The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 69th Annual Yearbook which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

- 1992-93 marked the 85th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Our membership was down to 208 high schools. Because of the decreasing number of schools and the large number of co-ops, one may see some drastic changes in the basic format of the NDHSAA in future years.
- 1992-93 was the first year of our Distinguished Student Program. Sixty-five juniors were nominated from our schools and the winner received a \$500.00 scholarship.
- 1992-93 was the first year to expand the State Class B Baseball Tournament from four to eight teams.
- 1992-93 also showed an increase in the number of schools that sponsored teams in volleyball, gymnastics, baseball, girls golf and in some areas of fine arts.
- Also because of another successful year financially the schools will receive increased mileage and per diem payments in 1993-94.

I would like to express a very sincere thank you to all administrators, coaches and athletic directors for your support and cooperation in my fifth year as your Executive Secretary. Our staff will continue to make every effort to provide your school the best possible service in 1993-94.

The Board reviewed the audit as prepared by James Lochow of Ludvigson, Braun and Company. Haugland moved to accept the audit. Second by Hansen and carried. The Board also would like Mr. Lochow to appear before the September meeting to review the audit.

The Board next reviewed the investment report as prepared by the Executive Secretary. Motion by Schmeling to approve the report. Second by Haugland and carried.

The Board reviewed a breakdown of the financial results of each individual activity for the past 6 years and a report on the General Fund.

The proposed budget for the 1992-1993 fiscal year was reviewed. Motion by Rust to approve the budget for the 1992-1993 year of \$881,400.00. Second by Haugland and carried. The Executive Secretary was instructed to complete possible additional per diem payments to those activities sponsored by the Association not currently getting a per diem. This report will be placed on the September agenda.

The Board reviewed a proposed change in admission to regional volleyball tournaments. Schneider moved to approve a tournament ticket for regional volleyball of \$6.00 for adults and \$4.00 for students. Second by Johnson and carried.

The final Accident Benefit Fund report and the closing of this fund was reviewed. Motion by Johnson to accept the report. Second by Schmeling and carried.

The Board was informed of a schedule conflict at the Fargo Civic Center between the East Region Giris'

Basketball tournament and the Region I Girls' Basketball tournament. Motion by Schmeling to move the Class B Region I Girls' Basketball tournament to Wahpeton. Second by Rust and carried.

A discussion was held concerning Association automobiles for the 1992-1993 year. Motion by Haugland to advertise for pids on the 1992 automobiles and ask for bids on 1993 automobiles and report to the Board in September. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Board recessed at 12:00 Noon for lunch and reconvened at 1:00 P.M. with all members present.

The Executive Secretary reported that all tournament assignments for the 1992-93 year had been accepted.

The Board reviewed a NDHSAA Distinguished Student program as submitted by the staff. Haugland moved to put the program as presented in effect for the 1992-93 year. Second by Schmeling and carried.

A communique from the Jud Public Schools expressing their feelings that a transfer because of curriculum reason should not be considered under the hardship policy. There was no action by the Board.

The Board reviewed the proposed surcharge of \$.25 each on all tickets at the FARGODOME. A motion was made by Haugland instructing the Executive Secretary to re-open negotiations with the Fargodome relative to the ticket surcharge and to report back to the Board in September. Second by Schneider and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board that the University of North Dakota was making the necessary repairs of their track and recommended that the 1993 State Track Meet return to UND. Motion by Haugland to assign the 1993 State Track meet to UND. Second by Schneider and carried.

The Board reviewed the survey dealing with the possible combination of the Class A and Class B State Volleyball tournaments with the option of a 3-day event being held one week earlier. There will be no action taken until the survey is completed by more schools.

Information dealing with the handling of possible bloodborne infections was reviewed by the Board. This information will be sent to all member schools in this fall's mailing.

The Board reviewed the following proposed cooperative sponsorship applications:

Golva to Beach for junior high football and track. Motion by Johnson to approve. Second by Hansen and carried.

Jud to Kulm for girls' basketball. Motion by Bommersbach to approve. Second by Rust and carried.

Christ the King to Mandan for junior high football, volleyball, golf and track. Motion by Haugland to approve. Second by Johnson and carried.

Leonard to Kindred for boys' and girls' cross country. Motion by Schneider to approve. Second by Schmeling and carried.

Willow City to Bottineau for football, hockey, volleyball, boys' and girls' track and boys' and girls' golf. Motion by Haugland to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Fargo Shanley to West Fargo for girls' gymnastics. Motion by Hansen to approve. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

Possible changes in the membership dues charged to schools was reviewed. No action was taken.

The Executive Secretary reported on the following hardship investigations he had conducted:

Jason Reed from Colorado Springs to Oakes and recommended that immediate eligibility be granted under the hardship rule. Motion by Bommersbach to approve. Second by Schmeling and carried.

Jodi Fransen from Hazelton to Linton and recommended approval because of a parental move for employment. Motion by Schmeling to approve. Second by Haugland and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the following hardship investigations conducted by staff member Solberg:

Harry Hisatake transfer from Madras, Oregon to Minot with the recommendation to grant immediate eligibility under the hardship rule. Motion by Sanstead to grant immediate eligibility. Second by Schneider and carried.

