FOREWORD

This yearbook provides a detailed accounting of the past years' activities for the NDHSAA. I would like to thank the Board of Directors, NDHSAA office staff and all representatives of the member schools for your dedication and commitment to the Association.

Farmers Union Insurance has completed its eighth year as the Premiere Partner of NDHSAA and continues to be actively involved in all activities. Their entire company has demonstrated a commitment to the enhancement of activities for North Dakota students and once again provided \$5,000 in scholarship funds for the NDHSAA Distinguished Student Program. The Association is very appreciative for what they do for the athletes and fine arts students in North Dakota.

The North Dakota National Guard has been a supporting sponsor of NDHSAA sponsored activities for the past seven years. We appreciate the demonstrated support of the Guard, as well as the North Dakota Department of Transportation, who completed their third year as a supporting sponsor. They have a great safety message and we are able to help promote that message.

Some highlights from the 2015-16 school year include:

*The implementation of a New Administrator Orientation for new superintendents, principals, and/or athletic administrators. NDHSAA staff members presented a variety of topics to help prepare incoming administrators for their "rookie season." The inaugural workshop was well attended and will continue to grow in upcoming years.

*The first full year of the Local Officials Program, which allows individuals to register through their local school district to become eligible to officiate athletic contests at the sub-varsity level. 147 individuals took advantage of the program in 2015-16, which is intended to grow the registered officials pool for the future.

*The Association added a staff member for first time since 2007-08 with the addition of a Media Specialist Position. Tom Mix began working for the NDHSAA in May 2016 and coordinates information platforms and media coverage of events for the Association.

Once again, the NDHSAA served a large number of students in grades seven through twelve. The most recent completed survey indicates there were 26,657 student participants in sports activities and 14,562 student participants in fine arts activities. The Association experienced a successful fiscal year, as gross admission records were set during the football playoffs, the Dakota Bowl, and at the Class B Boys Basketball Tournament. \$408,301 was distributed to member schools through the team payment program at the conclusion of the 2015-16 school year.

The NDHSAA continues to be a very successful organization that serves North Dakota students who wish to be involved in educationally based activities. It is important that each member school feels as though they are an important part of the Association. Your support is greatly appreciated.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association held their meeting on August 18, 2015 in Valley City. President Wiberg called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. and welcomed new Board members.

Upon additions to the agenda, motion by Manley to approve. Second by Bertsch. Motion carried unanimously.

Upon removal of the Bismarck Public Schools – Bismarck Legacy High School girls' hockey coop application from the consent agenda, motion by Hall to approve. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board discussed the Bismarck Public Schools and Bismarck Legacy coop application in girls' hockey for 2015-16, grades 7-12, with no fee. Discussion included whether the Board should take a stand in the formation of coops in Class A schools. Cooperative sponsorships are created by member schools and need NDHSAA Board approval. Board members questioned whether coops are being formed for participation or competition reasons. Motion by Roaldson to approve Bismarck Public Schools and Bismarck Legacy girls' hockey coop as requested. Second by Dahlen. Motion carried unanimously.

Harold Rotunda, NDHSAA auditor, provided the Board with a 2014-15 fiscal year audit report. Motion by Roaldson to approve. Second by Vollmer. Motion carried unanimously.

The Internal Revenue Service Form 990 was presented for approval by the Executive Director. Motion by Hall to approve the IRS Form 990 as presented. Second by Schafer. Motion carried unanimously.

Jason Wiberg, Executive Committee chair, reported Executive Board actions.

- An emergency coop application request from Shanley High School was denied by the Executive Board. Application does not move forward to the entire Board.
 - o Shanley and St. Joseph's (MN), girls' swimming, 7-12, 2015-16, no fee
- Fargo South High School reported the use of a 20 year-old participant during the 2015 boys track season. NDHSAA will issue a letter of reprimand to Fargo South High School. Fargo South forfeited all points for meets in which the ineligible player participated.
- Bismarck St. Mary's HS –violation of out-of-season coaching rule
 - A letter of reprimand will be issued and Bismarck St. Mary's High School will report to NDHSAA an action plan by November 13, 2015 stating how they will address out of season coaching compliance with their coaches.

Motion by Rinas to approve report. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

Andy Dahlen, Committee Chair, provided a Football Committee recommendation for the 2017 and 2018 football plan. Staff member Fletschock will develop a survey for committee member approval and send to schools. The committee is possibly looking at a ranking system on the survey to provide better feedback. The recommended football plan timeline was shared with the Board.

First Week in October Football Committee meets & finalizes recommended plan

Motion by Roaldson to approve the football committee report. Second by Bertsch. Motion carried unanimously.

Steve Hall, Committee Chair, provided a report from the Constitution and By-Law's committee on the development of a Code of Conduct policy. The draft Student Participation Code of Conduct presented at the June Board meeting was reviewed by NDHSAA legal counsel as per Board request. Legal counsel recommended NDHSAA refrain from adopting the Student Participation Code of Conduct. The committee is considering requiring all schools to have a local school policy to address participant code of conduct. The committee would like NDHSAA office staff to review recommendations set forth in the opinion from legal counsel and schedule a meeting with NDHSAA legal counsel, Rachel Bruner-Kaufman, at the October Constitution & By-Laws Committee meeting. Motion by Baesler to approve Constitution & By-Laws report. Second by Manley. Motion carried unanimously.

Todd Bertsch, Media Committee Chair provided the Board with a report. The committee discussed the proposed extension of the NFHS Network contract. NDHSAA is currently in year three of a five year contract with NFHS Network. The proposed extension would set the amount of money paid to NDHSAA to \$55,000 for contract years 6 through 8 and \$65,000 for contract years 9 and 10. The committee directed Executive Director Fetsch to pursue a revised extension with the NFHS Network to broadcast post season events.

The committee also discussed potential penalties for streaming post season events without NDHSAA permission. The proposed penalty would be a fine equal to double the rate listed on the NDHSAA broadcast fee schedule. NDHSAA staff is directed to create policy wording to communicate with schools and tournament managers. NDHSAA will contact main school contacts and tournament managers concerning streaming opportunities. Motion by Vollmer to approve the media committee report. Second by Schafer. Motion carried unanimously.

Brad Rinas, Finance/Personnel Committee Chair, provided the Board with a report. The committee would like to explore a possible position for a media relations position in the NDHSAA office. More

information will be available at the September meeting. Motion by Manley to approve the committee report. Second by Dahlen. Motion carried unanimously.

Staff member Brenda Schell provided an update on the NDHSAA Strategic Plan. Motion by Roaldson to approve the Strategic Plan Report. Second by Rinas. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a request from Jason Schwabe, Thompson High School Principal/Athletic Director to waive item #14 of the 2015 football regulations, which states, "any varsity team that plays an independent team will be ineligible for the playoffs." Due to scheduling conflicts, Thompson would like permission to play a varsity football game against Four Winds High School on September 25, 2015 who is playing a JV schedule this year and will not be eligible for post season. The new 9-man format consisting of 55 teams made up of (3) 7 team regions and (3) 8 team regions, made scheduling non-region games extremely difficult. Motion by Schafer to approve the request. Second by Stedman. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Director's Report

- a. Fall Administrator meetings were held around the state in five locations. Attendance was the highest we have had in recent years.
- b. A New Administrator Orientation was held August 17, 2015 in the Valley City office. NDHSAA staff discussed regulations, deadlines, policy and procedures. The feedback was very positive. The attendees will be surveyed for feedback. Overall the orientation was a success.
- c. Fetsch informed the Board NDHSAA legal counsel Jon Sanstead is no longer employed with Pearce-Durick. NDHSAA is under contract for legal counsel with Pearce-Durick through December 2015.
- d. 2014-15 tee shirt sales report was reviewed.
- e. Anyone Can Save a Life Program was presented at all fall administrative meetings.
- f. Fetsch updated the Board on the progress of the parking lot repaving project.

NDHSAA Distinguished Student Jordyn Hetland, Wyndmere High School, and finalist Keaton Erickson, Carrington High School, provided a summary of the NFHS Student Leadership Summit held in July in Indianapolis. They thanked the Board and felt it was an extremely worthwhile conference to attend and felt it would be beneficial for all six Distinguished Student finalists to attend. At the conference they had sessions on how to have a good online presence, being respectful, being good role models along with service to others. Most states represented at the conference have student advisory or student leadership committees in their home states. Jordyn and Keaton are interested in altering the role of the NDHSAA Distinguished Students to include a leadership council with two goals in mind. First to gain more visibility for the program so more high schools participate throughout the state. Secondly allow students a recognizable voice in NDHSAA through the Distinguished Student program. They requested the Board consider financial and moral support. The council would report back to the NDHSAA Board. Board members were very interested in the idea of student input. Jordyn and Keaton would also like the Distinguished Students to act as a leadership group representing the NDHSAA. There seems to be a lack of connection between students and NDHSAA and the addition of a group of students to spread awareness of the Distinguished Student program and NDHSAA would increase visibility. The current main duty of Distinguished Students is to assist with presentation of awards at tournaments throughout the year and be role models for other students. They would like to expand those duties. The Distinguished Students plan to present the leadership skills learned at the NFHS Student Leadership Summit at the Jr. High Student Council conference this year and would like to increase awareness of NDHSAA throughout the state. NDHSAA staff will present a recommendation on a student advisory committee to the Board in September.

The next NDHSAA Board meeting will be held September 22, 2015 in Valley City.

President Wiberg declared the meeting adjourned at 11:45 am.

Jason Wiberg, Executive Committee chair, reported Executive Committee actions.

- a) There were four school violations.
 - 1) New Town Use of 6th grader in junior high cross country.
 - i) NDHSAA will issue a letter of reprimand to New Town High School. New Town High School forfeited all points for meets in which the ineligible player participated.

- 2) Kenmare use of academically ineligible participant in football
 - i) NDHSAA will issue a letter of reprimand to Kenmare High School. Kenmare High School forfeited all games in which the ineligible player participated.
- 3) Valley City Use of academically ineligible participant in football.
 - i) NDHSAA will issue a letter of reprimand to Valley City High School. Valley City High School forfeited all games in which the ineligible player participated.
- 4) Parshall High School Use of ineligible player in junior high volleyball.
 - i) NDHSAA will issue a letter of reprimand to Parshall High School. Parshall High School forfeited all games in which the ineligible player participated.
- b) Review of Vinje Law Firm letter
 - 1) Shiloh Christian School hired an attorney to investigate whether undue influence was used to bring a student to Shiloh Christian School. Upon completion of the investigation by Vinje Law Firm no undue influence was found.

