#### FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 71st annual Yearbook which contains an historical and statistical account of the years operation.

- 1994-95 marked the 87th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Our membership decreased from 204 to 199 high schools. Because of the decreasing number of schools and the large number of co-ops, one may see some drastic changes in the basic format of the NDHSAA in future years.
- 1994-95 will be the second year the NDHSAA will deficit spend aprroximately \$80,000.00. The deficit has occured mainly because of increased payments made to schools.
- The fall of 1994 was the second time that all three championship football games were played in the FARGODOME, which was a very successful venture. Next fall, all Class B semi-final games will also be played in the FARGODOME.
- 4. The 1996 combined State Class A and B Volleyball Tournaments will be held in Fargo.
- 5. 1995-96 will be the first year for NDHSAA sponsorship of boys' and girls' soccer.
- The NDHSAA Board will provide catastrophic insurance for all member schools at no cost in 1995-96.

I would like to express a very sincere thank you to all administrators, coaches, athletic directors and officials for your support and cooperation in my seventh year as your Executive Secretary. Our staff will continue to make every effort to provide your school the best possible service in 1995-96.

August 11, 1994 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Bismarck Ramada Hotel at 10:00 A.M. on August 11, 1994 with all members present except Leidal. Jim Haussler of the Bismarck Public Schools was present representing the Athletic Directors. President Hansen called the meeting to order and welcomed new member Larry Gegelman to the Board.

Upon review of the minutes of the June Annual Meeting, motion by Schmeling to approve. Second by Ness and carried.

The Board reviewed and approved the committee assignments as follows:

The Executive Secretary presented the audit report for the 1993-94 year as approved by the auditor. Also mentioned was the price of the audit and the work being acceptable was encouraging for the 3-year bid for audit from the presently contracted company. Motion by Bommersbach to approve the audit. Second by Rust and carried.

SCHMELING & BOMMERSBACH (study realignment)

The Executive Secretary reviewed with the Board the Fund Balance Report, End of Year Investment Report, The General Fund Balance comparison sheet from 1981 to the present, and the Athletic/Activity Financial report comparison sheet from 1987-88 to the present. Motion by Rust to accept the financial reports as presented. Second by Johnson and carried.

The final 1993-94 budget was reviewed followed by a review of the projected budget for the 1994-95 budget as proposed by the Finance Committee. Motion by Schmeiling to approve the budget at \$1,006,800.00 for 1994-95. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

Norland reported on behalf of the Football Committee with the reminder of the change of date of the championship games to Friday, November 11. A discussion was held by the committee on the possibility of hosting 2 games on Friday and one game on Saturday. The Committee recommended all games be played on the same day. The Committee also recommended a rotation of games be set with the 1994 games starting at 9:00 a.m. with Class A, followed by Class B 9-man, followed by Class B11-man and this rotation continuing for up-coming years. The 1995-96 year will be the year for Class B football realignment.

Motion by Rust to continue to play all three games on the same day. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Motion by Ness to set up rotation with the last game of the previous year being the first game the following year. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

Johnson reported on behalf of the TV Committee. The Committee recommended to accept a \$6,000 bid on a one year basis for the Class A East Region Girls' and Boys Basketball tournaments. Motion by Johnson to accept this recommendation. Second by Norland and carried.

The Committee reviewed a bid from WDAY-TV to televise the bowl game for 1994. Motion by Johnson to accept. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Norland reported on several requests of the Board to consider the presentation of an 8th place trophy at the Class B State Basketball Tournaments. Motion by Ness to present a team participation trophy to the team that places 8th at the Class B State Basketball Tournaments. Second by Gegelman and carried.

A discussion was held concerning the 3200 meter relay being run in one section at the 1994 State Track Meet . Motion by Norland to run this event at the 1995 State Meet as a four-turn stagger start and remain with one section with other options studied for consideration at a future date. Second by Schmeling and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported that all tournament contracts have been accepted for the 1994-95 year.

The Board reviewed the proposed qualifying procedure for advancement from regional to state play for the Class A Girls' Golf. The Executive Secretary recommended that this same qualifying procedure for teams be applied for the Class A Boys' Golf. Motion by Norland to approve these recommendations. Second by Schmeling and carried.

The Board reviewed a process proposal for the site selections as introduced by the Executive Secretary. Johnson recommended that this new process be represented by a general form upon which each submitted bid would be outlined. The Board also agreed that communities should have the opportunity to attend the site selection meeting for the purpose of answering any questions the Board might have concerning their presented proposal. Also suggested was to select all sites at the April meeting, including the following spring events. Motion by Bommersbach to adopt this process with the changes as indicated by the Board members during discussion. Second by Johnson and carried.

Plans were discussed for the replacement process for Association automobiles. Motion by Norland to accept the proposal of Miller Motor to purchase through their dealership and said dealership will buy back the presently owned cars if all other bids opened in October are lower than the book value. Second by Schmeling. Motion failed.

Motion by Rust to use the same process as was used the previous year in which the Executive Secretary would obtain bids for 1995 automobiles and the 1994 automobiles would be sold through the usual bidding process. Second by Gegelman and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the following hardship requests:

Jason DuPaul who has transferred from Fessenden to Rolette with a recommendation of approval. Motion by Johnson to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Jeremy Utecht who transferred from Fargo North High School to Fargo Oak Grove with a recommendation to approve eligibility at Fargo Oak Grove. Motion by Schmeling, second by Bommersbach for approval. Motion carried.

