The Board reviewed the minutes of the June meeting. After the corrections of 1989-90 site selections to read Class B Boys Basketball changed from Bismarck to Minot and Class A Girls Basketball from Jamestown to Minot, Mundy moved to approve the minutes. Motion second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the investments accounts of the North Dakota High School Activities Association for the past year with the Board. Motion by Sailer, second by Sanford to accept the report as presented.

The Board reviewed the interest report for the last three years. Sanford moved to approve this report. Second by Enget and carried.

The Board reviewed the comparisons sheet on financial reports of the 1987-88 activities as compared to the 1983-84 through 1986-87 years. Sanstead moved to accept this report. Second by Mundy and carried.

The end of the year Financial report was explained by the Executive Secretary for review by the Board.

Mundy reported for the Finance Committee on the proposed budget for the 1988-89 year. As chairman, Mundy moved to approve both the report for the fiscal year and the budget of \$786,250 for the 1988-89 year. Second by Sanford and carried.

Ray Braun, Certified Public Accountant of Valley City presented the annual Audit of the Association for the 1987-88 fiscal year. From the discussion that followed, the Personnel Committee was assigned to look into the retirement trust fund and the vesting of the same. Ott moved to accept the auditor's report. Second by Sailer and carried.

The Board reviewed the financial report list of Association bills as paid up to June 30, 1988. Howe moved to approve the report. Second by Christian and carried.

A delegation from Fargo Shanley High School appeared before the Board as requested from the June meeting. A letter of explanation was read to the Board by Irvin Rustad, President of the Shanley School Board. Several other members of the group were heard from. The hearing was then opened to questioning of the Shanley representatives by the Board. Sanford moved a letter of censure be sent to Shanley High School pointing out the places where a violation has been made. Second by Ott and carried unanimously. The Executive Secretary was instructed to write this letter.

Koppelman reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee. The committee was assigned to study the tentative districting in the event the 3-class system is approved. The committee will continue their study.

Howe presented a report of the Officials Association Committee presenting the possible proposed adjustment of the officials fee schedule. The proposal is for the 1988-89 school year. The Committee requested input from the Board to take back to their next meeting. From their next meeting, they will make a final proposal. Following the report, the Committee was assigned to study the setting of officials fees for district basketball.

Superintendent Don Herbel of Hebron and Superintendent Pat Feist of Glen Ullin appeared before the Board requesting a football co-op. Howe moved that the co-op be accepted and Glen Ullin be the host school. Second, by Enget and carried.

Superintendent Rod Scherbenske of Goodrich appeared before the Board requesting a girls' and boys' basketball co-op between Goodrich and McClusky. Sailer moved that the girls' basketball co-op be approved. Second by Enget and carried. Howe moved that the boys' basketball co-op be approved. Second by Christian and carried.

The Executive Secretary read a request from Bismarck High School that their wrestling team be allowed to participate in a Florida tournament on January 20-21, 1989. Ott moved approval. Second by Koppelman and carried.

The Executive Secretary read a communique from Don Engen, Athletic Director of NDSCS - Wahpeton that NDSCS would host the EDC boys' basketball tournament unless it conflicted with the Class B Region II tournament. A communique from Ron Luttschwager, Athletic Director of the Jamestown Public Schools was read; stating that James - town would host the EDC Boys' Basketball Tournament.

The Board individually reviewed the following cooperative sponsorship requests:

Oak Grove to Shanley in girls' and boys' tennis. Enget moved approval, second by Sanstead and carried.

Milton-Osnabrock to Edinburg in girls' basketball. Sailer moved approval, second by Mundy and carried.

Our Redeemer Lutheran School to Minot Bishop Ryan in all 7th and 8th grade activities. Mundy moved approval, second by Sanstead and carried.

North Sargent to Sargent Central in wrestling. Koppelman moved approval, second by Ott and carried.

Cando to Devils Lake in hockey. Howe moved approval, second by Sanford and carried.

Alexander to Watford City in 11-man football. Sanford moved that the co-op be approved for the normal 3 years and if the combined size of the two schools would move the football program into the Class A division, the schools would have to formally request that the co-op be dissolved. Second by Ott and carried.

Bismarck St. Mary's to Bismarck Public Schools in Gymnastics. Ott moved approval, second by Sanford and carried.

Minto to Grafton in girls' and boys' cross country. Enget moved approval, second by Mundy and carried.

The Executive Secretary read a request from Balta and Anamoose to dissolve their football cooperative agreement. Enget moved approval, second by Mundy and carried.

The Executive Secretary noted that all tournament assignments had been accepted but two which would be accepted shortly.

Rick Fitzner reported on the Accident Benefit Fund. He noted that no schools were dropping ABF this year.

Sanford moved that the Association van be advertised for sale and that two new automobiles be purchased for 1988-89. Second by Howe and carried.

