The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 73rd annual **Yearbook** which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

- 1. 1996-97 marked the 89th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Our
 membership decreased from 199 to 197 high schools. Because of the decreasing
 number of schools and the large number of co-ops, one may see some drastic changes
 in the basic format of the NDHSAA in future years.
- 1996-97 will be the third year the NDHSAA will deficit spend approximately \$80,000.00. The deficit has occurred mainly because of increased payments made to schools.
- The fall of 1996 was the fourth time that all three championship football games were played in the FARGODOME, which was a very successful venture.
- This fall we will have 4 divisions in football and all semi final and final games will be played in the FARGODOME.
- The Class B Boys' Basketball Tournament was played in the FARGODOME for the first time and proved to be very successful.
- 6. The Board of Directors approved a Class B re-districting that will go into effect in 1998-99.
- The NDHSAA Board will continue to provide catastrophic insurance for all member schools at no cost in 1997-98.

I would like to express a very sincere thank you to all administrators, coaches, athletic directors and officiats for your support and cooperation in my ninth year as your Executive Secretary. Our staff will continue to make every effort to provide your school the best possible service in 1907-08

The Executive Secretary reviewed the Fund Balance report, End of Year Investment report, the End of the Year Interest report and comparative reports from 1990-91 to the present. Motion by Gegelman to approve, second by Sylling and carried.

The final 1995-96 budget was reviewed followed by a review of the projected 1996-97 budget of \$1,088,900 as amended by the Finance Committee. Noted deficit spending and that interim fund should not be spent below \$800,000. Motion by Sanstead to approve, second by Gegelman and carried.

Ness reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee concerning the following subjects: (1) Two amendments proposing the removal of mandated dates for the end of football and basketball seasons will be placed by the Board on the October Annual Meeting agenda. (2) The committee needs to study Board interpretations of the hardship rule. (3) Concerning the "Player/Coach Ejection Rule," the words "next scheduled, re-scheduled or contracted date" should appear on page 18 of the Constitution and ByLaws under Section XIII. (4) Lowell Jensen will work with the ByLaws Committee to help write a policy on procedures for handling hearings. (5) Review eligibility of middle schools (consider 6th graders as part of middle school.) (6) Recommended a proposal to change the requirements of the physical examination procedure. Motion by Gegelman to propose an amendment to the ByLaws changing the Physical Examination form an annual to a biannual requirement. Ness moved approval, second by Jensen and carried.

Motion by Jensen to advertise for football television bid with a \$5000 minimum cash bid. Second by Toso and carried.

Denied request from Mandaree to participate in a four-game tournament (Second Annual All-Nations Girls' Basketball Classic at Bismarck with ten teams) as it exceeds 3-game limit. Motion by Gegelman, second by Norland and carried.

Allow Belfield to use irregular placed goalposts for 1996 season if team playing gives mutual consent.

Motion by Gegelman to deny a hardship request from Richardton-Taylor for the immediate eligibility of Jerry and Jonathan Sigl. Second by Jensen and carried.

Ness reported on a hardship investigation concerning Seth Geirsdorf who transferred from Beulah to Florida as a freshman and is returning to Beulah as a sophomore. Recommendation for this request was to deny. Motion by Leidal to deny. Second by Norland and carried.

The executive Secretary reported on a hardship request for Ryan LaFontaine who transferred from Bagley, Minnesota to Midway;. The report was concluded with a recommendation to grant immediate eligibility. Motion by Gegelman to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried,

The Board was informed of an appeal from Mandaree concerning the denial to allow teams to play more than three games in their up-coming All Nations Basketball Tournament. The original sanction was approved prior to the policy limiting teams in invitational tournaments to a three-game maximum. Motion by Norland to allow their request on a one-year only basis. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Bismarck at the Radisson Inn at 1:00 P.M. on September 17, 1996. President Ness called the meeting to order with all members present except Auer, Sanstead and Jensen.

Motion by Leidal to approve the minutes of the August 8, 1996 regular meeting and August 29, 1996 special meeting. Second by Gegelman and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial reports as of September 13, 1996. Motion by Sylling to approve the report. Second by Norland and carried.

Staff member Solberg presented a report on the cheerleader one-day clinics conducted in August, 1996 along with bids received for the 1997 series. Motion by Gegelman to accept the bid of \$1500 from Universal Cheerleader Association for the 1997 cheerleader clinics. Second by Toso and carried.

Motion by Gegelman to increase the individual registration fee for the 1997 cheerleader clinics from \$1.00 per cheerleader to \$2.00 per cheerleader with a charge of \$3.00 @ the door. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

President Ness appointed Sylling to chair the girls' district chairmen's meeting and himself as chair of the boys' district chairmen's meeting.

Supt. Robert Scrivner of Hankinson appeared before the Board to discuss (a) the present football plan and a possible reconsideration of that plan, (b) propose returning to a 3 division football plan with minor changes and (c) the relationship of the Board with the member schools. The Board studied the presented proposal for a 3-division plan including play-offs. Mr. Scrivner also expressed concern over communication from the Board to member schools. An extensive discussion and question and answer period followed. Clarification was made that the results of the football study had been published in the association Bulletin.