Kari Langseth, who transferred from Cass Valley North to Fargo Oak Grove with a recommendation to deny the request. Motion by Ness to deny. Second by Rust and carried.

Gegelman - No

Rust reported on Melinda Hopkins who transferred from Yakima, Washington to Ray. Motion by Bommersbach to approve the request. Second by Norland. Motion failed. A roll call vote was requested with the following result:

Schmeling - No Norland - Yes Rust - No Ness - No Johnson - Yes Sanstead - Yes Bommersbach - Yes Hansen - No Motion failed, 5-4.

Following a noon recess, President Hansen called the meeting to order.

Bommersbach reported on an eligibility request concerning Andre Ost and Mario Ost who are presently living in the Surrey School District but are planning to attend the Granville School District with a recommendation to approve the request. Motion by Norland to approve the request. Second by Genelman and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the request for transfer of eligibility for Kelli Brady who was originally approved for eligibility upon her move to live with brother, Damon Brady. Mr. Brady has accepted a position in White Shield and she will be moving with her brother. Motion by Sanstead to approve the transfer of eligibility. Second by Schmeling and carried.

Ness reported on an eligibility request concerning Justin Baker who is transferred to Standing Rock from McLaughlin, South Dakota. Motion by Bommersbach to deny. Second by Rust and carried.

Executive Secretary reported on Nathari Ewioniuk who transferred to Belfield from Salt Lake City. Motion by Sanstead for approval. Second by Schmeling and carried.

The Board held audience with Jerome Enget and Joel Wood of Hazen and Wilfred Volesky and Rex Wenke from Beulah. For information purposes, Mr Enget shared with the Board the Hazen and Beulah Public Schools' proposed amendment to the NDHSAA Constitution and ByLaws section that defines classification of schools.

The Board held audience with a delegation from Tolna including Supt. Jack Adkins, Kay Sundquist and the subject of the audience, Laura Sundquist. This delegation was represented by Attorney Solberg. Attorney Thune was present on behalf of the NDHSAA and spoke on behalf of the Association. Following extensive discussion, motion by Schmeling to reconsider. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

After further discussion, motion by Norland that with consideration of the circumstances of students originally being told that they were to attend Tolna, the Board accept the request to allow Laura to be eligible at Tolna. Second by Bommersbach. A roll call vote resulted as follows:

Rust-No. Ness-No Schmeling - Yes Norland-Yes Gegelman -No Johnson-Yes Sanstead-Yes Bommersbach-Yes Hansen-No. Motion carried, 5-4.

Cooperative Sponsorships were reviewed. With motion by Schmeling and second by Johnson the Board

Pierson, Manitoba to Sherwood for football Velva to Minot for swimming Golva to Beach for junior high volleyball Rock Lake to Rolla for boys' and girls' track Dunseith Day School to Dunseith for track, volleyball, cross country, golf and football.

The Executive Secretary indicated that Larry Klundt from the North Dakota Council of School

Administrators has approached the Association to share the cost of a speaker for the January General Assembly Meeting. Motion by Norland to approve. Second by Ness and carried.

The Board discussed the conflict of the upcoming Board meeting scheduled for September 15 at Valley City. With another event taking facilities in Valley City, the site of the September 15th meeting was changed to Bismarck.

The Executive Secretary gave an update on the soccer groups plan in requesting the NDHSAA to sanction soccer for the 1995-96 school year. A brochure that was prepared by the North Dakota Youth Soccer Organization was reviewed. A time line as planned by the NDYSO was also reviewed. A soccer delegation will be appearing before the board at the November meeting.

Staff member Solberg presented a proposal indicating what swimming official positions required a registered official along with a recommended fee scale for these officiating positions. Motion by Norland to accept the proposal as presented. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the results of a study which requested the NDHSAA look into the number of schools and athletes that are assigned to each track region. As the study indicated, the results do not warrant any type of change. No action was taken.

The Board reviewed the catastrophic insurance plan that has been proposed by the National Sports Underwriters. The Board directed the Executive Secretary to prepare a presentation for the October General Assembly meeting. Following this presentation, a survey will be sent to each member school to study the wishes of the membership.

The Executive Secretary distributed the 1994-1995 NDHSAA Board Policy Handbook.

The Board heard a request from the Bismarck Public Schools to approve the following: Century Girls' swim team to Osseo, Minnesota on September 16 and Minneapolis, Minnesota on September 17; Bismarck wrestling team to Blain, Minnesota on December 16 and 17; Century wrestling team to Cleveland, Ohio on December 16 and 17; Bismarck wrestling team to Mitchell, South Dakota on January 14; and Bismarck hockey team to St. Cloud, Minnesota on December 28, 29 and 30. Motion by Norland to approve the requests. Second by Gegelman and carried.

The Board heard a request for approval of eligibility for visa student, Vicente Tapin who will attend Bowbells High School. The organization that arranged for the exchange student is currently in the process of being accredited by the NASSP. Motion by Bommersbach to approve. Second by Johnson and carried.

