

## **FOREWORD**

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 63rd Annual Yearbook which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

- 1. 1986-87 marked the 79th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Once again our membership decreased and dipped to 237 high schools.
- 2. The ABF once again suffered a substantial loss for the year due to increased medical costs and a continued increase in the number of family policies with \$300 and \$500 deductible clauses.
- 3. The General Fund did manage to show a surplus despite the deficit start in fall sports because of the snow storm that reduced crowds at the football playoffs and at the girls' basketball tourna-
- 4. The Board of Directors voted to use the surplus in the General Fund to help hold down increases in the ABF rates to member schools.
- 5. A complete audit of the General Fund and ABF can be found in the back of this publication.

The NDHSAA staff extends a sincere thanks to all the administrators, athletic directors, coaches and activities directors for your support and cooperation this past year. We will continue to make every effort to provide you and your school with the best possible service in 1987-88.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the annual Audit of the Association for the 1985-86 fiscal year as prepared by James Lochow, Certified Public Accountant of Valley City. Upon motion by Tjaden and second by Mundy the report was approved as presented.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the investments and interest accounts of the North Dakota High School Activities Association for the past year with the Board. Motion by Olson, second by Sanford to accept the reports as presented and carried.

The Board reviewed a yearly financial report for all activities sponsored by the NDHSAA. Motion by Sailer, second by Mundy to accept this report as presented and carried.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the 1985-86 fiscal year with the Board and proposed a 1986-87 budget of \$686,100.00.

Mundy reported for the Finance Committee and informed the Board his committee had reviewed the 1985-86 fiscal year and the proposed budget for 1986-87 and moved to accept both the report for the fiscal year and the budget for 1986-87 as proposed. Second by Ott and carried.

Tjaden reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee and informed the Board they had carefully reviewed the parts of the Constitution and ByLaws dealing with training violations and penalties. He informed the Board his committee will have definite changes for them to review at the September meeting and to present to the General Assembly in October.

Sailer reported for the Trophy Committee and informed the Board the items to consider had been tabled until the September meeting.

Supt. Dean Koppelman of Linton and Supt. Bob Tollefson of Napoleon appeared before the Board to speak against the new football plan that was developed by the NDHSAA Football Study Committee.

The Board discussed Association cars. Tjaden moved to advertise for bids to sell the 1986 cars and to order two 1987 cars, second by Sailer and carried.

Marleen Norris of Wilton appeared before the Board to explain her concerns over large group band competition. After a lengthy period of discussion Howe moved to refer this item to Committee, second by Sailer and carried.

Tjaden reported on behalf of the Football Committee and moved that the following items as submitted by the Football Study Committee be approved and that it be implemented for the fall of 1987, second by Olson and carried.

- Class A football to be left as is, three regions, EDC, WDA, and North Star.
- 2. To use a weighted participation formula in determining co-op counts. Four times the number of participants from the cooperating schools with a cap of 50 percent of its enrollment. Students grades 9-12 will be used in participation counts. The previous two year average will be used to determine participation count.
- 3. The largest 36 class B schools, by enrollment, to be placed in four regions to play 11-man football with play-off format.
- To allow smaller schools to petition up to 11-man football, but not down to 9-man football.
- 5. The plan should go into effect the fall of 1987 and the 1986 Department of Public Instruction fall enrollment report be used to determine enrollment. School placement should be adjusted every two years.
- 6. No school should move to a lower class of competition for this two year period, but that special consideration be given to schools dropping out of a co-op or schools starting a new football program.
- To establish one division of 9-man football, placing them into eight regions and to continue with existing play-off format.
- 8. Schools that are not willing to play in division assigned will not be eligible for football play-offs.

The Board heard a report on Chemical Abuse Seminars being sponsored by the Bismarck Public Schools for their coaches and student leaders. These seminars will be put on by Hazelden-Cork from Minneapolis on September 29th & 30th. They agreed to hold another seminar on October 1st for coaches and student leaders from other schools at a cost of \$1,000. Ott moved to have the NDHSAA sponsor this seminar on October 1st, second by Mundy and motion was defeated by voice vote. The Executive Secretary was instructed to contact Hazelden-Cork and see what the cost would be to put on regional meetings in the state for NDHSAA member schools.

