2019 STATE BOYS' AND GIRLS' BASKETBALL Bismarck Welcomes the State Class A Boys' and Girls' Basketball Tournament

This year marks the 16th year of the combined State Girls' and Boys' Class A Basketball Tournament and the 7th time that the Bismarck Event Center has served as the host site. The tournament will run for three days, on two floors the first two days, and one floor on Saturday. One floor will be in the Main Arena and the Event Center's Exhibit Hall will be the site of the second floor.

All of Thursday's games will be considered a single session. Friday will be divided into two sessions to allow for television coverage. Saturday will be considered as one session. On Thursday, the girls' first round will be played in the Exhibit Hall starting at 1:00 p.m. with the boys' first round played in the Main Arena starting at 2:00 p.m. Friday's schedule in the Exhibit Hall starts with the boys' consolation semi-finals, followed by the girls' consolation semi-finals. The semi-finals for the girls will lead off Friday's action in the Main Arena at 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m., and the boys' semi-finals will be played at 6:30 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. On Saturday, play goes to one floor—the Main Arena. The girls' and boys' consolation championships will be played at 9:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m., respectively, followed by the girls' and boys' third place games at 1:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. The girls' and boys' state championships are scheduled for 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m., respectively. Purpose: To elevate standards of Good Sportsmanship and to encourage the growth of responsible citizenship among the students, member schools, and their personnel.

Fundamentals of Good Sportsmanship

- 1- Know, appreciate and understand the rules of the contest.
- 2- Show respect for the officials. Good Sportsmanship implies the willingness to accept and abide by the decisions of the officials.
- 3- Show respect for the opponent at all times. Good Sportsmanship is the Golden Rule in action.
- 4- Recognize and appreciate the skill of performance regardless of team affiliation.
- 5- Maintain self-control at all times. Good Sportsmanship is a responsibility of all who are involved in the game.
- 6- Show a positive attitude in cheering, refraining from intimidation or negative cheering. Good Sportsmanship is cheering your own team "on to victory."

Acts of Misconduct

- 1- Throwing of any object onto the playing floor or in the stands.
- 2- Behavior deemed dangerous or which interferes with the rights of others to watch the game.
- 3- Possessing, consuming or being under the influence of chemicals.
- 4- Use of obscene, profane or abusive language or gestures, signs, posters or banners which show disrespect for opponent's team, officials, cheerleaders, band or other performing groups.
- 5- The use of noise-makers.
- 6- Entry onto the playing surface at any time.

Information Concerning the North Dakota High School Activities Association

Membership

The NDSHAA is a voluntary non-profit organization of the high schools in the State of North Dakota. All schools eligible for membership belong to the Association. Membership is granted upon application of the School Board, at which time the school agrees to enforce the rules which the members have established and to participate in the legislative process of modification and revision of rules to fit the changing needs of member schools and students.

II. Purpose as per NDHSAA Constitution

The purpose of the Association is to contribute to the education of high school boys and girls of North Dakota by:

- a. Administering a program of Interscholastic activities, clinics, contests and festivals among its member schools:
- b. Elevating the standards of good sportsmanship and encouraging growth in good citizenship, not only of high school students, but also of all others who come in contact with the school activities;
- c. Protecting member schools, students, and personnel from exploitation by special interest groups;
- d. Encouraging pride in scholastic achievement as a fundamental basis for a well-balanced activities program;
- e. Supplementing the dramatic, literary, music and physical education programs of the schools and giving due emphasis to those tendencies which promise best to promote the mental and physical health and social well-being of all students.

III. Brief History

The activities association was founded in 1908 under the name of the High School League and originally was concerned only with athletics. In 1923 the state organization became affiliated with the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. A full-time executive director was employed in 1949, an assistant was added in 1963, a girls' sports supervisor in 1973, and a music and speech coordinator in 1978.

