

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors August 13, 2003 - Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on August 13, 2003 at the North Dakota High School Activities Association office. President Koppelman called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. with all members present.

New Board members, Wilfred Volesky, Robert Briggs and Don Schaible were introduced and welcomed.

President Koppelman offered a few comments.

- Thank you to each Board member for the work they will do in the upcoming year
- Appreciation expressed for the professionalism, courtesy and respect shown for the work toward and support of decisions of the board.
- Looking forward to working together and open to suggestions for improvement.

Following additions and deletions, motion by Sanstead to approve the agenda. Second by Kringen and carried.

The minutes of the June 24th, June 29th, and July 14th meetings were made available for the Board to review. Motion by Kringen to approve as amended with change in the starting time of the June 29th meeting. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report for Board review. The report included the year-end and July balance sheets, updated budget, investment report and checks written for June and July. The audit report will take place later in the meeting. Motion by Schook to approve the finance report. Second by Carlson and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on tournament management fees previously approved. The regional wrestling manager fee was a misprint and it is suggested to correct that amount from \$150 to \$175. Motion by Lockwood to approve the regional wrestling tournament management fee to \$175. Second by Sanstead and carried.

A hardship eligibility applications from Trenton and Beach were the next agenda items. Motion by Kringen to go into executive session. Second by Coles and carried. President Koppelman declared the Board in executive session at 9:50 a.m.

The Board was declared out of executive session at 10:13 a.m. Motion by Kringen to deny the hardship eligibility application from Beach. Second by Coles and carried. Motion by Lockwood to deny the request for hardship eligibility from Trenton. Second by Kringen and carried.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the situation of selection of first-round regional basketball tournament sites and the invitation from Garrison which was withdrawn. District 10 was initially placed in Garrison and since the invitation has been withdrawn, a new site must be designated. Motion by Kringen to assign District 10 to the Bismarck Convention Center for the first round of regional play. Second by Lein and carried.

New Board members had been given their policy manuals at their orientation meeting. The remainder of the Board was reminded to place the approved revised edition into their policy manuals.

Auditor Harold Rotunda presented his annual audit for the financial year ended June 30, 2003. President Koppelman thanked the Executive Secretary for the work he does with the Association budget. Motion by Lockwood to approve the audit. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Kringen reported on behalf of the Tournament Committee with four items on their agenda.

 Pre-tournament practice was discussed and it was the recommendation of the committee to not reinstate practice. Motion by Kringen to approve the recommendation to not reinstate pre-tournament practices. Second by Volesky and carried with one dissenting vote.

- Discussed holding the boys and girts' hockey tournament combined at the Engelstad Arena. The Committee is not prepared to make a recommendation at this time.
- The state basketball schedule was discussed. It was recommended by the Class A boys basketball coaches the tournament series would be Class A boys the first weekend, the Class A and Class B girls' the second weekend and the Class B boys the third weekend.

Motion by Kringen to deny the request to change the state basketball tournament format. Second by Coles and carried.

4. Regional sites for gymnastics should be Grand Forks and Dickinson. Motion by Kringen to approve. Second by Lockwood and carried.

Coles reported on behalf of the Officials Committee with the following recommendations received from the Coaches advisory.

 Increase the number of officials at the Class A State Basketball Tournament from 9 to more than 12.

Motion by Coles to deny the request. Second by Lein and carried.

Request for the NDHSAA to address the illegal use of the arm bar and offense backing down defense in basketball. Coles indicated these will be addressed at the rules clinics under rough post play.

The Executive Secretary presented a proposed timeline for the process of procuring bids for the sale of association automobiles and the purchase of new. This bid process will allow individuals to have an opportunity to purchase the vehicles through the bidding process. Motion by Coles to call for bids. Second by Lein and carried.

With the completion of board members Koppelman, Kringen and Lein, there is a need to establish a nominating committee for each of these positions. Present practice is to allow the group represented by each board member to become the nominating committee rather than selecting several individuals to carry out this assignment.

Discussion took place concerning the representation of the Class A representatives. It was pointed out the Class A central position represents only 4 schools. Motion by Kringen to establish a nominating group of the southeast administrators to select the nominations and the NDIAAA to select their nominations. The Class A central position was discussed with the possible study of changing the Class a representation to Class A east, Class A west and Class A at large. This concept is to be referred to the Constitution & By-Law Committee for further study. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Board received regulations for fall sports. Motion by Kringen to approve the fall sports recommendations. Second by Lein and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board member schools have questioned why a late fee is assessed for junior high coops. In the past, the late fee was initially brought into the policy to avoid affecting scheduling and has been applied to all levels of sports coops. Extensive discussion followed with no action to change.

The Board reviewed the following cooperative sponsorship applications:

Shanley and Park Christian (Minnesota) in boys hockey (03-04)

Elgin-New Leipzig and Carson in 7th & 8th grade boys and girls' basketball (03-04)

Elgin-New Leipzig, Flasher and Carson in junior high football Motion by Kringen to approve Elgin-New Leipzig and Carson in 7th & 8th grade boys and girls' basketball (03-04) and Elgin-New Leipzig, Flasher and Carson in junior high football with the \$500 late fee. Second by Coles and carried.

The Shanley and Park Christian application was acted upon. Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Coles and carried.

The Board read a letter of request from Hope-Page concerning their pre-season practice requirements for football not being met because of involvement in Legion baseball. Motion by

Coles to deny the request. Second by Schock and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented to the Board an update on the work taking place as a result of the Sportsmanship Committee and the ad hoc committee. The assignment was to put together a working sportsmanship document for member schools.

The Executive Secretary gave his report to the Board:

- Several hardships are to be reviewed in the future. This may possibly be via conference call or at the September board meeting.
- Recognized Gaillord Peltier, superintendent of Four Winds has been appointed to the National Federation Coaches Education Committee
- Also recognized Peggy Person, principal and athletic director from Berthold who has been named to the National Federation Citizenship Committee

The Board held an audience with a mother and son from Minnewaukan concerning a hardship request. Motion by Kringen to move into executive session. Second by Lockwood and carried. President Koppelman declared the Board in executive session at 12:40 p.m.

The Board was declared out of executive session at 12:58 p.m. Motion by Kringen to deny the Minnewaukan hardship request. Second by Coles and carried with two dissenting votes.

With no further business, President Koppelman declared the meeting adjourned.

Minutes NDOA Board Meeting Valley City, 9/14/03

President Anderson called the meeting to order @ 12:02 PM with Dave Klundt, Greg Selbo, Donna Hutchison, Terry Schneweis, and Don Glarum attending.

President Anderson welcomed all and especially new board members, Donna Hutchison and Greg Selbo.

Klundt moved to approve minutes of the February meeting. Second by Glarum. Motion carried.

A discussion concerning the upcoming board term vacancies and representation was held. Geography, sport representation and registration in one sport of a board members portfolio were brought forward for consideration. The board welcomes nominations or personal requests from individuals who would like to serve on the NDOA Board. Two board positions will be open for next year: northwest, baseball and wrestling portfolios; southwest, boys basketball portfolio.

The possibility of adding one seat on the board to have 2 members from each quadrant was discussed, but no action was taken.

Active Officials Awards - Baseball, Dave Achen, Grand Forks; Boys Basketball, Perry Smith, Wilton; GBB, Bob Zimney, Grand Forks; Football, Arnie Harstad, Grand Forks; Gymnastics; 7, Fargo; Hockey, John Colter, Grand Forks; Soccer, Cindy McKay, Minot; Swimming, Gerry Pfau, Bismarck; Volleyball, Rod Heisler, Devils Lake; Wrestling, Mike Nider, Mandan. Moved by Glarum to accept the Active Officials Awards. Second by Klundt. Motion carried.

The NDOA Board thanks the NDHSAA Officials Committee and the NDHSAA Board for being pro-active in developing the 2004-05 fee schedules.

Hutchison moved to recommend a raise in JrHi volleyball fees from \$16 to \$21 and sub-varsity from \$21 to \$26 on the 2004-05 fee schedule. Second by Glarum. Motion carried.

Following extensive discussion, Glarum moved to limit the number of NDOA HOF inductees per year to three. Under special circumstances, the board may induct one additional person provided such person receives a two-thirds majority vote. Second by Klundt. Motion carried. The aforementioned will be proposed to the membership as a By-Law change in May.

