## FOREWORD

This yearbook provides a detailed accounting of the past year's activities for the NDHSAA. I would like to thank the Board of Directors, NDHSAA office staff and all representatives of the member schools for your dedication and commitment to the Association.

Farmers Union Insurance completed its 17<sup>th</sup> year as the Premiere Partner of NDHSAA and continues to be actively involved in all activities, including the Distinguished Student Program. Vision Zero has been a supporting sponsor of Association sponsored activities for the past twelve years. For the seventh straight year, the Marcil Foundation provided a \$100,000 donation to member schools as part of the NDHSAA's Television partnership with Forum Communications. Choice Bank also completed their third year as the official banking partner of the NDHSAA. The Association is very appreciative for what all these organizations do for the athletes and fine arts students in North Dakota.

Some highlights from the 2024-25 school year included the following changes:

- \*The addition of a 12<sup>th</sup> Board of Directors seat, currently served by Wayne Fox as the Native American At-Large representative.
- \*Approved by-law amendments to allow K-8 member schools to have junior high cooperative sponsorships with multiple schools and added baseball to the list of sports that are exempt from the classification by-law.
- \*Inaugural meeting of the volleyball classification committee to determine team classifications in future years.
- \*Utilized digital ticketing for all region tournaments and playoff games throughout the school year in addition to state tournaments.

Once again, the NDHSAA served many students in grades seven through twelve. The most recent completed survey indicates there were 31,497 student participants in sports activities and 12,085 student participants in fine arts. The State A & B Girls Golf Tournaments, State Boys Tennis Tournament, Football Dakota Bowl, and State Girls Swimming & Diving Meet all set admission records in the fall. Despite unseasonably warm weather, winter tournament revenue was down significantly, as the second year of the three-division basketball format saw a decrease in tournament attendance. The State Track & Field Meet continues to grow in popularity, again setting an admissions record in the spring. Over \$700,000 was again distributed to member schools through the team payment program at the conclusion of the 2024-25 school year. Distribution has totaled nearly \$7 million since the team payment plans inception in 2005-06.

The NDHSAA continues to be a very successful organization that serves North Dakota students who wish to be involved in education-based activities. It is important that each member school feels as though they are an important part of the Association. Your support is greatly appreciated.

The committee reviewed the Spectator Ejection Policy draft:

Any attendee ejected from a regular season or NDHSAA tournament contest will incur a minimum three (3) game/event suspension from that team's games/events and all other NDHSAA games/events in the interim at any level of competition. If the ejection occurs with fewer than three (3) games/events remaining in the team's season, the suspension will carry over to the school's sports season which immediately follows. An attendee ejected for a second time during a school year shall be suspended for a minimum of one (1) calendar year from all NDHSAA regular and postseason events. NDHSAA member schools may increase these minimum penalties at their discretion.

Motion by Aanenson to approve the Spectator Ejection Policy as presented. Seconded by Bakke.

Jordan called for a roll call vote.

Motion by Aanenson to approve the consent agenda, seconded by Christensen. Motion carried unanimously.

Kevin Ressler presented on behalf of NDHSAA's Premier Partner Farmers Union Insurance.

Jordan offered the Executive Board report.

The Executive Board held audiences with Lewis & Clark-North Shore and Parshall High Schools on September 24, 2024. The two member schools are currently in year three of cooperative agreements in boys and girls cross country, boys basketball, boys and girls track and field, and baseball. They are also in the second year of a football cooperative agreement, where they field a 6-man team and play an independent schedule. Lewis & Clark-North Shore has requested an early dissolution to these cooperative agreements to allow them to re-coop with Lewis & Clark-Berthold, including boys basketball this winter.

The Executive Board denied their request for boys basketball, boys and girls track and field, and baseball, as the current NDHSAA cooperative agreement by-law does not allow a coop dissolution prior to three years unless supported by both member schools involved. The denial means this request is not forwarded to the full Board of Directors for consideration. Lewis & Clark-North Shore has the ability to dissolve these coops, along with their current cross country coops, for the 2025-26 school year without mutual agreement of Parshall, and these dissolution requests are expected in the future.