The staff presented a report on the 1994 cheerleader clinics. Motion by Ness to approve obtaining bids for the 1995 cheerleader clinics. Second by Gegelman and carried.

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was called to order by President Hansen at 9:30 A.M. on August 24, 1994. All members were present except Johnson.

Norland excused himself from the meeting.

President Hansen indicated the purpose of the meeting was to review a number of hardship investigations and cooperative sponsorship applications.

Solberg from the staff reported on an eligibility request for Tobie Hansen transferred from DesLacs-Burlington to Surrey with a recommendation to approve. Motion by Schmeling to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the request for Matthew Vetter to transfer eligibility from East Grand Forks to Shanley. This transfer to Shanley is to allow for study at Cardinal Muench in preparation for priesthood. The report included the recommendation to grant eligibility. Motion by Bommersbach to approve. Second by Gegelman and carried.

Gegelman reported on Jamie LaCombs transferred from Rolla to Towner with a recommendation to approve. Motion by Ness to approve. Second by Rust and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on an eligibility request for Carissa Truedson to transfer from Sykeston to Fessenden with a recommendation to approve. Motion by Schmeling to approve the request for immediate eligibility. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on an eligibility request for Kimberly and Melissa Rasmusson, previously students at the now closed Leonard School District. Their request is to transfer eligibility from Kindred which is assigned the Leonard district, to Enderlin which is geographically closer to their residence. Motion by Rust to approve. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

Gegelman reported on a request to grant immediate eligibility for Joey Lassonde at Dunseith and recommended that with present circumstances, eligibility would be in the best interest of the student. Motion by Ness to approve. Second by Leidal and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on and recommended approval of eligibility for Bernie Mullen transferred from Houston, Texas to Edinburg. Motion by Bommersbach to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried

The Executive Secretary reported on an investigation on the request for eligibility for Cassie Krenz transferred from Dallas, Texas to Litchville-Marion. The recommendation is to approve. Motion by Sanstead to grant eligibility. Second by Schmeling and carried.

Schmeling excused himself from meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported on a request from Bottineau to allow the transfer of eligibility for Seth Martin from Velva. Following extensive discussion, motion by Leidal to deny the request. Second by Rust. A roll call vote was requested.

Motion to deny the request carried, 4-3.

The Executive Secretary reported on the six cooperative sponsorship applications received. Upon motion by Leidal and second by Sanstead, the Board approved the following:

> MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors September 15, 1994 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck on September 15, 1994. President Hansen called the meeting to order with all present except Johnson and Sanstead. Darryl Anderson, Mandan Public Schools Athletic Director, was present as an exofficio member representing the North Dakota Athletic Directors Association.

Gary Thune, NDHSAA Attorney appeared before the Board to discuss what is the perception of his role as legal council and what the Board expects procedurally from him during meetings and hearings. A question and answer session followed.

Attorney Thune also informed the Board on the correspondence received from Fargo Attorney Robert Feder who had been in correspondence with the Board to address the conflicts created with scheduling post season activities on Jewish holidays. Discussion concerning sections of the Constitution and ByLaws that refer to religious days was held. The proposed amendment procedure on this matter was discussed and is listed later on the agenda.

Minutes were reviewed. Motion by Rust to approve the minutes of the August 11 regular meeting and the August 24 special meeting. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented reports of the Trial Fund Balance Investments and General Fund through September 9, 1994. Motion by Schmeling to approve the reports. Second by Nortand and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared a letter from Dunseith requesting the Board waive the policy limiting the number of games on nights that are followed by a school day because of a scheduling problem. Motion by Leidal to deny the request. Second by Ness and carried.

The Board reviewed the proposed amendment concerning the reclassification of schools for basketball as submitted by Beulah and Hazen. The purpose of the review is to discuss any questions that have arisen from the membership concerning the amendment.

An amendment to remove reference to Sunday from the Constitution and ByLaws was reviewed by the Board for possible sponsorship. Motion by Bommersbach to propose this amendment as written. Second by Norland and carried.

The Board reviewed an amendment to the Constitution and ByLaws as proposed by Larimore. This amendment would change how the total enrollment within a cooperative sponsorship for a wrestling program would be counted to determine the classification of that particular program for competition. The Executive Secretary was directed to clarify, with Larimore, questions raised by the Board with concern over the wording of this amendment.

Norland reported on behalf of the Football Committee with the recommendation to approve the 2-year plan as presented. This proposal recommends a plan for 5 regions of 8 teams for Class B 11-man football and 7 regions for Class B 9-man football. Motion by Gegelman to send this proposal to the schools for their input prior to final action at the October meeting. Second by Norland. Following extensive discussion, motion carried.

The Board reviewed the recommended list of officials for the Class A and Class B Regional and State Girls' Basketball Tournaments. Motion by Schmeling to approve the recommended list. Second by Leidal and carried.

The Distinguished Service Award was discussed. The presentation of the selected recipient will take place at the October General Assembly meeting. The presenter will be determined at the October meeting.

Jim Haussler, Athletic Director of the Bismarck Public Schools appeared before the Board to address the request to play a consolation round at the regional hockey tournaments. This would provide all teams the opportunity to play more than one game in a regional tournament setting. Motion by Bommersbach to table until the October meeting. Second by Schmeling and carried.