Jerin Hughs who transferred from Forsyth, Montana to Trenton with the recommendation for immediate eligibility. Motion by Haugland to grant immediate eligibility. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

The Board heard a request from Mr. Vetter and Mrs. Zundel of Jud to grant their sons immediate eligibility at Edgeley and Gackle respectively, because Jud is not providing adequate curriculum for their sons. Motion by Haugland to table the request until the September meeting and instruct the Executive Secretary to check with other states to see how they handle this situation. Second by Hansen and carried.

N. DAK. HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

Rod Scherbenske of Goodrich and George Wieland of Drake appeared before the Board to request a late cooperative sponsorship application for football. Mr. Scherbenske informed the Board that the co-op between McClusky and Goodrich in football would not have adequate players to field a team this fall. They presented signed application forms that would allow McClusky and Goodrich to Join the Tri-County cooperative sponsorship (Drake, Anamoose and Butte) in football for the 1992 season. After a period of considerable discussion, Haugland moved to approve the co-op. Second by Johnson and carried.

Schneider reported on the Constitution & ByLaw Committee meeting. The Committee made no recommendation but informed the Board they are studying various issues of concern.

The Board reviewed a letter sent to all schools dealing with the concern of loss of school time for activities.

Preliminary results of a survey currently being conducted dealing with the Parade of Champions at the Boys' State Class B Basketball Tournament were reviewed. The Board will consider the results as more surveys are submitted

The Board heard a motion by Leidal to delete Item A., #4 under Expense Allowance on page 2 of the Policy Handbook. Second by Rust and carried.

There being no further business, the President declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors - Special Meeting August 28, 1992

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was called to order with all members present.

The following hardship investigations were reported to the Board:

David Rust reported on Terry Falcon who transferred from Trenton to Williston and recommended that he be ruled immediately eligible. Motion by Schneider to grant immediate eligibility. Second by Schneiding and carried.

Sheryl Solberg reported on Joseph Epply IV who transferred from Cheyenne, Wyoming to Fargo Oak Grove. Motion by Bommersbach to grant immediate eligibility. Second by Hansen and carried.

Hurt reported on Dan Kindt who transferred from Williston to Richardton. Motion by Leidal to grant eligibility under the hardship rule and be allowed to compete when the student becomes academically eligible. Second by Rust and carried.

Executive Secretary King reported on Valeria Jahner who transferred from Bismarck to Linton and recommended she be granted eligibility in Linton until October 1st. At that time eligibility will continue if the father actually moved to Linton by that time. Motion by Haugland and second by Sanstead. Carried.

The Executive Secretary also reported on German Gonzalez, a foreign exchange student from Mexico to Finley-Sharon High School. This student is involved in an exchange program that is not on the approved list. Based on the fact that this program is in the process of becoming recognized, motion by Schneider to grant eligibility. Second by Johnson and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board on the officiating fees increase that has been individually proposed by a local officials association to the schools that they service. This would cause the schools to pay an amount above the maximum fees that have been set for member schools. It was the feeling of the Board that the schools will pay the fees as set by the maximum fee schedule.

The Board heard an updated report on the negotiations with the Fargo Dome Authority. This is on the agenda for the September meeting.

President Hurt appointed the following to chair the Class B District Chairmen's meetings: November 20, 1992 - Kirk Hansen March 19, 1993 - David Rust

A Nominating Committee was appointed to assist in the 1993 elections. Members of the Nominating Committee are Mark Sanford, Grand Forks; Dean Koppelman, Bottineau; Wade Faul, Underwood. Atternate member is Dale Gilje, Beulah.

Schmeling reported on behalf of the Finance Committee with the following recommendations:

A. The study concerning additional per diem payments be continued.

Jim Lochow, from Ludvigson and Braun Accounting firm appeared before the Board with the audit review. Following questions concerning Mr. Lochow's report, the Executive Secretary was directed to work with Mr. Lochow to produce a monthly balance sheet. This sheet is to be used as part of the financial report at future meetings.

Haugland reported on behalf of the Football Committee stating the Class B 9¹man and 11 man football alignment will go as per formula and will be finalized after responses from those schools who have the option to petition to remain in 11-man or be moved to 9-man.

Haugland also reported that a committee of Class A athletic directors will be formed to formulate a Class A football play-off plan.

The Board congratulated Bob Hetler of the staff on his up-coming induction into the North Dakota Speech and Theater Half of Fame.