Ott moved that Bob King and Alida Posein be formally approved to handle NDHSAA financial transactions. Second by Koppelman and carried.

The Board reviewed correspondence from the Association Attorney Leonard Bucklin concerning the Sanford case and proposed addition to building rental agreements. No action was taken.

The Executive Secretary reported on the National Federation's "Dreamers and Doers" program which requested each state to choose a "Dreamer and Doer"

Richard Ott reported on a hardship investigation for Trevor Kuntz at SRCHS of Fort Yates. Ott moved for fmmediate eligibility, second by Sanstead and carried.

Jerome Enget reported on a hardship investigation for Jay James to Garrison. Enget moved that the request be denied, second by Howe and carried.

Les Christian reported on a hardship investigation for Lisa Olson to Bottineau. Mundy moved that the request be denied, second by Howe and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the problem with basketballs arriving late from Northwest Sporting Goods but was assured balls would arrive at the schools before September 1.

The Executive Secretary read a request from Grafton that Sara Evans be allowed to participate in the National PGA Junior Golf Championship August 23-26 in St. Louis, Missouri. Mundy moved approval, second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary distributed a written request to the Board asking that Par Vellan of Rykkin, Norway be allowed immediate eligibility to Bottineau as a foreign exchange student. Howe moved approval, second by Sanford and carried.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

### MINUTES

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors September 22, 1988 - Valley City, N.D.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 10:00 A.M. on September 22nd at the Association office in Valley City. Ott and Sanstead were absent.

The Executive Secretary read a thank you note from the family of Jim Maxwell.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the August-meeting and Special meetings. Motion by Sailer to approve the minutes, second by Enget and passed.

The Board reviewed the financial report of all business transacted from July 1, 1988 to September 6, 1988. The Board also reviewed the ABF report as reported by Rick Fitzner. Upon motion by Howe and second by Mundy, the reports were accepted.

Howe reported on the Constitution and ByLaws Committee meeting held to study the conceivable changes in light of the possible acceptance of the proposed 3-class system. A motion was made by Enget to circulate a letter to member schools indicating some of the projected complications related to the short time frame given to work out all the details should the 3-class amendments be passed. Without taking a stand in favor or opposed, this letter shall ask the membership to consider delaying the initiation of the amendment to the 1990-91 school year in the event that this amendment may be approved. Sanford second the motion and motion was passed.

Howe reported on behalf of the Officials Committee concerning (a) increment of officials fees, (b) district tournament fees and (c) the problem concerning late registration of officials. Howe moved that the varsity fees for football, basketball, volleyball, hockey and baseball be increased \$5.00. Enget second and motion carried.

Sailer moved that a \$45.00 maximum fee be set for payment of district basketball officials. Howe second and the motion passed.

Howe moved that a late registration fee equal to the varsity game fee of the sport being registered for be assessed to those officials who miss their particular deadline date. Second by Sanford and carried.

Enget reported on the Football Committee meeting concerning the discussed Class B 9 and 11-man football. Final recommendations will be made at the October meeting so they will be available to the membership at the October General Assembly meeting.

Sanford reported on behalf of the Academic Committee. Information is being collected on all academic events that are taking place at this time. With this information completed, further discussion will take place at the October meeting as to where to go with this plan.

Jerome Enget was appointed Chairman of the Class B District Chairmen's Meeting to be held during the Girls' and Boys' State Basketball Tournaments in November and March.

A Nominating Committee was appointed for a report at the Representative Assembly Meeting. Those appointed were: Dale Duggan, Chairman, Central Valley (east), Dave Smette, Dickinson (west), and Gerald Christianson, Wilton (central).

The Board reviewed the following cooperative sponsorship applications:

Tolna to Devils Lake for Hockey. Howe moved for approval, second by Sanford and carried.

Carpio to Berthold for Volleyball. Mundy moved for approval, second by Enget and carried.

St. Mary's School at Breckenridge to Wahpeton for gymnastics. Koppelman moved for approval, second by Mundy and carried.

The Board reviewed a communique from Bottineau High School requesting approval to move to the Class B ranks following the mandatory 2-year waiting period. Motion by Sailer to approve the request, second by Christian and carried.

The next communique read was from Rugby requesting approval to be moved to Class B beginning with the 1990-91 school year. Christian moved for approval of the request, second by Sailer and carried.

The Executive Secretary called the Board's attention to the communique from Four Winds High School concerning their violation of the use of a scholastically ineligible player. 'Also read was a letter of response to the reported violation indicating that all games in which the ineligible player was used must be forfeited.

The Board reviewed the changes in the contract with the Bismarck Civic Center by the NDHSAA attorney, Bucklin. Sanford moved to approve the language of the contract as written by Bucklin. Koppelman second and the motion carried.

