FOREWORD

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the 74th annual **Yearbook** which contains an historical and statistical account of the year's operation.

- 1997-98 marked the 90th year of service to the schools of North Dakota. Our membership decreased from 197 to 198 high schools.
- 2. In 1997-98 the NDHSAA will deficit spend approximately \$120,000.00. Because the NDHSAA can not continue to deficit spend some changes will have to be considered to correct this. Basically, we have two choices: 1) to increase ticket prices or 2) decrease the amount we pay to schools. This year the gross receipts of the Association were approximately \$900,00.00, and of that amount, over \$510,000.00 was returned to the schools
- The fall of 1997 was the fifth time that all championship football games were played in the FARGODOME.
- The Board of Directors will be considering an increase in dues for schools by adding an entry fee
 for all sponsored activities.
- This year's deficit spending was caused by a drastic cut in profit from hockey, football and boys' basketball.
- The NDHSAA Board will continue to provide catastrophic insurance for all member schools at no cost in 1998-99

I would like to express a very sincere thank you to all administrators, coaches, athletic directors and officials for your support and cooperation in my tenth year as your Executive Secretary. Our staff will continue to make every effort to provide your school the best possible service in 1998-99.

The Board reviewed the Fund Balance report, End of Year Investment report, End of Year Interest report and comparative report from 1990-91 to present. Motion by Toso to approve the reports. Second by Jensen and carried.

The final 1996-97 budget was reviewed followed by a review of the projected 1997-98 budget of \$1,105,800. On behalf of the Finance Committee, motion by Leidal to approve the 1997-98 budget as presented. Second by Boschee and carried.

Leidal reported on behalf of the Finance Committee and moved to approve the following changes in admission prices for the 1997-98 school year. Second by Jensen and carried:

A question had been raised as to whether the schedule would be in effect for the 1997-98 year or would not be in effect until the 1998-99 year because if was adopted after tournaments were assigned for the coming year. Motion by Sylling for the management fee schedule to go into effect for the 1998-99 year. Second by Toso and carried.

The Board considered a request from Park River to move the dates for the 1998 State Class B Boys' and Girls' Golf Tournament to May 26th and 27th. After a period of discussion, the request was tabled for further investigation.

The bid process for association automobiles was discussed. Motion by Hjelmstad to use the same process as previously used to obtain bids for the purchase of 1998 automobiles. The Executive Secretary will obtain these bids as well as advertise the sale of the 1997 automobiles. Second by Jensen and carried.

The schedule for the 1997 football semi-final and final games in the FargoDome were reviewed. After a period of discussion, motion by Hjelmstad to approve the schedule listed below. Second by Toso and carried.

Yates Public and Solen to SRCHS for football; Richardton to Dickinson for boys' and girls' cross country. Motion by Toso to approve the applications. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board also considered a cooperative sponsorship request from Dickinson Trinity to Dickinson for boys' and girls' tennis. Motion by Sanstead to approve the application upon receipt of the \$500 late fee. Second by Boschee and carried.

A letter of resignation from Larry Gegelman was read. Because of his acceptance of a new position taking him out of the area, he will no longer be able to represent the northeast region on the NDHSAA Board of Directors. Motion by Sylling to accept the resignation with regret and compliment Gegelman for the great job he has done as a Board representative the last three years. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board considered a replacement from the northeast region to fill the remainder of Gegelman's term on the NDHSAA Board. Motion by Sylling to appoint Dean Koppelman of Bottineau to fill the remaining term for the northeast region. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

Toso reported on behalf of the Trophy Committee and moved to approve the addition of the following trophies. Second by Sanstead and carried:

The Board thanked Terry Hijelmstad for making the arrangements for the meeting and the hospitality extended to the board by him and his wife.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors - Special Meeting August 28, 1997

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was called to order by President Leidal at 9:00 A.M. on August 28, 1997. All members were present except Jensen.

Staff member Solberg reported on an eligibility request concerning Shannon Kliniske-Nelson who transferred from St. Thomas to Drayton. Based on prior situations similar to this case, it was recommended the motion be denied. Motion by Boschee to deny. Second by Toso and carried.

Hjelmstad reported on a hardship request concerning Brandon Jacobs who transferred from Augusta, Georgia to Stanley. Recommended was to not consider this as a hardship but consider granting eligibility for non-varsity participation. Motion by Auer to deny. Second by Tollefson and

Hielmstad also reported on a hardship request concerning Alan Hill who transferred from Norman, Oklahoma to Bottineau. He is moving from his mother's to his father's residence. Dual custody is present and the student is allowed one move of eligibility. The father's residence is in the Dunselth school district but Alan wishes to attend school in Bottineau. Motion by Koppelman to grant eligibility. Second by Sanstead. Motion and second were withdrawn. Motion by Toso to approve eligibility in Bottineau. Second by Koppelman. Koppelman amended the motion to consider eligibility for sub-varsity competition. Second to the amendment by Sanstead. Motion on the amendment carried. The vote on the original motion as amended was carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a hardship eligibility request for James Ell who transferred from Baltimore, Maryland to Williston. The report was concluded with a recommendation to approve immediate eligibility. Motion by Koppelman to approve eligibility. Second by Boschee and carried.

Sylling reported on a hardship investigation in New England for Jennifer Schaefer who transferred from Bismarck St. Mary's to the Dickinson school district but wishes to attend New England. Recommended was to deny the request for eligibility. Motion by Tollefson to deny the request for hardship. Second by Auer and carried.

Toso informed the Board of a situation with a transfer student who moved to Valley City during the 1996-97 school year. Because of trouble with the legal system, the privilege of participation is in question. Although the Valley City School District has a policy to cover this situation, Toso requested the Board to review possible wording for a policy to address felonies and the effect such may have on a student's eligibility for co-curricular participation.

The Constitution and ByLaws Committee will meet prior to the September meeting to discuss possible policy on eligibility of someone charged with a felony as well as eligibility in connection with

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** September 16, 1997 - Bismarck Radisson Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on September 16. 1997 at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. Chairman Leidal called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. with all members present.

Harold Rotunda appeared before the Board to present the review of the audit from the 1996-97 year.

Dean Koppelman was welcomed as the newly appointed Board member to serve out the term vacated by Larry Gegelman because of relocation to another area of representation.

The Board reviewed the August 8th meeting and the August 28th special meeting minutes. Motion by Sanstead to approve the minutes as corrected. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on the Trial Fund Balance, the Investment Report and the 1997-98 budget through September 12, 1997.

Following a review of the registration and attendance numbers for the NDHSAA sponsored one-day cheerleader clinics, the staff was directed to submit a survey to member schools to indicate need for these clinics. A report to the Board will be made at a later meeting.

Jerome Enget and Joel Wood appeared before the Board to discuss Article 2. Classification of Schools and the amended section that allows the Board to waive the mandatory movement if the projected enrollment fails below 325. Requested was a consideration to waive their movement to Class A ranks for the 1998-99 school year. A grid showing past and projected D.P.I enrollment figures for the Hazen district were reviewed. Based on the wording of the amendment and the criteria indicated, motion by Jensen to allow the waiver for Hazen to remain in Class B for the 1998-99 school year. Second by Hjelmstad. Sylling moved to amend the motion to Indicate if Hazen's enrollment would actually be 325 or over for th 1998-99 year, they would automatically be Class A for the next two years, (1999-2000 & 2000-2001). Second by Toso. Following an extensive discussion concerning the NDHSAA Constitution and By-Laws, the amendment and the second were withdrawn. The original motion carried with one descending vote.

The Board reviewed the recommendations from the Cheerleader Advisory committee. A brief discussion concerning unsportsmanlike behavior from student spectators was held.

President Leidal appointed Sylling and Boschee to chair the Class B District Chairmen's meetings in November and March respectively.

The Board appointed a nominating committee for the purpose of naming two candidates for each of the two positions of expiring terms, Class A East and Class B Northeast. Selected were Ron Bommersbach, Chair, Larry Gegelman, Casselton, and Mike Ness, Center.

