2017 STATE BOYS' AND GIRLS' BASKETBALL

Bismarck Welcomes the State Class A Boys' and Girls' Basketball Tournament

This year marks the 14th year of the combined State Girls' and Boys' Class A Basketball Tournament and the 6th time that the Bismarck Event Center has served as the host site. The tournament will run for three days, on two floors the first two days, and one floor on Saturday. One floor will be in the Main Arena and the Event Center's Exhibit Hall will be the site of the second floor.

All of Thursday's games will be considered a single session. Friday will be divided into two sessions to allow for television coverage. Saturday will be considered as one session. On Thursday, the girls' first round will be played in the Exhibit Hall starting at 1:00 p.m. with the boys' first round played in the Main Arena starting at 2:00 p.m. Friday's schedule in the Exhibit Hall starts with the boys' consolation semi-finals, followed by the girls' consolation semi-finals. The semi-finals for the girls will lead off Friday's action in the Main Arena at 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m., and the boys' semi-finals will be played at 6:30 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. On Saturday, play goes to one floor—the Main Arena. The girls' and boys' consolation championships will be played at 9:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m., respectively, followed by the girls' and boys' third place games at 1:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. The girls' and boys' state championships are scheduled for 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m., respectively. NDHSAA TOURNAMENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Purpose: To elevate standards of Good Sportsmanship and to encourage the growth of responsible citizenship among the students, member schools, and their personnel.

Fundamentals of Good Sportsmanship

- 1- Know, appreciate and understand the rules of the contest.
- 2- Show respect for the officials. Good Sportsmanship implies the willingness to accept and abide by the decisions of the officials.
- 3- Show respect for the opponent at all times. Good Sportsmanship is the Golden Rule in action.
- 4- Recognize and appreciate the skill of performance regardless of team affiliation.
- 5- Maintain self-control at all times. Good Sportsmanship is a responsibility of all who are involved in the game.
- 6- Show a positive attitude in cheering, refraining from intimidation or negative cheering. Good Sportsmanship is cheering your own team "on to victory."

Acts of Misconduct

- 1- Throwing of any object onto the playing floor or in the stands.
- 2- Behavior deemed dangerous or which interferes with the rights of others to watch the game.
- 3- Possessing, consuming or being under the influence of chemicals.
- 4- Use of obscene, profane or abusive language or gestures, signs, posters or banners which show disrespect for opponent's team, officials, cheerleaders, band or other performing groups.
- 5- The use of noise-makers.
- 6- Entry onto the playing surface at any time.

Information Concerning the North Dakota High School Activities Association

Membership
The NDHSHAA is a voluntary non-profit organization of the high schools in the State of North Dakota. All schools eligible for membership belong to the Association. Membership is granted upon application of the School Board, at which time the school agrees to enforce the rules which the members have established and to participate in the legislative process of modification and revision of rules to fit the changing needs of member schools and students.

II. Purpose as per NDHSHAA Constitution

The purpose of the Association is to contribute to the education of high school boys and girls of North Dakota by:

- Administering a program of Interscholastic activities, clinics, contests and festivals among its member schools;
- Elevating the standards of good sportsmanship and encouraging growth in good citizenship, not only of high school students, but also of all others who come in contact with the school activities;
- Protecting member schools, students, and personnel from exploitation by special interest groups;
- Encouraging pride in scholastic achievement as a fundamental basis for a well-balanced activities program;
- Supplementing the dramatic, literary, music and physical education programs of the schools and giving due emphasis to those tendencies which promise best to promote the mental and physical health and social well-being of all students.

III. Brief History

The activities association was founded in 1908 under the name of the High School League and originally was concerned only with athletics. In 1923 the state organization became affiliated with the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. A full-time executive director was employed in 1949, an assistant was added in 1963, a girls' sports supervisor in 1973, and a music and speech coordinator in 1978.

In 1950 the Consolidated League, an organization of the smaller schools of the state, affiliated with the High Schools League, thereby uniting all high schools of the state under one organization. Music and speech activities were placed under the direction of the Association in 1955, and the name was changed to the North Dakota High School Activities Association at that time. Schools in the League were all one class for basketball competition from 1908 to 1932. A two-class system was used from 1933 to 1947 and a three-class system from 1948 to 1963. In 1964 the two-class system was restored and this arrangement has been in effect since then up to the present time. Official state champions have been named in boys' track since 1908 and in boys' basketball since 1914. Official champions in other sports were later added as follows: boys' golf and boys' tennis 1938, baseball 1950; wrestling 1959; boys' cross country 1961; boys' hockey 1967; girls' track, golf and tennis 1966; girls' gymnastics 1969; girls' basketball 1974; girls' swimming 1974, boys' swimming 1975 and girls' cross country 1979. State football champions were determined off and on between 1916 and 1959, when the practice was discontinued, but again restored in 1975. Basketball tournaments for girls were conducted by the Consolidated League for a number of years and by the NDHSHAA from 1951 to 1960, at which time they were discontinued because of the small number of schools fielding teams. Girls' basketball was reinstated as an Association-sponsored activity in 1973 on a district level, with separate state Class A and Class B champions being named since 1974. Class A girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1984 and Class B girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1989. Boys' state soccer champions were first named in 1995 and girls' state soccer champions in 1996. Girls' state hockey champions were first named in 2003. Girls' softball champions were first named in 2009 with separated Division A & B champions in 2012.

IV. ACTIVITIES

SPORTSMANSHIP

Good sportsmanship is conduct which imposes a type of self-control involving honest rivalry, courteous relations and graceful acceptance of results. School spirit is a reflection of those attitudes and behavior. Spectator etiquette requires that we refrain from displaying any action to taunt the opponent's fan section such as carrying flags around the court and stopping to taunt the opponent's fan section. This may lead to competition among observers which is mistakenly under the auspice of good sportsmanship.

Spectators are asked to remain in their designated fan section. Approaching the opponent's fan section with the purpose of taunting and baiting will not be tolerated. The carrying of flags around the court will not be allowed.

Good sportsmanship shall be defined as those qualities which are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. An awareness is expected of the impact of an individual's influence on the behavior of others. Good sportsmanship is viewed as a concrete measure of the understanding and commitment to fair play, ethical behavior and integrity.

V. Registration of Officials and Interpretation Meetings

More than 1,497 officials are registered with NDHSHAA. These men and women are furnished rule books for the sports in which they officiate, and examinations are provided annually in baseball, basketball, football, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, volleyball and wrestling. Officials are also required to complete on-line rules clinics in all sports and workshops in baseball, basketball, football, softball, volleyball and wrestling.

VI. Cheerleader Clinics

The NDHSHAA has recognized the importance of safety in cheerleading. Because of this, the Association has added rules/safety clinics for head cheer coaches of all member schools who have cheerleaders. These clinics recognize the importance of informing cheer coaches of proper safety techniques as well as emphasizing the responsibility of cheerleaders for sportsmanship and crowd control.

VII. Organization of Association

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors consists of 11 members. Three Board members shall be chosen from Class A Schools, one each from two geographical areas and one at-large. Four administrators of Class B schools, one high school principal as a member-at-large, and one athletic administrator. These representatives are elected by the membership as a whole, with each school having one vote. In addition, a representative of the North Dakota School Boards Association and the Superintendent of Public Instruction serve as a member of the Board.

REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

The superintendent or high school principal or athletic administrator of each school serves as a member of the representative assembly, with each school being entitled to one vote. An annual meeting is held each year to adopt rules and regulations governing inter-school contests and eligibility regulations. All such rules are made by the representative assembly.

DISTRICT COMMITTEES

The district activities are controlled and managed by committees elected by school officials in each area.

EXECUTIVE OFFICERS

The administration of the various programs and the implementation of the policies of the Association are placed in the hands of an executive secretary and four assistants who are employed by the Association.

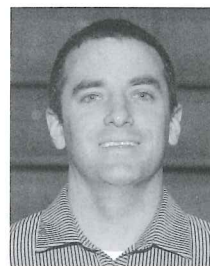

Ron is a graduate of Carson High School and Dickinson State University. Ron taught at Simle Middle School from 2002-2012, currently he is a teacher at Century High School.

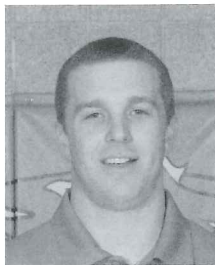
Ron and his wife Jill have two daughters, Rani (husband David and grandson Ryken) and Ree.

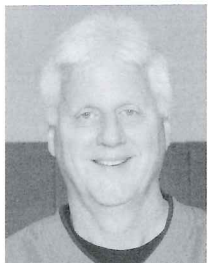
Jim is currently a 6th grade Social Studies teacher at Simle Middle. His wife, Kylie, is also a teacher with the Bismarck Public School System.

1991 NDHSAA Class A Girls' Basketball State Champions – Bismarck

The 1991 North Dakota High School Activities Association Class A Girls' Basketball State Tournament was held November 14-16 at the Bismarck Civic Center where a hometown team – Bismarck High – made program history.

