The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 68th Annual Yearbook which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

- 1991-92 marked the 84th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Our membership was down to 211 high schools. Because of the decreasing number of schools and the large number of co-ops you could see some drastic changes in the basic format of the NDHSAA in future years.
- 1991-92 was the first year of a combined Class A & B Wresting Tournament which proved to be very successful. The Board of Directors is also considering combining the Volleyball Tournament in the future.
- With the decreasing number of schools and the addition of more cooperative programs you will continue to see many changes in the Association, 1992-93 will see the number of Class "B" Districts reduced from 24 to 16.
- The 1991-92 year ended up to be successful financially for the Association even after a very disappointing fall season caused by the weather.
- It appears that the changes made in admission prices for the 1991-92 year will be adequate to run Association business and hopefully enough to increase tournament payments to schools.
- A complete audit of the General Fund can be found in the back of this publication.

I would like to express a very sincere thank you to all administrators, coaches and athletic directors for your support and cooperation in my fourth year as your Executive Secretary. Our staff will continue to make every effort to provide your school the best possible service in 1992-93.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors - Special Meeting July 24, 1991

The meeting was called to order with all members present.

President Haugland welcomed new Board Members Nancy Johnson, Wallace Schmeling and David Rust.

A cooperative application for Wolford to Leeds in Boys Basketball was reviewed and discussed. Because of the controversy surrounding this application, Hurl moved to table this until the August meeting, giving all parties an opportunity to present their concerns to the Board. Second by Lentz and carried.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the interpretation by Attorney Thune of the eligibility of students from a school that is entering into a consortium. Along with this interpretation comes a concern for those students who wish to transfer to a school that would eliminate traveling the long distance required to remain in their current school system. The Board was asked for their opinion as to whether this would constitute grounds for a hardship application .

The Board heard from Tom Decker of the Department of Public Instruction concerning what they have been advising those schools that are entering into a consortium. The Ludwig case has been mentioned with the recommendation that the hardship approach be used in an application for granting of eligibility to transfer from the Midkota Consortium to the New Rockford school district.

The Dept. of Public Instruction indicated that they will share with the NDHSAA each consortium's policy concerning fuition agreements with adjoining schools to assist in ruling on hardship eligibility requests. Motion by Hanson that one of the requirements in order to act on a hardship application is to have the consortium's policy concerning the tringe population. Second by Lentz and carried.

Motion by Hurt that the Executive Secretary use his discretion concerning the need for an on-site investigation for a hardship request that results in an application because of the development of a consortium. Second by Rust and carried.

The Board was informed that there are several investigations for hardships that are being sent to respective Board members.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the up-coming dates for Board meetings including the new Board member orientation meeting on August 7 and the regular meeting on August 8th.

Motion by Johnson for adjournment. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Auditor James Lochow, CPA with Ludvigson, Braun and Co., reviewed with the Board the Annual Audit of the NDHSAA for the 1990-91 fiscal year. Motion by Lentz to accept the audit report as presented. Second by Schneider and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the investment Report as well as a report indicating what moneys came from each investment area.

The Board studied a report breaking down the financial results of each individual activity for the last 6 years and a comparison report on the General Fund and ABF Fund for the last 5 years.

Lentz reported on behalf of the Finance Committee concerning the budget for the past year and the 1991 92 year. Following a comparison study of the admission prices in North Dakota and other states, a list of price increments as follows was proposed to be added to the 91-92 budget:

Motion by Hurt to accept, with the increase in ticket prices, the proposed budget for the 1991-92 year of \$872,700. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Board reviewed the AFB report and the projected run-out costs. Motion by Lentz to accept the report. Second by Tehle and carried.

Hurt reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee Indicating that the 91-92 Constitution and ByLaws changes as well as the final proposed changes in the Board Policy book are complete and in place. Acceptance of the new Board Policy was recommended. The Committee also discussed the Athletic Review Committee's request for the NDHSAA Board to sponsor an amendment to Part 2, Article XII, removing all sport regulations from the Constitution and recommended that no action be taken on this

Motion by Rust to accept the recommendations of the Committee. Second by Tehle and carried.

Hurt reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee concerning the proposed 16-district boundary lines as sent to the member schools as well as presented to the administrators at the Summer Administrators Conference in Devils Lake. The Committee recommended that the revised map be the considered proposal. This will be sent back to the schools along with a survey to study the consensus of the membership on the proposed change. Motion by Schneider to approve the recommendations of the report. Second by Hansen and carried.

Schneider reported on behalf of the Officials Committee with the following recommendations:

- a. Accept the proposed list of officials selected to work the Girls' State Class A and Class B basketball tournaments
- b. Beginning with the 1992 Boys Class A and Class B state basketball tournaments, a proposed list officials for state basketball tournaments will be made by office staff using lists of suggested officials from the NDOA and the Coaches Association as part of the criteria. Final approval of these selections will be made by the NDHSAA Board.
  - c. Accept the proposed increment of Class A JV Basketball officiating fee to \$20.
- d. Adopt the 3-year sit-out rule for state baseball and wrestling officials starting count with the 91-92 year.
- e. Indicate to the NDOA Board of Directors that they have the power to make exceptions in special cases to the requirements for induction to the NDOA Hall of Fame but to not change the guidelines that have been used in the past.
  - f. Office staff shall be instructed to research new avenues of recruitment of officials.

Motion by Schmeling to approve the recommendations of the Committee. Second by Hurt and carried.

A discussion took place concerning the possibility of declaring the NDHSAA building as a smoke-free facility. Motion by Hurt to put into place a smoke-free policy. Second by Tehle and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the proposed 4 regions for Class B Boys' and Girls' grass greens goth from the present 3 regions. Motion by Schneider to approve the 4-region alignment. Second by Hansen and carried. The new alignment is as follows:

With a motion by Hurt and second by Hansen, the Board approved the following regional Class B Golf tournament site assignments:

Schneider reported on a hardship investigation for Sheldon Williams who is requesting to be made eligible through a hardship transfer from Belcourt to Dunseith. Motion by Schneider to approve immediate eligibility. Second by Hansen and carried.

Hansen reported on a hardship investigation concerning Rob Hoffman who has transferred to Oakes from Post Falls, Idaho. Motion by Hurt to grant immediate eligibility. Second by Schmeling and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the following hardship investigations:

a. Shelby Rauschenburg of Grand Forks who did not obtain sufficient credits to be eligible for the first four weeks of the fall semester. Because the Constitution and ByLaws regulations cannot be waived by action of the Board, motion by Lentz to deny the request. Second by Schneider and carried.

b. Gary Klein family and the James Ludwig family who reside in the Grace City School District and are requesting permission to transfer to Carrington and New Rockford respectively without loss of eligibility. By power previously given to the Executive Secretary to act on these without Board approval it. was reported that more information will be obtained before action is taken.

Hurt reported on a hardship investigation concerning Wade Bachmeier who wishes to transfer from St. Mary's to Bismarck High School and moved to deny the request. Second by Tehle and carried.

