Bismarck Welcomes the State Class A Boys' and Girls' Basketball Tournament

This year marks the 13th year of the combined State Girls' and Boys' Class A Basketball Tournament and the 5th time that the Bismarck Event Center has served as the host site. The tournament will run for three days, on two floors the first two days, and one floor on Saturday. One floor will be in the Main Arena and the Event Center's Exhibit Hall will be the site of the second floor.

All of Thursday's games will be considered a single session. Friday will be divided into two sessions to allow for television coverage. Saturday will be considered as one session. On Thursday, the girls' first round will be played in the Exhibit Hall starting at 1:00 p.m. with the boys' first round played in the Main Arena starting at 2:00 p.m. Friday's schedule in the Exhibit Hall starts with the boys' consolation semi-finals, followed by the girls' consolation semi-finals. The semi-finals for the girls will lead off Friday's action in the Main Arena at 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m., and the boys' semi-finals will be played at 6:30 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. On Saturday, play goes to one floor—the Main Arena. The girls' and boys' consolation championships will be played at 9:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m., respectively, followed by the girls' and boys' third place games at 1:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. The girls' and boys' state championships are scheduled for 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m., respectively. Purpose: To elevate standards of Good Sportsmanship and to encourage the growth of responsible citizenship among the students, member schools, and their personnel.

Fundamentals of Good Sportsmanship

- 1- Know, appreciate and understand the rules of the contest.
- 2- Show respect for the officials. Good Sportsmanship implies the willingness to accept and abide by the decisions of the officials.
- 3- Show respect for the opponent at all times. Good Sportsmanship is the Golden Rule in action.
- 4- Recognize and appreciate the skill of performance regardless of team affiliation.
- 5- Maintain self-control at all times. Good Sportsmanship is a responsibility of all who are involved in the game.
- 6- Show a positive attitude in cheering, refraining from intimidation or negative cheering. Good Sportsmanship is cheering your own team "on to victory."

Acts of Misconduct

- 1- Throwing of any object onto the playing floor or in the stands.
- 2- Behavior deemed dangerous or which interferes with the rights of others to watch the game.
- 3- Possessing, consuming or being under the influence of chemicals.
- 4- Use of obscene, profane or abusive language or gestures, signs, posters or banners which show disrespect for opponent's team, officials, cheerleaders, band or other performing groups.
- 5- The use of noise-makers.
- 6- Entry onto the playing surface at any time.

Information Concerning the North Dakota High School Activities Association

Membership

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a voluntary non-profit organization of the high schools of the State of North Dakota. All schools are eligible for membership belong to the Association. Membership is granted upon application of the School Board, at which time the school agrees to enforce the rules which the members have established and to participate in the legislative processes of modification and revision of rules to fit changing needs of the member schools and students.

II. Purpose as per NDHSAA Constitution

The purpose of this Association is to contribute to the education of high school boys and girls of North Dakota by:

- Administering a program of Interscholastic activities, clinics, contests and festivals among its member schools;
- Elevating the standards of good sportsmanship and encouraging growth in good citizenship, not only of high school students, but also of all others who come in contact with the school activities;
- Protecting member schools, students, and personnel from exploitation by special interest groups;
- Encouraging pride in scholastic achievement as a fundamental basis for a well-balanced activities program;
- Supplementing the dramatic, literary, music and physical education programs of the schools and giving due emphasis to those tendencies which promise best to promote the mental and physical health and social well-being of all students.

III. Brief History

The activities association was founded in 1908 under the name of the High School League and originally was concerned only with athletics. In 1923 the state organization became affiliated with the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. A full-time executive director was employed in 1949, and assistant was added in 1963, a girls' sports supervisor in 1973, and a music and speech coordinator in 1978.

In 1950 the Consolidated League, an organization of the smaller schools of the state, affiliated with the High Schools League, thereby uniting all high schools of the state under one organization. Music and speech activities were placed under the direction of the Association in 1955, and the name was changed