Schneider reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee with the following:

A. Reviewed a semester eligibility request from Grand Forks concerning a student who has transferred from the Victory Christian Academy. Motion by Schmeling to deny the request. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

- B. Reviewed the eligibility cases of two transfers, one from TMCHS (Belcourt) to Ojibwa Indian School and one from Ojibwa Indian School to TMCHS. Motion by Schneider to deny both requests. Second by Haugland and carried.
- C. The Committee has studied a proposal to develop a policy concerning contest ejections because of unsportsmanlike conduct. This ejection rule is to be studied and the office staff was directed to develop such a proposal for presentation at the October meeting.
- D. Shared with the Board the NDHSAA attorney's interpretation of guardianship and how it applies to the Constitution and ByLaws rules regarding transfer of students.
- E. Discussed eligibility status of a foreign student attending school via a visa rather than through a foreign exchange program. Motion by Haugland to allow the visa student attending school in Ray to play in sub-varsity level competition and only dress for varsity competition. Second by Rust and carried.

The Board held an audience with Fargo Superintendent Vern Bennett concerning the revised contract for the 1994 Boys' Class A State Basketball tournament at the Fargo Dome. The contract no longer carried the stipulation of a \$.25 surcharge on each ticket. Motion by Rust to approve the contract that is written without the surcharge and with a \$7,000 ceiling on expenses. The Executive Secretary is to review the contract before this approval is final. Second by Leidal and carried.

Bids for Association automobiles were reviewed. Motion by Schneider to accept the bid from Miller Motors for the 1993 Dodge Grand Caravan at \$21,545.92 and from Perkins, Inc. for the 1993 Pontiac Bonneville SE at \$18,475. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

Staff member Solberg gave a report on the 1992 cheerleader clinics. Because of the success of the clinics as staffed by the National Cheerleader Association, it was requested the same company be contracted for the 1993 cheerleader clinic series. Motion by Johnson to contract the National Cheerleader Association for \$1,400. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board held audience with James Vetter and Mr. and Mrs. Zundel concerning their son's transfer of eligibility. Following extensive discussion, motion by Rust to consider this transfer as qualifying under the hardship rule. Second by Haugland and carried.

Following more discussion, motion by Rust to approve the request for immediate eligibility under the hardship rule for Brad Zundel and KevinVetter at Gackle and Edgeley respectively. Second by Haugland. A roll call vote was taken:

The Executive Secretary reported on the up-coming Section V meeting North Dakota is hosting in Fargo on October 4, 5 and 6. An agenda of the meeting was shared with the Board.

The proposed list of officials for the Class B and Class A regional and state tournaments was reviewed. Motion by Sanstead to approve the list as presented. Second by Schneider and carried.

An update of the Distinguished Student Program was presented. A gold medallion will be presented to the student selected as the North Dakota Distinguished Student. Silver medallions will be presented to the other 5 finalists.

The proposed amendment to Article VII, Section I of the Junior High ByLaws as presented by the Grand Forks Public Schools was reviewed. This is to be voted on by the General Assembly at the October meeting.

Schneider reported several requests from coaches and officials to receive their tests at an earlier date. Because the National Federation sets a test date and tests cannot be released earlier, the Association must continue the present testing dates.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Bismarck Ramada Inn on October 14, 1992 with all members present except Johnson. President Hurt called the meeting to

Motion by Bommersbach to approve the minutes of the September 17th meeting. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented a copy of the trial balance and a report of the General Fund through September 30, 1992. Motion by Haugland to approve the report. Second by Hansen and carried.

Schneider reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee introducing the possible proposal of an amendment concerning sportsmanship. Motion by Rust to have this presented to the General Assembly October meeting for possible input. This amendment will then be presented to the member schools for vote at the January meeting. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

Schneider also reported on the Committee's discussion concerning visa students who are enrolled in a member school through other than an approved foreign exchange program. Motion by Schneider to add the clarification to the question and answer portion of the Constitution and ByLaws to note if a foreign exchange student is from an organization not recognized by the NASSP, they would be granted eligibility at a sub-varsity level for no longer than a 1-year period. Second by Hansen. Motion failed.

Motion by Bommersbach to add a note to the answer following Question 154 to read: "Foreign students attending school through other than a NASSP approved exchange program may be granted eligibility on an individual basis by the NDHSAA Board of Directors." Second by Schneider and carried.

Motion by Haugland to declare the foreign student from Ray immediately eligible. Second by Schmeling and carried.

Haugland reported on behalf of the Personnel Committee with the following recommendations:

- a. A new member coming on the Board shall receive a NDHSAA blazer, windbreaker, sweater and 2 shirts.
- b. The Board shall be supplied with a list of events indicating formal or informal.

The Class B District Chairmen met at the Bismarck Ramada (nn at 10:00 A.M. on November 20, 1992 with Kirk Hansen presiding).

Chairman Hansen called the meeting to order and called for reports from the districts starting with District 1.

DISTRICT 1: Supt. Dennis Nathan of Wyndmere reported the following recommendations:

- Football cooperative sponsorships need to be settled by September 30th of the current
 - 2. The Board should consider a better quality basketball in their study of the bids.
 - 3. Recommend Wahpeton for Region 1 Boys' and Girls' Basketball Tournament.
 - 4. Start all fall practices on the same date.

The Executive Secretary informed the group that the bids were sent out for this coming year with a change in the specifications of the bid. Schools may have input into the final selection.