Motion by Bertsch to approve Executive Committee report. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

Andy Dahlen, Football Committee Chair, provided an update on the development of a member school survey regarding the 2017 and 2018 football plan. Fetsch and Fletschock shared football plan information they presented at the NDIAAA conference. Using a ratio 2.5:1 based on enrollments, the current football plan would include 14 AAA teams, 7 AA teams, 53 A teams and 27 9-Man teams. Also discussed was applying schools free & reduced rate to the male population to determine adjusted enrollment. Currently only free and reduced rates are used to adjust male population only if the rate is at 60% and above. A survey will be developed and sent out in the next 2 weeks. The survey will include a ranking system for answers to questions. A copy of the survey will be sent to the Football Committee for review before being sent to member schools. Feedback will be reviewed at the the October Football Committee meeting.

Motion by Rinas to approve the Football Committee report. Second by Schafer. Motion carried unanimously.

Jeff Manley, Realignment Committee Chair, provided the Board with a recommendation for the placement of South Prairie High School boys and girls track teams in Class B Northwest Region beginning in the 2015-16 season.

Motion by Schafer to approve the Realignment Committee report. Second by Dahlen. Motion carried unanimously.

Todd Bertsch, Media Committee Chair provided the Board with a report. September 11th the Media Committee met via conference call with Robert Rothberg, President of Playon Sports. The purpose was to discuss a 5-year extension to the NDHSAA - NFHS Network contract.

A week after the conference call, NDHSAA received a list of NFHS Network declined events for the 2015/16 year. Declined events are post season events the NFHS Network is not planning to broadcast. NDHSAA has the ability to sell declined events to third party entities. The committee reviewed the list of declined events. The committee recommended continued research by NDHSAA staff before signing the extension. The committee also discussed the penalty for streaming NDHSAA post season events without NDHSAA permission. The penalty recommended by the Media Committee is double each tournament's broadcast/streaming rate as listed in the NDHSAA policy manual. This information will be distributed to statewide media, main school contacts, tournament managers, and via the BULLETIN. The full Board discussed the extension of the NFHS Network contract.

Motion by Hall to approve the media committee report. Second by Rinas. Motion carried unanimously.

Brad Rinas, Finance/Personnel Committee Chair, provided the Board a report regarding the creation of a media relations position in the NDHSAA office. The committee provided a summary and a list of job responsibilities for an NDHSAA Media Specialist for Board review. The committee recommended a compensation base of \$50,000 salary plus benefits and retirement.

If approved, the committee recommended the following timeline for the process of hiring a media relations position.

Application window opens February 1, 2016 Applications received until April 1, 2016 Applications screened April 6, 2016 Interviews conducted April 13, 2016 in Valley City Board approval April 19, 2016

The committee will receive feedback from the Board on the recommended job summary, recommendations and timeline at the October meeting. Motion by Roaldson to approve the Finance/Personnel Committee report. Second by Bertsch. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board received a handout from staff member Morast with an update on the development of a Student Leadership Advisory Committee. Action was tabled. The Board would like to continue discussion at the October Board meeting.

The Board reviewed a letter from Tom Milbrandt, Maple Valley Athletic Director, on behalf of Region 1 schools requesting the Board change the approved number of volleyball and basketball contests and region tournament structure for the 2016-17 school year.

Region I request:

- 1. Beginning the 2016-17 season, allow volleyball teams an extra match allowing the NDHSAA to handle the entire Region I VB tournament, profit/loss included. New restrictions would be (matches-tourney) 18-2, 16-3, 14-4.
- 2. Beginning the 2016-17 season, allow girls and boys basketball teams an extra game allowing the NDHSAA to handle the entire Region I girls basketball/boys basketball Tournaments, profit/loss included bringing the allowable games from 20 to 21 regular season games. They would like to keep the sites the same as the original Region I Super Regional proposal approved by the NDHSAA board.
- 3. Keep home sites for play-in games for volleyball. Also keep the Region I tournament location for boys and girls basketball. Region I schools will discuss the possibility of changing site locations at the conclusion of the 2015-2016 season.

Motion by Schafer to allow volleyball teams an additional match beginning the 2016-2017 season allowing the NDHSAA to handle the entire Region I Volleyball Tournament, profit/loss included. New restrictions would be (matches-tourney) 18-2, 16-3, 14-4. Second by Dahlen. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Schafer to deny allowing an additional game as proposed for girls and boys basketball. Second by Manley. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board discussed ticket prices for state soccer. State soccer ticket prices were not adjusted when 2015/16 tournament ticket prices were previously approved. Motion by Rinas to approve the adjustment to the tournament ticket prices. Adult tournament ticket increase from \$20 to \$24 and student tournament ticket increase from \$10 to \$12. Second by Hall. Motion carried unanimously.

Representative Reports

- Schafer entertained a plan to allow transient students the opportunity to play at varsity level if
 they have not participated in a sport/activity in their previous state/location. Students are
 encouraged to become involved and then are not allowed to participate in varsity sport/activity
 once they are involved.
- Wiberg brought up the Board regulation concerning sport specific out of season open gyms.
 There is currently a Board regulation stating schools can not have sport specific open gyms.
 Wiberg would like the Board to investigate changing the summer sport specific open gym
 regulation. He feels there is a liability when volleyball standards are set up and students are
 playing basketball. This was referred to NDHSAA staff for recommendation.

Steve Hall, committee chair, provided a report from the Constitution and By-Law's Committee. The committee continued to discuss a NDHSAA Code of Conduct. Legal counsel, Rachel Bruner-Kaufman was in attendance and recommended NDHSAA not implement a Code of Conduct as discussed. Patti Stedman is going to research the policy recommendation of the North Dakota School Boards Association. Development of a transgender policy was discussed. Due to numerous inquiries from member schools, the NDHSAA Board of Directors and staff are working with legal counsel to develop a regulation regarding participation of transgendered students in NDHSAA athletics and activities. South Dakota High School Activities Association, Missouri State High School Activities Association and NCAA current policies were discussed. The committee recommendation is to direct legal counsel to develop a draft policy based on Missouri and NCAA policies for committee review. Nationally, 37 states have some sort of transgender policy.

Motion by Schafer to approve the Constitution & By-Law Committee report. Second by Rinas. Motion carried unanimously.

Jeff Manley, Realignment Committee Chair, provided the Board with a recommendation for placement of Dakota Prairie in Class B wrestling region 2 for the 2015-16 season. Dakota Prairie is planning to request a coop for 2016-17.

Motion by Vollmer to approve the Realignment Committee report. Second by Rinas. Motion carried unanimously.

The General Assembly meeting agenda was distributed and discussed. President Wiberg will chair the meeting. Jordyn Hetland of Wyndmere, 2015-16 NDHSAA Distinguished Student, will address the General Assembly. Nominations for representatives will be accepted for Class B SE, Class A At-Large and NDIAAA.

Staff member Fletschock presented a handout regarding open gym guidelines as per previous Board request. Motion by Stedman to change the word gymnasiums to facilities throughout from the Guidelines Relative to Out-of-Season Participation and Use of Gymnasiums in Part III, Board Regulations and Guidelines of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws. Second by Manley. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board continued discussion on the creation of a student leadership advisory group which was tabled at the September meeting. The discussion indicated the Distinguished Student program is fulfilling the intent for which it was created. Motion by Vollmer to leave the Distinguished Student program as it is currently being operated. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board discussed a Personnel Committee recommendation to create a media specialist position beginning in July 2016 as previously presented. The addition of a media specialist follows the NDHSAA Strategic Plan to address changing demographics, social media and the long term financial security of the NDHSAA.

The following timeline for the process of hiring a media relations position will be implemented.

The Board received a request from Perry Piatz, Activities Director at Kindred High School, requesting participation in a varsity football contest prior to the first allowable AA date and to adjust their first allowable practice two days earlier for the 2016 season. Board discussion included the different start dates for different divisions.

Motion by Rinas to allow Kindred High School to play a contest prior to the first allowable AA football first contest date and to adjust their first allowable practice two days earlier for the 2016 season. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Director's Report

- a) An action plan to address out of season coaching regulations was submitted by Bismarck St. Mary's.
- b) Fetsch received a contract extension to provide Spalding basketballs and Dudley softballs for the NDHSAA tournaments from Spalding/Dudley. We are currently in year five of a five-year contract for basketballs. Spalding offered a five-year extension of their current contract. Spalding will pay NDHSAA \$15,000 per year, an increase of \$5,000, and supply all basketballs for NDHSAA state tournaments at no cost. Dudley agreed to supply softballs for NDHSAA state tournaments.
- c) Fetsch also contacted suppliers of game balls for other sports such as Wilson for tennis balls to request their support. He has not yet heard back from other suppliers.
- d) Blue Cross/Blue Shield Health Insurance renewal was presented. Health insurance renewal shows a .19% increase for family health insurance.
- e) Fetsch presented the Board with notes from the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee meeting held in September. In 2010 the Board had a request to add immunizations to the Pre-Participation Form. The advisory committee indicated the form is intended to confirm if you are healthy enough to participate and immunizations are not a part of that.
- f) Staff member Bubach and Executive Director Fetsch will present a session at the North Dakota School Boards Association Conference at the end of October. The main topics they will present are drug and alcohol rule appeal process and code of conduct.

West Fargo Sheyenne High School principal, Greg Grooters appeared before the Board to appeal to a denied hardship application. Necessary information was distributed to the Board. Executive Director Fetsch explained the process and his hardship investigation to the Board. Grooters and a parent of the student provided the Board additional information as to reasons they believe the hardship should be granted.

Motion by Baesler to approve the hardship appeal. Second by Stedman. Roll call vote: Roaldson – no, Rinas – no, Vollmer – yes, Bertsch - no, Dahlen - yes, Hall - yes, Baesler - yes, Schafer - yes, Manley - yes, Stedman – yes, Wiberg – no. Motion approved (7-4).

