board of Directors of the N.D.H.S.A.A. according to size and geographical location.

Section III: Class B Schools

All member high schools other than those designated Class AA or A shall be classified as Class B.

Section IV: The N.D.H.S.A.A. Board of Directors will redesignate classification every two years starting with the 1989-90 school year.

Section V: Class AA, A & B schools shall compete in separate classes to determine state basketball championships. The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is authorized to combine classes in other athletic or non-athletic contests and festivals.

Supt. David Schneider of Edmore seconded.

Supt. R. L. Buchholz of Anamoose moved to amend the section on Class A Schools from 32 to 48 schools.

Supt. Steve SedImayr of Leonard seconded.

Motion was defeated 77 yes 117 no

Supt. Dave Schneider of Edmore requested a roll call vote. The request was defeated. 54 yes 149 no

After a lengthy discussion the original motion was defeated. , 73 yes 133 no

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association reconvened at 1:30 P.M. on March 14th at the Sheraton Riverside Inn in Minot with all members present.

Rod Romine of Minot representing the KX Network appeared before the Board to discuss the upcoming TV bids. He informed the Board that his network favored the continuation of a package bid for TV rights to NDHSAA events.

Dick Karlgaard and Sheryl Solberg appeared before the Board to report on the Drugs & Alcohol Workshop they attended at Hazelden-Cork in Minneapolis. Karlgaard informed the Board of a conference that is being planned in Bismarck in May. After a period of discussion Sanford moved that the NDHSAA endorse the efforts of schools to work in the area of drug and alcohol education, second by Tjaden and carried.

Olson reported on behalf of the TV Committee and made the following recommendations:

- Live TV reports be allowed from NDHSAA sites by stations who do not have the contract as long as no live action is shown.
- 2. Consider bids for football championships after teams and sites are determined.
- Require TV bids be submitted in a package for the Class A Girls' and Boys' Basketball, Class B Girls' & Boys' Basketball and Hockey.

Ott moved to adopt the TV Committee report, second by Oison and carried.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Class B District Chairmen and will take action on these requests at the April Board Meeting.

The Executive Staff was instructed to contact the NDHSCA and get information dealing with the selection of Coaches of the Year and selection of players for summer all-star competition.

The Board reviewed the final financial report for Wrestling as submitted by the Assistant Executive Secretary. They also reviewed the Class A State Wrestling Tournament and the new format used for 1986. Sailer moved to use the same format for the 1987 Tournament in Minot, second by Ott and carried.

The Executive Secretary gave preliminary financial reports for Boys' Basketball and Hockey and informed the Board a final report will be available for the April Board Meeting.

Roger Slotsve reported to the Board on behalf of the Football Study Committee and made the following recommendations:

- 1. Class A football to be left as is, three regions -- EDC, WDA and North Star.
 - 2. To use a weighted participation formula in determing co-op counts. Four times the number of participants from the cooperating schools with a cap of 50 percent of its enrollment. Students grades 9-12 will be used in participation counts. The previous two year average will be used to determine participation count.
 - The largest 36 class B schools, by enrollment, to be placed in four regions to play 11-man football with play-off format.
- To allow smaller schools to petition up to 11-man football, but not down to 9-man football.
- 5. The plan should go into effect the fall of 1987 and the 1986 Department of Public Instruction fall enrollment report to be used to determine enrollment. School placement should be adjusted every two years.
- 6. No school should move to a lower class of competition for this two year period, but that special consideration be given to schools dropping out of a co-op or schools starting a new football program.
- To establish one division of 9-man football, placing them into eight regions and to continue with existing play-off format.
- Schools that are not willing to play in division assigned will not be eligible for football play-offs.

Howe moved to accept the Football Study Committee report and refer it to the NDHSAA Football Committee, second by Huber and carried.

The Board reorganized for the 1986-87 year. An election was held and Don Strang was elected president for 1986-87 and Mark Sanford was elected vice president for the same year.

Duane Schindler and Pete Davis from TMCHS appeared before the Board to discuss an incident that occurred in a B Squad Basketball Tournament that was held in Rolette. After a period of discussion the Assistant Executive Secretary was instructed to contact the official involved and the Rolette school officials and then report back to the Board.

The Board considered a football co-op between Page and Hope that was tabled at the last Board Meeting. Supt. Lyle Peterson of Hope appeared before the Board to answer questions. After a period of discussion Huber moved to approve the request, second by Howe and carried.

HOWEVER, IF THE SUSPENSION IS NOT IMPOSED AND THE STUDENT IS FOUND TO BE IN VIOLA-TION OF THE ALCOHOL, TOBACCO AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE RULE ANY INTERSCHOLASTIC CONTESTS OR ACTIVITIES PARTICIPATED IN BY THAT STUDENT AFTER THE INITIAL HEARING WILL BE FORFEITED AND THE SUSPENSION WILL START FROM THE DATE THAT GUILT WAS ESTABLISHED. Such hearing shall be on notice and conducted by a school administrator. The student shall have the right to be present at the hearing and offer such testimony and other evidence the student deems material. Such student shall also have the right to confront and question the person or persons who complained of such student's violation of this NDHSAA rule. If the student is not satisfied by the ruling of the hearing officer, such student shall have the right to have the ruling reviewed by the local Board of Education.

