FOREWORD

This yearbook provides a detailed accounting of the past years' activities for the NDHSAA. I would like to thank the Board of Directors, NDHSAA office staff and all representatives of the member schools for your dedication and commitment to the Association.

Farmers Union Insurance has completed its eleventh year as the Premiere Partner of NDHSAA and continues to be actively involved in all activities. Their entire company has demonstrated a commitment to the enhancement of activities for North Dakota students and once again provided \$5,000 in scholarship funds for the NDHSAA Distinguished Student Program. The Association is very appreciative for what they do for the athletes and fine arts students in North Dakota.

The North Dakota National Guard has been a supporting sponsor of NDHSAA sponsored activities for the past ten years. We appreciate the demonstrated support of the Guard, as well as Vision Zero, who completed their sixth year as a supporting sponsor. They have a great safety message and we are able to help promote that message.

Some highlights from the 2018-19 school year include:

- *First year of a 5-year, \$75,000 annual donation to member schools from Marcil Foundation *First-time state tournament venues including:
 - -State Girls Swimming and Diving Meet Hulbert Aquatic Center in West Fargo
 - -State B Girls Basketball Tournament Betty Engelstad Sioux Center in Grand Forks
 - -State B Softball Tournament Tharaldson Park in Fargo

Once again, the NDHSAA served a large number of students in grades seven through twelve. The most recent completed survey indicates there were 27,212 student participants in sports activities and 14,881 student participants in fine arts activities. Despite unseasonable weather impacting football attendance at playoff games and other outdoor fall state tournaments, as well as a number of statewide blizzards during region and state basketball tournaments, gross admission records were set during the Girls Swimming and Diving Meet, the Boys Tennis Tournament, the State Track & Field Meet, and the Class B Baseball/Softball Tournament. Over \$250,000 was distributed to member schools through the team payment program at the conclusion of the 2018-19 school year. Distribution has totaled more than \$1.5 million over the past five years and over \$3.6 million since the team payment plans inception in 2005-06.

The NDHSAA continues to be a very successful organization that serves North Dakota students who wish to be involved in educationally based activities. It is important that each member school feels as though they are an important part of the Association. Your support is greatly appreciated.

Harold Rotunda, NDHSAA auditor, provided the Board with a 2017-18 fiscal year audit report.

Motion by Privratsky to accept the auditor's report. Second by Sorlie. Motion carried unanimously.

Eligibility Committee Chair, Mark Rerick, provided the Board with a committee report. The committee reported determination on a hardship denial for a student who transferred from Grant County to Flasher. The committee recommends upholding the hardship denial. Motion by Strand to approve the eligibility committee report. Second by Sorlie. Motion carried unanimously.

Oak Grove High School requested a waiver of the transfer rule for a student. The student enrolled in online courses without attending Oak Grove for at least one class as required by Board regulation. The student then transferred from an entirely online class load back to Oak Grove as a full-time student. Motion by Privratsky to deny the Oak Grove request. Second by Vollmer. Roll Call Vote: Baxley-yes; Brandt – yes; Carlson- no; Jordan-no; Privratsky- yes; Rerick-yes; Schafer-yes; Sorlie-no; Strand-yes; Vollmer-yes. Motion carried: 7-3

The eligibility committee recommends the transfer rule and the eight-semester rule be reviewed by the Constitution & By-Laws committee.

Privratsky, Finance/Personnel & Policy_Committee chair, provided the Board with a committee report. Recommend continuing Valley Officeworks 5-6% increase in costs for 2019-20. Advertising sales more than cover the increased cost. Motion by Strand to approve. Second by Vollmer. Motion carried unanimously.

Ben Schafer, Football Committee Chair, provided the Board with a final recommendation for the 2019 and 2020 football plan including divisions, regions and play-off format. Change in guidelines to include the addition of the underlined wording: During the 2019 and 2020 seasons, any varsity team that chooses to play a team that declares independent status after the September 18, 2018 deadline will be ineligible for the playoffs. Board members appreciated the efforts the football committee put forth into the plan. Motion by Vollmer to approve the 2019 and 2020 football plan. Second by Baxley. Motion carried unanimously.

Scott Privratsky, Realignment Committee Chair, provided the Board with a committee report. The committee reviewed the plan recommended by Wahpeton and Fairmount High School. The committee recommends surveying member schools on the proposed plan with a one question survey. Survey Question: Is your school in favor of the NDHSAA Board of Directors adopting the volleyball/boys basketball/girls basketball proposal submitted by Wahpeton and Fairmount High Schools? The proposed plan will be sent out in advance of the survey. The survey will be emailed to Class A Athletic Directors and Class B Superintendents and Athletic Directors on October 3, 2018 with a submission deadline of October 17, 2018. Motion by Sorlie to approve the committee report. Second by Jordan. Motion carried. Roll call vote: Rerick-yes; Schafer-no; Sorlie-yes; Baxley-yes; Brandt-no; Carlson-yes; Jordan-yes; Privratsky-yes; Strand-yes; Vollmer-no.

Jeremy Brandt provided an Awards and Canvassing Committee report. The committee recommends discontinuation of 9th through 16th place ribbons in swimming and gymnastics, 4th through 8th place ribbons in region track relays and all student congress ribbons effective immediately as ribbons are no longer available from our vendor. Motion by Vollmer to approve. Second by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Vollmer, Fine Arts Committee Chair, provided a committee report. The Fine Arts Committee recommends researching realignment for all fine arts based on current 8 basketball regions. Motion by Jordan to approve. Second by Brandt. Motion carried unanimously.

Staff member Brenda Schell provided the Board with an update on the approved NDHSAA strategic plan.

The following region site changes were recommended: 2018-19 West Region Boys Tennis tournament move from Bismarck to Minot 2018-19 Region 1 Volleyball tournament move from TBD to Northern Cass Motion by Strand to approve the site changes. Second by Privratsky. Motion carried unanimously.

Representative Reports

Carlson mentioned schools in his area questioned the progress of the District Chairs recommendation that NDHSAA, NDOA, NDIAAA, and NDHSCA jointly develop a plan to enhance and develop officiating to include recruitment, evaluation, mentoring, and education of officials. Board consensus was the lead be taken by NDIAAA.

Informational Items

Fetsch provided a 2017-18 Apparel Report

NDHSAA General Assembly will be held in Bismarck on October 19, 2018. The Board was presented with the tentative agenda.

NDOA Recommendations are as follows. These recommendations will be voted on in November allowing time for feedback from member schools.

A 4% increase on the maximum fee schedule for officials for the 2019-20 and 2020-21 school years. Add two turn officials for the boys and girls State Swim Meets.

Remove high school students from the officials' full registration (high school students are unable to officiate varsity games). Steer all high school students through the Local Official program.

For swimming, add "and/or Dive Referee" to the line on the officials fee labeled "Meet Referee".

Use four umpires for the winner's bracket in the Class A State Baseball Tournament and two umpires for the consolation bracket.

Executive Director's Report

Meeting Recaps

Fall Administrator meetings were well attended with 159 of 169 member schools represented.

New admin orientation was held in August with 24 new administrators attending.

NFHS Section V discussed the following:

Cyber liability

Standards based report cards – require schools to convert to GPA and credits to verify student eligibility ND is only state in Section V that does not count grades 7-12 semesters consecutively (12 semesters). National Guard Supporting Sponsorship has committed \$35,000 for the 2018-19 year.

Fetsch provided an update on NFHS Rules Committees. Fetsch indicated North Dakota is well represented on national committees.

Bubach will serve his second year as the chair of the NFHS Speech Committee and is beginning year four of a four-year term on the NFHS Music Committee.

Fletschock is serving in year three of a four-year term on the Softball Rules Committee.

Schell will serve year four of a four-year term on the Spirit of Sport and Heart of the Arts award committees.

Tara Hofmann will begin year two of a four-year term on the NFHS Gymnastics Rules Committee.

Justin DeCoteau will begin year two of a four-year term on the NFHS Wrestling Rules Committee

Fetsch will serve year two of a four-year term on the NFHS Hockey Rules Committee, will be serving his third of five years on the NFHS Hold Co Board and will finish his final year of interim on the NFHS Foundation Board.

Jeff Risk will be serving his third year of a four-year term on the NFHS Football Committee.

Mix will begin his first year of a four-year term on the NFHS Records Committee.

