NDHSAA TOURNAMENT CODE OF CONDUCT

PURPOSE: To elevate standards of Good Sportsmanship and to encourage the growth of responsible citizenship among the students, member schools and their personnel.

Acts of Misconduct

- 1. Throwing of any object onto the playing floor or in the stands.
- 2. Behavior deemed dangerous or which interferes with the rights of others to watch the game.
- 3. Possessing, consuming or being under the influence of chemicals.
- Use of obscene, profane or abusive language or gestures, signs, posters or banners which show disrespect for opponent's team, officials, cheerleaders, band or other performing groups.
- 5. The use of noisemakers.
- 6. Entry onto the playing surface at any time.



A 25 Year Tribute to the Past

The early 1990s was a great time for Midkota girls basketball. The Mustangs won five straight district championships (1991-1995) and had appeared in the Region 4 Tournament championship game for six consecutive years (1990-1995). In that span, Midkota, coached by Byron Hoeckle, won Region 4 titles in 1991, 1992, 1994 and 1995.

The 1995 season was the culmination of all the Mustangs' success. Midkota (a consolidated school district comprised of Glenfield, Sutton, McHenry, Binford and Grace City) defeated Leeds 51-43 in the 1995 Region 4 championship. The next stop would be the Minot State Dome for the NDHSAA Class B State Tournament.

Joining, the Mustangs in Minot at state were Starkweather, Milnor, Hatton, Linton, Hettinger, Washburn and Watford City.

In the quarterfinals, Midkota matched up with Starkweather, a team that had defeated the Mustangs 62-55 in the regular season. Midkota avenged the loss with a 60-50 victory led by senior forward Megan Fiechtner who scored 17 points and senior guard Nina Topp who scored 16 against Starkweather.

Midkota would play Hatton in the semifinals. The game featured a meeting of two Miss Basketball finalists, Topp and Hatton's Lisa Maus. Topp, Maus and Hope-Page standout Katie Richards were named Co-Miss Basketball winners following the state tournament. Hatton had defeated Midkota 74-53 during the regular season, but once again the Mustangs turned the tables. Topp scored 16 to lead Midkota to a 54-49 win.

The Mustangs were in the state championship game for the first time since 1991 and would meet Washburn. Like Midkota, Washburn was a strong program in the early 1990s winning a state championship in 1991 and finishing runner up in 1992. After a close first quarter, Washburn seized control in the second quarter by building an 11-point lead at halftime. Midkota chipped away at the Cardinals' lead and rallied to tie the game before the end of regulation. Midkota took its first lead of the game in overtime. The score was tied two different times in overtime before Fiechtner hit the final basket of the game with three seconds left to give Midkota a 54-52 win. Fiechtner led the Mustangs with 26 points, 18 of which came in the second half and overtime. Topp and Fiechtner were named to the All-Tournament Team. Midkota finished the season 24-5.



NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION BRIEF HISTORY

The activities association was founded in 1908 under the name of the High School League and originally was concerned only with athletics. In 1923, the state organization became affiliated with the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. A full-time executive director was employed in 1949, an assistant was added in 1963, a girls' sports supervisor in 1973, and a music and speech coordinator in 1978.

In 1950 the Consolidated League, an organization of the smaller schools of the state, affiliated with the High School League, thereby uniting all high schools of the state under one organization. Music and speech activities were placed under the direction of the Association in 1955, and the name was changed to the North Dakota High School Activities Association at that time.

Schools in the League were all one class for basketball competition from 1908 to 1932. A two-class system was used from 1933 to 1947 and a three-class system from 1948 to 1963. In 1964 the two-class system was restored and this arrangement has been in effect since then up to the present time.

Official state champions have been named in track since 1908 and in basketball since 1914. Official champions in other sports were later added as follows: golf and tennis 1938; baseball 1950; wrestling 1959; cross country 1961; hockey 1967; girls' track, golf and tennis 1966; girls' gymnastics 1969; girls' basketball 1974; boys' & girls' swimming 1974. State football championships were determined off and on between 1916 and 1959, when the practice was discontinued, but again restored in 1975. Basketball tournaments for girls were conducted by the Consolidated League for a number of years and by the NDHSAA from 1952 to 1960, at which time they were discontinued because of the small number of schools fielding teams. Girls' basketball was reinstated as an Association-sponsored activity in 1973 on a district level, with separate state Class A and Class B champions being named since 1974. Class A girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1984 and Class B girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1989. Boys' state soccer champions were first named in 1995 and girls' state soccer champions in 1996. Girls' state hockey champions were first named in 2003. Girls' softball champions were first named in 2009 with separated A and B champions in 2012.

NDHSAA Tournament Sportsmanship

Good sportsmanship is conduct which imposes a type of self-control involving honest rivalry, courteous relations and graceful acceptance of results.

School spirit is a reflection of those attitudes and behavior. Spectator etiquette requires that we refrain from displaying any action to taunt opponent's fan section such as carrying flags around the court and stopping to taunt the opponent's fan section. This may lead to competition among observers which is mistakenly under the guise of good sportsmanship.

Spectators are asked to remain in their designated fan section. Approaching the opponent's fan section for the purpose of taunting and baiting will not be tolerated. Also, carrying of flags around the court will NOT be allowed! The use of profanity at ANY TIME will NOT be tolerated.

Good sportsmanship shall be defined as those qualities of behavior which are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. An awareness is expected concerning the impact of an individual's influence on the behavior of others. Good sportsmanship is viewed as a concrete measure of the understanding and commitment to fair play, ethical behavior and integrity.





The History of Basketball

Invention of the game

The game of basketball as it is known today was created by Dr. James Naismith in December 1891 in Springfield, Massachusetts, to condition young athletes during cold months. It consisted of peach



baskets and a soccer style ball. He published 13 rules for the new game. He divided his class of eighteen into two teams of nine players each and set about to teach them the basics of his new game. The objective of the game was to throw the basketball into the fruit baskets nailed to the lower railing of the gym balcony. Every time a point was scored, the game was halted so the janitor could bring out a ladder and retrieve the ball. After a while, the bottoms of the fruit baskets were removed. The first public basketball game was played in Springfield, Massachusetts, on March 11, 1892.

The first basketball game

On December 21, 1891, James Naismith published rules for a new game using five basic ideas and thirteen rules. That day, he asked his class to play a match in the Armory Street court: 9 versus 9, using a soccer ball and two peach baskets. Frank Mahan, one of his students, wasn't so happy. He just said: "Harrumph. Another new game". However, Naismith was the inventor of the new game. Someone proposed to call it "Naismith Game", but he suggested "We have a ball and a basket: why don't we call it basketball?" There were other differences between Naismith's first idea and the game played today. The peach baskets were closed, and balls had to be retrieved manually, until a small hole was put in the bottom of the peach basket to poke the ball out using a stick. Only in 1906 were metal hoops, nets and backboards introduced. Moreover, earlier the soccer ball was replaced by a Spalding ball, similar to the one used today.

Professional leagues, teams, and organizations

The first professional league was founded in 1898. Six teams took part in the National Basketball League, and the first champions were the Trenton Nationals, followed by the New York Wanderers, the Bristol Pile Drivers and the Camden Electrics. The league was abandoned in 1904. Then, many small championships were organized, but most of them were not as important as some teams who played for money against challengers.

The Original Celtics, for instance, are considered the "fathers of basketball" and were presented as "World's Basketball Champions"; the players had to sign a contract to play with them, and Jim Furey organized matches as a circus, moving daily from town to town. The Celtics became the strongest team, and their successes lasted from 1922 until 1928, when the team disbanded due to ownership problems. The Original Celtics are sometimes incorrectly thought of as forebears of the current Boston Celtics of the NBA; in reality, they share only a name, as today's Celtics were not founded until 1946, nearly two decades after the demise of the Original Celtics.