to the North Dakota High School Activities Association at that time. Schools in the League were all one class for basketball competition from 1908 to 1932. A two- class system was used from 1933 to 1947 and a three- class system from 1948 to 1963. In 1964 the two-class system was restored and this arrangement has been in effect since then up to the present time. Official state champions have been named in track since 1908 and in basketball since 1914. Official champions in other sports were later added as follows: golf and tennis 1935, baseball 1950; wrestling 1959; cross country 1961; hockey 1967; girls' track, golf and tennis 1966; girls' gymnastics 1969; girls' basketball 1974; boys & girls' swimming 1974. State football champions were determined off and on between 1916 and 1959, when the practice was discontinued, but again restored in 1975. Basketball tournaments for girls were conducted by the Consolidated League for a number of years and by the NDHSAA from 1952 to 1960, at which time they were discontinued because of the small number of schools fielding teams. Girls' basketball was reinstated as an Association-sponsored activity in 1973 on a district level, with separate state Class A and Class B champions being named since 1974. Class A girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1984 and Class B girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1989. Boys' state soccer champions were first named in 1995 and girls' state soccer champions in 1996. Girls' state hockey champions were first named in 2003. Girls' softball champions were first named in 2009 with separated Division A & B champions in 2012.

IV. ACTIVITIES

SPORTSMANSHIP

Good sportsmanship is conduct which imposes a type of self-control involving honest rivalry, courteous relations and graceful acceptance of results. School spirit is a reflection of those attitudes and behavior. Spectator etiquette requires that we refrain from displaying any action to taunt the opponent's fan section such as carrying flags around the court and stopping to taunt the opponent's fan section. This may lead to competition among observers which is mistakenly under the auspice of good sportsmanship.

Spectators are asked to remain in their designated fan section. Approaching the opponent's fan section with the purpose of taunting and baiting will not be tolerated. The carrying of flags around the court will not be allowed.

Good sportsmanship shall be defined as those qualities which are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. An awareness is expected of the impact of an individual's influence on the behavior of others. Good sportsmanship is viewed as a concrete measure of the understanding and commitment to fair play, ethical behavior and integrity.

V. Registration of Officials and Interpretation Meetings

More than 1,460 officials are registered with NDHSAA. These men and women are furnished rule books for the sports in which they officiate, and examinations are provided annually in basketball, football, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, volleyball and wrestling. These individuals are also required to complete an on-line rules clinic.

VI. Cheerleader Clinics

The NDHSAA has recognized the importance of safety in cheerleading. Because of this, the Association has added rules/safety clinics for head cheer coaches of all member schools. These clinics recognize the importance of informing cheer coaches of proper safety techniques as well as emphasizing the responsibility of cheerleaders for sportsmanship and crowd control.

VII. Organization of Association

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors consists of 11 members. Three Board members shall be chosen from Class A Schools, one each from two geographical areas and one at-large. Four administrators of Class B schools, one high school principal as a member-at-large, and one athletic administrator. These representatives are elected by the membership as a whole, with each school having one vote. In addition, a representative of the North Dakota School Boards Association and the Superintendent of Public Instruction serve as member of the Board.

REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

The superintendent or high school principal or athletic administrator of each school serves as a member of the representative assembly, with each school being entitled to one vote. An annual meeting is held each year to adopt rules and regulations governing inter-school contests and eligibility regulations. All such rules are made by the representative assembly.

DISTRICT COMMITTEES

The district activities are controlled and managed by committees elected by school officials in each area.

EXECUTIVE OFFICERS

The administration of the various programs and the implementation of the policies of the Association are placed in the hands of an executive secretary and four assistants who are employed by the Association.

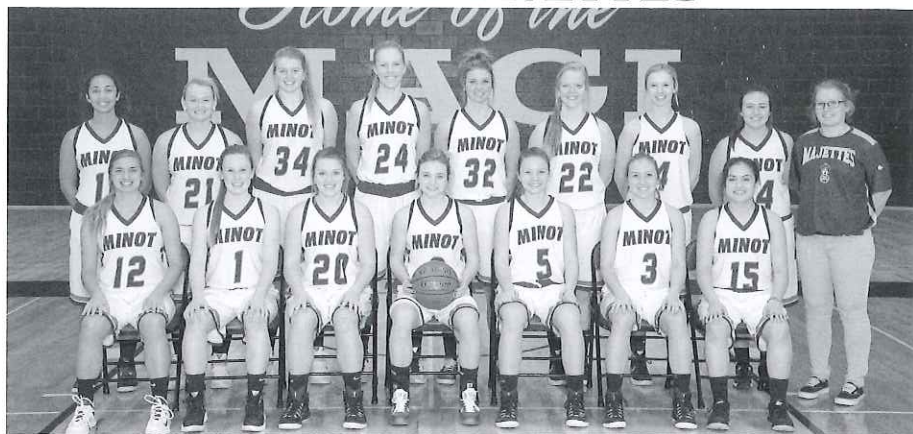

Century Patriots brought the first girls basketball title to the school and to Bismarck with a 53-51 victory over St. Mary's.

