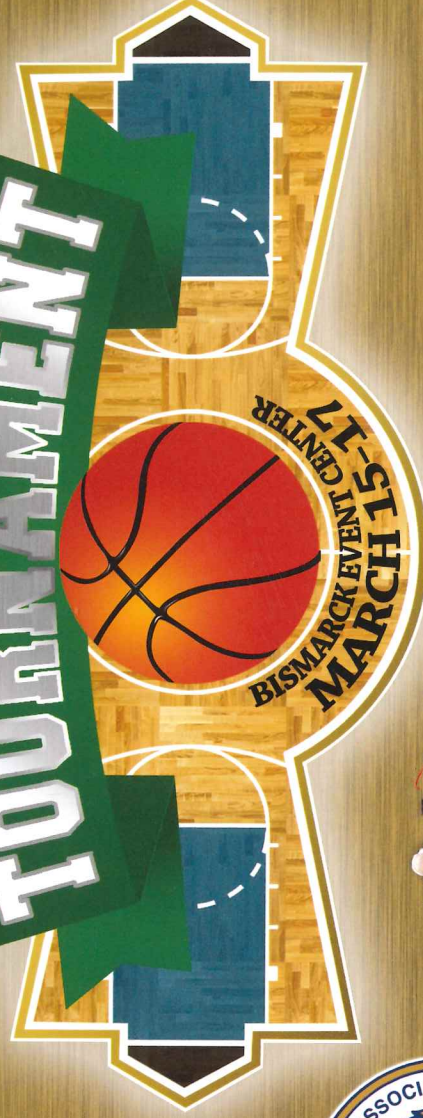

## NDHSAA TOURNAMENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Purpose: To elevate standards of Good Sportsmanship and to encourage the growth of responsible citizenship among the students, member schools, and their personnel.

### Fundamentals of Good Sportsmanship

1. Know, appreciate, and understand the rules of the contest.
2. Show respect for the officials. Good sportsmanship implies the willingness to accept and abide by the decisions of the officials.
3. Show respect for the opponent at all times. Good Sportsmanship is the Golden Rule in action.
4. Recognize and appreciate the skill of performance regardless of team affiliation.
5. Maintain self control at all times. Good sportsmanship is a responsibility of all who are involved in the game.
6. Show a positive attitude in cheering, refraining from intimidation or negative cheering. Good sportsmanship is cheering your own team "on to victory."

### Acts of Misconduct

1. Throwing of any object onto the playing floor or in the stands.
2. Behavior deemed dangerous or which interferes with the rights of others to watch the game.
3. Possessing, consuming, or being under the influence of chemicals.
4. Use of obscene, profane, or abusive language or gestures, signs, posters, or banners which show disrespect for opponent's team, officials, cheerleaders, band or other performing groups
5. The use of noise-makers.
6. Entry onto the playing surface at any time.

## Information Concerning the North Dakota High School Activities Association

### Membership

The NDHAA is a voluntary non-profit organization of the high schools in the state of North Dakota. All schools eligible for membership belong to the Association. Membership is granted upon application of the School Board, at which time the school agrees to enforce the rules which the members have established and to participate in the legislative process of modification and revision of rules to fit the changing needs of member schools and students.

### II. Purpose as per NDHAA Constitution

The purpose of the Association is to contribute to the education of high school boys and girls of North Dakota by:

- Administering a program of interscholastic activities, clinics, contests and festivals among its member schools.
- Elevating the standards of good sportsmanship and encouraging growth in good citizenship, not only of high school students, but also of all others who come in contact with school activities.
- Protecting member schools, students, and personnel from exploitation of special interest groups.
- Encouraging pride in scholastic achievement as a fundamental basis for a well-balanced activities program.
- Supplementing the dramatic, literary, music and physical education programs of the schools and giving due emphasis to those tendencies which promise best to promote the mental and physical health and social well-being of all students.

### III. Brief History

The activities association was founded in 1908 under the name of the High School League and originally was concerned only with athletics. In 1923 the state organization became affiliated with the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations (NFHS). A full-time executive director was employed in 1949, an assistant was added in 1963, a girls sports supervisor in 1973, and a music and speech coordinator in 1978.

