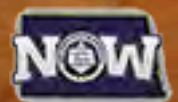

### NDHSAA MINIMAL BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS FOR REGULAR AND POSTSEASON COMPETITIONS:

- Respect the American flag and the National Anthem.
- Contesting schools shall each have an authorized faculty representative present who shall be responsible for his/her school's participants, students, and fans throughout the contest.
- Spectators must wear clothing that covers the entire torso. Those who do not comply or who wear clothing that is vulgar, obscene or that in some other way inappropriate, as determined by school/tournament personnel, will be removed from the facility if they do not cooperate with this behavior expectation.
- The use of appropriate language is expected at all times. Profanity, negative chants, trash talk, name-calling, personal attacks or other acts of disrespect are unacceptable and must be immediately addressed by school/tournament administrators. Any discriminatory slur will result in immediate removal from the facility.
- Any attendee ejected from a NDHSAA tournament venue will be banned from the venue(s) for the remainder of the event.
- Respect the game/contest. Under no condition shall anyone other than the members of the official squad enter the playing surface. No one may interfere with the contest in any way.
- Hand held signs and flags, which do not obstruct the view of others, are permitted provided they are in good taste. Signs or other similar items contest/tournament officials deem to be in poor taste will be removed. Message or "white" boards are prohibited. The carrying of flags around the playing surface is NOT allowed.
- Artificial noisemakers of any kind (i.e. megaphones, cowbells, sirens, whistles, thunder sticks, and other similar items) are not allowed at any indoor events, including outdoor sports played at indoor venues. Exception – Megaphones appropriately used by cheerleaders are permitted if allowed by contest officials.
- Laser lights or any other lights deemed distracting to participants are strictly prohibited.
- Confetti is banned at all NDHSAA tournament venues. Tournament staff is instructed to confiscate such articles at the door.
- Objects shall not be thrown into the stands at any NDHSAA tournament venue.
- The use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV), also known as drones, is prohibited for any persons at NDHSAA tournament venues.

## 1973 CLASS B BOYS BASKETBALL STATE CHAMPIONS HILLSBORO BURROS

The 1973 NDHSAA Class B Boys Basketball State Tournament was played in Minot with a tournament field consisting of eight new region champions who hadn't qualified for the tournament in 1972. Teams making a trip to Minot for state in 1973 were: No. 1-ranked Parshall, Richardton, Hillsboro, Fairmount, Rolette, Michigan, Glenburn and Edgeley.

Hillsboro, a scrappy defensive team with a formidable front court, entered state having lost two games during the regular season – one to Larimore and another to Mayville-Portland. The Burros would avenge the loss to Mayville-Portland by defeating the Patriots in the District 6 championship game, which propelled the team to a Region 2 Championship the following week.

The Burros were hitting their stride just in time for state. Hillsboro played undefeated Richardton in the first quarterfinal matchup of the tournament. The Burros edged the Rebels 52-49 thanks to a late steal and layup by Kent Bruun, who finished with a game high 20 points.

In the semifinals, Hillsboro matched up with Fairmount. The Burros built a 40-31 advantage at halftime and never let the Pheasants get into a rhythm in the second half ultimately winning the game 77-63 and advancing to the program's first ever Class B state championship game.

Top-ranked Parshall awaited the Burros in the title tilt. The Braves were led by All-State standout Randy Hedberg, who would go onto have a Hall of Fame collegiate athletic career at Minot State and later play quarterback in the National Football League.

Hillsboro matched up well with the Braves. The Burros front court dominated as it had all year. Starting forwards Kent Bruun and Roger Bohnsack combined to score 50 points in the title game – Bruun 30 points and Bohnsack 20 points. Center Keith Meyer added 16 points and added all up the front court overwhelmed Parshall as the Burros emerged with a 74-53 win.

Bruun was named Tournament MVP following the game and was joined on the All-Tournament Team by Bohnsack.

The state championship was the first of four that Hillsboro would win over the next 10 seasons under longtime head coach Ed Beyer. The origins of the Burros' Class B boys basketball dominance in 1970s and early part of the 1980s took root during the 1973 championship season.

# 1973 CLASS A BOYS BASKETBALL STATE CHAMPIONS 50 Years Ago

## FORT YATES WARRIORS

The 1973 Class A boys basketball state championship game is remembered 50 years later as one of the greatest games ever played in state history.

The championship game that pitted the smallest Class A school at the time – Fort Yates – and the largest Class A school – Minot High – would go to triple overtime in front of a packed crowd at the Bismarck Civic Center.