The Executive Secretary reported on the request from Park River to move the Class B State Golf Tournament one day earlier because of scheduling conflicts. Motion by Hielmstad to set the date one day earlier to May 26 and 27, 1998. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reviewed the attorney's opinion concerning the eligibility of home-based students to compete on a school team. Following an in-depth discussion, the staff was directed to contact the NDHSAA attorney for further information. This item was tabled until the October meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board on the change of the practice requirement and the effect on the first allowable contest, particularly for girls' basketball. Some dates in other activities currently reflect the shorter amount of time between the first allowable practice and the first allowable contest. The Executive Secretary will bring a copy of calendar possibilities to the October meeting.

The bids for the 1998 association automobiles were reviewed as follows: Miller Motors - 1998 Dodge Grand Caravan LE - \$24,699.00 (dual sliding doors) Perkins - 1998 Buick LaSabre Custom - \$23,000

Scheer reported on a hardship investigation concerning Kelli Durbin who transferred from Devils Lake to Park River. Motion by Sanstead to approve the request. Second by Koppelman and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a request for hardship eligibility for BreAnn Uttech who transferred from Hebron to Dickinson Trinity. Motion by Toso to deny. Second by Tollefson and carried

The Executive Secretary gave an update concerning an injunction to allow a student, previously ruled ineligible by the Maddock school, to participate in football. Along with the NDHSAA attorney, the Executive Secretary attended a hearing concerning this injunction. Following the hearing, the injunction was reversed. During the interim, the student actually participated in two games. The opinion given by the courts was to not enforce forfeitures for these two games.

The Board reviewed the list of post-season girls' basketball officials as selected by coaches ballot. Motion by Scheer to approve the list as presented. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

Scheer reported on behalf of the Principal's Association explaining their academic team selection of the top 30 students from North Dakota schools. These individuals are placed on 3 teams, Gold, Silver and Bronze. Requested is to allow these students be recognized at an NDHSAA tournament. Suggested would be to introduce these teams at the Class A Boys' basketball tournament and list them in the Bulletin. Motion by Toso to invite the Secondary School Academic team to the Class A Boys' basketball tournament for recognition. Second by Hjelmstad and carried. The office staff will be supplied with the list and send invitations and gather information for this function.

Jensen reported on behalf of the Constitution and By-Laws committee. Discussed at the committee meeting was the current transfer rule. The committee recommended documentation of past rulings and provide definitions to act as guidelines for future hardship applications.

Also discussed was the possibility of an addition to the NDHSAA Constitution and ByLaws eligibility rules to include students convicted of a felony. This will be placed on the October agenda for further discussion.

Cooperative applications were reviewed:

Regent to New England for 7th and 8th grade basketball Martin Luther Elementary to Bismarck Public Schools for all sports

Wolford to Rolette for girls' track

Oriska to Maple Valley for 7th and 8th grade football

Motion by Auer to approve these applications upon receiving the completed forms. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a possible facility conflict for housing for the state track meet. The Grand Forks community is in the process of working out the situation. Further discussion will take place at a future meeting.

A request for eligibility was heard concerning Marco Pasarellio who is a visa student and attending Williston High School. Motion by Boschee to approve eligibility. Second by Tollefson and carried.

A hardship request was reviewed by the Board concerning Elijah Larson who transferred from LaMoure to Lisbon. After an explanation by the Executive Secretary, the recommendation was made to deny the request. Motion by Jensen to deny. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a hardship request for Travis Wisner who was returning to

Grand Forks from Bernidji where he attended school for one day. Motion by Auer to approve the eligibility request. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Board read a request from Sawyer School District to allow them to move from District 11 to District 12 for girls' and boys' basketball. Accompanying this letter was a communiqué from the District 12 schools supporting the change. Motion by Sylling to approve the request. Second by Koppelman and carried.

Sylling requested the physical examination process be placed on the October agenda.

With no further business, President Leidal declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors October 8, 1997 - Blemarck Radisson Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on October 8, 1997 at the Radisson inn in Bismarck. Chairman Leidal called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Tollefson.

Motion by Auer to approve the minutes of the September 16 meeting. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the Fund Balance, Investment, and NDHSAA Budget reports as of October 1, 1997.

Toso reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws Committee concerning the discussion on the hardship eligibility rule. The committee reviewed possible guidelines that may be made available to any member school that is considering an application for a hardship. Also discussed was the possibility of amending the constitution to allow any transfer to be immediately eligible for sub-varsity competition and will be required to apply for a hardship eligibility ruling for possible varsity competition. Motion by Toso and second by Scheer to present to the General Assembly the concept of allowing this prior to introducing an amendment for the January meeting. Motion carried.

The Constitution and ByLaws Committee also discussed the eligibility of a student convicted or adjudicated of a felony. Several questions were brought up that will be communicated to NDHSAA attorney Gary Thune when he appears before the Board later in the agenda.

The Board held audience with NDHSAA attorney Gary Thune. Three key issues were addressed:

1. Home Schooling - recommended no change in the present participation rules. The Board reiterated their stand concerning eligibility of home based education students as eligible in the public school district in which they reside. Should they wish to participate with a private/parochial school, they need to be involved in partial enrollment.

2. Criminal Activity - There are basically two options - a. The NDHSAA could adopt a policy or b. the local school could adopt a rule in their own policy concerning criminal activity. This presents certain areas of concern such as having to define criminal acts that would be eliminated. Also, would this policy be for conviction/adjudication or is it for being charged. If as with present rules, the school would conduct their own investigation which would have its own burden of proof. If a local school would adopt a misconduct rule, the definition could be quite wide spread. If either are considering adopting a rule, it would be recommended to avoid imposing a policy with a vague definition of teleprine.

3. Hardship Rule - In ruling such as hardship investigations, the test by courts is whether the Board has abused their discretion. If the hardship rule will only be applied to the varsity level, as may possibly be proposed, wording such as "For all varsity activities, eligibility application must be filed for transfers" could be considered.

Tollefson joined the meeting.

Superintendent Wilfred Volesky, athletic director Rex Wenko and school board members Phil Eastgate and Myron Mitzel of Beulah appeared before the Board to request consideration to allow a release from being reclassified to Class A in activities other than boys' basketball that is tied to enrollment. Because the NDHSAA Board of Directors does not have the power to walve the Constitution and ByLaws, motion by Jensen to deny the request. Second by Tollefson and carried with one decending vote.

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was called to order by President Leidal at 9:30 A.M. on December 19, 1997. All members were present except Auer and Hielmstad.

Jensen reported on behalf of the Constitution & ByLaws Committee concerning the Board's amendment which reads:

The Board of Directors of the NDHSAA is proposing to amend Part Two, Article XIII, Section X under Rules of Eligibility to read:

Section X:

a. A student shall have been in attendance at the school which he/she represents for 90 school days upon transferring from another school unless his/her parents have become residents of the school district to which he/she transferred or unless the school from which he/she transferred does not offer work of the corresponding year in which he/she is ranked, and in the instance of a pupil transferring from a public high school to a private or parochial high school in the same city, or vice versa, he/she shall not be eligible to represent the new high school in varsity competition for 90 school days. Should a school district maintain more than one high school, residence shall be understood to refer to the territory assigned to a specific high school by the Board of Education, and any transfer by a student from one school to another within the school district without a corresponding change in parental residence shall result in a loss of eligibility in varsity competition for 90 school days. If a student begins his/her high school career in a school other than the one in the district of his/her parents' residence or if the student who has previously transferred from one high school to another without a corresponding change in parental residence re-transfers to the district in which his/her parents reside, he/she shall be immediately eligible in said school if the retransfer is made at the beginning of the school year. If the re-transfer is made during the school year, he/she shall not be eligible to represent the new high school in varsity competition for 90 school days or the balance of the school year, whichever is the lesser, if the student has participated in interscholastic activities in the school from which he/she is re-transferring; however re-transfers from a private or parochial high school to a public high school in the same city, or vice versa, shall result in a period of ineligibility in varsity competition for 90 school days regardless of when such a

In the event that the school district in which a student's parents reside does not have a high school, the first high school attended by the student shall be considered his home district for the purpose of this rule.

