MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors August 11, 2000 – Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on August 11, 2000 at the NDHSAA office in Valley City. President Tollefson called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present.

President Tollefson welcomed the Board members to the first meeting of the new year along with a special welcome to new members Bradshaw, Kringen, Koppelman, Lein.

Motion by Scheer to approve the agenda. Second by Krueger and carried.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the June 22 & 23, 2000 annual meeting. Motion by Lukach to approve the minutes. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report. Reviewed were the Finance Report as of June 30, 2000 as well as the budget report. Also, a report listing payments to member schools as well as the cost of major services to the member schools was studied. Motion by Scheer to approve the report. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Lukach reported on behalf of the Football Committee concerning the final plan for the 2001 post season playoff system. Motion by Krueger to approve the plan. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

Tollefson reported on behalf of the Finance Committee study on ticket prices. The Executive Secretary will check on whether the tickets have been printed for upcoming tournaments. This will determine if the price adjustments can be made for this year. The committee studied increasing the individual prices and lowering the season ticket prices for hockey. The committee will continue to study this option along with other ticket prices. Motion by Hjelmstad to approve the report. Second by Kringen and carried with one dissenting vote.

Scheer reported on behalf of the Trophy Committee review of the number of team and individual awards presented at regional and state tournaments. The Class A Athletic Administrators have recommended their regional footbalf trophy be eliminated because their conference already presents one. Also they suggested the association eliminate all but first and second team trophies for state qualifying tournaments as there is a trophy case space problem. Motion by Lukach to eliminate the AAA regional footbalf trophy. Second by Hjelmstad and carried. This will go into effect for the 2001-2002 trophy order.

Tollefson also asked the committee to study the situation of student managers, statisticians, etc. not receiving some type of award at state tournaments. The committee had discussed this briefly and felt this will also be studied at a later committee meeting.

Dunderland reported on behalf of the Promotions Committee with the recommendation the Distinguished Service award be presented to the Minot Daily News for their continuous coverage of high school athletics and fine arts programs. This would be presented at the 2001 Class B Boys' Basketball tournament, which will be held in Minot. Motion by Sanstead to approve this recommendation. Second by Scheer and carried.

Hjelmstad reported on behalf of the Tournament Committee. This committee has met several times in an attempt to form guidelines for tournament managers. Eight areas were covered:

- Venue what are the specs
- Workouts or pre-event practices
- Hospitality
- Payments related to the cap
- i. Passes
- Housing
- Media
- Ticket Sales from NDHSAA office

The recommendation of the committee for Board adoption are:

Based on equity and cost, there will be no scheduled practices on the day prior to the tournament unless it is a non-school day for all schools involved. All arrangements for these practices shall be the responsibility of the individual schools.

No gifts will be provided for adults coming to event,

Universal nametags shall be used to lower costs.

The management will provide no tournament banquets or socials.

Association staff will prepare packets for media.

Motion by Kringen to adopt these recommendations of the tournament committee. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

The Executive Secretary reviewed with the Board the application and accompanying documents for a hardship eligibility request from Fargo Shanley student, Jared Hardy. An investigation was conducted earlier in the week by the Executive Secretary. John Whartnaby appeared before the Board to speak on behalf of the applying student. Motion by Scheer to grant immediate eligibility. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

Letters from Regent and New England were read informing the Board of a reorganization procedure with Regent going to Mott. New England agreed to the dissolution of the current cooperative sponsorship programs between Regent and New England. Motion by Krueger to approve the agreed release of all cooperative sponsorship programs between Regent and New England. Second by Koppelman and carried.

Sites for regional golf for the upcoming years have become difficult to determine. In the future, recommendations for sites to be considered by the Board will be assigned to the Golf Advisory Committee. For this year the recommendations for sites not names to date are:

Class A West - Williston

Class A East - Grand Forks

Class B Region 4 - Glenburn (MAFB) Boys'

Class B Region 4 - Garrison Girls'

Class B Region 4 - Harvey (Girls' or Boys')

Class B Region 2 - Cooperstown (Girls' or Boys')

Motion by Scheer to approve Williston, Grand Forks, Glenburn and Garrison. Second by Lukach and carried.

The Board reviewed applications for cooperative sponsorship programs. The following were approved: Center to Stanton for baseball and boys' & girls' golf Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Lein and carried.

Sherwood to Mohall for boys' & girls' cross country. Motion by Krueger, Second by Kringen and carried.

Regent to Mott for boys' and girls' basketball, boys' and girls' track, and boy's and girls' goif. Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Koppelman and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the bidding process for the association automobiles. The automobiles will be advertised in the September Bulletin. Also, the Board is requested to authorize the solicitation of bids for the new association automobiles. Both sets of these bids will be reviewed at the September meeting. Motion by Dunderland to approve these requests. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

The Board reviewed the bid from The Forum Communications Company for \$7,000 to televise the State Football Finals. Previous payment by this company was \$10,000. Motion by Dunderland to reject the bid as presented and set a \$10,000 minimum for this event. Second by Scheer and carried. The Executive Secretary will contact this company with this decision and invite them to resubmit a bid. Other stations will also be contacted for an opportunity to televise this event.

The Board reviewed the new policy manual. President Tollefson shared the adjustments in the committee assignments with a committee newly formed to study the fine arts recommendations prior to the annual meeting.

The Board read a letter from Minot High School concerning a visa student who transferred from Serbia and not with an approved foreign exchange program. The clarification was made this student would be eligible for junior varsity without approval. Motion by Scheer to send this request back to Minot indicating such and will act on total eligibility once the student enrolls in their school. Second by Krueger and carried. This eligibility rule will be studied by the Constitution and By-Laws Committee on August 17th at 10:00 a.m. at the NDASA building.

The Board held an audience with Del Kessler from Mayville-Portland CG concerning a violation of out-ofseason practice. Kessler shared his frustration in properly enforcing this rule with the number of exceptions that ere made for many of the other activities. Motion by Kringen to send a letter of reprimand and place the shat are made for the football season. Second by Dunderland and carried, with a 6-5 roll call vote as follows

Harold Rotunda presented the auditor's report for the financial year, July 1, 1999 to June 30, 2000. Motion by Sanstead to approve the report. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared a letter he had written to Cedric Dempsey, president of the NCAA. This later was written for the purpose of sending the NDHSAA position in opposition of the possible deregulation of amateurism by the NCAA. Motion by Hjelmstad to approve the sending of this letter. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board read a letter from Supt. Volk of Granville requesting reconsideration of the previous denial to walve the fee assessed the school for a late submission of a renewal of a coop program. Motion by Sanstead to reconsider the action from the previous meeting. Second by Krueger. Motion defeated 2-9.

The Board reviewed a letter from Supt. Bitz of Hillsboro concerning an eligibility question of a student wishing to transfer from Fargo North. Motion by Krueger to support the interpretation of the association and Hillsboro school that this student is ineligible for 90 school days if he so chooses to transfer to Hillsboro Second by Bradshaw and carried.

The Executive Secretary report.

Billie Ann Caya of Bismarck has been named to a four-year term on the National Federation Spirit Committee.

Staff member Solberg has been named as Chair of the National Federation Volleyball Rules Committee for a four-year term.

North Dakota's modification of rules for basketball and baseball results in not being allowed to serve on the national rules committees in those sports.

The Constitution & By-Laws Committee will meet August 17th in Bismarck. Members of the committee are Merrill Krueger (chair), Kari Ann Dunderland, Jon Kringen, Robert Bradshaw, Alton Nygaard, Beb Toso, Gaillord Peltier, Ken Keller and Dean Ralston.

There is a need to review of the meeting dates. Motion by Krueger to move the September 21st meeting in Bismarck to September 26th in Fargo. This meeting is scheduled to begin at 1:00 p.m.

Sanstead shared with the Board the fine arts article written in the National Federation News by staff member Hetler and commended him for his efforts.

With no further business, President Tollefson declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** September 26, 2000 - Bismarck Radisson Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on September 26, 2000 at the Fargo Doublewood Inn. President Tollefson called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Sanstead.

The minutes of the August 11 regular meeting and the August 25, August 31 and September 12 and

September 22 special meetings were in the Board's packets for review. The following amendments to the August 11 minutes were presented:

(a) Page 2, add to the Tournament Committee report recommendation's first point, "based on equity, cost and loss of classroom time"

(b) Add to the Finance Committee report to reflect the addition of state wrestling tournament ticket amount

Motion by Bradshaw to approve the minutes as amended. Second by Krueger and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the investment report as of September 19, 2000 as well as the financial reports as prepared through August 31, 2000. Motion by Lukach to accept the reports. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Board held an audience with a delegation from the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Representing the group was Gordy Fosness. Mr. Fosness handed out a brochure to explain the organization and its mission. The group requested the Board to consider allowing their organization to sponsor a breakfast at state tournament venues. The Board thanked the delegation and reminded them of the current policy concerning banquets and will have to discuss the request and how it relates to the policy.

A Finance Committee report was given. The Board discussed the retirement plan situation with the non-TFFR staff. NDHSAA auditor, Harold Rotunda met with the Finance Committee the previous evening concerning the plan. It was recommended to approve the verbiage in the non-TFFR retirement contract to indicate making adjustments as reflected by TFFR percentages and make it retroactive with the start of the Valic plan. Motion by Scheer to make these adjustments. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Committee addressed the car bids. The Board will not open the car bids and are returning them to the persons submitting these bids with a request these bids be resubmitted the following month. Motion by Koppelman to return the unopened bids and re-advertise for these bids. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

The Finance Committee also gave an update on the discussion on the price of hockey tickets. At this time the committee recommended further study.

The final item discussed by the Finance Committee was the reimbursement factor for the upcoming summer convention. This will be placed on the agenda for the committee to discuss at the next meeting.

Krueger reported on behalf of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee's work on the reorganization of the Constitution and By-Laws. Since the last committee meeting, a new member has been named to the group, Brian Kramer, athletic administrator of Minot Bishop Ryan will be replacing Ken Keller, athletic administrator of Dickinson Trinity. The next meeting will be October 19th prior to the General Assembly meet-

Krueger reported on the two amendments to the Constitution that will be presented to the General Assembly at the October meeting. These two amendments will be presented to the general assembly and voted on by mail ballot:

1. Amend Article V, Section IV, Paragraph C of the Constitution to delete "rules thereof" and replace with "By-Laws of the Association".

2. Amend Article X, Section II to delete "and regulations".

Because these two amendments are to the Constitution, they must be voted on by mail ballot.

Also, an amendment to the By-Laws will be presented for vote at the General Assembly meeting in Janu-

1. Amend By-Laws Section XIII, 2nd paragraph) to omit the wording "The second" and replace with the wording "Any subsequent".

Because this is an amendment to the By-Laws, it will be presented to the membership for a vote at the General Assembly meeting in January.

Motion by Scheer to approve the recommendations of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee. Second by Lukach and carried.