The Board was informed that the Coaches Association request to house boys' basketball teams in the same motel had been accomplished. Teams at the State Class B Tournament in Fargo will stay at the Townhouse Motel and teams at the State Class A Tournament in Bismarck will stay at the Kirkwood Motel.

The Board was informed that the NDHSAA is not covered by Liability Insurance on the ABF program. The Executive Secretary was instructed to contact Ruedlinger's to see what it would cost to get this coverage.

There being no further business the Board Meeting adjourned.

- B. If tied teams have not played each other during the regular season, a point system for rating the teams should be used:
  - 1. 100 Points are awarded for each win, provided the defeated team is in same classification.
  - No points are awarded for a defeat; however, the game will count as one of the qualifying games in computing the rating average.
  - 3. 10 Bonus points are awarded for each win that the defeated team has through the course of the season, provided the wins are against teams in the same class.
  - 4. The rating average is determined by dividing a team's total points awarded by the number of qualifying games played -- carried out to .000.
- C. If teams remain tied after implementing preceding criteria, a coin toss will be held by NDHSAA to determine home field.
- D. When weather conditions are not conducive to playing at the formula determined site, NDHSAA will have option to name an alternate site.
- 2. Recommend that the awards ceremony following the semifinal game will be conducted in the same manner as the awards ceremony following the championship game. If detailed ceremony is needed for individual sites, the NDHSAA will provide a uniform ceremony criteria that has been adhered to generally in the past.
- 3. Recommend that two meetings of the Football Advisory Committee be held. The first to be held at the summer Coaches' Clinic and the second following the season.

## CLASS B 9 & 11-MAN RECOMMENDATIONS

- Recommend that games played against JV teams do not count in determining power ratings of team.
- Sites for all Football playoff games will be set by NDHSAA after participating teams have been determined.
- 3. Recommend using the same tie breaking procedure for Class B 11-man that is used in Class B 9-man football.
- 4. Recommend advancing the top two teams in each region to the playoffs for Class B 11-man football.

- 4. The eight regional champions in each weight class will receive the greatest consideration for one of the eight seeded positions. After this consideration the criteria developed by the coaches will be used.
- After placing the eight seeded wrestlers, the remainder will be placed by open draw, with no consideration where regional winner was seeded.
- Each two region areas will be responsible to select one coach to represent them on the seeding committee.
- 7. Any other provisions necessary to be developed by Asst. Executive Secretary.

Second by Ott and carried.

The Board reviewed a communique from Bismarck St. Mary's expressing concern over losing students because of not allowing students from public junior highs to wrestle with St. Mary's after the close of the junior high season. The Board took no action.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

### MINUTES

Special Meeting of General Assembly North Dakota High School Activities Association January 26, 1987 - Bismarck, N.D.

A special meeting of the General Assembly of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck on January 26, 1987 at 4:00 P.M. for the purpose of considering amendments to the Constitution and ByLaws.

President Don Strang called the meeting to order. A quorum was established.

Parliamentarian Howard Snortland was introduced.

Elmer Huber, Chairman of the Canvassing Committee reported on the annual election of representatives of the Board of Directors as follows:

Class A East Region

Dr. Mark Sanford ---- 173 Scattered----- 5

Class B Northeast Region

Mel Olson ----- 166 Scattered ----- 4

Class B Northwest Region

Jerome Enget ----- 117 Roger Slotsve ----- 98

Executive Secretary Bruce Anderson gave a brief report on the new Board policy dealing with cheerleader pyramids.

Supt. Ron Broeker of Watford City presented and moved for adoption the following amendment to his original amendment to Part Two, Article XIII. Section VII:

A student shall not be eligible to compete in interscholastic activities on or after the day on which the twentieth anniversary of his/her birth occurs; except for a student who is past his/her twentieth anniversary and has a written Special Education IEP and has not had the opportunity to avail themselves of eight semesters of participation in interscholastic activities. That student will be eligible for consideration of a waiver by the NDHSAA Board of Directors or their committee, upon a showing that the denial of this opportunity was by reason of the handicapping condition and would not be likely to result in a substantial risk of injury to younger participants.

Second by Supt. Mark Sanford of Grand Forks, and was passed by voice vote.

