NDHSAA TOURNAMENT CODE OF CONDUCT

**PURPOSE:** To elevate standards of Good Sportsmanship and to encourage the growth of responsible citizenship among the students, member schools, and their personnel.

Fundamentals of Good Sportsmanship

1. Know, appreciate and understand the rules of the contest.
2. Show respect for the officials. Good Sportsmanship implies the willingness to accept and abide by the decisions of the officials.
3. Show respect for the opponent at all times. Good Sportsmanship is the Golden Rule in action.
4. Recognize and appreciate the skill of performance regardless of team affiliation.
5. Maintain self control at all times. Good Sportsmanship is a responsibility of all who are involved in the game.
6. Show a positive attitude in cheering, refraining from intimidation or negative cheering. Good Sportsmanship is cheering your own team "on to victory."

Acts of Misconduct

1. Throwing of any object onto the playing floor or in the stands.
2. Behavior deemed dangerous or which interferes with the rights of others to watch the game.
3. Possessing, consuming, or being under the influence of chemicals.
4. Use of obscene, profane, or abusive language or gestures, signs, posters, or banners which show disrespect for opponent's team, officials, cheerleaders, band or other performing groups.
5. The use of noisemakers.
6. Entry onto the playing surface at any time.

THESE ACTS OF MISCONDUCT WILL NOT BE TOLERATED AND WILL RESULT IN AUTOMATIC REMOVAL WITHOUT REFUND OF ADMISSION.

# Voice of Class B Basketball




Larry Louser

Growing up in Garrison, North Dakota, Larry’s first experience with organized sports was in middle school where he excelled in football, basketball and track. The first state basketball tournament Larry attended was in 1953, hosted at Swain Hall on the campus of what is now known as Minot State University.


In 1969, Larry picked up a microphone for the first time. For fifty consecutive years, he has continued to share his enthusiasm with fans, coaches and athletes from around the state of North Dakota. In 2004, Larry received a special recognition from the North Dakota Coaches Association for his lifetime contributions to North Dakota high school athletics. In 2013, Larry was inducted into the Minot High School Hall of Fame as a contributor for his years of service. Larry was also presented with a lifetime pass to all Western Dakota Athletics by the state activities directors. Larry has announced 2 NAIA National wrestling finals, National fast pitch softball, class A and B wrestling, girls basketball, boys basketball, football, track, baseball and soccer. In addition, Larry has had the honor of announcing for the State Special Olympics basketball tournaments.

Over the past 50 years, Larry has announced three generations of athletes as players and many others as coaches and officials. Having been dubbed the “Voice of Class B Basketball,” Larry will have the honor of announcing the 2019 State Class B Boys Basketball Championship game.

## 1969 STATE B CHAMPIONS OAK GROVE

Posting 26 wins in a basketball season while going undefeated is tough to do, but it was a feat Oak Grove was able to achieve in 1969 culminating with a state championship.

The Grovers' path to the 1969 NDHSAA Class B boys basketball state tournament was a tough one playing in Region 1, which had produced the eventual state champion in 1968 (Casselton) and 1967 (Ellendale). At the Region 1 Tournament, Oak Grove would play fellow unbeaten Ellendale in the first round. The Grovers came away with a 47-46 win to advance to the championship where they defeated Litchville 54-33 to earn a trip to state. It would be Oak Grove's fourth appearance in program history at the Class B state tournament and would prove to be a memorable one.

The 1969 Class B state tournament field included Oak Grove, New Town, Jud, Wolford, Berthold, Hebron, Edmore, and Northwood. Six of the eight teams had won 20 or more games. Oak Grove and Jud were undefeated entering state while Wolford was the only team returning from the 1968 state tournament.


Oak Grove edged Northwood 45-43 in the final quarterfinal game. Senior Mark Henderson scored a layup with four seconds remaining as the Grovers defeated the Trojans for the third time. In the semifinals, Oak Grove locked up with Wolford – a team known for

its pressure defense. Luckily, the Grovers had a roster deep with good ball handlers to counter-act Wolford's press. Oak Grove defeated the Wolves 53-47. Senior guard Marc Langseth led the Grovers with 16 points. Senior forward Warren Larson added 12 points and Henderson finished with 10 points.

In the championship game, Oak Grove squared off against Hebron. The Grovers led at all the quarter stops, but saw a 12-point lead at halftime dwindle to just two points in the second half. Hebron keyed its defense to contain Langseth, but he finished with 11 points including three free throws in the final 38 seconds of the game to help Oak Grove clinch its first Class B State Championship in program history. Ken Kvaale and Dave Tranby each finished with 10 points for Oak Grove. Langseth was named the tournament's most valuable player following the championship game.