The Board held audience with Gelaine Orvik, secretary of the North Dakota High School Coaches Association. Mr. Orvik spoke on the NDHSCA response concerning the out of season coaching rule and the possible changes being considered for this rule. The coaches assembly voted 72-3 in favor of not dropping the rule. Also, the NDHSCA asked the NDHSAA to leave the rule as it currently reads and keep the restriction there with the knowledge Legion baseball would need an emergency exception. That vote on this recommendation was a smaller majority (38-34). This information will be recorded for future reference,

Gerry Gauderman of Wimbledon-Courtney and Rudy Hanson of North Central appeared before the Board to address their proposal for a cooperative sponsorship application for girls' and boys' basketball for grades 7 through 12 beginning with the 2001 season. This application was presented one year previously and was denied. The two districts have reapplied for this coop and the delegation indicated both school boards are unanimously in favor and the local communities has been more accepting of the plan than they were one year ago. Motion by Hielmstad to approve the coop as presented. Second by Scheer and carried.

Kim Knodle, Valley City Tennis coach and member of the Tennis Coaches Advisory Committee appeared hefore the Board with a proposal to help the inequity in the numbers of teams in the east and west. A langthy question and answer period took place. Suggested was the coaches take the information from this discussion and see if there is a new recommendation the coaches can form. Motion by Scheer to deny the request but to look into the future for possible realignment. Second by Kringen and carried.

Lukach reported on behalf of the Football Committee presenting the request of Center to review the DPI numbers every year with adjustments done within the two-year cycle. Noted by Scheer that there will always be some fluctuation in enrollment during the two-year cycle and adjustments would interfere with the scheduling. The committee will be meeting at the October date to discuss concerns that have been presented to them and to invite any schools to join the committee during that meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board on the considerations for scheduling of the football championship games. Motion by Scheer to hold all four games on Friday, November 10th, setting the bowl games in two sessions with the first two games starting at 11:00 a.m. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Executive Secretary suggested discussion of ticket prices. Motion by Hjelmstad to charge \$8 for adults and \$4 for students at each session. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board was informed of a request from a tournament manager for a ruling concerning the hosting of a social for tournament workers and inviting school officials. This request is in light of the Board policy of no pre-tournament banquets. The feeling of the board was it is honorable to treat the tournament workers to a appreciation social and this would be without the public advertising of the event. The Board indicated this was in support of the interpretation previously given by the Executive Secretary.

Kringen reported on an investigation of a student who transferred from Fargo South to Fargo Oak Grove. Based on the fact this does not fit under the hardship rule, motion by Lukach to deny the request. Second by Koppelman and carried.

The Board heard a request from Wahpeton to approve the eligibility of a foreign exchange student attending through a program (EF). This program was not approved through the CSIET. Based on the fact that this program was not approved by the clearinghouse, motion by Scheer to deny. Second by Krueger and

The Board reviewed the cooperative sponsorship applications:

Elgin/New Leipzig and Carson for speech.

Motion by Lukach, second by Lein to approve. Motion carried.

Edmore and Adams for music,

Motion by Kringen to approve the coop and waive the \$500 late fee. Second by Koppelman, Motion and second were withdrawn.

Motion by Kringen to approve the music coop. Second by Krueger and carried.

It was clarified by the Board the original intent of the By-Law late fee for cooperative sponsorship applications and renewals was not to apply to fine arts. Based on this, motion by Koppelman to add this clarification to the Note in the regulations. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

Cando/Bisbee-Egeland/Munich for volleyball. Motion by Lukach to approve. Second by Lein and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the upcoming vacancies on the Board. A nominating committee comprised of administrators from the southwest section will nominate two for the position of Class B Southwest. Also the procedure to nominate Robert Bradshaw to continue to serve the remaining portion of the Class A East position vacated by Julian Bjornson was discussed. Motion by Hjelmstad to request the Executive Secretary to draft a letter to each region needing nominations suggesting their nomination procedure. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board read a letter from Scranton reporting themselves for using an ineligible player and having taken trie appropriate steps concerning this including forfeiture of the games in which the player participated. Motion by Scheer to send a letter of reprimand to Scranton thanking them for reporting themselves and taking proper steps for this violation. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the sites not yet set for the following year and are in need of action. Motion by Dunderland to set Region 2 Class B Girls' Golf at New Rockford and Class B Boys' golf at Cooperstown. Second by Kringen and carried.

Also, Class B Region 6 golf was set incorrectly. Girls' shall be placed at New Town and Boys' at Watford City. Motion by Hjelmstad to make that change. Second by Dunderland and carried.

Lein reported on the NDIAAA conference that was held in Mandan September 17th & 18th. There were six new members attending and a LTC Leadership workshop was conducted for approximately 20 athletic administrators. The athletic administrators had noted their concern of the adjustments of the regular season officials fee scale coming late and not allowing time for adjustments in the athletics budgets. Also, a proposal came from the northwest for study of a three-class system for basketball.

The Board read letters from Minnewaukan and Bottineau in opposition to the cancellation of pre-tournament banquet and practices. A lengthy discussion followed. It was clarified again that the tournament management had addressed the Board with their concern of the cost of hosting the banquet and other tournament extras that are the expense of the host community. MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors October 18, 2000 - Bismarck Radisson Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on October 18, 2000 at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. President Tollefson called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. with all members present.

Motion by Scheer to approve the agenda. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reviewed the minutes. In the September 26, 2000 minutes, it was noted to change the minutes to reflect Kringen reported on behalf of Officials Committee, rather than Finance Committee. Motion by Bradshaw to approve as amended. Second by Dunderland and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report as of September 30, 2000. Also presented for review was the NDHSAA Investment/Savings report July 1 through September 30, 2000. Motion by Hjelmstad to approve the report. Second by Krueger and carried.

Tollefson reported on behalf of the Finance Committee concerning the opening of bids for association automobiles. There were no outright bids for private purchases. The dealer bids were:

The Finance Committee made the recommendation to accept the Miller Motor bid for the Dodge Intrepid with a trade difference of \$5,715.00. If there is a larger amount from a future private bid, the Executive Secretary has been given the option to consider these bids.

The Finance Committee also made the recommendation to accept the Stoudt-Ross bid for the Ford Windstar with a trade-in difference of \$7,508.00, also with the directive to the Executive Secretary to consider any option to accept private bids.

Lukach reported on behalf of the Football Committee with a study of the placement of teams for the upcoming re-divisioning of the football plan. They held an audience with Center concerning the divisioning of teams and questions raised about the numbers used to determine these assignments to divisions. There has been difficulty obtaining numbers because of the schools not meeting the deadlines set by the Department of Public Instruction. Along with the current numbers, the committee attempted to project declining enrollments in particular situations. It is the belief of the committee it would be appropriate to place Standing Rock Community Grant School in the A Division because of their enrollment numbers. Examining the numbers would direct the committee to attempt to look at the current numbers to review the assignment of divisions. Motion by Scheer to move Standing Rock back into their original A division and return Center to the 9-man divisionf. Second by Lukach and carried with one dissenting vote.

Another item discussed by the Football Committee, was to bring one less region team into the 9-man playoffs. Presently, four teams from each region advance, causing the teams to play 5 games in a short period
of time. It was suggested this idea be presented to the Football Coaches Advisory Committee for their
input. Another suggestion was the Class A division have one less regular season game and bring more
into the play-offs. Final point discussed was the idea of play-offs and conflicting dates. The committee was

asked to discuss the tie-breaking criteria in their future meeting. Suggested was each region be given the authority to set their own tie-breaking criteria. This would need to be revisited each time there is an adjustment of the regions. Motion by Krueger to study these items revisit the tiebreaker and study the plan used to set the placement of teams. Second by Scheer and carried.

Scheer reported on behalf of the Trophy Committee with the following:

The question has been raised to add individual participation awards for student managers, statisticians, etc. for state tournaments. The committee recommended to devise a generic award to be given to these participants. The original count for the regular individual awards will remain the same. Class A Region Basketball trophies shall be given to first and second place only for the 2001-

Motion by Scheer to approve the recommendations. Second by Kringen and carried.

Mark Swendsen, President of Midwest Information Systems appeared before the Board asking consideration to approve a pool of radio stations throughout North Dakota to broadcast the Dakota Bowl games. Along with Mr. Swendsen, Todd Engstad of Engstad Broadcasting and Tim Oat, president of the Valley City radio station also spoke to this issue. Presented was a bid of \$50 per station, which would give a total of approximately \$1700 based on the number of radio stations that would participate in this bid. Proposed is a group of radio stations working together to obtain a group bid to broadcast the Dakota Bowl. Requested was the possible reduced bid for these stations involved in this group and also this could possibly be a multi-year contract. It was suggested the Board can look at this as an experimental process that would deviate from what has been established as policy. Because policy has been established to address individual stations, dealing with a network radio station would be an expansion of policy. It was suggested the Media Committee give their report prior to any action on this request.

Lukach reported on behalf of the Media Committee with 5 items:

KQLX FM 106.1 and KQLX.COM request to allow video streaming. Suggested was to delay for one year the consideration for this type of request. This would give the Association an opportunity to study this concept and check with other states how this is handled. Recommended was to deny at this point. The Dakota Network proposal was discussed. There were questions on control issues as far as

what happens with each tournament. Discussed was \$70 per station plus \$70 per feed.

Discussed a bid procedure for future TV coverage of events. 3.

Reviewed the policy manual relative to TV

reflect the broader spectrum of their responsibility.

Also suggested that any action taken would be on a one-year basis to allow the Media Committee the opportunity to study all of these new concepts.

Motion by Kringen to accept KQLX proposal as offered to provide video streaming of the Dakota Bowl with the request of a financial audit to examine the net income. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board held audience with members from the Solen and Flasher school districts in response to letters written by Solen to address concerns over a girls' basketball game played on October 9, 2000. In this game, the final score was 115-3. President Tollefson welcomed the audience and shared a 1939 quote from Dr. James Naismith, "Sportsmanship: let us all be able to lose gracefully and to win courteously; to accept criticism as well as praise; and last of all, to appreciate the attitude of the other fellow at all times." President Tollefson also read Part Two, Article III -- Contests, Article VII of the Constitution and By-Laws that states, "High standards of courtesy, fair-dealing and sportsmanship must be featured in all Association contests. The Board may rate schools or students in these respects, recognizing high attainment and penalizing low."

Gene Reidinger spoke on behalf of the Solen district and introduced Supt. Wanda Belgarde, Al Bjorson, athletic director and Hillary Ward, girls' basketball coach. Mr. Reidinger indicated their wish was to use this incident to work toward the improvement of relations between the school districts. The Solen district would

Supt. Beigrade also addressed the Board and suggested coaches of opposing teams in similar situations could get together and set up a good working relation so games can be an educational experience. Athletic Director Bjorson indicated the need to mend this issue because these two schools will be playing each other in future. This is also an issue of humiliation of a first-year teacher/coach who handled the situation very well.

Supt. Mike Severson of Flasher brought a letter to read to the Board in response to this situation. Also, Clyde Heinle, athletic director and Flasher coach, Darla Schafer spoke commending both teams' athletes and the Solen coach on their conduct during the game.