After a period of discussion Supt. Broeker moved for adoption of this substitute amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section VII, second by Supt. Mike Worner of Garrison and was defeated by voice vote. Supt. Larry Nudell of Harvey presented and moved for adoption an amendment to Part Two, Article XII, Section II Boys' Basketball to read as follows:

c. Total games played by any boys' team shall not exceed sixteen season games or fourteen season games and one invitational tournament. Any boy may not participate in more than eighty quarters of competition or seventy quarters plus four quarters in an invitational tournament and one tournament of a lower level, nor more than five quarters in an evening.

Second by George Wieland of Drake and a lengthy period of discussion followed.

Supt. Reid Straabe of Alexander presented a substitute motion to change the game limitation to 17 games or 15 games plus one invitational tournament. Second by Mike Worner of Garrison and the substitute motion was defeated by voice vote.

The Chairman then called for the vote on the original amendment to Part Two, Article XII, Section II and it was defeated by a vote of 73 Yes and 128 No.

Supt. Nudell withdrew his proposed amendment to Part Two, Article XII, Section VI, Girls' Basketball.

Supt. Gerald Christianson of Wilton presented and moved for adoption an amendment to Part Two, Article I, Section V: Committees, to read as follows:

All Committees, whether standing or special, shall be appointed by the President unless otherwise provided by the Representative Assembly.

A Nominating Committee, consisting of not less than three nor more than five members, shall be appointed by the President at least two weeks prior to the annual meeting of the Representative Assembly for the purpose of nominating members to fill vacancies on the Board of Directors as provided in Article V, Section II of the Constitution.

The Nominating Committee shall submit two nominees, for each vacancy and the Representatives shall have the power to make additional nominations from the floor.

Second by Cliff Moser of Larimore and was passed by a voice vote.

Jerome Tjaden representing the Board of Directors of the NDHSAA presented and moved for adoption the following amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section V; Rules of Eligibility to read as follows:

Second by Lewis Getz of Beach and was passed by a standing vote of the delegates.

Jerome Tjaden presented and moved for adoption the following amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section VIII; Rules of Eligibility to read as follows:

Section VIII After attending the first semester of the ninth grade he/she shall have credit on the school records in the unit-per-year or half-unit-per-semester subjects of at least four half units earned and recorded at the close of the last semester in which he/she was enrolled as a student, thirty days or more of attendance or participation in interscholastic competition within any shorter period being sufficient to constitute enrollment in any semester. Failure to acquire four half units at the end of a semester will make him/her ineligible for a period of four weeks the following semester.

Second by George Wieland of Drake and was passed by a standing vote of the delegates.

Jerome Tjaden presented and moved for adoption the following amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section XII; Rule of Eligibility to read as follows:

Section XII The use or possession of tobacco, alcohol, or any controlled substance as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extra-curricular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities. Penalties will be prescribed as follows:

## A. First Violation

- Penalty: After confirmation of the first violalation, the student shall lose eligibility for the next two (2) consecutive interscholastic events or two (2) weeks of a season in which the the student is a participant, whichever is greater.
- Recommendation: It is recommended that the studdent receive counseling from a community agency or professional individual such as a drug counselor, medical doctor, psychiatrist or psychologist.

## B. Second Violation

- Penalty: After confirmation of the second violalation, the student shall lose eligibility for the next four (4) consecutive interscholastic events or four (4) weeks of a season in which the student is a participant, whichever is greater.
- Requirement: It is required that before being re-admitted to activities following suspension for the second violation, the student shall show evidence in writing that he/she has received counseling from a community agency or professional individual such as a drug counselor, medical doctor, psychiatrist or psychologist.

## C. Third Violation or Subsequent Violations

- Penalty: After confirmation of the third or subsequent violations, the student shall lose eligibility for the next eight (8) consecutive interscholastic events or eight (8) weeks of a season in which the student is a participant, whichever is the greater.
- 2. Requirement: It is required that before being re-admitted to activities following suspension for the third, or subsequent violations, the student must become a participant in a chemical dependency program or treatment programs and the student must receive a certificate of completion or be certified as a non-dependent person by the director or a counselor of said chemical dependency treatment center.
- D. In those NDHSAA sponsored activities in which a member school does not have a schedule of interscholastic contests, exclusive of NDHSAA sponsored tournaments (Examples: music, drama, speech, student congress, etc.), the penalty for violation will be a minimum of one event.
- E. Penalties shall be accumulative beginning with and throughout the student's participation in NDHSAA sponsored activities from Grade 7 through 12.