Norland reported on behalf of the Football Committee with a motion to accept a master plan for scheduling in the Class A division with the first two dates open for scheduling purposes. Second by Gegelman. Motion by Sanstead to table this motion until the Board discusses the reconsideration of the original football plan. Second by Leidal and carried.

The Football plan discussion continued. President Ness entertained a motion to reconsider the Board's vote on the 4-class plan as approved at the September meeting. Upon hearing no motion, no action was taken.

The motion to consider the master schedule for Class A was brought back to the table. Motion carried.

Supt. Jerome Enget of Hazen and Athletic Director Joel Wood appeared before the Board with a request to study the Constitution and ByLaws rule addressing classification of schools by enrollment. Hazen will be above the 325 cut-off for two consecutive years. The third year, which is the year they would be mandated to be Class A, their projected enrollment will drop below 325. The Board was asked for a clarification concerning the status of that third year. The NDHSAAAttorney's interpretation will be sought and the Constitution and ByLaws Committee will study this situation to report at the next meeting.

Wood also requested the board consider studying the out-of-season coaching rule to allow coaches to coach sports other than the program they are involved in during the school year. Chairman Ness asked

Mr. Wood to write a proposal and present it to the Constitution and ByLaws Committee for their next scheduled committee meeting.

The meeting was adjourned to allow the Football Committee to meet.

Norland reported on behalf of the Football Committee with these recommendations: Reassign Cavalier to Class AA, Region 1; leave Harvey in Class AA and m ove Kindred to Class A 11-man, Region 1 replacing Carrington who will be moved to Region 2. Motion by Norland to accept this recommendation. Second by Sylling and carried.

President Ness appointed a nominating committee for the upcoming Class B Southwest Board position: David Rust of Tioga as Chairman, Kirk Hansen of Ellendale and Dave Schnelder of Edmore.

Trophy presentation assignments for the 1996 fall regional and state tournaments were made.

Motion by Auer to present the physical examination form for the January general assembly. Second by Gegelman and carried.

b. A request was received from Hazen to co-sponser an amendment to the Constitution and ByLaws that will allow the Board to grant a one-year grace period for schools who would be moved into the Class A ranks because of a 2-year enrollment of 325 or more. The third year, the year they would move into Class A, the projected enrollment could possibly be back under 325.

Motion by Gegelman to have Attorney Thune help with the wording for the amendment and have the NDHSAA Board and Hazen co-sponsor this amendment to be presented for vote at the January general assembly meeting. Second by Jensen and carried.

N. DAK HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

c. The out-of-season coaching rule was discussed. The committee indicated this would be addressed at 2:30 during audience with the Junior Olympic volleyball group.

- d. The situation of 6th graders' eligibility if part of a middle school was discussed. A consensus of the general assembly will be sought to determine if there is a need for the committee to further study the issue.
- e. The renewal process for cooperative sponsorship programs was discussed. A deadline for return of the renewal form has been suggested with a \$500 late fee as described on the renewal

Motion by Gegelman to accept this policy addition with a deadline for renewal set as August 1 for fall sports, October 15 for winter sports and January 15 for spring sports. Failure to meet these prescribed deadlines will result in a \$500 late fee assessed to the coop. Second by Boschee and carried.

f. The question of allowing competition in post-season activities by a junior high school team was discussed. A clarification was recommended to limit post-season competition to member high

Motion by Leidal to make this recommended clarification and inform schools of this policy. Second by Toso and carried.

g. The form used for application of open enrollment was discussed. Many felt the statement on page 2 of the form concerning transfer of eligibility was not clear and students may not understand that a move to another school through open enrollment may cause loss of eligibility for a period of 90 school days.

The staff was directed to work on the change of the present statement to clarify the transfer rule. Sanstead indicated he would work with the NDHSAA in rewording that portion of the form.

The Board held audience with Ed Lockwood, Fargo South activities director; Paul Johnson, Fargodome manager; and Curt Jones, West Fargo athletic director. The plan for activities in the Fargodome during the 1997 State Class B Boys' Basketball tournament was explained. Questions were raised concerning insurance coverage with these additional activities. Also questions concerning possible day care, traffic flow and admission procedures were raised. Motion by Hielmstad to approve the plan. Second by Auer and carried.

Curt Jones presented the initial pamphlet describing the hoop shoot that is planned in March during the Class B state basketball tournament.

Mr. Lockwood and Mr. Jones addressed the calendar for the 1997-98 school year on behalf of the East Class A athletic directors. Requested were these changes in the proposed calendar developed by the calendar committee:

- a, Move the first allowable date of boys' soccer practice from August 14 to August 11 and continue to require 9 days of practice but delete the team requirement of 2 weeks of practice.
- b. Require one week of practice with a minimum requirement of 5 practices for boys' tennis.
- c. Waive the 14 day requirement for boys' swimming.
- d. Move the girls' tennis season to one week later ending the same weekend as state track.

Another calendar-related item was brought to the table. The music educators group wrote a letter of concern to the NDHSAA relating to the possible conflict with their all-state music festival due to the proposed change in the end of boys' basketball season.