<u>DISTRICT 2</u>: Supt. Art Mitzel of Page reported their district's request to rotate the girls' and boys' regional basketball tournaments between Wahpeton and Fargo.

<u>DISTRICT 3</u>: Supt. Roger Rieger of Finley-Sharon reported their district's concern over lack of time between fall and winter seasons not allowing time for concerts, plays, etc. during the break.

<u>DISTRICT 4</u>: Supt Harold Mach of Minto indicated their district wishes to have the Board of Directors study on the football realignment be delayed for 1 year until the results of some of the consortiums are known.

DISTRICT 5: Supt. Merrill Krueger of Rolette reported the following:

- Suggest or recommend that other districts and maybe even regions consider to eliminate pretournament practice sessions on the tournament site floor.
- 2. There needs to be an effort made to equalize the length of seasons between girls' and boys' basketball seasons. Presently, the coaches recognize fatigue factors when attempting to play too many games in a few short weeks in girls' basketball. (eg. Langdon 10 games in 22 days)
- District 5 member, Cando is concerned about being switched to 11-man football. They do not feel they can compete with teams such as Rugby or Cavalier.
- The Board needs to study whether or not the current district alignment forming larger districts is good for the member schools.

Extensive discussion followed with all districts having the opportunity to give input as to how the 16 district alignment has affected them.

<u>DISTRICT 6</u>: Supt. Dean Koppelman of Bottineau indicated support for the length of season and number of games for the girls' basketball season.

DISTRICT 7: Athletic Director Joe Mertens of Four Winds recommended:

- Shorten the girls' basketball schedule to fourteen games plus a tournament or sixteen games.
- 2. Require balloting for the state officials to be October 1st instead of September 1st.

DISTRICT 8: Supt. Dale Hogie of Fessenden and Bowdon reported their district's recommendations:

- Bench Decorum Rule Our members are concerned about the consistency of enforcement of officials from game to game and even within the same game. Look into a possible warning system.
- 2. More emphasis should be placed on training and critiquing officials. Would like suggestions on recruiting of local officials.
- Requested clarification of the intent of the rule which requires a team's bench to be opposite their first half basket.

DISTRICT 9: Supt. Arlyn Irion of Edgeley reported:

- 1. Their district is opposed to the coaches box.
- 2. Voiced some concern over selection of officials.
- 3. Recommend both girls' and boys' regional basketball tournaments be in Jamestown.
- Recommend reducing the number of girls' basketball games by one and lengthen the season by one week.

<u>DISTRICT 10</u>: Supt. Leland Ham of Tappen recommends the following sites for regional basketball: girls' at Napoleon and boys' at Jamestown.

DISTRICT 11: Prin. Gordon Davis of New Salem recommends the following:

- 1. Recommend two officials from each district work the regional tournament.
- 2. Alternate the boys' and girls' regional site between Mandan and Bismarck.

DISTRICT 12: Supt. Roger A. Pommerer of New England reported:

- 1. The site recommendation for boys' regional tournament will be given at the March meeting.
- 2. Voiced concern over the conflict of rules clinics with district tournaments.

DISTRICT 13: Supt. Mike Ness of Center recommends the following:

- Adopt the coaches' box.
- 2. Seed teams into the state tournament. Study using the power formula for this purpose.

DISTRICT 14: Supt. Hy C. J. Schlieve of Garrison reported the following:

- Concern over regional tournament sites. By having a regional located in a site on Mountain Time causes a loss of time upon the return home. Case in point being Region VII. Assuming the tournament ends at 9:30 P.M. and the team is from Central Time, returning home takes on hour for the trip. Leaving at 10:00 P.M. MT will result in a midnight arrival home. Should travel be in the other direction, MT teams leaving at 10:00 P.M. CT would arrive home by 10:00 P.M. MT again assuming the same travel argument.
- District 14 would like to recommend discontinuance of the current "Home Court Rule" in favor of the visitor choice rule in place during past years.
- District 14 coaches would like to recommend institution of the coaches box. The administration is opposed to this.
- 4. District 14 coaches would like to express concern relative to the consistency of officiating seen during the course of a season and recommend institution of a season evaluation system by the Association. This especially applies to the bench decorum rule.
- Coaches would like to express concern relative to the length of the girls' basketball season and would like to suggest lengthening the season by one week or reducing the number of games.

DISTRICT 15: Supt. Art Grochow of Kenmare reported:

- 1. An explanation is requested of the additional \$5 for officials when only officiating one game.
- 2. Request Region 8 tournaments for both girls' and boys' be held at the Minot Auditorium.
- If possible, the home school provide basketballs for warm-up during regular season games.
 This could be recommended at the rules clinics.

DISTRICT 16: Supt. Stanley Miller of Powers Lake reported:

- Their district questions the rule of limiting the number of basketball players that can dress for district, regional and state tournaments.
 - 2. Size of districts are felt to be too large.
- Concern for the cost of rooms for teams in the state tournaments. Are they booked in the more expensive motel?
- 4. Raised the question as to how are state tournament sites determined and is a package deal presented to the Board when a determination is made?