Supt. Belgrade responded to the letter in defense of the negative suggestion by Mr. Severson's letter that the Solen athletes lack ability to achieve or do not care. Coach Ward addressed the group indicating her pride in how her athletes handled the situation and the improvements the Solen program is experiencing.

President Tollefson addressed the group encouraging the two districts to look to what they can change in the event similar experiences are encountered. Scheer indicated that in both district's presentations they reflected part of the solution because all indicated there was no learning that took place. It is easier in hindsight to mention what should be done and these suggestions can be used in the solution process. Also, Scheer addressed each of the four suggestions brought forth by Mr. Reidinger. Bradshaw shared his comments that both coaches are handling this in a very professional manner and administrator's egos should not be involved in the solution process. Kringen concurred with the coaches professionalism and indicated at this time, this situation is a very difficult issue to be settled by a state association and would be more appropriate to allow it to be handled by the local districts.

President Tollefson made closing comments encouraging all involved to work toward a solution to make this situation a positive outcome. At this time the NDHSAA Board is not here to make a decision but to assist the two school districts to come to their own solution. The two districts were encouraged to keep open communication and to work toward a good relationship as an ongoing process. Koppelman voiced his agreement on the importance of communication.

Scheer recommended the two administrations get together to go through their two letters and also the coaches get together to discuss the issue with both groups sending a communique back to the office listing their recommendations. - Earnest payment was discussed and it was decided there would be no earnest money but the amount of the bid for a particular event would be due within 30 days after the completion of that event.
- Also discussed was multi-sport bid versus a bid for each individual activity with no recommendation.
- 4. This draft is recommended to be utilized in its final form and submit to the media.

Motion by Dunderland to approve the report. Second by Lukach and carried.

Lukach continued with the committee report by referring to the policy manual portion relative to the television policy on page 32 with the following recommendations:

Change the policy heading reference from TV to Media.

In I. Cross out two-year period

In II. Cross out the date, "September 15th" and add "As specified by the Board"

In V. Questioned the amount of the earnest payment.

The Committee also studied page 34, policies for radio and indicated due to radio broadcasting fees, the numbers are acceptable. The Board was asked to review these pages in the Policy Manual, page 32 & 33 with these items to be reviewed at the next meeting.

Dunderland reported on behalf of the Promotions Committee concerning the National Federation Leadership committee. Recommended:

- Student selection for this conference will be worked out by the NDHSAA staff.

The Board held audience with athletic director, Rodney Volk of Central Cass and student, Anthony Frison. Presented was a request to grant two additional semesters of eligibility. The student lost a year of competition because of medical testing for what could have possibly been a life-threatening disease. This testing caused the student to be unable to participate in wrestling. Based on the potentially life-threatening medical condition requiring surgical testing for this student, motion by Hjelmstad to grant two additional semesters of eligibility. Second by Scheer and carried.

Tollefson reported on behalf of the Finance Committee with ongoing plans for the summer meeting. The intent of the plan is to use the budget that was set for the 1998 Washington D.C. convention as a guideline for setting a cap for the cost of attending the 2001 summer convention. The committee will continue to work

Sanstead reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee with the results of the votes on changes to the

Constitution as follows: Amendment #1 Part Two, Article V, Section IV, Paragraph c as follows: Delete the words "rules thereof" and replace with the words "By-Laws of the Association". (Page 2, Constitution & by-Laws). The amendment

passed, Yes - 168, No - 3.

Amendment #2: Part Two, Article X, Section II as follows: Delete the words "and regulations". (Page 4, Constitution & By-Laws. The amendment passed, Yes - 169, No - 2.

Motion by Santead to adopt the report from the Canvassing Committee. Second by Krueger and carried.

Krueger reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee with the engoing work on the revision of the due process procedure for appeals. The next committee meeting will be via a conference call scheduled for November 21st.

Scheer gave a brief synopsis on the District Chair meeting, which was held earlier in the day.

- Elimination of banquets and practicing times was discussed. Most indicated they wished practice times to be reinstated. There was a general feeling the shoot-around on the first day of the tournament was helpful in place of the practices scheduled the day prior to the start of the tournament.

President Tollefson thanked Mr. Scheer for a job well done and indicated these recommendations will be reviewed at its future scheduled time.

Discussion took place concerning the date for the Class B state golf tournament. The Board has been asked to consider placing the date to avoid the conflict with graduation and practice prior to the tournament. Motion by Scheer to survey the member schools as to setting the state tournament date, possibly to be one week later. Also, the survey must indicate there will be no practice allowed on Monday if the tournament was to be scheduled for a Tuesday, Wednesday of the current week if the date was moved

to only one day later. Second by Kringen and carried.

The Board held audience with Gene Reidinger of Solen and Mike Severson of Flasher who reported on their efforts to remedy the situation arising from the score discrepancy of their October Girls' basketball game. Also in attendance was a Solen school board member, Ivan Blackcloud. Several activities have been planned as an exchange between the two schools to learn more about each other as fellow high school students. The Board complimented and commended the groups for their bringing in all aspects of those involved. The Board indicated they are looking forward to a follow-up report on the results of this agreement.

The Executive Secretary gave an update on the situation of setting seasons for girls' basketball and volleyball with those states that have recently had seasons similar to North Dakota. South Dakota is meeting on November 21st to vote on whether to switch or go to court on this situation. The Board indicated it may be beneficial to have the Executive Secretary and Board members attend this meeting to hear their discussion because of the similarities between North Dakota and South Dakota. Krueger indicated the need for lead time if a switch is to be made because of the adjustments that would be needed for coaching requirements. Dunderland indicated this might effect the discussion of going from two-whistle to three-whistle officiating crews for basketball. Scheer indicated the importance of preparation prior to any mandate with court intervention. Also mentioned is the effect the changing of seasons in Montana and South Dakota will have on the western and southern schools in loss of contests. The Executive Secretary was directed to attend this South Dakota meeting on November 21st to gather information on what their association is and will be doing in response to this situation.

Tollefson reported on a hardship investigation conducted for Joseph Anderson who transferred from Hawall to Beach. Based on the past living conditions not conducive to proper development of this youth, motion by Hjelmstad to approve the eligibility under the hardship circumstances. Second by Dunderland and carried.

The Board reviewed letters from Hatton and Northwood requesting the dissolution of their cooperative sponsorship program in speech. Motion by Hielmstad to dissolve. Second by Krueger and carried.

Discussion followed expressing a concern for the number of cooperative sponsorship programs that are being approved to the point that it may no longer be increasing but actually decreasing opportunities for students to participate.

A cooperative sponsorship application and an accompanying letter from Edmore Supt. David Schneider were reviewed. The request for approval of a cooperative sponsorship, Adams/Edmore would include assignment of the girls' basketball to District 4 and the boys' basketball to District 8. Motion to approve the application including the request for district assignments. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

The Board held audience with Kurt and Patricia Weinberg asking the Board to reconsider the ruling causing their daughter, Katie to be ineligible for the Sate Cross Country meet because she competed outside of her school program during the season. Mr. Weinberg shared with the Board the circumstances with which this happened and asked the Board to review the rule and the validity of the rule and how it effects those students that are involved in an activity outside of the team but still is for a good cause. Hisimstad commented Katie should be commended for the intent of being involved in a charitable event but also there is a need to know the rules and a violation of a rule is not waived because the individual's lack of knowledge of the rules. Scheer indicated this may have brought out a gray area and is in need of some type of study. Krueger suggested there be study of this rule. Sanstead indicated the concept of expanded learning service is a worthy activity. Motion by Scheer to assign this study to the Constitution & By-Laws. Second by Kringen and carried. The Board took no further action concerning the Weinberg's request.

MINUTES Class B District Chairmen's Meeting 9:00 A.M. - November 17, 2000 Radisson Inn, Fargo, ND

The Class B District Chairmen met at 9:00 a.m. on November 17, 2000 at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. Chairman Scheer called the meeting to order and welcomed the district representatives and thanked them for bringing the recommendations from their respective districts.

Because several of the districts' recommendations were similar relative to pre-tournament banquets and practices, these items will be discussed after the other items have been presented.

The following recommendations were heard:

District 1, Robert Scrivner, Hankinson reported:

- Would like to see girls' basketball and volleyball districts identical.
- Limit to a maximum of 8 teams in 9-man football regions. 1.
- Their district could not come to a consensus on the regional site but feels it should be within 2. their regional lines, which Valley City is not.

District 2, Jon Kringen, Enderlin:

- Propose a change in required practices for fall sports if a student is in the military similar to what is done for team members who are in a state tournament, which overlaps with the next season's sport.
- Region I Girls' Basketball site District 2 has concerns about the current location of the tourna-
- ment. Favor Valley City as a regional site. 3.

District 3, Randy Vigen, Central Valley

- Girls' basketball should remain as a fall sport.
- Discussed video taping ethics. Would like to see if it is a problem in any other areas.
- The push to go to 5-man football officiating crews is causing a financial problem. The district is 2. wondering if any other areas are going to 5-man for regular season football games.
- Would like to see two officials selected from each district to work regional basketball.

Discussion followed on switch of seasons. Several plans were shared from other states. It was suggested the membership must start discussion on how to implement some ideas. The question was raised as to whether there is a possible lawsuit for loss of income for coaches who coach both seasons. There are a number of areas of athletic programs that would be examined if the courts would step in.

District 4, Harold Mach, Minto:

Change boys' and girls' golf region alignment. A handout was provided.

District 5, Hy Schlieve, Ellendale:

- Will discuss regional site and present a recommendation.
- Suggested a maximum of 8 teams per football region. 2.

- Move the state golf tournament to Tuesday and Wednesday rather than Monday and Tuesday to District 6, Ron Groth, Gackle: avoid a conflict with many school's graduations. Extensive discussion followed.
- Keep the football play-off system as is.

District 7, Tim Guler, New Rockford

- Keep girls' basketball in fall:
- Officials need to be consistent in the enforcement of the profanity rule in basketball. 1.
- Would like to see Class B events held in Class B towns. 2.

- Recommend the NDHSAA drop the rider fee for officials for the 2001-2002 school term and District 8, Arlyn Irion, Langdon:
- leave everything else the same (all sports). Review the formula and process for breaking ties in football. Use the same format as in the 1998 post-season and communicate with all schools prior to the season on the playoff method that will is

used for breaking ties.

- Oppose moving all-state band to the weekend of teachers' convention. It was pointed out that the music educators are no longer requesting this change.
- Recommend the NDHSAA move the starting date for girls' basketball and football from the traditional Thursday to the following Monday for the 2002 sport season.
- Move all seasons back one week. 5.
 - Allow only three teams to advance in 9-man football playoffs.
- Districts 7 and 8 have agreed on a recommendation for their regional basketball site. 7.

Barry Haggin, Divide County indicated the rider's fee is a constant fee for their town because all of their officials are from outside the mileage limit. It was also pointed out that many officials have to leave work early and may need compensation.

