FOREWORD

This yearbook provides a detailed accounting of the past years' activities for the NDHSAA. I would like to thank the Board of Directors, NDHSAA office staff and all representatives of the member schools for your dedication and commitment to the Association.

Farmers Union Insurance has completed its 12th year as the Premiere Partner of NDHSAA and continues to be actively involved in all activities. Their entire company has demonstrated a commitment to the enhancement of activities for North Dakota students and once again provided \$5,000 in scholarship funds for the NDHSAA Distinguished Student Program. The Association is very appreciative for what they do for the athletes and fine arts students in North Dakota.

Vision Zero has been a supporting sponsor of NDHSAA sponsored activities for the past seven years. We appreciate the demonstrated support of Vision Zero, who has a great safety message and we are able to help promote that message.

After a "normal" and successful fall and winter, the NDHSAA and its member schools changed forever on March 13, 2020. Due to the rapidly evolving COVID-19 pandemic, the State Class A Basketball Tournament was suspended mid-tournament and the State Class B Boys Basketball Tournaments, spring sports, and fine arts seasons were suspended indefinitely. The following timeline unfolded throughout the remainder of the 2020-21 academic year:

March 13, 2020 – NDHSAA State Tournaments and spring sports/activities suspended indefinitely March 15, 2020 – Governor Doug Burgum suspends in-person learning for all K-12 schools indefinitely May 1, 2020 – Governor Doug Burgum cancels in-person learning for the remainder of the school year May 1, 2020 – NDHSAA Board of Directors cancels all 2020 spring sports and fine arts seasons

All 50 state associations canceled spring seasons in 2020, while K-12 students nationwide spent the last quarter of their school year learning from home. Thanks to a donation from the Marcil Foundation, \$75,000 was distributed to member schools through the team payment program at the conclusion of the 2019-20 school year. Due to canceled tournaments and seasons, as well as a cloud of uncertainty as to what the 2020-21 school year will look like, the Association anticipates having to exhaust most of the reserve fund over the next year. The Board of Directors approved a deficit budget for 2020-21, as the ability to have fans in attendance, if sports resume, appears unlikely until a COVID-19 vaccine is readily available.

The NDHSAA continues to be a very successful organization that serves North Dakota students who wish to be involved in educationally based activities and will continue to do so in 2020-21, whatever it may look like.

Harold Rotunda, NDHSAA auditor, provided the Board with a 2018-19 fiscal year audit report. Motion by Carlson to accept the auditor's report. Second by Brandt. Motion carried unanimously.

Scott Privratsky Executive Board Committee Chair, provided a committee report

- 1. School violations
 - 1. Fargo Davies self-reported an out of season coaching violation in girls basketball. Letter of reprimand to be issued.

- 2. Shiloh Christian self-reported an out of season coaching violation in football. Letter of reprimand to be issued
- 3. New Rockford-Sheyenne self-reported the use of an ineligible transfer student in a varsity volleyball contest. Prescribed penalty administered with letter of reprimand and forfeiture of contest in which the ineligible student participated.
- 4. South Prairie self-reported an individual exceeded the daily volleyball match limit. Prescribed penalty administered with letter of reprimand and forfeiture of contest in which the ineligible student participated, and head varsity coach suspended for next match.
- 2. The committee recommends allowing a coop request for Wahpeton, Breckenridge (MN), and St. Mary's (MN) girls swimming to go forward to the NDHSAA Board with a \$500 fee. Any students from St. Mary's (MN) are not eligible immediately and will remain ineligible until the \$500 fee is received by NDHSAA.
- 3. An individual will not be allowed to obtain a media pass at NDHSAA post season activities due to unpaid media fees from 2018/19. The committee also directed Fetsch to notify NDHSAA schools of the unpaid fees.

Motion by Carlson to approve. Second by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed the following request for coop:

Wahpeton, Breckenridge (MN), and St. Mary's (MN) girls swimming, 2019/20, \$500 late fee Motion by Brandt to approve coop. Second by Rerick. Motion carried unanimously.

Jeremy Brandt, Finance/Personnel & Policy Committee chair, provided a committee report.

- 1. Building and grounds update.
 - 1. Staff discussed office security of NDHSAA buildings and grounds. Fetsch will investigate digital security system for the two NDHSAA entry ways. Privratsky requested as part of the report to allow Fetsch authority to complete this upon receiving additional information and bids.
 - There are issues with water seepage and damage to the NDHSAA office roof due to the flat roof design. Fetsch will investigate the addition of a second story to the NDHSAA building with the inclusion a gable roof. He will report back to the NDHSAA Board at a later date.
- 2. There was a lawsuit against the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA) concerning whether officials were employees of PIAA or independent contractors. PIAA was successful in defending the position officials are independent contractors. This case could have ramifications in other state associations and recommended sending PIAA \$1,000 for assistance in legal fees.
- 3. Honigs contacted NDHSAA regarding an agreement for official's apparel. This non-exclusive agreement will provide a 10% discount to NDHSAA officials on apparel with an additional 5% of the cost of apparel returned to NDHSAA. The committee recommends entering into this non-exclusive agreement with Honigs.
- 4. Brand indicated from conversations with Fetsch, 82% of eligibility questions in August 2018 were from parents. Fetsch developed a Parent Inquiry Form to streamline the process of parent inquiries and assure the chain of command is followed with contact with local school administration before contact with NDHSAA.
- 5. Supporting sponsorships were discussed. The North Dakota Army National Guard will not be a supporting sponsor in 2019/20. The committee felt there was not a need to solicit additional sponsors at this time. However, if offers are brought to the attention of NDHSAA, they will be investigated.

Motion by Sorlie to approve. Second by Strand. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Rerick, Football Committee Chair, provided a 2021 and 2022 football plan report. The committee created a survey to be sent to Class A Athletic Directors and Class B Superintendents concerning the 2021 and 2022 football plan. Motion by Baxley to approve the football committee report. Second by Carlson. Motion carried unanimously.

Mitch Carlson, Constitution & By-Laws Committee Chair, provided a committee report.

- 1. Review Article XIV, Section XI concerning the possession of tobacco, alcohol and controlled substances.
 - 1. Recommend Strand get feedback from the North Dakota Secondary School Principal Association at their winter meeting to provide additional information and potential language to bring back to the Board.
- 2. Review Article XIV, Section IXb, #10 concerning the participation of seventh and eighth grade students attending a parochial school.

1. Recommend removal of interpretation #10 of Article XIV, Section IXb to mirror current practice.

Motion by Rerick to approve the Constitution & By-Laws committee report. Second by Jundt. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Rerick, Realignment Committee Chair, provided a committee report

- 1. Reviewed a request from Glen Ullin-Hebron for a realignment for volleyball, girls basketball and boys basketball from Region 7 to Region 5. Board wants to keep a minimum of 12 teams in each region. Recommendation to deny Glen Ullin-Hebron request.
- 2. Region placement
 - a. Northwood wrestling placed in Region 2
 - b. Kidder County boys and girls golf placed in Region 1

Motion by Jordan to approve the realignment committee report. Second by Schoch. Motion carried unanimously.

Baxley provided the Board with an Awards and Canvassing Committee report.

- 1. There were no Distinguished Service nominations for committee review.
- 2. Recommended re-naming the Distinguished Service award the Robert D. King Award.

Motion by Jundt to approve the Awards and Canvassing Committee report. Second by Strand. Motion carried unanimously.

Board reviewed the previously tabled request to move Class B girls golf from a spring sport to a fall sport. In the Spring of 2019, Class B administrators were surveyed with 67.8% in favor of moving Class B girls golf from spring to fall. Fletschock provided further information to the Board.

Motion by Jordan to move Class B girls golf from the spring to the fall beginning fall 2021 mirroring the Class A Girls golf schedule. Second by Schoch. Motion carried unanimously.

Athletic Review recommendations were presented for Board consideration.

Motion by Sorlie to approve 2019-20 region tournament dates and sites as recommended. Second by Rerick. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a letter from Michael Breker, Shanley High School Athletic Director, requesting permission for Shanley's speech team to participate in an out-of-state meet prior to the NDHSAA speech season. Bubach provided additional information to the Board. Motion by Baxley to allow all speech teams to attend the John Edie Holiday Debates hosted by Blake in the 2019/20 school year with annual review. Topic will be forwarded to speech advisory. Second by Sorlie. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed correspondence to include a letter from Central Cass concerning moving the Class B Boys golf season to the fall.

Rerick questioned if the NDHSAA Strategic Plan needs to be re-visited. Privratsky directed the NDHSAA staff to review the Strategic Plan to see if the goals are still applicable.

 - Second by Baxley. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5. Fetsch indicated President Privratsky would like to host the June 2020 meeting in Devils Lake. Motion by Jordan to move the June 2020 Board meeting to Devils Lake. Second by Strand. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a request from Shanley High School for an exception to the out of season participation for a boys swim participant to attend a Junior National Championship to be held December 11-14, 2019, which is during the NDHSAA boys swim & dive season. Motion to approve by Rerick. Second by Brandt. Motion carried unanimously.

MINUTES

General Assembly Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association October 18, 2019 - Bismarck, ND

The General Assembly of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Bismarck Ramkota on October 18, 2019. President Privratsky called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

President Privratsky welcomed member schools to the NDHSAA General Assembly. Privratsky introduced the NDHSAA Board of Directors and NDHSAA staff and thanked the Board and NDHSAA staff for all they do for member schools. Privratsky encouraged member schools to have open communication with their Board representatives and the NDHSAA office. Privratsky declared a quorum.

The minutes of the October 2018 General Assembly Meeting were addressed. Motion by Brandt Dick, Underwood Public Schools, to approve the minutes. Second by Kent Dennis, Hankinson Public Schools. Motion carried.

1. Privratsky introduced Cassandra Rostvet, 2019/20 NDHSAA/Farmers Union Insurance Distinguished Student from Northwood High School. Cassie's involvement in high school sports and activities have affected her immensely. Coaches, teachers and teammates have supported and encouraged her throughout her high school life. She indicated NDHSAA allowed her to be an athlete. Her coaches put a huge emphasis on growing as an athlete, but even more emphasis on growing as a person. Her favorite quote from her basketball coach is: "You're never as good as everyone tells you when you win, and you are never as bad as they tell you when you lose." Cassie has learned she can count on teammates as sports build relationships. NDHSAA fine arts activities have given her self-confidence and poise. Fine arts have impacted her and prepared her for the future by making her feel worthy, valued and loved. In closing, Rostvet reminded the membership they educate the minds of the next generations and it is comforting for students to know they are there for them.

President Privratsky introduced Mark Rerick, NDHSAA Football Committee chair to report on the 2020 and 2021 football plan survey.

Survey results include the following:

- 124 surveys were submitted
- Desire to continue with 4 divisions
- Questions on a 6-Man division will require follow up with some schools
- AAA & AA prefer East vs West over QRF for playoff brackets
- There was not clear direction on the minimum number of teams per division. This topic will need follow up.
- Overwhelming direction on the most important criteria
 - Competitive balance. 69% of all schools prefer competitive balance over travel
- The greatest parity exists in Division A
- 64% of respondents prefer using multiple factors instead of just adjusted male enrollment

Motion by Todd Olson, Fargo Public Schools, to introduce an amendment to Part II, Article XIV, Sections II, IX and X of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws. Second by Dave Zittleman, Bismarck Public Schools. Motion passed 116-Yes, 1-No.

Amendment to: Part II, Article XIV, Sections II, IX and X

SECTION II: A student shall not participate in more than four seasons in grades 9-12 in any interscholastic activity. A student shall have only eight consecutive semesters (four consecutive years) of eligibility in high school in which he/she may participate in one season per year in any activity.

SECTION IX: REMOVE

SECTION X: In the event that a student has been unable to participate in an activity due to a diagnosed life threatening illness or other exceptional reason, the Executive Secretary has the power to grant/deny the student one or two additional semesters of eligibility provided the member school of attendance submits and supports an extra semester(s) application establishing that the student has not reached his/her twentieth birthday and the student is academically eligible. The decision of the Executive Secretary may be appealed pursuant to the Due Process Procedures of Article VI, Sections XV through XVII of these By-Laws (see Extra Semester(s) Appeals Flow Chart, attached hereto at page 38 and incorporated by reference), provided the student has not reached his/her twentieth birthday and is otherwise eligible. (October 2019)

Motion by Jason Wiberg, Devils Lake Public Schools, to introduce an amendment to Part IV, Article III, Sections VI, IX and X of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws. Second by Shane Martin, Turtle Mountain Community High School. Motion passed 109-Yes, 7-No.

Amendment to Part IV, Article III, General Regulations, Sections VI, IX and X

Section VI: Any team combination of 7th and 8th grade is considered junior high school. Ninth grade teams may declare their status and participate as either a high school team or as a junior high school team. Any 7th or 8th grade student who plays on a 9th grade team plays at the status chosen for that team. If the 9th grade team choose high school status, high school rules apply, or if a 9th grade team declares itself a junior high team, junior high rules apply.

Section IX: A student is eligible for only TWO SEMESTERS in each the 7th and 8th grade beginning with the first semester of entrance in each grade. A student who is repeating a grade is not eligible. Junior high students are limited to one season per year sport/activity. The same rule as applies to senior high schools relative to what constitutes a semester's attendance shall prevail.

Section X: A ninth grade student shall not be eligible to compete in the junior high division on or after the day on which the seventeenth anniversary of his/her birth occurs, a seventh or eighth grader on or after the day on which the sixteenth anniversary of his/her birth occurs.

President Privratsky introduced Matt Fetsch, NDHSAA Executive Director. Fetsch called on nominating committees for upcoming vacancies on the Board of Directors.

Scott Privratsky, Superintendent Devils Lake Public Schools reported nominations for the Class A At-Large representative.

- 1. Josh Johnson, Superintendent, Valley City Public School
- 2. Ned Clooten, Principal, Wahpeton High School
- 3. There were no other nominations from the floor.

Mitch Carlson, LaMoure High School, Superintendent, reported nominations for the Class B Southeast representative

- 3. Rick Diegel, Superintendent, Kidder County Public School
- 4. Travis Lemar, Athletic Director, Central Cass Public School
- 5. There were no other nominations from the floor.

Patti Aanenson, Larimore Public School Athletic Director, reported nominations for the NDIAAA representative

- 1. Michael Beaton, Athletic Director, Fargo South High School
- 2. Guy Fridley, Athletic Director, Dickinson Public School
- 3. There were no other nominations from the floor.

Motion by Dave Zittleman, Bismarck Public Schools to approve nominations. Second by Kirk Ham, Park River Public School. Motion carried. Ballots will be emailed to member schools in December of 2019. Ballots will be canvassed at the January 2020 NDHSAA Board meeting.

Executive Director Fetsch gave his report. He began with a photo from the New Administrator meeting in the NDHSAA office in August which got him thinking about the year 2040 and how different things may look. In his crystal ball the year 2039-40 may include the following:

- Girls wrestling (first team this year at Grand Forks Central)
- 3-day State Track & Field Meet (to include wheelchair divisions)
- e-Sports (beginning this year in North Dakota as a non-sponsored activity)
- Instant replay (currently limited usage in state hockey, state basketball and state football)
- Fair Pay to Play Act (NCAA Scholarships have been declared illegal)
 - Statement from NFHS earlier this fall:
 - "If amateurism were to gain way to professionalism at the college level, high schools would struggle to fulfill their ultimate goal of preparing large numbers of well-rounded individuals for futures beyond athletics."
- Student-athlete safety Concussion insurance is now an option available for NDHSAA member schools.
- Fetsch reported a breakdown of association revenue now vs a guesstimate of association revenue in 2039-40.
 - Media piece of the pie will continue to grow.

However, we need to focus on the NOW. Fetsch thanked Cassie for her presentation. Fetsch indicated Cassie and the NDHSAA Distinguished Students are great representation for our organization. Great leaders: "admit when they are wrong", "realize they can't please everyone", "raise the level of all they lead", and "appearing calm even when you don't know what's going on" are just a few memorable comments made by students through the interview process. Fetsch thanked Cassie for sharing her thoughts with the membership.

In closing Fetsch mentioned he had his first experience of a parent of an NDHSAA athlete this year beginning August 12 when his oldest son joined the cross-country team. There was a noticeable difference within the first few days of practice. It is refreshing to see the results of the labors of NDHSAA member schools, administrators and coaches from a parent view. So far it has been a great experience! Keep doing what you are doing!

Fetsch thanked administrators for their hard work and told them to keep up the good work they do for their students on a daily basis.

Mitch Carlson, Constitution & By-Laws Committee chair, provided a committee report. The committee presented a second reading to update Part II, Article XIV, Section II Interpretations and Q & As after the passing of the By-Law amendment in October 2019.

- Art. XIV-Sect. II. a. A season is to be interpreted as any part of an interscholastic contest, at either the varsity or sub-varsity level.
- Art. XIV-Sect. II. b. Under the terms of this rule any participation while in the seventh or eighth grade is not counted. Only that participation from the ninth grade up is to be construed as counting under this rule. Thus, a seventh or eighth grader could possibly play more than four years on a high school team, but never more than four years after reaching the ninth grade.
- Art. XIV-Sect. II: 1: Q. A student transfers to a NDHSAA member school from a state which sponsors boys golf during the fall sports season. The NDHSAA sponsors boys golf in the spring. May the student compete in the spring making it his second golf season during the same school year?
 - A. No. A student shall have only one season of eligibility per sport per year. Therefore, the new student may not compete with the school golf team but may practice if approved in advance by the school administration.
- Art. XIV-Sect. II: 2: Q. A student participates in an out-bound foreign exchange program in what would have been the student's senior year of high school. The student returns the following year to complete the required coursework to graduate. Is the student eligible to compete upon their return?
 - A. The student has no semesters of eligibility remaining as the student's last two semesters of eligibility expired while the student attended school abroad.
- Art. XIV-Sect. II 3: Q. A student dropped out of school at the end of the fall semester of the student's 10th grade year and returned to school at the beginning of the fall semester the next school year. The school considers the student a 10th grader academically. How many semesters of eligibility does the student have remaining?
 - A. The student has four semesters of eligibility remaining up returning in the fall (including the fall semester) provided the student has met all other NDHSAA and local school eligibility requirements.

Art. XIV-Sect. II 4:

- Q. A student has returned to school after withdrawing for one year (during his/her senior year) due to medical reasons. Is the student eligible to compete?
- A. The student has no semesters of eligibility remaining, unless extra semesters are granted pursuant to Part II, Art. XIV, Section X.

Motion by Sorlie to approve a second reading of the Interpretations and Q & As for Part II, Article XIV, Section II of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws. Second by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Review Part II, Article XIV, Section III, Q & A #10

Scrimmage Rules: (Team Sports):

The following conditions must be met in conducting scrimmages:

- 1. One scrimmage may be held prior to the first contest and will not count against allowable contests.
- 2. When more than 2 teams are involved in a scrimmage no team should participate longer than what would constitute a regular contest.
- 3. A time clock may be used in order to approximate certain game situations where coaches may want to give instruction to their athletes.
- 4. No official score shall be kept.
- 5. Registered officials may be used.
- 6. Admissions and concessions are allowable at the discretion of the host school.
- 7. Scrimmages shall count towards an individual's preseason practice requirement.

Mitch Carlson, Media Committee chair, provided a committee report. KNOX radio requested a reduced broadcast rate for the East Region Hockey tournament based on EDC hockey played at 4 different sites and KNOX may not have the ability to broadcast all games. The standard cost from the NDHSAA media rate card is \$3000. The committee recommended a 2/3 rate reduction rate of \$2,000 for EDC hockey at this time and recommend review of the rate card for split site tournaments at upcoming meetings. Motion by Strand to approve the Media Committee report. Second by Schoch. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Rerick, Football Committee chair, provided a football committee report. The committee recommends creating football classification guidelines to include two divisions of Class A football and two divisions of Class B football.

NDHSAA Football Classification Guidelines.

- 1. There will be 4 divisions of football. (AAA, AA, A, 9-Man)
- 2. AAA and AA Divisions will consist of Class A schools and any co-op that contains 160 or more male students in grades 7-10 for two or more consecutive years.
- 3. A and 9-man Divisions will consist of Class B schools and co-ops which do not exceed 160 male students.
- 4. Enrollments for division placement will be determined by the following steps:
 - Step 1: Obtain total male enrollments for grades 7-10 as provided by the Department of Public Instruction.
 - Step 2: Multiply the enrollment created in Step 2 by the percentage of the student body that qualified for free and reduced meals during the previous school year according to Department of Public Instruction data. That number will be multiplied by 50%.
 - Step 3: The number derived in Step 3 is subtracted from the grades 7-10 enrollment created in Step 2. The remainder number will represent the football enrollment for classification purposes during the next season.
- 5. The dividing line between AAA and AA will be determined by finding the median of Class A football enrollments. If there is an odd number of Class A teams, the median is the football enrollment of the center school; the median team and all larger teams will be placed in the AAA Division. If there is an even number of Class A teams, the median is the average of the football enrollments of the two center schools divided by two; all teams larger than the median number will be placed in the AAA Division.
- 6. The dividing line between A and 9 Man will be determined by finding the median of Class B football enrollments. If there are an odd number of Class B teams, the median is the football enrollment of the center school; the median team and all larger teams will be placed in the A Division. If there is an even number of Class B teams, the median is the average of the football enrollments of the two center schools divided by two; all teams larger than the median number will be placed in the A Division.
 - a. The maximum number of teams in the 9-man division shall be 40.
- 7. Any school may request to move up to any division for the following season. Such requests to opt up shall be made annually by September 15th.
- 8. Teams may request to opt down to the next lower division if they meet both items a. and b. below:
 - a. The team's football enrollment must be within 25% of the median between divisions.
 - b. The team may not have qualified for the playoffs more than once in the previous four seasons.
 - c. No team may opt down into Division A.
 - d. Such requests to opt down shall be made annually by Sept. 15th.
 - e. Opt down requests to the 9-Man division will be denied if the opt-down would result in more than 40 teams in the division. Opt down requests will be considered in order of football enrollment from small to large.

9. Success Factor

- a. Teams shall earn the following point values for the final level of the playoffs they achieve as follows:
 - i. Eliminated in quarterfinal One (1) point
 - ii. Eliminated in semifinals Two (2) points
 - iii. State Runner-Up Three (3) points
 - iv. State Championship Four (4) points
- b. Division AA and 9-man teams achieving twelve (12) points or greater due to playoff success during a four-year period shall move up to the next largest division for the next two seasons.
- c. After participation in a larger division for two years, a team achieving a two-year total playoff success point value of two points or below shall be eligible to move down.
- d. After participation in a larger division for two years, a team achieving a playoff success point value of three or more points shall remain in the same division for the next two seasons.
- 10. At the Class A level (Divisions AAA and AA), each team's regular season schedule shall include at least 7 intraconference (EDC and WDA) games unless other opponents are mutually agreed upon by representatives of both conferences.
- 11. Schools may request to field an independent or 6-man team by officially notifying the NDHSAA Office annually by September 15 of the previous year.
- 12. Any school planning to opt up, opt down, or declare an independent status shall confirm their intentions with both divisions in order to better plan future game schedules.

- 13. Any varsity team that chooses to play a team that declares independent status after the September 15th deadline will be ineligible for the playoffs. Any teams that declare independent status after the September 15th deadline shall be responsible for paying game fees to all contracted officials and \$1000 to any contracted opponent that loses a varsity game.
- 14. BY-LAW REMINDER: Football coops must be submitted by September 15th of the previous year.
- 15. A North Dakota school may apply for an emergency coop if the following criteria are met:
 - a. An approved coop for the following year must be in place prior to being eligible for an emergency coop
 - b. Emergency coop applications will only be considered if the requesting school has provided proof that studentathletes have no opportunity to compete at the varsity level for the upcoming football season
 - c. If the emergency coop is approved:
 - i. The host school shall be that school with the largest enrollment. The NDHSAA Realignment Committee shall determine the new co-op's division and regional alignment.
 - ii. Only seniors from the applying school would be eligible for varsity competition for a \$1000 non-compliance fee per player.
 - iii. Sub-varsity players from the applying school could compete for a \$200 non-compliance fee per player.
- 16. Following the implementation of these guidelines for the fall of 2021, NDHSAA staff members will be responsible for researching, receiving opt up and down requests, and placing teams into their applicable divisions. The NDHSAA Realignment Committee will be responsible for creating any necessary adjustments to regional assignments within those divisions.
- 17. The NDHSAA Board of Directors shall have final say in the administration of these guidelines.

Scott Privratasky, Committee Chair, reported on committee action.

 - a) Self-report by Langdon Area High School of an assistant coach who was coaching a non-school team during spring season. Penalty assessed was a letter of reprimand.

 - a) Academic eligibility for the fall of 2020 was discussed with a recommendation for no adjustment to academic eligibility by-laws in fall of 2020 due to distance learning in spring of 2020.
 - b) The out-of-season coaching window was discussed with a recommendation to extend the out-of-season coaching deadline from July 31, 2020 to August 6, 2020 for 2020-21 due to COVID-19 limitations in June. The extension does not apply to boys soccer, whose season is scheduled to begin on August 3, 2020. Motion by Schoch to approve the Executive Board report. Second by Baesler. Motion carried unanimously.

Michael Sorlie, Officials Committee Chair, provided the Board with a report. Basketball day camps were discussed with a recommendation to extend the NDHSAA officials' day camp requirement from a camp every three years to a camp every four years for the 2020-21 year only due to the cancellation of some team camps and day camps over the summer of 2020. Official's registration date was reviewed with a tentative opening date of July 1, 2020. Opening registration date will be set at the June 24, 2020 Board Meeting. Motion by Jordan to approve the Officials Committee report. Second by Carlson. Motion carried unanimously.

Farmers Union Insurance representative Mark Anderson, Chief Executive Officer and Kevin Ressler, Chief Sales, Marketing & Brand Officer, appeared to thank the Board for the opportunity to work with the NDHSAA. Anderson indicated Farmers Union Insurance agents have been working hard in their own communities during this trying time. Farmers Union Insurance has been going through the same procedures and policies as other essential businesses. Anderson indicated the Distinguished Student interviews were held virtually this year and the virtual platform pushed him to be more prepared for meetings in advance. Ressler indicated Farmers Union Insurance recently became a sponsor of college sports, the Utah High School Activities Association and Razorback baseball and football in Arkansas. The goal of Farmers Union Insurance is to build new relationships and continue to foster existing relationships. Privratsky thanked Farmers Union Insurance for their support as the NDHSAA Premier Sponsor and for the offer to extend

their sponsorship for the next five years. Fetsch echoed Privratsky's thoughts and thanked Farmers Union Insurance for their continued support of the Distinguished Student program.

Finance/Personnel & Policy Committee Chair, Jeremy Brandt explained to the Board the estimated year-end income and expenses along with estimated team payments. Recommend team payment amount of \$75,000, which is the amount of the Marcil Foundation money earmarked for team payments. Motion by Baxley to approve the year-end estimate and team payments. Second by Carlson. Motion carried unanimously.

Budget for 2020-21 was discussed including an overall 10% decrease in budgeted revenue. There is a possible recommendation for catastrophic insurance to be paid by member schools. The budget will be approved at the next June meeting.

Recommends amending previously approved NDHSAA staff contracts for 2020-21 to the 2019-20 level. If the 2020-21 year is a more "normal" year and funding permits, the Board may choose to honor the previous contracts. Motion by Sorlie to approve an overall NDHSAA salary freeze for 2020-21. Second by Baesler. Motion carried unanimously.

Recommend extending the Farmers Union Insurance Premier Sponsorship contract for an additional five years through June of 2026. Recommend Russell Brands, which includes a Spalding basketball and Dudley softball, contract extension of 5 years beyond 2020-21, through June of 2026. Motion by Rerick to extend the Farmers Union Insurance contract an additional 5 years and extending the Russell Brands contract for an additional five years past the 2020-21 year. Second by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Rerick provided an Esports Ad-Hoc committee report. The committee worked with the Play-VS to make the esport season dates work with NDHSAA existing sport and activities calendar. - 3) Athlete violation of ejections at region and/or state wrestling tournaments were discussed. Recommend allowing the Executive Board to handle these case by case.

Recommend approval of the second reading of Part II, Article XIV, Section III, Q & A #10 – Scrimmage Rules as follows: Scrimmage Rules:

The following conditions must be met in conducting scrimmages.

- 1. One scrimmage may be held prior to the first contest and will not count against allowable contests.
- 2. When more than 2 teams are involved in a scrimmage no team should participate longer than what would constitute a regular contest.
- 3. A time clock may be used in order to approximate certain game situations where coaches may want to give instruction to their athletes.
- 4. No official score shall be kept.
- 5. Registered officials may be used.
- 6. Admissions and concessions are allowable at the discretion of the host school.
- 7. Scrimmages shall count towards an individual's preseason practice requirement.

Motion by Jundt to approve the scrimmage rules as presented. Second by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Schoch to Constitution & By-Laws committee report. Second by Sorlie. Motion carried unanimously.
