

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association

Board of Directors August 13, 1999

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in Washburn at 9:15 A.M. on August 13, 1999 with all members present except Boschee. President Hjelmstad called the meeting to order and welcomed new board members Kari Ann Dunderland and Kent Hjelmstad.

Motion by Scheer to approve the minutes of the previous June 10 and June 26 meeting as corrected to indicate Tollefson was not present at the June meeting. Second by Krueger and

The Board held audience with Scott Kittell, president of the North Dakota Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association. On behalf of the association, Kittell thanked the Executive Secretary for meeting with their group concerning the Mr. and Miss Basketball award. Reported is the association's plan to continue with awarding only one Mr. and Miss Basketball. Their rationale was they felt the award will be less prestigious if there is a separation of the award for each classification. Also discussed was the selection of the all-tournament team and the desire for input in the selection. Scheer informed Kittell the Board's decision to not allow the announcement of this award at the state ceremonies was unanimously supported by the Class B district chairmen. Kittell indicated their association is in the process of putting together a committee that will work with the NDHSAA Executive Secretary in making future recommendations to the Board of Directors for selection processes for all-tournament teams, etc. Tollefson spoke on behalf of the Board emphasizing the importance of doing what is in the best interest of the students and of moving on and establishing communication with the media with this in mind.

The Executive Secretary reported on the Finance Committee meeting earlier in the day. This committee reviewed the budget report as of the end of the 1998-1999 year. Committee Chairman Tollefson continued the review of the reports with a motion to approve the final financial report to conclude the fiscal action of that previous year. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary continued the review with the July 1, 1999 beginning balance and the activity through July 31, 1999. Motion by Lukach to accept the finance report. Second by Tollefson and carried.

Foreword

On behalf of the NDHSAA Board of Directors, I am pleased to present the 2000 yearbook, which illustrates a detailed account of the past years' activities. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the NDHSAA Board of Directors, Office Staff, School Administrators, Coaches, Athletic Administrators, and Officials for your support during my first year as Executive Secretary. I would also like to thank Bob King for the condition in which he left the Association upon his retirement. I have thoroughly enjoyed my new position and look forward to the future.

This was our first year having US Bank as a corporate sponsor of activities. Their support of our catastrophic insurance and distinguished student programs is appreciated. The additional revenue will certainly help curtail the deficit spending we have dealt with the past few years.

The success of any organization is determined by the support of its members. My goal is for the North Dakota High School Activities Association to be an organization all member schools feel an important part of. Your continued support is greatly appreciated.

Sherman Sylling **Executive Secretary** The Board was informed of the upcoming car bid process and a report will be brought back to the September meeting. Motion by Tollefson to authorize the Executive Secretary to request bids for new association automobiles. Second by Toso and carried.

The Board read a communique from Bismarck Public Schools reporting the use of school uniforms at an out-of-season competition. The Board directed the Executive Secretary to write a letter of reprimand.

Staff member Soiberg reported on some inappropriate conduct that took place at one of the state golf tournaments and the need for the Association to adopt some guidelines for tournament management in this area. The USGA rules which govern the competition do not address misconduct. Motion by Bjornson to adopt the conduct rule as proposed:

Any competitor who throws a club or other item in disgust, uses profanity, etc. shall be penalized as follows:

First offense - two stroke penalty Second offense - Tournament disqualification Second by Toso and carried.

The Board held audience with a delegation from Minot Bishop Ryan concerning two students returning to their school system after transferring to schools outside of the city. It was the opinion of the Board that these students may retransfer to the school of original eligibility without loss of eligibility.

An audience represented by Supt. Debra Syvertson and Prin. Mark Vollmer from Willow City appeared before the Board concerning their cooperative sponsorship application with Towner and Upham for girls basketball. This application is being submitted late because of the loss of team members causing Willow City to be unable to field a team. Motion by Toso to approve the cooperative sponsorship application. Second by Krueger and carried. The Executive Secretary was directed to send a letter to the Willow City School Board informing them of the approval of the application along with a concern for the late date and the hardship caused schools that were scheduled to play their now dissolved team.

The Board heard a report concerning an extra semester request for a Griggs County student. Because at no time do the records show that the opportunity was not available for this student to participate in the eight semesters of school attendance, motion by Bjornson to deny the request. Second by Scheer and carried.

Following adjournment, the Board reconvened with all members present except Krueger and Boschee.

The Board reviewed a communique from Jack Crary concerning the out-of-season coaching rule regarding soccer. Motion by Tollefson to extend this exemption for a second and final two-year extension. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Park Christian to Shanley for boys' and girls' tennis, boys' and girls' golf, boys' and girls' soccer, boys' and girls' cross country, girls' swimming, and baseball.

Kensal to Carrington for football

Oriska to Maple Valley for 7th and 8th grade girls' basketball Bismarck and Bismarck St. Mary's for debate Parshall to New Town for wrestling

Second by Bjornson and carried.

Discussion was held concerning the proposed cooperative sponsorship of Des Lacs-Burlington to Minot for gymnastics. Motion by Scheer to approve the cooperative sponsorship upon completion of the application forms. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The cooperative sponsorship application for a Bismarck/Bismarck St. Mary's/Mandan tennis program was discussed. Motion by Scheer to approve. Second by Bjornson and carried.

Discussion was held concerning the placement of the boys' golf season and the increased demand for use of the golf courses. No action was taken.

The Executive Secretary reported on a hardship eligibility application for Josh Olson who transferred from Nebraska to Hillsboro and recommended approval of the hardship application. Motion by Sanstead to approve the application. Second by Scheer and carried.

A letter from Fargo South requesting consideration on the Class A girls in-season junior golf competition rule to include any junior golf competition rather than limiting the rule to North Dakota Junior Golf sponsored competitions. Motion by Sanstead to clarify the intent of the rule to be any one Junior Golf Association sponsored tournament. Second by Toso and carried.

A letter from Lisbon concerning the moving of the regional wrestling tournament from Lisbon to Enderlin was discussed. This site move took place at the June meeting after it was brought to the attention of the Board that there was a rotation in place that would place the tournament in Enderlin rather than in Lisbon which had been assigned the tournament at the April meeting. The concern of Lisbon was this action moving the site from Lisbon to Enderlin was taken without any communication with Lisbon. Motion by Tollefson to deny the request. Second by Scheer and carried. The Executive Secretary was directed to send a letter to Lisbon informing them of the discussion along with an apology for any inconvenience this has caused their community. Scheer indicated he would be in communication with that region concerning this issue.

The Executive Secretary shared a letter from Finley-Sharon requesting eligibility for Ineke Stigter from the Netherlands who was visiting through an approved foreign exchange program but has graduated from high school in her country. Motion by Lukach to approve the request. Second by Toso and carried.

The Board was informed of the proposed contract from WDAY/WDAZ to televise the football finals. Motion by Sanstead to approve the contract. Second by Scheer. Concern over the previous year's televised games not reaching the entire state was discussed. Motion carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board the Eastern Dakota Conference athletic directors have recommended the site of the east region gymnastics tournament be moved from Jamestown to Wahpeton with a recommendation to honor the request of the athletic directors. Motion by Sanstead to move the site of the East Region Gymnastics meet from Jamestown to Wahpeton. Second by Scheer and carried.

A letter was read from Dean Ralston, Grafton representing the Eastern Dakota Conference athletic directors requesting the movement of the State Boys' Class A East Region and State tournaments from Grand Forks to the Fargo Country Club plus changing the date of the state event to May 31, June 1. Motion by Toso to approve the request contingent on the release of those two contracts from the original site, Grand Forks. Second by Dunderland and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported:

- 1. The North Dakota School Administrators request to move the October General Assembly meeting from the Thursday of their conference at 4:00 p.m. to Friday at 8:00 a.m.
- 2. The US Bank corporate sponsorship media release will be held in Fargo on September 1, 1999 at 10:00 a.m. at the Bank Plaza.
- Staff member Solberg has been appointed Chair of the National Federation Equity Committee
- 4. There is a need to study consideration of moving the June Board meeting from June 15 and 16 to June 22 and 23. This will be placed on the agenda for the September meeting.
- 5. On September 19 & 20, there has been scheduled an athletic directors conference in Bismarck. The NDHSAA staff has been asked to make several presentations concerning the Constitution and ByLaws at this conference. This conference will contain a discussion session on the dual state wrestling tournament concept.

The September Board of Directors meeting will be scheduled on the 20th to begin at 1:00 p.m. at the Radisson in Bismarck.

With no further business, President Hjelmstad declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** September 20, 1999 - Bismarck Radisson Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on September 20, 1999 at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. President Hjelmstad called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present.

The minutes of the August 13 regular meeting and the August 26, August 31 and September 15 special meetings were in the Board's packets for review. Motion by Lukach to approve the minutes. Second by Bjornson and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial reports as prepared through August 31, 1999. Motion by Krueger to accept the reports. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The Board reviewed the dates of the 1999-2000 Board meetings. Motion by Toso to move the date of the June, 2000 meeting to June 22, 23. Second by Boschee and carried.

For the upcoming district chairmen's meetings, President Hjelmstad appointed Lukach to chair the November girls' district chairmen's meeting and Krueger to chair the March boys' district chairmen's meeting.

Supt. Jon Kringen of Enderlin appeared before the Board to request consideration for having the division of their football program changed from Class A to 9-man. The presentation illustrated the enrollment of their school as compared to enrollments of other schools in coops that have a larger total enrollment but are playing 9-man because of the enrollment formula that is used in the case of a cooperative sponsorship. Any further discussion was delayed until this item came up later in the agenda.

NDHSAA auditor, Harold Rotunda appeared before the Board with the final report of the audit for the 1998-1999 fiscal year. Motion by Sanstead to accept and file the auditor's report. Second by Scheer and carried.

A discussion followed concerning the Association's investments. The Executive Secretary was asked to check into the Association's investments to find out how they were secured.

The Board discussed the selection of a nominating committee for the upcoming Class A Central and South East Class B positions on the Board of Directors. Boschee suggested the nominations come from a meeting of their southeast schools rather than a selection of three school administrators to act as a nominating committee. Toso was directed to research this same process for the Class A Central. Motion by Tollefson to have these two area's representatives conduct a thorough search for the purpose of nominating two people. Second by Sanstead and carried. Discussion was held concerning minority and gender representation. Encouragement was given to the two groups to keep the equity issue in mind during their search.

The bids for the 1999-2000 association automobiles were opened and read. Bids for a van to accompany the trade-in of the current association van were:

Motion by Scheer to accept the bid from Stoudt Ross. Second by Toilefson and carried.

Bids for a car to accompany the trade-in of the current association car were: Perkins - 3.1 V-6 Grand Prix - \$6400

Miller Motors - 2.7 V-6 Dodge Intrepid - \$7091 less \$1000 rebate (\$6091)

Motion by Tollefson to accept the bid from Miller Motors. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board directed the Executive Secretary to schedule a meeting for the Finance Committee prior to the Board meeting for the purpose of opening and reviewing the bids for the 2001 association automobiles. Following the review by the committee, a report and recommendation will be brought to the entire Board of Directors for action.

The board reviewed cooperative sponsorship application Neche, Pembina and Walhalla for baseball and boys' and girls' track (\$500 late fee for the track program is included). Motion by Scheer to approve. Second by Krueger and carried.

Grafton and Minto for hockey application that has been approved by the individual school boards and the final application work is currently being completed. Motion by Sanstead to approve pending receipt of the completed applications. Second by Lukach and carried.

Mott to Regent for speech. Motion by Lukach to approve. Second by Sanstead and

carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board on the need to update the computer system in the office. Through invitation, Tim Kadrmas of the Valley City Center for Innovation appeared before the Board to present an initial plan of how to develop a technology plan for the NDHSAA. Motion by K. Hjelmstad to approve the staff to proceed with the planning stage. Second by Tollefson and carried.