Hansen reported on a hardship investigation that he conducted on Bryan Mitzel who transered from Anahelm, CA to Edgeley and moved for approval. Second by Hurt and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a hardship request for Landon Wilson who wishes to transfer to Grand Forks. Motion by Schneider to deny the request. Second by Lentz and carried.

The Board held an audience with a delegation from Jameslown requesting that the Board reconsider the site selection for the 1992 East Region Boys' Basketball tournament. With a note of emphasis to the Eastern Conference to clarify their preference for site selections in the future, no action was taken.

Jerry Sheldon of the Fargo Public Schools appeared before the Board to ask for consideration of sponsorship of Class A soccer. A committee was appointed to study this proposal and report to the Board at the October meeting. The committee as appointed shall consist of: Jerry Sheldon, Chairman; Andy Dahlen, Grand Forks; Terry Hielmstad, Minot; Darrell Anderson, Mandan and Jim Haussler, Bismarck.

A large delegation from Wolford and Leeds appeared before the Board to speak on the community feelings concerning their proposed cooperative sponsorship for Boys' basketball. John Nelson, President of the Wolford School Board presented the process that has taken place from the beginning of the proposed coop up to the present time. Following a number of comments from the others in attendance, motion by Johnson to approve the cooperative application. Second by Lentz and unanimously approved by roll call vote.

The meeting was called back to order on August 9, 1991 at 8:30 A.M. with all members present except Sanstead

Association cars were discussed followed by a motion by Tehle to call for bids on the two vehicles and those bids be opened at the October Board meeting. Second by Rust and carried.

The Board received a up-to-date list of all cooperative sponsorships separated by sport for information purposes.

A communique from Dick Karlgaard thanking the Board for assisting with the National Coaches Association convention which was held in Bismarck.

The Board was informed that the vote concerning tax monies for the proposed additional seats in the Bismarck Civic Center was passed and the need for study of a possible change in the site of the 1993 Class B Boys State tournament site need not continue.

Following a study of cooperative sponsorship applications, upon motion by Hurt and second by Schneider, the Board approved the following:

Upon motion by Tehle and second by Johnson the discussion tabled in the June meeting concerning frequency of physical exams and physical cards was brought back for discussion. From Inquiries at the National Federation convention it was discovered that many states require annual physical examinations of all participants in their sanctioned athletic activities. This is done to avoid liability problems. With recommendation from the Executive Secretary, no action was taken to change the current requirements.

The Board was informed of a request from Devils Lake to have their eligibility request tabled from the June meeting placed on the September agenda.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the receipt of a contract from the Fargo Dome for the 1993 Football Play-offs. NDHSAA attorney Gary Thune will be requested to be available when this case is reviewed with the Fargo Dome Authority.

The Executive Secretary reported that all tournament assignments for the 1991-92 year have been signed with the exception of Region IV Track which is on hold until the newly contracted VCSU track coach is available.

With information available that the University of North Dakota track facility is not being repaired as originally planned, the Executive Secretary was instructed to contact the Track Advisory Committee for Input as to what should be done with site selection for the State Track meet.

Motion by Hurt to adjourn. Second by Schneider and carried.

Heather Sandness who transferred from Totino Grace in Fridley, Minnesota to Fargo Oak Grove. Motion by Hansen for approval of the request for immediate eligibility. Second by Schmeling and

The Executive Secretary reported on a hardship investigation that he conducted in Cooperstown concerning Bo Beaudin who has transferred from Valley City High School to Griggs County High School. Motion by Lentz to grant immediate eligibility. Second by Tehle and carried.

The Board reviewed a cooperative sponsorship application for Golden Valley to Beulah for cross country. Motion by Hurt to approve the application. Second by Rust and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported that 88 of the possible 192 surveys for the new re-districting plan had been returned and informed the Board of the results to that point.

There being no further business. President Haugland declared the meeting adjourned.

#### MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors September 19, 1991 - Bismarck, N.D.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 1:00 P.M. on September 19, 1991 at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck. President Haugland called the meeting to order with

The Board reviewed the minutes of the August 8 regular meeting and the September 5 special meeting. Motion by Rust to approve the minutes as read. Second by Tehle and carried.

The Executive Secretary reviewed with the Board the General Fund report through August 31, 1991. Upon motion by Hurt and second by Johnson, the report was accepted.

The ABF report was reviewed followed by a motion by Rust to give authority to the Executive Secretary to employ Rick Fitzner on an as-needed basis to process claims. Second by Schmeling and carried.

Hurt reported on behalf of the Class B Re-Districting Committee pointing out the results of the survey and letters from schools addressing the questions outlined in the survey. The surveys returned indicated that 81 schools were in lavor of reducing the number of Class B schools from 24 to 16 and 38 schools were opposed with 52 schools not returning their survey. Input from schools will be heard today via scheduled audiences of requesting schools and action concerning this proposal will go as scheduled at the October meeting. At that time, a report will be given to the General Assembly.

Lentz reported on behalf of the Finance Committee with the recommendation that the NDHSAA no longer participate in the Employer Participation program with TFT and a 6.75 increase be included in the salaries of those participating. Motion by Hansen to follow this recommendation as of October 1, 1991. Second by Schneider and carried.

President Haugland recommended the following selections to the nominating committee: Supt. Jerome Enget (Chmn.), Hazen; Supt Mark Sanford, Grand Forks and Supt. Gerald Christianson of Cooperstown. Motion by Hurt to approve these selections. Second by Tehle and carried,

Assistant to the Executive Secretary, Solberg reported on the attendance numbers for the four 1991 cheerleader clinics and the bids presented by a list of cheerleader companies for the four 1992 clinics.

Larry Klundt, Executive Secretary of the North Dakota Council of School Administrators appeared before the Board concerning the time scheduled for the General Assembly meetings during the NDASA Fall and Mid-Winter Conferences. The Fall Conference schedule has been finalized but the Mid-Winter Conference schedule could be modified to accommodate a motivational speaker provided by the NDHSAA immediately followed with the General Assembly meeting. Several Board members and the Executive Secretary will meet with the planning committee tomorrow morning to work on schedule possibilities for the Mid-Winter Conference.

The President informed the Board that several school administrators have requested that consideration be given to change the date of the State Track Meet. Discussion followed concerning the possible requirement of seniors being mandated to attend 180 days of school which would eliminate early graduation. A ruling such as this would force later graduations and a date conflict with State Track. Further discussion was tabled until the Attorney General makes a rule interpretation on this matter.

#### N. DAK. HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

Continued discussion took place concerning the condition of the University of North Dakota track and the possibility of moving the site of the state event. Rust wished to go on record as being opposed to hosting a North Dakota High School Activity event in a facility that was not in the state. The Executive Secretary was directed to gather more information and this subject shall be placed on the October agenda.

The Board held an audience with Supt. Gary Engebretson of Ray and Supt. Clifton Lee of Grenora who spoke in opposition to the Class B re-districting proposal.

Prin. Steve Swiontek of Devils Lake and student Chad Rolland appeared before the Board in a follow-up from the June meeting requesting an extension of one year of eligibility because of loss of participation due to a "life-threatening illness". NDHSAA attorney, Gary Thune supplied an opinion as to the interpretation of what is a life-threatening illness as it is stated in the Constitution and ByLaws. Following questioning and discussion, motion by Sanstead to grant an additional year of eligibility. Second by Johnson. A roll call vote followed.

