### MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors

August 12, 2004

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association held their meeting on August 12, 2004 in Valley City. President Schock called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. with all members present.

President Schock welcomed new Board members, Lorell Jungling, Brian Duchscherer and Kim Knodle.

Following additions, motion by Briggs to approve the agenda. Second by Sanstead and carried,

The Board was supplied with minutes of the June 22, 2004 meeting. Motion by Schaible to approve. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Board reviewed the financial reports. Following questions and discussion, motion by Volesky to approve the reports. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Board held audience with Supt. Kevin Keenaghan to hear Watford City's appeal of the Board's denial of their request for an extra year of eligibility for a student. Motion by Sanstead to allow the additional year of eligibility. Second by Lockwood and carried.

Requests for cooperative sponsorship dissolutions were reviewed. With motion by Lockwood and second by Briggs, the board approved the dissolution of New Public School Dist. 8 and Williston in gymnastics, baseball, speech, debate and one act play.

Applications for cooperative sponsorship were reviewed.

- a. Milnor/Wyndmere and Lidgerwood in track, 7-12 (2004-2005)
  Motion by Volesky to approve the application. Second by Lockwood and carried.
- b. Grafton and Midway in cross country 7-12 (2004-2005)
   Motion by Lockwood to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.
- c. New Town and Mandaree in football 7-12 (2004) Motion by Briggs to approve. Second by Volesky and carried.
- d. Cavalier and Pembina in cross country 7-12 (2004)
   Motion by Volesky to approve. Second by Schaible and carried,

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the updates for the policy book which is in their meeting file.

The Board was informed of the incorrect dates that were shared with the Board at the last meeting. The DPI Call Conference is September 26th through noon on September 28th. Therefore, it is recommended NDHSAA committee meetings will take place on September 27th and the meeting would be held on September 28th. Also, the National Federation moved the Legal Conference one week later, which conflicts with the April 21th meeting. The April meet date is changed to April 20th. Motion by Sanstead to approve the changes for meeting dates. Second by Carlson and carried.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Finance Committee with two main items on their agenda:

- Vehicle bids for replacement of the gray van. The Executive Secretary is requesting permission to go directly to the dealership to negotiate a deal with the company that has provided the vans in the past.
- The committee is studying a plan to revise team payments. The committee will meet prior to the next meeting and devise a payment schedule prior to the September meeting. The plan is to have something in place to share with the membership at the October meeting.

Schaible reported on the Constitution and By-Laws committee with the following recommendation for wording concerning an interpretation of the intent of the rule which has been given in the past but was in need of a wording update. Page 37 under 4a, in bold after the wording "high school's coaching staff" and following question 58, add an explanation as a note which states, "Note: Boys' and Girls' basketball, boys' and girls' hockey, and boys' and girls' soccer are each interpreted as one sport. Motion by Sanstead that these language additions be made. Second by Briggs and carried.

Briggs indicated the wording in Section XI on page 34 may need to be reviewed to indicate appeals need to come from a school rather than an individual.

Carlson reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee's study on the recommendations that were approved for the 2005-2006 school year. There is one problem with the number of teams assigned to District 7 and District 8. Currently the number of teams is unequal. Recommended is to wait for any action until the October General Assembly meeting in case there is a proposal and vote on a three-class amendment. In volleyball, previously the following changes were: Hillsboro from District 2 to District 3; Center from District 10 to District 9, Sawyer from District 12 to District 11; Trenton from District 15 to District 16 and Belfield/South Heart from District 13 to District 14. When the committee studied their previous action, they missed reassigning Trinity Christian to the same district as their basketball teams were assigned. If Trinity Christian were now moved from District 15 to District 16, there would be an extreme imbalance with district numbers. Recommendation from the committee is to leave Trinity Christian in District 15 and put Trenton back in District 15 to make the numbers equal. Motion by Coles to support the recommendation. Second by Schaible and carried.

The Board held audience with a delegation from North Border with a request concerning regional alignment in the new football plan. Jeff Carpenter, Shawn Horgan, Morgan Huset and Joe Defoe represented the schools. Jeff Carpenter spoke on behalf of the delegation with several suggestions to change the regional alignment for their division by switching North Border and Griggs County region assignments. Motion by Lockwood to refer this request to the Football Committee for study and a recommendation to be presented to the Board at the September meeting. Second by Carlson. Suggested by Duchscherer is all teams involved should be notified there is a study of the region alignment to be brought back September 28th. Motion carried.

Harold Rotunda, Certified Public Accountant, appeared before the Board with the audit of the financial year ended June 30, 2004. Motion by Volesky to approve the auditor's report. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Board read a letter from Jim Haussler, athletic director of the Bismarck Public Schools requesting permission to allow Grant Bakke to participate in the Northwest Athletic Club Boys' Fail Classic championship Level 5 September 17-19. The question was raised as to whether this would be of international or Olympic ramifications. Motion by Volesky to deny the request to allow this student to participate. Second by Lockwood and carried.

Motion by Briggs to go into executive session. Second by Sanstead and carried. President Schock declared the Board in executive session at 1:15 p.m.

Motion by Volesky to end the executive session. Second by Sanstead and carried. President Schock announced at 1:35 p.m. the Grand Forks hardship has been denied.

The Board reviewed the 2005 calendar date that has been approved for the end of 9-man regular season and first round for 9-man football playoffs. Currently, they have been set for Tuesday, October 11th and Saturday, October 15th. A request has been forwarded to change these dates to October 18th and October 22th respectively in the 2005 football season. Motion by Coles to accept the calendar change as presented. Second by Volesky and carried.

With the completion of Board terms for Schock and Coles, there is a need to establish a nominating committee for the Class B southwest position. The Principal's association will be responsible to supply nominations for Coles' position. Motion by Volesky to contact the southwest Class B administrators for this purpose. Second by Schaible and carried.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Tournament Committee concerning the Track and Field Advisory Committee's recommendation to reconsider placing the 2005 State Track and Field meet in Grand Forks. A thorough investigation revealed the facility is in condition to allow conducting the state meet adequately. The committee shared a recommendation to remain in Grand Forks for the 2005 state meet. Motion by Coles to accept the recommendation. Second by Volesky and carried.

Trophy assignments were turned in.

The Board reviewed recommendations for region track sites. Recommended are:

Region 1 - Fargo, Terri Krueger, Mgr.

Region 2 – Grand Forks, Donna Galloway, Mgr.

Region 3 - Devils Lake, Darren Sheidon, Mgr.

Region 4 - Jamestown, Jim Roaldson, Mgr.

Region 5 - Hazen, Randy Johnson, Mgr.

Region 6 - Rugby, Scott Grochow, Mgr.

Region 7 - Watford City, Tom Suelzle, Mgr.

Region 8 - Bowman, Steve Conley, Mgr.

Motion by Coles to accept these sites. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Board reviewed a request from Fargo South for an additional year of eligibility for a student because situations beyond his control denied him opportunity to participate. Motion by Carlson to

approve the request. Second by Knodle and carried.

The Board read correspondence from Four Winds directing the Executive Secretary to respond. The Executive Secretary gave his report:

1. The latest Michigan ruling for seasons has been an area of concern.

- The Attorney General invited the association to attend a Council for Youth Alcohol Abuse seminar to explain the NDHSAA rules and regulations
- Attended a sports huddle with the sports writers of North Dakota. Had a good visit about the relationship with the print media and the NDHSAA.

Motion by Duchscherer to adjourn. Second by Jungling and carried.

Meeting adjourned.

## MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors-Special Meeting August 20, 2004

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was called to order at 9:00 a.m. on August 20, 2004. Vice-President Lockwood called the meeting to order with all members present except Schock and Schaible.

The purpose of the meeting was to hear reports concerning hardship applications and a request for approval of a cooperative sponsorship application.

Supt. Steve Dick from Velva was present for the Velva portion of the report to answer any questions. Motion by Briggs to go into executive session to hear a hardship application from Velva and LaMoure. Second by Jungling and carried.

Chairman Lockwood declared the Board out of executive session with the announcement the two hardships for Velva and one for LaMoure have been approved.

The Board considered a Hettinger and Bowman cross country cooperative sponsorship agreement. John Campbell and Tony Duletski were present to answer any questions concerning this request. Hettinger had dropped their program but had a senior student that wished to compete. Because of this, Hettinger had requested Bowman to accept a cooperative sponsorship. Hettinger also indicated if the number of Hettinger athletes was to increase, they may start their program again. Motion by Sanstead to approve the application with the \$500 late fee. Second by Volesky and carried unanimously. It was noted although the total enrollment of the schools involved in this coop exceeds the 325 limit, by the Constitution & By-Laws exception for wrestling and cross country, this program may continue to compete in Class B.

With no further business, Chairman Lockwood declared the meeting adjourned.