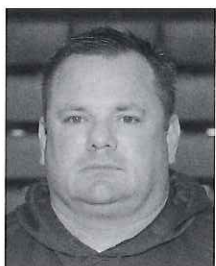
BOYS' COACHES' PROFILES

WEST FARGO PACKERS

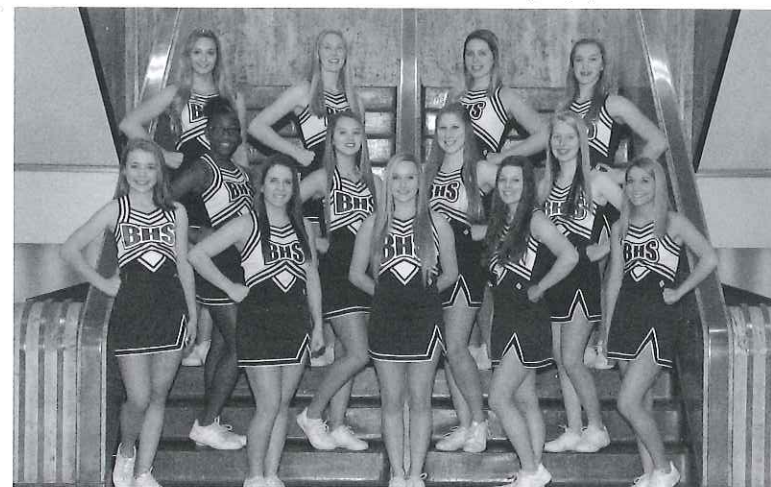

It was a long wait between the first Mandan Braves State Championship in 1940 to the second one in 1966. The Braves, unlikely champions at the beginning of the season, with a new coach Jim Walker, along with an inexperienced team (3 seniors and 9 juniors).

Back in the 60's, class A basketball had four regions and only two state tourney entrants from each region. The SW Region had 10 teams competing for two berths. The Braves, as expected had an up and down season, starting out strong, fading a bit in the middle, and ending the season with a State Championship.

Mandan entered the regional tournament unranked in the polls. To make it to state they defeated the No. 5 ranked Ft. Yates Warriors in the semifinals, 65-62. The finals were cancelled due to the great blizzard of 1966, thus seeding Mandan 2nd to No. 1 ranked Bismarck Demons, who had defeated the Braves twice during the regular season. The 1966 state tournament was held at the UND Field House. With the new regional format, there were two teams that had never appeared before, Cavalier and Fargo North. A third team made the trip but never won, Minot Ryan. The rest of the field consisted of Wahpeton, Minot, Bismarck, Grand Forks Central, and of course the Mandan Braves.

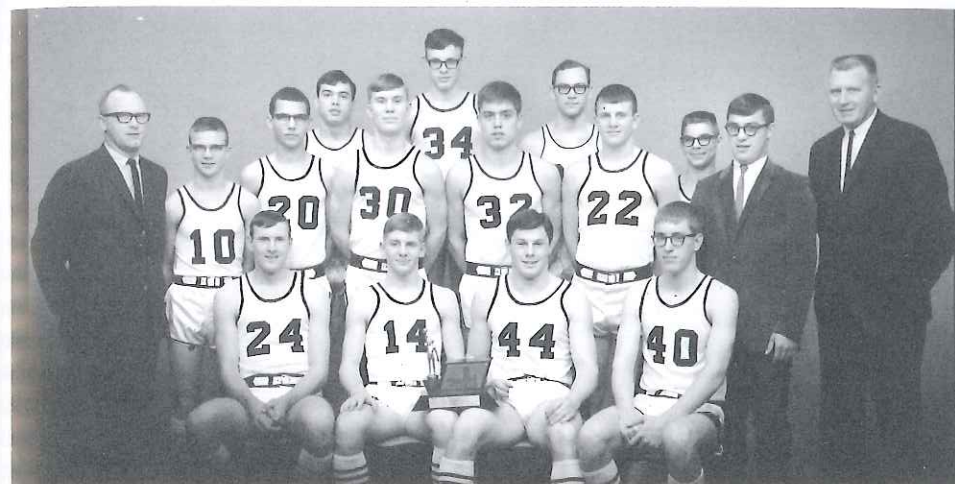
This year's tournament had the state's four top ranked teams contending for the title. All these teams had multiple championships except for the Braves. First Round had the Braves balanced attack defeat #2 Grand Forks Central, #1 Bismarck defeated Cavalier, #4 North defeated Ryan, and #3 Wahpeton defeated Minot. Semi-final action had Bismarck defeat Wahpeton 70-65 while the Braves took down North 56-55 in a very physical contest. The finals had #1 ranked Bismarck Demons once again taking on the unranked Mandan Braves for an All-West Championship Game.