Rust - No Lentz - No Hansen - No Schmeling - Yes Schneider - No

Hurt - No Tehle - No Sanstead - Yes

Motion failed 4-6.

Gerry Baumgartner who transferred from Strasburg to Linton. It was recommended to deny. Motion by Schneider to deny the request. Second by Tehle and carried. Request denied.

Rust: Jon and Kelli Brady who transferred from New Town to Mandaree. Motion by Rust to approve. Second by Hurt and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on his investigation of a student reported to be an ineligible participant at Tuttle. This protest had been submitted by Robinson. Motion by Hurt to deny the protest and allow the student to participate in Tuttle. Second by Lentz and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared a letter sent by the Grand Forks Public Schools explaining that changes have been made in their system pertaining to credits per semester and how credits per year are earned. Under the present interpretation of Question 60 of the Constitution and ByLaws, this new system may not be in compliance with the rule. Following a motion by Hurt and second by Schneider, the Board approved the change and directed the staff to work on a change in interpretation that would fit a more flexible scheduling policy.

A Devils Lake letter of concern about presentations of awards that do not fall under the guidelines of the Constitution and ByLaws was reviewed. The Board indicated that a reminder of the rule will be shared with the General Assembly at the Fall Conference.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board that all the necessary papers for the Breckennidge to Wahpeton-Shanley hockey cooperative agreement have been received. The coop was approved at a previous meeting pending receipt of such documents

A cooperative application for New Leipzig to Elgin for music was heard. Motion by Lentz to approve. Second by Tehle and carried.

The Board heard letters from the Bismarck Public Schools requesting their programs be allowed to exceed the 300 mile limitation for the following:

- 1. Century girls' swim team to Woodbury Invitational September 21. 2. Bismarck and Century wrestling teams to Blaine, MN, Dec. 20 & 21.
- 3. Bismarck hockey team to Cottage Grove, MN, Dec. 26, 27 & 28.

Motion by Schmeling to approve the Bismarck requests. Second by Johnson and carried.

Discussion took place concerning the Special Note on Board policy on the Drug and Alcohol rule. The Constitution and ByLaws Committee was appointed the task of researching this noted Board policy.

The Board read a letter from the Devils Lake hockey program indicating that they will not be attending the hockey jamboree. It was noted that the purpose of the hockey jamborees has been served and they will possibly be discontinued.

The Board read a letter from Verona indicating that they had used a 6th grade student on a high school team which is a violation of the Junior High section of the Constitution and ByLaws. The Executive Secretary was directed to send a letter of reprimand to Verona but also to thank them for reporting their own infraction.

The procedure that is taken upon receipt of a misconduct report was explained to the new Board

Hurt requested that NDHSAA staff look into the possibility of establishing the school year calendar using the numbering system for each week as used by the National Federation.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 1:00 P.M. on October 16 at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck. President Haugland called the meeting to order with all members present except Sanstead.

The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed. Upon motion by Tehle and second by Schneider, the minutes were approved as read.

The Executive Secretary presented the Financial Reports of the General Fund as of September 30, 1991 and the Accident Benefit Fund.

Supt. Michael Ness of Center spoke to the Board in support for a proposed cooperative agreement allowing Stanton to join Center for volleyball. Following Mr. Ness' presentation, the Board reviewed the following additional cooperative sponsorship applications:

Valley to St. Thomas for Baseball and Track Verona to LaMoure for Wrestling Leonard to Kindred for Wrestling, Speech and Volleyball Bottlneau to TMCHS (Belcourt) for Wrestling Hope to Page for Baseball.

Motion by Johnson to approve the reviewed cooperative sponsorship applications, with the Bottineau to TMCHS contingent on the completion of the application requirements. Second by Rust and carried.

Supt. Dean Koppelman of Bottineau appeared before the Board concerning the Kramer-Maxbass school district's closing of their Kramer elementary school and the wishes of those in the Kramer district to send all of their students, including the high school students to Bottineau High School without loss of eligibility. Motion by Schneider to allow those students to be eligible immediately. Second by Johnson and carried.

Russell Fletschock of Munich spoke to the Board in support of retaining the 24 District Basketball plan.

Hurt reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee with a proposed ciarification of the Note following Part II, Section XII concerning eligibility reinstatement after attendance at a certified alcohol/drug treatment center. The committee recommended further study.

Schneider reported on behalf of the Ad Hoc Committee. A survey conducted indicated that schools wished to continue the study concerning students involved in criminal acts. Motion by Hurt to report to the General Assembly and take a straw vote to poll the feelings of the school. Second by Schmeling and carried. This will be placed on the agenda for the November meeting when the Ad Hoc and Constitution and ByLaws Committees can meet together.

Prin. Loren Scheer of Cavalier appeared before the Board on behalf of the Pembina County Educators Association and most of District 7 concerning the re-districting plan and the fact that longer district play caused by more teams will lead to loss of school time.

President Haugland reminded those in attendance that the Board has supplied advance notice to all schools on the proposed re-districting plan and has allowed sufficient time for all schools to respond before the October meeting.

Lentz reported on behalf of the Finance Committee's proposal to no longer have the NDHSAA participate in the Employer Participation Program with TFT as of October 1, 1991 and moved that this action be amended to January 1, 1992. Second by Hansen and carried.

Hansen reported on behalf of the TV Committee and made the motion that they be tabled until after the broadcasters appeared later in the agenda. Second by Lentz and carried.

A number of broadcasters asked for an audience with the Board. First to speak was Gary Rogers of KBMW who indicated that he was speaking on behalf of the North Dakota Sportscasters Association concerning the increases in radio broadcasting fees. Also speaking to this Issue were Bruce Dougherty of KQLX in Lisbon, Wayne Sanders of Minot, Rod Kleinjan of KDIX in Dickinson and Dan Brannon of KFYR In Bismarck. All presenters indicated that the amount of income generated from radio advertisements for broadcasts of NDHSAA sport events added to the increase in fees was pricing them out of doing these games.

The Board reviewed the suggestions for possible amendments to the NDHSAA Constitution and ByLaws that may be proposed by the North Dakota School Boards Association. The Board indicated that someone from the NDHSAA Board should work with this group to hear their concerns. Johnson was appointed to this duty.

Prin. Norm Sortland of Divide County appeared before the Board representing Region 9 Music and Speech expressing concern over the increased number of basketball tournaments, hoop shoots and related activities that are in direct conflict with scheduled speech, music and track events. Mr. Sortland had conducted a survey of the regions and the following statement was given support by Regions 1 through 10: "Give priority in scheduling to North Dakota High School Activities Association sponsored events over those that are not and which occur at the same time." Jerry Sheldon appeared before the Board with the following requests:

# MINUTES Class B District Chairmen's Meeting 10:00 A.M. - November 22, 1991 Holiday Inn, Bismarck, ND

The Class B District Chairmen met at the Bismarck Holiday Inn at 10:00 A.M. on November 22, 1991 with Dave Schneider presiding.