After a lengthy period of discussion Ott moved to table the motion until the June Board Meeting and to send this new policy out to all schools for their consideration, second by Tjaden and carried.

Sanford reported on behalf of the Promotions Committee and informed the Board that the Team Scholar Awards, Sportsmanship Program and Class B Parade of Champions had all been very popular and should be continued.

Huber reported on behalf of the Personnel Committee and informed the Board of a staff request changing the policy Tjaden reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws dealing with vacation time. Huber moved to allow NDHSAA current year, second by Ott and carried.

Board of Directors

North Dakota High School Activities Association

Valley City, North Dakota - June 12, 13, 1986

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office at 10:00 A.M. on June 12, 1986 with all members present except Mundy.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the April meeting. Motion by Ott to approve the minutes, second by Strang and carried.

The financial reports of the General Fund from July 1, 1985 to May 30, 1986 were reviewed by the Board. Tjaden moved to accept the financial reports, second by Strang and carried.

Rick Fitzner gave the Board a report on the ABF and after a review by the Board, Olson moved to accept the report, second by Huber and carried.

The Assistant Executive Secretary presented a final report on the T-Shirt sales for 1985-86. Motion by Sailer to accept the report and continue the program for 1986-87, second by Olson and carried.

Supt. Rudy Hanson of Marion appeared before the Board to ask the Board to consider sponsoring Class B Girls' Golf. After a period of discussion Olson moved to sponsor Class B Girls' Golf starting in the spring of 1987, second by Sailer and carried.

The Board reviewed the financial report of the 1986 State Track Meet that was presented by the Asst. Executive Secretary and compared it with the cost when the two meets were held separately.

Sailer reported on behalf of the Football Committee that they unanimously approve the new football plan and that it be placed on the August Agenda for final action by the Board.

The Asst. Executive Secretary reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee and presented the Board with a new division of schools for Class B Track starting in the spring of 1987. Motion by Sailer to approve the new division of schools, second by Olson and carried.

Tjaden reported on behalf of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee and moved that Board regulation #4 on page 47 be amended to include Volleyball and 3 students be allowed on same team, second by Sailer and carried.

Tjaden reported that his committee still did not know what to do with the policy change dealing with Article XIII, Section XII of the ByLaws. After a lengthy period of discussion the Constitution and ByLaws Committee was charged with the task of studying all parts of the NDHSAA Constitution and ByLaws that deals with suspension of students for violations of NDHSAA rules.

- 2. Teams that qualify for state through regionals must declare the five gymnasts in each of the individual events that will compete for team score. This must be done by noon on the Monday following the regional meet.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Hockey Advisory Committee and upon motion by Sailer and second by Tjaden the following recommendations were approved:

- 1. Recommend changing starting times to 12 noon, 2:30 P.M., 6:00 P.M., and 8:30 P.M. on Thursday and Friday.
- Recommend moving the 5th & 6th place game to 12 noon and the 3rd and 4th place game to Saturday afternoon at 2:30 P.M. and the championship game at 7:30 P.M.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Swimming Advisory Committee and upon motin by Tjaden and second by Ott the following recommendations were approved:

The Board reviewed recommendations from the Class B District Chairmen and took action on the following items:

- 1. Recommend using one hotel for teams at State Tournaments with security.
- 2. Request a NDHSAA Official be present for all regional tournament trophy presentations.
- Recommend fan -shaped bankboards be used at all regional tournament sites. Tjaden moved that all NDHSAA Tournament sites must have fan-shaped bankboard, second by Olson and carried.
- 4. Recommend the State Team: Champions in all events be listed in the Class A & B State Boys' Basketball Tournament booklet.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Class A Regional Chairmen and took no action because they will all be covered later in Advisory Committee reports.

The Board reviewed the Basketball Advisory Committee recommendations and upon motion by Sanford and second by Howe the following items were adopted:

- Recommend reducing the number of officials to be voted on the ballot for state tournaments.
- 2. Recommend having all teams stay at same motel during state tournaments.
- 3. Equalize the number of regular season games allowed between girls' and boys' season.

- 5. Recommend having girls' basketball officials take test during the girls' season.

- Recommend changing the make-up of Class B Track Regions, possibly to the same as used for basketball.
- Recommend changing the starting time for the first day of the State Meet to 11:00 A.M. for field events and 11:30 A.M. for running events.
- Recommend to allow qualifying in the pole vault and high jump at invitational meets only if a fiberglass crossbar is used.
- Recommend allowing coaches to vote for regional and state meet starters at the track rules clinics.
- Recommend rotating the order of competition at the State Track Meet. Next year will be Class A Girls, Class B Girls, Class A Boys, Class B Boys.
- 8. Discussed problem of illegal implements being used in the throwing events during regular season track meets. Recommended it be a point of emphasis at rules clinics next year and take NDHSAA scale to rules clinics.
- 9. Recommend using declaration method for both Class A and B participation in the State Track Meet. Coaches must declare what events their athletes will enter by 10:00 A.M. on the Thursday prior to the State Meet. This will include the following events: 100, 200 and 400 meter dashes and the hurdle races.