District 9, Herb Kringen, Selfridge: No additional recommendations.

District 10, Rob Rust, Center: No additional recommendations.

District 11, Mike Ness, Bottineau:

- Cannot come to agreement to regional site but would like the board to consider a rotation plan for their region.
- Would like to see the Board going back to tournament bidding for sites.

District 12, Robert Thom, Glenburn:

What is the status of the coach's box? It was suggested the coaches have not requested this lately because they like the way the bench decorum is being enforced.

District 13, Norm Fries, Bowman and Rhame:

- Set the site of the state cross country more toward the middle of the state.
- Would like to see switch of girls' basketball and volleyball seasons if Montana and South Dakota go.

District 14, Terry Quintus, Dickinson Trinity:

- Keep the state boys' and girls' basketball tournament sites in Bismarck and Minot.
- Set the number in an officiating crew at four for football and two for basketball. District 15, Ed Lone Fight, Mandaree:
- The coaches in their district are against the switch of girls' basketball and volleyball seasons.

District. 16 - Barry Haggin, Divide County:

There is a problem of district basketball being in conflict with rules clinics.

Discussion followed concerning the lack of television coverage for the first round of girls' basketball at the state tournament. The Media Committee has reviewed the contract and is in the process of discussing the bidding process.

The subject of pre-tournament practice and banquets was brought to the floor. Discussion concerning loss of classroom time for students and teaching coaches and the possible intervention of the legislature followed. Also the issue of equity of treatment of activities in relation to banquets was discussed. Haggin suggested each team would pay an additional \$100 for a banquet. Also mentioned was the non-revenue acilytics that must be hosted by those same communities, which host basketball tournaments in which we expect these amenities.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board the next draft of the Due Process procedure had been received from NDHSAA attorney, Gary Thune. First, the Board must consider whether the Executive Secretary had made the correct interpretation on the original question concerning the student's semesters of eligibility as per Section XI. Second, to rule as to whether there is additional information available for consideration of this eligibility situation in regard to the eight semester rule. Wording in the Constitution & By-Laws makes latitude available for extension of semesters but must be voted upon by the Board. This consideration may be possible; keeping in mind the student must be eligible in all other ways including academics and age. It was shared the student will be 20 years of age on March 7, 2001.

The Board reviewed the initial request as to whether the ruling was correct. Motion by Kringen to uphold the initial ruling of the NDHSAA Executive Secretary pertaining to the eight-semester rule. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

The Board considered the second provision as related to the last sentence on Section XI relating to the right to appeal to the Board. Motion by Kringen that based on circumstances in this situation as being potentially life-threatening, the Board shall grant an additional year of eligibility for Beau Azure until the day of his 20th birthday. Second by Dunderland and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the receipt of a request from University of Mary to allow them to place a booth at upcoming state tournaments. This will be placed on the agenda for the January meeting.

Tolletson reported on the Athletic Review meeting which was held earlier in the day. This meeting allowed the committee to review the recommendations from the coaches advisory committees from the fall sports. An explanation was shared with the Board on the operation of the advisory recommendation process. As the various groups review and record their input, this will be posted on the web site. Hjelmstad indicated discussion took place on how some upcoming issues will be handled. These issues include the possible switch of girls' basketball and volleyball seasons as well as a restructuring of all of the sport seasons.

Sanstead reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee. Because Bradshaw was a member of the Canvassing Committee and was also a candidate in the Board election, Krueger stood in for Bradshaw to avoid a potential conflict of interest. The results of the Canvassing committee were:

Motion by Kringen to accept the report. Second by Scheer and carried.

Scheer reported on behalf of the Officials Committee:

a. The Committee recommended accepting and adopting the clinic/day camp format to replace the rules clinic and workshop for basketball coaches and officials.

Motion by Scheer to approve the recommendations of the committee. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

b. The Committee studied the list of post season officials and recommended to accept the assignments.

Motion by Scheer to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Executive Secretary introduced Chris Semrau, a representative from the Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks. Semrau presented the new facility features and the possible future of hosting NDHSAA events in this facility. A proposal to house the 2002 state hockey tournament was presented. Their group expressed their willingness to work with the NDHSAA on the many details of the operation of this tournament. President Tollefson thanked Mr. Semrau for his presentation.

Hjelmstad reported on behalf of the Tournament Committee meeting which was held in Carrington on January 17th. The main items from the meeting were:

- Present tournament policies will remain in place. Equity among tournaments was discussed.
- b. The shoot-around scheduled prior to sessions at state basketball was appreciated.
- c. The Committee wishes to look into the possibilities of all tournaments having some type of social gathering for the participants.
- d. The committee felt it was important to hold some type of pre-tournament practices for football
 and golf.

At this time there is no recommendation for any change. At state basketball tournaments, management will continue scheduling a shoot-around the day of the tournament.

- e. Nametags that were initiated by the Athletic Administrators Association have been appreciated. The cost of these tags was underestimated and further sponsorship is being persued.
- f. Tournament caps were reviewed. Some tournaments have changed the make-up of the competition without a change of the cap. Should there be a tournament cap for the management and a different cap for the facility expense? Ultimately, in terms of caps, there are these options:
- 1. Keep caps as they are
- 2. Create a cap that includes management but excludes facility costs
- Reset the caps
- Create a management budget
- Return to a bidding process
- Contract some person or firm to seek sponsorship to cover costs of the tournament and leave the running of the tournament to the management.

The Board reviewed a handout from Hjelmstad which was a plan formed to address two items that he determined needed structure. The two-part handout listed (1) a timeline on how to come to a conclusion on the setting of tournament caps and (2) rotation of sites in conjunction with these caps. The concept of a need to look at tournament caps and site rotations will be shared with the membership.

Hjelmstad shared with the Board that a plan of the NDIAAA for nametags for all state tournament participants covered from money generated from the two sponsors has fallen into some financial difficulties because of over costs if additional sponsorship money does not materialize. The \$10,000 which the NDIAAA received to cover the cost of these nametags has been sent to the NDHSAA with the thought of getting help from the association for assistance to cover any additional costs. The NDIAAA organization is currently seeking additional money to help in the cost of the nametags for some of the upcoming tournaments.

The Board held audience with Jim Sandy, programs operation manager for KVLY, Fargo; KMOT, Minot, KFYR, Bismarck; KUMV, Williston and KQCD, Dickinson and an NBC affiliate. Sandy shared with the Board the State Hockey Tournament contract dates conflict with the 2002 Winter Olympics as NBC owns the television rights to the Olympics. The Media Committee will continue to discuss this situation and will look at the various options, one being moving the state tournament one week later to avoid this conflict.

The Board thanked Mr. Sandy for sharing these concerns.

The Executive Secretary reported the results of the golf survey concerning the possible change of dates of the State Class B Boys' and Girls' Golf Tournament. Based on the survey information indicating a split in the return, no action was taken to change the current dates of the state tournaments.

Through the Executive Secretary, the Board was approached by Minot and Bismarck tournament managers to review the cap of expenses for the State Wrestling Tournament. The managers, Terry Hjelmstad and Jim Haussler as well as other tournament managers were asked to bring a budget statement to the Tournament Committee for future consideration. This review and report will take place at the March meeting.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board clarification concerning the Class A Regional Basketball finance policies as outlined in the Policy Manual. Suggested was to change the Board Policy Manual on page 24 and 26 to add, "excluding sponsorship, media and T-shirt revenue". This defines in the Policy Manual what is currently being practiced. Motion by Hjelmstad to make this adjustment. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

The Board held a discussion concerning the South Dakota season changes for volleyball and girls' basket-ball. At the present time, the South Dakota High School Activities Association is proposing two plans to deal with this switch of seasons. This plan is to be presented to their member schools and to the Department of Justice. The Board held a lengthy discussion on this topic which included concern for scheduling with South Dakota and Montana and the problem that would result if these schools would be unable to schedule. This issue will be included in the Executive Secretary's address at the General Assembly Meeting. Motion by Kringen to address this issue at the January General Assembly meeting and consider making a decision in March concerning a possible move for the 2002-2003 year. Input will be sought from the membership. Second by Scheer and carried.

Following review of letters from schools reporting themselves for various violations, motion by Hjelmstad to issue a letter of reprimand and thank the following schools for self-reporting these violations:

- Sheyenne for using an academically ineligible player in a volleyball match vs. Rugby
- b. Eliendale for exceeding the number of games in volleyball vs. Wishek
- Dunseith for using a player that was to sit out a contest because of an unsportsmanlike conduct disqualification vs. North Shore
- d Parshall for a five-quarter violation in basketball vs. Des Lacs-Burlington
- Montpelier for playing an ineligible player because of enrollment in only three classes in volleyball vs. Oakes and Edgeley

Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from gymnastics coaches concerning the recent cooperative sponsorship among the Grand Forks Central, Grand Forks Red River and East Grand Forks schools. Discussion took place and no further action was taken.

A communique from Fargo Girls' Hockey club and a communique from Dickinson Schools requesting consideration for girls' hockey was reviewed. These groups have been supplied with the procedure that has been put in place by the Board to follow in the request to approve an activity for sanctioning.

The Board heard a request for a partial dissolution of a cooperative sponsorship with the release of McClusky from the Turtle Lake-Mercer/McClusky/Underwood track cooperative sponsorship. Motion by Krueger to approve. Second by Lukach and carried.

A letter from North Carolina High School Athletic Association was reviewed surveying member states as to their interest in attending a summit and inviting the Executive Secretary for a roundtable "brain storming" session devoted to development and fundraising. Motion by Hjelmstad to give the Executive Secretary the option to participate with this if it actually takes place. Second by Scheer and carried.

A request for the following cooperative sponsorship applications were reviewed:

- Berthold and Our Redeemer's Christian School in football
- b. Dickinson and South Heart for baseball
- Súrrey and Sawyer for boys' basketball and baseball
- d. Grafton/Park River and Drayton for hockey

Motion by Lukach to approve the cooperative sponsorship applications. Second by Scheer and carried with one dissenting vote.

The Board reviewed the agenda for the upcoming General Assembly meeting scheduled for Monday, January 29, 2001 beginning at 8:00 a.m.

The Executive Secretary directed the Board to a letter from US Bank proposing they increase their sponsorship of the Distinguished Student by providing a \$2,000 scholarship to the Distinguished Student, a \$1,000 scholarship for the runner-up and \$500 for the remaining four finalists. Motion by Scheer to accept this proposal. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

Krueger reported on his investigation concerning a student, Kyle Parisien who transferred from Fargo to Turtle Mountain Community High School. Recommended is to grant this hardship request. Motion by Sanstead to approve the request. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented his report to the Board:

- Years ago, the NDHSAA entered into a class action lawsuit and the insurance company to which the suit was filed has declared bankruptcy. The result is no money will be received.
- b. Letters received:
- Michael Frank and AAA football coaches concerning televising of football finals.
- 2. Letter of thank you from Jaden and Pam Civeralla.
- Letter from a student who has moved from Colorado to Grand Forks and wishes to play baseball. The
 possibility of filing a hardship application is still being discussed by the Grand Forks School District.
- 4. Dakota Ag Network with a \$2,240.00 check enclosed for the broadcasting of the Dakota Bowl. There were 32 games/stations for the four-game day.
- 5. Thank you from Anthony Friesen of Central Cass
- c. Milton-Osnabrock has indicated they will discontinue their membership beginning with the 2001-2002 year.
- d. Met with the Bismarck tournament committee on concerns of hosting a state event.
- e. Erin Sorensen, VCHS School to Work student is working with the NDHSAA web site
- f. Office staff is continuing the process of training under the technology plan. The office is in the second year of the three year plan and is looking to add a third year to continue to have the three-year plan in place.

