The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 72nd annual **Yearbook** which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

- 1995-96 marked the 88th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Our
 membership decreased from 199 to 198 high schools. Because of the decreasing
 number of schools and the large number of co-ops, one may see some drastic changes
 In the basic format of the NDHSAA in future years.
- 1995-96 will be the second year the NDHSAA will deficit spend approximately \$80,000.00. The deficit has occurred mainly because of increased payments made to schools.
- The fall of 1995 was the third time that all three championship football games were
 played in the FARGODOME, which was a very successful venture. Next fall, all semifinal games will be played in the FARGODOME.
- 1996 was the first year that a combined Girls' State Volleyball Tournament was held in Fargo.
- The 1995-96 school year was the first year to sponsor Boys' and Girls' Soccer.
- The NDHSAA Board will continue to provide catastrophic insurance for all member schools at no cost in 1996-97.
- The 1997 combined Girls' State Volleyball Tournament will be a three day event for the first time.

I would like to express a very sincere thank you to all administrators, coaches, athletic directors and officials for your support and cooperation in my eighth year as your Executive Secretary. Our staff will continue to make every effort to provide your school the best possible service in

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors August 10, 1995 - Valley City, North Dakota

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the association office in Valley City at 10:00 A.M. on August 10, 1995 with all members present. President Bommersbach called the meeting to order and welcomed new members Janet Auer, Sherman Sylling and Lowell Jensen to the Board.

A letter was read from Supt. David Rust of Tioga thanking the NDHSAA and the Board of Directors for the opportunity of serving on the Board.

Upon review of the minutes of the June meeting, motion by Hansen to approve. Second by Sanstead. Following an amendment to change page 5 of the June minutes to read 95-96 budget, motion carried as amended.

Harold Rotunda, certified public accountant presented the audit for the 1994-95 year. After review of the audit, Mr. Rotunda recommended the Finance Committee study the following:

- Study the possibility of adjusting the process for which the gate receipts from association sponsored events are reported. The Executive Secretary expressed faith in the honesty of the school people who are involved with the management of the tournaments.
- 2. It was recommended the Finance Committee be involved with the recommendations concerning the ongoing investment activities.

Mr. Rotunda completed his report by indicating no problems were determined during the audit. Motion by Norland to approve the audit. Second by Ness and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented for review the Final Fund Balance, General Fund Year End Balance and the 1994-95 budget through 6-30-95.

Hansen reported on behalf of the Finance Committee with the projected budget for the 1995-96 year as proposed by the Finance Committee. Hansen indicated the committee's additional recommendation for the planned renovation of the office to be handicapped accessible. With this addition to the budget, the Finance Committee recommended the Office Improvement section of the budget be increased to \$20,000.00. Motion by Hansen to approve the budget at \$1,095,000.00. Second by Gegelman and carried.

The Finance Committee looked at the ending fund balance and discussed what would be a realistic bench mark for that balance. This was added to the responsibility of the committee to be discussed at the next committee meeting.

The budget report from July 1, 1995 to the present time was presented for information purposes.

Ness reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws with the following subjects:

a. Physical Exams - there has been expressed a concern over the quality of exam students are receiving as well as the large numbers seeking exams at the same time of year. In checking, Minnesota requires an

exam every 3 years with an update process. South Dakota requires an exam every 2 years. Auer stated the rising costs of examinations and the possibility of these type of exams not being as thorough as could be. Also, those students with health problems are already being monitored by their doctor. The physical examination card could be looked at for possibly being more in depth. Discussion followed as to what should be required for a physical exam. Concern was expressed this could possibly drive up the cost of the exam. Gegelman suggested to gather a group of doctors to determine what would be an adequate physical examination. Ness suggested working with MeritCare. Hansen suggested NDHSAA attorney Thune study what legal obligations the Association has. The National Federation will be contacted for any information concerning this. Auer suggested a visit with Family Practice Physicians Association for information and possibly request them to appear before the Board at the September meeting. Following discussion, the decision was made to seek the NDHSAA attorney's opinion and also obtain information from the National Federation and other states. This information will be studied at the September meeting. A decision will be made at that time as to the direction the committee should go from there.

b. Baseball game limitations were discussed with these recommendations:

- No player may participate in more than one hundred and seventy-five (175) innings during the regular season.
- 2. No more than two dates per week on days followed by a school day.

Motion by Ness to accept these changes to the regulations. Second by Gegelman and carried.

- c. The Committee discussed whether the Fall DPI count or the spring ADM count should be used to determine a school's enrollment for classification purposes. It was recommended the fall report will continue to be used to determine the number of students in a particular school. Motion by Ness to continue using the fall DPI enrollment numbers and to have schools close to a determining number (from 300 to 350)provide a roster of all students grades 9 through 12 to the Association office. Second by Gegelman and carried.
- d. Summer convention attendance was discussed. It was recommended to continue discussion leaning toward allowing the incoming Board members attending the summer convention rather than the off-going board members. This is scheduled to be discussed again at the September meeting.
- e. The Committee alerted the board of the expressed concern for the new out-of-season competition rule and the impending audience with those in opposition to this rule at the September meeting.
- f. The restructuring of Class B golf regions was not discussed because the committee ran out of time. This item will be discussed at the September meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported on the bid submitted by KVRR TV for \$10,000 per year for broadcasting the Class A Girls' and Boys' East Region basketball tournaments on a two-year basis. Motion by Hansen to accept the bid. Second by Leidal and carried.

The Board heard correspondence relative to the schedule conflict with the University of North Dakota hockey and the state high school tournament. The conflict is between a UND game scheduled on Saturday and the consolation game for the high school state hockey tournament. The television contract mandates a 7:00 p.m. starting time for the championship game. To allow for this, the consolation game may have to be moved to the Purpur City Arena. Motion by Norland to move the consolation game to the Purpur Arena for play to begin at 12:00 noon with the 3rd place at 4:00 p.m. and championship at 7:00 p.m., both at the Ralph Engelstad Arena. Second by Sanstead and carried.

A letter requesting the dissolution of the Hurdsfield-Bowdon cooperative sponsorship program was read. Motion by Hansen to approve the request. Second by Sylling and carried.

The process for replacement of Association automobiles was discussed. Motion by Gegelman to continue the process of seiling the current Association automobiles through advertising in the <u>Bulletin</u> and seeking bids for new automobiles. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a hardship investigation of Dana Strom who wishes to transfer from Bethel, Alaska to Fargo Oak Grove and recommended approval. Motion by Leidal to approve the request. Second by Auer. A roll call vote was requested with the following results:

Norland --no Jensen --yes Ness --no Sylling - no Sanstead - yes
Auer - yes Gegelman - no Hansen - no Leidal - yes Bommersbach - no
Motion was defeated, 4-6.