The Board reviewed an eligibility case of a student from Mohall. A letter of appeal concerning this situation was then heard. Sanford moved that Anton Brekhus be considered an 8th grader in the 1985-86 school year and now a junior for the 1988-89 school year. Along with this motion is a recommended review of the interpretation on page 81, question 96 in the Constitution and ByLaws. Second by Christian and carried.

The Board reviewed the report of the 1988 Cheerleader Clinics and the bids that were received for the 1989 clinics. The bids were as follows:

Howe moved to accept the Meyer Broadcasting Company bid for the television rights to the 1989 Boys WDA Basketball Tournament and the Red River Broadcast Group bid for television rights to the 1989 Boys EDC Basketball Tournament. Mundy second the motion and carried.

The Board read a communique from Fargo South reporting the use of an ineligible player. The Executive Secretary's letter of answer to Fargo South and copy to Dickinson indicating the forfeiture of said game was then read. Following the two communiques, the Executive Secretary letter appealing the decision to Fargo South's follow-up requesting a reversal of the initial decision. No action was taken.

An audience with Dr. David Pokorny, N.D. Chiropractic Assn. was scheduled for 3:00 P.M. Howe spoke in behalf of Dr. Pokorny who canceled his appearance. Howe reported the that North Dakota Chiropratic Association received an attorney's interpretation indicating that responsibility of a physical performed by a chiropractic physician would be with that doctor and liability of any problems would fall on the doctor, not the school who uses the proposed amendment change regarding Page 31, Article XI of the Constitution and Bylaws.

# North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors Meeting October 12, 1988

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 1:00 P.M. on October 12, 1988 at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck. All members were present.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the September Board Meeting. Mundy moved to approve the minutes, second by Ott and carried.

Bids were opened for the sale of the 1988 Association Van. Bids were as follows:

Mike Johnson, Minot - \$11,300 Sanford Sivertson, Kathryn - \$8,500 Rocky Skarsgaard, Stanley - \$11,800 Merle Strandberg, Valley City - \$13,777 Rick Fitzner, Valley City - \$13,550 Mary Jones, Verona - \$11,000 John Schmitz, Williston - \$11,600

After reviewing the bids, Howe moved to accept Strandberg's bid of \$13,777. Second by Sanford and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board that several past Board Members have requested permission to purchase Association rings. The policy of giving a ring to retiring Board Members was started after they had completed their terms as Board Members. Enget moved to send a letter to all past Board Members indicating that a ring may be purchased through the Association. Second by Koppelman and carried.

The Board reviewed a request sent from Meyer Television Network concerning starting times of evening games for State Basketball Tournaments. The Executive Secretary was instructed to send a reply informing the network that all evening games of the State Basketball Tournaments will start at 6:30 P.M.

The Board read a communique from Grand Forks Public Schools concerning two ineligible competitors participating on Grand Forks Central's 1987 Girls' Basketball and 1987-88 Volleyball teams. Howe moved that a letter of commendation be sent to the Grand Forks Public School thanking them for reporting this incident and asking them to forfeit all contests won in which these two had illegally participated. The Grand Forks Public Schools is to inform those teams that are effected by this ruling. Second by Ott and carried.

The Agenda for the Representative Assembly Meeting was reviewed and discussed in preparation for the meeting the following day.

The Board reviewed the following applications for cooperative sponsorship of activities:

Regent and New England to New England St. Mary's for wrestling Sailer moved for approval, second by Mundy and carried.

Leahy School to Flasher for 7th and 8th grade basketball Enget moved for approval, second by Sanford and carried.

The Board read several letters of appeal concerning Nelson W. Heart III, currently a 10th grade student at Devils Lake High School who has been ruled ineligible under the transfer rule. Howe moved to uphold the Executive Secretary's decision concerning Heart's ineligibility and to send a communique to Devils Lake High School informing them of the decision. Second by Enget and carried.

The Board held an audience with representatives of Shiloh Christian High School concerning two eligibility cases. The first concerned Todd Graf who is a senior and is entering his ninth semester of high school making him ineligible for competition under the semester rule. Enget moved to support the original ruling making Graf ineligible, second by Mundy and carried.

The second concerned the transfer of Paul Wagner from Bismarck Century to Shiloh Christian School at the beginning of the 1988-89 school year and whether he would become eligible at the end of the first semester or after 90 school days. Howe moved that because of misinformation that was given by the Association, Paul Wagner would be made eligible at the end of Shiloh's first semester. Principal Leonard Bjerklie of Hettinger proposed and moved for adoption the amendment to the Junior High ByLaws, Article IV Football Regulations - Section 1 Sport Season to read as follows:

Football season opens on the same date as high school football.

Supt. R. L. Buchholz, Anamoose second the motion. A vote was taken by a show of hands. The amendment was passed by a vote of 138 to 50.