President Glarum called the meeting to order @ 12:04 PM with Dave Klundt, Greg Selbo, Donna Hutchison, Terry Schneweis, Ron Wright and Kim Anderson attending.

President Glarum welcomed all and especially new board member, Ron Wright.

Klundt moved to approve minutes of the February meeting. Second by Schneweis and carried.

Anderson moved to assign the boys' basketball portfolio to Ron Wright and Kim Anderson would take the baseball and wrestling portfolios. Second by Klundt and carried.

A discussion concerning the upcoming board term vacancies and representation was held.

Geography, sport representation and registration in one sport of a board member's portfolio were brought forward for consideration. The board welcomes nominations or personal requests from individuals who would like to serve on the NDOA Board. Two board positions will be open for next year; southeast, girls' basketball portfolio; southwest, football portfolio. Ron Wright and Don Glarum will serve as the NDOA nominating representatives.

Active Officials Awards - Baseball, Kevin Kerr, Mandan; Boys' Basketball, Mitch Parker, Fargo; Girls' Basketball, Carl Buechler, Bismarck; Football, Howard Klug, Williston; Gymnastics, Suzanne Darling, Fargo; Hockey, Scott Ellis, Williston; Soccer, Russ Wilber, Grand Forks; Swimming, Irene Wrenn, Grand Forks; Volleyball, Steph Smith, Bismarck: Wrestling, Jim Ladbury, Dickinson. Selbo moved to accept the Active Officials' Awards. Second by Schneweis and carried.

Ron Wright moved to increase regular and post season officials' fees by 4% for the 05-06 school year. Second by Klundt and carried.

A discussion was held concerning officials who do not have social security numbers the possible utilization of the I-9 form.

Schneweis moved to allow soccer officials to develop and use a patch on their officiating uniforms. Second by Anderson and carried.

Selbo moved to allow swimming officials to wear white shirts with navy pants or navy shorts and that gymnastics officials be allowed to wear black slacks/skirt and white top. Officials are to be uniform in their dress for each meet. Second by Schneweis and carried.

The board decided to continue utilizing last year's action, the number of NDOA HOF Inductees per year to three. Under special circumstances, the board may induct one additional person provided such person receives a two-thirds majority vote, as a board policy.

Selbo moved to induct Rocky Schell, Jim Potter and Larry Houser into the NDOA Hall of Fame. Second by Klundt and carried.

Schneweis moved to raise the officials' registration late fee and make up workshop late fee to \$20. Second by Wright and carried. Too many people are paying the nominal late fee so they can do "fun" things instead of attending the scheduled meeting. It is felt an increased fee will help discourage that practice.

\*\* Hockey Day camps were discussed as a number of officials have expressed concern about the hardship of traveling to a single site with no date options and being required to skate every year to qualify for post season officiating. Distance for some is great depending on the location of the day

The possibility of an officials' convention was discussed. Ron and Dave will do some research and report to the board in February.

NDOA meeting days were discussed and it was determined that Sundays are the best days for the NDOA Board to meet.

The next board meeting will be held Sunday, February 13th at noon in the NDHSAA Office in Valley City. Board meetings are open and you are welcome. Please contact a board member or Dave Carlsrud in advance to be on the agenda.

#### MINUTES . North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** September 28, 2004 - Bismarck, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on September 28, 2004 at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. President Schock called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Sanstead who joined the Board at 1:30 p.m. Following additions, motion by Briggs to approve the agenda. Second by Schaible and carried.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the August 12, 2004 regular meeting and the August 20, 2004 special meeting. Motion by Lockwood to approve. Second by Voiesky and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the finance report included in the Board's packet including the

balance sheet, updated budget, investment report and checks written for August. Motion by Briggs to approve the report. Second by Knodle and carried.

The following cooperative sponsorship applications were considered:

- Mandan and Center-Stanton in boys' swimming 7-12 (2004-2005)
- Wishek and Ashley/Zeeland for wrestling 7-12 (2004-2005)

Motion by Schaible to approve. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Board held audience with a delegation from North Border requesting the Board consider reassigning regions for football. Coles reported on the meeting the Football Committee held with Griggs County and North Border with a recommendation to have the regions remain as originally assigned. Speaking for the delegation, Supt. Joe Defoe shared thoughts on behalf of the North Border delegation, Also in the delegation was Supt. Dave Hanson of St. Thomas. The purpose of their appearance is to indicate they have accepted their region assignment but ask consideration for a one-year region schedule followed by a review and change for the following year.

Sanstead joined the meeting at 1:30.

Mr. Defoe indicated they realize no football plan will be totally acceptable to all member schools. Carlson indicated it may be favorable to look at a three-division football plan to reduce the amount of travel that is required now. He also suggested in looking at any plan, strength of program is not used for basketball and should not be used for football. Coles pointed out the football committee did discuss a letter concerning a three-class football classification. It was discussed that a survey be sent to the member schools requiring signatures from the superintendent, principal, athletic administrator and coach to get total communication. The Board suggested questions: (a) Do you favor a one or a two-year? (b) If one year, would you be okay with dropping the home and home opportunity to go with a different plan? (c) Do you favor a three-division system? If you favor a three-division system, how large should the middle division be? (d) Will there be a number of schools in disagreement with the plan they favor? Carlson stated that each school has one vote, even if there is disagreement among those within that school. Briggs asked what would be a timeline with this type of survey? The Executive Secretary recommended this be done immediately and the results be shared at the October General Assembly. At that time, the Football Committee may be given some direction.

Motion by Lockwood to direct the staff to develop a draft of the survey that will be sent out within the next week asking the questions that have been suggested. Second by Jungling. Should a coop with more than one school have more than one vote? The staff was directed to send the survey to the host school and indicate in the letter they need to contact the other schools within that coop who will also be sent a survey for review, to meet and discuss the survey and come up with a consensus from that football program. Only the survey from the host school will be counted. There was a call for the question and motion carried.

Motion by Coles to accept the plan from the Football Committee as developed. Second by Schaible and carried with one dissenting vote.

A letter from Beulah was reviewed petitioning their school be moved to Class B status for the 2006-2007 school year as their enrollment will fall below 325 for two consecutive years. This is the first notice for a reclassification status. This action will take place in two years if their enrollment remains below the 325.

Gary Cowdus from the Dakota Boys' Ranch appeared before the Board requesting an exemption from the participation fees. He is requesting this because of the participation fee being charged for each of their cooperative sponsorships with Minot Public Schools and paying them, even though they may not have a student that is capable of participating. The previous year they paid for 21 activities and only one student participated in cross country and track and field. Motion by Lockwood to have the NDHSAA assess yearly participation fees to residential/institutional (court placed individuals) schools such as the Dakota Boys' Ranch, based only on the activities in which they participate. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from Jim Stenehjem, Principal at Red River High School requesting consideration to change the Sportsmanship Challenge Program in determining what schools are eligible for a sportsmanship banner at a state tournament. It was stated there are a number of Class A Schools that have newly hired principals. Prin. Michael Heilman of Bismarck Century appeared before the Board representing the Class A principals to express this concern of the ineffectiveness of this particular program. Lockwood clarified their principals were addressing opposition to the tournament sportsmanship banner rather than the Sportsmanship Challenge Banner. Volesky asked if the principals had an alternative suggestion. Mr. Heilman indicated the principals had not had the opportunity to meet for discussion. Knodle indicated the principals are planning to come together as a group to discuss what are the expectations of the Class A schools in deserving a tournament sportsmanship banner. Lockwood stated the Sportsmanship Committee took a great deal of time in forming this plan. The Class A principals are requesting that the tournament sportsmanship banner not be awarded at the state tournament. Coles shared the amount of work that was put into this plan and there were questions about the effectiveness but the committee reached the consensus that the committee would go forward with this plan. Following the fall events, the committee could reevaluate the effectiveness of the plan with the possibility to make changes with the plan. Lockwood asked how do you handle tournaments where you have both classifications and give sportsmanship awards to only one of those two classes? Carlson asked if the Board could find out how the total administration of each Class A school feels about this issue before any action is taken. No action

Motion by Lockwood to go into executive session. Second by Briggs and carried.

Motion by Jungling to come out of executive session. Second by Briggs and carried. President Schock announced the Board is out of Executive Session and the three hardship eligibility requests from Flasher Schools have been denied.

The Board held audience with Billie Ann Caya concerning the National Federation Coaches Education and her certification to become an instructor. The Executive Secretary shared an update as to how the NDHSAA became involved with cheerleading, even though cheerleading is not sanctioned. The cheerleading programs are now allowed to stunt under National Federation rules if the coach becomes safety certified through the ASEP program and a member of the cheer squad attends a bonafide cheerleading camp. The Board endorsed reimbursing Mrs. Caya for the cost of her safety recertification.