QUALIFYING TEAMS (12 Teams)

1. The top five teams in the East Region and the top four teams in the West Region will qualify for the playoffs. Ties will be broken by the tie-breaking procedure listed below.



2. The three remaining positions in the play-offs will be filled by three teams not previously qualified.

These teams will be determined by union the black. These teams will be determined by using the highest power rating for all regular season games.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1. The NDHSAA will select dates and game times for all pre-quarter, quarterfinal, semifinal and final games.
- 2. The team that is seeded highest will be designated as the home team. A wildcard team will never be the home team.
- 3. The final will be played in the FARGODOME on November 13th at a time to be determined by the NDHSAA.
- 4. The NDHSAA will select officials for all play-off games.
- 5. The NDHSAA will determine jersey colors to be worn by teams in all play-off games.
- 6. All teams will have a maximum of 40 players in uniform for play-offs.
- 7. The NDHSAA will provide suitable awards for each team in a semitinal game. First and second place team trophies will be awarded at each final plus suitable individual awards (maximum of 41).
- 8. Individual participation awards will be provided to ALL teams in the play-offs beginning with the quarterfinals.
- 9. Each team will furnish their own ball(s).
- 10. Head phones may not be used unless available for both teams.

CLASS A FOOTBALL POWER RATING

To determine a team's power rating you must first calculate a team coefficient for each team.

- 1. Team coefficient is calculated by:
 - +10 for beating a team with a winning record (.500 or better)
 - + 5 for beating a team with a losing record
 - 5 for losing to a team with a winning record
 - -10 for losing to a team with a losing record
- 2. After calculating each team's coefficient, the power rating is determined by the following formula:
 - 100 points for each game
 - + 40 for a win, 40 for a loss
 - + or points differential (up to maximum of 17 points)
 - + opponent's team coefficient

Add total for all games and divide by the number of games to determine power rating.

EAST PLAY-OFF REPRESENTATIVES

- 1. The five teams with the highest power ratings from regional games will quality for play-offs.
- 2. Wildcard teams will be determined by the power rating for all regular season games and will be selected from both East and West regions.

TIES

- A. In case of two-way tie in power rating, head-to-head competition will be used.
- B. If teams did not play each other, coin flip will be used.
- C. In case of three-way tie in power rating, and the three teams have played each other, the following procedure will be used:
 - Step 1. A three or more way tie shall be broken by total score differential between the tied teams. A maximum of 20 points will be allowed for a victory or a defeat. The team with the highest total (offensive pts./defensive pts.) would be first. Second place would be determined by head-to-head competition.
 - Step 2. If there is a tie after Step 1, the tie will be broken using a total score differential of all games played within the region. Maximum allowance of 20 points for a victory or a defeat.
 - Step 3. If there is a tie after Step 2, a list of tied teams will be placed in a hat and the team drawn will be designated as the first place team. Head-to-head competition will be used to break the tie between the other teams.
- D. In case of a three-way tie in power rating and all three teams have not played each other, a coin flip will determine placement.

WEST_PLAY-OFF_REPRESENTATIVES

- 1. The four teams who finish highest in the regional standings will qualify for the play-offs.
- 2. Wildcard teams will be determined by the power rating for all regular season games and will be selected from both East and West regions.

If a tie exists in the regional standings for a play-off berth, teams will be selected to advance on the following order of priority:

- Step 1. In case of two-way tie in power rating, head-to-head competition determine standings
- Step 2. A three or more way tie shall be broken by total score differential between the tied teams. A maximum of 20 points will be allowed for a victory or a defeat. The team with the highest total (offensive pts./defensive pts.) would be first. Second place would be determined by head-to-head competition.
- Step 3. If there is a tie after Step 2, the tie will be broken using a total score differential of all games played within the region. Maximum allowance of 20 points for a victory or a defeat.
- Step 4. If there is a tie after Step 3, a list of tied teams will be placed in a hat and the team drawn will be designated as the first place team. Head-to-head competition will be used to break the tie between the other teams.

The Board discussed the eligibility rules and the affect school reorganization and consortiums would have on a student's eligibility. The Board fell that the Constitution and ByLaws Committee should start working to answer these questions.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

MINUTES

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors - Special Meeting December 18, 1992

A special meeting of the NDHSAA Board of Directors was called to order by President Hurt with all members present except Johnson.

The Board was asked to consider the following hardship eligibility requests: Dale Hurt reported on Bobby Fox who transferred to White Shield from Golden Valley on Dec. 10, 1992. Motion by Schmeling to grant immediate eligibility under the hardship rule. Second by Schneider and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a hardship eligibility request concerning the transfer of Matthew Curry from Baker, Montana to Bottineau and recommended that immediate eligibility be granted. Motion by Leidal to approve, second by Rust and carried.

The Board next considered a cooperative sponsorship of programs in 7th & 8th boys & girls basketball and 7th & 8th boys & girls track from Johnson Corners Christian Academy and Watford City Public Schools. Motion by Schmeling to approve, second by Bommersbach and carried.