Moved by Schneweis to induct Tim O'Leary, Allen Dockter, (one to be named later) and Ross Loibl into the NDOA Hall of Fame. Second by Klundt. Motion carried.

Discussed the NFOA Governance as administered by the NFHS. Changes will be made for the future due to the financial crunch resulting from increased insurance costs.

The board discussed pros and cons of suspending registered officials should they be found guilty or plead guilty to criminal activity. Discussions and research will continue. The board requests the NDHSAA Board also discuss and share its thoughts with the NDOA Board.

The proposed NDHSAA Sportsmanship plan was reviewed with the board.

The board was informed of the new web page.

The next board meeting will be held Sunday, February 15th at noon in the NDHSAA Office in Valley City. Board meetings are open and you are welcome. Please contact a board member or Dave Carlsrud in advance to be on the agenda.

Minutes

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors September 16, 2003 - Bismarck, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on September 16, 2003 at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. President Koppetman called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Sanstead who joined the Board at 2:30 p.m.

Following additions and deletions, motion by Briggs to approve the agenda. Second by Schaible and carried.

The minutes of the August 13, 2003 meeting were provided in the Boards packet. Motion by Kringen to approve the minutes. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the finance report including the balance sheet, updated budget, investment report and checks written for August. Motion by Coles to approve the report. Second by Lein and carried.

The request reviewed at the June meeting from the Volleyball Advisory Committee for additional matches/tournaments was brought back to the table. With the shortening of the volleyball season as per recommendation by the district chairpersons, it is believed this would negate the rationale for the initial request. Motion by Kringen to deny the request. Second by Coles and carried.

The Board previously had approved the Alerus Center as the site for the opening round of Region II boys basketball. Although the Alerus has successfully scheduled the girls' first round tournament date, because of a scheduling conflict, the site cannot host the boys region first round. Region II has recommended the two sites be Mayville for District 3's' 1st and 2nd place teams to host the 3nd and 4nd place teams and Grafton for District 4's 1st and 2nd place teams to host District 3's 3nd and 4nd place teams. These opening round games are to be scheduled for March 8nd. Other first-round basketball date and facility conflicts were reviewed. The results were:

Region VIII girls' first round play was to be at Williston HS and Tioga HS. Because of construc-

tion, Williston HS will not be able to host. District 15 indicated their choice of Williston State College which is the site of the region tournament.

Region V tournament will be at Mandan HS. The opening rounds will be at the Bismarck Convention Hall and Century High School. District 9 will be at the Convention Hall and District 10 will be at Century. This is by request of the regional schools.

Region I tournament for boys on March 8th was to be at Wahpeton State School of Science. District 1 has recommended Lisbon to host because of a schedule conflict with Wahpeton Science. This would be unless Lisbon is to travel to the other first-round site. If so, Enderlin will host. Also there is an invitation from Sargent Central.

As a result of the discussions the following first-round sites were set: Region 1 - Dist 1 girls' @ Lisbon; District 3 boys @ Mayville, District 4 boys @ Grafton, and District 15 girls' @ Williston State College. Motion by Lockwood to approve these first-round site recommendations. Second by Briggs and carried.

It was requested this split site issue be discussed with a note going out to districts prior to the March District Chair meeting to get feedback concerning this process.

It was noted to the Board by the Executive Secretary that the girls' Region VII site was changed from DSU to Dickinson Trinity because of a facility conflict.

Motion by Kringen to go into Executive Session. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Board came out of executive session at 2:00 p.m. with the announcement the New England hardship request was denied.

Motion by Lockwood to go into Executive Session. Second by Kringen and carried.

Board returned to open session at 2:15 p.m. to announce the approval of the Thompson hardship request.

Motion by Sanstead to go into executive session. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Board returned to open meeting at 2:30 p.m. with the announcement the Oak Grove hard-ship request has been approved.

A discussion took place relating to the hardship process. The points brought out in discussion indicated this may be reviewed by the Constitution & By-Laws.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board concerning a review of the policy on lifetime passes. The policy for awarding lifetime passes includes state tournament managers that have accumulated sufficient points from managing tournaments to be presented a lifetime pass.

Recommended is a change to include points awarded for a combined state basketball tournament to be worth 7 points, the same as other combined tournaments. With the review of past state tournament points received, a recommended list of individuals eligible to receive recognition and a gold pass for past performance as state tournament manager was reviewed.

Lockwood shared with the Board past performances of several other people who are now retired but did not receive sufficient points for management of state tournaments but were instrumental in the hosting and management of many regional tournaments. Motion by Kringen to approve lifetime passes for Ed Lockwood, Craig Perry, Jim Haussler and Darryl Anderson. Second by Coles and carried.

Koppelman reported on the Executive Board with the following:

- Towner-Granville reported themselves for the use of non-registered volleyball officials. The Committee recommended a letter of reprimand be sent to the school.
- Minot reported the use of an ineligible student in two junior varsity cross country meets. A letter of reprimand will be sent indicating they must forfeit the two meets in which they used this student.

The Committee also would like to thank these schools for self-reporting these violations.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Finance Committee. The committee studied the investment report in detail. The committee also studied team payments and what appears as inequities in comparing payments among the various sports. The committee will reconvene prior to the January meeting for further study.

Schock reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee. The following was discussed:

Class A Central Board representation: It was determined the presently, time would not allow completion of an amendment to change the Class A Board representation prior to the next election. The procedure must first receive Board approval. If so, between now and August, 2005, the Committee will draft an amendment to present to the Board. This amendment would be voted on January, 2006 which would effect the replacement of that Class A Central Board member in 2008. Recommended was the Board to approve the drafting of the concept of Class A East, Class A West and Class A At-Large to replace the current Class A Central Board representation. Motion by Lockwood to go on record supporting this amendment and vote prior to the vacancy of that position in 2008. Second by Coles and carried.

For the upcoming vacancy of the Board for Class A Central, the administration of those schools represented by this position shall form a nominating committee. Motion by Kringen to create a nominating committee consisting of the Class A Central schools. Second by Schaible and carried.

Schock also reported on the committee's discussion on graded elementary schoots and how question 167 needs adjustment to meet the current charges. Motion by Schock to change question 167 to meet the current dues structure, continue prior practice of requirement of membership to be eligible for coops and add charging participation fees to those graded elementary schools for the 2004-2005 school year. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Constitution & By-Laws Committee also discussed Page 24 - eligibility of graduated students. The Board was charged with deciding as to whether the interpretation of this section does or does not match the wording of the rule. The Board was in agreement that after a student has graduated from high school, they are no longer eligible. This charges the Constitution & By-Laws Committee with the task of setting a definition of graduation and to rework the wording to match the interpretation and past practices.

Kringen reported on the Sportsmanship Committee work on the NDHSAA Sportsmanship Program. The last committee meeting was very productive but left three questions to be addressed:

- Should fans be included in the consideration of the sportsmanship award at state tournaments?
- What are the logistics of how to determine what schools will receive a sportsmanship banner at state tournaments.
- What will be the name of this program?

Board response:

- Adult fans shall not be a part of this criteria of the sportsmanship banner but student fans will be part of the consideration.
- The logistics of how to determine what schools will receive a sportsmanship banner at state tournaments will be brought back to the October meeting.
- 3. The name of the program will continue to be studied.

Trophy presentation assignments were made.

The Board discussed post-season basketball and the format used for districts, regions and state tournaments. Much informal discussion has caused unrest among facility managers and others as to what plans will take place in the future. This discussion shall be charged to the Tournament Committee. A meeting will be scheduled for October 13th at 9:30 a.m.

The Board reviewed cooperative sponsorship program applications:

Fargo South and Shanley in girls' hockey (03-04)

Wilton, Wing, Tuttle-Pettibone and Baldwin in jr. hi. Football (03-04)

Oak Grove and Grace Lutheran School in junior high volleyball, boys basketball, girls' basketball, and track (03-04) (\$1500 late fee).

Motion by Kringen to approve. Second by Briggs.

Williston and Dickinson Trinity in girls' swimming (03-04)

Motion by Kringen to approve for 2004-2005 year. Second by Coles. Motion and second were withdrawn. Motion by Coles to approve for the 2003-2004 year. Second by Lockwood and carried with two dissenting votes.

Discussion took place concerning cooperative sponsorship programs with teams from other states that have different transfer eligibility rules from North Dakota.