Second by Dick Karlgaard of Bismarck and was defeated by a standing vote of the delegates.

Jerry Tjaden asked the delegates for their opinion on a Board policy dealing with violations of Section XII. Seventy-five schools indicated they favored the new interpretation and fifty-nine did not.

Supt. Gerald Christianson of Wilton presented the following proposed change to Part Two of the Constitution under Article V, Section I and Section II to read as follows:

Section I: There shall be a board of directors, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of ten members, elected as hereinafter prescribed. As of July 1, 1987 each new member, elected by the member schools shall be seated July 1st following his/her election for a term of four years and may not hold office more than one elected term. Further, members serving their first term shall have their term extended to four years and members serving their second term shall complete their three year term with the following exceptions: The term of office of the Class A representative from the west district shall expire in 1991 and the term of office of the Class B southeast representatives shall expire in 1988. Three members of the Board shall be chosen from Class A schools, each from a geographical area as follows: The state shall be divided into three areas - one area from the Montana border east of U.S. Highway 83, including Bismarck and Minot - one area from U.S. Highway 83 east to State Highway 32 one area from State Highway 32 east to the Minnesota border. Four members of the Board shall be chosen from Class B schools, each from a geographical area as follows: The state shall be divided into four areas with U.S. Highway 83 and State Highway 14 north and south and State Highway 200 east and west forming the boundaries of said areas and one member will be from each area. Class B schools located in towns on the boundary lines as designated shall fall in the area as determined by the location of the high school building in said towns in relation to the boundary lines. A secondary school principal, as so defined by the Department of Public Instruction, shall serve as an ex-officio member of said Board. He/she shall be elected by the member schools in the same manner as the other seven elective Board members and his/her term of office shall also be the same. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or a member of his/her duly constituted staff, designated by him/her shall serve as an ex-officio member of said Board. One school board member from a member high school, or the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association, shall be selected by the executive committee of the North Dakota School Boards Association and his/her term of office shall be the same as that of other elective Board members, except that there shall be no limitation on the number of consecutive terms which the executive director of the Noth Dakota School Boards Association may serve. Should this member cease to be a school board member from a member high school, or the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association, the position shall be declared vacant and a successor selected by the Board of Directors of the School Boards Association to fill the unexpired term.

Section II: Board members shall be nominated at the annual meeting of the Representatives of the Association, hereinafter called the Representative Assembly, and shall be elected by mail ballot, such ballot to be prepared by the Secretary and mailed to member schools on or before January first following the nomination and shall be returned to the Secretary before January fifteenth. The ballot is valid if the envelope in which it is mailed is postmarked before midnight of January fourteenth.

Should any member move from the state or profession change into a different class school, cease to be an administrator, or should the secondary principals' representative cease to be a principal of a member school, his/her position shall be declared vacant immediately and a new member appointed by the Board to fill the vacancy until the next annual meeting when the regular procedure of nomination and balloting shall be followed to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term of office.

Mail ballot will be sent to schools on January 27, 1987.

Supt. Dean Koppelman of Linton moved to have the NDHSAA Board of Directors continue to work on a change in Part Two, Article XIII, Section XII under the Rules of Eligibility because he felt it was a needed change but many details had to be worked out. Second by Dick Karlgaard and carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Because it was determined that the basketball game played in by Wayne Poitra was a non-athletic contest and was just part of the family weekend activities. Second by Olson and carried.

The Board was informed of a request from Richard Crockett the attorney for Chad Prosser asking for a rehearing of this eligibility case. The Board took no action on this request at this time.

### MINUTES

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors Meeting March 13, 1987 - Bismarck, N.D.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck at 1:30 P.M. on March 13, 1987 with all members present.

The Board first reviewed the minutes of the previous meeting and Kunkel moved to approve, second by Ott and carried.

Each member of the Board was furnished with a packet containing a complete financial report of the General Fund and the ABF Fund from July 1, 1986 to February 27, 1987. The Board reviewed the various reports and upon motion by Olson and second by Huber all reports were approved.

The Executive Secretary reported that all professional and secretarial staff had accepted the contract offer for 1987-88. Huber moved to issue contracts. Second by Tjaden and carried.