There is a different precedent in football, where previous NDHSAA Boards have allowed football coop dissolutions after the June 1<sup>st</sup> deadline when involving 6-man teams who play independent schedules. The Executive Board recommended approving the dissolution request of Parshall and Lewis & Clark-North Shore's football coop for the 2025-26 school year and allowing Lewis & Clark-North Shore and Lewis & Clark-Berthold to coop for the 2025-26 school year. Parshall will continue to field an independent 6-man team, and Lewis & Clark's new coop would continue in the 9-man division, where Lewis & Clark-Berthold currently competes.

Motion by Simpfenderfer to approve the football coop dissolution between Lewis & Clark-North Shore and Parshall and to approve the football coop between Lewis & Clark-North Shore and Lewis & Clark-Berthold for the 2025-26 football season. Seconded by Hanson. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Board reviewed the new Sunsetting Process and determined the activity of Debate and the sport of Gymnastics potentially meet the criteria as "at risk," as both previously had 12 or more participating teams/schools and no longer do so. The Executive Board recommended identifying Gymnastics as a program at risk, notifying their participating school administrator and coaches advisory groups, and working with both parties to help increase the number of participants over the next three school years. Debate currently has 11 teams, but the number of participants is at a 20-year high, so the Executive Board did not recommend identifying them as at risk at this time. The Executive Board recommended the Policy committee reviews the "at risk" definition for individual sports and fine arts activities.

Motion by Derr to identify Gymnastics as a program at risk. Seconded by Bakke. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Board reviewed the new spectator ejection policy that was approved by the NDHSAA Board of Directors on August 14, 2024.

Q. If a football player is ejected from a volleyball match as a spectator by a site administrator or game official, they are suspended from attending the next three volleyball matches and all contests in other sports during the interim. Does this suspension also include football games for the team the student is a member of?

A. Yes, the penalty would include any games an ejected student would otherwise be playing in.

Motion by Berseth to approve the Q & A with amended text at "football player" to state "football player or coach". Seconded by Lunde.

Through further discussion with the Board of Directors indicating the language may not be broad enough and could be misinterpreted, Jordan requested that the Constitution & By-laws Committee develop language for a Q & A.

Berseth withdrew his motion to approve the Q & A language.

Currently the NDHSAA Behavior Expectations prohibit the use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV), also known as drones, at all contests. The Executive Board recommended granting WDAY Sports permission to use a drone to broadcast the state cross country meets on 10/25-26/24. All applicable Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations would be followed.

Motion by Berger to permit WDAY Sports use of a drone to broadcast the state cross country meets on 10/25-26/24. Seconded by Christensen. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Board reviewed the current coop late fees and emergency coop fees within the football guidelines. No changes to the current language are recommended.

2024-25 was the first-year member schools were fined for failure to upload their student rosters into the NDHSAA system by September 1<sup>st</sup> annually. Seventeen (17) member schools did not submit their rosters prior to the deadline, and a number of them asked NDHSAA staff for a one-year waiver of the fine. The Executive Board did not wish to forward this item to the full Board for consideration.

The Executive Board reviewed three (3) member school self-reports for the inadvertent use of an ineligible player. In all three instances, the prescribed penalty of forfeiture was applied. The Executive Board applied no additional penalties to any of the situations and will send letters of reprimand to each school as a matter of record.

Motion by Hanson to approve the Executive Board report. Seconded by Tescher. Motion carried unanimously.

Lunde provided the Realignment Committee report.

The Committee discussed the district and region alignments included in the current three division volleyball draft.

The draft includes a draft of realigned Districts 3 and 4 in Division B, which switches from a north-south alignment to an east-west alignment. This draft would also apply to boys and girls basketball beginning in 2025-26.

The Committee directed staff to contact the schools in Districts 3 and 4 and gather feedback.

The Committee reviewed the region alignments for the Volleyball draft and recommended placing teams as presented.