The Executive Secretary continued explanation of the ASEP program which, along with the National Federation, is also providing a coaches education program. This program is provided on line for a fee set by the state association. Billie Ann indicated there are 32 states that require coaches to take the coaching certification course. Each state is able to set requirements and fees for this program. She recommended coaches take the coaches education course because they will find a great benefit from this course. Currently the cost of a course is \$95. It was clarified that this could provide a college credit. The Executive Secretary will continue working with the other educational groups in this study.

Coles reported on behalf of the Football Committee with the correspondence received expressing concern about students that are not competing because of the dissolution of cooperative sponsorship programs in football in response to the upcoming football plan. Also received was a letter from Langdon requesting to be moved up from Division A to AA. The committee discussed this request and will report on this. A school stated their enrollment was inaccurate and cannot be corrected at this time. No action was taken on any of the requests received that would effect the current plan. Motion by Lockwood to accept the Football Committee report. Second by Coles and carried,

Motion by Lockwood to deny Langdon's request to move from Division A to AA in football because they had ample opportunity to make this request prior to the deadline. Second by Schaible and carried.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Finance Committee's study on a team payment formula. Basically, the study is dividing travel into zones based on mileage to determine team payments. Also, the committee is to determine what type of interim fund must be kept. A basic handout will be prepared and shared with the General Assembly to explain the study in the development of the team payments. Motion by Lockwood to approve the report indicating the committee will continue with this study. Second by Coles and carried.

Schock reported on behalf of the Executive Board with the following:

- Standing Rock played 3 ineligible football players. The new athletic director indicated he was late with the eligibility reports. Decided was to direct them to forfeit the two games and place them on probation.
- Four Winds had paid for the attendance of their athletes to attend a basketball camp which is in violation of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws. Decided was to place the school on probation and further violations will make this school ineligible for post-season play as subject to review by the Executive Board.

Motion by Sanstead to approve the Executive Board's report. Second by Knodle and carried.

The Executive Secretary gave his report:

- a. We have 113 schools which have signed up for sportsmanship banners.
- Starkweather and Munich will not have football teams at the end of the school year, They are requesting the waiver of the \$500 late fee when they pursue a coop.
- The NDHSAA is hosting Section V meeting. One of the major items on the agenda is committee assignments. The one assignment is Section V's turn to have an at-large National Federation board member and the rotation calls for North Dakota to name that person. The Board will be asked to address this issue at the October meeting.

Sanstead shared a telephone call he received from a retired military officer indicating his susceptibility

to second hand smoke. His question was does the Activities Association have any policy on smoking at association sponsored events. Questioned is, does the association have any policy concerning this issue? It was stated there is currently no policy and this would be a local control issue.

The next meeting will be held in October 20 in Bismarck. With no further items, President Schock declared the meeting adjourned.

The Board heard requests for dissolution of the following cooperative sponsorship programs:

- Hebron and New Salem in wrestling for 2005-2006. Motion by Volesky to dissolve. Second by Duchscherer and carried.
- Hebron and Dickinson in cross country for 2005-2006. Motion by Briggs to approve the request. Second by Jungling and carried.

Cooperative sponsorship applications were reviewed: Motion by Carlson to approve:

- a. Dickinson and South Heart in wrestling, 7-12 (04-05)
- b. Border Central and Rock Lake in speech, 7-12 (04-05)
- c. Hebron and Glen Ullin in cross country (05-06)
- d, Fargo South, Shanley and Oak Grove in girls' hockey, 7-12 (04-05)

e. West Fargo and Northern Cass in boys' hockey (04-05)

Second by Duchscherer and carried.

Concern was expressed with the number of schools in a coop for cross country as individuals may compete without a full team. With the total enrollment of all schools involved in the May-Port CG, Larimore, Northwood/Hatton/Thompson request for a cross country coop, there would be a total of about 800 students, plus, programs aiready exist and individuals may compete on their own without a full team, motion by Volesky to deny the request. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Enderlin and Maple Valley coop application for football (05-06) was reviewed. Supt. Jon Kringen of Enderlin was present to answer any questions the Board may have. Motion by Schaible to deny the request as it is past the deadline as set by the football plan. Second by Coles and carried. Coles indicated the need to stay the course on the football plan, even though the decisions have been very difficult. President Schock shared the importance of schools planning ahead in an attempt to avoid situations that put their students in an unfair advantage. Lockwood stated the difficulty of planning with so many uncertainties but planning ahead is very important.

Coles reported on behalf of the Officials Committee with the following.

- The NDOA proposes to increase fees plus post season fees by 4% for the 2005-2006 season. The committee is recommending the adoption of this recommendation.
- Swimming and gymnastics officials are requesting a change in the official uniform. More information will be presented at the November meeting.
- Raise the officials' late registration fees from \$15 to \$20 and workshop late fee from \$10
- Baseball officials requested two additional officials but the committee recommended continuing with the present number of officials at the state tournament.
- The committee informed the Board of an official involved in an incident in a football game between Dickinson and Williston. There is an ongoing investigation of this situation.

Schaible reported on the Constitution & By-Laws Committee's study of Section 1 to remove the 11th day part of the rule. The remainder of this section addresses home based students. The committee will continue this study.

The Executive Secretary reported on the recommendation to determine how teams qualify for the State Girls' Hockey Tournament. The change would read as follows: "State Tournament Format: The top four teams in each region (determined by region standings) will advance to the state girls' hockey tournament." Rationale: Equitable division of teams in the state tournament. The scheduling process is more flexible because all teams do not have to play each other the same number of times. Lockwood expressed concern the western hockey schools will be left short on their schedule because the east schools have Minnesota schools they can schedule. Motion by Volesky to accept the proposal. Second by Coles and carried.

The Board read a communiqué from the athletic administrators from the east region requesting a split of the hockey jamboree into an east and west site from the current one site. This year the hockey day camp is being considered to be held in Minot because all teams are coming to this event and there is a need of three sheets of ice. Motion by Lockwood to allow for a second officials' jamboree in hockey for the east region. Second by Knodle and carried.

Sanstead reported on a letter from Scott Miller, Assistant Attorney General, addressing a North Dakota Century Code on adopting a position on suspension rules. He was asked to consider the

- a. Determine if there is a real need for a resolution and if so would the NDHSAA would be a participant in any such action.
- b. Go to the legislation assembly to pass a bill to support. It was suggested this was not a direction the association wishes to take. The board felt the Department of Public Instruction should support the regulations and policies of the member schools.

The Board reviewed the regulations for the winter season activities, basketball, gymnastics, hockey, and wrestling. Motion by Knodle that artificial noise makers will not be allowed for all indoor events during the entire regular season as well as the post season. Second by Jungling and carried. Motion by Sanstead to approve winter season sports regulations as amended. Second by Schaible and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board the association was asked to review the note concerning alcohol violations and the ruling concerning an in-patient treatment to lessen the length of suspension. Deputy Attorney General Sandy Tabor appeared before the Board to represent Attorney General Wayne Stenehjem. Shared is a three-year plan to focus on law enforcement and prevention coming together to provide resources and prevention programs for chemical abuse. Questions were raised concerning the situation where a student voluntarily attends a smoking cessation program and how does this affect the alcohol, tobacco and chemical regulation of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws. It is the contention that these programs were developed to help a student and not put them in a position where participation would cause punishment. President Schock indicated this should be referred to the Constitution & By-Laws Committee for study. Motion by Lockwood to refer this to the Constitution & By-Laws Committee. Second by Briggs and carried.

Volesky reported on the Finance Committee recommendation for the purchase of a replacement vehicle of the two-year old automobile. Negotiations have taken place with Miller Motor for \$9,894 for trade-in of the 2003 Dodge Caravan for a 2005 Dodge Caravan. The committee recommends approval of the purchase of this vehicle. Motion by Briggs to approve the recommendation. Second by Coles and carried.

Volesky shared the materials that were developed for the continued study of the team payment plan. The Executive Secretary will give a preliminary report to the General Assembly at the October 21.

Supt. Gaillord Peltier of Four Winds appeared before the board to appeal the decision of the Executive Board at the September 28, 2004 meeting concerning their school paying for registration for a basketball camp which is in violation of Part Three, 5, page 37 of the 2004-2005 Constitution & By-Laws: "Students may participate in summer sports camps on their own. SPECIAL NOTE #2 Schools are not permitted to pay registration fees for students attending summer camps." Mr. Peltier asked for reconsideration of the penalty for their infraction changing it from probation to a letter of warning. The Board was asked to remand this back to the Executive Board to come back with their decision in this matter. Mr. Peltier was commended for standing up in support of the rules and regulations of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws. Schaible stated as a school board representative, he has a perspective of a board member and feels members of a local board need to be held accountable to know the rules. Motion by Schaible to uphold the Executive Board's decision to place Four Winds on probation. Second by Briggs and carried. The Executive Secretary will be sending a letter to the Four Winds school board concerning this issue.

Mr. Peltier shared with the Board a possible movement of football teams that feel they cannot compete in the division they are assigned for the 2005 season. These teams are considering an independent season rather than being tied into a schedule in which they cannot compete.

Supt. Kevin Harmon of Minot Bishop Ryan and Terry Voiles appeared before the Board asking advice concerning a situation in which they obtained two students from Serbia who are not here through an approved foreign exchange program but were referred to them from another student who had attended school in Minot. The Board indicated these two students would be eligible for one calendar year for sub-varsity competition.

The Executive Secretary reported the results of the football survey which was requested at the September meeting. From the 95 returns, the results were:

Favor a one-year plan -- 19 Favor a two-year plan - 76

Favor three divisions - 30

Favor four divisions - 60

These results will be shared with the General Assembly.

Staff member Carisrud spoke to the Board concerning the weight management movement at the National level. This was for informational purposes and will be shared with the General Assembly meeting the following day.

The Board reviewed the agenda for the General Assembly and reviewed plans in preparation for

Motion by Duchscherer to go into executive session to hear a request for a Rolla student. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Motion by Jungling to come out of executive session. Second by Lockwood and carried. President Schock announced the request for an extra semester for a Rolla student was denied.

Letters of correspondence were reviewed by the Board from Gary Beck, Barb O'Hara and Tim and Karen Smith,

The Executive Secretary reported five staff members will attend a Microsoft Office workshop.

The General Assembly of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn on October 21, 2004. President Schook called the meeting to order at 4:30 and declared a quorum.

President Schock began with some opening remarks thanking the membership for being an important part in offering opportunities for students. The NDHSAA Board of Directors and staff were introduced.

Motion by Supt. Wade Faul, Griggs County Central to approve the minutes of October, 2003 and January 2004 as published in the yearbook. Second by Supt. Dean Vorland, Drake and carried.

Supt. Myron Schweitzer of Mott-Regent presented the nominations for Class B southwest position on the NDHSAA Board of Directrs:

Supt. Royal Lyson, of Center-Stanton

Supt. Tony Duletski of Bowman and Rhame

With no other nominations from the floor, these names will be placed on the ballot.

Prin. Kevin Coles, Hillsboro presented the nominations for the NDASSP position on the NDHSAA Board of Directors:

Prin. Kurt Hayes of Munich

Prin. Mickey Jordan of Dickinson

With no other nominations from the floor, these names will be placed on the bailot.

The Executive Secretary reported on the Finance Committee's study of the team payment policy. Wilfred Volesky was introduced as the chairman of the committee that is studying this plan.

The NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws concerning voting was reviewed.

Loren Scheer, Dakota Prairie presented the amendment to delete existing Article XIII, Sports Seasons, and replace it with Article XIII, Section I, which would read as follows: "All NDHSAA sponsored interscholastic activities shall be governed by regulations as established by the NDHSAA Board of directors." Motion by Scheer to accept this amendment. Second by Curt Jones, West Fargo. By voice vote, motion carried.

Gerald Quintus, Richardton-Taylor HS presented and made a motion to adopt the proposed following amendment to Part Two, Article II, Sections I<sub>4</sub>II, III, and create Sections IV and V of the By-Laws as found on pages 5 & 6 of the NDHSAA Constitution and By-Laws. The rationale as supplied by the Southwest North Dakota Association of School Administrators is as follows: "It is hoped that by adding a third level of participation in the sport of basketball that more student athletes will be provided the opportunity to experience the benefits of being involved in a state tournament in the sport while still maintaining the integrity of each of the proposed state tournaments: AA, A and B." PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO NDHSAA BY-LAWS TO ESTABLISH THE THREE CLASS SYSTEM TO BECOME EFFECTIVE THE BEGINNING OF THE 2005-2006 SCHOOL YEAR PART TWO; ARTICLE II-CLASSIFICATION OF SCHOOLS:

Section 1: Class AA Schools:

- a. This group shall consist of the eighteen (18) schools with the highest number of students enrolled in grades 8-11 inclusive, as of October 1, 2004, based on DPI figures, using a one-for-one ratio when co-ops exist, plus any two member schools that elect to choose Class AA as provided in section (b) herewith. AA shall consist of a minimum of seventeen schools and a maximum of nineteen schools.
- b. Before January 1, 2005, any two (2) member schools whose enrollment places them in Class A may petition the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors to be moved

immediately to Class AA. After the original Class AA has been established on January 1, 2005, if an open spot is available, a member school classified in Class A must give two years notice to the Board of Directors of their desire to change classification.

Such choice must be made not later than September 1st of any year and shall become effective with the opening of the fall term two years later. Schools that elect to change classifications must remain in that classification for a minimum of two years before they may again apply for reclassification. Section II: Class A Schools:

- a. This group shall consist of the thirty-two (32) schools (after the highest seventeen) with the next highest number of students enrolled in grades 8-11 inclusive, based on DPI figures, as of October 1, 2004, using a one-for-one ratio when co-ops exist. Those schools immediately below the Class AA schools, plus any member schools that elect to choose Class A as provided in section (b) herewith shall be included in Class A. A shall consist of a minimum of thirty schools and a maximum of thirty six schools
- b. Before January 1, 2005, any four (4) member schools whose enrollment places them in Class B may petition the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors to be moved immediately to Class A. After the original Class A has been established on January 1, 2005, if an open spot is available, a member school classified in Class A must give two years notice to the Board of Directors of their desire to change their classification. Such choice must be made not later than September 1st of any year and shall become effective with the opening of the fall term two years later. Schools that elect to change classification must remain in that classification for a minimum of two years before they may again apply for reclassification.

c. Determination of qualifiers for and seeding of the regional tournament will be decided by the schools of each region. They may hold district tournaments or seed according to season record.

- d. in the case of co-ops in which only one gender takes part in a co-op, classification will be determined on an individual basis based on the same criteria as used in letter (a) of this section. Example: Girls from school A and school B are part of a co-op which places them in Class A. Boys from these two schools participate individually. Since enrollment for each of the schools places them in Class B individually for boys basketball, the girls team will participate in the Class A level and each of the boys teams will participate in Class B. Section III: Class B Schools:
- a. All member high Schools, other than those designated Class AA or Class A, shall be classified as Class B schools.
- b. Determination of qualifiers for and seeding of the regional tournament will be decided by the schools of each region. They may hold district tournaments or seed according to season record. Regional tournament sites are to be determined by the NDHSAA Board of Directors.
- c. In the case of co-ops in which only one gender takes part in a co-op, classification will be determined on an individual basis based on the same criteria as used in letter (a) of this section. Example: Girls from school A and school B are part of a co-op which places them in Class A. Boys from these two schools participate individually.

Since enrollment for each of the schools places them in Class B individually for boys basketball, the girls team will participate in the Class A level and each of the boys teams will participate in Class B. Section IV: Two Year Review: Every two years the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors shall review enrollment figures for grades 8-11 from each participating school to determine classification assignments to become effective with the opening of the fall term two years later.

Section V: Authorization for Competition in Other Activities:

Class AA, Class A, and Class B schools may compete in separate classes to determine state basketball championships. The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is authorized to combine classes in other athletic or non-athletic contests and festivals if it appears expedient and desirable.

Second by ElRoy Burkle, Border Central

Several members of the General Assembly spoke including Supt. Mike Ness, Hazen and Supt. Terry Quintus of Burke Central.

Supt. Robert Tollefson of Washburn proposed a floor amendment to the amendment Section II, Class A Schools – "a. This group shall consist of the thirty-two (32) schools after the highest seventeen comprised of all remaining private schools not included in the Class AA and other schools." Motion by Tollefson to approve this amendment to the amendment. Second by Supt. Douglas Bertsch of Valley High School. Others spoke including Supt. Noel Lunde, New England; Supt. Daniel Anderson, Ray

Following a voice vote on the amendment, a roll call vote was requested. The amendment to the amendment failed by a vote of 33-135.

A roll call vote on the original amendment failed - yes, 49, no 120.

The Executive Secretary gave his report

 Football plan for the 2005-2007 was reviewed. Results of the survey were shared with the assembly, 95 responded, 19 indicated one-year plan and two-year-76.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on November 19, 2004 at the Jamestown Gladstone Inn. President Schook called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Sanstead.

Several additions were made to the agenda,

The minutes from the October 20, 2004 meeting were provided to the Board in their packets. Motion by Lockwood to approve as written. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report. Comparatively speaking, neither football nor volleyball has shown to be financially successful this fall. Motion by Volesky to approve the report. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Board reviewed a request for the dissolution of the Halliday and Killdeer volleyball cooperative program. Letters from both schools were read indicating approval of the dissolution. Motion by Volesky to approve the request. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Board reviewed the following cooperative sponsorship applications:

- Turtle Lake-Mercer and Underwood in junior high football (05-06). Motion by Briggs to approve. Second by Duchscherer and carried.
- b. Grand Forks Central, Grand Forks Red River and East Grand Forks in girls' swimming

 Halliday and Dodge/Golden Valley in volleyball, 7-12 (05-06). Motion by Volesky to approve. Second by Schaible and carried.

 Velva and Sawyer in volleyball 9-12 (05-06). Motion by Carlson to approve. Second by Jungling and carried.

 Cavaller and Drayton in wrestling, 7-12 (04-05). Motion by Lockwood to approve. Second by Coles and carried.

Coles inquired as to the possibility of a committee to study the guidelines to help the Board in their consideration of cooperative sponsorship requests.

The Board held audience with a group from Maple Valley and Enderlin. They were present to appeal a Board decision that denied their application for a football cooperative sponsorship program. Supt. Roger Mulvaney of Maple Valley spoke as well as Ron Fraase, Maple Valley School Board member. Also, Dalen Grieger and Neal Dimmer from the MV school board were present. Representing Enderlin was Brian Midthun, athletic director and school board members, Bobby Geske and Dan Billing. The question arose if the coop was to be approved, would their football program stay in the 9-man division. Questions followed. Lockwood addressed the intent of the parameters that were set for the 2-year football plan would not allow a re-divisioning of any teams after the deadline. Because of this, if their coop was to be approved, it would make them larger than more than half of the schools in the next division higher. Motion by Lockwood to allow the coop between Maple Valley and Enderlin be approved for the 2006 football season. Motion died for lack of a second. Motion by Coles to deny the appeal. Second by Volesky. Further discussion followed. Jungling indicated if the parameters were to be adjusted, does this mean we scrap the current football plan. Motion to deny carried with one dissenting vote.

There is an upcoming vacancy for the at-large position on the National Federation Board of Directors. The Board suggested those eligible and are interested are to contact the Executive Secretary within the next two weeks and allow the Executive Board make the decision if more than one Board member expresses interest in serving in this position.

Motion by Briggs to go into executive session. Second by Schaible and carried.

Motion by Jungling to return from executive session. Second by Schaible and carried. President Schock reported the Board approved the hardship applications from Montpelier and Fairmount and denied the application from Mandan.

Briggs reported on behalf of the Fine Arts Committee concerning the changes made with the State Class A Instrumental Music Contest. As was stated earlier, this was approved on a one-year basis and there will be a thorough review following this one year. It is requested the Fine Arts Committee meet and set some critical review criteria. They will be meeting prior to the January, 2005 Board meeting.

Coles reported on behalf of the Football Committee with no regional assignment until further review. The number of football passes for distribution to participating teams for Dakota Bowl was discussed. The committee has placed this on their agenda for a future meeting. The AA playoffs will be studied and the committee will report later. The committee also dealt with the Devils Lake request for 05-06 because of an error in counting the numbers for Turtle Mountain. No action was taken. Also studied a second letter of request for the 07-08 from Devils Lake to consider moving down one division. This will be addressed at a later date using numbers that will be current at that time.

Coles reported on behalf of the Officials Committee with the following action:

- a. Increase regular and post season officials' fees by 4% for the 2005-2006 school year,
- Allow swimming & diving officials to wear white shirts with navy pants or navy shorts and allow gymnastics officials to wear black siacks/skirt and a white top.
- c. Raise the officials' registration late fee and make up workshop late fees to \$20 for the 2005-2006 school year.

Discussion was held concerning allowing students younger than 11th grade to register to officiate. This will be discussed further. Motion by Briggs to accept the recommendations as listed by the committee. Second by Lockwood and carried.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Finance Committee:

- a. Studied the health insurance increase for the staff. This is a \$4,532.40 increase from the previous year. The committee recommends continuing with the current plan. Motion by Briggs to approve continuing with this plan with the increase. Second by Duchscherer and carried.
- b. Tesoro has indicated they are interested in becoming a corporate sponsor. Decided this would be allowed if \$30,000 was paid for the year or pay \$10,000 per activity to be a supporting sponsor.
- c. The Board directed the Executive Secretary to request \$100,000 for renewal of the US Bank contract. Motion by Briggs to ask this amount. Second by Knodle and carried.
- d. The study continues on a team payment plan. Currently, the same dollar value is being

assigned to all activities. One of the issues being discussed is setting a cap on the number of participants in music.

The Finance Committee will meet on Saturday morning prior to the Board meeting to further discuss the team payment plan.

Prin. Mark Andresen of Mandan appeared before the Board requesting an additional semester for a student. Motion by Briggs to approve pending receipt of said paper and remain eligible until the 20th anniversary of his birth. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Board discussed the problems that have taken place with the hosting of the State Volleyball Tournament. Possible alternative sites were discussed. It was decided that Jamestown will be able to work out their problems for the State Girls' Class B Basketball Tournament.

The Board read a letter of appeal from Mrs. George Overby. Motion by Lockwood to uphold the Executive Secretary's decision and reject the appeal. Second by Schaible and carried.

The recommendations from the District Chairperson's meeting were reviewed.

The Board read a letter from Craig Pool of Belfield/South Heart concerning a district realignment and Pat McNally of Minot concerning the hockey jamboree.

The Executive Secretary gave a report:

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on January 29, 2005 at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. President Schock called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Carlson.

The agenda was reviewed. After additions were made, motion by Volesky to approve the agenda. Second by Briggs and carried.

The minutes of the November 19, 2004 regular meeting and the November 29, 2004 and December 17, 2004 special meetings were previously reviewed. Motion by Lockwood to approve the minutes of these meetings. Second by Knodle and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report. The Board reviewed the balance sheet, year-to-date budget, and the savings and investment reports. Also provided to the Board was a list of checks written for November and December as well as detailed financial reports for each of the fail tournaments and activities. Motion by Briggs to approve the report. Second by Schaible and carried.

The Board reviewed requests for dissolution of the following cooperative sponsorships:

- c. Bottineau and Westhope in boys' hockey (05-06) no fee
- d. Midway and Minto in girls' and boys' basketball, 9-12 (05-06) no fee
- e. Cando and Bisbee-Egeland in boys' and girls' golf (04-05) no fee

Motion by Schaible to approve the coops. Second by Lockwood. Motion carried with 3 dissenting votes.

Schock reported on the Executive Committee review on the use of an ineligible wrestler by Rolla. The committee recommended all matches wrestled by the ineligible student this season be forfeited and adjust the dual score of all matches in which he participated, with the outcome reversed if there was a win that affected the score. For a Grand Forks hockey player exceeding the period limitation, it was recommended the penalty be forfeit of the game. The Board agreed to add periods to the prescribed penalty rule for athletes to be in line with the penalty for participating in too many quarters

Motion by Briggs to go into Executive Session to review a hardship eligibility application. Second by Lockwood and carried.

Motion by Lockwood and second by Jungling to come out of Executive session. Motion carried, President Schock announced the hardship application from Montpelier has been denied.

The Board reviewed a letter from Velva requesting approval to receive the football sportsmanship banner which was denied them because Sawyer High School failed to file a Sportsmanship Challenge plan prior to the deadline. It was noted that schools were informed of the deadline and that all schools in a coop must have a verified sportsmanship plan. It was stated if there was an exception, it would lead to a difficult situation if there was another request. Also, it was felt the host school should make it their responsibility to ensure other participating schools in their coop take care of this responsibility. Motion by Volesky to deny the request. Second by Coles and carried.

The Board held audience with Gene Utecht concerning a fight between Underwood and Flasher basketball players with the Underwood player becoming physically aggressive. The Board reviewed the tapes of the incident. Mr. Utecht reported what Underwood prescribed an additional penalty for the one which has been previously established. The Underwood student invoived in the incident was given a seven-game suspension as well as the student being placed on probation for the remainder of the year. He was also required to meet with the elementary students to explain the importance of good sportsmanship. The student also wrote a letter of apology which was sent to the Flasher school. The Board accepted the decision of the school and commended Mr. Utecht for his efforts in this matter. No further action was taken. The Executive Secretary will write an official letter to the school.

The Board held an extensive discussion concerning the bench decorum rule in basketball and the lack of consistency in enforcement. It was agreed the administrators have a great deal of work to do concerning this area.

The Board held audience with Supt. Robert Stringer of Sykeston concerning their reorganization to join the Carrington school district. Interpretations of several transfer eligibility questions were discussed. It was stated this and all situations of schools closing is in need of study before the Board would make a ruling on this issue. Motion by Lockwood to refer this to the Constitution & By-Laws Committee. Second by Volesky and carried.

The Board had previously reviewed the affidavits from Supt. Kevin Harmon of Minot Bishop Ryan and Bojan Janjic, student at Minot Ryan. NDHSAA attorney Thune appeared before the Board to update them on the progress of this court case,

The National Federation Board of Director's position was discussed. Three Board members have expressed interest in serving this position. A secret ballot was taken. The results indicate Lorell Jungling will be the National Federation representative.

The Board read a communiqué from Leeds requesting permission for two athletes to attend the Nike Indoor Track & Field Championships. It was noted the meet was sanctioned by US Track & Field, Motion by Lockwood to approve the request. Second by Knodle and carried.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Finance Committee:

- a. The proposed team payment plan was explained as finalized by the committee and is ready for presentation to the membership at the General Assembly meeting. It was determined this would be implemented July 1 beginning with the 2005-2006 school year.
- b. Salary proposals are as follows: The Executive Secretary is in the first of a two-year contract. The Assistant Executive Secretaries will be offered a two year contract with 3.5% increase each year and the support staff is offered a 3.5% increase for the 2005-2006 year.

It was the feeling of the committee that there needs to be a minimum number of weeks that a participating student must fulfill before being declared eligible under this note. The Executive Secretary asked if this should continue to be a note subject to possible change by the Board or if it should be presented as an amendment to the Constitution & By-Laws for a vote of the membership.

Briggs reported on behalf of the Fine Arts Committee. Requested is the establishment of a committee similar to the Athletic Review Committee to address the issues brought forward by the fine arts advisory committees. This review from this formed committee will be done toward the latter part of the school year before being brought to the Board. The criteria will be established contingent to the Board approving this concept. 2. Part #8 of the plan which indicates new coops must be submitted by the deadline or wait one year to go into effect.

3. Discussed how to count male enrollment. Currently the plan is taking grades 7-10 but currently are discussing using grades 9-11 which would give more of a varsity take.

Bracketing was reviewed.

Advisory recommendations will be reviewed as approved by the Board.

The Committee will continue study before they bring recommendations to the Board for consideration.

The Board reviewed the Class A principals letter concerning their objections to the Sportsmanship Challenge program. Also given to the Board were responses from the office staff. ## MINUTES District Chairperson's Meeting March 18, 2005--9:00 A.M. Minot Holiday Inn Conference Center Minot, ND

Brian Duchscherer, NDHSAA Board Representative, welcomed the chairpersons. The members present introduced themselves.

Sheets were passed around for the chairpersons to indicate their district's recommendation for the site of the 2006 region basketball tournaments.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the recommendations from the fall meeting and the results of the recommendations presented to the NDHSAA Board of Directors. Also reviewed was the process of the district recommendations.

The various Districts have an agenda for discussion. Before any item is submitted to the NDHSAA Board for consideration it must receive approval from a simple majority of the Districts.

The reports in order of districts were as follows (voting action in bold print): District 1-----Rick Jacobson, Wyndmere

- Have three FB classes instead of four. Duchscherer indicated the survey of the member schools indicated they wanted to keep the plan as presented.
- Is the issue of moving golf to the fall dead?
- Move from 14 weight classes to 12 in wrestling. Those recommending this did not indicate which weight classes should be removed.
- 4. Implement coaching box or somehow the officials need to address this. Currently it is not being enforced. Was also a recommendation from District 10. Their administrators felt they would meet with officials and coaches before every game to indicate they wish to have the bench decorum, rough play, taunting and language enforced. District 3 indicated they are in favor of either the coaching box or enforce as intended. Games with Minnesota where they have the coaching box has caused a problem. District 7 also discussed the coaching box and at their regional tournament, half of the coaches were up more than 50% of the game. As administrators, there is a responsibility to teach coaches proper bench conduct.

Wayne Stanley moved as a Dist. Chair to pass on to the officials to be consistent in the enforcement of rules (bench decorum). A vote was taken and passed, 13-0.

#### District 2-----Morgan Forness, Oak Grove

- Do not reduce length of seasons. It is felt there is flexibility in the season and they
  may schedule fewer than the maximum number of games.
- Move regional basketball tournaments to Saturday, Monday, and Tuesday. The vote was defeated, 2-12

#### District 3-----Kevin Rogers, Hatton

1. District 3 is not in favor of shortening any of the athletic seasons.

Change the 6 quarter per night and 95 quarters total for the season to 6/114. District 14 indicated they also have that recommendation because of shortage of players rather than some players not being allowed to play if the quarters per season are raised. The increase would help scheduling with smaller schools. Dist 8 agreed some schools ran out of quarters before the season ended. District 6 had some concerns that the larger schools would play the better athletes more and some others would sit. Rogers indicated their athletes were playing more because the junior varsity players could play 2 quarters and still be eligible for the whole varsity game. A vote was taken and passed, 14-1

Allow teams to conduct scrimmages during the season and not have them count

against game totals.

a. "Rationale being that due to girls' district tournaments and regional tournaments the boys play about 5 games in February and 7-10 day gaps in scheduling frequently occur. Some schools already scrimmage as part of official clinics, and it would allow for some form of competition over the Christmas break which tends to be 12-16 days long most years." A vote was taken and defeated, 1-14

4. We would like discussion to be held on the use of wooden bats in baseball vs. metal. The Executive Secretary indicated the National Federation is currently

conducting a study of bat speed, etc.

#### District 4----- Doug Bertsch, Valley

1. No agenda items at this time.

#### District 5-----Jim Dunnigan, Medina

 Change the six quarter rule with the 95 quarter limit to six quarters a night without the limit. (Vote approved as recommended by District 3.)

. Region 3 Boys Tournament in Jamestown-Girls Region 3 Tournament to be

decided by District 6 schools.

3. There is a concern of teams playing their district games with their junior varsity squads so the varsity teams could play outside the district for a tougher schedule. It was determined this issue is best addressed at the district level. This could become more of an issue if the total quarter limitation is raised.

#### District 6-----Jim Eiseman, Strasburg

Selection of officials for the regionals. Possible break between the selection so
votes are not wasted. It was clarified that officials have the option to take a boys
of girls' region, of which one may also include a state tournament. Making them
accept a contract for one season may unfairly eliminate them from a state contract
in the other season.

2. Volleyball celebration issue. This will be addressed at the rules meetings prior to

the next season.

#### District 7-----Gaillord Peltier, Four Winds

 Either enforce the existing rule on coaches have to sit down, or adopt a coaching box. Vote aiready taken from District 1 report.

regional tournament, versus what might be recommended on changing the process
to two or three teams. It was clarified by the Executive Secretary that there is no

Site recommendation for Region 5 BBB is the Bismarck Civic Center for days 1 and 2. Move day 3 to Univ. of Mary or Bismarck Century.

- Coaches Association It was felt by the District 10 coaches there is a need to establish a Class B advisory committee to give Class B schools more representation. Discussion indicated the importance of coaches belonging to the Coaches Association as to the professional development that is offered. Also, all advisory committees appointed by the NDHSCA have Class B representation.

Motion by Sanstead to bring back to the table a previous motion by Coles and second by Volesky to approve the interpretation to Section X as follows, "If two or more high school districts combine through dissolution or reorganization resulting in the closing of one or more of the high school buildings, students in these buildings which are closed because of this dissolution or reorganization would become immediately eligible in any contiguous high school." Second by Briggs and carried to bring this back to the table.

NDHSĂA attorney Gary Thune gave an opinion on the proposed wording. It was the consensus of the Board they want the motion to reflect what would be parallel to state law. Thune will present the wording as such for the next Board meeting. Suggested was to look at the transfer rule to be a one-year sit-out rather than the 90 school days. Motion by Coles to table. Schalble reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee with the recommendation to the following wording change for Part two, Article XIV, Section XI on page 34:

a. In the last sentence delete the words "Any" and replace with, "The administration of a member school of a". It would now read as: "The administration of a member school of a student who does not qualify under Section XI has the right to appeal to the NDHSAA Board of directors provided he/she has not reached his/her twentieth birthday and the student is academically eligible".

Motion by Volesky to approve this wording. Second by Briggs and carried.

Also, the wording used to set policy and regulations is to be provided by NDHSAA attorney Thune. This will be received for review at the June meeting.

It is recommended an administrator be required to appear before the Board before any hardship eligibility application is considered. Also, the following wording is recommended to the Hardship Eligibility application form:

"G. The receiving school must be represented by a school administrator at the meeting where the consideration is given."

An administrator's e-mail addresses will be required on the form for the purposes of contacting those schools involved in the application. Motion by Briggs to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried

The Constitution & By-Laws also reviewed the application form for cooperative sponsorship with consideration for adding questions to the form. The committee recommends any application should be posted on the NDHSAA web site for a minimum of 2 weeks prior to being considered. This would give member schools the opportunity to respond with feedback on the request. Duchscherer suggested it is important but may be it could also be put on the list serve and cut the time down. It was suggested the list serve be used to notify schools to check the web site when a new coop application has been filed. The Board examined the Winter Sports, Spring Sports and Fine Arts financial reports which were sent to the Board earlier for review. Motion by Briggs to approve the finance report. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Board reviewed the following requests for cooperative sponsorship program dissolutions along with the year the dissolution will go into effect:

Kensal and Midkota in track & field (2006)

Motion by Volesky to accept this dissolution. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Berthold and Des Lacs-Burlington in track & field (2006) North Shore-Plaza and Parshall in track & field (2006)

Motion by Briggs to accept these dissolutions. Second by Lockwood and carried.

The Board discussed the dissolution request from Selfridge to dissolve the Selfridge/Solen (Dakota Oyate) cooperative sponsorship program in boys' and girls' basketball. Motion by Duchscherer to table this dissolution until receipt of approval by Solen because this coop is within the first three years. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Board reviewed the following requests for approval of a cooperative sponsorship program along with the year the coop will go into effect:

Mandan and Center in boys' hockey, 9-12 (05-06)

Grafton, Park River, Minto, Drayton and Cavalier in boys' hockey, (05-06)

Lewis & Clark Berthold and Lewis & Clark North Shore/Plaza in golf, track & field and speech, 7-12 (05-06)

North Sargent and Sargent Central in girls' & boys' track & field, 7-12 (05-06)

Mandan and Sweet Briar in volleyball and girls' track & field, 7-8 (05-06)

Williston Trinity Christian and Trenton in baseball, 7-12 (05-06)

Motion by Lockwood to approve the cooperative sponsorship applications. Second by Sanstead and carried with one dissenting vote.

President Schock deferred to the Executive Secretary to report on behalf of the Executive Board.

Kindred High School allowed an ineligible student to compete in a track meet. Along with a forfeiture of all points which the individual earned, the committee directed the Executive Secretary to write a letter of reprimand to the school.

Adams Edmore allowed a baseball player to exceed the innings pitched regulation. The committee directed a letter of reprimand and forfeiture of the game. This also changed

team advancement to the regional tournament.

The committee recommended for Board adoption the regulation to state: "At a minimum, the use of an ineligible participant in team sports, will result in forfeiture of contest(s) and the participant will sit out the next regular scheduled contest. With a prescribed penalty. this will reduce the number of incidents that must be presented to the Executive Board and allows more consistency in dealing with rule violations.

Motion by Coles to approve the recommendation to adopt the prescribed penalty for team sports change in policy. Second by Schaible and carried.

Carlson reported on behalf of the Media Committee concerning the still-shot photography proposal submitted by Rick Westra of Jostens Photography. This would be for athletics only. Support for lighting and camera placement would be between Jostens' and the venue manager (not the tournament manager). The committee also adjusted some of the terms of the proposed agreement. This is a three-year agreement and at the end of the year each year, a report will be submitted to the NDHSAA Board of Directors. A proposed bullet was added to the agreement indicating the contracted television station would have preference in placement of cameras. Motion by Knodle to accept the recommendations of the committee as changed through discussion of the Board if agreed upon by Jostens Photography. Second by Briggs and carried.

Carlson reported on behalf of the Trophy Committee with the following company proposals and amounts recommended to the Board:

- Allard Trophy
- **ESCO**
- Awards & Trophies
- Four Seasons

Motion by Lockwood to approve the report. Second by Jungling and carried.

Presentation of individual trophies at state football ceremonies was discussed. The number of football players allowed to dress is a different number than the number of awards that are being awarded. Motion by Coles to purchase the number of awards as deemed necessary and cover the cost of those additional plaques. Second by Jungling. Motion and second withdrawn. Motion by Coles to order the maximum number of awards of those that are allowed to dress. Schools will be billed for the difference between the number of awards presently allowed and the maximum number dressed. Second by Carlson and carried.

Coles reported on the Football Committee's meeting held to address the final parameters to apply to the administration of the current football plan and any subsequent plan. Those parameters proposed are:

1. Football plans are established for two years: Season years are 2005-2006, 2006-2007, 2007-2008, etc.

- There will be four divisions of football.
- Straight enrollment will be used for determining divisions.
- Co-ops shall count one for one. (enrollments)

Grades 9-11 male enrollments as provided by DPI shall be used.

Schools may petition to move up to a higher division if the next smaller enrollment school in that division is willing to move down and so on.

The number of teams in the top three divisions will remain constant for the years of the plan. (AAA=16, A=16, A=32)

If a school in one of the upper three divisions discontinues football during the two-year plan, the number of teams remaining in that division will not be changed in the second year.

If a co-op is approved for the 2nd year of the plan, realignment in any of the top three divisions may be allowed with consideration given to the geographic location of schools involved in the change.

Geography can be an issue when establishing regional boundaries but not for determining division assignments.

For both years of the two-year plan, new co-op applications must be submitted by the end of the preceding football season. (no extensions or fines will be considered)

This will require a wording change to note on page 77 of the Constitution & By-Laws

Wording change will be reviewed at the August meeting. b.

This information will go out to member schools for response. Final time-line will be September, giving the Board the August meeting to review these responses. Duchscherer shared concern over the requirement of 32 teams in the A division with the lower enrollment school's ability to compete and would like to see three divisions of football. Lockwood indicated four divisions allows for less disparity in enrollments within a division.

Carlson reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee. Recommendations are:

District 7 & 8 has an imbalance. Recommended is to move Minnewaukan and Leeds from District 7 to District 8 in girls' and boys' basketball. With the difference in volleyball coops, there is no recommended change at this time.

Districts 13 and 14. Proposed placing Beulah in District 14 and move Beifield and South Heart from District 14 to 13 for boys' and girls' basketball and volleyball.

These recommendations will be communicated to the schools as well as the district chairman of each of these districts in pursuit of responses from these districts. Final placement will be made at a future meeting. Motion by Lockwood to approve the report. Second by Briggs and carried.

Schaible reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee. NDHSAA attorney Thune was present at the committee meeting via telephone. The committee reviewed Thune's recommendation for change of wording regarding eligibility for students involved in school district dissolution or reorganization. Motion by Sanstead to take previous motion from the table regarding this subject. Second by Briggs and carried. Motion by Sanstead to approve the language provided by the attorney including the interpretations as presented by Attorney Thune. Second by Carlson and carried with three dissenting votes.

Schalble also reported on the committee's study of policy and regulations as pertaining to the powers and duties of the NDHSAA Board of Directors. The wording proposed is:

n. It shall have the authority to adopt policies and regulation in furtherance of the exercise and implementation of its powers and duties

Motion by Coles to approve the presentation of this amendment to the membership for a vote at the next General Assembly meeting as per Constitution & By-Laws requirements. Second by Schaible and carried.

The proposed change to Part II, Article 14, Section 11 - 8 semester rule: Motion by Briggs to approve this amendment to the Constitution & By-Laws. Second by Volesky and carried.

The committee studied the period of ineligibility which is 90 days for transfer students but no time of ineligibility for CSIET students entering a new high school. The question raised is, do we still want one allowable year of eligibility for CSIET students, or 90 days of ineligibility for foreign students who are attending not from an approved program. Suggested by attorney is to standardize rules for foreign and domestic students moving into a new school. Discussion followed. It was noted that transfer students are more apt to be ineligible for football and become eligible for basketball. This could be considered unfair for football athletes. Consideration of a one-calendar year of ineligibility for transfer students would eliminate that situation. Motion by Volesky to treat all students, foreign and domestic, with the same transfer rule. Second by Coles and carried.

Also Attorney Thune recommended a due process procedure for hardship eligibility rules. Section 10; part b would be amended to read:

...investigated and ruled on by the Executive Secretary who will provide a written report. Appeal may be made to the Executive Committee and then to the full board." Motion by Briggs to approve this change. Second by Sanstead and carried. This will require a vote

of the membership at the October meeting.

For the September meeting, the Board directed the Constitution & By-Laws Committee to draft wording for the Constitution to change the Class A Board representation from East, West and Central to East, West and At-Large. This will be presented in time for a mail ballot in December, 2005 and the results to be announced at the January, 2006 meeting of the membership.

The Board discussed the future of the girls' state hockey tournament. A survey will be taken prior to taking any action concerning the location of the girls' state hockey tournament. The Board had previously authorized a survey to be sent to member schools to help in the direction of the selection of site and format of the girls' state hockey tournament. Study will continue on how and when this combination of tournaments will take place. It was stated the Board endorsed and is working toward the combination of girls' and boys' state hockey with details still to be determined.

The Board held audience with a delegation from Jamestown as requested by the mayor of Jamestown to address the Board concerning the Class B State Girls' Basketball Tournament being moved out of Jamestown. Supt, Dave Smette and Athletic Director Jim Roaldson represented Jamestown asking what can be done to again be reconsidered for state tournament assignments. It was clarified the management and hospitality of Jamestown was not the reason for moving the tournament. The actual reason for moving the tournament site was the lack of blocks of motel space within the city. The Board thanked the delegation for coming to share.

Lockwood reported on behalf of the Class A Regional Committee's study of the recommendation to move Jamestown from East A Region to West Region for all activities beginning with the 2006-2007 school year. This recommendation was brought forth by the majority of West Region schools. With the addition of Beulah moving to Class A, this would provide 9 Class A schools for each region. There is also the future potential of Fargo and West Fargo each opening a new high school as well as Central Cass growing to the point where they may surpass the 325 enrollment, causing them to move to Class A. Supt. Dave Smette and Ath. Dir, Jim Roaldson shared the views and feelings of the Jamestown community concerning this possible re-assignment. The Class A Regional Committee supports the realignment moving Jamestown from the East Region to the West Region with these four rationales:

- Jamestown has previously been involved in 3 varsity sports in the West Region.
- Jamestown's JV programs are already participating in sports in the West Region.
- This move would create a balance of regions.
- Jamestown would have a definite regional identity.

Motion by Volesky to move Jamestown from the East Region and the West Region for all activities. Second by Knodle. Roaldson spoke on behalf of Jamestown in response to this action including these four main concerns:

- 1. Addition to the school district budget
- 2. Loss of school time
- Media coverage
- Increase in travel

Motion carried with two dissenting votes.

The Board reviewed the recommendations from the Class B District Chairpersons, advisory committee recommendations and Athletic Review Committee recommendations. By vote of each recommendation, the results are:

c.(APP) BURDEN OF PROOF CLARIFICATION: Burden of proof may be met by attaching photocopies of pertinent pages of a book, magazine or manuscript that prove genre and copyright to the student's script or speech.. Information must include the photocopy of book cover or magazine cover, title of selection author or playwright, copyright date and Publisher, proof of genre (i.e. Jack's Book of Poetry, A Book on One Act Plays, etc.) and at least first page of selection. Coaches should keep copies, but the burden is upon the participant at the time the judge makes inquiry, otherwise rounds would be unduly prolonged. The contest is for the participant! (#3, page 8 and 4C, page 17, 4D, p. 18 4D, P. 19).

d. (APP) COPYRIGHT: All cuttings and/or selections must be copyrighted and an ISBN number or Dewey Decimal number may be shown, but is not required, to prove genre or copyright. References to copyright have been altered: 4C, p. 17, 4D, p. 18, 4C on p. 18,4E, p. 17, 4d, p. 19, 4C, p. 21. Place in each genre, "Students can not author their own selection."

e. (APP) INTERNET SELECTION REQUIREMENTS for interpretation selections as well as bibliography for sources used in original speeches or extemporaneous speaking must include the following: title of selection, author or playwright, name of website, website address, access date, plus an attached printout of the web source such as SimplyScripts.com plus a printout of the actual script which contains web information.

The Board reviewed a request from Tappen High School to move from Region 7 to Region 6 in music, drama and speech. Letters supporting this move were received from both regions. Motion by Briggs to approve. Second by Jungling and carried.

The fall sport regulations were reviewed. Motion by Lockwood to approve these regulations with the changes to reflect the regulations from athletic review as approved earlier in the meeting. Second by Duchscherer and carried.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Finance Committee with the following:

Proposed budget for the 2005-2006 year. It was explained how the change in the way team payments are administered changes the numbers of the budget. Team payments will include \$50,000 which will be taken from the interim fund.

Motion by Briggs to approve the budget as presented. Second by Knodle and carried.

It was reported by the Finance Committee that team payments for Class A Region playin basketball and volleyball teams not advancing to the regional tournament should have team payments that reflect the one day and 15 participants should be counted. Motion by Volesky that play-in basketball and volleyball teams will receive a team payment for one day and play-in basketball teams will not receive profit distribution of the entire tournament. Second by Schaible and carried.

Motion by Voiesky that 7.5 participants shall be used to figure team payments for teams Region Basketball. Second by Coles. It was determined that that qualify for Class A using 7.5 participants would result in very similar payments as in the past since team payments are no longer deducted before figuring profit. It was also discussed understood that Regional Volleyball payments would be based on 15 participants as there is sharing, Motion carried.

It was emphasized the importance of tournament managers being timely with turning in the financial forms from regional and state events, particularly the spring tournaments. This is to allow processing the team payments in a timely manner. Jungling indicated the NDIAAA will also emphasize the importance of completing financial reports.

The Board reviewed the adjustments of the US Bank contract with the changes that were made from the original wording. The changes were:

- Description of Event: existing activities
- Paragraph 3.2
- Post event evaluation adjusted for Exhibit A
- Page 10, Exhibit A Item d
- Page 12 Minimum contents of the post-event evaluation was acceptable if "if available"
- Page 14 Non-athletic events. Distinguished Student awards shall be asterisked or

placed elsewhere as separate from the basic contract.

Page 15 - Made Farmers Union Insurance as an exception

Page 15 - Operating marketing plan was deleted from the contract.

Motion by Sanstead to conditionally approve the contract with the premiere partner of the NDHSAA as adjusted. Second by Lockwood and carried.

It was suggested the trophy award presentation assignment sheet be shared with US Bank as well as the Board. This will help in planning for each tournament awards ceremony.

The technology plan for 2005-06, 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 was reviewed by the Board for approval. Motion by Briggs to approve the report. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reviewed the Sportsmanship Plan. It was shared that each plan called for schools to evaluate the plan following the completion of the year. Knodle shared the concern that came from the Eastern Dakota Principals Association meeting. The major concern is the existence of a sportsmanship banner at state tournaments. It was requested there would be no banner or if the banner continues, each tournament community have a committee rather than each school supplying their own committee. Coles indicated support to continue the program. Jungling shared the feelings of the West Principals in wanting more consistency in determining which schools were to receive the banner. Volesky recommended a committee of Board members study the responses and review the current plan. Knodie (Chair), Lockwood, Schaible, and Volesky volunteered to conduct this study. Their findings and recommendations will be presented at the August or September meeting.

The Executive Secretary reviewed with the Board the possibility of hosting a leadership/sportsmanship summit and asked the Board if this is a concept that the staff should pursue. Sanstead shared there are models of this type of summit currently being held by other organizations and there may be a saturation of activities. Volesky indicated because of the similar activities now in place, addition of another activity state-wide may not be in the member school's best interest. Lockwood told the group that Fargo, West Fargo, Moorhead and Shanley currently have a ropes course and team summit. The Board responded that this would be placed on hold to be considered at a later date.

Staff member Carlsrud informed the Board the NF Wrestling Rules Committee has approved a three-pronged weight management program to be in effect for the 2006-2007 season. The threepronged plan is:

- 1. Hydration
- 2. Body fat
- 3. Controlled decent

#### Response is:

1. A committee indicated a color chart to check dehydration will be used.

- A caliper will check body fat.
- A monitored weight descent plan through the National Wrestling is available on the internet. 



# NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2005 AND 2004

### 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

### A. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

### B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

### C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is computed on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset which range from Three to twenty years. The Association capitalizes all significant equipment and building additions. The Association does not capitalize costs associated with its web site.

### D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash equivalents include time deposits, certificates of deposits and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less.

### E. Financial Statement Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Boards in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted assets and permanently restricted net assets. In addition the Association is required to present a statement of cash flows.

### F. Income Tax Status

The Association is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Association is not a private foundation.

### G. Investments

Under SFAS No. 124, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

### H. Designation of Unrestricted Assets

It is the policy of the Board of Directors of the Association to review its plans for future property improvements and acquisitions from time to time and to designate appropriate sums of unrestricted net assets to assure adequate financing of such improvements and acquisitions.

### 2. INVESTMENTS

Investments are presented in the financial statements in the aggregate at fair market value (amortized, in the case of bonds). For investments other than certificates of deposit, fair market value was determined by references to the brokers statements.

### 5. PENSION PLANS

Three professional employees participate in the North Dakota Teachers Fund for Retirement (TFFR). Once these employees terminate their employment at the Association no other employees will be allowed to participate in TFFR. One professional and all clerical employees participate in a tax deferred annuity program. Employer contributes 16.8% of the employee's salary as determined according to TFFR. Total expense for the Association for the year ended June 30. 2005 and 2004 was \$67 711 and \$63 880 respectively.

### 6. ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES

As required by FASB No. 117, the following is a breakdown of expenses by function:

### 7. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Association is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets; errors or omissions; injuries to employees; or natural disasters. The Association participates in the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund (NDIRF), a public entity risk pool for its general property and casualty and other miscellaneous insurance coverages. The NDIRF operates as common risk management and insurance program for North Dakota cities and schools. The Association pays an annual assessment to the NDIRF for its general insurance coverage. The NDIRF agreement provides that the Trust will be self-sustaining through member assessments and will re-insure through commercial companies for claims in excess of certain limits for each insured event.

The Association also carries commercial insurance for certain other risks of loss including employee health insurance. Settled claims resulting from these risks have not exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three years.