Should an elementary school district establish a high school, this rule shall be waived for all students enrolling in said high school at the initial opening of school that year and such students shall be immediately eligible. Thereafter the rule shall apply as for all other high schools.

b. A student who, because of unavoidable circumstances, such as broken home conditions, death of parents or guardians, abandonment or other exceptional or emergency reasons, finds it necessary to change schools, may be declared eligible for varsity competition by the Board of Directors, provided the administration of each school involved files a statement with the NDHSAA that the change was necessary and there was no undue influence or recruitment. Rulings in such cases will be considered by the Board only when in regular session and after a complete investigation by the NDHSAA professional staff and/or Board of Directors.

Rationale: This change would allow transfer students who switch schools without a change of their parents' residence or do not qualify under the hardship rule to be eligible to compete at a sub-varsity layer.

Although the committee had not discussed an emergency clause, the feeling of the Board was it would be appropriate. Motion by Jensen to present this amendment to the membership along with the emergency clause. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board reviewed several options for possible amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Sect. III of the Constitution and ByLaws. Discussion indicated there needs to be a penalty to fit the violation and a clearer definition of that penalty without Board involvement for each offense.

Motion by Boschee propose loss of eligibility from the date of infraction for six contests for each violation in that sport. The definition of a violation will be participation in one contest. Second by Toso and carried.

Motion by Toso to add the emergency clause. Second by Sylling. Motion and second withdrawn.

Motion by Jensen to propose an attachment making this amendment retroactive to the beginning of the fall, 1997 sports seasons. Second by Scheer and carried.

The proposed amendment shall read:

The Board of Directors of the NDHSAA is proposing to amend Part Two, Article XIII, Section III (a) under Rules of Eligibility to read:

Section III:

a. A student shall not have participated in a similar athletic contest during the same sports season as a member of any other than a high school team nor as an unattached individual in non-school contests during the high school season in that sport and the penalty for this violation shall be the loss of eligibility from the date of the infraction for six contests for each violation in that sport. A school may petition the Board of Directors for exemptions from provisions of this section on behalf of a talented student involving competition with U.S. Clympic or International ramifications. NOTE: If passed this change would be retroactive to the start of the 1997 fall sports season.

Tollefson reported on a hardship eligibility application for Kara Strickland who transferred from Oakes to Washburn and recommended approval. Motion by Scheer to approve the eligibility. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Motion by Sylling to adjourn the meeting. Second by Boschee and carried. Meeting adjourned.

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was called to order by President Leldal at 9:30 A.M. on January 13, 1998. All members were present except Jensen.

Tollefson reported on a hardship eligibility application for Dorothy Richau who transferred from Libertyville, Illinois to Mandan. Motion by Auer to approve the eligibility request. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

Hijelmstad reported on a hardship investigation concerning an application for Kris Spaulding who transferred from Drake to Granville. Their move caused them to live on a farm south of Granville but within the Velva school district. Hijelmstad recommended the student be granted immediate eligibility for sub-varsity competition. Motion by Koppelman to approve eligibility for sub-varsity competition. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Chairman Leidal questioned the rule addressing players participating on a non-school team within the school season and the need for clarification. The interpretation for what the penalty is for each violation in each activity needs to be defined. Each non-school contest played in by a student during the school season will result in a six-contest suspension.

A brief conversation was held concerning the drug/alcohol amendment.

Motion by Boschee to adjourn the meeting. Second by Tollefson and carried. Meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors January 24, 1998 - Bismarck Radisson Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met January 24, 1998 at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. Chairman Leidal called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. with all members present.

Motion by Boschee to approve the minutes of the November 21 regular meeting and the December 11. December 19 and January 13 special meetings. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented a financial report highlighting areas of the Fund Balance as of January 19, 1998 and the report of the fall activities. Also reviewed was the investment report and the finalized fall activity financial report.

The Board held audience with Supt. Vern Brenner of Beach concerning the use of an Ineligible transfer student during the fall semester. Motion by Hjelmstad to place Beach on probation for the remainder of the school year. Second by Tollefson and carried. The penalties as written in the Constitution and ByLaws require the school to forfeit all contest in which an ineligible student participated and the student must sit out as many contests as he participated while Ineligible.

The Board studied an expense comparison report listing the charges from the sites hosting post-tournament events.

Sylling reported on behalf of the Personnel and Finance Committee. The committee received a letter of resignation from the Executive Secretary as of July 1, 1999. Motion by Sylling to accept the letter of resignation. Second by Jensen and carried.

Sylling also reported on the Personnel Committee's recommendation of a 4% salary increase plus an additional \$400 for secretary Patty Bass. Motion by Sylling to approve the recommendation of the committee. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Auer reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee with the results of the election for the two upcoming vacancies on the NDHSAA Board of Directors.

Motion by Sanstead to accept the Canvassing Committee report. Second by Koppelman and carried. Auer will present this report to the General Assembly at the January 26th meeting.

The Board read a letter from Valley City athletic director, Jim Gentile concerning the Eastern Dakota Conference request to allow a sub-varsity football game on the Thursday prior to the first allowable game in the fall of 1998. Motion by Toso to allow this sub-varsity game on that Thursday. Second by Boschee and carried.

Scheer reported on a situation addressed by Valley Public Schools concerning a student declared ineligible but did compete in one contest after becoming ineligible. Motion by Tollefson for suspension of one contest following reinstatement after the six-week period. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Board read a letter from Gordon Opstad, Grand Forks Public School concerning the hard feelings caused by the way the Miss Basketball and Mr. Basketball awards are chosen and presented. The Executive Secretary was directed to contact representatives of the media and invite them to visit with the Board concerning this issue.

The Board read a letter from SRCGS athletic director, Tim Krahler listing the steps they have taken to insure proper supervision and sportsmanship. This is in response to an incident with Flasher.

A letter from the Standing Rock Community Grant School Board proposing representation on the NDHSAA Board of Directors was read and discussed. Hjeimstad suggested a representative be invited to attend Board meetings, much like the athletic directors association did for several years prior to an amendment being proposed to create a seat on the NDHSAA Board of Directors. The Executive Secretary was directed to reply to the SRCGS request informing them the Board had discussed this suggestion and to ask them to communicate this with Native Americans interests from all other areas of North Dakota.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board a letter from the Olympic Development Program administrator, Loran Gaipin. Motion by Hjellmstad to give the soccer a two-year exception allowing them to coach out of season. Second by Toso and carried.

Hjelmstad reported on behalf of the Football Committee with the following recommendations:

1. Pairings for all four divisions will remain the same as last year.

- Because of scheduling problems at the FargoDome, all semi-final games will be played at the home field of the higher seeded team as set by the NDHSAA.
- Play-off games played on any non-school owned field will have a maximum rental fee of \$500

The Dakota Bowl will be considered with the following options:

- (a) Two games on November 13 and two games on November 14 (b) Three games on November 13 and one game on November 14
- (c) Two games on November 12 and two games on November 13

Motion by Hjelmstad to accept this report. Second by Toso and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented a cost analysis for the possible addition of Class A baseball. A lengthy discussion ensued with no action taken. Motion by Hjeimstad to send a survey to the Class A schools as to their wishes concerning this matter. Second by Toso and carried.

Supt. Merlin H. Dahl of Halliday appeared before the Board to explain a situation of using high school students in a high school cooperative sponsorship program that was approved for junior high only. This is from Prairie Winds school which was only junior high at the time of the approval and has since added high school classes. Motion by Sanstead to extend the cooperative sponsorship to include Prairie Winds with the Golden Valley/Dodge coop for two years. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Executive Secretary introduced for study a four-year calendar as requested by the athletic directors group. This would assist in securing facilities for up-coming tournament bids. Motion by Hjelmstad to approve the calendar. Second by Scheer and carried with two descending votes.

Trophy Assignments and other plans for up-coming post-season events were discussed.