A letter was read requesting approval of eligibility for Ralf Klassen who transferred from Germany to Bottineau as a visa student but not with an approved program. Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Jensen and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported that we have settled with the insurance company for the water damage

With motion by Gegelman and second by Sylling, the Board approved the following cooperative sponsorship programs:

Johnson Corners to Walford City for girls' and boys' basketball, girls' and boys' track, girls' and boys' golf, football and volleyball (7-12).

Drake to Anamoose for volleyball (7-12).

Scranton to Reeder for all activities except boys' basketball (7-8)

to the office which happened on May 25, 1995.

Halliday to Killdeer for boys' and girls' cross country

Our Redeemer's Christian to Minot for all activities (7-12)

Motion by Sanstead for approval of the following co-op requests pending completion of all application papers:

Kindred to West Fargo for boys' and girls' tennis

Pingree-Buchanan to Carrington for football

Second by Ness and carried.

Staff member Hetler reported on the Class A regional speech assignment of Class A schools which will take place on a yearly basis. Motion by Sanstead to move Valley City to the West Region for the 1996 regional competition. Second by Norland and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on telephone calls the association has received from schools inquiring as to the Supreme Court decision allowing random drug testing of students during physical examinations. A brief discussion followed for information purposes only.

The Executive Secretary shared a letter from John Warren, Mandan High School music instructor and allstate music manager thanking the NDHSAA for support through the NDMEA of the all-state music publication.

A letter from Ft. Yates Public was read indicating their possible need for a cooperative sponsorship program for their girls' basketball program. It is recommended the Board wait to hear from them concerning any type of action the school may wish to take.

Planning is in process to secure a speaker for the General Assembly meeting. Input is being sought for any suggestions.

Gegelman reported on a recommendation submitted from the NDOA Board of Directors concerning the selection process for Class B regional and state officials. Motion by Hansen to table the recommendation to allow for time to study. Second by Norland.

A discussion took place concerning the late fee for applications for cooperative sponsorships and when this late fee will go into effect. Motion by Leidal to change the wording of the deadline for clarification purposes to read "go into effect at the end of each of the 1995-96 individual seasons" to clarify the intent of the board. Second by Ness and carried.

There being no further business, President Bommersbach declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors - Special Meeting August 25, 1995

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was called to order by President Bommersbach at 10:00 A.M. on August 25, 1995. All members were present except Jensen and Sanstead!

President Bommersbach Indicated the purpose of the meeting was to review a number of hardship investigations and cooperative sponsorship applications.

The Executive Secretary reported on a hardship investigation of Lance Lennick transferred from Inver Grove, Minnesota to Fargo North. Immediate eligibility was recommended. Motion by Gegelman to approve the eligibility request. Second by Ness and carried.

Ness reported on a request from Regent school district to approve eligibility for Daniel Yourk under the hardship rule. Motion by Ness to approve immediate eligibility until September 20, 1995. At that time the family must be moved into the Regent school district to allow eligibility to continue. Second by Sanstead and carried

The Executive Secretary reported on a request from Supt. Fuhrman to consider eligibility for Miranda Meyhoff at Milnor because he had given her the wrong information relative to her transfer at the beginning of the school year. Motion by Norland to approve the request. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Board heard an appeal from Supt. Remington of Mott asking the Board to reconsider the denial of immediate eligibility for Tommy Taylor under the hardship rule. No action was taken to reconsider.

There being no further business, President Bommersbach declared the meeting adjourned.

> MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors September 19 & 20, 1995 • Bismarck Radisson Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on September 19, 1995 at the Radisson inn in Bismarck. Chairman Bommersbach called the meeting to order at 2:15 p.m. with all members present.

Motion by Hansen to approve the minutes of the August 10th regular meeting and the August 25th and September 1st special meetings. Second by Ness and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report as of September 13, 1995.

The Board reviewed the investment report as well as the budget to the present time.

A letter from Walhalla Public Schools reporting themselves for the use of an ineligible student in the 1994-95 school year was read. Motion by Gegelman to send a letter of reprimand to the school and thank them for reporting themselves on the violation. Second by Sylling and carried.

Staff member Solberg reported on the cheerleader clinics that were conducted in August and the results of the company bids for the 1996 cheerleader clinics. Motion by Sanstead to accept the bid of \$1,500 from the Universal Cheerleader Association for 4 clinicians. Second by Leidal and carried.

Chairman Bommersbach appointed Hansen to chair the girls' district chairmen's meeting in November and Gegeiman to chair the boys' district chairmen's meeting in March.

Dennis Nathan, Wyndmere and Jerry Enget, Hazen were suggested and appointed to serve on the nomination committee along with Wallace Schmeling who will serve as chairman of that committee.

The Executive Secretary reported on behalf of the Finance Committee with discussion on the auditor's recommendations as heard in his report at the August meeting:

- 1. Tournament gate receipts: Recommended was each tournament site have two people in charge of counting the money. Motion by Leidal to make this a requirement. Second by Hansen & carried.
- 2, investment Advisory: Recommended was an advisory member or members from the NDHSAA Board of Directors assist the Executive Secretary in decisions on investments should be call upon that
- 3. Target Amount for Fund Balance. The Board will continue study of the possibilities of further payments to schools from the Fund Balance. This type of study was placed in the hands of the Finance Committee by Chairman Bommersbach. This committee is charged with (a) Identify the amount and the reason for this balance and (b) study the payment schedule to member schools.

Ness reported on behalf of the Redistricting Committee with a recommendation for basketball districts to be studied

Ness reported on a request from Mott school district to approve eligibility for Tommy Taylor who transferred from Ocean Side, California. Motion by Norland to deny the request. Second by Leidal and

Staff member Solberg reported on a request from and interview with Berthold Public Schools to grant eligibility for Marcel Lamour, a student from Germany attending Berthold on a F-I visa rather than through an approved foreign exchange program. Motion by Ness to approve eligibility. Second by Gegelman and

Solberg reported on a hardship request for Justin Rutledge who transferred from Lumberton, Texas to Bismarck and is attending Century High School. Immediate eligibility was recommended. Motion by Leidal to approve. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on an investigation concerning a request from Lisbon to grant eligibility to transfer student, Mike Bruns, Jr. who has transferred from Fargo. Immediate eligibility was recommended. Motion by Hansen to approve eligibility. Second by Sylling and carried.

Solberg reported on a request from Washburn Public Schools to allow eligibility of student, Jill Heringer who will be living in the Washburn school district. The family has purchased a house in the school district but are not able to move into this house until renters vacate at the beginning of September. In the interim, the Heringer family has been forced to move Into the Bismarck district. Motion by Norland to approve immediate eligibility until September 20, 1995. At that time the family must be moved into the Washburn school district to allow eligibility to continue. Second by Leidal and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a request from Leeds High School to allow an academically ineligible student to participate under the hardship rule. The Board was Informed of a letter sent by the Executive Secretary Indicating this did not fall under the hardship rule and the Board does not have the power to waive any Constitution and ByLaws rules.