Motivated by two heart-breaking losses in consecutive years during regional tournament play – a 65-62 double-overtime loss to Des Lacs-Burlington in the 1992 Region 6 championship and a 66-64 loss to Des Lacs-Burlington in the 1993 Region 8 semifinals – the Bishop Ryan boys basketball team made the 1994 season one to remember.

Led by All-State First-Team center and ND Mr. Basketball finalist, Ross Pankratz and a tenacious defense, the Lions averaged 83 points per game and maintained an average margin of victory of 29 points throughout the season. Bishop Ryan would go undefeated on its way to winning the 1994 NDHSAA Class B state championship.

An early test came against District 15 foe Mohall – No. 2 ranked at the time – eight games into the season. In front of a standing-room only crowd at the Minot Auditorium, Bishop Ryan would play its closest game of the year defeating the Yellow Jackets 61-60 in a meeting of the two best teams in the state. At the District 15 Tournament, Bishop Ryan met Mohall in the championship game – this time winning by a margin of 71-60. All-District selections for Bishop Ryan included Duncan Susag, Travis Vannatta, Robbie Meyer and Pankratz.


The Minot State Dome would host the Region 8 Tournament. Following wins against Alexander and Tioga, the Lions would play No. 3-ranked and fellow unbeaten Grenora in the championship. In front of a packed house, Bishop Ryan won decisively 75-52 against the Gophers with Shane Hafner, Pankratz, Susag, and Vannatta earning All-Region honors.

The 1994 NDHSAA Class B Boys Basketball State Tournament would be played at the Bismarck Civic Center. The tournament field was made up of Bishop Ryan, Dunseith, Linton, Dakota Prairie-Tolna, Hettinger, St. Thomas/Valley, Oakes and Halliday.

The Lions opened with an 83-57 win over St. Thomas/Valley in the quarterfinals. Pankratz led all scorers with 23 points and was one of four Lions to reach double figures. In the semifinals, Bishop Ryan defeated Halliday 73-38 led by Pankratz, who poured in 23 points. Meyer added 16 points for the Lions.

In the state championship game, Bishop Ryan defeated Dakota Prairie-Tolna 76-64 to claim the school's first Class B boys basketball state championship. The Lions built a 40-22 lead at the half, before the Knights cut the margin to six midway through the fourth quarter. With the undefeated season on the line, Travis Vannatta intercepted a pass and raced down court for a critical layup late in the game. This play combined with clutch free-throw shooting propelled Bishop Ryan to victory. The Lions held Dakota Prairie-Tolna's top scorer junior forward Scott Hanson to 12 points after he had combined for 70 points in the first two games of the tournament. Pankratz led the Lions with 25 points and 15 rebounds earning All-Tournament team honors. Susag and Vannatta added 12 and 10 points respectively.

This win coupled with the 1993 Lady Lions' Class B girls basketball championship made Greg Limke the first head coach in North Dakota history to win both Class B Basketball Championships during the same school year.






Cody Reiland

Brandy George






Tyler Cook

Jeremy's wife Heather is the school counselor at the Beulah Elementary School, they have two kids Hanah who is a freshman in college and Trey who is in 9th grade.



## A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

The activities association was founded in 1908 under the name of the High School League and originally was concerned only with athletics. In 1923 the state organization became affiliated with the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. A full-time executive director was employed in 1949, and assistant was added in 1963, a girls' sports supervisor in 1973, and a music and speech coordinator in 1978.

In 1950 the Consolidated League, an organization of the smaller schools of the state, affiliated with the High Schools League, thereby uniting all high schools of the state under one organization. Music and speech activities were placed under the direction of the Association in 1955, and the name was changed to the North Dakota High School Activities Association at that time. Schools in the League were all one class for basketball competition from 1908 to 1932. A two-class system was used from 1933 to 1947 and a three- class system from 1948 to 1963. In 1964 the two-class system was restored and this arrangement has been in effect since then up to the present time. Official state champions have been named in track since 1908 and in basketball since 1914. Official champions in other sports were later added as follows: golf and tennis 1938, baseball 1950; wrestling 1959; cross country 1961; hockey 1967; girls' track, golf and tennis 1966; girls' gymnastics 1969; girls' basketball 1974; boys & girls' swimming 1974. State football champions were determined off and on between 1916 and 1959, when the practice was discontinued, but again restored in 1975.

Basketball tournaments for girls were conducted by the Consolidated League for a number of years and by the NDHSAA from 1952 to 1960, at which time they were discontinued because of the small number of schools fielding teams. Girls' basketball was reinstated as an Association-sponsored activity in 1973 on a district level, with separate state Class A and Class B champions being named since 1974. Class A girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1984 and Class B girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1989. Boys' state soccer champions were first named in 1995 and girls' state soccer champions in 1996. Girls' state hockey champions were first named in 2003. Girls' softball champions were first named in 2009 with separated Division A & B champions in 2012.