Carolyn Foster, Grand Forks Red River volleyball coach appeared before the Board requesting an extension of the present one-year exemption from the out-of-season coaching rule for Junior Olympic volleyball. Suggested by Foster was to add volleyball to the current list of exempt programs. Another suggestion was to allow assistant coaches to be involved in the Junior Olympic volleyball programs. Motion by Leidal to give volleyball one additional year of exemption to allow study as to what other states are doing with the out-ofseason coaching rule. Second by Toso. A roll call vote was requested:

Motion carried, 8-3.

Gegelman proposed an addition to the out-of-season coaching rule to read "In that sport" with a motion to approve. Second by Auer and carried.

Motion by Ness to drop the 14 day requirement for team practice for all sports except football and boys' basketball. The practice requirement for boys' basketball and football will require an amendment to the Constitution. Second by Sylling and carried. The Board indicated they will continue to set the first allowable date of practice and the first allowable date for a contest in each activity.

The Board reviewed the proposed changes as recommended by the Calendar Committee. Motion by Hjelmstad to accept the calendar as amended by the board. Second by Norland and carried.

The bids were opened for the association automobiles. Motion by Gegelman to accept the bid of \$15,500 from Vince Olson for the Chrysler Concorde and the bid of \$20,888 from Jeff Milender for the Dodge Caravan. Second by Auer and carried.

The Executive Secretary indicated the nominating committee had reported they will be nominating Clarke Ranum, Scranton and Bob Tollefson, Washburn for the upcoming Class B Southwest opening on the Board of Directors.

Staff member Solberg reported on a hardship eligibility request from Shiloh Christian for Lisa Sund who transferred from Bismarck Century. Motion by Hjelmstad to approve the request. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported the administrator regional meetings and Solberg reported on the regional sportsmanship meetings which were held in September and October.

The Executive Secretary reported on a hardship eligibility investigation concerning Ben Jones who transferred from Minot to Glenburn. The report was concluded with a recommendation for eligibility. Motion by Boschee to grant immediate eligibility. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The agenda for the general assembly meeting was reviewed. Lowell Jensen was appointed as parliamentarian for the meeting.

The Board read a letter of request from Devils Lake petitioning for exemption of the in-season rule for two girls' hockey players, Matty Brekken of Devils Lake and Mikaela Tofte of Williston. Motion by Leidal to approve based on the Olympic ramification exception. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Board read a communiqué from Rugby requesting their football be moved to the east region replacing Belcourt who would be moved to the west region. Rationale for the request was the extensive travel required by the present assignments. Leidal reminded the Board of the motion in the September special meeting that finalized the football assignments with no further changes. Chairman Ness entertained a motion to reconsider. With no motion, no action was taken.

The Board read two communiqué, one from the superintendent and one from the principal of Lisbon concerning the football plan. No action was taken.

Selected as the Principals Association nominees for the upcoming vacancy on the Board of directors are Loren Scheer, Cavalier and Alton Nygaard, Des Lacs-Burlington. These names will be reported to the general assembly.

The formula that will be used for the skin fold test for wrestling was presented to the board for clarification purposes.

With no further business, President Ness declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES Class B District Chairmen's Meeting 10:00 A.M. - November 22, 1996 Radisson Inn. Bismarck, ND

The Class B District Chairmen met at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, November 22, 1996, at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. Chairman Sylling called the meeting to order and introduced the NDHSAA staff and members of the Board of Directors in attendance. The district chairmen introduced themselves and what district they were representing.

Chairman Sylling indicated the main concerns as reflected by the agenda were (1) the calendar and length of each season and (2) the selection of regional and state basketball officials. The Chairman called for those districts indicating concerns on the agenda, Dist. 16, 8, 5, 2 and 1 beginning with a report from District 16.

District 16: Supt. David Rust spoke on their recommendation to continue work on the equity in the length of sports seasons.

District. 8: Supt. Dennis Adair of Pingree-Buchanan did not add to district 16's recommendation other than look into the length of season with concern for overlap of girls' basketball and volleybail as well as early starting dates for fall activities.

District 5: Supt. Wayne Lingen of Bisbee-Egeland also expressed concern of the early starting date of fall activities with some of their schools starting after Labor Day.

District 5 also indicated their wish for Langdon to be included in the rotation of sites.

District 3 chairman Jankowski indicated the shortness of girls' basketball season and the length of boys' basketball was a concern. Their district felt the equity issue remains a concern.

District 2: Prin. Greg Jenkins of Oriska indicated their district would prefer the regional tournament first round be played on a Saturday afternoon and Saturday evening without a concern for conflict with football play-offs. The teams that finish their district play on Tuesday of the week of regionals would rather wait until Saturday to start regional play.

District 1: Supt. Art. Conklin of Oakes shared their district's recommendation to set aside two Fridays during the fall season for girls' basketball.

District 12 chairman, Supt. Russ Fletschock of Bowman asked if South Dakota and Montana are considering a switch of girls' basketball'and volleyball seasons.

The Executive Secretary reported on what is current on this issue in those two states.

District 16 chairman, Supt. David Rust of Tioga indicated their community has expressed concerns for the early start in the fall.

District 4 chairman, Prin. Dave Hanson of St. Thomas indicated concern for facility problems if the switch of seasons took place.

District 14 chairman, Gerald Christianson of Parshall indicated problems with the extensive traveling season for 5th and 6th grade basketball and competition for gym time with the volleyball program.