1. Seasons:

- A. Add one week to the girls' swimming season making a 13 week season. The season will always begin two weeks before Labor Day counting 13 weeks to set the State Meet. Wish to set for 1986.
- B. Boys' season shall be 14 weeks with the State Meet set for the same weekend as boys' Class A basketball regional tournaments.
- 2. Relay times shall be included on the regular season qualifying forms. These times will be used to assist in seeding at the State Meet. A team may enter a slower relay time but may not list a time faster than any regular season times.
- 3. Recommend changing the consideration times from 103% to 105% of the qualifying times.
- 4. Set State Meet times as follows:

12. Switch the 300 Meter Hurdles and 800 Meter Relay in the Friday schedule.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Volleyball Advisory Committee and upon motion by Sanford and second by Strang approved the following items:

- 1. The state tournament shall be a two day events using the three of five game match format.
- Regional and state team rosters may consist of fourteen players of which any twelve may dress for a tournament match.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Wrestling Advisory Committee and upon motion by Ott and second by Tjaden approved the following items:

Class A

- Recommend same format for state tournament next year that
 was used this year with the following modifications:
 - A. Use five mats instead of four all day Friday until the semi-finals..
 - B. Use three mats for the fourth and fifth round wrestleback on Saturday.
 - C. Only cross bracket twice instead of three times.

Class A & Class B

- Recommend that wrestling weight permits may be done by either a doctor or a certified athletic trainer.
- Recommend that home and visiting teams alternate putting their wrestler on the mat first by the odd and even choice at the beginning of the dual match. (If permission is granted by National Federation).

- 1. Reminders to Directors at Clinics:
 - A. Emphasize note on Rule I, Page 20 -- "No Pop Music in Miscellaneous Mixed Musical Ensembles."
- 2. Large Groups









NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: The significant accounting policies followed are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

Fund Accounting

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the user of resources available, the accounts of the association are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purposes. Separate accounts are maintanined for each fund. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group.

The assets, liabilities, and fund balances of the association are reported in self-balancing fund groups as follows:

Operating funds, which include unrestricted and restricted resources, represent the portion of expendable funds that is available for support of the operations of the association. The operating fund has been subdivided into the general fund and the accident benefit fund.

Plant funds represent resources restricted to plant acquisitions and other plant expenditures.

Basis of Accounting

All funds are accounted for using the accrual basis. Revenues are recognized when earned and expenditures are expensed in the period they are incurred.

Plant Assets and Depreciation

Uses of operating funds for plant acquisitions are accounted for as transfers to plant funds. Proceeds from the sale of plant assets are included in the operating fund balances. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is provided over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets on a straight-line basis.

- 2. INVESTMENTS: The association pools its funds and keeps them invested for maximum yield. On June 30, 1986, .5% of the investments were in a local bank, 34.2% in a local savings & loan association and 65.3% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. This is in comparison to June 30, 1985, when .4% of the investments were in a local bank and 36% in two local savings and loan associations and 63.6% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. Investments consist primarily of money market and time savings certificates which bear interest at rates from 6.2% to 12.5%. The average yield for the year ended June 30, 1986 was 9.9% compared to 11.4% for the prior year.
- 3. RESERVES AND UNDESIGNATED BALANCES: The board has designated or reserved portions of funds for contingencies and special purposes. The reserves are reviewed and updated, if necessary, on an annual basis by the board of directors. Unclaimed checks issued in excess of one year are restored to the bank accounts and carried as a liability for a period extending beyond the six year requirement of the statute of limitations.

Undesignated balances are intended to be maintained at only a nominal level.

RETIREMENT PLANS: The association has provided elective retirement plans for the administrative staff. These rotirement plans provide for 6½ of the salary to be contributed by employees which is matched by the association. The funds are in a trust with a local savings & lona association.

After July 1, 1979, professional staff members (that are qualified teachers) have been included in the state teachers retirement plan. Contribution and matching requirements are also 64% of salaries. Beginning July 1, 1983, the association agreed to fund the entire contribution of 12.5% for those covered under the teachers retirement plan.

The associations contribution totaled \$22,869.99 in 1986 and \$21,402.60 in 1985.

The employee's contributions (currently 6.25% of salaries) and related earnings are fully vested at all times. Retiring or terminating employees are entitled to withdraw such funds in a lump sum distribution.

The association's matching contributions and related earnings are payable to the employee over ten years on retirement at or after age 65.

If termination occurs after the tenth year, an employee can elect to defer all distributions until reaching age 65 and then obtain benefits as a retiring employee. If an employee terminates employment before retirement, these funds become partially vested as follows:
