MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors August 6, 2009

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association held their meeting on August 6, 2009 in Valley City. President Schatz called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all members present except Swiontek.

Following an addition, motion by Jacobson to approve the agenda. Second by Looysen and carried unanimously by show of hands.

The Board was supplied the minutes of the June 15, 16, 2009 meeting for review. Motion by Maus to approve the minutes as read. Second by Sanstead. A vote was unanimous by show of hands.

Harold Rotunda appeared before the Board to report on the audit for the 2008-2009 year. Mr. Rotunda shared with the Board there may need to review the reimbursement policy for the Board and staff. This will be placed on the agenda for the Finance Committee. Motion by Eastgate to approve. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Maus - yes, Looysen - yes, Jacobson - yes, Moe - yes, Sanstead - yes, Eastgate - yes, Ulland - yes, Helvik - yes, Ranum - yes, Schatz - yes. Motion passed unanimously.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report reviewing the balance sheet, budget and savings and investment reports. Also included was the financial report for spring activities and the t-shirt sales report. Motion by Sanstead to approve the report. Second by Jacobson. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: Maus - yes, Looysen - yes, Jacobson - yes, Moe - yes, Sanstead - yes, Eastgate - yes, Ulland - yes, Helvik - yes, Ranum - yes, Schatz - yes. Motion passed unanimously.

The Board reviewed the request to dissolve the cooperative sponsorships:

Motion by Eastgate to approve. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken resulting in the motion passing unanimously.

Ranum gave some background on the Scranton move in cooperative sponsorships from Bowman to Hettinger. The philosophy of coops was discussed. Moe presented a report on behalf of the Football Committee review of the request from Scranton to move to 9-man with Hettinger via their coops as requested and the implications of how it would affect the new (09-11) football plan. If Scranton's coop application is approved, it would require adjustments in the plan. Motion by Maus to deny the dissolution of the Scranton and Bowman cooperative sponsorship for football as recommended by the Football Committee. Second by Ranum. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: Maus - yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Moe – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Ulland – yes, Helvik – yes, Ranum – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion passed unanimously.

- b. Hettinger and Scranton in wrestling, 7-12, 2009-2010 (late fee).
- c. Hettinger and Scranton in boys' track & field, 7-12, 2009-2010, (late fee)
- d. Hettinger and Scranton in girls' track & field, 7-12, 2009-2010 (late fee)
- e. Hettinger and Scranton in boys' golf, 7-12, 2009-2010 (no late fee)
- f. Hettinger and Scranton in girls' golf, 7-12, 2009-2010, (no fee)
- g. Hettinger and Scranton in speech, 7-12, 2009-2010, (no fee)

Motion by Helvik to approve cooperative sponsorship requests b. through g. Second by Jacobson. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: Maus - yes, Looysen - yes, Jacobson - yes, Moe - yes, Sanstead - yes, Eastgate - yes, Ulland - yes, Helvik - yes, Ranum - yes, Schatz - yes. Motion passed unanimously.

Moe continued the Football Committee report. The committee discussed the AAA teams and adding Davies in the second year of the two-year plan. The committee recommended staying with the current timeline. Guidelines and timelines will be presented to the membership at the January General Assembly meeting.

Moe presented a report of the Officials' Recruiting & Retention meeting which was held July 7, 2009. Organizations present were NDHSAA Board, NDIAAA, NDHSCA, NDOA and NDHSAA staff . All organizations represented agreed the apprehension of a potential official shortage in the near future is genuine. Cited reasons are:

- A large percentage of current pools of officials are nearing retirement
- Although respectable numbers of new officials are registering every year, more than 60% do not return for a second season
- The shortage will appear first in the more rural areas but major cities also believe they will be affected as well

Reasons cited by the committee:

- Time of games causing officials to leave work early
- Cost of getting started in officiating
- Giving up Friday and Saturday nights
- Unruly behavior by fans and coaches

What the committee recommends:

- Media Blitz "The Good Things About Officiating"
- Officials bringing a potential new official to rules clinics
- · Brochure endorsed by all organizations involved
- Reach out to high school students
 - Dual Credit for PE Officiating classes
 - Presentations at camps
- Reach out to coaches at the coaches' convention and rules clinics
- NDIAAA will devote a session at the fall conference in September
 - Policing coaches and fans

- Giving younger officials an opportunity
- NDOA will look at developing a mentoring program for young officials

The committee requested to hold another meeting after the fall season to assess the progress. Moe was assigned to set up the meeting following the fall season. Ranum asked if there was an issue of some officials associations making it difficult for new officials to get game assignments and asked if there is something that can be done. Carlsrud indicated schools are not always receptive to new officials as they wish to continue to hire the veteran officials. Moe added their school is planning to hire a five-person crew for two of their football games as well as a few of their basketball games where they are hiring a three-person crew. Each game, they are asking the officials to bring a newer official to work with the veteran officials.

Moe reported on a request submitted by Swiontek concerning the setting of the number allowed to be dressed on the sidelines for football playoff games. The request is:

- a. 9-man 40
- b. Division A 50
- c. Division AA 60
- d. Division AAA 70

The Football Committee advised an adjustment to the recommendation to be:

- a. 9-man 40
- b. Division A 50
- c. Division AA 55
- d. Division AAA 60

There is a safety concern over the number on the sideline. Motion by Looysen to approve the Football Committee recommendation. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: Maus - yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Moe – no, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Ulland – yes, Helvik – yes, Ranum – yes, Schatz – no. Motion passed 8-2.

Maus asked if the Awards Committee should address the increase in number of players dressed for post-season football and how it relates to awards. Schatz assigned the staff to make key fobs available for the extra coaches and the school will be billed for those awards. The Tournament Committee will also address how to conduct these awards ceremonies and how rosters are listed in the programs.

The Executive Secretary gave a report on their July 17th meeting with the Medical Advisory Committee. From that meeting was a formation of a transfer of care form. Following further review by the committee, approval will be requested at the September meeting. The Executive Secretary was directed to have the form reviewed by NDHSAA Attorney Thune.

An update was requested concerning the situation of an injury which occurred at the B Girls' State Basketball Tournament. No change has happened since the report was given at the previous Board meeting.

Staff member Solberg presented the recent issues arising from the use of new technology suits for swimming. The swimming and diving coaches expressed concern at the NDHSCA convention in Mandan and asked to have these two items as recommended by the S&D Advisory Committee be placed on agenda for NDHSAA Board approval Thursday:

1.Legal competitive suits shall be:

- a. Boys no more than navel to knees
- b. Girls shoulder to knees (no arm coverage)
- c. Both genders only one suit may be worn (may be a drag suit)

At this time, the coaches have not addressed the material of the suit as other swim codes have done by restricting to "textile" material. We will wait for direction from the National Federation. Motion by Looysen to approve the recommendations as presented. Second by Jacobson, unanimous.

2. The leadoff leg of a relay should be considered for a state record and asked the adoption of this change in the State Meet Manual be retroactive. If the Board approves, coaches have the opportunity to check if they have someone in this position from previous state meets.

Motion by Eastgate to approve the request. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: Maus yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Moe – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Ulland – yes, Helvik – yes, Ranum – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion passed unanimously.

The Board discussed the number of Board members that are unable to attend the next regularly scheduled meeting. Motion by Eastgate to change the date of the meeting from September 22^{nd} to 23^{rd} with the Finance Committee meeting scheduled for the evening of the 22^{nd} and the Football Committee meeting prior to the Board meeting on the 23^{rd} . Second by Ranum. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: Maus - yes, Looysen - yes, Jacobson - yes, Moe - yes, Sanstead - yes, Eastgate - yes, Ulland - yes, Helvik - yes, Ranum - yes, Schatz - yes. Motion passed unanimously.

There was no Board correspondence to report.

Eastgate asked about the timeline for the replacement of the Assistant to the Executive Secretary position. The timeline is in place and progress will be presented by the Personnel Committee at a later date.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

- a. The offer still stands for any Board member who takes the on-line coaches education as provided by the National Federation may voucher the expense which will be paid by the NDHSAA.
- b. We have a high percentage of sub-varsity coaches who are not on staff and would benefit from taking this course.
- c. There are 138 coaches that have taken the blended coaches education course which is a five unit course. The total taking the strictly on-line course is 322 coaches.
- d. The Board was sent replacement pages for the Policy Manual.

The Executive Secretary presented a building update. Upon adjournment, the Board will tour the building.

With no further business, motion by Looysen to adjourn. Second by Helvik. A hand raise vote was taken resulting in the motion passing unanimously.