An application for an emergency cooperative sponsorship program for North Sargent to Milnor for girls' basketball was heard. The Board requested Supt. Dale Fuhrman of North Sargent be contacted to join the discussion for the purpose of answering a number of questions concerning the application. Following the question and answer session, motion by Auer to approve the application. Second by Ness. A roll call vote was as follows:

Motion defeated, 3-4

Solberg reported on a hardship investigation concerning Jeremy Clooten who has transferred from Bismarck to Strasburg. Immediate eligibility was recommended. Motion by Auer to approve eligibility. Second by Ness and carried.

A request was heard from Ojibwa Indian School and Turtle Mountain Community High School to add 9th grade to their current co-op program. Motion by Leidal to approve. Second by Auer and carried.

A request was heard from Trinity Christian School and Williston High School to add 9th grade to their current co-op program. Motion by Ness to approve. Second by Sylling and carried.

The out-of-season policy as approved in the June meeting was discussed. Board members and staff indicated the number of calls and letters received in opposition to this policy. Further study on how other states handle this policy as well as the NDHSAA attorney's opinion will be obtained for discussion at the September meeting.

There being no further business, President Bommersbach declared the meeting adjourned.

The Executive Secretary Informed the Board of a number of football teams that have played in the FargoDome and rather than paying the 25 cent user charge, they have been adding it to the admission price. The NDHSAA has currently been paying that 25 cent fee rather than passing that cost on to the public. It was the general feeling of the Board that this practice will be continued.

The Board heard a request from KVRR TV to consider a time change for the Class A East Regional Girls' Basketball tournament to allow coverage to work around the television station's mandated coverage of the Mike Tyson fight. This would require a change of the ending date of the regional tournament. Motion by Leidal to change the tournament to end on Friday rather than Saturday. Second by Jensen and carried.

Chairman Bommerbach declared the meeting adjourned until the following morning at 9:00 a.m. The meeting will be moved to Room 3015 for more space.

The Board reconvened September 20, 1995 at 9:00 a.m.

The Board held an audience with athletic directors Jim Haussler of Bismarck and Terry Hjelmstad of Minot who voiced concerns with the budget problems caused by the mandated shot clock for Class A Boys' basketball. The athletic directors requested consideration to have the implementation of the shot clock delayed one year so it can be worked into their individual school district's budget. NDHSAA attorney Gary Thune appeared before the Board in response to questions concerning the policy on physical examinations. The national standard requires an individual to have a physical examination prior to the first year of participation with a clearance by a doctor for each of the following years of participation. Auer recommended the Executive Secretary write a letter to the Medicał Association seeking their opinion on this issue and if they would support a change and what that change would be. Also, ask if a disclaimer signed by the doctor would be acceptable.

The Board reviewed the proposed ByLaw change concerning preseason practice requirements counting if an individual is involved in an NDHSAA sponsored tournament or play-off competition being held in the preceding season concurrently with such preseason practices. The question was raised if practice prior to these play-off competitions would count toward the following preseason practice requirements. The Executive Secretary will add wording to clarify any practices for the preceding season play-offs will also count toward the following season's preseason practice requirement.

Mr. Schaefer also spoke in support of a reconsideration of the out-of-season rule.

Motion by Norland to rescind rule #4 in its entirety. Second by Ness, Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Bommersbach thanked the Executive Secretary and the Board as well as parents who offered positive Input in reconsidering the rule in question.

The Class B District Chairmen met at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, November 17, 1995, at the Minot Holiday Inn. Chairman Hansen called the meeting to order and briefed the group on how their recommendations are forwarded to the NDHSAA Board of Directors to be acted upon at the June annual meeting. Chairman Hansen called for reports from the districts beginning with District 1.

District 1 - Supt. Dale Furhman:

 Consider designating two Friday nights during the season as girls' basketball nights and move the football games to Thursday or Saturday nights. Example: The Friday night of the week before Teachers' Convention.

Region 1 has volunteered to be the experimental area for this scheduling study. Prin. Dendinger of Rugby stated they travel much farther for football than basketball so there may be a problem on a school night. Prin. Gorder of Fargo Oak Grove - there is a concern for the Friday - Tuesday turn-around prior to the football play-offs.

- 2. Recommend staying with the Spalding Basketball as the official ball. The Executive Secretary informed the group we are on the first year of a three year bid.
- 3. Recommend changing girls' volleyball to follow the same format as the girls' and boys' basketball for district, regional and state playoffs. District playoffs will be to advance four teams from each district into the region and the champion going on to the state tournament. Solberg gave update on district study being shared with the volleyball coaches.

District 2 - Prin. Darwin Gorder, Fargo Oak Grove:

- 1. Recommend moving the starting date for girls' basketball from August 8th to August 15th. One way to address this issue is to reduce the number of games for glirs' and boys' basketball. Supt. Tollefson asked if girls' basketball practice is tied into the start of football practice. Supt. Hagen of Stanley informed the group that Dist. 16 has a calendar proposal that they will present.
- 2. Recommend reducing the number of girls' and boys' basketball games to 16 or 14 plus one invitational tournament. Supt. Fuhrman Basketball is one of the only revenue producing incomes and he would question reducing the number of games. Prin. Dendinger The number of games is not the problem for girls' basketball, it is just that the season is too short for the number of games.

District 3 - Supt. Gerald Bartholomay, Hillsboro:

- Recommend studying the feasibility of moving boys' basketball season and tournaments one week later. Concern was expressed about the general public questioning the early date for starting practice for fall sports.
- Recommend continuing current rotation of regional girls' and boys' basketball tournaments between Mayville and Grafton.
- 3. Also added the recommendation to keep girls' basketball in the fall.

District 4 - Supt. Claude Sheldon, Park River:

- 1. Strongly recommend that girls' basketball remain in the fall.
- Recommend glris' basketball season not be lengthened. Would like to see end of tournaments before Thanksgiving.

3. Recommend bench decorum remain as is.

District 5 - Supt. Don Davis, St. John:

- 1. Concern over early start of activities next fall on August 8th for girls' basketball.
- 2. Recommend the 10 foul rule be eliminated.
- 3. Concern over bench decorum rule not being enforced. Nothing is being done. Supt. Fuhrman -Districts have a couple of coaches that ignore the rule and the rest of the coaches are great. This issue must be addressed by the administration of the coach that is not in control.
- 4. Expressed concern over the way that cooperative sponsorships are being counted in determining which schools are in 9-man and which in 11-man.
- 5. Expressed concern for basketball games becoming more physical. Is this for a purpose?
- 6. Dist. 5 requests an explanation of how regional tournament sites are selected. Chairman Hansen explained how the regional sites are determined with district recommendations and invitations from sites considered. Suggested that each individual school have a vote on the selection of the site. Gorder -There are other factors that enter into the selection of tournament sites.