Motion by Bakke to approve the Three-Division Volleyball Draft alignments as presented in the Three Division Volleyball Draft. Seconded by Simpfenderfer. Motion carried unanimously.

Hanson offered the Fine Arts & Academics Committee report.

The Committee recommended adding the following language to page 7 of the Play Regulations:

Schools are prohibited from using any flame, fire, liquids of any sort, and stage properties requiring fixture to the stage floor or walls using appliances such as screws or nails, etc. Penalty: Disqualification; schools in violation of this rule will be financially responsible for all reparations to host site.

The Committee recommended adopting the Play-In Proposal to current debate regulations for State Debate seeding.

The Committee recommended an amendment to #15, page 19 of the Speech Regulations:

15. Regional participation: All state qualifiers must be registered for and participate in that school's regional tournament. Students who have prequalified for state through invitationals must be registered for no more than 2 events on the regional registration form by the 7 day deadline **which is 11:59 p.m. CT of the date listed in the NDHSAA system.** ~~(2011)~~ Students may not change categories from region to state. Prequalified entries only advance to state through regional competition in those categories. **If a pre-qualified student's registration is completely missed by the 7-day regional registration deadline, s/he may be placed on the regional state qualifier list. Penalty: \$200/event.** ~~The registration deadline is 11:59 p.m. CDT of the date listed in the NDHSAA system (2012). No exceptions.~~ Regional tournament substitutions and drops may be

made any time before tournament day by **contacting** ~~fax (845-4935) or email (Brian.Bubach@ndhsaa.org)~~ and the regional manager.

The Committee recommended an amendment to #5 on page 19 of the Speech Regulations:

5. Minimum entries per category: To be a qualifying event, there must be a minimum number actually participating in at least the first round:

- i. ~~15~~ **8** participants in serious, humorous, dramatic, poetry
- ii. ~~12~~ **8** participants in storytelling, serious duo, humorous duo and EPR
- iii. 8 participants in radio broadcasting, extemporaneous speech, impromptu, inform, persuade and entertain. ~~(2016)~~

The Committee recommended an amendment to #2 on page 5 of the Speech Regulations:

2. Students may enter a maximum of ~~4~~ **2** events at invitational tournaments ~~(2018)~~.

The Committee recommended an amendment to page 4 of the Debate Regulations as follows:

Forms of Debate:

Two forms of debate are offered in our state: Public Forum and Lincoln-Douglas.

1. Public Forum – two-person team debate that uses a different current event topic each month. Competitors formulate fact-based and/or analytical arguments which uphold the pro or con side of the topic. PF uses individual and team cross examination times.
2. Lincoln-Douglas - single person debate that uses a value-based topic. ~~LD uses two topics during the season: one in November and December, and one in January and February.~~ LD students use a combination of evidence and reasoning to develop their cases.
3. **Two topics are used for PF and LD during the season: one in November and December, and one in January and February. NDHSAA will determine topics and release to coaches each fall prior to season.**

The Committee recommended the Board of Directors endorse State Speech Tournaments utilizing 3-round format starting this spring based on increased student participation opportunity.

The Committee discussed potential establishment of regional qualifiers for State A Plays with State A Plays moving to the last Monday-Tuesday of February starting in 2025-26. Staff was directed to gather more information for further Committee review.

Motion by Aanenson to approve the Fine Arts & Academics Committee report as presented. Seconded by Fox. Motion carried unanimously.

Hanson presented the Eligibility Committee Report.

The Eligibility Committee heard an extra semester appeal from Glenburn Public School. Following a lengthy discussion and review of the applicable NDHSAA by-laws, regulations, and policies, the committee unanimously agreed to deny the appeal.

Motion by Aanenson to approve the Eligibility Committee report. Seconded by Berger. Motion carried unanimously.

Fletschock presented a report from the North Dakota Officials Association.

Fetsch offered a report from the Regional Administrator Meetings.

Fetsch offered a report from the NFHS Section 4-5 Meeting.

Motion by Aanenson to approve the Three Division Volleyball draft as presented. Seconded by Hanson. Motion carried unanimously.