Hardship Waiver Report

There have been 9 hardship rulings so far this school year, 5 have been approved and 2 were appealed. NFHS Section V Citation Award will be presented to Sue Carlsrud of the NDHSAA office in July 2019. Sue is in year 43 with NDHSAA and a wealth of information and knowledge.

Fetsch will be meeting with Blue Cross/Blue Shield concerning health insurance renewal rates. Rates are anticipated to decrease a small percentage.

MINUTES General Assembly Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association October 19, 2018 - Bismarck, ND

The General Assembly of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Bismarck Ramkota on October 19, 2018. President Schafer called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

President Schafer welcomed member schools to the NDHSAA General Assembly. Schafer introduced the NDHSAA Board of Directors and thanked the Board and NDHSAA staff for all they do for member schools. Schafer declared a quorum.

The minutes of the October 2017 General Assembly Meeting were addressed. Motion by Brandt Dick Underwood Public Schools, to approve the minutes. Second by Matt Herman, Ellendale Public Schools. Motion carried.

Schafer introduced Michael Hall, 2018/19 NDHSAA/Farmers Union Insurance Distinguished Student from Kindred High School. Michael thanked the NDHSAA membership for their support of the Distinguished Student program. He shared the importance of co-curricular activities and the values gained through his experience such as friendships, memories and skills. Participating in sports and activities have taught him how to work hard and brought him improved time management skills. Michael brought to light how life throws curve balls to everyone and through his experiences, he gained the skills to handle the curve balls. Involvement in music pushed him into being comfortable with being uncomfortable. Many people have helped him throughout the years. Teachers, in and out of the classroom have taught him many skills outside of sports. Coaches, who invest their time in each and every one of their athletes. Finally Athletic Directors and the NDHSAA both make sure school and all activities are available to students. In closing, Hall thanked member schools for their dedication to students in North Dakota. It is appreciated by students.

President Schafer introduced Matt Fetsch, NDHSAA Executive Director. Fetsch called on nominating committees for upcoming vacancies on the Board of Directors.

Dr. Mark Vollmer, Superintendent Minot Public Schools reported nominations for the Class A West representative.

Dr. Shon Hocker, Superintendent, Dickinson Public School Paul Jundt, Athletic Director, Bismack Legacy High School

Motion by Tyler Senn, Bowman High School to add Randy Cranston, Principal, Watford City High School to the nominations with a second by Kirk Ham, Park River High School. Motion passed unanimously.

Ben Schafer, Superintendent, Ray Public School, reported nominations for the Class B Northwest representative

Dave Schoch, Superintendent, Velva Public School Nick Klemisch, Superintendent, Garrison Public School There were no other nominations from the floor.

Motion by Warren Strand, Fessenden-Bowden High School to approve nominations. Second by Michael Sorlie, North Sargent Public School. Motion carried.

Ballots will be sent to member schools in December of 2018. Ballots will be canvassed at the January 2019 NDHSAA Board meeting.

The Executive Director gave his report. Fetsch began by relating the inspiration for his presentation began with a new pastor in his church giving his first sermon to the congregation. The sermon reminded Fetsch of the first presentation he gave in an educational setting which was at NDIAAA in 2009. When Fetsch returned home after church he looked through flash drives to find that presentation. The presentation is still timely today. In 2009, he presented on the benefits of multisport participation. In 2008 he surveyed the Grafton hockey and boys basketball teams, both state champions and found 50% of participants were three sport athletes, 41% were two sport athletes and 9% (3 individuals) were single sport athletes. His research further showed in 2008 there were 77 academic scholarships to each sport scholarship with less than 1% of college athletes receiving a full ride.

There is information out in the media participation is dropping; however, in 2008-09 participation was 82%, and in 2017-18 participation was 89%. When three sport athletes were asked why they participate in 3 sports, the overwhelming conclusion is because of their peers. They want do what their friends are doing.

The NDHSAA Board understands the changing demographics in our state and is researching ways to address the changes. One change was in track & field and swimming & diving, NDHSAA sports which do not normally have a JV division at meets. The NDHSAA recently approved the ability of transfer students to participate in varsity track & field and swim & dive meets, providing certain stipulations are met.

Several states have passed By-Laws in the past year, adding "if you have not participated in a sport in your school the previous year, you are eligible in your new school".

Fetsch indicated state Executive Directors across the nation agree the biggest challenge in their field is youth sports. We've become what we thought was wrong in Eastern-block countries that forced kids to pick sports at a young age.

Jack Roberts, retiring Michigan Executive Director summed up what we do. "Sports brings help and hope to parents and schools. We turn good athletes into great citizens down the road."

Fetsch also stated the NDHSAA Distinguished Students are a great representation for our organization. "Train effective leaders", "leaving a legacy" and "effective and realistic goals" are just a few memorable comments made by students through the interview process. Fetsch thanked Michael for sharing his thoughts with the membership.

Fetch stated the NDHSAA organization works best as a member school led organization. The Board discussed in June and September through the realignment committee, a three-class plan for volleyball, girls basketball and boys basketball. The Board decided to survey member schools for their opinion on the proposed plan.

The survey results are as follows: 41.9% in favor of the proposed plan 58.1% not in favor of the proposed plan

Pro-rated to 123 girls basketball teams and 128 boys basketball teams: 38.5% in favor of the proposed plan 61.5% not in favor of the proposed plan

In closing Fetsch again thought of his new church pastor who is reading "Faith", by Jimmy Carter. The quote that stood out in the book is "Our work is never finished". Which is true of the NDHSAA organization.

Fetsch thanked administrators for their hard work and told them to keep up the good work they do for their students on a daily basis.

With no further business, the meeting was declared adjourned at 9:17 am.

Executive Board chair, Ben Schafer, provided the Board with a committee report including eligibility violations.

Trenton/Williston Trinity Christian School self-reported use of an academically ineligible player in a varsity football contest. Prescribed penalty administered with letter of reprimand and forfeiture of all games in which the ineligible student participated.

Fargo North High School self-reported an individual exceeded the daily volleyball match limit. Prescribed penalty administered with letter of reprimand and forfeiture of all contests in which the ineligible student participated.

Max/Garrison/South Prairie cooperative self-reported the use of an ineligible transfer student in a varsity cross country meet. Prescribed penalty administered with letter of reprimand and forfeiture of all contests in which the ineligible student participated.

Williams County (Tioga/Ray) cooperative self-reported the use of an ineligible participant in a junior varsity wrestling tournament. Prescribed penalty administered with letter of reprimand and forfeiture of all contests in which the ineligible student participated.

Motion by Vollmer to approve the executive board report. Second by Sorlie. Motion carried unanimously.

Mitch Carlson provided a Constitution & By-Laws committee report. The committee recommends the addition of the following Board interpretation to Article V, Part II of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws, effective immediately:

If a student who has been declared ineligible is permitted to participate in interscholastic competition because of a court restraining order and/or injunction against the school or NDHSAA and if such restraining order and/or injunction subsequently is voluntarily vacated, stayed, reversed or finally

determined by the courts not to justify injunctive relief, one or more of the penalties in Part II, Article V, Sections I, II, III and IV above may be taken in the interest of restitution and fairness to other member schools.

Motion by Vollmer to approve the committee recommendation to add the Board interpretation to Article V, Part II of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws. Second by Privratsky. Motion carried unanimously.

The committee reviewed Article XIV, Section IX concerning online classes and has no recommendation at this time. There was discussion concerning implementation of a 12-semester rule for participants in grades 7 through 12. Fetsch will bring draft language to the Constitution & By-Laws committee. Motion by Baxley to approve the committee report. Second by Brandt. Motion carried unanimously.

Scott Privratsky provided a realignment committee report. The committee reviewed the results from the member school survey of the Wahpeton-Fairmount three-class proposal. The results showed 28% of total member schools voted yes for the proposed plan. The committee does not recommend pursuing the proposed three-class system.

The committee discussed a three-class system at length as the issue is brought forth frequently. The committee recommends creating a guideline for proposals similar to the Board procedure for the addition of an activity. The committee received and reviewed communication from Adam Hill, Mott-Regent Athletic Director/Principal.

Motion by Vollmer to approve the committee report. Second by Sorlie. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Vollmer, Fine Arts Committee Chair, provided a committee report.

Class B Fine Arts Region Realignment & Timeline

Recommend alignment with basketball regions

State Class A Orchestra Judges

Three options – go as far as Twin Cities to find adjudicators – have instructors judge their own – run regions. Committee authorizes Bubach to confer with NDMEA on resolutions.

Student Congress - Resolution Regulation Proposal

Coaches propose a regulation change on how resolutions are chosen. Proposal for students to develop resolutions and coaches vote on final resolutions. Enacted immediately and voting would begin in January.

Each school can determine how their school legislation is created. It is intended that the students are still writing the resolutions.

By the first Friday in December, schools may propose **two pieces** of legislation each of the following groups: Group 1-Senate/House 1; Group 2-House 2/House 3/House 4; Group 3-House 5/House 6. Resolutions will be submitted electronically with school name.

Resolutions shall be posted without school identifier. Coaches/schools shall rank the resolutions 1 to the final number. (This is a preference ballot which will decide the resolutions for the season.)

Legislation ranked 1-5 will be reserved for the state tournament.

Legislation ranked 6-10 will be reserved for the West Congress.

Legislation ranked 11-15 will be reserved for the East Congress.

Legislation ranked 16-20 will be reserved for an invitational 1.

Legislation ranked 21-25 will be reserved for an invitational 2.

Legislation ranked 26-30 will be reserved for an invitational 3.

It is the coach/school responsibility to **submit resolutions by the deadline** and the coach/school responsibility to **vote on the anonymous resolutions by the deadline**.

No legislation submitted after the first Friday in December 11:59 pm CST will be considered. The legislation will be available for coach vote (1 vote per school) during the week between the second and third Friday in December. The vote will close at 11:59 pm CST on the third Friday in December. **Topics will be released by NDHSAA by January 15th.**

Items approved by nine of more of the districts in attendance are forwarded to Athletic Review for consideration. Fetsch also explained only district chair recommendations approved by Athletic Review will continue to the NDHSAA Board for review.

Each district was given the opportunity to present their district's recommendations and discussion items, which are listed as submitted.

District 16----Ryan Eraas, AD Tioga HS

In basketball, extend the coach's box to the baseline

Discussion: Fletschock discussed history of coaching box implementation, including the current 14-foot coaching box being placed wherever.

Vote: No (1-13) - Failed

Change the state ball bid in basketball to the Baden Elite or the Wilson Evolution instead of the Spalding. College use and ball durability are the reasons

Discussion: Fetsch discussed current contract which runs through 2021. Durability is number one concern with current ball that is adopted.

Interested in a 3-class system, initiated by the state, not a proposal voted on that a school makes.

Discussion: Fetsch updated the district chairs on the Board timeline for development of a regulation to add a classification to all sports and activities. Jung said District 13 is in favor of three classes of basketball. DesRosier mentioned a couple of regions have been dominant in boys basketball, but not in girls basketball. Dennis commented that Region 1 teams farther from Fargo seem to favor three classes while schools closer do not. Hunter noted that superintendents voted on most recent survey and other did not see plan.

- IV. All delayed tele/webcasts are to be delayed a minimum of two hours upon completion of event.
- **V.** An earnest payment fee shall be required of the TV station prior to the televising of an event, and a penalty fee as established by the Board for failure to pay the balance within 30 days after completion of the event shall be included in the contract.
- VI. Advertising that is in poor taste shall be subject to rejection and/or a requirement it be edited. Certain advertising categories will not be accepted, including but not limited to:
 - A. Advocacy Advertisements. An advocacy advertisement is any advertisement that advocates a political, religious or controversial public position.
 - B. Cigarettes or Tobacco Advertisements
 - C. Betting or Gambling Advertisements
 - D. Firearms Advertisements
 - E. 900 Phone Number Advertisements
 - F. Contraceptive Advertisements
 - G. Tattoo Parlor and Body Piercing Advertisements
 - H. "NC-17" Rated Movie Advertisements
 - I. Adult Entertainment Advertisements
 - J. "R" Rated Movie Advertisements
 - K. "M" Rated Electronic (computer or video) Game Advertisements
 - L. Hard Liquor or Alcoholic Beverage Advertisements
 - M. "High Risk" Investments (e.g. commodities, options, foreign exchange) Advertisements
 - N. "High Risk" Business Opportunities (e.g., "get rich quick" schemes and business opportunities)
 - O. "High Risk" Health Offerings

Mark Rerick, Committee Chair, provided the Board with an Eligibility Committee report. Hardship appeals presented to the Eligibility Committee from Shiloh Christian School and Lewis & Clark North Shore-Plaza High Schools were denied. Motion by Privratsky to approve the Eligibility Committee report. Second by Vollmer. Motion carried unanimously.

Mitch Carlson provided a Constitution & By-Laws committee report.

The committee recommends presenting PART II, ARTICLE XIV, SECTION II of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws as a proposed amendment to bring to a member school vote in October of 2019.

PART II, ARTICLE XIV, SECTION II: A student shall not compete for more than four seasons in any one branch of interscholastic contests, provided that competition while in the seventh, and/or eighth grade shall not constitute one of the four seasons. A student shall not participate in more than four seasons in grades 9-12 in any interscholastic activity. A student shall have only eight consecutive semesters (four consecutive years) of eligibility in high school in which he/she may participate in one season per year in any activity.

SECTION IX:

c. When some of the senior high schools within the same public school district are organized as three-year high schools and others are organized as four-year high schools, students finishing the ninth grade in the school system operating a three-year high school have the privilege of transferring to the four-year high school system without loss of eligibility if transfer is made at the start of the first semester of tenth grade. Such transfers are not permitted from four-year high schools to the three-year high school without loss of eligibility. This in no way abridges the right of a student to establish his/her eligibility in any high school of his/her choice at the beginning of ninth grade.

SECTION X: A student shall not participate in any interscholastic contests after his/her eighth semester in high school unless he/she is under 18 years of age, nor after his/her seventh semester, if his/her seventh and eighth semesters are not consecutive. In the event that a student has been unable to participate in an activity due to a diagnosed life threatening illness

or other exceptional reason, the Executive Secretary has the power to grant/deny the student one or two additional semesters of eligibility provided the member school of attendance submits and supports an extra semester(s) application establishing that the student has not reached his/her twentieth birthday and the student is academically eligible. The decision of the Executive Secretary may be appealed pursuant to the Due Process Procedures of Article VI, Sections XV through XVII of these By-Laws (see Extra Semester(s) Appeals Flow Chart, attached hereto at page 38 and incorporated by reference), provided the student has not reached his/her twentieth birthday and is otherwise eligible. (October 2011 2019)

Motion by Vollmer to approve presentation of an amendment to PART II, ARTICLE XIV, SECTION II of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws. Second by Baesler. Motion carried unanimously.

The committee recommends presenting PART IV, Article III: General Regulations of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws as a proposed amendment to bring to a member school vote in October of 2019.

PART IV, Article III: General Regulations

Section VI: Any team combination of 7th and 8th grade is considered junior high school. Ninth grade teams may declare their status and participate as either a high school team or as a junior high school team. A team designed as a ninth grade team must have fifty percent or more of the participants enrolled in ninth grade. Any 7th or 8th grade student who plays on a 9th grade team plays at the status chosen for that team. If the 9th grade team choose high school status, high school rules apply, or if a 9th grade team declares itself a junior high team, junior high rules apply.

Section IX: A student is eligible for only TWO SEMESTERS in each the 7th and 8th grade beginning with the first semester of entrance in each grade. A student who is repeating a grade is not eligible. Junior High students are limited to one season per year sport/activity. A student must not have attended a three year junior high school more than six semesters, or a two-year junior high school consisting of grades seven and eight more than four semesters. The same rule as applies to senior high schools relative to what constitutes a semester's attendance shall prevail.

Section X: A ninth grade student shall <u>not</u> be eligible to compete in the junior high division <u>on or after the day on which the seventeenth anniversary of his/her birth occurs</u> for the complete school term if his/her sixteenth birthday occurs on or after September 1, a seventh and <u>or</u> eighth grader <u>on or after the day on which the sixteenth anniversary of his/her birth occurs</u> if his/her fifteenth birthday occurs on or after September 1.

Motion by Jordan to approve presentation of amendment to Part IV, Article III: General Regulations for a member school vote in October 2019. Second by Privratsky. Role Call Vote: Privratsky - yes, Sorlie - yes, Baxley - yes, Strand - yes, Rerick - yes, Brandt - yes, Carlson - yes, Jordan - yes, Baesler - yes, Vollmer – yes, Schafer – no. Motion carried (10-1).

Recommend a re-format of the hardship eligibility form. Motion by Vollmer to approve the recommended changes in the hardship eligibility form. Second by Sorlie. Motion carried unanimously.

Recommend a hardship application appeal form and fee of \$500. If the hardship is overturned, the \$500 fee will be waived. Motion by Privratsky to approve the Request for Appeal Form as amended with no fee. Second by Vollmer. Motion carried unanimously.

Brenda Schell presented the 2019-20 Technology Plan. Motion by Privratsky to approve the 2019-20 Technology Plan and thank Schell for her work on the Technology Plan. Second by Strand. Motion carried unanimously.

Scott Privratsky, Realignment Committee Chair, provided a recommendation of procedure for addition of a classification in a sport or activity.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Board of Directors North Dakota High School Activities Association Valley City, North Dakota

Report on Financial Statements

I have audited the accompanying financial statements of North Dakota High School Activities Association, which comprise the statement of financial position as of June 30, 2019, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with U.S. generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement in the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, I express no such opinion. Opinion

In my opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position- modified cash basis of the North Dakota High School Activities Association, as of June 30, 2019, and the results of its activities- modified cash basis and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the basis of accounting described in Note 2.

Basis of Accounting

I draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. My opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Report on Summarized Comparative Information

I have previously audited the North Dakota High School Activities Association's 2018 financial statements and I expressed an unmodified audit opinion on those financial statements in my report dated July 22, 2018. In my opinion, the summarized comparative information presented herein as of and for the year ended June 30, 2018, is consistent in all material respects, with audited financial statements from which it has been derived.

Other Matter

My audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The supplemental schedules on pages 17-20 is presented for of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

NATURE OF BUSINESS

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues, sponsorships, and sales and charges at athletic events.

INCOME TAX

The Agency is incorporated exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), though it would be subject to tax on income unrelated to its exempt purposes (unless otherwise exempted by the IRC). The tax years of 2019, 2018, and 2017 are still open to audit for federal purposes. Contributions to the Agency are tax deductible to donors under Section 170 of the IRC. The Agency is not classified as a private foundation.

CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash equivalents are short term interest bearing highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, unless the investments are held for meeting restrictions of a capital or endowment nature.

PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

Land, buildings and equipment are reported in the balance sheet at cost, if purchased, and at fair value at the date of donation, if donated. All land and buildings are capitalized. Equipment is capitalized if it has a cost of \$1,000 or more and a useful life when acquired of more than one year. Repairs and maintenance that do not significantly increase the useful life of the assets are expensed as incurred. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset as follows:

Buildings and improvements 40 years Leasehold improvements 5-20 years Equipment 3-15 years

ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. On an ongoing basis, the Agency's management evaluates the estimates an assumption based upon historical experience and various other factors and circumstances; however, the actual results could differ from those estimates.

NET ASSETS

The Agency is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to two classes; net assets without donor restrictions and net assets with donor restrictions.

Net Assets Without Donor Restrictions- Net assets that are not subject to donor- imposed stipulations. Net assets without donor restrictions include unrestricted resources and are subject to self-imposed limits by action of the governing board. Board designated net assets may be earmarked for future programs, investments, contingencies, purchase or construction of fixed assets, or other uses. The governing board may delegate designation decisions to internal management. Such designations are considered to be included in board-designated assets.

Net Assets with Donor Restrictions- Net Assets with donor restrictions represent net assets resulting from contributions and other inflows of assets whose use by the Agency is limited by donor-imposed stipulations. Some donor imposed restrictions are temporary in nature, stipulating that resources used after a specified date, for particular programs or services, or to acquire building or equipment. Other donors impose restrictions that are perpetual in nature, stipulating that resources be maintained in perpetuity. Laws may extend those limits to investment return from those resources and to other enhancements (diminishments) of those resources. Thus, those laws extend donor-imposed restrictions.

ADVERTISING COSTS

Advertising costs are expensed as incurred.

GRANT REVENUE

The Agency records income from grants in the period designated by the grants or when they have incurred expenditures in compliance with the restrictions of the grantor.

ASSETS WHOSE USE IS LIMITED

Assets limited as to use include designated assets set aside by the Board of Directors for future capital improvements and debt retirement as well as donor restricted pledges and endowment funds. The board retains control of the board designated funds and may at its discretion subsequently use for other purposes.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions received are recorded as with or without donor restrictions depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. With donor restrictions net assets are reclassified to without donor restrictions upon satisfaction of the time or purpose restrictions.

PROMISES TO GIVE

We record unconditional promises to give that are expected to be collected within one year a net realizable value. Unconditional promises to give expected to be collected in future years are initially recorded at fair value using present value techniques incorporating risk-adjusted discount rates designed to reflect the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the assets. In subsequent years, amortization of the discounts is included in contribution revenue in the statement of activities. We determine the allowance for uncollectible promises to give based on historical experience, an assessment of economic conditions, and a review of subsequent collections. Promises to give are written off when deemed uncollectible.

REVENUE AND REVENUE RECOGNITION

Revenue is recognized when earned. Program service fees and payments under cost-reimbursable contracts received in advance are deferred to the applicable period in which the related services are performed or expenditures are incurred, respectively. Contributions are recognized when cash, securities other assets, an unconditional promise to give, or notification of a beneficial interest is received. Conditional promises to give are not recognized until the conditions on which they depend have been substantially met.

DONATED MATERIALS, FACILITIES, LAND AND SERVICES

The Agency periodically receives contributions in a form other than cash and investments. If the Agency receives a contribution of land, buildings, or equipment the contributed asset is recognized as an asset at its estimated fair value at the date of the gift, provided that the value of the asset and its estimated useful life meets the Agency's capitalization policy. Donated use of facilities is reported as contribution and expense at the estimated fair value of for rent under similar circumstances. Donated supplies are recorded as contributions at the date of the gift and as expenses when the donated items are placed into service or distributed.

The Agency benefits from personal services provided by a substantial amount of volunteers. Those volunteers have donated significant amounts of time and services in the Agency's program operations. However, the majority of the contributed services do not meet the criteria for recognition in the financial statements. GAAP allow the recognition of contributed services only if (a)the services create or enhance nonfinancial assets or (b)the services would have been purchased if not provided by the contribution, require specialized skills, and are provided by individuals possessing those skills.

FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

The Agency reports its fair value measures using a three-level hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value. This hierarchy, established by GAAP, requires that entities maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The three levels of inputs used to measure fair value are as follows:

Level 1. Quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2. Observable market-based inputs or unobservable inputs that are corroborated by market data.

Level 3. Unobservable inputs that are not corroborated by market data.

FUNCTIONAL EXPENSES

The cost of providing the Agency's programs and other activities is summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities and statement of functional activities. Expenses that can be identified with a specific program or support service are charged directly to that program or support service. Costs common to multiple functions have been allocated among the various functions benefitted.

General and administrative expenses include those costs that are not directly identifiable with any specific program, but which provide for overall support and direction of the Agency.

Fundraising costs are expensed as incurred, even though they may result in contributions received in future years. The Agency generally does not conduct its fundraising activities in conjunction with its other activities. In the few cases in which it does, joint costs have been allocated between fundraising and management and general expenses in accordance with standards for accounting for cost of activities that include fundraising. Additionally, advertising costs are expenses as incurred.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. On an ongoing basis, the Agency's management evaluates the estimates an assumption based upon historical experience and various other factors and circumstances; however, the actual results could differ from those estimates.

4. RETIREMENT PLAN

The Association participates in a defined contribution, individual account, money purchase, retirement plan that covers all employees who work over 20 hours per week.

In accordance with the plan agreement, the Association contributes 16.8 percent of the employee's gross wages to the plan. During the years ended June 30, 2019 and 2018, the Association contributed \$126,106 and \$117,533 respectively, to the retirement plan.

5. CONCENTRATIONS OF RISK

Amounts held in financial institutions occasionally are in excess of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and Securities Investor Protection Corporation limits. The Association deposits its cash with high quality financial institutions, and management believes the Association is not exposed to significant credit risk on those amounts.

A significant portion of the Association's annual funding comes from events and media for the programs operated.

6. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 4, 2019, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Events occurring after that date have not been evaluated to determine whether a change in financial statements would be required.