District 6 - Prin. George Dendinger, Rugby:

- 1. Allow free throws to be shot at the end of the game even if time has expired as this could figure into the tie breaker system.
- 2. Expressed concern over the early starting date for girls' basketball. Girls' and boys' seasons should be equalized by adding to girls' season and cutting boys' season.

District 7 - Supt. Richard Cheatley, Maddock:

- 1. Recommend holding official selection for later in the year. Suggested was one month later.
- 2. Concern over early date of starting girls' basketball practice.
- 3. Request the schools be allowed input on football playoffs.
- 4. Expressed concern about coaches mandatory rules testing. Coaches in for 20 years should be trusted to know the rules.

District 8 - Supt. Rodney Scherbenske, Goodrich:

1. How was it determined that there is no practice at district and regional sites? Requested is consideration for those teams that do not play at site during the regular season. Kummeth - commented it is an excellent rule. Davis - Leaving it locally is not the answer. Dendinger - If you are the host, you are forced to cancel classes in your gym because you are forced to schedule practices. Bartholomey - Maybe address just the issue when you are not in a neutral site. Ness - What is a neutral site? Batterberry - This is just the first year that it is in effect so let it continue and give it a chance before a change is discussed. Chairman Hansen stated the general consensus is to continue study. Tollefson - The policy is good because it reduces the loss of school time.

District 9 - Supt. Robert Kummeth, LaMoure:

- 1. Concern over officials not showing up for games and sending someone else. Carlsrud Schools please notify the NDHSAA and we will work with officials to attempt to prevent any miscommunication with contracting officials.
- 2. Standardize the rule that permits schools with less than 50 in the junior high to move students up and down at will. Should be same for all schools. The Executive Secretary suggested this could be studied by the Constitution and Bylaws Committee.

Motion by Sheldon to refer this amendment to the Constitution and ByLaws Committee. Second by Kummeth carried, 14-2,

- 3. Two schools from this district would like elementary athletics added to the NDHSAA.
- 4. Recommend both the girls' and boys' regional basketball tournaments be held in Jamestown.

District 10 - Supt. Leon Ableidinger, Steele-Dawson:

- 1. Move girls' basketball season one week back to coincide with football season.
- 2. Recommend reducing the number of basketball games to 16 games or 14 and a tournament.

N. DAK, HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

Discussion continued on early start. Sheldon - Their district voted unanimously to follow the activities dates. Bartholomay - He has been directed by his school board to ask for a general consensus of the district chairmen on the early starting date. Hagen - introduced for District 16 a proposal for length of season and tournament structure. Sheldon - We maybe need to remove the bylaw that requires boys basketball season to end on a specific date and allow the Board to set the tournament each year. Batterberry - We need to take care of our own situation before it is handled by outside parties. A straw vote indicated the group was in favor of removing the requirement for the boys basketball ending date from the Constitution and ByLaws. A straw vote indicated all were in favor of considering a later date for start of fall practice in 1996.

District 11 - Supt. Sam Tollefson, Carson:

- 1. Recommend the continuation of the rotation of regional basketball tournaments between Mandan and
- 2. Recommend teams be allowed to practice at district and regional sites.
- 3. Recommend parking passes be sent out with admission passes to the district chairmen for the state tournament.

District 12 - Supt. Duane Martin, Regent:

- 1. Recommend returning to three-district regions in basketball.
- 2. Concern over no practice rule at district and regional basketball tournaments.
- 3. Expressed concern that play-offs in the Dome two weekends in a row makes for long travel for west

District 13 - Supt. Bob Tollefson, Washburn: No further items for recommendation

District 14 - Supt. Norm Batterberry, North Shore:

1. Recommend the coaches box.

2. Recommend allowing practice at regional basketball site at the discretion of local administration.

District 15 - Prin. Clyde Huber, Berthold:

No further discussion as all recommendations had been covered.

District 16 - Supt. Elroy Hagen, Stantey:

- 1. Recommend coaches box. They polled administrators in his district and they were in favor of the coaches box. 7-3.
- 2. Recommend holding regional basketball tournaments in Williston.
- 3. Presented the Watford City proposal concerning the calendar. Encouraged everyone to study their proposal on length of season.

Chairman Hansen reviewed discussions that have occurred in the past concerning the bench decorum

With no further business, Chairman Hansen declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES Board of Directors January 27, 1996 Bismarck Radisson inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on January 27, 1996 at the Radisson Inn in Bismarck. Chairman Bommersbach called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. with all members present.

Motion by Gegetman to approve the minutes of the November 17 regular meeting and the November 30, December 7, December 21 special meetings. Second by Ness and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report as of January 24, 1996.

The Board studied the expense comparison chart showing expenses charged at different sites at all regional and state girls' basketball tournaments.

Leidal reported on behalf of the Personnel and Finance Committee. Four issues were discussed:

- 1. Study the possibility of allowing the staff to participate in a flex benefit program.
- 2. Studied the policy on reserve vacation days.
- 3. Extended the Executive Secretary one year on a two-year contract to 1997-98.
- 4. Recommend a 3.5% increase in salary for all association staff.

Motion by Leidal to approve the increase in salary. Second by Hansen and carried.

Motion by Leidal to extend the Executive Secretary's contract to include the 1996-97 and 1997-98 year with salary for the 97-98 year to be determined. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Committee expressed their appreciation for the fine work done by the association staff.

The Personnel Committee also recommended a study of an evaluation process for the Executive Secretary position. The formation of a policy was assigned to the Personnel Committee for a future report.

Norland reported on behalf of the Football Committee with their preliminary study of the football programs for the 1997-98 year and their review of the Football Advisory committee's recommendations:

Motion by Hansen to table the Football Advisory recommendations until the football plan is finalized. Second by Ness and carried.

Auer reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee with results of the balloting:

Athletic Administrator position: Terry Hjelmstad - 135, Ed Lockwood - 40 Class B Southeast: Adam Boschee - 119, Steve Nelson - 62

Class A Central: Robert Toso 96 - Ukestad - 77

Motion by Auer to accept the report of the Committee. Second by Jensen and carried.

