FOREWORD

This yearbook provides a detailed accounting of the past years' activities for the NDHSAA. I would like to thank the Board of Directors, NDHSAA office staff and all representatives of the member schools for your dedication and commitment to the Association.

Farmers Union Insurance completed its 14th year as the Premiere Partner of NDHSAA and continues to be actively involved in all activities, including the Distinguished Student Program. Vision Zero has been a supporting sponsor of Association sponsored activities for the past nine years. For the fourth straight year, the Marcil Foundation provided a \$75,000 donation to member schools as part of the NDHSAA's Tier I Television partnership with Forum Communications. The Association is very appreciative for what all three of these organizations do for the athletes and fine arts students in North Dakota.

2021-22 marked the first entire academic year without COVID interruptions since 2018-19. Some highlights from the year included the following changes, which were overwhelmingly accepted as successes:

- *Class B Girls Golf as a fall sport. The State Meet was held in Carrington and played in warm weather.
- *Two-day State Cross Country Meet. The event was held near Jamestown and set a gross admissions record. *First annual state girls wrestling individual tournament. Fourteen different champions were crowned during the State Wrestling Tournament in Fargo. The number of girls wrestling participants statewide more than doubled from the previous year and continued growth is expected.
- *Three-day State Track & Field Meet. The event was held in Bismarck and also set a gross admissions record.

Once again, the NDHSAA served a large number of students in grades seven through twelve. The most recent completed survey indicates there were 26,451 student participants in sports activities and 13,436 student participants in fine arts activities. Gross admission records were set during the Dakota Bowl football championships, the State Boys Tennis Tournament, the State Cross Country Meet, and the State Volleyball Tournament in the highest revenue producing Fall in Association history. The winter was long and harsh, causing as many winter and spring regular season and tournament postponements as ever. However, the State Track & Field Meet set another gross admissions record in the spring. Over \$658,000 was distributed to member schools through the team payment program at the conclusion of the 2021-22 school year. Distribution has totaled more than \$4.9 million since the team payment plans inception in 2005-06.

The NDHSAA continues to be a very successful organization that serves North Dakota students who wish to be involved in educationally based activities. It is important that each member school feels as though they are an important part of the Association. Your support is greatly appreciated.

If each region cannot secure two officials, coaches shall serve as tournament officials by request. If three officials cannot be secured for state, coaches shall serve as tournament officials by request.

b. Rerick gave an update on the eSports Ad Hoc meeting. The Committee proposes approval to conduct further study regarding Fenworks, financing of post season tournaments, and the impact on existing staff and funds in accordance with existing board regulation.

Motion by Brandt to approve the consent agenda, second by Schoch. Motion carried unanimously.

Harold Rotunda provided the Board with an audit report for the 2020-21 fiscal year.

Motion by Jundt to approve the audit report as presented, second by Fridley. Motion carried unanimously.

Rerick provided the Executive Board report. The Executive Board approved 3 late coop applications; Rolla and North Star in boys wrestling (7-12, 2021-22), Harvey and Wells County in girls wrestling (7-12, 2021-22), and Devils Lake and Grafton in girls hockey (7-12, 2021-22). Winter and spring coop application deadlines were changed from September 1st and January 1st to September 15th and January 15th respectively. Approved the following additions to girls wrestling regulations:

- 1. Unlimited entries into regional (if necessary) and/or state tournament for each team during the 2-year implementation period.
- 2. After the 2-year implementation period, region and/or state tournament entries will follow the Class A model. One entry per weight class plus three alternates.
- 3. Once eight (8) girls wrestling teams are able to fill at least ten (10) weight classes each, a state girls wrestling dual tournament will be added.

The Executive Board ruled on five school violations. Turtle mountain received the prescribed penalty for use of an academically ineligible sub-varsity volleyball player. Fargo South received the prescribed penalty for use of ineligible varsity boys soccer players. West Fargo Sheyenne received the prescribed penalty for use of an ineligible player in boys soccer. Grand Forks Valley Middle School received the prescribed penalty and a letter of reprimand for use of a 6th grader in a junior high cross country meet. Williston received the prescribed penalty for use of 6th graders in a junior high cross country meet.

West Fargo Sheyenne boys soccer was placed on probation throught the 2022-23 season due to a violation of the NDHSAA sportsmanship by-law. Additional misconduct during the probationary period will result in further board action.

The Executive Board ruled on two member school regulation waiver requests. Shiloh Christian requested a waiver on the out-of-season coaching request. Powers Lake requested a waiver for a foreign exchange student that had graduated in his home country. Both requests were denied. Powers Lake requested an appeal of this decision.

Motion by Brandt to approve the Executive Board report as presented, second by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Schoch provided the Realignment Committee report. The committee reviewed all class A and B region assignments, making the following changes; Class B boys wrestling will move to 2 regions, east and west in the 2023-24 season. Class B volleyball and basketball regions were reviewed. Class B golf regions were discussed with concerns due to travel distances, but no action was taken. Also the 2022 preliminary football divisions and region assignments were presented. The committee preliminarily placed 3 new Class B softball teams into regions, Bottineau and New Town in Region 3, and Carrington in Region 2.

Motion by Jordan to approve the Realignment Committee report as presented, second by Diegel. Motion carried unanimously.

Fridley provided the tournament committee report. Two Class B region sites needed to be relocated:

Region 1 will be moved to due to unavailability of the Fargo Civic Center. Committee recommends moving tournament to Central Cass after analyzing bids from NDSCS, Valley City High School, and Central Cass High School. Motion by School to place Region 1 volleyball tournament in Central Cass, second by Brandt. Motion carried unanimously.