That night – March 10, 1973 – Fort Yates forever cemented its place in North Dakota sports history by defeating the mighty Magicians 79-78.

The journey to history was a team effort with some individual heroics mixed in along the way.

The path to the championship game was anything but easy as Fort Yates edged Wahpeton 54-50 in the quarterfinals and then defeated Langdon 63-62 in the semifinals.

Fort Yates would play in its first ever state championship game in program history. The Warriors' opponent – Minot High had played in a state championship game 14 different occasions and as one of the state's top boys basketball programs, boasted 10 total state championships won prior to 1972-73 season.

Though it would seem a mismatch, Fort Yates had the talent to compete with any Class A team in the state and after playing two tight games in Bismarck already that weekend, the Warriors were ready to seize the opportunity in front of them.

Fort Yates trailed 18-13 after the first quarter, but recovered to tie the game 32-32 at halftime. In the second half, Minot High appeared to have the better of the Warriors as it led by eight points with only 42 seconds remaining in the game. That's when Fort Yates senior guard Wyman Archambault stepped up his game. He made two free throws with 42 seconds left; then a teammate intercepted a pass and scored with 28 seconds remaining. Then Fort Yates stole another pass and scored with 21 seconds remaining. Minot High then turned the ball over again, and Fort Yates had the ball at mid-court.

With just two seconds left on the clock, Archambault ran to the left side near the top of the key, caught the inbounds pass and launched a turn-around shot that arched up high, "apparently off-course," but it banked in off the backboard at the buzzer to tie the game at 68.

In overtime, the Fort Yates crowd chanted, "Archambault . . . Archambault . . . Archambault," and the senior sparkplug responded, making four points at critical times during the three overtimes and ultimately helped lead the Warriors to the state championship victory.

Fort Yates, coached by Clark Swisher, finished the season 18-9. Following the championship game, sports reporters dubbed the last-second 20-foot fadeaway jump-shot bucket by Wyman Archambault a "Miracle Shot," the Warriors a "Miracle Team," and the triple-overtime contest the "Game of the Century" in North Dakota.

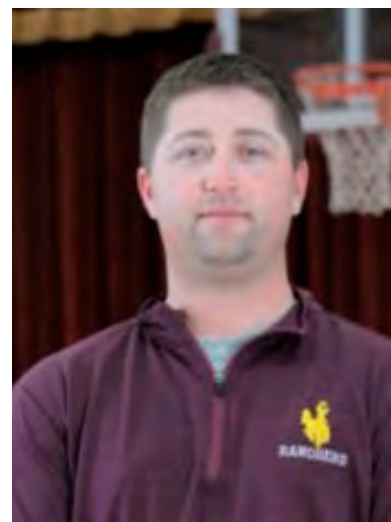

### STANDING ROCK WARRIORS

With only one returning starter and a new coaching staff it was difficult to predict the type of season laid ahead for the Standing Rock Warriors during the 1997-98 season.

New co-head coach was Jim Schroeder, who had 20-plus years of coaching experience that included several NDHSAA Class B boys basketball state tournament appearances while coaching at Belfield High School. Joining Schroeder on the bench was Cole Higlin.

The combo of Schroeder and Higlin would be tasked with instilling a team-brand of basketball at Standing Rock that featured a roster full of individuals who could score. If the Warriors could buy in to that style of play the squad had the talent to do big things come postseason tournament time.

After a 56-52 loss to Elgin/New Leipzig at the midway point of the season, each player on the team had to evaluate their game and decide what was best for the team. And even though the Warriors took another loss to Hettinger later in the regular season, the team was taking big strides. The Warriors defeated Shiloh Christian 71-68 in the regular season final and was ready to see if their new style of play would bring success during the postseason.

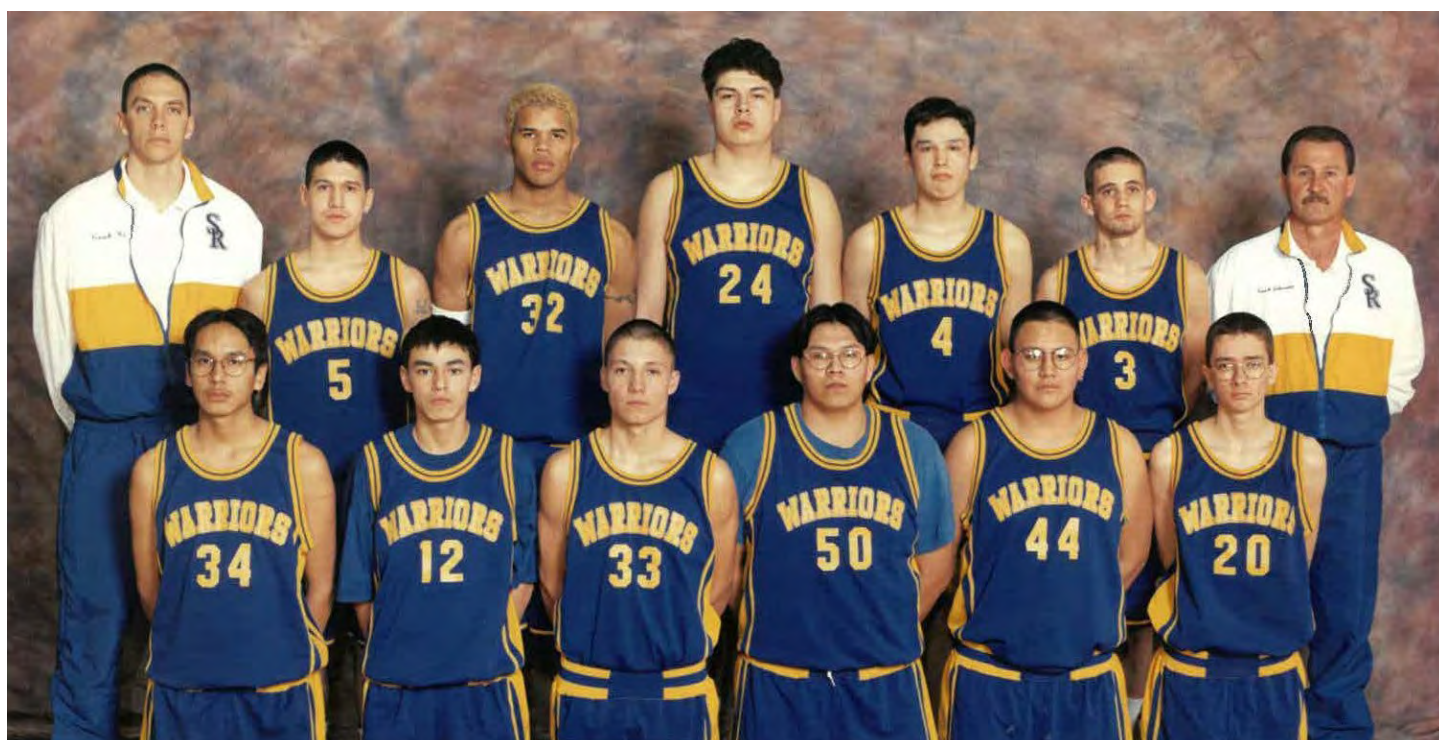
Standing Rock cruised through districts out scoring their opponents by a combined 108 points, but met some stiff competition at the region tournament. There would be no blowouts at the Region 6 Tournament. After tough battle with New England/Regent in the quarterfinals, which Standing Rock won 53-50, the Warriors met Dickinson Trinity in the semifinals. The Titans took the Warriors down to the wire, but a late basket made by senior forward Quinn Austin off an out of bounds play set up by coach Higlin proved to be enough to help the Warriors to a 67-61 win. Standing Rock followed up with a 79-75 win over Scranton in the region 6 title game to punch its ticket to the state tournament that would be played at the Minot State Dome.

Standing Rock entered state with a 23-3 record and met Lisbon (22-3) in the first state quarterfinal game on Thursday afternoon. The Warriors edged the Broncos 54-45 and followed up with a 70-47 win over Des Lacs-Burlington in the semifinals to advance to the state championship game.

The title game would match the Warriors up with Leeds. The game was Standing Rock's final opportunity to showcase what they had learned throughout the season and its team-brand of basketball was on full display. Standing Rock defeated Leeds 59-50 in the championship led by a balanced attack of Quinn Austin (18 points), Felix Bradley (13 points), D.J. Two Bears (11 points), Jake Luger (nine points) and Maverick Valandra (8 points).

Austin earned MVP honors following the championship game and was joined on the All-Tournament Team by Bradley and Valandra.

The Warriors finished the season 26-3.

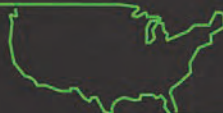