Ness reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee with a recommended policy addressing out of season coaching. The policy reads:

A student participating in an activity "out of season" may not receive coaching or training from a salaried or non-salaried member of his/her school's coaching staff except under the following provisions:

- During June and July, coaches of team sports (basketball, football, hockey, soccer and volleyball) from a NDHSAA member school's coaching staff in that sport may instruct students in a summer contest or camp who have participated in a contest as members of their school team in that sport.
- 2. Coaches of individual sports (cross country, golf, gymnastics, swimming, tennis, track and wrestling) from a NDHSAA member school's coaching staff may coach students in that sport in an "out-of-season" contest or camp, provided that it is not under the supervision and operation of the member school.

Motion by Ness to approve as presented. Second by Auer and carried.

Ness also reported on the study of the elimination of Constitution and ByLaw's mandated end of season for basketball and football giving the Board more flexibility in the scheduling of the seasons. This would require deleting Article XII, Section 1: Football: e and Section 1 Boys Basketball: d. Motion by Ness to propose this amendment. Second by Gegetman and carried.

Following a discussion of junior high bylaws, the committee directed the staff to write a clarification of the Valley City/Mandan amendment passed by the General Assembly at the October, 1995 meeting.

Following a discussion of junior high rules, Norland requested a study of the length of quarters for junior high basketball.

Ness also reported on the committee's discussion of rules addressing hardship transfer and visa student situations. The Committee encouraged the Board to discuss possible solutions to this issue.

Auer reported on the study of sports physical examinations and the possible change in the requirements. She introduced Dave Peske from the North Dakota Medical Association. Mr. Peske presented the minutes of their meeting concerning the discussion on the issue of physical exams. Ness asked Mr. Peske if there was anything their medical group felt should be added to the present examination requirements. Mr. Peske indicated there were no further requirements for which the group saw a need.

Auer recommended to the Board the study of sports physical examination requirements continue.

Sylling indicated the General Assembly may express concern for the different costs for a physical examination in different parts of the state. Information regarding the girls' hockey program was provided to the Board. Currently there are many programs which are growing steadily. Requested was the Board's encouragement to schools to allow girls to letter in hockey in their schools. The clarification was made by the Executive Secretary that schools determine their own lettering policy. The Executive Secretary was requested to provide the Constitution and ByLaws rules concerning eligibility of participants.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the National Federation Hall of Fame becoming too large for their building and the plagues of the three Inductees from North Dakota are being sent to the NDHSAA, Motion by Norland to house these plaques in the hall of fame in the Jamestown Civic Center. Second by Jensen and carried. The Board indicated the need for a stipulation these are on loan to the Civic Center to allow the NDHSAA to retain ownership.

The Executive Secretary was directed to pursue the nomination of Serge Gambucci for the National Federation Hall of Fame.

The Board was informed the television bids are up this year and new contracts will be solicited for the March 15 Board of Directors meeting.

A letter from Dickinson indicating their intention to start high school competition in hockey for the 1996-97 school year was read. The Board discussed the possibility of moving a hockey school from the west region to the east region to even team numbers. Motion by Norland to table any decision on this. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Board reviewed the Soccer Advisory Committee recommendations. No action was taken,

The Executive Secretary shared a fetter received from Killdeer indicating a concern for the amount of per diem allowance for their team involved in post-season play in football. Ness indicated the Board study the possible consideration to raise the mileage to help schools traveling from the western part of the state to the Dome for football playoffs.

The District 16 calendar proposal on length of seasons was discussed. Sytling will respond to the study at the March meeting.

The board held audience with Dr. David Haney, superintendent of Jamestown Public Schools, Ron-Smedshammer, athletic director of Jamestown Public Schools and Randy Coleman, athletic director of Devils Lake Public Schools. Prior to their address to the Board, the Executive Secretary reviewed the concerns with the uneven numbers in the assignment of Class A regional schools and the problems with the football, basketball and hockey alignments. Mr. Smedshammer shared a letter listing their concerns over the possible realignment and their wishes to be reassigned to the east for nockey competition. Their indication was they would continue to compete in hockey in the west if they were not moved from the east in any other athletic program.

Randy Colemen spoke next representing Devils Lake's concerns with regional assignments. They indicated their hockey program would be willing to play in the east region. All other activities should not be acted upon because eventually the regions will balance themselves as several schools in the west will be added to Class A because of enrollment. With Devils Lake possibly being reassigned to the east region in hockey, Coleman indicated the need for a mandated 14 game schedule with North Dakota schools to ensure each member of the east region scheduling games with each other rather than some scheduling with Minnesota schools leaving other North Dakota schools with a short schedule.

Motion by Leidal to move Jamestown to the east region for hockey for the 1996-97 school year. Along with this move, a notification will be made to the hockey schools of a strong expectation to fairness to all regional programs in scheduling or a mandated schedule from the Board will follow. Second by Norland and carried.

The recommendations from the North Dakota Athletic Directors was reviewed. Motion by Sanstead to authorize a jamboree setting for boy's soccer similar to the hockey rules/jamboree. Second by Leidal and carried.

Ness shared some concerns that have been voiced to him as a result of the out-of-season coaching rule. An Interpretation as to who may coach under this rule was discussed. Executive Secretary Informed the Board of a request from Hope/Page to be moved from Region 2 to Region 4 for track and field. Motion by Leidal to allow the change. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Board read a letter from Craig Perry, Grand Forks Public Schools athletic director concerning out-ofseason coaching questions. The Executive Secretary was directed to respond to the letter answering the questions listed.

The Board read a letter from the west region hockey coaches expressing gratitude over the hospitality at the region tournament.

A request from the Bismarck Public Schools to allow Bismarck High School and Bismarck Century to form a cooperative sponsorship for boys swimming was reviewed. Motion by Leidal to deny the request. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Gegelman reported on a hardship investigation of Jessica Poltra who transferred from Grand Forks to Dunseith. Motion by Gegelman to approve eligibility under the hardship rule pending reinstatement of scholastic eligibility. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reviewed recommendations from the NDOA. Motion by Sylling to allow a first year official who falls to fulfill all officiating meeting and testing requirements to be placed on probation for one year rather than being declared ineligible. Second by Gegelman and carried.

MINUTES Class B District Chairmen's Meeting 10:00 A.M. - March 15, 1996 Radisson Inn, Bismarck, ND

The Class B District Chairmen met at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, March 15, 1996, at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. Chairman Gegelman called the meeting to order and indicated the reports will begin with District 1. The following reports were given:

Dist. 1 - Supt. Dale Fuhrman of Milnor:

- Their district favors keeping the three class football plan. If four classes are formed, four sets of problems rather than three will exist. Suggested was setting the Class B 9-man first rather than the other way.
- 2. Oppose the use of a shot clock. When asked if any districts were in favor of the shot clock, no districts indicated such.
- Recommend the designation of two Friday nights in the fall for girls' basketball rather than football.
 Suggested was the association set these dates rather than separate conferences.
- 4. Recommend the enforcement of the tucked in jersey rule.
- 5. Quit talking about creating volleyball districts the same as basketball and do it.