President Ron Wright called the meeting to order @ 11:57 AM with Richard Peterson, Don Martindale, Brad Nold, and Troy Huber attending.

President Wright welcomed all and especially new board members who were present, Don Martindale and Brad Nold.

Martindale moved to approve minutes of the February meeting. Second by Huber and motion carried.

A discussion concerning the upcoming board term vacancies and representation was held. Geography, sport representation and registration in one sport of a board member's portfolio were brought forward for consideration.

The board welcomes nominations or personal requests from individuals who would like to serve on the NDOA Board (Nominations will be from the NE or NW). One board position is to be filled from the NW or NE as Ron Wright will have completed two terms.

Brad Nold and Ron Wright will serve as the NDOA nominating representatives.

The Board reviewed some efforts regarding the Recruiting Officials' Blitz (ROB) as described in the 2009 February Minutes:

- The cooperation of the North Dakota State Media outlets was terrific
- Troy Huber's development of a ROB Brochure

With the winter clinics beginning October 7th, the Board recognizes ROB is a "journey" versus a "destination" as help is needed from all parties to create a new awareness for winter sports officiating. Please do what YOU can.

The board noted that officials in smaller towns are needed and that will be promoted through the ROB presentations and encourage athletic directors to set up more sub-varsity workshops.

Active Officials' Awards – Baseball, Perry Olson; Boys' Basketball, Rob Kueneman, Fargo; Girls' Basketball, Mark Ukestad, Jamestown; Football, Steve Conley, Bowman; Gymnastics, Tara Hofmann, Bismarck; Hockey, Mike Eslinger, Minot; Soccer, Dave Maier, Bismarck; Swimming, Lori Hahn, Williston; Volleyball, Jackie Walby, Dickinson; Wrestling, Justin DeCoteau, Bismarck. Peterson moved to accept the Active Officials' Awards. Second by Martindale and motion carried.

Martindale noted the cost of living increase according to Social Security Income Cost of Living Adjustment is 5.8% and moved the officials' fee schedule be increased 2.5%. Second by Huber. Motion carried.

A discussion was held concerning the basketball fee for sub-varsity where more than 16 minute halves are played; no action was taken.

Peterson moved to induct Ron Thue, Williston, ND into the NDOA Hall of Fame. Second by Nold and motion carried.

The consensus is that each group has different needs so sometimes the agenda works and sometimes not. The Board encourages workshop supervisors for ALL sports to "view the field" to determine the needs of the group each is serving. Some suggestions for workshops:

- Use scrimmages for workshops
 - o Lower level intra-squad scrimmages work well for inexperienced officials
 - o Upper level intra or inter-squad scrimmages work well for experienced officials
- Utilize expertise of the experienced officials to help teach
- Encourage workshop supervisors to join NASO for teaching and other resources
- Film study

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association **Board of Directors** September 23, 2009 - Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on September 23, 2009 at the NDHSAA office in Valley City. President Schatz called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all members present except Swiontek.

Following additions and deletions, motion by Looysen to approve the agenda. Second by Sanstead and carried.

The Board reviewed the minutes of the August 6, 2009 regular meeting. Motion by Jacobson to approve the minutes. Second by Ranum and carried.

The Executive Secretary presented the finance report. Motion by Ulland to approve the report. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Moe - yes, Ulland - yes, Ranum - yes, Jacobson - yes, Maus - yes, Sanstead - yes, Eastgate - yes, Looysen - yes, Helvik - yes, Schatz - yes. Motion carried, unanimously.

President Schatz presented a report on behalf of the Executive Committee. The Board reviewed the quidelines for cooperative applications. Attention was brought to number 7, the last sentence, "No coop applications will be considered by the NDHSAA Board of Directors after the following dates:" The Committee recommended the statement be edited to read,

"Coop applications are due in the NDHSAA office by the following dates:

- i. Fall Sports-----June 1st, prior to start of season
- ii.Winter Sports-----September 1st, prior to start of season iii Spring Sports-----January 1st, prior to start of season

Coops will be acted on at the Board meeting following each date."

Rationale: Coop applications are currently being submitted by Sept 1st rather than having all action completed by the date. With the revision, coop applications are now due to the NDHSAA by the previously listed dates. Coops will be acted upon at the meeting which follows each deadline date. Coop applications from schools with existing programs must continue to be submitted by the end of the preceding season or the late fee is applied. Moe stated this would clear up any misunderstandings with due dates. The committee also reviewed the policy requiring the application to be on the website two weeks prior to it being acted upon (page 11, Article 11). The committee suggested deleting the 2 weeks on the website requirement. Moe asked if the purpose of that requirement was to allow schools to respond. It was noted no responses have occurred to this point with any coop that has been posted. Motion by Jacobson to adopt the new deadline statement and eliminate the requirement of posting a coop application on the website two weeks prior to it being acted upon. Second by Ranum. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Ulland – yes, Ranum – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried, unanimously.

The Board reviewed a request for dissolution of cooperative sponsorship programs for McClusky and Drake-Anamoose in football, 7-12, 2010-2011. Supt. Lee Kelm of McClusky appeared before the Board to give an update of the process of moving all cooperative sponsorships to be with Central McLean. Eastgate asked for clarification if this would be for the 2010-2011 year. Jacobson indicated by dissolving this coop, it would not change the football plan. Helvik asked for point of clarification, is this setting a precedent with the BowmanCounty/Scranton coop. Looysen stated this is in the middle of a two year plan. Motion by Maus to deny the dissolution and to have the current program continue for the remainder of the two-year football plan. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Ulland – yes, Ranum – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried, unanimously. Supt. Kelm was encouraged to request the removal of grades 7 and 8 and request a new coop at a future meeting.

- h. Grand Forks Public Schools and Fisher, MN in boys' swimming and diving 2009-10. Motion by Jacobson to approve. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Moe yes, Ulland yes, Ranum yes, Jacobson yes, Maus yes, Sanstead yes, Eastgate yes, Looysen yes, Helvik yes, Schatz yes. Motion carried, unanimously.

President Schatz shared he had denied a request from a member school to consider a hardship appeal by conference call. The Board had previously indicated they wished to discontinue addressing this type of situation via conference call in favor of a face-to-face meeting.

Representatives from Scranton appeared before the Board to appeal a decision concerning their application for dissolution of a football coop with Bowman County. Supt. John Pretzer, Prin. Kelly Pierce and three board members were present to ask the Board to reconsider the recent decision to deny the dissolution of the Bowman County and Scranton Football coop and the football coop application with Hettinger. It was suggested application of dissolution of the 7th and 8th grade part of the current coop to allow them to play their own junior high football may be a solution to part of the situation. Motion by Eastgate to deny the appeal. Second by Jacobson. Until its elimination, the committee further recommended that employees that have retired and have or will reach age 65 during this two-year period will receive Medicare supplement (Schedule F) as a benefit.

Motion by Eastgate to approve the recommendation of the committee. Second by Ulland. The Board heard a request from Grafton to approve the use of a shot clock for non-conference/non-district games. The experiment of the use of the shot clock for Division B may continue until further review. Second by Sanstead. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Ulland – yes, Ranum – yes, Jacobson – no, Maus – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Helvik – yes, Swiontek – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried, 10-1.

The Executive Secretary reported on the results of a requested study to develop a regulation giving a deadline for schools to declare intent for participation in sports that use statewide scheduling. The staff crafted a regulation to address this issue:

For those sports involving statewide scheduling, the following dates shall be applied to member schools that are declaring intent to sponsor that activity:

- o Fall sports: June 1, prior to the start of season
- o Winter sports: September 1, prior to the start of season
- Spring sports: January 1, prior to the start of season

Any member school not having declared intent in writing to the NDHSAA office by the deadline date and therefore not included in a statewide schedule may compete with an independent schedule but shall not be eligible for post-season competition that season.

All NDHSAA and NFHS rules and regulations shall apply to all teams sanctioned by NDHSAA and sponsored by the member school.

Motion by Jacobson to approve. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Ulland – yes, Ranum – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Helvik – yes, Swiontek – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary directed the Board to a letter from Hazelton-Moffit-Braddock asking to waive a late fee for a coop application with Linton for boys' and girls' track. Motion by Maus to deny. From this meeting, because of the reported Social Security Income Cost of Living Adjustment of 5.8%, the NDOA is requesting the Board to consider a 2.5% increase in the recommended fee schedule. Motion by Helvik to table until the November meeting. Second by Swiontek. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Ulland – yes, Ranum – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Helvik – yes, Swiontek – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried unanimously. Carlsrud was directed to bring an adjusted officials fee schedule reflecting this proposed increase to the November meeting.

The Executive Secretary indicated to the Board a tournament policy adjustment. State softball should be added to the points list for life-time passes consideration for state tournament managers. Motion by Sanstead to add State softball to the list with a value of 3 points. Second by Ranum. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Ulland – yes, Ranum – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Helvik – yes, Swiontek – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a Charitable Cause policy proposed by the staff. This was necessitated by schools requesting to waive uniform rules, etc when hosting a charity night at a basketball game. Motion by Maus to accept the policy with the addition the NDHSAA set the week to allow this. Second by Looysen. After discussion, the motion and second were withdrawn. The Board directed this policy, as proposed, will be in place until the Board indicates any change:

Schools may host a contest in recognition of a charitable cause under the following conditions:

- 1. The contest or competition may be held during any one week, to be determined by each individual school, of the designated sport season.
- 2. A commemorative ribbon may be worn, properly placed on the jersey or school-issued uniform. Uniforms must conform to National Federation rules, including colors.
- 3. Team members may be allowed to wear headbands or wristbands of a solid non-regulation color.
- 4. Officials may be allowed to use a colored whistle.
- 5. Colored game balls will not be allowed, however they may be used during any warm-up period prior to the contest.

Swiontek reported the Northeast athletic administrators conducted a survey regarding the movement of the girls' basketball season to be the last tournament. This will be included in the Executive Secretary report.

The Executive Secretary presented his report.

- 1. A letter was sent out to the regional schools from Four Winds to inform them they will be playing an independent schedule in football.
- 2. BEK Communications of Steele has purchased the television rights for State Wrestling for \$2,000 and State Volleyball for \$1,000.
- 3. At the NDIAAA conference there was a discussion to switch the order of the Division B girls' and boys' basketball seasons. The Division B region chairpersons were asked to survey the member schools concerning this issue. At the present time, there is no proposal that has been brought forward concerning these seasons.
- 4. Received a letter from Supt. Johnson of Lisbon expressing concern as to how the current H1N1 will affect the handling of school contests, regular season as well as post-season.
- 5. A letter was received from the Principal at Shanley concerning the State A Girls' Golf Tournament. The letter was asking for a contingency plan in the event of inclement weather.
- 6. Moderators for the upcoming District Chairpersons meetings need to be selected. Volunteers were sought:

November meeting – Ranum March meeting – Maus

The Board held audience with Supt. Koppelman of Valley City concerning a three-class plan with encouragement to reconsider the possibility of proposing a plan. Supt. Koppelman thanked the Board for all they do for the young people of North Dakota. Supt. Diegel of Edgeley also spoke on the three-class subject. The purpose of the audience is to bring forward the letter that had been submitted requesting consideration for a three-class system for volleyball and basketball. Swiontek indicated the letter would need to actually ask for a vote for Board action. Jacobson referred to the points of concern that were expressed during a survey of the member schools that was conducted last year. Swiontek stated this is something that should come from the membership rather than from the Board. With no motion, there was no further action.

The membership meeting which will be held the next day was discussed.

With no further business, President Schatz declared the meeting adjourned.

- 2. North Dakota is well represented on National Federation sports rules committees:

- 4. On the previous day, the Board approved continued use of the shot clock in Division B basketball for non-conference and invitational basketball tournaments. Teams involved must have prior mutual agreement of all teams for the use of the clock.
- 5. The Board approved a transfer of care form which will be available at NDHSAA post-season tournaments. This will allow parents of an athlete involved in a tournament to have their private medical care provider to sign a release of on-site medical services and allow a family's own medical service provider to care for their athlete.
- 6. The Finance and Personnel Committee annually reviews the team payment plan. In the past, \$50,000 from general fund was added to team payments. In the future, there will no longer be money withdrawn from the reserve.
- 7. The new two-year football plan has been sent out to the member schools. A survey will be sent to the member schools to help in setting guidelines for the football plan. The time-line has been approved for the completed plans.
- 8. Over 500 coaches have completed the National Federation coaches education program. Coaches involved in this education program have been encouraged from and, at times, supported by member schools as there is no mandate for these coaches to be involved in this program. The Board has approved the formation of an ad hoc committee to study coaches' education and the direction to take with these programs. The Board feels a need to protect educationally based athletics. The Committee will be comprised of members of organizations affiliated with the NDHSAA:
 - a. NDCA exec dir

- b. NDHSCA
- c. NDIAAA
- d. NDHSAA
- e. Two NDHSAA Board member
- f. Medical Advisory Committee

This committee has been charged with determining the direction of coaches education.

- 9. NDOA has recommended a 2.5% cost of living increase to the officials recommended fee scale. This was tabled to allow the Board to receive input from member schools.
- 10. The Officials Recruitment program was implemented this year. Brochures have been developed and are available to members following the meeting.
- 11. The Board has received word that Four Winds will be playing an independent schedule for the 2010 season. The membership is reminded of the regulation that would eliminate teams involved with independent scheduling from post-season consideration.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board a proposed membership application form for approval. The Board has been made aware the staff will be using an application form for the purpose of record keeping with graded elementary schools.

Swiontek reported on behalf of the Fine Arts Committee:

Item 1. Held audience with Bismarck Public School music teachers. They requested a change to the number of vocal entry allotments for A music contests. Recommended: Increase the overall A allotment for vocal music entries at the regional events to 90 events per member high school and advance 50% at the regional to the state competition. This item will also be placed on the fine arts review committee's agenda at the spring meeting.

- Item 2. A instrumental MVP registration report. Brian informed the committee there has been some resistance by advisors in the state to using this system but he has reminded those advisors the NDHSAA has already endorsed the mandatory use of the system.
- Item 3. A 9^{th} grade music participation is an issue for the large school districts that have middle schools with 9^{th} grade students. This was also discussed in item 1 as well. The committee did not have a problem with 9^{th} grade students participating with their respective high school as long as the districts followed their district attendance boundaries.
- Item 4. Brian reported the NDHSAA office has received some complaints from the member schools regarding MVP registration for Fine Arts Activities Report. Some districts have stated it is very difficult to register students. Brian stated that Brenda and he have been working on the problems, but overall it is working well. The committee reaffirmed its position that anything new is going to have some minor issues but they will be worked out and the system will be an excellent program for the entire state.
- Item 5. Brian provided some information regarding the regional drama competition in which two schools tied for 1st, but the tie breaking procedure was not used at that level. Through use of the rule, a reversal of places caused the 2nd place team to be awarded 1st place. There was no action by the committee, as this will be addressed by the full board.

Staff member Bubach reported to the Board about a situation at Region 5 plays in which New Rockford-Sheyenne had been erroneously rewarded first place and Griggs County Central second place at the region one-act play competition. New Rockford-Sheyenne is requesting the tie not be broken and two first place awards be given. Using the past practice of tie-breaking, Bubach's determination was the tie is upheld and the places and trophies are switched. Moe asked how much time transpired before this was called to the attention of the association. Motion by Jacobson to sustain the decision. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken:

MINUTES Class B District Chairperson's Meeting 9:00 A.M. – November 20, 2009 Minot Holiday Inn

(Items advanced to NDHSAA Board listed following minutes)

The Class B District Chairpersons met at 9:00 a.m. on November 20, 2009 at the Minot Holiday Inn. Chairman Ranum called the meeting to order with all districts present. Chairman Ranum welcomed the district representatives and thanked them for representing their respective districts.

Following introductions, the Executive Secretary thanked the representatives for being an important part of the process. He indicated he will be passing out information sheets to be completed by each district for the 2010 district volleyball chairperson, 2010 district volleyball site and manager, and 2010 regional volleyball site recommendations.

Chairman Ranum indicated they would hear the recommendations from each district beginning with District 1. The district representative as indicated presented their district's recommendations:

District 1-----Rick Jacobson, Wyndmere HS, Supt.

- 1. Implement a mercy rule in basketball -- A running clock would be utilized when there is a point spread of 35 points or more at the end of the third quarter or thereafter. Once begun, the running clock will be stopped only for team, official, or injury time outs, and for technical fouls. Once a 35point differential is reached the running clock will continue even if the differential falls below the 35 points.
- 2. Equal representation of officials for regional tourney between the two districts involved. Example if there are four officials used for the regional tourney then two of them should be from one district and two should be from the other district.
- 3. NDHSAA should determine the color of the volleyball for next year.

The group was asked for straw vote on #1 & #2:

#1 – Dist. 4 Chairman Herman asked if this would affect Class B only. Jacobson indicated – yes, he would assume this to be only for their division. Staff member Carlsrud asked NFHS Exec. Dir. Becky Oakes to review how the mercy rule worked when she was the Executive Director in the Missouri Association. Oakes indicated they found it was a sportsmanship issue. Herman stated it might not change attitudes and asked if the running clock in football is a good thing. Some were concerned it may become a management rule difficult to educate schools to understand the rule.

The Executive Secretary was asked to review where the District Chairpersons' recommendations go after there is a majority vote at the current meeting. It was also clarified a recommendation can be reviewed earlier than the January board meeting which is as past experience. Dist. 2 Steve Hall asked

if the mercy rule would be applied to varsity or sub-varsity. It was decided this was in general for all levels. Dist. 8 Manley stated the mercy rule in football is harder to understand than basketball.

#2 Equal representation – Jacobson indicated too many times teams have a referee at regions that neither district has seen. Dist. 14 Lunde indicated you would be eliminating a large pool of officials to move on through the system. Staff member Carlsrud shared the background and process for selection of officials.

#1 - Chairman Ranum reviewed the schedule for girls' and boys' bb for the 2010-2011 year. Discussion followed. Dist. 7 Wiberg indicated there are possibly better options than the switch. Dist. 11 Marshall asked to figure out a way to resolve it by leaving as planned. Also discussed was move volleyball season one week earlier. Dist. 3 Aanenson suggested moving football one week later would cause another week so you can move volleyball one week earlier. Dist. 2 Hall stated with the switch, a lot of things are in place and why would we change the decision when we have not yet tried it. The Executive Secretary indicated with the switch, the venues were in place so nothing was changed administratively so to reverse the switch would be as easily done. Dist. 14 Lunde pointed out the discussion held indicated the media and venues should not be determining the tournaments. We followed the process to address the problem and now that it is time, is this what we want to do without trying it? Dist. 4 Herman indicated the number of times the pre-season practice for basketball is being interrupted by more than just the state volleyball as there are music activities, etc. The Board has worked on this for quite some time and we should follow through. Where were we before? Dist. 12 Person states, in a simplistic form, do you want to give the girls a break or do you want boys' state basketball tournament in Fargo or Bismarck. The boys are anxious to get into the gym and the girls are tired. Dist. 1 Jacobson indicated something needed to be done.

- If this is not possible because of National Federation rules, then North Dakota should propose to the Federation to allow states to set weight classes as they see fit.
- 2. District 8 is in favor of not switching seasons for girls and boys basketball effective the 2010-11 season.

#1 Duals have become small making it difficult for schools to fill 14 wt. classes, 12 would be easier. Carlsrud shared the National Federation Wrestling Rules Committee is coming forward with three wt class plans that will be sent out to the states. The Board held audience with Supt. Wayne Trottier of Four Winds. Also present Eric Longie, Board president, Chip Anderson, principal and head girls' coach and Justin Yankton, Sec/ Treas of the Spirit Lake Tribe. The request of the Board was to appeal the penalty as assessed by the Executive Board at the November, 2009 meeting. The penalty was for the use of an ineligible player during the second semester of the 2007-2008 year in boys' basketball. Members of the community were also present to support the appeal. Supt. Trottier suggested a monetary fine rather than the punishment that affects the present boys' basketball athletes for a violation which took place three years earlier. Following the audience, the Board asked questions and comments. Maus stated although the decision affected kids, it was a decision that had to be made. Supt. Trottier was asked to explain the "oversights" and how this will not happen in the future. Supt. Trottier indicated he will be made aware of any situations in the school which, in the past, he was not informed. There will now be a system of checks and balances with more than one person being responsible to determine eligibility of any student that transfers into the school district. There is now an annual eligibility review. Also being offered is an after-school program to emphasize the importance of scholastic eligibility. The school and athletes have already experienced consequences by returning awards, etc. Ranum asked Dr. Trottier if he was aware the then athletic administrator actually knew they were using an ineligible student. Jacobson asked Dr. Trottier what he felt would be an alternate penalty rather than ineligibility of postseason. Jacobson asked if post-season district play could be allowed if the team was not allowed to advance further than district. President Schatz stated there needs to be a penalty. The Executive Secretary suggested if the Board wished to accept the appeal, should the decision of a penalty go back to the Executive Committee. Ulland stated it appears Four Winds is cleaning house and asked is there going to be an assurance that things will change? Board members expressed a reluctance to overturn the decision of the Executive Committee. Dr. Trottier assured the Board situations will be dealt with swiftly in the future. Eastgate emphasized any decision of the Board that affects students is not taken lightly and the Board has been put in a position in which they had to address the decision. Motion by Swiontek to reinstate Four Winds boys' basketball for the 2009-2010 post-season. Second by Looysen. Ranum asked for clarification as to whether the forfeiture of trophies and other consequences would stay in place. It was agreed that would stand. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland - no, Swiontek - yes, Ranum - yes, Sanstead - yes, Eastgate - no, Looysen - yes, Jacobson - no, Maus – no, Moe – no, Helvik – no, Schatz – yes. Swiontek reported on the Coaches' Education/Certification Committee meeting which took place December 3, 2009. It was stated North Dakota was one of the few states that did not require some form of certification for coaches. This is becoming more important as there is an increase in the number of coaches that are from outside the school system. Maus asked if this movement might be something that should be implemented by the individual schools rather than the NDHSAA Board. Swiontek clarified the function of this committee is in the best interest of the student athletes of North Dakota. Moe informed the Board although the coaches association has encouraged coaches certification, the group does not have the power to do some type of requirement. He also indicated the NDIAAA met and they were in support of coaches' education. They feel the time has come to do so. Jacobson pointed out this is the right thing to do. Some coaches probably should not be coaching and if they do not wish to go through the time to certify, that should be a concern. This Coaches' Education/Certification Committee will meet again April 14, 2010. Looysen indicated it would be important to get the support from all the education organizations.

The Board held audience with a delegation from Washburn to hear an appeal to a decision in which eligibility was denied a transfer student. The Executive Secretary made available to the Board letters sent that further explain the appeal. First presentation was Supt. Brad Rinas, Washburn, also Brad

Sheldon, School Board and Mr. & Mrs. Clayton. Following Supt. Rinas' presentation, the floor was open to the Board for questions. Swiontek asked staff member Carlsrud to report on the investigation he conducted and what caused him to believe there is a dual residence present. Motion by Jacobson to deny the appeal. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Swiontek – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ranum – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried 10-0 (Moe abstained from the vote).

President Schatz reported on behalf of the Executive Committee:

- a. Washburn violations Two violations in which ineligible student participated were reviewed. The Committee set a penalty of \$500 fine and probation for one calendar year for all programs plus forfeiture of all contests in which the ineligible students were involved.
- b. Central Valley reported their boys' basketball team played in a scrimmage prior to the season. The penalty set will be probation for one calendar year for the boys' basketball program.
- c. Belfield ineligible player The penalty set will be forfeit of all football games and any boys' basketball games in which the ineligible student participated and probation for one calendar year for the Belfield football and boys' basketball programs.

Moe presented a report regarding the Football Committee:

Guidelines are being considered by the NDHSAA Football Committee for the administration of the current football plan and the development of subsequent two – year football plans

- 1. Football plans shall be established for two years.
- 2. Football seasons for plan purposes will be 2011 and 2012.
- 3. There will be 4 divisions of football. (AAA, AA, A, 9M)
- 4. Enrollments for plan development purposes will be determined by:
 - a. Fall 2009 male enrollments for grades 7 10 as provided by the Department of Public Instruction shall be used except as stipulated below.
 - b. The host school shall be that school with the largest enrollment for plan purposes.
 - c. When schools have equal enrollments, the largest enrollment of the host school will be the determining factor for division placement.
 - d. In all school districts that have 60% or more of its student body qualifying for free and reduced meals, 60% of the 7 10 male enrollments will be used for the development of this plan.
 - e. Private / BIA school enrollments will be determined by using the 2009 2010 male enrollments in grades 9 12 as reported to the Department of Public Instruction.
- 5. Schools may request to move up to a higher division if the next smaller enrollment school in that division is willing to move down and so on. Request for division assignments as of March 1. 2010 are final.
- 6. The maximum number of teams in the top three divisions will be: AAA = 14, AA = 16, A=32 with the remainder of the teams in 9 man.
 - a. If a school chooses to play an independent schedule or discontinues football during the two year plan, the number of teams in that division will not be changed.
 - b. Any varsity team that chooses to play an independent team will be ineligible for the playoffs.
 - c. If a co-op is approved, realignment in any of the top three divisions may be allowed with consideration given to the geographic location of schools involved in the change.
- 7. BY LAW REMINDER: Football coops must be submitted by September 15th of the previous year during both years of the two-year football plan.
- 8. The NDHSAA Board of Directors shall have final say in the administration of these guidelines.

Swiontek asked along with the free and reduced meal program, was there was any discussion of a correction factor for private schools? Moe indicated this was not part of the current proposal. Motion by Helvik to approve the guidelines and report. Second by Looysen. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Swiontek – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ranum – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a letter from Rod Backman, Chairman of the ND Census Committee with a request for Board to consider allowing them to have a booth at tournament with no fee. Motion by Swiontek to deny. Second by Maus. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Swiontek – yes, Sanstead – no, Ranum – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – no, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Moe – no, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried, 8-3.

Ranum reported on behalf of the Tournament Committee:

- a. Because Valley City no longer has a coach for their gymnastics program, it is suggested by the committee the site of the 2010 State Gymnastics Meet be moved from Valley City to Jamestown. Motion by Jacobson to approve the change. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Swiontek yes, Sanstead yes, Ranum yes, Eastgate yes, Looysen yes, Jacobson yes, Maus yes, Moe yes, Helvik yes, Schatz yes. Motion carried unanimously.
- b. The practice of throwing items into the stands during tournaments was discussed. The committee felt it important the policy banning this practice will be emphasized with tournament managers, schools, coaches and teams.
- c. The proposed sites for the 2013-14 tournaments as recommended by the committee were reviewed. Motion by Jacobson to approve the recommendations of the Tournament Committee. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Swiontek yes, Sanstead yes, Ranum yes, Eastgate yes, Looysen yes, Jacobson yes, Maus yes, Moe yes, Helvik yes, Schatz yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Swiontek spoke on behalf of Devils Lake High School requesting a change in the regulations for junior high basketball. The original recommendation was to change the number of games from 12 games and one tournament to 16 games and remove the one tournament limitation. Discussion followed. Motion by Swiontek to change current regulation to 15 games and eliminate regulations with a reference to the less than 50 enrollment in the 7th and 8th grade. Second by Maus. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – no, Swiontek – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ranum – no, Eastgate – no, Looysen – no, Jacobson – no, Maus – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – no, Schatz – no. Motion failed 4-7.

Motion by Ulland to have further study of the junior high regulations conducted by NDIAAA. Second by Eastgate. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Swiontek – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ranum – no, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – no. Motion carried, 9-2.

The Board discussed requests from Divide County and Napoleon to reconsider the rule involving the 16 consecutive weeks a student can play in a basketball season and allow them to break up the 16 weeks rather than consecutive. It was suggested by Maus the NDIAAA may wish to discuss this. Motion by Swiontek to deny the request to change the 16 consecutive week regulation. Second by Ranum. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Swiontek – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ranum – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion to deny carried unanimously.

Swiontek reported on behalf of the Fine Arts Committee

- 1. Fine arts certification. Upheld regulation to require certified judges for advancement of teams to the state event.
- 2. The committee is moving toward correcting region alignments so a school would have all fine arts programs in the same region. Presently, there is one school, Max that wishes to continue their split assignment.
- 3. Class A entries moved from 60 to 90 for region vocal music contests.

Looysen reported on behalf of the Finance Committee:

1. Staff salaries, 2010-11 - The committee recommended a 4% raise for the Executive staff with an additional 2% for Solberg as per a previous agreement. Also recommended a 3.5% increase for assistants Carlsrud and Bass and a 5% increase for assistant Prosby.

Motion by Helvik to approve the committee recommendation. Second by Eastgate. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Swiontek – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ranum – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

- 2. Building updates The new office is completely remodeled with décor left in the meeting room. There has been an offer on the old building but the offer is less than remodeling costs. The committee recommended a counter offer to meet a minimum of the remodeling cost.
- 3. Finance Review There has been some discussion from member schools about team payments and there may be proposals brought forward in the future. With purchases of the building and decrease of interest income, there is continual support of the current team payment plan.
- 4. The committee recommended the acceptance of the letter of retirement from staff member Solberg as of June 30, 2012. Motion by Jacobson to accept the recommendation. Second by Sanstead. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Swiontek yes, Sanstead yes, Ranum yes, Eastgate yes, Looysen yes, Jacobson yes, Maus yes, Moe yes, Helvik yes, Schatz yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board discussed the current retirement contributions policy. This was referred to the Finance Committee for further study.

Sanstead reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee.

Result of the ballot count for the Class A East position: Todd Olson – 89 / Andy Dahlen – 43 Result of the ballot count for the Class B Northeast position: Kirk Ham – 102 / Wayne Trottier – 40 Motion by Ranum to accept the report of the Canvassing Committee. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Swiontek – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ranum – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary reported on the National Federation Officials Association. North Dakota is a 100% membership state. Benefits associated with this membership were reviewed. There are 1290 officials registered in North Dakota. The NFOA has started a video training program using Arbiter Sports. There is a fee asked of states to be involved in this endeavor. This will be on the agenda for the Board in March following the NDOA meeting in February.

The Board reviewed the results of the Class A Review emphasizing:

- 1. Softball exemption 5 years with a date ending August 31, 2014
- 2. Baseball exemption 3 years with a date ending August 31, 2012

These recommendations along with the sport specific advisory committees and the Class B District Chairperson recommendations will be addressed at the March meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported several requests from member schools to waive the restriction of no more than two games per week followed by a school day to allow schools to reschedule games which have been postponed because of the weather. Motion by Looysen to approve the waiver only for games postponed because of weather. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Swiontek – no, Sanstead – yes, Ranum – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – no, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – no. Motion carried, 8-3

Staff member Bubach reported on an appeal from West Fargo to allow a late registration. Motion by Helvik to deny. Second by Jacobson. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Swiontek – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ranum – yes, Eastgate – yes, Looysen – yes, Jacobson – yes, Maus – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Board correspondence was reviewed:

- a. Ellendale
- b. National Federation distribution

Representative Reports

Ulland indicated there are still some schools that are not certain whether the Class B girls' and boys' basketball seasons have been switched. The membership will be reminded at the General Assembly meeting this is in effect for the 2010-11 year.

Discussion was held concerning the General Membership meeting. The agenda was reviewed. A quorum requires 50 member schools. If a quorum is established, business can be conducted. In

anticipation of a possible amendment, the Board reviewed if an amendment to a proposed amendment would be passed at the assembly, this would nullify any electronic vote.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

- 1. In the Board folder, the result of balloting for region and state basketball officials shows the return of ballots. There were a number of schools that did not return their ballot.
- 2. Currently there are 12 applications for the upcoming Assistant to the Executive Secretary opening.
- 3. West Fargo High School investigation revealed the City of Fargo had determined the subject of the investigation had vacated their home in Fargo which is in violation of the zoning laws for businesses being run in a residential area.
- 4. There is a concern hockey officials are boycotting region tournaments because of the lodging policy for regional tournaments where rooms are provided as needed. A number of hockey officials are demanding lodging for all nights rather than driving and refuse to officiate the regional tournament. A brief Officials Committee meeting will be held following the Board meeting to discuss this issue.
- 5. Gave a brief report on the hardships investigations and how the rulings were made.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 12, 2010 in Bismarck.

With no further business, President Schatz declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES Annual Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association January 28, 2010 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Representative Assembly Meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held Thursday, January 28, 2010 at 9:00 A.M. at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. President Schatz welcomed the membership, called the meeting to order, and declared a quorum had been established. Dr. Wayne Sanstead was present to serve as parliamentarian for the meeting.

President Schatz introduced the Board of Directors and staff to the assembly.

Supt. Rick Diegel, Edgeley introduced an amendment to Part Two, Article II, Section III, Section IV of the Constitution & By-Laws to read:

ARTICLE II - CLASSIFICATION OF SCHOOLS

SECTION I: Class A Schools:

- a. This group shall consist of all member high schools with a total enrollment of 325 or over, and/or an enrollment of 160 or more pupils in an all male school in grades 9-12, inclusive as of October 1, 1974, plus any member high school that elects to choose Class A as provided in paragraph (b), (c) and (d) herewith.
- b. Any high school with a total enrollment between 200 and 324 in grades 9-12, inclusive on October 1, 1974, may elect to join Class A for interscholastic competition by written notice to the Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association before January 1, 1975.
- c. After classes are established on January 1, 1975, a member school having a total enrollment of more than 199-and less than 325 in grades 9-12, inclusive must give two years notice to the Board of Directors to change its classification. Such choice must be made not later than September 1st of any year and shall become effective with the opening of the fall term two years later. Schools that elect to become Class A schools must remain in that classification for a minimum of three years before they may again apply for reclassification. Provided further, when the total high school enrollment in grades 9-12 drops below 325, and/or the enrollment in an all male school in grades 9-12 drops below 160, that school shall have one year of grace in which to choose its class of competition. Should an A school drop below 200 in enrollment in grades 9-12 and continue below 200 for two consecutive years, this school must be reclassified as a B school. Should a school rise above 324 in enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive and continue above that figure for two consecutive years, this

school must be classified as an A school unless waived by the NDHSAA Board of Directors upon a showing that the projected enrollment in grades 9-12 will be less than 325 in the first year of such reclassification as an A school.

d. Should a new high school be established in an existing district or area, whose enrollment in grades 9-12, inclusive, exceeds 324,the two year waiting period stated in paragraph (c) above shall be waived and the school shall be immediately classified as an A school.

SECTION II: Class B School: All member high schools, other than those designated Class A, shall be classified as Class B schools.

SECTION III: Where there are two classes or divisions for competition in NDHSAA sponsored events, school classification (325 and above for class A, 324 and below for class B) will be used and member schools must compete within their school classification (325 and above for class A, 324 and below for class B) in NDHSAA regional and state events.

SECTION **III-IV**: The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association is authorized to combine classes in all athletic or non-athletic contests and festivals if it appears expedient and desirable. (Oct. 2007)

*To be implemented July 1st, 2010

Motion by Supt. Rick Diegel, Edgeley to approve the amendment. Second by Supt. Mitch Carlson, LaMoure.

Motion from the floor by Supt. Mike Ness, Hazen to amend the date of implementation to read July 1, 2011. Second by Supt. Wade Faul, Griggs County Central. Members of the assembly including Supt. Jeff Fastnacht, Ellendale; Ath. Dir. Curt Jones, West Fargo; Ath. Dir. Todd Olson, Grand Forks; Supt. Diegel, Edgeley; and Supt. Mitch Carlson, LaMoure addressed pros and cons of the amendment to the amendment. Roll call vote was taken. The amendment to the amendment failed, 34-44.

Discussion continued on the original amendment. Members of the assembly that spoke included Supt. Diegel, Edgeley; Supt. Dean Koppelman, Valley City; Supt. Terry Erholtz, Wishek; Supt. Royal Lyson, Center-Stanson and Ath. Dir. Ed Lockwood, Fargo Public Schools. A roll call vote on the original amendment was taken. The amendment passed, 73-33.

Athletic Director Lorell Jungling, Mandan introduced an amendment to Part Two, Article XII, Section I, of the Constitution & By-Laws.

SECTION I: A student participating in NDHSAA sanctioned athletic events and representing his/her school must have on file with the superintendent, principal, athletic director or school nurse an annual Athletic Pre-Participation Health History Screening and Physical Examination form completed by a qualified health care professional (i.e. Doctor of Medicine or Osteopathy, Nurse Practitioner or Physician Assistant under the supervision of a physician) prior to participation; physical examinations or health history screening updates must be completed on or after June 15 for the current school year. FORM: A physical examination is required by a Medical Doctor, Doctor of Osteopathy, Nurse Practitioner or Physician Assistant. The front page (the health history screening) is to be completed by the student and parent/guardian. The back of the physical examination form is to be completed by the individual conducting the physical examination.

INTERPRETATIONS SECTION I

This Article requires a physical examination as stated in Article XII of all prospective athletes. Parental consent is required before any athlete is permitted to participate in high school athletics.

The purpose of this section of the By-Laws is to protect the athlete from undiscovered physical weaknesses which might be aggravated by strenuous physical activity and also to protect the school administration from possible legal action charging negligence in permitting participation without a doctor's certificate of fitness. School administrators will keep records of the physical examination and parental consent on their files.

Deletes: A student being physically fit to participate in such activities will require a screening every two years. The Health History Screening must be updated year two by the student and parent/guardian; any change in the Health History Screening (from previous year) will require a physical examination year two;

Adds: the word annual in line three.

Changes: In the last line the amendment proposes a change of April 15 of the past school year to June 15 of the current school year.

Motion by Jungling to approve the amendment. Second by Calvin Dean, Dickinson.

Athletic Director Calvin Dean, Dickinson introduced from the floor an amendment to the amendment.

Amended Amendment to Part Two, Article XII, Section I of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws

SECTION I: Prior to participation (including practice), a student participating in NDHSAA sanctioned athletic activities and representing his/her school must have on file with the superintendent, principal, athletic director or school nurse an annual NDHSAA-approved Athletic Pre-Participation Health History Screening and Physical Examination form completed by a qualified health care professional (i.e. Doctor of Medicine or Osteopathy, Nurse Practitioner or Physician Assistant under the supervision of a physician); the Athletic Pre-Participation Health History Screening and Physical Examination is valid for one school year; a physical examination completed before June 15 is not valid for participation the following school year.

FORM: A physical examination is required by a Medical Doctor, Doctor of Osteopathy, Nurse Practitioner or Physician Assistant. The front page (the health history screening) is to be completed by the student and parent/guardian. The back of the physical examination form is to be completed by the individual conducting the physical examination.

INTERPRETATIONS SECTION I

This Article requires a physical examination as stated in Article XII of all prospective athletes. Parental consent is required before any athlete is permitted to participate in high school athletics. The purpose of this section of the By-Laws is to protect the athlete from undiscovered physical weaknesses which might be aggravated by strenuous physical activity and also to protect the school administration from possible legal action charging negligence in permitting participation without a doctor's certificate of fitness. School administrators will keep records of the physical examination and parental consent on their files.

Motion by Dean to accept the amendment to the amendment. Second by Jungling. Members of the assembly spoke to this amendment including Supt. Tom Rettig, Medina, Ath. Dir. Lorell Jungling, Mandan, Supt. Hy Schlieve, Drayton, and Ath. Dir. Mike McCall, Wahpeton. A voice vote on the amendment to the amendment carried with one voicing a dissenting vote.

A roll call vote on original amendment as amended carried, 69-7.

Dr. Sanstead reported on behalf of the Canvassing to announce the results of the ballots:

- 1. Membership to the Board of Directors from the Class B Northeast Region for a four year term Kirk Ham, Park River.
- 2. Membership to the Board of Directors from the Class A East for a four year term Todd Olson, Grand Forks.

Board member Moe presented a report on behalf of the Football Committee. Guidelines and timelines were shared with the membership, highlighting the recent changes. The finalization of the plan is dependent on receiving enrollment and free and reduced meals programs from the Department of Public Instruction. Timelines include April 1 with preliminary plan, June 1 dissolutions, September 15 deadline for new coops and October the final plan will be presented at the General Assembly meeting.

The Executive Secretary gave his report:

- 1. At the October meeting, there was reference to the National Federation Spirit of Sport which is on the website. Member schools are encouraged to nominate a student from their school who would fit the profile outlined in this program.
- 2. Seventy-five schools have renewed their sportsmanship program. This is a low number in comparison to the number of member schools.
- 3. Yesterday the Board approved a waiver of the 2 games per week with the provision the rescheduled game is because of a weather postponement.
- 4. Reminder in 2010-2011 the boys' and girls' Class B basketball seasons are switching. The boy's season will begin Nov. 15th and the girls' season Nov. 29th.
- 5. There is a committee in place to discuss coach certification and what direction should be taken requiring certification of coaches.
- 6. The Board heard a request to change the junior high basketball limitation from 12 games and one tournament to 15 games and to drop the 50 enrollment regulations. There is a committee that will study this for further consideration.

- 7. Also, a request was made to allow junior high students to break up their season rather than counting their weeks of eligibility consecutively. That request was denied.
- 8. The membership was encouraged to go on the website and review the recommendations that come from the various sport advisory committees as well as the district chair recommendations and Class A Review recommendations.
- 9. Currently 12 applications have been received for the Assistant to the Executive Secretary position that will open beginning July 1, 2010.
- 10. Announced the resignation of staff member Solberg as of June 30, 2012.
- 11. Announced staff member Carlsrud's retirement as of June 30, 2010. The membership showed their appreciation and thank you for Carlsrud's work with the NDHSAA.
- 12. Thank you to the membership as well as President Schatz and the Board for their work.

President Schatz declared the meeting adjourned.

> Class B District Chairperson Meeting March 19, 2010--9:00 A.M. Minot Holiday Inn Riverside

The Class B District Chair meeting was held on March 19, 2010 at the Minot Holiday Inn Riverside. Chairman Maus called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all districts represented.

Chairman Maus welcomed the district chairpersons and thanked them for representing their district. Each representative introduced themselves and identified their district.

The Executive Secretary thanked the member schools for their past service to the member schools. Sheets were passed around to allow each member to complete information on the 2011 Girls' District chairperson and region site recommendations as well as 2011 Boys' District chairperson and region site preference. The group was reminded the April Board meeting is the time the region sites are set and information from the districts assist in this process.

Chairman Maus reminded the group the recommendations require a majority vote for it to be forwarded to the NDHSAA Board for consideration.

Each member presented the recommendations from their respective districts. Votes were taken on various recommendations. Where no vote is indicated, no vote was taken.

District 1-----Rick Jacobson, Supt. Wyndmere

1. Implement a coaching box for basketball. Volleyball coaches appear to be up moving around already.

Staff member Carlsrud stated with the uniform rule, coaches' box, and other rules in the National Federation rule book, enforcement must be from the top down. Administration can be a determining factor in the implementation and enforcement of these rules. Until rules such as properly wearing a legal uniform are enforced by the coach and administration we cannot rely on enforcement of these rules by officials. Many of these items should never get out of the lockeroom.

2. Reduce weight classes from 14 to 12 especially in Class B. With this many weight classes, too many forfeits were occurring this past year.

The weight class issue is something that is being studied by the National Federation. The committee recognizes the problem and is studying not only reducing the number but what weight classes will constitute the reduced number. The membership was cautioned in thinking of deviating of the National Federation rules. The National Wrestling Coaches Association data base is being implemented to determine which weight classes could possibly be dropped. Wiberg from District 7 indicated the reduction of weight classes has been brought up for the past several years and it has been voted upon at previous meetings. Lunde stated schools are worried about their sport and coaches are heavily in favor of going to 12 classes. The North Dakota wrestling coaches feel the 105, 112, 119, 126, 132, 138, 145, 155, 167, 185, 205, 285. They weight classes should be understand crossing state lines could cause difficulty if other states do not have the same weight classes. Carlsrud asked if there was any talk about a different number of classes. Several districts indicated their wrestling region talked about 12 weight classes. Wiberg indicated if we deviate from the rule, it would be in the best interest of the wrestlers. Aanenson from District 4 indicated there was talk about going back to the original 12 prior to the time the number of classes was increased to 14. Lunde indicated there is a need to determine the number of weight classes and put people in place to determine those classes.

VOTE - to reduce the weight classes to 12 with no particular weights specified. (16-0)

District 2-----Steve Hall, Supt. Kindred

1. Summer Baseball Coaching Rule -- eliminate summer baseball coaching rule & set defined allowable baseball coaching dates of Mar. 15-Sept. 15.

The Executive Secretary indicated this is being addressed by the Class A Review. No vote was taken.

The Executive Secretary shared the results of Board action on the recommendations that came from the previous District Chair meeting in November, 2009.

District 3-----Patti Aanenson, AD Larimore

No recommendations at this time.

District 4-----Matt Fetsch, AD Grafton

1. Make a 35-second shot clock mandatory for all Class "B" GBB and BBB games beginning in 2011-12.

It was clarified this recommendation is for varsity games. Supt. Cascaden of District 15 stated their district is opposed to the expense of installation and securing an operator. Ath. Dir. Peggy Person of District 12 and Supt. Andrew DeCoteau of District 9 indicated their districts were opposed. Person shared they hosted a four-team super Saturday using the shot clock. The shot clock went off once during those games.

2. Move Class "B" boys and girls golf to the fall beginning in 2011.

Overwhelming support came from their district. Supt. Jacobson stated flooding can be an issue with spring golf. Supt. Tom Rettig of District 5 stated with spring golf, teams play into good weather and in fall golf, teams play into bad weather. Aanenson shared their district had mixed reviews but will never know if it works until it is tried. Ath. Dir. Mitch Lunde of District 14 said a decision to move golf to the fall would result in three opportunities to compete in the fall and only one in the spring. Ath. Dir. Brandt Gaugler of District 13 shared concern with going from two sports in the fall and two sports in the spring to three and one could cause a problem.

VOTE – Move boys and girls' golf to the fall beginning in 2011. (9-6)

3. Switch to 16 minute halves for all 9-12 basketball and 12 minute halves for junior high basketball.

This would work with games in Minnesota where they are using the half timing. Lunde stated 16 minute halves are better than 18 because of the number of athletes in the Class B programs. Jacobson shared with quarters, there are more stoppages for coaching. Supt. Cascaden asked how would this work with quarter limitation? It was clarified the limitation for Class A is three halves per night. Ath. Dir. Person indicated she had difficulty voting without discussing this with the district members.

VOTE – Change to 16 minute halves for high school and 12 minute halves for junior high (3-12).

District 5-----Tom Rettig, Supt. Medina

No agenda items at this time.

District 6-----Les Dale, Supt. Ashley

No agenda items at this time.

District 7-----Jason Wiberg, AD Lakota

1. Change the region basketball and volleyball set-up so that the #1 team in each district is the home team in each bracket. VOTE (4-12)

District 8-----Kevin Baumgarn, Supt. Munich

1. Request discussion on holding the region 3rd place game.

There seems to be a lack of respect for the game from some teams if they are not playing for a state tournament berth. Ath. Dir. Fetsch indicated he felt coaches like the third place game if they themselves are in the championship because it builds up the excitement. Supt. Cascaden indicated we should not want to take away the chance for a team to win a trophy by eliminating the third place game.

District 9-----Andrew DeCoteau, Supt. Solen

1. Region/State voting for officials should be sent to the AD and coaches.

There were some coaches that indicated they did not receive a ballot.

- 2. Shot Clock District not in favor
- 3. Halves instead of quarters District not in favor
- 4. Mercy Rule What's happening with the study?

The group indicated they wish to have the staff explore what other states utilize the mercy rule and the details of the rule. This information will be obtained from the National Federation website.

District 10----Rodney Scherbenske, Supt. Goodrich

1. District 10 is asking why is there a different ratio for advancement to State Music between Class A and Class B.

Staff member Bubach shared with the regions more closely adhering to the rules, there should be some data coming that will help in determining the quota percentage.

2. With the number of transfers, there are concerns with families moving to a different district and starting their children in that school district. Once the students establish eligibility, the parents return to their original city of residence, leaving their children eligible in their new school.

District 11-----Malcolm Marcus, AD, TGU Towner

1. A pay scale for 3 man officiating crews.

Staff member Carlsrud reminded the group in issues where the number of officials change, the fee schedule is a maximum recommendation. Schools can pay the maximum amount or a negotiated amount. Prin. Gaugler indicated their school always pays the maximum fee. Aanenson shared they pay three for varsity and pay for two for JV, allowing the officials to use a three-whistle and split that amount among the three. Brandt indicated they rarely have three-whistle for basketball or 5-whistle for football because there are not enough officials in the area.

2. Change the boys and girls seasons back to the way they were in two years.

Ath. Dir. Lunde stated it is difficult to vote when the process is in place but we have yet to implement it. VOTE - (1-15)

District 12----Peggy Person, AD, Lewis & Clark Berthold

- 1. No out-of-season coaching rule for baseball: where will we find the coaches for summer baseball?
- 2. Coaching box for basketball? Seatbelt rule? Let's have the rule fit the practice (or vice versa).
- 3. Point of discussion. There are different coaches with various demeanors that are standing during a basketball game. Discussion followed. Carlsrud shared that until administrators buy into the rules concerning bench decorum, uniforms, etc. we should not depend on officials to correct these issues which actually should not reach the court.

District 13-----Brandt Gaugler, Prin/AD, Beach

No further recommendations.

District 14----Mitch Lunde, AD, Beulah

1. MVP website -- Fines/legal issues discussion.

Discussion was held.

2. Remove the underline section. Junior high students may compete on both the junior and senior high teams providing they conform with the regulations in 6, 7, and 8. However, once a junior high student in a school with a 7th and 8th grade enrollment of 50 or more competes on a high school team, he/she no longer is eligible for the junior high team.

This is on the agenda at the NDIAAA spring conference.

3. Wrestling -- All minimum weight and 2% request be calculated to the tenth, as digital scales read.

This would be for consistency as there is a need for a clarification. Carlsrud informed the group this type of recommendation will be coming from the Wrestling Coaches Advisory Committee.

4. Wrestling-- 12 weight classes

No further discussion on this recommendation.

District 15----Steve Cascaden, Supt. Parshall

1. Shot clock - Hard to come up with someone to run it and cost.

As a point of discussion, sportsmanship is going by the wayside. Fans are using unsportsmanlike conduct as an intimidation factor which is unacceptable. Ath. Dir. Brandt shared they had a discussion about this issue at their district tournament. There is an increasing practice of student fans gathering on the endlines for unsporting reasons.

District 16----Celeste Thingvold, Prin/AD, Bowbells

1. Vote for regional and state basketball officials during the season instead of in the fall. This has been previously discussed.

The Executive Secretary gave a review of those recommendations that carried sufficient votes to be brought forward to the NDHSAA Board of Directors:

- 1. Reduce weight classes from 14 to 12.
- 2. Move boys' and girls' golf to the fall beginning in 2011, 9-6 vote.

Carlsrud shared information concerning the mercy rule being used by other states. These samples from other states will be sent to the districts for study.

Chairman Maus thanked the group and declared the meeting adjourned.

- First Aid and Safety (If completed after the 2007-08 fiscal school year, it will satisfy the requirement for the first Coaching Permit certificates beginning in 2012-13)
- Maintain current CPR Certification

Renewal, Coaches must renew:

- Every 5-years 8 approved contact class hours will be required
- Verification of approved contact hours must be provided

Temporary Emergency Permit:

- The Temporary Emergency Permit will be valid for the fiscal school year in which the permit is issued and may be re-issued only once
- A school administrator must request the Temporary Emergency Permit by submitting the appropriate form (form to be developed) to the NDHSAA

The Committee will continue the development of this program.

The Board adjourned for lunch.

President Schatz called the meeting back to order with all members present except Swiontek.

Jacobson reported on behalf of the Realignment Committee: Glen Ullin submitted a request to change their district assignment because the county in which they reside has changed to Central Time zone. They are assigned to a district in which the remainder of schools is on Mountain Time zone. A request from Park Christian to dissolve their football program with Fargo Oak Grove was discussed. President Schatz assigned this to the Football Committee to meet prior to the beginning of tomorrow's meeting to provide a recommendation.

Staff member Carlsrud reported to the Board of recent information received concerning the request of an experiment for reduction of weight classes in Class B wrestling. The National Federation is currently working on what can be done for smaller programs providing 12 weight classes rather than

the current 14 weight classes. Discussion was how to decide which recommendation would be acceptable and how to proceed to request permission from the National Federation to conduct an experiment with a revised weight classification. The Board agreed to delay action on the wrestling issue until more information can be obtained.

Once the discussion of recommendations concerning the altering of weight classes was finished, Moe asked to have this issue moved forward with a study committee. Staff will form a plan.

Following review of the advisory recommendations, Swiontek asked Carlsrud if the boycott of regional hockey by the Grand Forks hockey officials has improved. Carlsrud indicated the situation is better. The Executive Secretary indicated NDHSAA attorney Thune is working on a contract that would help eliminate this type of situation.

The Board discussed the previously approved recommendation from the Basketball Advisory Committee for the use of the shot clock for Class B girls' and boys' basketball. President Schatz adjourned the meeting until Tuesday, June 22nd at 9:00 a.m.

President Schatz called the meeting back to order June 22, 2010 at 9:00 a.m. with all members present except Jacobson.

Staff member Schell presented a technology update and the technology plan for the 2010-2011 year.

- Online rules clinics began with baseball this spring. The online clinics will continue this fall
 with soccer, cross country, play, student congress and swimming & diving; winter with
 basketball, music, drama, wrestling and speech; spring track & field. The following year will
 be the remaining clinics.
- Online testing is now being housed with ArbiterSports.
- MVP up-date we have been using MVP 2.0 and will be moving to MVP 2.1 which will again be an improvement in which it will add stability and speed.
- Tech Plan: Same format as previously used.

Motion by Ranum to approve the technology report and the 2010-2011 technology plan. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken: Swiontek – yes, Looysen – yes, Ranum – yes, Ulland – yes, Maus – yes, Eastgate – yes, Sanstead – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion passed, 10-0.

Carlsrud presented information concerning the Board's questions on the proposed reduction in the number of wrestling weight classes. There is a possibility of requesting permission from the National Federation for an experiment. NF wrestling liaison, Bob Colgate indicated the best chance for approval of an experiment would be to use NFHS weight classes and eliminate two. Suggested weight classes to be eliminated are the 135 lb. and 189 lb. classes. Using the NWCA data, the 189 lb. weight class has the greatest number of forfeits. The 285 lb. weight class has the second greatest number of forfeits but recommend not eliminating that weight class because it is too close to the 189 lb. class. The weight class to eliminate which would be more equally distributed among the range

would be the 135 lb. class. It was recommended to survey the Class B Coaches on this proposal and create a report to the Board at the August meeting. Motion by Eastgate to approve the report and continue the implementation of the Class B wrestling weight proposal. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken: Swiontek – yes, Looysen – yes, Ranum – yes, Ulland – yes, Maus – yes, Eastgate – yes, Sanstead – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – yes. Motion carried, 10-0.

The Board held audience with a group introducing a new plan for a Three-Class system for basketball and volleyball for the 2011 and 2012 school year. Representing Edgeley, Valley City, Fargo, Grafton, Enderlin, Beulah, Barnes County North, Griggs County Central, Jamestown, Drayton, Richland, Wyndmere and Lewis & Clark, Berthold was Supt. Rick Diegel of Edgeley who presented the plan. Also addressing the Board were Supt. Dean Koppelman of Valley City and Ath. Dir. Jim Roaldson of Jamestown. The Board thanked the group but reiterated if this plan is to be approved, it must be membership driven. Supt. Koppelman asked the Board to approve a vote of the membership to be taken at the October meeting. If the membership shows favor with the plan, the presenting group would take it to the member schools to answer all questions. Motion by Maus to allow this group on the agenda for a presentation and administer a binding roll call vote of the member schools at the October General Assembly meeting. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Swiontek – yes, Looysen – yes, Ranum – yes, Ulland – no, Maus – yes, Eastgate – yes, Sanstead – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Schatz – no. Motion carried, 8-2.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

- 1. In the Board packet is a report on the rulings for hardship applications for the year.
- 2. A copy of the participation survey is included in the folder. These reports reveal the number of participants as compared to the previous year. Sports participation is down 247 and Fine Arts shows an increase of 325.
- 3. The Board received a copy of a letter from the Fargo Public Schools with a list of programs that Davies High School will participate in NDHSAA sanctioned events at the varsity level.
- 4. A phone call has been received from Jeff Fastnacht, Ellendale indicating he is willing to honor the appointment to fill the Board vacancy for the Class B Southeast for the 2010-2011 year.

Eastgate thanked Maus, Jacobson and Schatz for their four years of service.

President Schatz declared the meeting adjourned.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

A. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is computed on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset which range from Three to twenty years. The Association capitalizes all significant equipment and building additions. The Association does not capitalize costs associated with its web site.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash equivalents include time deposits, certificates of deposits and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

E. Financial Statement Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Boards in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted assets and permanently restricted net assets. In addition the Association is required to present a statement of cash flows.

F. Income Tax Status

The Association is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Association is not a private foundation.

G. Investments

Under SFAS No. 124, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

H. Designation of Unrestricted Assets

It is the policy of the Board of Directors of the Association to review its plans for future property improvements and acquisitions from time to time and to designate appropriate sums of unrestricted net assets to assure adequate financing of such improvements and acquisitions.

5. PENSION PLANS

Three professional employees participate in the North Dakota Teachers Fund for Retirement (TFFR). Once these employees terminate their employment at the Association no other employees will be allowed to participate in TFFR. One professional and all clerical employees participate in a tax deferred annuity program. Employer contributes 16.8% of the employee's salary as determined according to TFFR. Total expense for the Association for the year ended June 30, 2010 and 2009 was \$90,109 and \$84,593 respectively.

7. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Association is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets; errors or omissions; injuries to employees; or natural disasters. The Association participates in the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund (NDIRF), a public entity risk pool for its general property and casualty and other miscellaneous insurance coverages. The NDIRF operates as common risk management and insurance program for North Dakota cities and schools. The Association pays an annual assessment to the NDIRF for its general insurance coverage. The NDIRF agreement provides that the Trust will be self-sustaining through member assessments and will re-insure through commercial companies for claims in excess of certain limits for each insured event.

The Association also carries commercial insurance for certain other risks of loss including employee health insurance. Settled claims resulting from these risks have not exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three years.