New Town requested the Region 8 tournament be moved from their school. The tournament will be moved to Parshall High School Motion by Jundt to move Region 8 volleyball tournament from New Town to Parshall, second by Baxley. Motion carried unanimously.

Fridley continued the Tournament Committee report. State tournament awards scripts to announce Senior Athlete of the Year and Coach of the Year immediately after the last game they participate in at the state event. All state tournament programs will be available online only. Fall tournament ticket prices needed to be corrected. Ticket prices from June mistakenly included facilities fees. The corrected prices can be found on the table below:

Motion by Clooten to approve the Tournament Committee report as presented, second by Jundt. Motion carried unanimously.

Rerick provided the Constitution & By-laws Committee report. The committee provided potential interpretations to Article VIII – Amateurism relative to Name, Image, and Likeness. This topic is to be further researched and presented at a later date.

The committee recommends the following changes to the Pre-Season Practice Sessions regulations:

1. Pre-season practice sessions in all sports shall be held in the immediate environment of the city or school district in which the school is located. (Sept. 2007). Executive Secretary has authority to waive this regulation when appealed by a member school. (June 2014)

- 2. Required preseason practices, which are not attended by an athlete because that athlete is actively involved in practice for or participation in NDHSAA post season athletic competition held concurrently with such preseason practices shall be waived.
- 3. Two Three days of the nine-day practice rule may be waived due to Basic Military Training/AIT attendance, provided there is a conflict with the first contest.
- 4. Three days of non-pad football practice may be waived if practice is missed due to attending basic military training. Six days of pad practice is required.
- 5. Practices held the same day as a game/meet shall not count towards the required minimum practice rule. An individual may not have their ninth practice and participate in a contest on the same day.
- 6. Pre-season practice requirements shall apply to both teams and individuals. Though the requirement may have been met to number of team practices, individual students would not be eligible for the first contest scheduled if they had not personally met this requirement.

Motion by Baxley to approve changes to Pre-Season Practice Sessions as presented, second by Diegel. Motion carried unanimously.

Rerick discussed adding language to Article XIV regarding eligibility of entirely online students attending Virtual Learning Academies and which school they are eligible to compete for. Rerick continued discussion in December. No action was taken.

Also in Article XIV, the committee recommends adding the following Q&A to Section XIII to clarify junior high transfers:

Section XIII: Residence:

A student is eligible in the school of the district where his/her parents are bona-fide residents. A student who transfers from one junior high school to another must meet the same rules pertaining to residence and migration as set forth for senior high school competition.

1. <u>First-time seventh graders are varsity eligible at the school they represent. For any student transfer during junior high, refer to Part II, Article XIV, Section IX.</u>

NOTE: In districts which have more than one junior high school, the home school of the pupil shall be the same school as is determined by the Board of Education for all students living in a designated area.

Motion by Fridley to approve the addition of the Q&A to Section XIII as presented, second by Johnson. Motion carried unanimously.

Finally, the committee recommends the addition of the following Q&A to Part IV – Article III – Section III:

1. <u>Eligible 5th and 6th grade pupils are only allowed to compete in junior high events.</u> 5th and/or 6th grade participation in junior varsity or varsity contests is prohibited.

Motion by Schoch to approve the addition of the Q&A to Part IV – Article III – Section III as presented, second by Clooten. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Jundt to approve the Constitution & By-laws Committee report as presented, second by Fridley. Motion carried unanimously.

Brandt provided the Finance, Personnel & Policy report. He reviewed the status of the association's investments and savings accounts. The committee has also received estimates from Icon Architecture for roofing repairs on the association office. Patty Bass will be retiring after September 30th. At this time the committee recommends not filling Bass's position and dividing duties between JeriAnn Everson and Sharon Prosby and raising their respective wages. Motion by Jordan to approve absorbing Bass's position, dividing duties to Everson and Prosby and increasing wages, second by Diegel. Motion carried unanimously.

Brandt continued the committee report by recommending extending the contract with RWP for printing of the annual association calendar. Motion by Fridley to extend the calendar contract for 3 years as presented, second by Schoch. Motion carried unanimously.

Brand concluded the Finance, Personnel & Policy report with the recommendation to extend the contract for Valley Office Works to continue printing the annual member school directory. Motion by Johnson to approve a 3-year contract extension to Valley Office Works, second by Jundt. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Clooten to approve the Finance, Personnel & Policy Committee report as presented, second by Fridley. Motion carried unanimously.

Diegel provided the Media Committee report. The committee discussed instituting a commercial photographer fee but determined it would potentially be too much for tournament managers to monitor. Motion by Brandt to approve the Media Committee report as presented, second by Baxley. Motion carried unanimously.

Rerick provided the esports ad hoc committee report. Rerick described trying to find common ground with Fenworks and association by-laws. Currently association by-laws do not work with Fenwork's structure. Fenworks needs to develop a method to fit the association's current by-laws or potentially seek out a different organization. Rerick also mentioned concerns with pricing changes at Fenworks to member schools. The committee has no recommendation for action regarding esports at this time. Motion by Jundt to approve the esports ad hoc committee report as presented, second by Schoch. Motion carried unanimously.