Dist. 2 - Darwin Gorder of Fargo Oak Grove:

- 1. Adopt the coaches box. A straw vote Indicated 3 districts in favor and 13 districts opposed.
- Allow for a preseason jamboree. The Executive Secretary Indicated this would take an amendment to the Constitution and ByLaws.
- 3. Rotate Region 1 basketball tournaments between Fargo and Wahpeton. Questions arose concerning the seating capacity in the Civic Center.

Dist. 3 - Jerry Bartholomay, Hillisboro:

- 1. Keep volleyball in the winter.
- 2. Adopt the coaches box.
- Expressed a concern of officials cancelling out of contracts. Staff member Carlsrud requested these situations be reported to allow the association to check into this and do a follow-up.
- 4. Favor rotation of Region 2 basketball tournaments between Grafton and Mayville. Following the regional tournament, some discussion indicated the possibility of Grand Forks as a regional site.
- Dist. 4 Claude Sheldon, Park River indicated no further recommendations.

Dist. 5 - Brad Fitzgerald, St. John:

- Recommend keeping the Region 3 tournament within the confines of Region 3 boundaries for both boys and girls. The regional tournament in Devils Lake was not very well attended. No specific site was indicated.
- 2. Recommended next year's boys' tournament in Langdon and girls' in Rugby or Bottineau.
- 3. Recommend girls' basketball and football cannot start until after Labor Day. Gegelman informed the

group of the possible proposal of amending the Constitution and ByLaws to remove the mandatory dates for the ending date of football and boys' basketball to allow for more flexibility in scheduling all seasons.

Dist. 6 - George Dendinger, Rugby:

- 1. Concern over the length of seasons and early starting dates.
- 2. Also indicated concern for the seating capacity of some of the Region 3 basketball tournament sites.

Dist. 7 - Myron Jury, Minnewaukan:

- 1. Asked about the timing and selection of region and state tournament referees. Indicated a preference to conduct the selection process the first part of January.
- 2. There is a need for addressing rough play, especially in tournaments. Referees call games closer during the season and let almost anything go during tournaments.
- 3. Leave Region 4 site at Devils Lake.

Dist. 8 - Rodney Scherbenske, Goodrich:

- 1. Recommend continuing to use the ratio in determining football coop's enrollments.
- 2. Recommend treating volleyball as a separate sport in determining district lines, etc.
- 3. If a district site is also the regional site, the district not played in that site should be allowed to practice in this facility.

Dist. 9 - Robert Kummeth, LaMoure:

- 1. Recommend both Region 5 basketball tournaments be held at the Jamestown Civic Center. It is the feeling the present practice is not fair to the girls.
- Non administrative advisory committee recommendations that are approved should be communicated with the superintendents prior to NDHSAA Board approval.

Dist. 10 - Leon Ableidinger, Steele-Dawson;

- Request from District 10 to rotate the Boys' Region 5 tournament between Bismarck/Mandan and Jamestown. There needs to be some type of rotation with Region 6.
- 2. District is in favor of enforcement of the bench decorum rule for coaches.
- 3. There is a concern for crowd control. Other districts were asked what they are doing for this situation. Discussion included the new policy of the Bismarck Public Schools concerning crowd control. Each athlette Director from the community from which the unruly fan is from may talk to them prior to calling the law enforcement.

Dist. 11 - Sam Tollefson, Carson:

- 1. Recommend the continuation of rotation of Region 6 basketball tournament between Mandan and Dickinson
- 2. Recommend teams be allowed to practice at the district and regional basketball tournament sites.
- 3. Indicated their district's opposition to the shot clock.
- 4. Keep the Spalding basketball as the official ball. The district chairmen were informed that this was the first of a three-year bid.
- 5. Should any players be declared ineligible within a district, the activities association should contact the District Chairman of that district regarding the ineligible player. Mentioned was the districts have local control over their operation.

Further discussion took place concerning practice at district sites. A straw vote of 5-11 indicated the present rule is preferred.

The Executive Secretary was asked to explain guardianship versus custody in relation to transfer of eligibility.

Dist. #12 - Duane Martin, Regent Indicated no further recommendations.

Dist. #13 - Robert Tollefson, Washburn:

- 1. Volleyball coaches want regional concept and administrators want the district/regional concept.
- The district discussed having officials in the regional tournament that are from participating schools which causes a problem for the tournament manager concerning assignments.
- 3. The subject of football produces various opinions from the schools throughout their district. Requested was not to eliminate the 9th regular season game in future considerations for the football plan.

Dist. 14. - Norm Batterberry, North Shore:

- Recommend Region 7 girls' basketball tournament be held in Washburn. There is a basic problem in the time zone differences. Washburn is closer to schools in the region.
- 2. Recommend Region 7 Boys' basketball tournament be held in Minot.

Dist. 15 - Clyde Huber, Berthold:

1. Expressed concern about the early start for practice for both girls' basketball and football.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors April 18, 1996 - Valley City, N.D.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in the Association office at 9:30 a.m. on April 18, 1996 with all members present except Auer who joined the meeting later as noted. President Bommersbach called the meeting to order.

Motion by Hansen to approve the minutes of the March 8 and March 15 meetings. Second by Gegelman and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the Fund Balance report, the Investment report and the budget through April 15, 1996.

Ness requested to continue the study of a template or other computer means for member schools for the purpose of registering for various activities, reports, etc.

The Board's attention was called to an expense comparison chart on the various tournaments held during the 1995-96 year. Also studied was a state basketball comparison chart with the 1988 year through the 1996 year.

The finalized winter financial reports on boys' basketball were reviewed.

A discussion took place on the procedure to be used for the site selection item on the agenda. Information on the various invitations had been supplied for review prior to the time of site selection for various tournaments.

Sanstead reported on the following on behalf of the Promotions Committee:

The Distinguished Service Award nominees will be reviewed and afinal report and recommendation will be made at the June meeting.

The staff was directed to check into styles and colors for new NDHSAA blazers.

Norland reported on the following on behalf of the Football Committee:

A survey will go out to schools with 2 plans listed. A request will be included for suggestions for any other possible plan. Finalization of the study is planned for the June meeting.

Semifinals are planned for the Dome. If two teams that are to compete are both from the western part of the state and both teams consent to play at a site in the west, they will be allowed to do so.

No quarter-finals will be held in the Dome.

The dates of the Class A semi-final is Friday, November 8th and the Class B semi-finals are set for Monday, November 11th. All three finals will be played in the Dome on Saturday, November 16th. The order of play will be studied by the committee at the June meeting.

A letter was read from Dr. Sherryl Houdek, Superintendent of Shanley High School indicating they wish to continue to compete with their natural rivals and would continue to be in the Class A ranks.