Solberg reported on the August cheerleader one-day clinics. Enrollment has decreased drastically and is currently only being held on alternating years. Tollefson indicated that because the cheerleader one-day clinics schedule is on an every other year basis, any action on what to do with future clinics may be delayed for further study.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board of a foreign exchange student, Simone Vogels who has graduated in her country. Motion by Krueger to approve. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Board was informed the Ford Windstar LX that was approved in the bid process could have a power seat added for the cost of \$277. Motion by Sanstead to approve this addition. Second by Toso and carried.

North Dakota Officials Association President, Lisa Harmon appeared before the Board with a presentation on the importance of the three organizations, NDHSAA, Administrators/coaches, and NDOA working together to support sportsmanship and recruitment and retention of officials. Much discussion followed. The Board thanked Ms. Harmon for the presentation.

Staff member Carlsrud presented the results of the officials selection for the regional and state officials for the girls post-season tournaments. Motion by Scheer to accept the list of officials. Second by Toso and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared a letter from Four Winds regarding a 5-quarter violation and indicated this has been handled appropriately. The Executive Secretary was directed to send a letter acknowledging their report of the violation.

Trophy presentation assignments for the 1999 fall regional and state tournaments were made.

Sanstead moved to correct the September 15 Board of Directors special meeting minutes to indicate Sanstead was present at the conference call. Second by Scheer and carried.

Sanstead

The Executive Secretary shared a letter from Bowman which was expressing concern for the State Cross Country meet being held on the weekend of the NDEA convention. The letter encouraged consideration for this conflict in future scheduling.

Kent Hjelmstad reported on behalf of the Wrestling Committee. The committee shared a collaborative recommendation resulting from the discussion on the possible proposal for a State Dual Wrestling tournament. Motion by Toso to sponsor the dual team tournament this year on a trial basis. Second by Bjornson and carried. The staff was directed to set up a timeline to determine the details of this tournament and communicate that with the Wrestling Committee. Finalized details are to be shared with the General Assembly at the October 22nd meeting.

Lukach reported on behalf of the Football Committee with the possibility of upcoming requests for the dissolution of football coops as well as requests from other programs to be moved to different divisions. Concerning the request heard earlier in the meeting from Enderlin, there is a need for action. Discussion was held concerning the possible study of the formula for divisioning cooperative sponsored football programs. Mentioned was the re-divisioning that will take place at the end of the two-year cycle. At that time, the numbers will be studied and action taken will be in the interest of the entire state-wide football program. Motion by Toso to deny the Enderlin request and look at all options for divisioning of all schools at the end of the two-year cycle. Second by Scheer and carried with two descending votes.

Carlsrud assured the Board the football divisioning that took place the year earlier was the result of a very extensive study prior to making the final decision and this same care will be taken for the next cycle.

The Executive Secretary suggested the study of the entire football program begin now with the gathering of information so by the time the divisioning meetings take place, the proposed plan will be thoroughly studied. Tollefson suggested the regional meetings begin discussion now for suggestions as to how the upcoming divisioning can take place. This was suggested to be placed in the Bulletin. Staff member Hetler was given that directive.

Krueger reported on behalf of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee concerning three ar-

a. The Committee discussed proposing an amendment to change Part Two, Article XIII, Section X, Part a. This deals with the transfer, retransfer rule and how eligibility is affected. The section of Part a that would be amended is, ".... or if a student who has previously transferred from one high school to another without a corresponding change in parental residence re-transfers to the district in which his/her parents reside,....." The proposed amendment would change the words "district in which his/her parents reside" to "original school of eligibility".

Motion by Krueger to propose this amendment to the General Assembly at the October meeting with no emergency clause. Second by Dunderland and carried.

b. Also discussed was a proposal for an amendment to Part Two, Article VIII, Section IV to add the wording "with the exception of NDHSAA corporate sponsors". This is in need of an emergency clause which must be sent out to the schools no less than 30 days prior to the October General Assembly meeting.

Motion by Krueger to propose (b) to the General Assembly at the October meeting as an emergency clause. Second by Toso and carried.

c. The Committee suggested a change in the Board interpretation which determines how many high school classes a student must take as a combination 8th/9th grade student to be considered a high school student. Previously, two high school classes would define a student in this situation as a high school student and considered to be in their first of 8 semesters of eligibility. The Committee recommends changing that number from two to four as a Board interpretation. Motion by Krueger to change Question 114 as well as other references in the Constitution and By-Laws interpretations to qualify a student entering his/her first year of high school eligibility as one who is taking four or more classes. Second by Scheer and carried.

Boschee reported on behalf of the Personnel Committee:

(a) There is a need to develop a pension plan for the new Executive Secretary as well as any future staff members being hired as office executive staff. Study is currently taking place and a pension representative will be appearing before the committee at the October meeting date. Also, the Committee will continue their study of options.

(b) The committee discussed the possible change in title (Associate Director) for a member of

the executive staff. Discussion will continue at the October meeting.

The Executive Secretary gave the following report: 1. U.S. Bank:

(a) It is important to give progress reports of the agreement as the year unfolds. There have been some areas of the state that have expressed concern for this agreement. An article will be placed in the October Bulletin explaining how this agreement is providing opportunities for students and how this only has an effect at the state level.

(b) Discussion is ongoing about the handling of state tournament programs.

2. Constitution and By-Laws:

(a) The newly formatted Constitution and By-Laws first draft is completed. The NDHSAA attorney is reviewing this draft and the final copy will be presented to the General Assembly at the October meeting. At the January General Assembly meeting, the membership will have the opportunity to accept the newly formatted document.

(b) The Executive Secretary emphasized there are no changes in the actual rules and interpretations, just a format that is intended to be more user friendly.

3. The Executive Secretary and Carlsrud had recently represented the Association at the Southeast conference meeting in Lisbon.

4. The North Dakota Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association conference was held in Mandan September 19 and 20. Included on their agenda were several presentations by the NDHSAA.

The next meeting is scheduled for October 20 with the General Assembly scheduled for October 22. Committee meetings will be scheduled for the evening of October 19.

With no further business, motion by Bjornson to adjourn the meeting. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a letter of request from Fargo South for a waiver allowing a student, Heather Harris to attend a U.S. Olympic camp during the high school season. Ed Lockwood, athletic director from Fargo South and Skip Fisher, Fargo-Moorhead Gators coach spoke on behalf of the request. This special camp is sponsored by the U.S. Olympic committee and invites athletes born in 1985. These athletes will meet and work with Olympic coaching staff with the possibility of opening opportunities to compete on the national and international level. Bjornson asked what relationship the Gator program had with the school. Lockwood indicated this program allows athletes to swim outside of the high school season and does not traditionally conflict with the high school schedule. President Hjelmstad indicated his coach considered this an excellent opportunity for Heather but also considered this an honor for swimmers in North Dakota and should allow this opportunity.

Motion by Sanstead to allow this request. Second by Scheer and carried.

With no further business, President Hjelmstad declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** October 20, 1999 - Bismarck Radisson Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on October 20, 1999 at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. President Hjelmstad called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. with all members present.

Motion by Bjornson to approve the minutes of the September 20 regular meeting and September 30 Special meeting. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the 1999-2000 finance and budget reports through September 30, 1999. Also presented was a report as encouraged by the NDHSAA auditor indicating all investments are secured either through the FDIC or the SIGF. Motion by Tollefson to accept the report. Second by Krueger and carried.

K. Hjelmstad reported on behalf of the Wrestling Committee. The committee presented recommendations for the format of the Dual Team/Individual Team State Wrestling Tournament. The report included the following plans for the combination dual and team wrestling state tourna-

- One team from each of the eight Class B regions and four from each of the Class A will compete in their respective dual team tournament.
- Teams will be allowed up to three alternates, not to be included in team payments. These alternates will be provided with a tournament pass. - Schools will be reimbursed for weight classes filled up to 14.
- Suggested ticket prices will be: Adults \$29 with consideration to increase the price to \$32 or the amount to mirror the cost of the state basketball tournament the following year. Students -
- The first year, individual championships and team dual championships will be held in the evening with the individual tournament held first.
- Each region may determine how they will qualify the team for the state dual tournament using one of the following guidelines:

- a. Individual team competition at the regional tournament
- b. Regular season dual records
- c. Designate a qualifying dual team tournament during the regular season with an emphasis schools work toward no additional loss of school time.
- Note: Dual team competition is encouraged during the regular season.
- Forfeits without a medical reason substantiated by medical personnel will disqualify said student from the remainder of the entire state tournament.
- Details not set by the committee will be determined by the state tournament manager and staff member Carlsrud.
- The committee felt with this being the first year of the tournament, there will be some details that will need to be reviewed for possible revision the following year. Motion by Scheer to accept the report. Second by Lukach and carried.

Lukach reported on behalf of the Football Committee. The committee discussed the coop formula and how it affects the divisioning. The General Assembly will be informed that the committee is conducting an ongoing study of this item. Also, discussion involved the extensive miles traveled for the first round of play-offs being conducted on a school night. The Football Committee will continue to study the many aspects of the entire football program. Motion by Boschee to approve the report. Second by Krueger and carried.

A jetter from Four Winds requesting to be included in the 9-man football play-off plan for the 2000 season. They are currently playing a junior varsity schedule. This item was tabled until later in the meeting.

Krueger reported on behalf of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee indicating the final draft of the reformatted Constitution and By-Laws document is ready for presentation to the General Assembly. Krueger also reviewed the two amendments the Board will be proposing at the General Assembly meeting on Friday. The committee discussed various interest groups wishing to present awards which are tied to a business sponsorship. These ventures need to be considered for authorization to continue these practices.

The Committee indicated to the Board their future plans to study the eligibility rules and how they relate to the present school picture. This will be done with the assistance of legal consultation.

Krueger reported on their discussion of the ejection rule. By rule, in the event a coach is elected from a contest, the amendment does not address the specific parameters under which the suspension is be conducted. The initial intent for an elected coach is he/she shall not to be on site of the contest(s) designated in the suspension, including the warm-up. To clarify this, motion by Krueger to adopt the following note as clarification: "When a coach has been ejected in accordance with Section XIII, he/she is not allowed to attend any of his/her team's games or to be on site for any pre-game contact direct or indirect with players during the suspension." Second by Scheer and carried.

Boschee reported on behalf of the Personnel Committee with a finalization of the study of a pension program that must be adopted for the new Executive Secretary as well as any support staff not covered under TFFR. The committee met with a representative from Valec to clarify questions that had arisen during the study. Valec, because their company works with the North Dakota Administrators, will waive the start-up charges to set up a retirement plan for the Exec. Sec and the support staff. The representative also indicated there will be no annual fee. This would fulfill the need for an approved retirement plan. Motion by Sanstead to approve the Valec pension plan. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The other issue relating to an associate position within the staff has been tabled until November.

Boschee reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee. They reviewed the request from White Shield to move from District 15 to District 10 because of the travel required to play the team furthest from them in their current district. The committee thoroughly discussed this request as well as the total picture concerning district movement. The committee is of the Opinion any district movement at this time would be premature and recommended delay of any action on district assignments until the total redistricting plan is revised. At the time of said

redistricting, a strong consideration will be given to the White Shield request. Motion by Lukach to deny the White Shield request. Second by Scheer and carried.

President Hjelmstad reported to the Board concerning the continuing study of the loss of school time as related to activities. Questioned is what area(s) are the concerns? Do they deal with with loss of school time during the regular season, is it any particular sport, student's school time, teacher's absence, post-season tournaments, etc. Suggested is ongoing study by an active committee as appointed by President Hjelmstad: Loren Scheer, (Principals Association), Robert Tollefson (Class B representative), Terry Hjelmstad (Athletic Administrators Association), Karl Ann Dunderland (School Boards Association) and Wayne Sanstead (Department of Public Instruction). These people will meet and discuss these questions as well as the suggestions from the various groups. Tollefson suggested the concerns may be different in various areas of the state and may be somewhat affected by local decisions.

The Board held audience with Principal Roger Gendreau from Shanley concerning a hardship application submitted for Marie Strinden. Toso followed with a report on his investigation of this hardship situation with a recommendation to grant the request. Motion by Boschee to approve the request. Second by Scheer and carried.

Mark Vollmer and Deb Severson of Willow City appeared before the Board concerning their forfeiture of all boys' basketball games for the 1999-2000 year and plans for cooperative sponsorships for the 2000-2001 year which necessitates the dissolution of their current cooperative sponsorships with Bottineau in all activities except hockey. This will go into effect after the current school year except the boysÕ basketball program which would be an emergency clause. Vollmer added they have experienced the benefits of being in the current coperative sponsorship for girls' basketball. Motton by Toso to accept an emergancy cooperative sponsorship with Towner and Upham. Second by Krueger and carried.

Motion by Lukach to dissolve all coops except hockey with Bottineau. Second by Krueger and carried.

Motion by Toso, to approve Willow City's requests for cooperative sponsorships as indicated by their applications: Towner for football, volleyball, Boys' and Girls' Track, and Boys' Golf. Second by Krueger and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the ongoing changes in cooperative sponsor-ships among a number of schools including Walhalla, Pembina, Neche, Drayton, St. Thomas and Valley. A request has been communicated from all parties involved to dissolve the Pembina/Drayton/Neche football coop. Motion by Lukach to dissolve the North Border (Pembina/Drayton/Neche) football coop. Second by Toso and carried.

Supt. Morgan Huset of Walhalla appeared before the Board to explain the current situation concerning various requests to dissolve old coops and possible requests to approve new coops.

Motion by Lukach to approve the application for Walhalla/Neche/Pembina for wrestling for the 1999-2000 season. Second by Scheer and carried.

Motion by Lukach to accept the football cooperative sponsorhsip application for Walhalla/Neche/Pembina beginning with the fall of 2000. Second by Scheer and carried.

The request for a Neche/Pembina with Walhalla cooperative sponsorship for girls' basketball was discussed. Motion by Bjornson to accept the application beginning with the 2000-2001 year. Second by Krueger and carried with two dissenting votes.

Krueger suggested the study of some type of new protocol to clearify and assist the Board in the review of the cooperative sponsorship program.

The Board returned to the request from Four Winds to be assigned to a football region which was tabled earlier. Motion by Lukach to assign Four Winds to Region 2 for 9-man football. Second by Toso and carried.

The Board reviewed a cooperative sponsorship application for Thompson to Grand Forks Red

River for wrestling. Motion by Sanstead to accept the request. Second by Toso and carried.

A cooperative sponsorship application for Grand Forks Schroeder and Grand Forks Christian for 7 & 8 grade boys' basketball and girls' volleyball was reviewed. Motion by Scheer to approve. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Board read the letters of request for dissolvment of the coop of South Heart to Dickinson for volleyball. Motion by Toso to accept the request. Second by Boschee and carried.

Motion by Scheer to approve the request for South Heart to Belfield for volleyball. Second by Krueger.

By a show of hands, the board indicated they felt the late fee must be assessed South Heart for the late request of an existing program.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of a request to grant immediate eligibility for visa student, Kristine Lasso attending Powers Lake not under an approved program. Motion by Lukach to approve the request. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Krueger reported on a hardship investigation concerning Nathan Zahn who transferred from Montana to Westhope. Several unsuccessful attempts have been made to reach the parent. Motion by Sanstead to approve the request. Second by Krueger and carried.

Bjornson reported on a hardship request for Tyler Moe who transferred from Edinburg to Park River. Motion by Lukach to deny the hardship request. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared a letter from the Fargo-Moorhead Junior High League concerning the low officials fee for junior high officials making it difficult to secure officials to work their games. This request was passed on to the North Dakota Officials Association for their recommendation.

A letter from Minot reporting their school for a student's half violation by playing more than the maximum allowed in soccer. Motion by Boschee to send a letter of reprimand for the violation and thank them for reporting the violation. Second by Krueger and carried.

Krueger reported on a hardship investigation concerning Christopher Peltier who wishes to transfer from Dunseith to Bottineau. K. Hjelmstad indicated a concern for the situation as not fitting under the hardship rule. Tollefson added this is a local issue. Motion by Toso to deny, Second by Tollefson and carried.

A letter from Scott Kittell, President of the North Dakota Media organization was reviewed. This letter indicated the organizations attempt to set a policy to be used in the selection of the all-tournament teams. Recommended is the all-tournament selection process be reinstated for regional state basketball tournaments. The Board indicated the need for the regional tournament management be given the responsibility of monitoring the selections to ensure they fit the selection criteria. Motion by Bjornson to approve the media selection of all-tournament teams at regional and state basketbail tournaments using the recommended selection policy. Second by Krueger and carried.

Motion by Lukach that this policy be recommended for media use at regions and will be required at the state tournaments. Second by Toso and carried.

The Board heard a request from Fargo Shanley for a foreign exchange visa student, Katja Pietruska who is attending Shanley but not through an approved program. Motion by Krueger to approve eligibility. Second by K. Hjelmstad and carried.

The Executive Secretary's report was given.

- a. Recently attended the Section 5 meeting and discussed the current NDHSAA event sanctioning plan and the upcoming possible changes.
- b In discussion with Lockton Insurance, 23 schools in the state take the extended catastrophic coverage.
- © South Dakota is currently experiencing a situation of one of their girls' basketball team being

invited to Oregon for a tournament. The date of this tournament is out of South Dakota's season and has been ruled illegal by the SDHSAA. As a result of that denial, the governor has stepped in causing the association to reverse their decision.

d. The NDHSAA has rented a booth at the upcoming North Dakota School Boards Association.
e. The NDSBA has received recommendations for two resolutions (1) no activities to be held before Labor Day and (2) expressed concern for not having an authorized voter representing each member school board at NDHSAA General Assembly meetings.

f. The minutes from the October 16, 1999 NDOA meeting was given to the Officials Committee. g. The Executive Secretary is meeting with the managers of the major tournaments to discuss various aspects of the management of the state tournaments.

h. The staff has had two technology planning meetings with four sessions remaining. The Board will receive a report on the technology planning at the January Board meeting. i. There are two incidents to be reported:

(1) A Mohall bus had windows shot at with a pellet gun. This situation is being left to the local law enforcement as there is no direct connection with the member schools.

(2) The varsity Mandaree girls' basketball team pulled out of a game in the third quarter at a scheduled game with the Williston junior varsity. As the players left the floor, they displayed obscene gestures at the Williston crowd. The Mandaree athletic director indicated there was taunting from the Williston players. Two Mandaree players and one cheerleader have been suspended for the next regular season game and one district tournament game. These three students have written a letter of apology to the school. The Mandaree coach has received a letter of reprimand from the Mandaree athletic director.

Motion by Toso to suspend Mandaree from the District Girls' Basketball Tournament. The motion died for a lack of a second.

Motion by Lukach to place Mandaree school on probation for all activities. This probation is to continue to for one calendar year ending October 20, 2000. Second by Krueger and carried.

Motion by Toso to suspend the girls' basketball coach for the remainder of the season, through the state tournament. Motion died for a lack of a second.

Motion by K Hjelmstad to direct the Executive Secretary to suggest to the Mandaree athletic director that in addition to the actions that they have taken, to consider having the coach suspended for one game. Second by Krueger and carried with one dissenting vote.

The Executive Secretary read a letter from official Ron Wright of the Williston Officials' Association citing New Town and Renville County football teams for a night of positive competition where each team, coaches and fans displayed good sportsmanship.

The Executive Secretary commended the Board committees for the extensive effort they have put into their meetings.

A discussion was held concerning the awards and the process for presentation of these awards at state tournaments.

The Board reviewed the agenda for the Friday, October 22, 1999 General Assembly meeting. Sanstead was appointed as parliamentarian for the meeting.

Sanstead shared with the Board the number of school programs that have been canceled with no way to fill the void.

With no further business, motion by Boschee to adjourn. Second by Bjornson and carried.

Chairman of the NDHSAA Board of Directors' Constitution and By-Laws Committee, Krueger Introduced the proposed amendment to Part Two, Article XIII - RULES OF ELIGIBILITY Section X, Part a, of the By-Laws and moved for adoption of the amendment to read as follows:

a. A student shall have been in attendance at the school which he/she represents for 90 school days upon transferring from another school unless his/her parents have become residents of the school district to which he/she transferred or unless the school from which he/she transferred does not offer work of the corresponding year in which he/she is ranked, and in the instance of a pupil transferring from a public high school to a private or parochial high school in the same city, or visa versa, he/she shall not be eligible to represent the new high school in varsity competition for 90 school days. Should a school district maintain more than one high school, residence shall be understood to refer to the territory assigned to a specific high school by the Board of Education, and any transfer by a student from one school to an-

other within the school district without a corresponding change in parental residence shall result in a loss of eligibility in varsity competition for 90 school days. If a student begins his/her high school career in a school other than the one in the district of his/her parents' residence or if a student who has previously transferred from one high school to another without a corresponding change in parental residence re-transfers to the original school of eligibility, he/she shall be immediately eligible in said school if the re-transfer is made at the beginning of the school year. Second by Craig Perry of Grand Forks. By voice vote the amendment passed unanimously.

OFFICIAL YEARBOOK

Chairman of the NDHSAA Board of Directors' Constitution and By-Laws Committee, Krueger introduced the proposed amendment to Part Two, Article VIII - AWARDS, Section IV to add the wording:

No awards shall be accepted which in any way advertises any firm or individual so far as commercial or business interests are concerned "with the exception of NDHSAA approved corporate sponsors for NDHSAA awards. (Emergency Clause). Second by Supt. David Rust of Tioga. By voice vote, the amendment passed with a small number of dissenting votes.

Cooperative sponsorship applications were reviewed for Sykeston to Carrington for football, boys' basketball, girls' basketball, boys and girls track, wrestling, volleyball, boys' and girls' cross country and boys' and girls' golf. Motion by Boschee to approve. Second by Krueger and carried

Supt. Stringer informed the Board of the situation of three senior students from Sykeston who wish to finish their last year of school continuing their involvement with the athletic teams originally formed through the now dissolved Sykeston/Fessenden-Bowdon cooperative sponsorship programs. Several parents appeared before the Board represented by Cindy Felan as the spokesperson requesting the Board to allow the three Sykeston students to finish their senior season with their current team at Fessenden-Bowdon. Bjornson suggested the Board needs to conduct a significant study into this issue and any other possible issues that may arise with the increased number of requests to dissolve cooperative sponsorship programs. Motion by Bjornson to refer this issue to the Constitution and By-Laws Committee to be addressed via a special meeting in December. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board held an exhaustive discussion concerning the many issues raised because of unsportsmanlike conduct reported on several occasions involving Hankinson. In the absence of an administrator from Hankinson, Rick Jacobson of Wyndmere was asked by the Hankinson administration to be in attendance at this Board meeting. Following an extensive discussion in which the Board indicated Hankinson would benefit from hearing the points raised by the discussion, motion by Boschee to table this issue and request the Hankinson delegation to appear before the Board. Second by Krueger. After an additional extensive discussion, motion carried unanimously.

Continued discussion centered around the inappropriate actions by a Hankinson fan that led to physical contact of an official. Motion by Lukach to declare this fan to be banned from all NDHSAA sanctioned activities events for the remainder of the 1999-2000 school year. Second by Scheer and carried.

Mandaree School Board president, Ted Lone Fight and members of the Mandaree School Board appeared before the Board to appeal the decision of being placed on probation. This action took place at the October 20, 1999 NDHSAA Board meeting. Also speaking was the Mandaree school district attorney, Vance Gillette, team coach, Sherry Turner and several other members of the Mandaree School Board. Correspondingly, apprehension was expressed on the issue of inconsistent officiating and the feeling that some teams are treated unfairly in contests. Following an extensive discussion, the Board commended the Mandaree School District for their actions to address their sportsmanship issues and thanked them for making the effort to establish communication with the association.

Lone Fight also requested a review of a letter addressed to the NDHSAA Board of Directors from FBISBA. One of the concerns was the lack of representation for Native Americans on the NDHSAA Board. Mr. Lone Fight was informed the addition of a representative on the Board of Directors could only be done through an amendment sponsored by a member school. Mr. Lone Fight was also informed of a previous meeting in which Supt. Terry Yellow Fat presented a similar request and was invited by the Board to have a representative sit in on the meetings as a non-voting guest, similar to a practice once rendered by the Athletic Administrators Association.

The protest procedure was clarified. Mr. Lone Fight thanked the Board for their attention and indicated he looks forward to continuing dialogue with the Board.

The Board discussed Mandaree's request to lift the probation which was placed on the school at the October meeting. This request cited additional information which took place during the incident in question which involved Williston fans. Motion by K. Hjelmstad to follow the proper procedure to investigate the allegations that have come from Mandaree concerning Williston in the situation from which the probation for Mandaree was initiated. Second by Scheer and carried

Regarding the request from Mandaree to lift the probation, motion by Toso to deny. Second by Krueger and carried.

Lukach gave a report on behalf of the Football Committee. The committee discussed preliminary items such as adjustments that may be needed in preparation of the next two-year plan.

Boschee reported on behalf of the Personnel Committee concerning the organization of the staff. This has been tabled until the January committee meeting with all assistant staff members to attend that meeting.

Scheer reported on behalf of the Officials Committee with the following:

- a. The committee discussed the officials fee schedule and the decline in the number of registered officials. It is the feeling of the committee there is a need to do something about officials fees. The committee will be meeting in January to allow time to receive input from the member schools.
- b. Recommend using a 5-person officiating crew for the state finals in football.
- c. The committee discussed changing the wording of the officiating fee schedule from "maximum" to "recommended". The concern with this change could result in placing officials and schools in a bidding war. Prior to any action on this item, this proposal also needs to be communicated with the member schools.
- d. The \$15 meal allowance for gymnastics and wrestling officials for regional competition was inadvertently deleted from the policy manual. This will be added to the current policy manual. Motion by Scheer to accept this report. Second by Toso and carried.

Lukach reported on behalf of the District Chairpersons' meeting. These recommendations will be reviewed at the June Annual meeting.

The Board reviewed the applications for cooperative sponsorship programs. Motion by Scheen to table approval of the Mott/Regent coop request and approve the following: Langdon/Pembina for boys' cross country; Trenton/Trinity Christian for boys' and girls' golf; Maple Valley/Oriska for girls' basketball; Four Winds/Warwick for football; Pembina/Neche/Walhalla for boys' and girls' golf, boys' basketball and volleyball; Valley/St. Thomas/Drayton for football; and Drayton/St. Thomas for boys' and girls' golf. Second by Toso and carried.

The Board reviewed letters from Kulm and Wimbledon-Courtenay reporting themselves for dressing more than the maximum allowed for post season basketball and from Discovery for playing an academically ineligible student in a game. Motion by Scheer to send letters of reprimand for these violations and acknowledging their commitment as members of the association in reporting themselves. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared the proposals to clarify the policies used in the applications and renewals of cooperative sponsorships. That wording reads:

"To emphasize the importance of avoiding late cooperative sponsorships requests or renewals, the Board has placed a \$500 late fee on any co-op application involving schools with existing programs or renewals submitted after the last day of state competition for each activity. Each season ends with the last day of the state tournament in that sport/activity." Motion by Tollefson to approve. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board there has been a great amount of effort being made by the association and officials in the improvement of officiating in general.

Staff member Carlsrud shared with the Board a proposal to revise the policies concerning the sanctioning of activities. This revision would require no written applications for sanctioning intrastate and bordering states/provinces events. The process for registering and reporting results of track and field qualifying meets will be finalized and communicated to the member schools at the mandatory rules clinics. The Board would approve a blanket sanction for all intrastate and bordering states/provinces events not requiring National Federation sanctioning. Therefore, submitting sanctioning forms for the aforementioned would no longer be necessary. National Federation sanction forms must be completed and sent to the NDHSAA office with a \$50 fee, as mandated by the National Federation, when more than three teams compete and:

- 1. An event is sponsored by a university, theme park, shoe company, etc.
- 2. Eight or more schools compete, at least one being from a non-bordering state.
- 3. Schools from five or more states compete with at least one being from a non-bordering state. Motion by Tollefson to approve the proposal to go into effect immediately. Second by Bjornson

and carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from the Sports Marketing division of Gatorade requesting support for the Gatorade Circle of Champions program. Motion by Krueger to approve the Gatorade request. Second by Toso and carried.

A rule violation from Grand Forks was discussed. The violation occurred when a member of their coaching staff was ejected from a basketball game after he had received a second technical. This coach continued to coach the next game although he should not have been allowed to do so. Motion by Scheer to place Grand Forks Red River on probation for a period of one year. Second by Toso and carried.

The Board read a letter from Fargo South requesting permission for a member of their boys' swimming and diving team to compete outside of the team in season at an invitational meet in Canada. Based on the Constitution and By-Laws rule concerning out-of-season rule, motion by Bjornson to deny. Second by Tollefson and carried.

A letter from the Coaches Association requesting permission to continue with their NDHSCA Outstanding Senior Athlete of the Year Award which is underwritten by Burger King. Motion by Lukach to approve the request. Second by Dunderland and carried.

The Board reviewed the request from Harvey to be released from the Anamoose/Drake coop for boys' and girls' track. Motion by Scheer to approve. Second by Dunderland and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported the recommendation received to set McVille and Larimore as the sites of the 2000 Girls' Class B State Golf tournament. Motion by Krueger to approve these recommended sites. Second by Dunderland and carried.

The Executive Secretary read a letter from Bjornson announcing his retirement at the end of the school year and his appreciation for being a member of the NDHSAA Board of Directors. The Board discussed the Constitution and By-Laws process for selection of a temporary replacement for that position.

Among the items of the Executive Secretary's report were:

- A letter from Glenburn expressing appreciation for addressing sportsmanship at the recent administrators conference in Bismarck.
- The office technology plan is progressing. There will be a plan forthcoming for Board consideration at the January meeting.

The Board set their next meeting date as a special meeting December 7th at 10:00 a.m. in Vailey City.

With no further business, the meeting was declared adjourned.

MINUTES Class B District Chairmen's Meeting 10:00 A.M. - November 19, 1999 Radisson Inn, Bismarck, ND

The Class B District Chairmen met at 10:00 a.m. on November 19, 1999 at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. Chairman Lukach called the meeting to order and welcomed the district chairmen explaining the recommendations from this meeting will be combined with the recommendations from the Class B District Chairmen's meeting in March and reviewed by the NDHSAA Board of Directors at their June Annual meeting.

The following recommendations are listed with marked additional comments from the group discussion:

District 1: Supt. Rick Jacobson of Wyndmere reported:

- 1. Rotate girls' basketball regional tournament site between Valley City, Wahpeton and Fargo.
- 2. Set up district alignment to be the same for volleyball, boys' basketball and girls' basketball.
- It was noted that because of the number of schools that do not sponsor a volleyball program, using the same district lines would cause an imbalance of numbers.
- 3. The first round of the 9-man football play-offs should be played within the region.
- The Executive Secretary indicated the Football Committee will be addressing this issue along with other issues dealing with the next 2-year plan.
- 4. Football officials knowledge of rules is inconsistent. Example is the 30-point rule.
- 5. Eliminate using sanction forms for every event. Use one for to list all events schools are planning to host during the school year.
- The sanctioning process has been placed on the agenda for the NDHSAA Board meeting later in the day.
- 6. Eliminate coaches coming out to center court to meet with captains and officials prior to game.
- -This is a National Federation rule and coaches are not being required to attend the pre-game meeting at center court but rather in front of the score table.
- 7. Eligibility forms for individual sports are unnecessary.
- 8. Head to head tie breaker formula for football is unfair.
- Carlsrud stated the formula will be clarified in the future.
- 9. Eliminate Thursday and Friday pre-season practices in the fall (drop from 9 to 7 required practices). Starting date is too early.
- First round of State Class B Girls' Basketball tournament needs to be and should be televised.
- The wrestling group also wishes to have the state tournament televised.

District 2: Supt. Larry Gegelman of Central Cass reported:

- 1. Football play-off format needs discussion. Specifically issues of travel distance on a school night.
- 2. Discuss the option of having 3 referees for basketball games. Part of the issue of crowd and coach hostility is the lack of adequate referees and inconsistent calls by the referees. Would three officials help?
- The District Chairs were informed that they may and some do hire 3-whistle officiating crews for basketball.
- 3. There is a concern for consistency in calls by the officials. Example, some officials enforce logo on socks, uniforms tucked in, tattoos, rough play issues, etc., while others don't. This inconsistency is difficult for players, coaches and fans to accept and is one cause for hostile situations. Gegelman added there seems to be an attitude of officials that in one-sided games, they just want to get it over with.
- Tollefson shared there is an issue of fees that may be causing us to lose officials.
- Schneider stated three officials will not help if they don't blow their whistle.
- Barry Haggin stated the Williston Officials Association brings in young people for a "Super Saturday" tournament hosted by the Class B schools to provide experience for new officials.
- The Executive Secretary stated that not blowing the whistle is not the only concern. There is more to the issue with officials not being hired back if they enforce certain rules.
- Loren Mathson stated some officials that work all levels have difficulty in the transition. Also, officials make an effort to do a good job but are burning out and there is no one to replace them.
- Ronald Gade Can you hire 3-person for more contested games and hire two-person for the remainder of the games? Yes contact visiting school and inform them of the plan.
- Solberg shared that coaches attending the pre-game conference is where coaches are to certify that all players are in legal uniforms. Some coaches that refuse to attend this pre-game meeting may be part of the concern for overall picture of sportsmanship.
- Gade cited a situation in which they were upset about a call and approached the official after the game. Later that night, they saw the play on television highlights, and the call was correct.
- 4. Move the NDEA Convention to early August. October dates cause a conflict in athletic scheduling, especially football play-offs. Also, the convention should be a motivation to start up the new year and it is too late to do this in October.
- Suggested was to approach the Council of School Leaders to see if they could work with this.
- Myron Jurry encouraged administrators to approach their NDEA people in their schools.

Hetler stated the dates have been set through 2004.

- Tollefson A representative needs to sit in with their NDEA Board meeting.
- Mathson Does see it as a valuable and motivational tool for teachers.
- Krueger suggested they should tie all association's meetings together.
- Gegelman stated vocational education holds their conference the middle of August.

pistrict 3: Supt. Sherryl Houdek of Thompson reported:

- Girls' basketball should remain in the fall.
- The Executive Secretary gave an update of the proposed changing of girls' basketball and volleyball seasons in South Dakota.
- 2. How are regional officials selected?
- Carlsrud gave an overview of how the selection of regional and state basketball officials are selected with the ballot calling for the signature of the head coach and an administrator.

District 4: Athletic Director Jim Gebur of Drayton:

No recommendations.

District 5: Prin. Richard Diegel of Edgeley:

No recommendations.

District 6: Supt. Loren Scheer of Hazelton-Moffit-Braddock:

- 1. Bench decorum is an issue. Officials are afraid they aren't going to be hired back if they make calls. We need the athletic administrators to contract those officials that have the courage to make the calls including the technicals charged to coaches.
- 2. As a member of the Football Committee, Scheer reported alignments are up for discussion and request the District Chairmen to share any suggestions.
- District 6 voted to have the regional boys' basketball tournament in Hazelton. The ultimate goal should be some type of rotation in regions where the districts cannot agree on the regional site.

District 7: Supt. Myron Jury of Minnewaukan/Sheyenne reported:

- f. Schedule conflicts such as one act play being scheduled the same time as a regional basketball tournament needs to be studied to make certain this does not happen. This needs to be emphasized to the regional committees to avoid scheduling conflicts.
- 2. Timing of teachers' convention creates a long layoff between last regular season game and the district basketball tournament.
- 3. There is concern about missed school time for activities and if we don't do something about if the legislature will. This happens mainly in spring with baseball and track.

District 8: - Supt. Dave Schneider of Edmore reported:

- The NDHSAA continue its emphasis on sportsmanship at all levels of competition.
- 2. The admission fees charged at regional events be reviewed with consideration being given to number of games played, all day events, etc. For example: the same admission price is charged for one football game as an all day wrestling meet.
- 3. Some guidelines be established for the expenses that are charged at play-off events that would be consistent across the state. There seems to be some inconsistencies in what is charged.
- 4. The regional football play-off games be reviewed/adjusted so excessive travel is not involved especially on evenings followed by a school day. Is there any consideration for neutral field?

District 9: Supt. Gordon Davis of New Salem:

No further recommendations.

District 10: Supt. Les Kramer of Wilton stated their district recommendations have been discussed

District 11: Supt. George Wieland of Drake reported:

- 1 Rugby requests to co-op with Leeds in cross country and remain in Class B. Requests for size exemptions for combined enrollments in coops now exists in wrestling.
- Tollefson stated with the rapidly changing enrollments, the cooperative sponsorship programs are in a continuing state of flux.

2. Request the cut-off date for 9-man football be moved up to 10-10-00 to allow first play-off game to be played on Saturday before teachers' convention. This would allow a full week before the second play-off game on the Saturday after teachers' convention. If the teachers' convention is moved back in subsequent years, the old play-off format used prior to the moving of the teachers' convention should be reinstated.

3. Request activities be allowed on Saturday after teachers' convention.

District 12: Supt. Ron Gade of Our Redeemer's reported:

1. Requesting a clarification of the regional team assignments to the state basketball. Is there a possibility of seeding the state tournament?

District 13: Supt. Roger Pommerer of New England reported:

- 1. Look into the coaches being able to call time-outs and how the referee looking at a requesting coach may miss something that happens on the court.
- 2. Still some concern on how the home sites are selected on ties in football. Could we reintroduce the power poll.
- Carlsrud stated the rationale for not using the power poll was to allow teams to play other divisions without causing themselves a seeding penalty.
- 3. Out of season tournaments seem to be getting out of hand.

District 14: Supt. Loren Mathson of South Heart requested:

1. Study the three class system in basketball

District 15: Athletic Administrator Tom Suelzle of Watford City reported:

- 1. With concern for lack of officials, we need to get over wanting just a few select officials. Also, we need to use high school students to officiate junior high contests.
- 2. Encourage administrators to compliment officials after the game.

District 16: Activities Director, Barry Haggin of Divide County reported:

- 1. The NDHSAA hold no rules clinics during the district tournaments.
- Hetler encouraged administrators to report good sportsmanship for the Award of Excellence program.
- Scheer stated referees are human and encouraged needed support from administrators.
- The Executive Secretary stated the group discussion today indicates a willingness to collectively address the sportsmanship issue. There is a definite need for support from administrators and in turn there is a need for support of those administrators from their local school boards.

With no further business, the meeting was declared adjourned.

MINUTES

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors - Special Meeting December 7, 1999

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was held in Valley City on December 7, 1999. The meeting was called to order by President Hjelmstad at 10:00 A.M. with all members present except Scheer.

President Hjelmstad explained the purpose of this special meeting was to deal with items that were tabled at the November regular meeting and were in need of decisions in December.

Supt. Scrivner of Hankinson appeared before the Board as requested at the November 19, 1999 meeting. Scrivner addressed the points of concern in connection with reports of unsportsmanlike conduct at a Hankinson football game and the associated reports. One of the

actions resulting from these reports was the banning of a Hankinson fan from all NDHSAA sanctioned events for the remainder of the 1999-2000 school year.

Following Scrivner's presentation, K. Hjelmstad inquired if the Hankinson football coach indicated any remorse for his conduct. Tollefson indicated the letter from Supt. Scrivner written to banned spectator Krause was not clear and that the emphasis on sportsmanship appeared to belong to the Association and not necessarily the school system. Our concern is that these issues be addressed by all involved including administration, parents, school boards, etc.

Hankinson Principal Smith asked for direction as to their responsibility in keeping the banned fan from attending away contests. It was clarified that the fan is banned from activities to the best of their ability but they cannot follow this individual. K. Hjelmstad indicated the administration can call upon the dignity of the fan to avoid attending all activities. Boschee suggested this fan be given the opportunity to reverse the negative attention by not drawing further attention to himself by attendance at any activity events. Boschee also stated each school is responsible at heir home site and felt there is enough information out there that other communities know this individual and will report this person's presence. K. Hjelmstad indicated this fan needs to know he is not welcome at any events. Toso asked if it would be advisable for Hankinson to write to the district schools informing them of this ban and asking them to cooperate. Prin. Smith indicated that the surrounding communities already know who he is and does not see a need to further pursue. President Hjelmstad thanked the delegation for coming. A letter from Supt. Scrivner as well as a letter from the Executive Secretary will be written to this banned individual.

Krueger reported on behalf of the Constitution and By-Laws committee to discuss the issues that had arisen from the Sykeston request to allow three seniors to continue to participate with the school from their dissolved coop. This would call for eligibility for students from one school to participate in programs in more than one school. A survey of state associations indicated that the 24 states responding who do sponsor coops do not offer any special rulings for any specific students involved in a coop. Motion by Tollefson to deny the request based on the research of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee. Second by Krueger and carried.

Supt. Hanson of North Central and Supt. J Gauderman of Wimbledon-Courtenay as well as a delegation from North Central appeared before the Board concerning their cooperative sponsorship applications. Supt. Hanson presented a history of the planning of the cooperative sponsorship program request for girls' and boys' basketball that is currently being considered. This request has been met with community response, both positive and negative. Two North Central School Board members spoke to both sides of the issue. Mr. Lettenmaier spoke on behalf of the patrons indicating each school represented in this request has sufficient numbers to host their own programs. Bjornson stated coops were not meant to be approved to the detriment of a particular school district nor to cause community strife. Numbers were looked at as far as how many participants were counted for each school. Tollefson indicated he was part of a cooperative sponsorship application that was denied based on the fact that there was sufficient numbers. Motion by Lukach to deny the request. Second by Bjornson and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board that it is important to note this issue has been denied based on the response from the administration of each school and is not based on the fact that a number of patrons from a school district came to the meeting. The Board does not want to have every decision that is made contested by the general public in this type of forum.

The Board reviewed the cooperative sponsorship application from Regent and Mott for football.

Motion by Tollefson to approve. Second by Boschee and carried with one dissenting vote.

The application for the Pembina/Neche/Walhalla coop request for boys' & girls' golf and boys' basketball was reviewed. Motion by Krueger to approve. Second by Bjornson and carried.

Krueger reported on the remaining agenda from the Constitution and By-Laws Committee concerning the dissolution of cooperative sponsorship programs and the need to sponsor an amendment to substantiate the fact that programs may be dissolved prior to the end of the three-year term. The Amendment sponsored by the NDHSAA Board shall read: "3. Cooperative sponsorship agreements will be enforced for a minimum of three years. Any early dissolution of cooperative agreements requires NDHSAA Board of Directors' approval. Dissolution will

be considered only upon receipt of an official letter from each school board requesting consideration to end the agreement prior to the conclusion of the three-year period." This amendment will be sent to the membership at least 30 days prior to the General Assembly meeting in January, 2000. Motion by Krueger to present this amendment to the General Assembly at the January meeting as an emergency clause. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board discussed further the upcoming changes that may occur with the altering scene in North Dakota schools and how this may cause the review of the purpose and intent of the cooperative sponsorship program.

T. Hjelmstad reported on behalf of the Loss of Class Time ad hoc committee. The committee reviewed the recommendations that came from the North Dakota School Study Council. The Board recognized that any standardization of recommendations is difficult to formulate because of the various situations in each school's geography, sharing of faculty, I-TV classes, etc. The Board discussed post-season for football, primarily the travel time on a school night for the first round games. Recommendations as reviewed will be studied at the January committee meeting including a plan to address the General Assembly with some items that the committee will endorse in an attempt to avoid loss of classroom time.

Tim O'Leary joined the meeting to meet the members of the Board. The Executive Secretary introduced Mr. O'Leary and asked him for a brief overview of the hockey scene in North Dakota. Mr. O'Leary stated that the sport of hockey has changed as far as players and the emphasis on sportsmanship as well as more of the coaching staff are now faculty members as opposed to individuals hired outside the school district. The style of hockey has become more of a finesse and speed type of game and is much more exciting to watch. Many of the North Dakota players and officials have gone on to a higher level of the game. Mr. O'Leary complimented the NDHSAA on the sponsorship of the hockey program and their efforts in the continuing improvement of the hockey program. The issue of high school students leaving school early to play junior hockey is a real problem. Mr. O'Leary emphasized the junior and senior years of high school hockey are important and those leaving school early to play on these leagues are putting themselves in a setting with older players that is not always desirable. The Board discussed the problems with the Chicago Show Case and the lack of supervision for these young people. The last item presented by Mr. O'Leary was since the jamboree concept, the number of registered officials has doubled.

President Hjelmstad shared with the Board the final draft of the schedule for the upcoming State Wrestling Tournament,

President Hjelmstad requested a discussion of the 2000 cross country season conflicts. Motion by Tollefson to place this item on the agenda for the January meeting. Second by Sanstead

Tollefson requested a study of a four-year calendar and make available for review at the next

The Executive Secretary introduced Scott Olson and Kent Sortland from Dakota Internet Technologies, Inc. Their presentation informed the Board on how they will be able to assist the Association with their website and are willing to participate in an interaction with member schools via the internet. Motion by K. Hjelmstad to empower Executive Secretary to work on the details and draft a letter to member schools encouraging them to participate in this trial run for boys' basketball and volleyball. These results as well as other details will be worked out and the results will be presented at the January Board meeting. Second by Tollefson and carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from Fargo South requesting the approval for eligibility for visa student Maria Virginia Cana. Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared his report:

- Revenue and expenditures matched in the hosting of the Hockey Jamboree.

- Congratulations to Dr. Kent Hjelmstad for being selected as the North Dakota Superintendent of the Year.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** January 29, 2000-Bismarck Radisson Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met January 29, 2000 at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. President Hjelmstad called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. with all members present.

Motion by Tollefson to approve the minutes of the November 19th regular meeting and the December 7th special meeting. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Held an audience with James Haussler, Athletic Director of the Bismarck Public Schools, and members of the Bismarck Tournament Committee, concerning expenses incurred at the 1999 State Class B Girls' Basketball Tournament. They suffered a \$4000 deficit while cutting many managerial costs. He offered some solutions for all state sites such as the following: corporate sponsorships, cutting some hospitality, adding a web site to generate advertisement revenue, eliminate practice days to schools, review caps on expenses, and the amount of review team payments to schools and divert more funds to cover tournament costs. Bismarck hosts 15 regional and state events in 1999-2000. Discussion ensued concerning the possibility of raising caps on tournament costs as well as naming a Site Selection Committee to visit these concerns before choosing sites while trying to keep venues equitable for all activities.

The Executive Secretary presented a financial report of the Fund Balance, investment Report, Fall Activities Financial Report and budget-to-date as of December 31, 1999. Motion by Bjornson to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Joe Lukach reported on behalf of the Football Committee relative to early organization of the two-year plan to be implemented in the fall of 2001. Also discussed was a possible 1-to-1 student ratio plan for teams within a cooperative agreements. The committee will seek more input from member schools. well as report of a school paying above the maximum fee. Executive Secretary will investigate.

Held an audience with Lloyd Armstrong of Fargo concerning Team North Dakota and the Chicago Showcase Hockey Tournament. Discussed need for better supervision of players including expanded educational itinerary during the time in Chicago. Motion band carried.

Scheer moved to approve a cooperative agreement for Belfield and South Heart in boys' and girl' golf with payment of the \$500 late fee. Second by Lukach and carried.

Krueger moved to approve a cooperative agreement in boys' and girls' 7-12 track for St. Thomas, Valley and Drayton. Second by Dunderland and carried.

Scheer moved approval of a cooperative agreement for St Thomas and Drayton in volleyball. Second by Dunderland.

Kent Hjelmstad moved approval of a cooperative agreement for Parshall and New Town in boys' and girls' golf with payment of the \$500 late fee. Second by Lukach and carried.

Toso moved approval of the ball bids from Gerrells Sports Center of Grand Forks as follows: VOLLEYBALL- The Tachikara SV-5WH will be supplied free-of-charge for regional and state tournaments (48 balls) for 3 years. Gerrells will make available to schools the Tachikara SV-5WH for \$31.49, The Tachikara SV-18L for \$25.49 and the Tachikara SV-5WS for \$21.99 each. These prices will be honored through the 2002-03 school year. FOOTBALLS - The Wilson TD (1201) will be offered to schools at \$33.94, the Wilson TDV (1232) at \$27.48 and the Wilson 1552 rubber football at \$11.50 each. These prices will be honored through the 2002-03 school year. Both the volleyballs and footballs will carry the National Federation authenticating mark. Second by Dunderland and carried.

Dunderland moved to table the wrestling proposal which would Delete #4 on Page 27 of Con-

stitution and By-laws and would read as follows: "Each team can schedule a minimum of fifteen dates and each wrestler can have a maximum of 35 matches prior to the regional tournaments." or "Each wrestler can have a maximum of 35 matches prior to the regional tournaments." Second by Boschee and tabled.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors - Special Meeting February 10, 2000

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was held in Valley City on February 10, 2000. The meeting was called to order by President Hielmstad at 8:00 A.M. with all members present except Biornson.

President Hjelmstad explained the purpose of this special meeting was to review the revisions of the contract with Dakota Internet Technology. All Board members had previously been provided with a copy of the 3-year contract and together discussed the details.

Tollefson asked for an explanation of the steps in the division of revenue provided by advertising. The Executive Secretary suggested the NDHSAA have final approval of the advertising.

Tollefson indicated a need for a list of what is available on this web site to better inform schools of what the product contains. Schools need to know what they can anticipate in the area of information provided as a result of their participation in the web site.

The Executive Secretary explained Dakota Internet Technologies has agreed to be our web site server. Sendit will no longer be our web site host because of the introduction of advertising. We will need to contact Sendit if the contract is approved,

Dakota Internet Technologies(DIT) is working on forms that will allow schools to electronically file registration forms. At this time, music forms are available to the schools through the web site. The capability to allow schools to electronically submit registration forms is in the plans but is not activated at this time.

DIT spokesperson, Scott Olson indicated he has included in the NDHSAA portion of the contract the wording, OAdvertising type and content is contingent on NDHSAA final approvalÓ.

Krueger confirmed this agreement would be re-evaluated after three years.

The Executive Secretary clarified after 3 years, if the contract is non-renewed, the product is the ownership of the NDHSAA. Sanstead stated the need for this to be clarified with some type of successor statement to clarify the situation after the 3-year term. Tollefson agreed there is a need for wording in the contract to indicate that if at some point DIT goes out of business, the Association is not responsible for DITOs outstanding financial obligations.

K. Hjelmstad suggested the following statement: OThe NDHSAA web site and products thereof, are the property of the NDHSAA. Successor companies which merge with or purchase rights from DIT agree to adhere to this concept. In addition, the NDHSAA is held harmless in the event any companies suffer financial loss.O

Sanstead said while this is a hand-shake agreement, it is important that we do have a contract that protects the parties involved.

President Hjelmstad shared concerns he has heard over the completed segments of the program versus the number of programs in which the NDHSAA is actually involved. These programs need to be included once we start. Tollefson suggested Scott Olson and the NDHSAA staff together formulate expectations as well as time lines. This could be some type of addendum to the contract. The Executive Secretary stated this is good business and goals and time lines will be developed.

Scheer cautioned the need to be careful not to make the contract so complicated that interpretation of the terms become difficult.

K. Hjelmstad agreed the web site needs to be completed over time with consideration for gender balance. Scott Olson shared that the selection of what they are putting on the web site first is not based on popularity but is more general to the number of schools in a particular activity. This is to ensure the success of the project. The final details will be shared with the Board.

Motion by Scheer to approve the 3-year contract as revised. Second by Dunderland and carried.

Olson stated the success of this project generally depends on three items:

a. Development which is mainly done by DIT

b. Marketing which depends on the participation by the schools

c. Affiliations made with the right people and the right companies to make this happen.

President Hjelmstad shared that yesterday in their meeting, the Northwest Schoolmasters complimented the NDHSAA for working with an in-state company.

A final concern was of problems with coaches not wanting statistics to be available for other coaches as being one of the deterrents to the success of this project. It is expected that coaches will soon see the benefits of this program will far outweigh their concerns and the benefits to the students involved in the programs promoting these students.

With no further items, President Hjelmstad declared the meeting adjourned.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on March 10, 2000 at the Minot Holiday Inn Riverside. President Hjelmstad called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present.

The minutes of the January 29 regular meeting, the January 31 General Assembly meeting and the February 10 special meeting were included in the Board member's packets. Motion by Bjornson to approve the minutes with an amendment to the January 29th minutes removing Terry Hjelmstad from the Site Selection Committee list. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report. Motion by Scheer to approve the report. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Lukach reported on behalf of the Football Committee. The committee discussed the drafts of proposed plans and are returning to the drawing board for the A and AA division to fine-tune the plans. This will be on the agenda for committee presentation to the Board at the March 17th meeting. The time-line was discussed and it was suggested the progress of the Football Committee continue to be communicated to the member schools. The April 13th Board meeting is the target date to finalize the plan. This will allow schools ample time to adjust to the plan. The June meeting was also mentioned as a time when the plan can be reviewed by the member schools and respond to the Board. It was decided the April 13th Board meeting will be the goal

for adopting the plan with these four segments:

- 1. The actual Plan
- 2. The Playoff system
- 8. Possible co-op movement as a reaction to the plan
- 4 Adjusted time-lines from April 13th meeting

Motion by Krueger to approve the committee report. Second by Lukach and carried.

At the April meeting the Committee indicated the need to address:

- t. The one for one enrollment count to determine divisioning
- 2. How the divisioning effects the plans geographically
- 3 Any other program issues
- 4. How the plan addresses the philosophy of student participation

Tolletson reported on behalf of the Personnel and Finance Committee. The committee discussed the staff response to the initial two-year salary proposal and the change in the structure of the health insurance plan. After a variety of options were reviewed, the initial offer of 3.5% for the next two years will remain in tact. The Executive Secretary will be sharing this report with the staff. Motion by Lukach to accept the report. Second by Scheer and carried.

Scheer reported on behalf of the Officials Committee with a presentation of proposed changes of the fee schedule. The committee is recommending the Board approve the schedule as presented. Motion by Sanstead to accept the fee schedule as proposed by the committee. Second by Boschee. Tollefson indicated we are not getting new people into officiating and hopefully, the sub-varsity game fees will encourage new officials to become involved. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed the five-year calendar requested at a previous meeting. Motion by Krueger to approve the next two years of the calendar (2000-2001 & 2001-2002). Second by Toso and carried.

The Board held audience with Billie Ann Caya, vice-president of the North Dakota Cheer Coach's Association to review their advisory recommendations. Kirsten Farnsworth and Lori Harris are other members of the committee. Following the review of the recommendations, a lengthy discussion took place concerning safety in cheerleading and the lack of enforcement of the rules in place. Motion by Scheer to approve the mandatory cheerleader rules clinics with additional sites as worked out by the staff. Second by Toso and carried.

The cap on tournament expenses was discussed. President Hjelmstad shared with the Board the financial statements from the 1999 and 2000 state wrestling tournaments. There has been an additional session put in place with the team dual concept without an increase in the expense cap. The report indicated there is a shortage from the cap to pay the tournament expenses owed to the management and secretarial staff. This concern was also expressed by the Bismarck athletic director in response to the Girls' Class B State Basketball tournament at a previous meeting. The cap on the tournament expense also prevented them from paying all of those expenses. Motion by K. Hjelmstad to pay the managers fees and secretarial fees not to exceed \$600 per tournament for these two tournaments with a plan to review all tournament caps. Second by Krueger and carried.

It was mentioned that line-up cards for dual wrestling competition may need to be included in the state tournament. Also, consideration may be given to not holding up matches for awards, saving the awards ceremonies for later. These suggestions will be included in the study of the tournament.

The board reviewed a letter from Ron J. Gerhardt, BS LAC concerning out-patient and inpatient services for chemical dependency.

The Executive Secretary shared the following bids for the production of the 2000-2001 NDHSAA wall calendar:

Dalton Press - \$3.483 per calendar for a total of \$5224.50 for 1500 calendars Sheyenne Publishing - \$4.02 per calendar for a total of \$6,042 for 1500 calendars Knight Printing - \$4.09 per calendar for a total of \$6,130 for 1500 calendars

Motion by Tollefson to accept the Dalton bid. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board the Wrestling Advisory Committee's discussion concerning the season limitations. The Advisory committee agreed to a limit of 38 matches per season. Motion by Lukach to approve the recommendation of a 38 match limitation. Second by follefson and carried.

The Board reviewed the following cooperative sponsorship applications:

- a. Lodgepole, South Dakota to Hettinger for speech. Motion by Sanstead to approve, second by Lukach and carried.
- b. Dickinson Trinity, Scranton, New England and Richardton-Taylor to Dickinson for baseball. Motion by Scheer to approve. Second by Boschee and carried with 3 dissenting votes.
- o. Garrison and Max to Velva for wrestling. Motion by Boschee to approve. Second by Toso and carried with 2 dissenting votes.
- d. Our Redeemer's to Minot for baseball. Motion by Krueger to approve pending the completion of the necessary documents. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board read a letter from Grafton concerning a quarter violation. Motion by Toso to send a fatter of reprimand to Grafton. Second by Lukach and carried.

The Board read letters from David Jenson, Class B Volleyball Advisory Committee representative as well as Supt. Kevin Keenaghan of Watford City supporting an exception of the out-of-season coaching rule to allow coaching contact for Junior Olympic Volleyball. An extensive discussion took place regarding the out-of-season coaching rule restricting members of high school coaching staff. Motion by K. Hjelmstad to approve the request for Junior Olympic Volleyball for a period of one year to allow a study of the coaching rule in general. Second by Scheer and carried with two dissenting votes.

The Board reviewed a letter from Starkweather requesting eligibility for Augenio Marschner, a foreign exchange student who had previously graduated in his country. Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Lukach and carried.

Other items added to the agenda:

- a. Process for adding (sanctioning) an additional NDHSAA activity. The Executive Secretary shared the policy that is in place in the Montana Association. He also shared with the Board the telephone conversation with a person from Grand Forks concerning their request for the sanctioning of Girls' hockey. It was suggested the Executive Secretary formulate guidelines for a member school to follow in the process of requesting the Association to sanction an activity. This is to be presented to the Board at the April meeting. Motion by Sanstead to place this on the April agenda. Second by Bjornson and carried.
- b. A response from Mandan concerning overpayment of sub-varsity officials was reviewed. After investigation into this situation, it was determined this was simply a clerical error. - c. Region I Boys' Basketball Tournament ticket fees were erroneously set with last year's fees of \$5.00 rather than \$6.00. This amounts to \$3,367 in uncollected gate receipts. It was recommended this manager meet with the Board at the March 17th meeting and bring the financial report. Motion by Tollefson to contact the region tournament manager to appear March 17th. Second by K. Hjelmstad and carried.

The Executive Secretary gave his Board report:

- 1. Steele-Dawson response to the referee/coach incident indicated this has been dealt with and assured the Board the situation should be concluded.
- 2. The District Chairmen's agenda is in the Board packet to review prior to the scheduled time which is 9:00 a.m. on March 17th at the Fargo Radisson Inn.
- 3. The Site Selection Committee is reminded of their meeting on March 28th at the Chieftain Cafe in Carrington beginning 10:00 a.m.
- 4. Boschee reported on his visit to a California high school basketball zone tournament in San Jose Convention Center. The officiating was very exact and sportsmanship was emphasized with a large sign that met them at the entrance. As he sat behind a student fan section, he

observed some unacceptable cheering which was also observed by the tournament manager. These students were removed from the tournament by security as directed by the tournament manager. He reported that the enforcement of sportsmanship was refreshing to watch.

5. West Region hockey is up from \$3,079 to \$10,100 and West Region Volleyball is up from \$981 to \$2,657

6. A letter was received from Gaillord Peltier of Dunseith concerning a fan incident which led to the barring of this fan from one game.

7. A letter from Ryan Selbrude Indicating the chiropractor group is going to request allowing them to conduct sports physical examinations. Also in the report is a letter from the attorney general supporting the NDHSAA rule is valid and chiropractors are not to conduct these physicals.

8. At this time, only the Football Committee is scheduled to meet prior to the March 17th meeting.

9. East Region Basketball receipt is up.

K. Hjelmstad requested the Executive Secretary prepare a list of what needs to be discussed at the Site Selection Committee meeting in Carrington on March 28th.

Motion by Scheer to adjourn. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reconvened on March 17th at the Fargo Radisson Inn. The meeting was called back to order by President Hjelmstad at 1:00 p.m. with all members present.

The minutes from the March 10th meeting were reviewed. Motion by Lukach to approve. Second by Krueger and carried.

President Hjelmstad shared with the Board a letter received from wrestling coaches concerning the recently approved match limitation. Discussion indicated there was a misunderstanding as to whether this limitation included the regional tournament. The original intent of the limitation is for the regular season only. It was clarified this decision came from the recommendation of the Wrestling Advisory Committee which is a representative branch of the wrestling coaches. The Board directed the Executive Secretary to write a letter to the Advisory Committee with a copy to the letter to the coaches listed on the letter of inquiry. Along with this, a letter clarifying the process which is used to adopt changes in programs will be sent. This letter will also ask what is the actual status of this match limitation recommendation. There seems to be a breakdown in communication and it needs to be solidified. Motion by K. Hjelmstad to write the letter. Second by Tollefson and carried.

Tim Ost appeared before the Board representing the North Dakota Broadcasters concerning the fees set upon the radio stations for broadcasting games. These fees are difficult to cover by the smaller radio stations from communities where the base of sales for advertisements is shrinking. Along with this, increase in the costs of phone fees, expenses to send a person to cover a tournament, etc. are making meeting the costs of coverage more difficult. Dean Aamont, station manager from Wahpeton also stated a radio station can create a lot of interest for an upcoming game. This station works with Minnesota where there is no fee to broadcast tournament games. In turn the station performs public service announcements addressing issues concerning young people. These PSA's equal a particular amount of dollars worth of radio time. Motion by Scheer to have the North Dakota Broadcasters Board of Directors put together some type of proposal to present to the NDHSAA at an upcoming meeting. Second by K. Hjelmstad and carried. K Hjelmstad thanked the broadcasters for coming before the board and encouraged a continued line of communication to jointly promote sportsmanship and other issues for which the NDHSAA stands.

Krueger reported on the District Chairpersons meeting earlier in the day with these highlights: 1. There was concern expressed over the beer advertisements in the arena

President Hjelmstad shared with the Board some of the happenings following the Class A Boys'

MINUTES Class B District Chairmen's Meeting 9:00 A.M. - March 17, 2000 Radisson Inn, Fargo, ND

The Class B District Chairmen met at 9:00 a.m. on March 17, 2000 at the Fargo Radisson inn. Chairman Krueger called the meeting to order and welcomed the district chairmen and thanked them for bringing the recommendations from their respective districts.

The following recommendations were heard:

District 1, Rick Jacobson, Wyndmere reported:

- 1. Suggested the prices are too high for all regional tournaments.
- 2. Align volleyball and basketball districts to include same schools.
- 3. Televise the first round of the State Class B Girls' Basketball Tournament. This was overwhelmingly the top priority of the recommendations.
- 4. Those schools that do have golf recommend using separate courses for State Class B Golf Tournament for girls and boys.

In response to these recommendations, the Executive Secretary indicated that Region 1 Basketball Tournament was incorrectly charged last year's price. Also, the State Class B Golf Tournament has been scheduled on separate courses for girls and boys. The girls will play on the McVille and Larimore courses and the boys will play on the Hillsboro and Mayville courses.

District 2, Larry Gegelman, Central Cass:

1. Allow a scrimmage prior to the season for each activity.

District 3, Dr. Sherryl Houdek, Thompson:

- 1. The district discussed the selection of officials for regional basketball. Highlighted were:
 - ¥ The district recognized four schools did not vote.
 - ¥ Some schools may possibly be voting together as a block.
 - ¥ Coaches have requested to see the vote tallies.
 - ¥ What other possibilities exist for getting officials without voting such as each dis
 - trict select two and vote at the end of the tournament?
 - ¥ When are Class A and Class B officials selected?
 - ¥ is mileage a factor in the state's final decision.

Staff member Carlsrud explained the selection process and indicated the ballots are kept on file at the office for one year. Anyone is encouraged to stop at the Association office and review these ballots. Mileage is not a factor in the selection of state tournament officials as each of the eight regions is represented by their selected official.

Barry Haggin indicated there is a problem of having to select district officials ahead of time. Suggested is to ballot the schools at the start of the season with a ranking. Each district would get the odd numbered rank, the other get the even number of the results of the ranking. This would prevent districts from contracting officials and not allowing the other district in their region the opportunity to contract these same officials. Robert Pommerer stated there are some young officials out there that may do a good job but coaches are hesitant to give them games or district assignments. Haggin also stated when selection takes place at the coaches meeting, the older coaches have influence as to how the younger coaches vote. Chairman Krueger stated their district contracts in a multiple year agreement.

The Exec Sec shared fan and coach wrath has been a deterrent in the recruitment and retention of officials. The new officials are not getting other than lower level games and are becoming discouraged. It has been suggested the three-whistle officiating team would be more conducive to bringing up a new official.

- 2. Concerning the wrestling team format, allow each region to determine their own format. Also, for the State Tournament, the format should be known earlier.
- 3. Football alignment:
 - ¥ District 3 has many concerns
 - ¥ District 3 believes each school should have a say in the football plan.
- 4. District 3 thanks the NDHSAA for their direction with the web site. Even though they acknowledge not all schools are using and taking advantage of the site it is a valuable tool for the

schools.

District 4, Jim Gebur, Drayton:

 $\hat{1}$. Coaches are still interesting in exploring the idea of allowing practices on the regional floor prior to the start of the tournament.

District 5, Arlyn Irlon, Edgeley:

i. Continue to utilize the same regional sites as have been in the past. Girls in Napoleon and hovs' in Jamestown.

District 6, Loren Scheer, Hazelton-Moffit-Braddock:

- 1. District 6 is opposed to a new football alignment (increased travel, missed school time and break up of natural rivalries). However, when discussing the alignment, if the one for one did not increase travel or break up natural rivalries, they are not opposed to that concept.
- 2. District 6 is in favor of the 35 match limit proposed for wrestling.
- 3. The district would like to see region boys and girls set up on a rotation basis.

District 7, Myron Jury, Minnewaukan:

- 1. The district expressed concern for bad language used on the basketball floor, trash talk, swearing, etc. There is a need to enforce the rules pertaining to this.
- 2. Concerning proposed changes in football, leave the plan as is. Coaches are involved in a plan in response to the proposal.
- 3. The district would like the region for boys' basketball to remain in Langdon.

District 8, Wayne Lingen, Cando:

- 1. Their district rejects the football plan. Coops are a problem in the one for one if you don't get any players from a school in which you are cooped.
- 2. Lingen passed out a new football plan (the Pfeifer Plan) which was based on geography, school enrollments, etc.
- Support having the top four district volleyball teams advance to the regional tournament with no byes in the first round and the first round losers eliminated.
- 4. Keep girls' basketball in the fall and volleyball in the winter,
- 5. Would like to keep regional basketball in Devils Lake.

District 9, Gordon Davis, New Salem:

- District 9 recommends Mandan High School to be the host site for Girls' Region 5 with Bismarck High School as second choice.
- 2. The district recommends Mandan High School to be the host site for Boys' Region 5 Basket-
- 3: Elgin-New Leipzig asks that you review their enrollment numbers on the football print-out.

 They maintain the number should be 106 and not 156 as printed on the D-R-A-F-T,
- 4. Eliminate the Tuesday play-off game in 9-man football.

District 10, Les Kramer, Wilton:

f. Thought the bench decorum would be brought up again. Would like to see the coaching decorum addressed the same as the Montana Association. As long as the coaches are not harassing officials, they whould be allowed to be up and move around wherever they wish. On the other hand, the referees are being intimidated by the coaches. Officials are out there doing the best they can.

District 11, George Wieland, Drake:

1. Are opposed for the one for one football plan. If it moved them up in the divisioning, they would likely loose some of those players that travel 30 to 40 miles to practice. The district likes the plan as introduced by Rolette because of common rivalries.

District 12, Pat McNally, Minot Bishop Ryan:

- 1. Coaches support the use of the coaches box.
- Would like to go back to the old basketball rule of release of players on a free throw.
- Expressed concern that the schools are scheduling too many track meets on school days.
 Emphasize holding track meets on Saturdays.
- In response to Dist. 12's #3, Scheer commented administrators need to step in and help with scheduling.

District 13, Roger Pommerer, New England:

1. Only players should be allowed to call the time-out in basketball.

2. Increase the 20 sec. time-out to 30 sec.

3. Their district is not happy with the proposed football plan

4. The 3-second rule is not being enforced.

5. Region basketball site should be held at Dickinson State University for a neutral floor.

6. The district questions whether the substitution held until after first shot of a free throw is actually saving time or is lengthening the game.

District 14, Terry Quintus, Dickinson Trinity:

1. The district is in support of a three-class basketball system that would follow:

¥ Placing schools similar to the 1999-2000 football program. Class AAA football and the present Class A basketball would remain similar.

¥ Class AA football teams or similar would make up one of the new classes.

¥The Class A and 9-man football schools would make up one of the new classes.

¥ Our recommendation would be to study the power poll format used by neighboring states such as Montana and Wyoming. North Dakota has had a power poll format in previous years that allowed teams to play across classes.

2. There is concern for lack of television coverage during the State Girls' Basketball Tournament. District 14 would like to see coverage on all three days of the tournament.

District 15, Mark Quenette, Alexander:

1. Their district is in favor of the Cando or NDHSAA plan.

2, The State Class B Basketball Tournament should be held in Bismarck and Minot because of the state's central locations.

3. Recommendation could be clarified for the hearing process for drug and alcohol rule.

District, 16 - Barry Haggin, Divide County:

1. Some of the coaches did not understand the rule concerning game and quarter limitation in basketball. Mostly with JV tournament players had the problems.

2. Along with district 15, their district recommends the Class B State Basketball Tournaments be held in either Bismarck or Minot only.

Davis stated the FargoDome facilities are not conducive to a tournament atmosphere. Houdek indicated their district has spoken highly of Bismarck and Minot as far as facility and tournament atmosphere.

Following further discussion, a straw vote was taken indicating 15 of the 16 district representatives voted for the tournament to be held exclusively in Bismarck and Minot.

Gebur shared the need to stay out of Bismarck during the state legislature.

Many district chairpersons also expressed concern over the beer advertisements in the tournament facility

The Executive Secretary stated addressing these problems with facilities is not an easy task. This will increase as the Aurora enters into the picture. The site selections have been helped with the athletic directors getting together to form a rotation plan for all state events so a community does not bear too many assignments in one year. Site selection is not an easy job. The Site Selection Committee is meeting March 28th and all of these issues will be laid on the table.

Chairman Krueger indicated the intent of the originally proposed football plan was to get schools talking. Input from the membership is appreciated

Staff member Hetler announced the music registration process is being done on the web site and it is working well. Schools are encouraged to participate in all aspects of the web site.

The Executive Secretary gave a closing report:

1. Football timeline - it is starting to become evident about the push to move volleyball to the fall. That will become a real issue if South Dakota makes this change. Montana is currently in court and that may change the feeling of the western part of the state. This issue is on the fore front.

2. How do administrators and coaches feel about the out-of-season coaching rule? The Execu-

live Secretary is on the agenda for the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Board of Directors meeting on Sunday and will ask their association to respond with a stand on this question. This rule already has several exceptions. If we are to have this rule, it either needs to be enforced to the letter or the rule should be abolished. Any thoughts?

McNally stated coaches are being eliminated from coaching spring sports if they are allowed to stick with basketball. The rule was originally formed to protect a coach from being pressured into coaching beyond their season.

With no further business, Chairman Krueger thanked the district for taking time to represent their people. The meeting was declared adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** April 13, 2000 - Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on April 13. 2000 in Valley City. President Hjelmstad called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m., with all members present except Dunderland.

Motion by Lukach to approve the minutes of the March 10 and 17, 2000 Board meetings. Second by Boschee and carried.

President Hielmstad thanked the committees that had come in early to work on their assignments. He commended them for their dedication to the NDHSAA.

K. Hielmstad reported on behalf of the Site Selection Committee with these five general comments to lead into the selection process:

a. Sites should seek to decrease the loss of class time and to quest equity among the gamut of sports in North Dakota

b. Services desired should be defined to level the field for hosts.

c. Efforts should be made to minimize expenditures such as banquets, socials, practices.

d. Caps should be set appropriately and reviewed periodically.

e. The Association should cultivate sponsorships for itself and for the hosts.

The Committee also recommended the district chairperson be asked to include recommendations for selection of sites for their particular area of post-season site assignments.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board the results of the site selection study committee meeting that took place in Carrington on March 28th. A member of the visiting audience, Fargo South Athletic Administrator, Ed Lockwood spoke to the Board concerning the expenses passed on to the association in relation to the actual costs covered by the tournament host city. Also representing the Fargo School District was Business Manager Dan Huffman who shared some of the operation procedures of the Metro Tournament Committee and what it takes to put on a major tournament.

With the great number of various regional and state tournaments that each of these cities host, there needs to be an awareness of what these tournament managers do to provide a service to the association's member schools.

The Executive Secretary shared with the board two letters, one from Fargo South and one from Fargo North concerning contests being held on Sunday as pertaining to counting as one of the two allowable days of the week followed by a school day. Motion by Bjornson to allow for the dispensation for their request for this season. Second by Tollefson and carried with three dissenting votes.

Motion denied, 5-5.

The Executive Secretary shared information on the Northern Lights Boy Scouts program called Venturing. This program would sponsor a summer basketball program which would include a sportsmanship program incorporated in the program. Motion Lukach to support this program. Second by Krueger and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report as of March 31, 2000. Also reviewed were the itemized individual tournament income and expenses reports. Motion by Sanstead to approve the report. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on June 22, 2000 at the Ft. Berthold Community College in New Town. President Hjelmstad called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Sanstead.

Motion by Krueger to approve the minutes of the April 15, 2000 Board meeting. Second by Boschee and carried.

The Executive Secretary gave the Financial Report through May 31, 2000 as well as the Budget Report through June 20, 2000. The Board also reviewed the individual finance reports from each of the spring activities. Motion by Tollefson to approve the report. Second by Boschee and carried.

K. Hjelmstad reported on behalf of the Tournament Committee. Discussion took place in regard to tournament management. The committee expressed the need to put together some options and lists of what is expected from tournament managements. The Board represents all of the members of the association and must keep that in mind when determining how tournaments are conducted. Items discussed were:

Hielmstad also reported on the committee's inspection of the Bismarck Bowl in anticipation of hosting the State Track & Field Meet. The committee reports the management is making facility

improvements in answer to seating concerns as well as assuring the Board the surcharge will not be passed on to the general public.

Tollelson stated the committee was established to address these concerns and needs to be ready to make recommendations to address these concerns. The board representatives of the Tournament Committee will meet with the entire Tournament Committee including the athletic administrator/tournament managers on August 10 and report to the Board August 11. Motion by Bosehee to approve the report. Second by Scheer and carried.

Lukach reported on behalf of the Football Committee. A letter was sent from the Wyndmere/Lidgerwood School District requesting the dissolution of their cooperative sponsorship for football after the first year of the new football plan. Because the one-year delay and the dissolution coming in the middle of the two-year football plan, motion by Scheer to correspond with Wyndmere/Lidgerwood encouraging them to make the necessary changes to their program prior to the start of this 2001 season because they will not be allowed to change divisions in the middle of the two-year plan. Second by Lukach and carried.

Lukach continued the report with a presentation of the 4-18-00 draft of the football divisions and regions. Center had appeared before the Board earlier in the day concerning their request to be assigned to a region other than proposed. The Committee recommended accepting the draft as originally proposed. - 8. Recorder/tonette eliminated as an instrumental category. Handbells are not recognized as a
- 9. Developed a standardized format for Regional Managers as follows:

Motion by Krueger to accept the following Class B recommendations:

1. Hold a three-day state tournament so all teams may play on the main field Second by K. Hjelmstad and carried.

The Basketball Advisory recommendations were reviewed. Motion by Biornson to accept the following recommendation:

1. Officials Evaluation - Coaches recommend that a system be put in place to evaluate officials during the season rather than at the state tournament. The opinion was expressed that the games are officiated differently at the state tournament and this places undue stress on the officials working the tournament.

Discussion took place as to how this could be implemented. Suggested is a mandatory workshop for both coaches and officials at a one-day clinic, on-court session. Coaches would benefit from the sharing of the philosophy concerning sportsmanship: Day 1 of the season -Zero tolerance - coaches and players. Amended: Study for possible implementation for the 2001-2002 season.

Second by Scheer and carried.

Motion by K. Hjelmstad to accept the following Class A Girls' Recommendations:

1. Adopt the 35 second shot clock for girls for the 2001 season.

Second by Toso and carried.

The Football Advisory recommendations were reviewed. The football plan was finalized according to the last proposal. This plan will be mailed to the member schools.

The Golf Advisory recommendations were reviewed. Motion by Tollefson to accept the following Class B Girls' recommendation:

1. Individual qualifying shall be 15 over par, for both the regular season invitational qualifier and the regional tournament.

Second by K. Hjelmstad and carried.

Motion by Lukach to accept the following Class A Girls'recommendations:

1. Allow the players to participate in the state tournament if their score at the regional meet is no more than fifteen (15) strokes above the medalist score at the regional meet or no more than fifteen (15) strokes above par at the regional meet, whichever is greater. Amended: Include this qualifying for Class B Girls'

2. Team trophies: Amended: Team trophies to fifth place was referred to the Trophy Committee for possible adoption (Tollefson/Krueger).

3. Starting time on the first day of the State Meet will be at 10:00 a.m. local time (weather permitting). Second day play will start as determined by the tournament management.

4. Golfers participating in any summer tournaments/competitions may advance and continue to play in any **Junior Golf** (amended) **omit best balls, etc.** (amended) events including state, sectionals, regionals, nationals, even if these events take place after the start of and/or during the high school season. Participating in these events will not be a violation of the NDHSAA rules. Participants will not lose eligibility for high school meets, nor will it prohibit the participants from playing in high school events.

Motion by Scheer to adopt the following over-all recommendations:

3. At the state meet, in the event of a 9-lane track, preliminary heats shall be seeded using 9 lanes. Advance 8 to finals using an 8-lane assignment.

5. Clarify regional entry procedure:

a. As per National Federation Rule 4, Section 2, Art. 1, a contestant shall not be entered in more than four individual events. If a contestant is entered in more than the allowable number of events, meet management shall scratch the contestant from the excess event(s) by following the listed order of events.

b. Entries as well as participation shall follow the distance limitation rule. An athlete shall not enter more than two distance events. If an athlete is entered in three distance events, the meet manager shall scratch the contestant from the excess distant event by following the listed order of events.

c. Event entries are to be in the meet manager's hands no later than noon on the Wednesday before regionals for Class A and Thursday before regionals for Class B.

d. After these deadlines, no additions or substitution are allowed. Scratches are allowed but must count as one of their four events if done after the scratch meeting the morning of the meet. Exceptions will be made for scratches required because of injury or illness of a member of a relay. e. Scenario: An athlete is entered in the 100, 200 and 400 Meter Dashes and the Long Jump Coach scratches this athlete from the 400 Meter Dash (a) at the scratch meeting (b) after the scratch meeting so he/she can run in a relay. (a) Legal (b) NOT legal as the scratched 400 Meter Dash will count as one of this athlete's four events and competing in the relay would exceed the four event limitation. The result in (b) would be a loss of all places and points accumulated, including the relay, from events in which this athlete was involved. (Note the illness/injury exception.)

6. A ballot was prepared for selection of starters for the 2001 state meet. This ballot will be sent to schools prior to the 2001

season

The supplementary financial information as presented on pages 9-12 for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the financial procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and, in my opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

OFFICIAL YEARBOOK

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

A. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is computed on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset which range from Seven to twenty years. The Association caspitalizes all significant equipment and building additions.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash equivalents include time deposits, certificates of deposits and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

E. Financial Statement Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Boards in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted assets and permanently restricted net assets. In addition the Association is required to present a statement of cash flows.

F. Income Tax Status

The Assocition is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Association is not a private foundation.

G. Investments

Under SFAS No. 124, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

H. Designation of Unrestricted Assets

It is the policy of the Board of Directors of the Association to review its plans for future property improvements and acquisitions from time to time and to designate appropriate sums of unrestricted net assets to assure adequate financing of such improvements and acquisitions.

7. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Association is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets; errors or omissions; injuries to employees; or natural disasters. The Association participates in the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund (NDIRF), a public entity risk pool for its general property and casualty and other miscellaneous insurance coverages. The NDIRF operates as common risk management and insurance program for North Dakota cities and schools. The Association pays an annual assessment to the NDIRF for its general insurance coverage. The NDIRF agreement provides that the Trust will be self-sustaining through member assessments and will re-insure through commercial companies for claims in excess of certain limits for each insured event.

The Association also carries commercial insurance for certain other risks of loss including employee health insurance. Settled claims resulting from these risks have not exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three years.