District 16 chairman Rust asked why there are two extra games in the football season. The Board may want to adjust the length of the football season.

Chairman Sylling states the other common concern indicated by the agenda was the selection process for regional and state basketball officials. The Districts indicating this concern (15,6,5&3) were called upon.

District 15 chairman, Supt. Joe Lukach of Des Lacs-Burlington recommended two officials from each district be selected to work the regional tournament.

District 6 chairman, Supt. Gary Volk of Granville indicated their district's support of the proposal to eliminate the balloting procedure for regional selections.

District 5 chairman, Lingen indicated his district also supports the proposal.

District 3 chairman, Supt. John Jankowski of Larimore stated their district did not discuss the officials selection other than there were no officials in their geographical area. Also discussed was a concern for roughness of play and comments that took place during the season along with a possible evaluation of officials.

Chairman Sylling requested comments on how the officiating has improved.

District 9 chairman, Supt. Jim Gross of Litchville-Marion indicated his district agreed the officiating has improved.

District 7 chairman, Supt. Tim Guler of New Rockford stated the support and resources coming from the NDHSAA office has greatly helped to improve the professionalism of the officials.

Other district chairmen indicated they felt officiating is improving.

The Executive Secretary indicated Washington is currently studying how the contracting of officials will effect the reporting to the Internal Revenue Service.

Discussion took place on District 5 and 6 recommendation to support a concept of each district supplying the names of two referees for consideration as regional referees. These four names will also be submitted by the region for consideration as state referees. This would supply the NDHSAA with names. Schools would not have to submit names individually. Chairman Sylling asked for a straw vote on support of the District 5 & 6 selection process.

Yes: Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 13, 14 (on a one year trial basis) and 15.

No: Districts 9, 12 and 16,

District 7 chairman Guler stated the concept is good but they should wait until next year to work out the problems. There is a need to take a further look.

District 3 chairman Jankowski suggested taking this selection process to the boys' district chairmen's meeting.

Chairman Sylling directed the district chairmen back to the agenda for additional comments on other agenda items.

Districts 16 and 15 indicated no further comments.

District 14 chairman Christianson expressed concern for the officiating at football games. Some officials have worked an afternoon game and an evening game in the same area and charged double mileage. The association is asked to look into that issue.

Christianson indicated their district would like to host a girls' regional tournament on a rotation basis. Another issue mentioned by Christianson was rules clinics. Coaches should be mandated to go every other year.

District 6 chairman Volk Indicated he felt it was valid they attend every year. The coaches are the people who evaluate officials and need to know the current rules. District 9 chairman Gross agreed it is important the coaches attend rules clinics every year.

District 13 chairman, Supt. Gary Engebretson of Killdeer recommended Washburn as the site of the 1997 Region VII girls' basketball tournament and Beulah as the site for the 1998 Region VII boys' basketball tournament.

District 12 chairman Fletschock recommended both boys' and girls' regional basketball tournaments be held at Dickinson.

District 11 chairman, Supt. Martin Schock of Eigin-New Leipzig recommended a rotation of boys' and girls' regional basketball tournaments between Mandan and Dickinson.

District 10 chairman, Cordell Dick of Shiloh Christian recommended their district's desire to host the Region V boys' basketball tournament on a rotation between Bismarck/Mandan and Jamestown. Also, their district would like to know the reasons or what they could do to get the regional site at Bismarck.

District 10 chairman Dick also indicated their district coaches recommended the coaches' box.

District 9 chairman Gross recommended both girls' and boys' regional basketball sites be Jamestown. The selection of Bismarck/Mandan as a regional site would cause travel problems for some of the teams in the eastern part of their region.

District 8 chairman Prin. Allan Zerr of Kensai indicated no further concerns from what has been previously stated.

District 7 chairman Guler suggested although this is not a NDHSAA concern, their district wishes the media would select a Mr. and Miss Basketball for both Class A and Class B.

District 14 chairman Christianson would like to see all outside awards eliminated from NDHSAA sponsored state tournaments.

District 6 chairman Volk reported their district site recommendation is Rugby as first choice and Bottineau as second choice for next year's girls' regional basketball tournament. District 6 also feels it may be time to look again at a 3-class basketball system.

District 5 chairman Lingen recommended Langdon remain in the rotation for regional sites.

District 4 chairman, Prin. Dave Hanson of St. Thomas recommended practice times be reinstated for district and regional tournaments. Districts should set up their own policy regarding practice on the district floor. Also, District 4 requests the NDHSAA Board look at Grafton each year as an alternate site for boys' or girls' regional basketball.

NDHSAA Board member, Supt. Ness asked for a straw vote on how district chairman felt about reinstating practice times for district and regional tournaments. Following extensive discussion, the straw vote on allowing practice prior to regional tournaments was: Yes - 1, No - remaining members.

District 3 chairman Jankowski indicated Mayville may not host district tournaments in the future because of their need for classroom space.

Jankowski also indicated the schools would like the option of purchasing up to eight tickets for the Class B Boys' State Basketball tournament.

District 2 chairman Jenkins indicated their district is satisfied with the current site selection format.