The Demons were a short, fast pressing, good shooting team that took advantage of their opponents mistakes. The Braves were a more conservative team who relied on team balance, defense and rebounding. The Demons took an early 11 point lead in the 2nd quarter until the Braves made three quick buckets to go into the locker room down 36-33. The 3rd Quarter changed the game. Led by Wally Koch and Bill Cook's playmaking, Scott Howe and Mike Norton controlling the boards and Bob Green providing the scoring, the Braves scored 15 straight points and never looked back. The final score was 84-63, with 84 points being a new championship game scoring record along with Bob Green's 40 point effort, which set a new state championship scoring record previously held by Phil Jackson, who had 35 points in 1963. Norton and Howe chipped in with 16 and 11 respectively.

The Braves were indeed giant killers, defeating four ranked teams for their first championship in 26 years. The Braves ended up with a 20-5 record while the Demons ended 21-4.

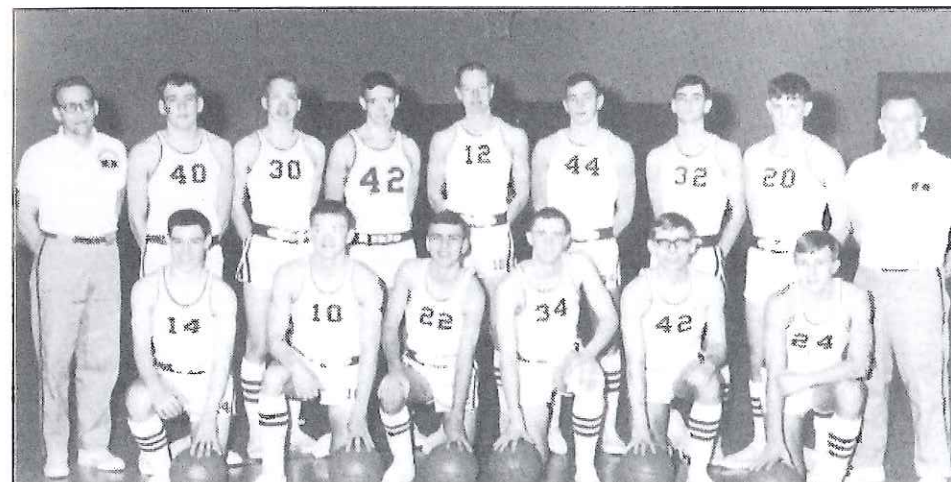
As usual, their winning formula was based on a balanced team effort. Coach Walker and the Braves proved the experts wrong by winning the 53rd State A tourney. It was a sweet finish after a long wait!

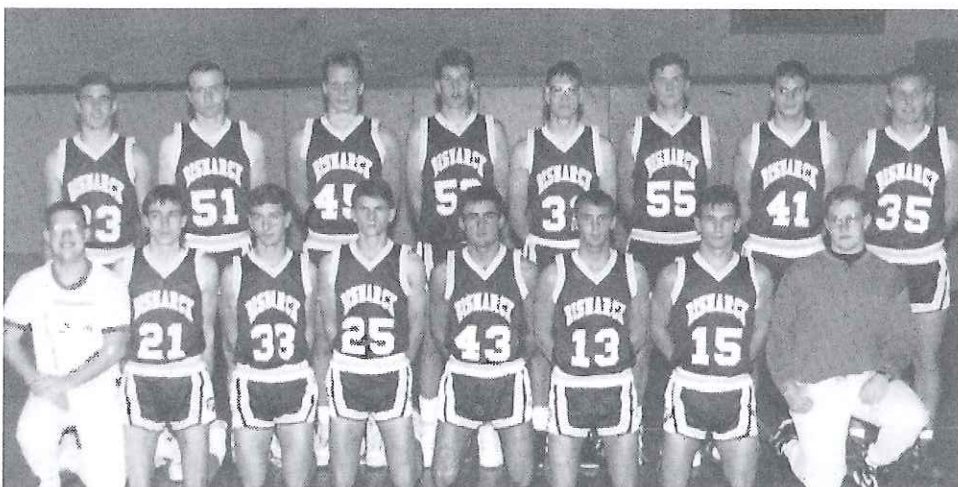

1991 TOURNAMENT

25 Years Ago

The 1991 West Fargo Packers boys' basketball team captured the school's 3rd state championship across all sports, and is one of the best teams in school history. The 21-4 Packers combined an explosive and balanced offense with a suffocating defense; for the season, they averaged more than 70 points per game with four players averaging in double figures, while holding opponents to 55 points per game. The team was composed of senior veterans and up-and-coming underclassmen who led the Packer teams from 1989 to 1993 to a five-year record of 103-23 that included two state titles and no finish worse than 5th place.