Tom Mix presented the Awards & Canvassing Committee report. Currently North Dakota has Jeff Risk in the Officials category and Dave Carlsrud in the Administration category. The committee recommends re-nominating Darin Erstad for the Athlete category, nominating Dan Carr for the Coaches category, as well as moving Dave Carlsrud from Administration to the Other category, vacating the Administrators category. Motion by Deigel to approve the Awards and Canvassing report as presented, second by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Jundt provided the Officials Committee report. The committee held audience with Perry Smith, who is concerned about several officiating issues in the state. The committee will continue to research these concerns and report back to the board at a later date. Motion by Brandt to approve the Officials Committee report as presented, second by Baxley. Motion carried unanimously.

Fletschock presented a report from the North Dakota Officials Association meeting that took place on Wednesday, September 15, 2021. Last year's raise was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the NDOA will be recommending a 6% raise in December for the 2022-23 school year with no increase in 2023-24. Motion by Schoch to approve the NDOA report as presented, second by Clooten. Motion carried unanimously.

According to NDHSAA by-laws, graduated students are ineligible for participation. Principal Seth Wisthoff of Powers Lake High School and Anita Jorgenson stated while the student has graduated, he is only 17 years old. The student was unable to attend Powers Lake last year due to the COVID-19

pandemic, though there is no documentation to confirm this. Johnson stated approving this would set a precedent and potentially create issues in the future for the association.

Motion by Brandt to deny Powers Lake High School's waiver request, second by Johnson. Motion carried 10-0 roll call vote.

Minutes General Assembly Meeting North Dakota High School Activities Association October 21, 2021 – Bismarck Events Center, Room 104 – Bismarck, ND

The General Assembly of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met in room 105 of the Bismarck Events Center on October 21, 2021. President Rerick called the meeting to order at 4:30pm CDT.

President Rerick welcomed member schools. Rerick thanked the school administrators for all the work they did last year and into the start of this current year. Rerick declared quorum. Rerick introduced current NDHSAA board members and staff. Rerick recognized former board members.

Rerick introduced Matt Fetsch, Executive Director NDHSAA.

The minutes of the October 2020 General Assembly Meeting were addressed. Motion by Patti Aanenson, Larimore High School, to approve the minutes, second by Michael Sorlie, North Sargent High School. Motion carried unanimously.

Fetsch introduced Sloane McCray from Hazen High School as the 2021-22 NDHSAA Distinguished Student. McCray recited a poem she wrote. She explained that the poem demonstrates the importance of school sports and activities for growing together as community and improving oneself.

Fetsch introduced the proposed amendment to Part I, Article V of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Law.

Motion by Four Winds High School to propose the following amendment to the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Law, second by Mandaree High School.

Part I, Article V - Officers and Duties

SECTION I: There shall be a board of directors, hereinafter called the Board, consisting of eleven twelve members. Each new member shall be seated on July 1st following his/her election for a term of four years and may not hold office more than one elected term. Three board members shall be chosen from Class A schools, one each from two geographical areas and one at-large. The geographic designations are as follows: The state shall be divided into two areas - one area from the Montana border east to State Highway 3 (or State Highway 30), including Belcourt and one area is from State Highway 3 (or State Highway 30), east to the Minnesota border. One board member shall be designated as Class A West, one board member shall be designated as Class A East and one board member shall be designated as Class A At-Large. Four members of the board shall be chosen from Class B schools, each from a geographical area as Highway 83 and State Highway 14 north and south and State Highway 200 east and west forming the boundaries of said areas and one member will be from each area. Class B schools located in towns on the boundary lines as designated shall fall in the areas as determined by the location of the high school building in said towns in relation to the boundary lines. One board member, who shall be a member of a federally recognized tribe, shall be chosen from a member school comprised of a minimum

50% Native American K-12 student population. If a sitting board member's school drops below 50%, they will be eligible to complete their term. A secondary school principal as so defined by the Department of Public Instruction shall serve as a member of the Board. Two candidates shall be nominated by the Board of Directors of the Secondary School Principals Association and their candidate will be selected by mail ballot sent directly to the secondary school principals of all member high schools and his/her term of office shall also be the same. A member of the Athletic Administrators Association shall serve as a member of the Board. Two candidates shall be nominated by the Board of Directors of the Athletic Administrators Association and their candidate will be selected by mail ballot sent directly to the athletic administrator of all member high schools and his/her term of office shall also be the same. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or a member of his/her duly constituted staff, designated by him/her shall serve as a member of said Board. One school board member from a member high school, or the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association, shall be selected by the executive committee of the North Dakota School Boards Association, and his/her term of office shall be the same as that of other elective Board Members, except that there shall be no limitation on the number of consecutive terms which the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association may serve. Should this member cease to be a school board member from a member high school or the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association, the position shall be declared vacant and a successor selected by the Board of Directors of the School Boards Association to fill the unexpired term. (Oct. 2005) (Oct. 2021)

A roll call vote of the membership was taken. Amendment failed (Yes – 55, No - 72).

Fetsch called on nominating committees for upcoming vacancies on the NDHSAA Board of Directors.

Todd Olson, Director of Student Activities of Fargo Public Schools reported nominations for Class A East representative.

Fetsch spoke about the idea of common sense. He spoke about a study where the conclusion was when two opposite opinions appear equally correct, there is an issue with obviousness. He continued to reflect on the previous 18 months and how common sense seemed to differ greatly from person to person, but in the end high school activities and the NDHSAA came out of it together stronger.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:00pm CDT.

Jundt provided the Officials committee report. The Officials committee submitted a letter for approval of the board in response to an audience with the committee on September 23, 2021.

Rerick provided esports Ad Hoc committee report. Rerick reviewed various phone conversations with Fenworks, stating that there has been no change since the last meeting. Recommendation is to wait until after winter esports season before any further discussion.

Powers Lake and Burke Central in volleyball, 7-12, 2022-23 late fee III. Powers Lake and Burke Central in boys basketball, 7-12, 2022-23 no fee mmm. Powers Lake and Burke Central in girls basketball, 7-12, 2022-23 no fee nnn. Valley City and Maple Valley in softball, 7-12, 2021-22, late fee

Motion by Fridley to approve the consent agenda as presented, second by Brandt. Motion carried unanimously.

Rerick provided the Executive Board Report. The executive board ruled on four school violations. Velva and Stanley reported the use of an unregistered wrestling official. Bismarck Legacy received the prescribed penalty of forfeiture for use of an ineligible varsity wrestler and a letter reprimand, and Ellendale received the prescribed penalty of forfeiture and coach being suspended one game for exceeding the daily quarter limit in girls basketball as well as a letter of reprimand.

The Executive Board also proposed adjusting the first allowable contest date for the 2022-23 boys and girls hockey season to Friday, November 18, 2022.

Jundt recommends creating language regarding charitable game uniforms stating that during regular season games, any uniform can be worn so long as it meets NFHS regulations. The Executive Board recommends assigning the Finance, Policy and Personnel committee to this task.

Motion by Jordan to approve the Executive Board report as presented, second by Diegel. Motion carried unanimously.

Diegel provided the Awards and Canvassing Committee report. The committee tabulated the results for Class A East representative and Class B Northeast representative. Results for Class A East are Matt Bakke 73 votes, Mike Beaton 16 votes. Results for Class B Northeast are Patti Aanenson 37 votes, Randy Loing 18 votes, Kent Dennis 17 votes, and John Maus 16 votes.

Motion by Schoch to approve the vote count as presented, second by Clooten. Motion carried unanimously.

Awards and Canvassing also reviewed the National High School Hall of Fame nomination timelines, setting a time table for having nominations submitted and vetted. The committee discussed having a paragraph in the Bulletin advising the membership how to nominate individuals for the National Hall of Fame.

Motion by Brandt to approve the Awards and Canvassing committee report as presented, second by Clooten. Motion carried unanimously.

Brandt presented the Finance, Personnel & Policy committee report. Brandt introduced Bubach to review State Class A and B Plays Contest expenses. Due to increased site workers and technical workers in the light booth at these contests, the committee recommends worker stipend adjustments. The annual additional cost will be approximately \$1,515.00.

Motion by Fridley to approve an increase to the State Class A and B Plays budget of \$1,515.00, second by Schoch. Motion carried unanimously.

Teall Properties Group (TPG) representatives Mike Wolfert, CEO, and Adam Raak, Business Development, provided a presentation covering their company and how TPG can benefit NDHSAA. TPG provided an updated contract proposal for the committee and board to review.

Motion by Johnson to authorize Fetsch to sign a contract with TPG once NDHSAA Legal Counsel approves the agreement, second by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Fridley to approve the Finance, Personnel & Policy report as presented, second by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Schoch presented the Realignment committee report. The committee recommends Class A football use QRF rankings to determine and seed the eight playoff teams in Divisions 11AA and 11A, beginning in 2022. Class A athletic directors were invited to participate in a virtual Q and A session with QRF's owner in December. EDC and WDA athletic directors met in January with minimal feedback.

The Realignment committee recommends the Board authorize President Rerick to assign an ad-hoc committee to review future Class A region alignments. Current projections include 24 Class A teams beginning in 2024-25.

Northern Cass and Central Cass have requested to dissolve their current boys wrestling coop and Northern Cass will field their own program next year. The committee recommends placing Northern Cass in Region 2 wrestling for 2022-23

season. Class B wrestling will move from four regions to two regions in 2023-24, so the placement will be for one season only.

The Realignment committee discussed Class B volleyball and basketball regions. The committee recommends not making any changes at this time to the Class B volleyball and basketball regions.

The Realignment committee had an audience with Board Member Rick Diegel to discuss the opt up and opt down portions of the current football guidelines. Diegel indicated he will be making a motion to the full Board regarding those two guidelines on January 20th and he wanted to visit with the committee first.

Motion by Brandt to approve the Realignment Committee report as presented, second by Fridley. Motion carried unanimously.

Fridley presented the Tournament committee report. The committee reviewed Fall 2022 region tournament site recommendations.

The committee recommends the presented sites for approval. District 1 Chairman Pat Adair from Lisbon and District 2 Chairman

Calvin Kraft from Enderlin were present to answer questions the committee had regarding the Region 1 volleyball site. The committee recommends Region 1 volleyball be hosted by Enderlin, with the region establishing a rotation between viable sites moving forward.

Motion by Johnson to approve changes to the Fall 2022 region tournament sites as presented, second by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Jundt provided the Eligibility committee report. The committee had one hardship appeal on January 12, 2022, from Lewis & Clark – North Shore Plaza. Committee unanimously recommends denying this appeal.

Motion by Brandt to approve the Eligibility committee report as presented, second by Clooten. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed the Fall 2021-22 Athletic Review grid. Two items required Board action for Boys Soccer:

- 1. Require state tournament to be played on a turf field. this will be applied to both Boys and YES (10-0) girls soccer.
- 2. Recognize 25-year anniversary teams during the state tournament. YES (10-0)

Jundt recommends adopting guidelines for tournament managers in what is and is not the responsibility of the tournament managers regarding 25- and 50-year reunion teams, recommendation is to discuss item at the next Combined Tournament Committee meeting.

Davies High School requested a waiver to allow one of their track and field athletes to run in the Simplot Games, February 17-19, 2022.

Motion by Johnson to grant a waiver to add the Simplot Games to the list of acceptable national events, second by Fridley. Motion carried unanimously.

St. Mary's Central High School requested an audience to ask for the elimination of success factor points from the current NDHSAA football plan. Gerald Vetter presented data to support their request, claiming school male enrollment should be the key factor in determining which division a football team should be placed. Vetter noted the success factor will likely impact more schools than just St. Mary's. Vetter also questioned how little notice SMCHS was given regarding the success factor being applied to them for the 2022 season.

Motion by Fridley to apply success factor points beginning in 2021-22, second by Jordan. After an hour of discussion, a roll call vote was called: Baesler, yes; Schoch, yes; Brandt, no; Diegel, yes; Fridley, yes; Johnson, no; Clooten, no; Jundt, no; Jordan, no; Rerick, no. Motion fails 5-5.

Motion by Diegel to eliminate item 9b in 2022 and remove 9e 2023 from the football plan, second by Schoch. Roll call vote, Jordan, no; Diegel, yes; Fridley, no; Brandt, no; Baesler, no; Rerick, no; Schoch, no; Clooten, no; Johnson, no; Jundt, no, Motion fails 1-9.

Motion by Johnson to Realign to study the football plan in-depth, utilizing stakeholders input to be completed in time for scheduling requirements of the Fall 2023 season, second by Clooten. Motion carried unanimously.

Cavalier and LaMoure High Schools have also requested that the NDHSAA re-evaluate the use of success factor points regarding 9man football. Linton High School requested a re-evaluation of the use of success factor to force Class B teams to move up divisions, specifically forcing 9-man up to 11B. The board feels that this was covered in the previous motion, and no action was necessary.

Naughton Elementary School submitted an application to become a member in the NDHSAA.

Motion by Schoch to grant NDHSAA membership to Naughton Elementary School, second by Brandt. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed correspondence from Region 2 Music departments, Jasmine Smith and Jessica Fritz.

Clooten has concerns with item 10 negatively interacting with the use of QRF for post season placement. He feels that item should be removed. Jundt recommends the Realignment investigate this along with their continued research into the current football plan.

Diegel voiced concerns about declining numbers in girls basketball and asked if there is anything the NDHSAA can do.

Fetsch presented the proposed meeting dates for the 2022-23 year.

Motion by Jundt to approve the 2022-23 Meeting Dates, second by Fridley. Motion carried unanimously.

Fetsch recommends adjusting the June meeting to one day rather than the traditional two days, citing committee meetings taking place two weeks prior to the Board meeting, making a two day meeting unnecessary.

Motion by Fridley to change the June meeting from 7-8 to June 7, second by Jundt. Motion carried unanimously.

Fetsch presented his Executive Director report. He oversaw 6 hardship hearings since the December Board meeting, 2 were approved 4 denied. Currently there are 6 girls wrestling teams that could field the minimum 10 weight classes each, short of the 8 teams mandated by the board previously.

Motion by Jundt to incorporate a girls wrestling state dual tournament with a minimum of 6 teams, each team able to fill a minimum 8 weight classes changing the previous board decision, second by Fridley. Motion fails 1-6: Jundt, yes; Diegel, no; Baesler, no; Johnson, no; Fridely, no; Schoch, no; Rerick, no.

Fetsch noted in his report that the state track schedule is close to being finished. He also noted the NCAA has changed their transgender policy, noteworthy because NDHSAA policy mirrored their previous policy.

The next Board of Directors meeting will be held on Tuesday, April 5, 2022, at 10:00 am CDT in Valley City at the NDHSAA office.

Rerick adjourned the meeting at 1:42pm CST on Thursday January 20, 2022.

Surrey doubled the prescribed penalty on their own and the Executive Board took no further action. New Town girls basketball had an individual exceed the daily quarter limit. They forfeited the game and the entire coaching staff sat out the next game. No further action was taken. Mandan wrestling used an unregistered official during a regular season tournament. The official will drop a classification next year. Bismarck Legacy soccer had an out-of-season coaching violation, Executive Board issued a letter of reprimand. The Finance/Personnel & Policy committee recommends updating the Charitable Contest Guidelines to the following:

In Regular Season Charitable Contest Guidelines

<u>NDHSAA member</u> schools may host a <u>regular season</u> contest in recognition of a charitable cause under the following conditions:

• The contest or competition may be held during any one week, to be determined by each individual school, of the designated season.

- The NDHSAA is supportive of charitable initiatives and has developed guidelines in regards to an athletic competition being held in the name of a charitable cause. Each school participating must be in agreement to allow any modifications to the rules.
- Team members may be allowed to wear headbands or wristbands of a solid non-regulation color.
- Charitable contests shall be approved by school administration of the host school.
- A commemorative ribbon may be worn, properly placed on the jersey or school-issued uniform.
 Uniforms, including headbands or wristbands, must conform to National Federation of State
 High School Associations (NFHS) rules, including colors.
- Commemorative or memorial patches, not to exceed 4 square inches, may be worn on the uniform.
- Officials may be are allowed to use a colored whistle.
- Colored game balls will are not be allowed, however they may be used during any warm-up period prior to the contest.

The committee also reviewed the current transgender board regulation and recommended Fetsch contact NDHSAA Legal Counsel to draft revision options.

The Finance/Personnel & Policy committee reviewed the region basketball site practice regulation and made the following recommendation:

PRACTICE SESSIONS

No Class B team is permitted to practice on the regional tournament floor after the seeding of district teams and no Class A team will be allowed to practice at their Class A regional site after the seeding of the tournament. A member school hosting a region tournament on their floor is exempt. No Class A or B teams will be allowed to practice on their respective state tournament floor following the conclusion of the regional tournament, with the exception of pre-tournament shootarounds.

<u>Penalty:</u> The head coach of any team in violation of this rule will be suspended for the team's next game.

The Finance/Personnel & Policy committee discussed language for the reunion team recognition policy and does not recommend making changes to the existing language.

Finally, the Finance/Personnel & Policy committee discussed creating a sample media policy for member schools, the committee does not recommend creating a sample but does recommend that NDHSAA staff assist member schools if needed.

Motion by Jundt to approve the Finance/Personnel & Policy committee report as presented, seconded by Johnson. Motion carried unanimously.

Diegel presented the Awards and Canvassing committee report. The Committee reviewed the current status of North Dakota's National High School Hall of Fame nominees. Jeff Risk will be inducted as part of the 2022 class in the Official category. Dan Carr (Linton High School) will remain in consideration in the Coach category through 2024 and Dave Carlsrud (NDHSAA) will remain in consideration in the "Other" category through 2023. The Committee had no other names to consider at this time, but names in the Athlete, Fine Arts, Administrator, and Official categories may be considered at future committee meetings. Potential nominees for the 2024 Class will be approved on or before April 2023.

Motion by Brandt to approve the Awards and Canvassing committee report, seconded by Clooten. Motion carried unanimously.

Johnson presented the Constitution and By-Laws committee report. Discussion on Name, Image and Likeness (NIL) continued from January. Executive Director Fetsch noted the NDHSAA Office has received zero inquiries regarding NIL this school year. Fetsch also visited with administrators at UND and NDSU and each school has been minimally impacted by their new NIL policies. The Committee recommends a minimal addition to Article VIII: Amateurism of the NDHSAA Constitution and By-Laws as follows:

INTERPRETATIONS SECTIONS I, II, III, IV, V or Article VIII – Amateurism

Art VIII – Section II. A student may benefit from the use of their name, image and likeness (NIL) consistent with current NDHSAA regulations.

A NIL Board regulation with further details would be available to NDHSAA member schools as needed if this recommendation is approved by the Board in June 2022 and will be reflected in the 2022-23 NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws.

The Constitution and By-Laws committee continued discussion on Article XIV, Section IV, Q & A #11 from January. The Committee is comfortable with the presented revisions regarding online students and virtual learning academies and will be looking for Board approval in June 2022 with changes reflected in the 2022-23 NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws. Discussion on revised Board interpretations for Article III, Section IX of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws continued from January. The Committee is comfortable with the revisions presented and will be looking for Board approval in June 2022 with changes reflected in the 2022-23 NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws.

Motion by Fridley to approve the Constitution and By-Laws committee report, seconded by Brandt. Motion carried unanimously.

Schoch presented the Realignment committee report. Realignment reviewed the football classification guidelines. The committee clarified that if points are earned while up a division and then move back down, the success points accrued in the upper division do count towards the total in the lower division. Discussed item 13 and how it is interpreted. The committee clarified guideline 2, co-ops will move up in their third year if they contain 160 or more male students.

Realignment committee discussed how to involve stakeholders in football classifications. The committee interpreted the board's directive to gather more information from stakeholders. Most likely this would be in the form of a survey or surveys. The committee decided to come up with questions to produce a survey to be distributed in the fall of the 2022-23 school year.

The Realignment committee also reviewed a letter from Region 3 nine-man football schools. The letter presented concern regarding the scheduling format that are implemented by the NDHSAA. The letter presented a couple of ideas on how to deal with scheduling concerns. There is no recommendation from the committee at this time, but the scheduling format will be reviewed again in the fall.

Motion by Fridley to approve the realignment committee report, seconded by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Fridley presented the Tournament committee report. The committee reviewed the Winter 2023 tournament sites. Region 3 Girls Basketball was the only region where both districts did not agree on a recommended region site. District 5 recommended the Jamestown Civic Center and District 6 recommended Newman Arena at the University of Jamestown. The Jamestown Civic Center submitted a bid to host the tournament and the University of Jamestown did not, so the Jamestown Civic Center was recommended without discussion.

Fridley also presented the Combined Tournament Committee report. The committee reviewed state tournament sites. The 2022-23 State B Girls Golf was slated to be in Mapleton, but due to work being done on the golf course they would like to swap with Minot (DLB) and host in 2023-24 instead.

The 2022-23 State A Boys Golf is currently slated to be in Mandan but there is a scheduling conflict. Dickinson volunteered to host instead.

The 2022-23 Boys Tennis and Boys Soccer tournaments are slated to be in Grand Forks. Grand Forks is hosting a concert the same weekend so hotel availability will be an issue. The committee suggests moving soccer to Fargo for 2022-23 and then back to Grand Forks in 2023-24 and swap moving forward. The committee suggests finalizing a state boys tennis site for 2022 in June.

The Combined Tournament Committee discussed the elimination of the unreserved seating option at state wrestling, as adult reserved and unreserved seats are currently the same price. The concept will be discussed with FargoDome management and a Board action may be requested next Fall. 25 and 50-year reunion teams were reviewed. State tournament managers agreed this winter's "catch up" year went well and thanked staff member Tom Mix for all his help in coordinating. Girls hockey scheduling for 2022-23 was discussed due to the addition of a 12th team. State tournament programs were discussed. The possibility of making a commemorative program available for purchase following each state tournament was discussed. State tournament managers agreed the virtual tournament programs should be continued indefinitely. Compensation was discussed for gymnastics equipment due to continued wear-and-tear on it due to moving it from gymnastics facilities to tournament sites.

Motion by Jordan to approve the Combined Tournament and Tournament Committee reports, seconded by Baxley. Motion carried unanimously.

Fridley presented the Class A Region Ad Hoc Committee. The committee reviewed the history of Class A region alignments for basketball, primarily from 1948-2022, and gauged If there was interest in adding a third Class A region, similar to what was done prior to 1963 and from 1981-1990, due to the projected increase in Class A schools in the future. Committee members pointed out any change will ultimately come down to the qualification process to determine state tournament teams and accepting the concept of Class A teams scheduling Class B teams for non-region games. The committee felt it was worth continuing the conversation and agreed the next Ad Hoc committee meeting would be held in conjunction with the 2022 NDIAAA Fall Conference in Mandan.

Motion by Brandt to approve the Class A Region Ad Hoc Committee report, seconded by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Diegel presented the Media Committee report. The committee reviewed Tier I and Tier II television contract requests for proposal from back in 2017. Current television contracts with Forum Communications (Tier I) and BEK Sports (Tier II) run through the 2022-23 school year. The Committee agreed to absorb the information received and to meet again in June to determine a timeline for future agreements.

Motion by Fridley to approve the Media Committee report, seconded by Jundt. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed the seven-year calendar.

Motion by Schoch to approve the 7-year calendars with the exception of the boys tennis date changes which would need to be reverted to the originally scheduled dates, seconded by Jundt. Motion carried unanimously.

West Fargo Public Schools requested 2022-23 8th grade students who reside in the 2022-23 Horace High School territory and have changed schools from Liberty Middle School (WF Sheyenne) to Heritage Middle School (WF Horace), be

granted a one-time, immediate eligibility transfer to be completed at the beginning of the school year. The rational for the request is these students did not have a choice to transfer, but due to overcrowding at Liberty and Sheyenne, they are now being placed at Heritage Middle school. WFPS is also requesting 2022-23 10th and 11th grade students who reside in the 2022-23 Horace High School territory and have changed schools from Sheyenne High School to Horace High School, be granted a one-time, immediate eligibility transfer to be completed at the beginning of the school year. This request was made because a student may choose to transfer to Horace High School due to siblings now attending Heritage and/or Horace. A student may also request a transfer due to district transportation only being provided to Horace High School. These requests are being made due to attendance area boundary changes taking affect in the 2022-23 school year.

Motion by Johnson to approve both requests from West Fargo Public School's as presented, seconded by Fridley. Motion carried unanimously.

District 7 and District 8 (Region 4 Schools) request to move to a Super Region format beginning in the 2022-23 girls and boys basketball seasons, with the elimination of district tournaments. They have submitted this request because District 8 will be down to 5 teams after Rolla and Rolette enter a coop.

Motion by Brandt to approve the Region 4 request as presented, seconded by Clooten. Motion carried unanimously.

Maple Valley and Hope-Page requested to be moved back into Region 2 for this year's boys golf season. They mistakenly requested to be placed in Region 1 when forming their coop.

Motion by Johnson to replace Maple Valley/Hope-Page into Region 2 seconded by Baxley. Motion carried unanimously.

Grace Lutheran School made a request to operate under the same Century Code provisions as Home School students due to their small size and the fact that their students reside all over the Fargo-Moorhead metro area.

Motion by Brandt to deny Grace Lutheran's request, seconded by Fridley. Motion carried unanimously.

Garrison High School has filed a formal protest appeal regarding Shiloh Christian using an ineligible player. In accordance to FERPA laws, the Board entered executive session at 12:02 pm CDT. Executive session ended at 1:13 pm CDT.

Motion by Fridley to uphold Fetsch's determination to deny Garrison's formal protest, seconded by Schoch. Motion carried 9-1 roll call vote: Baxley, yes; Brandt, yes; Clooten, no; Diegel, yes; Fridley, yes; Johnson, yes; Jordan, yes; Jundt, yes; Rerick, yes; Schoch, yes.

Diegel stated that he would like to investigate solutions for the overlap of sports seasons. Rerick directed Finance/Personnel and Policy committee to investigate options for how to proceed.

Diegel would like a NDHSAA guideline for a uniform statute of limitations on the drug, alcohol and tobacco rule. Jundt points that this could be very hard to find a consensus within the membership. Rerick requested that Executive Director Fetsch speak with other national sections to see if any of them have language like this.

Clooten would like a review of announcement of athlete's names during awards ceremonies. Fetsch pointed out that this was also brought up in District Chairs. Rerick directed Tournament Committee to explore this.

Johnson reported from a focus group that is interested in designing a plan to be shared to the membership regarding a three-class system.

Fetsch presented his Executive Director's report. Distinguished student interviews will take place on April 27, 2022. 50 applications were submitted. Fetsch conducted seven hardship investigations. Fetsch reported that the current website developer will be terminating their contract with the NDHSAA at the end of April. Walton will be taking over a majority of the website development. Fenworks has reached out with an update on their season and their state tournament. Fetsch discussed some of the changes for the upcoming board retirement dinner and the inclusion of board and staff alumni. Wet bulb thermometers from the NFHS will be distributed to all schools in the state that host football games. Fetsch reminded the Board members that June is when the next President and Vice President will be selected.

The next Board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 7 at 10:00 am CDT in Valley City at the NDHSAA Office

Meeting adjourned at 2:39 pm CDT.

May-Port-CG baseball committed a pitch count violation. The game was forfeited and the coach will be suspended for May-Port-CG's next varsity baseball game.

Motion by Schoch to approve the Executive Board Report as presented, seconded by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Brandt presented the Finance/Personnel and Policy committee report. The committee is recommending a team payment amount of \$658,004 for the 2021-22.

The Finance/Personnel and Policy committee discussed auditors and recommended continuing with current NDHSAA auditor Harold Rotunda. No board action is necessary.

Mark Anderson gave a presentation on behalf of Farmers Union Insurance, the NDHSAA's Premier Partner. Anderson said their staff is traveling again. Anderson discussed how their branding is changing and evolving as they grow and expand. He also highlighted how their business districts operate and utilize their agents. Mark reviewed some of their new agents. He described how climate change and storm severity impacts where their policies are concentrated. President Rerick and Executive Director Fetsch thanked Mark and Farmers Union Insurance for their continued support of NDHSAA sports and activities.

Napoleon High School is appealing an Executive Board decision to suspend their varsity girls basketball coach from their first varsity game of the 2022-23 season. The penalty was administered during the April 26, 2022 Board meeting due to practicing at the region tournament site after their district tournament was completed. Napoleon contested prior to that meeting there was no prescribed penalty for the infraction and thus should not be penalized.

Rerick called for a roll call vote to overturn the Executive Board's decision to suspend Napoleon's head girls basketball coach from their next varsity game: Brandt, no; Clooten, no; Diegel, yes; Fridley, no; Johnson, no; Jordan, no; Jundt, no; Rerick, no; Schoch, no. The appeal fails 1-8.

Diegel presented the Media committee's report regarding television contracts. The committee currently recommends offering current television partners a one-year extension of their current contracts, through the 2024-25 school year.

Motion by Diegel to approve the one-year extension, seconded by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Johnson presented the Constitution and By-Law Committee report. Johnson presented the final reading for changes to Article VIII – Amateurism.

Motion by Clooten to approve changes to Article VIII – Amateurism as presented, seconded by Fridley. Motion carried unanimously.

Johnson continued with the final reading of changes to Article XIV, Section IV – Rules of Eligibility.

Motion by Brandt to approve changes to Article XIV, Section IV – Rules of Eligibility as presented, seconded by Schoch. Motion carried unanimously.

Johnson presented the final reading of changes to Article III, Section IX – Contests.

Motion by Clooten to approve changes to Article III, Section IX – Contests, seconded by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

Johnson finished the Constitution and By-Law committee's report by reporting the committee determined that an August 1, 2022 golf tournament was not exempt form Article XIV, Section III.

Motion by Schoch to approve the committee report as presented, seconded by Clooten. Motion carried unanimously.

Fridley presented the Tournament committee report. The committee reviewed and recommended changes to the 2023 Spring sports region tournament sites as shown on the NDHSAA Tournament Sites calendar.

Motion by Jordan to approve the changes to the 2023 spring region tournament sites as presented, seconded by Johnson Motion carried unanimously.

Tournament committee recommends moving the 2022 boys East Region boys tennis tournament to Grand Forks and 2022 boys state tennis tournament to Minot due to a lack of hotels in Grand Forks on the weekend of state.

Motion by Schoch to approve moving the 2022 boys East Region tennis tournament to Grand Forks and 2022 boys state tennis tournament to Minot, seconded by Brandt. Motion carried unanimously.

Recommend moving the 2023 State A Baseball/Softball from Grand Forks to Fargo and West Fargo due to an upcoming renovation of Kraft Field in Grand Forks. Future spring tournament changes are also recommended to balance East/West and overlapping of tournament sites.

Motion by Diegel to approve changes to the State A Baseball/Softball schedule as presented, seconded by Jordan. Motion carried unanimously.

The committee discussed introducing individuals during state tournament awards ceremonies. The committee has no recommendation and will refer to the full Board of Directors for discussion. Fridley highlighted that the largest outlier for this is football due to major time constraints with television broadcasting. This is to be added to Tournament Committee's agenda for the September Board meeting.

Minot North High School made a request to become a member school. Minot North will begin having 9th graders, housed at Minot Central campus, and will have separate teams beginning as soon as possible. They have additionally requested immediate coops with Minot High School in all activities except girls golf, which they plan to have a varsity team beginning in 2022-23. Minot North would like to sponsor separate 9th grade teams where possible with students being elevated to Junior varsity and Varsity teams where appropriate. The application also states that Minot North High be allowed to immediately dissolve any of these coop agreements at any time with notice to the NDHSAA Executive Director.

Motion by Schoch to approve membership of Minot North High School as presented, seconded by Johnson. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Jundt to nominate Schoch to be Board president and Johnson to be vice president for the 2022-23 school year, seconded by Brandt. Motion carried unanimously.

Diegel shared a concern about amenities at some tournaments. He acknowledges that many of these issues are not necessarily the NDHSAA's responsibility but he is worried about how it reflects on the association. Rerick posed that there may need to greater discussion regarding this at Combined Tournament Committee.

Johnson expressed his appreciation to President Rerick for his work as president and a board member. He also extends thanks to the rest of the board and staff for a great year.

Executive Director Fetsch heard two hardships, both were denied. He heard 1 extra semester appeal which he granted. He has one hardship going into the 2022-23 school year which will be heard over the summer. Fetsch will be coordinating with board members regarding NFHS Summer Meeting.

The next Board meeting is scheduled for September 22, 2022 at the Valley City office. The New Board Member orientation is scheduled for July 18, 2022 also in Valley City.

President Rerick adjourned the meeting at 11:22 am CDT.