District 1 chairman Conklin reported their district recommends regional girls' and boys' basketball tournaments be placed in Wahpeton and regional track in Wahpeton.

District 1 also recommended the continued use of the Spalding basketball.

District 12 chairman Fletschock recommended because of controversy caused by all-conference and other awards, announcement of these selections be delayed until after the season. Extensive discussion followed.

With no further business, Chairman Sylling declared the meeting adjourned.

Motion by Sanstead to accept the report. Second by David Schneider, Edmore and carried.

Gegelman introduced Part Two, Article XII, Section I, item b under football to read:

There shall be at least 9 daily practice sessions prior to the first game. Individual participants have participated in at least 9 daily practice sessions before being permitted to participate in an

interscholastic contest.

Motion by Gegelman to adopt the amendment. Second by Dean Koppelman, Bottlineau and carried.

Gegelman introduced Part Two, Article XII, Section II, item b under Boys' Basketball to read:

There shall be at least 9 daily practice sessions prior to the first game. Individual participants

must have participated in at least 9 daily practice sessions before being permitted to participate in an interscholastic contest.

Motion by Gegelman to adopt the amendment. Second by Ed Lockwood, Fargo South and carried.

Supt. Jerome Enget, Hazen introduced an amendment to Part Two, Article II, Classification of Schools, Section I c, Class A Schools to read:

c. After classes are established on January 1, 1975, a member school having a total enrollment of more than 199 and less than 325 in grades 9-12, inclusive must give two years notice to the Board of Directors to change its classification. Such choice must be made not later than September 1st of any year and shall become effective with the opening of the fall term two years later. Schools that elect to become Class A schools must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification. Should an A school drop below 200 in enrollment in grades 9-12 and continue below 200 for two consecutive years, this school must be reclassified as a B school. Should a school rise above 324 in enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, and continue above that figure for two consecutive years, this school must be classified as an A school unless walved by the NDHSAA Board of Directors upon a showing that the projected enrollment in grades 9-12 will be less than 325 in the first year of such reclassification as an A school.

Motion by Enget to adopt this amendment. Second by Greg Haugland, Kenmare. A roll call vote resulted Yes - 79 No - 64.

Motion carried.

Athletic Director Jim Gentile of Valley City introduced an amendment to Part Two, Article III, Section X under contests to read:

Interscholastic teams composed of members of both sexes are permissible in sports sponsored by the Association if a school does not provide for separate teams for each sex. Teams composed of members of both sexes shall follow the rules as outlined for boys and compete in the boys' division with the exception of girls' gymnastics which shall follow the National Federation girls' gymnastics rule code.

Motion by Gentile to adopt the amendment. Second by Gary Mailloux of Fargo North. Motion defeated.

Athletic Director Trent Baalke of Fargo Shanley proposed the following amendment to Part Two, Article III, Section IX under contests to read:

No interscholastic event shall be held from noon Thursday to midnight Friday of the NDEA instructional conference.

Motion by Baalke to approve the amendment. Second by Ed Lockwood, Fargo South and carried.

Gegelman introduced an amendment to Part Three, Article XI - Athletic Preparticipation Health History Screening and Physical Examination:

A student participating in NDHSAA sanctioned athletic events and representing his/her school must have on file with the superintendent, principal, athletic director or school nurse an Athletic Preparticipation Health History Screening and Physical Examination form completed by a qualified health care professional (i. e. Doctor of Medicine or Osteopathy, Nurse Practitioner or Physician Assistant under the supervision of a physician) prior to participation; a student being physically fit to participate in such activities will require a screening every two years. The Health History Screening must be updated year TWO by the student and parent/guardian; any change in the Health History Screening (from previous year) will require a physical examination year two; physical examinations or health history screening updates must be completed on or after May 20 of the past school year.

Motion by Gegelman to adopt the amendment. Second by Ed Lockwood, Fargo South and carried.

The Executive Secretary made announcements:

- The Redistricting Committee is studying a proposed realignment for basketball. The District Chairmen will bring to the March meeting information concerning the reaction of their district to this plan.
- 2. The proposed district and region lines for Class B volleyball have been adopted by the NDHSAA Board of Directors.
- 3. A small groups music registration form has been made available to all schools to take back to their music directors.
- 4. Site selections will be made at the April Board meeting.
- 5. The membership is reminded of the Distinguished Student Program.
- 6. The membership is reminded of the Distinguished Service Program.
- 7. The three-point contest sponsored by the host city of the Class B Boys' Basketball State Tournament is not the responsibility of the schools but of each individual involved.
- 8. Schools are reminded the facilities must be cleared in time to properly prepare prior to a scheduled contest. This preparation will allow the contest to start at the contracted time.
- With the by-law concerning the practice requirements for basketball being passed earlier in this meeting, the first allowable contest for boys' basketball will be December 12.
- 10. The NDHSAA Board of Directors was asked by the State Tourism Committee to support a bill requiring schools to start after Labor Day. The Board took no action on this request.
- 11. The starting date for the first allowable practice for Boys' Class A basketball has been moved to one week earlier. The first allowable contest shall remain as previously set.

- 5. The Dakota Bowl will be played on Saturday, November 15 in the FargoDome.