A letter of request from Minot was reviewed to allow Matthew Lowe to attend the U.S. Open Swim Meet. This event is of national and potentially Olympic ramifications. Motion by Coles to allow. Second by Kringen and carried.

Staff member Hetler reported on a movement among a few Class A schools to host their own regional music competition. What has been offered as a suggestion is sanctioning of this event as an invitational. It was clarified that this would not be a NDHSAA regional event.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

- a. Regional meetings, we had 74 attendees and although small numbers, we have received very positive feedback. There will be an attempt to shorten the agenda and make it more of a question and answer session for the 2004 fall series.
- Letters have been received from different interest groups concerning the sites of girls' and boys state hockey tournaments.

The next meeting will be October 22, 2003 in Bismarck.

Volesky informed the Board the tobacco coalition will be approaching the Board for an interpretation of how it is handled when a student enters a smoking cessation program.

With no further business, President Koppelman declared the meeting adjourned.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on October 22, 2003 at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. President Koppelman called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. with all members present.

Following additions and deletions, motion by Briggs to approve the agenda. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The minutes of the September 15, 2003 meeting were provided in the Boards packet. Motion by Volesky to approve the minutes. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the finance report including the balance sheet, updated budget, investment report and checks written. Motion by Schaible to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Curt Jones and Perry Braunagel representing the Class A athletic administrators appeared

before the Board concerning the 2004 volleyball season and post season calendar. Motion by Lockwood to rescind the previous plan and re-enact the plan to begin the volleyball season one week later August 16 and end the season one week later, November 18, 19, 20. Second by Lein A roll call vote was taken.

Lockwood - yes Carlson - yes Kringen - no Coles - no Schaible - no Volesky - yes Schock - no Sanstead - yes Lein -yes Briggs - ves Koppelman - no

Motion carried, 6-5

Sawyer Principal Dan Larson appeared before the Board requesting additional semesters of eligibility for a student. Briggs requested the minutes note the fact he is representing his region rather than a particular school in his vote on this issue. Motion by Volesky to deny. Seconded by Coles and carried by roll call vote:

Lockwood - yes Carlson - yes Kringen - no Coles - yes Schaible - yes Volesky - yes Schock - yes Sanstead - no Koppelman - no Lein -yes Briggs - yes

Motion to deny carried, 8-3

Coles reported on behalf of the Officials Committee with a recommendation of maximum fees adjustment for volleyball in 2004-05 to \$21 for Jr. High and \$26 for all sub-varsity. Motion by Coles to accept these recommendations. Second by Lein and carried.

Point of privilege - Sanstead left @ 9:45 a.m.

The Executive Secretary indicated the next several items on the agenda are related issues concerning cooperative sponsorships. Northwood and Hatton are in the process of beginning plans to consolidate and are seeking approval of coops. An approval of a Northwood/Hatton coop in cross country in conjunction with a current coop between Northwood and Thompson would put their combined enrollment over 325, causing them to compete in Class A. Thompson is requesting the 325 rule be waived allowing the three schools to be members of this coop. Supt. Jack Maus, of Hatton and school board presidents Gary Bilden of Northwood and Jim Housen of Hatton appeared before the Board to explain the reason supporting approval of coop requests for girls' basketball, boys basketball, volleyball and cross country. Motion by Kringen to approve the girls' basketball, boys basketball, volleyball and cross country applications for Hatton and Northwood. Second by Lockwood. Motion by Lockwood to amend the motion to state approval of these types of coops will be based on a submission of documentation outlining proof of a plan for consolidation process, which will stand in the record for future reference. Second by Volesky. Discussion ensued on making record of reasons why requests were approved. All motions and seconds were withdrawn as per vote of the Board. Following further discussion, based on plans for future consolidation as submitted by Hatton and Northwood, motion by Kringen for approval of girls' basketball, boys basketball, volleyball and cross country cooperative sponsorship programs. Second by Lockwood and carried with one dissenting vote.

Motion by Lockwood to approve the request by Northwood to dissolve the Thompson/Northwood cross country coop. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Board discussed Thompson's request to waive the 325 limit for their cross country coop. This would allow Thompson to remain in their coop with Northwood with the addition of Hatton in the existing coop. Motion by Kringen to deny the request from Thompson to waive the 325 limit to remain Class B for cross country as it would be in violation of the Constitution & By-Laws. Second by Coles and carried.

Supt. Bruce Schumacher of Fairmount and Athletic Director Jess Smith of Hankinson appeared before the Board to request allowing Hankinson to join the Fairmount/Campbell-Tintah football cooperative sponsorship program. Kringen reported on the Football Committee meeting the previous evening. There was an in-depth discussion concerning this request with a recommendation to deny. Motion by Carlson to approve the request. Second by Schaible and carried with one dissenting vote.

Roman Marcellais of Dunseith appeared before the Board with a request to allow their football team be moved from 11-man to 9-man because of their strength and numbers. Motion by Carlson to allow their request. Second by Lockwood. A roll call vote was taken:

Sanstead returned to the meeting.

Schock reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee with the following items:

Page 15 of the By-Laws concerning the football limitation. There is a possible difference of interpretation regarding the wording of the By-Law and the regulations which is current practice. The committee felt the intent of the By-Law was as the regulation is worded. The recommendation is to change the By-Law to fit what has been the current practice as outlined in the printed regulations. This would take a proposed amendment to be presented to the General Assembly in January. Motion by Coles the By-Law be amended to reflect the language of the regulation. Second by Sanstead and carried. The committee chairman was directed to draw up an amendment for the January vote.

The committee was asked to examine the hardship rule and determine whether the Board must review hardship applications only if both schools agree this is a hardship. Recommended wording is, idirectors, provided the investigation reveals the change was necessary. The last sentence shall read, iRulings in such cases will be considered by the Board after a complete investigation by the NDHSAA professional staff and/or Board of Directors. Delete wording ionly when in regular session. This also would need a vote in January. Motion by Briggs to approve this

recommendation. Second by Kringen and carried.

The committee reworked the interpretation of Section VI on page 24 to define the meaning of the term igraduation. A graduate shall be defined as ia student who has received and accepted a signed high school diploma or equivalent, from the high school of attendance, regardless of the number of semesters attended. Accepting the diploma constitutes graduation which makes the student alumni of that school and therefore, no longer eligible for extra-curricular activities or competition at the high school level. Motion by Schaible to adopt this definition as a regulation. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Question 167 on page 39 was reviewed. In dealing with grades 7 and 8, dues listed as \$10 is changed to \$25.

Motion by Briggs to go into executive session to consider a hardship request from Maddock. Second by Schaible and carried.

President announced the Board back into open session at 1:12 p.m. The Maddock request has been denied.

Kringen reported on behalf of the Tournament Committee with the following:

- Reviewed the number of passes allowed to teams participating in the State Wrestling tournament. The recommendation was to allow 5 passes plus two for coaches if 1-5 participants and 7 passes plus two for coaches if 6 or more participants. Motion by Kringen to change the pass allowance as listed. Second by Coles and carried.
- Wrestling ticket prices adult reserved season ticket \$38, adult unreserved season ticket \$30, adult reserved daily pass \$14, adult unreserved daily pass \$12, adult single session reserved \$7, adult single session unreserved \$6, student unreserved season pass \$15 and student unreserved daily pass \$6 and student unreserved single session \$3. All ticket prices are the base price, plus the facility ticket tax.
- Class B Basketball ticket prices adult reserved season ticket \$38, adult unreserved season ticket \$30, adult reserved individual session (2 or more games) \$7, adult unreserved individual session (2 or more games) \$6, adult reserved individual session (1 game) \$6, adult unreserved individual session (1 game) \$5, student unreserved season ticket \$15, student individual session \$3. All ticket prices are the base price, plus the facility ticket tax. Motion by Kringen to accept as presented. Second by Coles and carried.
- Discussed the State Hockey Tournament and the facilities chosen to house each
 of the tournaments. It was decided the competition facility at each site meets the

requirements for competition.

- Discussed charging admission for State Cross Country as well as state tennis and golf.
- Continue the task of discussing the future of the make-up of basketball.

Kringen reported on behalf of the Sportsmanship Committee with the presentation of the final NDHSAA Sportsmanship Plan. Motion by Kringen to formally adopt the sportsmanship program for proposal to the General membership. Second by Sanstead and carried. This plan will be introduced to the General Assembly October 23, 2003. Request for feedback will be taken until the January General Assembly meeting. Following final approval at that January meeting, the program will be made available to the member schools on the NDHSAA web site.

Kringen reported on behalf of the Football Committee concerning their discussion on the process of determining the divisions of football. Questions included but were not limited to using geography, strength of program, student enrollment or what would be appropriate to use in the process of setting divisions in football. Following an extensive discussion, the committee felt they have sufficient direction to continue their study.

The Executive Secretary reviewed with the Board the North Dakota Parks and Recreation request to partner in a sportsmanship plan. Carlsrud reported on a meeting that he attended. The emphasis was to teach sportsmanship to those involved in recreation programs at a younger age than junior high and high school activities.

Wrestling, hockey, basketball and gymnastics regulations were reviewed. Also reviewed was the proposed ticket prices for regional gymnastics of Adults - \$5.00 and Students - \$3.00; and state gymnastics one day, Adults - \$6.00/Students - \$4.00 and two-day tournament pass, Adults - \$10.00/Student - \$6.00. Motion by Kringen to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reviewed the agenda for the General Assembly meeting scheduled for October 23, 2003.

The Board reviewed the remaining cooperative sponsorship applications:

- Elgin-New Leipzig and Carson in girls' basketball (03-04) (\$500 late fee)
- Underwood and Turtle Lake-Mercer in boys and girls' golf (03-04) (\$500 late fee)
- Minot and Dakota Memorial in all 9-12 sports (03-04) (\$25 activity fee/membership fee required)
- Rolla and Rolette in 7-12 wrestling (03-04)

Motion by Kringen to approve. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Oak Grove and Park Christian application for a coop in girls' golf (03-04) was reviewed. Motion by Kringen to deny on the basis Oak Grove has sufficient numbers to have a program. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared letters received from St. Alphonsus School from Langdon to dissolve their cooperative sponsorship for girls' junior high basketball. A letter from Langdon requesting the same was shared. Because this coop was less than three years old, there was a need for the request to come from both schools. Motion by Lockwood to dissolve. Second by Volesky and carried.

A request from a group requesting permission to sell ispirit gartersî at NDHSAA sponsored tournaments was discussed by the Board. This created discussion of the validity of certain types of solicitations and alternative programs to generate sources of income. The existing policy does not allow for this type of endeavor.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

- A St. Mary's hardship application is available for review. An investigation will take place and the report will be presented at the November meeting.
- There was approximately 16% increase in health insurance premiums.
- North Dakota Farmers Union Insurance has indicated interest in becoming a supporting partner of the North Dakota High School Activities Association.

The next meeting is scheduled for November 21, 2003.

Motion by Supt. Bruce Schumacher, Fairmount to approve the minutes of October, 2002 and January 2003 as published in the yearbook. Second by Supt. ElRoy Burkle, Munich/Stark-weather and carried.

The Executive Secretary made a special presentation of NDHSAA life-time passes to Darryl Anderson, Craig Perry, Jim Haussler and Ed Lockwood. These passes were awarded for management of a number of state tournaments

Nominations for upcoming vacant Board positions were announced as follows:

- Class A Central presented by Asst. Supt. Robert Toso of Jamestown Public schools
 with the following Supt. Steve Swiontek, Devils Lake and Prin. Kim Knodel, Valley
 City. There were no further nominations.

 - Last year 36 ejections
 - This year 19 ejections
- Thank the Board of Directors in their work and effort in what they do.
- Thank you to the staff for their work
- Thank you to administrators for your efforts in dealing with difficult issues.

President Koppelman thanked the membership for their attendance and declared the meeting adjourned.

Minutes

Class B District Chairperson's Meeting 9:00 A.M. - November 21, 2003 Lake View Inn, Grand Forks, ND (Items advanced to NDHSAA Board listed following minutes)

The Class B District Chairpersons met at 9:00 a.m. on November 22, 2003 at the Grand Forks Lake View Inn. Chairman Coles called the meeting to order with all districts present except District 13. Chairman Coles welcomed the district chairmen and thanked them for bringing the recommendations from their respective districts.

Following each district chairperson, guests and staff introducing themselves, the Executive Secretary passed out information sheets to be completed by each district for 2004-05 district volleyball chairperson, 2004-05 district volleyball site and manager, and 2004-05 regional site recommendations. He also expressed gratitude to the district chairpersons for their time and work in preparation for this meeting.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the process for recommendations from the district chairpersons. These recommendations are voted on by the members of their respective districts, and then must be voted on as a district chair group. The group was thanked for their involvement in this process. One of the items to cover in the March meeting is the split sites for first round of region basketball.

The following districts reported:

District #1 - Supt. Rick Jacobson, Wyndmere:

- Move Class B boys and girls' golf to fall. It would be easier to get courses in the fall.
- Reduce all activities by one week. Football is finished two weeks prior to their first allowable day of practice where girls' volleyball overlaps girls' basketball.
- Supports split sites for regional basketball tournaments if Saturday is not an option.

Jerry Obenauer, Hazen shared that while hosting the state golf tournament last spring in Bismarck, he was told by course managers the courses would be easier to obtain in the fall. Golfers are also coming off their summer play. Staff member Carlsrud indicated

receiving encouragement from golf course supervisors that fall would be easier to get on courses. It was stated some schools would be forced to drop their golf and football programs because they would choose volleyball and football over golf. Jill Taylor, New Rockford indicated her district was in favor of the switch. John Barry, Standing Rock pointed out spring golf only competes with track. If was held in the fall, there would be much more competition with other activities. Harold Knoll, Park River indicated their school is dealing with the amount of time that students are away from the classroom. With the combination of golf and track in the spring, there is an increased amount of loss of classroom time. No vote was taken but a straw vote was taken resulting in 4 in favor and 10 opposed to switching golf to the fall season.

Further comments were made on the overlap of volleyball and girls' basketball. Several district chairpersons indicated there is a concern.

A straw vote to study the reduction of all activities by one week was taken resulting in 13 in favor and 2 opposed. Direction given to the Board is to place this on the agenda for discussion. Alton Nygaard, Des Lacs-Burlington indicated the reduction of length of seasons may be narrowed to the overlap of volleyball and girls' basketball rather than all activities. Jerry Srur, North Central of Barnes inquired as to whether they are looking at parity. Board member Koppelman indicated we need to be concerned with television contracts and availability of venues when studying this issue.

District #2 - Gary Milbrandt, Maple Valley-Oriska:

- 1. Regional volleyball match times are too far apart between afternoon and evening sessions on first round.
- Overlap of girls' basketball and volleyball season has already been thoroughly discussed. Suggested the first round sessions

District 3 - Kirk Ham, Griggs County Central:

- 1. Flexibility in football playoff times was discussed.
- Maintain four-divisions in football. Also their football division was opposed to seven teams in their region.
- There is a concern about the amount of time set aside for volleyball tournaments. The district, regional and state tournaments take 4 weeks to play. Is it possible to look at these and eliminate some of the down time?
- 4. Football coaches requested using their input into the selection of officials for playoff games. Discussion followed indicating difficulty in this implementation.

The Executive Secretary indicated the re-divisioning of football is coming up and there are many concerns involved with this process. Srur stated although there is no recommendation, it was discussed in their district where it was felt there should be only two divisions of football. Ham indicated any change would be considered as the sooner, the better. Their cooperative sponsorship program is a problem if the count is one-for-one for divisioning because there is one school that does not supply many or any students for their football team. Football Chairman, Kringen indicated the timeline will be attempted depending on receiving the correct information from the Department of Public Instruction. It is intended to have this plan completed by the beginning of the 2004 football season.

Discussion took place concerning the selection of football officials for post season.

District 4 - Harold Knoll, Park River:

1. Expressed appreciation with the flexibility of setting times for the post-season football games.

District 5 - Jerry Srur, North Central of Barnes:

- No three class system in basketball
- Class A football teams have eight teams per region
- Favor blocking serve in voileyball
- Region volleyball reimbursement for participating teams.
- Class B regional tournaments for basketball and volleyball should go to a four-team format. Top two teams from each district.
- Would like to commend the Board on the change for the date for volleyball. It is

not easy pleasing everyone.

The Executive Secretary indicated the district chairpersons have, in the past gone on record as supporting team payments for region volleyball. The Board is in the process of studying the entire team payment schedule. Nygaard indicated their district discussed team payments for regional volleyball go to the four teams that advance to the second and third days. Ham indicated there is no parity in payments for basketball as compared to activities such as cross country. A vote was taken on approval of team payments for region volleyball resulting in 14 in favor and 0 opposed.

Srur requested the top 2 teams from each district be advanced to regions with the region being held on two nights as opposed to four advancing and playing on three days. This will help with the concern for loss of school time. A vote taken indicated 2 in favor and 12 opposed.

District 6 - Gene Kotaska, Wing:

1. Regional tournament site, their district would like to have the regional tournament at one site, possibly on Saturday, Monday and Tuesday. Rationale: Possibility of a host school playing at an away site causes fan and worker problems. A vote on holding the regional tournaments on Saturday, Monday, Tuesday resulted in 8 in favor and 6 opposed.

District 7 - Jill Taylor, New Rockford:

- 1. Recommend the NDHSAA conduct random evaluations of officials in all sports. Inconsistency of officiating is a concern.
- Region 2 football schools are in favor of retaining the 4-class football system.
- Flexibility be given to participating schools in setting start times for football playoff
- District 7 would like to see the State Association consider placing the State Class B tournament in Bismarck or Minot on a rotating basis. Tournament quality and atmosphere were reasons for this recommendation.
- A recommendation for the regional volleyball tournament for 2004 in Langdon
- District 7 volleyball tournament will be held in New Rockford October 28, 29, November 1, 2004 with the tournament director being Larry Larson.
- Recommendation to have the regional track meet at Wells County (Fessenden). Board member Lockwood asked for feedback concerning the comments on quality of tournament so he could take it back to his tournament committee in an attempt to put on a better tournament. Brad Webster from District 8 also indicated there were the same strong feelings but, like District 7, did not take a vote. The vote of the chairpersons resulted in 9 in favor and 6 opposed.

District 8 - Brad Webster, Rolette:

Most of the issues have already been discussed. The recommendations are:

- 1. Like to see region volleyball in Langdon for 2004.
- Recommend football stay with the four class system and would like to see some flexibility with starting times for football playoffs. Due to the distance that some teams may have to travel, starting at 1:30 may not always be possible or fair.
- Class B girls and boys basketball tournaments in Bismarck or Minot. The carnival atmosphere in the FargoDome is seen as a distraction to the tournament.
- Region Track meet moved from Devils Lake to Wells County. The meet in Devils Lake has been unorganized and coaches have had to set up the throwing areas before competition could begin on the day of the meet.
- Would like to see the NDHSAA come up with a way of evaluating officials in all sports.

District 9 - John Barry, Standing Rock:

- 1. Already discussed team reimbursement for mileage and meals for volleyball as is done in girls' and boys basketball.
- Volleyball will begin a week later, August 16th in 2004 season and the volleyball tournament to be played on November 18-20.
- 2004 region volleyball recommended to be held at Shiloh Christian.

District 10 - Rod Scherbenske, Goodrich:

- 1. Go back to the hard copy for the bulletin.
- 2. Volleyball officials should go to college games and observe.

- 3. Music regional two weeks prior to State contest.
- Volleyball region at Washburn

Staff member Hetler shared the quality of the Bulletin has improved greatly. He also indicated each of the regions have their own flexibility to set their regional music dates.

District 11 - Malcom Marcus, Towner:

- Recommend that the regional volleyball tournament be rotated between the districts in the region. One year a team from one district host the site and the next year the other district is the host.
- Consider adding the Libero, now that we have rally scoring. A straw vote was taken indicating 2 in favor, 8 opposed.
- 3. Remove the substitution limitation vote 12 in favor, 2 opposed.

Concerning recommendation #1, Nygaard indicated it is more financially successful if the region is placed in Minot. As far as geography goes, Minot is more centrally located for the entire region.

District 12 - Alton Nygaard, Des Lacs:

- 1. Unlimited substitution for volleyball.
- Starting the 20-minute clock for the varsity volleyball match immediately after the completion of the junior varsity match.

Discussion took place on the amount of time it takes between the end of the junior varsity match and the start of warm-up for the varsity match.

District 13 - Steve Conley, Bowman was absent but asked the recommendation be considered:

1. Start and end girls' basketball one week earlier. No vote was taken.

District 14 - Jerry Obenauer, Hazen had no agenda items.

District 15 - Scott Ulland, Stanley

- 1. Regional site request was submitted.
- 2. What can be done to keep volleyball and girls' basketball from conflicting?
- Celebrating in volleyball. How do we define what is the difference between celebrating and taunting during a game.

District 16 - Marlyn Vatne, Wildrose-Alamo:

- Volleyball season has been covered.
- Additional item, has there been discussion concerning the televising of state volleyball?

With no other items, Coles thanked the chairs for their attendance and input.

Minutes

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors November 21, 2003 - Grand Forks, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on November 21, 2003 at the Grand Forks Lake View Inn. President Koppelman called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present.

Several additions were made to the agenda.

The minutes from the October 22, 2003 meeting were provided to the Board in their packets. Motion by Briggs to approve as written. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report. It was noted with team and officials payments being paid by the office prior to the completion of the financial report from tournaments, is placing additional strain on the budget. Motion by Lockwood to approve the report. Second by Schock and carried.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Finance Committee;

- Bids for association automobiles were reviewed. The committee recommended a
 new van be purchased to replace the car and the following year, the other van will
 be replaced. The cost of the trade-in for a 2004 Dodge Grand Caravan SXT will be
 \$12,937 from Miller Motors. Motion by Sanstead to approve the recommendation.
 Second by Briggs and carried.
- 2. The next item was deferred to the Executive Secretary to present the current proposal of possible sponsorship from Farmers Union Insurance. He has met with US Bank concerning how this affects the current contract with them. After meeting with US Bank, they approved Farmers Union Insurance as a supporting sponsor. Therefore, the NDHSAA will enter into a sponsorship program for \$17,000 the first year and \$27,000 the second year. Part of the agreement would be the NDHSAA purchasing a full-page advertisement in state tournament programs for Farmers Union Insurance where feasible. This part of the agreement increased the negotiated amount that would come from the sponsor. Motion by Kringen to approve the Farmers Union Insurance proposal. Second by Lockwood and carried.

Coles gave a report on the district chairperson's meeting which was held earlier in the day. There were basically five issues that were voted upon and will be presented to the Board for action at the January meeting. These recommendations will be posted on the web site for reaction by the membership prior to January. Coles also states the district meetings have become more effective with more active discussions. Volesky asked to clarify what recommendations are actually voted upon at this meeting.

The Board reviewed the three amendments that will be presented at the January meeting. Two of these amendments were requested to be prepared by the office staff to be proposed by the NDHSAA Board of Directors. Following an adjustment in the rationale of the second amendment concerning scrimmages, the Board approved the mailing of these amendments on the specified dates.

The Board received letters concerning requests for dissolution of the following cooperative sponsorship:

- a. Hebron and Glen Ullin in football
- b. Bowbells and Kenmare/Burke Central in baseball
- c. Tuttle-Pettibone and Wilton in football
- d. Mohall and Sherwood in cross country'
- e. Underwood and Turtle Lake-Mercer in speech

The Board expressed concern whether all schools belonging to a cooperative sponsorship program are made aware of a request for dissolution by a member school in their coop. Motion by Briggs to have the Constitution & By-Law Committee work on wording to ensure that all schools are made aware of requests for dissolution by any school within a coop in which

they are a member. Motion by Kringen to approve the requests for dissolutions. Second by Briggs and carried.

Motion by Schaible to go into executive session to discuss a hardship application for Grand Forks Red River. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Board came out of executive session at 2:20 with the announcement that the applying student's eligibility has been granted starting at the beginning of the second semester.

The Board held an audience with Gene Utecht of Underwood who has a student that is a foreign exchange student that has come to Underwood through a non-approved program. The Executive Secretary on behalf of the NDHSAA Board of Directors presented a proposed amendment to Part Two, Article XIII, Section I, part f as found on page 15 of the Constitution & By-Laws to read:

a. One scrimmage shall be permitted prior to the date of the first authorized game and after eight (8) daily practices. Each scrimmage shall count as one of the allowable contests.

Report of the Executive Secretary:

Attended two national meetings with a major discussion item being national championships. There is a major move to incorporate national championships into the high school level. The National Federation will be faced with the decision in the near future. The Executive Secretary will ask the national membership to review the mission statement of the National Federation of High Schools.

Membership is reminded that April 1 is the deadline for Distinguished Student nominations. Six finalists are brought in for interviews. US Bank is still the primary sponsor with a \$2,000 scholarship for the Distinguished Student and a \$1,000 scholarship for the runner-up with \$500 scholarship given to the other four finalists.

Farmers Union Insurance has come on board as a supporting sponsor for the NDHSAA. We will receive \$17,000 in 03-04 and \$27,000 in 04-05.

This is a two-year plan (2005-06 and 2006-07)

Will count straight enrollment (no geography, no strength of pro-

Coops will count one for one.

Count male school enrollment 7-10 based on 2003-2004 DPI figures.

Schools may petition to move up a division if a school is willing to move down (smallest enrollment will have the first opportunity to move

Regional alignment will be subject to change on an annual basis (not new divisions)

Geography may be an issue when setting boundaries but not for divi-

Regions will have an even number of schools where possible to help with the scheduling process.

10. New football coops will have to be approved by the deadline or must wait one year.

11. No football coop dissolutions will be allowed after the 2005 plan is finalized this June, 2004.

The two year calendar was reviewed. Previously approved were the 2003-2004 and 2004-2005 years. Also studied was the proposed draft of 2005-2006 year. Motion by Briggs to table action on this calendar until the March 19^{th} meeting. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Board reported on their study of Center's self-report of playing one game over the season limitation. Because of extenuating circumstances, the committee recommends placing the school on probation for a period of one year.

Carlson reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee with the following recommendations for recent cooperative sponsorship programs

- c. The coop of Steele-Dawson/Wing/Tuttle/Pettibone in girls' basketball will remain in District 6 eliminating one team from that district.
- d. Based on completion of requirements for approval of the proposed cooperative sponsorship application, Mohall/Sherwood will be placed in District 12 for basketball, which would decrease that district by one team.

Motion by Kringen to approve. Second by Schaible and carried.

Study of other districts numbers produced the following recommendations to be consideration at the April meeting. This would allow member schools to communicate with the Board on these proposals. The following recommendations, if approved, would be for the 2005-2006 year:

- a. Move Tappen boys baskeball from District 6 to District 5
- b. Center-Stanton girls' and boys basketball from District 10 to District 9
- c. Sawyer girls' basketball from District 12 to District 11
- Belfield boys basketball from District 13 to District 14
- e. Hillsboro volleyball from District 2 to District 3
- f. Center volleyball from district 10 to District 9
- g. Sawyer volleyball from District 12 to District 11
- Belfield/South Heart volleyball from District 13 to District 14.
- i. Trenton volleyball from District 15 to District 16.

This information will be shared with the membership for input prior to the April 22nd meeting.

The Board reviewed the bids for the printing of the 2004-2005 calendar. Bids were:

Motion by Volesky to approve the bid from Sheyenne Publishing. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on several incidents that took place at the State Girls' Hockey Tournament. The Board was asked to review an incident with a fan and NDHSAA employee, Tim O'Leary. Motion by Briggs to table for further investigation. Second by Kringen and carried.

Lockwood reported to the Board there will be 12 girls' hockey teams next year with Mandan adding a program. The athletic directors have agreed to a 2 region concept. The East region shall be Fargo North, Fargo South, Wahpeton, Jamestown, Grand Forks and Devils Lake. The West region shall be Williston, Dickinson, Hazen, Minot, Mandan, and Bismarck. Each school will play each other in their region twice and the top 4 will advance to state from each region. Discussion took place concerning setting of the state tournament site.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board situations that may arise because of a previous approval of a split of a graded elementary for a split coop request. Other graded elementary schools have approached the NDHSAA questioning why they are not allowed to have the same type of agreement. Sanstead reported on the demographics of future enrollment with a drastic decline being projected. Lockwood asked if the eligibility rules need to be studied to see if they fit today's demands. The Constitution and By-Laws Committee has been and will continue studying this question.

The Board reviewed a letter from the Jamestown Civic Center and the Jamestown Chamber of Commerce with data on number of rooms blocked off for the 2005 Class B Girls' Basketball Tournament. Discussion took place on the room needs that are caused by this event. A date for the Tournament Committee will be set to study this issue.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board on the progress of study of a coaches' education plan. With more coaches being non-faculty/staff people, we are losing the educational component of our programs. Many of the coach ejections have been in the sub-varsity divisions. Many of these coaches are not involved with school other than the coaching and are not as involved with the academic part of the student's life. Darrel Anderson of the NDIAAA and Gelaine Orvik of the NDHSCA agreed to meet to discuss the possibility of introducing the concept of coaches education to the member schools. John Martinson from the School Boards Association and Doug Johnson of the Administrator's Association also met and all agreed to go back to their individual boards to see how they favored this approach to coaches' education. The Board had an extensive discussion on the direction that should be taken. The Executive Secretary was directed to continue to study the program and report to the Board on the progress of the study.

The Executive Secretary gave his report:

- The District Chair meeting will be chaired by Carlson
- The two-year calendar needs to be studied for action at the next meeting. c.

District Chairperson's Meeting March 19, 2004-9:00 A.M. Ramada Piaza Suites Fargo, ND

The Class B District Chairperson meeting was held at the Ramada Plaza Suites on March 19, 2004. Ron Carlson called the meeting to order at 9:00 with all district chairpersons present. The present including members of the Board of Directors and staff along with the district chairpersons introduced themselves.

The Executive Secretary handed out forms to the district chairpersons asking them to indicate their selection of the follow year's chairperson and their recommendation for district and region sites for boys and girls' basketball.

A report was given on the action taken on the district chairpersons recommendations from the November meeting.

The various districts submitted the following agenda items for discussion. The Executive Secretary indicated before each item is submitted to the NDHSAA Board for consideration it must receive approval from a simple majority of the districts represented.

Chairman Carlson shared the various district recommendations regarding the first round of regional basketball tournaments, specifically the split site situation.

Each district responded to the region first-round issue:

District 1 was not in favor of the split site. The 3:00 start at one site would be an option which would be a minimal loss of school time.

When the district chairpersons were asked, no district indicated they were in favor of the split site for first round plan. The choices were placed before the district chairs:

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday with split sessions on the first day.

Monday, Tues, Thurs - 3:00 start. - 5 indicated they were in favor of this plan

Sat, Mon, Tues - 10 indicated they were in favor of this plan

Greg Johnson of District 7 stated if the plan is to avoid the Saturday for boys regional basketball because of the girls' state tournament, they wish to go Monday, Tuesday, Thursday. However, if Saturday would be an option, that would probably be the best. It is still best to play at one site and, if necessary, with a 3:00 start. Rick Jacobson of District 1 shared a concern for loss of fan support if the first round is played on Monday. Kirk Ham of District 3 indicated the same concern. Jim Gross of District 5 stated people will be more open to this because with the combination of seasons as the people have had to make these decisions during the season. ElRoy Burkle of District 8 stated some choices have to be made but first-round travel got some teams home late. Loss of school time shouldn't be an issue as Class A schools are missing school time because of the large amount of travel.

Motion by Elroy Burkle of District 8 to hold regional basketball on Saturday, Monday, Tuesday. Second by Harold Knoll of District 4. A roll call vote carried 15-1 with District 12 voting no.

Motion by Elroy Burkle to reconsider the motion. Second by Wayne Stanley of District 12 and carried with a roll call vote of 16-0.

Burkle moved to amend the motion to hold region basketball on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday with a 3:00 start on Monday. This would be for the following year and the Saturday, Monday, Tuesday start will be scheduled for the 2005-2006 year. Second by Jim Gross of District 5. The vote on the original new motion passed 15-1 with District 4 as the dissenting vote.

The recommendations from each district were reviewed:

District 1-----Rick Jacobson, Wyndmere

- 1. Grant an additional time-out in volleyball when score reaches 24. (This was proposed to the National Federation and was voted down.)
- 2. Have volleyball teams stay on the same side throughout the entire match. (This may be by state association adoption and will be passed on to the vollevball coaches.)
- Have state track meet run on the weekend before Memorial Day weekend. (Concern for a conflict with graduation was discussed. Also, it was stated the coaches are not in favor of this because the season is too short)
- Eliminate the advancement of four teams to the regional basketball tourney.
- Golf coaches should not be allowed to golf at invitationals

District 2-----Gary Milbrandt, Maple Valley

- Play regional basketball tournaments at a single site
- Continue researching the switch of the boys and girls' BB seasons
- Decreasing the number of teams in regional tournaments. Possibly advancing three teams to regions with two first-round byes.

District 3-----Kirk Ham, Griggs County

- 1. Six quarters a night in basketball. (a) Current rule prevents substitution by a school that has a large lead in the varsity game. (b) Gives more schools more opportunities for players.
- 2. Junior high 50 enrollment rule is causing problems. District 3 will be presenting an amendment to the membership concerning this by-law.

Motion by Kirk Ham of District 3 to change the quarter limit from 5 to 6. Second by Wayne Stanley of District 12 and carried 14-2 with District 1 and 11 voicing a dissenting vote

Motion by Al Feist of District 14 to allow 5 quarters per day and 60 quarters plus a tournament for junior high basketball. Second by Kirk Ham of District 3. A roll call vote carried the motion with all districts voting in favor of the motion.

District 4-----Harold Knoll, Park River

- 1. Discuss the quality of basketballs used for boys and girls season. No response from other districts as to a problem. (No other district indicated problems with the Spaulding basketball)
- Recommend keeping the same schedule for the girls and boys season (girls start first and boys start two weeks later).
- Recommend to go back to playing on Saturday for the girls and boys re-
- Recommend to keep all games at the same location for all regional games.

District 5-----Jim Gross, Litchville-Marion

- 1. The state volleyball tournament and the state football championships should be played the same weekend and in the same city. Suggested the Board study but did not ask for a vote.
 - May shorten one of the seasons and possibly create more fan interest
- 2. Two officials from each district tournament should officiate regional tournaments for volleyball and basketball.
- Region 3 girl's basketball sites continue to alternate between Napoleon H.S. and Hazelton-Moffit-Braddock H.S. and the Region 3 boys basketball tournament continue to be played at the Jamestown Civic Center.

District 6-----Gene Kotaska, Wingórepresented by Otto Uhde

1. Girts' and Boys regional basketball tournaments should start on Saturday and be held at one site.

District 7-----Greg Johnson, Carrington

- Move Girls' basketball back to the fall.
- Regional Boys and Girls' basketball quarterfinal games one day, one site, and play them on the corresponding dates to this year. (Mon. Tues. and Thurs.)
- Regional site for both Boys and Girls to be Devils Lake.

District 8-----ElRoy Burkle, Munich Starkweather

- 1. Host all regional games at one site.
 - a. Drop regional play-in sites
 - If regional play-in remains for next year, regional play-in games for District 8 will be at the respective district tournament sites for boys and girls.
- Start regionals on a Saturday
- With the change of seasons, we request research data regarding:
 - a. Effects of number of college scholarships given/received for volleyball players as compared to past years.
 - Effect of this change on number of game officials. (The Executive Secretary indicated the number of basketball officials registered in 2001-2002 was 512; 2002-2003 was 624 and in 2003-2004 was 624. The practice of hiring the same officials does not encourage
 - new officials to renew their registration.)

District 9-----John Barry, Standing Rock

- Request one site for the regional boys basketball, girls' basketball and volleyball and not have split sites.
- Regional 2005 site for girls' basketball in Mandan
- Regional site for boys basketball in Bismarck Civic Center
- District 9 is in total agreement that the boys basketball, girls' basketball and volleyball regional tournament be located in the Bismarck/Mandan area because it is a central location for all schools in District 9/10.
- Discuss time table for redistricting around the state for boys basketball, girls' basketball and volleyball.
- 6. District 9 is not in favor of a 3-class system.

District 10----Rod Scherbenske, Goodrich

- 1. All boys and girls' basketball regionals played at the same site.
- 2. Rotate girls' volleyball and girls' basketball regional between the two districts. District 9 had the volleyball in 2003 at Shiloh and we would like the 2004 volleyball at Washburn. Girls' basketball in 2005 would be hosted by District
- Support three-class system.
- Support boys regional at the Bismarck Civic Center.

District 11-----Debby Marshall, TGU Townerórepresented by Malcolm Marcus

- Recommend regional basketball tournaments be held at one site on Saturday, Monday and Tuesday.
- Eliminate the NDHSAA governing over 7 & 8 basketball programs.
- Realign basketball districts so the number of teams is equal in each district.
- Send out ballots for selection of regional basketball officials in December to be returned in January.

District 12-----Wayne Stanley, Sherwood

- Opposed to rotating the boy' and girls' start date.
- 2. Opposed to a combined state tournament
- Encourage use of the shot clock
- 4. Would like to see a coaches' box

District 13----Steve Conley, Bowman

- 1. Prefer Regionals be held the old way (Sat. Mon. Tues.)
- Discuss four team regional tournaments.
- Six quarter limit and remove restrictions on JH BB or allow five quarters per night. (It was indicated this was a Constitution & By-Laws article that would need an amendment sponsored by a member school.)
- 4. Regional BB tournaments to Dickinson.
- Change free throw administration: (Those present were informed this is on the National Federation questionnaire as well as on the agenda for the National Federation Basketball Rules Committee.)
 - a. Allow people on lane to step in after ball leaves shooter's hands
 - Allow baseline rebounder on free throws to stand on box or adopt college women's free throw rule.
- 6. End VB season a week earlier.
- Allow free substitution in VB. (This was proposed to the National Federation Volleyball Rules Committee and was voted down.)
- 8. Region VII nine-man FB concerned about number of teams to schedule.
- 9. WR Region 4 tournament to Killdeer which is scheduled as per rotation.
- Track regional meet-1st choice Dickinson, 2nd choice Bowman. (The condition of the track at Dickinson State University was discussed.)
- 11. Basketball coaches want input on who officiates the regional tournaments. (The Executive Secretary and Assistant Executive Secretary Carlsrud reviewed the procedure of coach's ballot that is used in the selection of regional officials. Those present were also made aware of the fact that some officials have a choice of more than one region, hence if selected by a region, they do not necessarily take the contract for that particular region.)

District 14----Al Feist, Hebron

- Do not split the regional tournament.
 - a. Easier to use the officials so there are no back-to-back games.
 - Better for fans that want to see more than one team from the district
 - Picking awards is difficult when it is impossible to see all teams play in the first round.
- Eliminate the 50 student rule for junior high students' participation back and forth with high school teams. (This would require an amendment to the constitution.)
 - Student numbers fluctuate from year to year in our rural schools.
- Switch the starting dates for boys and girls' Class B basketball so that boys begin first.
- a. Eliminates overlap between volleyball and girls' basketball.
- 4. Don't combine Class B girls' basketball tournaments with Class A girls.
- Make a By-Law change to allow 6 quarters of participation in basketball for high school athletes and 5 quarters for junior high athletes. Change the maximum number of quarters per participant to fit the above change.

Motion by Al Fiest to allow junior high teams to play 5 quarters of basketball per day and 60 quarters plus one tournament in a season. Second by Kirk Ham and passed unanimously by roll call vote.

Favor rotating the state basketball tournaments between Bismarck and Minot.

District 15----Steve Cascaden, Parshall

- 1. Use a 3-man crew at both the regional and state tournaments.
 - a. ëA' schools and some ëB' Districts have started

District 8 indicated they had tried three-whistle and it was not well received because the officials were not familiar with the coverage. District 15 has been asked by the officials in their area to hire three-whistle crews and they have used it in both boys and girls' district basketball tournaments. Motion by Steve Cascaden to contract three-whistle officiating teams for regional and state basketball. Second by Arley Larson of District 16. A roll call vote resulted in Districts 9, 11, 12, 15, and 16 were in favor and all other districts voted no. The motion failed, 5-11.

- 2. Get rid of the overlap between volleyball and girls basketball.
 - Move volleyball back a week.
- Hold the State Tournament in a central location.
 - a. Ticket prices have gone up and are now paying for facility tax.
 - b. Volleyball tournament in Grand Forks lost approximately \$7,000.
- 4. Do not favor the current regional basketball tournament format.
- Not in favor of four officials being assigned to work the regional tournament.

Motion by Arley Larson of District 16 to hold all state volleyball and basketball tournaments in Minot or Bismarck. Second by EIRoy Burkle of District 8. A roll call vote is as follows: Yes - Districts 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16 / No - Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 9, and 11. Motion carried, 10-6.