The Board next discussed the procedure to be used in voting for positions on the NDHSAA Board of Directors. MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** January 30, 1993 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Bismarck Ramada Hotel on January 30, 1993 with all members present. President Hurt called the meeting to order.

The President explained that the Board had convened early for the purpose of holding an audience with the North Dakota High School Principals' Association. Wayne Levang of Lisbon, President of the NDHSPA, appeared before the Board. A request was made of the Board to sponsor an amendment to the Constitution and ByLaws giving each member schools' principal the voting power in the selection of the Principals' Association position on the NDHSAA Board of Directors.

The Executive Secretary indicated this type of proposal could be mailed to the member schools in the form of an amendment to the Constitution and ByLaws. Thirty days after this amendment was mailed to the schools a ballot would be sent out to the schools.

Motion by Haugland to propose an amendment that would allow the ballot for selection of the Principal Association's position on the NDHSAA Board of Directors be sent to the member school's principal. Second by Schmeling. Motion carried.

Haugland requested the Constitution and ByLaws Committee study the possibility of adding a position to the NDHSAA Board of Directors that would mandate an athletic director serve in that position.

MINUTES Annual Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association February 1, 1993 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Representative Assembly Meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held Monday, February 1, 1993 at 8:30 A.M. at the Blamarck Ramada Inn. President Hurt called the meeting to order, welcomed those in attendance and declared that a quorum had been established.

John E. Roberts, Executive Director of the Michigan High School Athletic Association was introduced and addressed the assembly.

Board member Johnson was introduced as the acting parliamentarian for this meeting.

Board member Schneider presented and moved for adoption of the amendment to Part II, Article XIII, Section XII and add Section XIII under Rules of Eligibility to read as follows:

Section XII: The use or possession of alcohol or any controlled substance as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extracurricular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities.

The use, possession or sale of non-prescriptive anabolic steroids by any student athlete at any time during the school year is prohibited. Any student athlete found to be in violation of this policy shall be subject to the penalties provided in Section 12 of the Constitution and ByLaws of the Association.

The use or possession of anabolic steroids prescribed or directed by a physician shall not be a violation of this section.

Penalties will be prescribed as follows:

A. FIRST VIOLATION

 Penalty: After confirmation of the first violation the student shall lose eligibility for the next six (6) consecutive calendar weeks or three (3) consecutive calendar weeks plus counseling for a minimum of three (3) hours. **NOTE:** If the student chooses counseling they will show in writing that he/she has received the number of hours of counseling required by a medical doctor, psychiatrist, psychologist or licensed drug counselor. (The cost of the special services is not the responsibility of the School District).

B. SECOND VIOLATION

 Penalty: After confirmation of the second or subsequent violations, the student shall lose eligibility for the next eighteen (18) consecutive calendar weeks or nine (9) consecutive calendar weeks plus counseling for a minimum of nine (9) hours.

NOTE: If the student chooses counseling they will show in writing that he/she has received the number of hours of counseling required from a medical doctor, psychiatrist, psychologist or licensed drug counselor. (The cost of the special services is not the responsibility of the School District).

C. Penalties shall be accumulated beginning with and throughout the student's participation in NDHSAA-sponsored activities in Grade 7 and 8. Penalties shall again be accumulative beginning with Grade 9 through Grade 12.

NOTE: Administrators should remind students when suspended that they may not play on nonschool teams while under suspension.

SECTION XIII: The use or possession of tobacco as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extracumcular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities. Penatties will be prescribed as follows:

A. FIRST VIOLATION

1. Penalty: After confirmation of the first violation, the student shall lose eligibility for the next three (3) consecutive calendar weeks.

B. SECOND VIOLATION

- 1. Penalty: After confirmation of the second or subsequent violations the student shall lose eligibility for the next nine (9) consecutive calendar weeks.
- C. This tobacco policy is a non-accumulative policy.

Second by Supt. Hy C. J. Schlieve of Garrison.

Jeff Schatz, Athletic Director of the Grand Forks Public Schools proposed to amend the amendment with a motion of the following Grand Forks proposed amendment:

Section XII: The use or possession of alcohol or any controlled substance as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extracurricular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities.

The use, possession or sale of non-prescriptive anabolic steroids by any student athlete at any time during the school year is prohibited. Any student athlete found to be in violation of this policy shall be subject to the penalties provided in Section XII of the Constitution and ByLaws of the Association.

The use or possession of anabolic steroids prescribed or directed by a physician shall not be a violation of this section.

Penalties will be prescribed as follows:

A. FIRST VIOLATION

Penalty: After confirmation of the first violation the student shall lose eligibility for 3
consecutive interscholastic contests or 3 consecutive calendar weeks of a season in
which the student is a participant, which ever is greater.

NOTE: It would be recommended that each school district follow Century Code Section 15-21.1-05, which allows each school to develop and implement a plan to address chemical abuse violations.

B. SECOND VIOLATION

 Penalty: After contirmation of the second violation, the student shall lose eligibility for 18 consecutive calendar weeks. The 18 week period of suspension would begin from the time in which the violation is confirmed, within a season, and/or the beginning date of a season or activity if the violation occurred out of season.

N DAK. HIGH SCHOOL ACITVITIES ASSOCIATION

NOTE: It would be recommended that each school district follow Century Code Section 15-21.1.
.05, which allows each school to develop and implement a plan to address chemical abuse violations.

C. THIRD VIOLATION

 Penalty: After confirmation of the third violation, the student shall lose eligibility for one school year. The school year would be defined as the period of time from the first school day to the last school day.

NOTE: If after the third or subsequent violations, the student, on his or her volition, submits to a chemical dependency evaluation and follows the recommendations of the evaluation, then the student may be certifled for reinstatement after a minimum period of eighteen consecutive school weeks.

D. CUMULATIVE VIOLATIONS

Rule violations shall be cumulative beginning with and continuing throughout the student's participation on a freshman, sophomore, B-squad, junior varsity, or varsity team or activity.

NOTE: Administrators should remind students when suspended that they may not play on nonschool teams while under suspension.

SECTION XIII: The use or possession of tobacco as defined by North Dakota Law is prohibited. Any extracurricular participant who is in violation of the foregoing shall be suspended from participation in interscholastic contests or activities. Penalties will be prescribed as follows:

A. FIRST VIOLATION

 Penalty: After confirmation of the first violation, the student shall lose eligibility for the next three (3) consecutive calendar weeks.

B. SECOND VIOLATION

- Penalty: After confirmation of the second or subsequent violations the student shall lose eligibility for the next nine (9) consecutive calendar weeks.
- C. This tobacco policy is a non-accumulative policy.

Second by Supt. Terry Bartness of Larimore.

The motion to amend the amendment failed.

Motion by Marv Knoll, Athletic Director of the Dickinson Public Schools to omit Section XII, Paragraph C of the original motion. Second by Supt. Duane Zwinger of Gackle.

A roll call vote was taken with the results, Yes - 82, No - 81. Motion carried,

The vote was then taken on the original motion as amended with the omission of Section XII, Paragraph C. The roll call vote results were, Yes - 64, No - 80. Motion defeated.

Gien Melby, Asst. Supt. of the Fargo Public Schools proposed and moved for the adoption of the following amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section IV under Rules of Eligibility to read:

Section IV: A student shall not have been enrolled in any institution of higher rank than a secondary school, except, in the case of an accelerated student doing work in an institution of higher rank. Such student shall continue to qualify for high school competition, if taking two or more high school subjects in the high school in which he/she is enrolled and one or more college level courses each of which is equal or greater than the time requirements of a regular high school course for a minimum of four courses and fulfilling all other eligibility requirements.

Second by Supt. Leon Johnson of Flasher. Motion carried.

Prin. Leonard Bjerklie of Hettinger presented and moved for the adoption of the proposal to eliminate Part Two, Article XII, Section II, Item F under Boys' Basketball which reads:

All tournaments other than Association sponsored tournaments must end on a night not tollowed by a school day. However, when only four B squad teams are involved in an invitational tourney, said tourney shall be exempt from this provision if all participating schools are within a driving distance of 50 miles from the tourney.

Second by Supt. Roger Hulney of Hatton and carried.

Board member Schneider presented and moved for adoption of the following additional amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section XIV under Rules of Eligibility to read:

SECTION XIII: Any student or coach disqualitied from an interscholastic contest by game officials for flagrant, violent or verbal misconduct will be ineligible for the next regularly scheduled game/meet at that level of competition and all other games/meets in the interim at any level of competition.

The second violation carries a four (4) regularly scheduled game/meet ineligibility. If penalties are imposed at the end of the sport season and no contest remains, the penalty is carried over in that particular sport until the next school year. In the case of a senior, the penalty will continue to the next sport season.

Student: Anytime a student-athlete is ejected from a game/meet, he/she does not participate the remainder of that day. The student is also suspended from the next scheduled, rescheduled or contracted contest at that level of competition and all contests in the interim at other levels of competition.

Coach: Anytime a coach is ejected from a game/meet, he/she does not coach the remainder of that day. The coach is also suspended from the next scheduled, rescheduled, contracted contest at that level of competition and all contests in the interim at other levels of competition.

Appeal: A basketball coach may appeal the penalty only when he/she is disqualified following a third technical foul and his/her actions did not contribute to the disqualification. This appeal will be heard by the local school administration. A complete report must be sent to the NDHSAA for review.

Second by Supt. Stanley F. Miller of Powers Lake and carried with one descending vote.

The assembly indicated their support of the concept of the proposal

GOLF: Upon motion by Bommersbach and second by Haugland, the following was approved:

- Increase the individual awards to 10 with 2nd through 10th being identified as "all-state".
- 2. Starting times were recommended to be moved to 10:00 A.M. on the first day (from 12:00) and the second day to remain at 9:00 A.M.

- 2. Prior to team competition on Friday of the State Meet, a base score shall be set by judging a routine using a non-qualified gymnast. This will take place 1/2 hour prior to the beginning of competition which is during the scheduled judges' meeting. It shall be the host coach(s)' responsibility to obtain this individual(s) for this purpose. This is currently taking place prior to individual competition on Saturday.
- 3. Each region will be responsible for setting their own starting time of competition.
- 4. Begin team competition on the Friday of the State Meet at 5:30 P.M. Individual competition on Saturday will remain at 2:00 P.M.
- 5. Hold a state-wide judging workshop similar to the 1992 workshop. Recommend to bring in an official to act as workshop supervisor. This will be a mandatory attendance for all judges once every two years.
- 6. Require first-year officials to practice judge a minimum of one time prior to the Christmas break. This can be done at any high school practice session. Coaches will be required to verify these practice sessions to the regional officials selection chairperson. Cards will be made available to the officials to give to the coach of the program in which they perform their practice judging.
- 7. Allow a touch warm-up for both team and individual day at the State Meet.
- 8. Awards for regional and state shall be ordered after the events to eliminate problems with ties.
- 9. It is recommended that competitors remain in their team warm-ups for the awards ceremony at all regular season meets and required at all post season meets.
- 10. During Individual competition of the State Meet, gymnasts must wear their team leotard.

HOCKEY: Motion by Hansen and second by Sanstead to accept the following hockey recommendations:

- 1. Of a first of recommended officials returned by coaches by January 15th, the top 12 in order will be contracted for the State Tournament (top 8 referees and next 4 linesmen).
- 2. Continue the Officials' Jamboree for the 1993-94 season.
- 3. After two periods or any time during the third period, running time will be used when a team leads the opposing team by 8 or more goals.
- 4. Enforce the maximum 12 minute time between periods at the State Tournament.

3. Players must be placed in the rank order with the best player #1, second best player #2, etc. If a regular season line-up is in question, the protest shall be taken to the regional individual seed meeting. Coaches shall vote on the protest and, if upheld, shall result in a forfeit of any matches in question. This will be reflected in the seeding for team day. Records of challenge matches held within the team may be used to verify line-ups and shall supersede the protest leaving the line-up. to stand as originally listed.

IRACK: Upon motion by Bommersbach and second by Hansen, the following recommendations were approved by the Board as amended:

1. Scoring shall be eight places in regional and state track meets (10-8-6-5-4-3-2-1).

The Executive Secretary was directed to work out the scheduling to enable televising of all three games without being in conflict with the televising of the Girls' Class A Basketball Tournament third place and championship games.

The Board read a communique from Velva requesting the Board refrain from adopting a policy that would mandate scheduling of regular season contests in an effort to minimize loss of school time. It was felt this should be a local concern.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

A. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies followed are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

Fund Accounting

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the user of resources available, the accounts of the association are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purposes. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group.

The assets, liabilities, and fund balances of the association are reported in self-balancing fund groups as follows:

General fund, which includes unrestricted and restricted resources, represents the portion of expendable funds that is available for support of the operations of the association.

Plant funds represent resources restricted to plant acquisitions and other plant expenditures.

Basis of Accounting

All funds are accounted for using the accrual basis. Revenues are recognized when earned and expenditures are expensed in the period they are incurred.

Plant Assets and Depreciation

Uses of operating funds for plant acquisitions are accounted for as transfers to plant funds. Proceeds from the sale of plant assets are included in the operating fund balances. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is provided over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets on a straight-line basis.

B. INVESTMENTS

The association pools its funds and keeps them invested for maximum yield. On June 30, 1993, 36% of the investments were in local banks, 19% in a local savings and loan association and 45% with investment firms. This is in comparison to June 30, 1992, when 14% of the investments were in a local bank, 25% in a local savings and loan association and 61% with investment firms. Investments consist primarily of money market and time savings certificates which bear interest at rates from 3% to 9%. The average yield for the year ended June 30, 1993 was 5.38% compared to 6.71% for the prior year.

During the years ended June 30, 1993 and 1992, investments held at a local savings and loan association exceeded \$100,000. As required by law, the depository granted a security interest in securities and notes as collateral for all amounts in excess of the \$100,000 PSLIC insurance coverage.

D. RESERVES AND UNDESIGNATED BALANCES

The board has designated or reserved portions of funds for contingencies and special purposes. The reserves are reviewed and updated, if necessary, on an annual basis by the board of directors. Unclaimed checks issued in excess of one year are restored to the bank accounts and carried as a liability for a period extending beyond the six year requirement of the statute of limitations.

Undesignated balances are intended to be maintained at nominal levels,

E. RETIREMENT PLANS

The association is currently funding a retirement plan for the administrative staff through a tax sheltered annuity. Professional members that are qualified teachers are included in the state teachers retirement plan.

At the present time, the contribution rate is 13.5% of the staff's salary and is fully funded by the association. The retirement contributions for 1993 and 1992 totaled \$33,537 and \$32,845, respectively.