Supt. Samuel Tollefson, Crary on behalf of North Dakota School For the Deaf, submitted and moved for adoption of the following amendment to the Junior High ByLaws, Article III, General Regulations - Section III to read:

If the total enrollment of the 7th & 8th grade in an elementary school is not over fifty (50), the 5th and 6th grade pupils over 13 years of age may be permitted to participate on all junior high teams, including tackle football and wrestling.

Supt. Richard Kunkel, Devils Lake second the motion. By a show of hands, the amendment was defeated by a vote of 86 to 84.

Principal Dennis Dockter, Starkweather moved for adoption of the following amendment to Part II, Article XIII, Section XII, The Use or Possession of Drugs, to read:

The use or possession of tobacco, alcohol, or any controlled substance as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extra-curricular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities for a minimum period of six consecutive school weeks for the first offense and a period of eighteen consecutive school weeks for any subsequent offense. If the violation of the foregoing occurs toward or at the end of a school year, and the suspension cannot or has not been fully served by the end of the school year, the suspension, or remainder thereof, will become applicable with the opening of school in the fall.

Second by Leonard Bjerklie, Hettinger.

Supt. George Weiland, Drake proposed an amendment to the amendment and moved for the adoption of the following:

The use or possession of tobacco, alcohol, or any controlled substance as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extra-curricular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities for a minimum period of thirty consecutive instructional days for the first offense and a period of ninety consecutive instructional days for any subsequent offense. If the violation of the foregoing occurs toward or at the end of a school year, and the suspension cannot or has not been fully served by the end of the school year, the suspension, or remainder thereof, will become applicable with the opening of school in the fall.

Motion second by G. F. Muckenhirn, Enderlin. By a show of hands, the amendment to the amendment was defeated. The vote was then taken on the original amendment which was defeated by a vote of 120 to 67.

Gary Engebretson of Ray submitted and moved for the adoption of the following amendment:

Part Two, Article II Classification of Schools

Section I: Class AAA Schools:

- a. This group shall consist of the eighteen member high schools with the largest enrollments in grades 9-12 inclusive as of October 1, 1988, except as otherwise provided in this Article or Article III, Section XI.
- b. Additionally, any Class AA school below this Class AAA designation may petition the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors to be included in this classification. These original petitions must be submitted to the Board of Directors not later than January 1, 1989, to go into effect for the following year. Following the first year of athletic participation all petitions must be submitted by September 1 preceding the review as provided for in Section IV, paragraph b. The Board of Directors may approve a maximum of eight of these petitions, divided equally among the regions as determined by the Board of Directors. All Class AA schools whose petition has been approved to be in Class AAA by the Board of Directors shall remain in Class AAA until the next biennial review. The maximum number of Class AAA schools allowed in this classification shall be twenty-six.

Section II: Class AA Schools:

a. This group shall consist of all other schools in the groups of the 74 member schools with the largest enrollments in grades 9-12, inclusive as of October 1, 1988, except those assigned or placed by petition into Class AAA, or as otherwise provided in this article or Article III, Section XI. b. Additionally, any school below this classification may petition the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors to be included in this classification. These original petitions must be submitted to the Board of Directors not later than January 1, 1989, to go into effect for the following school year. Thereafter, the petitions must be submitted by September 1 preceding the review as provided for in Section IV, paragraph b. The Board of Directors may approve a maximum of eight of these petitions, divided equally among the regions as determined by the Board of Directors. A school whose petition has been approved by the Board of Directors shall remain in Class AA until the next biennial review.

N. DAK, HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

Section III: Class A Schools:

All member high schools, other than those designated or approved as Class AAA or Class AA schools, shall be classified as Class A schools.

Section IV:

- a. Class AAA, Class AA, and Class A schools shall compete in separate classes to determine state basketball championships. The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is authorized to combine classes in other athletic or non-athletic contests and festivals if it appears expedient and desirable.
- b. The enrollments of the schools shall be reviewed every two years by the Board of Directors with the purpose of adjusting the classifications of the schools within the three classes.
- c. Should a new high school be established, the enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, shall determine the classification of that district, and that placement shall be in effect at least until the next review procedure as established in section IV, Paragraph b, above.

Second by Steve Sedlmayr, Leonard.

Jerry Christianson, Wilton moved to amend the amendment to move the effective date back one year to the 1990-91 school year. Second by Jim Holwell, Bottineau.

The amendment to the amendment was voted on by a show of hands and passed  $134\ \text{to}\ 59$ .

The Assembly then called for the question on the original amendment. The amendment was defeated 113 to 101.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Supt. Donald Emch of Flasher moved that the report of the Canvassing Committee be accepted. This motion was seconded by Supt. Hy Schlieve of Garrison. Motion carried.

President Olson welcomed the new members to the Board.