Gegelman reported on behalf of the Officials Committee:

Several NDOA requests were reviewed. The committee recommended accepting:

- 1. Raise sub-varsity football and hockey fee from \$20 to \$25.
- 2. Beginning with 1996-97, begin a 3-year rotation for gymnastics events at the state meet.
- 3. In a meet where there are 6 teams or more, a separate official will be designated as the Meet Referee.

A letter from District 16 concerning officiating was discussed by the committee. The Officials Committee recommended a resolution be formed by the office staff to go out to each school and each official on what will be done to address rough play in girls' and boys' basketball. This resolution is to be presented for review at the June meeting.

Motion by Gegelman to accept recommendation number 1 above. Second by Sylling and carried.

Motion by Ness to accept recommendations 2 and 3 from above. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Auer joined the Board meeting.

Motion by Sylling and second by Sanstead to accept the formation of the Officials Committee's recommendation to draw up a resolution to address officiating. Motion carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of plans to conduct regional meetings at 8 to 10 sites inviting administrators that handle the enforcement of the Constitution and ByLaws. Also planned is the hosting of sportsmanship meetings to be held in conjunction with these meetings inviting several students and key people including school board members. This program would give schools strategy they could take back to their school to implement a sportsmanship program. Motion by Jensento proceed with the plans. NDHSAA Board members are encouraged to be in attendance at one of these regional meetings. Second by Hansen and carried.

A letter of apology from the Butte Public School District concerning an unsportsmanlike incident was read,

A letter was read from the Mayville-Portand-Clifford-Galesburg school district concerning the housing of the state basketball tournament teams and seating for these players at the tournament site when they are not involved in play. Also mentioned was unauthorized microphones in the huddles. Discussion followed concerning the interviewing process that takes place immediately following a tournament game. The Executive Secretary was directed to study the television contract to see how it addressed the interview policy as well as sound in the time-out huddles.

Auer reported on the on-going study of the sports physical policy. The recommended form from the North Dakota Medical Association was other than the type of screening that is expected by the NDHSAA. The question is whether this is a sports participation screening rather than a total physical exam. The inconsistencies in what entailed the physical examination was making a wide variance of costs to parents. Suggested by Auer was a letter and a draft of the physical form recommended by the NDHSAA be sent to the NDMA for their review.

The Board held audience with Jim Gentile, Athletic Director; Robert Toso, Principal; Mr. & Mrs. Mel Stoltz, parents; and Lisa Brown, gymnastics coach from Valley City Public Schools. The issue at hand is a young boy, Tyler Stoltz who wishes to compete on the girls' gymnastics team. This youth has been involved in girls' gymnastics club competition since an early age. Discussed was the possibility of the Valley City Public Schools propose a by-law change to the membership to make an exception for boys competing on a girls team for gymnastics.

The Board reviewed the correspondence received in response to the crowded conditions at the Class B Region 2 boys' basketball tournament. This will be taken into consideration at site selection time.

Ness gave a report on the Constitution and ByLaws Committee. Discussed was the interpretation of what is a basketball fournament. Recommended was an interpretation stating a tournament shall be no more than 3 games played by any one team. A study will be made following the 16-team exception made for experimental purposes. Nominations were opened for a vice-chair. Gegelman/Sanstead nominated Leidal. Motion by Ness to close nominations. Second by Sylling and carried.

It was brought to the attention of the Board the need to designate a voting delegate for the summer convention. Motion by Sanstead to designate the Executive Secretary to serve as the North Dakota delegate to the National Federation meeting at the summer convention. Second by Hansen and carried.

The Board reviewed the agenda and registration materials of the National Federation meeting.

The Board held audience with Merril Krueger of Wolford, Sharon Humble, School Board member of Wolford and Jim Isaak, superintendent of Leeds. Their purpose was to request the Board to consider some type of transitional year for their boys' basketball program to allow them to form a cooperative sponsorship program for a non-varsity team with Rolette while allowing Wolford to complete the remaining one year of their three year agreement with Leeds for their cooperative sponsorship. This would allow the one senior to finish his high school career with the Leeds/Wolford coop while allowing the remainder of the Wolford students to start a coop with Rolette. This would, in their opinion, increase participation. Motion by Hansen to deny the request. Second by Norland and carried.

Requests for adjustments to game limitation have also been brought in for baseball. Because of the flexibility baseball teams already have, no action was taken.

The Executive Secretary Indicated the hockey jamboree has been successful and there is a yearly request to allow for continuation. Motion by Jensen to approve. Second by Leidal and carried.

The Board discussed school's concerns about room rates being too high for teams attending the state basketball tournament. One of the reasons is the hotel cannot give favorable rates if all 8 teams stay at the same hotel. The Board was asked if they wished to reconsider the policy to have all teams stay at the same facility. The policy of all teams at the same motel came from a recommendation from the North Dakota Coaches Association. No action was taken. The NDHSCA will be contacted for input.

Plans were made for the upcoming June annual meeting which will include a meeting of the trophy committee with those companies that are bidding costs and styles for trophies, plaques and other awards.

The letters of response from Powers Lake concerning the conduct of the boys' basketball coach were read. Gegelman indicated the NDOA Board of Directors had requested information as to what had transpired following the NDHSAA letter of reprimand to Powers Lake School District. The Executive Secretary will write a letter to the NDOA Board.

The Board heard a request for a cooperative sponsorship for boys' and girls' golf from Hazelton to Linton. Motion by Gegelman to approve the request. Second by Jensen and carried.

The Executive Secretary gave the Board an update on the process of determining the final six distinguished student applications for the interview that has been scheduled for May 10th.

Norland shared with the Board the scheduling problems that have happened in hockey with some schools refusing to help all schools in their region to fill. This is something that had earlier been indicated by the Board that if they did not accommodate their own regional schools through scheduling they would receive assistance in this issue. This will be addressed at the Athletic Review meeting when they review the hockey advisory committee's recommendations.

A lengthy discussion took place concerning the enforcement of the bench decorum rule. The Board determined the responsibility of this enforcement is with all involved in basketball.

2. Recommend a minimum number of 8 regular season varsity high school games an official must work if he or she is working at the district and/or the regional level (as amended).

(Gegelman/Ness)

The office will study the possibility of reassigning regional officials in the event of a conflict.

The Golf Advisory Recommendations were reviewed with the following approved: Class A Boys':

2. Beginning count with the 1996-97 year, a judge may officiate the same event at regional and state competition 3 years consecutively. After the 3 years, the judge must officiate a different event or sit out of regional and state for 1 year.