Staff member, Solberg presented bids received for the 1995 cheerleader clinics. These bids were as follows

National Cheerleaders Association - \$1,750 (three [3] instructors) Universal Cheerleaders Association - \$1,500 (four [4] instructors)

Motion by Ness to accept the bid as presented by the Universal Cheerleaders Association. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a request from Norwest Bank to display signage at the state basketball tournaments. A suggestion was made from the Association to use these signs to promote the interests of the Association. Motion by Gegelman to allow these signs. Second by Ness and carried.

President Hansen appointed Gegelman to serve as chairman for the Class B District Chairmen's meeting in November and Ness to chair the meeting in March.

The Board was assigned the task of appointing a Nominating Committee for the purpose of selection of candidates for the vacant Board positions as of the end of the 1994-95 year. These nominations will be presented at the October General Assembly meeting. Motion by Rust to appoint Supt. Dale Hurt of New Satem, Supt. Mark Sanford of Grand Forks, and Supt. Dean Koppelman of Bottineau. Second by Leidal and carried.

The Board reviewed a request for eligibility from Robinson Public Schools. Motion by Sanstead to approve the request. Second by Ness and carried.

A cooperative sponsorship application for a Leeds-Wolford coop for volleyball was reviewed. Motion by Gegelman to approve the application. Second by Leidal and carried.

The cooperative sponsorship application for cross country was reviewed as submitted by Parshall, White Shield and Twin Buttes to Mandaree. Motion by Sanstead to approve the application. Second by Rust

A letter concerning students enrolled in Enderlin from the Central Cass School District was read. The annexing process is underway to allow these students residence be transferred to the Enderlin School District. The letter requests these students be allowed immediate eligibility. Motion by Leidal to approve eligibility pending the vote to allow the annexation. Second by Ness and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board that a Beulah cooperative sponsorship with Golden Valley for cross country had put their total enrollment over 325 and should have caused them to compete in the Class A division. Motion by Norland to approve the dissolution pending the letter of release from Golden Valley. Second by Sanstead and carried.

A letter requesting the eligibility of a student who transferred from Walhalla to Park River be re-established in Walhalla because of the unusual circumstances involved. Motion by Norland to approve the request. Second by Leidal and carried.

The Board discussed the site selection process and the creation of a form that will be used by communities submitting their proposal for a tournament. Suggestions were given to the Executive Secretary for improvement of the form. Further review will take place at the October meeting.

The Board was informed of a request from Ray to review the Board's August ruling on a student's eligibility. Rust, the original investigator spoke on behalf of the request to reconsider. In view of the facts, motion by Sanstead to reconsider. Second by Norland and carried.

Supt. Terry Bartness of Larimore presented and moved for the adoption of the following amendment to Part Two, Article III, Section XI, 20B to read:

When Class B schools are involved with the cooperative sponsorship of an activity and the combined enrollment of the schools involved exceeds 325 students in grades 9 through 12, these schools will compete as a Class A school in that activity except wrestling. Co-op must be approved by NDHSAA Board of Directors.

(Emergency Amendment)

Second by Supt. Ed Mundy, Finley Sharon. Motion carried by voice vote.

The chairman heard a request from the floor for clarification as to when the amendment to Part Two, Article III, Section IX that deleted reference to Sunday would go into effect. Because this did not have an emergency clause attached to the amendment, this would go into effect for the 1995-96 year.

Supt. Jerry Enget of Hazen presented and moved for the adoption of the following amendment to Part Two, Article II - CLASSIFICATION OF SCHOOLS, as follows:

#### SECTION I: CLASS A SCHOOLS

- a. This class shall consist of the sixteen member high schools with the largest enrollments in grades 9-12, inclusive as of October 1, 1994 except as otherwise provided in this Article or Article III, Section XI.
- b. Additionally, any Class B Division I school below this Class A designation may petition the North Dakota High School Addivities Association Board of Directors to be included in this classification. These original petitions must be submitted to the Board of Directors not later than August 1, 1995 to go into effect for the following school year. Following the first year of athletic participation all petitions must be submitted by September 1 preceding the review as provided for in Section IV, paragraph b. The Board of Directors may approve a maximum of four of these petitions. All Class B Division I schools whose petition has been approved to be in Class A by the Board of Directors shall remain in Class A until the next biennial review.

#### SECTION II: CLASS B DIVISION I SCHOOLS

- a. This class shall consist of the next 40 member schools with the largest enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive as of October 1, 1994, except those assigned or placed by petition into Class A or as otherwise provided in this Article or Article III, Section XI.
- b. Additionally, any school below this classification may pelition the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors to be included in this classification. These original petitions must be submitted to the Board of Directors not later than August 1, 1995 to go into effect the following school year. Thereafter, the petitions must be submitted by September 1 preceding the review as provided for in Section IV, paragraph b. The Board of Directors may approve a maximum of eight of these petitions. A school whose petitions have been approved by the Board of Directors shall remain in Class 8 Division I until the next biennial review.