Supt. Nicholas Roster of Oakes, Chairman of the Basketball Study Committee, introduced the committee members and reported on their past two meets. Study will continue with follow-up regional meetings, a Study Committee meeting on April 19, 1989 and a final recommendation to the NDHSAA Board of Directors for the June Annual Meeting.

Marv Knoll, Athletic Director of Dickinson Public Schools introduced and moved for adoption of the following amendment to Article XI, Section I to the Constitution and Bylaws.

Physical Examination, Parent's Consent to read:

No pupil shall be allowed to represent his/her school in high school athletics until there is on file with the superintendent or the principal a statement signed by a participating physician, chiropractor, or nurse practitioner and his/her parents or legal guardian certifying that he/she has passed an adequate physical examination since May 20th of the past school year; that in the opinion of the examining physician, chiropractor or nurse practitioner he/she is physically fit to participate in such activities; that he/she has the consent of his/her parents or legal guardian to participate.

Supt. Cal Sailer of South Heart seconded the motion.

Supt. Ronald Broeker of Watford City called attention to the fact that the Attorney General's interpretation as to the legality of this amendment had not been obtained. Because of this, Supt. Broeker moved that this amendment be tabled until such time that the interpretation could be obtained. Second by Dick Karlgaard of Bismarck Public Schools and carried.

#### MINUTES

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors June 15 & 16, 1989 - Valley City, North Dakota

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office at 9:00 A.M. on June 15, 1989 with all members present except Sanstead.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the April meeting. Sailer moved that the minutes be approved, second by Ott and carried.

The financial reports of the General Fund from July 1, 1989 to May 31, 1989 were reviewed by the Board. Enget moved to accept the financial reports, second by Christian and carried.

After reviewing the list of checks written during the same period, motion by Enget, second by Mundy to accept the list. Motion carried.

Rick Fitzner gave the Board a report of the Accident Benefit Fund. Ott moved to approve the report, second by Koppelman and carried.

Howe reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee on the efforts to standardize all pre-season practice requirements to nine days. The committee recommended that an amendment be prepared and presented at the fall General Assembly to change the Constitution and ByLaws practice requirements to nine days. Howe then moved to accept the report and prepare the two amendments necessary to make the appropriate changes. Second by Koppelman and carried.

The Executive Secretary gave a final report on the T-shirt sales for the 1988-89 year. Christian moved to accept the report. Second by Mundy and carried.

The Board reviewed the recommendations of the Class A Regional Chairmen. Discussion was held concerning the football alignments. President Olson appointed a committee to deal with the entire alignment picture. Action on all other recommendations was delayed until they were covered in the Advisory Committee reports.

The Board reviewed the Class B Regional Chairmen recommendations. Discussion was held concerning several recommendations dealing with cooperative agreements and now the total enrollment of the schools involved in football was handled, concluding that the practice of using the larger school's total enrollment would be the primary consideration when figuring enrollments for finalizing the Class B 9 and 11-man football divisions for 1990-91.

The Board also discussed the 4 to 1 ratio with no action taken.

The Board reviewed the Basketball Advisory Committee recommendations and upon motion by Sailer and second by Enget the following was approved:

 State tournament official selection shall be done by region. Each region shall select an official from the group that are working their regional tournament.

Howe noted the pre-game dunking issue with a message that the coaches are essentially responsible for the adherence to the rules and should have control of the pre-game situation, not allowing any illegal dunking.

The recommendations of the Golf Advisory Committee were reviewed and with the amendment to the recommendations concerning state qualification, Howe moved and Sailer second the acceptance of the following:

# CLASS A BOYS:

 Regions shall be made up of an East/West division with the top six teams and individuals from each region advancing to the state tournament. Also any individual who scores 8 or less over par shall advance to the state tournament.

After further review, motion by Sailer and second by Koppelman to accept the following:

# CLASS B BOYS AND GIRLS:

- Class B grass greens coaches shall act as marshals as assigned by the tournament management. This assignment is not for the purpose of keeping score but to be available to check scores and give rules interpretations and assess penalty strokes.
- Class B Boys and Girls Grass Greens regionals shall advance the top six individuals plus any other individual that scores nine or less over par.

The recommendations of the Gymnastics Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Howe and second by Ott, the following items were approved:

Regional alignment shall be:

West Region (8) - Bismarck, Century, Dickinson, Kenmare, Mandan, Minot, New Rockford, Toga

East Region (9) - Fargo North, Fargo South, Grand Forks, Jamestown, Larimore, Mayville-Portland, Valley City, Wahpeton, West Fargo

- The top four teams from each region shall advance to state.
- Teams that qualify for state shall designate the six competitors per event that shall compete for team score. This must be done by noon the Monday following the regional meet.
- 4. State Gymnastics Meet shall be:

Friday - Team competition Saturday - Individual and All-Around competition

Schedule shall be: Friday - 4:00 P.M. - Begin Competition Saturday-NOON - Begin

- 5. Gymnasts that qualify in four events will also qualify for All-Around competition on Individual Day.
- With new state format, finals will no longer be held.
- 7. Regional competition shall begin at 2:00 P.M.

- Two judges per event will officiate at the state meet. (Top official from each region).
- Meet Referee shall assist in the selection of the superior judge in each event.
- Meet Referee shall handle the draw for rotation at regional and state meets.

Recommendations from the Hockey Advisory Committee were reviewed and upon motion by Christian and second by Mundy, the following items were approved:

- Recommend that the NDHSAA adopt a standard game report form to be used by all schools.
- Recommend change in the method used in selecting State Tournament officials.
  - a Coaches nominated the following 15 officials in their order of preference:

b. Executive Secretary, Tim O'Leary and Coaches' Advisory Committee will hold conference call in January to select top twelve officials (first eight referees and other four linesmen).

The Board reviewed the recommendations from the Swimming Advisory Committee and following the amendment to #2, motion by Mundy and second by Ott, the following were approved:

- A set warm-up procedure at meets is to be left up to the host team with prior mutual consent of the visiting team.
- A lifeguard is recommended to be on duty at all meets for all warm-up and competition.
- 3. State Meet officials are required to write the National Federation swimming and diving examination. It is also recommended that these officials attend the NDHSAA rules interpretation clinic.
- Diving sheets shall remain confidential throughout the entire diving event at all meets.

The Tennis Advisory Committee recommendations were reviewed and upon motion by Sanford and second by Sailer, the following were approved:

1. The penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct shall be:
First offense - Game penalty
Second offense - Set penalty
Third offense - Match penalty

This penalty system will not be carried into the competitors next match.

NOTE: Under unusual circumstances, if tournament management deems necessary, a competitor may be immediately suspended from the tournament.

- Tournament management shall select court monitors and shall hold a briefing meeting with these officials prior to the tournament to familiarize them with their duties including conduct rules and prescribed penalties.
- 3. The regional team challenge match, if need be held, shall be played after regional competition with a deadline date of completion of the Tuesday before the State Tournament. This match shall be held at the site of the 4th place team or nearest indoor facility if necessitated by weather.
- 4. Regional and State court assignments shall be left to the tournament management. This will enable the management to schedule any matches to be played outdoors when weather permits.
- A trainer is recommended to be at tournament headquarters for regional and state competition.

The following Track Advisory Committee recommendations were read and separately approved as follows:

# Class A and B

- Recommend having weight implements available for optional use by participants at State Meet.
- 2. Lanes should be assigned in reverse order in the distance events when more than one runner is in a lane for 800, 1600, 3200 and  $4 \times 800$  relay.
- Recommend that the roped off area at the State Meet should be ushered more closely.
- 4. Revised the minimum standards as follows:

 Class A Girls
 Class B Girls

 3200 Meter Run
 12:30.0

 Class A Boys
 Class B Boys

 800 Meter Run - 2:01.5
 Pole Vault - 12' 3"

Motion by Howe, second by Sanford and carried.

# Class B

- Adopt Class A regional schedule for regional meets. Motion by Ott, second by Christian and carried.
- Triple jump shall be optional at regular season meets. Motion by Sailer, second by Enget and carried.
- Break at regional meets will be after the 400 Meter Run. Motion by Enget, second by Koppelman and carried.

The Volleyball Advisory Committee recommendations were reviewed by the Board. Upon motion by Sailer and second by Koppelman, the following <u>Class A</u> recommendations were approved:

- Teams shall be allowed a total of 20 minutes warmup at the regional tournament.
- Only NDOA officials shall be contracted for the State Tournament.
- State tournament management shall provide a floor captain and statisticians.

Upon motion by Howe and second by Koppelman, the following were approved for Class B:

- Starting times at the State Tournament shall be 9:00 A.M. on Friday to allow rest time for the teams that play the semi-final matches that evening.
- 2. Add a 7th place match to State Class B Tournament. Saturday competition shall begin earlier to accommodate this in the schedule.
- Selection of State Tournament officials shall be number one vote getter in Regions 1,3,5 and / for 1990. For the 1991 tournament, selections will be made from Regions 2,4, 6 and 8.

The Wrestling Advisory Committee recommendations were read and upon motion by Koppelman and second by Sailer, the following were approved:

- 1. Coaches would like the scheduling option of adding up to two tournaments in exchange for two duals for each. (Presently six tournaments and eight duals are allowed.) Some schools feel they can get more wrestling at a lower cost to the schools by adding tournaments instead of duals.
- Requested that weigh-ins Friday night (scratch weight) and Saturday morning (1 pound allowance) be provided at the State Tournament.