Jensen reported on the Constitution and ByLaws discussion on the amendments that will be proposed at the General Assembly meeting. Several points concerning Robert's Rules of Order were highlighted for conducting this meeting. A discussion was held on each of the proposals.

The Executive Secretary reported on the progress of the pre-tournament ticket sales.

For information purposes, the Board studied an enrollment sheet comparing numbers per school from 1982 to 1997.

The Executive Secretary reported on a survey of home school students.

A list of the regional and state basketball officials as selected by coaches ballot was introduced. Motion by Scheer to approve officials selected for Class A and Class B regional and state tournaments as presented. Second by Koppelman and carried

The Executive Secretary reported on a survey of baseball schools as to the possibility of changing the date of the state tournament. No action was taken,

Scheer reported he had been questioned as to the need for NDHSAA approval of schools involved in a 600 miles round-trip event. The Principal's Association questioned the need for obtaining approval. It was stated this is mostly an informative procedure.

The Board read a letter from Watford City athletic director, Tom Suelzle reporting themselves for playing three games on nights followed by school days. The Executive Secretary was directed to write a letter of reprimand to the school and thank them for reporting their violation.

The Board read a letter from Peggy Stibbe, President of the Fargo-Moorhead Junior High League. The letter reported a season violation, playing their 3th grade games prior to the first allowable date. Also, the league requested permission to continue the practice of starting their season earlier than the first allowable dates for practice and competition. Motion by Toso to send a reprimand to the league for the violation and deny the request to continue the practice of setting those season dates. Second by Koppelman and carried.

Jensen reported on the Constitution and ByLaws Committee discussion on the out-of-season coaching rule and indicated a need to have this placed on a future agenda.

Sanstead reported on behalf of the Promotions Committee indicating a Distinguished Service nomination had been received from Willow City for Phil and Cindy Meyer. Although it was noted these people have been a valuable asset as long time contributors to the local school district, one of the requirements for the Distinguished Service award is the nominee must have state impact. The Executive Secretary will write a letter to school thanking them for their nomination and encourage them to honor these deserving people locally. Also, the Promotions Committee saw a need to investigate why we are not receiving more nominations.

The Executive Secretary reported on the Volleyball Advisory Committee request to hold practice slots prior to the state tournament. Motion by Boschee to allow practice no earlier than 3:00 p.m. the day prior to the state tournament. Second by Hjelmstad and carried with two descending votes.

Tollefson reported on a hardship investigation concerning Joshua Ternes who transferred from Washburn to Center. Motion by Sanstead to approve the request. Second by Koppelman and carried with one descending vote.

A letter from Supt. Koppelman of Bottineau reporting an out-of-season coaching rule violation by a member of their coaching staff. Motion by Boschee to send a letter of reprimand to Bottineau thanking them for reporting this violation. Second by Toso and carried.

Hjelmstad suggested the Board address the issue of out-of-season coaching. Motion by Hjelmstad to change the wording of the policy to read "high school (9 through 12) coaching staff". Second by Koppelman. Motion falled. The Constitution and ByLaws Committee will place this on their agenda for the March meeting. Koppelman suggested the rule be emphasized at the coaches rules clinics.

Cooperative sponsorship applications were reviewed.

Upham, Towner to Granville for baseball

The Board read a letter from Mohall requesting placement of their cooperative sponsored football team in Region 6. Motion by Boschee to allow this move. Second by Tollefson and carried.

A letter from Minot athletic director, Terry Hjelmstad reporting several students for participating in season on a non-school team resulting in ineligibility for the remainder of the season. Motion by Toso to send a letter of reprimand to Minot thanking them for reporting this violation. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The Executive Secretary Informed the Board on a situation of a student from Langdon who had not received sufficient credits from the State Industrial School to maintain academic eligibility upon return to Langdon. Because this is outlined in the Constitution and ByLaws, the Board was unable to take any action.

The Board was informed of District 9 volleyball losing a team because of a Westhope/Newburg cooperative sponsorship. Motion by Sanstead to move Rugby to District 9 from District 10 for the 1998-99 volleyball season. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

With no further business, motion by Hjelmstad to adjourn the meeting. Second by Sanstead and carried. President Leidal declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES Annual Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association January 26, 1998 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Representative Assembly Meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held Monday, January 26, 1998 at 8:30 A.M. at the Bismarck Radisson Hotel. President Leidal called the meeting to order, welcomed those in attendance and declared that a quorum had been established.

Following the welcome, President Leidal introduced Michael Broome for the keynote address.

Board member Auer reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee with the following results:

Class B Schools - Northeast: Merrill Krueger

Class A Schools - East: Julian Bjornson

Motion by Supt. Dave Schneider of Edmore to accept the report. Second by Supt. Gary Engebretson of Killdeer and carried.

Board member Jensen introduced an amendment to Part Two, Article XI, Section I under Athletic Pre-Participation Health History Screening and Physical Examinations and moved for approval of this amendment: Section 1: A student participating in NDHSAA sanctioned athletic events and representing his/her school must have on file with the superintendent, principal, athletic director or school nurse an Athletic Pre-Participation Health History Screening and Physical Examination form completed by a qualified health care professional (i.e. Doctor of Medicine or Osteopathy, Nurse Practitioner or Physician Assistant under the supervision of a physician) prior to participation; a student being physically fit to participate in such activities will require a screening every two years. The Health History Screening from previous year) will require a physical examination year two; physical examinations or health history screening updates must be completed on or after April 15th of the past school year.

Second by Supt. Mike Bitz of Milnor and carried.

Jensen introduced an amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section X under Rules of Eligibility. Jensen moved for approval of this amendment:

a. A student shall have been in attendance at the school which he/she represents for 90 school days upon transferring from another school unless his/her parents have become residents of the school district to which he/she transferred or unless the school from which he/she transferred does not offer work of the corresponding year in which he/she is ranked, and in the instance of a pupil transferring from a public high school to a private or parochial high school in the same city, or vice versa, he/she shall not be eligible to represent the new high school In varsity competition for 90 school days. Should a school district maintain more than one high school, residence shall be understood to refer to the territory assigned to a specific high school by the Board of Education, and any transfer by a student from one school to another within the school district without a corresponding change in parental residence shall result in a loss of eligibility in varsity competition for 90 school days. If a student begins his/her high school career in a school other than the one in the district of his/her parents' residence or if the student who has previously transferred from one high school to another without a corresponding change in parental residence re-transfers to the district in which his/her parents reside, he/she shall be immediately eligible in said school if the re-transfer is made at the beginning of the school year. If the re-transfer is made during the school year, he/she shall not be eligible to represent the new high school in varsity competition for 90 school days or the balance of the school year, whichever is the lesser, if the student has participated in interscholastic activities in the school from which he/she is re-transferring; however re-transfers from a private or parochial high school to a public high school in the same city, or vice versa, shall result in a period of ineligibility in varsity competition for 90 school days regardless of when such a re-transfer is

In the event that the school district in which a student's parents reside does not have a high school, the first high school attended by the student shall be considered his home district for the purpose of this rule.

Should an elementary school district establish a high school, this rule shall be waived for all students enrolling in said high school at the initial opening of school that year and such students shall be immediately eligible. Thereafter the rule shall apply as for all other high schools.

b. A student who, because of unavoidable circumstances, such as broken home conditions, death of parents or guardians, abandonment or other exceptional or emergency reasons, finds it necessary to change schools, may be declared eligible for varsity competition by the Board of Directors, provided the administration of each school involved files a statement with the NDHSAA that the change was necessary and there was no undue influence or recruitment. Rulings in such cases will be considered by the Board only when in regular session and after a complete investigation by the NDHSAA professional staff and/or Board of Directors.

Second by Supt. Mike Ness of Center. Wait Beseler of Golden Valley volced concern as to how this would effect activities such as music which do not have the distinction of sub-varsity/varsity status. Following discussion, a voice vote was taken. Motion carried.

Supt. Wilfred Volesky of Beulah introduced an amendment to Part Two, Article II, Section I a,b,c,d under Classification of Schools and moved for approval:

Section I: Class A Schools:

a. This group shall consist of all member high schools with a total enrollment of 400 or over, In grades 9-12 inclusive, as of October 1, 1998, plus any member high school that elects to choose Class A as provided in paragraph (b), (c), and (d) herewith.

With no further action, motion by Supt. Russell Fletschook of Bowman to adjourn. Second by Supt. Wayne Levang of Cavalier and carried.

b. Any high school with a total enrollment between 250 and 400 in grades 9-12 inclusive, as of October 1, 1998 may elect to join Class A for Interscholastic competition by written notice to the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association before January 1, 1999.

c. After classes are established on January 1, 1999, a member school having a total enrollment of more than 249 and less than 400 in grades 9-12 inclusive, must give two years notice to the Board of Directors to change its classification. Such choice must be made not later than September 1, of any year and shall become effective with the opening of the fall term two years later. Schools that elect to become Class A schools must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification. Provided further, when the total high school enrollment in grades 9-12 drops below 400 that school shall have one year of grace in which to choose its class of competition. Should an A school rise above 400 in enrollment in grades 9-12 and continue below 250 for two consecutive years, this school must be reclassified as a B school. Should a school rise above 400 in enrollment in grades 9-12 inclusive, and continue above that figure for two consecutive years, this school must be classified as an A school unless waived by the NDHSAA Board of Directors upon a showing that the projected enrollment in grades 9-12 will be less than 400 in the first year of such reclassification as an A school.

d. Should a new high school be established in an existing district or area, whose enrollment in grades 9-12 inclusive, exceeds 400, the two year waiting period stated in paragraph (e) above shall be waived and the school shall be immediately classified or paragraph.

Emergency Clause: This amendment carries the emergency clause and will go into effect upon passage.

Second by Supt. Julian Bjornson of Grafton. Following the introduction of rationale by Mr. Volesky, a roll call vote was requested resulting a falled motion, 46-118.

Supt. Kent Hjelmstad of Mandan Introduced an amendment to Part Two, Article Xiii, Section VI under Rules of Eligibility and moved for acceptance to this amendment:

Section VI: A student shall not be a graduate of a four-year high school course, nor a graduate of a senior high school comprising the tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades. Neither shall he/she compete after having earned credits sufficient to meet the graduating requirements in any course of study prescribed by the school he/she is to represent unless such credits have been earned in less than eight semesters of school attendance. However, a foreign exchange student from a program recognized by the NASSP who has graduated from high school in his/her home country will be eligible up to the day of his/her 19th birthday to participate in sponsored activities if approved by the NDHSAA Board of Directors.

Emergency Clause: This amendment carries the emergency clause and will go into effect upon passage.

Second by Supt. Edward Slocum of New Town. Voice vote indicated the amendment carried.

Supt. Jack Maus of Hatton informed the assembly their amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section XII under Rules of Eligibility was withdrawn.

Jensen presented a proposed amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section II (a) under Rules and Eligibility and moved for adoption retroactive to the start of the 1997 fall sports season.

Section III:

a. A student shall not have participated in a similar athletic contest during the same sports season as a member of any other than a high school team nor as an unattached individual in non-school contests during the high school season in that sport and the penalty for this violation shall be the loss of eligibility from the date of the infraction for six contests for each violation in that sport. A school may petition the Board of Directors for exemptions from provisions of this section on behalf of a talented student involving competition with U.S. Olympic or International ramifications.

NOTE: If passed this change would be retroactive to the start of the 1997 fall sports.

Second by athletic director, Curt Jones of West Fargo. Following a brief discussion a voice vote indicated motion carried.

Chairman Leidal indicated the purpose of the meeting was to allow Beach superintendent Vern Brenner and party speak to the Board concerning the NDHSAA eligibility ruling as of the January 24, 1998 meeting. One of the questions raised was the possibility of this student being allowed a hardship consideration.

Following continued discussion, the Beach delegation indicated they would voluntarily remove themselves from the meeting to allow the Board of Directors to discuss. At that point, the Beach delegation removed themselves.

Hjelmstad stated he felt the forfeiture of all contests in which the student in question had been involved and the school reprimand was in order. Motion by Hjelmstad to have the situation be treated as a hardship and declare the student eligible immediately upon receipt of the required hardship forms and necessary information. Second by Koppelman.

Motion by Jensen to table. Second by Scheer and carried.

Exec. Session:

Jensen hesitant to proceed until the request for a hardship has actually been filed by the school. Sylling indicated the ByLaws clearly deal with the penalty in this situation.

The Executive Secretary was directed to speak to Beach along with attorney Thune in relation to the requirements of the Beach school prior to the reconvening of the Board.

Motion by Sanstead to adjourn the meeting. Second by Boschee and carried. Meeting adjourned.

Board of Directors - Special Meeting
March 2, 1998

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was called to order by President Leidal at 2:00 P.M. on March 2, 1998. All members were present except Boschee and Jensen.

The Executive Secretary indicated because of the weather, a number of basketball districts are having trouble completing their tournament prior to regional tournament time. Some of the districts are three days behind schedule.

Koppelman indicated their district would not be completed until Thursday with a possible challenge game being held on that Friday. The regional tournament is currently scheduled to begin the next day.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** March 20, 1998 - Minot Holiday Inn Riverside

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on March 20, 1998 at the Minot Holiday Inn Riverside. Chairman Leidal called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Koppelman.

Motion by Jensen to approve the minutes of the January 13, 24, 29, February 5 and March 2 meetings. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented to the Board the Trial Fund Balance report, Investment report and Budget report as of March 13, 1998.

The Board was informed that all NDHSAA staff had accepted their contract proposals and signed for

An update on the winter financial report was reviewed. The completed report will be reviewed at the April Board meeting.

Boschee reported on the District Chairmen's meeting which was held earlier in the day. He indicated the obvious feeling of unity among the districts with their concern not only for their individual school or district but also for the state of being of the association in general. Some of the items discussed were: (a) Bench decorum with an agreement the administration needs to continue to be involved in the enforcement. (b) Seeding at the state basketball tournament. (c) District and regional sites - if there is an opportunity to place the site somewhere that would be more neutral, the Board was asked to do so. (d) National Federation rules discussed games in halves rather than quarters, discontinue the 10 fouls per half rule, intentionally throwing a ball off an opponent to avoid an out-ofbounds violation, and the shot clock. These recommendations will be reviewed with possible action at the June meeting.

Sylling also indicated the district chairmen were obviously doing a great job of representing their entire district. Sanstead stated the district chairmen were working toward the good of the entire picture. Jensen indicated it was obvious the chairmen were dealing with all the activities.

Ed Lockwood, activities director of Fargo South appeared before the Board representing Supt. Vern Bennett of the Fargo Public School system. The item discussed was the growth of Fargo South and the plans for that growth. One of the questions brought before the Board concerns a rule that would prevent South High School from having more than one varsity team in an activity. They are looking at an expansion of the school rather than building an additional high school. The discussions of these possible plans had caused unrest within the district. Motion by Jensen to seek a legal opinion and research the ByLaws to answer the question whether a high school could offer duplicate varsity teams in selected sports. Second by Sylling and carried.

Gary Schell, athletic director and Supt. Elroy Hagen of Stanley appeared before the Board to discuss the possibility of allowing a sweet sixteen Northwest conference tournament for the year 1999-2000 for boys' basketball. This would be similar to the concept previously approved for girls' basketball. Motion by Tollefson to approve the request for the 16-team tournament for the year1999-2000. Second by Hjelmstad. Tollefson withdrew his motion with the idea to place this on the agenda for the Constitution and ByLaws Committee prior to the June meeting. Hjelmstad withdrew his second. This will be assigned to the Constitution and ByLaws Committee.

Koppelman joined the meeting.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board the National Federation Legal Seminar which has been scheduled. NDHSAA attorney, Gary Thune has been placed on the program. Motion by Sanstead to approve the NDHSAA Executive Secretary and Thune to attend this meeting. Second by Jensen and carried.

Bids for the NDHSAA calendar were reviewed:

Knight Printing - \$3.97 per calendar

Dalton Press - \$3.38 per calendar

Motion by Jensen to accept the bid from Dalton Press at \$3.38 per calendar. Second by Tollefson

The Board reviewed the wrestling situation of the restraining order served to the association allowing a Fargo South student previously determined ineligible for the state tournament to compete. Relative to this situation, a letter from attorney Thune concerning proposed clarifications relative to season limitations was reviewed.

Sylling indicated a concern with the recent complications pertaining to the Constitution and ByLaws and the credibility of being challenged on the rules as written.

The Executive Secretary shared a letter from NDSO indicating their summer games will be moved to Fargo to avoid the conflict with the State Track and Field meet to be held in Grand Forks.

The Class A baseball survey was shared with the Board. Results were 9 schools indicating they did not wish to sanction, 6 schools indicating they favored sanctioning and 2 schools having no opinion. The board felt the survey indicated not to sponsor Class A baseball at this time.

Tollefson reported on a hardship investigation concerning Chad Myers who transferred from Texas to Beulah. Because this situation does not fit the hardship criteria, motion by Toso to deny the request. Second by Auer and carried.

Tollefson also reported on a hardship investigation concerning Leslie Saunders who transferred from Texas to Mobridge, SD. From there she moved to Mandan, attended for two weeks and then transferred to Shiloh Christian School. Because of a similar situation the previous year being approved, motion by Hjelmstad to accept the recommendation. Second by Boschee. Following discussion, Boschee withdrew his second. Hjelmstad also withdrew his motion. Motion by Sylling to deny the hardship request. Second by Toso and carried.

Koppelman reported on a hardship investigation concerning Clndy Stanley who transferred from Rugby to St. John. Because this request does not fit under the hardship criteria, motion by Auer to deny. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The Board appointed the Executive Secretary as the delegate at the National Federation summer meeting. Motion by Toso to approve the appointment. Second by Sylling and carried.

The Board read a letter from Jean Legge, a Litchville-Marion parent concerned with the loss of school time being caused by the many different activities. The Executive Secretary was directed to answer this letter complimenting her for her interest in the students and indicate it has been discussed.

The Board made plans for the upcoming meetings. April meeting will be scheduled for one day (April 16th) rather than two with committee meetings being scheduled for the previous night (April 16th). Constitution and ByLaws meeting at 7:00 p.m. with the Board meeting scheduled for Thursday at 9:00 a.m.

DISTRICT CHAIRMEN MEETING March 20, 1998 Minot Holiday Inn Riverside

Chairman Boschee called the meeting to order welcomed everyone and introduced the NDHSAA staff and members of the Board of Directors in attendance. The district chairmen were asked to introduce themselves as they report for the district they are representing. Beginning with District 1, the reports were heard:

District 1: Rocky Jones, Sargent Central:

- Although the district understands, would like to get teams back closer to their basketball alignment.
- 2. Rotate region volleyball sites by district.
- 3. District volleyball coaches should be involved in recommendation and selection of officials for district tournaments.
- 4. Recommend the Nine-man football play-offs hold their first round within the region. District12 indicated they had a concern about football play-offs and will address this later.
- 5. Would like some type of support from the NDHSAA in implementing the scheduling of one Thursday night during the football season schedule to free a Friday night for girls' basketball. Because of the shortage of officials, it was suggested individual Thursdays be separated for different levels so not all done at the same time. This would free up officials.
- 6. Add two days to the beginning of the boys' basketball season to allow for practice time. This would then be the same for both boys' and girls' basketball
- Recommend the site of the state music contest be centralized. Bob Heller indicated he is working
 on a site in Bismarck after the 1998-99 year. At that time, they are working on implementing a
 rotation plan.

District 2: Bruce Hackey indicated he had no agenda items but individually asked if there ever was a consideration to seed the state basketball tournament. Straw vote on whether it should be considered. There was about a 50% indication in interest. Rocky Jones explained how the seeding process was worked out in South Dakota.

District 3: Del Kessler, May-Port:

1. Their district was concerned the early start scheduled in the year 2000 would cause the legislature to become involved in mandating the start of school. Cliff Lee of Wildrose indicated his school district was concerned with the early starting date for the school session.

2. The schools in District 2 expressed a concern on financial drain that Class A sports is having as they continue to add sports (girls' hockey and baseball). Recommend possibly changing the fee structure so Class A schools pay more of the cost of running their deficit tournaments.

3. The district is concerned over the lack of enforcement of the bench decorum rule. Also, other rules such as shirt tails and logos are not being enforced until tournament time. The district wishes to go on record supporting a coaching box that would be strictly enforced. Dist. 10 stated it seems to be certain coaches are abusing the rule and able to get away with the violations of the bench decorum rule while other coaches, even in the same game, are warned or penalized for their bench decorum.

Chairman Boschee asked staff member Carlsrud to explain what is shared with the officials concerning the enforcement of the bench decorum rule. It was agreed by the district representatives that school administration must take an active part in the encouragement of following the rule. The group also indicated the uniform rule is inconsistently enforced.

- 4. A rumor about a change in the boys' basketball post-season play was shared and informed the rumor was false.
- 5. Their district is opposed to Class A awarding a senior player of the year. District 4 echoed the same sentiments.

District 4: Jim Bauley, Cavaller:

1. District is concerned about insufficient room for fans at regional boys' basketball tournament when held at Mayville State University.

District 5: Wayne Lingen, Bisbee-Egeland:

1. Would like to see one week added to the end of the girls' basketball season.

Reported complaints over the price of admission their regional volleyball tournament. The Executive Secretary explained the misunderstanding of the prices printed and fans were actually overcharged.

There was a brief discussion concerning the site selections for regional basketball tournaments.

District 6: Ken Henderson, Velva:

1. No further recommendations.

District 7: Tim Guler, New Rockford:

- 1. Recommend New Rockford be the site for the Region 4 Girls' Basketball Tournament.
- 2. Recommend Devils Lake be the site for the Region 4 Boys' Basketball Tournament.
- 3. When possible, Class B schools should be the sites for Class B activities. District 8 also recommends this.

District 8: Gil Black, Midkota:

- Their district is requesting rationale for changing state volleyball and state wrestling tournaments to three-day tournaments. The Executive Secretary and staff shared information that resulted in this change.
- 2. Recommend New Rockford be the site for the 1998 Region 4 Girls' Basketball Tournament.
- 3. Recommend Devils Lake be the site for the 1999 Region 4 Boys' Basketbal! Tournament.

District 9: Clyde Erickson, North Central (Rogers):

- 1. Enforce bench decorum rule of discard it.
- 2. Would like to see Region 3 basketball tournament at Jamestown for distance and facility.

District 10: Tim Ketterling, Napoleon

1. Rotate site of region basketball for boys between Jamestown and Mandan and keep girls' at Napoleon.

2. The district is concerned about the hiring in advance of district basketball tournament officials.

District 1 asked if there was any action taken with officials that jump contracts. They were informed no action can be taken unless these contract violations are reported to the association office.

3. Discussed the benefits of training programs for beginning officials. Many expressed concern that there are no new officials starting up reflecting the need to help young officials by bringing them in and giving them support.

4. Recommend the regional wrestling site be rotated to every school within the region. If a school declines, go on to the next school. Possibly another suggestion would be an east-west rotation. Sylling indicated some schools are concerned about lodging in some of the towns.
5. A suggestion for a per diem for wrestling and volleyball be implemented. The district held a

discussion about some sports being slighted.

6. Concern over the amount of school time students are missing with spring sports such as track, golf and baseball

District 11: Mike Severson, Flasher:

1. Region tournament be set in Bismarck or Mandan. Both Mandan and Bismarck St. Mary's have indicated they would host the tournament.

District 12: Gerald Quintus, Richardton-Taylor:

- 1. District expressed dissatisfaction with new district alignment. Some schools complained they had to drive through two towns that used to be in their district to get to their new district competition.
- 2. Formats for state wrestling and volleyball were previously discussed
- 3. They would still like to have the semi-finals in football in the dome. Maybe cut back on the number of teams that advance into the play-offs.

District 13: Bud Vels, Wilton indicated no agenda items.

District 14: Jack Adkins, Turtle Lake-Mercer:

1. Bench decorum concerns were previously discussed.

2. Asked who is involved with the requirement of second place volleyball coaches from each region attending the state tournament to select all-state teams.

District 15: Roger Gendreau, Mohall:

- 1. Requested discussion on the shot clock for Class B basketball. Some feel this would help the game by changing how the end of quarters and end of game are being played.
- 2. Play high school basketball in two 18-minute halves. This would pick up the lag in play as compared to quarters. This recommendation would be with no loss of allowable regular season games. Three halves of play per individual would be allowed.
- 3. Discontinue the two-shot foul on the tenth team foul. This rule takes defensive teams out of the
- 4. Implement a rule making it a violation for intentionally throwing the ball off an opponent to avoid an out-of-bounds violation. Seven district chairmen indicated they would like to see this rule implemented.

District 16: Cliff Lee, Grenora

- 1. All district tournaments would be held at a neutral site. Expand this requirement to include regional sites.
- 2. Their district changed referee format to three-whistle for the tournament.
- 3. Some schools in district are interested in playing 6-man football. Numbers are getting down to where this may save some programs. This could occur without necessarily expanding to post season ply. The Executive Secretary will send out a survey this spring to see how many schools are interested. This could possibly dissolve some of the coops that schools are in because they have insufficient numbers for 9-man and may create more teams.

A discussion took place on the state baseball and state track being on the same weekend. There is concern about the athletes that participate in both activities.

Boschee thanked the district chairmen and declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** April 16, 1998 - Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on April 16, 1998 in Valley City. Chairman Leidal called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. with all members present except Sanstead.

Motion by Tollefson to approve the minutes of the March 20, 1998 meeting. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented to the Board the Trial Fund Balance report as of April 13, 1998 and the Investment report and Budget reports as of April 10, 1998. Also studied were the financial reports for each of the winter activities. Ensuing discussion was on the budget and upcoming decisions that must be made concerning the deficit spending and how it will affect the future health of the association.

The Board held audience with Evie Lawrence and a delegation involved with home based education. Ms. Lawrence's presentation concerned her son's eligibility for participation with a private school in co-curricular activities. Joshua, her son had qualified for the state speech tournament but was later found to be ineligible because he was not enrolled at the school with which he competed. This item is scheduled for discussion later on the agenda.

Jensen reported on behalf of the Constitution and ByLaws with these issues:

- a. A request for a 16-team basketball tournament had been tabled from the previous meeting. This issue created discussion of the number of games allowed per season and how this number is changed with a 3-game tournament vs a 4-game tournament. To make the game limitation clearer, the committee recommends the Board sponsor a Constitution and Bylaw amendment setting the game limitation at 20 games with the make-up of the schedule up to each individual school. Motion by Jensen to propose this amendment of a game limitation of 20 games plus a change in individual limitation to 100 quarters total per season. Second by Auer and parried.
- b. NDHSAA attorney, Gary Thune wrote a suggested wording to interpret the length of season. Recommended is the adoption of the suggested wording for the regulation in PART FOUR, Wrestling, #1. The season begins on the date set by the Board, and #5. 7th, 8th, or 9th graders may wrestle at the junior high and/or senior high level, as long as they have no more than 2 appearances a week and do not wrestle in a total number of consecutive weeks in excess of the number of weeks established for the high school season. Motion by Jensen to propose the amendments to the membership with the word consecutive inserted prior to weeks in each proposal to the membership. These proposals will be presented with the emergency clause. Second by Hielmstad and carried.

Motion by Jensen to adopt the regulation to Part Four, Wrestling, page 27 to read:

1. The season begins on the date set by the Board.

2. 7th, 8th, or 9th graders may wrestle at the junior high and/or senior high level, as long as they have no more than 2 appearances a week and do not wrestle in a total number of consecutive weeks in excess of the number of weeks established for the high school season.

Second by Toso and carried.

c. Discussed the penalty for competing on an outside team during the season. The recommendation is to re-write the NOTE ON PENALTY on page 12a #2 to read: If a player participates in a sport during a semester in which he/she is ineligible, he/she may be required by the Board to sit out a number of games or events not to exceed the number he/she participated in while ineligible in that sport. If the sport overlaps two semesters he/she may be required to sit out during the next semester when he/she becomes eligible. If the sport does not overlap two semesters, he/she may be required to sit out as many games or events in that sport, the next season.

Motion by Jensen to adopt this regulation. Second by Koppelman and carried.

d. Out of season coaching. Suggested is wording that would change the limitation concerning coaching out-of-season. Suggested change on page 23, #4. to add the word high to

A student participating in an activity "out of season" may not receive coaching or training from a salaried or non-salaried member of his/her school's high school (9th through12th grade) coaching staff in that sport....

Motion by Jensen to adopt this policy change. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the request from Class A Boys' golf to move the state meet from Wednesday, Thursday to Tuesday, Wednesday because of schedule conflicts. Motion by Hjelmstad to change the dates from the 27th & 28th of May to the 26th and 27th of May. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The Board read a letter from Lisbon thanking them and tournament manager Terry Hjelmstad for the wonderful experience at the State Class B Boys' Basketball Tournament.

A request was heard from Oriska to allow the dissolution of their cooperative sponsorship program for golf with Valley City. Motion by Sylling to approve. Second by Koppelman and carried.

The Board discussed the value of the hockey lamboree in the instruction and improvement of officials. This program has proven to be valuable in the past but should consider discontinuing. Motion by Tollefson to allow the jamboree in 1998-99 for the final year. Second by Toso and carried.

Organization of the Board of Directors for the 1998-99 year was discussed. Motion by Auer to nominate Sylling for president. Second by Koppelman. Motion by Jensen cast unanimous ballot for Sylling. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The Board heard a nomination for Hjelmstad as vice president. Motion by Jensen to cast a unanimous ballot for Hjelmstad. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Board reviewed the plans for the summer meeting.

Plans for the Board members attending the State Track Meet were discussed.

The Board read a letter from Standing Rock Community Grant School expressing the positive experience their community had at the State Class B Boys' Basketball Tournament.

Hjelmstad reported on behalf of the Class A basketball coaches concerning their request for a 4game invitational tournament. Motion by Tollefson to approve the request for the 4-game holiday tournament for the 98-99 year. Second by Jensen and carried with one descending vote.

The meeting reconvened at 1:00 p.m.

The Board held audience with Supt. Vern Bennett and athletic director, Ed Lockwood from Fargo South concerning their questions pertaining to the number of varsity teams that may be fielded by one high school. NDHSAA attorney, Gary Thune had written an opinion concerning how this is interpreted from the Constitution and ByLaws. The interpretation would allow the Board to make a ruling that would be applicable until the next Representative Assembly. The Board indicated there is a need to study this concept and consider how it would affect the total membership rather than just one or a few isolated situations. Dr. Bennett indicated this concept would not be seriously considered earlier than the 1999-2000 year but realistically not until the 2000-2001 school year. Koppelman suggested the Board consider putting together a committee of various size schools which would provide a broader base of input to work with this concept and determine answers to the many questions this issue has raised. Motion by Koppelman to direct the Chairman to establish an ad hoc committee consisting of various schools from across the state as well as representation from the association to study this concept and form guidelines. Second by Sylling and carried.

Motion by Hjelmstad to have the Class A athletic directors meet to discuss the 2002-2003 site selection proposal including the addition of Class A Girls BB. Second by Jensen and carried.

The Board read letters from Tioga and New Town representing the Northwest Conference Association. At their March 25th spring meeting, the group recommended the NDHSAA board discuss policies and procedures for awards following the championship game of the Class B Boys' Basketball tournament. This lead to the Board's discussion concerning the selection process and announcement of the all-tournament team, tournament MVP, Mr. Basketball, etc. as well as whether these should be included in the awards ceremony. The public misconception is the association is responsible for these selections. This subject has been placed on the agenda for the June annual

A communiqué from the Granville Sports Boosters group concerning home court advantage and officiating was read. Several inaccuracies in the letter were clarified with no further action.

A letter from the Class A East region athletic directors was read which requested consideration to move the boys' regional golf site from Jamestown to Grand Forks. Traditionally, the east region site has been the same as the site of the state tournament when held in the east. This year the state is scheduled in Grand Forks. Motion by Toso to approve the request. Second by Scheer and carried.

A letter from Shlioh Christian School was read addressing the allowance of home based education students who are not enrolled in Shiloh as participants on their co-curricular activity teams. They were requesting the NDHSAA allow a home based student who had qualified as a member of the Shiloh speech team to be eligible. An extensive discussion followed. The Board expressed deep concern that when a member school fails to follow the rules, the association takes the brunt of the criticism when enforcing the rules that have been put in place by the member schools. Shilloh School is actually in violation of the rules, rather than any individual students who have been allowed to participate with an ineligible status. As members of the association, schools are responsible to adhere to the rules that have been laid down in the Constitution and ByLaws. In regards to the requirements that have been put in place for eligiblity of home based students, Sylling stated these rules were patterned after the North Dakota Century Code and doesn't think the NDHSAA Board can change the current eligibility policy.

Jensen indicated the need to address each Issue individually: (a) Individual students, (b) The Shiloh Christian School, and (c) the request for the individual student, Joshua Lawrence to participate In speech for Shiloh Christian School

Motion by Toso to place Shiloh Christian School on a one-year probation. Second by Scheer. Discussion over some other alternative action followed. A substitute motion was made by Jensen to send a letter of reprimand. Second by Tollefson and carried with one descending vote.

No further action was taken on any other items related to this issue.

STUDENT CONGRESS

New Rule 4, Page 46. At State, a maximum of two entries will be allowed per school in Senate through House IIB and three entries in House IIC and IID.

Each school must enter their most experienced students in the upper chambers (senate and descending order) but a student of any grade level may be entered in any chamber at the State Congress.

Rule 1, Page 46. Each student must present 2 typewritten copies of their resolution. One copy should be anonymous and coded and another copy with student's name and school must be presented at opening roll call of each congress.

Rule 1, Page 47. The State Congress shall be a two-day event and begin with a general assembly. If possible, there should be 3 sessions on the first day (committee meetings will be the first part of the second session) and three sessions on the second day.

Rule 2, Page 56. Scoring/Ballot Change - point range changed from 0 to 5 to 0 to 10 with the maximum points a student may receive for one day changed from 25 to 50.

New Rule10, Page 47. Schools are limited to a maximum of 2 students per chamber in the Senate through IIB and 3 students in Houses IIC and IID that may present resolutions (Introductory Speeches) at the State Congress. This must be monitored at the East or West Congress that is held nearest to the date of the State Congress.

New Rule 11, Page 47. If a school has the maximum number of delegates in a chamber and one delegate is elected Presiding Office, that student must forego giving the introductory speech and debate will start with an affirmative speech.

A student may not be allowed to yield all of his speaking time in the last session of a congress. If a student so requests, the P.O. or another chamber member must know the rule and properly intervene to stop such action.

4. SPEECH

- Recommended a standard fee for invitational tournaments be \$4.00 per entry and \$40 for each judge not furnished by the school for every 8 entries.
- Class A East and West Regions may submit judge list of possible state judges by В. December 1.

Place timing fundamentals on Master Judge Ballot.

Penalties for acting in any prese/interpretation event: Any use of pantomime shall result in the drop of one rank. EXTREME ABUSE OF THE RULE WILL RESULT IN AN AUTOMATIC FIVE. Tab room shall do all changing of rankings.

Section 2A on Page 34 - Extemporaneous Speaking: All topics the tournament manager receives shall contain the name and date of the magazine(s), name of article and page numbers.

The contestants shall see only the topics. "Works Cited" sheets will be provided for each tournament draw room. Each contestant must complete the form and present it to the judge before speaking. The judge shall attach a copy of this sheet to each student's ballot so coaches may monitor their own students.

Motion by Toso to approve. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The Board directed staff member Hetler to do a study of all forensics activities in reference to loss of school time, length of season and number of contests in which they participate, etc. This report will be placed on the agenda for the January meeting.

The Board reviewed the recommendation from the Spirit Advisory Committee. An extensive discussion followed with an indication to look into other possible communication with member schools pertaining to the rules and regulations. The Executive Secretary will review the liability of schools in this situation.

The Finance Committee presented a financial history of the increase in payments to member schools and the deficit spending that has taken place four of the last five years. Motion by Jensen to charge a \$25 fee for each program a member school carries, increase revenue from ticket prices from \$28 to \$30 for season basketball tickets and \$4 to \$7 for tickets to the Dakota Bowl as well as a 5% assessment for insurance. Second by Toso and carried.

Motion by Jensen to have next year's Finance Committee study the over-all picture of the budget and set up a 4 to 5 year plan to level off the expenditures. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The Board studied a packet of information from the National Federation concerning home-schooling eliability. At this time, 29 states do not allow home schooled students to participate in activities in their state and 12 states allow participation within the guidelines as set by each individual state.

The Executive Secretary Informed the Board of a request from Mandan Public Schools to allow eligibility for a visa student, Sylvia Elena Perez, who has graduated from her school in Caracas, Venezuela. This student will become 19 years of age on March 26, 1999 and at that time, she would become ineligible. Motion by Sylling to approve the request contingent upon meeting the criteria of the policy which would require she be from an approved program. Second by Toso and

The Board read a letter from Steele-Dawson reporting themselves for a violation of the number of games per week in baseball. Motion by Tollefson to send a letter of reprimand. Second by Hielmstad and carried.

Motion by Sanstead to change the Boys' State A Golf Tournament from Bismarck to Dickinson. Second by Koppelman and carried.

The Board held an extensive discussion concerning the presentation of awards at state tournaments as well as the selection process for these award recipients. Motion by Hjelmstad to allow only awards from organizations that are affiliated with the NDHSAA such as the NDHSCA and NDOA. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board read a letter from Oak Relle on behalf of the F-M Area Junior High League requesting consideration to increase number of contests for junior high football, wrestling, boys' basketball and volleyball. The Executive Secretary was directed to answer the letter indicating their request would require an amendment to the Constitution and ByLaws.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of an incident involving students receiving out-ofseason coaching from a member of their school program. Motion by Toso to send a letter of reprimand to North concerning this situation and thank them for their cooperation in this matter. Second by Hielmstad and carried with one descending vote.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

A. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is computed on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset which range from Seven to twenty years. The Association caspitalizes all significant equipment and building additions.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash equivalents include time deposits, certificates of deposits and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less.

E. Financial Statement Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Boards in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted assets and permanently restricted net assets. In addition the Association is required to present a statement of cash flows.

F. Income Tax Status

The Assocition is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Association is not a private foundation.

G. Investments

Under SFAS No. 124, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

H. Concentration of Credit Risk

The balance of the Association's bank account was in excess of federally insured limit at year end.

5. PENSION PLANS

The professional employees participate in the North Dakota Teachers Fund for Retirement. Clerical employees participate in a tax deferred annuity program. Employer contributes 13.5% of the employee's salary. Total expense for the Association for the year ended June 30, 1998 was \$ 47 970.

7. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Association is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets; errors or omissions; injuries to employees; or natural disasters. The Association participates in the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund (NDIRF), a public entity risk pool for its general property and casualty and other miscellaneous insurance coverages. The NDIRF operates as common risk management and insurance program for North Dakota cities and schools. The Association pays an annual assessment to the NDIRF for its general insurance coverage. The NDIRF agreement provides that the Trust will be self-sustaining through member assessments and will re-insure through commercial companies for claims in excess of certain limits for each insured event.

The Association also carries commercial insurance for certain other risks of loss including employee health insurance. Settled claims resulting from these risks have not exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three years.