#### SECTION III: CLASS B DIVISION II SCHOOLS

All member high schools, other than those designated or approved as Class A or Class B Division I schools, shall be classified as Class B Division II schools. SECTION IV:

- a. Class A, Class B Division I and Class B Division II shall compete in separate tournaments to determine a state basketball champion. The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is authorized to combine classes in other athletic or nonathletic contests and festivals if it appears expedient and desirable.
- b. The enrollments of the schools shall be reviewed every two years by the Board of Directors with the purpose of adjusting the classification of the schools within the three classes.
- c. Should a new high school be established, the enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, shall determine the classification of that district, and that placement shall be in effect at least until the next review procedure as established in Section IV, paragraph b, above.

Second by Supt. David Schneider of Edmore. A roll call vote indicated 77 yes and 101 no. Motion defeated.

With no further business, President Hansen declared the meeting adjourned.

# MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors April 19 & 20, 1995 - Valley City, N.D.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office at 1:00 p.m. on April 19, 1995 with all members present. President Hansen called the meeting to order.

The Executive Secretary presented the Fund Balance report, the Investment report and the budget through April 10, 1995.

The Board discussed the procedure that will be used in the selection of tournament sites. This will take place the following day.

The Board studied a comparison chart of the regional and state basketball tournament expenses from each tournament site.

An information chart of the history of sites for state tournaments was made available to the Board.

A summary of financial reports on all 1994-95 fall and winter activities to date was studied.

The final financial report on the boys' basketball tournaments was reviewed.

The dates for the 1996-97 volleyball season was discussed. Motion by Rust to approve the dates as follows:

A discussion followed concerning out-of-season competition and the effect these activities have on high school programs. The Constitution and ByLaws Committee will place this item on their agenda for the June meeting.

A letter of communique was read from Mayville-Portland-CG High School.

The Executive Secretary read a bid from Greenberg Roofing for a new roof on the Association building. Motion by Norland to approve the bid. Second by Johnson. Motion was tabled until further information could be acquired from the roofing company.

Letters were read from Marnie Walth, Program Director of the Prairie Rose Games requesting the 3 player limit be waived on a one-year basis for basketball and volleyball. This would be in effect at the state games only. Motion by Norland to approve the request. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the response to the Association request addressed to the Radisson concerning rates for the NDHSAA. Motion by Rust to move the Association business in Bismarck to the Radisson. Second by Gegelman and carried.

Selection of officers for the 1995-96 year were discussed. Motion by Schmeling to nominate Bommersbach for president. Second by Leidal and carried.

Motion by Bommersbach to nominate Ness for vice-president. Second by Johnson and carried.

Motion by Sanstead to cast a unanimous ballot for the president and vice-president positions. Second by Gegelman and carried.

Motion by Bommersbach to name the Executive to be the voting delegate at the National Federation summer meeting. Second by Ness and carried.

The Board discussed the plans for the June annual meeting. The Athletic Review Committee will meet at 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, June 14 with the Board meeting beginning at 2:00 p.m. The retirement supper will be held Wednesday evening and the remainder of the Board meeting will be on Thursday, June 15.

Dr. Ilvedson and Sidney Fox of New Town appeared before the Board asking them to reconsider a request to recognize Elbowoods as the 1942 State Class B Basketball Champions which was denied in previous Board meetings. Following extensive discussion, motion by Norland to table until the following day. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board read a Dakota Prairie communique informing them of their school consolidation.

A survey of the member schools concerning the length of the girls' and boys' basketball seasons was studied. The survey indicated support for the Board's 3-year proposal which included the lengthening of the girls' basketball season.

The Board also studied a survey of member schools polling their opinions on the workings of the regional and state volleyball tournaments.

The Executive Secretary reported on the progress of the Distinguished Student program. The selections have been reduced to 17. These are currently being rated by a committee to name the six semi-finalists. These six will be interviewed on Friday, May 12 at a site to be determined.

A cooperative sponsorstip application concerning Sheldon to Enderlin for girls' basketball was read. Motion by Schmeling to approve. Second by Johnson and carried.

The Board also heard a request for a cooperative sponsorship program between Sheyenne and New Rockford for music. Motion by Norland to approve. Second by Sanstead. Motion by Rust to amend the motion to eliminate the 1994-95 year. Second by Leidal. Motion denied.

The vote on the original motion resulted in motion failed.

The Executive Secretary was directed to contact the Sheyenne and New Rockford schools for possibly resubmitting this application for the 1996-97 school year.

The Executive Secretary recommended the continuance of the hockey jamborees for the purpose of hockey officiating workshops. Motion by Schmeling to continue. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board that Minot Bishop Ryan and Sheridan County have submitted their 1995-96 boys' basketball schedules. Both schedules have indicated that Minot has reduced their home schedule by one game and Sheridan County has reduced their home schedule by two games.

A discussion was held concerning the 1995 track season and the inclement weather that has caused a large number of competitions to be postponed or canceled. Motion by Schmeling to approve the request for 3 meets per week for track beginning May 1. Second by Leidal and carried.

The Executive Secretary read a letter to the Board indicating Central Valley students in violation of the 3 player limitation. Motion by Gegelman for a one game-suspension at the beginning of next year's boys' basketball regular season for those in violation. Second by Rust and carried.

The Board heard a request from the athletic directors of soccer schools to move the starting date for practice for boys' soccer from August 14 to August 10 and first allowable game from August 28 to August 26. Motion by Leidal to approve. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

Gegelman recommended the Constitution and ByLaws Committee study the possibility of setting a monetary fine for late application of any cooperative sponsorships involving existing programs.