Board Correspondence was reviewed including letters from Devils Lake patrons.

Representative Reports

Dahlen was contacted by a member school concerning streaming fees for post season events. Fetsch indicated NDHSAA is under contract to the NFHS Network for post season events. Member schools that are members of the NFHS School Broadcast Program have the ability to stream their own games, using a subscription model.

Schafer brought up a complaint from Williston expressing frustration with golf coops within Class A schools.

The Executive Director gave his report:

- Fetsch indicated the theme of his report is "the only constant is change"
- NDHSAA unveiled new blazers at the General Assembly.
- The Local Officials Program, which began January, 2015 had 30 officials participate in the 2014/15 school year. Currently the program has 116 registered officials with 4 local officials from 2014/15 becoming fully registered officials in 2015/16.
- Football contact limitations reported in January, 2015 began in the fall of 2015/16 making football in North Dakota safer than it has ever been. We continue to spread that word throughout North Dakota.
- NDHSAA held a new administrator workshop at the NDHSAA office in August with 19 new Athletic Directors receiving training for their new position.
- The Board and staff continue to study a requirement that schools have a Code of Conduct policy.
- Due to numerous inquiries from member schools, the NDHSAA Board of Directors and staff are working with legal counsel to develop a regulation regarding the participation of transgender students in NDHSAA athletics and activities.
- Fetsch indicated the constant is change, but it's amazing how similar our current status is to that of 50 years ago citing the following examples.
 - o In 1965-66 a new Class A high school was formed Fargo North.
 - In 2015-16 we have a new Class A school in Bismarck and one in West Fargo.
 We also have two new Class B schools for the first time in a generation.
 - In 1965-66 the sport of hockey was added to NDHSAA sports administrated with the anticipation curling and skiing would be the next sports added.
 - In 2015-16 many schools are adding clay target as a club sport.
 - In 1965-66 a staff position was added to work more closely with officials.
 - In 2015-16 the NDHSAA Board approved the addition of a media specialist position in the NDHSAA office.
 - In 1965-66 there was a change in classification from 3 classes to 2.
 - In 2015-16 Watford City will be Class B in 2016-17 and 2017-18.
- Fetsch shared with the membership, the numerous requests the NDHSAA Board of Directors and staff receive to waive approved Board of Directors regulations or By-Laws, written and amended over the past 100+ years by member schools, prohibiting a student from participating

in activities. Parents, coaches, or administrators frequently request exceptions be made, that a violation be overlooked, or the consequences of the violation be reduced or waived. When the request is not approved, it is not infrequent that those applying the rules will be told: "You don't care about kids." In reality it is the presence of high standards of eligibility and conduct that contribute to the value of participation for students, their schools and the community. If we raise standards, we raise the value of the program; if we lower standards, we diminish the value of the program for participants, schools, and communities. As an example of creating high standards. Fetsch cited the following changes to the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws.

- In October 2006 the number of days a transfer student was ineligible to participate in varsity contests was changed from 90 to 180 days with a 71% approval of the membership.
- In October 2008 the elimination of the re-transfer rule passing with a 97% approval of the membership.
- In January 2015 academic eligibility changes were increased with a 94% approval of the membership.
- Fetsch told the membership North Dakota currently has the highest standard for alcohol, drug, and tobacco suspensions in the country. Those numbers clearly show member schools support raising standards, and that educationally-based activities in our great state are a privilege and not a property right. When told "You don't care about the kids," Fetsch' response is that making and enforcing rules will always be the first and foremost way the NDHSAA cares about kids. It is NDHSAA's tough love, something that a majority of parents in today's world refuse to give.
- Fetsch provided the membership with photos of the recently created Champions Room in the NDHSAA office and invited schools to stop by the NDHSAA office for a tour.
- In closing, Fetsch thanked administrators for all they do for North Dakota students on a daily basis and for what they do for their colleagues. He encouraged those in attendance to continue to take advantage of opportunities like this conference and to call the NDHSAA office with any questions they may have.
- Fetsch closed with a humorous video about over-bearing parents.

With no further business, President Wiberg declared the meeting adjourned at 5:16 pm.

A transgender student will be defined as a student whose gender identity does not match the sex assigned to him or her at birth.

Any transgender student who is not taking hormone treatment related to gender transition may participate in a sex-separated interscholastic contest in accordance with the sex assigned to him or her at birth.

The following clarifies participation in sex-separated interscholastic contests of transgender students

undergoing hormonal treatment for gender transition:

- A trans male (female to male) student has undergone treatment with testosterone for gender transition may compete in a contest for boys but is no longer eligible to compete in a contest for girls.
- A trans female (male to female) student being treated with testosterone suppression medication for gender transition may continue to compete in a contest for boys but may not compete in a contest for girls until completing one calendar year of documented testosterone-suppression treatment.

Motion by Dahlen to approve the transgender regulation as presented. Second by Schafer. Motion carried unanimously.

Andy Dahlen, Football Committee Chair, provided an update on the member school survey regarding the 2017 and 2018 football plan.

The committee reviewed the fall male enrollment numbers received from the ND Department of Public Instruction and the effect on football divisions. Potential options for the next football plan were discussed. The Football Committee will meet on December 3, 2015 to continue discussion. A conference call Board meeting may be called before the January Board meeting to approve a final football plan.

Motion by Vollmer to approve the Football Committee report. Second by Hall. Motion carried unanimously.

Brad Rinas, Promotions and Programs Committee Chair, provided a report on a request from Farmer's Union Insurance for the creation of a Facebook contest for NDHSAA member schools. The proposed contest, named "Simply Different" would be for schools to post why their school is "Simply Different" and have Facebook users vote for their school by "Liking" the school page. The school with the most "Likes" in both Class A and Class B would receive \$5,000 each for their school athletic, arts or music department.

The committee recommended no action at this time to move forward with the Farmer's Union proposal.

The committee also discussed sponsorship tiers with no recommendation for change at this time.

The North Dakota Officials Association (NDOA) recommends increasing the fee for reciprocity officials to \$10 per sport beginning in 2016-17.

Motion by Roaldson to approve an increase in the reciprocity fee to \$10 per sport beginning in 2016-17. Second by Rinas. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed and discussed correspondence concerning the next football plan from Turtle Mountain Community School.

Representative reports included:

- Rinas asked Board members if there has been any discussion about using neutral sites for football playoffs. Executive Director Fetsch indicated the issue had been discussed with coaches advisory and coaches in the past. They indicated they would like to remain at home sites for playoff games.
- Vollmer indicated a school in his area requested additional information about a school with a one act play team which won a region play contest and was later found to be ineligible. Fetsch indicated Bottineau High School did not submit their registration for the State One-Act Play competition by the required deadline. The information was emailed directly to the tournament manager as the school did not complete their registration by the required due date and registration was closed. The region manager allowed the team to compete without proper registration. When the issue was realized, the team was informed they could not participate in the state competition causing the 2nd place region play to move to 1st place and the 3rd place region play to move to 2nd place.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association held their meeting on December 3, 2015 in Valley City via conference call. President Wiberg called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

Andy Dahlen, Football Committee Chair, provided a recommendation for male enrollment numbers to be used for classification in the 2017 and 2018 football plan. The committee recommends offering an option of independent 6-man football. Schools would be required to declare their interest in 6-man football by September 15, 2016. The committee recommends creating four football divisions as in the past. The committee's preliminary suggestion for the number of teams in each division would be: 14 teams in AAA,10 teams in AA, 32 teams in A, the remaining teams who are not interested in playing a 6-man independent schedule in 9-man. Also recommended for the upcoming plan is to use each school's free and reduced rate to adjust male student enrollment numbers. Students participating in free and reduced meals will be counted at 50% for enrollment number purposes.

The committee proposed the following plan for determining enrollments for football plan development. Enrollments for plan development purposes will be determined by:

- Step 1: Fall 2015 male enrollments for grades 7 10 as provided by the Department of Public Instruction.
- Step 2: The enrollment reported in Step 1 is multiplied by the percentage of the student body that qualified for free and reduced meals during the 2014-15 school year according to Department of Public Instruction data. That number will be multiplied by 50%.
- Step 3: The number derived in Step 2 is subtracted from the total 7 10 grade enrollment reported in Step 1. The remainder number will represent the total school enrollment for classification purposes during the 2017 and 2018 football plan

The committee reviewed the football plan timeline with proposed changes indicated by *.

Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (Drone) Policy

For NDHSAA Tournaments

The use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV), also known as drones, is prohibited for any purpose by any persons at NDHSAA tournament venues. Tournament management shall refuse admission or entry to anyone attempting to use a UAV; and if necessary, tournament management shall remove anyone attempting to use a UAV and/or confiscate the UAV until the event has been completed.

For purposes of this policy, a UAV is any aircraft without a human pilot aboard the device.

An exception to this policy may be made in specific cases for NDHSAA broadcast partners, provided the management of the tournament facility permits the presence of UAVs for broadcast purposes under the control of the NDHSAA.

Football Plan Guidelines

The following guidelines are being considered by the NDHSAA Football Committee for the administration of the current football plan and the development of subsequent two – year football plans

- 1. Football plans shall be established for two years.
- 2. Football seasons for plan purposes will be 2017 and 2018.
- 3. There will be 4 divisions of football. (AAA, AA, A, 9M)
- 4. Enrollments for plan development purposes will be determined by:
 - Step 1: Fall 2015 male enrollments for grades 7 10 as provided by the Department of Public Instruction.
 - Step 2: The enrollment reported in Step 1 is multiplied by the percentage of the student body that qualified for free and reduced meals during the 2014-15 school year according to Department of Public Instruction data. That number will be multiplied by 50%.
 - Step 3: The number derived in Step 2 is subtracted from the total 7 10 grade enrollment reported in Step 1. The remainder number will represent the total school enrollment for classification purposes during the 2017 and 2018 football plan.
- 5. Schools may request to move up to a higher division if the next smaller enrollment school in that division is willing to move down and so on.
 - a. All such requests for division assignments as of September 30, 2016 are final.
 - b. Schools that have previously opted to move up shall be given first consideration.
- 6. Schools may request to field an independent 6-man team by officially notifying the NDHSAA office on or before September 15, 2016.
- 7. The maximum number of teams in the top three divisions will be: AAA = 14, AA = 10, A = 32 with the remainder of the teams in 9-man.
 - a. If a school chooses to play an independent schedule or discontinues football during the two year plan, the number of teams in that division will not be changed.
 - b. Any varsity team that chooses to play an independent team will be ineligible for the playoffs.
 - c. If a coop is approved, realignment in any of the top three divisions may be allowed with consideration given to the geographic location of schools involved in the change.
- 8. BY–LAW REMINDER: Football coops must be submitted by September 15th of the previous year during both years of the two-year football plan.
- 9. A North Dakota school may apply for an emergency coop for the second season of a current football plan only, if the following criteria are met:
 - a. An approved coop for the following two-year football plan must be in place prior to being eligible for an emergency coop
 - b. Emergency coop applications will only be considered if the requesting school has provided proof that student-athletes have no opportunity to compete at the varsity level for the second year of the existing plan
 - c. If the emergency coop is approved:
 - The host school shall be that school with the largest enrollment. The host school's current schedule and division placement will be used for the second year of the existing plan
 - ii. Only seniors from the applying school would be eligible for varsity competition for a \$1000 non-compliance fee per player
 - iii. Sub-varsity players from the applying school could compete for a \$200 noncompliance fee per player
- 10. The NDHSAA Board of Directors shall have final say in the administration of these guidelines.

Motion by Vollmer to approve request. Second by Hall Motion carried unanimously.

MINUTES NDHSAA Annual Membership Meeting January 26, 2016 - Bismarck, North Dakota

The Representative Assembly Meeting of the North Dakota High School Activities Association was held Tuesday, January 26, 2016 at 12:00 noon at the Bismarck Ramkota. President Wiberg welcomed the membership, called the meeting to order, and declared a quorum had been established.

President Wiberg introduced the Board of Directors and staff to the membership.

On behalf of the Canvassing Committee, Chair Kirsten Baesler reported the results of the ballots for NDHSAA Board positions.

Class B Southeast: Mitch Carlson, Superintendent, LaMoure Public Schools

Class A At-Large: Scott Privratsky, Superintendent, Devils Lake Public Schools NDIAAA: Michael Sorlie, Athletic Director, North Sargent High School

Football Committee Chair, Andy Dahlen, provided the membership with an update on the 2017 & 2018 football plan guidelines. The football plan guidelines were distributed and reviewed. Dahlen reminded the membership of the football plan timeline.

Motion by Kirk Ham, Park River, to propose the following amendment to the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Law. Second by Kevin Baumgarn, Rolla.

Part II, Article XIV, Section IXa

A student shall have been in attendance at the school which the student represents for 180 school days one (1) calendar year upon transferring from another school unless the student's parents have become residents of the school district to which the student transferred or unless the school from which the student transferred does not offer work of the corresponding year in which the student is ranked, and there is no evidence of recruitment or undue influence. In the instance of a pupil transferring from a public high school to a private or parochial high school. or vice versa, the student shall not be eligible to represent the new high school in varsity competition for 180 school days one (1) calendar year beginning with the first day of attendance in the new school. Should a school district maintain more than one high school, residence shall be understood to refer to the territory assigned to a specific high school by the Board of Education, and any transfer by a student from one school to another within the school district without a corresponding change in parental residence shall result in a loss of eligibility in varsity competition for 180 school days one (1) calendar year. Should the student transfer from one school after the completion of the school year to another school prior to the start of the subsequent school year, the one (1) calendar year loss of varsity eligibility shall begin on the first date for fall practice in any sport.

A roll call vote of the membership was taken. Amendment passes (Yes - 110, No - 9) and will go into effect July 2016.

Executive Director Fetsch informed the membership of the availability of public service announcements produced in cooperation with NFHS, NIAAA, NDHSAA and NDIAAA. These PSAs are available on the NDHSAA website.

In closing, Executive Director Fetsch thanked member schools for what they do for students in our state on a daily basis.

President Wiberg thanked the membership for their attendance and attention. The meeting adjourned at 12:42 pm.

> District Chairperson Notes Minot - Holiday Inn (Riverside) March 18, 2016

The Class B District Chair meeting was held on March 18, 2016 at the Minot Holiday Inn - Riverside. Chairman Rinas called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with 16 districts represented. Upon introductions, Chairman Rinas welcomed the district chairpersons and thanked them for representing their district.

The Executive Director thanked the member schools for past service as district chairs. Sheets were passed around to allow each member to complete information on the 2017 basketball district

chairperson and each district's recommendation for district and region sites, dates and managers. Fetsch informed the chairs of the approval process and timeline for approving district and region sites.

Each district was given the opportunity to present their district's recommendations, which are listed as submitted.

District 1-----Kent Dennis, Principal/AD Hankinson HS

1. No items

District 2-----Brian Midthun, AD Enderlin HS

- 1. All 13 coaches in District 2 are in favor of a running clock/mercy rule in basketball. No vote requested as this appears on the agenda in different districts with more specific plans and will hold discussion at that time.
- 2. Coaches are wondering why NDHSAA has not made a decision as to mandating the superregion tournaments. Fetsch explained the Board formed an ad-hoc committee last year to address this issue. The ad-hoc committee will meet later today and will provide the Board with an update.

District 3-----Patti Aanenson, AD Larimore HS

- 1. The wrestling coaches from Region 2 are proposing dropping the number of weight classes from 14 to 12. The weight classes used would be the 10 college classes along with 106 and 115.
 - a. 106, 115, 125, 133, 141, 149, 157, 165, 174, 184, 197, 285
 - b. The request is being made due to the number of teams that cannot field 14 weight classes. Staff member Morast indicated if NDHSAA deviates from the NFHS weight classes we would no longer have a vote on the NFHS wrestling rules committee. The district chairs questioned the consequences if we deviate from NFHS. Morast also informed the group about an NFHS wrestling rules committee recommendation to go from 14 weight classes to 13 in 2017/18. The NFHS Board will vote on this in April. This topic came up at the wrestling coaches meeting with a result of wrestling coaches in favor of waiting for the NFHS Board to make their decision before making additional requests. Aanenson requested a straw vote to how many would be in favor of following the NFHS recommendations. Vote to Follow NFHS vote: 11-5 Aanenson also requested a vote to go to 12 weight classes as proposed. Vote: 4-10

District 4-----Aaron Schramm, Principal/AD Park River HS

1. No items

District 5-----Lucas Isaacson, AD LaMoure HS

- Would like to discuss eliminating the total number of quarters played in basketball for the season. Leave a limit of 6 quarters per night but not the end of the year total. Vote Requested: 6-10
- 2. Change wrestling to 12 weight classes. Vote Requested: 7-9

District 6-----Damon Bosche, AD Medina HS

- State wrestling ticket distribution was discussed. State wrestling ticket distribution process needs to adopt one of the two procedures. Continue to have schools submit their ticket request like the current procedure. Then proceed to one of the two scenarios. Vote Requested: 3-13
 - i. Seed the dual tournament immediately after region tournaments are done. The top four dual teams get reserved seating. Then the rest of the ticket orders are randomly picked for the remainder of the seating...or
 - ii. Complete random draw for all the schools that have submitted ticket requests.
 - b. This would give more precedence to the top teams. Right now the schools have a form that is filled out and faxed in with the form requests starting at midnight. First come first serve based on what the Fargo Dome feels is the best seating for Class A and Class B. Fargodome has requested the time be moved to 8:00 am instead of

midnight. The time will be changed to 8:00 am and NDHSAA is investigating using PayPal for ticket orders rather than faxing information.

- 2. Would like discussion on the possibility of providing passes to all North Dakota AD's for access to tournaments and games throughout the state. Discussion included this is a local issue and is a conversation that should be held at the district level.
- 3. Would like discussion on the possibility of the ND High School Coaches Association handling the entire certification process for ND coaches. Each coach would be in charge of verifying their coaching status. Johnson indicated it should be up to the AD in each school to assure their coaches are certified. This should be a school district's responsibility. Many districts represented require coach education for coaches in grades 7-12 or grades 5-12 which is over and above the minimum requirements set by NDHSAA. Consensus was coaches certification needs to remain in the hands of the local schools with submission to NDHSAA.

District 7-----Scott Lindgren, AD Leeds HS

1. Mercy rule in basketball—District 7 feels this should be left up to coaches' discretion. This appears on the agenda in different districts with more specific plans and will hold discussion at that time.

District 8-----Brad Fitzgerald, AD St. John HS

- 1. We are in favor of a mercy rule in basketball.
 - a. Proposed: If a team is ahead by 30 points or more to start the 4th quarter of a game the clock will run and only stop for an injury or a time out. If the margin of score becomes less than 20 points, regular game regulations will be used for stopping the clock until/if the margin of point difference becomes 30 points. **Vote Requested: 10-6**

District 9-----Matt Scherbenske, AD Shiloh Christian HS

- 1. District 9 would like discussion on basketball rule 3-5 Art. 3 ("Arm sleeves, knee sleeves, lower leg sleeves and tights). Discussion to be focused mainly on the same color being required of all teammates. Staff member Fletschock indicated this is mandated in the basketball rules book.
- 2. District 9 would like a vote on changing baseball regulation regarding the number of games allowed to play in a season. Currently teams are allowed to play a maximum of 36 games in 23 dates prior to the state tournament. This includes whatever format of region tournament (in baseball Region VIII it is a possible seven additional games played in the region tournament.)
 - a. We are proposing to change the regulation to: Teams can play a maximum of 32 games in 23 dates prior to the state tournament excluding any tournament games to determine the region representative for the state tournament. (This would make the region tournament games NOT count towards the 32 games).

Vote Requested: 2-14

District 10----Vicky Bender, AD Wilton HS

- 1. We would like to see the player penalization (sitting out next game/match) for excessive quarters/sets played be eliminated. Discussion was based on the player be penalized for something the coach did. The game/match should be penalization enough or maybe the coach should be fined/penalized somehow. This is not a unique situation. This happens across the state. Historically this came about as a deterrent to a coach doing this nightly if there is no consequence. Vote Requested: 15-1
- 2. Or maybe the coach should be fined/penalized somehow. Wiberg asked the district chairs their opinion on coaches being penalized. Midthun indicated he would be in favor of a warning for the first offense and something different for the subsequent offenses as there is a need to have a deterrent.

District 11-----Larry Sandy, AD Velva HS

1. Concern over the timeline of finalizing the football plan. Main concern is that with finalization not completed until October meeting, some schools have difficulty contracting officials by the time a schedule is developed. This is more of a concern over the lack of officials than the actual time line. Fetsch indicated this would take a by-law vote as the final date for the football plan is September 15th. This is a more complex problem and a vote was not

- requested.
- 3. Would like to see high school football officials use the college football mechanics in providing the countdown of the 25 second clock when an on field clock is not present. Alternative solution to using college method would be to require on field 25 second clocks at all football games.

District 12----Lyall Krueger, AD Surrey HS

1. Move golf to the Fall - Vote Requested: 7-9

District 13-----Daryl Jung, AD New England HS

1. No items

District 14----Randy Johnson, AD Hazen HS

1. State rate for hotel rooms at state tournaments was discussed. NDHSAA does not have control over what motels charge. Schools are urged to contact the tournament manager to see if rates can be adjusted.

District 15----Randy Cranston, AD Watford City HS

- 1. Mercy Rule—40 points in 2nd half runs for the rest of the game (stops timeouts, quarter break, injury). This topic was previously voted upon.
- 2. Requested the NDHSAA Board pursue a 3 class system for basketball only with implementation in 2017-18. Formation of a committee to formulate a plan that is right for kids. Jung indicated only 2 states in the US have a two class system. Cranston indicated their district created 4 plans, however none were brought forward to this meeting. District 15 would like a vote for the NDHSAA to move forward in creation of a plan for a 3 class system. Vote Requested: 14-2
- 3. 9 teams in District 15, move one to District 16 to make 8 and 8. Districts can make this request to the realignment committee.

District 16----Kent Harding, AD Divide County HS

- 1. Basketball Super Region Tournaments, will every region be required to use this format? If so, when? Previously discussed.
- 2. Volleyball- concern that region volleyball tournament sites use qualified line judges, bookkeepers, and clock keepers. No other districts indicated this was an issue in their district.
- 3. Possibly if the NDHSAA could create 2- 9-man football divisions.

MINUTES North Dakota High School Activities Association March 18, 2016, Minot, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association held their meeting on March 18, 2016 in Minot. President Wiberg called the meeting to order at 1:00 pm.

Others present: Kelly Koppinger, New England Superintendent, Darryl Jung, New England Athletic Director and a group of parents from New England

Upon additions to the agenda, motion by Baesler to approve. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Vollmer to approve the consent agenda. Second by Schafer. Motion carried unanimously.

Consent agenda items:

- 13. Approval of Consent Agenda
 - a. Approval of Minutes January 25, 2016
 - b. Financial Report
 - i. Balance sheet January 2016
 - ii. Budget

Jason Wiberg, Executive Committee chair, reported Executive Committee action. There were three schools with self-reported violations and one late coop dissolution request.

Self violations included:

- 1. South Heart High School reported an athlete exceeded the daily quarter limit in girls' basketball. Prescribed penalty was applied. Forfeiture of game in which the violation occurred and student sat out next game. A letter of reprimand will be sent to South Heart High School.
- 2. Fargo North High School reported violation of an individual's wrestling decent plan. Prescribed penalty was applied. Forfeiture of match in which the violation occurred and student sat out next match. A letter of reprimand will be sent to Fargo North High School.
- 3. By-Law violation
 - a. White Shield High School reported White Shield and Alexander held a girls basketball contest consisting of a junior high team containing 6th graders vs. a high school team. White Shield High School and Alexander High School were placed on probation through 2016/17.

Late coop dissolution request from Dickinson Trinity to dissolve the grade 7-12 football coop between Dickinson Trinity and New England beginning in 2016-17. The request for dissolution was denied.

Motion by Wiberg to approve Executive Committee report. Second by Rinas. Motion carried unanimously.

Wiberg, provided a Media Committee report on post season streaming violations. Four Winds High School streamed the District 7 girls' basketball tournament without NDHSAA approval. The media committee recommends a \$1,000 penalty with any subsequent violations double that amount and a letter of reprimand to the offending school. The committee also discussed Class A region broadcast fees. No change was recommended to the broadcast fees at this time.

Motion by Wiberg to approve Media Committee report. Second by Manley. Motion carried unanimously.

New England Superintendent, Kelly Koppinger, appealed the Executive Board's decision to deny a football coop dissolution for the 2016-17 school year. New England requested dissolution of the current football coop with Dickinson Trinity for the 2016-17 school year, and if approved requested consideration of an emergency football coop with Mott-Regent for the 2016-17 school year. Darryl Jung, New England Athletic Director indicated he was contacted three times by the Dickinson Trinity administration indicating the desire to dissolve the current football coop immediately. Area schools were surveyed with New Salem/Glen Ullin and Grant County indicating they are not in favor of allowing the dissolution in the second year of a 2-year football plan. Dickinson Trinity indicated they did want to appeal the Executive Board's prior decision. New England's request was three part:

- 1. Dissolution of FB coop with Dickinson Trinity for 2016/17
- 2. Emergency coop with Mott-Regent for 2016/17

3. Change the football guidelines to allow all students to participate at the varsity level.

The Board indicated exclusions in the past have been based on the opportunity for kids to participate. This is different than issues in the past as the New England students have the opportunity to play regardless if this appeal is approved. Rinas indicated if this were approved it would open the door to additional coops and coop dissolutions in the middle of a football plan. NDHSAA staff indicated precedent indicated denial of dissolution in similar cases. Motion by Roaldson to deny New England's appeal of the coop dissolution. Second by Vollmer. Motion carried unanimously.

Andy Dahlen, Football Committee Chair, provided a report on the two committee meetings that have been held since the last Board meeting. The committee reviewed the emergency coop guidelines and recommended no change to these guidelines. Stanley & Powers Lake appeared before the Football Committee on March 17th to address concerns. The committee took these concerns into consideration. Preliminary division placement recommendations for the 2017 and 2018 plan were distributed to the Board. The preliminary divisions will be placed on the NDHSAA website. The preliminary divisions will be updated as coops are approved and dissolved.

Motion by Dahlen to approve Football Committee report. Second by Manley. Motion carried unanimously.

Steve Hall provided a Constitution & By-Laws Committee report with potential language changes to Part II, Article IX: Awards By-Law. A draft of proposed By-Law changes was distributed to the Board for review. The committee would like feedback from Board members on the proposed changes. Potential changes are as follows:

Current By-Law with edits, additions and strike through.

Article IX: Awards

SECTION I: The giving and receiving of awards and medals shall:

- a. Be kept within reasonable bounds
- b. Have symbolic value only, and
- c. Be done by and with the consent and under the supervision of the superintendent and/or principal concerned.

SECTION II: Awards such as unattached letter, trophy, metal football, metal basketball, metal track shoe or similar article of symbolic value only may be given, provided that the cost of the awards shall not exceed the amount set by the NDHSAA Board of Directors (\$300.00).

SECTION III: Conferences or schools conducting invitational tourneys and meets under Association rules may make awards to the winning schools or contestants, provided that the awards are within the bounds of Sections I and II.

SECTION IV: Suitable awards of symbolic value only may be given by such organizations as service clubs, patriot organizations, civic groups, Dads' and Mothers' Club, and the sports department of a newspaper, radio or television station. No awards shall be accepted which in any way advertises any firm or individual so far as commercial or business interests are concerned "with the exception of NDHSAA approved corporate sponsors for NDHSAA awards".

SECTION VI: The Board shall have authority to designate, give and control medals and trophies to be awarded to schools or individuals on championship teams in any sport or activity, provided that these awards are kept within the bounds of Sections I and II III.

SECTION VI: Awards, medals, recognitions, gifts, trips and honors shall not be accepted by individuals or schools from colleges, universities and higher institutions of learning and their alumni. High school athletes or performers should be permitted to complete their high school careers without being exploited by outside sources.

SECTION VII: Penalties for violations of the above rules may be suspension of the school and ineligibility of the individual who accepts the award.

Proposed Draft Article IX: Awards

SECTION I: A student activities participant may not accept monetary compensation in recognition of activities ability, participation and/or achievement.

SECTION II: A student may accept non-monetary compensation or items of value solely in recognition of activities ability, participation and/or achievement if the total monetary compensation or items of value, including the actual value of any gift certificates (so long as they are not convertible to cash), discounts, coupons, etc., does not exceed the amount set by the NDHSAA Board of Directors during the Association year (July 1-June 30).

SECTION III: Non-monetary compensation or items of value does not include customary awards of symbolic nature without resale value such as the school's athletic letter, medals, ribbons, certificates, plaques, trophies and other emblems, provided the cost of the award does not exceed the amount set by the NDHSAA Board of Directors.

NOTE: This rule does not regulate or prohibit compensation received by a student for ability, participation and/or achievement in a non-NDHSAA sponsored sport or activity, nor does this rule prohibit the acceptance of college scholarships by students.

SECTION IV: A coach or director is responsible for reporting to the school's athletic/activities director all compensation or items of value received by the students on that coach/director's team within one month of the receipt of the compensation or items of value. School administration is responsible for verifying that the total sum of compensation or items of value received by each student participant at that school does not exceed the retail value amount set in SECTION II.

SECTION V: The NDHSAA Board of Directors shall have authority to designate, give and control medals and trophies to be awarded to schools or individuals on championship teams in any sport or activity, provided that these awards are kept within the bounds of Section III.

SECTION VI: Penalties for violations of the above rules may be suspension of the school and ineligibility of the individual who accepts the award.

Motion by Hall to approve Constitution & By-Laws Committee report. Second by Schafer. Motion carried unanimously.

Jeff Manley, Realignment Committee Chair, reported on the Super-Region Ad-Hoc Committee Meeting. Each committee member reported on the situation in their district. There is a mix of super-region and conventional district/region formats throughout the state. Overall, the regions are happy with the models they have chosen. There is a different fit for each region and they appreciate having the option to do what seems to be the best for each area. It is working now with each region doing different things and they would like to keep it that way. The committee indicated there is not a need to meet again until there is a change directed from the Board or a change in demographics throughout the state.

The committee recommended region placements as follows:

South Prairie boys and girls' golf – Region 4 Drake-Anamoose boys' golf – Region 4 New England boys and girls track & field – SW Region

Motion by Manley to approve Realignment Committee report. Second by Rinas. Motion carried unanimously.

NFHS Summer Meeting was discussed. Conference books will be mailed to Board members when they are received. Fetsch asked Board members to indicate their attendance plans to him.

Board Correspondence was reviewed. There were seven letters addressing the Bismarck girls' hockey coop including letters or emails from McCowan, Black, Barendt, Abrahamson, Klemetsrud, Longtin, and Wold.

The Board discussed coops in general and coops between Class A schools. The Board has not traditionally stepped in to determine criteria for coops, they have allowed schools to apply for coops based on their local criteria. Board members indicated this may be the time to have large coops give a plan to the NDHSAA Board concerning their Class A coops. The Board felt school districts need to address this issue at the local level. The letters received were concerning girls hockey, however, hockey is not the only sport where there is an issue. Roaldson indicated the top 6 girls' hockey schools have a full roster of 20 girls consistently. Where smaller teams struggle to have 10-16 girls on a roster. Roaldson researched past years' final standings for girls' hockey from 2007-08 through current year. His research showed the same larger schools consistently in the top 6 teams with the smaller schools at the bottom of the standings. Smaller schools are considering playing in the 19U league rather than through NDHSAA. Roaldson indicated we entrust our member schools to do the right thing through trust and integrity. The Board talked about having the Executive Director meet with the Bismarck Public Schools Athletic Directors to address a plan. The Board indicated this is not about the success of the program, it is based on the number of schools participating in a single team.

Motion by Vollmer to direct Executive Director Fetsch to visit with Bismarck administration on their future plans for their girls' hockey program. Second by Hall. Motion carried unanimously. Executive Director Fetsch will report back to the Board in April on the discussion with Bismarck administration.

The Board reviewed a letter from Loren Scherr, Beulah Superintendent and Carl Blackhurst, Beulah Activities Director concerning placement of the Region 7 volleyball and basketball tournaments.

A letter from Richardton-Taylor High School in support of the New England appeal was addressed during the appeal process.

Representative Reports

 Andy Dahlen indicated one of his coaches talked to him about out-of-season coaching regulations. Dahlen has a coach that would like to coach his son in travel ball. The out-of season coaching was discussed. There is a difference between working with your son and coaching a team. Past practice allows a parent to work one on one with their son/daughter. Steve Hall was questioned by schools in his area about venue surcharges. Hall questioned the
customary acceptable venue charge for regions. Fetsch indicated over half the region sites have
a venue surcharge on tickets.

Executive Director's Report included:

NFHS Foundation grant for \$2000 was approved. The grant will be used to send the students to the Student Leadership Conference in Indianapolis in July.

Fetsch reported all 2016-17 staff contracts have been accepted.

Fetsch provided an update on the Media Specialist position. There are 11 applications to date with several more indicating they will apply. A recommendation will be presented at the April Board meeting.

The next NDHSAA Board meeting will be held April 19, 2016 at the NDHSAA office in Valley City.

President Wiberg declared the meeting adjourned at 3:13 pm.

There may be no other members of the coach's program or the feeder program on the same team.

Specifically, a member of Fargo North's coaching staff requests allowance to coach his child's out-of-season team. The player/child is competing on a non-school team with no other Fargo North players. This addition to the out-of-season coaching regulation would be allowed only under the circumstance in which a parent, who is a coach for a grade 9-12 team his/her child either plays on or is in a grade 7-8 feeder system for, and the child/player are involved in an out-of season team that has no other team members of the coach's team or feeder team playing.

Motion by Stedman to approve the additional language in the out-of-season coaching regulation as requested beginning immediately. Second by Bertsch. The Board reviewed a letter from Tom Milbrandt, Athletic Director at Maple Valley High School, on behalf of Region 1 schools requesting the Board consider scheduling the final night of the 2017 Region 1 Girls Basketball Tournament on a Wednesday evening. Of the 13 schools in Region 1, ten schools were in favor of the proposal and three opposed holding the final night of the tournament on a Wednesday evening.

Motion by Roaldson to table the Region 1 Girls Basketball Tournament request. Second by Stedman. More information will be available for the Board to make a decision in June. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Director Fetsch proposed a seven-year activity calendar that would go through 2022-23 for Board review and approval. The Board previously approved the activity calendar dates through 2018-19. Fetsch proposed changing the 5-year activity calendar to a 7-year activity calendar to bring the activity calendar in line with the site rotation calendar. The proposed calendar added three years to the activity calendar.

Motion by Manley to approve the proposed seven-year calendar. Second by Stedman. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a letter from Patti Aanenson, Northeast region track meet manager, requesting the Board consider allowing a 2:00 pm start time for the Northeast Region meet on Friday, May 19, 2016. Motion by Hall to deny the request. Second by Dahlen. The Board felt not enough information was provided to change the Board regulation. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Director's Report included:

1) Fetsch reported information from a meeting with the Bismarck Public Schools athletic administration concerning the future of the Bismarck girls hockey program. Dave Zittleman, Bismarck Public Schools athletic director, provided a report to the Board on the girls hockey program. The Board discussed philosophy of Class A coops at length and whether Class A coops supported the purpose of coops, which is to enhance participation. Roaldson discussed the option of Jamestown moving from NDHSAA Class A girls hockey to the Under 19 club hockey program as Jamestown is not able to field viable teams at the level of the larger cooped programs. He does not feel girls hockey has a level playing field for all teams. Rinas brought up the possibility of creating coop guidelines dependent on participation. Baesler indicated she felt the Bismarck schools should be forced to take another look. Fetsch indicated if that path is chosen, NDHSAA would need to look at all coops, not just the Bismarck girls hockey coop. Staff member Bubach indicated there are two separate issues that need to be addressed. The issue of Class A coops and the issue of girls hockey. Originally the Bismarck girls hockey coop was put in place to grow girls hockey. The Bismarck girls hockey coop has grown and the longer it is in place, the harder it is to dissolve the coop. Bismarck has proven they have enough kids because they have a JV program in addition to their varsity program. Only two of the 11 girls' hockey teams in North Dakota have JV teams. The possibility of bringing back the past practice of renewing coops every 3 years was discussed. Hall cautioned the Board they would have to look at this issue globally rather than coop by coop. Manley guestioned whether large coops are in line with the NDHSAA

philosophy of coop previously adopted by the Board. The NDHSAA Board has the ability to change the current philosophy with consideration of the purpose of cooperative sponsorships. Baesler questioned whether Executive Director Fetsch should send a letter to Bismarck Public Schools explaining the Board's concerns and require an updated plan concerning the future/dissolution of their girls hockey coop. The second issue the Board should consider is to review NDHSAA cooperative sponsorship philosophy. Fetsch indicated the Bismarck schools are aware of complaints NDHSAA received concerning the girls hockey coop. Roaldson suggested a letter be sent to all Class A superintendents and school board presidents explaining the Board is looking to re-evaluate Class A coops with a reminder of the coop philosophy. Wiberg suggested Fetsch communicate with Bismarck and request a plan rather than an overview of their program. Evaluation of coops would be difficult for NDHSAA staff or the Board to determine as circumstances are different for each coop. The overall feeling of the Board is Bismarck's girls hockey coop does not align with the NDHSAA coop philosophy. Bertsch felt it was fair to ask the question of Bismarck as to what is their plan. Fetsch will send a letter to Bismarck Public Schools discussing information provided at the Board level and inquiring specifics of their plan and how NDHSAA can help facilitate changes to their girls hockey coop.

- 2) Fetsch reported on the NFHS legal meeting, which was held in Indianapolis in April. The following issues were presented.
 - i) Legal separation
 - ii) Home-school transfers
 - iii) Eligibility of F1 and J1 students.
 - Some states have Board regulations concerning schools that challenge state associations mandating payment of legal fees by the member school if the association is not found at fault.
 - v) Social media was discussed. For example, NDHSAA staff researched social media posts by media specialist applicants and ruled out some applicants based on their social media presence.
 - vi) Classification systems in other states was discussed. Forcing non-public schools to play at a higher level would not be recommended by NDHSAA legal counsel.
- 3) NFHS Network Summit was also a part of the legal meeting. NDHSAA is in year 3 of a 5-year contract with the NFHS Network for broadcast/streaming rights to some post-season tournaments. NFHS Network recently offered an amendment to all extensions due to lower than anticipated revenue. In order to pay off the debt to investors they are looking at leveling amounts paid to associations. Fetsch will have more information for the media committee in June.
- 4) Construction was completed last week for an office for Tom Mix, NDHSAA media specialist who will begin at the Association May 2, 2016.
- 5) Fetsch informed the Board of the retirement supper which will be held the evening of June 13, 2016.
- 6) Aimee Copas, NDCEL director requested NDHSAA move their August 4, 2016 region administrator meeting date as they scheduled the NDCEL Fall Boot-camp conference for the first week in August, in conflict with one of the NDHSAA mandatory administrator meetings. The meeting in Valley City on August 4, 2016 will be moved to August 11, 2016.

The next NDHSAA Board meeting will be held June 13-14, 2016 at the NDHSAA office in Valley City.

President Wiberg declared the meeting adjourned at 1:25 pm.

Fetsch made note the 2015-16 team payment includes money from reserve to cover the parking lot and new vehicle expenses as both were 2014/15 expenditures for which the bills were not received until 2015/16. Fetsch indicated 2015/16 is the second highest amount allocated for team payments.

Motion by Hall to approve the 2015/16 year-end estimate and team payments. Second by Rinas. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Rinas to approve the proposed 2016-17 NDHSAA budget. Second by Schafer. Motion carried unanimously.

The Finance Committee provided information on an extension of the existing state tournament apparel contract with Coaches Choice Corporate and Athletic Apparel. Coaches Choice offered an extension of the state tournament apparel agreement for state volleyball, wrestling, track & field, cross country, football, Class B boys and Class B girls basketball tournaments through 2020 including guaranteed pricing for t-shirts for all other state tournaments. The Board discussed contract extensions versus requests for proposals at length. Staff was questioned on the service received through the current contract. Staff indicated they have been good to work with and all issues have been resolved immediately.

Motion by Bertsch to accept the tournament apparel contract extension with Coaches Choice Corporate and Athletic Apparel as proposed. Second by Roaldson. Role Call Vote: Hall - yes, Rinas - yes, Roaldson - yes, Baesler - yes, Schafer - no, Dahlen - yes, Bertsch - yes, Stedman - yes, Wiberg - yes. Motion carried (10-1).

NDHSAA staff member Brenda Schell presented the Board with the NDHSAA 2016-17 Technology Plan.

Motion by Roaldson to approve the NDHSAA 2016-17 Technology Plan. Second by Schafer. Motion carried unanimously.

Jason Wiberg, Executive Committee chair, reported Executive Committee action. There were four schools with self-reported violations and two late coop dissolution requests.

- Bowman County High School Individual ran the 800 meter run and 1600 meter run in a JH track meet
 - Individual sat out the next meet at that level, forfeiture of points earned and a letter of reprimand was issued to the school.
- MLS Individual competed in 5 events in a JH track meet
 - Individual sat out the next meet at that level, forfeiture of points earned and a letter of reprimand was issued to the school.
- East region strings manager awarded an additional star.
 - Letter of reprimand to manager of that event.
- Harvey High School Individual exceeded the 7-day inning pitching limit.
 - Individual sat out the next game at that level, forfeiture of game and a letter of reprimand for the school.

Andy Dahlen, Football Committee chair, provided an update on preliminary division assignments for the 2017 and 2018 football plan. The number of teams in each division has not changed. September 15th is the deadline for new football coops for the 2017 and 2018 football plan.

Request from Jay Claymore, AD from Standing Rock for waiver of the rule that underclassmen are unable to participate in the first year of an emergency cooperative agreement. In the current football guideline there is a \$1000 non-compliance fee per player for seniors and \$200 for underclassmen. Seniors are eligible for varsity competition and underclassmen are eligible only for sub-varsity competition. Standing Rock does not offer a junior varsity football program.

Motion by Hall to allow the waiver of the football guideline not allowing underclassmen to participate at the varsity level in an emergency coop and allow all students to participate at the varsity level for \$200 each. Second by Schafer.

NDHSAA Behavior Expectations as follows were distributed to the Board. The expectations will be shared with administrators at the fall administrator meetings and be distributed to tournament managers.

NDHSAA MINIMAL BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS FOR REGULAR AND POSTSEASON COMPETITIONS:

- Respect the American flag and the National Anthem.
- Contesting schools shall each have an authorized faculty representative present who shall be responsible for his/her school's participants, students, and fans throughout the contest.
- Spectators must wear clothing that covers the entire torso. Those who do not comply or who wear
 clothing that is vulgar, obscene or that in some other way inappropriate, as determined by
 school/tournament personnel, will be removed from the facility if they do not cooperate with this
 behavior expectation.
- The use of appropriate language is expected at all times. Profanity, negative chants, trash talk, name-calling, personal attacks or other acts of disrespect are unacceptable and must be immediately addressed by school/tournament administrators.
- Respect the game/contest. Under no condition shall anyone other than the members of the official squad enter the playing surface. No one may interfere with the contest in any way.
- Hand held signs and flags, which do not obstruct the view of others, are permitted provided they are
 in good taste. Signs or other similar items contest/tournament officials deem to be in poor taste will
 be removed. Message or "white" boards are prohibited. The carrying of flags around the playing
 surface is NOT allowed.
- Artificial noisemakers of any kind (i.e. megaphones, cowbells, sirens, whistles, thunder sticks, and other similar items) are not allowed at any indoor events, including outdoor sports played at indoor venues. Exception – Megaphones appropriately used by cheerleaders are permitted if allowed by contest officials.
- Laser lights or any other lights deemed distracting to participants are strictly prohibited.
- Confetti is banned at all NDHSAA tournament venues. Tournament staff is instructed to confiscate such articles at the door.
- Objects shall not be thrown into the stands at any NDHSAA tournament venue.
- The use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV), also known as drones, is prohibited for any persons at NDHSAA tournament venues.

Motion by Hall to approve the NDHSAA minimal behavior expectations policy. Second by Dahlen. Motion carried unanimously.

All state awards at state tournaments were discussed. There is not a Board approval on the announcements of all state teams at state tournaments. NDHSAA media specialist, Tom Mix is creating a script for tournament managers for awards ceremony at the completion of each state tournament. Exceptions would be tournaments that all state honors are tied to how the individuals place in an individual tournament such as state golf and state tennis.

Hall moved that all state teams are not announced at the conclusion of state tournament. Second by Schafer. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Hall to approve the tournament committee report. Second by Baesler. Motion carried unanimously.

Steve Hall, Constitution & By-Law's Committee chair, provided the Board the actions as listed below.

Legal opinion was received from NDHSAA counsel Rachel Bruner-Kaufman on the following items:

Legal separation interpretation:

Interpretations Section IX of Article XIV at Q & A 21 bullet #3 as follows (additions are in red).

- 3. Parents: The term Parents: The term "parents" shall mean the student's:
 - a. natural parents;
 - b. adoptive parents;
 - c. foster parents, if the student is placed in a foster home after becoming a ward of the court;
 - d. custodial parent, if the parents are divorced;
 - i. A student of divorced parents who have joint, legal custody of the student, as indicated in the court-issued divorce decree or most recent custody judgment, who moves from one custodial parent to the other custodial parent shall be immediately eligible at the time of the move:
 - 1. At the moved-to public school district of residence
 - 2. At a nonpublic school located within the moved-to public school district of residence.
 - ii. The student may utilize this provision only one time during grades 9-12. The parents must provide proof of joint, legal custody as identified in the parents' court-issued divorce decree or most recent custody judgment to the administrator in the school the student attends.
 - e. legal guardian, but only in a case where neither parent is living or legally competent; or
 - f. a family with whom a student has been living continuously for at least 180 school days

Home school transfers

Section I Article XIV in the Bylaws "NOTE ON HOME-BASED SCHOOL"

NOTE ON HOME-BASED SCHOOL: The 1989 North Dakota State Legislature passed a law that permits home-based education. Basically, this law allows children to be taught at home by their parents if all the provisions of the law are followed.

The 1999 and 2001 legislature amended this provision as follows:

Home education - Participation in extracurricular activities.

- 1. A child receiving home education may participate in extracurricular activities either:
 - a. Under the auspices of the child's school district of residence; or
 - b. Under the auspices of an approved non-public school, if permitted by the administrator of the school.
- 2. For purposes of this section, a child participating under the auspices of the child's school district of residence is subject to the same standards for participation in extracurricular activities as those required of full-time students enrolled in the district.
- 3. For purposes of this section, a child participating under the auspices of an approved non-public school is subject to the same standards for participation in extracurricular activities as those required of full-time students enrolled in the school.
- 4. Once a child's parent has selected the public school district or the approved non-public school in which the child will participate for purposes of extracurricular activities, and has provided notification of the selection through the Statement statement of Intent required by subsection 4 of section 15-34.1-06 section 15.1-23-02 in N.D. Century Code, the child is subject to the transfer rules as provided in the Constitution and By-Laws of the North Dakota High School Activities Association.

The responsibility of checking on the eligibility of students involved in home-based instruction is that of the school in which the student is participating in the co-curricular activities program. It is recommended that each school develop a form to be used in checking eligibility of all students including home-based students.

Interpretations Section I of Article XIV at Q & A 10 as follows.

Q: May a student involved in home-based education be eligible for NDHSAA sponsored activities? A: Yes. The legislature has ruled that a student is eligible in the student's school district of residence or at an approved non-public school, if permitted by the school administration. However, once a student

the student's parent selects either the child's school district of residence or an approved nonpublic school, the NDHSAA transfer rules apply makes his/her choice any subsequent change would be governed by the NDHSAA transfer rules. The transfer rules apply to students involved in home-based education the same as they apply to students who elect to attend a public school or an approved nonpublic school.

Legal challenge policy

Add to interpretation under Article IV

If a member of the Association brings a legal action against the Association and the Association prevails, the member shall reimburse the Association for all costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred by the Association in connection with the legal action. (June 2016)

Roaldson moved to approve the legal opinions as presented. Second by Rinas. Motion approved unanimously.

The committee recommended the following change to summer camps.

SPECIAL NOTE ON SUMMER CAMPS

- 1. Individual or team camps may be sponsored by non-member entities, member schools or coaches of member schools, provided the camp is conducted in June or July and is not exclusive to their own athletes. (June 2016)
- 2. The use of school equipment, pads, and the like, other than school uniforms, at a summer camp is permissible.
- 3. NDHSAA catastrophic insurance does not cover summer camps.

Roaldson moved to approve the special note on summer camps. Dahlen seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Hall to approve the Tournament Committee report. Second by Bertsch. Motion carried unanimously.

Todd Bertsch, Media Committee chair, provided recommended action on the following:

- (1) Class A Region Tournament broadcast fees The committee recommended broadcast fees stay with the Association and not be split between the NDHSAA and the region.
- (2) NDHSAA received a letter concerning the NFHS Network contract from the NFHS Holdings, LLC ("HoldCo") board recommending a freeze on the NFHS Network rights fees paid to states over the next three years to include 2016-17, 2017-18 and 2018-19. Committee recommended directing the Executive Director to write a letter to the HoldCo board respectfully requesting the HoldCo Board of Directors to honor the NDHSAA's guaranteed rights fee as per contract for years four and five (2016/17 and 2017/18).

Motion by Bertsch to approve the Media Committee report. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

Farmers Union Insurance representative Mark Anderson, general manager, appeared to thank the Board for the opportunity to work with the NDHSAA. Anderson provided an overall view of all Farmers Union Insurance agents and managers throughout the state. Anderson also gave the Board an overview of other activities Farmers Union Insurance is involved in such as a new sheet of ice connected to Scheels Arena in Fargo (Farmers Union Insurance Center) and a new sponsorship with BEK Communications for regular season broadcasts beginning fall of 2016. Executive Director Fetsch indicated NDHSAA is very appreciative of the working relationship with Farmers Union Insurance. President Wiberg thanked Farmers Union Insurance for their support as the NDHSAA Premier Sponsor.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Board of Directors North Dakota High School Activities Association Valley City, North Dakota

Report on Financial Statements

I have audited the accompanying financial statements of North Dakota High School Activities Association, which comprise the statement of financial position as of June 30, 2016, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with U.S. generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement in the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. My opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

I have previously audited the North Dakota High School Activities Association's 2015 financial statements and I expressed an unmodified audit opinion on those financial statements in my report dated July 22, 2015. In my opinion, the summarized comparative information presented herein as of and for the year ended June 30, 2015, is consistent in all material respects, with audited financial statements from which it has been derived.

My audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The supplemental schedules on pages 17-20 is presented for of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In my opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2016

1. DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues, sponsorships, and sales and charges at athletic events.

General and administrative activities include the functions necessary to provide support the Association's program activities. General and administrative activities include those that provide governance (Board of Directors), oversight, business management, financial recordkeeping, budgeting, legal services, human resource management, and similar activities that ensure an adequate working environment and an equitable employment program.

Fundraising activities include publicizing and conducting fundraising campaigns, maintaining donor lists, conducting special fundraising events; and other activities involved with soliciting contributions from corporations, foundations, individuals and others.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Association maintains its records on the modified cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. On an ongoing basis, the Association's management evaluates the estimates an assumptions based upon historical experience and various other factors and circumstances; however, the actual results could differ from those estimates.

NET ASSETS

The financial statements report net assets and changes in net assets in three classes that are based upon the existence or absence of restrictions on use that are placed by its donors as follows:

UNRESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Unrestricted net assets are resources available to support operations. The only limits on the use of unrestricted net assets are the broad limits resulting for the nature of the organization, the environment in which it operates, the purposes specified in corporate documents and its application for tax-exempt status, and any limits resulting from contractual agreements with creditors and others that are entered into in the course of its operations.

TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Temporarily restricted net assets are resources that are restricted by a donor for use for a particular purpose or in a particular future period. The Association's unspent contributions are classified in this class if the donor limited their use, as are unspent appreciation of its donor restricted endowment funds.

When a donor's restriction is satisfied, either by using the resources in the manner specified by the donor or by the passage of time, the expiration of the restriction is reported in the financial statements by reclassifying the net assets from temporarily restricted to unrestricted net assets. Net assets restricted for acquisition of buildings or equipment are reported as temporarily restricted until the specified asset is placed in service by the Association, unless the donor provides more specific directions about the period of its use.

PERMANENTLY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Permanently restricted net assets are resources whose use by the Association is limited by donor-imposed restrictions that neither expire by being used in accordance with a donor's restriction nor by the passage of time. The portion of the Association's donor restricted endowment funds that must be maintained in perpetuity are classified in this net asset class.

All revenues and net gains are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets in the statement of activities unless the use of the related resources is subject to temporary or permanent donor restrictions. All expenses and net losses other than losses on endowment investments are reported as decreases in unrestricted net assets. Net losses on endowment investments reduce temporarily restricted net assets to the extent that net gains of the fund from prior years are unspent and classified there; remaining losses are classified in decreases in unrestricted net assets. If an endowment fund has no net gains from prior years, such as when a fund is newly established, net losses are classified as decreases in unrestricted net assets.

CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash equivalents are short term interest bearing highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, unless the investments are held for meeting restrictions of a capital or endowment nature.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

Accounts receivable are primarily unsecured non-interest bearing amounts due from grantors on cost reimbursement or performance grants. Management believes that all outstanding accounts receivable are collectible in full, therefore no allowance for uncollected receivables has been provided.

SHORT TERM INVESTMENTS

The Association invests cash in excess of its immediate needs in money market funds. Short term investments are reported at fair value.

The investment policy specific to these investments is monitored by the Finance Committee.

INVENTORIES

Inventories of food are stated at the lower of cost or market using the first-in, first-out method.

CONTRIBUTIONS RECEIVABLE

Contributions receivable are unconditional promises to give that are recognized as contributions when the promise is received. Contributions receivable that are expected to be collected in less than one year are reported at net realizable value. Contribution receivables that are expected to be collected in more than one year are recorded at fair value at the date of promise. That fair value is computed using a present value technique applied to anticipated cash flows. Amortization of the resulting discount is recognized as additional contribution revenue. The allowance for uncollectible contributions receivable is determined based on management's evaluation of the collectibility of individual promises. Promises that remain uncollected more than one year after their due dates are written off unless the donors indicate the payment is merely postponed.

LAND BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Land, buildings and equipment are reported in the balance sheet at cost, if purchased, and at fair value at the date of donation, if donated. All land and buildings are capitalized. Equipment is capitalized if it has a cost of \$1,000 or more and a useful life when acquired of more than one year. Repairs and maintenance that do not significantly increase the useful life of the assets are expensed as incurred. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset as follows:

Buildings and improvements 40 years Leasehold improvements 5-20 years Equipment 3-15 years

ACCOUNTING FOR CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions, including unconditional promises to give, are recognized when received. All contributions are recorded as increases in unrestricted net assets unless use of contributed assets is specifically restricted by donor. Amounts received that are restricted by the donor to use in future periods or for specific purposes are reported as increases in either temporarily restricted or permanently restricted net assets, consistent with the nature of the restrictions. Unconditional promises with payments due in future years have an implied restriction to be used in the year the payment is due, and therefore are reported as temporarily restricted until the payment is due unless the contribution is clearly intended to support activities of the current fiscal year or is received with permanent restrictions. Conditional promises, such as matching grants, are not recognized until they become unconditional, that is, until all conditions on which they depend are substantially met.

GIFTS-IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

The Association periodically receives contributions in a form other than cash and investments. If the Association receives a contribution of land, buildings, or equipment the contributed asset is recognized as an asset at its estimated fair value at the date of the gift, provided that the value of the asset and its estimated useful life meets the Association's capitalization policy. Donated use of facilities is reported as contribution and expense at the estimated fair value of for rent under similar circumstances. Donated supplies are recorded as contributions at the date of the gift and as expenses when the donated items are placed into service or distributed.

The Association benefits from personal services provided by a substantial amount of volunteers. Those volunteers have donated significant amounts of time and services in the Association's program operations. However, the majority of the contributed services do not meet the criteria for recognition in the financial statements. GAAP allow the recognition of contributed services only if (a) the services create or enhance nonfinancial assets or (b) the services would have been purchased if not provided by the contribution, require specialized skills, and are provided by individuals possessing those skills.

GRANT REVENUE

Grant revenue is recognized when the qualifying costs are incurred for cost reimbursement grants or contracts or when a unit of service is provided for performance grants. Grant revenue from Federal agencies is subject to independent audit under the Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133 and review by grantor agencies. The review could result in the disallowance of expenditures under the terms of the grant or reductions of future grant funds. Based on prior experience, the Association's management believes that any costs disallowed would not materially affect the financial position of the Association.

EXPENSE RECOGNITION AND ALLOCATION

The cost of providing the Association's programs and other activities is summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities and statement of functional activities. Expenses that can be identified with a specific program or support service are charged directly to that program or support service. Costs common to multiple functions have been allocated among the various functions benefitted.

General and administrative expenses include those costs that are not directly identifiable with any specific program, but which provide for overall support and direction of the Association.

Fundraising costs are expensed as incurred, even though they may result in contributions received in future years. The Association generally does not conduct its fundraising activities in conjunction with its other activities. In the few cases in which it does, joint costs have been allocated between fundraising and management and general expenses in accordance with standards for accounting for cost of activities that include fundraising. Additionally, advertising costs are expensed as incurred.

TAX STATUS

The Association is incorporated exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), though it would be subject to tax on income unrelated to its exempt purposes (unless otherwise exempted by the IRC). The tax years of 2016, 2015, and 2014 are still open to audit for federal purposes. Contributions to the Association are tax

deductible to donors under Section 170 of the IRC. The Association is not classified as a private foundation.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Association reports its fair value measures using a three-level hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value. This hierarchy, established by GAAP, requires that entities maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The three levels of inputs used to measure fair value are as follows:

Level 1. Quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets to which the Association has access at the measurement date.

Level 2. Inputs, other than quoted prices included in Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly. Level 2 inputs include

- 1- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- 2- quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active;
- 3- observable inputs other than quoted prices for the asset or liability (for example, interest rates and yield curves); and
- 4- inputs derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or by other means.

Level 3. Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability. Unobservable inputs should be used to measure the fair value to the extent that observable inputs are not available.

When available, the Association measures fair value using level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. However, level 1 inputs are not available for all of the assets and liabilities that the organization is required to measure at fair value (for example in-kind contributions).

The primary uses of fair value measures in the Association's financial statements are:

- I- Initial measurement of noncash gifts
- II- recurring measurement of short term investments

4. INVESTMENTS

Investments consist of the following at June 30, 2016:

Short term investments: \$419,797

As discussed in Note 3 to these financial statements, the Association is required to report its fair value measurements in one of three levels, which are based on the ability to observe in the marketplace the inputs to the Association's valuation techniques. Level 1, the most observable level of inputs, is for investments measured at quoted prices in active markets for identical investments as of June 30, 2016. Level 2 is for investments measured using inputs such as quoted prices for similar assets, quoted prices for the identical assets in inactive markets, and for investments measured at net asset value that can be redeemed in the near future. Level 3 is for

investments measured using inputs that are unobservable, and is used in situations for which there is little, if any, market activity for investments.

The Association uses the following ways to determine the fair value of its investments:

Money market funds: Determined by the published net asset value per unit at the end of the last trading day of the year, which is the basis for transactions at that date.

6. RETIREMENT PLAN

The Association participates in a defined contribution, individual account, money purchase, retirement plan that covers all employees who work over 20 hours per week.

In accordance with the plan agreement, the Association contributes 16.8 percent of the employee's gross wages to the plan. During the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015, the Association contributed \$100,449 and \$94,568 respectively, to the retirement plan.

8. CONCENTRATIONS OF RISK

Amounts held in financial institutions occasionally are in excess of the Federal Deposit Insurance

Corporation and Securities Investor Protection Corporation limits. The Association deposits its cash with high quality financial institutions, and management believes the Association is not exposed to significant credit risk on those amounts.

A significant portion of the Association's annual funding comes from events and media for the programs operated.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through August 4, 2016, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Events occurring after that date have not been evaluated to determine whether a change in financial statements would be required.