The Board discussed the new academic eligibility rules that were passed by the General Assembly in January. Tjaden moved that this new rule go into effect on July 1, 1987 and that students next fall be required to have passed four classes the previous semester to be eligible to compete, second by Mundy and carried. The Executive Secretary was instructed to inform schools of this interpretation immediately.

N. DAK. HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

Kunkel reported on behalf of the Trophy Committee and asked each Board member to study the list of trophies now being presented and be ready to make any recommendations at the Fargo Board meeting. Kunkel also reviewed the procedure to be used in June for the Trophy bid letting.

Sailer reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee and moved to deny the request from District 18 to add one school to their district, second by Olson and carried. Sailer also requested that the twenty-four district plan be presented to the Committee at the Fargo meeting.

Huber reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee on the vote of membership to amend Part II, Article V, Section I & II of the Constitution to read:

Section I: There shall be a board of directors, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of ten members, elected as hereinafter prescribed. As of July 1, 1987 each new member, elected by the member schools shall be seated July 1st following his/her election for a term of four years and may not hold office more than one elected term. Further, members serving their first term shall have their term extended to four years and members serving their second term shall complete their three year term with the following exceptions: The term of office of the Class A representative from the west district shall expire in 1991 and the term of office of the Class B Southeast representative shall expire in 1988. Three members of the Board shall be chosen from Class A schools, each from a geographical area as follows: The state shall be divided into three areas - one area from the Montana border east of U.S. Highway 83, including Bismarck and Minot - one area from U.S. Highway 83 east to State Highway 32 - one area from State Highway 32 east to the Minnesota border. Four members of the Board shall be chosen from Class B schools, each from a geographical area as follows: The state shall be divided into four areas with U.S. Highway 83 and State Highway 14 north and south and State Highway 200 east and west forming the boundaries of said areas and one member will be from each area. Class B schools located in towns on the boundary lines as designated shall fall in the area as determined by the location of the high school building in said towns in relation to the boundary lines. A secondary school principal, as so defined by the Department of Public Instruction, shall serve as an ex-officio member of said Board. He/she shall be elected by the member schools in the same manner as the other seven elective Board members and his/her term of office shall also be the same. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or a member of his/her duly constituted staff, designated by him/her shall serve as an ex-officio member of said Board. One school board member from a member high school, or the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association, shall be selected by the executive committee of the North Dakota School Boards Association and his/her term of office shall be the same as that of other elective Board members, except that there shall be no limitation on the

number of consecutive terms which the executive director of the Noth Dakota School Boards Association may serve. Should this member cease to be a school board member from a member high school, or the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association, the position shall be declared vacant and a successor selected by the Board of Directors of the School Boards Association to fill the unexpired term.

Section II: Board members shall be nominated at the annual meeting of the Representatives of the Association, hereinafter called the Representative Assembly, and shall be elected by mail ballot, such ballot to be prepared by the Secretary and mailed to member schools on or before January first following the nomination and shall be returned to the Secretary before January fifteenth. The ballot is valid if the envelope in which it is mailed is postmarked before midnight of January fourteenth.

Should any member move from the state or profession change into a different class school, cease to be an administrator, or should the secondary principals' representative cease to be a principal of a member school, his/her position shall be declared vacant immediately and a new member appointed by the Board to fill the vacancy until the next annual meeting when the regular procedure of nomination and balloting shall be followed to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term of office.

Huber reported 123 yes votes and 93 no votes and that the amendment passed. Ott moved to accept the report of the Committee, second by Sanford and carried.

The Board reviewed the following applications submitted by schools for cooperative sponsorschip of activities:

Crary to Lakota - Football Plaza to North Shore - Boys' and Girls' Track

Sailer moved for approval of these applications, second by Howe and carried.

Assistant Executive Secretary Robert King reported on a hardship investigation for Ann Littlefield, a student at Fargo South High School. Huber moved to grant immediate eligibility under the hardship rule, second by Howe and carried.

Olson reported on the hardship investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Rocky Bracelin to Drayton from Montana and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be granted. Second by Mundy and carried.

Strang reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Jeff Gieser from Minot to Des Lacs-Burlington under the hardship rule and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be approved. The motion was seconded by Kunkel and carried.

Strang reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Mariam Packineau from Parshall to White Shield under the hardship rule and moved that the request for immediate eligibility be approved. Second by Tjaden and carried.