Motion by Norland to accept these changes. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Board reviewed the request from the North Dakota Cheer Coaches Association to approve a maximum of 8 cheerleaders, total. Motion by Leidal to approve the request. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board read a letter from District 11 concerning an improper picture submitted by Standing Rock Community Grant School for the district program. Motion by Sylling to send a letter of reprimand to the school. Second by Boschee and carried.

Motion by Jensen to go into executive session. Second by Auer and carried. At this time, visitors were asked to leave the room.

The Board read a letter from Watford City concerning Napoleon's possible use of certain ineligible students at the 1997 State Wrestling Tournament. Motion by Jensen to authorize an investigation by NDHSAA legal council. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

Motion by Sylling to adjourn the executive session. Second by Auer and carried.

The regular meeting was called back to order.

The Board read a letter from Wing requesting the late fee for cooperative sponsorship applications be waived for their coop request. Motion by Sanstead to approve the request to waive the late fee. Second by Auer. Motion failed.

The Executive Secretary informed the board of a request to allow a student home schooled in the Bismarck school district to participate at a private school. Because of the laws, the letter of intent must be filed with the local district of residence and the law does not provide for a private school to monitor a home-based student. Motion by Sylling to deny this request based on the legal definition of home-based education. Second by Leidal and carried.

The Board read a letter from Hazen requesting the acceptance of out-patient addiction treatment as a means to regain eligibility. There was much discussion concerning the changing times relative to in-patient versus out-patient addiction treatment. Motion by Gegelman to deny. Second by Toso and carried. Auer indicated she will pursue information for further study.

Hjelmstad spoke about their holiday basketball tournament requesting they be allowed to play a 4-game round-robin tournament on Friday, Saturday, Monday, Tuesday. The Class B District Chairmen met at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, March 21, 1997, at the Fargo Ramada Piaza Suites. Chairman Ness called the meeting to order and introduced the NDHSAA staff and members of the Board of Directors in attendance. The district chairmen introduced themselves and what district they were representing.

District 1: Supt. Art Conklin of Oakes reported their district rejected any proposed changes in district and region alignment. Also:

- a, Recommend NDSCS (Wahpeton) as site for Region 1 Boys' and Girls' Basketball Tournaments.
 - b. Encourage NDHSAA to take a leadership role in jointly setting a yearly educational calendar with other school activities not under the NDHSAA umbrella.

Chairman John Jankowski of District 3 stated - With the message from the legislature, we need to look at the early start of our fall activity season.

District 2: Prin. Greg Jenkins of Oriska reported:

- a. Support Hillsboro's request to stay in District 3 if there were to be any redistricting.
- b. Request NDHSAA to consider lobbying against mandating starting school after Labor Day.
 The group indicated this legislation had recently been voted down.

District 3: Supt. John Jankowski reported:

- a. Did not support the redistricting plan because moving Hillsboro and Griggs County Central from their district would cause conference to lose identity.
- b. Again, recommend girls' basketball season remain in the fall.
- c. Discussed the selection of regional basketball officials and the problems occurring with the attempt to contract district officials. Many officials have verbally committed to another district, causing their district to hire other than their top choices.
- d. Continue to rotate regional basketball sites between Grafton and Mayville.

District 4: Prin. David Hanson of St. Thomas reported:

 Reconsider allowing practice on the regional basketball floor prior to the tournament and leave the decision to allow practice prior to district tournament to the district.

A Straw vote was taken on allowing practice on the regional site. The vote indicated one in favor of the recommendation to allow practice.

- b. The district requests to start boys' basketball practice the same date as the Class A.
- c. Indicated the district would like to be informed of the voting totals for the selection of regional officials. The office staff indicated the voting results are available to any member school who wishes to obtain such information.

District 5: Supt. Wayne Lingen of Bisbee-Egeland and Rock Lane, sitting in for Supt. Tom Birchem of Starkweather reported:

a.What is the status of the selection process which was proposed at the fall district chairmen meeting. Discussion followed with District 12 Chairman Fletschock stating the membership does not want to micromanage the workings of the NDHSAA. There is a problem of contacting district officials early but the districts need to handle that problem. Staff member Carlsrud explained the current process for selection of regional officials.

District 15 Chairman Lukach stated that usually when you get to the regional level, some of the officials selected are not available to work the region.

District 7 Chairman Guler stated any system is still going to have some problems.

District 14 Chairman Christianson suggested the Board and staff gather any information needed and make the decision to keep or change the selection process.

A straw vote taken to see who was in favor of the present system indicated 13 in favor of the current system. The addition of a list of those officials contracted for districts will be included in the ballot for the 1997 girls' regional officials.

District 6: Supt. Gary Volk of Granville reported:

- a. Recommend Bottineau for regional basketball tournament site.
- b. Recommend the Distinguished Student be listed in the state tournament booklet.

District 7: Supt. Tim Guler of New Rockford indicated no further recommendations.

District 8: Supt. Gil Black of Midkota expressed concern for any proposed redistricting plan.

District 9: Supt. Jim Gross of Litchville-Marion indicated his district was not in favor of a new district or region proposal.

District 10: Cordell Dick of Shiloh Christian recommended:

- a. Rotate the regional basketball site between Bismarck/Mandan and Dickinson.
- b. Shiloh expressed concern being placed in a district outside of their time zone.