- 2. Selection of regional and state tournament officials be done by ballot sent to all head coaches.
- 3. The times of games in regional play shall be adjusted to prevent the team playing last on Friday night from playing first on Saturday. (Norland/Hansen)

The Boys' and Girls' Socoer Advisory Recommendations were reviewed with the following approved:

- 1. (as amended) Allow 18 games and no invitational tournament or 16 games and one invitational tournament.
- 2. Eliminate overtime play in regular season play.
- 3. Moving the state tournament one week later because of the uncertainty of our spring weather.

These changes will be for the 1996-97 year for girls' soccer and 1997-98 for boys' soccer.

The Volleyball Advisory Recommendations were reviewed with the following approved:

- 1. The state tournament shall be a 3-day event. This will be for the 1996-97 year,
- 2. Set allowable match limitation to be in line with the current 16 matches/2 tournaments. Needed changes: 14 matches/3 tournaments
 - 12 matches/4 tournaments

This will be for the 1997-98 season.

(Gegelman/Hansen)

3. Change the current Class B tie-breaking criteria for regional seeding:

Step#2 - With a 3-way tie, use the procedure to determine top team.

Remaining teams are seeded using head-to-head competition.

Step #3 - Replace total points with % of points

(Ness/Gegelman)

The Wrestling Advisory Committee recommendations were approved as follows:

1. Set weigh-ins for state tournament for Thursday night for Class B.

(Norland/Gegelman)

2. Allow for experimental purposes during regular season invitationals a 215 lb. class. The NDHSAA must be contacted for permission to use this weight class at each invitational tournament. This is on a one year trial basis.

(Norland/Ness)

The Music Advisory Recommendations were reviewed with the following approved:

- 1. Change rule Ton page 15 to read, "Taped accompaniment will be allowed for a solo or ensemble in an emergency if a school receives permission from the NDHSAA. The recording must be of the school's piano accompanist,
- 2. Raise state judge fee from \$100.00 to \$125.00.
- 3. A student may be entered only once per category, but a student may enter both the vocal and instrumental divisions. The categories for both areas shall be defined as (1) solo, (2) ensemble 2-5, (3) ensemble 6-12, (4) mixed ensemble 2-5, (5) mixed ensemble 6-12, (6) miscellaneous mixed musical 2-5 and (7) miscellaneous mixed musical 6-12,
- 4. Strings division shall be changed to 2-3, 4-5 and 6-12. A student shall be limited to entering only once per category in a solo, like ensemble and mixed ensemble as defined in #4.
- 5. Regional managers will be instructed that one judge must adjudicate a category in its entirety
- or if the entries in a category constitutes more than a full day's schedule for one judge, the category shall be divided equally between two judges.
- 6. The following definition shall be written on each solo/ensemble judge ballot within the QUALITY OF SELECTION criterion: "Selections must be from the NDHSAA Recommended Music List or be comparable to the list. No pop or jazz music is on the list."
- 7. Regional managers will be asked to attend a meeting of all managers to discuss new technology for scheduling, prescribed methods of scheduling and as a forum for a general exchange of management

(Hansen/Sanstead)

The Board reviewed the Speech Advisory recommendations with the following accepted: 1. STUDENT CONGRESS

A. Invitationals only - students hand ballot to judge with pertinent information completed.

B. Speaker points converted for team points using 10 point system (10-8-6-4-2) for senate, 9 (9-7-5-3-1) point system for all House I's and 8 (8-6-4-2-1) point system for House II's.

2. DEBATE

- A. Have 2 debate judge certification clinics. Certification is optional, but 25% fee reduction for non-certified judges at invitationals and state. NDHSAA may "grandfather" experienced state judges.
 - B. Speaker awards will not count towards sweepstakes points.

 C. Continue LCID debate on trial basis for another year. No sweepstakes points given in this category.

D. Clarify penalties for the following violations: (1) A student's unfair interpretation - penalty is a judge voting issue, (2) Discourtesy towards opponent - penalty is verbal warning for the first offense and loss of points for second and subsequent offenses. (3) Falsification of evidence - automatic loss of round.

3. ONE-ACT PLAYS

Class A: Run same individual events on a third year trial.

4. SPEECH

A. Video and audio cassettes not allowed as burden of proof for a legitimate play script in any dramatic category.

B. State rankings shall be 1 through 5, but each judge will give a sub-rating of (6), (7) and (8) to be used only as a tiebreaker.

C. Disqualification rule for invitational and regional/state forensic & play contests. "A student shall be disqualified from an invitational or regional/state contest for unsportsmanlike conduct which may be of the following:

(1) using profanity in discussion with a coach, manager, judge or contestant, (2) insubordinate or unethical conduct such as, but not limited to, distracting a contestant and (3) damaging or theft of property."

The final determination for disqualification shall be made by the tournament manager after consultation with the parties involved. Penalty: A disqualified student shall not participate the remainder of that contest and the next contest in that same activity and level of competition which his/her school participates. The student also shall not participate in any other level of speech competition in the interim.

F. Change Rule 15, second sentence on page 9 to read. Class B REGION NOTE: # 8 or less contestants are entered in any category, all participants will participate in 3 rounds, 1 judge per round.

G. Use of computers or data base will not be allowed in Extemporaneous Speaking anytime during a speech tournament.

H. A participant in Extemporaneous Interpretation must use the book while performing unless visually impaired. The visually impaired student may use an enlarged copy of the selection.

I. RULE 2, PAGE 10 - State participants in prelims and finals shall be ranked 1 through 5, but for tle-breaking purposes only, an additional ranking shall be placed in parenthesis beside the contestant sub-ranked 6, 7 and 8.

K. Speech judge certification will be offered as part of the NDHSAA rules clinics. An open book test will be part of certification. Certification will be optional, but those not certified will receive 25% less in fees.

L. 1996-97 Extemporaneous Interpretation book shall be <u>75 Short Masterpieces</u> - <u>Short Stories</u> from the World's Literature.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Fund Accounting

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the use of resources available to the Association, the accounts of the Association are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purpose. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund; however, in the accompanying financial statements, funds that have similar characteristics have been combined into fund groups. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group.

The assets, liabilities, and fund balances of the association are reported in a self-balancing fund groups as follows:

- Operating funds, which include unrestricted and restricted resources, represent the portion of expendable funds that is available for support of the Associations operations.
- 2. Plant funds represent resources restricted for plant acquisitions and funds expended for plant.

B. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the cash basis of accounting, Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

c. Operation

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for local school district. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

D. Income taxes

The Association is exempt from payment of Federal income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

E. Plant Assets and Depreciation

Uses of operating funds for plant acquisitions and principal debt service payments are accounted for as transfers to plant funds. Proceeds from the sale of plant assets, if unrestricted, are transferred to operating fund balances, or, if restricted, to deferred amounts restricted for plant acquisitions. No depreciation has been provided.

2. INVESTMENTS

Investments are presented in the financial statements in the aggregate at the lower of cost (amortized, in the case of bonds) or fair market value.