The Board reviewed a communique from Beach High School reporting themselves for using an ineligible wrestler. The Executive Secretary was instructed to send a letter to the school handling this situation.

The Board discussed the alcohol and controlled substance bylaw and instructed the Constitution and ByLaws Committee to continue working on the proposed change.

The Asst. Executive Secretary presented a request to allow Howard Hausauer of Bismarck to participate in the Pathmark National Scholastic Track Meet at Yale University. Sailer moved for approval, second by Mundy and carried.

The Board considered the Board policy listed on page 36 of the Constitution and ByLaws. Mundy moved to change the policy to read as follows:

## NDHSAA BOARD POLICY

Suggested Procedures When a Violation is Reported:

The School Administrator (Supt. or Principal) shall immediately investigate any alleged violation of the alcohol, tobacco and controlled substance rule, that is made known to the administrator and if the administrator finds probable cause to believe that this rule has been violated he shall give the student notice as provided below.

The period of suspension shall begin from the date and time notification is given to the student by the school administrator. The student shall have the right to a hearing within three school days after such notification. During the period between notification and hearing, the suspension may be deferred for good cause shown. HOWEVER.

IF THE SUSPENSION IS NOT IMPOSED AND THE STUDENT IS FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION OF THE ALCOHOL, TOBACCO AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE RULE ANY INTERSCHOLASTIC CONTESTS OR ACTIVITIES PARTICIPATED IN BY THAT STUDENT AFTER THE INITIAL HEARING WILL BE FORFEITED AND THE SUSPENSION WILL START FROM THE DATE THAT GUILT WAS ESTABLISHED. Such hearing shall be on notice and conducted by a school administrator. The student shall have the right to be present at the hearing and offer such testimony and other evidence the student deems material. Such student shall also have the right to confront and question the person or persons who complained of such student's violation of this NOHSAA rule. If the student is not satisfied by the ruling of the hearing officer, such student shall have the right to have the ruling reviewed by the local Board of Education.

Second by Kunkel and carried.

The Board heard a request from Bismarck St. Mary's asking for permission of public school students to compete at their school after the public school program is over, if an affidavit is signed by the parents saying their children will attend high school at St. Mary's. Ott moved to approve this request but motion died for lack of a second.

The Board then recessed until Friday, March 20, 1987 at 1:30 P.M. at the Fargo Holiday Inn.

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors Meeting April 23, 1987 - Valley City, N.D.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City at 1:30 P.M. with all members present.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the March meeting. Motion by Sanford to approve the minutes, second by Mundy and carried.

The financial reports of the General Fund from July 1, 1986 to April 10, 1987, and the NDHSAA Investments were reviewed by the Board. Motion by Kunkel to approve the reports, second by Huber and carried.

Rick Fitzner gave the Board a report on the ABF to date and after a review by 'the Board, Howe moved to accept the report, second by Olson and carried.

The Board reviewed the items presented by the Class A Regional Chairmen. The Board will consider those recommendations at the June meeting.

Tjaden reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee. Tjaden moved to add the following statement to Part II, Article XIII, Section XII under B-2 and also C-2.

- B-2 Requirement: It is required that before being re-admitted to activities following suspension for the second violation, the student shall show evidence in writing that he/she has received counseling from a community agency or professional individual such as a drug counselor, medical doctor, psychiatrist or psychologist. (The cost of the special services are not the responsibility of the School District.)
- C-2 Requirement: It is required that before being re-admitted to activities following suspension for the third, or subsequent violations, the student must become a participant in a chemical dependency program or treatment programs and the student must receive a certificate of completion or be certified as a non-dependent person by the director or a counselor of said chemical dependency treatment center. (The cost of the special services are not the responsibility of the School District.)

Second by Sailer and carried.

Tjaden moved to amend Part II, Article XIII, Section XII, letter E to read:

E. Penalties shall be accumulative beginning with and throughout the student's participation in NDHSAA sponsored activities in Grade 7 and 8. Penalties shall again be accumulative beginning with Grade 9 through Grade 12.

Second by Kunkel and carried.

Tjaden moved to present Part Two, Article XIII, Section XII, letter D as originally presented, second by Olson. After a lengthy period of discussion this part of the proposed change to the Bylaws was tabled to allow the Committee further study.