Fetsch reviewed informational items for the Board.

Fetsch presented his Executive Director Report. Since last meeting 3 hardship determinations and extra semester appeal. BCBS meeting for annual renewal premium increase 6%. Indicated a double-digit increase next year. Jim Haussler was hired by Integrity Public Affairs and will represent NDHSAA at upcoming legislative sessions. Fetsch presented at NDIAAA about change processes in the NDHSAA. Fetsch also presented at the Southeast Superintendent Meeting. NDHSAA staff plan to have presence at NDCEL and School Boards meetings in coming weeks. Fetsch announced the first virtual meeting for member school update will be tomorrow.

The next Board of Directors meeting is scheduled for Thursday, December 5, 2024 at 10:00 AM CT in Valley City at the NDHSAA Office.

Motion by Berseth to approve the consent agenda, seconded by Simpferfer. Motion carried unanimously.

Jordan presented the Executive Board report.

The Executive Board clarified the athletic review golf recommendations to take effect 2025 school year.

Tom Simon illegally streamed a region volleyball tournament game. He was assessed the prescribed penalty and sent a formal letter from NDHSAA Legal Counsel.

Our Redeemer's reported that they played an ineligible player in some football games. They are looking into what games the player participated in and will provide a report as part of their self-report. Prescribed penalties will be applied at that time.

Motion by Christensen to approve the Executive Board report. Seconded by Hanson. Motion carried unanimously.

Berger offered the Volleyball Classification Committee report.

The Committee met virtually on October 9, 2024, to review the classification committee guidelines.

The Committee met in person on October 15, 2024, and heard 4 appeals from member schools petitioning to move down a division for the 2025 & 2026 NDHSAA volleyball seasons. The Committee acted to the requests as follows (a 2/3 majority (8 votes) is required for approval:

- Grand Forks Central (AA to A) – Denied 0-11
- Four Winds-Minnewaukan (A to B) – Approved 11-0
- Dunseith (A to B) – Approved 11-0
- Standing Rock (A to B) – Approved 11-0

No volleyball teams reached six (6) tournament performance points during the 2024 postseason, so the Committee did not have to meet again following the state volleyball tournament.

Lunde presented the Football Classification Committee report.

The Committee met virtually on October 9, 2024, to review the classification committee guidelines.

The Committee met in person on October 16, 2024, to review 7 petitions from member schools petitioning to move from Division A to the 9-man division for the 2025 & 2026 football seasons. The Committee acted to the requests as follows (a 2/3 majority (6 votes) is required for approval:

- Midway-Minto – Approved 9-0
- Larimore – Approved 9-0
- Central McLean – Denied 0-9
- Surrey – Approved 9-0
- Hatton-Northwood – Approved 9-0
- Tioga – Denied 1-8 (Wiberg – Yes vote)
- South Prairie-Max – Denied 0-9

Committee action resulted in the maximum of 40 teams being placed in the 9-man division. 33 teams remain in Division A.

The Committee met in person on November 19, 2024, to determine the number of teams to be placed in the AAA and AA divisions for the 2025 & 2026 football seasons. After a lengthy discussion, the Committee unanimously approved 12 teams will be placed in AAA and 12 teams in AA.

Next, the Committee reviewed 7 petitions from member schools petitioning to be placed in the AA division for the 2025 & 2026 football seasons. The Committee acted to the requests as follows (a 2/3 majority (6 votes) is required for approval:

- Fargo North – Denied 0-9
- West Fargo Horace – Denied 0-8 (Midthun abstained due to conflict of interest)
- Williston – Denied 1-8 (Chris Larson – Yes vote)
- Minot North – Approved 8-0 (Lunde abstained due to conflict of interest)
- Grand Forks Red River – Approved 9-0
- Grand Forks Central – Approved 9-0
- Dickinson – Approved 9-0

Also, the Committee recommended the Realignment Committee and Board of Directors consider allowing more than 14 teams to be placed in the AAA division in future classifications.

Lunde offered the Realignment Committee report.