In 1950 the Consolidated League, an organization of the smaller schools of the state, affiliated with the High Schools League, thereby uniting all high schools of the state under one organization. Music and speech activities were placed under the direction of the Association in 1955, and the name was changed to the North Dakota High School Activities Association at that time. Schools in the League were all one class for basketball competition from 1908 to 1932. A two-class system was used from 1933 to 1947 and a three-class system from 1948 to 1963. In 1964 the two-class system was restored and this arrangement has been in effect since then up to the present time. Official state champions have been named in other sports were later added as follows: boys golf and boys tennis 1938, baseball 1950; wrestling 1959; boys cross country 1961; boys hockey 1967; girls track, golf and tennis 1966; girls gymnastics 1969; girls basketball 1974; girls swimming 1974; boys swimming 1975 and girls cross country 1979. State football champions were determined off and on between 1916 and 1959, when the practice was discontinued, but were restored in 1975 when NDHAA officially sponsored Class A, Class B and 9-man championship games. The NDHAA Dakota Bowl - a one day event where all three football championship games are played - was introduced in 1993. In 1997, the current four division format (Division AAA, Division AA, Division A and 9-man) for NDHAA football was introduced. Basketball tournaments for girls were conducted by the Consolidated League for a number of years and by the NDHAA from 1951 to 1960, at which time they were discontinued because of the small number of schools fielding teams. Girls basketball was reinstated as an NDHAA-sponsored activity in 1973 on a district level, with separate state Class A and Class B champions being named since 1974. Class A girls volleyball state champions were first named in 1984 and Class B girls volleyball state champions were first named in 1989. Boys state soccer champions were first named in 1995 and girls state soccer champions in 1996. Girls state hockey champions were first named in 2003. Girls softball champions were first named in 2009 with separated Division A & B champions in 2012.

### SPORTSMANSHIP

Good sportsmanship is conduct which imposes a type of self-control involving honest rivalry, courteous relations and graceful acceptance of results. School spirit is a reflection of those attitudes and behavior. Spectator etiquette requires that we refrain from displaying any action to taunt the opponent's fan section such as carrying flags around the court and stopping to taunt the opponent's fan section. This may lead to competition among observers which is mistakenly under the auspice of good sportsmanship.

Spectators are asked to remain in their designated fan section. Approaching the opponent's fan section with the purpose of taunting and baiting will not be tolerated. The carrying of flags around the court will not be allowed.

Good sportsmanship shall be defined as those qualities which are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. An awareness is expected of the impact of an individual's influence on the behavior of others. Good sportsmanship is viewed as a concrete measure of the understanding and commitment to fair play, ethical behavior and integrity.

### IV. ACTIVITIES

### V. Registration of Officials and Interpretation Meetings

In 2016-17 school year 1,471 officials registered with the NDHAA. These men and women are furnished rule books for the sports in which they officiate, and examinations are provided annually in baseball, basketball, football, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, volleyball and wrestling. Officials are also required to complete online rules clinics in all sports and workshops in baseball, basketball, football, softball, volleyball and wrestling.

### VI. Cheerleader Clinics

The NDHAA has recognized the importance of safety in cheerleading. Because of this, the Association has added rules/safety clinics for head cheer coaches of all member schools who have cheerleaders. These clinics recognize the importance of informing cheer coaches of proper safety techniques as well as emphasizing the responsibility of cheerleaders for sportsmanship and crowd control.

### VII. Organization of Association

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors consists of 11 members. Three Board members shall be chosen from Class A Schools, one each from two geographical areas and one at-large. Four administrators of Class B schools, one high school principal as a member-at-large and one athletic administrator. These representatives are elected by the membership as a whole, with each school having one vote. In addition, a representative of the North Dakota School Boards Association and the Superintendent of Public Instruction serve as a member of the Board.

#### REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

The superintendent or high school principal or athletic administrator of each school serves as a member of the representative assembly, with each school being entitled to one vote. An annual meeting is held each year to adopt rules and regulations governing interscholastic contests and eligibility regulations. All such rules are made by the representative assembly.

#### DISTRICT COMMITTEES

The district activities are controlled and managed by committees elected by school officials in each area.

#### EXECUTIVE OFFICERS

The administration of the various programs and the implementation of the policies of the Association are placed in the hands of the Executive Director, one Associate and three Executive Assistants who are employed by the Association.

## 1968 Class B Boys' Basketball State Champions – Central Cass Squirrels

The 1968 North Dakota High School Activities Association Class B Boys' Basketball State Tournament was played at the Minot Municipal Auditorium. The tournament field consisted of Hillsboro, McHenry, New England St. Mary's, Underwood, Wolford, Langdon, Casselton and Kenmare.

Hillsboro, Wolford, Central Cass, and New England St. Mary's each posted quarterfinal victories on the opening day of the tournament. Eventual state champion Central Cass charged past Kenmare 63-49 in the quarterfinals and would be paired up with New England St. Mary's in the semifinals.

Central Cass had entered the Class B tournament with only one loss at the hands of Class A Fargo Shanley. In 1967, the Squirrels had come within one game of state, but lost to Ellendale (1967 Class B state champions) in the Region 1 championship. Central Cass would meet Ellendale again in the 1968 Region 1 championship game only this time the Squirrels punched their ticket to state with a 78-55 victory.

The Squirrels kept rolling in Minot with a 76-68 semifinals win over New England St. Mary's despite trailing at halftime. Leading the way for Central Cass was senior Jerry Pyle who poured in 35 points against the Saints.