With no further business, President Tollefson declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES Annual Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association January 29, 2001 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Representative Assembly Meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held Monday, January 29, 2001 at 8:00 A.M. at the Bismarck Radisson Inn. President Tollefson called the meeting to order, welcomed those in attendance and declared that a quorum had been established.

Following the welcome, President Tollefson introduced Robert Ashe of Indiana for the keynote address.

Introductions of the Board of Directors and staff took place.

Board member Sanstead reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee with the following results:

Class B Southwest: Martin Schock, Elgin-New Leipzig
Class A East: Robert Bradshaw, Grafton

Principals Association: Kevin Coles, Hillsboro

The Executive Secretary introduced the proposed amendment to the Constitution & ByLaws, which is a result of the Constitution & ByLaws Committee's work on the due process procedure of this document. NDHSAA attorney Gary Thune was introduced and brought to the podium to explain the legalities of the proposed procedure which would replace the current two separate due process policies. Attorney Thune recommended adoption of this due process procedure. Motion by Supt. Robert Tollefson, Washburn for adoption of the article as proposed. Second by Supt. Adam Boschee, Kindred and carried.

Executive Secretary's report:

Athletic Review Committee - A committee of ten members of which the make-up is two NDHSAA

Board members, two from the Coaches Association, two Class A athletic Directors and four Class B athletic directors met on January 27, 2001 to review each individual sport advisory committee's recommendations. The committee met to review the recommendations of the fall seasons. The progress of these recommendations from the various groups is placed on the web site to inform the membership.

The National Federation has released a report that the NCAA amateurism proposals contain elements that threaten the core values of educational value of education. The NCAA is considering a "play for pay" rule that threatens amateurism. The National Federation, of which the NDHSAA is a member, has gone on record as being opposed to this new proposed legislation.

The NDHSAA approved an offer from USBank to provide scholarship for the Distinguished

Student program in the amount of \$5,000

A survey on foreign exchange students has been distributed to the membership to complete and return to the National Federation.

As previously, the Class B District Chairpersons were reminded that site recommendations are in April and encouraged each regional site recommendation be at the agreement of the two districts that comprise that region.

6. Dr. Hjelmstad reported on the meetings of the Tournament Committee with two main considerations, (a) tournament caps and (b) site rotation. The membership is encouraged to share input concerning

these items. A plan of study and schedule of completion was shared with the membership.

7. The Executive Secretary presented an update on the recent happenings in Montana and South Dakota in the switching of girls' basketball and volleyball seasons beginning with the 2002-2003 season. Shared with the membership are the two proposed plans South Dakota is studying. The NDHSAA Board of Directors would like to make a decision at their March meeting as to what action will be taken, and encouraged the membership to share their input with the members of the board. Suggested would be an ad hoc committee to work out the issues connected with the possible switch. Also, the Board has been asked to review the placement of activities in seasons. The floor was opened for remarks at this time:

Clifton Lee, Grenora appeared before the assembly and shared his experience at a meeting in Montana and knows the expense of resisting the season switch is great. There is a need to look at the switch for the

2002-2003 volleyball season.

Gaillord Peletier believes the membership does not have the money to fight this and even if we even did have the money, should we fight. As a member of a boarder school, there is concern that South Dakota's switch will severely affect their schedule and supports the plan to switch seasons with the 2002-2003 season. They currently play five South Dakota teams in girls' basketball, boys' basketball and volleyball.

Jim Haussler, Bismarck Public schools have to look at this for the young people. Students need to be informed as soon as possible to make it less stressful for the students involved with the switcfhing of the seasons. Would like to look at the placement of seasons in all activities.

Lowell Lunde, McClusky – in Montana first, financial issue – would rather spend money on equipment and second felt students would like to see this. Supports a switch of seasons to avoid unnecessary costs to the member schools. Also, we should switch the seasons when the members have some control rather than having limited control and have a group set the guidelines.

Brent, Berthold the sooner the decisions can be made, the better it will be for schools and students to adjust.

John Jankowski, Larimore asked to consider a straw vote.

Jerry Enget, Hazen wondering if the adhoc committee could

A straw vote was taken indicating all but a handfl were in favor of the switch.

By Schleve, Ellendale suggested taking the issue back to their boards for their thoughts.

The Executive Secretary indicated there will be resistance to this issue and the membership is again encouraged to share their input with the Association and thanked the member schools for their support of high school activities.

President Tollefson thanked the media for attending and wished the membership well and declared the meeting adjounced.

Motion by Sanstead to approve the eligibility request because of an exceptional situation. Second by Dunderland. Extensive discussion followed. The motion passed with two dissenting votes.

Following additions to the agenda, motion by Scheer to approve the agenda. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reviewed the minutes from the January 27, 2001 regular meeting and the February 8, 2001 Special Meeting. Motion by Hjelmstad to approve the minutes as presented. Second by Krueger and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report. Reviewed were the NDHSAA Investment Report, Balance Sheet and Budget Report as of February 28, 2001. Motion by Lukach to approve the reports. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Lukach reported on behalf of the agenda of the Media Committee:

- The State Hockey Tournament television conflict: 1.
- Leave as is a.
- Move the season one week earlier b.
- Move the season one week later (during regional basketball)

The decision is to meet with Meyer Broadcasting the following week in Minot. The Media Committee wishes to leave the State Hockey Tournament on the regularly scheduled weekend. The Executive Secretary reported on his meeting a week earlier with the television company and expressed the importance of cultivating a good relationship with the television company. The Media Committee will be meeting with the television company on Friday, March 16 in Minot.

Recommended adding wording to the regional basketball bid specifications to indicate "for live 2. coverage" to the heading.

Motion by Lukach to approve the recommendation. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Hjelmstad reported on behalf of the Tournament Committee

Discussed Tournament caps for state tournaments: Need to meet and come to terms as to whether caps should be continued. Along with this, there is a number of items that must be studied to determine as to whether they are actual expenses.

Studied the State Wrestling Tournament cap that may need adjustment as there has been several changes in the makeup of the tournament in addition of a weight class. Also, the addition of team dual tournament which has required an additional day for the tournament.

Recommended was to not address the wrestling cap but to respond to this individual wrestling state tournament and adjust the expenses to help cover the 2001 tournament costs. Motion by Kringen to pay \$20,000 toward State Wrestling tournament expenses. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

The Committee reviewed the guide for the approval of requests for exhibit booths at state tournaments. The committee recommended acceptance of the guide as submitted and allow the staff to negotiate whatever the market bears for each particular tournament.

Motion by Sanstead to accept the staff guidelines and, case by case, look at the requests to host booths and allow the staff to negotiate. Second by Lukach and carried.

Tollefson reported on the marketing meeting held with Den Gardner from Gardner & Gardner Communication tions concerning the seeking and maintaining of corporate sponsorships. Tollefson indicated the Board might wish to look into having this company help in this area. Krueger indicated this company has knowledge. edge the NDHSAA does not have and with Gardner & Gardner Communications working on a commission basis, a marketing person may be the way to go. Bradshaw stated Mr. Gardner's presentation indicated a core value of business ethics. Other Board members shared positive thoughts concerning Mr. Gardner Suggested was to allow other marketing firms an opportunity to present any proposal that would be in the

same category. Following further discussion, motion by Kringen to enter into contract relations with Gardner & Gardner Communications. Second by Lukach and carried. The Executive Secretary will contact Mr. Gardner and draw up a plan to be reviewed by the Finance Committee.

The Board studied the Advisory Committee/Athletic Review flow chart with the following recommendations approved:

- 2 Include in the NDHSAA Golf Handbook the criteria for Outstanding Senior.

Girls' Basketball:

Recommend girls' basketball remain in the fall for the 2001 season (as amended by Athletic Review).

Boys' Tennis:

No recommendations were approved.

A spreadsheet documenting the voting records of the Athletic Review Committee, the Athletic Administrators and the NDHSAA Board of Directors is attached.

The Board held audience with a contingent of soccer coaches represented by Mel Fisher requesting the extension of the waiver of the out-of-season coaching rule for soccer. Motion by Scheer to extend the request for two years. This extension will expire as of March, 2003. Second by Krueger and carried.

Jennifer Conlon of Mandan and Cindy Bohn of Bismarck St. Mary's appeared before the Board representing the volleyball coaches with a request to waive the out-of-season coaching rule for volleyball. Also present was Kay Anderson, President of the Junior Olympic Volleyball program in Bismarck/Mandan, who spoke of the problems of acquiring coaches with those coming out of the high school programs not being eligible to coach. Motion by Hjelmstad to allow a 2-year waiver of the out-of-season coaching rule for volleyball, beginning 2002. This extension will expire in the fall of 2004. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board read a letter from Berly Nelson, UND Student Body president, requesting an implementation of a standard admission charge for college students to all athletic events. Motion by Kringen to deny the request. Second by Scheer and carried.

Krueger reported to the Board on the request to dissolve the Leeds and Wolford cooperative sponsorship program for volleyball. Wolford did not have any participation in this coop for the 2000-2001 year. The School Boards of the two school districts have requested to dissolve this agreement. Motion by Lukach to dissolve the cooperative sponsorship program. Second by Scheer and carried.

The Board held a discussion on the change of seasons topic. They clarified the process of taking recommendations from the March meetings with action be taken at the April meeting. An extensive discussion followed. The Board determined the importance of having sufficient information prior to making a decision. There are many details that need to be worked out in order to consider implementation of a switch of seasons. This topic will be discussed at the district chairperson meeting on March 16th in Minot. This meeting may reflect the sentiment of the membership. A decision will be made at the April Board of Directors meeting.

The Board was informed Dalton Press has submitted a bid of \$5,880 (\$3.92 per calendar) for the 2001-2002 NDHSAA calendar. Motion by Lukach to accept the bid. Second by Hjelmstad and carried.

- A brochure addressing the use of smokeless tobacco has been made available from the National Federation.
- 7. A letter informing the Board the East Region track meet has been changed to Saturday.

With no further business, President Tollefson declared the meeting adjourned.

Boys' basketball, Kim Anderson from southwest and Scott Privratsky from the northeast to fill the position vacated by Tim Garrett who has served two terms. Wrestling & Baseball, Kevin Harmon from the northwest. Second by Blikre. Motion carried.

Parker moved to partner with the NDOA, NDHSCA, NDSSPA, NDSBA and the NDIAAA to promote good sportsmanship/citizenship. Second by Don Glarum. Discussion concerning the acts of poor sportsmanship during the past season followed. Young officials are quitting because of verbal abuse from the coaches and parents at lower levels of play. One official shared that he won't take his 8-year old son to certain games because of the swearing and other acts of poor sportsmanship/citizenship. Another official suggested that officials boycott schools where the fans and coaches display unacceptable behavior and the administrations don't "handle" the situations. Motion carried. President Harmon will contact the board presidents of the aforementioned groups to explore the possibility of a joint effort.

Sportsmanship is a concern of the NDOA. Much discussion has been held, many stories have been told, but now it is time for action. The NDOA Board would like to work with the leadership of NDIAAA, NDSSPA, NDHSCA, and NDHSAA. We, as a board, feel that working together will generate ideas for a plan of action which will be consistent across the state. How can we work together to promote sportsmanship in our athletic programs and activities?

Schnewies moved to raise varsity soccer fees to \$50 each for varsity, \$35 each for JV, \$20 each for JrHi. Second by Parker. Motion carried.

Schnewies moved to request funding from the NDHSAA for one board member to attend the coaches' officials conference in Indianapolis.

NDOA Annual Meeting in Bismarck 3/10/01

President Kevin Harmon called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM with approximately 18 NDOA members, Loren Scheer, Clint Lein and Jon Kringen from the NDHSAA present.

Minutes of the March 2000 meeting were approved.

The names of NDOA officials who have been registered for twenty and twenty-five years were recognized.

Risk nominated Kim Anderson as a candidate for the boy's basketball position on the NDOA Board. Second by Mark Riggs. Motion carried.

Terry Porter asked about 3-whistle coverage for basketball indicating a number of class A schools are already using said coverage and a majority are planning to use it next year. Extensive discussion followed encouraging use of 3-whistle in the class A games and indicated a majority of the class A schools will use 3-person coverage next year. Jon Kringen shared concerns about having enough experienced officials for the class B rivalry games. MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors March 16, 2001 – Minot Holiday Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities met on March 16, 2001 at the Minot Holiday Inn. President Tollefson called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present.

Motion by Scheer to approve the agenda. Second by Kringen and carried.

Motion by Hjelmstad to approve the minutes of the March 9, 2001 meeting. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The financial report was given at the March 9th meeting.

Sampson appeared before the Board concerning the out-of-season coaching rule to speak on behalf of the North Dakota hockey coaches. At their coaches meeting in conjunction with the state hockey tournament, their discussion indicated their desire to be allowed to be involved in coaching on all levels during the time in which facilities have ice, which is past the end of the high school season. These coaches feel they are missing out on the opportunity to give back to their students and maintain a qualify of sportsmanship they wish to teach. The coaches are requesting a three-year coaching exemption to the rule.

The floor was open for questions. Sanstead asked if the group would accept a two-year exemption rather than a two-year which was given to soccer and volleyball at the March 9th meeting. Motion by Lukach to approve a two-year waiver on the out-of-season coaching rule for hockey. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Scheer reported on the Officials Committee with the recommendations from the NDOA Board of Director. Also speaking on the recommendations was NDOA president, Kevin Harmon. Action is as follows:

- Implement a one-year sitout policy for swimming and diving officials after working 3 consecutive tournaments (boys' and girls' combined) as meet Referee, Diving Referee and Starter with implementation to be staggered.
- Motion by Scheer to approve. Second by Kringen and carried.
- Supported the request to make mandatory annual workshops for coaches and officials in gymnastics. Officials must attend to be eligible for post season tournaments each year.
 Motion by Scheer to approve. Second by Krueger and carried.
- c. Raise varsity soccer fees to \$50 each for varsity, \$35 each for JV, and \$20 each for junior high.
- Implement three-whistle officiating for Class A regional and state tournaments for 2002.
 Motion by Scheer to implement for Class A boys' regional and state tournaments. Second by Kringen and carried.
- Implement 5-person crews for all football playoff games.
 Motion by Scheer to adopt this recommendation. Second by Kringen and carried.
- f. Request funding from the NDHSAA for one NDOA board member to attend the National Federation coaches/officials conference in Indianapolis.

 No action was taken.
- 9. Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, each basketball official must have officiated or have been a supervisor at a NDHSAA approved rules clinic/day camp within the previous three years to be eligible for officiating region and state tournaments.

Motion by Scheer to approve. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

Also, Scheer shared the discussion with the NDOA of their concerns over the selection process for the district basketball tournaments. Veteran coaches are perceived as having undue influence over new coaches in the selection process. The committee felt the district selections are to be determined by each district on an individual basis.

The Executive Secretary shared information from his meeting that Districts 15 and 16 have selected officials for two years but have agreed to flipflop? Lukach reported on behalf of the Media Committee's meeting with KVLY. Issues:

What would happen if the state hockey would remain on the same weekend as the last three days of the Winter Olympics. Solution-leave as is.

2. Move the state tournament to one week later. This would cause facility conflicts and would have to rearrange the schedule of game times.

Koppelman indicated the meeting was productive and feets it is important to continue open dialogue with this company. No recommendation at this time.

Also discussed was the equity of televising of girls' vs boys' basketball. It was explained that November is one of their months that is difficult to pre-empt because of the sweeps week. A brief discussion was held on television coverage if the two basketball seasons were combined. These discussions will continue at a April 12th meeting.

Motion by Scheer to take action at the April meeting which would move girls' basketball to the winter and volleyball to the fall. Second by Lein. Krueger asked to consider how this switch will effect other activities such as speech. Kringen stated the membership has given a clear statement that the switch needs to be made. Scheer shared there is a timeline now that allows members to have an input prior to the April meeting. The feeling of the Board that the Executive Secretary will be given the peramiters to determine the selection of this task force.

The Board reviewed the cooperative sponsorshipo application from Goodrich and McClusky for track. Motion

by Kringen to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Minot athletic director, Terry Hjelmstad spoke to the Board concerning the setting of the State Cross Country meet. The Park Board has rejected the request to hold this meet at the Souris River Golf Course.

The Board discussed the site of the June 13th retirement supper and June 14th for the annual meeting. Dunderland indicated the possibility of meeting at Lake Metigoshie and will check on the availability. Also suggested would have the meeting on Thursday-Friday rather than Wednesday-Thursday. The dates are tentatively set for June 14th for the retirement supper and June 15th for the meeting.

The Executive Secretary gave his report:

- The Board folders included letters from concerned fans for several reasons. One letter of invitation for Dave Carisrud will not be done.
- Letters of complaints of officials
 - Included was the tabulation of the Athletic Review results.
- 4. A letter from Lou Ogaard commending the recent decision to exempt soccer from the out of season coaching rule.
- A review of the North Dakota Broadcasters Association meeting which resulted in the agreement in which the media was allowed to select the all-tournament teams. This agreement included the NDHSAA having input in the selection of this all-tournament team to prevent those individuals demonstrating unsportsmanlike behavior from being named. The media group agreed to this process and has now been criticized for this very issue.

MINUTES Class B District Chairmen's Meeting 9:00 A.M. - March 16, 2001 Holiday Inn, Minot, ND

The Class B District Chairmen met at 9:00 a.m. on March 16, 2001 at the Minot Holiday Inn. Chairman Kringen called the meeting to order and welcomed the district chairmen and thanked them for bringing the recommendations from their respective districts.

It was determined the group would delay their discussion on two common recommendations (a) banquets and practices and (b) switch of girls' basketball and volleyball seasons until the other recommendations were reported.

Recommendations were heard beginning with District 1.

Dist. 1 - Bruce Schumacher, Fairmont:

- The junior high athletic seasons should be organized as four seasons, which would correspond
 as closely as possible with the four academic quarters of the school year.
- Align the girls' volleyball districts/regions with the boys' and girls' basketball regions.

Dist. 2 – Jon Kringen, Enderlin:

- 1. Align junior high game regulations with high school limitations (i.e. high school can play 19 games/junior high can play 12 games and a tournament or a total of 15 games).
- Expand the regional volleyball tournament to three days.
- Region 1 basketball tournament should rotate between Valley City and Wanpeton. Boys' in Wahpeton every other year/girls in Valley City every other year.

Comments: Schumacher - we need to be aware of the amount of competitions that we expect from junior high age and because of to many expectations, this would not be a good move.

Ness – Concerning the four-season junior high seasons and the "less than 50" rule, are we going to allow junior high players from a different season play in the high school season if under 50 in 7 & 8 grade?

Dist: 3 – Randy Vigen, Central Valley:

- Reinstate banquet and full practice time at state tournaments.
- Would like to see two officials selected from each district to work regional basketball tourna-

ments.

3. Continue rotating Region 2 sites between Mayville State and Grafton.

The question was asked as to whether there is a conflict between Grafton and Mayville State. Vigen indicated no, as it has been working quite well. Also, the region has not discussed the Alerus in Grand Forks as a regional site at this time.

Comments:

Barry Haggin - The banquet is educational experience.

Schlieve - without a banquet and practice the day before, there is not an opportunity to meet and be informed of the operations of the tournament.

Ness requested how many teams in the current tournament came in on Wednesday?

Highest addressed the situation informing the group four of the teams came in on Wednesday and the remainder drove in the day of the tournament.

Dist. 4 - Harold Mach, Minto:

Will delay comments until group discussion on switch of seasons.

Dist 5 - Hy Schlieve, Ellendale

Move golf to the fall starting the season the first of August.

2. District 5, on a straw poll regarding the "proposal" to have three classes, the District split 7-2, with 7 favoring staying with the current two-class system.

Dist 6 - Ron Groth, Gackle

Eliminate the riders fee for officials.

2. Continue to explore the move of the State Tournament golf dates from Monday/Tuesday to Tuesday/Wednesday. Rationale: Sunday is graduation day for many schools and is causing conflict for practice on the course.

3. Region recommends a rotation plan for east-west sites in their region.

Comments: Ness, there is concern about the loss of practice round problems.

Schlieve – riders fee seems to be a larger problem for Class B schools as officials travel more to the Class B schools. In football, with a 5-man crew, the amount adds up.

Schneider, Edmore – Would like to have a straw vote as to whether it should be removed from the fee schedule.

Guler – maybe raise the officials' fee if you want to eliminate the riders fee. Not every official can conveniently leave their jobs early enough to get to the ball game on time. It is a small benefit for those officials that do so

Chairperson, Kringen requested a straw vote as to if the districts felt the riders fee is a financial burden – no hands were raided. The next straw vote was to request how many districts felt there is a need to drop the riders fee. Four of the 16 districts voted in favor of eliminating the riders fee.

Dist 7 - Tim Guler, New Rockford

Everything their district had has been discussed.

Dist. 8 - Dave Schneider, Edmore

 Recommends that the NDHSAA oppose any mandated three-man officiating crews for basketball.

Dist 9 - Herb Kringen, Selfridge

Recommend the boys' regional tournament be held at Mandan High School.

Dist 10 - Rob Rust, Center

Concerned about the seating capacity for their regional tournament.

Their district discussed the three-class system with no strong consensus.

Board member Tollefson added their district has held discussion about transfer of students and the related eligibility. There is a suggestion the Board may want to consider in the future a waiting period for eligibility rather than immediate eligibility to allow examination of the nature of the move of a family unit. Ness indicated this is an issue that is in need to be considered. The Board may want to revisit the hardship rule, including when a student moves with the family and each move be examined on an individual basis.

Dist 11 - Mike Ness, Bottineau

- Volleyball tournament Do not like the current system with the top seed getting a bye at regional tournament.
- A reminder the tournament manager's fee did not get adjusted when the volleyball region went from one to two days.

Dist. 12 - Robert Thom, Glenburn

Would like to see a continued effort for all activities to minimize the amount of school time lost for extra-curricular activities. This would include coaches that attend meetings such as district seeding, etc. if was a consensus of the group that each district can address this on an individual basis.

Dist. 13 - Norman Fries, Bowman

Their district had a concern about home court advantage at their regional site.

Their district is continuing discussion of the three-class system.

There may be some confusion in the interpretation of the junior high section of the Constitution & ByLaws concerning which rules do not apply to schools with less than 50 in the 7th & 8th grade.

g by Laws on the state of the health and the second member Krueger stated in review of all the junior high limitations, we need to be mindful of the health of the child.

Dist. 14 - Terry Quintus, Dickinson Trinity

Concern with the number of teams in each district in volleyball. The numbers in their districts has become lopsided.

Dist. 15 - Ed Lonefight, Mandaree

- 1. Mr Lonefight related he had played Class C basketball at Mandaree and thought the three-class system was a good system. This has been proven in Montana.
- The district has composed a letter relating to switching of seasons.

Dist, 16 - Barry Haggin, Divide County

Concerns will be discussed later in this meeting.

The floor was opened to seek each district's opinion on the switch of season issue.

Dist 1 - Schumacher:

Observations – their school, by their cooperative sponsorship with a Minnesota school, does play volleyball in the fall and girls' basketball in the winter. Their schools simply work it out and feel it is not a big problem. There are concerns and there will be problems but schools in North Dakota have the ability to address these things. Input in the planning process is important.

Dist. 2:

In a district straw vote, it was unanimous they did not want to make the change but agreed unanimously to make the change. There are concerns about coaches and officials and how this will impact individual athletes that may have to drop a sport with the switch. Their district has a question about the time-line. Dist. 2 supports the change in knowing it needs to be done soon enough to allow the membership to be in control of their own process rather than having an outside interest step in. They are in support of the switch and felt it was important for an earlier change.

Dist. 3:

Earlier, their district went on record to be strongly opposed to switch of seasons. After further research, they became in favor of the change and hope the change will take place when we are ready. Sooner is better as long as preparation is complete.

Dist 4:

There is a concern for coaching staff and those individuals that coach both seasons of basketball will have to take a financial cut. Also, their volleyball coach is in the agriculture business and a fall season would eliminate him from coaching.

Dist 5:

Their district is not anxious for change but is in support and sooner better than later. Districts should be involved in this process.

Dist 6:

Everyone is resigned to the fact it will happen and is reluctantly in favor.

Dist 7

Their only concern is coaching staff. The district sees the need for the switch to come and supports going in the 2002-2003 season.

Dist. 8:

Make certain there is sufficient input during the planning sessions. Regional meetings will be important. Switching scoper is acceptable.

Dist. 9:

In favor of a switch, as many of their schools play South Dakota Schools. Their district recommends 2002-2003.

Dist. 10

Can see the handwriting on the wall and supports the switch.

Dist. 11

Later is better than sooner. Their district would like to see the junior high seasons scheduled as previously

mentioned.

Their district had a lot of discussion and had concern for the border schools if the switch is delayed. Their group is ready to go whenever the Board decides and would like sooner rather than later.

Their district is in favor of switching the same time that South Dakota changes.

Schlieve - Most teams schedule home and home and to delay change would cause problems in scheduling. with South Dakota schools.

Scheer asked the group how many districts in favor of a 2002-2003 switch. A straw vote indicated 12 districts are in favor of a 2002-2003 switch.

Their group has the same concerns as other districts but agrees it will happen and the sooner the better.

Dist. 15 Is inevitable and want to be involved in the process.

Their district was unanimous against the change of seasons. If it is going to go, would rather see it go later to see if we are prepared.

Schumacher indicated he was asked by several people that when Minot hosts a tournament the size of the Boys' Class B, the city not host another large event as this causes trouble with availability of motel rooms.

Lukach - With switch of seasons, football and volleyball could have the opening date of their season at the same time.

Haggin - There is a need to take time to look at other programs. This season switch is going to cause more coops and the need for redistricting.

Schumacher - Go back to opening statement - it works pretty well. We are gong to see more coops because of the declining enrollment. Turn it over to the office and go with it.

The Executive Secretary was asked to address the group on this subject. He indicated he would prefer to wait until 2003-2004. Mainly, there are other related items to be studied. Schools are asking that placement of seasons for all activities be studied. Recommendation is that if 2002 is the choice, a very large cross-section committee be used in the planning stages.

The District Chairpersons were thanked for their work on recommendations for the regional sites for girls and boys' basketball and were reminded to be certain these sites submit an invitation for those particular tournaments.

With no further business, the meeting was declared adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** April 12, 2001 - Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities met on April 12, 2001 at the NDHSAA office in Valley City. President Tollefson called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all members present.

Motion by Lukach to approve the agenda. Second by Krueger and carried.

Motion by Bradshaw to approve the minutes of the January 29 and March 16, 2001 meetings. Second by Kringen and carried.

The financial report through March 31, 2001 was presented by the Executive Secretary. Motion by Scheen to approve the report. Second by Sanstead and carried.

President Tollefson reported on a violation of the no-practice policy prior to the regional tournament. Prior to reporting on the incident, the Board reviewed the policy flow chart used to review a violation. The Executive Board placed Strasburg High School on a warning status for violation of the no-practice policy and informed them further violation could lead to probation or suspension.

in the event there is a situation where districts do not hold a seeding meeting, the regulations need to add "following the seeding of teams" which would set the mark for which no practices shall be allowed at the regional site. Motion by Scheer to approve the recommendation. Second by Bradshaw. With a clarification of the process, the motion and second were withdrawn.

Eukach reported on behalf of the Media Committee meeting with KVLY television. The committee recommended leaving the hockey tournament on the original weekend as scheduled and work further with the NBC representatives for further plans to televise the tournament using an alternative plan.

Dunderland reported on behalf of the Promotions Committee discussion of the Distinguished Student nomination process used by each individual school. It was emphasized by the committee the nomination is recognizing the student that reflects the philosophy of the program. Also discussed were the various ways the Distinguished Student and the other 5 finalists would be utilized during their senior year. Various groups associated with the NDHSAA can be made aware these students are possibly available to speak at their functions. It was recommended that a budget line item be created to cover the costs for Distinguished Students when representing the Association. USBank has approached the NDHSAA with the name being the USBank Distinguished Student but the committee recommends the title, "NDHSAA Distinguished Student sponsored by USBank". Sanstead indicated the importance of this award being specified for not only athletics but also all of the activities. The Executive Secretary indicated there is work on how to include the USBank in the medallion for the Distinguished Student. Lukach indicated there could be USBank banners included on the awards table along with the NDHSAA banner. The Board agreed there is the possibility of placing promotional information on the awards table.

Hielmstad reported on behalf of the Ad Hoc Committee formed to review the process and the application of the addition of an activity. Appreciation was expressed to the committee responsible for the formation of the procedure used by schools to request the sanctioning of an activity. Reviewed was the information made available for the request of the sanctioning of a girls' hockey program. - k. What would be the season, starting and ending calendar dates.
- The Executive Secretary addressed how this possible addition would impact the staff. Estimation it would cost of between \$10,000 and \$20,000 to the association. The impact to the staff would be minimal as long as we retain Tim O'Leary to help with the overall hockey program. It is believed the local schools have looked at how the addition would impact their other school programs.

This letter of invitation will be drafted and sent to Craig Perry to be passed on to the delegation.

Barry Haggin of Divide County appeared before the Board with a letter from David Rust of Tioga introducing Mr. Haggin as the representative of the Northwest school administrators. This appearance is in regard 16 the elimination of pre-tournament practices and banquets. The policy debate program will be organized on three levels; (A) the upper division will be varsity Policy; (B) the second division will be Novice Policy; and (C) the third division will be Limited Current issue Debate.

Keep # 2 as is - See restrictions below for novice eligibility.

Add a new #10 on page 61.

A tab room committee will be created (2002 committee is Gayle Hyde, Yvonne Kalka, Deb Fenlason). The committee will report to the tournament site no later than 1:00 p.m. on the Friday of the tournament to assist with the scheduling of Round I in all novice and junior varsity divisions. The committee will work with the tournament manager and NDHSAA as a support team throughout the tournament and will agree to be on call while scheduling and tabulating the results. The tournament manager and NDHSAA will determine assignments. However, the committee will primarily oversee the novice and junior varsity divisions and the tournament manager will set all varsity division schedules and judge assignments. Coaches who serve on the tab room committee will be required to fulfill their school's judging obligation by supplying a judge. The need for judges supersedes the need for added tab room staff.

Page 62 – Change Open Policy Division to Policy Division. Substitute the following for what is #1 and #2. (Each school may enter up to six two-person teams in the Varsity Policy Division.

2.Each School may enter up to four two-person teams in the Novice Policy Division , but

must follow novice guidelines

3.Novice Status (as currently printed on page 60).

4. Novices must be registered with the NDHSAA office by mid-December. Protests concerning

novice status along with ballots and/or tournament results sheets must be received by the NDHSAA office to later than one week before the first day of the tournament.

Substitute the following for #3 on page 62.

3/All teams (Policy & L-D) will debate four preliminary rounds using the following criteria:

a Preliminary rounds 1 and 2 will be randomly paired with half the teams paired on the affirmative side and the other half on the negative.

b. One judge will be used in all preliminary rounds.

Each team will be guaranteed one affirmative and one negative round.

d.in the event that an uneven number of teams are registered, the bye for each round will be randomly drawn before the pairing begins. No team may receive more than one bye in the four preliminary rounds. as No teams from the same school may meet in the first two preliminary rounds unless they account for more than 50 percent of the division.

Found 3 will be power-matched based upon the records accumulated in the first two rounds. Teams will be power-matched within brackets with the highest seed in each bracket meeting the lowest seed. For example, if there were four teams with a 2-0 record, the team ranked 1 would meet the team ranked 4 and he team ranked 2 would meet the team ranked 3.

g. If an uneven number of teams have the same win-loss record, a team from the middle of the next lowest bracket, in this case 1-1, would be drawn up to meet an undefeated team. For example, if there are five leams with a 2-0 record, one team from the 1-1 bracket would be brought up to be the sixth team in the undefeated bracket in order for the pairings to be set.

(I) No team may be pulled up into a higher bracket more than one time.

(2) No teams from the same school may meet in the third round unless 40 percent or more of the teams in the division are from the same school. The school may elect to have the higher seed win or have the teams debate the round, without penalty. If the school elects to have the higher seed win, the speaker points for both teams are averaged following the procedure used for byes.

(3) There are no side constraints in Round 3.

h. Round 4 will be power-matched based upon the records accumulated in the first three rounds.

(1) Teams will be power-matched within brackets with the highest seed in each bracket meeting the lowest

(2) If an uneven number of teams have the same win-loss record, a team from the middle of the next lowest bracket, not previously drawn up, will be moved to the higher bracket.

(3) No teams from the same school may meet in the fourth round unless 40 percent or more of the teams in the division are from the same school. The school may elect to have the higher seed win or have the teams debate the round, without penalty. If the school elects to have the higher seed win, the speaker points for both teams are averaged following the procedure used for byes.

(4) Sides will be set based upon the need for a team to have an affirmative or negative side after three

rounds.

Speakers points will be tallied from all of the four preliminary rounds to determine individual speaking awards. Debaters with byes will receive the average of their speaker points for the other rounds in which they debated. In the case of ties, and to compensate for disparity in the point ranges used by the various judges, the Z score will be the basis for final placement. (The Z score is calculated by the computer and determines variance between speaker points in a given round from the particular judge's average.) Substitute the following for what is currently #4, #5, and #6 (continuing on page 63).

New #4. The top eight Varsity Policy teams after prelims will advance to the elimination rounds which would begin with quarterfinals and be bracketed as follows: 1 vs. 8; 4 vs. 5; 2 vs. 7; and 3 vs. 6. All elimination rounds will have three-judge panels.

A. The winners of the quarterfinals will advance to the semifinal rounds and be bracketed as follows: winner of 1 vs. 8 will meet winner of 4 vs. 5; winner of 2 vs. 7 will meet winner of 3 vs. 6.

B. The winners of the semifinal rounds will meet in a final round.

Hockey

1. Support continuation of the coach/official rules clinic/day camp format currently being utilized.

Boys' Basketball

The coaches indicated their wish for better seating at the class B tournament.

- 1. Facility requirements to host a state competition not in a gymnasium
- Review the number of competitors for the site а
- Seating capacity of 600 spectators b.
- Adequate bathroom facilities C.
- Allow coaches input in selection of state meet facility d.
- Recommend a three-year advance notice for state meet site
- 2. Eliminate regional competition. Host a state competition in two sessions with all teams separated by conference scores. Comment on recommendation:
- a. With the lack of balance with east and west regions, this would be a more equitable evaluation of programs on a statewide basis
- 3. Eliminate publishing warm-up time in the Bulletin. Allow meet management to set warm-up time to accommodate the field of competitors.

Team substitutions are permitted at regional meets up to the time of the start of the event using the roster as submitted on the original entry form. If any varsity gymnast was injured or has an illness that prevents them from competing at regionals, a petition for entry to the State Meet if the following requirements are met and required materials are sent to the NDHSAA office by deadlines as outlined:

a. Photocopies of current season results from three meets of which only one may be a home contest, showing scores equal to or greater than the lowest qualifier's score in the petitioner's region shall be made available.

b. Supply a physician's written verification of injury/illness with a physician's approval to con-

pete.

c. A written request from the gymnast's coach must be produced.

d. A written recommendation from the Gymnastics Advisory Committee verifying this gymnast is eligible to advance to the state meet.

e. Deadline for petition must be made by noon, Monday preceding the state meet.

f. The Advisory Board will notify the petitioner and coach of the approval or denial of the petition by 6:00 p.m. on Monday of the state meet.

g. The coach will notify the State Meet director or host coach of the state meet by Sunday evening after the Regional meet, whether the petition will be taking place.

h. The State Meet director will be notified of the approval of the petition.

i. If the petition is accepted and the gymnast is then unable to compete, the coach must immediately notify the State Meet director of host coach by Thursday evening prior to the State Competition. NOTE: This illness/injury substitution policy shall be in effect, only if regional competition is reinstated. 5. Hold one state-wide mandatory rules clinic for all coaches and officials.

Swimming

The NDHSAA send a copy of the diving sheets to the host management for entry into the computer prior to the day of the state meet.

- Set the break after the Medley Relay on the finals day to be 5 minutes.
- Set the deadline for submitting state meet entries for 10:00 a.m. the Monday prior to the state 3. meet.
- Send the state meet information to coaches concerning state meet entries, meet schedule, etc.
- Adopt Schedule D of the State Meet Manual to be the Friday schedule for all state meets, regardless of the composition of the pool area.

Volleyball

It is requested of the Redistricting Committee to review the district alignments for possible adjustments. This could take place the same time as the switch of seasons.

Kringen, as part of the prevailing side, made a motion to reconsider the earlier vote to deny the following Volleyball Advisory Committee recommendations:

Advance 4 teams from each district to the regional tournament.

Hold regionals on three days. Consider the first night of regional play to be held at 2 sites to reduce the loss of classroom time.

Second by Lukach. The motion to reconsider carried with one dissenting vote.

Motion by Kringen to advance four teams from each volleyball district to regional play. Regional tournament shall be a three-day regional, using two sites the first day to avoid loss of school time. Second by Lukach and carried.

Gary Engebretson of Killdeer appeared before the Board to ask the Board to reconsider their action to hold intra-regional play in the first round of Division A football and hold inter-regional first round play. This request would reverse an earlier decision of the Board to hold the first round within the region to reduce travel time. Motion by Lukach to hold inter-region first-round play for the 2001 Division A football season. Second by Kringen and carried.

The Board continued with the athletic advisory recommendations. By motion and second, the Board approved:

Golf

Class B Boys' & Girls:

Eliminate regional registrations.

State tournaments be held Wednesday and Thursday after Memorial Day. If the courses weren't available on the Wednesday and Thursday, then Tuesday and Wednesday would be considered.

Each school shall be allowed ONE team of up to 6 golfers at the qualifying tournaments.

Girls shall be allowed 3 teams from each region to qualify for the state tournament. (They currently are allowed 2 teams)

NDHSAA was given the continued support of the coaches' association to balance the number of teams in each region when possible.

Baseball

 The higher seeded team shall be the home team and also have choice of dugout. When like seeds play, a coin flip will determine the aforementioned.

2. All pitchers shall be allotted twelve innings and three appearances for the state class A tournament based on a four-day rest prior to the state class A tournament.

Class B

1. Allow teams to have 18 players on the roster.

All pitchers are allotted twelve innings and three appearances for the state tournament based on four days rest prior to the state tournament.

Soccer

 Have the state tournament one week later - extend the season one week maintaining the same starting date

That girl's tournaments shall be scheduled on fields of natural grass.

 Implement a system of 3 points for a win and 1 point for a tie in pool play with tie breaking criteria remaining the same.

4. With the two-day format, game times are:

Track

Girls' pole vauit qualifying difference between Class A and Class B shall be 6" or 12" to facilitate
the raising of the bar at regular season meets.

2. At the state meet, starting height for the pole vault shall be 12" below qualifying height. Increments shall be 6" until one increment beyond qualifying height and then go to 3" increments.

At the state meet, starting height for the high jump shall remain at 4" below qualifying height.

 Declaration deadline for the state meet shall be the Wednesday prior to the State Meet at 5:00 p.m. central time.

The Board reviewed the Class B District Chair minutes from the November, 2000 and March, 2001 meetings. The recommendations concerning selection of officials was discussed with follow-up explanations to be made available to the member schools. All other recommendations were considered and included in previous actions of the Board.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board the negotiations that have taken place between the Finance Committee and EDAK (host of NDHSAA web site). As a result, EDAK has submitted a proposal of \$1,500 per month to provide service and hosting, along with any additional hours provided at a rate of \$50 per hour. Suggested was an offer of \$750 per month guaranteed for 15 hours with the possibility of additional hours at \$50 per hour and allow the Executive Secretary work out the details for a possible change in the negotiations. Motion by Kringen to contract with EDAK at \$50 per hour on a month-to-month basis with no minimum fee and the Executive Secretary explore the possibility of obtaining additional staff to handle the technology demands. Second by Bradshaw and carried.

The Board reviewed the Spirit Advisory Committee recommendations and tabled any action until the September meeting.

The Executive Secretary gave his report:

With permission from the Board, if the golf tournament sites are available, the date changes for Class B girls' and boys' regional and state golf tournaments that were tabled earlier for time to check on site availability, will be placed on the 2001-2002 calendar.

2. A disability insurance plan provided to the staff as part of the employee package was sold to Jefferson Pilot. This change was not communicated to the Executive Secretary by the agent and because of these problems, there was a search for another insurance plan. A new company, Horace Mann, was purchased because of a better plan and smaller monthly payments.

3. Ed Dissinger, the agent handling the association catastrophic insurance, has informed the association that the company contracted for this policy, K&S insurance has indicated they are not going to honor the third year of their contract. Mr. Dissinger is in the process of handling this situation. The association may experience a charige from the \$42,000 premium per year the association has been paying for member school's catastrophic insurance.

The work between Flasher and Solen to bring a positive result from their situation is ongoing. The student councils will be meeting together in the fall to discuss various issues.

 No blazers will be required at the summer meeting but the National Federation has encouraged casual local attire for the Hail of Fame Banquet.

 Relations with US Bank has remained healthy and conversations concerning continuing the sponsorship.

The Finance Committee was informed that study indicated the Engelstad Arena rental fee for State Hockey totals a similar amount that was charged the previous year. The previous year's rent did not include a majority of charges that were extra in the old arena cost but are included in the flat rate charged by the Engelstad Arena making the rental comparable.

Sanstead recognized staff member Carlsrud for his work as the capstone speaker at the National Federa-

The Board thanked President Tollefson for his leadership throughout the year. Also, the Board thanked Dunderland for hosting the annual meeting.

President Tollefson thanked the Board and expressed appreciation for the amount of time the members of the Board are committed to and let them know they are appreciated for their diligence.

The Board also thanked Scheer for his work in the four years on the Board.

With no further business, President Tollefson declared the meeting adjourned.

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

A. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is computed on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset which range from Seven to twenty years. The Association caspitalizes all significant equipment and building additions.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash equivalents include time deposits, certificates of deposits and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

E. Financial Statement Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Boards in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted assets and permanently restricted net assets. In addition the Association is required to present a statement of cash flows.

F. Income Tax Status

The Assocition is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Association is not a private foundation.

G. Investments

Under SFAS No. 124, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

H. Designation of Unrestricted Assets

It is the policy of the Board of Directors of the Association to review its plans for future property improvements and acquisitions from time to time and to designate appropriate sums of unrestricted net assets to assure adequate financing of such improvements and acquisitions.