The Committee recommended approving the football regions as presented based on the decisions of the Football Classification Committee.

The Committee reviewed the football classification guidelines and recommended adding the following:

h. Enrollment in proximity to division above or below.

i. Formal feedback from teams in the region where appealing team would be placed.

The Committee recommended aligning Lisbon baseball and softball in Class B Region 1.

Motion by Berger to approve the Realignment Committee report as presented. Seconded by Tescher. Motion carried unanimously.

Aanenson presented the Combined Tournament Committee report.

The committee reviewed state tournament sites through 2031-32 and recommends the following changes:

- 2027-28
  - State B Girls Golf – Oxbow to Minot
- 2028-29
  - State B Girls Golf – Minot to Fargo
- 2029-30
  - State B Girls Golf – Carrington to South Heart
  - State Gymnastics – Valley City to Dickinson
- 2030-31
  - State B Girls Golf – Jamestown to Carrington
  - State Gymnastics – Dickinson to Jamestown

The Committee discussed a new technology that will be used for scripts for several tournaments this winter and spring. Reviews from the first use at last month's Dakota Bowl were overwhelmingly positive.

The Committee discussed the potential of the NDHSAA Finance/Personnel & Policy Committee exploring a policy that would allow 50/50 draws during postseason events, but there is not support from the group at this time.

The Committee discussed awards presentations following tournaments. The Committee supports continuing the practice of announcing all assistant coaches and non-dressed players and having schools order additional awards afterwards.

The Combined Tournament Committee will meet again on April 7, 2025, in Fargo.

Motion by Derr to approve the Combined Tournament Committee report as presented. Seconded by Hanson. Motion carried unanimously.

Aanenson presented the Tournament Committee report.

The committee recommends approving the 2025 fall region tournament sites as presented.

Motion by Bakke to approve the Tournament Committee report as presented. Seconded by Simpfinderfer. Motion carried unanimously.

Bakke offered the Constitution & By-Laws Committee report.

The Committee met on Tuesday, November 19, 2024. They discussed the development of Q and As for the NDHSAA Spectator Ejection Policy, specifically for a current player, coach, registered official, team personnel/worker, or administrator who are ejected from a contest as an attendee. Most of the hypothetical scenarios likely involve legal questions/employment law, so NDHSAA Legal Counsel will be developing an opinion regarding certain scenarios. The Committee also discussed the development of definitions for "attendee" and "ejection," as well as any other terms that may help with consistent enforcement of the policy.

The Committee met again on Thursday, December 5, 2024, along with NDHSAA legal counsel to review Q&As that were developed after the previous meeting. The committee will continue to work on the Q&As prior to the January Board of Directors meeting.

Motion by Aanenson to approve the Constitution & By-Laws Committee report as presented. Seconded by Lunde. Motion carried unanimously.

Hanson presented the Fine Arts & Academics Committee report.

The Committee reviewed participating member school survey results and discussed potential dates and format changes and recommends the following:

- State A Plays remain a direct-register event at this time.
- Starting April 13, 2026, State A Plays become a single-day event to be held the first non-Easter Monday in April (corresponding date as on current calendars).
- The overtime limit shall be set at 30 minutes.
- Oral critiques will not be provided by adjudicators. Comments shall be limited to ballots only.
- Once 16 plays have competed, conferences will schedule regional qualifiers the following school year with a deadline for completion 14 days prior the state competition. State qualifying ratios from region contests will be determined by the Board of Directors during the first year of regional-state series contests and may be adjusted based on participation as needed.

Motion by Berger to approve the Fine Arts & Academics Committee report as presented. Seconded by Aanenson. Motion carried unanimously.

Jordan presented the Finance/Personnel & Policy Committee report.

The Committee reviewed previously approved fall region and winter state tournament digital and cash ticket prices and recommends approval for this winter's sub-state tournaments.

Motion by Aanenson to approve the winter sub-state digital and cash ticket prices as presented. Second by Christensen. Motion carried unanimously.

The Committee reviewed an awards contract extension proposal from Allards Trophy in Valley City. The previous contract for NDHSAA trophies expired at the end of the 2023-24 school year. The contract extension was delayed due to a material shortage experienced this summer, specifically the team champion and runners-up trophies presented at Dakota Bowl, Girls Swim & Dive, and Volleyball recently, which were a different style than previous champion and runners-up team trophies. The shortage is not an issue moving forward.

The Committee recommends accepting the awards contract extension with Allards Trophy for the 2024-25 year only, including the new style of team champion and runners-up team awards, and bidding out the awards contract for the 2025-26 school year, as the award contract has not been bid out in nine years.

Motion by Simpfenderfer to approve the awards contract extension with Allards Trophy for the 2024-25 year only, including the new style of team champion and runners-up team awards, and bidding out the awards contract for the 2025-26 school year. Seconded by Hanson. Motion carried unanimously.

The Committee reviewed the current media rate card for third parties who purchase the rights to televise or video stream NDHSAA tournaments that are declined by both WDAY and the NFHS Network. Currently any third parties who purchase declined events do not have exclusive rights for their production. A couple of media companies have requested the NDHSAA Board of Directors consider adding another level to the rate card that would allow these parties to purchase exclusive rights for these declined events, for example, an option to pay twice the listed rate to have exclusive rights to the event. NDHSAA Legal

Counsel is reviewing current contracts to make sure there are no legal issues with a potential exclusive option. The Committee will meet again prior to the January 2025 Board of Directors meeting.

The Committee reviewed the current presenting partner/sunset process language as Fenworks has indicated they are interested in proposing a presenting partner agreement for esports in accordance with the attached policy. They are working on soliciting letters from at least 12 school based-teams of their commitment, which won't be an issue, but there is an issue with the following requirement "the governing organization must be an accredited nonprofit organization (pursuant to N.D.C.C. 10-33), considered a 501(c)(3), or similar designation," as Fenworks is a for-profit company. The Committee would like further discussion on the nonprofit organization requirement with the full Board of Directors.

Motion by Berseth to approve the Finance/Personnel & Policy Committee report as presented. Seconded by Aanenson. Motion carried unanimously.

Jordan presented the potential of appointing task forces for golf and tennis to assist advisory in re-focusing their respective regulations.

Motion by Berseth to create task forces for golf and tennis to review regulations. Seconded by Aanenson.

Jordan called for a roll call vote.

Lunde, yes; Hanson, yes; Christensen, yes; Simpfenderfer, yes; Aanenson, yes; Berseth, yes; Tescher, yes; Derr, yes; Bakke, yes; Berger, yes; Jordan, yes.

Motion carried eleven yes to zero no.

Region 1A Girls Basketball requires a date change to their region tournament due to a scheduling conflict at the venue. The staff recommended moving the affected games scheduled for Wednesday, February 26, 2025, to Thursday, February 27, 2025.

Motion by Bakke to approve rescheduling the Region 1A Girls Basketball games currently scheduled for Wednesday, February 26, 2025, to Thursday, February 27, 2025. Seconded by Hanson. Motion carried unanimously.

Fetsch reviewed several informational items for the Board of Directors.

Fetsch presented his Executive Director report.

Fetsch has 5 hardship reviews scheduled for the week following this meeting. Fetsch, lobbyists, and other staff and board have met with 25 legislators to discuss NDHSAA policies and procedures over the last month, as part of an effort to establish an open dialogue with the State Legislature. Fetsch provided the board with the preliminary NFHS Summer Meeting schedule.

The next Board of Directors meeting is scheduled for Thursday, January 23, 2025 at 10:00 AM CT in Valley City at the NDHSAA Office.

Jordan adjourned the meeting at 11:21 am CST.

Turtle Mountain and Standing Rock each self-reported playing a 6<sup>th</sup> grader on their respective JH basketball teams. Penalties for each included game forfeitures and letters of reprimand.

The Executive Board outlined the Executive Director evaluation process for the 2024-25 year.

Motion by Aanenson to approve the Executive Board report. Seconded by Hanson. Motion carried unanimously.

Jordan presented the Finance/Personnel & Policy Committee report.

The Committee continued discussion on the current media rate card for third parties who purchase the rights to televise or video stream NDHSAA tournaments that are declined by both WDAY and the NFHS Network. Currently, any third parties who purchase declined events do not have exclusive rights for their production. After feedback from NDHSAA Legal Counsel, the committee recommends adding the following language to Section II of the NDHSAA Board Policies concerning TV/Webcasting:

II. Declined events not included in the live coverage contract or in conflict with an exclusivity clause may be contracted individually and shall be subject to the minimum acceptable fees. Third parties may purchase exclusive rights to declined events by paying double the rates listed below:

Motion by Aanenson to approve adding language to Section II of the NDHSAA Board Policies concerning TV/Webcasting regarding the purchase of exclusive rights to declined events as presented. Seconded by Hanson. Motion carried unanimously.

The Committee reviewed previously approved cash ticket prices for fall and winter region tournaments and recommends approval of this spring's region tournaments cash prices as presented.

Motion by Tescher to approve the spring region tournament cash ticket prices as presented. Seconded by Christensen. Motion carried unanimously.

The Committee reviewed the current presenting partner/sunset process language as Fenworks has indicated they are interested in proposing a presenting partner agreement for esports in accordance with the attached policy. They are still working on soliciting letters from at least 12 school-based teams of their commitment. There is also an issue with the following requirement "the governing organization must be an accredited nonprofit organization (pursuant to N.D.C.C. 10-33), considered a 501(c)(3), or similar designation," as Fenworks is a for-profit company. The Committee does not have any recommendation for change and is comfortable with continuing with the current language in the policy.

The committee discussed staff contracts for the 2025-26 and 2026-27 fiscal year. The committee recommends issuing staff a 2-year contract through the 2026-27 fiscal year, with a cost-of-living increase in salary in 2025-26 and an increase in the Association's contribution into the retirement plan in 2026-27.

Bakke presented the Constitution & By-Laws Committee report.

The Committee continued development of Q and As for the NDHSAA Spectator Ejection Policy. Based on feedback from member schools, the Committee recommends developing a draft to change the penalty for spectator ejections from three games to two calendar weeks beginning in 2025-26. The Committee will present this draft with related Q and As for first reading at the April meeting.

The Committee briefly discussed the Board regulation regarding students who maintain a full class load entirely online. The Committee will continue discussion at their next meeting as the educational landscape continues to evolve.

Motion by Aanenson to approve the Constitution & By-Laws Committee report. Seconded by Tescher. Motion carried unanimously.

Berger presented the Realignment Committee report.

The Committee reviewed the draft of Class B Golf Regions that were developed last spring. Their recommendation is to implement these alignments beginning with the 2025-26 school year.

The Committee recommends the new varsity softball program of Sargent Central/Milnor/Oakes in Region 1 for the 2025 season.

Motion by Bakke to approve the Realignment Committee report. Seconded by Aanenson. Motion carried unanimously.

NDHSAA member schools may increase these minimum penalties at their discretion.

Q. How is the two (2) week suspension applied?

A. If an attendee is ejected on a Tuesday, the suspension will end on the second Tuesday following the event.

Q. Who is classified as an "attendee"?

A. Anyone at an event except for a participant or coach is considered an attendee.

Q: If ejected from one sport's event, does this rule apply to all other sports and/or activities?

A: Yes. For example, if an attendee is ejected from a football game, they will not be able to attend any NDHSAA games/events (such as volleyball matches, debate competitions, etc.) until the two weeks has been served.

Q: Does this rule apply to students or coaches who are ejected as an attendee and may be participating/coaching in another sport or activity?

A: Yes. If a student or coach is ejected from a game/event as an attendee, they will be prohibited from attending or playing/coaching in any NDHSAA games/events until the period of suspension is over.

Q: Does this rule apply to junior varsity and/or junior high games/events?

A: Yes. If ejected from a sub-varsity game/event, the attendee would be prohibited from attending any NDHSAA game/event until the period of suspension is over.