District 11: Supt. Michael Severson of Flasher indicated his district recommends rotation of the regional tournament between Mandan and Dickinson.

District 12: Supt. Russ Fletschock of Rhame recommended:

- a. Officials must be reminded to enforce the bench decorum rule.
- b. Expressed concern for the large size of trophies which cause storage problems.
- c. Supported Dickinson as the site of the boys' and girls' regional basketball tournaments.

District 13: Supt. Gary Engebretson of Killdeer discussed further the redistricting plans with no unrelated recommendations.

District 14: Supt. Gerry Christianson of Parshall reported:

- a. Their district had concerns over the lack of enforcement of the bench decorum rule.
- b. Asked for a clarification of the flagrant foul rule.
- c. Recommend no re-districting at this time.
- d. Their district supports holding the district tournament within the district lines.

District 15: Supt. Joe Lukach of Des Lacs-Burlington reported the following from their post-tournament meeting:

- a. Indicated they felt no need to change districts that currently work together.
- b. Recommend no home be used for regional tournament site.
- c. Further discussed the selection process for regional basketball officials.
- d. Propose the act of saving the basketball off of an opponent a violation.
- e. Recommend the use of the coaches box.
- f. Had a brief discussion on the shot clock.
- g. Recommend the proposal of adding one 20 second time out per team, per half.
- h. Propose 18 to 20 minute halves in basketball.
- i. The district has a concern for the increasing length of half times.

The Executive Secretary clarified some of these recommendations would need to be submitted to the National Federation as a rule change.

Some discussion took place concerning the shot clock.

District 16: Supt. David Rust of Tioga reported:

- a. The State Class B Boys Basketball tournament should always be centrally located in Minot or Bismarck.
- b. Their district had concern over the message the legislature is giving with the early start of fall activities
- District 16 favors the Watford City plan for an activities calendar which has equalization of sports seasons by months.

The group held a brief discussion on possible redistricting. Chairman Ness separated the group into the four quadrants of the state for discussion on redistricting. The members of the NDHSAA Class B Redistricting Committee were to lead the discussions. The group was directed to reconvene for final analysis.

Chairman Ness called the District Chairmen's meeting back to order.

Gegelman reported for the Northeast with an indication they did not wish redistricting. If this plan were to be implemented, they would recommend Lakota and McVille be taken out of District 3 and moved to District 7. Also, move Pingree to District 5 and Cooperstown to District 3.

Boschee reported for the Southeast with the recommendation to leave the district lines the way they are. If there must be a change, Linton and Strasburg should move back to an eastern district where they are now and Oakes, Verona to Region 1 and Hillsboro to District 2.

It was pointed out that with these changes for geographic improvement, you would end up with 5 schools in Dietrict 5.

The Southeast group also indicated the current system should be used to set regional sites.

Sylling reported on behalf of the Northwest. District 15 and 16 support the current plan. What would it take to go along with a change. If the proposed change is accepted, they would favor north/south lines. The group felt there was no real clear direction from their meeting. The general consensus was to accept what is best for the state with possible but controlled change.

Ness reported on behalf of the Southwest with a general consensus to follow the Ness plan. Concern was expressed from Shiloh as they wish to stay in a district with their time zone.

Ness indicated this input will be considered and placed on the agenda for the April Board meeting.

Chairman Ness encouraged the chairmen to talk with the Fargo tournament committee concerning the appreciation for their work in preparing for the state basketball tournament.

With no further business, Chairman Ness declared the meeting adjourned.

The Executive Secretary presented the Fund Balance report, the Investment report and the budget through April 4, 1997. Along with this report, an expense comparison sheet from various tournament sites was presented to the Board. This may be used as a reference when the site selections take place. Motion by Sanstead to approve the report. Second by Jensen and carried.

The Board received an update on the athletic activity financial report.

The 1998-99 calendar was given a final review. A recommendation was received by the Gymnastics Advisory Committee to move the starting dates for first allowable practice to one week later setting the dates as November 17, 1997 and November 16, 1998. Motion by Gegelman to approve the calendar with this change. Second by Sanstead and carried.

A discussion was held concerning the allowable number of contests per week for spring activities. Action on this will be delayed.

The Board reviewed a communiqué from KVRR concerning their bid for the East Region Giris' and Boys' Basketball tournaments. Motion by Leidal to accept the bid for these tournaments. Second by Toso and carried.

Organization of the Board of Directors took place. Motion by Jensen to elect Leidal for President. Second by Geoelman and carried as a unanimous ballot.

Motion by Gegelman to elect Sylling for Vice President. Second by Boschee and carried as a unanimous ballot.

Motion by Toso to select the Executive Secretary as the voting delegate at the National Federation General assembly meeting. Second by Jensen and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the hockey jamboree with a request to continue the jamborees for one more year followed by a review. Motion by Hjelmstad to approve the request. Second by Gegelman and carried.

Plans were made for the June Annual meeting on June 11 and 12 in Valley City.

Applications for cooperative sponsorships were reviewed. By motion of Boschee and second by Auer, the Board approved:

Litchville/Marion to Montpelier for volleyball

Golden Valley/Dodge to Hailiday for boys' basketball grades 7-12

Bowdon/Sykeston to Fessenden for boys' basketball, grades 7-12

Plans were discussed for the Board meeting calendar for 1997-1998. These plans will be finalized at the June meeting.