The Packers path to the 1991 title included 15-point victories over Fargo Shanley, Fargo North, and Fargo South in the East Region tournament. In the state tournament, they sailed past defending state champion Minot, before a four-point win over Fargo North in the semifinal, and a dramatic 67-64 overtime victory over Bismarck in the state championship.

They were led by legendary Coach Bob Torgrimson, who is a member of both the North Dakota and Minnesota High School Coaching Hall of Fames. Coach Torgrimson led West Fargo boys' basketball to nine state tournaments over fourteen seasons, including three state titles, a runner-up, a third-place, a fourth-place, and a consolation winner. He coached teams to state tournament appearances in four different decades, and finished his career with more than 500 victories.

The 1991 Packers are prevalent throughout West Fargo's 40 year-old record book, where five players still stand in the top 16 in career scoring; five are in the top 20 in career rebounds; five are in the top ten in career steals; two are in the top four in career assists; and four are in the top twelve in career 3-point percentage. Each feat is unmatched by any other team in school history. In addition, two players would finish their careers as the school's all-time leading scorer, while another remains the all-time leading rebounder. One would later earn Mr. Basketball honors. Four would be voted as all-state during their careers. Two would later play in the NCAA Division I basketball tournament.

More important than the on-court records, these student-athletes continued to achieve after their basketball careers ended. The fifteen-player roster of 1991 today includes a critical care surgeon, three attorneys, an engineer, a doctor and professor of philosophy, a high school principal, and international lobbyist, and leaders in religion, business, law enforcement, military and government. As youth, this team together committed to work to become champions, and their goal-setting, determination and teamwork carried over into life.

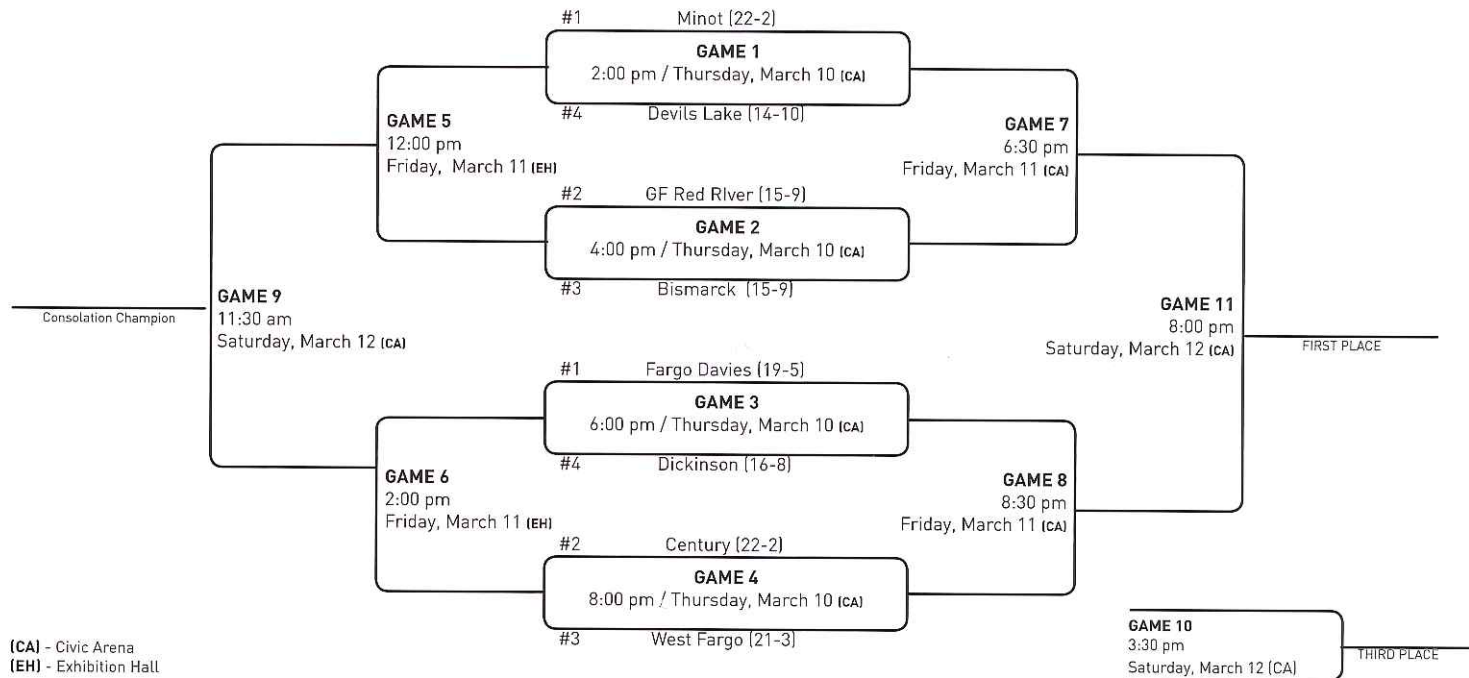

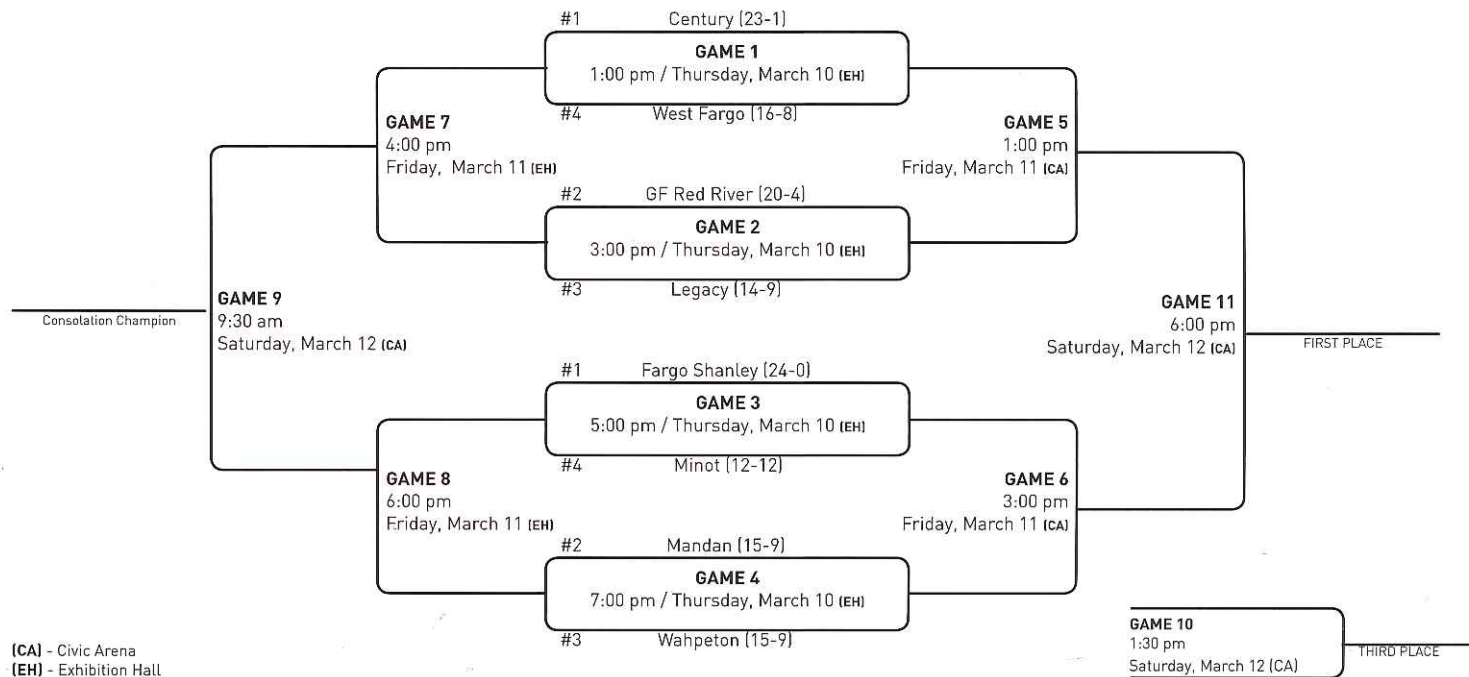