In 1950 the Consolidated League, an organization of the smaller schools of the state, affiliated with the High Schools League, thereby uniting all high schools of the state under one organization. Music and speech activities were placed under the direction of the Association in 1955, and the name was changed to the North Dakota High School Activities Association at that time. Schools in the League were all one class for basketball competition from 1908 to 1932. A two-class system was used from 1933 to 1947 and a three-class system from 1948 to 1963. In 1964 the two-class system was restored and this arrangement has been in effect since then up to the present time. Official state champions have been named in boys' track since 1908 and in boys' basketball since 1914. Official champions in other sports were later added as follows: boys' golf and boys' tennis 1938, baseball 1950; wrestling 1959; boys' cross country 1961; boys' hockey 1967; girls' track, golf and tennis 1966; girls' gymnastics 1969; girls' basketball 1974; girls' swimming 1974, boys' swimming 1975 and girls cross country 1979. State football champions were determined off and on between 1916 and 1959, when the practice was discontinued, but again restored in 1975. Basketball tournaments for girls were conducted by the Consolidated League for a number of years and by the NDHSAA from 1951 to 1960, at which time they were discontinued because of the small number of schools fielding teams. Girls' basketball was reinstated as an Associationsponsored activity in 1973 on a district level, with separate state Class A and Class B champions being named since 1974. Class A girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1984 and Class B girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1989. Boys' state soccer champions were first named in 1995 and girls' state soccer champions in 1996. Girls' state hockey champions were first named in 2003. Girls' softball champions were first named in 2009 with separated Division A & B champions in 2012.

IV. ACTIVITIES

The following chart indicates the activities sponsored by the Association, the number of senior high schools participating and the approximate number of students participating in interscholastic competition during the 2015-16 schoo

Good sportsmanship is conduct which imposes a type of self-control involving honest rivalry, courteous relations and graceful acceptance of results. School spirit is a reflection of those attitudes and behavior. Spectator etiquette requires that we refrain from displaying any action to taunt the opponent's fan section such as carrying flags around the court and stopping to taunt the opponent's fan section. This may lead to competition among observers which is mistakenly under the auspice of good sportsmanship.

Spectators are asked to remain in their designated fan section. Approaching the opponent's fan section with the purpose of taunting and baiting will not be tolerated. The carrying of flags around the court will not be allowed.

Good sportsmanship shall be defined as those qualities which are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. An awareness is expected of the impact of an individual's influence on the behavior of others. Good sportsmanship is viewed as a concrete measure of the understanding and commitment to fair play, ethical behavior and integrity.

V. Registration of Officials and Interpretation Meetings

In the 2017-18 school year 1,460 officials registered with the NDHSAA. These men and women are furnished rule books for the sports in which they officiate, and examinations are provided annually in baseball, basketball, football, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, volleyball and wrestling. Officials are also required to complete online rules clinics in all sports and workshops in baseball, basketball, football, softball, volleyball and wrestling.

VI. Cheerleader Clinics

The NDHSAA has recognized the importance of safety in cheerleading. Because of this, the Association has added rules/safety clinics for head cheer coaches of all member schools who have cheerleaders. These clinics recognize the importance of informing cheer coaches of proper safety techniques as well as emphasizing the responsibility of cheerleaders for sportsmanship and crowd control.

VII. Organization of Association

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors consists of 11 members. Three Board members shall be chosen from Class A Schools, one each from two geographical areas and one at-large. Four administrators of Class B schools, one high school principal as a member-at-large, and one athletic administrator. These representatives are elected by the membership as a whole, with each school having one vote. In addition, a representative of the North Dakota School Boards Association and the Superintendent of Public Instruction serve as a member of the Board.

REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

The superintendent or high school principal or athletic administrator of each school serves as a member of the representative assembly, with each school being entitled to one vote. An annual meeting is held each year to adopt rules and regulations governing inter-school contests and eligibility regulations. All such rules are made

DISTRICT COMMITTEES

The district activities are controlled and managed by committees elected by school officials in each area.

EXECUTIVE OFFICERS

The administration of the various programs and the implementation of the policies of the Association are placed in the hands of an executive secretary and four assistants who are employed by the Association.

1993 Class A Girls Basketball State Champions – West Fargo Packers

The 1993 West Fargo girls basketball team received some surprising preseason honors before taking the court as the Packers were tabbed the top-ranked team according to the North Dakota Hoopster Magazine.

After a 15-4 regular season, West Fargo prepared for the East Region Tournament. The Packers defeated Jamestown and Grand Forks Central – teams West Fargo had split games with during the regular season – to advance to the East Region Championship against defending state champion Fargo South. The Bruins edged the Packers 41-32 in the championship game, but a state tournament berth had been secured.

The 1993 Class A State Tournament field was made up of Mandan, Grand Forks Central, West Fargo, Bismarck St. Mary's, Bismarck Century, Fargo North, Fargo South and Minot. The Packers defeated St. Mary's 55-42 and advanced to the state semifinals for the first time in program history.

In the semifinals, the Packers would meet Grand Forks Central for the fourth time. West Fargo played tentative against the Knights on the big stage, but rallied thanks in part to a defensive switch to tie the game and force overtime. The Packers emerged victorious 40-39 and advanced to the state title game against Fargo North.

The Packers played relaxed and with great confidence in the championship game against the Spartans. West Fargo won 56-33 to win its first ever state championship in girls basketball and finished the season 20-5. Leah Tilly, Kara Thulin and Nichole Walla were named to the All-Tournament team. Walla, Jennifer Rud and Nicole Vetter were selected as All-Eastern Dakota Conference players.

2019 NDHSAA Distinguished Service Award - Dr. Jim Haussler



Dr. Jim Haussler, former Activities Director at Bismarck Public Schools, has been named a recipient of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Distinguished Service Award. The NDHSAA's Distinguished Service Award recognizes individuals and organizations that have made positive contributions to interscholastic activities in the state.

Haussler served as Activities Director for Bismarck Public Schools from 1992 through his retirement in 2015 (23 years). During his tenure, the Demons of Bismarck High School and Patriots of Bismarck Century High School won a combined total of 232 region titles and 128 state championships. Prior to serving as AD in Bismarck, Haussler taught and coached at Finley-Sharon High School and New England High School. He also accepted his first administrative position at Aberdeen Central High School in 1983 serving as the school's assistant principal and athletic director. From 1984-1992, Haussler served as

assistant principal for both Bismarck High and Bismarck Century.

In 1996 and 2006 Haussler was named North Dakota Athletic Director of the Year and was recognized as Regional Athletic Director of the Year on four occasions. Haussler became a Certified Athletic Administrator (CAA) in 1997. In 2002, Haussler was recognized by the North Dakota Coaches Association with the Special Recognition Award. He was nominated as a finalist for the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Athletic Director of the Year in 2004, 2007, 2010, 2013 and 2016. He was named National Athletic Administrator of the Year in 2016.

In 2011, he was inducted into the North Dakota Track and Field Hall of Fame. Haussler was inducted into the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2013. He was recognized with the University of Jamestown's Rollie Greeno Award for excellence in education in 2014. In 2015, Jim was awarded the Special Achievement Award by the North Dakota Associated Press Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association. That same year, the new gymnasium at Bismarck's Legacy High School was named the 'James Haussler' Gymnasium. Jim was inducted into the North Dakota Interscholastic Administrators Association (NDIAAA) Hall of Fame in 2016.

Haussler managed 237 NDHSAA regional and state tournaments. He is a member of the North Dakota Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (retired member), North Dakota High School Coaches Association (NDHSCA), North Dakota Officials Association (NDOA) and Good Shepard Lutheran Church. He served as the chairman of the Bismarck Community Bowl Authority (BCBA) from 1997-2015. After his retirement as an athletic administrator, Haussler managed the MDU Resources Bismarck Community Bowl for three years. In 2018, Haussler accepted an interim position as Superintendent of the Bismarck Public Schools and served in that position until March 1 of this year.

Haussler is a 1973 graduate of Monango High School in Monango, North Dakota. He obtained his Bachelor of Arts Degree from Jamestown College in 1978 with a double major in History/Political Science and Health, Physical Education and Recreation (HPER). Haussler was a four-year letter winner in football for the Jimmies. Haussler obtained his Master degrees in Educational Administration and HPER from South Dakota State University in 1983 and his Doctorate in Educational Administration from the University of North Dakota in 1994.

Jim and his wife, Julie, a retired teacher at Mandan Middle School, have five children: Jeremy (married, works for North Dakota National Guard), Jon (married, works for Arizona National Guard), Jamie (teacher in Roberts, Montana), Tessa (a social worker) and Cara, a sophomore at Bismarck State College. They also have five grandchildren: Madison (16), Jaxon (12), Cooper (10), Colt (10) and Hadley (8).





In addition to being the head basketball coach, Adam is an assistant football coach and teaches mathematics at WFHS. Coach Palczewski lives in West Fargo.


WAHPETON HUSKIES

1969 Class A Boys Basketball State Champions - GF Red River


The 1969 North Dakota High School Activities Association Class A Boys Basketball State Tournament was played at the University of North Dakota Fieldhouse in Grand Forks. Teams qualifying for state in 1969 were Grand Forks Red River, Grand Forks St. James, Dickinson Trinity, Valley City, Minot, Fort Yates, Fargo Shanley and Williston.

Red River, the eventual state champion, clinched a spot in the state tournament defeating Grafton 63-47 in the semifinals of the Northeast Region Tournament. Red River edged Grand Forks St. James 58-48 in the Northeast Region championship game giving the squad plenty of momentum heading into the state tournament. Red River had been runner up the year before at state to the Williston Coyotes and would be looking to return to the state championship game for a chance at redemption.

At State, Red River topped Minot 80-61 in the quarterfinals and followed up with a 67-31 win over Valley City in the semifinals. Red River would play Grand Forks St. James – a rematch of the Northeast Region title game – in the Class A state championship.

The Roughriders once again defeated the Royals – this time by a 70-52 margin to win its first NDHSAA Class A state championship after only being established as a high school in 1967.

1994 NDHSAA CLASS A BOYS BASKETBALL STATE CHAMPIONS – BISMARCK

The path to the state title consisted of a 15-4 regular season record - 3 straight wins at the WDA. The first game consisting of a huge comeback win of St. Marys 55-53. The second win in the WDA only saw a huge 13 point lead get cut in the final 4 minutes but Danny Murray being the hero of game two, hitting a shot at the buzzer to defeat Minot 64-62. The third game in the wild west found top seeded Mandan and the Demons in a shoot out. But redemption was on the mind of the Demons from the last regular season contest, only to have the Demons come out on top 44-41 to win the West Region Championship.


First round of the state tourney matched up the Demons against a very powerful Grand Forks Central. It was all Grand Forks in the first half and the Demons had to chip away in the second half to eventually pull away late in the 4th Quarter winning 54-46. The second round proved to me much of the same with a very close game with the Demons coming out on top 37-35 over Fargo North. Then onto the championship. Once again, we found a rematch of the week prior - The Demons and the Mandan Braves. The Demons started the night going 0-10 from the field and Mandan jumped to an early 8-3 lead. This was until a quick 11-0 spurt from the Demons, most in Part from key reserve Brian Wallner. The Demons led at half 16-13 - possibly the lowest scoring half in State Tourney history. Despite the poor shooting of the Demons, the low scoring from the Mandan Braves was due in part to the stingy defense the Demons continued to carry throughout the State tournament. No matter the shooting percentage by either team the Bismarck Demons claimed their first State Championship since 1959, a 35 year drought, beating the Mandan Braves 48-30.