District 16-----Marlyn Vatně, Wildrose-Alamo

- Recommend there be no overlap of seasons (VB and GBB)
- 2. All major tournaments be held either in Minot or Bismarck
- 3. Regional basketball tournaments be held at one site rather than split sites
- 4. All boys regional and state tournaments have 3 officials.

Staff member Hetler indicated fine arts is interested in being able to bring in 6^{th} graders to participate in some of their competitions.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the recommendations that will be presented to the NDHSAA Board of Directors at the June 22nd meeting.

- Region basketball be held on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday with a 3:00 p.m. start on that Monday for the 2004-2005 year and Saturday, Monday, Tuesday for the 2005-2006 year.
- 2. Allow 6 quarters per night for high school basketball.
- Allow 5 quarters per day for junior high basketball.
- Place atl State Volleyball and State Basketball tournaments in Minot or Bismarck.

Kirk Ham asked for a review of schools who requested to be moved to an upper division from the original football plan as proposed. Final date for requesting cooperative sponsorship program dissolutions is June 14th.

Chairperson Carlson thanked the membership and declared the meeting adjourned.

Second by Briggs and carried.

The Executive Secretary gave a financial report. He indicated Piper & Jaffray investments will be transferred to Dain Rauscher by the end of April. Also presented was the year to date budget, savings and investment report and checks written through March 31st. A total breakdown of the winter and spring financial reports will be presented at the June meeting. Motion by Lockwood to approve the report. Second by Schaible and carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from Mandan asking for the dissolution of their girls' hockey cooperative program with Bismarck. Motion by Kringen to approve the request for dissolution. Second by Coles and carried.

Applications for cooperative sponsorship programs were reviewed. Motion by Briggs to approve:

Bismarck and Steele-Dawson in boys swimming (04-05)

May-Port CG and Northern Cass in boys and girls' gotf (04-05)

Watford City and Alexander for junior high girls' basketball (04-05)

d. Watford City and Alexander for 7-12 boys basketball (04-05)

Second by Sanstead and carried. Motion by Sanstead to rescind the action on the May-Port CG and Northern Cass request for a coop in boys and girls' golf as they had withdrawn the request. Second by Briggs and carried.

Koppelman reported on behalf of the Executive Board concerning Minot Bishop Ryan's self reporting they exceeded the total number of games allowed in a season for boys basketball. Minot Ryan will be issued a letter of reprimand and will be placed on probation for a period of one year plus a forfeiture of their last regular season game. They will also be informed that further violation of this rule will lead to a reduction of future games allowed.

Kringen reported on behalf of the Football Committee with adjustments to their plan based on dissolution of coops, etc. Regions were developed but schools have until June 14th to respond to the plan. Further adjustments may need to be made and a final report will be made to the Board at the June Board meeting.

The Board held audience with several schools regarding the proposed football plan:

a. Wishek - School board member Keith Sailer and Supt. Brian Duchscherer requested an exception to the assignment of Wishek to Division A 11-man in Football in the new plan. Kringen asked to have Wishek review the parameters of the football plan with their school board. The Board indicated any movement would have to wait until the June 14th deadline in order for the committee to see the whole picture.

b. Steele-Dawson - Supt. Leon Ableidinger indicated they have accepted the 11-man assignment but is requesting to be reassigned to Region 1 or 3 rather than the current region which would cause a large travel budget. This would also maintain

a schedule with some schools with which they are familiar.

New Salem - Supt. Gordon Davis, football coach, Steve Kleinjan and Glen Ullin athletic director, Douglas Schmidt presented their concerns. Their current coop with Glen Ullin causes them to play in 11-man but if they dissolve the coop they would drop to 9-man. This causes some relations problems. Kleinjan added their numbers are a problem but they will play where they are assigned. Their main concern is for those students that wish to play through the coop but may not be able to do so if the coop is dissolved. Schmidt indicated they had hoped to send about 5 or 6 students to New Salem through the coop but only one is currently involved. Kringen indicated the past practice of using strength of program and geography was not fair to all schools. Coles stated this plan may cause member schools to make decisions concerning their programs on a local level rather than asking the Board to make decisions for them. Lockwood reviewed the process that brought the committee to the parameters that are being used for this plan. Davis asked the Board if they can play 9-man this coming year with their current coop even if they dissolve the coop by June 14th. It was clarified the dissolution would be for the 2005 season and for the 2004 season, they would still play with their current coop.

President Koppelman restated the Board will not be taking any action until after the June deadline.

d. Four Winds - Prin. Darren Albrecht and Athletic Director Rick Smith shared their concern for being placed in 11-man. The enrollment numbers given were accurate but their varsity program is only four years old. This year the program finished with 12 players. The concept of training and competing are new to this group. They did not complete their junior high season because of low numbers. Smith restated it is a new program getting started and playing teams such as Rugby and Harvey are not fair to those schools either.

Kringen asked if they had reviewed the parameters as set by the Football Committee. He stated again this objective plan is based on what is best for the entire state. The final plan will take place at the June Board meeting. President Koppelman thanked the schools for coming to share their concerns with the Board.

Kringen reported on behalf of the Tournament Committee on the site selections. The recommendations for sites are:

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors June 22, 2004 - Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met June 22, 2004 in Valley City. President Koppelman called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. with all members present. Also present as guests were the incoming Board members, Kim Knodle, Lorell Jungling and Brian Duchscherer.

President Koppelman expressed a thank you for the hard work of the members of the Board of Directors and the camaraderie of the previous evening at the retirement gathering.

Following additions and corrections, President Koppelman declared the agenda approved.

The Board reviewed the minutes from the April 22nd and May 5th meetings. Motion by Briggs to approve the minutes. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Executive Secretary reviewed with the Board the balance sheet, year to date budget, savings and investment report. Checks written report for April and May were also included in this report. Following review of these items, the Board examined the Winter Sports, Spring Sports and Fine Arts financial reports which were sent to the Board earlier for review. Motion by Sanstead to approve the finance report. Second by Volesky and carried.

The Board reviewed the following requests for cooperative sponsorship program dissolutions along with the year the dissolution will go into effect:

Motion by Kringen to approve the 2004-2005 request to dissolve the Midway and Fordville-Lankin cooperative sponsorship program in football. Second by Coles. Supt. President Koppelman reported on behalf of the Executive Board and reported they had determined a penalty for Turtle Mountain Community High School for playing an ineligible baseball player and for using a non-certified baseball official. The Board reviewed a letter from Garrison requesting changes in regional alignment for Speech, Music and Track. Bob Hetler has indicated the changes for speech and music would work out well. Some member schools have expressed a concern about regional track meets not being as competitive as they have been in the past. coaches education programs. If train the trainer programs were inplemented, there is a possibility of hosting an east and west session. Grants may be available to help fund this plan.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

A. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is computed on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset which range from Three to twenty years. The Association capitalizes all significant equipment and building additions. The Association does not capitalize costs associated with its web site.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash equivalents include time deposits, certificates of deposits and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

E. Financial Statement Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Boards in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted assets and permanently restricted net assets. In addition the Association is required to present a statement of cash flows.

F. Income Tax Status

The Association is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Association is not a private foundation.

G. Investments

Under SFAS No. 124, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair

values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

H. Designation of Unrestricted Assets

It is the policy of the Board of Directors of the Association to review its plans for future property improvements and acquisitions from time to time and to designate appropriate sums of unrestricted net assets to assure adequate financing of such improvements and acquisitions.

2. INVESTMENTS

Investments are presented in the financial statements in the aggregate at fair market value (amortized, in the case of bonds). For investments other than certificates of deposit, fair market value was determined by references to the brokers statements.

5. PENSION PLANS

Three professional employees participate in the North Dakota Teachers Fund for Retirement (TFFR). Once these employees terminate their employment at the Association no other employees will be allowed to participate in TFFR. One professional and all clerical employees participate in a tax deferred annuity program. Employer contributes 16.8% of the

7. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Association is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets; errors or omissions; injuries to employees; or natural disasters. The Association participates in the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund (NDIRF), a public entity risk pool for its general property and casualty and other miscellaneous insurance coverages. The NDIRF operates as common risk management and insurance program for North Dakota cities and schools. The Association pays an annual assessment to the NDIRF for its general insurance coverage. The NDIRF agreement provides that the Trust will be self-sustaining through member assessments and will re-insure through commercial companies for claims in excess of certain limits for each insured event.

The Association also carries commercial insurance for certain other risks of loss including employee health insurance. Settled claims resulting from these risks have not exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three years.