Ott reported on behalf of the ABF Committee and reviewed a survey conducted by the NDHSAA dealing with school involvement in the ABF Program. Because of the estimated loss in the ABF Program for the year, Ott moved to increase the all-sports premium by 20% for the 1987-88 school year, second by Mundy and carried.

Howe moved that starting with the 1988-89 school year the NDHSAA Board of Directors will set the sites and dates for all Class A Regional Basketball Tournaments. Second by Mundy and carried. The Board took no action on any other recommendations because they will be covered later in Advisory Committee reports.

The Board reviewed recommendations from Class B District Chairmen and took action on the following items:

- Recommend that each Class B School be allowed the option of purchasing four tickets for the State Class B Basketball Tournament.
- Recommend that basketball bids be for three or four years if possible.
- Recommend that players have a reserved area at regional and state tournaments. (Include this in information to managers)

The Board reviewed the Basketball Advisory committee recommendations and upon motion by Sailer and second by Huber the following items were approved:

- All teams stay at same Motel during Basketball Tournaments.
   If failure to do so, school would forfeit team payment for
  motel.
- Eliminate ranking officials in balloting for State Class A Basketball Tournaments.

A discussion was held on the use of rectangular backboards in basketball. Kunkel moved to allow either rectangular or fan backboards at regional basketball tournaments, second by Olson. A roll call vote was held: Kunkel - yes, Sanford - no, Huber - yes, Tjaden - no, Howe - yes, Mundy - no, Olson - yes, Sailer - yes, Strang - no. Motion was passed 5 - 4.

The recommendations of the Gymnastics Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Olson and second by Ott the following items were approved:

- 1. No Regional Meets will be held in Class B State Meet only.
- First, second and third place teams advance to State plus any team who scores one point or less from the third place team score in Class A Regional Meets.
- Addition to the recommended fees for gymnastics judges. Meet referees will be paid as a judge unless is judging and acting as Meet Referee. In this case an additional \$5 will be included in the fee.

The Golf Advisory Committee recommendations were reviewed and upon motion by Sanford and second by Ott the following item was approved:

 In case of a team tie, the two day total of the number five players will break the tie.

Tim Mueller representing the Prairie Rose State Games appeared before the Board to ask them to change policy on number of players allowed on a basketball team in non-school competition. The Board took no action on this request.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Hockey Advisory Committee and upon motion by Ott and second by Olson the following recommendations were approved:

1. Select State Tournament officials during January of the tournament year. Each head coach is responsible to send a list of nominated officials, to be received by the chairman of the hockey coaches' advisory committee before December 15, of the season in question. An overall ballot will be compiled of the officials so nominated and the list will make up the official ballot. The ballot will be required to be returned to Mr. Bruce Anderson (NDHSAA Executive Secretary - 134 NE Third St., Valley City, N.D. 58072) by January 15 of the tournament year. Coaches rank the top ten officials from the list. The top 8 vote-getters will be designated as referees and the next 2 as linesmen. The #11 and #12 vote-getters are alternates and will be used when needed according to past policy.

2. The tie-breaker plan is as follows:

If teams have earned equal number of total points (2 = win; 1 = tie) at the end of the regular season, their regional position shall be determined by:

- Most wins in head to head competition If still tied, then . . .
- Most goals scored head to head competition If still tied, then . . .
- Most wins against highest ranked team in the region (next team below if the teams are tied for first place.)
   If still tied, then . . .
- Greatest differential in goals for/goals against topranked team in region. (next team below if the teams are tied for first place.)
   If still tied, then . . .
- Coin flip by NDHSAA respresentative. <u>Winner of flip</u> gets higher seeding.

The Board reviewed a copy of a Swimming Handbook written by the Advisory Committee. Huber moved for approval, second by Ott and carried.

The recommendations of the Tennis Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Mundy and second by Tjaden the following items were approved:

- Regular season format for dual competition shall consist of a 6-3 line-up (6 singles and 3 doubles). (Recommendation to be sent to EDC for their consideration)
- For all regional and state play, no-ad scoring will be used for both team and individual day. All championship and consolation matches will be 2 of 3 set matches.
- Team line-up from regional to state play need not be limited to the roster of players entered in the region.
- 4. In the event that injury or illness during team play causes a player to forfeit their match, that vacated position will be a forfeit for all subsequent team matches unless injured or ill player is able to return.