Chairman Schneider called the meeting to order and following a brief introduction, called for the order of business starting with District 1.

<u>DISTRICT 1</u>: Supt. Dennis Nathan of Wyndmere presented the following recommendations:

1. The NDHSAA purchase a better quality ball through the bid process.

Expressed their district's concern over tootball camps allowing physical contact outside of the quidelines.

3. The patrons were concerned over the price increase of admission for football play-off games.

At this time the Executive Secretary spoke on the admission price increase issue explaining the reasons necessitating the changes.

Supt. Robert Kummeth of LaMoure suggested that an increase in public relations explaining the cause for admission increases would make the public more understanding of the reasons. He also suggested that schools may not see a problem with an increase in membership dues to offset the current deficit spending.

A straw vote indicated that the districts approved a further study to show projected revenue from a fee structure.

DISTRICT 2: Supt. Robert Kummeth of LaMoure reported:

- 1. The Board look at correcting the overlap of football and wrestling seasons.
- 2. The Bench Decorum rule needs to be enforced or changed to be enforceable.

At this time, a number of the districts went on record to indicate that the bench decorum rule must be left as currently written.

<u>DISTRICT 3</u>: Darwin Gorder of Oak Grove asked if there was any movement to go from the fan shaped backboard to the rectangular board.

The Executive Secretary indicated that there was no movement to change to any specific backboard mainly because of the cost factor.

DISTRICT 4: Prin. Roger Mulvaney of Oriska:

1. Asked for any information from the other districts of the new 16-district plan as to how they will determine what 4 teams will advance to regions.

DISTRICT 5: Supt. Keith Laite of Clifford-Galesburg indicated there were no further recommendations.

DISTRICT 6: Supt. Kevin Keenaghan or Northwood presented the following:

1. Devils Lake be considered for their district site and to not consider Grand Forks as a site for the regional tournament but rotate between Mayville and Grafton.

2. Expressed concern that the extended district play will cause a loss of school time.

DISTRICT 7: Supt. Steve Dick of St. Thomas expressed opposition to the 16 District concept.

DISTRICT 8: Supt. Russell Fletschock of Munich also expressed opposition to the new district alignment siting loss of school time and the change being too soon as reasons.

DISTRICT 9: Supt. Merrill Krueger of Rolette presented:

1. There was much confusion as to when the schools do vote or do not vote on issues, referring specifically to the new district alignment. There needs to be a clarification on when something is a survey and when it is a ballot for vote.

2. With the new district alignment, an 11-team tournament may be too much of a strain on one facility and their tournament workers.

3. Requested that the NDHSAA Board of Directors return to the original concept of cooperative sponsorship programs that were formed to allow an opportunity to participate. Many coops are now taking a playing position away from someone originally in an activity.

DISTRICT 10: Supt. Rocklyn Cofer of Warwick recommended:

1. The NDHSAA should get more input from the schools for the selection of regional and state basketball

2. The over-all roughness of play in basketball be addressed.

#### MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors November 22, 1991 - Bismarck, N.D.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 1:30 P.M. on November 22, 1991 at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck with all members present.

Jim Haussler, Athletic Director of the Bismarck Public Schools appeared before the Board to report on the study being conducted on the possibility of NDHSAA sponsorship for boys' and girls' soccer. A list of regulations, times and lengths of seasons and tournament format were included in their recommendation for sponsorship. Motion by Schneider to table for further study. The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at 1:00 P.M. on March 13, 1992 at the Bismarck Holiday inn with all members present.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the January 25th Board meeting, the January 27th Special Meeting of the General Assembly and the January 31st Special Board meeting. Motion by Rust to approve, second by Schmeling and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report of the General Fund through and including February 28, 1992. Motion by Hurt to accept the report. Second by Schneider and carried.

The Board heard the report of the Accident Benefit Fund through March 9, 1992. Motion by Tehle to accept the report. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board that all contracts offered to the NDHSAA staff were accepted and signed. Also, NDHSAA attorney, Thune is presently studying the retirement funds that the NDHSAA established for all staff that are not on the Teachers' Retirement Fund. A recommendation will come from the attorney at a later meeting.

Hurt reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee with the following items:

- (a) Consider change in the Alcohol and Drug rule with a recommendation that the revised School Board recommendation be prepared and presented in the form of an amendment at the Fall, 1992 General Assembly meeting.
- (b) The Committee recommends there be no addition to the Constitution and ByLaws concerning "criminal acts" and treatment of this situation be left up to the individual
- (c) There shall be no action on the " All-Star" rule and this be left for further study when more information is made available.

Motion by Hurt to table the proposal of an amendment to the Constitution and ByLaws concerning the alcohol and drug rule until the March 20th meeting. Second by Tehle and carried.

Lentz reported on behalf of the Football Committee. Upon motion by Sanstead and second by Johnson. the Board approved the following Football Advisory Committee recommendations as amended:

- 1. A scheduling meeting of the Class A schools will be held before the 1993 season. (Amended to include Ron Smedshammer of Jamestown and Darryl Anderson of Mandan to coordinate the meeting.)
- 1. The NDHSAA will furnish trophies for regional champions.

Following discussion of the 1993 football season, a motion was made by Lentz that all classes of football have an 8-game season for the fall of 1993. Second by Schmeling and carried.

Hurt reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee's discussion on the following:

- (c) Commended the Minot Tournament Committee and Manager Terry Hjelmstad for the smooth running of the combined state wrestling tournament. Coaches were informally polled and were in favor of keeping the tournament together.
- (d) The Committee favored returning to Minot for the combined state wrestling tournament

Hansen reported on behalf of the TV Committee. After reviewing the bid specifications they recommended to leave as is and send to the television stations for bids for the 92-93 and 93-94 seasons.

Motion by Hansen that the formulated bid specifications for the 1993 combined football finals that will be held in the Fargo Dome be kept separate from bids for other events. The office staff shall draw the specification for the bid. Second by Rust and carried.

The Board reviewed the Class A Girls' golf proposal. No action was taken.

For information purposes, communiques from New Town and Parshall concerning the site for Region 7 basketball were read by the Board.

Haugland reported on behalf of the Class A Committee with the following recommendations: (a) Consider the present hockey proposal at the following week's meeting.

A communique was read from Mandan Public Schools officially announcing their participation in the high school hockey program for the 1992-93 season.

A letter from Concordia College was read inviting the Board of Directors to consider their facility for the state track and field competition.

The Board was directed that a replacement for Tehle who is retiring from the Board must be considered. Motion by Tehle to table this replacement discussion until the April meeting. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The North Dakota School Boards Association's recommendation concerning the alcohol and drug rule was discussed. Study will continue and the recommendation shall be placed on the April agenda.

The Board held an extensive discussion on sportsmanship awards. A communique from Washburn was read concerning this issue.

#### MINUTES NDOA Board of Directors' Meetina MARCH 21 1992

President Risk called the meeting to order at 9:03 AM with members present, Bruce Jessen, Darrell Matejcek, Dave Johnson, Del Gab, Dwane Getzlaff and Jeff Hamre NDHSAA Board Members in attendance, Dave Schneider, David Rust and Greg Haugland.