With a victory on Friday night the stage was set for Central Cass to play undefeated Wolford in the state championship game. The game lived up to its billing in the first half as both teams entered the halftime break tied 43-43. Central Cass would pull away in the second half and would emerge as state champions by a final score of 95-77 over the Wolves.

Jerry Pyle finished with 38 points for the Squirrels earning him tournament Most Valuable Player honors. Joining Pyle on the all-tournament team was Central Cass senior Jerry Ford, who had scored 17 points in the title game.

The state championship was the Squirrels' second in program history with the team's previous state title coming in 1955.

## 2018 NDHSAA'S DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

### Wayne Sanstead



Wayne Sanstead, former North Dakota Superintendent of Public Instruction and North Dakota High School Activities Association Board Member, has been named as a recipient of the NDHSAA's Distinguished Service Award.

Wayne Sanstead served as North Dakota's Superintendent of Public Instruction for 28 years prior to his 2012 retirement which ended a public service career that lasted almost a half century. During his tenure as North Dakota Superintendent of Public Instruction, Sanstead served on the North Dakota High School Activities Association's Board of Directors from 1987 to 2012.

According to the Council of Chief State School Officers, a Washington-based organization of education administrators, Sanstead was the longest-serving state school administrator in the country prior to his retirement.

Sanstead was first elected as North Dakota's Superintendent of Public Instruction in 1984 and held that post until January 1, 2013. He won re-election six times.

Colleagues and contemporaries described Sanstead as being a well-respected representative for North Dakota's public schools. Sanstead was known for his efforts outside of the office in visits to schools across the state and attending numerous extracurricular activities.

Sanstead also served North Dakota as a member of the state's house of representatives (1965-1970), a member of the state senate (1971-1973) and also was the state's 31st Lieutenant Governor under Governor Arthur A. Link (1973-1981).

Sanstead was born April 16, 1935 in Hot Springs, Arkansas and is a 1953 graduate of Minot High School. After graduating, Sanstead attended St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota receiving a Bachelor of Arts Degree in speech and political science in 1957. Sanstead taught one year in Luverne, Minnesota before moving back to Minot, where he taught for 18 years also serving as a speech and debate coach.

Sanstead received a Master's Degree in Public Address from Northwestern University in 1966 and later earned a Doctorate in Secondary Education from the University of North Dakota in 1969.

Sanstead is married to Mary Jane Sanstead and has two sons Timothy and Jonathan.

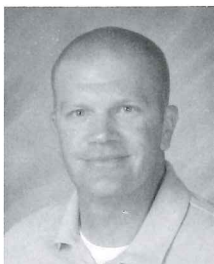


### ST. JOHN WOODCHUCKS

Brad Currently manages a construction business. Brad is married to Kathy and they have 4 children and 5 grandchildren.

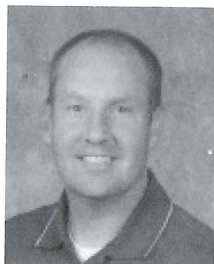


### HILLSBORO-CENTRAL VALLEY

### 1993 Class B Boys' Basketball State Champions – Central Valley Valiants

The 1993 North Dakota High School Activities Association Class B Boys' Basketball State Tournament was played at the Bismarck Civic Center. The tournament field consisted of Leeds-Wolford, Des Lacs-Burlington, Garrison, Sargent Central, Bottineau, Central Valley, Standing Rock and Gackle-Streeter.

The Valiants of Central Valley entered the state tournament with a sense of purpose. The team returned a lot of talent from the 1992 squad that had lost to Hillsboro in the Region 2 championship game. Central Valley also had lost in the 9-man state quarterfinals in the fall of 1992. The basketball season was the Valiants' chance to leave their mark and they did so by winning the 1993 Class B state championship.

Central Valley punched their ticket to state with a 77-67 victory over Fordville-Lankin in the Region 2 championship game. The Valiants only had two losses during the regular season – one against Bishop Ryan (a Class A program in 1993) and the other to Hankinson.

At state, the Valiants would be paired with Gackle-Streeter in the quarterfinals. Central Valley cruised to a 54-38 win on Thursday behind the 29-point effort of Brent Vigen.

Central Valley kept its momentum going with a 67-60 win over Bottineau in the semifinals. Chris Hong led the Valiants with 23 points. Ryan Wigestrland and Ross Nygaard combined for 30 points in the semifinal giving Central Valley multiple threats that allowed them to get past a talented Bottineau squad.

In the championship, Central Valley would play Des Lacs-Burlington. The Lakers led 35-28 at halftime. Central Valley made an adjustment in the second half shifting up its defense so Wigestrland would be guarding Lakers standout Steve Holen. The halftime deficit quickly was erased and the Valiants held a 52-43 lead entering the fourth quarter. When the final buzzer sounded Central Valley was celebrating a 71-62 victory.

Hong led the way with 27 points for Central Valley followed by Vigen (26 points) and Wigestrland (16 points). Hong and Vigen were named to the all-tournament team following the championship game.