Ott reported on behalf of the Target Committee. After a period of discussion Chairman Ott as instructed to send a letter to the Superintendent of Public Instruction, with a copy to the Governor asking them to develop a curriculum on Chemical Awareness that can be used by all schools.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Volleyball Advisory Committee and upon motion by Huber and second by Mundy approved the following items:

- 1. The Regional Tournament Schedule shall consist of three of five game matches with the exception of the consolation quarterfinal matches which will be two out of three game matches.
- Deadline for regular season play will be the Saturday prior to the Regional Tournaments which will be Friday and Saturday.

- Page 24, rule 15 "There shall be no duplication of literature between large groups and 2-12 ensembles from the same school for educational reasons if there is any duplication of performers."
- Page 22, add new rule 3 Performers must use same selection at state as awarded Star Rating with in Region.
- Page 6, item 2d Recommended state judges fee be rasied from \$75.00 to \$100.00 plus expenses.
- New recommended music list will be added to rule book.
- Names of "certified" judges will be added to rule book.
- Page 23, rule 8 Recommend that all Regional/State contest time slots be at least 8 minutes.
- Recommendation to Constitution and ByLaw Committee to consider proposed eligibility amendment of ByLaws of Part Two. Article XIII, Section XII concerning those students in music activities only: "Students in Regional Music contest only who violates said rule shall lose eligibility for 2 scheduled public performances or for 2 weeks ... whichever is greater."









#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: The significant accounting policies followed are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

Fund Accounting To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the user of resources available, the accounts of the association are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purposes. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group.

The assets, limbilities, and fund balances of the association are reported in self-balancing fund groups as follows:

Operating funds, which include unrestricted and restricted resources, represent the portion of expendable funds that is available for support of the operations of the association. The operating fund has been subdivided into the general fund and the accident benefit fund.

Plant funds represent resources restricted to plant acquisitions and other plant expenditures.

Basis of Accounting

All funds are accounted for using the accrual basis. Revenues are recognized when earned and expenditures are expensed in the period they are incurred.

Plant Assets and Depreciation Uses of operating funds for plant acquisitions are accounted for as transfers to plant funds. Proceeds from the sale of plant assets are included in the operating fund balances. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is provided over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets on a straight-line basis.

- INVESTMENTS: The association pools its funds and keeps them invested for maximum yield. On June 30, 1987, 4% of the investments were in a local bank, 17.4% in a local savings & loan association and 78.6% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. This is in comparison to June 30, 1986, when .5% of the investments were in a local bank and 34.2% in a local savings and loan association and 65.3% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. Investments consist primarily of money market and time savings certificates which bear interest at rates from 5.1% to 12.5%. The average yield for the year ended June 30, 1987 was 9.65% compared to 9,9% for the prior year.
- 3. RESERVES AND UNDESIGNATED BALANCES: The board has designated or reserved portions of funds for contingencies and special purposes. The reserves are reviewed and updated, if necessary, on an annual basis by the board of directors. Unclaimed checks issued in excess of one year are restored to the bank accounts and carried as a liability for a period extending beyond the six year requirement of the statute of limitations.

Undesignated balances are intended to be maintained at only a nominal lavel.

RETIREMENT PLANS: The association has provided elective retirement plans for the administrative staff. These retirement plans provide for 64% of the salary to be contributed by employees which is matched by the association. The funds are in a trust with a local savings & loan association.

After July 1, 1979, professional staff members (that are qualified teachers) have been included in the state teachers retirement plan. Contribution and matching requirements are also 61% of salaries. Beginning July 1, 1983, the association agreed to fund the entire contribution of 12.5% for those covered under the teachers retirement plan.

The associations contribution totaled \$24,284.40 in 1987 and \$22,869.99 in

The employee's contributions (currently 6.25% of salaries) and related earnings are fully vested at all times. Retiring or terminating employees are entitled to withdraw such funds in a lump sum distribution.

The association's matching contributions and related earnings are payable to the employee over ten years on retirement at or after age 65.

If termination occurs after the tenth year, an employee can elect to defer all distributions until reaching age 65 and then obtain benefits as a retiring employee. If an employee terminates employment before retirement, these funds become partially vested as follows:
