



FORWARD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 64th Annual Yearbook which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

- 1987-88 marked the 80th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Our membership dipped again down to 234 high schools.
- The biggest problem of the year was another substantial loss in the ABF. The problems remain the same, increased medical costs, higher deductibles and a declining number of schools joining the plan. Reserves are rapidly diminishing and if the trend continues, the membership must face increased rates or consider discontinuing the program.
- One of the highlights of the year was the Association's ability to increase team payments and mileage for regional and state tournaments in the amount of \$110,000 in pay back to the schools.
- Even with the increase in team payments, the General Fund finished the year with a surplus.
- A complete audit of the General Fund and ABF Fund can be found in the back of this publication.

This will be one of my last official acts as Executive Secretary and I would like to thank all of the administrators, athletic directors, coaches and activities directors for your support and cooperation the past eight years. It has been a real pleasure serving you. I leave your service knowing the association is in good hands with the very capable leadership of your office staff.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the investments and interest accounts of the NDHSAA for the past year with the Board. Motion by Kunkel, second by Sailer to accept the reports as presented and carried.

The Board reviewed a yearly financial report for all activities sponsored by the NDHSAA. Motion by Olson, second by Sailer to accept the report as presented.

The Board heard a report from the Finance Committee and after a careful review of all material presented, Kunkel moved to approve the admission prices listed below, second by Olson and carried.

Kunkel moved to make the following changes in team payments, second by Tjaden and carried.

- 1. Mileage will now be paid to schools for round trip mileage by the following formula:

 1 5 participants \$.20
 6 10 participants .40
 11 15 participants .60
 - Over 15 participants 1.00
- 2. The following changes in per diem paid at tournaments will be:

<u>VOLLEYBALL</u> - \$25.00 for 14 players plus 2 coaches at state tournament

WRESTLING - \$37.00 per wrestler plus 2 coaches at state tournaments

TRACK - \$28.00 per athlete plus 2 coaches at State Meet

BASKETBALL - Increase team allowance at Girls' & Boys' Regional Tournaments to \$150.00 per day.

Kunkel reported for the Finance Committee and informed the Board his Committee had reviewed the 1986-87 fiscal year and the proposed budget for 1987-88 as amended by previous Board action and moved to accept both the report for the fiscal year and the budget of \$745,100 for 1987-88 as amended. Second by Tjaden and carried.

Supt. Les Kramer and Athletic Director Del Hesse of Maddock and Athletic Director Dwight Leier of Esmond appeared before the Board to appeal previous action that denied these schools a coop in Girls' Basketball for the 1987-88 school year. After a period of discussion the Board tabled this until after other coop applications were to be considered.

Supt. Clay Dunlap of Zeeland appeared before the Board asking that students from the Hauge School District be allowed to transfer from Strasburg to Zeeland without any loss of eligibility because of a disagreement over tuition payments. The Board took no action at this time but will consider the request later in this meeting.

Supt. Kent Hart of Bowdon, Supt. Sherman Sylling of Fessenden and Supt. Robert Stringer of Sykeston appeared before the Board to ask consideration on a football coop that would allow Bowdon-Sykeston to go to Fessenden for 9-man football. Reason for the request was a lack of participants in the Bowdon-Sykeston program. The Board tabled this request until other coops would be considered.

The Board considered a request from the North Dakota "Hall of Fame" asking the NDHSAA to provide a "Parade of Champions" display in their building. The Board took no action on this and will request a tour of the building as part of their October meeting in Bismarck.

The Board discussed Association cars. Howe moved to advertise for bids to sell the 1987 cars and to order two 1988 cars, second by Ott-and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board that all 1987-88 tournaments had been accepted but one and that problem was in the process of being resolved.

The Board approved the attendance of Sheryl Solberg to the National Federation Athletic Directors Conference in December.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board that a firm offer had been received for the NDHSAA office building and that a majority of the staff felt we should stay in the present building. Tjaden moved that the Executive Secretary continue to explore the purchase of the PCA building and that he also get a cost estimate on building an addition to that building. Second by Sailer and carried.

The Board recessed until 8:00 A.M. on August 14th and reconvened at that time with all members present except Mundy.

Tjaden reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee and informed the Board that they had carefully reviewed Article XIII, Section XII of the Constitution and ByLaws that deals with training violations and penalties. Tjaden moved that Article XIII, Section XII of the Constitution and ByLaws be submitted to the General Assembly for their consideration as listed below and that this proposal would include the emergency clause. Second by Olson and carried.

Section XII The use or possession of tobacco, alcohol, or any controlled substance as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extra-curricular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities. Penalties will be prescribed as follows:

A. First Violation

- Penalty: After confirmation of the first violation, the student shall lose eligibility for the next two (2) consecutive interscholastic events or two (2) weeks of a season in which the student is a participant, whichever is greater.
- 2. Recommendation: It is recommended that the student receive counseling from a community agency or professional individual such as a drug counselor, medical doctor, psychiatrist or psychologist.

B. Second Violation

- Penalty: After confirmation of the second violation, the student shall lose eligibility for the next four (4) consecutive interscholastic events or four (4) weeks of a season in which the student is a participant, whichever is greater.
- Requirement: It is required that before being re-admitted to activities following suspension for the second violation, the student shall show evidence in writing that he/she has received counseling from a community agency or professional individual such as a

drug counselor, medical doctor, psychiatrist or psychologist. (The cost of the special services are not the responsibility of the School District.)

C. Third Violation or Subsequent Violations

- Penalty: After confirmation of the third or subsequent violations, the student shall lose eligibility for the next eight (8) consecutive interscholastic events or eight (8) weeks of a season in which the student is a participant, whichever is the greater.
- 2. Requirement: It is required that before being re-admitted to activities following suspension for the third, or subsequent violations, the student must become a participant in a chemical dependency program or treatment programs and the student must receive a certificate of completion or be certified as a non-dependent person by the director or a counselor of said chemical dependency treatment center. (The cost of the special services are not the responsibility of the School District.)
- D. In those NDHSAA sponsored activities in which a member school does not have a schedule of interscholastic contests, exclusive of NDHSAA sponsored tournaments (Examples: music, drama, speech, student congress, etc.), the penalty for the first violation will be the loss of eligibility for two scheduled public performances or two weeks whichever is greater.

(Note: Subsequent violations will follow the same criteria listed above except scheduled public performances would be substituted for interscholastic events.)

E. Penalties shall be accumulative beginning with and throughout the student's participation in NDHSAA sponsored activities in Grade 7 and 8. Penalties shall again be accumulative beginning with Grade 9 through Grade 12.

Tjaden reported to the Board of the NDHSCA concern over post season competition in various activities sponsored by the NDHSAA. He asked if the Board felt this item should be discussed with the membership at the General Assembly Meeting in October. No action was taken by the Board.

Olson moved that a policy be added to the NDHSAA Policy Handbook that allows a student to be reinstated for competition at the completion of a Drug Treatment Program if the student or school provides a signed completion report from said treatment center to the NDHSAA office. Second by Howe and carried.

The Board reviewed the following applications for cooperation sponsorship of activities:

Reeder to Scranton for Girls' Basketball Midway to Grafton for Cross Country Leonard to Kindred for Football Tuttle to Steele-Dawson for Football Milton-Osnabrock to Edinburg for Football Binford to Cooperstown for Football Halliday to Beulah for Cross Country

Sailer moved for approval of these applications, second by Ott and carried.

The Board reviewed a request from Bowdon-Sykeston to coop with Fessenden in football. The Board considered the lateness of the application and after a period of discussion Sailer moved for approval, second by Ott and it was passed by a 5 to 3 vote.

The Board reviewed a request from Lidgerwood to coop with Wyndmere in football. After careful consideration by the Board Tjaden moved to approve, second by Olson and it was passed by a 6 to 2 vote.

The Board considered the appeal from Maddock-Esmond on their application for a coop in Girls' Basketball that was denied by Board action on July 14, 1987. After a period of discussion Ott moved to rescind the action of July 14, 1987 and approve that coop application as submitted. Second by Olson and passed by a 5 to 3 vote.

Chairman Sanford instructed the Constitution and ByLaws Committee to evaluate the present coop amendment and to make recommendations to the Board if they feel it should be changed in any way.

Mel Olson reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Brian Akset from Sutton, Nebraska to Edinburg under the hardship rule and moved that immediate eligibility be granted, second by Sailer and carried.

Executive Secretary reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Chad Christianson from a service school in Japan to Hettinger under the hardship rule and recommended that immediate eligibility be granted. Motion by Sailer to grant immediate eligibility, second by Kunkel and carried.

The Board reviewed a communique from Supt. Hoyt of Mohall asking the Board to consider an academic eligibility case involving Mike Foss. After a review of the case Howe moved to deny the request to set aside any NDHSAA academic eligibility rules. Second by Tjaden and carried.

Executive Secretary reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of MaRoy Charging from White Shield to New Town under the hardship rule and recommended that immediate eligibility be granted. Motion by Tjaden to grant immediate eligibility, second by Kunkel and carried.

The Board considered the request of Supt. Clay Dunlap of Zeeland that was heard earlier in the meeting. The Board reviewed the case as presented and Olson moved to allow the transfer of Hauge students from Strasburg to Zeeland without any loss of eligibility, second by Tjaden and it passed by a 5 to 4 vote.

Arlo Howe reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Maurice Jasman from Dickinson High School to Dickinson Trinity under the hardship rule and moved that immediate eligibility be granted, second by Sailer and it passed by a 5 to 4 vote.

The Board discussed the NDHSAA Tournament Rotation plan. Tjaden moved that the Girls' Class A & B State Basketball Tournaments be added to the rotation plan and this be done at the June Meeting when tournament sites are determined. Second by Sailer and carried.

The Board heard a request from the Language Arts Festival to have the NDHSAA take over sponsorship of this activity. The Board took no action on this request. Chairman Sanford appointed the following committee to study competition in all non-athletic areas. Chairman - Sanstead, Ott, Kunkel and Hetler.

Rick Fitzner reported to the Board on the NDHSAA ABF program and informed the Board of the enrollment in the program for the upcoming year.

The Board reviewed the new academic eligibility rules and agreed the period a student would be ineligible because they did not pass the required subjects would be four weeks in both junior and senior high school.

Tjaden asked the NDHSAA staff to investigate what the cost would be to subsidize NDHSAA non-athletic activities and to report this at a later meeting.

The Board approved a request from the Cheerleader Advisors to allow two people to be used in the base of a pyramid but the person being supported still must be above the waist.

The Board was informed that a meeting was called by the Department of Public Instruction to consider what steps could be taken to establish a common Drug Education Curriculum.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors Meeting September 24, 1987

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 10:30 A.M. on September 24th at the Association office in Valley City with all members present.

The Board first reviewed the minutes of the August meeting and Special meetings. Motion by Kunkel to approve the minutes, second by Ott and carried.

The Board reviewed the report of all business transacted from July 1, 1987 to September 11, 1987. The Board also reviewed the ABF report covering the same period. Upon motion by Olson and second by Tjaden both reports were accepted.

Next Jerry Sheldon, Athletic Director of the Fargo Public Schools and Don Dehne, Principal of Fargo North High School appeared before the Board to request permission to play the North and South football game on Friday, October 16th. Reason for the request was a scheduling problem with NDSU Dacotah Field. Howe moved to deny the request because the restriction on playing during the NDEA Convention is a bylaw and the Board cannot set aside a bylaw. Second by Mundy and carried.

Barry Lentz of Grafton appeared before the Board to appeal the ineligibility of Sara Evens for girls' golf. Sara had been declared ineligible because she competed in a non-sanctioned golf tournament after the start of the NDHSAA Girls' Golf season. Tjaden moved to allow the appeal and reinstate Sara Evens for girls' golf because the meet did have international ramifications. Second by Kunkel and carried.

Sanstead reported on behalf of the Special Committee dealing with academic competition. He recommended this item be placed on the agenda for the October General Assembly Meeting for discussion. Sanstead moved that the request from the Language Arts Festival for NDHSAA sponsorship be tabled and they be informed that the NDHSAA will continue to study all academic competition, second by Kunkel and carried.

Tjaden reported for the Constitution and Bylaws Committee and reviewed all proposed changes that will be presented at the October General Assembly Meeting. The Board will determine at the October Board Meeting how each item will be presented and what support they will give it.

Sailer reported for the Class B Re-districting Committee and informed that Board that preliminary work on districts for Class B Volleyball had been considered. His committee will present a more detailed report at the October Board Meeting.

Cal Sailer was appointed Chairman of the Class B District Chairmen's Meetings to be held during the Girls' and Boys' State Basketball Tournaments,

The Board heard a brief report from Board members who attended the Region 4 Meeting held in Fessenden on September 2, 1987.

The Board appointed a Nominating Committee. Dave Schneider of Edmore was selected chairman and Lowell Jensen of Bismarck and Dale Gilje of Beulah as other members.

After a period of discussion by the Board, the Executive Secretary was instructed to send a survey to all Hockey schools asking their feelings on the possible change.

Kunkel reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Brad and Quincy Lund from Miles City, Montana to Leeds under the hardship rule and moved the request be granted, second by Ott and carried.

Ott reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Jermey Westrom from Turtle Lake to Hazen under the hardship rule and moved the request for immediate eligibility be granted, second by Enget and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the investigation he conducted concerning the transfer of Tom Weiss from Oakes to Valley City under the hardship rule and recommended that it be approved. Motion by Kunkel and second by Olson to approve the request and it carried.

The Board reviewed the report of the 1987 Cheerleader Clinics and set the 1988 clinics for the week of August 8th.

The Board reviewed the bid from the Meyer Broadcasting Company of Bismarck for \$8,000.00 to televise the 1988 WDA Boys' Basketball Tournament. Motion by Ott to accept this bid and contract be sent out, second by Mundy and carried.

North Dakota High School Activities Association
October 15, 1987 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Annual Meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held at the Kirkwood Motor Inn in Bismarck on October 15, 1987 at 3:30 P.M.

President Sanford called the meeting to order and declared a quorum of fifty members in attendance.

President Sanford introduced Parliamentarian Howard Snortland.

Supt. Russ Fletschock of Munich moved to approve the minutes of the previous meetings from October 1986 and January 1987 as published in the yearbook. Second by Principal Don Dehne of Fargo North and passed.

The North Dakota High School Athletic Directors Association presented their Athletic Directors of the Year awards.

Executive Secretary Bruce Anderson gave a brief report on new Association projects such as the new finance program, Class B Girls' Volleyball and an update on the ABF program.

Supt. Bob Gibson of Edinburg asked the General Assembly to consider an extension of the girls' basketball season. A straw vote indicated a majority of the schools were opposed to any extension of the season at this time.

The report of the Nominating Committee was presented by Supt. Dave Schneider of Edmore submitting the following names for vacancies on the Board of Directors for four year terms:

Class B Southeast Region:

Leon Johnson, Sargent Central Dean Koppelman, Linton

Class A Central Region:

Bob Lentz, Valley City Les Christian, Bottineau Supt. Schneider moved for the acceptance of the submitted names, second by Supt. Muckenhirn of Enderlin.

President Sanford called for nominations from the floor, none were made.

Supt. Jerome Tjaden of Central Cass and as a member of the NDHSAA Board of Directors moved to amend Part II, Article XIII, Section XII to read:

The use or possession of tobacco, alcohol, or any controlled substance as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extra-curricular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities. Penalties will be prescribed as follows:

A. First Violation

- Penalty: After confirmation of the first violation, the student shall lose eligibility for the next two (2) consecutive interscholastic events or two (2) weeks of a season in which the student is a participant, whichever is greater.
- 2. Recommendation: It is recommended that the student receive counseling from a community agency or professional individual such as a drug counselor, medical doctor, psychiatrist or psychologist.

B. Second Violation

- Penalty: After confirmation of the second violation the student shall lose eligibility for the next four (4) consecutive interscholastic events or four (4) weeks of a season in which the student is a participant, whichever is greater.
- Requirement: It is required that before being re-admitted to activities following suspension for the second violation, the student shall show evidence in writing that he/she has received counseling from a community agency or professional individual such as a drug counselor, medical doctor, psychiatrist or psychologist. (The cost of the special services are not the responsibility of the School District.)

C. Third Violation or Subsequent Violations

 Penalty: After confirmation of the third or subsequent violations, the student shall lose eligibility for the next eight (8) consecutive interscholastic events or eight (8) weeks of a season in which the student is a participant, whichever is greater.

- 2. Requirement: It is required that before being readmitted to activities following suspension for the third, or subsequent violations, the student must become a participant in a chemical dependency program or treatment programs and the student must receive a certificate of completion or be certified as a non-dependent person by the director or a counselor of said chemical dependency treatment center. (The cost of the sepcial services are not the responsibility of the School District.)
- D. In those NDHSAA sponsored activities in which a member school does not have a schedule of interscholastic contests, exclusive of NDHSAA sponsored tournaments (Examples: music, drama, speech, student congress, etc.), the penalty for the first violation will be the loss of eligibility for two scheduled public performances or two weeks whichever is greater.

(Note: Subsequent violations will follow the same criteria listed above except scheduled public performances would be substituted for interscholastic events.)

E. Penalties shall be accumulative beginning with and throughout the student's participation in NDHSAA sponsored activities in Grade 7 and 8. Penalties shall again be accumulative beginning with Grade 9 through Grade 12.

Second by Dick Karlgaard of Bismarck. Vote was called for and defeated by a vote of 88 to 83. Principal Del Easton of Williston asked for a division of the house and a roll call vote followed. The roll call vote showed 87 yes and 95 no so the motion was defeated.

Supt. Bob Gibson of Edinburg moved to amend Part II, Article III, Section IX to read:

No interscholastic event shall be held on Sunday.

Second by Jerry Sheldon of Fargo and was defeated by a standing vote of delegates.

Supt. R. L. Buchholz of Anamoose presented and moved for adoption an amendment to Part II, Article III, Section XI to read:

Cooperative sponsorship of any activity by two or more member schools will be considered under the following

- 1. Schools are to be located in the same geographical area.
- School Enrollments:

- A. All member schools of the NDHSAA will be eligible to participate in the cooperative sponsorship program.
- B. When Class B schools are involved with the cooperative sponsorship of an activity and the combined enrollment of the schools involved exceeds 325 students in grade 9 through 12, these schools will compete as a Class A shcool in that activity.
- Cooperative sponsorship agreements will be enforced for a minimum of three years.
- 4. A resolution from each school board stating the purpose of sponsoring a joint team or activity must be submitted to the NDHSAA office.
- 5. The school boards of the participating member schools must jointly make the application to the NDHSAA Board of Directors who, for Class B schools, will refer it to a five member overview regional committee comprised of officials of conference, district, or regional schools of the same class from the same general area (committee to be selected by the NDHSAA). Approval of the over-view committee will be necessary before applications will be considered by the Board of Directors.
- 6. Request must be submitted to the NDHSAA Board of Directors for fall activities by May 1, for winter activities by August 1, for spring activities by October 1. The Board will have the power to act on applications after these dates only if considered to be an absolute emergency.
- Decisions on all applications will be determined by the Board of Directors at the next regularly scheduled meeting following receipt of each application.

Second by Leonard Bjerklie of Hettinger and was defeated by a standing vote.

Supt. R. L. Buchholz of Anamoose lead a discussion on his proposed Constitutional Amendment for Part II, Artricle V, Sections I, II & III of the NDHSAA Constitution. This being a change to the Constitution it requires a mail ballot.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Kunkel reported on behalf of the Personnel Committee. Kunkel moved to approve the appointment of Robert King as Executive Secretary effective 7-1-88 at an annual salary of \$47,000, second by Ott and carried. The committee tabled all other recommendations of the NDHSAA staff until after a meeting with the new Executive Secretary to discuss possible staff reorganization.

CLASS A AND B RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Recommend the following video exchange system for teams involved in the football play-offs. (This is not mandatory).
 - A. Teams involved in the first round games be required to exchange with their opponent a video of the two previous games or a suitable substitution to be determined by the coaches involved.

B. Also, the home teams involved in the play-off games would be required to video the game and distribute copies to both teams involved in the game and to the opponent of the winning team for the next play-off game.

This recommendation would eliminate the NOTE: schools cost of scouting.

Recommend the Class A championship game alternate east to west locations from the previous year.

CLASS B 9 AND 11 MAN RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommend changing the tie broken procedure for dehermining play-off teams to read:

TIES

If a tie exists within a region for a play-off berth. one team will be selected to advance based on the following order of priority.

- Step 1. In case, of a two-way tie, head to head competition will determine team standings.

Supt. Cal Sailer presented Executive Secretary Bruce Anderson a plaque from the NDHSAA membership for his years of service to the schools of North Dakota.

Sheryl Solberg reported on the status of Class B Girls' Volleyball and outlined a tentative plan for the 1988-89 school year.

Rick Fitzner gave an ABF report to the schools and asked for their support for the program.

Supt. Mike Ness of Stanton presented and moved for adoption an amendment to Article XI, Section I: Physical Examination, Parents Consent to read:

No pupil shall be allowed to represent his or her school in high school athletics until there is on file with the superintendent or the principal a statement signed by a participating physician, chiropractor or nurse practitioner and his or her parents or legal guardian certifying that he/she has passed an adequate physical examination since May 20th of the past school year; that

in the opinion of the examining physician, chiropractor or nurse practitioner that he/she is physically fit to participate in such activities and that he/she has the consent of his/her parents or legal guardian to participate.

Second by Supt. Wes Kessler of Washburn.

Richard Ott informed the member schools of a legal opinion obtained by the NDHSAA that recommended not making the change in this ByLaw.

This proposed change was defeated by a voice vote of the delegates.

Supt. Norm Baumgarn of Rolla presented and moved for adoption an addition to the Junior High School ByLaws. The addition would be Article VIII: Girls' Basketball to read:

Junior High Girls' Basketball season may be the same length as the high school girls season and each school may set their own starting time which may not be earlier than the starting date for the high school girls season.

Second by James Holwell of Bottineau and passed by a voice vote of delegates.

Supt. Pius Lacher of Mandan presented and moved for adoption an amendment to Part Two, Article XIII Rules of Eligibility, Section VII to read:

A student shall not be eligible to compete in interscholastic activities on or after the day on which the twentieth anniversary of his/her birth occurs. On those occasions when a handicapped student turns twenty years old, the Board of Directors, upon request from a member school, may review the request for continued participation past the twentieth birthday.

Second by Supt. Ron Broeker of Watford City and proposed change was defeated by a voice vote of the delegates.

Supt. Roger Pommerer of New England presented and moved for adoption an amendment to Part Two, Article XII Sports Seasons, Section 1B Football to read:

Practice sessions shall start at least 11 days prior to the first game and there shall be at least 8 daily sessions. Individual participants must have participated in at least 8 daily practice sessions before being permitted to participate in an interscholastic contest.

Second by Supt. Al Peterson of Cando and proposed change was passed by a 89-38 vote of the delegates.

Supt. Kirk Hansen of Ellendale presented and moved for adoption an amendment to Part Two, Article XII Sports Seasons, Section II: Boys' Basketball Part G to read:

No more than two games per week are permitted on nights followed by school days.

Second by Supt. Duane Zwinger of Gackle and passed by 105-50 vote of the delegates.

President Sanford reviewed the new policy adopted by the Board dealing with the control of infectious blood diseases and informed the membership that it will be used for all NDHSAA sponsored wrestling tournaments and recommended use by all schools for regular season competition.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

- 3. Officials NDOA registered officials are required for all high school competition and are recommended for juniór high level.
- 4. All play shall be governed by the National Federation Volleyball Rule Book.

REGIONAL TOURNAMENT

- 1. Seeding criteria shall be in order as follows:
 - A. Regular season matches won and lost with regional opponents. (Use two points for win if meeting once, one point per match if playing twice.) If tied go to B.
 - B. Head to Head (If still tied, games won/lost) If tie stands go to C.
 - C. If two-way tie, total points between tied teams. If three or more way tie, use percentage of wins and losses between three or or more teams.
 - D. Coin flip
 - NOTE: If teams meet only once during the season, total games won/lost and total points must be doubled when using B and C.

Solberg reported on the facility conflict for the 1989 Boys' State Swim Meet which was originally to be held in Grand Forks. The Coaches Advisory Committee indicated their wishes to have this meet moved to Minot Magic City Campus. Tjaden moved that the 1989 Boys' State Swim Meet be moved to Minot. Second by Ott and carried.

The Board reviewed the following applications submitted by schools for cooperative sponsorship of activities:

Dissolve - Fort Yates Public to Selfridge for Track
Approve - Fort Yates to Standing Rock for Track on a one-year basis.

(This request came about because of the closing of Fort Yates Public and their students going to Standing Rock starting with the 1988-89 school year).

Kunkel moved to approve these requests. Second by Mundy and carried.

Glifford-Galesburg to Mayville-Portland for Gymnastics.

Sanstead moved this coop be approved. Second by Sailer and carried.

The Minot Ryan to Minot coop renewal was discussed. Approval was tabled until the June meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported on the NDHSAA work with the Juvenile Supervisors Association and the continuing progress with this group.

The Board heard a request from Supt. Wes Kessler to establish a policy to have smoke-free Representative Assembly Meetings. The Executive Secretary was directed to contact Mr. Kessler and suggest that he present this proposal to the General Assembly at the fall meeting.

The Assistant Executive Secretary reported on the results of the Football survey. Further study was tabled until the June meeting.

A letter was heard from the North Dakota School for the Deaf requesting their elementary students that are Junior High age be allowed to take part in football and wrestling. Because this is contrary to the Constitution and ByLaws, the Executive Secretary was directed to contact NDSD and suggest that they sponsor an amendment to the Constitution and ByLaws allowing this participation.

The Board reviewed the policy concerning the length of half-time entertainment at state tournaments. Tjaden moved that each half-time be limited to one entertainment group. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Following a review of Class B Gymnastics, Kunkel moved the NDHSAA sponsor a Class B State Gymnastics meet for the 1988-89 school year. The following year 1989-90, gymnastics competition will be one class. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary requested that the Board consider an early sale of the Association automobile, setting a fair price and allowing him to purchase the automobile. President Sanford was directed to carry out this request.

The Board reviewed the plans for the June Meeting and set the supper for the night of June 15th and the Annual attend the retirement supper. The Board approved this request.

The Board discussed the voting and alternate delegate to the National Federation Summer Meeting in Kansas City. Ott moved that the President be designated as the voting delegate and the Vice President be designated as the alternate. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The next item was a request from Big Sky Athletic, Inc. of Dickinson to include the NDHSAA calendar of events in their calendar. This calendar is distributed free of charge to their area customers. The Board voiced approval for this request.

Sailer requested that the NDHSAA consider the planning of a booth to be at the School Board Convention. The Board

approved the request and directed the staff to look into the planning of this booth.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors Meeting June 16 & 17, 1988 - Valley City, North Dakota

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office at 10:00 A.M. on June 16, 1988 with all members present except Ott.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the April meeting. Sailer moved that the minutes be approved, second by Mundy and carried.

President Sanford requested that it be entered into the minutes that the price for the sale of the Association automobile was set at \$9,750 using bids from previous years as a guideline. The automobile will be sold to Bruce Anderson at that price.

Sailer presented the report of the Class B Redistricting Committee. The Committee directed the office staff to project the specifications that would come up with the acceptance of the 3-Class system. These projected specifications would include drawing up a proposed district and regional boundaries, play-off advancement plans, etc. This will be presented at the August meeting.

The Constitution and ByLaws Committee reported on their study on the 5-quarter rule. The Board took no action. The Committee also informed the Board of the following proposed amendments to the Constitution and ByLaws:

District 10: Part Two, Article VIII - DISTRICT COMMITTEES, Section I

Amended to include athletic directors to be eligible for assignment to district representative.

From NDSD (Devils Lake): Part Seven, Article III: GENERAL REGULATIONS, Section III

Amended to include participation in tackle football and wrestling to the sports possible for 5th and 6th graders provided they have reached their 13th birthday and the total enrollment in an elementary school is not over fifty (50).

From Hettinger: An amendment allowing Junior High football to begin practice on the same day as the high school football.

The financial reports of the General Fund from July 1, 1987 to May 31, 1988 were reviewed by the Board. Olson moved to accept the financial reports, second by Tjaden and carried.

Rick Fitzner gave the Board a report on the ABF. Sailer moved to approve the report, second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary called the Board's attention to the report on trophies and awards, pointing out a Board reduction in costs compared to the previous year.

The Assistant Executive Secretary reported on the 1987-88 T-Shirt sales final report.

The Board reviewed the Financial report of the 1988 State Track meet.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Class A Regional Chairmen. Discussion was held on the request that the North Star Speech be dropped and two schools be placed in the East Region and two in the West Region. In the light that Devils Lake will be coming back into the speech program for the coming year, no action was taken. The Board delayed action on any other recommendations because they are covered later in the Advisory Committee reports.

The next recommendations reviewed by the Board were from the Class B District Chairmen. Action was taken on the following items:

- District 26 requested NDHSAA to investigate the possibility of obtaining state rates for hotel rooms for teams in the State Tournaments. Upon motion by Tjaden and second by Sailer, the Board approved this request.
- 2. District 22 proposed that NDHSAA set a price for tournament. working district officials President Sanford referred this to the officials committee to have a report at the August meeting.

The Board reviewed the Basketball Advisory Committee recommendations and upon motion by Tjaden and second by Kunkel, the following items were approved:

- Allow each of the eight regions to select an official for the State Tournament.
- The NDHSAA Board of Directors set the sites and dates for regional tournaments, at January or preceeding June Board Meetings.

The recommendations of the Golf Advisory Committee were reviewed and with the amended addition to the recommendations, Howe moved and Sanstead second the acceptance of the following:

- A reminder on sportsmanship on the course will be emphasized during regular season and at all tournaments. (Amended addition)
- Class A Girls' Golf A team may not substitute a player on the second day of the State Tournament.
- 3. The following scorekeeping will be made mandatory at all meets:

Each player in a group will receive a score card containing every player's name from that particular group as well as their name at the top of the card. These cards will be exchanged at the first tee. Each player will be responsible for the card received, keeping score of everyones play. All scores in the group will be reported to and scored by everyone. If there is a question about a score it must be resolved before play resumes. Players must sign their own card and the card they were keeping. Scoring errors and unsigned cards will lead to disqualification.

4. Do not start regionals before 10:00 A.M.

The recommendations of the Gymnastics Advisory committee were reviewed and upon motion by Kunkel and second by Mundy, the following items were approved:

- 1. Any vault may be performed twice.
- Two officials per event will be contracted for regional meets by coaches ballot. The selection of the three judges per event for the State Meet will be made by ballot using the names of the regional officials.

CLASS A

- Teams that qualify for state through regionals may declare 6 gymnasts in each of the individual events that will compete for team score.
- 4. First and second place teams advance to state from regionals plus any team who scores one point or less from the second place team score.

The Hockey Advisory Committee recommendations along with an additional recommendation from the NDOA were reviewed and upon motion by Olson and second by Mundy, the following recommendations were approved:

 Two mandatory workshops will be scheduled. One in the east and one in the west with a classroom and an on ice sessions.

- Increase the number of linesmen at the State Hockey Tournament from two to four to allow more young officials to acquire tournament experience.
- 3. Selected the following officials for the 1988-89 Play-offs and State Tournament:

5. The use of three officials at all regular season varsity games will be mandatory.

The Board reviewed recommendations from the Swimming Advisory Committee. Enget moved for approval, second by Howe and carried for the following items:

- Consideration times will be 107 percent of the qualifying times.
- Because of the concern for safety following the conclusion of the State Meet it is recommended that:
 - A. The pool be cleared immediately following the 400 Meter Freestyle Relay.
 - B. The entire pool area be cleared of all swimmers and spectators immediately following the awards ceremony.
- The junior high swimming season shall be no longer than the high school season and each school may set their own starting time.
- 4. 7th, 8th and 9th grade students involved in swimming may compete at either the junior high or senior high level but cannot compete in more than 2 meets per week or a total of 16 meets in a school year.
- At least two weeks of 8 daily practice sessions are required for junior high and high school teams and individuals before competition.
- Meet officials shall be as follows:

N. DAK, HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

Dual Meet - minimum of two officials with a recommended three officials.

Invitational Meet - minimum of three officials with recommended five officials.

The recommendations of the Tennis Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Kunkel and second by Sailer, the following items were approved:

- 1. Line-ups for regional and state team competition may be changed from match to match.
 - A. Line-ups shall be submitted at the time of court assignments for that particular round. These line-ups will not be revealed until both have been received.
 - B. Line-up submitted must be selected from the 8 member roster submitted to the Activities Association.
 - C. Substitutions on the original team roster may be made by notifying the NDHSAA or Tournament Manager prior to the start of regional or state competition.
 - D. Coaches must place their best singles player in the No. 1 singles spot, their best doubles player in the No. 1 doubles spot, etc. in the line-up submitted for a match.
 - E. Once line-ups are submitted, no substitutions may be made for that round.
 - 2. Include in the Tournament Manager's authority the assigning of courts and determining whether play will be held indoors or outdoors.
 - 3. Add a statement of sportsmanship to all regional and state tournament programs.

With the editorial change of the recommendation concerning cross country practice from 10 to 8, Howe moved, Enget second and the motion carried to approve the following Track Advisory Committee recommendations:

- 1. Regional Meets Start the field events one hour earlier than the track events.
- 2. Lane assignments for all races that are run around one or more curves shall be 3-4-5-2-6-1-7-8 in all regional and state meets.

The Volleyball Advisory Committee recommendations were reviewed by the Board. With a motion by Tjaden and second by Olson, the following as approved:

- 1. All matches at regional and state tournaments will be 3 out of 5 game matches.
- 2. Officials for regional and state tournaments will be selected using the weighted factor, first choice receiving 8 points, second choice receiving 6 points, third choice receiving 4 points, etc. Top four officials from each region shall be contracted for regional tournaments and the top two from each region will work the state tournaments.
- 3. Regional tournament play shall start at 1:00 P.M. on Friday.
- 4. State tournament championship semi-final matches will be played on Friday evening and consolation semi-final matches will be played on Saturday morning.
- 5. Game balls will be designated for regional and state tournament play. The type of ball that will be used will be announced one year in advance.
- 6. For the state tournament, the host town will reserve a block of rooms for the teams that are participating in the tournament.
- 7. JUNIOR HIGH GUIDELINES
 - A. The volleyball season shall be no longer than the high school season and each school may set their own starting time. The volleyball season shall end no later than April 1st.
 - B. Matches shall be 2 out of 3 game matches.
 - C. Teams shall play a maximum of 10 matches and 2 tournaments or 8 matches and 3 tournaments.
 - D. Registered Association officials shall be provided in all cases possible. High school students should not be used as referees.

The Board reviewed the recommendation of the Wrestling Advisory Committee and upon motion by Enget and second by Mundy approved the following items:

- 1. Junior high wrestlers will be allowed to wrestle Junior High or High School the entire season, but no more than two appearances per week.
- 2. Recommend keeping eight regions and re-assign schools to balance number of schools in region.

Recommend not combining the State Class A and B Tournaments.

CLASS A WRESTLING

- Recommend that we continue to bring entire team to State Tournament.
- Recommend continue seeding wrestlers into State Tournament and allowing each region to elect own representative.

Recommendations of the Music Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Sanstead and second by Sailer the following items were approved:

- Publish North Dakota Recommended Music List in 1988-89 Music Rule Book.
- 2. NHDSAA to select and hire State Music Festival judges. Must not have judged state entrant at regional during current season and must be "certified" if an in-state judge.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Speech Advisory Committee. After amending Item V Speech, letters G and H to be on a one-year trial basis, motion by Howe and second by Sailer the following items were approved:

STUDENT CONGRESS

- A. Second session at all meets will begin with committee meetings and the P.O. in each chamber will reconvene regular debate when committees have completed their business.
- B. Each student must submit a typewritten resolution with name and school attached when roll is called.

DEBATE

- A. Raise state registration from \$15.00 to \$20.00 for varsity policy debate teams and Lincoln-Douglas varsity debaters.
- B. Debate coaches may submit list of preferred judges if done so by November 1 (Maximum of 15)
- C. Authorized committee to revise varsity and junior varsity categories in policy debate as long as number of total entries allowed each school remains the same.

CLASS A PLAY FESTIVAL

A. Play schedule will begin at 8:00 A.M. with student introductions and time to inspect stage. Host school will be first to perform. Workshops at 10:15 and possibly afternoon workshops if time permits.

B. Run a set-design contest in conjunction with plays for tech. students.

CLASS B PLAYS

A. Allow regions to set their own contest format as long as qualify one play for every 7 schools participating up to a maximum of 2 state qualifiers.

SPEECH

- A. Raise regional student judge's fee from \$35.00 to \$45.00.
- B. Use 75 Short Masterpieces, a Bantam Book edited by Roger Goodman as the Extemporaneous Interpretation book for 1988-89.
- C. For Class A, a "Novice Extemp. Speaker" shall be defined as, "A student who has not participated in Extemporaneous Speaking before the current season and hasn't been a Lincoln-Douglas or policy debater (has debated no more than six rounds of debate prior to September of the current season), but he/she may be a senior."
- D. A student may enter two extemporaneous events, but his/her prep time will automatically be cut to 30 minutes per event.
- E. (P. 9, #20) Taping or recording of any speech category at a tournament is forbidden.
- F. (P. 9, #2) If at all possible, when determining finalists, those receiving a one and a five should qualify for the finals and be given consideration over other receiving sixes (total from 2 prelim rounds).

ON A ONE-YEAR TRIAL BASIS

- G. First place winners from invitational tournaments qualify for the State Tournament if each particular category within the tournament meets the following criteria:
 - 1. Only one person from each category qualifies. All ties must be broken.
 - Must go strictly by current NDHSAA Speech Rule Book.
 - Coach from school of first place winner may not have judged that student in any rounds of that tournament.
 - 4. The tournament must have a minimum of 18

actual participants in Serious, Humorous, Poetry, Dramatic and Duo and a minimum of 15 actual participants in all other categories.

- Each school may be allowed a maximum of three entrants in each category.
- The tournament must have a final round using three judges.
- 7. A qualifying tournament must be sanctioned and the tournament manager must send in all "qualifiers" with proof that the specific category(ies) with qualifiers met the above criteria.
- H. General Rules for State Qualifiers from Invitational Tournaments:
 - A student cannot qualify for more than two State tournament events.
 - No school may qualify more than 3 students within each category.
 - 3. Even though a student has already qualified for the state, that student must still enter that category or those 2 categories unless exemption given by NDHSAA (i.e. -illness).
 - 4. Manager should send note to all schools whether or not each category or particular categories will be qualifying categories if minimum number of students participate.

The Board examined the rotation plan with the consideration to include track and girls' basketball. Olson moved that track, Class A girls' basketball, Class B girls' basketball and music be included on the master schedule of tournament site rotation and project through the 1989-90 season. Second by Kunkel and passed. The June, 1989 annual meeting will be the projected date for setting tournament sites for 2 years in advance.

The dates for the 1988-89 Board of Directors meetings were reviewed and upon motion by Howe and second by Mundy; the Board approved the following dates:



NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: The significant accounting policies followed are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

Fund Accounting

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the user of resources available, the accounts of the association are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purposes. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group.

The assets, liabilities, and fund balances of the association are reported in self-balancing fund groups as follows:

> Operating funds, which include unrestricted and restricted resources, represent the portion of expendable funds that is available for support of the operations of the association. The operating fund has been subdivided into the general fund and the accident benefit fund.

Plant funds represent resources restricted to plant acquisitions and other plant expenditures.

Basis of Accounting

All funds are accounted for using the accrual basis. Revenues are recognized when earned and expenditures are expensed in the period they are incurred.

Plant Assets and Depreciation

Uses of operating funds for plant acquisitions are accounted for as transfers to plant funds. Proceeds from the sale of plant assets are included in the operating fund balances. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is provided over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets on a straight-line basis.

- INVESTMENTS: The association pools its funds and keeps them invested for maximum yield. On June 30, 1988, 5.2% of the investments were in a local bank, 21.8% in a local savings & loan association and 73% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. This is in comparison to June 30, 1987, when 4% of the investments were in a local bank and 17.4% in a local savings and loan association and 78.6% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. Investments consist primarily of money market and time savings certificates which bear interest at rates from 6.6% to 12.5%. The average yield for the year ended June 30, 1988 was 9.01% compared to 9.65% for the prior year.
- RESERVES AND UNDESIGNATED BALANCES: The board has designated or reserved portions of funds for contingencies and special purposes. The reserves are reviewed and updated, if necessary, on an annual basis by the board of directors. Unclaimed checks issued in excess of one year are restored to the bank accounts and carried as a liability for a period extending beyond the six year requirement of the statute of limitations.

Undesignated balances are intended to be maintained at only a nominal

4. RETIREMENT PLANS: The association has provided elective retirement plans for the administrative staff. These retirement plans provide for 6½% of the salary to be contributed by employees which is matched by the association. The funds are in a trust with a local savings & loan association.

After July 1, 1979, professional staff members (that are qualified teachers) have been included in the state teachers retirement plan. Contribution and matching requirements are also 6½% of salaries. Beginning July 1, 1983, the association agreed to fund the entire contribution of 12.5% for those covered under the teachers retirement plan.

The associations contribution totaled \$24,999.12 in 1988 and \$24,284.40 in 1987.

The employee's contributions (currently 6.25% of salaries) and related earnings are fully vested at all times. Retiring or terminating employees are entitled to withdraw such funds in a lump sum distribution.

The association's matching contributions and related earnings are payable to the employee over ten years on retirement at or after age 65.

If termination occurs after the tenth year, an employee can elect to defer all distributions until reaching age 65 and then obtain benefits as a retiring employee. If an employee terminates employment before retirement, these funds become partially vested as follows:
