North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors August 5, 2010

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association held their meeting on August 5, 2010 in Valley City. President Ranum called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all members present except Looysen and Fastnacht. President Ranum welcomed the new board members.

Following additions, motion by Helvik to approve the agenda. Second by Moe and carried unanimously.

The Board was supplied the minutes of the June 21, 22, 2010 meeting for review. Motion by Sanstead to approve the minutes as read. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken. Eastgate – yes, Swiontek – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Ulland – yes, Ham – yes, Olson – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report beginning with the 2009-2010 year-end balance sheet, detailed budget and investment report which was made available prior to the meeting for review. For further review, the Executive Secretary introduced Harold Rotunda who appeared before the Board to report on the audit for the 2009-2010 year. Motion by Eastgate to approve the audit report. Second by Sanstead. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Swiontek – yes, Ulland – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham - yes, Ranum – yes. Motion passed unanimously.

The Board continued reviewing the balance sheet, budget and savings and investment reports. Also, detailed reports from each tournament were provided to the Board along with an overall spring sports financial report. A five-year financial report of fine arts was available for review. The 2009-2010 t-shirt sales report was reviewed. An overall review of five years of revenue divided into three seasons was presented and discussed. It was noted there is a downward trend for winter activities. Swiontek asked about television and webcasting and how it has an effect on attendance of the winter activities. Ulland asked about the tennis expenses and the reason for the high cost of tennis. The Executive Secretary was asked to present a television and webcasting impact on the association finances for the previous 5 years. This will be presented at the September meeting. Motion by Ham to approve the finance report. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Swiontek – yes, Ulland – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham - yes, Ranum – yes. Motion passed unanimously.

The Board reviewed a letter from Hazen asking to table the request from Beulah to dissolve the baseball coop between the two schools. The Board indicated with the request to dissolve, there is the possibility of unequal numbers between regions. The alignment committee was asked to review the region assignments. Motion by Swiontek to dissolve the Beulah/Hazen coop for baseball. Second by Ulland. Moe clarified the scheduling for the 2011 baseball regular season is usually done in February. Helvik asked if Hazen could sponsor a team on their own. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – no, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Swiontek – yes, Ulland – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham - yes, Ranum – no. Motion carried, 7-2.

The Board reviewed the application for the following cooperative sponsorships:

a. Bismarck Public Schools and Kidder County (Steele-Tappen) in softball, 9-12, 2010-2011 (no late fee). This request had been tabled from the June meeting for clarification of which program those cooping students would participate.

Motion by Eastgate to approve the application. Second by Olson. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Swiontek – no, Ulland – no, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham - no, Ranum – yes. Motion carried, 6-3.

- b. Heart River and Richardton-Taylor in boys' golf, 7-12, 2010-2011 (no late fee).
- c. Heart River and Richardton-Taylor in girls' golf, 7-12, 2010-2011 (no late fee).

Motion by Helvik to approve. Second by Olson. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Swiontek – yes, Ulland – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham - yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

President Ranum reported the Executive Committee has determined the coop applications received for Bishop Ryan and Sawyer for boys' and girls' cross country would not be heard because they were submitted after the deadline.

Eastgate asked for a clarification of the by-law rule concerning wrestling and cross country coops which are not required to move to Class A competition if their total enrollment exceeds 325. This was a by-law that was approved by the membership.

Staff member Fetsch informed the Board of the progress of the study of 12 weight classes for Class B wrestling. This was discussed by the advisory committee and it was determined to delay any action. The National Federation is currently studying the weight class designation. As a result, in 2010-2011, Class B wrestling will retain the current system of 14 weight classes and wait to see what the National Federation will do.

Ranum reported on behalf of the Finance Committee. A request was made to review the vacation policy and how it effects staff members in retirement. The committee recommended to reimburse Carlsrud for ten additional days that were not originally counted. Motion by Helvik to approve the recommendation. Second by Eastgate. Discussion continued. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Swiontek – yes, Ulland – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham - yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a letter from Devils Lake requesting the Board to allow Devils Lake to remain in the AA division for the next two year football plan. Motion by Moe to deny. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes, Sanstead – yes, Eastgate – yes, Swiontek – no, Ulland – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham - yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried, 8-1.

The Executive Secretary reported on the progress of concussion management. The National Federation has formed language to address the procedure in the event of a possible concussion. Part of the language alludes to "an appropriate health-care professional". There is a need for the NDHSAA to determine what the state policy will be that determines who is an appropriate health-care professional. The Board was asked to seek a recommendation from the Sports Medicine Committee to determine what health-care professionals would be included in this statement. It was the consensus of the Board to allow the committee to pursue this.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board the National Federation Medical Advisory Committee has declared composite bats immediately illegal. A number of schools last year used composite bats. Also established by the National Federation is a new standard (BBCOR) for all bats which is based on the performance of wood bats, which goes into effect in 2011-12. Staff member Fetsch indicated the sporting goods manufacturers are asking for a wood composite bat waiver for the 2010-11 year. At that time, the list of bats that meet BBCOR standards will be produced.

The Executive Secretary shared with the Board a letter of resignation from the Board of Directors submitted by Eastgate. Board members shared their appreciation for Eastgate's service to the North Dakota High School Activities Association. Eastgate replied with appreciation for the opportunity.

Board reviewed correspondence from Rick Roberts (radio name) concerning the transfer rules. Swiontek pointed out the inaccuracies in the letter and asked President Ranum to respond to the allegations in the letter.

The request from the Softball Advisory Committee to split post-season into Class A and Class B was discussed. The Board previously approved a separate state tournament for Class B when there are 12 programs.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board a group is continuing to prepare a three-division proposal for presentation to the membership for a vote at the October General Assembly meeting.

Staff member Schell reported to the Board the progress of online rules clinics. To this date, the process has been going well.

The Board was issued the 2010-2011 Constitution & By-Laws, Policy manual and nametags for upcoming post-season tournaments.

The Executive Secretary shared the association is currently in the final year of the three-year contract for our catastrophic insurance agreement.

President Ranum reminded the Board of an upcoming conference call concerning the recommendations which will be received from the Sports Medicine Committee on a concussion policy.

The Board discussed next meeting date of September 21st with a time to be determined. Swiontek indicated the North Dakota Study Council is a conflict and asked for a change of the date. The Board agreed on changing the date of the Board meeting to September 14th.

Moe reported on the NDHSCA convention. Coaches' education was well received. The NDHSCA Executive Board conducted a ballot on the feelings of the coaches if they were in favor of maintaining the summer coaching rule or to rescind this rule. The results were 68% of the coaches wished to retain the current rule.

Swiontek informed the Board of a program entitled "Life of an Athlete" developed by the New Mexico Association. More information on this program will be brought to the September meeting.

With no further business, President Ranum declared the meeting adjourned...

Motion by Ulland to deny the appeal. Second by Swiontek. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary introduced Cheryl Wavrin from the Red River Valley Immunization Coalition and Anita Sherwin from Innovis Health. They appeared to request the NDHSAA pre-participation form include an immunization review section. Currently there are two age groups for immunizations. The first is required for sixth grade students but as parents are allowed to exempt their children from immunizations as high school students this has lowered the percent of students that actually receive their immunizations. Motion by Swiontek to have the NDHSAA endorse this program. Second by Moe. Discussion took place concerning the Medicine Advisory Committee's work on the initial preparticipation. It was the opinion of the Board this consideration should be shared with the Sports Medicine Committee for their input. Swiontek and Moe withdrew their motion and second. This information will be shared with the Sports Medicine Committee for consideration prior to the October meeting.

President Ranum reported on behalf of the Executive Board meeting:

West Fargo will be contacted to produce an action plan for educating their coaching staff on rules and regulations. The action plan is to be presented to the NDHSAA office by October 19, 2010. The action plan must be implemented and reported to the NDHSAA Board of Directors by December 31, 2010.
- d. Fargo South reported the use o an academically ineligible participant in boys' soccer. The administration will be sent a letter of reprimand and shall forfeit contests in which the ineligible student participated.

This has been endorsed by the NDOA with the knowledge the liability for care of an athlete with a concussion lies with the student's school. After a thorough review of the report, motion by Swiontek to approve the procedure document. Second by Looysen. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Looysen reported on behalf of the Finance Committee

- 1. The committee will continue discussing the policy addressing unused vacation.
- 2. Retirement benefits and Teachers Fund For Retirement were discussed. The committee recommends changing the retirement benefit in the policy manual to read:
- XIII. Retirement Program
- C. Other Retirement

Employees not under the Teachers Fund For Retirement will be included in an Association sponsored retirement plan. The Association shall pay into the retirement plan the same percentage as both sides of TFFR (employee/employer) <u>capped at the 2009-10 rate.</u> That percentage shall be applied to his/her gross salary.

Motion by Ulland to approve the recommendation. Second by Helvik. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland - yes, Moe - yes, Swiontek - yes, Helvik - yes, Olson - yes, Ham - yes, Fastnacht - yes, Looysen - yes, Sanstead - yes, Auch - yes, Ranum - yes. Motion carried unanimously.

- 3. Health Insurance The committee requested the Executive Secretary to explore options for higher deductible insurance plans. The plan currently in effect is Select Choice 100 through Blue Cross Blue Shield with an anniversary date of December 31. The committee also recommended changing the following policies as shown below:
- X. Insurance
- B. Hospitalization for all full time employees
- 1. Blue Cross Blue Shield for family coverage (including major medical) Family health insurance will be furnished for each married employee and single coverage for unmarried individuals.
- 2. In the case of married individual whose spouse is working for another employer and has individual coverage, the association will pay the difference in premium for such coverage and a family policy. In the case the spouse is self-employed, Association will pay the difference between family coverage and individual coverage.

Motion by Helvik to approve the recommended changes in the policy manual concerning health insurance. Second by Auch. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Looysen excused himself from the meeting.

The Board held audience with Supt. Diegel of Edgeley to hear an update of the three class proposal they were sponsoring. Ham guestioned the A and B tournament plan with two champions playing an

additional championship and asked for clarification if this would be one division based on a challenge. Also discussed was the 1.4 weighting factor that is proposed to be applied to private schools. Motion by Fastnacht to have the Executive Secretary seek legal opinion on the weighted factor for non-boundary schools as well as an opinion if the proposal that is being presented is actually separating schools into two or three classes dependent on the tournament structure. Second by Auch. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – no, Moe – yes, Swiontek – no, Helvik – yes, Olson – no, Ham – no, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried, 6-4.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

- a. Open enrollment in relation to the transfer of home school students has come into question. It has been clarified the statue states home based education is eligible to compete in the school district in which they reside or a private school if accepted.
- b. A letter from Odean Olson of Premier Partner Farmers Union Insurance was shared with the Board. This is the third year of the current partnership contract.

The Football Committee, Coaches Education Committee and Realignment Committees are scheduled for October 12: 9:00 a.m. – Football Committee; 11:00 a.m. – Coaches Education Committee; 1:00 p.m. – Realignment Committee.

Swiontek reviewed the video course "The Life of an Athlete" which was produced by the New Mexico Association.

Olson brought to the Board a request to include a statement of consent to treat and who is responsible for medical treatment and a statement for parents to sign for approval to participate. The Board directed the Executive Secretary to work with Olson and share this request with the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee. This will be brought back to the Board at the October meeting.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on October 4, 2010 via conference call at the NDHSAA office in Valley City. President Ranum called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with 7 members present. The Board reviewed the applications for approval of the following cooperative sponsorship programs:

a. Four Winds, Tate Topa, and Warwick, Football, grades 7-12 beginning with the 2011-12 school year. Coop application was received by the September 15th deadline as per football guidelines. Motion by Swiontek to approve Four Winds, Tate Topa, Warwick football coop for 7-12, 2011-12. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Ham - yes, Helvik - yes, Moe - yes, Olson - yes, Sanstead - yes, Swiontek - yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously

The Board reviewed documents in support of an appeal of a denial of a football coop dissolution between Goodrich, Drake-Anamoose, and McClusky for the 2011-12 school year. A document dated October 26, 2009 requesting the dissolution of the Goodrich, Drake-Anamoose, and McClusky football coop for the 2011-12 school year was sent by McClusky Public School but not received by NDHSAA prior to the June 1st deadline.

Motion by Moe to reverse the 9/14/10 denial of the dissolution of the Goodrich, Drake-Anamoose, McClusky football coop for the 2011-12 school year. Second by Helvik. A roll call vote was taken: Helvik - yes, Sanstead - yes, Olson - yes, Moe - yes, Swiontek - yes, Ham - yes, Ranum - yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Ham to approve the dissolution of the Goodrich, Drake-Anamoose, McClusky football coop for the 2011-12 school year. Second by Olson. A roll call vote was taken: Swiontek - yes, Ham - yes, Helvik - yes, Moe - yes, Olson - yes, Sanstead - yes, Ranum - yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Helvik, to approve Turtle Lake-Mercer, McClusky, Underwood (Central McClean), football coop grades 9-12, for the 2011/12 school year. Second by Olson. A roll call vote was taken: Moe-yes, Swiontek - yes, Sanstead - yes, Olson - yes, Helvik - yes, Ham - yes, Ranum - yes. Motion carried unanimously.

MVP Sport Systems, LLC is the developer and host of the NDHSAA website. Mark Fidel, managing member of MVP Sports, LLC, has been funding MVP personally for the last year and has indicated he will no longer be funding MVP development. He has given NDHSAA 2 options concerning the purchase of the programming code for MVP. Discussions between NDHSAA and MVP indicate MVP would make these changes at the end of October. Rather than wait until the October regular board meeting, it was decided to deal with this now to allow time to react to changes. Three states now do business with MVP with each state in a different situation. New Mexico is using MVP 2.1, Virginia was set to open MVP 2.1 in January of 2011, and North Dakota is using MVP 2.0 with development in progress on the ND MVP 2.1 code.

MVP is offering NDHSAA pay \$15,000 to own MVP 2.0 (present code) and MVP 2.1 (existing future code). NDHSAA presently pays \$2,000 per month to MVP to develop, support and host website. The paid development and support side will go away. MVP will continue to host NDHSAA public and private sites for \$708/ month. This will free up \$13,000 through June 30th to either recover our \$15,000 investment or continue to develop MVP 2.1. For right now, programmers will charge up to \$100/hour for changes in programming. If we accept these terms, NDHSAA will be responsible for new development and support.

MVP 2.0 is up and running smoothly. The only upcoming times, to our knowledge we will need programming will be to deal with online rules clinics. All indications show this option to be as seamless as possible. If we don't do anything, we won't have a website.

This agreement will allow us to maintain MVP 2.0 as is. MVP 2.1 could be developed on-going as we feel necessary. It is important to NDHSAA and our member schools to keep our websites operating seamlessly. Original purchase price for both codes was \$20,000 and has been negotiated to \$15,000.

Questions were asked what other states were using. Website development and management differ greatly from state to state. The NDHSAA site is more interactive than merely informational. It is the request of the Board that schools will see normal operation. The tight timeline was questioned. The Board could wait until the October regular Board meeting to make a decision, however it would leave NDHSAA with a short window of time to react to changes.

Motion to table decision until the October 20, 2010 meeting made by Swiontek. Motion died for lack of a second.

Motion made by Helvik to purchase MVP 2.0, and MVP 2.1 code from MVP Sport Systems, LLC for 15,000. Second by Ham. A roll call vote was taken: Moe - yes, Olson - yes, Swiontek - no, Ham - yes, Helvik - yes, Sanstead - yes, , Ranum - yes.

Motion carried: 6-1

- a. Student Congress rules violation: A letter of reprimand will be sent to Devils Lake concerning a self-reported rules violation pertaining to lack of a judge's signature on the resolutions.
- b. Volleyball Violation: Our Redeemers use of an ineligible player, a 6th grade student played on the high school team. The decision was forfeiture of matches in which the student participated and a letter of reprimand sent to the school.

Swiontek reported on behalf of the Fine Arts Committee concerning a request from the Speech Advisory to not hire state plays judges that are contracted to judge region competition because of unintended favoritism. The committee felt removing region judges from State Plays competition would be fairer for competition and recommends the Board approve this recommendation with an immediate implementation. Motion by Looysen to approve. Second by Sanstead. Staff member Bubach was directed to work with the Fine Arts Advisory Committee to form prescribed penalties for fine arts violations.

The Board was presented with a letter from Jim Haussler, Bismarck Public School Athletic Administrator requesting permission for a student swimmer to compete in the USA Junior Nationals held during the high school season. As per the Constitution & By-Laws allowing this type of competition with Olympic ramification, motion by Olson to approve the request. Second by Looysen. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried.

The Board brought back to the table a letter from Cheryl Wavrin of the Red River Valley Immunization Coalition which had been reviewed at the previous meeting. The letter was asking the Board to approve the additional immunization information on the mandatory physical examination form. The Executive Secretary indicated the NDHSAA Medical Advisory Committee was contacted for input. The committee did not believe the immunization record should be included in the physical report, as this report is to indicate the student's physical fitness to participate in an activity. Fastnacht questioned if the coalition was asking a reminder being placed on the screening rather than a checklist. Olson

stated there are bullets on the current form not relevant to whether or not the student is able to participate. President Ranum stated there are other organizations indicating concern to bring immunization up to speed for every child. Helvik suggested this be delayed until the Sports Medicine committee is asked their opinion on adding a bullet under Physician Reminders rather than a questionnaire. It was the consensus of the Board to delay this item until the November Board meeting.

Helvik reported on behalf of the Realignment Committee's October 12 meeting in Valley City. Staff member Fetsch indicated schools have agreed there is a need to work toward a balance of baseball alignment. The committee reviewed the existing (2010-2011) Class B baseball regions and proposed recommending a new alignment for the 47 current baseball teams anticipated. A proposal in which seven of eight regions with six teams in each region except region 8 has five teams was reviewed. This will be placed on the agenda for the January meeting which is after the deadline for declaring a team for the 2011 season.

The committee also reviewed existing basketball and volleyball assignments. It was suggested looking at a proposal having 6 or 7 in each of the current 16 districts and 8 regions (some only have 5). A second suggestion was to look at having a proposal drawn up to have four regions, with each region having two districts. Fetsch is working on possible realignment for retaining 16 districts or the option of 4 regions with 8 districts and 2 from each region advance to state. These proposals will be made available to the committee at the next Realignment Committee meeting.

There was a discussion of academic requirements. The Executive Secretary reported on a meeting in Bismarck with the two Principals as well as the athletic administrator and a representative from Mary College for the purpose of discussing current academic requirements and the many changes in education. Questions are being asked concerning how the current academic regulations align with online classes and other means of obtaining high school credits. Currently, Minnesota has a virtual high school as approved by the Minnesota Department of Education. Sanstead was asked if there was anything in North Dakota addressing virtual schools. At this time, there is the Center for Distance Learning which would be similar to this. Olson indicated many accelerated students do not have courses available. Ham asked what the definition of "at the school" would be. Fastnacht shared there are students enrolled in their school courses from other parts of the state. Also shared was a situation involving a home school student who wishes to transfer to a school district that offers the activity in which the student wishes to participate. Olson asked what the Minnesota High School League is doing with requirements for eligibility through virtual school. Ham asked how this is different from the Center for Distance Learning. Currently this is being monitored via a traditional setting. The Executive Secretary indicated information from other states will be gathered prior to the Constitution & By-Laws Committee addressing these issues.

Swiontek reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee. The committee has set the proposed requirements for the first coaching permit:

- a. Fundamentals of Coaching from the NFHS website
- b. First aid course to include CPR
- c. Management of concussions as offered on the NFHS website

The question was raised what would be required of a person who had a coaching minor. The committee felt the requirements should be the same as any other coach. The committee also discussed how to collect the information. There will be a form to be completed by the local administrator to help track completion of the requirements. The Exec Sec will be reporting this study to the North Dakota School Boards Convention. The ongoing development of this plan has also been shared at the NDIAAA conference as well as the regional administrator meetings. The committee is looking at the 2012-2013 year for implementation date. The plan is to bring this to the full Board at the January meeting. Auch questioned what is included in the CPR course. The Coaches Education Committee will be meeting on November 19th at 11:00 AM in Minot at the Holiday Inn Express. A report will be given at the November Board meeting.

Moe reported on behalf of the Football Committee. Prior to the report, the Board held audience with Supt. Robert Thom of Westhope, Supt. Dave Wisthoff of Glenburn and Supt. Frank Schill of Cavalier. They were present to ask the Board to reconsider the placement of their football program. Swiontek

stated the Football Committee should be able to determine the best plan. If they wish to readdress this plan, that should be the Football Committee's decision. Moe indicated the committee attempted to do what was the best for the most schools. The Football Committee presented the 2011 - 2012 football plan.

- Division AAA will consist of largest 14 teams by male enrollment.
 - East and west regions.
 - Eight teams qualifying for the state playoffs.
- Division AA will consist of the next 16 teams by male enrollment.
 - East and west regions.
 - Eight teams qualifying for the state playoffs.
- Division A will consist of the next 32 teams by male enrollment.
 - Four eight team regions.
 - Sixteen teams qualifying for the state playoffs.
 - Harvey/Fessenden-Bowden petitioned up to the A division.
 - Velva petitioned up to the A division.
 - Considerable discussion was held on region assignments. Mileage comparisons from host schools were used to help make decisions on region assignments.
- The 9-Man Division will consist of the remaining 40 teams.
 - o Four ten team regions.
 - Guarantees a full schedule for all teams.
 - o Sixteen teams qualifying for the state playoffs.
 - This format will eliminate one round of playoffs.
 - An adjustment to the two year calendar is requested to the board.
 - Again, much discussion was held on determining region assignments. The availability of Missouri River bridges and mileage comparisons were key factors in decision process.
- The committee also discussed how the football timeline can be adjusted to better serve the development of the 2013 2014 plan.
- The committee discussed the viability of a six man division to keep football programs available in our smaller schools.

Motion by Ham to accept the entire football plan as presented. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – no, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – no, Sanstead – no, Auch – yes, Ranum – no. Motion carried. Motion carried, 7-4. This plan will be reported to the General Assembly at the October meeting.

Motion by Helvik to approve. Second by Olson. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried, 10-0 (Looysen had stepped out of the room).

Looysen reported on behalf of the Personnel and Finance committee's continuing work on the following policies from the employee benefits portion of the Board Policy Manual

a. Unused vacation day policy:

Direct the Executive Secretary to meet with the staff to determine the number of unused vacation days and discuss options regarding vacation time. The committee is exploring steps to eliminate banking of vacation days.

b. Health insurance:

There is a small increase in health insurance next year, so the committee recommended no change for next year. The committee will continue to work on changes to health

insurance. The health insurance anniversary date is December indicating a possible change in 2011 if research shows it is necessary.

As per Board request, NDHSAA Attorney Gary Thune was asked to review and edit the officials' contracts the association uses for post-season. It was recommended to the Board to adopt the contract as presented which would prevent officials from not signing one of the contracted tournaments but keeping the other. Motion by Sanstead to approve. Second by Ham. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

The Board heard a request from Devils Lake HS to review and perhaps propose an amendment to Article III, Section X of the Constitution & By-Laws. Swiontek clarified currently there is no request but is asking this be studied by the Board. Motion by Helvik to have Constitution & By-Laws study. Second by Fastnacht and carried unanimously by voice vote.

The Board reviewed the agenda for the General Assembly meeting. The Executive Secretary reported Attorney Thune had received an opinion by the Attorney General; any vote that generates change must be by roll call vote.

Discussion took place concerning the straw vote on the proposed three-class division which will occur at the General Assembly meeting. There may be questions and the Board should be prepared to react to questions. Looysen indicated the plan as proposed has been presented to the local school boards and questioned should there be a change in the plan after the local boards have made their decision as to how to vote.

The materials that will be made available at the General Assembly meeting were shared:

- The General Assembly agenda
- A Parent's Guide to Concussion in Sports

An extensive discussion was held concerning the Board's answers to possible questions from the assembly prior to the straw vote on the three-call proposal for basketball and volleyball.

Arrangements were completed for the upcoming November meeting as well as region and state functions leading up to that time.

Corrections were made in the Policy Manual to bring it up to date.

The Executive Secretary reported on the Executive Board's direction to West Fargo as to how they were to deal with out of season coaching and the sharing of information with their coaching staff. West Fargo Athletic Administrator Curt Jones prepared a Power Point presentation which he has shared with all members of the West Fargo Public School coaching staff. During this process, questions that arose from these meetings have been shared with the association. These questions will be addressed for further clarification of this rule. West Fargo took this on as directed by the Board and the process was thoroughly carried out.

The upcoming District Chair meetings in November and March were addressed. Moe volunteered to chair the November meeting and Helvik indicated he would chair the March meeting.

NDHSAA Attorney Gary Thune appeared before the Board concerning the request for an opinion on the multiplier which is being proposed in the current three-class system. The proposed plan will be addressed by the General Assembly meeting for a straw vote. Information received from other states was shared. Suggested is to garner statistical information to support whatever action the Board may take in response in the event the multiplier is part of an approved plan.

MINUTES Annual Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association October 21, 2010 - Bismarck, ND

The General Assembly of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn on October 21, 2010. President Ranum called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m. and declared a quorum.

President Ranum introduced the NDHSAA Board of Directors and staff.

The amendment would change the earliest date an athlete can have a physical exam from the current date of June 15 to the former date of April 15, effective for the 2010-2011 year. The remainder of this by-law would remain the same.

Motion by Supt. Merlin Dahl, Finley-Sharon to approve the amendment. Second by Supt. Norm Fries, Gackle-Streeter. A roll call vote was taken: Yes -170 / No - 0, motion carried unanimously.

Those students were grandfathered in at the time the rule was changed.

MINUTES

Class B District Chairperson's Meeting 9:00 A.M. – November 19, 2010 Minot Holiday Inn Express (Items advanced to NDHSAA Board listed following minutes)

The Class B District Chair meeting was held on November 19, 2010 at the Minot Holiday Inn Express. Chairman Moe called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all districts represented. Chairman Moe welcomed the district chairpersons and thanked them for representing their district. Each representative introduced themselves and identified their district. Minot Public Schools Athletic Director and State Volleyball Tournament Manager Pat McNally welcomed the group and thanked the schools for coming to Minot for tournaments. The CVB has worked hard to provide room availability at the community's hotels. Mr. McNally thanked the region managers for cooperating in assisting to put together the state tournament information. The Executive Secretary thanked the member schools for their past service. Sheets were passed around to allow each member to complete information on the 2011 Volleyball District chairperson and each district's recommendation for region site and manager. Each district was given the opportunity to present their district's recommendations which are

listed as submitted.

District 1-----Chris Swenson, Supt. Wyndmere HS No agenda items.

District 2-----Jeff Larson, AD, Finley-Sharon HS

1. Volleyball warm-ups - Recommend going back to 20 minute warm-ups aftercaptains/coach meeting. Staff member Solberg shared the regulation as approved by the Board concerning warm-up. Following the completion of the junior varsity match and upon release of the players, the clock is set at 25 minutes and started. The first 5 minutes are used for pre-match meeting with coaches and captains and when the clock winds down to 20 minutes, the timed warm-up begins. District 7 representative, Karla Michaelson indicated officials should call for captains and coaches immediately at the conclusion of the junior varsity match to efficiently follow the timeline.

2. Recommend removing summer restrictions on baseball/softball coaching.

Rationale – It is difficult finding coaches if they are not allowed to coach both seasons. The Executive Secretary explained the five-year exemption for softball and three-year exemption for baseball. The Board has been working toward putting all sports in the same position concerning coaching regulations. The NDHSCA has expressed opposition to eliminating the out-of-season coaching regulation whether the rule is to be eliminated or a change in the exemptions. The District Chairpersons Meeting November 19, 2010/ Page 2

Executive Secretary reminded the group exemption was given to volleyball and soccer to give them time to find a sufficient number of coaches. They no longer have the exemption.

VOTE - Recommend removing summer restrictions on baseball/softball coaching - (15-1).

3. Baseball Bats – Recommend starting in 2012 to allow aluminum bats that meet the new BBCOR (Batted Ball Coefficient of Restitution) requirements.

Staff member Fetsch spoke on the recent exemptions for bats. Starting in 2012, the bat will need a stamp for all composite bats. Also in 2012, legion baseball has adopted the BBCOR rule. Larson asked if all same by BBCOR, should it go back to all bats including aluminum. It was clarified the vote is specifically for Class B Baseball. The website will list those bats that will be legal.

VOTE – Recommend starting in 2012 to allow aluminum bats that meet the new BBCOR (Batted Ball Coefficient of Restitution) requirements – (16-0).

4. Fall Golf – Recommend moving class B golf to Fall Season.

Larson stated each time a vote is taken to move golf to the fall, it is moving closer to being a majority. District 2 wishes to hear the opinion of the other district chairpersons. Questions that were asked by other district chairpersons: How will this affect participation in other fall sports? Will this be a problem? Would this season run the corresponding dates as Class A Girls'? The Executive Secretary indicated a move could possibly shift the number of opportunities for girls' sports. In response to the concern over difficulty of securing a course in the spring when interest is high among the membership, District 14 shared they host only one meet during the season and local courses have those athletes as members.

VOTE - Recommend moving class B golf to Fall Season - (7-9).

District 3-----Patti Aanenson, AD Larimore HS

1. Status of the use of colored volleyballs

Dist 10 stated their wish is to stay with the white volleyball. District 14 stated the switch should be made. District 8 indicated whether the volleyball was white or colored, they didn't see much difference.

Straw Poll – In favor of using a color volleyball – (6-9).

2. Does Valley City want to host the State Cross Country Meet next fall? Rumors are that they do not wish to host.

District 3 had heard rumors Valley City was not interested in hosting the 2011 State Cross Country Meet. Solberg shared the staff at Valley City is welcoming the state meet and is already in the initial planning stage for the 2011 event.

3. Concern has been expressed about going from eight to four regions in track and field. Asked was should regions go to six first and take three from each region in each event for the State meet? District 13 was opposed to either six regions or four regions.

VOTE- Six track & field regions rather than four advancing three from each region - (16-0).

4. District 3's request was to poll the group as to how do other regions handle lack of volunteers to work track meets? There is a concern high school students were working track meets. District 13 – don't ask, beg.

District 4-----Lee Beattie, AD, North Border Pembina HS

1. Moving Boy's and Girl's golf to the fall

This was previously discussed.

2. Elimination of out of season coaching.

Chairman Moe asked if the group wishes to vote on all sports. District 13 indicated the way the rule is now, it is difficult to enforce. It was a common thought of the group they still want some type of rule. NDHSCA Exec. Sec Orvik spoke to the group indicating the general assembly at their state convention has voted to continue the out of season rule. Coaches are adamant they wish their time away from the sport without community pressure. They also felt there should be a time for not only coaches to be away and have family time but also athletes to have time away. District 13 shared Wyoming has a 9-day dead period as well as Missouri has a certain number of contact days. Information concerning plans from other states will be shared and hopefully this can be placed on the agenda for the March District Chair meeting. Orvik also shared various rules that the other states have implemented.

3. Criteria for selecting Senior of the Year athlete (all sports).

Asked what other districts use as criteria for selection. Chairman Moe shared there is a criterion on the NDHSCA website. The question that seemed to be confusing, is this a year award or a career award? District 13 shared the opinion the award is based on a career highlighted by their senior year.

District 5-----Mitch Carlson, Supt. LaMoure HS

No agenda items

District 6-----Daren Kurle, Supt. Strasburg HS

1. Look at re-districting teams in VB and BB if a district falls below 6 teams.

Currently there are districts that are composed of 5 teams. District 6 would like to see more teams in a district. District 16 has the same issue with 5 teams for volleyball but no teams geographically close to add to the district. With coops, this will become more of an issue. The Executive Secretary indicated the Re-Alignment Committee is working on equalizing the district numbers. The committee will look at the basketball and volleyball districts at the January meeting. Also, the baseball regions will be addressed by the Board at the January meeting. District 10 stated maybe the time is coming when two teams rather than four teams should be advancing to the region tournament. Districts are now scheduling home and away with their district teams to make the seeding more accurate. The group felt there was no need to vote as this item is on the agenda for committee study.

- 2. Push shot clock implementation back to 2012-2013 at the earliest.
- a. Concerns with compatibility with older clocks leading to extra costs.
- b. Concerns with availability of installation.

District 9 administrators felt they were left out in the decision process. District 7 would like to see both the girls' and boys' shot clocks be set at 35 seconds.

VOTE - Push shot clock implementation back to 2012-2013 at the earliest – (5-11).

District 7-----Karla Michaelson, AD Carrington HS

1. No limitation on the number of substitutions in volleyball matches.

Solberg shared this is a National Federation rule of which proposals to change this rule have been sent to the NF Volleyball Rules Committee the last two years. Both years, the proposal has been voted down unanimously.

VOTE - No limitation on the number of substitutions in volleyball matches - (2-14).

- 2. Will the state mandate the colored volleyball at the regions and state tourneys in 2011?
- 3. Some coaches still feel the website is not user friendly no spot for individual scores, pictures fuzzy, etc.

Staff member Schell shared the set scores are available for coaches to use on the website. Schell also explained the picture issue as the quality of the camera is important plus using the print

program to download a quality picture rather than simply copying it off the school team's page.

4. Wrestling – weight classes from 14 to 12

It was shared the difficulty to field a team of 14 weight classes. Class B coaches have unanimously indicated they wish to go to 12 weight classes. Could a committee be set up to do this? Staff member Fetsch shared it is difficult to determine which weight classes to eliminate. Fewer weight classes would place a larger span from the lightest to the heaviest in each of the 12 classes. The National Federation is working on this issue and will release their findings this spring.

5. Where did the shot clock implementation in Class B originate?

The discussion revealed this issue has been a topic for consideration for several years. All information as it happened has been available via the website.

VOTE on making the shot clock 35 seconds for both boys' and girls' basketball - (1-15).

6. Continue the sub-varsity workshops for football, volleyball, and basketball.

District 8-----Randy Loing, Prin. AD Rolla HS

- 1. Reduce wrestling weight classes from 14 to 12
- 2. Will colored VB be mandated for next season?

Both have previously been covered.

District 9-----Juno Pintar, AD Standing Rock HS

No agenda items.

District 10-----Gaillord Peltier, Supt. Turtle Lake-Mercer

- 1. Stay with the white ball as the official ball for competition.
- 2. Flags for the line judges should not be mandatory.
- 3. Review and recommend district re-alignment to bring another team into district 10 for next year.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on November 19, 2010 at the Minot Holiday Inn Express. President Ranum called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Auch.

Following several additions to the agenda, motion by Sanstead to accept the agenda. Second by Looysen and carried unanimously.

A copy of the minutes from the October 20, 2010 Board of Directors meeting was provided to the Board for review. Motion by Fastnacht to approve as read. Second by Olson. The motion passed unanimously.

North Dakota Juvenile Drug Court Coordinator Marilyn Moe shared the process in which there is confidential information. Requested is to allow teachers and administrators that are involved in this setting not to be required to report it. Swiontek spoke on behalf of the program but expressed concern over a double standard created. Also speaking were Board members Ulland and Looysen indicating this can be resolved. Moe reiterated the penalties are very strict if someone in the program violates. The Executive Secretary stated the Association is not in the business of superseding Federal law. Swiontek reported on behalf of the Coaches' Education Committee. The following recommendations are being considered for final presentation to the Board at the January meeting.

- a. The requirements for a coaching permit will be:
 - National Federation Fundamentals of Coaching course
 - First Aid/Safety course obtained either through the National Federation or locally
 - Concussion Management Course through the National Federation
 - CPR training once every 5 years
- b. Renewals will be after 5 years
- c. Coaching minors would apply if all requirements of that course fulfill the four requirements.

The Board discussed the process for the coaching permit requirements. The NDHSCA will issue a permit to each coach upon completion of the requirements. Coaches will be listed by way of a form of which a final draft will be made available. Training will follow. The Executive Secretary will be writing a letter to all superintendents, athletic administrators and school contacts explaining the program and potential implementation date if approved. After the school districts have received this letter, if there is a needed adjustment because of this input, the committee will meet prior to the January Board meeting. It was noted a recommendation from the District Chair to move this program to a non-mandatory program was defeated, 7-9. Information on this program has been published in the NDIAAA and NDHSCA publications. If implemented, this will also be shared with colleges and universities for information purposes in the development of their coaches' minor programs. Motion by Helvik to approve the report. Second by Sanstead. A roll call vote was taken: Helvik – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Olson – yes, Swiontek – yes, Ranum – yes. The motion passed, unanimously.

Also discussed at the Coaches Education Committee was a possible movement toward requirement of completing the Teaching and Modeling Behavior course prior to returning to coaching after an ejection from a contest because of unsportsmanlike conduct.

The Executive Secretary shared the process in which each year an additional year is added to the two year calendar. Usually this is done at the March meeting but with rooming issues in several communities in which tournament are set, it may be necessary to set dates earlier for the events in which these sites are approved to give the host time to prepare. In studying the 2012-2013 year, there

is a possibility of moving all basketball seasons one week later. A calendar with the original dates and possible revised dates was reviewed. Tournament managers for the larger venues have been contacted to see if the revised dates would fit their venues. Although most of the venue managers have indicated the revised dates would work, not all have responded. Motion by Looysen to approve the calendar as is. Second by Sanstead. During discussion, it was stated the Large Tournament Committee is scheduled to meet December 8, 2010 in Carrington. The discussion indicated possibly waiting until this committee had the opportunity for input. Motion and second were withdrawn. It was determined a conference call Board meeting will take place after the December 8th Tournament Committee meeting.

The Board acted upon two site assignments:

- A letter was received from Jon Erickson indicating Fargo would not be able to host the Girls Class B State Golf Meet for 2011 as there is not any course available for various reasons. Dakota Winds in Hankinson has provided an invitation to host the tournament.
- An invitation to host the Region 1 Track & Field meet at the Concordia Field was received by meet manager Justin Fletschock of Central Cass.

Motion by Helvik to approve the two site adjustments. Second by Olson. After discussion, the Board wished to act upon the two items separately. Motion and second were withdrawn.

Motion by Looysen to approve setting the Girls Class B State Golf Meet for 2011 at Dakota Winds in Hankinson. Second by Fastnacht. A roll call vote was taken: Helvik – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Olson – yes, Swiontek – yes, Ranum – yes. The motion passed, unanimously.

Motion by Helvik to place the 2011 Region 1 Track & Field meet at the Concordia Field. Second by Olson. A roll call vote was taken: Helvik – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Ulland – no, Moe – no, Looysen – no, Sanstead – yes, Olson – yes, Swiontek – yes, Ranum – yes. The motion carried, 6-3.

Moe reported on the Class B District Chair meeting of which he presided. Three items were brought forth for Board action at the January meeting.

- Eliminate the summer coaching rule for baseball and softball
- Allow aluminum bats if they meet the BBCOR
- Recommending region track to be divided into 6 regions rather than the previously approved 4 regions.

Motion by Helvik to approve the report. Second by Ulland

The Board brought back to the table for discussion a letter received from the Red River Valley Immunization Coalition asking the Board to approve the addition of immunization information on the mandatory physical examination form. The Executive Secretary had been directed to share this request with the Medical Advisory Committee. Dr. Mattern of the Medical Advisory Committee indicated immunization is required for attendance at a public school and would not be necessary on the physical examination form. Olson shared this would be a simple addition as bullet #10, "Are your immunizations up to date?". Motion by Olson to approve the addition of bullet #10. Second by Swiontek. - Reported Our Redeemer's has met the required compliance in response to their violation.
- The Combined Tournament Committee meeting will be 10:00 a.m. December 8, 2010 in Carrington.
- The Executive Secretary will be rendering a decision concerning the unacceptable actions of a member of the media as soon as positive identification of that person is received. If confirmed, that individual will not receive a press pass for the remainder of the year.

The next Board meeting will be January 22, 2011 at 1:00 p.m. Athletic Review will be scheduled for 10:00 a.m. that same day.

Jamestown notified the NDHSAA office an ineligible junior high wrestler competed at an event hosted by Horizon Middle School at Bismarck. After the competition Jamestown realized he did not have the required nine practices. The committee directed the Executive Secretary to send a letter of reprimand to Jamestown Public School directing Jamestown to forfeit matches in which the ineligible wrestler competed as well as the tournament placing. Also, Jamestown must send a letter notifying the tournament host and schools involved of the situation as well as providing a copy of the letter to the NDHSAA. Jamestown is encouraged to inform coaches of NDHSAA regulations.

January 7, 2011:

- Sawyer High School violated the nine-practice rule. The board agreed a letter of reprimand shall be sent to Sawyer High School and Sawyer must forfeit the game in which the ineligible student participated. Also, Sawyer is instructed to send a letter to the school in that competition and a copy to the NDHSAA.
- Wilton High School violated the ejection rule. The incident took place at a junior high basketball tournament on December 18, 2010. These were their last games of the season. The Wilton coach was ejected in the early morning game and returned to coach the next game that day. The officials were late in reporting the ejection to Matthew Fetsch. The coach

involved is now the assistant high school girls' basketball coach. The executive board agreed a letter of reprimand will be sent to Wilton, and the coach must sit out the next scheduled game in which he coaches at the JV level. Fetsch will also send a letter to the officials involved, as they erred in not following the procedures in dealing with ejections. The committee also directed Fetsch to approach the Officials Committee to explore another avenue in dealing with a coach's ejection from a contest. The suggestion was to have an ejected coach take an on-line course offered by the National Federation that is a teaching lesson for coaches dealing with behavioral issues. The Executive Secretary indicated that might be something for the Constitution and By-Laws Committee to explore.

January 18, 2011:

• Shiloh Christian self-reported a violation regarding non-compliance with the ejection rule. A Shiloh Christian student was ejected from a junior high game on Friday, December 17, 2010. Shiloh held the young man that was ejected out of the varsity game that night, but the ejected player played in the next regular season game against the Bismarck Sophomore team. This violated the NDHSAA ejection which states that an athlete will be ineligible for the next regularly scheduled game/meet at that level of competition and any other contests in the interim. The Committee directed a letter of reprimand be sent to Shiloh Christian, also directing them to inform Bismarck Public School of their violation with a copy sent to the NHDSAA office. Shiloh Christian will forfeit the contest and is to meet with their entire coaching staff to remind them of all rules, especially those dealing with the ejection rules. On a secondary level Fetsch was directed to send a letter to the officials involved in the ejection because their ejection report was a month after the incident.

The Board held audience with Tony Grubb regarding Hankinson's appeal to the decision to decline the request for hardship eligibility. Along with Mr. Grubb were the student and the student's uncle. Following the presentation and a period of questions from the Board, motion by Looysen to grant the appeal. Second by Ham. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – no, Moe – yes, Swiontek – no, Helvik – no, Olson – no, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried, 7-4.

Swiontek reported on behalf of the Combined Tournament Committee with the following recommendations:

- 1. Because of a facility situation, move Boys' State Swimming and Diving from Fargo to Grand Forks for 2012-2013. Motion by Looysen to approve the recommended site change. Second by Olson. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Swiontek yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Looysen yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously.
- 2. Approve the sites as recommended by the committee for the 2014-2015 year including the State A Baseball Tournament set for Fargo Red Hawks Stadium. Ulland suggested the Class B would also like to have the opportunity to play at the Red Hawks Stadium. Motion by Helvik to approve the recommendation for sites as proposed. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Swiontek yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Looysen yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Looysen asked if there were any schools that had trouble securing motel rooms for tournaments held in Minot. It was the general consensus of the Board that negative press created the impression there were no rooms but that was proven incorrect. It was also mentioned there are new hotels currently under construction in Minot.

3. The Dakota Bowl was discussed. With difficulty securing the FargoDome on the Saturday of the Dakota Bowl, the Tournament Committee presented these options: Option #1 Play Thursday/Friday leaving the site rotation as is, Option #2 - Play four games on Friday and Option #3 Switch the site from Fargo to Grand Forks. A letter expressing concern for the schedules being dictated by NCAA contests. Option #1 with games held on Thursday was revealed that would be in direct conflict with region volleyball finals as well as a shortened recovery time for teams just coming off their previous Saturday game. Motion by Fastnacht to deny option #1 to hold the tournament on Thursday and Friday. Second by Helvik. Motion and second were withdrawn. Motion by Looysen to table until additional information is available for the Board to address this issue. Second by Fastnacht. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham –

yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously. Olson will contact the Alerus for the availability of their facility.

- 4. Supported moving all basketball seasons one week later for the 2012-2013 season. This will be addressed when the Board reviews the two-year calendar.
- 5. Change ticket prices. With the change of first-round schedule for Class A Regions, there was a need to adjust the ticket prices. Prices suggested are \$6 & \$4 for one game and \$7 & \$4 for two games. Motion by Sanstead to approve the recommended ticket prices for the first round of Class A Region Basketball. Second by Helvik. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Swiontek yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Looysen yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Fastnacht reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws:

- 1. The Committee studied Article VI Due Process Procedure; Article XIV, Section X, b; and Article XIV, Section XI. The committee presented the recommended flowcharts to be followed for appeals. The flowcharts reviewed for reference were (a) Complaint and Appeals, (b) Hardship Exception Procedure and Appeals, and (c) Extra Semester(s) Procedure and Appeals. Motion by Helvik to approve the changes. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Swiontek yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Looysen yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously. The amendments will be presented to the membership for a vote at the October, 2011 General Assembly meeting.
- 2. There is a suggested procedure for administrators in the event an alcohol, tobacco and drug violation has been reported. This recommended procedure is found on page 47 of the Constitution & By-Laws. This recommended procedure has been misinterpreted as law rather than a suggested procedure. The committee recommends removing this procedure as it is Board interpretation rather than by-law. Motion by Ham to approve the removal. Second by Looysen. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Swiontek yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Looysen yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously.
- 3. The committee requests the Board to discuss the addition to the penalty for a coach ejected from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct to take the National Federation "Teaching and Modeling Behavior" which is an online course. Moe indicated he had taken the course indicating the material is basic and asked if a coach that was ejected would be receptive to the information made available. Fastnacht asked if there is a need for more than the current penalty, should the remainder be left to the individual coach's school administration. The Executive Secretary asked the Board if they wished to add a regulation to the By-Laws which were approved by the member schools or would the Board present an amendment to the By-Laws because there is already a prescribed penalty. Swiontek indicated maybe the NDHSCA should address this with their membership and come to the Board with a suggestion. Fastnacht suggested keeping a history of ejections to see if there is a frequent offender. Ham stated each school should be taking care of their own program. No recommendation was made at this time and this will be shared with the NDHSCA for any further solution.
- 4. The committee reviewed the present By-Law addressing the state NDEA conference and their possible adjustments. The committee recognizes the need to be prepared for possible changes but at this time, recommends leave the moratorium on the no contests Noon Thursday to midnight Friday in the Constitution & By-Laws. The current by-law requirements can be provided to the membership to clarify some concerns and confusion.
- 5. The committee discussed transfer eligibility for students entering a virtual school and how team membership is affected. The committee will continue study.

The Executive Secretary reported on his work with the Juvenile Drug Court and their changing of the language. They made the approval with the memorandum which was shared with the Board. Motion by Olson to approve the memorandum. Second by Sanstead. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Swiontek reported on behalf of the Coaches Education Committee in which he shared with the Board letters to the editor and a letter from the Executive Secretary on behalf of the committee. The committee has proposed a mandatory coaches' education requirement. Those recommendations are requirements for all coaches 7 through 12:

- 1. NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching
- 2. First aid Safety offered through Red Cross or NFHS
- 3. CPR training every five years
- 4. Concussion Management

Ulland raised the question, can the NDHSAA Board be held liable if this requirement is not mandated as the individual schools are assuming liability for their own coaches. Swiontek indicated he has been asked to make a presentation to the General Assembly concerning this subject. He will ask the membership, if there is nothing done, will there be legislation stepping in and doing what schools are not doing to educate coaches. Fastnacht stated there is a need to continue to work toward getting schools on board to include coaches in improvement much like teachers. Motion by Swiontek to state the NDHSAA strongly encourages school districts to adopt a coach's education plan in their respective districts that include these four components. Second by Looysen. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – no, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – no, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – no, Ranum – yes. Motion carried, 8-3. Swiontek will make a presentation on this at the General Assembly.

The Board held audience with Prin. Andy DeCoteau of Solen-Cannonball with an appeal to the previously denied hardship eligibility application. Also appearing before the Board was Daniel Martin, father of the student. Following questions from the Board, motion by Fastnacht to grant the appeal. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – no, Moe – no, Swiontek – no, Helvik – no, Olson – no, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried, 6-5.

Swiontek was called away for the remainder of the meeting.

Helvik reported on behalf of the Realignment Committee

- 1. The proposed region assignments for Class B Baseball were presented. Several plans plus a geographic proposal were studied. The committee looked at mileage as well as geographical location. There are four new varsity teams assigned to a region and three existing teams that were moved to a different region. Motion by Ulland to approve the baseball region assignments. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Looysen yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously.
- 2. Conducted a requested study to balance the region numbers for boys' and girls' basketball and volleyball. The current proposal indicates no less than 6 teams and no more than 8 teams in a district. The Committee also studied a four-region, 8 district concept. The committee will continue study with maps being drawn for future consideration. This will be placed on the March 18, 2011 Board meeting agenda.
- 3. The Committee reviewed a request from Cavalier to be moved from Region 2 speech to Region 3 Speech. The committee recommends approval of this request. Motion by Olson to approve for 2011-2012. Second by Sanstead. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Looysen yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Looysen reported on behalf of the Finance Committee with the following recommendations:

- 1. Beginning July 1, 2011 vacation days can no longer be placed in reserve. Employees that have vacation days in reserve will be paid, at their discretion, no later than the end of there 2012 contract. Compensation will be based on their 2010-11. This policy impacts five staff members. The vacation language will be reviewed and recommended changes will be forth coming. Motion by Helvik to approve. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Looysen yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously.
- 2. The Committee recommended a 3 % raise for the Executive staff with another 2% for staff member Solberg as per a previous agreement. The committee recommended that administration assistants, Patricia Bass and Susan Carlsrud receive an increase of \$.50 per hour and Sharon Prosby \$.60 per hour, an overall increase of 3%. Staff member Fetsch is in the second year of a 2 year contract with a salary of \$75,000. Motion by Olson to approve. Second by Auch. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Looysen yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously.

3. The IRS Form 990 was prepared by the auditor and distributed to members. The committee recommends that we approve the IRS Form 990.

The Executive Secretary presented the two-year calendar with approval pending for the 2012-2013 year. The early approval time-line is to move the basketball seasons one week later for the 2012-2013 year. Motion by Olson to approve the two-year calendar with the adjustment of the basketball seasons one week later than the corresponding dates of the previous year. Second by Auch. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Sanstead reported on behalf of the Canvassing Committee with the following results of the NDHSAA Board of Directors election:

This report will be shared with the General Assembly at the January 26th meeting.

The Board reviewed a letter from Divide County HS with questions concerning how the football plan was planned and finalized. Moe reviewed on September, 2010, the Football Committee contacted the athletic administrators concerning the football plan. This communication included Divide County. It was overwhelming the athletic administrators indicated they approved the proposed plan. A proposal from Divide County was received by the Association after the plan was finalized. The Football Committee looked at the plan as a whole picture and made the difficult decision in assigning schools to regions.

Moe reported on behalf of the Officials Committee meeting which was held December 21, 2010.

The committee discussed an appeal of a suspension of a Minnesota basketball official that officiated in North Dakota without obtaining reciprocity. Initially, the official was suspended from officiating in North Dakota for one calendar year. Because this official has worked in North Dakota with reciprocity in past years, it was determined by the committee this was a simple oversight by the official and recommends lifting the suspension and fining the official \$20 which is double the cost of reciprocity. The committee also recommends a fine structure for officials should be established. It was decided by the Board each situation will be handled as a case by case situation. Motion by Helvik to approve reinstating the official to continue officiating basketball this season. Second by Auch. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Moe reported on January 14, 2011 the committee received a preliminary list of post-season basketball officials for approval. This list has been approved by the Officials Committee and contracts are being sent

A letter from Park River requesting the Board to allow rescheduling flexibility by lifting the requirement of no more than two basketball games per week followed by a school day. Motion by Olson to approve scheduling up to three basketball games per week followed by a school day for the 2010-2011 basketball season. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed the agenda for the Membership meeting scheduled for 8:00 a.m. on Monday, January 24, 2011.

The Board reviewed a letter from Devils Lake High School requesting permission to allow their junior varsity boys' basketball team to participate in the Ramsey County Tournament on December 1, 2, 3, 2011. This tournament starts one day prior to the first allowable game for Class A teams. The participants will have their required nine practices prior to the first day of competition. Motion by

Looysen to approve. Second by Olson. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously

The Executive Secretary reported on a request from the Arizona Interscholastic Association on behalf of their association and the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association for assistance in the cost of defense concerning WIAA, et al. v. Gannett, et al. This litigation involves issues relating to state associations' ability to protect their proprietary interests in the games and events that are conducted by state associations. As WIAA's fiscal agent, requested from each association to consider a contribution of \$1,000 toward this effort. Motion by Olson to approve a contribution of \$1,000. Second by Looysen. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously

The Executive Secretary informed the Board he has been requested to appear at the capitol on Monday to answer questions on Senate Bill 2281 concerning the identification and management of concussions. Currently our process is leaving it to each member school to identify an appropriate health care professional. This bill indicates an appropriate healthcare provider with training in head trauma and concussions. Looysen cautioned there should not be a bill that cannot be enforced. Some of the smaller communities have expressed concern.

President Ranum reported on the Athletic Review Committee which met previously. These recommendations will require Board action at the March meeting.

The Board reviewed correspondence and information provided:

- 1. A letter from Ev Miller.
- 2. A copy of an article written by Jeff Schatz in the National Federation magazine was placed in the Board folder.
- 3. A letter from Uran on sportsmanship concerning Bishop Ryan. The Administration was contacted to visit about the letter. The administration indicated they have addressed how students should represent their school.
- 4. A letter from Hankinson concerning the loss of school time. The Board is welcomed to share any response. Ulland would like to see consideration of possibly switching the times and days for the divisions of football. Ham asked how much is the schedule dictated by television. Looysen stated reality is the Board is responsible to keep the association solvent to be able to offer programs to students. Fastnacht indicated the possibility the first three divisions rotating. Ham asked the possibility of sending a letter of explanation to schools as they might not understand the conditions of the television contract. It was recommended this information be shared with the membership at the Monday meeting.

- 2. Congratulated Jeff Fastnacht elected Superintendent of the Year.
- 3. Four Winds has met the obligations that were designed by the Board to address eligibility.
- 4. Beginning in 2005-2006, the number of ejections has been recorded. Statistics were shared.
- 5. For information purposes, Board was provided a list of hardships and the resulting action from October, 2008.

The next meetings are scheduled for March 11, 2011 in Fargo and March 18, 2011 in Bismarck.

With no further business, President Ranum declared the meeting adjourned.

Annual Meeting

North Dakota High School Activities Association January 24, 2011 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Representative Assembly Meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held Monday, January 24, 2011 at 8:00 A.M. at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. President Ranum welcomed the membership, called the meeting to order, and shared a few thoughts to remember administrators present and past.

President Ranum declared a quorum had been established and introduced Dr. Wayne Sanstead to serve as parliamentarian for the meeting.

The Executive Secretary clarified the position elected for the southeast and the following year that position will again be open for election.

Dr. Sanstead reported on behalf of the Canvassing to announce the results of the ballots:

- 1. Membership to the Board of Directors from the Class B Southeast Region for a one year term Steve Hall, Kindred.
- 2. Membership to the Board of Directors from the Class B Northwest for a four year term Steve Brannan, Garrison.
- 3. Membership to the Board of Directors from the Class A West Region for a four year term
- Shane Martin, Turtle Mountain

Supt. Steve Swiontek presented a report on behalf of the Coaches Education Committee. A committee has been studying this issue for 2 years and during the process the membership had the opportunity to share their input. Saturday the Board voted the NDHSAA shall strongly encourage that all membership schools adopt a coaching education program that contains the following:

- National Federation Fundamentals of Coaching
- First Aid through Red Cross or any organization that offers training
- CPR training every five years
- Training in Concussion recognition and management

The membership was cautioned to consider introducing a program in their individual schools before there is a mandate from an outside entity.

The Executive Secretary shared he has been invited to the Capitol later in the day to share what the NDHSAA has been done in the form of concussion education and management. An explanation of the current concussion policy was presented. A video was presented on the Lyson bill which is a story of a high school football player with a traumatic brain injury from returning to play following a concussion. Following the video presentation, the Executive Secretary shared the components of Senate Bill 2161.

The Executive Secretary presented an update on the National Federation concussion rule and the accompanying NDHSAA policy pertaining to identification of an appropriate medical professional.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

- 1. The National Federation of State High School Associations has developed a free course on-line titled THE ROLE OF PARENTS IN SPORT. A video clip on this online course was presented. The membership was encouraged to use this at a pre-season parent meeting.
- 2. At Saturday's meeting, the Board of Directors approved the calendar through 2012-13. There was a request from venues to set this for earlier determination with a major change, all basketball seasons will be moved one week later:
 - a. Class B Boys' opening date Nov 19, State Mar 7, 8, 9, 2013
 - b. Class A Boys' & Girls opening date Nov 26, State Mar 14,15,16, 2013
 - c. Class B Girls' opening date Dec. 3, State Mar 21, 22, 23, 2013

All other dates are corresponding dates.

- 3. The Board approved the sanctioning of softball and there has been a state tournament for two years. A year ago the softball community requested the Board to create two state tournaments, Class A and Class B. The Board made the decision to allow two state tournaments when there are 12 Class B schools playing a varsity schedule and state tournament eligible. At the present time we have 19 schools eligible for the 2011 state tournament. Of those 19, thirteen are Class A schools and 6 are Class B schools. There are six schools playing a JV schedule and not eligible for the state tournament. One of the six is a Class A school and five are Class B. One of the Class B schools intends to stay in Class A competition leaving five Class B schools eligible for post-season competition. Five Class B schools are playing a junior varsity schedule which totals ten. There is a need for two more Class B varsity programs in order to sponsor another state tournament. The future appears to contain much interest and support for fast pitch softball.
- 4. Saturday the Board approved the 2011 Baseball regions as recommended by the Realignment Committee. This information will be sent to the baseball schools as well as posted on the NDHSAA website. The Realignment Committee is further studying a balancing of schools in B Districts for basketball and volleyball. They are also studying an eight district four region concept.
- 5. The Board lifted the regulation concerning games followed by a school day for the 2010-11 basketball season. For the remainder of this year rescheduling will not be held to this regulation.
- 6. There has been an increase in violations concerning the enforcement of the ejection rule. The ejection rule, Article XIV, Section XIII, is found in the NDHSAA Const. & By-Laws on page 48. The By-Law reads:

SECTION XIII: Any student or coach ejected from an interscholastic contest by game officials for unsportsmanlike conduct, including but not limited to flagrant, violent or verbal misconduct, will be ineligible for the next regularly scheduled game/meet at that level of competition and all other games/meets in the interim at any level of competition. When a non-typical schedule is involved, the ejection penalty may be administered on a case-by-case basis.

Any subsequent ejection in that season's activity carries a four (4) regularly scheduled game/meet ineligibility. If penalties are imposed at the end of the sport season and no contest remains, the penalty is carried over in that particular sport until the next school year. In the case of a senior, the penalty will continue to the next sport season. (Oct.06)

INTERPRETATIONS - SECTION XIII

Student: Any time a student is ejected from a game/meet, he/she does not participate the remainder of that day. The student is also suspended for the next scheduled, rescheduled or contracted contest at that level of competition and all contests in the interim at any other level of competition.

Note: To meet this requirement, the contest must take place.

Coach: "When a coach has been ejected in accordance with Section XIII, he/she is not allowed to attend any of his/her team's contests or to be on site for any pre-game contact direct or indirect with participants during the suspension."

Appeal: A coach may appeal the penalty only when he/she is disqualified and his/her action did not contribute to the disqualification. This appeal will be heard by the local school administration. A complete report must be sent to the NDHSAA for review.

In the 2009-2010 year at this time, there were 38 total ejections. At this point in 2010-2011 we have had 41 ejections of which 32 are athletes and 9 are coaches. Boys' Soccer has had 12 with one coach, Football had 15 with three coaches, volleyball had 1, hockey has had four to date and boys' basketball has had nine so far with five coaches. Elimination or even a reduction of ejections will happen only with aggressive support of administrators. The Board has requested this to be included as a point of emphasis at the August Regional Administrators' Meetings.

7. With UND and NDSU in Division I, the scheduling of the Dakota Bowl has become

more difficult. The combined tournament committee looked at the possibility of holding the Dakota Bowl on Thursday and Friday, which would eliminate Saturday venue conflicts but Thursday is Class B Regional Volleyball Championship night. The other options considered were all four games on one day or moving The Dakota Bowl to Grand Forks as UND is not at home next year.

When it comes to scheduling the Dakota Bowl, consideration must be given to our television contract. They request AAA football to be the last game and prefer it to be as late as possible. The Class A towns contain the largest business market which is where they obtain advertising to make it possible to televise the tournament. This television contract amounts to \$112,500 for rights to the five televised tournaments which contributes to the organization as a whole.

- 8. Jeff Fastnacht was recognized and thanked for his service on the Board this past year as well as Board President Clarke Ranum and Dr. Dave Looysen, for their years of service to the Association.
- 9. Thank you to the staff for their untiring efforts to serve the membership. Also thank you to the administrators for the commitment to ensure our students receive the best education they can. Activities are a part of the educational plan. Thank you to those who treat activities accordingly.

President Ranum thanked the membership for attendance and attention and declared the meeting adjourned.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on February 21, 2011 at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. President Ranum called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with 8 members present. (Ranum, Swiontek, Ham, Helvik, Moe, Looysen, Sanstead and Auch). Others Present: NDHSAA Attorney, Justin Vinje; Sherm Sylling, NDHSAA Executive Secretary; NDHSAA Staff member Solberg and delegations from Solen-Cannonball and Standing Rock.

The meeting was opened with a prayer from the Spiritual Leader of Solen-Cannonball High School.

Attorney Vinje introduced himself as the appointed hearing officer and asked each member sitting around the table to introduce themselves: NDHSAA Board President Clarke Ranum; NDHSAA staff, Sheryl Solberg; Board members David Looysen, Kirk Ham, Solen-Cannonball Attorney Rachel Thomason; Solen-Cannonball Principal/Athletic Administrator Andrew DeCoteau; Standing Rock Atletic Administrator, Juno Pintar; Standing Rock Security Merril Elk and Robert (RJ) Weddell, NDHSAA Board members Ben Auch, Wayne Sanstead, Steve Swiontek, Larry Helvik, Pete Moe; and NDHSAA Executive Secretary Sherman Sylling.

Attorney Vinje explained the proceedings in which he will call four witnesses for questioning by himself and the NDHSAA Board of Directors followed by questioning by Solen-Cannonball's Attorney Thomason.

Those present to testify were asked to leave the room and wait to be called for questioning.

Prior to testifying, each individual was informed of the perjury laws and was sworn in by Attorney Vinje.

Individuals called in order by NDHSAA were: Merril Elk, Standing Rock Security Guard; Robert (RJ) Weddell, Standing Rock Security Guard; Juno Pinntar, Standing Rock Athletic Administrator; and Andrew DeCoteau, Solen-Cannonball Principal/Athletic Administrator.

Mr. DeCoteau shared pictures of the Standing Rock parking lot placed on posterboards, each containing four pictures taken by Mr. DeCoteau. These were marked as exhibits 1 through 4.

At 10:45 a.m. testimony was concluded and the meeting went off record to take a short break.

At 11:00 a.m. the hearing reconvened and went back on record.

Individuals called in order by Solen-Cannonball's Attorney Rachel Thomason were: Judy Zins, Solen-Cannonball Superintendent; two Solen-Cannonball students; Charlotte Uses Arrow, parent and Andrew DeCoteau, Solen-Cannonball Principal/Athletic Administrator.

Again, as each individual was brought into the room to testify, prior to questioning was informed of the perjury laws and was sworn in.

Questioning was concluded and with no other witnesses to recall, the testimonial portion was concluded and the hearing was closed.

As per the procedure rules, closing statements were given: Sherm Sylling, NDHSAA Executive Secretary; and Rachel Thomason, Solen-Cannonball Attorney.

Closing arguments were over and that portion of the hearing was closed.

The remainder of the hearing was closed to the Board.

President Ranum thanked the group and reviewed Section 17 of Article VI – Due Process Procedure. The Executive Secretary shared with the Board the penalty for the use of an ineligible student is already prescribed and the Board is to determine whether the infraction did occur.

After an extensive discussion, motion by Helvik to deny the appeal to reinstate the Solen-Cannonball student that was ruled ineligible. Second by Auch. A roll call vote was taken: Auch – yes, Sanstead –

yes, Swiontek – no, Helvik – yes, Moe – yes, Looysen – no, Ham – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion to deny Solen-Cannonball's appeal carried, 6-2.

Discussion took place concerning:

PART II, ARTICLE V, SECTION IV: Forfeit of Championship Rights: A school may be required to forfeit championship rights:

- a. For playing ineligible players in any District, Regional or State Tournament or play-off, or;
- b. For any violation of the Constitution, By-Laws or regulations of the Association.

PART II, ARTICLE VI, SECTION XVII: The Board of Directors shall render a written decision to the party within a reasonable time after its meeting and shall publish an account of the appeal in Association meeting minutes setting forth:

- (a) Findings of fact;
- (b) A determination of whether a violation has been committed by the party; and
- (c) The penalty imposed if a violation is found to have occurred. The Board of Directors may modify (increase or decrease) or eliminate the penalty [Constitution, PART II, ARTICLE V, Section IV POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD (f)].

Mr. DeCoteau again spoke to the Board.

Motion by Looysen is to reinstate the Solen-Cannonball Boys' BB team to region minus the student that was found to be ineligible. Second by Swiontek. The Executive re-read the prescribed rule for use of an ineligible student found in Section IV and also read due process on penalty found in Section XVII. A roll call vote was taken: Ham – yes, Looysen – yes, Auch – yes, Sanstead – yes, Swiontek – no, Helvik – no, Moe – no, Ranum – yes. Motion to reinstate carried, 5-3.

President Ranum reported on behalf of the Executive Board with the following:

- 1. The late coop application from Jamestown and Pingree-Buchanan/Kensal for baseball was denied and not advanced to the Board for consideration.
- 2. The late coop application for Minot and Bishop Ryan for girls' tennis was withdrawn.
- 3. A decision on a penalty for Solen-Cannonball High School's use of an ineligible player was a major discussion. The action of the committee is to send a letter of reprimand and notify them the Solen-Cannonball boys' basketball program is placed on probation for one calendar year. Also, Solen-Cannonball will be required to submit an action plan to prevent similar violations. This will place the responsibility back to the school to give them the tools to handle similar situations. The plan must be submitted by April 19, 2011.

Fastnacht asked to discuss the process in which specific sport advisory committee recommendations are reviewed. He expressed concern in which coaches mass email board members to promote their recommendations. Schools may not always understand the process for change. Communication through the district chair process to allow the schools they represent become more knowledgeable is lacking. Moe asked this be clarified to give him direction in what message needs to be conveyed at their NDIAAA meeting Sunday. Helvik indicated there needs to be more communication with coaches to advisory committee and athletic administrators with their board representative. The Executive Secretary stated communication is more open than ever. It is up to the schools to take advantage of these options.

The Board held audience with Charlie Jeske, manager of the Bismarck Civic Center and Rob Sobolik, manager of the FargoDome. Earlier there had been discussion about the two-year calendar with Mr. Jeske and Mr. Sobolik as well as Minot State University Athletic Administrator Rick Hedberg. There needs to be dialogue concerning issues with scheduling venues. Venders are approaching these managers asking for five, six and seven year contracts and it is becoming more competitive. Both Mr. Jeske and Mr. Sobolik offered to be present at the tournament committee meeting in an advisory capacity to help the committee be aware of conflicts, etc. President Ranum thanked Mr. Jeske and Mr. Sobolik for meeting with the Board.

The Board reviewed a letter from David Hoff, representing the North Dakota Amateur Hockey Association requesting Board approval for junior and senior boys and girls to participate in the Minnesota Showcase. As mentioned in the letter the Board has previously approved senior students to compete in the Chicago Showcase. The letter is also asking approval allowing North Dakota high school coaches to coach this event out of season. The Board has requested this to be placed on the agenda annually. Motion by Swiontek to approve the request for seniors but excluding juniors. Second by Looysen. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes; Looysen – yes; Olson – yes; Auch – yes; Ham – yes; Swiontek – yes; Ulland – yes; Helvik – yes; Fastnacht – yes; Sanstead – yes; Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Looysen was called away from the meeting.

Committee Chair Swiontek reported on behalf of the Combined Tournament Committee. The Board was previously provided the meeting notes from the February 23, 2011 Combined Tournament Committee meeting. The committee recommends holding all four Dakota Bowl games at the FargoDome on Friday which is Veterans Day. The 9-man and A divisions rotate and for the 2011 year the order would be 9-man and A. Also discussed was long term venue issues. This will continue to be worked on and the venue managers will be invited to attend the tournament committee meeting for advisory purposes. Motion by Helvik to approve the report and committee recommendation. Second by Ham. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes; Olson – yes; Auch – yes; Ham – yes; Swiontek – yes; Ulland – yes; Helvik – yes; Fastnacht – yes; Sanstead – yes; Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Swiontek reported on behalf of the Fine Arts Committee. The committee discussed what would be appropriate penalties for various infractions. For the use of improper content in speeches the penalty will be disqualification from that event but be eligible for the next event unlike the disqualification rule for athletics. In addition, there should be a sign-off from the school's administrator to indicate there will be no use of obscene language and inappropriate actions at the contest in which their students are participating. Staff member Bubach indicated the type of actions and words that were being used in competition would not be allowed in the classroom and co-curricular activities are an extension of the classroom. Supreme Court case opinions are available to support actions concerning appropriate student speech presentations. These recommendations will be going back to the advisory group for further action.

A request from the Speech Advisory recommending to change the two-week deadline for region entries to a 20-day deadline to be consistent with the music deadline. Motion by Auch to approve the recommended change. Second Ulland. A roll call vote was taken: Moe – yes; Olson – yes; Auch – yes; Ham – yes; Swiontek – yes; Ulland – yes; Helvik – yes; Fastnacht – yes; Sanstead – yes; Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary reported the NDHSAA has over the years maintained a 100% status with the National Federation Officials Association and, with Board approval, will remain a 100% state. Membership benefits for being a member were shared with the Board for review. With no action to change this plan, the NDHSAA will continue with the current 100% status.

- c. Concussion course report Currently, there have been 355 individuals that have taken the concussion course offered at no cost by the National Federation.
- d. Region 5 boys' basketball has an issue because of venue conflicts. The Executive Secretary will be meeting with the two districts involved to see what can be done. Hazen is discussing the possibility of hosting the tournament.
- e. The Board was asked to mark page 19 of the Constitution & By-Laws, Article X, Section I, NOTE. This is for a future discussion.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 18, 2011 in Bismarck. Also, committee meetings were scheduled:

Class B District Chairperson Meeting March 18, 2011--9:00 A.M. Bismarck Ramkota Inn

The Class B District Chair meeting was held on March 18, 2011 at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn. Chairman Helvik called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all districts represented except District 8.

Chairman Helvik welcomed the district chairpersons and thanked them for representing their district. Each representative introduced themselves and identified their district.

The Executive Secretary thanked the members for their service to the member schools. Sheets were passed around to allow each member to complete information on the 2012 Boys' District chairperson and region site recommendations as well as 2012 Girls' District chairperson and region site preference. The group was reminded the April Board meeting is the time the region sites are set and information from the districts assist in this process. Region 5 was informed of the facility conflicts for the boys' basketball region. Several options were reviewed.

The recommendations from the fall District chair meeting were reviewed to inform the district representatives the recommendations that were approved.

The representatives were also informed the Re-alignment Committee met and will recommend a proposal to realign girls' and boys' basketball and volleyball with minimal change. This is an attempt to have a minimum of 6 schools in each district. The group was encouraged to watch for the listing on the website and share with their district.

Districts have submitted the following agenda items for discussion. The District Chairs were reminded before each item can be submitted to the NDHSAA Board for consideration it must receive approval by a simple majority of the districts. Each recommendation is listed exactly as they were submitted by the district.

District 1-----Chris Swenson, Supt. Wyndmere

1. Limit wrestlers to 15 weigh-ins and not 40 matches Swenson asked to defer to the District 3 recommendation for discussion.

District 2-----Jeff Larson, AD Finley-Sharon

1. Coaching Box for Basketball

There is a lack of consistency in enforcement of the rule. Also, coaches in other sports are allowed to stand. Staff member Fetsch shared what other states were doing is reference to the various sizes of coaching boxes being used. District 7 Michaelson asked if officials are told to make coaches sit at the state tournament. District 10 Peltier indicated he was a proponent of the coaching box. There is a need for coaches to stand to allow communication with the players. District 1 Swenson shared coaches need to be held to a higher standard. Fetsch shared Minnesota and South Dakota have a 14 foot coaching box. District 14 Lunde indicated whether a coaching box is allowed all depends what the coach is doing within the box. If the coach is outside the marked box but not in an unsportsmanlike manner, is it acceptable?

A roll call vote on allowing the coaches box was taken: Yes – Districts – 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16. Vote carried, 15-0.

District 3-----Patti Aanenson, AD Larimore

1. Remove Regional Dual Tournament matches from the 40 match limit Suggested is to replace with 16 events as opposed to the 40 matches which is regulation #3 on the website.

A roll call vote was taken: Yes – Districts – 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16. Vote carried, 15-0.

2. Reduce weight classes from 14 to 12.

Suggested was waiting until the National Federation Wrestling Rules Committee meeting to revise the weight classes before two of the weight classes can be eliminated. No vote was taken.

3. Would it be possible to set up training sites for shot clock operation?

The shot clock operation rules are posted on the NDHSAA website.

4. Recommendations as to shot clock placement.

The group was asked how many are placing their shot clocks on backboards vs. walls and are putting in new scoreboards.

District 4-----Lee Beattie, AD North Border-Pembina

1. Move Boys and Girls Golf to the fall

It is difficult in the spring to get courses ready which leads to a short season. District 12 Derr asked if there is a possibility of starting two weeks later. Peltier asked how many communities

have been able to use their course early in the season. Beattie indicated there was no practice on the course until toward the end of the season. Dist 6 Kurle shared a concern for a conflict with football and volleyball if golf was moved to the fall.

A roll call vote was taken: Yes - Districts 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 9; No – Districts 1, 5, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16. Vote failed 6-9

2. Adopt 18-min. halves for boys and girls basketball

When North Dakota teams play games with Minnesota schools, teams play halves. These North Dakota coaches have indicated they wish to adopt playing halves for North Dakota. District 10 Peltier asked what the rationale was when it was approved for Class A. Explanation indicated the rationale was to allow Class A schools play longer games in place of the district tournament games allowed for Class B.

A roll call vote was taken: Yes – Districts 4, 9, 13, 14; No – 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 10, 11, 12, 15, 16. Changing to halves in basketball failed – Yes – 4, No -11

3. Eliminate the 10-sec rule in Girls basketball

In the NCAA women's basketball rule code, there is no 10 second rule with the shot clock. District 14 Lunde indicated he also has this as a recommendation. Also, Lunde stated it may be beneficial to have the same timing rules in Class A and Class B.

A roll call vote was taken on the elimination of the 10 second rule: Yes – 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 12, 13, 14, 15; No – 1, 10, 11, 16. Carried - 11-4.

4. Discuss concerns regarding the hosting of State Baseball Tournament
There was a concern over the change of site and how the change was directed to Minot. The
Executive Secretary indicated the Tournament Committee has been charged by the NDHSAA
Board of Directors to include Fargo in the rotation of baseball tournament sites.

5. Discuss clarification of bats (what is legal and what is not) for baseball

Fetsch indicated any bat used last year will be legal for the upcoming season. For the 2012 season, any composite bat that is not BBCOR rated will be illegal. All bats, including the aluminum bats, that meet the BBCOR standards will be stamped for the 2012 season.

District 5-----Tom Rettig, Supt. Medina

1. Discuss rules associated with having a shot clock

Indicated the NCAA women's rules no longer have a 5 second count when the player is dribbling the ball. Rettig asked the districts to take this back to the schools for discussion. Peltier indicated a concern for adopting rules that change coaching strategies.

District 6----- Daren Kurle, Supt. Strasburg

1. Summer Dead Period

District 6 schools are in favor of a rule and are looking for direction. The Executive Secretary indicated the NDHSCA is in favor of keeping the summer coaching rule. District 6 is in favor of a dead period somewhere around July 4th. Lunde indicated District 14 also has this on their agenda. Coaching leaders need to step in and tell athletes they need some time off. A dead period is needed to allow the coach as well as the athlete to have some family time.

2. Region basketball official selection

A concern from District 6 is they don't see their district officials in the region tournament. A request was the ballot results be published. Also, could the ballots ask for more than six selections on a ballot to provide more names from which to draw when it comes down to the selection process? District 10 Peltier asked if there was any written policy on officials working their home games.

District 7-----Karla Michaelson, AD Carrington

1. Do not include Region Dual Wrestling Tournament matches in the 40 match limit. No further discussion was needed.

District 8-----Absent

It was clarified voting on District 8 recommendations would not take place as there was no representative present.

- 1. Against switch of girls' and boys' basketball seasons. (Would like to see girls first, boys to follow).
- 2. Concern over re-districting and re-alignment.

- 3. Concern over 4 regions in track. (Keep at 6)
- 4. Support recommendation of coaching certification (That it is a recommendation, not a requirement).
- 5. Oppose moving FB state tournament to Bismarck. Keep FB state tournament in Grand Forks or Fargo.

It was clarified the Dakota Bowl will be held on Friday with all four games being held in one day. Also, with the rotation of 9-man and Division A, the 2011 Dakota Bowl is scheduled to begin with the 9-man game.

District 9-----Juno Pintar, AD Standing Rock

No recommendations were submitted.

District 10----Gaillord Peltier, Supt. Turtle Lake-Mercer

- 1. The shot clock, is there a recommended spot or where it should be placed?
- 2. Flip-Flop of boys and girls basketball seasons, boys state tournament weekend has conflicts with WDA, EDC. Concerns to watch out for.

It was indicated the girls' regional tournaments were up. District 14 Lunde shared this is a twoyear regulation and the group needs to wait to see how the change turns out. District 1 Swenson stated the benefits of athletes finishing the fall volleyball season having time to recuperate prior to starting the basketball season.

3. Can we have the Girls and Boys the same weekend at the same venue. Other sports do this, ex; Volleyball, Wrestling and Track and Field. Also, there is a Region 5 issue, we cannot rent the Civic Center or University of Mary for the Region 5 Tournament next year. Also a school in District 10 was asking if there is a possibility of adding a 6th foul.

District 11----Sue Lund, AD Sawyer

1. Concussion clarification on who can and who cannot clear an athlete to re-enter a contest.

The Executive Secretary clarified the current concussion rule. Each individual school is responsible to designate their appropriate health care provider. At a regional or state tournament, a transfer of care is available if they have their own appropriate provider.

District 12-----Larry Derr, Prin/AD Glenburn

- 1. Rule changes that increase expenses to schools. (shot clock, officials fees) Freeze officials pay. Bill 2150
- 2. Selection of Region Officials

This was previously addressed.

3. Quarter rule consequences- Player Suspension (forfeiting the contest is enough punishment)

Discussed was various penalties other than the individual athlete not allowed to participate in the next contest. District 16 agreed.

A roll call vote was taken: Yes - 6, 9, 12, 13, 16; No - 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 10, 11, 14, 15. Vote failed, 5-10 District 14 Lunde indicated this is a topic that should be taken back to the districts.

4. Support neutral site for regional tournaments

District 13-----Tyler Senn, AD Bowman County

1. 14 to 12 weight classes, allowing teams to take 15 athletes to regionals. Allow teams to take 15 athletes to regions, which would be 3 individuals that would wrestle unattached. It was determined to wait until the weight classes are defined before action on this recommendation.

District 14-----Mitch Lunde, AD, Beulah

- 1. Eliminate 10 second rule for girls
- 2. Dead Period for summer coaching
- 3. Mercy Rule

Although there is no specific plan, District 14 asked if districts are interested in the implementation of a mercy rule. District 9 Pintar and District 15 Enget indicated their invitational tournament would benefit from such a rule. There are no specifics at this time but it

was requested to be studied. District 1 Swenson asked if the shot clock and the running time are tied together. The group was asked if they are interested in the development of a mercy rule. District 15 Enget stated the mercy rule in football works well.

A roll call vote was taken: Yes – 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16; No – District 5. Recommendation passed, 14-1

4. Wrestling weigh-in/start times consistent

Requested is consistency in the scheduling of weigh-ins.

District 15----Lyne Enget, AD Stanley

- 1. Mercy Rule (35 / 40 Pts = Running Clock)
- 2. District 15 is in support of Coaches Certification

Almost all of the District 15 schools are requiring their coaches to take the course. Can there be a consideration for payback to help coaches pay for certification? Lunde indicated if NDHSAA assisted in payment of courses, that money would be coming from more than those coaches' schools.

- 3. Advisory Committee surveys should include AD's
- 4. Baseball Bats—make a decision and stick with it
- 5. Monies from MVP, Where is this going?

Also, a clarification was sought concerning the ejection rule.

District 16-----Celeste Thingvold, Prin/AD, Bowbells

- 1. Selection process of regional tournament officials
- 2. Recommend selecting regional officials in January
- 3. Penalty on athlete for playing too many quarters or matches should be lifted.
- 4. If the number of track regions is cut, add more qualifiers.

Top four should automatically qualify in each event at regionals.

The committee recommends moving Stanley to District 16, Center-Stanton to District 10 and Central Prairie to District 6. If approved, this will go into effect for the 2012-2013 season. The Board will have the opportunity to address this recommendation at the April Board meeting after sufficient time to receive input from member schools. The committee also looked a 8-district and 4-region plan and the result of that type of change. It was determined now is not the time for that type of change.
- c. The committee studied region assignments for six track regions for 2012. These proposed assignments will be shared with coaches and advisory committee for input prior to final decision.

Motion by Ulland to approve the committee recommendation to assign Dunseith baseball to Region 5. Second by Moe. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes,

Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Looysen – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion passed unanimously.

Moe reported on behalf of the Football Committee's work to amend the timelines associated with the development of the two-year football plan.

March 2012 - deadline for schools to declare to move up a division

April, 2012 - send out preliminary plan & request feedback

Helvik reported on the Class B District Chair Meeting which he moderated earlier in the day. The four items brought to the table by the 15 District representatives in attendance:

- 1. Add a coaching box for basketball (15-0)
- 2. Remove Regional Dual Tournament matches from the 40 match limit and replace with 16 events for wrestling (15-0)
- 3. Eliminate the 10 second rule in basketball (11-4)
- 4. Develop a mercy rule for basketball (14-1)

The Board discussed the wrestling proposals for clarification purposes.

The Board was asked to review the fine procedure found in Part II, Article X, Section I, page 19 of the Constitution & By-Laws.. The question is should the attendance fines be applied equally to fine arts as well as all activities. What shall be done with non-payment of fines? Fines are sometimes passed on to the coach and not paid. Olson indicated clarification of the penalty should be for all activities and should be due prior to post-season play.

Concerning the Robert Hoy letter, it was determined by the Board this should be studied by the Constitution & By-Laws Committee. President Ranum assigned this to the Constitution & By-Laws Committee to report back at the April meeting.

Preparations for the National Federation summer conference were discussed.

The Board discussed appropriate healthcare providers. The question was brought as to whether EMT people are considered appropriate healthcare providers in the recognition of a concussion. The Board will wait until action on Bill # 2281 is completed. At that time, the Board will look at the wording of our current concussion rules and how it compares with Bill # 2281. The House Education Committee will

hear the bill on Wednesday, March 23, 2011. The Executive Secretary and President Ranum will be in attendance.

The next Board meeting is set for April 19, 2011 in Valley City. Post season venues will be determined at this meeting. Options for Region 5 boys' basketball sites will be discussed. Member schools will be polled. Committees to meet will be Tournament Committee – 2:30 p.m. the previous day and the Fine Arts Committee meeting – 8:30 a.m. the morning of the Board meeting.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report. A balance sheet, detailed budget and investment report were made available to the Board. Motion by Sanstead to approve the financial report. Swiontek reported on behalf of the Tournament Committee with the regional tournament site recommendations as well as a review of the previously approved state tournament sites for the 2011-2012 year. The Committee reviewed the recommendations and invitations prior to submitting the recommendations. Motion by Sanstead to approve as presented. Second by Moe. Ulland asked if Devils Lake, Wahpeton or Valley City would ever host the regional basketball tournament. Swiontek indicated the size of the tournament would not be conducive to hosting. Olson indicated there are several activities in which there is a rotation of East Region sites. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Swiontek reported on the Combined Tournament Committee meeting which was held April 6th in Carrington. The major tournament site managers were present at the meeting to work on reserving facilities multiple years out. A discussion was held by the committee to begin consideration of permanent sites for state events. Currently there are several sites that could be considered permanent such as track & field. Also discussed was how broadcasting of state tournaments via webcasting should be addressed. Swiontek presented the following recommendations for Board action:

- 1. Develop a calendar 5 years out
- 2. Develop a site rotation 7 years out. It was determined if there would be changes, they be done with a sufficient number of years out to make the adjustment.
- 3. Change the State Class B Basketball adult reserved daily ticket from \$7 to \$9.
- 4. Change the site for State Boys Swimming from Grand Forks to Bismarck in 2012-13.
- 5. Change the site for State Boys Swimming from Bismarck to Grand Forks in 2013-14.
- 6. Change the site for State Boys Swimming from Grand Forks to Mandan in 2014-15.

Motion by Helvik to accept the recommendations as presented. Second by Fastnacht. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously. The Executive Secretary thanked the committee for their professionalism in tackling the many issues that are presented to their group.

Fastnacht reported on behalf of the Constitution & By-Laws Committee.

The alcohol, tobacco and drug rule as questioned by Robert Hoy, Attorney at Law was discussed. The committee recommended the staff develop wording to clarify how to handle the use of a valid prescription drug by someone other than the individual to which the drug was prescribed. Also, the development of a comment statement addressing the use of a mood/mind-altering drug. This will be reviewed for approval at the next committee meeting. It was clarified by Auch there is an appeal process that can be used in the event of a difficult situation in this regard.

The Committee discussed how to clarify the interpretations found in Part II, Article X, Section I-Note as found on page 19 of the By-Laws. It was determined to recommend adjustment of the regulations to bring the fine arts and athletics non-attendance of a rules clinic fine structure under one group. For any non-attendance of a mandatory rules clinic, there shall be a \$50 fine for the first offense and \$100 for the second and any subsequent offense. Fines must be paid prior to post-season participation in that activity to which the fine applies.

The committee also discussed the continued study of home/virtual school requirements.

These recommendations will be refined and brought back to the Board for consideration and approval.

Swiontek reported on behalf of the Fine Arts Committee:

1. Language content at speech and play events - Code of Conduct

Because there have been some issues regarding the use of language and/or obscene gestures during speech contests, the committee discussed some potential changes. The committee recommends the following:

- All schools participating in a speech meet shall complete a "Speech Language Content Form" before the team is allowed to compete.
- Teams shall complete a "NDHSAA Subjectional Content Form" for all potentially controversial speeches and their respective school administrator will be required to approve the speech.
- Meet managers will have the final say on contest appeals.

The committee earlier held a conference call with three speech coaches: Phyllis Kadrmas, Devils Lake; Sue Anderson, Richardton-Taylor and Yvonne Kalka, Grand Forks. The coaches believe the current system is working but could use some small adjustments. The coaches have no specific recommendations at this time. It was decided the Fine Arts Committee would write recommendations and send those recommendations back to the speech advisory committee for their review. Concerning dress code – appropriate attire will be expected.

2. Music and speech penalties for rule violations.

The committee discussed appropriate penalties for violations of procedure and code of conduct. Recommendations follow:

- Any rule violation as defined in the music contest rule book shall result in disqualification from said entry.
- The Code of Conduct is defined in the rule book and shall be used.
- Speech meet rule violations as defined in the contest rule book shall result in disqualification from the said entry at local, regional and state events.
- Code of conduct violation shall be the same as our policy manual.

3. Speech - end of season contests and state qualifiers.

The committee discussed issues regarding schools holding last chance speech meets in which state qualifiers can not attend or could attend and compete but were required to tell the judge to give them a five (bottom score). The committee felt these types of events are unethical. Regarding these situations the committee made the following recommendations:

No school shall hold a speech contest that eliminates contestants based on their prior achievements (state qualifiers can not be eliminated from local speech meets).

No school district shall hold speech meets after the regional speech deadline.

4. Request from the WDA Music Manager to extend the music registration deadline.

The manager would like to relax the rule of 20 days so that can hold the contest in the Methodist Church in Bismarck. Staff member, Bubach informed the committee the NDHSAA has had a twenty-day deadline for twenty years. Bubach recommended that WDA find a different site for their contest rather than the church. The committee did not want to deviate from the current rules and turned down the request.

Motion by Ulland to accept the recommendations as presented. Second by Helvik. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a request from Region VII chair, Supt. Steve Brannan, Garrison requesting on behalf of the Region VII speech coaches to reverse the decision disqualifying the Center-Stanton speech meet as a state qualifying contest. It was stated staff member Bubach has been given the task of strengthening the current rules governing fine arts. Motion by Swiontek to uphold the original ruling. Second by Fastnacht. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Ulland reported on behalf of the Trophy and Awards Committee. We are currently in the third year of a three-year contract. Discussion was held if the Board wished to extend the current contracts or consider accepting bids. The committee expressed satisfaction with the current contracted companies and wished to propose continuance with these companies. The only concern was with Four Season's timeliness of their delivery of merchandise as they crowd the date of the event to which the awards go but had never missed a deadline. This will be addressed by securing a deadline date with them. Recommended is to propose continuing with the current companies. Also, the committee discussed the size of the state awards. This reduction in size to fit in their display cabinets has been as a result of a directive from the member schools. Motion by Helvik to approve the Tournament Committee

recommendations. Second by Auch. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a letter from West Fargo High School requesting a waiver of contest limitations per week the remainder of the 2010-2011 school year for all activities. This request is in light of weather-related postponements and cancellations causing spring activities to lessen their number of contests. Motion by Ham to approve the request and waive all contest-per-week team limitations for the 2011 spring season. Second by Ulland. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board this is the last year US Bank will sponsor the Distinguished Student program. Farmers Union Insurance has indicated their wish to pick up this program. Details will be worked out. Also, Farmers Union Insurance has proposed an extension of the premier partnership for five years at the current amount. Motion by Ulland to accept this report. Second by Fastnacht. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed recommendations from the NDOA Board of Directors meeting which was held March 27, 2011.

- a. It was determined the fee schedule rate for sub-varsity basketball when rated proportionally to the varsity fee is 50% of what the varsity receives where other activities' sub-varsity fees are from 60% to 80% of the varsity fee for their sport. The NDOA recommends an adjustment of this rate the next time fees are adjusted. This will be presented at the September meeting when all officials fees are reviewed.
- b. The NDOA has requested annual workshops for baseball similar to other sports. It was also discussed to require day camps to be eligible for post-season for the purpose of exposing officials to three-umpire mechanics in preparation for post-season. Motion by Olson to approve workshops for baseball and continue study on day camps for future consideration. Second by Ham. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Swiontek yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously.
- c. The NDOA Board discussed recruitment of officials with a recommendation for a waiver of registration fees for first-year registrants. Motion by Fastnacht to deny this request. Second by Olson. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland yes, Moe yes, Swiontek yes, Helvik yes, Olson yes, Ham yes, Fastnacht yes, Sanstead yes, Auch yes, Ranum yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary reported receipt of the findings of facts from Attorney Vinje concerning the Solen hearing. Total cost of this hearing with attorney fees, board and staff travel was \$4,809.07. Ulland asked if this type of expense can be transferred to the protesting school rather than the membership sharing the cost. Auch indicated the cost might inhibit an appeal. The Executive Secretary shared Attorney Thune's statement this may be a roadblock to due process. Ham indicated the appealing school now is charged when it is handled through a conference call. The Executive Secretary told the Board Attorney Thune had complimented the Board for considering the sense of urgency and responding in the Solen situation.

Due to course conditions, the East Region Golf venue and State Golf venue and date are in need of change. Staff member Fetsch shared the EDC athletic administrators indicated the unlikelihood of hosting the region and state tournaments in Fargo and requested approval to move both tournaments to King's Walk in Grand Forks. King's Walk will accept the region on May 31st and the state tournament with a date change from June 8 & 9 to June 6 & 7. Motion by Swiontek to approve the changes as presented. Second by Sanstead. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Auch reported on behalf of the Promotions and Program Committee.

- a. Approved presenting the NDHSAA Distinguished Service Award to Staff member Solberg at an event of her choice during the 2011-2012 year.
- b. Continue development of plan to present the NDHSAA Distinguished Service Award to Odean Olson and Farmers Union Insurance. This will be placed on the agenda at a future meeting.

The Executive Secretary presented his report:

- a. Upon completion of the Solen investigation, the administration was asked to form an action plan to correct the processing of a violation similar to the one that occurred which led to the hearing concerning an ineligible student. Solen responded by indicating they already had a process in place as spelled out in the Coaches' and Directors Handbook. It was agreed by the Board this item is closed.
- b. NDHSAA received a rebate from NDIRF in the amount of \$3326.00.
- c. Gave an update on the concussion bill which was out of joint committee and presented for vote. Many amendments have taken place, most which have been directed at K-12 schools. Also initially targeted was any sporting team other than political subdivisions including programs sponsored by the parks and recreation organizations. Discussion was held as to the process the Board will take in the event of this bill being passed.

Staff member Bubach informed the Board the date of the April 16 State A Speech Tournament which was postponed due to inclement weather is rescheduled for May 14th. Motion by Moe to approve the rescheduled date. Second by Auch. A roll call vote was taken: Ulland – yes, Moe – yes, Swiontek – yes, Helvik – yes, Olson – yes, Ham – yes, Fastnacht – yes, Sanstead – yes, Auch – yes, Ranum – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Moe shared a representative report:

- a. A coaches opinion survey was sent asking if there should be an additional requirement such as mandating completing the National Federation course, "Teaching and Modeling Behavior" for a coach that is ejected from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct. It was the general feeling this would not be necessary unless the coach is a repeat offender.
- b. At the NDIAAA spring conference it was agreed the organization continues to support coaches' education. An online survey will be sent to all athletic administrators to see what part of the original recommendation is causing concern for the mandating of these education components.

The next meeting is scheduled for June 20 & 21, 2011 in Valley City. Athletic Review is scheduled for June 15, 2011.

There being no further business, President Ranum declared the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association Board of Directors – Special Meeting May 10, 2011 – Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met on May 10, 2011 via conference call. President Ranum called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all members present except Swiontek, Fastnacht and Looysen.

Class B Regional Golf Sites—Problems with water on the courses and other course conditions have caused concern and a need to relocate the site. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2011 AND 2010

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues and sales and charges at athletic events.

A. Basis of Accounting

The Association maintains its records on the modified cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation of buildings and equipment is computed on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset which range from three to twenty years. The Association capitalizes all significant equipment and building additions. The Association does not capitalize costs associated with its web site.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash equivalents include time deposits, certificates of deposits and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less.

E. Financial Statement Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Boards in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted assets and permanently restricted net assets. In addition the Association is required to present a statement of cash flows.

F. Income Tax Status

The Association is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Association is not a private foundation.

G. Investments

Under SFAS No. 124, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

H. Designation of Unrestricted Assets

It is the policy of the Board of Directors of the Association to review its plans for future property improvements and acquisitions from time to time and to designate appropriate sums of unrestricted net assets to assure adequate financing of such improvements and acquisitions.

5. PENSION PLANS

Three professional employees participate in the North Dakota Teachers Fund for Retirement (TFFR). Once these employees terminate their employment at the Association no other employees will be allowed to participate in TFFR. One professional and all clerical employees participate in a tax deferred annuity program. Employer contributes 16.8% of the employee's salary as determined according to TFFR. Total expense for the Association for the year ended June 30, 2011 and 2010 was \$90,054 and \$90,109 respectively.

7. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Association is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets; errors or omissions; injuries to employees; or natural disasters. The Association participates in the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund (NDIRF), a public entity risk pool for its general property and casualty and other miscellaneous insurance coverages. The NDIRF operates as common risk management and insurance program for North Dakota cities and schools. The Association pays an annual assessment to the NDIRF for its general insurance coverage. The NDIRF agreement provides that the Trust will be self-sustaining through member assessments and will re-insure through commercial companies for claims in excess of certain limits for each insured event.

The Association also carries commercial insurance for certain other risks of loss including employee health insurance. Settled claims resulting from these risks have not exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three years.