Minutes were read and approved.

Hamre moved, second by Getzlaff to continue the \$1.00 "surcharge" on the officials' registration and use it to fund a recognition plaque for officials that have been registered with the NDOA for twenty years or more in 1991/92, and as officials reach their twentleth anniversaries in subsequent years. Presentation of the plaques should be at a Regional level tournament of a sport in which the official was most prominent.

Getzlaff Moved, second by Matejcek that Ray Jones be ineligible for post season tournaments in 1992/93 because of contract violations. Motion FAILED.

Jessen moved, second by Hamre that Ray Jones be ineligible for post season tournaments in boys basketball for the school year 1992/93 because of contract violations. Motion carried.

Gab Reported from the NFIOA: Sheryl Solberg has been selected to receive the Section 5 Contributor Award. Jeff Risk has been selected to umpire baseball in the National Junior Olympics this summer in Boise, Idaho. The NFIOA has been working with Ruedlinger's to improve insurance coverage for officials, as well as improving computer technology to allow NFIOA members access to information as needed. Dues for the NFIOA are being raised from \$9.00 to \$10.00, however, 100% membership states will remain at \$6.00.

The Board recommended that when an official has multiple choices for a region and one of the choices will place the official in the state tournament, acceptance slips be sent to the official in a way that they will not "guess" incorrectly and miss the state assignment.

Read a communique from Sheryl Solberg thanking the NDOA Board for nominating her for the Section 5 Contributor Award.

The Board asked that Sectional and National Award winners be recognized at NDHSAA Tournaments.

Getzlaff moved, second by Hamre that the fee for JV be the same in Class B as in Class A, (\$20.00), and that line judges be paid \$10.00 for varsity and \$5.00 for sub-varsity volleyball matches. Motion carried,

# MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors Meeting April 23, 1992

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Valley City at 11:00 A.M. with all members present except Johnson.

With a motion by Hurt and second by Schneider, the Board approved the minutes of the March 13 and March 20 meetings.

Doug Bertsch, principal of Fairmount High School and Al Jansen, principal of Campbell High School in Minnesota appeared before the Board requesting the deadline for application for girls' basketball cooperative sponsorship program be waived. Because of the unique situation with their cooperative sponsorship application in volleyball and the different seasons between the states, the complete package of sponsorship which includes boys' basketball along with girls' basketball and volleyball was late in organization. Rejection of the girls' basketball co-op because of the late application would affect the other sponsorships as well.

Motion by Schneider to waive the deadline date and approve the application conditional upon a 100% release of Fairmount from the present schedule by each of the schools on that schedule. Second by Tehle and carried. Rust requested his no vote be recorded in the minutes. The Executive Secretary was directed to send a release document to each of the schools on Fairmount's schedule for the release.

Upon motion by Hurt and second by Schmeling, the Board approved the cooperative applications for Fairmount to Campbell-Tintah for Volleyball and Boys' Basketball.

The Financial Report and the ABF report as of March 31, 1992 were presented to the Board. Motion by Hurt to approve the report. Second by Tehle and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the past use of the auditing firm of Ludvigson, Braun & Co. and recommended the continued use of this firm. Motion by Rust to contact this same firm. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Hurt reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee's on-going study of Article XIII, Section XII and the possibility of changing the penalty clause. After an extensive study, it was a feeling of the Committee there presently is no recommendation for change. The Executive Secretary was directed to draw up several suggested amendments the Committee can study and report back to the Board at the June meeting.

The Committee also discussed the problems created by the extension of seasons through independent tournaments after the regular high school season. The recommendation was to research at the summer convention what other states are doing with this problem.

Benefit tournaments and the merit of allowing such a tournament of that type were discussed. The Executive Secretary was directed to draft a definition of what would be an acceptable benefit tournament and report to the Committee at the June meeting.

Lentz reported on behalf of the Personnel and Finance Committee. There is a need to formulate a statement in regard to the hiring of future professional staff. The Executive Secretary was directed to draw up a final draft for consideration at the June meeting.

The Committee also studied a severance pay policy and will continue that study and report at the June meeting.

Schneider reported on behalf of the Officials Committee with a recommendation to accept their proposed changes in the officials pay schedule. Through motion by Schneider and second by Lentz, the Board approved the following:

 \$5.00 extra paid to officials working a varsity contest only in basketball, football, hockey, wrestling and volleyball.

b. Gymnastics set as follows:

\$30.00 ea. judge, 4 teams & less \$35.00 ea. judge, 5 to 7 teams

\$40.00 ea. judge, 8 or more teams

Schneider also reported that the NDOA wishes to present a 20 year plaque to all officials with the plaque being paid for through a one year \$1.00 increase in the initial registration fee. This plaque will be presented at a post season contest in that particular sport when possible. Motion by Schmeling to approve the request. Second by Rust and carried.

The Officials' Committee also recommended an alternate official or officials be contracted for the purpose of carrying out the prescribed duties at the score table at each session of the state basketball tournaments. Motion by Schmeling to approve this recommendation to use a local official with a payment of \$10.00 per game plus 2 tickets to the tournament. In the event the alternate official must actually step in and officiate a game, the regular game fee will be paid that official. Second by Tehle.

Motion by Hurt to amend this motion to include hockey and football. Second by Lentz and passed with a vote of 6-3.

The vote on the original motion as amended was passed with a 9-0 vote.

The Committee also had discussed the report of an official, Ray Jones, who had signed 2 district contracts with conflicting dates. Motion by Schneider to declare this official ineligible for post season tournaments (district, regional and state) for the 1993 boys' basketball season as recommended by the North Dakota Officials Association Board of Directors. Second by Schmeling and carried.

The Board reviewed the winter financial report. Motion by Sanstead to approve the report. Second by Tehle and carried.

The Class A Regional Chairmen's recommendations from the April 22 meeting were reviewed. Action on these recommendations will take place at the June meeting.

The Board heard a report from Minto informing them of an out-of-season violation by some of their boys' basketball players. Motion by Hurt to notify Minto that these individuals must sit out the first game of their up-coming basketball season. Second by Rust and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the following hardship investigations:

Nina Finley and Lana Finley who transferred from Killdeer to Mandaree and recommended immediate eligibility be granted. Motion by Schmeling to approve the request. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Jon Hoffman who transferred from Sidney, Montana to Bottineau and recommended immediate eligibility be granted. Motion by Tehle to approve the request. Second by Hansen and carried.

President Haugland directed the Executive Secretary to open the television bids that had been received. The bids were opened and read as follows:

KXJB of Fargo and the 4X Network (KXMA, Dickinson; KXMB, Bismarck; KXMC, Minot; KXMD, Williston) submitted a bid of \$70,000 per year with a 2-year total of \$140,000 with the following

breakdown: \$26,250 for Boys' Class A Basketball; \$29,750 for Boys' Class B Basketball; \$3,500 each tournament for the final 2 games of Class A and Class B Girls' Basketball; \$7,000 for the final 2 nights of State Hockey.

Meyer Broadcasting Company and KTHI-TV submitted a bid of \$128,570 per year for a 2-year bid of \$257,140. Breakdown is \$5,140 for Girls' Class A and Class B semifinal games, 3rd place and championship; \$6,430 for State Hockey with a minimum of 4 games; \$47,570 for Class A Boys' State Basketball with a minimum of 8 games and \$64,290 for Class B Boys' State Basketball with a minimum of 8 games and \$64,290 for Class B Boys' State Basketball with a minimum of 8 games.

The TV Committee was then excused to review the bids and insure that all requirements as set forth in the bid sheet were met. Following the recess, Hansen reported on behalf of the T.V. Committee with a motion to accept the bid as submitted by Meyer Broadcasting Company and KTHI-TV for a 2-year total of \$257,140 for the 1992-93 and 1993-94 school years. Second by Lentz and carried.

The Board read a communique from New England St. Mary's High School informing them that they would be closing their school at the end of the current year.

For Information purposes, the Executive Secretary shared with the Board the expense comparisons from the different sites for regional boys' basketball. The Board expressed appreciation for the communities that host the NDHSAA tournaments.

The Board read a communique from DesLacs-Burlington which stated they were in opposition to an increase in the dues structure for Association membership.

The Executive Secretary reported the State Baseball tournament needed to be moved from Jamestown because of a delay in the construction to replace their grandstand that was destroyed by arson. Valley City is the recommended site for this state event. Motion by Sanstead to approve Valley City as the State Baseball site with Dave Carisrud as manager. Second by Lentz and carried.

Schneider indicated with the weather being a problem this spring, it has been very difficult to get any games played. Discussion followed as to the possibility of moving the regional and state tournaments to a week later. Motion by Tehle that if there is no opposition from those schools with baseball programs, the deadline dates, regional and state tournament play shall be moved to one week later. Second by Hansen dearlied. The Executive Secretary was directed to contact each district chairman for their district's response.

The Board read a communique from Pembina requesting the Board to dissolve their football cooperative agreement with Dominion City. Motion by Hurt to grant their request. Second by Rust and carried.

The Board read a communique from Leeds regarding the limitation of the number of cheerleaders allowed on the floor during tournaments and how this would cause a problem with their cooperative program. Discussion and action on this item was placed on the agenda of the June meeting.

An eligibility case from Glenburn was heard involving the use of an ineligible player on their baseball team. Motion by Hurt that because this violation was an unintentional error, the school be informed they must forfeit those games in which this student played but no further action be taken. Second by Schmeling and carried.

An extensive discussion took place involving loss of school time because of the increasing practice of scheduling away from Saturdays. Members of the Board will continue to research this problem and this will be placed on the agenda for the June meeting.

Through motion by Hansen and second by Lentz, the Board approved the following cooperative applications:

Minnewaukan to Leeds for Sand Golf Edinburg to Edmore-Adams for Baseball Hazelton-Moffit to Linton for Volleyball Chaffee to Central Cass for Wrestling

With the organization of the Board for the 1992-1993 year, motion by Tehle to cast a unanimous ballot for Hurt as President and Schmeling as Vice President. Second by Lentz and carried.

The Board was informed that because of a schedule conflict, the June meeting has been changed to June 18 and 19.

The Executive Secretary was appointed to be the voting delegate to the National Federation Council meeting on July 1st.

The Parade of Champions and the merits of continuing this program were discussed. The staff was directed to conduct a survey of the member schools as to their wishes to continue and if so, when to hold the parade.

The Executive Secretary reported on the meeting of all Class A athletic directors in Jamestown on April 15. Those in attendance were working towards solving the basketball scheduling problems for the 1993-94 season. The football coaches had presented a proposed scheduling plan that is presently being used as a guideline for football scheduling.

The Executive Secretary reported on the numerous calls relative to the limitation of 2 meets per week for track. The schools are requesting a 3 meet per week maximum be granted because of the inclement weather that has caused many cancellations. Motion by Rust to give the Executive Secretary the authority to make that decision in the event the weather problem continues. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Board read a letter from West Fargo regarding the NDHSAA all-star policy.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board as to the status of the soccer study committee. Hurt, Schmeling and Haugland were appointed to do the preliminary work with the soccer committee and finalize a proposal to the membership.

Motion by Tehle to bring back the tabled discussion concerning his replacement on the Board because of his retirement. Second by Hansen and carried.

Motion by Tehle to appoint Marvin Leidal of West Fargo to replace Tehle on the NDHSAA Board of Directors. Second by Lentz and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported that with the results of the budget a dues structure change is not necessary at this time. Motion by Hurt that the office staff draft a proposed dues structure that will equalize the dues to the number of programs sponsored by each school and still bring in the same amount of total monies. This is to be studied by the Board. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Board discussed a Bismarck communique regarding foreign exchange students and their involvement in high school activity programs.

The Board heard a communique from Edmore reporting the use of an ineligible player because the coach was under the impression their cooperative sponsorship application in baseball had already been approved. The Executive Secretary was directed to send a letter of reprimand to the school.

Hurt introduced for discussion the amount of per diem that is paid for meal allowance and that it does not cover actual expenses. The Executive Secretary was directed to add this to the agenda of the Personnel and Finance Committee's meeting and report back to the Board at the June meeting.

Sanstead informed the Board that with the date change for the June meeting, he will not be able to attend and requested that the Board excuse this absence so it will not affect his eligibility for the summer meeting. Motion by Schneider to allow this attendance to be waived. Second by Rust and carried.

Schmeling requested there be some study into the use and re-use of towels at wrestling meets and a possible proposal be placed on the June agenda.

The Board discussed the individual awards at state tournaments and the handling of same. This is assigned to the Awards Committee for the June meeting. The process needs to be refined to prevent problems of running short, etc.

There being no further business, President Haugland declared the meeting adjourned.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office at 10:00 A.M. on June 18, 1992. President Haugland called the meeting to order with all members present except Schmeling (who arrived later), Sanstead and Rust.

Upon motion by Tehle and second by Johnson, the Board approved the minutes from the April 23

Pat Hatlestad from Williston appeared before the Board to inform them of their present and proposed improvements to their facilities and their request to host the region 8 tournaments for girls' and boys' basketball.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report of the General Fund to May 31, 1992. Motion by Hurt to accept the report. Second by Lentz and carried.

The Board reviewed the Accident Benefit Fund report. The Board was informed that a date has been proposed to close the account.

A final report of all t-shirt sales for the 1991-1992 year was reviewed.

The Board reviewed the recommendation from the Class A Regional Chairmen's meeting. All action will be considered later in the agenda as they will be repeated in the respective advisory committee recommendations.

The Class B District Chairmen's recommendations were reviewed. Motion by Lentz to limit the number of cheerleaders to 6 plus a mascot starting with the 93-94 school year. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Board reviewed the following advisory committee recommendations:

BASEBALL: Following a motion by Tehle and a second by Schneider, the Board accepted:

1. Delete regional tournaments and send the district (amended to now be called region) champions to an eight-team tournament on June 1 and 2. Format for State Tournament: Play four games each day with only the winners advancing from the first round.

2. Region play deadline is proposed to be May 26.

BASKETBALL: With motion by Tehle and second by Schneider the Board approved:

1. At the state tournaments, reserve a seating section for those participants at that particular state tournament to be available when they are not competing.