Bismarck entered state with momentum after winning the West Region Tournament a week prior and kept rolling, ultimately winning its first state championship in team history.

The 1991 Demons were coached by Gary Schauer. Bismarck was a veteran group in 1991 with five seniors – Kim Potter, Heidi Thurlby, Chantel Hoff, Suzy Mayer and Shannon McQuade.

Bismarck averaged 56 points per game and allowed opponents 43.8 ppg. The 1991 Demons were a strong rebounding squad averaging 41 rebounds per game led by McQuade (10.8 rebounds per game) and Hoff (eight rebounds per game).

1991 was the Demons' 10th state tournament appearance in program history. Four different seasons – 1976, 1977, 1983, 1985 – Bismarck had made it to the championship game, but had finished runner up each year.

1991 was the Demons' year. Bismarck opened the state tournament with a 49-31 win over Grafton in the quarterfinals and followed up with a 36-23 victory over Fargo Shanley in the semifinals.

The state championship game would be a rematch of the West Region final with the Demons squaring off against Mandan. Mandan had defeated Bismarck twice during the regular season, but in the two postseason meetings between the Western Dakota Association rivals, the Demons edged the Braves.

Bismarck posted a 54-46 win over Mandan in the championship game and finished its season with a 21-4 record.

MINOT MAGICIANS

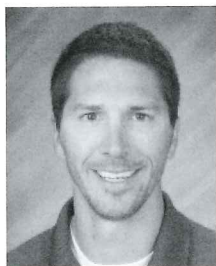

WEST FARGO SHEYENNE MUSTANGS

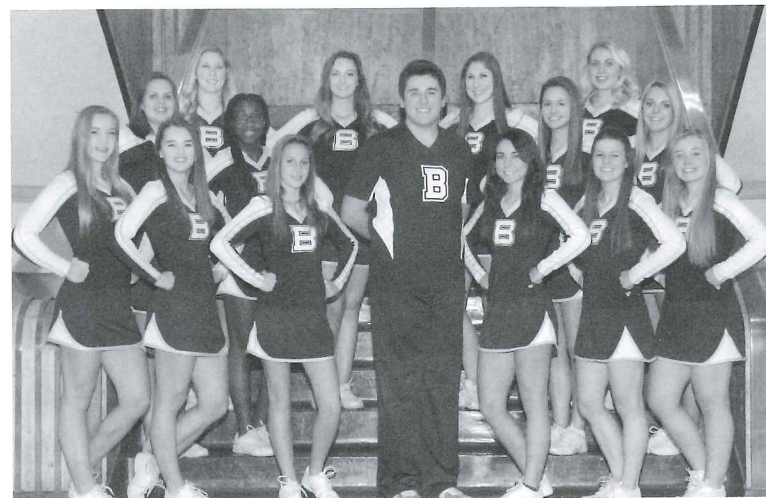

1967 NDHSAA Class A Boys' Basketball State Champions – Mandan

Mandan and Fargo Shanley appeared destined to meet in the championship game of the 1967 North Dakota High School Activities Association Class A Boys' Basketball State Tournament.

The Braves – No. 1 – and the Deacons – No. 2 – maintained the top two spots in the Class A polls all season long and entered state with identical 22-1 records.

The meeting between the two squads finally occurred March 11, 1967 at the University of North Dakota Fieldhouse in Grand Forks. The Braves edged the Deacons 58-56 in overtime to capture their second straight Class A state title.

Mandan defeated Wahpeton 74-56 in the quarterfinals and followed up with a 60-48 victory over Grand Forks St. James in the semifinals to set up the title game with the Deacons, who had beat Bismarck and Bottineau to get to the championship game.

Shanley and Mandan featured talented offenses. Both squads averaged 70 points per game, but the championship game proved to be a defensive battle.

Shanley grabbed an early lead, but Mandan rallied to take a 29-27 lead at halftime. In the third quarter, the Deacons regained the advantage and led 39-30 with four minutes left in the third, but once again the Braves answered and when the third quarter ended it was Mandan on top 42-40.

The margin between the two teams remained close into the fourth quarter. The game was tied six different times in the final quarter of regulation. Shanley led 54-52 in the final minute, but Mandan senior guard Bob Just got a 16-foot jumper to fall with 18 seconds on the clock to tie the game and force an eventual overtime period – the first time a Class A championship game had gone into overtime in state history.

Shanley and Mandan traded field goals in the first two possessions of overtime. Later, the Deacons held the ball hoping to get the game's last shot, but Shanley's Jeff Coleman got tied up by Mandan's Bill Cook on a drive to the basket forcing a jump ball. Mandan won the tip and with six seconds left in overtime Braves senior forward Scott Howe passed the ball to forward Bob Green, who was fouled.

Green made both of the bonus free throws to help put Mandan on top 58-56. Seconds later, the Braves were in the midst of celebrating a 25-1 season and a state championship.

Mandan was led by Green, who scored 28 points in the championship game followed by Just with 13 and Cook with 12. Howe grabbed 21 rebounds in the game and 5-foot-5 junior guard Rich Carrier kept the Braves one step ahead of Shanley's full-court press defense that had been very effective.

1992 NDHSAA CLASS A BOYS' BASKETBALL STATE CHAMPIONS - WEST FARGO

Though West Fargo's roster lost several key players from the 1991 Class A State Championship squad, the 1992 Packers proved they could still compete at a high level returning to postseason play with a mindset on repeating as champions.

The 1992 Packers continued the success brought to the program by head coach Bob Torggrimson. Several veterans from the 1991 state championship team returned and West Fargo also received important contributions from several first-year varsity players making it a balanced program capable of making another run late in the season.

During the season, the Packers averaged 65 points per game shooting just under 49 percent from the field and 73 percent from the free-throw line. Defensively, West Fargo held its opponents to 47 points per game while forcing an average of 20 turnovers a game. Only losses by one point and another by two points stood between West Fargo and a perfect season. Nevertheless, the Packers' 23-2 record remains the best in school history.

Under Torggrimson, the Packers were known for their tenacious defense and the 1992 squad put that defense on display at the East Region Tournament. West Fargo opened with a 73-33 victory against Devils Lake and followed up with a 52-28 win over Jamestown in the semifinals – holding the Blue Jays to just four points in the second half. In the East Region championship, the Packers held Fargo South to 10 points in the first half and won the game 60-47.

In the state tournament, the Packers defeated Williston 66-45 in the first round, before outlasting Bismarck Century 56-45 in the semi-final round. In the State Championship, the Packers defeated Minot 65-50.

While the Packers were a defense-focused team, they also had their share of firepower offensively. The 1992 team featured three players who scored over 1,000 points in their careers, including two players who ended their respective careers as the all-time leading scorer in school history. The team was comprised of a Mr. Basketball winner, two other Mr. Basketball finalists, and the school's all-time leaders in rebounds, assists, and steals.

Coach Torggrimson finished his illustrious coaching career with more than 500 victories, and has been inducted into the Coaching Hall of Fame in both North Dakota and Minnesota. In his fourteen years at West Fargo, his teams qualified for the State Tournament nine times, winning three titles, and finishing second, third, fourth, and fifth once each.

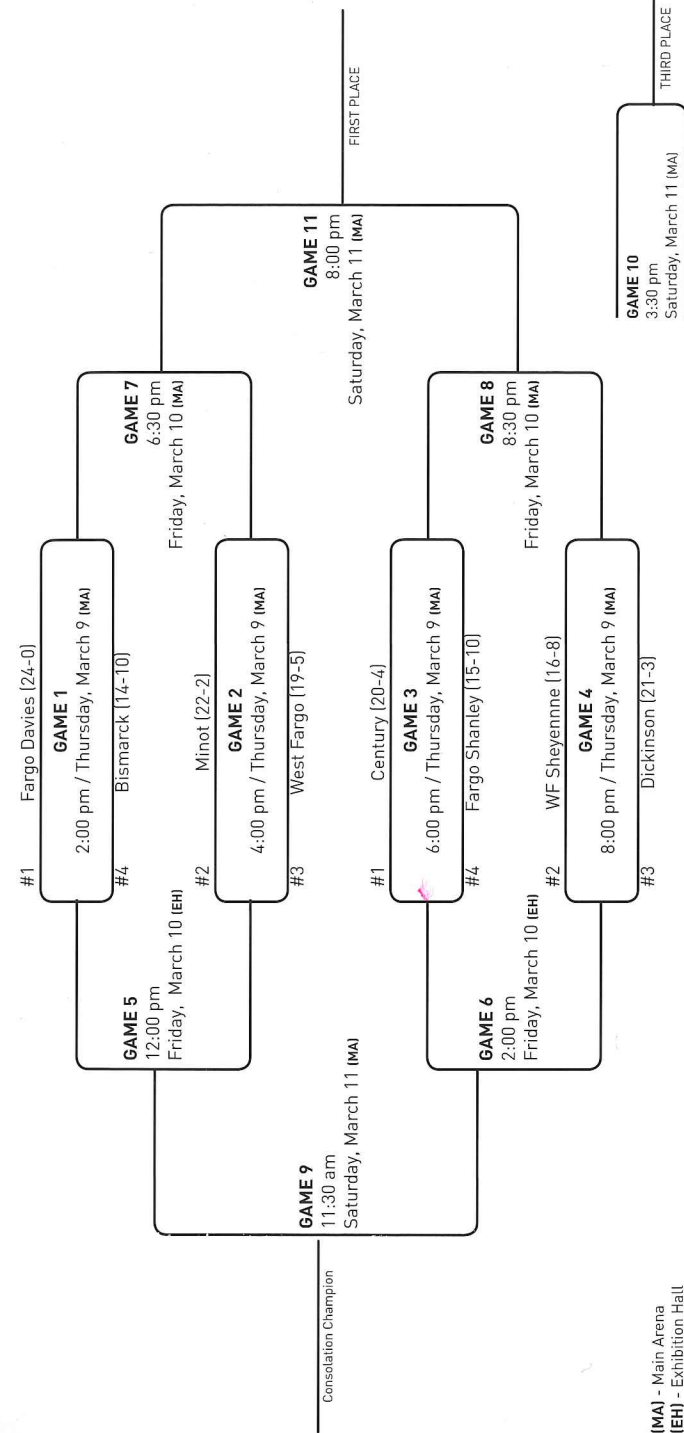

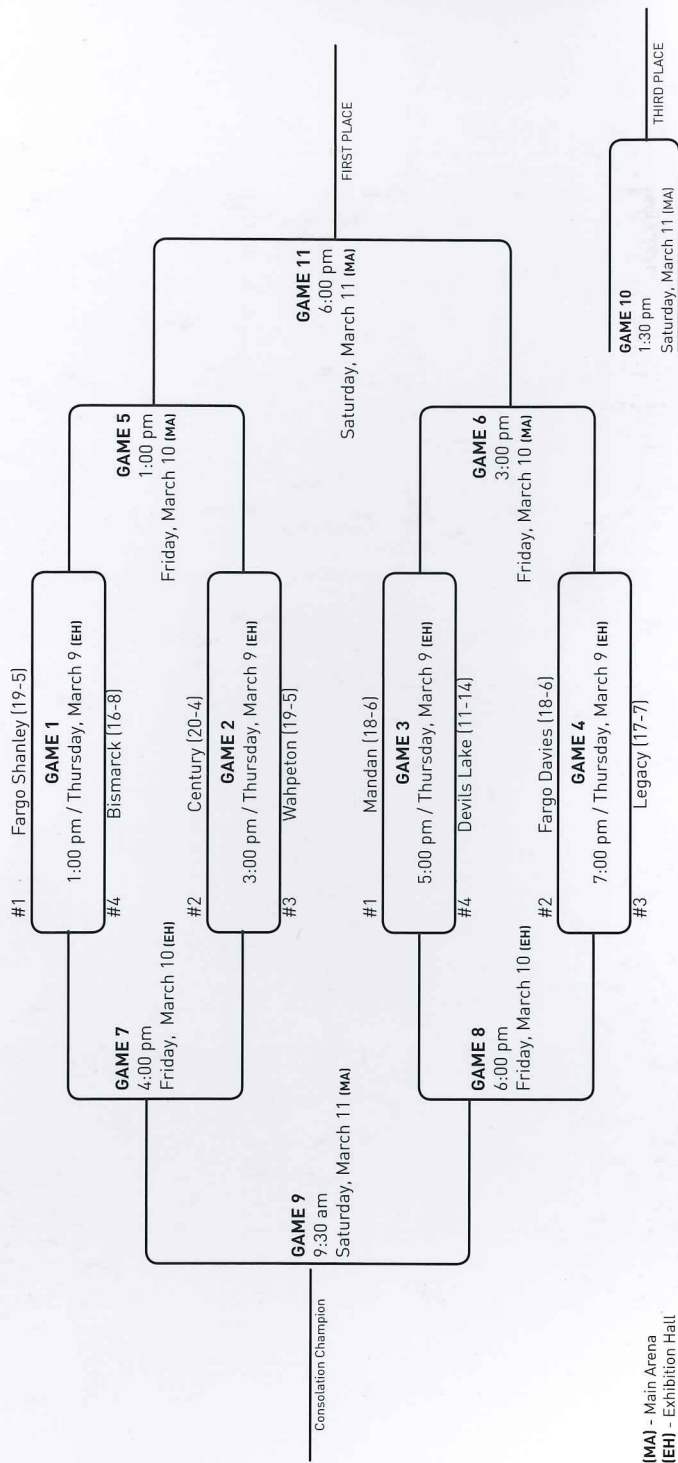