3. A before school weigh-in at home may be implemented for events held the day or evening of school days. This would relieve the wrestler of being concerned about weight during school time. This may be done only by mutual consent of both head coaches.

Music Advisory Committee recommendations were read and upon motion by Ott and second by Enget, the following were approved:

- Send music questionnaire to all administrators and music directors in late August NDHSAA mailing that contains the following questions:
  - a. Are you in favor of splitting the State Music Festival into separate Class A and Class B divisions.
  - b. Are you in favor of eliminating a State Festival and going to 2 to 4 regional sites? (We would call the existing 13 regions "districts".)
    - c. Are you in favor of limiting the number of categories one student could enter so as to make contests easier to manage and schedule?
  - d. If you are in favor of question 1 or 2, are you also in favor of raising entry fees substantially to pay the additional cost of more contests/festivals?
- Meet July 21st at the NDHSAA office to work on wording of questionnaire and to provide philosophy Board of contests on questionnaire.

The Speech Advisory Committee recommendations were read and acted upon separately as follows:

#### Student Congress:

- Credit point range be changed to 0 to 5 from 1 to 5 - page 77
- Clarification of Rule 15 on Page 75, "The P.O. must call for four affirmative speeches and four negative speeches on each resolution before it can be removed from the floor."
- Rules clinic for coaches only will be held at the NDSTA Convention and at each regional if need be. A 50 question test will also be given.
- 4. Penalty Clarification of Rule 1 on Page 68, "The penalty for not presenting a typewritten resolution/bill at each Region and State Congress shall be that the participant may not be seated in his/her respective chamber until a typewritten bill/resolution is presented to the P.O."

- 5. It is strongly recommended that each chamber have a separate parliamentarian and a separate judge (scorer) at regionals. The State Congress shall have both a parliamentarian and a separate judge (scorer) at regionals. The State Congress shall have both a parliamentarian and a judge in each chamber for each session.
- 6. To strengthen the quality of resolutions, House IA and IB shall use the same resolutions and House IIA and IIB shall use the same resolutions.

The Introductory Speech can only be given in one of the chambers and the resolution will have to be listed as "Written in Committee in the other chamber of both Houses".

- 7. Majority of voting purposes shall be defined as the number present in a specific chamber at the time a vote is taken.
- 8. Two-thirds majority shall be defined as two-thirds of the members present at Friday's roll call and again at Saturday's roll call.
  - 9. Add to Rule 4 under TABULATIONS and AWARDS on Page 78: Only the top ten participants per school will count towards the Sweepstakes awards at invitationals and the State Congress.
  - 10. When students yield time, no more than 5 points may be awarded, whether the 3 minute speaking period has been divided into halves, thirds, etc. A speaker may not receive any speaker points for his/her allotted time.

Motion to Sanford, second by Mundy and carried.

# DEBATE:

Change entry form so each school could enter the Varsity Policy Debaters, two JV Policy Debaters and two At-Large Debaters. All varsity, At-Large and JV debaters would debate oneanother through four preliminary rounds. The top eight teams after the preliminaries, would advance to championship round quarter finals and the next highest eight teams would move into the consolation bracket where they would debate for consolation champion and consolation runner-up beginning with quarterfinals, if there are eight teams. Awards in championship bracket would be for 1st, 2nd, two semi-final losers plus the two teams with the best records that lose in the quarterfinals will debate for fifth.

Motion by Ott, second by Christian and carried.

# PLAYS:

- 1. Recommend site for finals be different than site for preliminary round.
- 2. Add as new Rule 1 under both Class A and Class B Play Rules: "A school cannot use the same play used the last previous year in the state contest although a student can be entered in a play that he/she used a portion of in a dramatic interp. category the same or previous year".

Motion by Koppelman, second by Ott and carried.

# SPEECH:

- 50 Great American Short Stories shall be used for 1. Interpretation the 1989-90 Extemporaneous category.
- The following committee will work this summer to choose a recommended book for 1990-91: Kathy Lundstrom of Hazen, Ellie Gibson of Kindred, Tracy Steiner of Beulah, Mark Joraanstad of Fargo Shanley and Jodi Shorma of Wahpeton.
- Add the following clarification for all events: "No props may be allowed in any category with the exception of poster board visual aids in Speechto-Inform. Props include hats, hand props, etc.
- 4. In all Extemporaneous categories, there must be two preliminary rounds and a final round with three judges except Class A regionals where, if coaches agree, there may be three rounds with one judge per round.
- 5. A student may work at a radio station and still be eligible for Radio Broadcasting or any other speech event.
- 6. Qualifying Rules for Invitational Tournaments:
  - a. The minimum number in Extemporaneous Speaking, Radio, Inform, Entertain, and Persuade be lowered from fifteen to twelve.
  - All qualifiers must be paid regional entrants and no one can substitute for them.
- Add to Rule G, Page 41 in Extemporaneous Speech: "The contestant shall not use pre-written speeches or outlines..."
- Add to section 2, Rule B, Page 40 in Extemporaneous Speech: "...NOR HAS HE/SHE BEEN IN STUDENT CONGRESS OR BEEN A..."

- Add to Section 1-A on Page 40 in Extemporaneous Speech, change "will automatically" to "may be" limited to a 30 minute prep. period in each event.
- 10. Add to Oral Interp., Dramatic Duo that "...a participant may not use a cutting used in the previous year's speech contest."
  - Under Speech-to-Inform, the specific fundamentals of Persuade shall be listed.

Motion by Sailer, second by Sanford and carried.

The Tournament Rotation plan was reviewed by the Board. Howe moved and Enget second the motion to keep the rotation plan set three years in advance, setting the third year on an annual basis. After extensive discussion, the second and motion were withdrawn and the item was tabled until the following day.

The dates for the 1989-90 Board of Directors meetings were reviewed and upon motion by Enget and second by Sanford the Board approved the following dates:

Koppelman reported on behalf of the Redistricting Committee who have reviewed the recommendation of the Basketball Study Committee. Following the report, motion by Koppelman and second by Sailer the Board approved:

## Class A

- Retain the current classification numbers of 325 and 200, thereby permitting schools below 325 and above 200 the discretion to be classified either Class A or Class B.
- The participating schools in Class A are to recommend to the NDHSAA Board of Directors how many conferences they will have and how their play-off plans will be implemented.

3. Class A are to finalize conference and play-off plans no later than October 1, 1989.

# Class B (as amended)

- 1. The Board of Directors establish a 24 District format.
- Every attempt will be made to retain the present regional lines when the district lines are established.
- The NDHSAA staff will standardize the method of advancement of the two third place teams from district tournaments to regionals.

And, referred to the Constitution and ByLaws Committee:

#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: The significant accounting policies followed are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

Fund Accounting

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the user of resources available, the accounts of the association are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purposes. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group.

The assets, liabilities, and fund balances of the association are reported in self-balancing fund groups as follows:

Operating funds, which include unrestricted and restricted resources, represent the portion of expendable funds that is available for support of the operations of the association. The operating fund has been subdivided into the general fund and the accident benefit fund.

Plant funds represent resources restricted to plant acquisitions and other plant expenditures.

Basis of Accounting

All funds are accounted for using the accrual basis. Revenues are recognized when earned and expenditures are expensed in the period they are incurred.

Plant Assets and Depreciation

Uses of operating funds for plant acquisitions are accounted for as transfers to plant funds. Proceeds from the sale of plant assets are included in the operating fund balances. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is provided over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets on a straight-line basis.

2. INVESTMENTS: The association pools its funds and keeps them invested for maximum yield. On June 30, 1989, 7.1% of the investments were in a local bank, 30.3% in a local savings & loan association and 62.6% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. This is in comparison to June 30, 1988, when 5.2% of the investments were in a local bank and 21.8% in a local savings and loan association and 73.0% with Edward D. Jones & Co., an investment firm. Investments consist primarily of money market and time savings certificates which bear interest at rates from 6.6% to 12.5%. The average yield for the year ended June 30, 1989 was 9.5% compared to 9.01% for the prior year.

Investments held at a local savings & loan association exceed \$100,000. As required by law, the depository has granted a security interst in securities and notes as collateral for all amounts in excess of the \$100,000 FSLIC insurance coverage.

4. RESURVES AND UNDESIGNATED BALANCES: The board has designated or reserved portions of funds for contingencies and special purposes. The reserves are reviewed and updated, if necessary, on an annual basis of the board of directors. Unclaimed checks issued in excess of one year are restored to the bank accounts and carried as a liability for a period extending beyond the six year requirement of the statute of limitations.

Undesignated balances are intended to be maintained at only a nominal layer.

5. RETIRDHENT PLANS: The association has provided certified retirement plans for the administrative staff. These retirement plans provide for 6 1/4% of the salary to be contributed by employees which is matched by the association. After July 1, 1988, 2.25% of the salary was contributed by the employees and 10.25% contributed by the association. The funds are in a trust with a local savings & loan association.

After July 1, 1979, professional staff members (that are qualifed teachers) have been included in the state teachers retirement plan. Contribution and matching requirements are also 6 1/4% of salaries. Beginning July 1, 1983, the association agreed to fund the entire contribution of 12.5% for those covered under the teachers retirement plan.

The associations contribution totaled \$27,839 in 1989 and \$24,999 in 1988.

#### REPORT ON SUPPLEMENTARY DATA

Our audits were made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the basic financial statements taken as a whole. The accompanying supplementary information on pages 8 through 12 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.