The Board was recessed until 9:30 a.m. the following morning.

The Board reconvened on Thursday, April 20 with all members present.

Schmeling reported on behall of the Finance Committee regarding the catastrophic insurance proposals. All schools will be covered for catastrophic insurance grades 7 through 12 under a plan that would pay the premium by raising the insurance assessment from 2% to 5% for all post-season tournaments. Motion by Schmeling to approve the 5% assessment and consider the extended plan. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

The item on rooting was brought back to the table. The Executive Secretary reported on the advice

provided by Greenberg Roofing. Motion by Norland to accept the original bid without the additional insulation. Second by Schmeling and carried.

The Board discussed the Elbowoods request which was tabled the prior day. Motion by Norland to award the first place trophy for the 1942 state tournament to Elbowoods. Second by Bornmersbach. A roll call vote was requested.

Johnson reported on behalf of the Promotions Committee with a recommendation the Association solicit nominations for the different categories of the Distinguished Service award. The discussion on the award being open to corporations as well as individuals revealed the feeling that the award should be for individuals only.

Rust reported on behalf of the Officials Committee with the following recommendations:

- a. Discuss a sanction on any district that is party to contracting officials for a district tournament for an amount in excess of the maximum fee schedule. The sanction mentioned was \$250.00. Also, those officials that participated in this practice would be ineligible for the following year in that sport only.
- b, Purchase a plaque for an appreciation award to officials going off the NDOA Board. Value of this plaque would be between \$7 and \$10.
- c. Gymnastics recommended to change the fee schedule to reflect number of competitors rather than number of schools. This would be in the best interest of the host school in terms of officiating costs.
- d. Because of a shortage of officials in some of the sports, college students who are first year registrants are recommended to be charged a registration fee of \$20.00.
- e. Supports the NDOA recommendation to require basketball officials attend a workshop in each season they are registered.
- f. Volleyball officials fee to be set at \$40 per match for regional tournaments and \$45 per match for state tournament matches
- g. Request an additional NDOA Board position to allow for an official to represent girls' basketball and one for boys' basketball. Also asked the Board to study representation for swimming and soccer officials.
- h. Soccer officials fees are recommended to be set at \$40 per game for referee and \$20 for linesmen.

Motion by Sanstead to accept the report of the Committee. Second by Rust.

A request by Rust to remove items e. and g. from the committee's recommendations and vote on those separately was honored. The vote on remaining recommendations carried.

Discussion took place concerning the additional workshop requirement. Motion by Norland to hold one workshop for the girls' season and one workshop for the boys' season making each mandatory if registered in that season. Second by Schmeling and carried.

Motion by Gegelman to approve NDOA representation separate for boys' and girls' basketball officials beginning in the 1996-97 year. Second by Norland and carried.

President Hansen opened the discussion of site selections with state basketball tournaments beginning with the Boys' Class A state tournament. Motion by Norland to set the 1997 state tournament in Bismarck. Second by Ness and carried

Boys' 1997 Class B state tournament: Motion by Leidal to set the site as Fargo for the bid of \$10,500 for all expenses and no charge for the .25 surcharge on all tickets. Second by Johnson. A roll call vote was requested with the following results:

- 4. In the 800 Meter Run, if there are 16 or less entrants, one section will be run; over 16 competitors, two sections divided equally.
- 5. Revise qualifying standards:

Class A Boys Triple Jump - 41'6" Shot Put - 49'6"

Class A Girls 400 Meter Dash - 61.5

Class B Boys Triple Jump - 41'6" Pole Vault - 12'0" (Leidat/Johnson)

Class B Girls 400 Meter Dash - 61.5 6. In cross country, approve the use of modified scoring system for cross country for both Class A and Class B on a one-year trial basis. (Schmeling/Rust)

Motion by Bommersbach to have the office make contact with the track coaches to indicate a concern with the qualifying relays not using the original competitors. Input from these coaches shall be brought to the Board at the October meeting. Second by Schmeling and carried.

The Volleyball Advisory Recommendations were reviewed with the following approved:

1. The Class A Regional Tournament schedule shall be:

Friday - 12:00, 2:00, 4:00, 6:00

Saturday - Third place - 4:00, Championship - 6:00

(Norland/Bommersbach)

The Wrestling Advisory Committee recommendations were approved as follows:

1. All Class A wrestlers will conduct their weigh-ins on Thursday evening at 8:45 p.m. and All Class B wrestlers will conduct their weigh-ins at a determined time on Friday morning (Schmeling/Ness)

The Music Advisory Recommendations were reviewed with the following approved:

1. Re-endorse 1994-95 resolution: "Due to the concern of the NDHSAA Board of Directors and local school administrators relative to the loss of school time and the concern of the Board of Higher Education for the loss of instructional time on their campuses, the 1996 State Class B Music Festival will again be held on a Saturday. Every attempt should be made by school personnel to keep the date of the State

Music Festival free of conflicts for state music qualifiers."

2. Regional solo/ensemble time slots be set at minimum of 8 to maximum of ten minutes per entry.

3. Recommend Music Judge Certification clinics as 2 hour sessions at following sites:

Sept. 23 at Mandan High School

Sept. 30 at UND-Grand Forks

Oct. 7 at Minot SU

Oct. 20 at Fargo Discovery Middle School

Make-up at Valley City - TBA

(Norland/Johnson)

4. Recommend NDHSAA Board re-evaluate position of "no payment to non-host school bands for regional/state tournaments. Because the Board had earlier accepted a proposal for payment to regional tournament bands, motion by Leidal to accept this recommendation to also include State. Second by Sanstead. Motion failed.

The Board reviewed the Speech Advisory recommendations with the following accepted:

1 Student Coparess:

A. Add Chamber 1C because rooms at Capitol are too small to accommodate more than 15-20 students. This adds 5 individual plaques and one gavel to list of awards plus one additional judge.

2. Debate:

A. Add LIMITED CURRENT ISSUE DEBATE (LCID) category on a one-year trial basis.

3. One-Act Plays

A. Class A:

1. Run same individual events on a second year trial. Piano accompanist allowed in musical events. Contracted judges and directors will judge events (1 or 2 judges per event)

1. Give State Superior Performance award to third place play from each of the preliminary round sites (one size smaller than 4th place team award) . 4. Speech

A. Extend maximum time limit in Speech-to-Entertain from five to six minutes.

B. Add 7th and 8th place in each of the 13 categories at state A and B speech tournament. Sweepstakes points would be 10-8-6-5-4-3-2-1. (Approx. cost - \$130 - would cut Superior medal cost). Tie breakers would be added to limit finalists in each category to 8:

1. Preliminaries - substitute for D. - Choose the student that has the better ranking from either of the two preliminary judges.

2. Rank 1 - 6 in state preliminaries and 1 - 8 in state finals.

C. Keep 3 week deadline for speech schools to FAX sheet with number of regional entries per category to manager, BUT ALLOW two week deadline for faxing complete regional registration to manager/NDHSAA.

D. A \$5.00 fee charged per entry dropped day of regional schedule if drop could have been faxed by at least 4:00 p.m. day before regional. (Sanstead/Norland)

Motion by Johnson to amend the original motion by eliminating part B under Speech from those to be accepted. Second by Schmeling. Vote on the amendment to the motion failed,

Vote on the original motion carried.

The Board read a letter from Oak Grove concerning their district's response to the awarding of regional basketball tournament sites.

A communique from NDHSAA's attorney Gary Thune was read thanking the Board for making possible his attendance to the National Federation legal meeting.

A letter was read from Mandan explaining their reason for declining the request to host the 1996 Girls' State Golf tournament because of an inadequate clubhouse facilities. They indicated their interest in hosting when a clubhouse is built that would better accommodate the golfers. Motion by Johnson to accept the withdrawal. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

Johnson reported on behalf of the Promotions Committee.

1. Continue the current quality of the publication the Bulletin.

- 2. Informed the Board on the many programs and publications currently in place that are used to promote
- 3. The committee discussed ideas concerning a possible program on sportsmanship that would reach groups other than students and coaches. Many organizations that are in relationship with the NDHSAA Board would be effective connections in the promotion of sportsmanship. Committee recommended contacting people connected to these organizations to get input on how a sportsmanship program could
- 4. Recommended Lee Halvorson as a recipient for the Distinguished Service Award.

Motion by Johnson to continue current public services and pursue the development of sportsmanship with other contacted organizations. Second by Rust and carried.

Motion by Johnson to present the 1995-96 Distinguished Service Award to Lee Halvorson of Williston. Second by Schmeling and carried.

Motion by Leidal to approve the 1995-96 Board of Directors meetings as follows:

- 1. The Committee recommends catastrophic insurance for all member schools with Lockton Insurance of Kansas City for a total premium of \$39,950. Motion by Schmeling to approve this recommendation. Second by Bommersbach and carried.
- 2. In regard to officials insurance, switch from National Federation to Lockton Insurance for the price of \$6.50 per official which will be better coverage including excess medical. Motion by Schmeling to approve this recommendation. Second by Johnson and carried.
- 3. The office will proceed with the updating of the computers.
- 4. The Executive Secretary reported on the 1996-97 budget as studied by the Finance Committee. This budget is to be approved by the new committee at the August meeting.
- 5. The Committee discussed the possibility of discontinuing payments to home teams in all Association sponsored lournaments. An extensive discussion followed with no action taken.

The Board held audience with a delegation representing the North Dakota Cheer Coaches Association. A demonstration using Bismarck High School cheerleaders was given to show present legal stunts that are unsate and present illegal stunts that are actually sate. Following the demonstration, a proposal was presented. The Board held an extensive discussion concerning these proposals. Motion by Ness to approve the following proposal:

EACH INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL WILL BE GIVEN THE OPTION OF:

1. Staying with the current North Dakota High School Activities Association Guidelines of waist-high.

2. Being allowed to follow the National Federation Guidelines with the following provisions:

a. If the school opts to follow the National Federation Guidelines, the cheer coach must be safety

b. The cheerleaders must attend a camp or training session that teaches them the proper techniques in stunting and other more advanced moves.

Second by Gegelman and carried.

The Association was directed to update and remodel the NDHSAA office, particularly the bathroom facilities and kitchen area along with other areas that suffered water damage.

The Executive Secretary reported on the Distinguished Student program with another successful year,

The Board studied the trophy cost comparisons for the 93-94 and 94-95 years.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report on the spring activities. Noted was the results of the first year of admission charges from the regional track meets and how it helped to defray part of the expenses incurred from these meets.

Separately, the State Class B Baseball financial report was reviewed.

The financial report reflecting the results of all athletic activities for years 1988-89 through 1994-95 was reviewed.

The following cooperative sponsorship applications were reviewed:

Drake/Anamoose to Harvey for boys' and girls' track Washburn to Wing/Tuttle for cross country

Alexander to Watford City for boys' and girls' track

Wildrose-Alamo to Tioga for boys' and girls' track

Fargo Oak Grove to Fargo Shanley for boys' and girls' soccer

DesLacs-Burlington to Minot for boys' and girls' swimming.

Motion by Schmeling to approve these cooperative applications subject to application requirements being completed. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Rust presented to the Board a concern on the tate applications for cooperative sponsorship. Suggested was a \$500 late fee for filling an application past the deadline date. Motion by Rust to charge a \$500 late fee refundable if the application is denied. This is to be in effect beginning with the end of each 1995 individual fall season. Second by Gegelman and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board on the study of the possible facilities for the Girls' State Soccer tournament which has been scheduled to be held in Fargo. Motion by Schmeling to hold the tournament in Jamestown. Second by Johnson and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the board of the invitation from Kenmare and Mohall to host the Class B Girls' and Boys' State Golf Tournament.

Sanstead reported the Canvassing Committee's certification of the results of the vote on the amendment to the Constitution and ByLaws adding a position on the NDHSAA Board of Directors for a member of the North Dakota Athletic/Activities Association. The amendment passed with a vote of yes - 129, no - 43 and will be in effect with the 1996-97 year. Motion by Sanstead to accept this committee report. Second by Johnson and carried.

The Board read a letter from Valley City High School regarding consideration to recognize cheerleaders for the Team Scholar Award. Motion by Johnson to approve this request. Second by Sanstead. After discussion, both the motion and second were withdrawn. No action was taken.

A letter from Mohall was read requesting eligibility for Fabian Alvarez as a visa foreign exchange student from Mexico. Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Gegelman and carried.

Rust reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee with these three Issues:

1. Students may participate on non-school teams "outside" of the regular season. However, no more than three students in basketball and volleyball, or four players and a goaltender in hockey and no more than seven players in soccer may be students from any one team who were in grades nine through twelve and who have not yet graduated from high school may participate on the same team. However, no limitation on the number of players from one team will be in effect from June 1st to August 1st. Motion by Rust to approve this regulation. Second by Gegetman.

Motion by Schmeling to amend the motion to include 7 - 12. Second by Bommersbach and carried.

Vote on the original motion as amended carried.

 Concerning overlapping seasons and the pre-season practice requirements, it was recommended by the NDHSAA attorney the following amendment to Article XII, Section I Football and Section II Basketball be proposed to the Constitution and ByLaws;

Required preseason practices, which are not attended by an athlete because that athlete was actively involved in NDHSAA sponsored tournament or playoff competition held concurrently with such preseason practices, shall be waived.

Motion by Bommersbach to approve this to be submitted as a ByLaw change. Second by Rust and carried.

Concerning game limitations on baseball, the staff will study a possible policy and report to the Board at an up-coming meeting.

Motion by Schmeling to approve staff member Hetler's attendance at the National Debate Topic in Philadelphia. Second by Johnson and carried.

The Board held audience with the North Dakota Radio Broadcasters Association. The group stated North Dakota is the only state in the area that charges radio stations broadcasting rights fees to cover events. They suggested several options as alternative to the present policy. Ness requested the Broadcasters Association come in at a future meeting with a presentation the Board can review. Johnson suggested if a proposal is accepted, a study over several years should be conducted to study the effect on gate, etc.

Outgoing Board members, Rust, Johnson and Schmeling were thanked for their years of service as members of the NDHSAA Board of Directors.

President Hansen in turn was thanked for his year of leadership.

With no further business, President Hansen declared the meeting adjourned.

### 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### A. Fund Accounting

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the use of resources available to the Association, the accounts of the Association are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purpose. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund; however, in the accompanying financial statements, funds that have similar characteristics have been combined into fund groups. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group.

The assets, liabilities, and fund balances of the association are reported in a self-balancing fund groups as follows:

- Operating funds, which include unrestricted and restricted resources, represent the portion of expendable funds that is available for support of the Associations operations.
- 2. Plant funds represent resources restricted for plant acquisitions and funds expended for plant.

### B. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

### 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### C. Operation

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for local school district. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

### D. Income taxes

The Association is exempt from payment of Federal income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

### E. Plant Assets and Depreciation

Uses of operating funds for plant acquisitions and principal debt service payments are accounted for as transfers to plant funds. Proceeds from the sale of plant assets, if unrestricted, are transferred to operating fund balances, or, if restricted, to deferred amounts restricted for plant acquisitions. No depreciation has been provided.

### 2. INVESTMENTS

Investments are presented in the financial statements in the aggregate at the lower of cost (amortized, in the case of bonds) or fair market value.