2. Recommend officials be on court when one or both teams are on the floor for warm-up (varsity contest). Also, it is requested officials working both the junior varsity and varsity contests have one of the officiating pair remain on court for varsity warm-up.

Following a discussion of the sportsmanship banner program, motion by Schneider to continue to Issue the banners as presently done. However, if a school has already received a banner in a particular sport, they will receive a patch indicating the year to be attached to the original banner. Second by Tehle and carried.

GOLE: Upon motion by Tehle and second by Hurt, the following was approved:

1. Require mandatory golf rules clinics only every other year.

1. Require a minimum of 1 week of 5 daily practices prior to the first competition.

A discussion was held concerning gotif contests and the possibility that some school's coaches are not at the facility supervising his/her team during competition. Motion by Tehle to send a message to coaches and administrators that they must be on site of the event. Second by Schneider and carried.

GYMNASTICS: Upon motion by Tehle and second by Schneider, the following gymnastics recommendations were approved:

- 1. Adopt the following Injury Petition: If a senior gymnast was injured at the time of the regional meet, she may petition for entry to the State Meet if the following requirements are met:
- (a) Photocopies of current season results from three meets of which only one may be a home contest, showing scores equal to or greater than the lowest qualifier's score in the petitioner's region shall be made available.
- (b) Supply a physician's written varification of injury along with a physician's approval to compete.
- (c) A written request from the gymnast's coach must be produced.
- (d) A written recommendation from the Gymnastics Advisory Committee indicating this gymnast is to advance to the State Meet.

(e) Deadline for petition must be made by noon of the Thursday preceding the regional meet.

(f) The petitioner and coach will be notified of the approval or denial of the petition by the Advisory Board by noon on Friday of Regionals.

(g) The State Meet director will be notified of the approval of the petition.

- (h) If the petition is accepted and the gymnast is then unable to compete, the coach must Immediately notify the meet director.
- 2. Change the regional entry forms to allow 8 gymnasts per team in each event.
- 3. Prior to individual competition on Saturday of the State Meet, a base score shall be set by judging a routine using a non-qualified gymnast. This will take place 1/2 hour prior to the beginning of competition which is during the scheduled judges' meeting. It shall be the host coach(s) responsibility to obtain this individual(s) for this purpose.
- 4. Begin team competition on the Friday of the State Meet at 3:00 P.M. and individual competition

NOTE: NDHSAA will publish the competition starting times only. Meet director will notify coaches concerning open gym, coaches' meeting and timed warm-up schedule.

HOCKEY: Motion by Schneider and second by Hansen to accept the following state tournament hockey format:

EAST REGION: Fargo North, Fargo South, West Fargo, Grafton/Park River, Fargo Shanley/Wahpeton, Grand Forks Red River, Grand Forks Central

WEST REGION: Bismarck, Bismarck Century, Bottineau, Devils Lake, Hazen/Beulah, Jamestown, Mandan, Minot, Williston

- 1. Every team in a region must play other teams in their region at least once.
- 2. Games will have point value: 4 pts. for win if play once 2 pts. for tie if play only once, 2 pts for win if play twice, 1 pl for tie if play twice.
- 3. The champion of the East & West Region will automatically qualify for the State Tournament.
- 4. The other six teams will qualify by the following schedule:

VOLLEYBALL: Upon motion by Tehle and second by Schneider, the Board approved:

- 3. Site, date and schedule for the Saturday of the Class B Regionals will be set by the NDHSAA. Each region will be responsible for determining the schedule and process to reduce their regional team to the four that will compete on that Saturday.
- 4. Continue the use of the yellow/red card system which was introduced for the 1991-92 season on a one-year trial basis.

The staff was instructed to study the possibility of combining the Class A and Class B State Volleyball Tournaments if the event was held one week earlier and was changed to a 3-day tournament. Results will be reported to the Board at the August meeting.

WRESTLING: Motion by Tahle and second by Schneider the Board approved:

- 1. Wrestlers and coaches will not wear caps when representing their school, parade, awards and generally in the wrestling area.
- 2. Only school issued uniforms and/or warm-ups may be worn for the parade and for the award

The Board read a communique from Hankinson concerning the release of a school on their schedule to allow them to join in a cooperative sponsorship in girls' and boys' basketball.

By motion from Hansen and second from Lentz, the Board approved:

- 4. The NDHSAA may approve non-certified judges for regional testivals in an emergency on an annual basis.
- 5. Request a meeting of all education and activities organizations(NDHSAA, NDASA, NDASSP, NDPTA, Vocational Education such as FBLA, VICA, DECA, FHA, FFA and NDHSCA, DPI, School Boards Assn.) to discuss master calendar of activities to alleviate scheduling problems and loss of school time to be held before or at 1992 NDEA Convention/Administrator's Conference in Bismarck.

#### SPEECH:

#### 1. STUDENT CONGRESS

- A. Allow four Presiding officers candidates per school (1 per chamber).
- B. There shall be a 2-minute questioning period after each speech introducing a resolution/bill but the speaker will be not be scored.
- C. All chambers may suspend the rules to allow a 1-minute questioning period after each speech so there will be no Interruptions during a speech on a resolution/bill.
- D. Participants will be placed in the same chamber as their resolution in the first 1992 congress. If it is decided it works well, this procedure will continue.

#### 2. DÈBATE

- A. NOVICE STATUS: A student no longer has novice debate status if -
  - 1. Any 7th or 8th grader has exceeded 15 rounds of debate or 12 sessions of student congress the previous year(s), or
  - 2. Any 9th grader has exceeded 12 rounds of debate or 8 sessions of student congress the previous year(s), or
  - 3. Any 10th grader has exceeded 9 rounds of debate or 6 sessions of student congress during the previous year(s), or
  - 4. Any 11th or 12th grader has exceeded 6 rounds of debate or 4 sessions of student congress the previous year(s).
- B.·Use the coaches approved ND debate/L-D ballot in 1992-93.
- C. Novice Lincoln-Douglas individual awards: Award 1st, 2nd, 2 semi-finalists, 5th and 6th using the new tie-breaking procedure(NO ADDITIONAL AWARDS from 1992.)
- D. Novices -There shall be semi-finals after the fifth round in policy and Lincoln-Douglas debate.

#### 3. ONE-ACT PLAYS

A. Play Rules Clinics for first year directors only. (Problem with present clinic schedule and new play contest schedule.)

- A. Revise Rule 6 on page 10 to reduce number of superior medals given at state. Only finalists or those that did not make finals because of tie-breaker, but had same total rating points as those that did make finals.
- B. Change to revised ballots in all speech events.
- C. Split DUO into Humorous Duo category and Serious Duo category (raises number of categories to 13).
- D. Revise Rule 7 on pages 9 and 10. If there are 1 to 7 regional participants, one advances to state, if 8-14 participants, 2 advance, etc.
- E. Students have the option of using a single note card in all original speeches.
- F. A Student in Extemporaneous events cannot listen to performances in a round until after he/she has spoken.
- G. In Dramatic and DUO students must use cuttings from a legitimate play script. No "dramatic readings" are allowed from such companies as Edna Means, Dramatists Play Service, etc.
- H. Revise Rule 12, page 8. State changes or substitutions should be made before the schedule is received and no later than 7 days before the State Tournament, except for emergencies. Substitutions for drops will be made up through the Wednesday of the state tournament approved by the NDHSAA office.

A communique from Kenmare requesting the elimination of the quota system for music contests was discussed. No action was taken.

The comparison chart of different State Association's per diem and mileage payments to staff and Board was studied. Motion by Schneider to increase mileage payments to \$.25. Motion withdrawn and referred to the Finance Committee for a report on the following day.

The Board discussed the problems with scheduling and loss of school time because of fewer schools scheduling activities on Friday and Saturday evenings. The Executive Secretary was directed to draft a letter to the member schools addressing this problem.

A letter from Maddock concerning their intent to enter into a cooperative sponsorship program in football was discussed. No action will be considered until further action is taken by the school(s) involved in the possible application.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial reportof the state track meets from 1989 through 1992.

The dates for the 1992-1993 Board of Directors meetings were reviewed and upon motion by Hansen and second by Hurt, the Board approved the following dates:

Hurt reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee with their proposal for an amendment to Section XII. Motion by Hurt to communicate this amendment to the membership in August, present to the General Assembly for discussion in October and possibly propose the amendment for a vote at the January General Assembly meeting. Second by Tehle and carried.

Hurt also reported on the Committee's discussion on the Interpretation and application of the rules concerning "Benefit" contests. Through motion by Hurt and second by Table, the Board revised question 50 as follows:

Q: May a school sponsor a "benefit" basketball game after the close of the season between high school students.

A: A school is not permitted to field a team in any sport after the close of the season for competition against other schools or teams consisting of personnel other than the student body except by special permission of the NDHSAA. These "benefit" contests must strictly adhere to the guidelines as set by the Association.

Reasons for school benefits may possibley be but are not limited to:

- 1. Fund raiser for uniforms, equipment, etc.
- 2. Raise money for community member in need.
- 3. Promote the activities program(s), school and/or community

The Board reviewed the financial comparison chart for trophy costs from the 1991-92 year and the previous year.

Upon motion by Hurt and second by Schneider, the Board approved the following cooperative sponsorship applications:

The proposed change in the National Federation's constitution was reviewed. Motion by Johnson to authorize the Executive Secretary to vote or pass on the authority to vote at the National Federation Council meeting.

Schmeling-initiated a Board discussion concerning waste disposal and the necessity of more caution in the handling of body fluids at athletic events.

The Board heard a request for approval of Bob Hetler's attendance to the National Debate Topic Selection Conference August 7-9 in Indianapolis. Motion by Lentz to approve. Second by Tehle and carried.

A communique from Rolette representing their initial application for a girls track cooperative agreement with Rugby was discussed. Motion by Schneider to approve the application pending the completion of all application requirements. Second by Johnson and carried.

Haugland reported on his hardship investigation of Boe Kautzman who transferred from Bismarck to New Salem and recommended immediate eligibility. Motion by Schmeling to approve eligibility. Second by Johnson and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a request concerning Brad Sundel who desires to transfer from Jud to Gackle because of academic reasons. No action was taken.

The following requests from the Bismarck Public Schools for trips were heard:
Century girls' swimming & diving to the University of Minnesota on September 19th
Bismarck and Century wrestling to Blaine, Minnesota on December 18th & 19th.
Bismarck hockey to St. Cloud, Minnesota on December 29th, 30th & 31st.
Motion by Hurt to approve these trips, Second by Tehle and carried.

The Executive Secretary announced to the Board that the NDHSAA has been informed that one of the reinsurers of our Liability and Litigation coverage through Partners in Protection had been declared insolvent. The Executive Secretary presented to the Board a bid from the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund for Liability/Litigation and Errors & Omission coverage through the company

Motion by Hurt to authorize the Executive Secretary to move the liability and errors & omissions policy to the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund. Second by Lentz and carried.

The Board instructed the Executive Secretary to search out an Insurance company for the full coverage of the Association automobile insurance.

A procedure for the selection of sites was set in the following order: Class B Boys' Basketball, Class B Boys Basketball, Class A Girls' Basketball, Hockey, Track.

Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audits provide a reasonable basis for our opinion.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the North Dakota High School Activities Association as of June 30, 1992 and 1991, and the results of its operations and changes in financial position for the years then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies followed are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

### Fund Accounting

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the user of resources available, the accounts of the association are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purposes. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group.

The assets, liabilities, and fund balances of the association are reported in self-balancing fund groups as follows:

Operating funds, which include unrestricted and restricted resourses, represent the portion of expendable funds that is available for support of the operations of the association. The operating fund has been subdivided into the general fund and the accident benefit fund.

Plant funds represent resources restricted to plant acquisitions and other plant expenditures.

### Basis of Accounting

All funds are accounted for using the accrual basis. Revenues are recognized when earned and expenditures are expensed in the period they are incurred.

### Plant Assets and Depareciation

Uses of operating funds for plant acquisitions are accounted for as transfers to plant funds. Proceeds from the sale of plant assets are included in the operating fund balances. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is provided over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets on a straight-line

### B. INVESTMENTS

The association pools its funds and keeps them invested for maximum yield. On June 30, 1992, 14% of the investments were in local banks, 25% in a local savings and loan association and 61% with investment firms. This is in comparison to June 30, 1991, when 6% of the investments were in a local bank, 27% in local savings and loan associations and 67% with Edward D. Jones & Co. Investments consist primarily of money market and time savings certificates which bear interest at rates from 5% to 9%. The average yield for the year ended June 30, 1992 was 6.71% compared to 7.95% for the prior year.

During the year ended June 30, 1992 and 1991, investments held at a local savings and loan association exceeded \$100,000. As required by law, the depository granted a security interest in securities and notes as collateral for all amounts in excess of the \$100,000 FSLIC insurance coverage.

### D. RESERVES AND UNDESIGNATED BALANCES

The board has designated or reserved portions of funds for contingencies and special purposes. The reserves are reviewed and updated, if necessary, on an annual basis by the board of directors. Unclaimed checks issued in excess of one year are restored to the bank accounts and carried as a liability for a period extending beyond the six year requirement of the statute of limitations.

Undesignated balances are intended to be maintained at nominal levels.

### E. RETIREMENT PLANS

The association is currently funding a certified retirement plan for the administrative staff with the funds being held in trust at a local savings and loan association. Professional members that are qualified teachers are included in the state teachers retirement plan.

At the present time, the contribution rate is 13.5% of the staff's salary and is being fully funded by the association. The retirement contributions for 1992 and 1991 totaled \$32,845 and \$32,813, respectively.

The employee's contributions and related earnings are fully vested at all times. Retiring or terminating employees are entitled to withdraw such funds in a lump sum distribution.

The association's matching contributions and related earnings are payable to the employee over ten years on retirement at or after age 65.

If termination occurs after the tenth year, an employee can elect to defer all distributions until reaching age 65 and then obtain benefits as a retiring employee. If an employee terminates employment before retirement, these funds become partially vested as follows:
