North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors Special Meeting July 14, 2005

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of directors was called to order at 9:00 a.m. on July 14, 2005. President Lockwood called the meeting to order. Members present were; Lockwood, Duchscherer, Sanstead, Jungling, Jordan and Knodle. Kevin Harmon, Superintendent of Bishop Ryan High School was also present.

Bishop Ryan High School requested the dissolution of a cross country cooperative agreement with Minot High School effective 2005-06. The Executive Secretary read a letter from Supt. Harmon. Supt. Harmon then spoke to the Board indicating one student competed in the coop last year (2004-05) and 30 have signed up for cross country this fall if it is held at Ryan. It is the goal of Bishop Ryan to have 100% of their students involved in extra-curricular activities. The Executive Secretary indicated he had discussed this issue with the Administration of Minot High School and the concern expressed was the timing of the request. It was their belief that this should occur a year in advance so students have time to adjust. Motion by Duchscherer to approve the dissolution. Second by Sanstead and carried unanimously.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors August 11, 2005

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association held their meeting on August 11, 2005 in Valley City. President Lockwood called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all members present.

President Lockwood welcomed everyone back and welcomed the new Board members, Mickey Jordan and Royal Lyson.

Following additions, motion by Schaible to approve the agenda. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board was supplied with minutes of the June 21, 2005 regular meeting and the July 14, 2005 special meeting. Motion by Briggs to approve. Second by Volesky and carried.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the financial report that was previously made available to the Board for review. Motion by Volesky to approve the financial statements. Second by Duchscherer and carried.

The Board reviewed the request to dissolve cooperative sponsorship programs:

- a. Hebron and Glen Ullin in cross country
- b. Pingree-Buchanan and Carrington in wrestling. Pingree-Buchanan has not had any athletes involved in this program.

Moton by Briggs to approve the dissolution of these two cooperative sponsorship programs. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Applications for cooperative sponsorship were received:

a. Finley-Sharon and Griggs Country Central in football, cross country, golf and track for the 2006-2007 year. The Board reviewed the accompanying correspondence from Finley-Sharon with rationale and request for future coop consideration with another school.

Motion by Briggs to table this decision until further input from all schools involved. Second by Jordan and carried. b. Bismarck and Shiloh Christian for boys' soccer and boys' tennis for 2005-2006 year was reviewed.

Motion by Knodle to approve the application. Second by Volesky and carried.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board there are several cooperative sponsorship applications that are to be considered in the near future, possibly via conference call. Each coop application, upon completion, is posted on the NDHSAA web site for a minimum of two weeks prior to any Board action.

The Board was supplied with the updates for the Policy Manual and the Constitution & By-Laws.

The Board held audience with Supt. Bill Dietz and School Board President Stanley Hepper of Selfridge and Supt. Al Bjornson and School Board President Robert Full Bear of Solen. Selfridge Board President Hepper addressed

the Board concerning their request to be dissolved from their coop with Solen. Supt. Bjornson spoke on behalf of Solen who wished to not dissolve the coop. Cited were problems such as scheduling that would be created by the dissolution. Solen Board President Full Bear shared additional points of information. President Lockwood reviewed the portion of the Constitution & By-Laws wording on cooperative sponsorship dissolutions indicating within the first three years of an agreement it cannot be dissolved without agreement of all parties involved. Because of the rules as stated in the Constitution & By-Laws, motion by Carlson to deny the request to dissolve. Second by Briggs and carried.

Briggs shared with the Board a point of clarification of the motion at the previous meeting to change the mileage payment to the state rate but not to change any other per diem payment. Motion by Briggs to clarify the action from the previous Board meeting was to raise the mileage payment to \$.375 per mile and to leave all other per diem payments as were previously set (\$7/\$9/\$12). Second by Schaible and carried.

The Board held audience with Supi. Joei Braaten of Leeds in response to a Class B Redistricting Committee's proposal to move Leeds/Minnewaukan from District 7 to District 8. Carlson spoke on behalf of the committee's proposal and how they reached this recommendation. Supt. Braaten spoke to the Board with a request in the form of a proposal to leave their district assignment to District 7 as it is currently. Volesky indicated the changing and reorganizing of schools indicates an annual need for this type of review with possible changing of district assignments. The Executive Secretary reminded the Board that the recommendations from the Class B Re-Districting Committee were brought forth for input from the membership. All of this input will be reviewed by the committee for final proposals at the September Board meeting.

The Board reviewed a request from Bisbee-Egeland for an additional year of eligibility. Motion by Jordan to deny the request for the additional year of eligibility. Second by Volesky. It was clarified this request did not fall under the intent of the rule. Following further discussion, motion to deny carried.

A communiqué from Jamestown High School requesting the Board to move the September 27th meeting from Valley City to Jamestown to allow them the opportunity to have an audience with the Board. The purpose of this audience would be to appeal the decision to place Jamestown in the West Region for all activities. No action was taken.

NDHSAA auditor, Harold Rotunda presented the 2004-2005 annual audit report. Mr. Rotunda emphasized the wisdom of the change in policy of team payment and how it insures the financial security of the association of member schools. Motion by Volesky to approve the report. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Schaible reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee with the following:

a. Approved the constitutional ballot that will be sent out to member schools.

b. Proposed to the Board amendments Article XIV, Section X, part b on page 30 (Hardship rule) and Part two, Article XIV, Section XI on page 33 of the By-Laws that will be presented to the member schools for vote at the October General Assembly meeting. The Board was asked to approve the presentation of these amendments pending final approval of the wording by NDHSAA attorney, Gary Thune.

Motion by Schaible to propose these amendments to the member schools as reviewed by attorney Thune. Second by Carlson and carried.

- c. The changes in the foreign exchange/international student regulations were reviewed. This will be reviewed by NDHSAA attorney Thune for suggested wording clarifications. The committee will bring this back to the September meeting for the Board to review these suggestions.
- d. The committee was charged with reviewing the 90 day sit-out rule. There have been questions as to if this rule should be changed and, if so, how to change it. Suggestions such as change to contest sit-out, ineligibility for 180 days, etc. The committee is requesting input from the members of the Board for further consideration. Volesky indicated there are certain activities that may be more affected than others because of the placement of the season during the school year. Briggs indicated that if we are looking at equity, perhaps we should look at sit-out that would effect all sport seasons.

Volesky reported on the Finance Committee on the following:

- a. The bookkeeper position will be vacated as of December 31, 2005. The committee discussed how this position will be replaced with a target date of the first part of December. The Finance Committee requested a spreadsheet showing all secretary salaries. Committee recommends that the new secretary/bookkeeper hired shall be paid on an hourly rate with the two remaining secretary/assistants being switched to an hourly rate at the end of the current fiscal year. Committee members will recommend an hourly starting wage at the September meeting.
- b. Class A state music contests are split into three sites in the west and two in the east. Recommended: Average the miles driven for the east region/state and west region/state contests to find the average mileage for each school in their respective region. Use the mileage average to determine revenue sharing points. Schools will be paid for a cumulative total of no more than 50 students for all of the region/state contests for the year.

Motion by Volesky to use the average mileage rate for each of the region contests in the east and west. This cumulative mileage will be applied to the formula. Second by Briggs and carried.

c. The Executive Secretary met with the supporting sponsor, Farmers Union Insurance concerning the signage in the bowl area. At present, Farmers Union Insurance has an existing contract with all but one of the state tournament facilities and the request to not have their signs in the arena area would only apply to those facilities in

which they do not have a pre-existing agreement. FU Insurance is much appreciative of their involvement in the NDHSAA. Hence, they have proposed a three-year contract as supporting sponsorship agreeing to pay \$27,000 for 2005-2006 year, \$30,000 in 2006-2007 year and \$33,000 in 2007-2008 year. Motion by Briggs to approve the three-year contract. Second by Jordan and carried.

The Board discussed the formation of nominating committees for the purpose of replacing the outgoing positions of Class B Northeast and Class A East. The Class B East administrator group will be notified to select two names to be placed on the ballot. These names will be announced at the October meeting and ballot sent out in December. The Class A East chairperson is currently Andy Dahlen of Fargo North. Correspondence on this issue will be sent to him. Volesky indicated the Class A superintendents wish to have a copy of all information that is going out to the Class A principals and athletic administrators to allow them to keep informed as to the workings of the association. Many of the Class A schools do not house their superintendents in the same building as the athletic administrator and that can cause difficulty in communication. Motion by Volesky to add Class A superintendents to the mailing list for information that is sent to the Class A athletic administrators, Second by Knodle and carried,

Motion by Briggs to allow the Class B Northeast administrators serve as the nominating committee and Andy Dahlen to serve as chair of the Class A East nominating committee. Second by Schaible and carried,

The Board submitted their lists for assignments for trophy presentations at region and state events for the upcoming

Carlson reported on a hardship investigation he conducted at Wolford High School. Following a thorough report and discussion, motion by Carlson to approve the request. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Knodle reported on behalf of the Sportsmanship Committee with suggestions for adjustments for the process for determining teams to receive the sportsmanship banner at the state tournament. These adjustments will be shared with the Class A Principals' Association for input. A final report will be brought back to the Board at the September

Additional plans for upcoming board meetings were determined,

Executive Secretary report:

- a. The Board will be dealing with Golden Valley's request for a coop,
- b. The US Bank contract has been finalized and a copy will be sent to any Board member upon request.
- c. Josten's still shot photographer contract has been finalized.
- d. Jamestown is appealing their move to the West Region
- e. Class B Re-Districting Committee will be meeting to review input for final recommendations.
- f. There is a hardship in the Board folder to review for the next Board meeting or a conference call if requested by the school involved.
- q. There are two additional hardship requests that are to be investigated and reviewed.

With no further business, President Lockwood declared the meeting adjourned.

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was held on August 26, 2005. President Lockwood called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all members present.

Dave Bicknese of Golden Valley was present to address any questions in response to their request to dissolve the Golden Valley-Dodge/Halliday cooperative sponsorship in volleyball and to approve a new coop with Golden Valley-Dodge/Halliday and Beulah in volleyball.

Volesky indicated there needs to be a separate action for the dissolution of the previous coop prior to consideration of application for the new coop with Beulah.

Prin, Jim Larson of Thompson joined the Board concerning a transfer of a student from Central Valley to Thompson. Also joining the Board were the parent and student involved in the hardship request. Carlson reported on the investigation concerning this request. Following the report, Knodle asked the mother for more specific information concerning the transfer. Volesky stated there are issues that apply to the hardship rule and issues that do not apply to the hardship transfer rule as written in the Constitution & By-Laws. This would be considered a waiver of the transfer rule. Motion by Briggs to approve this interpretation. Second by Jungling and carried unanimously.

Brad Webster, Superintendent of Rolette and the father of the applying student were present for the hardship eligibillity request concerning two students who have transferred from Rugby to Rolette. Carlson reported on behalf of his interview regarding this request. The first report was in regard to a sophomore. Volesky stated the importance of any school from which a student is transferring be informed of any situation which would cause the student to leave their school. 

MINUTES

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors September 27, 2005 - Valley City, ND



Following additions, motion by Schaible to approve the agenda. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the August 11, 2005 regular meeting and the August 19, 22, 26, and September 1, and 9 special meetings. Motion by Sanstead to approve all six sets of minutes. Second by Jordan and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the finance report included in the Board's packet including the balance sheet, updated budget, investment report. A list of checks written for August is available if requested for review. Also, the final report on t-shirt sales with the dollar amount going back to the schools was shared. Motion by Jungling to approve the report. Second by Knodle and carried.

Knodle reported on behalf of the Sportsmanship Committee. Principals Jeff Shatz from Grand Forks Central, Jim Stenehjem from Grand Forks Red River and Gary Clark from West Fargo were present to represent the Class A Principals' Association. The report presented is as follows:

- 1. The Sportsmanship Challenge program will continue in each of our member schools with an emphasis on the 5 components that make up each qualifying Sportsmanship Challenge plan.
- 2. The awarding of the sportsmanship banners at state tournaments will be discontinued.
- 3. Each school participating in a state tournament will designate a liaison to the NDHSAA Staff member in charge of the tournament. This designate will check in with the NDHSAA staff member prior to the start of the tournament and will be responsible for incidents that occur involving their school. A liaison must be present at the following state tournament events:
- a. Football
- b. Giris' Basketball
- c. Boys' Basketball
- d. Wrestling
- e. Volleyball Hockey
- 4. Sportsmanship education will continue to be strongly encouraged in each of our member schools.
- 5, Schools that meet the criteria of the Sportsmanship Challenge program will continue to have their yearly tag sent to their school.

The Executive Secretary called to the attention of those in attendance Article III. Section 5 which read. "....." Extensive discussion followed. Carlson expressed concern over the lack of input sought from the Class B schools. Stenehiem indicated the number of tournaments in which they participate in one year causing a strain on the people that would be asked to serve on the sportsmanship committees for each tournament. Also, there was inconsistency in the judging of sportsmanship at past state tournaments with the different criteria from each school's committee. Schatz referred to the sportsmanship banner as punitive in nature. Clark also spoke to the issue and endorsed the proposal and presented. Motion by Knodle to accept the proposal. Second by Volesky. Motion defeated 5-5,

President Lockwood recommended the committee meet again with input from the Class B schools as well as the Class A superintendents and athletic administrators.

The following cooperative sponsorship dissolutions were considered:

a. Griggs County and Finley-Sharon in cross country, football, boys' and girls' track and boys' and girls' golf for 2006-2007 which was previously tabled.

A delegation including Supt. Wade Faul and Prin. Kirk Harn of Griggs County were present. Letters indicate Griggs County is in favor of the dissolution of all but the football coop. Motion by Volesky to approve the request for dissolution in cross country, track and golf for the 2006-2007 year. Second by Jordan and carried.

The Board next addressed Finley-Sharon's request for dissolution in football. Supt. Faul addressed the board indicating regrets concerning the requests for dissolutions. Requested is to delay the dissolution until the end of the two-year plan. Supt. Dahl spoke to the Board concerning the planning that has culminated with this request. Supt. Art Mitzel addressed the Board encouraging the approval of this dissolution. Ath, Dir, Virgil Babinski of Finley-Sharon shared further information. Motion by Volesky to decline this request for the dissolution of the coop to avoid deviating from the football plan. Second by Jungling. Further discussion followed. Jungling indicated the importance of staying consistent with the 2-year plan as was communicated to all member schools prior to the implementation of the current football plan. A vote was taken. Motion to deny the request was carried unanimously,

b. North Shore/Plaza and Parshall in volleyball and football.





Lewis and Clark School District is a new school district which is made up of Berthold and North Shore/Plaza. The request is clarified that this is for both activities as a package and the two activities stay together in the Board's action. Jungling clarified the football coop would give them an enrollment that makes them larger than other schools in their division. Motion by Volesky to deny the dissolution request of the football and volleyball cooperative sponsorship. Second by Schaible and carried unanimously.

c. Four Winds and Warwick in wrestling

Motion by Sanstead for approval. Second by Lyson and carried.

The following cooperative sponsorship applications were considered:

a. Jamestown and LaMoure in girls' swimming & diving (7-12) for 2005.

Motion by Jungling to approve. Second by Jordan and carried.

b. Valley Middle School GF and Manvel in JH boys' and girls' track, soccer, cross country and football for 2005-2006.

Motion by Jordan to approve. Second by Knodle and carried.

c. Finley-Sharon and Hope-Page in boys' and girls' track, golf, cross country, basketball, volleyball and football. Motion by Lyson to approve all except football. Second by Jordan. Carlson indicated the need to adjust the districts with the approval of this coop. District 2 would be considered. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board held audience with Jamestown with the following requests:

a. To delay the decision to move Jamestown to the west region for a period of one year.

b. The NDHSAA study the demographics of the region assignments

Greg Allen, president of the Jamestown School Board spoke on behalf of the Jamestown delegation. Board member Roy Musland presented a map and future projection of census. Volesky inquired as to whether Jamestown has studied scheduling to alleviate some of the travel concerns. President asked the Board if there was any action in response to the appeal presented by the Jamestown delegation. Discussion continued. Motion by Knodle to reconsider the motion from June that assigned Jamestown to the west region. Second by Sanstead and carried 6-4. Motion by Carlson to allow Jamestown to remain in the east. Second by Duchscherer. Motion and second withdrawn. Motion by Volesky to allow Jamestown to remain in the current (05-06) regional assignments for one additional year (06-07) and have the Class A Region Committee review this with consideration involving all activities Second by Carlson. A roll call vote was taken:

Motion defeated, 5-5.

Pat Feist of Glen Ullin appeared before the Board requesting an exception to the two-year football plan to allow a student from their school to participate in football with a neighboring school without the total enrollment causing them to move up a division. Volesky indicated the parameters that are part of the two-year football plan which would not allow changing the way enrollments affect divisioning. Motion by Jungling to deny the request for a waiver. Second by Volesky and carried.

The Board held audience with Bonnie Overby representing Thompson School District. The purpose of the audience was to ask for reconsideration of the denial of a hardship application for Mrs. Overby's daughter. Speaking on behalf of the Overby family was Jane Johnson, Licensed Social Worker for the North Dakota National Guard who indicated the hardships of being a family of a deployed military person. Also speaking was Mrs. Overby and daughter. Motion by Jordan to deny the appeal for a hardship. Second by Knodle and carried.

The Executive Secretary shared several incidents at tournaments where an athlete has been injured and determined by the sports medicine people they should not continue. A medical person unassociated with the tournament or a parent has intervened and indicated this athlete can continue. Proposed: "If a tournament physician/medical staff member determines an injured contestant should not continue, even though unconsciousness is or is not involved, she/he shall not be overruled." It was indicated this needs further study.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board a proposal from Harold Rotunda to complete the annual audit at a agreed rate of \$1,300 per year. Motion by Volesky to approve the Haroid Rotunda proposal. Second by Sanstead

Schaible reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee:

- 1. The committee reviewed the two proposed By-Law changes that were sent to the member schools for vote at the General Assembly October meeting.
- 2. The wording on Article VI Due Process Procedure (page 10) with the recommendations for the following contine gent upon the approval of the amendments in (a)
- a. Remove "of decisions in "hardship" request made pursuant to Section X, Paragraph b of the By-Laws
- b. Replace with "made pursuant to Article XIV, Sect. 1b "Hardship" or Sect. XI, 8 semester rule" of the By-Laws. Motion by Schaible to approve this recommendation contingent on the approval of the by-law. Second by Carlson and carried.
- 3. Recommend adding to the Foreign Exchange Student regulations to read: "Once a foreign exchange student is

no longer participating in an approved CSIET program, as defined above, that student will be subject to the eligibility rules for "Other International Students", as provided below.

Motion by Sanstead to add #5 to the foreign exchange regulations. Second by Lyson and carried. Motion by Schaible to approve the regulations for Foreign Exchange/ International Students policy as presented. Second by Jordan and carried.

4. Under interpretations to Sec. X (page 30), add 3(c) "Foreign Exchange Student who is participating in approved and licensed CSIET program

Motion by Schaible to approve this addition. Second by Sanstead and carried.

- 5. Because of inconsistencies in the graduation requirement of foreign exchange students in comparison to a student from North Dakota, there is a need for study and possible amendment to clarify this situation. Suggested from NDHSAA attorney Thune is to propose such amendment. Further study will be done.
- 6. The committee discussed the fact there is only one place in the Constitution & By-Laws that addresses recruitment. The committee has determined the need for definition and by-law that addresses recruitment.
- 7. The Committee discussed the transfer rule and what the actual term of ineligibility should be.

Jungling reported on behalf of the Football Committee:

- 1. Discussed the schools that are possibly starting a football program as well as those that are potentially dropping their program.
- 2. Discussed proposed changes to football parameters for the 2007 and 2008 football seasons as they are on the 2005 and 2006 plan.
- a. #2 Stay with 4 divisions of football because of the results of the survey of member schools. The results were 30 in favor of 3 divisions and 60 in favor of 4 divisions.
- b. #5 Count grades 9-11 male enrollments as provided by the DPI 2005 fall enrollment report. This will give a realistic indicator for the size of schools.
- c. #6 Continue this part with a deadline added for this petition of January 15, 2006.
- d. #7 If a coop is approved, realignment in any of the top 3 divisions may be allowed with consideration given to geographic location of schools involved in the change.

e. #7a The Committee is considering taking out "the second year of the plan"

Planned is to present the plan to the General Assembly at the October, 2006 meeting and set the deadline for coop applications as November Dakota Bowl. Discussion will continue on these proposals.

Carlson reported on behalf of the Officials' Committee:

- 1. Because of the increase in the number of mats at the State Wrestling tournament, it was recommended that two of the six officials that were to sit out this year should have an extension of one year.
- Motion by Carlson to approve this adjustment in the wrestling officials sit-out. Second by Knodle and carried.
- 2. Recommended rules clinician's fees be increased to \$60 and workshop supervisor's fees to \$40. Motion by Sanstead to approve the recommendation effective with the 2005-2006 year. Second by Jordan and
- 3. The committee recommends the elimination of day camps and to reinstate the workshops and day camps as a requirement for regional and state officials.
- a. NDHSAA approved workshops as mandatory for every official each year.
- b. Region and state officials must attend an NDHSAA approved camp once every three years in lieu of the workshop for the year in which they attend the camp.

Motion by Carlson to approve. Second by Jordan and carried.

Motion by Carlson to approve a recognized standard uniform top for swimming and volleyball officials, suggested for the 2006-2007 year and mandatory for the 2007-2008 year. Second by Knodle and carried.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Finance Committee:

- 1. Alida Posein has submitted a letter of resignation effective December 31, 2005.
- Motion by Volesky to accept this letter of resignation. Second by Duchscherer and carried.
- 2. The replacement process was discussed.

Motion by Volesky to advertise this position with a salary range of \$10 to \$12 per hour dependent upon prior experience and bookkeeper skills. Second by Duchscherer and carried.

Carlson reported on behalf of the Class B Redistricting Committee:

- 1. Beulah will be moving to Class B for the 2006-2007 year. The committee proposed placing them in District 14 for all activities.
- Motion by Jordan to place Beulah in District 14. Second by Schaible and carried.
- South Heart/Belfield from 14 to 13 in girls basketball and volleyball, South Heart from 14 to 13 in boys' basketball, and Belfield from District 14 to District 13 in bovs' basketball.

Motion by Lyson to approve. Second by Duchscherer and carried.

- 3. Hope Page and Finley-Sharon vb. gbb bbb may possibly be assigned to District 2 because of the new coop. This information will go out to the district schools for input
- No action was taken involving District 7.

Sanstead reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee with the following report:

1. Amendment #1 - Amend Part II, Article V, Section I: OFFICERS AND DUTIES by replacing the 3rd sentence with the following: "Three Board members shall be chosen from Class A schools, one each from two geographical areas and one at-large". The result of the vote was Yes - 149, No - 14.

2. Amendment #2 Part II, Article V, Section IV: Powers & Duties of the Board by adding a new paragraph (n) to read as follows: "It shall have the authority to adopt policies and regulations in furtherance of the exercise and implementation of its powers and duties as set forth in this Section". The result of the vote was Yes - 153, No - 10. It was noted two unsigned ballots were not counted by the committee.

The Executive Secretary reported on the girls' hockey survey. The majority of the girls' hockey schools want the state tournament in Grand Forks on the same weekend as the boys' state hockey tournament. President Lockwood assigned this to the Combined Tournament Committee for study. The Board discussed the history on how girls' hockey was sanctioned and the assigning of the state tournament site.

The Board read a letter from LaMoure requesting a waiver of the "All Star" rule for a senior athlete to attend the US Army All-American Bowl for football. The Executive Secretary reviewed with the Board the Constitution & By-Laws portion that addresses this type of situation. Motion by Lyson to allow him to attend this event if selected. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board on the Dakota Bowl schedule which is scheduled for November 11 and 12. Because NDSU has a home game scheduled on November 12, the FargoDome has indicated they prefer 3 games on Friday and 1 game on Saturday provided the Friday night game is Division AAA which was not approved. Recommended schedule is Friday 11:00 a.m. - 9-man; 2:00 p.m. - Division A; and 6:30 p.m. - Division AA. On Noon on Saturday, Division AAA. Motion by Volesky to approve the schedule as presented. Second by Schaible and carried.

Football ticket prices were discussed for the 2005 Dakota Bowl. Motion by Lyson to charge \$9 for adults and \$4 for students for Friday and \$7 for adults and \$4 for students for Saturday. Second by Jungling and carried with one dissenting vote. It was noted there will also be the venue charge added to the ticket.

Staff member Solberg reported to the Board funds were made available from the US Tennis Association to hire USTA registered officials for the State Boys' Tennis Tournament. The tournament management has been informed this has not been approved by the Board and this officiating schedule has been canceled.

Jungling reported on his attendance of meetings of the National Federation Board as well as Section 5 and Section 8 meetings as a member of the National Federation Board of Directors. His first official meeting will be in October.

President Lockwood addressed the Board concerning the Lifetime pass criteria. Requested is consider Letter "M' with point system in relation to the number of days state tournaments are held. The Executive Secretary will review and report to the Board.

President Lockwood indicated the Metro Tournament Committee has any number of persons that are tournament managers at a given tournament. Gary Mailloux has been one of those managers that would be worthy of consideration for this award.


The Executive Secretary gave a report:

North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** October 19, 2005, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities met on October 19, 2005 at the Ramkota Inn in Bismarck, North Dakota. President Lockwood called to order at 9:45 with all members present.

Following additions, motion by Sanstead to approve the agenda. Second by Volesky and carried.

The copy of the minutes from the September 27, 2005 meeting was previously provided to the Board in their packet. Motion by Jordan to approve the minutes. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report. The balance sheet, YTD budget, savings and investment reports were available for review. The list of checks written is available to the Board for review upon request. Motion by Volesky to approve the report. Second by Briggs and carried.

The following cooperative sponsorship program dissolutions were reviewed:

a. Velva and Sawyer in football, volleyball, wrestling, baseball and track (boys' and girls') effective the end of each of the current 2005-2006 seasons in each activity.

Motion by Schaible to approve the request for dissolution of the coops in all activities as requested. Second by Lyson and carried.

b. Rock Lake and Bisbee - Egeland in boys' and girls' basketball (2006-2007). Motion by Volesky to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried,

c. Finley-Sharon and Griggs County Central in football (2007-2008) Motion by Briggs to approve. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Board reviewed a request to approve a cooperative sponsorship program for Enderlin and Maple Valley in football (2006-2007). Motion by Carlson to approve the request which would move their program to Division A 11-man and Milhor to the 9-man division for the 2006-2007 year. Second by Lyson. Discussion followed. A voice vote was taken with the motion being approved with one dissenting vote.

Staff member Carlsrud shared with the Board a situation at the Girls' State Hockey tournament in which a player was injured and the on-site medical staff indicated this student should not continue play. However, this student was allowed to play the following day without approval by the on-site medical staff. The National Federation Wrestling Rule Book has a statement in which the on-site medical staff can rule an athlete cannot continue in competition and no other individual(s) can reverse this decision. A statement similar to the one found in the wrestling rule book was reviewed. Duchscherer asked if there would be information from other state associations that would be helpful in determining what to do with this proposed policy. Motion by Lyson to table until the next Board meeting to give the Executive Secretary time to check with the medical people as to their opinion on this type of statement. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Knodle reported on behalf of the Sportsmanship Committee with the following recommendation:

a. The Sportsmanship Challenge Program is in place for all member schools. Sportsmanship banners will be given to qualifying Class B programs in bracketed state tournaments.

b. The guidelines for selection of Class B sportsmanship banners shall be established by the Sportsmanship Committee in concert with the NDHSAA office staff and forwarded to the Class B teams involved in bracketed state

Schaible stated this would be evaluated after one year as schools will let the Board know their response to the proposed change. Motion by Knodle to approve the recommendation as presented with the NDHSAA providing a list of policies that will affect the awarding of the sportsmanship banner. Second by Volesky and carried.

The topic of football sportsmanship banners was discussed. Motion by Knodle to eliminate all but the Dakota Bowl finals for the sportsmanship banner for football. Second by Lyson and carried.

Jungling reported on behalf of the Football Committee discussion on parameters as they apply to the football plan. The main discussion was concerning the number of divisions. The football schools will be sent a survey to find out what the feeling is about the divisioning. This report will be prepared for the Board at the November meeting in Minot. This survey will be signed by the Supt, AD and Coach. In using the October, 2005 enrollment (9-11) report, the committee will be putting together the plan for the 2007 & 2008 football seasons. The committee is looking at changing the deadline of Sept. 15th for cooperative sponsorship applications. Approval or denial of these applications will take place prior to October 1st at which time there will be a conference call to determine divisioning. This will be ready to send to member schools in time to be voted upon at the October, 2006 General Assembly meeting, Discussion took place as to why the numbers in the junior high was not used for the projected football divisions. It was clarified the junior high numbers are not accurate because it cannot be determined to what high school they will

























attend. Motion by Jungling to authorize the staff to conduct a survey to all football schools concerning divisions of football. Second by Briggs and carried.

Motion by Jungling to have the Constitution & By-Laws Committee work on wording for an amendment to change the deadline of football cooperative sponsorship applications from the end of the season to September 15th. Second by Jordan and carried.

Carlson reported on behalf of the Class B Re-Districting Committee:

Motion by Carlson to approve. Second by Duchscherer and carried.

b. With Sawyer dissolving their coop with Velva, they will be placed in District 11 for volleyball. Motion by Carlson to approve. Second by Briggs and carried.

Schalble reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee:

a. The committee worked on the wording to define recruitment. A first draft was shared with the Board for comments. This will be given to NDHSAA attorney, Thune for study. Board action will be taken at a later date.

b. The subject of foreign exchange students who have graduated in their country and still eligible through a C.S.I.E.T. program in a member school was discussed. (A student shall also not be eligible to compete after having earned credits sufficient to meet graduation requirements unless said credits have been earned in less than eight semesters of school attendance)"

90 school days.

The Board reviewed the proposal from Miller Motor for a 2006 Grand Caravan SXT. Motion by Briggs to approve the purchase of the proposed van for \$10,518. Second by Jordan and carried.

The Board reviewed the agenda for the General Assembly.

The Executive Secretary gave his report:

a. The Region assignment for Beulah is Region 8 for track. Wrestling and golf will be studied and assignments will be made as per participation.

The next meeting will be November 18 in Minot. The District Chair-meeting will be in the a.m. and the Board meeting will follow. Carlson was assigned to chair the November District Chair meeting and Lyson will chair the District Chair meeting in March.

Class B District Chairperson's Meeting 9:00 A.M. - November 18, 2005 Holiday Inn Riverside, Minot, ND (Items advanced to NDHSAA Board listed following minutes)

The Class B District Chairpersons met at 9:00 a.m. on November 18, 2005 at the Minot Holiday Inn Riverside. Chairman Carlson called the meeting to order with all districts present. Chairman Carlson welcomed the district chairmen and thanked them for bringing the recommendations from their respective districts.

Following each district chairperson, guests and staff introducing themselves, the Executive Secretary thanked the representatives for their contributions. He indicated he will be passing out information sheets to be completed by each district for 2006 district volleyball chairperson, 2006 district volleyball site and manager, and 2006 regional volleyball site recommendations. He also expressed gratitude to the district chairpersons for their time and work in preparation for this meeting.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the process for recommendations from the district chairpersons. These recommendations are voted on by the members of their respective districts, and then must be voted on as a district chair group. The group was thanked for their involvement in this process.

District 1-----Rick Jacobson, Wyndmere HS

1. Football—something needs to be done. Either go three classes or stay with four but have two nine-man divisions. Geographic location should be considered when classifying.

Football Committee Chairman, Jungling gave a report from their meeting held earlier. The results of the most recent football survey were shared with those present. The committee discussion resulted in these four thoughts: (1) Set up a plan to provide the best opportunity (2) Ask the question, is it more important for schools to play the same size schools or more important to play schools geographically closer (3) Should there be a guaranteed schedule (4) Should the business side of this be considered, such as funding for the schools and how the divisioning is effected. This report will be shared at the Board meeting later in the day. The Executive Secretary followed with further details of the survey. The main concern from schools that wanted three divisions indicated travel as their biggest issue. The next topic expressed was rivalry. Of the schools that wished to continue with 4 divisions, it was the majority that indicated they wished the plan to remain as is. Other suggestions were mentioned. Schools that were indicating a possible cooperative sponsorship application were listed.

2. Shorten all seasons in all sports.

This is an issue with the girls having no time off between seasons where the boys have time off. It was stated there should be something done to avoid the overlap of volleyball and girls' basketball. Herman asked if the thoughts were to reduce the season length only or would there be an indication of reducing the number of contests. Jacobson indicated District 1 is open to any type of suggestions. Ulven indicated District 2 is looking at this issue which is causing individuals to pick activities for participation and reducing the over-all numbers participating. With the legislature looking at the possibility of mandating a later start date for all schools, how will this effect this concern. A vote taken indicated yes - 4, no - 11

3. Do not allow body paint at district, regional and state tourneys.

It was clarified the issue was shirts needs to be required. A vote was taken – yes – 12, no – 3 Herman indicated this should be an issue that is handled by the individual school rather than the tournament management.

4. Let tourney manager and their committee pick which teams receive the sportsmanship banner.

The Executive Secretary explained what the Sportsmanship Committee has done concerning changes in how the sportsmanship banner program is handled during state tournaments.


5. NDHSAA meetings that are scheduled in Aug, around the state should be held over ITV.

The Executive Secretary indicated this has been discussed. He indicated a concern there would be a loss of personal contact. Person, Dist 12 indicated this is a good time for administrators and other staff get together and meet new people. A vote taken indicated yes - 5, no - 9.

District 2-----Wayne Ulven, Richland HS

1. Hold the pre-game conference for both A and B teams at the same time before the JV game. This practice was currently being tried and will continue to do so. After discussion, a vote was taken Yes - 2, No - 12.

2. Supports three divisions for football with middle class set at 40 teams.



- 3. Supports shortening all sports seasons by one week and especially volleyball.
- 4. Supports changing the boys and girls basketball season around.

A vote was requested. Yes - 6, no - 9

District 3-----Dan Hoornaert, Hillsboro HS

1. Concerns about football playoff format

a. Advance the top 3 teams in 9-man. (In a three-way tie, the number 1 team did not advance to play-offs) Herman, Dist 5 has the same recommendation with the thought there is sufficient time to make this adjustment for the 2006 year rather than waiting for the next 2-year cycle. With this recommendation, there could be a Tuesday night play-off. Staff member Carlsrud indicated how superintendents indicated they were concerned about the number of less than competitive games in the first round. Vote - Yes - 10, No - 4

b. With the partner region system, you are possibly playing the same team twice in the same season. Pair odd regions together and even regions together to avoid this. Travel would not be such a significant difference, Morast indicated Dist 13 also is recommending this. It was stated by Quintus, Dist. 14 that in their area, not only would they possibly play the same team twice, but the games would be close together. It is suggested teams play their first round away from the scheduling partner. Herman indicated the Tuesday night game in this recommendation would be requiring more travel on a school night. It should be considered more important to have more kids involved in post season play rather than who they are playing in the first round. Vote Yes -- 6. No - 8

District 4-----Jeff Carpenter, North Border, Pembina

1. Volleyball warm-ups 6-6-6-2, going back to the way it was.

Vatne, Dist. 16 indicated coaches had suggestions as to how this should be changed. Dockter, Dist. 7 stated their district indicated a wish for change. Requested is the standardization of sub-varsity warm-up,

2. Continue libero servina.

This is currently in the first of a three-year experimentation process. A survey will go out to the coaches for information to forward to the National Federation Volleyball rules committee.

District 5-----Matt Herman, Ellendale HS

- 1. Recommend expanding the 9-man football playoffs to 3 teams from each of 8 regions.
- 2. Recommend the NDHSAA board of Director's approve no applications for new football coops nor any requests for dissolutions of existing football coops during the 2-year football plan.
- a. All action on coops involving football shall be determined prior to the start of a 2-year plan and there be no action on coops resulting in geographical changes to regions or adversely affecting 2-year scheduling of games coinciding with the 2-year plan. This has caused problems with scheduling. Vote Yes -6, No -7
- 3. Recommend the continued use of Jamestown as a site for state volleyball tournaments.
- 4. Recommend admission be charged at state fine arts events and contests.

This comes out of anticipation of how the new team payment plan will effect schools with more reimbursement for fine arts activities. Because of this, there should be an effort to collect revenue from these events. A vote was not requested but asked the Board to continue study of this recommendation.

5. Recommend the continued rotation of the Region 3 Volleyball Tournament between Districts 5 and 6 with the 2006 tournament be held in LaMoure.

District 6-----Ken Miller, Steele-Dawson, HS

1. No agenda items at this time that have not been previously discussed.

District 7-----Dennis Dockter, Harvey H\$

- 1. Concern with volleyball official officiating district tournament who had not worked any regular season games.
- 2. Concern with some schools using hometown officials.
- 3. Go back to 6-6-3 volleyball warm-up
- 4. Remind schools to use knowledgeable line judges and remind officials they can overrule a bad call by the line
- Neutral site for Regional Volleyball.

District 8-----Robert Lech, Rolla HS

- 1. Continued use of the libero in serving.
- 2. Leave VB start and end as currently stands.
- Change warm-up to 6-6-6-2,
- 4. Region 4 be placed in Devils Lake
- 5. Dissolve schedule partners for Region 4 football due to travel concerns.



District 9-----Mike Severson, Flasher HS

- 1. Discussion on new warm-up times for VB, 4-4-4-4
- 2. Favor four divisions of FB-two nine-man divisions.

District 10-----Dale Ekstrom, Underwood HS

- 1. A volleyball officiating concern whistling for serve before team was ready.
- 2. Support staying with 25 point system.
- 3. Discussion suggested eliminating the district tournament and advancing two teams to state tournament. Person, Dist. 12 indicated their district likes and wishes to keep their district tournament as it is well attended and enjoyable. Vatne, Dist 16 also indicated they like their district tournament but may need to look at a change in the future. The Executive Secretary indicated there has also been discussion about basketball doing this. Herman indicated the regional tournament may need restructuring with four teams advancing to region which would help eliminate playing on a school night and there would be less scheduling conflicts. No vote was taken.
- 4. Question regarding FB, 3 or 4 divisions was discussed.
- 5. There was discussion of mandating home and away scheduling of district teams to eliminate two-point games. Carpenter, Dist 4 stated this is up to the individual districts.

District 11----Steve Heim, Anamoose

1. No agenda items at this time

District 12----Peggy Person, Berthold HS

- Libero continue to serve in VB.
- 2. Change pre-game for VB so the participants shake hands only one time prior to the match. This will be taken to the coaches meeting for discussion.
- 3. Change back to old VB warm-up (6-6-6-2)
- 4. Unlimited VB substitutions.

It was clarified this could be proposed to the National Federation as this is a rule. Vatne, Dist. 16 also indicated they prefer this recommendation. The vote to propose was Yes - 12, No - 3

District 13-----Kevin Morast, Hettinger HS

- 1. The number of teams in District 13 is getting less. (Grant County in District 13) Home/Away schedules were previously discussed.
- 2. Nine-man football playoff format.
- Home / Away schedules.
- a. If forced to have a home/away schedule, the top team in district should have an automatic berth to the regional

District 14-----Gerald Quintus, Richardton-Taylor HS

- 1. Set districts and leave them (no changing back and forth)
- Home-Home scheduling should not be dictated.
- 3. Warm-ups for sub varsity volleyball should be standard (5-5-2)
- Volleyball libero rules (serving)
- 5. 9-man football scheduling partners (playing teams twice within weeks)

District 15----Tracy Peterson, Williston Trinity Christian HS

- 1. Supports shortening volleyball season to follow example set by Montana schedule.
- 2. Supports switching basketball seasons
- a. Boys start before girls to allow a break between volleyball and basketball
- b. The District felt this would not change the attendance at either tournament.
- 3. Supports starting volleyball same date as football so that volleyball tournament would end the same time as football finals.

District 16----Marlyn Vatne, Wildrose HS

- 1. NDHSAA be responsible for having a committee at the tournament to select who receives the tournament sports-
- 2. Move the regional VB tournament to Friday, Monday, and Tuesday to avoid the Saturday conflicts with music and
- Lech, Dist. 8 asked if it would make more sense to play the football game on Friday night because the region volleyball involves more teams. Person indicated it may be a better choice for all concerned to move football playoffs

to Friday night. Vote, Yes - 8, No - 7

3. Re-visit the VB warm-up schedule for regional and state.

The recommendations passed to advance to the Board are:

- 1. Do not allow body paint at district, regional and state tourneys. It was clarified the issue was shirts needs to be required. A vote was taken - yes - 12, no - 3
- 2. Advance the top 3 teams in 9-man. Vote Yes 10, No 4
- 3. Unlimited VB substitutions. Vote Yes 12, No 3

With no further business, Chairman Carlson thanked everyone for their input.

The Executive Secretary reported:

The Combined Tournament Committee will be meeting on December 7. One of the issues the tournament managers will bring up is tournament programs. The group was requested to go back to their schools and encourage them to get their pictures and rosters on the website. Options are being considered as to how the problem getting information and pictures. Discussion was held as to how this can be accomplished. It was concluded there needs to be a common template or system to facilitate this process.

Chairman Carlson declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** November 18, 2005 - Minot, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on November 18, 2005 at the Minot Holiday Inn. President Lockwood called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Sanstead.

Following several additions, motion by Briggs to approve the agenda. Second by Schaible and carried.

A copy of the minutes from the October 19, 2005 meeting was provided to the Board in their packets. Motion by Jordan to approve as written. Second by Knodle and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report. The Balance sheet, savings and investment reports were reviewed. Lockwood gave a financial report on the Dakota Bowl. Because of the schedule which was mandated by outside interests, there were additional costs that must be factored into the report. The Executive Secretary indicated the television contract amount has usually been put into the finance report with a distribution as determined by the association. This will now be listed as a separate item. Motion by Briggs to approve the report. Second by Volesky and carried.

The Board reviewed requests for dissolutions for cooperative sponsorship programs.

- a. Fargo Shanley and Fargo North in gymnastics, effective immediately.
- Motion by Volesky to approve the dissolution. Second by Jungling and carried.
- b. Wing and Steele-Dawson in volleyball for 2006-2007. Along with this dissolution, the Board reviewed the request from Wing and Wilton for volleyball, 7-12,

Motion by Jordan to approve the request for dissolution of the Wing and Steele-Dawson coop program in volleyball for 2006-2007 and approve the request for the coop application for Wilton and Wing in volleyball for 2006-2007. Second by Carlson and carried.

The following cooperative Sponsorship applications were reviewed:

- a. Lisbon, North Sargent and Milnor in boys' and girls' cross country for 2006.
- Motion by Briggs to approve. Second by Knodle and carried.
- b. Bowbells and Burke Central in one-act play and speech for 2005-2006.
- Motion by Carlson to approve both applications. Second by Schaible and carried.
- c. Finley-Sharon and Hope-Page in football for 2007-2008. Motion by Knodle to approve. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board the information that was requested from other state associations concerning their policy on sports medicine authority at a competition site. Jungling indicated there was a presentation at the National Federation Board meeting from a member of the Sports Medicine Committee. He indicated it would be favorable to have a form that would prove a parent or guardian has signed a statement that an injured student is allowed to continue. Lockwood stated as a tournament manager, it would be desirable to have a docu-



ment that indicates transfer of care. Duchscherer stated it would not be reasonable to put rural communities in a position where they must have medical personnel at every event. Volesky indicated there are many regular season contests that do not have a trainer on site. A policy would cause additional expense at events where it is not feasible to have someone on site. Lyson asked if wording such as in the event there is an injury and there is not medical personnel present, whoever has the highest level of medical expertise would have the authority to determine whether a student may continue in competition. Schaible suggested a form with signatures would be helpful in this type of situation. Motion by Lyson to form a committee of athletic trainers, two board members, one or two physicians and staff to review these issues and to report back at the March meeting. Second by Briggs and carried. Suggested Board members are Lyson and Knodle.

The Board held audience with Brett Stockert, Director of Player Development for the North Dakota Amateur Hockey Association with a request for consideration to allow contact between high school coaches and their players out of season. Rather than the June and July exception that is presently in place, the request is for March through May to allow contact. This would be to allow a selection process for athletes to attend a developmental program. Jungling asked if this could be done during the high school season. Volesky indicated allowing this would open the door for many other sports to approach the Board with the same request. Lockwood stated if this request is to replace the June and July exception, it would eliminate many hockey camps that are currently being run during the summer. Volesky stated past discussions indicate the rule should remain in place and any action to change would make the rule vulnerable in relation to other sports. Knodle shared the concern of students being forced to make choices rather than feeling free to participate in multiple sports. No action was taken by the Board.

The Board held audience with Rick Westra, NDHSAA official photographer. The program has been successful and orders are starting to come in. Westra thanked the Board for the opportunity to make this program a success. There was a concern voiced by the Board that other photographers who are unauthorized to sell photos are using NDHSAA tournaments for their own gain. The Board thanked Mr. Westra for his efforts.

Briggs reported on his investigation on a hardship eligibility application for a student who transferred from Dunseith to Belcourt to attend Turtle Mountain Community High School. The parents of this student were in attendance at the meeting. Volesky shared the Board operates by a set of guidelines as listed in the Constitution & By-Laws that does not fit this particular situation. Based on this, motion by Volesky to deny the request. Second by Jordan. After extensive discussion, motion passed.

Jungling reported on behalf of the Football Committee with the following items:

a. Regional assignments were discussed for Shiloh Christian. The committee recommends moving Sargent Central from Region 1 to Region 2. Shiloh would replace Sargent Central in Region 1. Sargent Central has communicated with the NDHSAA they would be agreeable with this move.

Motion by Jungling to approve this recommendation. Second by Volesky and carried.

b. The committee was informed concerning the New England football program. They have indicated they will be meeting with Mott-Regent and Dickinson Trinity to study their situation. If New England drops football, it is the committee's recommendation to allow Williston Trinity Christian to be assigned to Region 7.

Motion by Jungling to approve this recommendation. Second by Lyson and carried.

- c. The committee shared the discussion they held concerning the football divisional survey with the following observations:
- Survey results were 48 in favor of 4 divisions and 44 in favor of 3 divisions.
- Recommendation from the committee is approval of 4 divisions of football, as per survey results.
- · The committee questioned what is best for football in North Dakota. How can prioritization of a system that would give the most schools the opportunity to advance for playoffs, playing schools their own size, playing schools that are closer, guaranteed schedule, and/or financial gains be obtained. Travel will always be a concern. It was noted 17 schools did not return this survey. Volesky indicated no matter how slim the majority appears on the survey, it would be wise to follow it. Duchscherer stated surveys are not necessarily a vote but an opportunity for the Board to feel the pulse of the football schools. If staying with 4 divisions, Duchscherer expressed a concern

as to how many schools will be remaining in the 9-man and A divisions. d. The Football Committee discussed the timeline for the Football Plan and recommend it remains the same,

contingent upon the proposed By-Law change.

- e. The parameters were again reviewed and recommended is to remain as is, contingent upon By-Law change.
- f. Communications from Region 3 9-Man and A divisions were presented to the committee for review.
- g. Discussion was held on information relative to possible cooperative sponsorship programs that may be formed in the future.

Motion by Jungling to continue with the four-division football system as is currently in place. Second by Briggs. Schaible asked if the divisions would remain the same. Carlson indicated everything he hears is the opinion to go to three divisions. The motion carried with two dissenting votes.

Briggs reported on a hardship investigation that was conducted concerning a student who has transferred from Carrington to Fessenden. Supt. Oischlager of Fessenden was in attendance to answer any questions concerning this request for eligibility. Motion by Jordan to deny the request. Second by Jungling and carried.

Carlson reported on a hardship eligibility investigation concerning a student who has transferred from Cannon Bali

district to Four Winds. Motion by Jordan to deny the request. Second by Briggs. It was mentioned the two schools involved were not in agreement with the eligibility and it does not meet the criteria of a hardship. Motion carried.

Schaible reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws committee with the following:

- a. Recommended proposing to the membership an amendment to the Constitution & By-Laws Page 8, Part Two, Section XI, Cooperative Sponsorship, 6. "for all activities except football. Football cooperative applications must be received in completion by September 15th of the preceding year to be considered by the Board of Directors. Note: No late-fee extensions will be granted to football coops". Motion by Schaible to approve the submission of this amendment. Second by Carlson and carried.
- b. The committee reviewed page 9, letter e concerning undue influence. The feeling of the Board is to leave the wording as is until NDHSAA attorney Thune has an opportunity to review and offer any suggestions for possible change in the wording and any other associated action.

By Board consensus, action will move forward on this process.

Carlson reported on the District Chairperson meeting that was held earlier.

Duchscherer reported on behalf of the Media Committee:

A concern was brought forward by a member of the media on the process used to gain access to a tournament site if they do not have a certified media credential. The committee directed the office to form a credential for this particular situation to allow people to show proof they are a member of the media and can gain access to a tournament. The committee felt this request could be honored.

Motion by Duchscherer to approve this request. Second by Knodle and carried,

The Board discussed a question concerning School Practice Sessions as found on page 36 of the Board Regulations & General Information, School Practice Sessions. The question was raised as to whether participation in the State One-Act Play would fall under the exception for practice requirements when an athlete is actively involved in competition held concurrently with such preseason practices. Motion by Briggs to add "athletic" into the paragraph to clarify this is in reference to athletic participation. Second by Volesky and carried.

Jungling reported on behalf of the National Federation Board of Directors meeting:

- a. NF is working on a policies and procedures manual that could possibly be adopted in some form by the NDIAAA. b. Reports from each section were heard. Many same issues come from each section.
- c. Interested
- The libero player and rally scoring is going well.
- · No injuries have been reported since the pool depth has been changed.
- Study was made about the free-throw positioning and study indicated there would not need to be a change in the rule.

Lockwood shared with the Board a chart outlining tournament manager points in relation to the awarding of the NDHSAA Lifetime pass. The subject of this chart was tournament manager, Gary Mailloux who has been part of the management of 43 region and 39 state tournaments which should be applied to the point system. Shared was the part of the lifetime pass regulations that allows the Board, upon recommendation of the Executive Secretary, may grant such award to other individuals that might not meet the point requirement. The Executive Secretary recommended Gary Mailloux be considered for this award. Motion by Volesky to award a lifetime pass to Gary Mailloux. Second by Jungling and carried. This will be presented at the January General Assembly meeting.

Plans were made for the January meetings,

Briggs shared with the Board his concern about the last part of the document that was received from Ann Finley concerning a Board member. Briggs indicated the negative statements concerning this Board member who was carrying out his assigned duties were completely out of line and unnecessary.

The Executive Secretary reported on his investigation of alleged recruitment violations of Four Winds High School. After a thorough investigation, there was no evidence that was found that could prove recruitment. No further action is recommended.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

- a. Region assignments for Beulah in track, baseball, wrestling and golf will be delayed until information as to what schools will be participating before regional alignments can be made.
- b. Alida Posein's retirement will be December 21 in Valley City. Board members shared intentions of attendance. c. The NDHSAA will be served court papers concerning an ejection penalty that is being challenged by an injunction.

With no further business, President Lockwood declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors Special Meeting** December 5, 2005

A special meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors was called to order by President Lockwood at 9:00 a.m. on December 5, 2005. Members present were: Lockwood, Volesky, Knodle, Jordan, Jungling, Briggs, Schaible, Lyson and Duchscherer. Members absent were: Sanstead and Carlson.

The first order of business was to formally approve coop agreements between Dickinson High School and Hope Christian School for the following junior high activities: football, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls track. volleyball, boys golf, boys and girls cross country and baseball. Volesky moved to approve the coop applications, Briggs second and motion carried (9-0).

The second order of business was to consider a request from Frank Schill, Superintendent of Cavalier High School to allow special education students the option of being eligible at their attendance sites rather than at school of residence. The present Board interpretation allows for a waiver of the 90 school days period of ineligibility for a student placed in another school by Special Education placement causing a change in residence. Special Education students who attend a different school than where they reside are eligible in the school of residence. The Board was interested in declaring this student eligible in Cavalier, but was concerned about making "over the phone" wording changes to the interpretation. Jordan made a motion to allow the 8th grade student from Valley School District immediately eligible in Cavalier High School. It was understood that there would be a 90 school day period of ineligibility in the event the student wished to compete for Valley High School in the future. It was further understood the Constitution & By-Law Committee would work with Gary Thune to develop the proper wording for the interpretation. The motion was second by Lyson and was approved by a vote of (9-0).

Executive Secretary Sylling informed the Board of the recent ruling of a District Judge to vacate the temporary restraining order on behalf of a Mandan student and ruled in favor of Mandan High School and NDHSAA.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The minutes from the November 18, November 28, December 5 and January 19 meetings were provided to the Board in the packets. Motion by Briggs to approve as written. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report. Balance sheet, savings and investment reports were reviewed. The finance statements from the fall activities were reviewed. The Board was reminded the bottom line of these activities will be different from previous reports because there has yet to be any team payments made which will take place at the end of the school year. Motion by Sanstead to approve the report. Second by Lyson

The Board reviewed requests for cooperative sponsorship dissolutions:

- a. TGU and Minot in swimming effective 06-07. Motion by Briggs to approve the dissolution. Second by Sanstead
- b. Selfridge and Solen (Dakota Oyate) in boys' and girls' basketball effective 06-07. Motion by Schaible to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.
- c. Steele-Dawson and Wing/Tuttle-Pettibone in girls' basketball effective 06-07. Motion by Volesky to approve. Second by Knodle and carried. The assignment of the Wing/Tuttle-Pettibone program to a district will be forwarded to the Class B Re-Districting Committee.
- d. Garrison and Hazen in boys' hockey. Motion by Lyson to approve the dissolution. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Cooperative Sponsorship applications were reviewed:

e. Medina and Gackle-Streeter in boys' and girls' track (7-12), 05-06 with late fee assessed because of late application. Motion by Briggs to approve. Second by Lyson and carried.

f. Steele-Dawson and Tappen in music (7-12), 05-06. No late fee is assessed for fine arts applications. Motion by Briggs to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

g. Dickinson Trinity and New England in football (7-12), 06-07, late fee will be assessed because of late application. Motion by Lyson to approve. Second by Duchscherer and carried.

h. LaMoure and Litchville-Marion in baseball, (7-12), 05-06 no late fee is assessed as Litchville-Marion did not have a previous program. Motion by Jordan to approve. Second by Knodle and carried.

The Executive Secretary reported Sharon Prosby has been hired to fill the NDHSAA bookkeeper/secretary opening. Motion by Briggs to approve Sharon Prosby as the new bookkeeper/secretary for the NDHSAA. Second by Sanstead and carried.

President Lockwood reported the Executive Board met to determine a penalty for the Ashley High School allowing an ineligible wrestler to compete. The decision made by the committee was the wrestler was to forfeit any match or matches in which he participated while ineligible. The school was directed to write a letter to the NDHSAA and all schools involved in competition in which the ineligible wrestler was involved, explaining the violation and remedy.

Jungling reported on behalf of the Football Committee and recommended approval of the football guidelines developed by the committee. It is their recommendation to approve the guidelines as were sent to the membership and

A change in the guidelines was to use grades 7-10 to determine the divisioning for the upcoming football plan.

· The committee anticipates further adjustments with the possibility of more schools changing coops and programs being dropped.

Divisions are 16 AAA, 16 AA, 24 A and the remainder 9-man.

Motion by Jungling to accept the guidelines of the Football Committee. Second by Lyson and carried. The time-line will be shared with the membership at the Monday General Assembly.

Lyson indicated the guidelines need to be shared with the schools. The Executive Secretary assured the Board this will be done.

The Board discussed the letter from Graffon concerning a request for a new football survey. This survey would only be sent to the AAA and AA schools. It was mentioned if the survey indicated putting the two divisions together by a simple majority, it would still leave schools that are not in favor of the request. The committee decided this will be shared with the Board for their input. Jordan indicated the Association serves all member schools and should continue to seek survey results from all schools as was done in the previous survey that was sent out. The Football Committee recommended the survey requested not be carried out. Motion by Lyson to deny the request. Second by Jordan and carried. Lyson added this may lead to other divisions requesting surveys. President Lockwood indicated we have already surveyed twice.

Volesky reported on the Combined Tournament Committee meeting which was held December 7, 2005. The following recommendations were to be brought forward to the Board:

a. State Girls' and Boys' Hockey tournament was recommended to be combined in the 2007-2008 year.

Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Schaible and carried.

b. State Wrestling and State Volleyball sites in the 2006-2007 year were recommended to be switched. Minot is unable to host because of the increase in the number of mats needed which would reduce the seating. Because of this, it was felt Minot could no longer be in the wrestling site rotation.

Motion by Briggs to approve pending Minot's acceptance. Second by Knodle and carried.

c. Due to the shortage of gymnastics officials, East region gymnastics must be moved from Saturday, February 18 to the previous Thursday, February 16 to be able to secure officials.

Motion by Jordan to approve. Second by Volesky and carried.

d. To assist tournament managers in securing information for programs, etc., it is recommended all schools must have their team picture (with a cut line), roster and schedule on the NDHSAA website no later than three weeks from the opening date of their individual season. Any school not meeting this deadline will be fined \$50 for the first sport and \$100 for each sport after this.

Motion by Schaible to approve. Second by Briggs and carried.

Schaible reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee:

As recommended by NDHSAA attorney, Gary Thune, the following changes should be approved:

- Question 80 & 81 Delete Question and Answer
- Question 82 Renumber as 80
- Question 83 Renumber as 81 and rewrite as follows:
- · Q: Delete "not"
- A: No. The student has graduated.
- Question 84 Renumber as 82 and rewrite as follows:

· Q: Delete "honestly"

· A: Rewrite: The right to "return" to high school would be determined by local administration. Eligibility would be governed by all eligibility rules including the eight semester rule in Section XI.

- Question 85 Renumber as 83 and rewrite answer:
- Q: (same)
- A: Yes
- Question 86 Delete

Motion by Sanstead to approve these recommendations. Second by Briggs and carried.

After discussion and questions on the upcoming proposed amendment to Part Two, Article XIV, Section VI on page 23 of the July 2005 Constitution & By-Laws, the committee discussed how to add wording to address spring sports that continue after graduation, the committee proposed the following amendment to the amendment:

"NOTICE: A student eligible for and participating in a spring activity prior to graduation shall remain eligible in that activity until the season is completed."

Motion by Schaible to approve the amendment to the proposed amendment to Section VI which will be presented from the floor to the membership at the Annual Assembly. Second by Lyson and carried,

The committee recommended adjusting the wording in item 3a on page 30 which is the interpretation concerning the eligibility of Special Education students when they are placed in another school, but there is no change of residence. The wording recommended by NDHSAA attorney, Gary Thune, is delete "causing a change in residence" and add the following:

"After that placement the student's election to compete in his/her school of special education placement becomes him/her school for eligibility purposes. Any subsequent change not made necessary by a change in parental resident or change in special education placement, makes his/her ineligible 90 school days for varsity competition; Motion by Schaible to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Items concerning recruitment/undue influence and the ejection rules will be discussed with NDHSAA attorney Thune and placed on a future agenda for the Constitution & By-Laws Committee,

Sanstead reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee with the following results from the election for the two seats on the NDHSAA Board of Directors:

Class B Northeast - Jack Maus - 91, John Oistad - 71

Class A East Region - Jeff Schatz - 95, Kathy Cleslak - 58

This report will be presented to the General Assembly for approval.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Finance Committee:

1. Discussed the upcoming retirement plans as they relate to the professional staff.

2. Extended the Executive Secretary's contract for three years with the following adjustments which will reflect 4%. Salary and increases will be:

2008-2009	\$103487	\$3980

Motion by Volesky to approve the recommendation. Second by Briggs and carried. It was noted if there were specific circumstances in which there was a jump in the increase in the cost of living, negotiations may be revisited if both parties agree.

3. Beginning July 1, 2006, the office support staff shall be converted from a salary to an hourly wage. Sharon Prosby, recently hired, is currently receiving \$12.00/hour. Sue Carlsrud and Patty Bass are currently on salary which presently equates to an hourly wage of \$15.53. Time cards, vacation pay accrual, pay for vacation days, and the normal workday schedule were discussed.

Motion by Volesky to approve a 4% increase in support staff salaries effective July 1, 2006, as well as the remainder of these recommendations. Second by Jordan and carried.

4. Discussed the current vacation policy as written vs what has been in practice. Further discussion will be scheduled for a Finance Committee meeting.

The Board reviewed a letter from Supt. Diegel of Edgeley requesting the Board to discuss the penalty assessed against a student who is in violation of the allowable quarters/period rule. Motion by Briggs to table this item and place on a future agenda. Second by Jordan and carried. This topic may be discussed at the next NDIAAA conference as well as the Class A athletic directors

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of the up-coming centennial year. Discussion was held as to the number of different activities that can take place in celebration of this event. President Lockwood assigned this task of planning to the Promotions Committee. If the committee needs to appoint a sub-committee to be developed, they would need the authorization to do so. A preliminary report will be scheduled at the June Board meeting,

Knodle reported on behalf of the Officials' Committee:

- 1. Reviewed the process of selection and assignment of region and state basketball officials and approved.
- 2. Officials conduct is an on-going study. This is also on the NDOA agenda for their February meeting.
- 3. Reviewed a letter from Mr. Brian Novlesky concerning the assignment of state hockey officials. The committee feels there is a sound process that is in place for the selection of nockey officials, not only for the tournament itself, but also for match assignments within the tournament. The committee directed a letter be drafted to Mr. Novlesky
- 4. High School versus college officiating. Officials are encouraged to remember what level they are officiating.
- 5. ASEP, the officials education program was discussed. The committee reviewed specific kinds of training that can be developed to help in the improvement of officials.

Duchscherer reported on the Class B Redistricting Committee recommendation:

It is recommended to move Minnewaukan/Leeds from District 7 to District 8 to adjust to an earlier cooperative

Motion by Duchscherer to assign Minnewaukan/Leeds to District 8 in 2006-2007 for girls' and boys' basketball. Second by Jordan and carried.

A letter from the National Federation was reviewed. On a national level, the Sportsmanship Committee wishes to do a promotional campaign similar to the steroid project that was conducted earlier in which CD's were provided to all member schools. The NDHSAA was asked to join in this campaign with a donation to the program. Motion by Briggs to endorse the National Federation Sportsmanship Program with a \$1000 donation sent to the NF. Second by Jungling and carried.

President Lockwood reported on the Athletic Review Committee meeting which was held earlier in the day. The recording of the votes from this meeting will be posted on the website. Board action on these recommendations will be on the March agenda.

Regulations for spring activities were reviewed by the board with the following approval.

- o Track regulations Motion by Duchscherer to approve the regulations. Second by Knodle and carried.
- o Tennis Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Volesky and carried.
- o Baseball Motion by Briggs to approve. Second by Jungling and carried.
- o Golf Motion by Lyson to approve. Second by Knodle and carried.

The Board read a Grand Forks Tennis request which involved competition outside of the high school team during the season. Motion by Knodle to approve the request. Second by Sanstead. Discussion followed. Motion and second were withdrawn. Motion by Volesky to table this until the Board meeting March 10th in Grand Forks. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from Curt Jones, West Fargo requesting the Board to change the regulation of game limitation for hockey from the current 20 games or 18 games and a tournament to a straight limitation of 21 games. Motion by Jungling to approve the request. Second by Lyson and carried, 8-2. This will go into effect for the 2006-2007 season.

A letter from Curt Jones, West Fargo was reviewed. The letter was a request to waive the out-of-season coaching rule for a junior high coach who was not aware of the rule and volunteered with the high school program after her junior high season was completed. Motion by Jordan to deny the request for the exception. Second by Knodle and carried.

The Executive Secretary indicated the need to put into place a Class A review process which would be similar to the Class B District Chairperson process and the Coaches' Advisory Committee process to submit to the Board proposed changes. It was a consensus of the Board to put this together.

Jungling reported on the National Federation Board:

- 1. Pleased to report the relationship of the NIAAA and the NF is still strong. Along with Jungling being on the National Federation Board of Directors and President Lockwood is on the NIAAA Board of Directors. These two organizations are currently in the process of separating their organizations.
- a. NF has financially benefited from the NIAAA conferences. There will be a changeover of the NIAAA magazine
- b. The Athletic Conference will be a shared venture between the NIAAA and NF.
- 2. At the Winter Meeting, some national happenings:
- a. Steroids are becoming a national concern. Some associations are mandating testing of state champions.
- b. Oklahoma football season, a quarterback was ejected and not eligible for the next play-off game. This was taken to court and the association postponed the game until the ruling came back in the association's favor.
- c. Discussed state association adoption for National Federation rules.
- d. National Federation is looking for a certification course that is not as long as the ASEP safety certification courses. There is a possibility of severing ties in the coaches education.
- e. The NF has been approached by T-Mobil to be involved in the sponsorship of National Championship tournaments in which they would promote high school activities as opposed to club sports. This would bring a significa amount of money to the national as well as the state associations. Part of this would be they would fund the

National Leadership Conference for two students from each state.

Briggs reported on behalf of the Fine Arts Review Committee. Their review will take place the Thursday of the State Track & Field Meet. Motion by Briggs to add 2 people to this committee to promote balance. Second by Volesky and carried.

The rooming lists were finalized for the upcoming events.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

- 1. Justin Theel, Mgr. of Theel, has been approved to display three vehicles at the State Track meet for \$1500 which will be split with the tournament committee
- 2. Summer meeting plans were reviewed.
- 3. General Assembly meeting plans are in place.
- 4. The Board will need to start thinking about a candidate for the upcoming one-year replacement of Class A West Board member, Volesky who will be going off the Board next year when Beulah goes to Class B.

The next regular Board meeting will be March 10, 2006.

With no further business, President Lockwood declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES Annual Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association January 30, 2006 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Representative Assembly Meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held Monday, January 30, 2006 at 8:00 A.M. at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. President Lockwood welcomed the membership. called the meeting to order, and declared a quorum had been established. Dr. Wayne Sanstead was introduced as the parliamentarian for the meeting.

Following introduction of Board members and staff, President Lockwood gave a short talk sharing his gratitude to the association for the experience of serving on the NDHSAA Board of Directors. He thanked the great number of committees that serve the membership by representing them and bringing information and recommendations forward to the Board of Directors. Also, President Lockwood thanked the membership for all their hard work.

On behalf of the NDHSAA Board of Directors, the Executive Secretary presented the following proposed amendment:

Amend Part Two, Article XIV, Section VI on page 23 of the July 2005 Constitution & By-Laws.

Replace existing language with: "A student shall not be eligible to compete in interscholastic activities after he/she is a high school graduate. A graduate is defined as a student who has received a valid regular education high school diploma. A student shall also not be eligible to compete after having earned credits sufficient to meet graduation requirements unless said credits have been earned in less than eight semesters of school attendance." Motion by Supt. Larry Gegelman, Central Cass to place this amendment on the floor. Second by Supt. Delbert Fry. Powers Lake.

Board member Schaible presented an amendment to the amendment to add a statement after first sentence read: Exception: A student eligible for and participating in a spring activity prior to graduation shall remain eligible in that activity until the season is completed."

Motion by Supt. Robert Tollefson, Washburn to approve the amendment to the amendment. Second by Supt, Norm ries, Gackle-Streeter. The vote on the amendment to the amendment carried unanimously.

The amended amendment will now read:

Part Two, Article XIV, Section VI - A student shall not be eligible to compete in interscholastic activities after he/she s a high school graduate. Exception: A student eligible for and participating in a spring activity prior to graduaon shall remain eligible in that activity until the season is completed. A graduate is defined as a student who has eceived a valid regular education high school diploma. A student shall also not be eligible to compete after having earned credits sufficient to meet graduation requirements unless said credits have been earned in less than eight semesters of school attendance.

The vote on the amended amendment carried unanimously.

In behalf of the NDHSAA Board of Directors, the Executive secretary presented the following amendment to read: amend Part Two, Article III, Section XI on page eight of the July 2005 Constitution & By-Laws.

a. To paragraph 6, add to first sentence: "for all activities except football". A second sentence will be new and



state: "Completed football cooperative applications must be received by September 15th of the preceding year to be considered by the Board of Directors".

Motion by Supt. Wade Faul, Griggs County Central to place the amendment on the floor. Second by Supt. Larry Gegelman, Central Cass. A vote on the amendment carried with a scattering of dissenting votes.

Sanstead reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee the ballots were tallied with the following results: Membership to the Board of Directors representing a four year term will be:

Class B Northeast - Supt. Jack Maus, Hatton/Northwood

Class A East - Prin. Jeff Schatz, Grand Forks Central

Motion by Supt. Adam Bosche, Oak Grove to approve the report. Second by Supt. Don Nielsen, Divide County and carried.

The Executive Secretary explained the process of how it is determined who is to receive a lifetime pass. The Executive Secretary presented this pass to Ath. Dir. Gary Mailloux, Fargo North who has served the Association well for a number of years. The membership expressed their gratitude in the form of applause.

The Executive Secretary presented to the membership ample opportunity to share ideas and opinions to the improvement of the Association by inviting anyone to a microphone for this purpose.

The Executive Secretary gave his report:

- 1. An update of the Michigan Association concerning the switch of seasons. The association lost at the district level, State Supreme Court level and the US Supreme Court, who remanded it to the Federal Court of Appeals. There will be an oral argument which will be conducted in March. More information will be shared as it takes place.
- 2. The North Dakota Tourism Association held a meeting in Valley City earlier in the year. It appears there may be sufficient votes to have the legislature mandate school start after Labor Day. Larry Robinson called this meeting in Valley City. If this passes, the membership will be challenged to review the effect on activities.
- 3. There will be fall administrators meetings: July 31 in Dickinson, August 2 in Minot, August 8 in Valley City, August 14 in Grand Forks, and August 16 in Bismarck.
- 4. There is continuing work on the football plan. A letter was sent to all member schools in January asking for verification of numbers. Some changes were necessitated and other changes may take place under the guidelines The following guidelines have been approved:
- a. October, 2005 Meeting—continue work on Parameters
- b. November, 2005—survey schools concerning number of divisions
- c. November, 2005 Meeting—review Survey report, continue work on guidelines
- d. January, 2006 Meeting—complete guidelines and share with membership
- e. February 15, 2006—deadline for schools to declare if they wish to move up a division
- f. April, 2006—send out preliminary plan (request feedback from membership
- g. June 1, 2006—all requests for football coop dissolutions must be submitted
- h. September 15, 2006—deadline for new football cooperative agreements
- i. 1st week of October, 2006—conference call to deal with coops
- Following Thursday—Football Committee meets and recommends plan adjustments
- k. October, 2006 Meeting—Final plan revealed to membership
- 5. Alida Posein, 33 year veteran as bookkeeper has been replaced by Sharon Prosby who began the position January 1, 2006. Please welcome her when the opportunity arises.
- 6. The Board of Directors has a Tournament Committee as well as a Combined Tournament Committee which includes the athletic directors who frequently act as tournament hosts. Venue issues have become more of an issue. One of the recommendations in 2006-2007 which was approved was to move the 2007 State Wrestling Tournament from Minot to Fargo and the 2006 State Volleyball Tournament, in turn was moved from Fargo to Minot. This was done in response to the addition of wrestling mats needed for State Wrestling, which Minot would not be able to accommodate without losing spectator seating roofn.
- 7. A meeting is being scheduled with the web master to get a proper design to facilitate the requirement that has been approved for the 2006-2007 year. That requirement will be all member schools must have their picture (with cut line), roster and schedule on the website no later than 3 weeks into each respective season.
- 8. We have a statistical side of the website, and coaches are encouraged to participate. The membership is asked for their thoughts on whether this program is warranted to continue.
- 9. Another decision approved by the NDHSAA Board of Directors is the 2007-2008 Girls' and Boys' State Hockey
- tournament will be combined and held in Grand Forks. The results of the Athletic Review committee will be posted on website and the Board will be acting on these recommendations at their March 10th meeting. Also, the District Chair recommendations from the November meeting will be acted upon at that time.
- 11. District Chairs will meet March 17th in Bismarck
- In closing, the future of high school activities and education will present a new set of challenges to the NDHSAA membership.

President Lockwood thanked the assembly and declared the meeting adjourned.

Todd Olson, athletic director of the Grand Forks Public schools appeared before the Board to address a request for a Red River student to compete in tournaments outside of the team during the season. This request had been tabled from the previous meeting. Also present was Jane Wischer to answer any questions concerning the request. Motion by Knodle to allow this request, based on the selection process as explained. Second by Jordan and carried. The 9 day practice rule was waived as this was cited as a special circumstance.

President Lockwood thanked Mr. Olson for all the work he, the Grand Forks Public Schools and the community have put into the tournaments hosted by Grand Forks.

The Executive Secretary reported on his investigations into the complaints filed by Enderlin and Hankinson concerning the situations that took place during and after a game between these two schools on February 2, 2006 at Hankinson. A letter of apology from Hankinson sent to Enderlin was reviewed after which Enderlin submitted their etter of complaint against Hankinson. Jungling indicated the need for both schools to respond to the NDHSAA concerning their action. It was noted Hankinson has addressed the issue and has sent a letter of apology. It was he consensus of the Board that neither school has taken sufficient action in response to this situation. Sanstead indicated the purpose of activities is to educate and there is no education in this reaction. Briggs stated there has not been the appropriate action taken to reach a resolution. Jordan asked if it would be possible to bring the two parties together with the Board to mediate, much like the resolution following a playground dispute. Duchscherer agreed there has not been any resolution that would positively affect upcoming events. Briggs indicated if the Board does not ask for further action, there is no part being played to emphasize sportsmanship. Carlson stated something more and better has to come out of this situation. Lyson added sooner or later, something needs to be done. Schaible shared if both schools appear before the Board, would they just say and do whatever they need to satisfy the Board rather than doing something constructive for their individual schools. Volesky indicated he sees his as not being appropriate and there is a need to deal with this as a Board. Jungling suggested they get their wo schools together through student council or some other vehicle and bring their resolution to the Board. Knodle indicated there is a need for both parties to indicate what they are doing in response to this or the Board will need to tell the schools what they are going to do. The question was asked, is their remedy satisfactory to the Board? President Lockwood stated the need for the two professional administrators to get together and form a resoluion. Lyson indicated this type of situation maybe needs to be brought before the district chair group to use as an educational tool and stating this is unacceptable behavior. Motion by Briggs a letter be written to each school administration expressing dissatisfaction with the current resolution and require them to get together for mediation and form further corrective actions which they will personally report to the Board at the April meeting. Second by nodle. Sanstead added the need to address not only the game situation but also the fan and coach decorum and Il other contributing factors that lead up to the situation. President Lockwood stated obviously there is a need for in improvement plan. Knodle indicated the Executive Secretary can include this in his report of the current ongoing investigation to the district chairmen. Duchscherer stated concern for the statements from the students about their frustration concerning this atmosphere in which they are playing. Motion carried.

The group received a report on the Hankinson and Enderlin situation

Each district was asked to report on their recommendation for the following:

The various Districts submitted agenda items for discussion with the following results:

Either of these recommendations would help the schools in their area to keep the numbers interested and avoid an verlap. A straw vote indicated 11 districts were of the opinion that the volleyball season was too long. Motion by lven to shorten the volleyball season by one week and start one week earlier. Second by Rod Meier, Mott Regent. he vote was yes - 11, no - 5.

2. Official's need to follow the rules of basketball and tighten up the game. Be more consistent.

The group felt the game has become more physical and the finesse of basketball is being lost.

Eliminate the mandatory bench rule for coaches in basketball.

District 3-----Dan Hoornaert, AD Hillsboro

There was much discussion concerning the selection process. Why officials doing a girls region cannot do a boys region?

b. Recommended dates that schools can or cannot contact officials about officiating next years district tourna-

Motion by Honerat to be able to work more than one regional tournament. Second by Supt. Dennis Adair, Pingree-Buchanan. The vote was yes-14, no-2

c. Some districts are contacting officials well before the district meeting and there seems to be an unfair advantage. Supt. Martyn Vatne, Wildrose-Alamo indicated officials are being put in a difficult position when districts are contacting officials.

District 4-----Jeff Carpenter, Prin. North Border Pembina

1. Allow all schools to move junior high students up to high school and back down to junior high. Do away with the 50 enrollment rule.

The Executive Secretary explained this rule is a By-Law and any school may propose an amendment to the Constitution & By-Laws to change this rule.

District 5-----Dennis Adair, Supt. Pingree-Buchanan

- 2. Opposed to the shot clock for Class B Basketball.

Discussion followed. It was stated their district was in opposition to introducing the shot clock.

3. Move golf from spring to fall.

Prin. Daye Wistoff, Glenburn stated it may be better to conflict with football rather than track and field. Motion by Wistoff to move golf season from spring to fall. Second by Selzle. The vote was yes-7, no-7, and abstain-2.

4. Do not shorten the length of any athletic season.

No further discussion.

District 6-----Ken Miller, Supt. Steele-Dawson.

Discuss venue tax/charge at regional sites.

The girls' tournament was held in Hazelton with no venue charge, but in Jamestown, there was a \$.25 charge. Fans felt there was a double charge as there is the rental that the NDHSAA pays and the venue tax the fans pays. It was asked if other districts feel the same. It was stated almost all venues in large cities have some form of facility charge added to the admission charge. Another concern is more venues are charging for parking, causing a financial burden for families that attend tournaments.

, Go back to the big calendar.

It was unanimous in their district they did not like the small calendar that was published for the 2005-2006 year.

4. Mandan as site for Region 5 Girls Basketball Tournament.

District 10-----Dale Ekstrom, Supt. Underwood

1. 30 second shot clock in GBB favored by coaches, opposed by athletic directors and administration.

District 14-----Gerald Quintus, Supt. Richardton-Taylor

1. Three-person officiating crews should not be mandated for district (tournament and regular season) Class B

Would like to leave this as not being mandated for regular season.

2. Concerns over the balance of teams in districts.

There is a concern with the balance of number of teams in the two districts in their region. The Executive Secretary indicated with the closing of schools and the adding of cooperative sponsorship programs, the 8-region and 16-listrict plan could be in jeopardy.

istrict 16----Marlyn Vatne, Supt. Wildrose-Alamo

. Have a graduated fee schedule for two man crew versus three man crew. Rationale: The referees in our area like to use the three man crew in all varsity games; however, the cost is a concern of most of the

administrators. Tournament costs get pretty high with the three man crew; therefore it was suggested that the three man work for a smaller individual fee. Referee representatives at the meeting were in favor of such a schedule if it promoted using the three man crew.

2. District 16 also recommend the initiation of the coaching box.

Rationale: When the three whistle crew is used, the one official is almost always in front of the coach and/or between the coach and the action on the floor. The coaching box would allow the coach the latitude to be able to seen the action in their end of the floor.

3. District 16 recommends the postponement of Region/State Officials selection process.

Rationale: The letters with the ballots arrive in Sept. Some schools may not have coaches available or if new, don't know the referees.

4. Recommend a state mandate that no District Tournament officials be contracted until January 2nd. Rationale: All coaches will have seen many of the officials in action and voting would be more on the merit of that years refereeing. We would also eliminate the attitude of "lets have our meeting early, so we get best selection" All officials would be contacted at the same time so officials could decide on the direction they might want to go. Motion by Vatne that tournament officials not be contacted until January 2nd of the year for district officials. Second

5. District 16 recommends Williston State College as the Region 8 site for tournaments.

Carlsrud asked the committee to consider using 3-whistle coverage during regular season for some of their games. There is a need for officials to have this opportunity to improve their coverage skills.

The Executive Secretary indicated the following recommendations received support in the form of a motion, second and majority yes vote:

- 1. Junior high allow no more than 2 games per week followed by school adding weekend.

MINUTES

North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors March 17, 2006 – Minot Holiday Inn

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on March 17, 2006 at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. President Lockwood called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present.

Following additions to the agenda, motion by Knodle to approve. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Motion by Briggs to accept the minutes from March 10, 2006 Board meeting. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Executive Secretary gave a follow-up financial report with an explanation of budget item #8162. The history used to set the budget was incorrect because of a double payment in previous budget for NDIRF.

The following coop dissolution request was reviewed: Hillsboro and Norman County west for girls' golf, effective with the 2006-2007 year. Motion by Carlson to approve the dissolution. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Supt. Kelly Taylor, MLS appeared before the Board to address their cooperative sponsorship application that was denied at the January meeting. They wished to appeal this decision with an explanation as to why they felt there was a need for a coop among their schools for a track and field program. After hearing sufficient information, motion by Lyson to reconsider. Second by Volesky and carried. Motion by Lyson to approve the cooperative sponsorship application for Kenmare and Moñall-Lansford-Sherwood/Bowbells in boys' and girls' track. Second by Jordan and carried with two dissenting votes.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board the various businesses that are selling tournament photos without permission by the NDHSAA Board of Directors. Rick Westra from Josten's Photography School Pride has expressed concern with this. NDHSAA attorney, Gary Thune shared some thoughts as to how the Board can approach this issue. The condition of intellectual property was discussed. Further study on this issue will be done. It

was a consensus of the Board it would be difficult to enforce the limitation of sale of pictures from tournaments to School Pride. Further study will take place for review after the National Federation Legal Seminar.

The Executive Secretary shared information from the major winter tournaments with a list of the gross sales amounts.

The Board held audience with West Fargo Athletic Director Curt Jones and Pat Johnson, softball coach. They were there to present a request to sanction girls' fastpitch softball. There currently is a state-wide softball schedule that this year will include Enderlin, Devils Lake, Minot, Minot Ryan, Grand Forks Red River, Grand Forks Central, West Fargo, Fargo North, Fargo South and Fargo Shanley. The Executive Secretary reviewed with the Board the procedure that has been put into place for the addition of an activity. Motion by Sanstead to move forward with a study of this request into the second phase of the procedure. Second by Jungling and carried.

The Board reviewed a letter of communiqué from Supt. Kevin Harmon of the Minot Catholic Schools in response to the State Wrestling and State Class A Basketball tournament facility requirements. Requested was some type of criteria which is used for selection of these state tournaments. Motion by Sanstead to provide a set of requirements for facility guidelines for hosting state wrestling based on scheduling and format. Second by Jungling. Also reviewed was a letter from Wendy Howe, Director of the Minot Convention and Visitor Bureau. Duchscherer asked if it would be prudent to get into this type of directive causing some guidelines that are too restrictive for the site selection. Motion was defeated, 1-10.

Staff member Hetler reported to the Board on the bid process for the association calendar. Currently, three bids have been received for the 12 by 17 calendar, similar to the calendar that was used for the 2005-2006 year. Motion by Briggs to go with the second of a two year study using the small calendar and accept 3D Printing of Fargo's bid for \$3,465.92 for 1600 calendars. Second by Lyson and carried with four dissenting votes.

Carlson reported on behalf of the Officials Committee's concern of officials involved in unacceptable behavior and still in contact with high school students. Presented was an official's code of conduct that was discussed by the NDOA Board of Directors. The Board reviewed a proposed wording that is to be placed on the back of the registration form which is to be filled out by the registering official. Motion by Carlson to approve the placement of this on the registration form. Second by Knodle and carried.

Carlson also indicated baseball officials have asked for an increase for game fees for baseball. Duchscherer asked if this 26% increase, if not approved, would cause officials to no longer accept contracts. Motion by Carlson to set baseball game officiating fees for the 2006-2007 year as follows: Seven inning Varsity, \$50; seven inning sub-varsity, \$40; five inning varsity, \$35, five inning sub-varsity, \$30. Second by Jordan and carried.

Plans were discussed for the April Board meeting with the scheduling of committees to meet:

- Class A Region Committee
- Football Committee
- Tournament Committee
- Constitution & By-Laws
- Promotions and Programs

The Board reviewed the updated information concerning the Enderlin and Hankinson complaints that were filed by seach school. President Lockwood shared a conversation with Supt. Kringen of Enderlin as to what can be done in the future prior to reporting back to the Board at the April meeting. A letter of communiqué dated March 14, 2006 was reviewed. Briggs indicated once this complaint is brought to the Board, the schools should not be able to withdraw just to avoid an ongoing study and action. One of the remedies proposed by the schools was to not play each other next year. It was stated this was not an educational experience for the students. Carlson indicated there is no seign of remorse in some of the statements read and what they have done to date is too late. Volesky indicated deciding what is the right action should not be the job of the Board but should be handled by the administration of the schools. The Board express disappointment in how the situation has been handled and displeasure of the results as being inappropriate and poorly handled. President asked the Board how to handle the request from these two schools to appear before the Board at the April meeting. Motion by Lyson to have these two schools appear before the Board at the April meeting so they can be present for the Board's discussion. Second by Briggs and carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from Kerry Stastny, Region 5 Boys' Basketball Manager concerning some actions by a blayer from Dakota Oyate. No action was taken and the school will be contacted.

Jungling asked the Board about web casting an NDHSAA tournament. It was stated the television station which has the contract with the NDHSAA has exclusive rights to live broadcasting.

Board correspondence was shared.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

a. Thursday, the Executive Secretary met with the Native American schools to visit about the possibility of an

Volesky gave a report from the Combined Tournament Committee with recommendations for state tournament sites. iRecommendations for the 2009-2010 year is currently proposed and will need Board approval. The Class B Girls' 1State Basketball site for 2008-2009 in Grand Forks was discussed. The Combined Tournament Committee needs tto discuss what venue will be used for this particular tournament. Motion by Volesky to approve the state sites as listed for 2009-2010. Second by Knodle and carried. This site rotation is reviewed on an annual basis.

New staff member, Sharon Prosby was introduced to the Board and welcomed to the NDHSAA.

The Board held audience with Prin. Jess Smith of Hankinson and Supt. Jon Kringen of Enderlin. The purpose of their appearance was at the Board's request regarding the incident taking place at a girls' basketball game at Hankinson. Kringen brought the Board up to date on what action Enderlin has taken as agreed upon between the two schools in response to the problems that lead up to what took place at that game. He indicated satisfaction as to what Hankinson has done in response to the situation. Interaction took place between Kringen and the Board. Prin. Smith also was asked questions following his presentation. Motion by to Jordan to declare the complaints have been addressed by both schools satisfactorily. Second by Briggs and carried. Prin. Smith and Supt. Kringen were thanked for appearing before the board to offer clarity to the complaints.

Schaible reported on behalf of the Promotions and Programs Committee:

a. Reviewed two applications for the Distinguished Service Award. The Committee reviewed the two applicants and recommended both of the applicants be placed on the "inactive" list because of the lack of a state-wide component and would be reconsidered if more information is supplied.

b. Discussed the centennial celebration which will take place 2007- 2008. The Committee brain stormed ideas. They will be looking to prioritize these suggestions and the cost of any of those selected activities at a later meeting. Some suggestions were:

Governor's Proclamation of the celebration

Motion by Schaible to approve this report. Second by Jordan and carried.

The Executive Secretary introduced Tim O'Leary to the Board. O'Leary assists with the NDHSAA hockey program working with coaches and officials. The state of high school hockey was shared with the Board. Volesky stated the players and coaches are an example of good sportsmanship, but the adult fans are a problem and becoming more of a problem.

Lockwood reported on behalf of the Football Committee. Reviewed were the region assignments as per the division assignments. The committee, as requested, reduced the number in the A division from 32 to 24 to make more teams available for scheduling in the 9-man division. Preliminary region assignments were reviewed by division to be presented to the member schools for feedback:

a. AAA Division: Motion by Briggs to approve the AAA as presented. Second by Lyson and carried.

b. AA Division: Devils Lake was inserted into the east region with a question as to where Bottineau and Standing Rock will be assigned. Motion by Lyson to approve AA. Second by Sanstead and carried.

c. A Division: It was determined to propose a three-region assignment. Top 5 from each region qualify for postseason with a region receiving the bye by draw. A suggestion was to allow 6 from one of the 3 regions to fill the tournament bracket to 16 teams. Motion by Schaible to accept as proposed with the exception of qualifying 16 schools advancing 5 from two regions and 6 from the third region as determined by draw. Second by Knodle. Discussion took place as to how it would be placed on the bracket and the possible travel. Motion carried.

d. Nine-man Division: There are 54 schools in this division. With the possible cooperative sponsorship programs that may occur, some of these schools may be moved up to the next division, causing team(s) from the A Division to move into the 9-man Division in a different geographic region. Qualify 4 out of each region. Motion by Lyson to approve as presented. Second by Briggs and carried.

e. This will be sent to member schools with an April date for feedback.

The Board reviewed a request from Edgeley concerning the penalty for a player that exceeds the maximum number of quarters. This was tabled from the March meeting to give time to get feedback from member schools. Motion by Volesky to bring this back to the Board. Second by Lyson and carried. With the results of the feedback received from athletic administrators, motion by Lyson to leave the regulation as is currently. Second by Schaible and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented a report as requested by the Board in response to a proposal by member schools to sanction girls' fast pitch softball. A feasibility study was formed. Following review of the study, based on the statistical data provided and the recommendation of the Executive Secretary, motion by Briggs to, at this time, deny the request to sanction girls' fast pitch softball. Second by Lyson and carried.

With the current contract for the Spalding and Tachikara balls coming to an end, the Board heard the proposal from Spalding to renew the contract for an additional three years. Because of the late timing of other brands of balls just recently being introduced, the recommendation is to continue the contract with Spalding and Tachikara. Moton by Volesky to extend the ball contract with Spalding and Tachikara for three years. Second by Jordan and carried.

The two-year calendar was reviewed with an extension to the 2007-2008 year. Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Volesky and carried.

Volesky reported on behalf of the Large Tournament Committee recommendations:

1. Ticket Prices:

a. State A Basketball Student Daily Unreserved from \$6 to \$5

b. Football Pre-Quarter, Quarter & Semi-Final Student from \$3 to \$4

c. Dakota Bowl (2 Games or More) Student from \$4 to \$5

d. State Volleyball Student Season Ticket from \$12 to \$10

Motion by Lyson to approve the ticket price adjustments. Second by Schaible and carried.

2. Combined State Hockey

a. Hold the total first two rounds of the girls' tournament at the Purpur Arena

b. Move the girls' championship to the Ralph Englestad Arena

Motion by Volesky to approve the girls' hockey report. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Other items discussed by the committee:

Media issues have improved in relation to managers.

There is a concern with media interviews immediately following a game which interferes with post-game ceremonies. A championship coach was prevented from being available to receive his award during the ceremonies. It was a consensus that interviews should be delayed until after completion of the awards ceremony. This will be placed on the Tournament Committee agenda for a possible proposal.

COTY and Senior Athlete awards still pose some problems with presentation of the award and selection process.

Still-shot photography was discussed with no recommendations for change

· Starting times for State BB games on the final day was discussed. There is a concern for the lateness

Knodle presented a report of the Class A meetings facilitated by Mary Erhardt. Class A representatives will be returning to their schools to visit with their superintendents on what direction should be taken. It was suggested the group representation be enlarged to other schools that would be affected by any possible changes in classifications and other plans.

The Board reviewed a letter of request for an additional year of eligibility for a Standing Rock student who had been in an accident, causing an inability to compete. Motion by Sanstead to approve the request. Second by Jordan and carried with one dissenting vote.

The fall regulations were reviewed. There was a question concerning the use of cell phones during golf competition. It was determined there is a regulation of a 2-stroke penalty. Motion by Briggs to approve the following regulations: 2006 boys' tennis, cross country, volleyball, Class A Girls' golf and football, 2006-2007 soccer and swimming. Second by Carlson and carried.

The Board discussed the reorganization of the Board of Directors for the 2006-2007 year. Motion by Lyson to cast a unanimous ballot for Briggs as President. Second by Jordan and carried.

Motion by Lyson to cast a unanimous ballot for Knodle for Vice President for the 2006-2007 year. Second by Carlson and carried.

Carlson opened discussion with the board the one-year sit-out rule for transfer students rather than the current 90day rule. There is an increase in the number of players that are transferring without a corresponding move of the parents. Perhaps it is time to look at this again. Knodle also reminded the Board of a previous discussion of the possible ineligibility of half of each season as being a possible regulation. This is a bylaw which would have to be presented to the membership. Motion by Carlson to develop the eligibility period for transfer to 180 days. Second by Knodle and carried.

Representative Reports:

Briggs reported on the Northwest School Administrators meeting. People in the northwest are not happy with the current sportsmanship plan with Class A and Class B schools executing their plans differently. It was asked whether the Sportsmanship ad hoc committee was going to be called back together for review. Will the sportsmanship program be included in activities other than basketball and football? In regards to the regional meeting and fines for non-attendance, it was suggested the fine be more than the cost of travel to attend this meeting. It is the perception the Football Committee is not responding to their wishes for the football plan. In response for the Football Committee, Lyson indicated there has been a number of surveys conducted to clarify the wishes of the membership. Extensive discussion followed on the sportsmanship plan. Board members indicated sportsmanship is a mission of the NDHSAA and the association needs to continue to endorse this mission. The Board indicated the Association has an obligation to be stewards of sportsmanship. Sportsmanship will be placed on the agenda for the June Board meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board the recommendation from NBC Sports North Dakota concerning the scheduling of games for the Dakota Bowl. They asked the Board to consider 2 games on Friday 9:00 and 6:30 and 2 games on Saturday. Second preference would be three games on Friday and 1 game on Saturday. Motion by Carlson to have four games on Friday. Second by Knodle. After discussion the vote was taken with the motion carried unanimously.

The administrators from Park River and Fordville-Lankin were reminded the schools and officials previously contracted will need to be contacted immediately.



The Executive Secretary reviewed the Medical Advisory Committee concept which was previously approved by the Board. He has checked with Missouri that has a committee of eleven people. This committee will provide recommendations for the Board concerning sports medicine issues. It is suggested if the committee is developed, it would meet once a year or as needed. Dave Carlsrud reported on the sports medicine conference he attended in Minot. They had the new wrestling weight management component on their agenda and also discussed the association's consideration of a sports medicine advisory committee. This group was supportive of the committee. They suggested an EMT, a general practitioner without sports medicine training, an athletic trainer, an orthopedic and a doctor of chiropractic. They also asked the NDHSAA to develop a form of release in the case an injured participant has their own training people at a contest. Also, the group would like to appear before the various groups associated with the NDHSAA such as the NDIAAA. The Executive Secretary indicated this may be beneficial to the Board. Briggs indicated there was a previous indication there should be a board member as well as staff member added to this committee. Jungling reported the National Federation has a National Sports Medicine Advisory Committee that is very active and may be in conflict with the rules committees. It would be good to make certain what type of input is expected from the committee. Advisory recommendations would be implemented as determined needed by the NDHSAA Board of Directors. It was determined this committee would be used on resource basis as needed by the NDHSAA. Motion by Schaible to add a medical advisory committee that consists of 5 advisory members from the medical field as well as a Board member and a staff member which total 7 members. Second by Lyson and carried. <

The Board indicated the Fine Arts Committee has been a beneficial addition to the workings of the NDHSAA. There were several additions to the committee: 1 A and 1 B administrators plus two members of the NDHSAA Board. Motion by Briggs to approve these additions. Second by Sanstead and carried.

Schaible reported on the Fine Arts recommendations with approval of recommendations as follows:

1. Set a study committee which would include representatives of music, forensics/ play activities, two Board members

and two school administrators to study "fine arts seasons issues". The meeting will be held in Bismarck the week of the NDEA Conference

- 11. Clarify the 3rd sentence to read, "The list of topics the NDHSAA receives shall contain the title and date of the of the magazine..."
- 12. In Extemporaneous Speech, change Section 3, Rule A, on page 22 to read, "At regionals and state, 21 (Class A) and 30 (Class B) different topics will be used in each round. The NDHSAA will have a separate set prepared for each round."

- 2. The committee continued work on the Centennial Celebration plans with the following highlights:
- a. There is a need to set a time-line and budget for this plan.
- b. Continue work on a logo design contest for student of member schools, (grades 7-12) with a possible scholarship
- c. The Executive Secretary, President Briggs and Promotions & Programs Committee Chair, Schaible are to meet with possible sponsors for possible involvement in the celebration activities such as scholarship, bill boards, etc.
- d. Contact Gov. Hoven for proclamation and heads up on centennial (request to appear at the general assembly to make the proclamation)
- e. Line up sportscasters for articles on history of each sport
- f. Host a gathering of former board members, Distinguished students and Executive Secretaries
- q. Develop a chronological time line of history of Association including introduction of the various activities.
- h. Plan a kick-off with a press conference at Valley City

Knodle reported on behalf of the Principals' Association study on the no-shirt and body paint issue with two recommendations to be brought forward to the NDHSAA:

- 1. To enhance communication between NDHSAA and principals/activities directors;
- a. Shirt rule at region and state meets was voted on with no input from principals/activities directors
- All region and state events?
- ii. Track, tennis, swimming, and soccer how does this apply?
- b. Policies such as the shirt rule should be shared by NDHSAA with media outlets to publicize changes that may require action at a tournament so people know why the action is being taken.
- c. NDHSAA may want to consider timelines to allow new policies for school handbooks.
- d. The principals would prefer to get hard copies of bulletin, not an email with the bulletin attached as not everyone is on
- e. Information was shared about the creation of the Class A region committee which would address these communication
- 2. To establish specific dates/seasons for speech, debate and student congress seasons as with athletic seasons, Jungling indicated there are questions about what events this would apply and who would be responsible to enforce this rules. It was stated this rule needs to be communicated with the member schools to make them aware this policy will be enforced at the NDHSAA sponsored post-season tournaments. It was suggested this be placed in the September Bulletin. President Lockwood appointed Schatz, Duchscherer and Knodle to continue study the questions presented and report back to the August meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported on the corresponding dates for Board meetings for the 2006-2007 year. It was suggested the Board meet to review the various advisory recommendations the day previous to the regular Board meeting in June. Athletic Review would be scheduled one week prior to the Board meeting. Motion by Briggs to accept the proposed Board meetings with Athletic Review scheduled for June 12, 2007 and the Board as June 19 and 20, 2007. Second by Duchscherer and carried with one dissenting vote.

The Executive Secretary reported on the Technology Plan. The Finance Committee indicated the possibility of discontinuing the rotation plan for desktop computers for the professional staff and going with laptops only for both in and out of the office. Motion by Duchscherer to approve the Technology Plan as presented. Second by Sanstead and carried,

Briggs reported on behalf of the Finance Committee;

- 1. Wells Fargo has requested consideration concerning a visa card for overdraft protection. The committee recommendation is to cancel the current card and go with the Wells Fargo Visa card with overdraft protection for the checking
- 2. The 2005-2006 budget and the 2006-2007 proposed budget were reviewed by the Executive Secretary. Motion by Briggs to approve the Finance Committee recommendations including the budget. Second by Jordan and carried.

The preliminary report on team payments was reviewed. Corrections were noted and adjustments will be made prior to checks being issued to the member schools.

The Board reviewed a letter from ND Amateur Hockey regarding A U16 National Championship in Frazer Michigan. The letter requested an interpretation of the By-Law and how it refers to the issue of All-Star. This letter is requesting to allow coaches to coach their players in this program. Two issues were discussed: (1) out of season coaching and (2) the all-star rule as it pertains to the selection of team members. Discussion followed concerning the all-star rule. President Lockwood indicated this must be addressed by the Constitution & By-Laws Committee for the August meeting. The Executive Secretary will answer this communiqué with the current interpretation of the rule.

Schaible reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee:

1. A letter from an attorney representing two parties from the Richardton-Taylor school district requesting the NDHSAA investigate the procedure used in how Richardton-Taylor administration handled the investigation and enforcement of



Article XIV, Section XII of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws in connection with the alleged alcohol possession/usage. NDHSAA attorney, Gary Thune constructed a letter in reply indicating the association only works with member schools.

2. Attorney Thune has constructed wording for the following:

- a. Section X, Paragraph a (Transfer Rule), including changes from:
- 90 school days to 180 school days
- ii. change the term "he/she" to "student"
- iii. Insert reference to the absence of recruitment or undue influence.

Motion by Schaible to approve the language that has been provided. Second by Jungling and carried.

b. Revise Section X, Paragraph a

c. Revise Section X, Paragraph b (Hardship Rule)

Motion by Schaible to approve the wording. Second by Carlson and carried.

d. Question 150 would answer the definitions on page 33 as follows:

Motion by Sanstead to accept the language provided for question 150. Second by Briggs and carried.

e. Questions will be renumbered for each individual section.

f. The committee studied the ejection rule and will submit some recommendations for rewording back to the NDHSAA attorney. A report on this will be at the next Board meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported on a proposal being made by West Virginia to the National Federation Council to allow every state association to have the right to send a representative at their expense to all rules committee meetings to be a voting member of that committee. As the voting member for North Dakota, the Executive Secretary intends to vote no on this proposal unless Board feels otherwise. The Board indicated this no vote would be acceptable.

Jungling indicated the need to change the deadline date for completion of regional Class B baseball to be two Wednesdays prior to the State Tournament for Baseball which would be moving that date up one day. This will change the deadline for region completion will be changed from May 24th to May 23rd for the 2007 year. Motion by Jungling to approve this date change. Second by Lyson and carried.

The Board reviewed previous discussion about the sportsmanship program which was tabled. Carlson has indicated there may be a need for change to continue with the individual schools developing their sportsmanship plan, but to discontinue the sportsmanship award at state tournaments. Motion by Carlson to continue the individual school sportsmanship programs but discontinue the sportsmanship award for all state tournaments. Second by Knodle and carried with 3 dissenting votes. Lyson indicated there still may be a way to promote and recognize those schools that do renew their sportsmanship program for the year in which they are participating in a state tournament. Briggs echoed this statement.

Arrangements are being made for the August Board meeting in Valley City.

The Board reviewed the following Board correspondence

A cooperative sponsorship dissolution request from North Shore/Plaza and Parshall for VB and FB which was tabled earlier in the meeting was clarified and will be brought back to the table at the August meeting.

A report was given by National Federation Board of Directors member, Jungling who presented the information from the most recent National Federation Board of Directors meeting.

Knodle indicated EDC principals and activities directors have discussed the need to set season dates for some of the fine arts activities and should be set by the Board of Directors of the NDHSAA. At this time, there are no suggestions for season dates. Hetier indicated the Fine Arts Committee is currently studying this concept.

The Board heard the Executive Secretary's Report:

- a. A Native American Advisory Committee is in the process of being formed. A letter of support from Mrs. Hall was read to the Board. An update was given as to how the plan is proceeding.
- b. The Board was asked for information regarding postage machines. The office is in need of purchasing a replacement.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

A. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is computed on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset which range from Three to twenty years. The Association capitalizes all significant equipment and building additions. The Association does not capitalize costs associated with its web site.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash equivalents include time deposits, certificates of deposits and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

E. Financial Statement Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Boards in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Notfor-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted assets and permanently restricted net assets. In addition the Association is required to present a statement of cash flows.

F. Income Tax Status

The Association is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Association is not a private foundation.

G. Investments

Under SFAS No. 124, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

H. Designation of Unrestricted Assets

It is the policy of the Board of Directors of the Association to review its plans for future property improvements and acquisitions from time to time and to designate appropriate sums of unrestricted net assets to assure adequate financing of such improvements and acquisitions.

5. PENSION PLANS

Three professional employees participate in the North Dakota Teachers Fund for Retirement (TFFR). Once these employees terminate their employment at the Association no other employees will be allowed to participate in TFFR. One professional and all clerical employees participate in a tax deferred annuity program. Employer contributes 16.8% of the employee's salary as determined according to TFFR. Total expense for the Association for the year ended June 30, 2006 and 2005 was \$69 026 and \$ 67 711 respectively.

7. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Association is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets; errors or omissions; injuries to employees; or natural disasters. The Association participates in the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund (NDIRF), a public entity risk pool for its general property and casualty and other miscellaneous insurance coverages. The NDIRF operates as common risk management and insurance program for North Dakota cities and schools. The Association pays an annual assessment to the NDIRF for its general insurance coverage. The NDIRF agreement provides that the Trust will be self-sustaining through member assessments and will re-insure through commercial companies for claims in excess of certain limits for each insured event.

The Association also carries commercial insurance for certain other risks of loss including employee health insurance. Settled claims resulting from these risks have not exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three years.