The Board reviewed the final copy of the form which accompanied the letter on physical examinations sent to the member schools. A discussion took place concerning the deadline data for the earliest possible examination. The Constitution and ByLaws Committee will meet on this item at the August meeting for possible proposal of an amendment at the October General Assembly meeting.

Auer reported on her investigation concerning the in-patient versus out-patient treatment for drugs and alcohol and possible adjustments to this rule in relation to the NDHSAA Constitution and ByLaws. An addiction counselor will be invited to appear before the Board at the June meeting to make a presentation concerning how out-patient treatment is handled and what is required for completion of this treatment program.

A discussion took place regarding home school students and their possible participation in extracurricular activities in the public school in the district in which the home school student resides. There has been a question concerning whether private schools would also be included in this situation. Sanstead shared the wording on the home school statement as required to be signed by the Department Of Instruction. This wording addresses public school district and does not include private school. This will be placed on the agenda for the Constitution and ByLaws Committee meeting in June.

The Class B Redistricting Committee reported on their meeting presenting a revised map of basketball districts. The impetus behind the proposed change is to eliminate long distances for schools to travel to regional sites. The committee directed the Executive Secretary to send this revised map to the member schools for input. This survey will indicate this is just a consideration and at this time is not a recommendation. If this plan is received with favor by the member schools, the recommendation for this plan may be presented to the full board at the June meeting.

Athletic directors Jim Haussler, Bismarck; Craig Perry, Grand Forks and Ed Lockwood, Fargo appeared before the Board with a presentation on site selections. Proposed is a committee consisting of the athletic directors from Minot, Fargo, Grand Forks and Bismarck, the Executive Secretary and a NDHSAA Board member that would study possible sites for the major tournaments and make recommendations to the Board. The Executive Secretary suggested the possibility of a set amount that would be paid to the host city for holding certain tournaments. President Ness suggested this should be reviewed by the Budget Committee. Included in this discussion should be the costs of hosting regional sites. The athletic directors felt if there is a line item on costs for putting on a tournament, that would help in the planning of the tournament.

The Board studied the proposed maximum cost schedule for the five major tournaments. Motion by Norland to accept the proposed maximum costs as submitted:

Class B Boys' State Basketball: up to \$14,000

Class A Boys' State Basketball: up to \$12,000

Class B Girls State Basketball: up to \$10,000

Class A Girls State Basketball: up to \$7,000

State A & B Wrestling: up to \$11,000

NDHSAA would be responsible for official, team payments, tickets, awards and insurance. Second by Boschee and carried.

The proposal brought to the Board by athletic directors earlier in the meeting on the site selection process was discussed. Mentioned was the value of the input from these athletic directors and encouraged them to meet periodically for input to the Board for site selection. However, the Executive Secretary and a Board member need not be members of this committee. Consensus was, this process is a good idea for obtaining state-wide sponsorship and advance planning.

Motion by Hjelmstad to remove site for Girls' Class A Basketball and adopt the 4-year plan as presented by the athletic director contingency. Second by Sanstead. A lengthy discussion took place. Motion carried.

having performance areas in handicapped accessible areas, etc. 2. At judges/coaches meetings (invitationals), it is the duty of the coach and

manager to make judges aware of physical challenges of a student of which a judge may not be able to easily detect.

a. If a student does not want anyone to know of his/her handicap, the student must accept full responsibility for critical comments made in reference to same.

b. Remind judges that they must give a recognizable physically challenged student reasonable leniency concerning rules specific to gestures, eye contact, holding of the script, etc. if the student is challenged in such a way that she/he could not adhere to that rule in the strictest sense. c. STUDENT CONGRESS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

A. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is computed on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset which range from Seven to twenty years. The Association caspitalizes all significant equipment and building additions.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash equivalents include time deposits, certificates of deposits and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

E. Financial Statement Presentation

In 1997, the Association adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted assets and permanently restricted net assets. In addition the Association is required to present a statement of cash flows. As permitted by this new statement, the Association has discontinued its use of fund accounting and has, accordingly, reclassified its financial statements to present the three classes of net assets required. This reclassification had no effect on the change in net assets.

F. Income Tax Status

The Assocition is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Association is not a private foundation.

G. Investments

The Association adopted SFAS No. 124, <u>Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations</u>, in 1997. Under SFAS No. 124, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

H. Concentration of Credit Risk

The balance of the Association's bank account was in excess of federally insured limit at year end.

5. PENSION PLANS

7. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Association is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets; errors or omissions; injuries to employees; or natural disasters. The Association participates in the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund (NDIRF), a public entity risk pool for its general property and casualty and other miscellaneous insurance coverages. The NDIRF operates as common risk management and insurance program for North Dakota cities and schools. The Association pays an annual assessment to the NDIRF for its general insurance coverage. The NDIRF agreement provides that the Trust will be self-sustaining through member assessments and will re-insure through commercial companies for claims in excess of certain limits for each insured event.

The Association also carries commercial insurance for certain other risks of loss including employee health insurance. Settled claims resulting from these risks have not exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three years.
